

# Springsteen Sales Create Retail Flurry

November 10th will probably be a day that the record industry will remember as Bday. "It's Bruce Day," proclaimed a spokesman from one record chain.


Bruce Springsteen fans across the countru rushed local records stores last week for his long-awaited live album, "Bruce Springsteen & the E Street Band Live/1975-85,' which initially shipped 1,500,000 units with another 750,000 two days later, an unprecedented accomplishment for an advance order, especially for a multi-record package.

Initial demand for the 40 song, 3½ hour, five-record (3 CD or cassette) package, which is a compilation of live performances which span over a decade of Springsteen's career complete with photo and lyric book let, created a excited, carnival-like, almost frenzied atmosphere at record retail outlets around the country. Many began standing in lines hours before the stores opened. "It was like being bait in a piranha tank," said one clerk from Sam Goody's in Manhattan. "As soon as we could pull one out of the box, somebody pulled it from our hands."

Nationally, the LP and cassette price ranged from \$19.99 to \$24.99, while the CD sells for \$33.33 to \$39.99

The LP package has been the sold the largest volume according to most retailers and one-stops, but CD's are selling faster. CD supplies are almost depleted according to several one-stop dealers who reported that they wouldn't be able to obtain any more CD sets until next year, however, CBS vice president of press and public affairs, Bob Altshuler said, "We will have more back in the stores before Christmas.'

Show Industries, a Los Angeles based company who owns City 1 Stop and 41 Music Plus stores, shipped out 22,000 units from their City 1 Stop location where record store managers arrived at 7:30 a.m. to pick up product from the parking lot where three trucks which had just arrived from the airport had set up skids of merchandise. Show Industries spokesman George Chronis said they were able to meet the demand. "We're selling a lot more than we anticipated. We were able to restock some of the stores. Some customers were telling our clerks that they came to Music Plus because Tower Records and the Wherehouse were still waiting for shipments." Even though Music Plus was selling the collection for about \$5 more than some of their competitors, it was clear that availability was

# New York Is Mad About 'The Box'

NEW YORK - New York is mad about The Box. There are lines outside record stores, lines inside record stores, and lots of big bucks being spent for what has become the album of 1986. Indeed, this is no ordinary box; it is a forty-song, five-record set called "Bruce Springsteen and The E Street Band Live 1975-85" (Columbia) and it is already making music industry history.

# **CBS** Completes Publishing **Unit Sale**

NEW YORK-CBS has completed the sale of its music publishing business to SBK Entertainment World Inc., a corporation controlled by Stephen Swid, Charles Koppelman and Martin Bandier, for \$125 million.

The assets purchased are CBS Catalogue Partnership, April Music Inc., Blackwood Music Inc., Music Theatre International, and CBS Songs International. The sale also includes administrative rights for Michael Jackson's ATV Beatles catalogue. SBK has also entered into a separate four-year agreement to administer worldwide newly-acquired copyrights for the CBS/Records Group

In a statement, SBK said it "intends to become a major new entertainment company and expects to make additional acquisitions in the industry as opportunities present themselves. Future acquisitions may come from areas other than the music industry per se.'

CBS said it expects to show a gain on the sale in the fourth quarter of 1986.

# **CBS Declines Billion-Dollar Bid; Opts To Retain Record** Unit

LOS ANGELES-At their monthly board meeting last week, CBS directors turned down a \$1.25-billion offer for its record arm from an investor group led by CBS Records president Walter Yetnikoff, and including New York-based manufacturer Triangle Industries. 



Quaint anecdotes of "Bruce mania" incidents at record stores abound, even stories of violence. Indeed, Columbia has hit on a Christmas buying season bonanza unheard of since Cabbage Patch dolls. Mob scenes have been reported at local one-stops . . . as early as 5am, no less! And, of course, price wars have erupted, with tags ranging from Tower Records' \$19.99 (LP) to \$24.99 (LP) at Music Plus (CD prices have varied accordingly, starting at around \$33.). An actual fist fight broke out at the Sherman Oaks Tower outlet when supplies ran low. Was it the current rash of Santa Ana winds (known for mysteriously increasing L.A.'s crime rate) that caused the fracas, or is this album worth a broken jaw? I mean, sure, it's a great recording and all, but it's not like we've never heard most these tunes before in one form or another. Geeze leweeze! Gone Platinum records in Thousand Oaks reports one young customer who paid the store's \$20.98 LP price all in coins. Are kids breaking their piggy banks for this collection? I guess so. Still, stores do exist where Bruce Mania isn't all it's been cracked up to be. "It's a hype," said Jeff Platt, of the Canoga Park Moby Disc branch (the store sold 15 Springsteen albums the first day, as compared to the 400 LPs sold at the West Hollywood Tower the first day out). Nevertheless, Bruce Mania covers the nation, north and south and coast to coast like a storm of locusts, and folks are snatchin' up the record faster than you can misinterpret "Born In The U.S.A."

# NEW FACES TO WATCH

Manahattan recording artist Robbie Nevil is exuberant about the way his career is shaping up. Seated on a couch in his manager's office, the face of the 24-year-old singer/songwriter registers a cross-section of emotions as he explains his reaction to the success of his debut self-titled LP. The emotions range from excitement, to pensiveness, to unbridled gratitude.

These days, the once struggling young artist has plenty to get excited, pensive and grateful about. "C'est La Vie," the first single from his self-titled debut LP is bulleting up the Cash Box Singles chart, and its accompanying video, artfully directed by Peter Care, has gone into active rotation on MTV.

"I'm being played in other cities that I've never even heard of. I feel like I better get in the car and go travel just so I can find out about these places!" he enthusiastically joked. For the L.A. born-and-bred musician, positive feedback to the album is a dream come true. the ultimate payoff. He savors every moment. "People ask me what it's like to hear myself on the radio. I say, 'It's the best."

Not that Robbie Nevil has never had a song recorded before. His tunes have been covered by the Pointer Sisters, Sheena Easton, Al Jarreau, El DeBarge, Vanity - he even had a cut on the "We Are The World"LP. But it was an artist deal that Nevil had originally intended for himself, and through his songwriting, an artist deal was what he finally got."Many things can be a means to an end,"he commented."That's the nice thing about this industry. It's kind of like going fishing. You throw out the lines you can, and they all kind of connect."

The signing happened by chance, and it happened at a time when Nevil had more or less put his own recording ambitions on hold. After submitting some new material for artists on the Capitol roster, he got a call from one of the label's a&r people who had heard his tape. A meeting was scheduled. Nevil was asked if he'd be interested in an artist deal. "Of course!," he replied. "That's what I was interested in initially!" Then he was introduced to Manhattan Records founder

Bruce Lundvall, who said he wanted to

whole thing was so extraordinary, after all those years of wanting it so bad, and doing anything I could. And at that particular time it was no longer the main goal. It was so easy. I couldn't help but smile. It was like a dream."

Nevil grew up listening to the radio. When he sang too loudly in his grammer school singing class, the school principal took notice, and asked him to sing at graduation. He picked up a real guitar after years of playing "air guitar" to his favorite records, which included everything from Led Zeppelin to Motown. Songwriting came naturally.

Now, with a label deal under his belt, all of the elements of his craft, including live performing (though there are no tour plans at present), have finally gelled. The album was recorded in London, and produced by Alex Sadkin, with ex-Cure member Phil Thornally. Nevil waited a year and a half to work with the much-in-demand Sadkin, whose credits include the Thompson Twins, Duran Duran and Grace Jones, but the more he listened to Sadkin's work, the more he wanted to work with him. The wait was worth it. "Alex sees what you see, and embellishes it," he remarked. The result is an R&B inflected pop album, featuring a direct, gutsy approach, led by Nevil's soulful, energized vocals. Clearly, after years of having to farm it out to foster parents, Nevil's music is very much his own.

# **Stanley Clarke: Return To** Fusion

"I feel that right now is a nice period for people who play instrumental music," says Stanley Clarke. "There's kind of a resurgence, people are kind of taking notice of it again. It's funny, it happens every 10 years. I have no idea why -it's the stupidest thing ever - but, hey, that's the way it is."

Hey, so Stanley Clarke - the sultan of the electric bass—is cooling off on his r&b projects, slowing down on his producer-for-hire gigs, and getting ready to jump back into fusion waters. "Hideaway," his latest Epic LP, which Stanley terms a "transitional album," features such mavens of instrumental jazz fusion (or almost-jazz fusion) as Stanley

Jordan, Herbie Hancock, Stewart Cope land, George Howard, and Alphonso John son. He credits an openness on the part o audiences to instrumental music as the cata lust for its "resurgence."

# Duran Duran Is 'Notorious' For Going Platinum

EW YORK — Duran Duran is back. "Noious" (Capitol), the band's first LP since 84's "Arena," is likely to become their h platinum album in as many years. The st single is the title track, accompanied by ideo directed by Peter Kagen and Paula ief, and other tracks sound like potential igles as well.

Though drummer Roger Taylor and guiist Andy Taylor are no longer with the nd, Simon LeBon, Nick Rhodes, and hn Taylor stay true to the sound that first ide them successful. Steve Ferrone, forerly of The Average White Band and ritti Politti, is the drummer on "Notoris," and Nile Rodgers and Warren Cuccuro play lead guitar (Andy Taylor is atured on four tracks). The result is a ten ng collection that is as percussive and melic as anything the group has ever done. The song "Notorious," which was reportly one of the last cuts recorded for the oum, seems certain to be a hit, and the her songs on the album will have appeal r Durannies as well. "Skin Trade" is perps the catchiest and most oddly effective, nile the other songs run a wide gamut nging from the McCartney-esque "So Misad" to the moody "Winter Marches On." "I'm a restless sort of person in that I n't bare to be doing the same thing for too ng," Nick Rhodes told Cash Box some onths ago. "Meaning that what's great out being in a group is that we do writing id recording and playing live and doing

This restlessness has resulted in Rhodes at the other band members engaging in tra-curricular projects. Last fall, Rhodes, abon, and Roger Taylor formed Arcadia at recorded a successful album called "So and The Rose." Prior to that, John and ndy Taylor made an album with The ower Station which had two hit singles in Some Like It Hot" and "Bang A Gong (Ge On)." Indeed one can see the influence of ower Station on "Notorious" "Froposion," and hints of Arcadia on "Winter arches On."

"I have been listening to a lot of experi-

mental music," said Rhodes after the release of "So Red The Rose." "Some of it is obscure just for the hell of it and some of it is very original. What I'd like to do is combine more of the originality with something that relates to people, something that is slightly accessible. Because I still have an urge to communicate with people and I think it's always important to move music on to something else. I like things to be very modern. I don't like things that take too many ideas from the sixties or rock roots. I like something that maybe develops in sound but is still a damned good song."

For all his experimental leanings, Rhodes has kept it accessible on "Notorious," which should go a long way toward expanding this band's already solid commercial base. Another thing that has 'moved forward' the Duran sound is the addition of Nile Rodgers as co-producer of the album. He affords some songs a percussive authenticity that may take some people by surprise.

Video has played an important part in this band's development from the time of their 1981 self-titled debut album to their current 'performance' video for "Notorious." In fact, this band could be called one of the first bands of the video age. "I like video," said Rhodes. "I think Duran Duran eally pioneered it and moved it into new areas, but I think we always had our priorities right as well, that the song was the most important thing. Now I think it's time for a little more simplistic videos."

Duran Duran's tour in support of "Notorious," slated for a February kick-off, will begin in Australia, and will swing around to Japan and the U.S. later in the year. Certainly their repertoire – whether from 82's "Rio," "83's "Seven and The Ragged Tiger," "84's "Arena," or their debut album – will be more hit-packed than ever. Not only that but Rhodes said that "I would hope that we'd include both Arcadia and Power Station songs as well." But, clearly, the focus will be on "Notorious" — and a band that has a notorious reputation for going platinum.

# EAST COASTINGS

CHRONIC MURMURING — R.E.M.'s first of two sold-out Felt Forum concerts (11/06) was much better than their show last year at Radio City, but not quite as riveting as their show the year before at the Beacon Theatre. What made it better than last year's was the inclusion of songs from "Murmur" (IRS), their best album, and "Lifes Rich Pageant" (IRS), their second best album. What made it worse than the Beacon show was that **Michael Stipe**, the

compelling and charismatic member of the band, was not always the focus onstage. Instead, this show was often more of a group effort, and on such songs as "Fall On Me" and "Maps and Legends," **Bill Berry** and **Mike Mills's** lush harmonies nearly upstaged Stipe. On another song, "Superman," the tune's co-writer, **Gary Zekley**, helped out on vocals, relegating Stipe to the wings. Evidently, R.E.M. has become democratized and that is both good and bad.

It is good because Mills and Berry can harmonize like nobody's business, and it is bad because consistent focus is sacrificed, the focus being Stipe who gives the band its enigmatic cachet. But when they play together as a unit, with Stipe dominating, the results can be as great as folk-rock gets. "Pilgramage," for example, was done just the way one might want them to play it, with every hook in place and the tension of the final verse spilling over into the chorus. And the centrifugal "Pretty Persuasion" was exhilirating and positively irresistable. Though garage folk is what they do best, there is a goopy, paisley element to this band ("Flowers Of Guatamala") that shows up every now and then like some unwelcome party-crasher. But for the most part they keep that impulse at bay-which is more than they were able to do with the audience, which kept crowding the area in front of the stage. At one point, the crowd up front was getting so badly crushed that the band had to break off an encore of "Driver 8" while Stipe helped an injured fan backstage. Indeed, devotion to this band is fanatical, and it's but a matter of time before that translates into top ten success.

READY FOR PRIME TIME— The Feelies opened the show and were joined by R.E.M. guitarist Peter **Buck** for a cover of **The Beatles's** "She Said, She Said." (One could suddenly hear the striking similarity between the guitar riff in that song and the one Buck plays in "Begin The Begin.") Some years ago, The Feelies were a big influence on a nascent R.E.M.; today, it's the other way around. Whatever the case, The Feelies sound is more effortless and natural than R.E.M.'s and that plays well in concert. Songs like "Slipping (Into Something)" and "On The Roof" ("The Good Earth"/Coyote) are infectiously rythmic, while others, like "The Last Roundup," make novel use of vocal and guitar textures. Gauging from the crowd's enthusiastic reaction to the forty minute set, a major label deal can't be too far off.

THE RAMONES LIVE!-The rockin' Ramones gave one of their patented non-stop shows at the Ritz November 8, unleashing a sound and fury that still serves them well after nearly twelve years, going onetwothreefour into "Teenage Lobotomy," "Psychotherapy,""Rock 'N' Roll High School," 'Glad To See You Go," all without a break, and, get this, even playing lost-inthe-cracks classics like "Carbona Not Glue" and "I Don't Care" (which still has only nine words in the lyric), while de-Spectorizing "Rock 'N' Roll Radio" and metalizing "The KKK Took My Baby Away" and "Mama's Boy," before Joey Ramone again onetwothrees it into "Today Your Love, Tomorrow The World," "Rockaway Beach," and "Cretin Hop," dedicating "Sheena" to the "tenth anniversary of punk," letting Dee Dee Ramone sing the hard-core "Let's Go," bringing on a 'Gabba Gabba Hey' placard for "Pinhead," and then declaring "We're A Happy Family" to an audience that couldn't agree more after thirty-five songs in seventy minutes flat, some kind of record.

# Remerson, Lake & Powell

THE GREEK THEATRE/PACIFIC AM-PHITHEATRE, L.A.—To the delight of thousands of eager, adoring fans, Keith Emerson, Greg Lake and Cozy Powell (Powell having replaced Carl Palmer as the band's drummer/percussionist) made a triumphant return to Southern California with supercharged two-hour performances at both The Greek Theatre and Pacific Amphitheatre.

Better known as ELP, the band established itself in the 70's as one of the leading practitioners of classical/rock music relying almost exclusively on the keyboard expertise of Emerson for its musical identity.

Despite a several year-long absence since disbanding in the late 70's, and despite the many critics who castigate ELP as being pompous, pretentious and unimaginative, a group couldn't ask for a more loyal following of fans and friends than those who attended its concerts during this recent tour.

And so it was, appropriately, in this reunion-like atmosphere, that some of the loudest cheers rang out during the opening number, "The Score," as Lake belted out the lyrics, "it's been so long your welcome back my friends, to the show that never ends." Emerson, Lake & Powell responded in turn to the crowds enthusiastic approval and gave them a stirring version of their epoch "Pirates" from the "Works Vol. I" LP. For hardcore ELP fans, "Pirates" was truly one of the highlights for it was previously performed during the unsuccessful, short-lived "Works" tour that featured a complete orchestra. The orchestra was certainly not missed and if anything, these performances conveyed an even greater flair for the song's swashbuckling theme.

While there were some younger fans drawn to the show, the majority of fans most likely were the same that rallied to ELP shows in the early and mid 70's. No stones were left unturned as the group gave its fans everthing from "Tarkus" to "Lucky Man" and other ELP chestnuts like "Still You Turn Me On," "Fron The Beginning," "Knife Edge" and "Fanfare For The Common Man" to mention a few. However, in addition to the old ELP pleasers, songs from the new album like "The Score." "Touch And Go" and "Mars" were received equally well.

Welcome back my friends to the show that never ends. Based upon the crowd's

overwhelming, favorable reaction, it is doubtful if many left disappointed. ELP- it's like you never left.

Steve Earle

THE BOTTOM LINE, NYC — At his Halloween show here, Steve Earle debuted seven new songs from an as-yet untitled album he'll record in January and release next April or May. Many of these new songs emphasize the rock aspect of his country-rock, and a couple of them sound like instant classics. If this show was any indication, Earle's follow-up to "Guitar Town" (MCA) will be a major industry event.

The big question is whether he has come up with songs that equal "Someday," "Good Ol' Boy (Gettin' Tough)," and "Guitar Town." Apparently, he has. "Sweet Lit 66" is the best of the new batch, scaling down Springsteen themes to Chuck Berry size with a ferocity that would burn ears in Opryland. "Nowhere Road" is the best lyrically, a kind of 'Desolation Row Revisited' about a boomerang road of life that "don't go nowhere/it just takes you back again." "I Love You Too Much" is pure Buddy Holly roots pop, "Angry Young Man" is a melodic, harmonica-driven tune, and "San Antonio Girl" has more than a hint of The Beatles and mid-sixties farfisa pop.

But the new album is months away, and most of the crowd came to hear Earle perform "Guitar Town" songs. From the moment he opened with the title track, Earle played it raw and fast, articulating every musical surface and depth with an exquisiteness that suggested the E Street Band, particularly with Harry Stinson's "Born In The USA" drumming on "Someday" and Ken Moore's bell-like keyboard work on the touching "Little Rock 'n' Roller." Earle even covered Springsteen's "State Trooper" and when he sang "the radio's jammed up with talk show stations" Moore created a deserted highway feel with some icy, three-in-themorning organ fills.

While Springsteen characters are often just passing through on a highway trek to nowhere, Earle's characters know the local roads, drink the local beer, and can smell the speed traps half a mile away — in short, they live around here. There is transience, yes, but there's also a sense of regional allegiance that is so provincial it's universal. Perhaps that's why Earle has crossed over

from the country to the rock charts with ease, and is equally compatible touring with both George Jones and The Replacements.

On the cover of "Guitar Town" Earle is pictured with a guitar that has a broken D-string. At this show, Earle broke no less than three strings, and one song was even interrupted while a roadie handed him a new guitar — which is testament to his intensity. Earle thrashes his acoustic as if he were trying to make it sound like a strat or a percussive instrument. He may sing with a twang, and write songs about 'good 'ol boys,' but he's a rocker in the purest sense of the word, as this concert and his new songs attest.

American Jazz Orchestra

GREAT HALL, COOPER UNION, NYC—The American Jazz Orchestra, the jazz repertory band founded by jazz critic Gary Giddins, got off to a somewhat slow start earlier this year, but the band fell into line for its debut concert of the '86-'87 season, "A Tribute To Benny Goodman." The band, remarkably, sounded like a band (something it didn't at its debut) as it purred through the program of Goodman Big Band chestnuts with sleek aplomb.

The case for jazz repertory—something fiercely debated at the AJO's debut-was clearly made here. The Goodman chartsby such marvelous arrangers as Fletcher Henderson, Eddie Sauter, Jimmy Mundy, Mel Powell, and Edgar Sampson-are best heard live, with a well-greased big band swinging the hell out of them. Music director John Lewis this time had the right guys for the job-can one imagine a better big band trombone section than Jimmy Knepper, Jack Jeffers, and Urbie Green? - and he whipped them into major league shape. The rhythm section-Dick Katz, Rufus Reid, and Kenny Washington-was spry and elastic, and the choice to fill Goodman's clarinet shoes - Walt Levinsky - was a wise one: Levinsky's rich sound is pure Goodman and his own musical personality was subsumed here, without being compromised, into that of Goodman's. (Levinsky also served as guest conductor - John Lewis had to make a Modern Jazz Quartet gig across town.)

But the stars of the evening were, naturally,

the arrangements: some of the swinginge jazz arrangments ever made. Such favorit as Henderson's charts of "King Port Stomp," "Let's Dance," "Down Sou Camp Meeting," and "Stealin' Apples," Edie Sauter's challenging later charts things like "Clarinet a la King," and the movelously-performed "Benny Rides Again and Mel Powell's lesser-known, but no le effective, "The Earl" and "I'm Here," we given a wonderfully exuberant spin by the band. Solos were kept properly short, we such players as Green, Knepper, Katz, saphonist Loren Schoenberg, and trumpel Virgil Jones making good use of their their given spots.

The concert opened with "Tribute Benny," a concerto for clarinet and jazz chestra commissioned from Bob Browneyer, with BMI's help, expressly for tAJO. The concerto combined Goodman que swing passages with warm pastelshad the unmistakable stamps of both Goman and Brookmeyer—and it showed the AJO has more up its sleeve than jarepertory. Today's equivalents of the Hodersons and Sauters of yesteryear are content and this band can develop into an olet for their work: they certainly seemed do justice to Brookmeyer's fine piece.

The American Jazz Orchestra careful avoided one of the pitfalls of jazz repertorit so easily fell into at its debut sever months ago: the idea that a mixed group jazz personalities can overnight be traformed into a band. One needs team plers—the right team players—to make team. The young American Jazz Orchest, which will offer its next concert December 1, seems to, after a bumpy maiden voyal, be ready to take flight.

# UK BUZZ

The UK music industry had been ounting on the government to introluce a levy on blank tapes. Frantic lobying has been going on in the hope of speeding up the process-all to no ıvail. The cabinet committee has oushed aside the copyright bill, which ncluded the levy proposals, claiming he next Parliament session is already overcrowded.

BPI director general John Deacon s furious. He predicts "a kind of anarthy in the realm of copyright reform if he outdated and largely unenforceable 1956 act is not reformed."

The Performing Rights Society, the Musicians Union, and an impressive array of publishing bodies are all behind the BPI push for the bill to go through.

"Our industries say that it is absoutely essential that this bill go before Parliament this year," says Deacon, who fears that the opportunity for radical copyright reform may be lost for

I don't remember being this way, but, then again, I don't remember half my adult life. She took me and sat me down in my chair and she bound me in class, round and round and around it must have been 100 times-with bright red string. I remember that very vividly. I have a very fond memory of that, I think it affected me. It made me a little bit kinky, I thought to myself proudly, 'Hey, I'm in the red string..."

PASSING ON-Eddie "Lockjaw" Davis, the rough and tumble tenor saxophonist, died November 3 of cancer. Davis was an exciting soloist who could shake the walls - something he did quite handily with Count Basie, as part of a jousting two-tenor team with Johnny Griffin, with various organ trios, particularly one led by Shirley Scott, and in various tenor-for-hire situations. "Jaws" had a love-hate relationship with playing; he frequently packed up his horn and worked as a booking agent. His last appearance was at Dick Gibson's Colorado Jazz Party over Labor Day weekend, where he surprised the assemblage with a single number. Eddie "Lockjaw" Davis was 65.

Sippie Wallace, who died November 1 at the age of 88, was, perhaps, the last of the great female blues singers who came to prominence in the 1920's. She recorded with Louis Armstrong and Sidney Bechet back then and experienced something of a revival when Bonnie Raitt not only recorded her songs-most notably "Woman Be Wise"-but had Sippie open many of her concerts. Sexy, saucy, and sassy till the end-I last heard her only a couple of years ago at the Nice Jazz Festival, where she tore it up-the likes of Sippie Wallace will never pass this way again.

I'd like to note three other recent deaths. **Theorgeir Stubo**, a prominent Norwegian jazz guitarist, died of cancer October 22 at the age of 42. **Richard Calandra**, co-producer of **Spyro Gyra** and co-owner of Bear Tracks recording studio in Suffern, N.Y., died October 20 of cancer at the age of 45.

And **Louis Lorillard**, the tobacco heir who co-founded the Newport Jazz Festival with his then-wife Elaine in 1954, died of pneumonia November 5 at the age of 67.

The saxophone great's friends, sparked by Arnie Lawrence, are the one's who are behind this, and many of Zoot's musical compadres-including Al Cohn, Dizzy Gillespie, Gerry Mulligan, Jon Faddis, and Scott Hamilton-are expected to take part. EKAPA-Abdullah Ibrahim is, to my mind, one of the very best pianists, composers, and bandleaders currently working. A complete original, he is reponsible for two of the best jazz albums of this year - "Water From an Ancient Well" (Blackhawk) and "South Africa" (Enja). Now Blackhawk has picked up distribution of Ekapa - a label that lbrahim began a couple of years ago with his wife, vocalist Sathima Bea Benjamin - releasing Sathima's "Memories and Dreams" (as well as the new "Windsong''), and Ibrahim's "Ekaya" and "Live At Sweet Basil, Volume 1." They are all worth having, and Ibrahim is particularly worth hearing live: he'll be settling into N.Y.'s Sweet Basil the first two weeks in December and a stop there is highly recommended.



Previous rockers to be preserved in cement include: Stevie Wonder, Eddie Van Halen, Les Paul, Robert Moog, C.F. Martin III, Jim Marshall and Bill Ludwig. Soon to be inducted ore: Rod Stewart, Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young, Ricky Nelson, Elvis Presley and Jimi Hendrix.

HALL OF FAME: The National Association of Broadcasters is occepting nominotions from its rodio members for two inductees into NAB's Radio Hall of Fame. NAB Radio Board Chairman Bev E. kay, so you are a program director at an station. Your format is AOR (All Over the d), your ratings are dropping like a dirty, amd the new Clossic Rock station in just stole your best jock. Isn't there anyy you can call; a sort of AM Supermon

with all the powers to get your station flying high agoin? Well, removing his glasses and stepping from the neorest phone booth is the answer to all your prayers.

His name is Steve LoBeou. He is a man who has logged many miles and many years in AM rodio and he has recently formed AM Medio Consultants, a firm devoted exclusively to helping AM radio stotions. "During my years spent with AM radio it has become obvious that AM listening patterns have evolved in such a way that there ore special needs and problems that need to be addressed," LoBeau comments.

A native Californian, LaBeau's career has taken him from the wilds of Colorado through stops in Las Vegas, Orlando, ond Detroit before landing him back in Los Angeles, where he has served as Program Director at KFI-AM for the lost 4 yeors.

LoBeau finds programming extremes to be one of the major problems with AM formats today: "A lot of AM stations are just grabbing at anything, and others have programmers more concerned with ploying the Hot this thon they are obout really oppealing to the demographics available and making more money for their radio station. Between

these two extremes is programming that really does work."

In order to help fine-tune an AM station with problems, LaBeau has the important resource of experience to draw upon, and plans to use consistent programming and focused marketing to appeal to the big-bucks 35-49 demos. "Programming hos to come first. You must define just who it is that you want listening to your station, then moke sure that your programming is matching that audience," he insists. "If you have the right programming to reach the right audience, ond you know how to properly morket that rodio station, then AM radio can and will continue to be o significant force. But you must morket it so that it is successful os o business."

LaBeau plans to use his strategies to compete within the AM market for the most part, especially in the larger areas. However, he notes, "I do wont to make myself available from small to major markets and eoch morket will have different situations. The key is getting the right number of programming combinations together to grab new listeners and yet maintain o certoin consistency and image for your stotion." He is sure that there are plenty of PD's across the country who would like to

use that key to unlock the gateway to higher rotings.

"To my knowledge, there is nobody who is consulting AM and AM exclusively. I think we are unique. Hopefully the credibility I have established throughout the years in AM radio, as well os my willingness to work with AM radio and not just throw it by the woyside will corry some weight."

LoBeau speoks enthusiostically and optimistically about the future of AM rodio, but worns that it must be overseen with patience and foresight if it is to be successful again. "It is a future that has to be forged with quality decisions and the commitment to stick with the decisions you've made and see em through to their completion. These changes will take some time to become visible, and it won't hoppen in one or two books."

So take heart all of you in AM-Rodio land: the man of steel has landed, and programming that promises to increase your share and make you more profitable is just a phone call oway. 

Richard Mack President/Catawba Record Corporation

"Nothing is done overnight. It tokes olot of plonning and hord work."R.M. After 20 years and two medals in the United Stotes Coost Guord, Richord Mock retired os chief petty officer and decided that the music business was where he belonged. He wet his wings ond his oppetite in February of 1966 with Koppelman and Rubin Associotes, N.Y., on ossociote of United Artists. After o year there, he wos ready for Atlantic Records, N.Y. where he enjoyed the positions of not only ossistont to the vice president, but olso os notional promotion director. Five years of Atlantic gove Richard the experience he needed to move to CBS Records where he was both the national promotion director for special morkets and the vice president of national promotion.

Off to a great start, Richard had poved his way for what was yet to come.

In July of 1978, Richord went into business for himself os president ond chief executive officer of o lond development compony colled Noture's Development Corporotion. So for to dote, the compony hos developed some 400 trocks of lond in South Carolino, ond is storting up deals oversees, porticularly in the Philippines and Borbados.

While he was getting his lond development compony off the ground, onother very special project was also in the making. That project was Cotowbo Record Corporation which jumped quite strongly into the music scene in January of 1981.

Cotowbo hos on exciting catologue of ortists including R. Justice Allen whose recent releose entitiled "Crockin' Up," hos mode it onto the Block Contemporory singles chort, and whose follow up entitled "Bobies Moking Bobies" is scheduled for releose this Februory. Also on the roster is a Dutch Robinson record colled "Lowdown," o new Sondro Fevo LP, and new ortist Eleanor Gront is scheduled to release her record colled "Wind Me Up."

Mock's fovorite port of the job is the

molding of Cotowbo into a solid independent record compony. He feels that the compony now has the, "right personnel. We are very close to busting wide open, and by the 1st of the year we will be moving into an upper grade." Tommy Young from Poly-Grom has recently come on board as vice president general manager, and with Richard Eric Mack, his eldest son, as director of a&r, and Mack's wife Fonny as senior vice president, secretory treasure, and controller, this thriving family business can only win.

Believe me, Gwen hos certainly worked her woy up to this one. Storting with education, having been cum loude in the dept. of radio with o minor in television of Howard University, Gwen received scholarship tuition for three of the four years that she spent obtaining her B.A. in Communications. Her forth year scholarship come from RCA-NBC in 1975-76 for scholor of

the yeor in telecommunications. Bock then, Gwen's interests spread beyond radio into the field of low. 

# NASHVILLE FORUM



**Tommy West** 

(The following is the campletion of an interview with Tammy West, seniar vice president and heod of A&R far MTM Records, and part of an executive partnership that also includes Howard Stork [president] and Alon Bernard [CEO]. Part One of the interview was printed in lost week's issue.)

"What we're really selling, besides music, is lifestyles. And ta me, it's inevitable that there's ganna be an acaustic baam, because that's what's being written naw.....all in all, it's a gaad time ta be making acaustic kinds af recards. I feel really aptimistic far the peaple caming in. All these little spurts, this creative unrest that's in tawn naw—this graping far samething new—will yield samething great. And everybady benefits fram it."

In addition to the quest for the new and creative product, there is, naturally, a quest for more airplay for that product. As West sees it, the bulk of country radia can be segmented into "three little subdivisions: you have the traditionalists, then you have the middle-of-the-roaders and you have the 'left-wing' country stations who don't want to play George Strait, for instance, unless they 'have to'.

And then you have peaple wha will play anly that sart af praduct and will anly play the Almast Brathers if farced."

Still in all, he sees the cauntry market as being the natural autlet far the type af recards that he likes ta make.

"The anly acaustic area left, radiawise, is the cauntry farmat," he apines. As a result, perhaps, "cauntry has became almast like a dumping graund far a lat af music that isn't taa techna-pap, ar taa rack 'n rall.It's like a middle graund naw. Which I think cauld be gaad. Where else can yau ga but cauntry radia? Because if yau praduce a sensitive recard yau can't ga ta [a heavy rack statian] with that.

"Maybe what'll came aut af it is a new farmat—what I wauld call 'acaustic wave,' a newer acaustic kind af directian, if radia will allaw itself, because the peaple here are writing differently now, they're praducing differently.

"If that happens, the recard buyer af 25-44, ar 18-54, whatever the demagraphic is, may say, 'Gee, an this Hally Dunn, I can relate ta these things. I can like this, and I live in Sheepshead Bay, Braaklyn.'

"That's what I'm trying ta get ta—because there's a big vaid. Why is it that all of us dawn here wha are marketing and trying ta sell recards are getting massive airplay and nat selling thraugh, when ather kinds af music get na airplay and sell a lat? Ta me, that means there's a market aut there that is laaking far samething better, or samething different, and it isn't respanding.

"They may listen to the recards on the radia, but they're not gaing out and buying. So I figure that you have to came out with sangs that really hit people, samehaw. There's gotta be same kind of either depth or funniness to it, or irany to it, to make 'em think a little bit. To touch them.

"Naw, the peaple wha live in Chicaga ar New Yark ar San Francisca and L.A.

and markets like that dan't relate, an a lifestyle level, ta what [many traditional artists] are daing, ta any great extent. I think they're still turned off in certain markets ta what they think the image af cauntry is. And that image may be being sustained and perpetuated by peaple wha want ta keep it the way it is. I dan't knaw. Sametimes I almast think that this is the anly farm af music—cauntry—that sart of resists change. The anly area I've seen fight about what the recard should saund like is cauntry. That's sa surprising ta me. And sa annaying. There's mare arguments aver haw a record should saund in this genre than I've ever seen. It's like 'well, we can't put that an the recard because maybe the guitar's taa laud, ar taa much drums,' etc.

"One majar market (radio) guy wha really has resisted aur praduct—almast in tata—said he wauld play Hally Dunn's recard, maybe, if I taak the fiddle aff the beginning. Well, I'm nat ganna da a special mix far ane radia statian. I said, 'Let 'em talk laud aver it.' Na way am I gonna da that. That introductian is valid ta that recard, and it was purpasely put there. And the sang is sa ripe—I mean everybady has a father.

As far himself, West says, "I just see it as music. I dan't see it as cauntry music, I dan't see it as falk music. To me the key is goad. Give them unique; make unique recards. Dan't be afraid to try things. As a cammercially-ariented persan I'm certainly nat ganna be so aut af the ball-park that somebady can't play it.

"The music itself has ta be special. What they're telling us aut there, fram a sales paint af view, is that it's nat special enough ta buy. 'I'll listen ta it because I punch it up an the radia, and I dan't like what the AOR station's playing and I dan't like what the black station's playing, sa the anly chaice is the cauntry statian.'

"I laak at the success af all these newage artists wha dan't get played an the radia and whase recards sell mare that recards are selling. That's the dergraphic we're trying to hit. It's like sorthing is going an that we have to pattentian to, and maybe what it is is make better product, make better mu Dan't depend so much an the drum is chine and the synthesizers. Make the move people.

"Far country music to survive as a carding thing it has to appeal to masses. Because you can't make albifar \$6,000 anymare. As a business just can't do it.

At the same time, he cancludes, would like to think that there's a segnal of the population that is ready to senough af this product to make it problem.

"What we're developing here MTM) is a point of view. Not that expected saunds alike, but sanically out cards have a saund that radia likes. It it's dane very carefully, mixed very carefully, mastered very carefully. There paint of view here, I think, that I make us unique—and that's that it have af a certain quality. We've tur dawn acts that have gane an tabe ather places because we felt that just didn't fit into aur mix. It may so haughty, ar whatever, but I think have to have that.

"I laak at the great pap labels, wher it was Warner Bras. or A&M, Atle ar Matawn. They had a paint of v And that's what we want ta keep bing here, and I think we're aff ta a regood start. I really believe, alang my partners Haward and Alan, we're maving in the right directian."

He spent a year "working himself to death" so that when another side path suddenly opened up, he didn't need much persuasion to leave both the music store business and PNX to take a position at a local TV station, WTVM, as an engineer. The job offered more money and less hardship, and Ken enjoyed himself in TV land, both the technical side of the business and as a talent in commercials. In fact, he liked it sa much that he almost made it another (you guessed it) seven years at WTVM. But the truth was, he missed radio and in 1980 he took a \$500-a-month pay cut and went home to WPNX.

"As I look back, I know I could have made a lot of money doing samething different, but those things weren't making me happy," he says with a mental shrug. "This is a fascinating burines."

That fascination, for Ken, includes the country music industry as a whole. Although radio continues to be his main road through that land, the side roads continue to drow him owoy from time to time. During one of his pilgrimoges to Noshville, Ken made the acquaintonce of Razzy Boiley, and the two found they had a lot in common—they come from the same orea of the coutrry, liked the same style songs, thought a lot alike. So, in 1984 Ken set off once more, this time really on the road—with Razzy os his road manager. During those months the two co-wrote "Modern Doy Marriages."

Ken "thoroughly enjoyed" the touring life, but (surprise, surprise) his heart was still with radio, and when port-owner of WPNX Jim Martin asked him to come back to the station as p.d. ond m.d., Ken went along willingly. His knowledge of country music—as a sangwriter and producer—hos grown as he troversed life's musical highways, and the affects can be seen in the success WPNX has had under Ken's directorship. The station's ratings have increased from 3.5 to 12.5 since he took total control of the wheel.

If you think Ken's interstate life is over, however, think agoin. "I know the day will come when I will move to Noshville," Ken soys. "I'm more creotive when I'm oround creotive people, and my goal is to live in Nashville ond be a songwriter and producer."

Well, Ken, looking of the ol' 7-year clock on the wall, 1980 was when you started on your lost venture. You know, 1987 is looming just over the next hill...



JIM PATRICK—Music Director KSO—Des Moines, IA

Jim Patrick has learned a bunch during his six years in the business of radio. He's worked with an album rock format, MOR/country and automated rock (at the same time), back to rock and roll and on to country in the time spon of a half dozen years.

"My first reol job was in Ames, lowo after I groduoted with a degree in rodio from the University of Wisconsin in Platteville," Jim reminisces. "KASI was the daytime AM station with an MOR/country crossover format and the FM, KCCQ, was a 20-hour outomoted rock and roll station. I worked 6 p.m. to 2 a.m., so in the summer I often worked both stations at the same time." (The AM went off air at sunset.) He only worked at the station four months, but it must have seemed like ten yeors. "I often thought," he soid with a laugh, "that it would be nice to work someplace where you only worked one station at a time."

KASI/KCCQ was not Jim's first experience in radio, however. From May to August of 1981, he and o hondful of other students ran the compus radio station in Platteville. Potrick speaks of WSUP with notable pride.

"It was the best compus station in Wisconsin," he says af the album-rock formatted statian. "Our grade A signal anly reached 11 miles, but our grade B signal was picked up in DeBuque 27 miles away. We placed third in Arbitron ratings in the DeBuque market."

After getting his toes wet at WSUP and receiving his triol by fire at KASI/KCCQ, Patrick took a port time job at KGGO, ploying rack and roll and eventually maving into a full-time overnight slot at the station. In September of 1983, he was affered an avernight shift on the station's country-formatted AM affiliate.

"I grew up listening to Top 40 and I knew

rock, so I had never really considered doing country," Patrick explains. "But I didn't seem to be getting anywhere. When a station plays 15 cuts in a row, there's not much of a chance to develop an on-air 'personality.' I realized that the country station would give me that opportunity, so I took the job. I'm very glad I did.

That was three years ago. In 1984 he was moved to the evening shift on KSO, and last July he was promoted to music director.

Patrick credits the station's success (it was the highest rated AM station in the U.S. last year) and his own growing knowledge about country music and the radio business to Jarrat Day, program director at KSO since 1978.

"If you look back," Patrick says proudly, "you'll see that the rise of KSO coincides with Jarrat's arrival. He took over a rock station on the decline and made it into a popular country station."

One of the learning tools handed to Patrick was the "Decade of Dust" program he now handles on the evening shift. On different nights he plays songs that were hot one particular year during the lost ten. "I've learned o lot about the bockground of country from that show," he says.

"We ploy traditional country on KSO," he continues. "Our audience is older,  $35\pm$ , and we cater to them.

"My job here is not to break new octs. Our oudience oppreciates new music, but 1 try it out first to see if it will work." Potrick adds, "It really makes no difference if it's major or indie; if it's good and it fits whot I'm doing, I'll play it."

Jim Patrick moy only have six years behind him in the rodio business, but he's put those years to good use. He's well on his woy, ond under the tutelage of Jorrat Day, he's olreody leorned the most important thing: to know his audience and what they want to hear.

# HE MOSS "CD WALLET": AN

DEA WHOSE TIME HAS COMEs no surprise that compact disc sales ive exceeded everyone's expectaons. As more CD plants go on-line, ailability, which has been a major intributing factor in keeping CD ices high, is starting to loosen and a od quality compact disc player can w be had for around \$100, yet the ost of the average CD (around \$13) is ill prohibitively high for the average merican music consumer. Ira Moss. resident of the Moss Music Group, independent distributor, has develped a new package for the compact sc, the "CD Wallet," a self-contained orage protector and marketing tool hich is cheaper to produce than all of ne components which comprise the urrent CD packaging—the jewel box nd its plastic insert, which is now being ackaged into a cumbersome clam shell r long box which the consumer romptly disposes of. "Comparing it to jewel box, the insert and the long box, ie difference is a minimum of a halfollar savings to the manufacturer," ys Moss. This, he says, translates to at east a \$2 savings at list price. "A jewel Mox is a very handsome, rigid and durale package, but this (the wallet) does <sup>34</sup>ne same trick and allows the consumer get into the price area of CD's." The D Wallet, constructed of durable woard, similar to traditional LP packagug, stores the CD in the a special proective plastic cloth, the same which actories use to ship them in, which fits ito the wallet. The package measures 5"x 1114" x 1/8" when displayed with a stiffener, which can be used to advertise catalog which is discarded after the package is opened. The wallet is onethird the thickness of the standard CD long box, making them lighter, and therefore cheaper to ship, display and warehouse. "Three of them will fit in the counter in the place of one long box," Moss explains, "so if you can only stock one 3'x5' table with CD's in the store, you can fit 1000 CD wallets, but you can only fit 350 in the jewel box in either of the long box configurations. You can ship five CD wallets for the price of shipping one CD jewel box.' When the consumer opens the wallet, there is ample room for liner notes, credits and an extra pocket for another CD. The wallet is then folded to 41/2"x 5", the same size as the jewel box, for easy storage. "From the consumer's point of view, this packaging is intended to offer a safe and adequate storage facility. It has considerably more liner notes than do most records, the package is not breakable, the CD can't fall out. It's like a double record jacket." While Moss acknowledges that a cosmetic comparison of the CD wallet with the jewel box is akin to "comparing a Cadillac with a Chevrolet," he emphasized that since the CD itself is a much more durable format than vinyl, the jewel box is not a necessity. Indeed, the wallet is actually more functional to the consumer and more cost effective for the manufacturer and the dealer. Moss. who won a NARM award for Marketing Achievement in 1983, for expanding

the base of the classical market relative to popularly priced cassettes, developed the wallet to differentiate Moss Music's new Vox Prima classical line since classical CD's are sorted out by composer making them "unbrowsable." "Since promotion is very expensive now, the most important thing for us is to get our merchandise segregated from the rest of the product by having unique packaging," says Moss. Since Moss has made the wallet available for licensing, sample wallets have been sent to all the major labels, manufacturers, and independents. Dealer reaction has been enthusiastic including retailing heavies Russ Solomon, (Tower Records), Barry Bergman (Record Bar) and Joe Bressi (Camelot). "We've had definite and specific interest from some of the independent labels, but the majors, with all of their various inabilities to make decisions are waiting to see what happens," says Moss. P-O-P displays are now in the stores with 25 CD titles which list for \$12.98, yet most retailers are selling them at \$9.98! He is concerned that his classical CD line may not be a true indicator since the classical target market is more affluent and don't mind paying for the "Cadillac." "They're (manufacturers) missing the boat by not going into pop right away. From a pop point of view, the wallet makes more sense." Moss says the wallet has only been shipping for two weeks and not all of the responses have been positive. "Some are very negative, to be honest, but out of 105 responses, 91 said they would look for more product and see a catalog," he says, but more interestingly, "a number of them said, if this packaging is what brings the price down, we're all for it. We recognize that if we went out at the same price as a jewel box, we wouldn't stand a chance." In an informal Shop Talk poll, I found that CD aficionados who purchased their players early on, many to satisfy their audiophile needs, tended to be stuck on the "high-tech" aesthetics of the jewel box. Since the prices of the units have dropped, however, the complexion of the CD buyer is rapidly changing. Newer player owners, I found, are all for the package if it reduces prices. Being a member of the CD elite corps myself, I was skeptical about the CD wallet, yet when all the benefits are weighed, it won me over. For me, the extensive liner note area and the ease of removing the disc from the plastic pouch instead of wrestling it off of the plastic insert inside the jewel box are important benefits, but the prospect of paying \$10 instead of \$13-\$16 for a CD is particularly convincing, especially when statistics say I'll purchase about 50 of these addictive polycarbonate discs per year. In sum, the CD wallet is a not only a viable alternative to current CD packaging, it could be a catalyst for CD sales for the industry and make the CD more accessible to the average consumer. "After all," says Moss, "they're not buying a package. They're buying the music.

THAT OLD JACKSON MAGIC—What would a Michael Jackson extravaganza be without a "making of" piece to follow it? Now that Captain Eo, Jackson's hi-tech, multi-million dollar 3-dimensional music movie has been released to the public via

Disneyland and Disney World, beginning November 18, viewers of The Disney Channel will get a glimpse of how the dazzling 17-minute film was made. The hour-long documentary, called The Making Of Disney's Captain Eo, is hosted by Whoopi Goldberg, who takes us on a somewhat humorous, technically interesting look at what it took to put the project together. Goldberg seems a little out of her element as host of a Disney program, straining, as she does, against her notorious irreverence. But the show is an enjoyable tour, nonetheless, showing Jackson, executive producer George Lucas and director Francis Coppola in the process of creating a mini-epic, designed to chill and thrill Disney audiences. Multi-layer optical effects, elaborate make-up techniques, choreography, 3-D cinematography and other trials, including dance auditions and rough drafts of the cartoon-like co-stars (some of which are costumes peopled by midgets), all are examined here, right up to the film's premiere at Disneyland, where slews of celebrities were on hand. Jackson may have become one of pop music's most eccentric off-stage personalities in recent years, but he's still an amazement when he's on. This documentary provides a side-view of the energy of a Jackson camera performance. Also seen are Angelica Houston being made-up for her role as the Witch

Queen (a four-hour process), **Dick Shawn** as Jackson's space commander, and behind-the-scenes views of choreographer **Jeffrey Hornaday** (Flashdance, A Chorus Line), theatre and costume consultant **John Napier** (Cats), lighting and photographic consultant **Vittorio Storaro** (Apocalypse Now) and art director **Geoffrey Kirkland** (The Right Stuff).

HOME VIDEO REVIEW: Shatttered . . . If Your Kid's On Drugs -MCA Home Video - \$24.95 For concerned parents who live in a glass bubble, this tape could come in mighty handy. "What's wrong with Rick? Why's Kim acting so strangely? They skipped out on lunch at the country club! How could they?" Well, mom, well, pop, seems your little namesakes were off getting buzzed in the woods and you should see their friends! Not exactly the sort of young people you'd want to invite to your daughter's coming out party. Not at all . . . If this scenario hits home with you, then so will Shattered . . . If Your Kid's On Drugs, a well-acted, but hopelessly naive look into the lives of two very white, very conventional families (one upscale, the other middle-class), lost in the peril of teenage drug addiction. The cast is strong. The script, uninspired. Burt Reynolds and Judd Nelson make special appearances as a Greek chorus-ish Tweedledee and Tweedledum, who arrive on the scene in their pick-up truck to impart annoyingly banal commentary. But then, this is the stuff of high school Health classes, not high drama, and includes useful information on where families can go for help with their drug problems. It appears to have been devised to give "nice," Reagan-age parents something they can relate to, and in its white-washed, simplified view of their plight, there arises one nagging question: where were these people in the 60's? Shattered treats the drug issue as if the last 20 years never happened, and repeats the exact same scenarios one would expect to have found circa 1970. That drug abuse remains a mystery to these parents is a mystery to me, and doesn't say much for their powers of observation. Shattered lends further credence to the axiom, "Those who forget the past are condemned to repeat it."

DAT equipment is expected to be available in the United States sometime in 1987.

The copy-code system, developed by the CBS Technology Center, requires placement of a copy-code chip in recording equipment, which would prevent that equipment from replicating copyrighted recordings that are compatibly encoded during the mastering process.

The RIAA has joined members of the Senate in its crusade for copy-coding of DAT equipment. About the upcoming negotiations, Gortikov said, "We expect to approach our Japanese conferees constructively and hopefully. A vital synergism exists between our industries and products. Despite his positive feelings about fusion, Stanley Clarke says that he is none-too-impressed with the current crop of fusion bands. He goes to clubs in L.A., where he resides, and he finds himself yawning. Flash, he thinks, is replacing substance.

"I have a feeling it has something to do with the fact, to be point blank about it, that the guys don't practice like we practiced. I just know that they don't, I can tell. I've taught a lot of bass players and I can look at a musician and tell when they've spent more time on their equipment. It sounds to me, when I got to these clubs, that I'm hearing four individuals that kind of just walked off the street from different locations and started playing. There's some semblance of something happening, but they just didn't play enough together.

"It's funny, I can't even blame the musicians, totally. There just ain't enough time to figure out how to put a whole Midi system together, and get that going, and then practice, really practice, in one day. We had shitty equipment back then, but we used to practice 10 hours a day. Religiously, every day."

The "back then" Stanley refers to is the early '70s, the glory days of fusion; the "we" is Return To Forever—Chick Corea, Al DiMeola, Lenny White, and Stanley Clarke. If Clarke and DiMeola and White

have their druthers, Return To Forever will return to performing—and show these young fusion whippersnappers a thing or

"Lenny and AI and I are ready to go," says Stanley. "We are definitely going to tour. We're just waiting on a few little things in Chick's head, which I think will be real easy to solve, and we're going to go.

"When we got together for the last reunion, I had to stop everything that I was doing: I couldn't produce anybody, I couldn't see my family, I was constantly doing interviews, touring and rehearsing. It reminded me of when I was 19 or 20 and basically all I used to think about was music. So it's nice. That would actually, for me, be kind of an icing on the cake that would help propel this instrumental thing seriously into the '90s. RTF could do it real easy."

In the meantime, Stanley will hit the road with his own ensemble, finish producing flutist James Walker's classical fusion LP, and begin preparing the follow-up to "Hideaway," which he says will "probably be more along the lines of some of the more creative songs on that album." However, don't look for it to contain Stanley's best bass playing.

"I'm not as serious about albums as some people are," he says. "I think a lot of jazz musicians are like that, because you usually play your better stuff live anyway. I've never been, and probably never will be, captured on a record."

more important to eager fans. "We haven't heard people griping," said Chronis. "At this point, they want to get the album and they're enjoying just being able to get it." Indeed, there were reports of a fist fight between two customers over a final copy at a local Tower Records store.

Steve Kall, who owns an independent onestop, Pacific one-stop, said he had ordered 14,000 units which was enough to service his stores. "I had enough for all my accounts. I bought enough product that I thought it would last through December," says Kall, who ended up selling much of his product to Licorice Pizza, not one of his usual accounts. "Even though it only lasted one day, I'd still have some product today if it wasn't that the major chains needed it."

Many stores took pre-orders from cus-tomers. The Studio City Music Plus store led the chain in preorders with a total of 206. "It's been crazy," said clerk and selfconfessed Springsteen fan, Michael Zorek, getting them out and getting the preorders in alphabetical order has been a real project. We guarantee a copy will be here for them.' Zorek said the phone was constantly ringing with people asking, "Is it in?" "We say, yeah, it's in.' They don't even ask for Springsteen and everyone knows what they're talking about," he laughed. Zorek was so enthusiastic about the release, he had handed out copies of the song list a friend had acquired to customers days before the release. "We had it before Wherehouse and Tower," he said proudly.

Tower Records on Sunset Boulevard, in West Hollywood had 20 people and several news crews waiting before they opened. Howard Krumholtz, buyer for the location, said, "95 percent came in to buy Bruce. I can't say 100 percent because I just say someone buy a Judas Priest album." The store had stocked about 1,000 LP sets, 800 cassette boxes, and 500 CD boxes.

Also during Kwiker's tenure, Wherehouse has seen tremendous growth in new store openings, from 126 in 1983 to 190 today. Kwiker also initiated a unique stock ownership plan that has become a model for other industries.

Kwiker couched his acceptance in a message to students, some of whom were on hand to accept scholarships. "In selecting a career," Kwiker advised, "choose a company that's growing." He went on to include innovativeness, hustle and ethics as quali-



#### **MUSIC'S MIGHTY MISSION**

#### By Phil Driscoll

Music is powerful. It stirs emotions and reaches the senses in a way that nothing else can. It is a universal communicator.

In I Samuel, the Bible gives the account of King Saul, who was under a spirit of oppression. When young David played music for the monarch, Saul's heaviness was relieved. That force is still at work through music today.

In order to fully understand its vast potential it is necessary to define music's mission as it relates to the gospel of hope. Music can be used to actually penetrate areas where the church cannot reach. Missions is going to Honduras, The Philippines and Africa. By the same token it is reaching a kid in the ghetto or even the man who is depressed, fearful and full of guilt as he sits in his Rolls Royce in Beverly Hills. They all need Jesus. Music is the one thing that could potentially touch their world with hope.

Through travelling overseas, we've seen evidence that music actually transcends economic, political, social, geographic and even denominational borders. At a recent anti-drug rally in Tegucigalpa, the capitol city of Honduras, the power of God was unleashed through music and literally hundreds of lives were transformed. That is the potential before us.

On the home front there are many challenges to be addressed. Recently the plague of drug abuse has begun to receive national attention. Drugs have truly taken a toll on this nation and there is a vital role music can play in reversing this trend by taking a grass roots approach to reaching those in the grips of addiction as well as informing those who might be tempted.

In "Just Say No," and anti-drug single released by The Benson Company and Mighty Horn, we are attempting to reach out to the world in their vernacular: music. A Christian version of the song pointing to Jesus as the alternative to drugs will be sent to gospel stations nationwide

while a second version, geared for secular radio, without the blatant gospel message, states "There's a better way to fly than drugs." Both renditions will be promoted nationally; however, the mission potential of this single goes far beyond radio airplay.

The message included in this song could reach the homes of millions through a cooperative effort between the music industry and responsible corporations. Imagine if a company included 45 RPM sound sheets of this song on the back of cereal boxes or on top of pizza cartons, in a magazine or even with a six pack of beer. The slogan on such a package might read, "ABC Pizza Cares For the Family-Say No To Drugs." The public service message could have profound impact on the homes it enters through that distribution. The company who makes the effort to publicize this positive message would also benefit from a boost in company image.

As opportunities continue to present themselves to gospel musicians and more is learned about the world-changing power that is made available through the medium of musical expression, we must work to forge ahead and pioneer new ways to reach the vast mission field before us.

It's been awhile since we've heard from Evie, but this album was worth the wait. Her accomplished vocals have only improved, her songs strengthened. In fact, each song on here may become your favorite as you hear them. She sings with much conviction on "United We Stand" (a duet with Pelle Karlsson.) Karlsson's strong lyrics stand out on the title cut and "Another Angel In The Sky." (Listen for the cosmic production sounds on "Another Angel.") Evie's sweet power comes to the forefront on "Make Straight The Way For The Lamb Of God''and "Winter To Spring."



With a clap of thunder, the stage is set for a dramatic, storm-tossed rendition of "Halleluiah." The production techniques are definitely effective and well placed. And you know, "There's Nothing Wrong With Being Right" (another good one). More than anything, "You've Got To Trust Somebody." Okay, all cleverness aside, another goodie on here is Candy's version of "Oh It Is Jesus," a favorite chorus of many churches. The energetic congregational harmonies and simple piano instrumentation on the cut stir up some old-time memories.
