

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

Atlantic "Restructures" Jazz Division, Snyder Out As Chief

brtly after becoming head of the jazz on last spring, Snyder told *Cash Box* /'86): "Originally Ahmet Ertegun wanted me to produce crossover records—records that were so-called commercial records, records that would bring in a substantial return on the investment. But, after the first month, he said, 'Look, you just do three records and we'll see what you can do. If they work out, then we'll go beyond that."

The three records Snyder made under that mandate—LPs by guitarists Stern and Bullock and saxophonist Chris Hunter—had disappointing sales. In addition, Snyder supervised the 15 record "Atlantic Jazz" set and a recently released album by saxophonist David "Fathead" Newman. Other recent Atlantic jazz offerings—by Steve Slagle, Lionel Hampton, Dizzy Gillespie, and the Mel Lewis Jazz Orchestra (the last three Grammy nominees)—were outside productions that the label acquired as finished masters.

Atlantic has had an on-again, off-again relationship with jazz since the label was founded. As of early last week, if looks as if, for the time being, it's mostly off-again.

DAT Grabs Attention At Winter CES

LOS ANGELES — At the 15th annual Winter Consumer Electronics Show (CES), held this year January 8-11 in Las Vegas, a star of the massive convention was the controversial digital audio tape (DAT) technology.

Several major manufacturers exhibited, including Sony, who displayed a prototype Componant Recorder, while other major companies, for undisclosed reasons, decided not to exhibit their DAT capabilities.

One of those reasons could be increasing pressure from within the record industry to postpone the availability of DAT, a technology that affords high-quality digital recording, which industry hanchos feel will promote the pirating of pre-recorded music, and greatly diminish gains forseen from the ever-expanding CD market. Music business brass want marketing of DAT delayed until anti-piracy devices are installed in all DAT recorders to prevent taping of commercially recorded music. Leaders from the record industry and the Japanese electronics indus-

try reached a stalemate over this issue when they met in Vancouver December 11.

Exhibition of DAT at this year's Winter CES was timid in comparison to Japan's electronics show, held in October. While only a handful of companies exhibited the technology in Las Vegas, the Japanese show featured 18 companies displaying DAT.

A spokesman from the Consumer Electronics Group, organizers of the annual summer and winter electronics conventions, considered the world's largest trade shows, said the Consumer Electronics Group takes no stand on the issue, but commented that "if CD is the turntable of the future, DAT is the tape." The spokesman also noted that pricing for first generation DAT hardware is prohibitive to the mass market, falling somewhere between \$1,000 and \$2,000, while the tapes themselves are also expensive, costing roughly \$12.

Lipman Survey Yields Interesting Results

LOS ANGELÉS – Macey Lipman Marketing, an independent retail promotion firm whose clients include Madonna, Bon Jovi, and Lionel Ritchie, has released their fourth annual "State Of The Business" year-end survey which concluded that retailers generally enjoyed an "upswing" in overall sales for this past holiday season.

The survey information, an informal summarization of retail dealer responses to nine basic questions and specific dealer quotes, was compiled Monday, December 29th from approximately 170 retail record and video stores nationwide including racks, one stops, large and small chains and independent stores, both mall and free-standing. The report is sent to most industry executives for perusal by the beginning of the year.

"It's for free," says Macey Lipman, president of the firm. "We do it so that everybody comes in the first day after new year's and there it is on their desk."

Ranging from general percentage questions as far as volume, CD impact, vinyl sales, single sales to usage and response to the 4x12 cassette box and music video, many of the responses were unusual.

In past surveys, weather was always cited as a factor affecting sales, yet this year was "the first year in four that weather was not a negative factor in determining business. In fact, it probably contributed to the positive attitude of record consumers." Record Bar mall stores reported that rain brought consumers in and Camelot and Great American stores said it was "just cold enough to inspire shopping" and that the weather was "just right."

Of the stores surveyed, 49.9 percent are using the controversial 4x12 cassette box, while 50.6 percent are not. "4x12 was interesting," says Lipman. "From a marketing point of view and a display point of view, I thought it would be a good thing because cassettes are so tiny and they don't display and merchandise well in stores. I found, for the most part, the stores hate them. they're not like album jackets, They're disposable. Once you open it up and get the cassette out, you throw the box away and it's a

Fixturing the stores for the longbox and security were major concerns, yet Lipman explained the most peculiar one with regard to the longbox. "The most blatant thing we came across in this box business is so stupid that I can't believe it," he laughs. "Nobody put 'AUDIOCASSETTE' on the box, so that the consumer doesn't know what the hell is in the box. He's used to seeing a Norelco box. They should have big letters across the top!"

In a recent piece in Los Angeles Times Calendar section, Patrick Goldstein said that "CD fever disguised the fact that the industry had another mediocre year. Sales were expected to remain in 1985 levels, but profits were up, largely because CDs are priced considerably higher than cassettes or LPs." Lipman's survey acknowledged the impact of CDs but still contended that the industry had a healthy crop of hit product in spite of the CD success. "I disagree with Patrick Goldstein. I think he was looking at all the negatives," says Lipman. "If you take a look at all the artists that were selling last year and how well they were doing, we had a fantastic year. Aside from the fact that there was CD, just the fact that you had 15 (continued on page 24)

Celebrity D.J.'s To Host Local **NARAS Grammy Listening** Session

LOS ANGELES – The Los Angeles Chapter of the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences will host their 10th annual listening party for L.A. Chapter NARAS members at Motown's nostalgic Hittsville recording studio on January 22 and 23 starting at 7:00 p.m.

The event, open to the Recording Academy's voting members only, will feature several celebrity D.J.'s spinning the nominated discs at the listening session including Lamont Dozier (veteran producer/songwriter), Thelma Houston, Dr. Demento, Sue Raney (a jazz vocal nominee this year), and Rodney Bingenheimer of KROQ.

Al Schlesinger, president of the L.A. Chapter says, "This is a radical departure from the past years' events, we're very proud to have such celebrity guests hosting this year's event." In addition to the music selections, selected nominated videos will be seen. Other celebrity D.J.'s include Johnny Magnus (KMPC), Bill Moran (KGIL), and Jerry House (KLAC).

WEA International Makes Changes

LOS ANGELES - Seigfried E. Loch, president, WEA Europe, announced the resignation of Hans Tonino from the post of managing director, WEA Netherlands, and his replacement by Ted Sikkink, who assumes the same position. Sikkink will handle the post simultaneously with his duties as managing director, WEA Belgium.

According to Loch, the transition occurs with Tonino's decision to leave the Dutch company after more than a decade of service to pursue "other challenging goals." During his last five years of tenure as managing director, he led the affiliate in a dramatic pattern of market-share growth; he also served on the local boards of both the IFPI and its Edison Foundation. Loch says that "Hans Tonino has an impressive record of achievement at WEA Netherlands where he has been strongly involved in marketing, A&R, promotion, and the development of artists like Dolly Dots, Normaal and Gerard Joling. We react to his departure with regret and wish him success in his future endeavors.

Sikkink, who continues to serve as managing director, WEA Belgium, a post he has held for six years, has worked within the WEA organization since 1975, when he was hired as product manager, Atlantic Records, at WEA France. Two years later, he

was promoted to General Manager, WEA Belgium, a post he held until his appointment as deputy managing director of the company in 1979. In 1980 he was named managing director. Prior to his association with WEA. Sikkink worked with Radio Luxembourg's publishing companies, and with EMI Belgium, then a licensee for WEA product in that territory.

In other WFA International news, senior vice president Kieth Bruce announced the company's creation of a U>S.-based Latin music division, to be known as WEA Latina which will be headquartered in Burbank, California. WEA Latina will handle sales, marketing, and promotional activities in support of U.S. releases by WEA International's growing roster of foreign and domestic-based Latin artists.

Bruce also announced the appointment of Maximo Aguirre to director of operations for WEA Latina. Aguirre most recently established Ariola's Latin division in the U.S.. He was previously manager, international promotion for Latin America, based in Mexico City for Ariola. His earlier career included four years as promotion manager at Discos CBS in Argentina after which he joined Michophon, serving as international label manager in Mexico

Turtles Obtain Injunction Against Dutch Firm

LOS ANGELES - Mark Volman and Howard Kaylan, the two principles of musical acts The Turtles and Flo and Eddie, have obtained an injunction in United States District Court in Los Angeles against RecTrack (USA), Inc., RecTrack Nederland, b.v. and Wilhelm Mittrich. The Dutch company and its U.S. arm have been enjoined to discontinue distributing unauthorized sound recordings of The Turtles.

The original complaint was filed March 5, 1986 claiming violation of California Civil Code Section 980 (a) (2). This was followed by a request for a preliminary injunction which was filed December 11, 1986. The court's order of injunction was handed down December 22, 1986. Plaintiffs in the case were listed as Flo And Eddie, Inc., Mark Volman and Howard Kaylan. Defendents listed in the complaint are RecTrack (USA), Inc., RecTrack Nederland, b.v., Wilhelm Meitrich and Flash Records. "At the time of filing, plaintiffs had information that defendants were selling these illegal phonorecords in California and elsewhere through independent record distributors," according to the memorandum filed for the injunction.

The pirated titles allegedly are flooding the market in California. The sound recordings under scrutiny included "The Turtles-20 Greatest Hits," "20 Sweet Memories," "20 Raiders of the Old Charts," "20 All Time Golden Hits," "Those Were the Days, 28 Hits of the Sixties, Vol 1," "Those Were the Days, 28 Hits of the Sixties, Vol 2," "Do You Love Me-20 Golden Love Songs," "The California Sound of the 60's" and "20 Great Oldies, Vol 8."

The injunction was handed down by United States District Judge Mariana R. Pfaelzer.

Frank Zappa: Still Doing It His Way

Zappa.

Most seem to know the name. Some, a strong cult following, know and love the music, and many now know this enigmatic musician, composer as the sharp, articulate spokesman who spoke at federal and state congressional hearings as a defender against a dangerous move toward pop-music music censorship which has been spearheaded by the likes of the religious right and the PMRC, known as the "Washington Wives."

With the release of Zappa's latest album, "Jazz From Hell," a collection of instrumental compositions including "G-Spot Tornado" and "Damp Ankles," mostly created on the Synclavier, a state-of-the-art electronic computer/keyboard instrument capable of generating a melange of synthesized sounds as well as digitally recorded samples of "real sounds," this LP brings his total number of intensely personal recordings to almost 50 (over 50 if you count double albums). Released on his own Barking Pumpkin label, he still maintains total creative control of his projects.

Fans should delight that Rykodisc, a CDonly company, has released eight recordings which draw from many different periods of his career.

Zappa is an indefatigable, somewhat controversial, prolific artist whose hard-to-categorize, innovative music, ranging from vaudevillian vulgarisms to modern abstract instrumentals, has been highly influential. While his styles, which draw upon a juxtaposition of rock, jazz and classical music, have changed over the years since his first release in 1966, "Freak Out," with the Mothers Of Invention, Zappa has always followed his own musical instincts and "Jazz



From Hell" is no exception. Although he is known for his delectable guitar work and humorous vocal incantations, he is now able to compose and record the orchestral, instrumental compositions which had mostly eluded him until the technology that the Synclavier offers arrived.

He recently gave a demonstration of the capabilities of the Synclavier at the Audio Engineer's Convention at the Los Angeles Convention Center where he entertained a packed crowd in an unusually small room with his usual entertainingly glib witticisms. "Let the people in and let them watch it (the Synclavier computer) load," he quipped after a rather long line began forming outside before his demonstration.

James Mtume Scores With The Native Son Soundtrack

NEW YORK — To get the right ambience for the interview, James Mtume suggested we lock ourselves in the bathroom.

"We're in the bathroom now," said Mtume. "You've got to be honest in the bathroom."

And the honesty started flowing like water from a faucet as I took my seat on the toilet and Mtume leaned up against the bath tub.

"On television, name one black show that's not a comedy," said the Grammyaward winning composer. "You've got ten seconds."

Indeed, we went down the list and we couldn't name a single one. The point he was making is that in feature films and on television programs blacks are virtually shut out from serious drama and are only featured in comedic roles. Mtume sees this as a major problem, and it's one of the reasons he was attracted to composing the sound-track for the film *Native Son*, a drama based on Richard Wright's classic novel about racial crime and punishment in the 1930's.

"The interesting thing about me having the opportunity to score *Native Son* is that it's only the second time they've given a black composer full scoring rights to do what they want in a serious movie — other than Quincy Jones," he said.

The taut, atmospheric pieces Mtume wrote for the MCA soundtrack album are a departure from the more accessible sound he has been known for in the past. Mtume

eschewed conventional methods and preconceptions about film music for *Native Son*, and consequently it is somewhat different other film scores

"I said, what can I do on a film score that's gonna make my stuff different from the stuff that pisses me off from all the other composers who are staid and stale," he said. "You've got guys who do the same thing for every movie because nobody gets on them about it."

First, he decided to compose the whole thing on a Fairlight, instead of using an orchestra. Then he went hunting for sounds to sample.

"I went to a tenement house in Brooklyn and paid the maintenance guy to turn on his furnace," he said. "And I sampled the sound and fed it into my computer."

"Then I took broken glass, threw it against the wall and sampled the sound. I sampled my heartbeat. I sampled fingernails down a blackboard. Then I put a kind of Hitchcock string thing on top of the broken glass, the heartbeat and the furnace," he said, tapping the side of the bath tub.

The relentless tension of the score is broken only by two songs, one of them sung by Stephanie Mills and the other one written and performed by a rap newcomer named Woody Rock. The rap song, "Bigger's Beat," is reminiscent of Grandmaster Flash and The Furious Five's "The Message," which is exactly what Mtume was looking



NEW FACES TO WATCH

"It sounded like a really good name for a band," explains Rob Vandeven, one half of the Lucy Show. "It was originally a bit of a laugh and it stuck."

Fellow Canadians Vandeven, who plays bass, and Mark Bandola, who plays guitar and Keyboards, are the nucleus of the band whose first album, "Undone," received rave critical reviews, largely appealing to the alternative/college crowd in America.

On their new LP, "Mania," the Lucy Show continue and improve their guitar textured sound. "It's quite a bright sound, and tuneful as well," says Vandeven. "We go very much for melody and harmony in our music, but the songs are first and foremost before the sound. I suppose we are singer/songwriters dare I say."

Vandeven and Bandola, friends since high school, grew up in Calgary, Alberta where they acquired a penchant for melody listening to the Beatles, the Monkees and the Beach Boys.

"My parents gave me piano lessons at the age of five for about four years," says Bandola. "All that time I really hated playing the piano and the thought of being forced to play music, but as soon as the lessons stopped, I started composing my little tunes on the piano and when pop music became more important to me I became interested in learning guitar like most little boys would and from what I learned on piano, I sort of taught myself to play guitar. I'm still grateful to my parents for making me go through that hellish experience of piano lessons."

Vandeven, who had no formal musical training, learned how to play the bass with help from Mark and just "learning onstage." Vandeven recalls his childhood. "I used to have these wooden cutouts of guitars. My brother did the sawing and they looked really good with little strings painted on with felt pen. We pretended we were the Beatles."

When Bandola went to art school in London for a couple years, Vandeven followed for an "extended holiday" and stayed as well. Eventually, the two formed the Lucy Show, generating quite a stir with their first single "Leonardo Da Vinci," which landed them a record contract.

Although both have similar vocal styles resulting in the smooth harmonies which characterize their sound, they prefer to write their songs separately, yet arrangements are often done

Steve Winwood: Living The High Life

After a brief stint with Ginger Baker's "Airforce," Winwood began work on a solo album, but rejoined Traffic, thus the album became "John Barleycorn." Traffic had a revolving set of musicians until 1974, when Winwood decided to call it quits. He'd been playing with bands since he was fifteen and was suffering from bouts of peritonitis and he wanted to slow down. After working on various session projects in 1976 - including a period with Japanese percussionist Stomu Yamashta, keyboardist Klaus Shulze and Santana drummer Mike Shrieve in the band "Go," Winwood, began delving into solo work which would yield sporadic, yet brilliant LPs over the coming years.

"It wasn't because I thought that I'd played with all these people and now I didn't need to play with them anymore," Winwood said. "It was a continuation of what might be described as the same idle curiosity. I wondered what it might be like to play with no one. It was against a lot of odds that I did it, as well as a lot of advice, but I had the feeling I could do something worthwhile."

The result has been only four solo albums over the past 10 years, yet he has steadily produced quality, personal works which show him gaining momentum. In 1977 came "Steve Winwood," in 1979 "The Arc of a Diver," an all-solo studio performance which produced the single "While You See A Chance," a lilting soul-pop creation which reached #3 on the U.S. charts. In 1982 came another all-solo effort "Talking Back To The Night."

"I did make those two records, "Arc" and "Back To The Night," completely alone. It was very educational and fulfilling in many ways, and it was in some ways self-indulgent. I could probably have gotten some other players to do some of the things I was doing, and a little bit better too. But then again, it could have been a little different. So I felt the experiment was justified. It (continued on page 22)

EAST COASTINGS

EVERYTHING BUT The Girl is croon and swoon for an aging baby boom generation that craves 'adultpop' but hates A/C. Their sound is closer to Aztec Camera or mid-sixties AM-radio bands like The Foundations and Keith than the proto-jazz and pre-rock some might mistake it for. Tracey Thorn and Ben Watt form the singing/songwriting core of the group, and at the Ritz (Dec. 11) they put on a fresh and engaging show. Most of the set consisted of songs from their new album, "Baby, The Stars Shine Bright" (their third for Sire) - and did they ever shine bright: "Don't Leave Me Behind" had an arm-out-the-window breeziness, "Come On Home" was plaintive and earthy, and all the tunes were shot through with an endearing innocence. They also turned in some inspired covers, notably a heart-tugging "You're Always On My Mind" and Elvis Costello's "Almost Blue." But the high point was "Don't Let The Teardrops Rust Your Shining Heart," which was so elegant and simple and warm that it turned this excellent concert into

LONE JUSTICE is in a sophomore slump these days, having released a second album that's not as good as its debut. The band's recent show at the Ritz was also not as good as the show they gave there the year before (Sept. '85) and part of the reason is that vocalist Maria McKee is the only remaining original member of the band. The other reason is that much of their new material isn't that great, and she seems to overcompensate for this by getting shrill and manic on stage.

Still, Lone Justice, even in its present configuration, plays bar band rock 'n' roll convincingly and tunefully. McKee breaks hearts on ballads like "Wheels" ("Shelter"LP/Geffen) and "You Are The Light ("Lone Justice" LP/Geffen), and barely contains her abandon on rave-ups like "Sweet Sweet Baby (I'm Falling)." But where at '85's show she came across like an updated Janis Joplin - putting such vocal intensity to "Cry Baby" that the audience interrupted the song mid-way with spontaneous applause - at this show she just seemed jittery and overstated. Instead of Joplin, we got a mis-matched cover of "Sweet Jane," and instead of spontaneity, McKee was grandstanding to the MTV cameras filming the show. Though I still believe in the promise of Lone Justice, it probably won't be fulfilled before the next album and tour. CONCERTS IN BRIEF - After an 18-month performing hiatus, ex-Individual Glenn Morrow, fronting Rage To Live, recently made his long-awaited return to the stage with a sold-out gig at Maxwells'. Word has it that Morrow gave a knock-out show, and that more gigs are being planned, so stay tuned. Meantime, check out his "Rage To Live" album if you haven't already (Bar None Records; P.O. Box 1704; Main Post Office; Hoboken, N.J. 07030; Tel.: 201-795-4785)....The Beastie Boys, whose "Licensed To Ill" album (Def Jam/Columbia) is gaining extraordinary acclaim, followed a recent Ritz gig by entertaining the semi-black-tie throngs at MTV's New Year's Eve ball. Shooting beer and lyrics into the audience, The Beasties did a chaotic and spirited "Fight For Your Right" and "No Sleep Till Brooklyn," putting across more intensity and attitude than any of the other worthy players that night.....The Georgia Satellites, also on the MTV bill, opened for Jason and The Scorchers at the Ritz recently and had everybody singing along to "Keep Your Hands To Yourself," which is going a long way toward making this band a household name among AOR/MTV addicts. The rapid development of this band since their N.Y. debut Oct. 5 has been awesome, and their current gig supporting Bob Seger should widen their appeal. After the

THE HOUSEMARTINS

The Housemartins, who built their image on the ugliest boy next door, were the Christmas number one with their acapella song "Caravan of Love."

For the video, shot in Union Chapel, North London, the Hull-based group acquired provocative new hairstyles. Their very ordinary cropped hair had the addition of a cross shaved into one side. This has offended members of the church.

The Archdeacon of Hull, the venerable Michael Vickers says, "I can see that some sensitive folk will find this offensive. It depends on the motivation, if they have set about to ridicule Christianity or not.

Their motivation seems to be very unclear. In the past, they have made vague claims that they are Marxist Christians. Now they are being very serious about it.

Their local vicar, Michael Vernon of St. John's, Newland, Hull, is very involved with Christian pop music in his area. He says, "1" ve heard of the Housemartins of course, but I haven't heard that they have anything to do with Christianity. I'm very up on the Christian pop scene in Hull and I know they have nothing to do with it. I'm not going to condemn them, but I'm sure there are better ways of expressing their beliefs than a ridiculous hairstyle.'

Hull's area Dean Edward Parkinson says, "I find it extremely offensive. It seems they want to draw attention to themselves as people, not for what they stand for.'

The general view seems to be that if the Housemartins wanted to wear a cross they could have worn one around their necks instead of this ghastly shaved addition to their hairstyle.

Main writer Stan Cullimore defends himself by saying, "Although we don't go to church, we've definitely got religious convictions. Christianity sounds a good idea to me, everyone looking after each other and believing in equality. We don't believe in the way the state has used religion as a means of oppression. Jesus Christ is a political figure. He kicked over the money lenders' tables, he must have been very left wing."

Now the Housemartins and their brand of left wing Christianity are faced with the dilemma of success. They are the pop stars that they have been criticizing for the past three years. Singer Paul Heaton says, "We did not start the group for the ego or money.

With the money from their first ad-

vance they sponsored a local junior football team, Housemartins F.C.. They say that despite their number one hit, it means nothing to them to be "top of the league of idiots." They claim they will never be pop stars with extravagant lifestyles and swimming pools in their back garden. The group's Norman Cook says, "We'd rather buy a public swimming pool. We will definitely put our money into something that will last longer than the band and will be for the community. The band will be finished in 10 years, and we want something that will last longer than that."

Personally, I hope the Housemartins could not possibly last for another 10 years, and I'm already dreading the spate of acapella songs that will be released next Christmas.



THE POGUES

On a more uplifting note, The Pogues played London's Hammersmith Palais recently. This tacky and sweaty venue was steeped in Irish green light. Seconds later a line of Pogues stretched across the stage and opened with the romping "Irish Rover." "Vocalist" Shane McGowan sneered under his black shades. The words came out fast and furious, while he stood bolt upright without moving except to draw from his bottle of Special Brew.

Only last week he announced he was drying out. Somehow I doubt if the bottle was just a pose and filled with Perrier.

There is nothing posey about the Pogues. They demonstrated their raw and unique treatment of traditional Irish-inspired songs. The pace changed from waltzy accordions and nostalgic whistles to songs like "The Sick Bed of Cuchulainn," where the crescendoes of mandola strings got the audience Pogue-going up and down.

In the sweltering heaat several of the mostly male crowd had stripped to the waist. They lolled and swayed like caricatures of their idols. "Dirty Old Town" was anthemic, with its melodies of trembling strings.

Shane's voice was frighteningly direct. Towards the end, his heavy rasping breath fuzzed into the microphone. The counterpart to his decadent charm is Spider Stacey, who was perky, slick and shrill on the clean-sounding tin whistle. The softer voice and plucky fiddle playing of Elvis Costello's bride Cait O'Riordan was sadly missed.

The final green light came down on the galloping encore "Jesse James" and a seasick "Botany Bay."

Japan

TOKYO - Results at major record retail outlets in Japan for the year-end selling season (called the "bonus season" in Japan), were mixed, according to a survey conducted by Cash Box Tokyo. Some retailers reported even sales, while others were up as much as 10 percent. The period extends roughly from the end of November to the middle of December, CDs showed a dramatic increase which was offset by decreases in LP sales. Retailers reported strong traffic for the Christmas season. Big sellers for the period included Yumi Matsutoya, Kuwata Band, Hiroshi Itsuki, Kyoko Koizumi and Bruce Springsteen's boxed set.



Her performance style, riddled with quick- witted asides, further destroyed the fast deteriorating myth harbored by some detractors of country music that the genre is rife with simplistic, hillbilly humor - characterized by romps in that vein on shows like He-Haw, and with outrageously maudlin ballads - such as the Tammy Wynette hit, "D-I-V-O-R-C-E." Yates is as hip to the urban sensibility as she is to more basic life situations, singing with seemingly well-earned cynicism about degradation on the streets of Tinsel Town in a tune called "Hollywood, Let Me Go Home" (co-written with Lisa Nemzo), while serving up such warbling

country grabbers as a song entitled "Nothing Goes With A Heartache."

Yates' western and rock'n'roll influences are obvious enough. Several of the evening's songs were tinged with the mellow, southwestern strains identified with such artists as J.D. Souther and the Eagles, especially on certain of the gentler ballads. It was on these softer tunes where Yates' talent for getting her listener's heart strings throbbing shone through, especially with her lower register, a rich and vital aspect of her voice that provided added texture to many songs.

At the piano, Yates' set found its most convincing emotional edge. An engagingly plaintive ballad, "Hopeless Romantics Like Me," proved to be one of the evening's most engrossing.

While she proved herself a clever musician by performing solo, the absence of a band was a drawback on most tunes, especially those just begging for a slide guitar, and maybe even a fiddle. Her superb sonlywriting deserves that fuller sound. Vocallyyates carried the show remarkably well, though the addition of a back-up vocalist or two was also wanting on certain tunes.

Also unfortunate was the absence of her latest single, a breezy, upbeat country tune called "Let It Be Love."

Yates' strength as a solo performer, band or no band, was apparent in her show. A band would greatly enhance her sound, but by the same token it's refreshing to see a fresh-faced young artist who delivers well-written songs with all the direct audience communication that Yates exhibited here. Her future as an up-and-coming country act looks promising indeed, aided by her gutsy, rollicking sensibility and a gentle panchant for sweet country ballads.

ON JAZZI

THAT TIME AGAIN—Last year at this time I went into a whole harangue about the Grammy Awards. This year I've decided not to go into a whole harangue about the Grammy Awards. I've decided, for the most part, to ignore them. Although this year's jazz nominations are a scintilla better than last year's (thanks only to the fact that Sting didn't make another "jazz" album this year), the Grammy nominations still display a general lack of knowledge about current jazz record releases—the nominations only rarely represent the best records in each category. One quick example: Bobby McFerrin's "Spontaneous Inventions" (Blue Note) is, in one man's opinion, the finest jazz vocal album of the past two years. The Grammys do not include a nomination for "Spontaneous Inventions," but they don't ignore the brilliant McFerrin. They nominate a single track by him: the title tune from the "Round Midnight" soundtrack (Columbia) in the Best Jazz Vocal Performance, Male category. This is, in a word, hogwash. Enough said.

PAGING COLONEL NORTH—The Swiss Bank Corporation—that's right, the Swiss Bank Corporation—has journeved where few American banks have ventured: into the waters of jazz. Now, look, I'd expect the Swiss Bank Corporation to put its money up for yodelers and alphorns players - I'd expect Citibank and Chase Manhattan to fund iazz-but I'm certainly not complaining. The extraordinary Hat Hut record label was one beneficiary of the SBC's funds, and the extraordinary George Gruntz Concert Jazz Band was another. The Gruntz unit will receive the support for three international (that is, away from Switzerland) tours over the next three years: the U.S. this October (October 6-20), Asia in '88, and some lands as yet undisclosed in '89. Larry **Stanley** (212-580-4654) is handling the bookings for this year's tour.

SERIES' BUSINESS—The New York concert scene will, as usual, be enlivened by aral concert series' this winter and spring. First up is Sweet Basil's "Music is an Open Sky" festival which twice-a-year highlights some of the leading ensembles in what producer Horst Liepolt refers to as "today music." The festival starts this week and the line-up is: the String Trio of New York (1/20-21), Gerry Hemingway/ Mark Helias/Ray Anderson (1/22), The Group-Ahmed Abdullah. Marion Brown, Billy Bang, Sirone, Andrew Cyrille (1/23-24), Roger Kellaway (1/25), the Gil Evans Orch. (1/26), the Frank Gordon Quintet (1/27), the Rova Sax Quartet (1/28), the Ray Anderson Quartet (1/29), Sam Rivers' "Rivbea" Orchestra (1/30-31), and "Wind and Thunder Presents Yoruba Proverbs' (2/1).

Jack Kleinsinger's "Highlights in Jazz" series, which presents what could best be called "yesterday music" at NYU, offers a 12th Anniversary Gala with Al Cohn, Joe Newman, Carrie Smith, and others (2/12), a Salute to Maxine Sullivan with, among others, Milt Hinton, Doc Cheatham, and the lady of honor (3/12), "Dynamic Duos" showcasing Dave McKenna/Daryl Sherman, Gene Bertoncini/Michael Moore, and tapdancers Chuck Green and Ralph Brown (4/16), and "Bebop Spoken Here," including James Moody, Red Rodney, Jimmy Knepper, and Sheila Jordan (5/21).

And the newly spiffed-up and renamed Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall offers a contemporary jazz series—"today music" again—spotlighting Cecil Taylor (2/20), Julius Hemphill (3/27), and Don Cherry (5/1), as well as the Composer's Forum in a two-day "Ornette Coleman Celebration" (3/14-15).

Blues for Central Avenue is the name of an intriguing-sounding new film from Lois **Shelton** which documents the thriving L.A. jazz scene of the 1940s...Freshlyminted jazz books: Storyville to Harlem: Fifty Years in the Jazz Scene, a collection of Stephen Longstreet's drawings (\$27.95, Rutgers University Press) and La Tristesse de Saint Louis: Jazz Under the Nazis by Mike Zwerin (\$16.95, Beech Tree/Morrow). ri Campbell - MD BZZ B-94 - Pittsburgh, PA

n whot sounds like o modern-doy foiry tole the story of a determined, tolented young mon's rise to success in the competitive rid of CHR rodio. Lori Compbell of WBZZ/4 FM overcome o lot of obstacles before filing in her current position os music directlos the station. A modern doy Cinderello ry?... sort of. Lori started out on the hund floor of WBZZ and in less than five irs time hos chalked up numerous occombinents and won the respect of her peers.

Early on in life, Lori realized her goals and set out to make them a reality -"I've been interested in music since I was born... practically. So I thought radio would be a goad place to get into music. I storted out at B94 as on intern when I was 17. They didn't have an internship program then, they just knew that they needed someone to help them out around the station. So I came up here and asked 'Con I do onything free for you? I'll onswer phones, whatever you want me to do-I'll do it for free.' So they liked that, obviously."

Opportunities begon to come quickly, when the stotion initiated on internship program, Lori's experience made her the most likely condidate to be in charge of it - thus, she undertook the tosk of hiring and supervising all interns that possed through the stotion. Soon thereofter the stotion found itself with an opening for a research director - Lori assumed the responsibility (a position she still holds in addition to her other duties), and begon working full time and earned a slot on the company's payroll.

When the stotion found itself in need of o Music Director in September of 1985, Lori "pushed and pushed" to be given the opportunity. Her determination proved to be successful, and she soon found herself wearing the title of MD. "It was hard to prove to the

people that had been in the business for years that Lori Compbell deserved to be a music director." She recalls "... I think that I really come a long way and I am satisfied that I have earned the respect that I have from them now. They are finally looking at me like a MD and recognizing that I have the ability to do it."

Foced with this new chollenge, Lori wos not obout to sit oround idle. She ossumed the responsibilities of Music Director with o vigor "I work directly with the record people, I hove o lot of soy in whot we ploy, o lot of soy in our rototion. I oppreciate being given the chance to show what I can do." She participates in many of the stations concert promotions and she is constantly going to see live shows, leaving her very little free time. .. "I have one doy off o week," she sighs, "... and I'm thinking obout radio."

Compbell is very outspoken when the subject is rodio ond/or programming. She feels the clossic rock invosion "... is great, but stations should be coreful just how much of it they program" in order to avoid overkill. She foresees a strong resurgence of stroight ohead rock and roll in the year to come, predicting that "1987, from what we've seen from late '86... will see bonds like Cinderello and Bon Jovi topping the chorts." She also ocknowledges the strong response to donce

music to Pittsburgh's growing club scene, citing records by Stocey Q., Miomi Sound Mochine, and Jonet Jockson os examples. She feels that "... o lot of urban records have been breaking that maybe in the post wouldn't have - the club scene is definitely on important foctor here."

Lori will clock in five years of WBZZ this coming June, and it is certainly visible just how for she has come since her early days as an intern. Lori envisions o future in the music industry ". . . one doy down the line I would like to get into the 'record' end of it; octually working with bonds, doing A&R, monogement..." but for the time being, Lori is quite comfortable at WBZZ "I have no immediate plons to leave here, I love B94 and I love radio - so I'm reol hoppy here, it's o good place to work . I'm really reluctont to even think obout going someploce else, I often wonder if onother situation could be like this one - the people here ore great, they've given me a lat of support. People like Nick (Ferroro, B94's Program Director), gove me a lot of freedom to learn, thought I could do the job and really gove me o chonce to do it. I was given the opportunity to do whot I wont to do. "





COUNTRY PROFILES .



ROCKY McCUMBEE— Music Director WAMS—Wilmington, DE

WILMINGTON-Have you ever heard Racky McCumbee's voice? Booming over the microphone—or telephone? The mon is a natural radio personality. And his love far music, especially country music, is whot makes him such o notural far it. Currently the m.d. ot WAMS-Wilmingtan, Racky's infatuation with music began early. He started playing drums at o young oge, and by the time he was in high schaal (in his hametawn af Berkely Springs, West Virginia), he was granted special leave from school ta go on o USO taur af Europe and Japan with a country band. That's a pretty hefty tauring schedule far a teenager.

Nonetheless, the experience, along with his prowess as a musician, led to a music schalarship fram West Virginio University. But Rocky, marching ta the beat af his awn drum (did we really say that??!?), refused it. Seems he already had a firm idea of what he wanted ta da with his life—an idea that was already in the warks.

Rocky started in cauntry radio in 1967 as a weekend part-timer at hametown WCST while he wos still a freshman in high schoal. Later, as a juniar, he took a 7-11 p.m. shift, and then he took over the marning show from 6-9 a.m. before school. By the time the college schalarship was affered, Rocky had nat merely graduated from high school, but he'd accepted a full-time job at the station—

to do the saught-after morning show and ta do sales in the afternoan. He warked in this full-time capacity for three years.

He was then beckoned by WYII-Williomspart, MD, essentially a brand new statian, where he took over the morning show fram 5:45 a.m.-12:00. He also was p.d. and m.d. at that time, and stayed with WYII for o couple of yeors until the statian gat aff the ground. Meanwhile, back in Berkely Springs, WCST called for him ta came home. They mode him on offer that Rocky "cauldn't refuse," and he returned to the station, working as p.d./m.d. for four yeors.

WQCM, anather new statian, and once again in Moryland (Hagerstown), wos just gaing cauntry and they, too, wanted Racky. (He must've been gaining a reputation for getting stations off the ground!) He assisted the p.d. there for just aver a year, working the middoy shift. Having gotten that station going, he moved on to WEPM in Martinsburg, WVA, on AM country outlet with new awners (surprise, surprise), and was their p.d./m.d. for three years.

After oll this activity, and his jumping fram stotian to station, he took same time for himself, living in the Washingtan, D.C. area, where he did freelance radio and television production, and worked part-time for major stations in that market.

His wife Libby was from a town near Altoono, PA, so when an offer came fram WVAM, he taak it. Again he worked the morning show for a year and o holf, and olso wos p.d./m.d. (how unusual). During that time he was naminated for CMA's Disc Jockey of the Year for two consecutive years and reached the status af a small market finalist. He stoyed with WVAM until the station was sald in August of '86.

Finally (did yau think we were ever ganna get to this point?), he joined the staff at WAMS in Wilmington where he currently does—yau guessed it—the marning shaw, os well as handling m.d. duties. His "great friend" Bob Grayson serves as p.d. of the station.

What can we draw fram oll af this, besides the fact that Racky is a marning

person? Well, in 19 years af rodia he has never been without a job, and he never has had ta mave far from his home area. As o matter of fact, that's the very reason he decided ta go into rodio instead of being a musician—he wonted ta stay close to home. And country radia itself feels like hame ta Rocky. "I've met so many nice peaple the cauntry music industry," he says, "the promoters, the artists—it's like a big fomily working together for cauntry radia's odvancement."

As far his future aspirations, Racky would some day like to awn his awn cauntry rodio stotion. Considering all his experience in getting other people's stotions off the ground, it would seem to be o pretty realistic gool.

We wish him all the luck in the warld.

He wos college at the time, with one eye towar speech and teaching and the other to ward "anything in electronics," an rather than become crass-eyed, taak shot at rodioing, instead. Armed with h musical awareness ond some encourage ment and coaching in enunciation fram friend, he nailed down o part-time gig (KGAF, a Tap 40 autlet in Gainesville, T) That led to another Top 40 gig at KLEI in Kileen (which put him neor his home tawn of Rosebud), and eventually ta th town of Waco, country music and the first m.d. rale. Twa years there precede a 3-year taur with KTON in Beltan an then bock to Woco, where he settle down at WACO far the next seven co eight years.

Now at KPLE, where he's been for ju aver a year, Ray is also active dain commercial voice-overs and counts Bill Graham, Word Inc. ond on Amy Gror olbum among his plums.

He likes what country music is doin now ond thinks it hos a stranger directian. He's apen ta new artists, whom hasees as broadening the oppeol of caultry music: "The listeners have gotten twhere they wanna know more about the new ortists. The diehard fans take a leaf interest. They wanno know o little babout them—who they are, what they'vidane...."

Pet peeve: he hotes to see the alde established artists get stuck in ruts wit their music and think that anything with their because their names are on the record.

PRICING JUMPS-One by one, major suppliers of videocassettes are jumping on the \$89.95 price point bandwagon, and some retailers are none-too-pleased about it. But for the large chains we spoke to, the price hikes pose little threat. Joe Medwick of Tower had this to say: "I don't think it's going to alter in a big way what we're going to order. It's not going to to hurt us as much as it's going to hurt the mom & pop stores." One reason why the \$10 hike isn't such a large problem is the company's shift of focus from rental to sales. Independant retailers, who rely heavily on rentals, will either be forced to "raise rental prices or buy substantially less product," said Medwick, noting they can't very well do the latter and remain competitive. But for Tower, for the time being, "we're not going to change our pricing structure. If (the price hikes) get too rampant, then we'll have to take another look at it."

PARAMOUNT & PEPSI-At a morning press breakfast conference at Paramount's cheerily glamorous studio commissary last week, Paramount Home Video announced a unique promotional tie-in with Diet Pepsi for its March 11 release of Top Gun, last year's #1 film, which is still enjoying box office life after having already racked up a whopping \$175 million. The cassette debuts with a list price of \$26.95, a new low for a top title from Paramount. In the fashion of last year's Michael Jackson spot, on Grammy night (February 24) Diet Pepsi will debut a Top Gun-ish commercial, featuring a fighter pilot (Not Tom Cruise. There's no Cruise endorsement here whatsoever), whose bottle of diet pepsi gets stuck in its upright, cylindrical cooling container, a prank by colleagues flying in a plane nearby. The pilot solves the problem by uncapping the bottle, taking out a cup, doing a barrel roll with his jet, and pouring the Pepsi while flying upside down directly above his mischievous peers (a stunt borrowed directly from the film). But here's the clincher: for three months after its initial airing, the soft drink spot will announce the availability of Top Gun on videocassette. But the TV ads don't stop there. An extended version of the ad will be included as an intro to each Top Gun video - a special "video short" touted as a Collector's Version - all for just \$26.95! (Many viewers regard Pepsi's spots as entertainment in themselves, according to Pepsi's senior vice president of creative services, Alan Pottasch). A second Pepsi/Top Gun ad is due in the spring. And while the cassette packaging won't bear the Pepsi logo, p.o.p.s - including a sweepstakes - and posters will, as part of an estimated \$8 million advertising/promotion expenditure.

HOME VIDEO REVIEW: Soul To Soul - Atlantic Video - \$24.98 More than 15 years ago, a handful of top black music acts got together and flew to Ghana to perform at a music festival there. The resulting documentary, directed by Denis Sanders, is fascinating in its evocative views of black Americans coming in touch with their roots, some for the first time. Of course, these are no ordinary Americans. They are lke and Tina Turner, Wilson Pickett, Roberta Flack, Eddie Harris and Les McCann, The Voices of East Harlem, members of Santana and the Staple Singers, and they are as extraordinary as the land they are visiting. Riveting performance segments, including Ike and Tina's "River Deep, Mountain High" and Wilson Pickett's "Land of A Thousand Dances," are interspersed with off-hours footage, such as scenes from a welcoming banquet, the Staple women shopping in a busy street market and Tina Turner being taught a tribal song by a feisty village woman (Turner gives it her own R&B edge, naturally!). These sights and sounds of Ghana, its colorful clothing and rythmic music especially, together with the performance segments, might sound like a musical travelogue, but Soul To Soul goes deeper than that. Ghana was, after all, the site of Africa's booming slave trade several hundred years ago, and the significance of this fact in the face of visiting black Americans, ancestral survivors of that scourge, is not lost on Sanders, his film crew, or the visiting artists. Soul To Soul is a cultural feast filmed with intelligence and sensitivity.

"I wrote the song in one night, on Halloween night," said Woody Rock. "I'm like a street kid too. That's why I could relate to (Bigger Thomas, the film's protagonist). I pictured myself being him." The song is planned as the soundtrack's first twelve inch single.

"The Message' is the perfect frame of reference for 'Bigger's Beat,'" said Mtume. "Rap music is a very serious art form, unlike a lot of people who try to dismiss it. My concern is the content, I would like to see more meaningful content in rap.'

Rap, however, is only one of Mtume's musical interests. He is currently writing a symphony that fuses European and African classical traditions with scratch, deep funk, and even heavy metal. "It's never been done before," he said. "What I want to do is fuse the elements of different cultures. I've got one movement that's a sixty-piece orchestra accompanying a funk rhythm band. Then there's another movement that involves a

group rapping over a thing like Stravinsky's 'Rite Of Spring.'

The fascinating thing about Mtume's career is that, for all his musical daring, he usually tends to score big commercially. He has produced and written gold and platinum records for other artists, copped a Grammy award, had a number one single of his own in "Juicy Fruit," and released five albums with his band. So when he beat out even Sting to be the composer for Native Son, few were surprised.

"I'm associated more with the smooth, pretty stuff but they'll be no more straight Mtume albums," he said. "All of my albums will be concept albums from now on.'

Sensing that someone might want to use the bathroom, we decided to wrap up the interview. "This is really hip, coming to the bathroom, I hope you know that," said Mtume. Then he sampled the sound of warm water running in the sink, and we both cracked up.

40 YEARS AGO IN CASH BOX

January 14, 1946—From all over the nation leaders are writing in to declare that it is imperative for all juke box men to instantly write to their Congressmen so that the Buckley Bill now in the House of Representatives Patents Committee will be shelved right where it is. One coinman writes, "We can see no benefit, after reading this bill, which the Federal government can derive from its passage in the way of increased revenue-or, in fact, anything else. This bill," he continues, "is simply and wholly directed against the juke box industry with the intention to make this business pay ASCAP and BMI and any others who many enter into the music copyrighting picture a yearly license fee.' This means that every single juke box in the nation will then be liable to a tax of whatever figure BMI or ASCAP decides is fair, as a yearly license fee, for an instrument which will then be giving a "public performance for profit." Who is there to tell ASCAP or BMI that they should not charge \$200 or \$500 of even \$1,000 per year for the license which will give each individual juke box the

privlege to play their copyrighted music?...The Symphonola Music Co. of Hoboken, NJ, operators of wired music as well as juke boxes, are probably opening a new path to the music machine men with the fact that they are now charging 10 cents for every wired music tune and three tunes for 25 cents. ...The Cash Box Disc-Hits Box Score: 1. and parts I might never have attempted had I been working with other individuals."

On his latest offing, last year's "Back In The High Life," Winwood collaborated with Will Jennings, Vivian Stanshall and Joe Walsh, with studio appearances by Walsh, Nile Rodgers, Chaka Khan, James Taylor, Dan Hartman and James Ingram.

"Back In The High Life' differs greatly from my last couple of solo albums because I've used another producer, Russ Titelman, a great engineer by the name of Tom Lord Alge, and some great musicians and singers. Overall, I've had a lot more input on this

album than on the last two or three."

Winwood, who takes great interest in cording techniques and keyboard progra ming as well as engineering. Winwo enlisted help when he found himself spe ing too much time on mechanics, ratl than writing.

"Recently I found that I was spend more time programming and engineer and not enough time simply playing, sing and writing," Says Winwood. "I wanted concentrate more on those things on t

tor of operations at Windham Hill. "There was no point," thought Goldberg, "in immitating Windham Hill. They are the best at what they do. What I'm interested in is the audience that buys Windham Hill records, and some of the marketing techniques that they, with the help of Paula, pioneered."

"It seems that all of the major labels, when Windham Hill began to do a certain volume, came out with labels . . . essentially cloning Windham Hill and I didn't want to do that," stated Goldberg. The two primary differences between Gold Castle and Windham Hill, according to Goldberg, are that Gold Castle will revolve around vocalists (although they intend to release some instrumental LPs) and that the focus will be on the artists and not on the label. "I think that a lot of the other labels are focusing on the image and identity of the label, selling the label as a brand, a sort of Celestial Seasonings concept. I come from the school of selling artists and personalities."

"I think that historically, prior to this g eration, people stopped buying records ter they reached 20, 21. I think there something about this generation, which the largest group in society, that wants reintegrate music into their lives,," Go berg stated.

told *Cash Box* in an interview afterward. "It used to be pencil and paper. Now it's that keyboard (the Synclavier)." Although he has retained his trademark goatee, his appearance seemed unusual (for Zappa) sporting a conservative suit and tie replete with brown shoes and short hair.

He has hired musicians to play scales to "sample" into his Synclavier. While he uses some live musicians to sample certain instruments for his Synclavier, he doesn't agree with the argument that sampling synthesizers, which can digitally reproduce recordings of live instruments, can replace live musicians, applies to him.

"I don't steal samples. I was probably one of the first people to put out a notice on there (the album) that this object may not be sampled. I don't know whether I'm perfectly qualified to judge the moral implications of sample stealing off CDs. It seems a little chintzy in the fact that it's not very creative, but it does save a lot of money because to get a good sample you have to spend money and time. A lot of people are not thrilled about providing samples."

Zappa explained that the Synclavier "does things humans can't do—like breathing that long." In fact, he was unable to get musicians to play what he has been writing, instrumentals which involve some intricate poly-rhythms, for years until this technology evolved.

"Now you have more directions you can go in. The argument that these machines put musicians out of work doesn't really disturb me. What some of these musicians want to play—we've heard it already. Are they willing to develop their technique and stamina and other abilities to the point where they can compete with the Synclavier?

"You show me a bunch of musicians who can sit and read that off a piece of paper and I'll hire them. But if they can't play it, then why should I be denied the privilege of hearing what I imagine and what I write?

"Using this technology you can put instruments together that don't coexist very well in the same air space. You can have a very sweet string section with a fuzz tone guitar on it—equally balanced, equally well recorded. You try doing that in the real world—even if the musicians can read the notes, the physics, what happens in the air—it's just not possible."

He has performed with various musicians in various bands over the years, yet it doesn't seem especially important to him to perform live, especially given the difficult nature of the material. He only feels comfortable performing on guitar, yet he hasn't played for a while. "I don't have any calluses left. I think I could still play, but it would hurt a lot."

"If I want to do it live, I'll push the red

Speculation is sure to run rampant throughout all musical fields until then...but only the NARAS vote counters are going to know for sure. AAMA Hires 4 Ex-FBI Agents

CHICAGO—Four more former FBI employees have been hired by the American Amusement Machine Association to bolster the trade association's attack against counterfeit and parallel video game boards being imported, distributed and operated in the United States.

Robert C. Fay, AAMA's director of industry affairs and enforcement, advised that Tim Huhn, a twelve year FBI veteran who resides in Atlanta, Georgia, will serve as an investigator on the east coast. Larry Holdaway, a six year FBI veteran will be assigned to the west coast and Jim Roberts, a retired agent with 20 years plus of service will be responsible for investigative activities in the mid-west. Mr Cash worked for the FBI for 13 years and her last assignment served as the administrative assistant for the special agent in charg of the Newark FBI office. Her husban Tom, is the third ranking official in the feral Drug Enforcement Administration.
