LOS ANGELES – For non-industry music fans, and that means *most* music fans, the American Music Awards are apparently the one's to watch. Second to the Oscars, the AMAs have a larger viewing audience than any other awards show, which could be due to the fact that, instead of the largely selfcongratulatory, industry-voted Grammys, this is the evening when a cross-section of the public gets to choose their favorites from a list of nominees compiled from the *Cash Box* year-end polls.

Last week's 14th Annual American Music Awards ceremony, held at the Shrine Auditorium, had more visual oomph than past shows with its artfully designed sets, as well as several surprises in its course. Presided over by the always effervescent and dazzlingly attired Diana Ross, the show was its usual, tightly knight slate of country, soul, R&B, pop and rock music, with slews of presenters and performers representing these most commercial of musical genres.

One of the evening's jolts was Madonna's sudden emergence from the wings to accept her award for Favorite Female Pop/Rock Video (*Papa Don't Preach*). Jazz Show With David Sanborn Notches Up Its First Year

NEW YORK – When NBC Radio Entertainment's *The Jazz Show With David Sanborn* hit the satellite on January 3rd, 1986 for its first broadcast, the expectations were, not surprisingly, modest.

"We went in very conservatively and said if we get to 80 stations after we're on a year, and it's the right 80 stations, with good penetration in the top markets, then this will be a good, solid show, it'll be a glamour piece for us," says Andy Denemark, the executive producer of the show and now NBC Radio Entertainment's director of programming. "Normally we'd aim at 130 or 150 stations. We started with about 30 stations on the first week, but, by the end of the first guarter, we had 80 stations with good penetration in the top markets. After three months. And the thing kept going to the point where, at the end of its first full year a couple of weeks ago, we were on about 116 stations.

The Jazz Show With David Sanborn is a two-hour show that features the saxophonist spinning, mostly, fusion cuts and interviewing, mostly, fusion artists. It is an easygoing kind of a show that, according to Denemark, has no trouble crossing radio's sometimes insurmountable format boundaries.

"What's been most exciting about this show is it's not just that there was a need in the marketplace, that the listeners wanted variety and we gave it to them. What's really exciting, from our point of view, is, with a jazz show, if an AOR station doesn't want it, then an adult contemporary station can run it. And if an adult contemporary station doesn't want it, an urban station might want it, or a jazz station, or a CHR station. We're on all sorts of diverse kinds of stations."

Denemark first conceived of the show in late 1984, inspired by the success such stations as San Francisco's KFOG were having with Sunday afternoon "jazz brunch" shows—shows that, according to Denemark, "would give a rock station a real different twist for the listener to wake up to on a Sunday morning."

Denemark bandied about the idea until he went to the annual Abrams Convention, where he heard Dave Logan — an Abrams consultant and and ex-KFOGer, the guy who launched their jazz brunch show — get up and say, "The one thing I can't impress upon you enough — you're going to look at me like I'm crazy, but it's the thing to do — is to do a Sunday midday jazz show." The bandying stopped — the wheels were set in motion.

First came the testing of the waters: the waters were warm — people were going out of their way to impress upon Denemark their support for the show, some even offering to supply the show with rare records. Then came the idea for a format and a host. It should have interviews, that was decid-(continued on page 6)

ed—give the local stations something they can't get themselves — and it should have a celebrity host, since you really couldn't find a jazz disc jockey with the name value of, for example, an Imus or Howard Stern. David Sanborn seemed a good choice-because of his name value as a fusion artist in his own right, and because of his association with rock and roll (David Bowie, the Rolling Stones, Steely Dan, they've all used Sanborn)

"So we brought him into the studio for a voice test," says Denemark. "We didn't know if the guy had a lisp or a squeaky voice or what. It turned out that he had a nice, listenable voice — he wasn't Mr. Radio Pipes, but he didn't have to be, he's David Sanborn.'

Next came the pilot and, in late-'85, the go-ahead to launch the show with the new year. The rest, as they say on the radio, is history.

"We set up a real interesting situation in terms of the satellite feed. We feed the show

on Sunday. We produce the show, a twohour show, as Hour A and Hour B-they're both self-contained and each doesn't promote anything in the other hour. So it doesn't matter if a station runs Hour A be-fore or after Hour B. That way the stations can take the feed off the satellite for whatever two hours they want.'

And take the feed they do. Rock fans, soul fans, easy-listening fans, all kinds of fans are settling down with their Sunday brunch of bagels, croissants, Spyro Gyra, Pat Metheny, and the odd cut by, say, Oliver Nelson. Some stations even get pre-recorded drop-ins and ID's from Sanborn, making the show sound like its being done right there at home.

116 stations. Not bad considering that, when Andy Denemark got up at NBC Radio's Christmas party in 1984 and proposed a toast to a jazz show on the network in 1985, his boss "looked at me and said, 'Yeah, have another glass of wine. What are you, out of your mind?"

ngiovi teamed up with engineer Ed Evhelp conduct an acoustical study and op solutions. To that end, they devised 'bathing cap' helmet with three layers rier-vinyl inside. Then, with the help of west company called EAR, they came 'h an earphone piece that dampened bin noise while still allowing the pilots ur transmissions from the ground. In addition, they made suggestions about sealing up holes and moving fuel to dampen vibrations.

Their solutions worked; Rutan and Yeager traveled the 25,012 miles from Edwards AFB around the world and back to Edwards AFB in nine days without suffering any ill effects. Except, perhaps, disorientation ("Dick Ruttan said it was a weird sensation having to fly west to go home").

Some of their findings also apply to protecting the ears of rock musicians. "I would say the first person who's probably going to suffer any kind of hearing damage will be the drummer, because of the high-frequency output of the cymbals and things, and just being close to the instrument. So wearing earplugs could help them a lot...EAR makes these special earplugs that don't filter out too much of the music."

Another reason Bongiovi is interested in studying sound buffers is because he's an aviation enthusiast himself. This avocation has often paid off in terms of finding bands to record, since he regularly flies to out-ofthe-way places in search of local talent.

Though he's always looking for new bands, his current client roster sounds like a veritable who's who of rock: Mick Jagger, David Bowie, Bruce Springsteen, his cousin Jon Bon Jovi, and others. And he sees his work with the Voyager as just a diversion. "As a release from the pressures of the industry," he says, "I enjoy working on projects like this."





(a demo has been readied, featuring original material). Deal or no deal, the band is doing very well just now, with many thanks to Willis and his nocturnal club hoppings. But Willis very nearly missed seeing the Heaters altogether, Thoma revealed to Points West over the phone last week. In fact, he even mistook another band for the Heaters. "He had heard about the Heaters from a number of people, who said we were at Josephina's every Wednesday night. Well, the Wednesday night that he picked to go to Josephina's was the first Wednesday that we didn't play. So Bruce shows up and he sits in with the band that was playing that Wednesday that we didn't play, and he thought they were great - they were also kind of a blues band - and he thought they were the Heaters!" Identities corrected, Willis came back the next night to see the Heaters, and after their set and a brewski or two, asked them to play on his album. The band agreed, but not without a certain degree of Hollywood cynicism. As Thoma explained, the Heaters' first reaction was "Yeah, *right* Bruce. We're gonna play on your album. Sure."

NEW FACES TO WATCH

Saxophonist Najee, whose debut LP "Najee's Theme" (EMI America) is getting some play on the jazz and black contemporary charts, says his aim is to "bring instrumentals back to the common ear; a lot of people miss it?" The common ear?

"Well, basically trying to make instrumental music somewhat appealing to the younger audiences. You know, the older audience has an appreciation for it, but the younger audience — you have to get them in different ways: get them with grooves and so on, because they're not attracted to the playing so much. And we wanted to make is so that radio won't have a problem playing it on most of their formats."

A couple of things to get out of the way: Yes, Najee's his real name (well, it's his real middle name) and it's pronounced with the accent on the second syllable. And, no, he didn't write "Najee's Theme" to give himself a theme song (he's too young for a theme song)—he didn't even write "Najee's Theme" (Rahni Song wrote "Najee's Theme").

Najee was born and raised in New York City and he took up the clarinet in sixth grade and the saxophone when he was about 14. He then followed a notunfamiliar path for a young instrumentalist: he went to music school in Boston, in his case the New England Conservatory. There he studied with legendary reed instructor Joseph Allard and "listened to everyone. I guess some of the more modern people I listened to were, like, Michael Brecker, who, I think, is probably the trendsetter on the saxophone these days, and, of course, Grover and Ronnie Laws and David Sanborn.'

Najee's father, who died when Najee

was very young, was also a musiciar cellist with the New York Philharmon in fact. Najee doesn't really believe t music is inheritable, but he doesn't believe it either.

About his current success, Na says, "It kind of caught me by surp in a way, 'cause I didn't expect it to to off as well as it did so quickly. I thou it would take a lot more time."

He's also not wasting any time making his future plans.

"I'm going on a tour, starting in F ruary, with Freddie Jackson and R Goodman & Brown. So I'll be out tour for about two months, or ev longer; I'll be playing with Ray, Go man & Brown's band.

"We're talking about doing a pc ble video, and I should be recording next album perhaps in the summer." Farther into the future?

"I would love to go into more proc tion, maybe producing some new art, that I think deserve a shot. And the basically it, I guess."

That's it. But there's one thing t Najee's's got that most other new ists don't have: a theme song. Might help him, but it certainly can't hurt.

Still, the new album has two more singles on it — "Rock The Night" and "Carrie" and, again, video exposure is seen as key to breaking them. "Showing the band to kids is crucial," says Quinn. "That and radio, obviously. But video is what kept it alive long enough for radio to take a look at it seriously."

"One thing we've found is that with all the countries releasing it at different times, we've been running into a sync problem," he says. ""Rock The Night' has already come out in Germany and Holland, for instance, and it's performed pretty well. It went to number three in Holland."

The band members started Europe when they were still in high school, and after winning a contest at a talent show, they were given a recording contract as first prize. The quintet is led by Joey Tempest, who writes and sings most of the material, and the oldest of the group is but 24 years old. Though they recorded some of the album in the U.S., they've never toured here, but they tentatively plan to in March.

"It's nice to see a new band break through," says Quinn. "And hopefully this is only the first one of '87."

EAST COASTINGS

NONA HENDRYX is featured in Dance Theater Workshop's presentation of The Big Picture, a performanceart mix of music, theatre, dance, and multi-media magic. Hendryx sings several new songs, most notably "The Winds Of Change" which will be included on her upcoming EMI-debut album, as a duet with Peter Gabriel. But the big discovery here is an unsigned and relatively unknown singer/songwriter named Gayle Tufts who sang with Hendryx and turned in a memorable performance. Though there are no plans as-of-yet to make a soundtrack LP. Hendryx's album will be released in the spring. (The Big Picture, performed by Yoshiko Chuma and the School Of Hard Knocks, runs through February 1 at the Bessie Schonberg Theater.)

THE HUMAN LEAGUE will play Manhattan for the first time in five years, giving three sold-out shows at the Ritz February 5 - 7. The League is a prominent exponent of synth-rock, and over the course of six albums they have sought to add a human element to an otherwise icy genre. "The first decision we ever made was - once we had all the synthesizers in - we said, what will everyone expect us to do?: songs about robots. We will never do a science fiction song in our career," says vocalist Philip Oakey. "It would just be too predictable, and we hate to do anything predictable. Whatever people don't expect us to do next, we'll try and do. We're just English punks really.'

"The first electronic punks," adds vocalist **Joanne Catherall**.

Though that may be a contradiction in terms, The Human League did start out (on an early British tour) as a support act for Siouxsie and The Banshees. Their live shows in the U.S., however, have been rare; they gave one concert at N.Y.'s Palladium in 1980, followed by seven U.S. dates in 1982. So these Ritz shows, coming after the number one success of "Human" ("Crash" / A&M), take on added importance. "All the success we've had has been totally unexpected," says Susanne Sulley. "The Human League being number one in America still sounds like a fantasy." (The League also plays the Metro in Boston Feb.3 and the Warner Theatre in Washington, D.C. Feb. 10.)

The studios owned by a top producer of the early '80s have gone bust.

Martin Rushent, who produced the Human League's multi-millionselling album "Dare," among a string of other hits, has called in the receivers owing \$1 million in debt.

His country studios, Genetic Sound Ltd., equipment and adjoining house are now to be sold as a package in an attempt to pay of Rushent's debts.

The joint receiver said, "Basically, the company has run out of money and we are now actively trying to find a buyer for it. For the last two years, the residential recording studio, which forms the bulk of the business, was trading at well below capacity and this, combined with owner Martin Rushent's personal difficulties, was very damaging to the business." Rushent now works for Virgin Records.

Independent label Strikeback Records just completed a massive promotion--in-store displays and club appearances-across America in conjunction with Videopool. The label has always been proud of its low budget, high art, videos. Its bands include Ledernacken from Germany, the Sinatras, Perfect World from Canada, and the two brothers from London who make up Land of Distraction.



MICRODISNEY

After creating a stir for the past few years on the independent scene, Microdisney are back, though this time they're signed to Virgin Records.

The exquisite songwriting partnership of Cathal Coughlan and Sean O'Hagan has changed little in its emotional content, although the playing and production have matured. The album 'Crooked Mile'' was produced by Lenny Kaye, ex-Patti Smith guitarist. Microdisney may be remembered for their Rough Trade albums, "Everybody is Fantastic," and "The Clock Comes Downstairs.³

Songs on "The Clock" centered around the subjects of death and jealousy. Cal's bitterness remains intact.

"The songs on 'Crooked Mile' are about torture," he says.

Microdisney offer lyrics of childish appreciation of despair, tinged with irony. Sweet melodies offset Cal's stage sorrow and rage. A strange naivety and rawness add an essential power to Microdisney that makes them more than just another independent band gone major and blanded out. Something to watch out for.

Matt Johnson of The The, who became the most critically-acclaimed figure of 1986, is back with a new single, "Slow Train to Dawn."

"lt's about infidelity, it's the best thing I've ever done," Matt tells Cash Box. "My girlfriend was almost moved to tears. She said it was almost too close for comfort. It captured her feelings perfectly. The song is a duet, so it presents the weakness of the male and the reaction of the female, and the whole hypocrisy of infidelity.'

The former Skids member Richard Jobson, now with The Armoury Show, is not only back with a new single, "Love in Anger," but a new book, the loosely autobiographical Sixteen Years of Alcoholism.

"It's about a young Scottish alcoholic who runs away from Scotland only to find he has gone from one bad situation to further despair in another urban environment," Jobson tells Cash Box.

"Not nearly enough money is being spent on the problem of alcoholics. It's much worse than drugs. I drink whiskey macs, which is blended whiskey and ginger wine, and it turns us Scots into lunatics. But we aren't allowed to have drink in my house in Scotland because my mother had a bad problem, so my father doesn't allow alcohol ever in the house."

Jobson stresses the book is only loosely based on fact. "It sums up my feelings on when I left the Skids at 20 and had absolutely nothing to fall back on and nowhere to go. I had been 15 when I joined and knew nothing else, and it took me a long time to work things out."

Jobson, 26, insists that he is now happier than ever, with a new book a new record, a new home, and a new girlfriend."



HUE AND CRY

On the independent scene, watch out for two brothers, Patrick and Gregory Kane, who call themselves Hue and Cry. The Glaswegian duo have just released a single on Circa Records, the excellent "I Refuse."

"'I Refuse' addresses the pop cliches and sexual roles of the little girl and the young gun," says Pat. "My main inspiration comes from the feeling of Sinatra recordings, because you feel he was singing for you alone."

"I Refuse' is a very well-balanced pop tune, cerebral yet emotional.

ON JAZZ

SWING HEIL—A number of books about jazz have come out recently: most of them collections of magazine and/or newspaper $-\mathbf{R} \star$ icles by leading jazz critics. (The two most notable of that lot are Whitney Balliett's American Musicians, which collects all of the biographical pieces that Balliett has written for the New Yorker over the years; and Francis Davis's In The Moment: Jazz In The 1980s, the first book by one of America's more astute younger critics. Oxford University Press publishes them both - \$22.95 for the Balliett: \$18.95 for the Davis.) One jazz book, however, goes after something different, though not quite as different as its title might imply. The book is La Tristesse de Saint Louis: Jazz Under The Nazis by Mike Zwerin (\$16.95, Beech Tree/Morrow), which carries the cover-line, "When jazzmen under Hitler achieved a music that defied the savagery of war.'

A spectacular idea. Despite an official ban, jazz survived, in some respects thrived, in Europe under the Nazis. **Django Reinhardt** was entertaining in occupied France, **Svend Asmussen** was entertaining in occupied Denmark, things like that. What was the deal?

Anybody who is acquainted with Mike Zwerin's writing knows that they are not going to get the answer to that question in this book. You see, Mike Zwerin, a Paris-based music correspondent for the International Herald Tribune, writes, mainly, about Mike Zwerin-his world view, riddled with Jewish angst, is completely his own, every sentence he writes is autobiographical. This is not bad: in fact, it's terrifically entertaining: Zwerin has been a noted musician and the president of a steel company and he's an exceptional writer. But he won't, he can't, stick to the subject.

"Sticking to 'the subject' is bad form," he writes. "Only the widest defensible definition is adequate. Everything is linked, including the life that surrounds the writing of these words. The bio of the author on the jacket is part of the book."

So what we have here is Mike Zwerin roaming the world musing on the link between jazz and freedom: How does a music that needs to be free survive when its repressed? Zwerin takes us to Germany where he meets with a former SS officer who, it seems, is, aside from being a jazz fan, a good guy. He takes us to Poland, where jazz is currently hav ing its problems; and to South Africa, which he calls Sad Afrika and which, with typical guilt, he toured as a musician for the USIA. He justifies his tour there, just as he, in a way, justifies the willingness of Django Reinhardt, Svend Asmussen, and others to pursue their musical course in the face of occupation. He is told, by an elderly German. that nobody who liked jazz could be a Nazi. He tells us how much weight he has lost recently, how he fears he's

wasting away. He paints a beautifullywrought picture of Django Reinhardt, encountering dozens of Django's "cousins" along the way, and quotes numerous sources—on jazz, on Nazism, on repression. Hasn't jazz always suffered repression?

"Lack of purpose, indecision, a search for some kind of meaning," he writes. The world of jazz is clogged with negative emotion. One level removed from direct emotion, we are looking over our shoulders, a negative emotion. We think about what we are playing and why rather than just playing. We are obsessed by the size of the audience rather than the quality of the music. What is catching up with us? The synthesizer? Funk? Is 'inefficient' public acoustic interior exploration still functional? Does it reach anybody? Who has time for it? Money to spend on it? Shouldn't we be making more noise? Has 'the classical music of the twentieth century' lost its relevance before the century even ends?"

Zwerin never answers any of the questions he raises. But the way the questions are raised makes for excellent reading. The Nazis, the book seems to say, have come and gone, jazz has survived. This is the way things were meant to be. Jazz, and the human spirit, will survive, too, in Poland and Sad Afrika. *La Tristesse de Saint Louis* is an insightful, fascinating book.



AJO music director John Lewis, who is also expected to mount the podium for some of the concert, will be at the piano. It is, by any definition amajor jazz event, the one that should really put the AJO on the map.



Laak out party animals, you ain't seen nothing 'till you've seen Mr. Randy D. Jacksan in action. That's D far daring, D far Dynamic and a wit that wan't quit. Randy, a.k.a. 'King," has recently acquired the rights ta a piece of the stage with the guys in **Journey** as bass player and vacalist extracrdinare.

Naw let their be no confusian. This Randy Jacksan may be the spitting image of Clarence Clemmons, but he is in no way, shape or form related ta Michael, Janet, Jermaine ar anyone else in the Jackson family. Our 28 year old music man cames direct from San Francisco, via Baton Rouge, LA. where he grew up listening ta the Matawn saund, James Brown, John Coltrane and the Stanes. He picked up the drums at the age af 12, thanks to the influence from his brather Herman, wha was later the drummer far B.B. King, and fram there, he maved inta alta, then guitar and finally, his claim to fame, the bass.

Talk abaut yaur ga getters! Never enaugh can be said abaut his extensive background which includes the Louisiana All-Star Stage Pragram, a schalarship from the Natianal Association af Jazz Educatars to study at Las Vegas' Naje Stage Band Pragram, member af Fred John and the Playboys, member af the Batan Rauge Youth Symphany, received a grant fram the National Endawment far the Arts to study with Chuck Rainey in Las Angeles, studied at the Billy Cobham Clinic at Sauthern, played in Billy's band far twa years, recarded albums with him, taured the states and Eurape, etc... and all by the age af 21!

Now, yau might think that this is backgraund enaugh. Well, dan't be surprised ta find aut that Mr. Jacksan alsa finished a B.A. in Music, taught jazz at a perfarming arts schaal in Galvestan, TX. and has been warking an prajects with Narda Michael Walden for the last six years.

Randy's versatility has sparked his writing and producing towards a variety af music. He has became a master af markets while maintaining his own style, and laves it. In his wards, "I like praducing different genres as oppased to just r&b or pop. Ta me it's mare impartant ta be inspiratianal ta others than to follow someone elses lead. Sa, I invalve myself in whatever I feel there's a need far," and Randy can fill a need just abaut anywhere he sees one. He's been a member af Jean-Luc Ponty's band, and has recarded and/ar perfarmed with Aretha Franklin, Journey, **Clarence Clemmons, Whitney** Houston, Sheena Easton, Rodney Franklin, Herbie Hancock, Jeff Lorber, Lenny Williams, Narda Michael Walden, Taxxi, etc...

On the praductian end af things, Jacksan has three sangs an the current **Krystol** LP entitled "Passian Fram A Waman," including the title cut cawritten by he and wife Liz, and has capraduced (with **Preston Glass**) the farthcaming debut album by the modern British band, **Dance Like A Mother**.

At present, Randy is warking an a very exciting debut album with his wife and partner, Liz Jackson, wha alsa plays keybaards, sings and ca-writes their material. The album is a modern blend af pap, r&b, rack and dance making it categorically uneasy. "There's a big difference in audiences," explaines Jacksan. "A Lionel Richie and Whitney Houston, for example, fall right in the middle under that Diana Ross demagraphics ranging fram 5 ta 95yrs. There's samething far everyone, all ages. That's goad far them, but personally, Liz and I want to pinpaint around the 12 to 35yr range."

"Up until naw, record campanies have shyed away fram prajects that have defied descriptian. Hawever, music is maving inta a new age, and the recard industry is beginning ta take mare risks. The time is finally up far 'that went ta #1. Let me have ane,' ar 'Only thing my campany needs is anather Whitney Haustan!' Haw many af thase can there really be. Even radia is starting ta lean towards AOR, because it's gatten sa that almast every CHR station in almost every city is playing the same sangs every haur. They all know it's time for a change."

Randy cansiders warking with Journey ta be an inspiratian. He laves Perry's Motown influence, (Marvin Gaye, Jackie Wilson, Sam Cooke), and the wonderful meladies which stem fram the influence af singers as opposed ta the stylists af today. "It just re-iterates ta me that melody is a big key in writing sangs. Alsa, the crowds are like nathing I've ever experienced befare. They're wild as ever, and always thoraughly exciting."

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Randy D. Jacksan can be seen an MTV in two videos; Aretha Franklin's "Jumpin' Jock Flosh," and Jaurney's "The Girl Con't Help It." A View Towards Market Expansion

(The following is the second of a two-part interview with RCA's Joe Galante.)



Vice President & General Manager of RCA, Nashville

"If we're up 1%," says Joe Galante, referring ta the averall cauntry music market, "I'll be happy."

That market has seen little expansian in recent times. The *appearance* of expansion, reflected in any particular label's market share, is not sa much indicative af grawth far the entire country music community, accarding ta Galante, as it is an indicatian af a prapartionate decrease in someone else's portian. Sa what might *seem* ta be grawth may be, in reality, only a temparary shift in existing market shares.

"In arder far aur sales base ta expand, we need the AC chart," he offers. At this point, Galante reaches far a copy af a recent survey shawing that, in 1981, cauntry product made up aver 15% of the AC chart, but has since plunged steadily and consistently until it accaunted far a mere 3% last year. In the CHR area, says the same survey, cauntry praduct has had absolutely na impact far at least the last three years.

"One af the biggest prablems facing cauntry music," he claims, "is the bad rap it's been getting (fram thase in ather farmats). I dan't see anything an the harizan that's gonna change that apinian."

Nanetheless, he stresses the impartance of regaining a beachhead in the AC area as ane strategy necessary ta the widening of the cauntry sales base. Still, it won't be withaut same casualties.

"I think it's ganna be like being at Narmandy an D-Day. The first cauple af peaple an the share are likely ta be shat ta hell, just as the first cauple af recards that ga an the AC (ar CHR) charts are nat ganna perform to the degree they shauld, because there are ganna be a lat af nan-believers in the ather formats. But they *will* open the daars far ather peaple ta fallow.

"I dan't have a solutian as to how yau can further that. I anly knaw it's a market that we *have ta* appeal to, and that the cauntry statians shauld be able ta claim thase artists first. They shauld be germane to aur farmat and nat the ather way araund.

"One of the things I've naticed is that Billy Vera and the Beaters (an Rhino Records), who have ane of the tap CHR recards aut, are naw winding up an the cauntry charts. Which is akay. I think that's fine. People shauld be able ta hear that. But, it wauld be nice if we had same af our own that were gaing the ather way—far the identificatian far aur format."

Rannie Milsap's super-successful "Last In The Fifties" LP awes anywhere from 20 to 40% af its sales to the AC play it received, claims Galante. As a result of that play, added ta Milsap's normally strang cauntry play, the album "will go platinum in 3-4 months." Another piece af praduct that similarly benefited from strong AC respanse, he says, was Kenny Ragers' "Morning Desire," which, like the Milsap LP, is also on its way taward the platinum mark. ```Bap' was the same,'' he says, painting ta Dan Seals' EMI/America smash af a year aga. "That was evident on that record. You can get to a certain level and then it just kicks it right in."

In timing the marketing of the product, he paints aut that there are thase periads when the pap-daminated marketplace experiences a certain saftness, especially in between the ance-a-year releases fram the pap superstar element. He sees thase periads as being perfect appartunities far country product to "slip into the cracks" and take up more shelf space.

Aside fram saliciting airplay autside af the cauntry farmat, Galante suggests that ane af the avenues ta an expanded valume for Nashvillebased labels is through the intermixing af country releases with same af the best praduct fram ather areas af music, exemplified by "what MCA is daing with the Master Series" as well as same af the hat names from the gaspel arena, including Amy Grant and such rising cammadities as Michael W. Smith.

Here he paints ta the successful "crossaver" pattern af Grant. "I think that the thing that Mike (Blantan) and Dan [Harrell] have done over at Reunian with Amy was obviously successful cammercially, but it was *tastefully* dane. Ta me, that's the key. I dan't want something that smacks of 'Laak what they're daing!' They chase great singers to do duets with—or anytime she was invalved in a project it was staged correctly and it was dane with class.

"I think that's the way to approach it, if you're getting inta sameane else's market. First af all, yau have to *realize* that yau're getting inta sameane else's territary and yau gatta handle it the right way.

"I would think that that's the way we'd appraach it—an that level regardless whether it's doing duets or pictures with same ane else autside the format—that kind af thing.

"Nat that it's autside the farmat dramatically, but [Bruce] Hornsby and Restless Heart—that whale taur. I think it's ganna da same things for both sides because some af the country falks will be expased ta Harnsby and Hornsby will be expased ta cauntry music. Same af these CHR people shawing up—the radia falks—are gonna hear what country music is taday. And I think that's damn good."

Throughout his conversation, Galante mentions competitive labels and many of their successes.

"To sit here and nat acknawledge your campetitian and the things they've done is crazy. When you go walking around this building, everybady is playing samething fram ather labels. In fact we have a tape here that we pass through, af all the singles reviewed, and in the charts. We all listen to 'em. We may nat like 'em all, but we listen ta 'em. And then we stack aur product up against it. Because yau find aut what samebady's playing and why they're playing it. Yau'd be surprised. And sametimes yau raot-yau really da raat-far sameane else ta come thraugh. Because yau knaw that daars apen up and then everybady can fallaw thraugh."

All things taken into cansideration, Galante sees a bright future far the cauntry business. "During the next few years—mare tawards the latter part—I see a grawth in cauntry music. I really da. Because all the energy that we have yau can't harness, yau can't channel it. It's just ganna farce its way through."

By the same taken, he adds that "we've gat toa many recards right naw far the marketplace ta handle. I dan't mean that in the sense that peaple shauldn't be signing and everything else; I just think we're overly aptimistic. Everybady's gat 97 artists and, af caurse, they're all ganna sell, I and isn't this a great periad of time and all that...

"Yeah, akay, I understand all that.. Hawever, I think that with radia reducing their lists, as we've talked about, and the cansumer dollar being split in a lat af areas, we have ta be realistic. And I wauld hape that, as a tawn, when we find a real winner—like a Judds, or a Randy Travis—that *that's* what we wave as a tawn. Not that we wave the banners of traditianal music or contemporary music, because, to me, that's what halds us back."

Putting labels on our product can be to aur detriment, he adds. "When yau ga in and tell the *customer* what you've got, maybe the custamer daesn't want it the way yau've described it. Yau'd be surprised, if you use the wrong ward with them—'traditianal'—maybe I'm nat a 'traditianal' buyer, maybe I'm nat a 'traditianal' buyer, maybe I'm a 'country' buyer and I think 'traditional' is bluegrass, for instance. I dan't knaw all the nuances ta yaur terminalagy. Maybe I don't like 'crossovers,' maybe I just like 'cauntry.' I think that's a danger.

"But when you say 'Here it is. Make your own opinion. Here are the benefits of my product,' you let *them* decide.

"We dan't have ta warry abaut 'Is it danceable?' ar 'Daes it belang ta the traditianal marketplace?' Just leave it alone! It'll take care of itself on that side....There's the period that we've gane thraugh in the past: 'Let's cross aver. Let's ga pap. Let's get "traditional." Let's get "bluegrass." Let's get "roats-y".' I mean, I'm gonna start laaking for, or advertising for, singers that have gat raats? C'mon, guys!

"Wynanna's influence is Bonnie Raitt. I mean, she's definitely a very raotsie, traditianal persan. Yes, she is, in her farmat. And all Wynanna did was take that same ematian—in terms af a mentor—and run with it. Great! That's absolutely wonderful."

"Our music is authentic. I dan't care whether it's got bluegrass influences ar it's got synthesizers. That's *our* music. That's what we are praducing in this tawn that's nat praduced an place else. It is aurs.

"And these people writing the sangs and perfarming them are aurs They are fram this tawn. And that's the stamp."

COUNTRY PROFILES



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Billy Parker—Operations Director/Program Director KVOO—Tulsa, OK

TULSA—If killing two birds with one stane is goad, then nailing three with the same , stane is even better, right? Well, thot's what Billy Parker is up to these days—and has been all his life. No, he's not really out there in Tulsa throwing rocks at aur feathered friends, but he's balancing three aspects of the entertainment business that, he says, wark well together. Thase activities include radia, soles and "pickin' and grinnin'."

When he first started at KVOO, Billy enjoyed the freedom of the 11 p.m.-6 o.m. It ollowed expression in oll three oreos: he sold the spots for the show, got to do his bosic rodio stuff—ond song, right there over the ole oirwoves with his trusty guitor ploying olong with the whole thing. Billy did overnights for seven years before onyone got wise to him ond promoted the jock to PD/MD ond mode him work day shifts.

Billy's been with KVOO for 17 yeors pretty remorkable in this business. His attitude about his position at the station as vice president, operations director and program director may explain why he's stayed in one place all this time. "It's a perfect combination because it fits together so well—my lave of music makes programming and selling exciting."

There was a time, back in the onnols of Billy's life, when only two aspects of his triad were in place—he was playing music and selling, but the selling was in the grocery store business. Then come o day in 1959 when he heard that KFMJ-Tulso was looking for a part-time d.j. There it was the third birdie. And Billy took a shot at it.

It fit—he ended up being offered fulltime work ot the country-formotted station and stayed for eight months before moving on (in normal radio fashion) to KFDI-Wichito, then to KLPR in Oklohoma City, and finally returning to KFMJ in 1963. All this time he was playing country music bath an the radia and an his guitar in "every grocery store parking lat in town."

Then, unexpectedly, the triad split up again. He didn't mean for it to hoppen, but, well, when Ernest Tubb affers you o jab warking with him and the Troubadours, whot's a fello to da? Noturally, the musicion jumped at the chance and played with the renawned singer at the Grond Ole Opry and on the road far three years.

But while Billy was working on the ane facet (entertaining), he missed the other two (soles and radio). Something in him needed the triad in place, so, in 1971, he went back to Tulso. A friend of his who happened to be the g.m. of KVOO, soid, "Billy, if we ever change to country, I'd lave to have you." Lo and behold, o few months later, KVOO did just that ond Billy was hired. When the station gave him his chaice of air shifts, the musician in Billy naturally chose the oll-night show.

Since he would hove to give up rodio ond soles to be a full-time musician but doesn't have to give up being o musician to stoy in rodio and soles, Billy is right where he wonts to be—where he needs to be to hove all three aspects of his life in place. He records an Soundwaves in the U.S., and Conyon Creek for a special Canadian project, but he no longer has regular bookings every weekend. "You have to be in control of it," he says. "Dan't let yourself be cromped, or you wan't do a good job."

Now, Billy's shift goes from 10 o.m. to noon everydoy. But when he's not on the oir, you con find him working deals with The Jim Holsey Compony, or Pontioc, or pickin' ond grinnin' in o neorby grocery store porking lot....

Kerry Wolfe—Music Director WRNS-FM—Kinston, NC

KINSTON—Yau never know when it's going ta strike. There are aften warning signals, na symptoms, and by the time yau know it's got you, it's tao late.

"It" is the radio bug. It carries a terminal condition—radiaitis—terminal because, na motter haw yau try to shake it, it's usuolly gat yau for life.

Kerry Wolfe, the yauthful music directar at WRNS-FM almast escoped the malady, but it caught him unaware. He was minding his own business, peacefully pursuing a degree in Wildlife Bialogy ot North Carolino Stote when he innocently decided to spend some between-closs time working ot the compus rodio stotion, WKNC.

Slowly ot first, ond then more quickly, rodioitis got its hooks into Kerry. He no longer cored about his studies, his grodes slipped os he spent more ond more time ot the stotion. As the condition spreod, he become m.d., then p.d., then stotion monoger ot WKNC, ploying heovy metol rock ond roll—ond still, he couldn't get enough.

He went to work ot country stotion WKIX in Raleigh, working for Mike Chopmon ("one hell of a program director" in Kerry's estimation). He storted port-time, then went to full-time nights, still working at hord rock WKNC between classes.

The next stoge in the progressing oilment resulted in Kerry chonging his mojor. The life of o wildlife biologist wos for from his mind now: he become o Speech Communicotions mojor with on emphosis on Telecommunications.

And still it wosn't enough. He olso went to work port-time for on odult contemporary station, WYYD. "I hod rodio in my blood," the poor man admitted, "ond I couldn't get it out."

So, during the time when rodioitis hod its greatest hold over Kerry he was station

manager of hord rock WKNC, leorning from Chapman at country-formatted WKIX, learning fram classes in cammunication, and miking it ot odult cantemporory stotian WYYD! The boy had it *bod*.

After groduation, Kerry went to work for WYYD full time. When the p.d. left, he found himself a 23-yeor-old operations manager. Hawever, when the station switched ta satellite, he become bared (o side effect of his canditian) and left WYYD far o job at WRNS, an hour's drive away.

"After obout six months—ond 60,000 miles on my cor—I moved [to Kinston]," Kerry soys. He odds, with understondoble pride, "When I got here we were 7th in the morket. Our first book—ond second book—[ofter my orrivol] showed us ot 1st in the morket ocross the boord."

Once o person occepts the foct that radioitis is going to affect his entire life, he often settles in and goins a degree of peace and insight concerning the condition. Kerry seems to have already reached that point, no longer trying to work three jobs, focusing instead on the *music*.

"We ploy contemporary country here," he says contentedly, "We don't play o lat of records—we have a 45-song playlist but we do go out on a limb at times. I mean, I don't have anything against independent product. If a record fits our radio station, if it's a *positive* record, I'll play it." Kerry explains that he stays away from cryin-your-beer songs, but that that doesn't rule out traditional country records "os long as they're positive. Travis fit here, and Yookom, and Jones still fits."

And Kerry fits—he's where he wonted to be, where he had to be once the radio bug bit: with o mike to his mouth ond o record in his hands, spinning music over the oirwoves. **Valerie Hansen**

THE WINNING VIDEO—There's been a Rams video, a Raiders video. the Super Bowl Shuffle, the NFL Video Trivia Game, and there'll soon be a San Francisco Giants tape, just to name a few. If this isn't indication enough, here's the situation: Major league sports videos are becoming a big business. The question is, how well does a tape sell when the team is losing? In certain markets, the answer is "not well," according to David Helfant of Fandel Management. Helfant is executive producer, along with veteran music video producer Alexis Omeltchenko of Pendulum Productions. of the forthcoming Giants video and the L.A. Raiders Silver/Black Attack video (the latter was produced by Omeltchenko). "I think you've got to take into account the reaction of the city to the team," said Helfant. "For example, if we were to do a video of the Denver Broncos, irrespective of whether they won or lost they would sell a certain amount of music because the fans are so fanatical. In L.A. - and people warned me about this in advance - the fans are very fickle. They're so used to having a winning team, that when the team doesn't win, not only do they not want to be involved, they actually ridicule them." That a team's losses will effect cassette sales, particularly in the L.A. market, was a lesson Helfant and Omeltchenko learned the hard way. With pre-orders of 30,000 cassettes of the Raiders video, virtually all of those orders were retracted when the team lost its third game last season (eventually, about 2,000 pre-orders were regained). "(The losses) absolutely affected the sales," said Omeltchenko. "No one expected that." It's a mistake they'll never make again. With the upcoming Giants video, produced by Glenn Goodwin & Associates (Dancing On The Ceiling) the production team won't rely on baseball stars alone to sell videos. This time, the project will involve several well-known recording artists - as yet unnamed. Songs will be submitted to the featured artists by several writers, including the team of Craig Bartock and Harlan Lansky (now of the band Royalty), who provided the Raiders rap'n'roll music. The artists will then have their choice of performing the submitted material, or coming up with material of their own. As for a record label to release the accompanying album, Rhino Records, who released the Raiders EP, won't be involved, and Helfant thinks the recording will probably end up with the label of a given recording artist. But aside from the artist tie-in, which is certain to boost sales of the \$19.95 videocassettes (et. al.) with or without a winning season, what truly differentiates the Giants tape from other sports music video projects is that a percentage of the profits will be donated in support of the antidrug movement in the bay area.

They include: Treat Williams in Sweet Lies, Tom Hulce in Slam Dance, River Phoenix in Jimmy Reardon, Aidan Quinn in Robinson Crusoe, and Straight To Hell, starring Sv Richardson and Joe Strummer, featuring cameos by Grace Jones, Dennis Hopper and Elvis Costello. Four or five of the tapes will be released this year, and the rest in '88

jazzy guitar arrangements.

Their sound is at once fresh and unique, yet at there is a sense of melody and style which is timeless and traditional. Although the sense of style and mood are constant, the sound is hard to pin down.

Tracey and Ben, both possessing the same elegance and style found in their work, as well as considerable wit, shed some light on that subject and other ponderables.

"I think because of those differences, you can't describe the actual sound," says Tracey. "There are fundamentals which remain the same. It's my voice which obviously carries on through it and there is something in the way that we write our melodies which remains constant—a sort of simplicity, a very melodic approach. There is a certain mood."

"However much we try to thrash is out," Ben adds, "I think there is something overridingly melancholic about everything we seem to do. Even when we write our most optimistic songs, they do seem to be tinged with a sort of contrary mood that seems to be all pervasive in what we do. I don't think it's a real self indulgent sort of pessimistic, self-pitying melancholy, it's much more a mood. A sort of atmospheric lyricism if you like. Even when we are at our most melancholy, some people might even say morose, I think we can still be very uplifting in what we sing about. I think some of the best songs ever written were the saddest songs. Richard Thompson once said people just weren't interested in being happy and Charlie Rich said he didn't ever see how he could sing a happy song. If it's good enough for Charlie, it's good enough for me.

Thorn and Watt were asked to record together after both recorded solo projects for the Indie label, Cherry Red. Tracey had also worked with an all girl group, the "Marine Girls," which she describes as an very "amateurish, post-punk band." They recorded a one-time single under their current name which was the slogan taken from a furniture shop in England. "The single on Cherry Red was meant to be disposable so we thought we'd choose an utterly disposable name," Ben explains. "It's just like an American department store and it just sounded so cheap and vulgar that it would really fit the group."

When they realized that they "weren't going to attain easy heights of fame" working independently, they decided to "get together," Indeed, theirs is not only a musical relationship.

Their lyrics which also tend to be on the four side are perhaps a bit depressing for perican tastes. Tracey, who provides most of the lyrical contributions, explains the origins of EBTG's tales of infidelity and unrest.

"I don't think Americans are very good on introspection," Tracey explains. "If you want to generalize, Americans are very social people. English people have a reputation for being reserved and quiet. There is something about our music that doesn't strike a chord with American culture."

Unless the two have as stormy a relationship as her lyrics imply, where do they come from?

"You draw on things that have happened to you in the past obviously. If you're in a happy relationship, it would be very boring to keep writing about it so maybe you have to go back a little bit..."

"We are the Burton and Taylor of pop after all, we have had our ups and downs. It would be a lot harder if one of us was successful and the other one weren't. The fact that we're developing and progressing both as friends and in a group is very important." Ben adds.

"This is true," Tracey says.

As to where their influences come from, they both contend that it is the song form that they are concerned with irrespective of the genre. In other words, if a song is good, they will listen to it whether its a "jazz standard, a country western tune or even a Madonna single."

"You know, there is always something intrinsic about a good song which will sound good with an orchestra or with an acoustic guitar. I mean, you just can't play a Frankie Goes To Hollywood song on an acoustic guitar," says Ben.

So it follows, the two don't write their songs in the studio with a band. They compose on the piano or with guitar, usually at home.

"We don't write them with a band," he says "thrashing out riffs hour after hour until some small brain cell actually grinds itself into operation and creates the most horrendous rock garbage you've ever heard in your life. We just sit around..."

"...and turn out garbage around the piano-...middle of the road garbage," Tracey jokes.

Ben continues, "the piano or with guitar concentrating simply on the melody, the basic tune and the lyrics."

Ben and Tracey had what they call "the usual piano lessons, that sort of torture that kids are forced into," but neither one had many lessons. Ben recollects "running, screaming out of the room" because his piano teacher's long fingernails would make a horrible noise when they "clicked on the ivories." "I just couldn't bear it," Ben says. His father was a jazz musician, and he grew up with the strains of Bud Powell and Dizzy Gillespie wafting through the house. While this left a permanent stamp on Ben's musical sensibilities, there was an even more powerful, seemingly contradicting influence.

"The fascinating thing is that despite that after fifteen years growing up with jazz, the first thing that really took off for me in terms of expression was *punk*. Although it's in paradox in it's amateurism to jazz, it did have the same sort of energy and aggressiveness. Charlie Parker was the first punk rocker. Punk just had the spirit which made me want to do it myself and because I was an amateur it was an easier form to start off with."

Ben Watt, a veritable style maven, in a punk band?

"'Oh yeah," he laughs. "I could tell you some horrendous names."

"They're really terrible, really embarrassing," cries Tracey.

Worse than the Dead Kennedys?

"That was great. Wasn't it?" Tracey adds.

"Well...I used to be in a band called the afterbirths. Which is pretty repulsive. There you are."

Tracey has a special interest in femme fatales like Francis Farmer ("Ugly Little Dreams" on "Love Not Money") and Marilyn Monroe ("Sugar Finney" on the new LP).

"I suppose it comes from the fact that as a feminist, which I do consider myself to be, I'm interested in any successful or interesting women in any art form." She is very fond of Hollywood film circa the 30s and 40s.

"I do think that's very interesting to look back to and see the issues those films deal with, the personal relationships. They were taken very seriously and were incredibly popular because they spoke to people very closely. They seem relevant to me because that's an area that our lyrics are quite concerned with."

Ben, obviously a feminist himself, adds, "I think the successful writings of a women in any art form usually has a far more inter-

ton's outstanding number of wins. Other than mistress of ceremonies Diana Ross, no one graced the stage more frequently than Houston, whose five awards made her the evening's biggest winner. Visibly and audibly embarrassed by her sweep, Houston's acceptance patter all but run out after about the third award.

Houston's recurrent journeys to the podium were made all the more repetitive by the absence of Lionel Richie, on tour in Australia, who would have made four trips to the stage of his own.

A high point of the show was reached with a special tribute segment honoring Elvis Presley, who was recognized with the AMA's first posthumous Award of Merit. The tribute included film clips, reflections by current top recording artists, and a special rendition of "Don't Be Cruel" by country songstresses The Judds, with vocals by Presley's original back-up vocalists, The Jourdanaires.

Another high came with a 25-year anniversary salute to Peter, Paul and Mary, who performed a rousing set of some of their best-loved folk tunes, garnering a standing ovation and rousing applause.

Aside from that jubilant interlude, this year's performance segments included appearances by such top artists as Robert Palmer, Run D.M.C., George Strait, Whitney Houston, Tina Turner (dressed in jeans and cowboy boots, with a roots-rocking band behind her) and Janet Jackson, plus a previously taped segment from *Moonlighting* star Bruce Willis and The Heaters, performing as Bruno and The Heaters (as per Willis' new Motown LP). Diana Ross performed in several segments, reaching a pinnacle with a tribute to jazz great Billy Holiday.

Also performing on the show, albeit from another city, was rock band Genesis, who were beamed in with a live satellite hook-up to their simultaneously occuring concert in Cleveland.

If there was a song of the evening, it was the Dionne Warwick (and friends) tune, "That's What Friends Are For," the largest selling single of 1986. The song, whose proceeds go to the American Foundation For AIDS Research, was not included in the *Cash Box* year-end polls because it was a donation, and was instead given a special achievement award in this publication's year-end issue. It was performed as a closing segment to the awards show by a collection of music luminaries, including Warwick, who gathered on stage.

Produced by Dick Clark Productions, the evening is always carefully orchestrated to accomodate TV viewers, just as a publicly determined awards presentation might be. But this show had less drag live than then one would normally expect from a 3-hour TV production (which, let's face it, is a long time to keep any audience seated without an intermission. The goods, after all, are geared toward those at home). The show came off smoothly, despite close calls resulting from absent presenters and several instances of botched cue reading.

While the show itself was upbeat in the fashion of Clark's signature quick-paced, rock'n'roll style of TV, its most stimulating overall production feature was Ray Klausen's colorful, geometric set design, which gave the whole evening an arty and playfully high-tech look. Metallic scafolding which unfolded and folded at the beginning and end of Robert Palmer's performance was particularly effective, as was the geometric fabric structure from which Janet Jackson and her dancers emerged.

Kenny Ortega's choreography was as catchy as it was tight, especially on Ross's *(continued on page 29)*

A Permanent Shrine for Country Music Grammy Winners

NASHVILLE-They say first impressions are the most lasting. Well, if that's true, then Alabama, Crystal Gayle, the Oak Ridge Boys, Jerry Reed, Conway Twitty and Dottie West have a headstart on their fellow Grammy Award winners by being the first artists to cast their im-



pressions in cement for a new Nashville tribute to country music recording artists called Star Walk.

Star Walk will be a permanent display of cement plaques in which former and future Grammy Award winners will have placed their handprints, footprints, (and in Jerry Reed's case, chin print) and comments, in the same vein as Mann's Chinese Theatre in Hollywood. The 3'x 6', 700-pound, brass-framed cement plagues will form a low wall along a lakeside walkway in Fountain Square, a business/ shopping/entertainment area scheduled

to open this summer in Nashville's Metro Center.

In a music industry reception at the Maxwell House Hotel in Nashville on January 27, BMI VP Roger Sovine, president of the Nashville Chapter of the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences (NARAS-presenters of the Grammy Awards) and Barry Oxford, president of Aladdin Resources, Inc., developer of Fountain Square, jointly announced the initiation of Star Walk with the induction of the first ten Grammy winners. In addition to those mentioned above, Chet Atkins, the Charlie Daniels Band, Ronnie Milsap and Loretta Lynn were also among the first ten inductees, although they were unable to take part in the Jan. 27 ceremony.

At the ceremony, the first six plaques took on individual personality as the stars (continued on page 27)



TONY RICE—Me And My Guitar—(Rounder 0201)—(Producers: A.Rice, B.Wolf)

When Rice admits that Gordon Lightfoot is his favorite songwriter, the announcement certainly causes no gasp of surprise. On this album, the singer/ guitarist has surrounded himself with tunes by Lightfoot, James Taylor and Bob Dylan and instrumentalists of such ilk as Vassar Clements, Sam Bush and Jerry Douglas. The result is a fine, comfortable folk album designed for Sunday listening.

BELA FLECK—Inroads—(Rounder 0219)—(Producer: B.Fleck)

The compatibility of these two albums has resulted in a departure from the usual pattern of not having two from the same label in the same issue. The musicianship on Rice's LP is paralleled here, although where the former sticks to a folkie feeling, banjo virtuoso Fleck takes off on these self-penned instrumentals, exploring everything from jazz to bluegrass to Irish folk. With Bela's fellow New Grassers-Sam Bush, Pat Flynn and John Cowan-pickin' alongside Jerry Douglas and Mark O'Connor, this album boasts a roster of three Grammy nominees and two Frets Instrumentalists of the Year. 
MARTYN JOSEPH-Sold Out-(Power Discs PWRO 1089)-Producers: J. Pantry, C. Norton

opening number.

The show may be second only to the Oscars in awards show viewership, but the most extraordinary thing about the AMA's, this, or any other year, goes beyond its ratings. For one thing, it is a show that gets to the meat and potatoes of the music business - namely, the music that sells the most and is most popular on the mass scale. And then there is the simple fact that unlike any other televised music awards program, if there are any qualms about the choice of AMA winners, one has only public taste - or lack of it, if you like - to blame.

COIN MACHINE A \$EN\$IBLE Approach To Business Promotions

by Roger Sharpe

One of the most difficult challenges facing any game room owner is to face his business as a *business*. More often than not, daily activities are directed at maintaining clean, working equipment. And when new machines have been purchased, the decisions revolve around placement, settings and pricing. All of these events, and many others, are enough to keep even the most dedicated owners and store managers on the go around the clock.

Unfortunately, to compete for market share in the Eighties, the coin-machine industry must expand its scope and recognize the power of promotion and the impact of merchandising. After all, any endeavors must be targeted at increasing traffic — pure and simple. Once you can get that individual in the game room, he/she is bound to spend some amount of money. Making the experience a rewarding and entertaining one, can substantially improve that earning potential: day-in and day-out. And that is the secret that so many other businesses, in other fields have learned.

How many times have you been enticed into a store because of a special sale? Maybe there is a local restaurant or club that offers discounted meals/drinks during certain hours. You're willing to not only change your schedule to get to these places, but, often, you're willing to go out of your way to get there.

Admittedly, the goods and services that one can find in the average game room don't have the same clout as the reduced price color TV or an "early bird special", but through creative means, you can reap the benefits and bottom line profits that will accrue once you get some regular programs into operation.

First and foremost in determining what you might do, is to decide what you're trying to accomplish. Your goal might be to increase revenues overall and expand your customer base so that it includes more adults, or more children, or any combination that makes sense for your type of business. There might be some times – summer, winter, etc. or a Sunday morning, Tuesday evening, etc. – when you can't scare up business even if your games were on free play. But this is only a minor obstacle that can easily be surmounted if you give them a reason – above and beyond the games themselves – for coming into your location.

The important fact to recognize is that your commitment can be limited so that it fits your immediate and long term needs. You don't have to feel that once you embark on the road of promotional bliss that you're locked into it forever. You're not. All you want to do is try out different activities and see what works best for you. Obviously, what might be successful in one location might not work in another for a variety of reasons, not the least of which is your audience and where your business is situated.

However, there are some basics that can be applied across the board which can get you started. Since every game room suffers from those slow times during the week, borrow from the world of bars and taverns and institute your own 'happy hours.' This can mean everything from a special token rate exchange (although the problem in stopping people from stockpiling tokens for future 'reduced rate' play in unavoidable) to an approach that makes much more sense. Keep your prices the same, but offer a special prize during those slow hours. This might be for the highest score on a particular machine, or group of machines where the winner might receive a special package of tokens, or even some merchandise, such as a bicycle or a television set.

This latter option, opens up the door to do some cross-promotion with another local merchant who is as hungry as you are to gain visibility in the community. Go down the street to the ice cream store or fast food spot and see if they're willing to do some couponing via your game room. Both of you benefit and, it doesn't cost you anything more than a few signs in your game room announcing the promotion.

A different alternative to this type of program is to take advantage of the local press (penny savers and community papers) and advertise your business to the surrounding populace, but to go one step further and incorporate a sweepstakes. The problem with so many tournaments and other playoriented activities is that you get your same hard-core audience (those top players) competing against each other. There's no new business that you're generating. A sweepstakes takes away pure game playing skill and opens up this type of promotion to the masses. Once again, you can tie in with a local merchant for the top prize and have people enter by filling out any forms in your game room. You can even set up a contest in much the same way-borrowing, possibly, from the trivia boom, and offer a series of questions that must be answered correctly in order to qualify for the top prize.

These few promotion suggestions have something in common — very little expense to you and very little concern over regulating them during normal business hours. As a start, promotional activities can be very effective for traffic building and increasing the awareness of your business in the community. There's obviously, much more that can still be done, but this is just a starting point to get you going and thinking about what you might want to do. Personal creativity is the key in designing your own program.

Try one soon and see what the results are. If you're successful with the first, the other ideas will quickly follow — as will business revenues and a better understanding of making your business all that it can be.
