

Winwood, Simon Take Top Honors At 29th Grammies

LOS ANGELES—The National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences delivered its 29th Annual Grammy Awards last week in a nationally televised broadcast from the Shrine Auditorium here. The evening's biggest story was Paul Simon's victory with "Graceland" in the Album of the Year category. Amid controversy over his recording of part of the album in U.N.-boycotted South Africa, the Grammy served to not only recognize Simon's musical achievement but also to register the Academy's endorsement of his landmark cross-cultural work.

Simon's victory marked the third time he has won this award. He won in 1970, with Art Garfunkle, for "Bridge Over Troubled Water" and again in 1975 for his solo effort, "Still Crazy After All These Years." Last week's Grammy gives Simon a career total of 12, placing him in the company of Ella Fitzgerald and Aretha Franklin among those reaching that lofty perch.

Steve Winwood was a double winner, including his upset win in the Record of the Year category for "Higher Love." A third Grammy went to engineers for their work on his "Back In The High Life" LP. The veteran British artist was also honored with a Grammy for Best Pop Vocal Performance, Male. Winwood's career spans over two decades and has included remarkable stints with the groups The Spencer Davis Group, Traffic and Blind Faith. These were his first Grammies.

The odds-on favorite for Record of the Year going into Tuesday's awards show was Dionne & Friends' "That's What Friends Are For," Dionne Warwick's charity effort on behalf of AIDS research. "Friends" was eventually vindicated, though, winning Song of the Year, an award going to its writers, Burt Bacharach and Carol Bayer Sager. The pair gave an emotional acceptance in which they mentioned (continued on page 25)

ASCAP Wins \$60 Million Interim Blanket License Fee

NEW YORK—The interim blanket license fee for the some 750 local television stations that utilize ASCAP-licensed music was raised from \$40 million to \$60 million a year for the period beginning April 1, 1985 and ending March 31, 1988 in a decision by U.S. Magistrate Michael H. Dolinger in U.S. District Court in New York City February 17. Dolinger's decision stated, in part, "We are-...left, at this particular stage, without any precise guidelines for setting an interim figure. Since, however, the interim fee is subject to retroactive alteration upon the setting of a final fee - which is likely to oc-

cur in the relatively near future — and since neither party has suggested that a temporary fee anywhere within the broad range presently at issue would cause it irreparable harm, a blanket license fee will be set based upon the use of the somewhat arbitrary

ASCAP issued a statement saying: "ASCAP is very pleased that the magistrate has increased the interim fee from \$40 million a year to \$60 million a year for the period beginning April 1, 1985. We are still studying the decision.'

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
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

ceremonial revelry at some of the poshest boîtes in the basin. A&M had their party at Spago, Atlantic partied at Mr. Chow's, Warner Bros. overtook Chasen's, RCA was holed up at 385 North .. if "We Are The World" was guiltmotivated, the sumptuousness of Grammy night festivities could have had something to do with it. By far the most spiffy gathering was the CBS bash at Rex, where waiters made it their primary concern that no one's glass be at a loss for champagne for very long, and where sustenance included a lobster-bedecked food sculpture amidst an altogether massive spread. Natch, celebrities arrived by the limo full. Al Teller chatted with The Beastie Boys, Olivia Newton-John talked it up with Michelle Lee at a quiet upstairs table and Billy Idol jabbered with just about everyone (not his fault) . . . to drop a few names. Three or four blocks away was the main Grammy party, shaking up several floors of the Westin Bonaventure Hotel, As usual. tons of food, drink and music were on hand there, too, but the bars are no-host (which isn't nearly as much fun as holding out your glass to be refilled every two minutes, now is it?). Still, the bonaventure party is a large, generous, splashy event. This year's music, situated in the various theme ballrooms at the Bonaventure (rock'n'roll, jazz, classical and country) included The Heaters, the Western Swing Association. the Count Basie Orchestra, the Pro Arte Quartet and the Mundell Lowe Quartet.

NEW FACES TO WATCH

The first U.S. single release from Australia's Venetians, an intoxicating dance tune called "So Much For Love," is one of those lively records which other parts of the world catch onto long before the general American public gets

Recorded in late 1985 with producer Mark Opitz, the tune has already peaked at #8 on the Australian charts, and is included (along with two other previously released singles) on the band's debut Chrysalis album, "Calling In The Lions."

Consisting mostly of Englishman (except for drummer Tim Powles, who is a New Zealander), the Venetains were formed down under five years ago. Its members include lead vocalist Rik Swinn, guitarist/vocalist Dave Skeet, keyboardist Matthew Hughes, bassist Peter Wilson and Powles.

"I went to Australia in 1982," Swinn told Cash Box, "because England was really cracking up as a live situation. The places where the young bands used to get out and sort of strut their stuff had all closed down. Hence, England started to manufacture their recording artists a lot more. Australia, on the other hand, is totally the opposite - it's totally a live situation. So I took the risk and moved, and it was really good timing, because people now take Australia as a sort of viable proposition.'

Swinn, who had been with a band called the Lasers in England, ventured to Australia with a 24-track master demo in tow of a song he'd written and recorded for an English producer who hoped to land a record deal for the Lasers. Entitled "Sound On Sound,"the tune differed from the Lasers' usual sound, and when the producer focused on Swinn's song alone, the band broke up.

After encountering lukewarm response for the side in England, Swinn went ahead with his already-laid plans for a move to Australia, where he quickly set about gathering a new band. "Within a month I had a record deal, a publishing deal and aband,'' he remembers.

It was "Sound On Sound" that lan ed thenewly-formed Venetians the first record deal - with Australia's Fes val Records. Their version of the sor was released in April, 1983, and b came an underground hit, gathering cult following for the band.

and vigorous in-house action by commissioning two of our own CD manufacturing plants - the first in Swindon, UK was opened in May 1986, and the second in Jacksonville, Illinois, USA, came on stream last November. These two plants, in addition to completing the expansion of the Gotemba factory of our joint venture with Toshiba in Japan, provided us with sufficient captive CD capacity to enable releasing the Beatles catalog on this wonderful digital carrier which we are doing in batches commencing with the first four albums on February 26.


Q: What prompted the decision to release the UK formats worldwide and the mono versions?

Menon: We believe it is terribly important to preserve the original pristine purity of this great catalog and the CD program therefore provides each album with exactly the same mixes that were approved by the Beatles and George Martin, packaged exactly as they were originally and even issued on the original Beatles label - Parlophone. The

reason why the first four releases and mono are simply because those record were made for mono and never intende. be stereo. We were fortunate to ob-George Martin's close participation and vice on this entire project and we fully curred with his judgement that CD's those early records should be issued in t original mono format.

Q: Is there any truth in the stories that rc ty disputes/legal arguments delayed th sue of the Beatles on CD's?

Menon: Though we are currently in nec ations with Apple with regard to a consional CD royalty arrangement, this has nothing to do with our decision to defer release of Beatles CD's until such time as felt confident that we had access to quate manufacturing capacity, with which we would have been unable to ser in an orderly and well-supported mai what we full well expect to be formid worldwide consumer demand. Though they had a record deal, those days were so lean that Skinner wrote a song called "The Broken Years," their first single, that asks the question "Are you broke?" "That song was written when we were broke," he says flatly. "We gave up jobs and things so we could just rehearse."

"The way we write songs, it's very hard to see how they come," he says. "One minute you don't have something and the next minute it's there. ('Broken Years') is about being on the dole, and also about lost love, and incorporating those two wonderful, well-trodden themes."

"The Broken Years" got them enough attention so they could record a follow-up single, a cryptic quasi-gospel tune called "Ask The Lord." "That started off with a sort of gospel feel, and that implies a lot of things lyrically as well," he says. The lyrics to the song — particularly the chorus of "Black money pays for suffering" — is so open-ended that the South African government banned the song, thinking it was about apartheid. "That didn't upset us," Skinner says, laughing. "As long as they don't ban it in America."

"Black money just means bad money," he explains. "It could be about anything: it could be apartheid or it could be anything."

They followed "Ask The Lord" with a third single, some say their best, called "The Honeythief," which Skinner says was inspired by the novel *Lolita*. "The Honeythief" is the lead track on their Columbia album, and it is the current single and video as well.

The inclusion of the three singles —
"The Honeythief," "Ask The Lord," and
"The Broken Years" — almost assures that
this album will enjoy a protracted stay on
the charts. But the rest of the album is also

HELL BENT AND HEAVEN SENT

 The best indie debut album so far this year is without a doubt Webb Wilder and the Beatneck's "It Came From Nashville" (Landslide). If I were at a major, I'd pounce.

Webb Wilder is not your average rocker. He's an image-slinging, six-foot-four Mississippi eccentric who has his own (let's hope he's joking) quirky ideas about things. He believes in UFOs and alien beings, disclaims association with the devil, and recently turned down a spot on *Star Search* because the show was in color. "We only do black and white television," says Wilder.

But his music is far more earthly. It's spare and hard country-rock in the manner of **Dave Edmunds, Jason and The Scorchers, The Georgia Satellites,** and **Steve Earle,** but with a sense of campy Americana that sets him apart. On this album, Wilder and the Beatnecks push the pedal to the metal on a heartland joyride that's hellbent and heaven sent.

Producer **Robert Field** writes or cowrites many of the tracks, and his songs are artful, witty and packed with images of sunbelt marginalia: "a mobile home magnate," a temptress with "more spice than a Cajun cook," and guys "they warned you about in Bible school."

Wilder grew up with Field in deepest Mississippi ("so far south it's almost no man's land"), and they've often collaborated. "For instance, we wrote a song called 'Tell Me Why, Charlene," says Wilder, "and I came up with all these service station attendant, shade-mechanic Mississippi sort of colloquialisms."

The band, however, is at least as responsible for bringing these songs to full bloom — particularly guitarist **Donny Roberts**, who adds inspired touches. While Wilder sings "I've got a bumblebee inside my head," Roberts plays a buzz-like riff, and elsewhere he highlights melodies, and tears off leads with madman intensity.

It's hard to believe that the Beatnecks have only been around a couple of years, given the almost telepathic level of musical interplay involved. From the **Rockpile**-ish "Is This All There Is" and the **Ventures** kick of "Horror Hayride" to a souped-up cover of Steve Earle's "The Devil's Right Hand," this album is a sheer joy to listen to. (Webb Wilder and The Beatnecks tentatively plan to play New York in April.)

TIM BERNE'S sold-out show at the Kitchen (2/21) was an unqualified triumph that had the overflow crowd shouting for more even after the last notes of his "Icicles Revisited" encore. The alto-saxophonist took elements from jazz, rock, and classical music, and the result was not a fusion so much as a brawl between genres — a compelling and completely original one at that.

Berne is currently touring behind his "Fulton Street Maul" (Columbia) album, which includes some dazzling compositions. In concert, "Miniature" gradually built from miniature staccato bursts to a gigantic intensity, while "Conversations With Harold" opened with a muted, underwater sound that evolved into an easy swing, like a conversation that gets beyond the reticent stage and hits a groove.

But it was "Federico," also from "Fulton Street Maul," that produced gasps of awe from the audience. The quintet conjured the baroque ambience of a Mediterranean circus, but ended with a minimal drum solo, the drummer shaking his brush-stick, taking the sound down lower, lower, barely audible, and then into complete silence.

Many retailers experienced a sharp decline in sales last fall and the beginning of this year with the possibly over-publicized live Bruce Springsteen package. Some, like Lasky, were left with too much product after sales declined. "My hope is that these titles sell-through nicely," says Lasky, "and that three months from now, and when the next titles, which are much stronger by the way, come out, we're all in a nice inventory position. We've sold through and none of us are sitting with excess like we are with uncle Bruce. The way Capitol has structured this thing is very well thought through."

"We're watching the orders very carefully," says McCarrell. "We don't intend for anybody to get stuck with anything. I was at CBS and watched the whole Springsteen thing and it's very easy to get caught up in the media hysteria and deceive yourself to a certain extent to what the real consumer demand is. You've go to be very careful with those things because ultimately, if you over ship those things, you're just shipping returns and that's no good."

Lou Garrett, vice president of music purchasing for Camelot Enterprises, says while he thinks the release of the Beatle discs is a "happening," he thinks this will have "nowhere near the impact" of the Springsteen package. "This is really a catalog type item. I can't believe, and I hope I'm wrong, that two weeks from now people are going to knocking doors down asking for these things. I think there will be steady business on it to be sure, but you're only going to get the benefit of all the publicity, the hoopla, and all the hype the first week and part of the next." The 190 store chain ordered roughly 50,000 units.

Steve Lerner, director of purchasing for Record World Enterprises, was more optimistic for the long range sales. "I think it will help us a heck of a lot. We experienced a big let down with Springsteen after Christmas. We'd better not have that with the Beatles. My personal opinion is, it will not be as big as Bruce out of the box, but in the long run, it will have more staying power."

Bob Brownell, owner of the prototype National Compact Disc Franchise in California, a CD only store, says he's giving customers a discount from the regular price, only because of costumer interest. They are giving a five percent discount for two or three discs and a ten percent discount for all four. "Our store is geared more toward service, with our listening stations and our resale. We take trade-ins. Many customers will bring in trade-ins and apply them toward the Beatle CDs. In essence, I wouldn't have even offered any discounts whatsoever except for the fact there there were so many advertised discounts and my customers were demanding it."

has now come.

Q: How many Beatles CD's do you expect to sell?

Menon: As a matter of company policy we do not publicly disclose sensitive competitive information such as actual or forecast sales of individual product. However, it would be safe to assume that the Beatles CD catalog will represent the largest sales achievement of any repertoire yet released on this configuration.

Q: Have you personally discussed the release of the CD's with any of the Beatles?

Menon: I have personally discussed all aspects of the Beatles CD releases with George Martin and I have also kept Yoko Ono informed through her representative. Martin has explained our program to Paul McCartney who supports it enthusiastically. We sent early copies of the first four CD releases to George, Ringo, Paul and Yoko, and I expect them to be fully satisfied with the results.

Q: What are the plans for future Beatles CD releases?

Menon: Our plan is to release CD's of the entire original catalog of twelve albums, including the "White Album" which was a two-record set, in the same chronological order as their original UK analogue releases. We will do this in batches with the next release in April 1987 featuring "Rubber Soul," "Revolver" and "Help," followed by "Sgt Pepper" on June 1, 1987 which is the 20th Anniversary of the original release date of that album. This will be followed by "White Album" and "Yellow Submarine" in August 1987 and finally by "Abbey Road" and "Let It Be" in October this year.

George Martin, producer of each of the four Beatles albums now on CD, was interviewed at London's AIR Studios in mid-February of this year.

Q: What has been your involvement with the first four Beatles' Compact Discs released February 26?

Martin: Listening to them. Rupert Perry, managing director at EM! Records, asked me to listen to what had been done in December in the way of issuing stereo versions of the Beatles records on CD. I listened and didn't think they were very good and I was also worried because they were perpetuating a kind of myth that had grown up that those early records were made in stereo. I preferred the mono original and said the mono should be issued

Q: Why did you feel so strongly about the monorecordings?

Martin: We are talking about the very first records the Beatles made, in fact the first four Beatles albums issued. While I think there might be a case for for issuing the last two of the four in stereo at some time, in view of the way in which they were done I think it was very sensible to make them all mono CDs. The first Beatles records were mono records. They were not stereo records and never intended to be.

Q: How do you recollect those early days in the studios?

Martin: When I made those mono records the only machines available in the studios were either a mono machine or a stereo machine which the classical people used. I used a stereo machine as a twin track machine - I separated the two sides - and recorded them separately. But as we did live performances of the Beatles in the initial stages, I put all the rhythm on one track and all the voices on another. The reason for that was not to make stereo, but so that after the Beatles went home I was able to compress the two together to get a hard impact sound for mono - it saved me time and it gave me a better record.

Q: Would you have changed things in the light of the technical developments since 1962?

Martin: Of course I would have changed things, if I had today's technology, but the actual quality of the recording I'm very pleased with, listening to them again, going back all those years. They have a tremendous drive and vivacity and cleanliness which I'm very pleased about.

Q: Have you discussed the CDs with any of the Beatles?

Martin: I've only been able to get hold of Paul and I told him I'd heard them and that they were very good and that I was doing some work on the next batch.

Q: You are currently involved in work on future Beatles CD releases. What exactly are you doing?

Martin: I'm working on "Help," "Revolver" and "Rubber Soul." When I heard the transfers that had been done I didn't think they were very good and could have been cleaned up. So I asked if I could listen to the original four tracks that had been done and I found there were things on there which could have been put over on to Compact Disc much better, so I've been working on that. Not to change anything, but to clean up the sound-it's surprising how effective it is because on CD you hear so much more-you hear distortion and all sorts of things you'd rather not hear, things you didn't hear in the original songs.

Q: After these, there is of course "Sgt. Pepper." Do you foresee any particular problems in relation to the CD?

Martin: Well, we got better as we went on. I started recording the Beatles in 1962 - when life was very primitive in technical terms - and "Sgt. Pepper" was 1967 and we'd had five years experience by then and we'd gained stereo. So by the time "Sgt Pepper" came along, although it was only four track, it was a fairly good stereo record and I'm rather reluctant to touch it although I'd like to hear the original again. One of the benefits of going back and listening to these originals, while I'm not changing anything - the mixes are exactly as I did them 22 years ago - we are gaining technically because we are going back to the original four track 1" masters and we don't have any generation loss of dubbing down to stereo and then copy masters.

Q: How did you feel listening to the recordings over 20 years later?

Martin: Until recently, I'd never sat down and clinically listened to these Beatles recordings as you do when you're making a recording. It's been exciting but somewhat traumatic, particularly going back over the master tapes and listening to all the out-takes and listening to John's voice sort of chatting me up as I'm playing piano with him. It's like going back in time and it's a little bit unnerving and at the same time thrilling because in fact the rawness of their performance is wonderful - thrilled me to bits to listen to those voices as they were. I'm so glad they're going out on CD.

Q: What are the most important points to be made to people buying the Beatles Compact Discs?

Martin: I think the point to be stressed is that these are vintage recordings - it is a long time ago. The first record was made at the end of 1962 and life was primitive in technical terms so translating them to this modern media does give problems. Really, stereo didn't become popular until "Sgt. Pepper" - previously it had something of a lesser attraction. We were still experimenting. On "Rubber Soul" for instance. I haven't changed it because in my sense of experimenting I put a lot of lead voices on the right hand track only, put bass on the left and not much in the middle. I was playing around, finding out the best format for stereo - the Beatles had nothing to with that, it was just my aberration. But at the same time, mono was the way they were recorded and the impact is tremendous.





Don was sa impressed with O'Bryon's distinctive delivery, romontic presence and notural musical ability, that he signed the tolented 18 year ald ta o management cantroct ane week later. Certainly he wosn't the first star ta have storted perfecting their vacal talents via the church choir. Ta campile o list af thase wha storted singing in the chair ond hove maved on to become tap recording ortists would read like o wha's wha in the music business and would encamposs mony poges of this publication. Although he wosn't the first, he was perhops the mast surprised. In foct, during o recent conversation with this down to

earth young mon, he was very reflective obout the chain af events that lead ta his meteoric rise to recording occloim and the mossive exposure he hos gornered. Despite the worldly attention he has received, O'Bryon realized and treats this as the highly campetitive business that he must cantral insteod of vice verso. Understanding the competitive nature af the recard business, O'Bryon is olwoys seeking woys to imprave, in fact, he spake af some very interesting cancepts in terms of directions that he has presented ta Capitol ond his monogement. It olmast seemed pre-destined for O'Bryan ta became a top recording ortist hoving leorned ta ploy piono when he was six yeors ald, (bath parents play piana ond hove sung in local gaspel graups for yeors), but he never hod o vacol lessan in his life. He is whot you would coll a notural! In foct, this naw impressive songwriter had never written a sang until "Gigalo" his first chart topping single that reached tap 5 status fram an equally impressive debut LP "Doin' Alright." Enjoying the success of his first recard far Copitol, his confidence was certainly balstered thus he quit his jab ot a county government affice. Successful fallow-up singles included his incredible cover of "Still Water (Love)," top 15 singles an "You And I" and "I'm Freaky." His fourth album "Surrender" tokes O'Bryon inta o mare moture direction dealing musically with songs

obaut love ond the relotianships af men ond women. This reporter certoinly left the interview with O'Bryan feeling great, reolizing that far sameone so young in the business and chranologically (25) he thoraughly understands the good, the bod and the indifferences that one can encaunter in the highly competitive record business. This young mon will ga for, because af tolent and mast importantly, o winning attitude!



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Rick Blackburn: Profiling The Country Market

(The following article concludes a twopart interview with CBS' Rick Blackburn)

"Before you can develop any kind of o marketing strategy—you gotta hove enough dota an what the market is, or what the current market conditions are."

That's not exactly a blinding flash, of caurse. In fact, it is merely basic business sense. Basic military sense, too, for that matter. Like checking aut the terrain befare you engage the enemy. Or checking out the Drap Zane befare yau jump aut af an airplone.

Sometimes it can just be phrased "laok before you leap."

But far CBŚ-Nashville chief Rick Blackburn it's nat just a phrase, it's a way of life in the day-to-day manipulating af his division thraugh an ever-present obstacle course. Particularly during the arduous "transitian" period that the business has been undergoing here in Music City these last few years—a period which a number of music biz execs seem ta see as waning, if nat having totally passed. A raunding of the bend, sa ta speak, aut af o gray and murky time period into ane of more clarity. Blackburn's apinians olign him with that camp.
"Particularly in the product line can-

"Particularly in the product line canfiguration," he says—an area which has seen major fluctuation in recent years.

seen major fluctuation in recent years.
"We hove seen, in '85 and '86, the decline of the [record album], down to where, right naw, it's raughly 10% af aur business."

Vinyl, in generol, appears to be going the way of the dinosaur, judging by those declining LP sales as well as the vanishing singles business, which Blackburn says is down to 50% of where it was 5 years ago. (And that wasn't exactly o boam time in the history of country singles sales.)

If vinyl anly accounts for 10% of LP sales, obviously there's another 90% still oraund somewhere. That 90% is in the form of tape and CDs. And while cassette sales hove remained constant, the exceptional grawth at the CD apparently has been o pleasant surprise.

Movement Towards CDs

"The compact disc is here to stay. Sales have now accounted for 25, 30% of our business and that's for beyond what we thought it would be at this stoge. For some reason we thought the

campact disc would came slawer.

"There's this myth about cauntry music fans—that they are still into 8-trock, that they are slow to change—and a lat of that has been true. When they were making the transitian fram 8-track to cassette, far instance, the music cansumers had a library af 8-tracks. They had an 8-track player in their car, they had an 8-track player in their home. And they weren't going to take their entire collection and dump it in the river—and then come up with thousands af dollars to start a new library.

"It's a different story with campact discs. That country cansumer that's out there naw is nat just fixed on traditional cauntry, he likes ather farms of music, like Lianel Richie and same af the ather bigger names—Billy Jael—also appeal ta them. [They feel] they have o need far technology and better quality—particularly naw that compact discs are available at a reosanable price. Yau can get a gaad campact disc player for between, say, \$100 to \$200. So the price is reasanable and naw we're seeing that they are starting to build up the [CD] library.

"The key will be when the campact discs are available in outomobiles—that's gonna be the real shat in the arm far the record industry."

Labels like CBS are also "quietly watching" the development of the digital audio tape (DAT) as a possible marketing canfiguratian far music. Essentially a cassette, the DAT is credited with remorkably clean delivery of saund—much like that attributed to the CD. But, while Blackburn expresses a mild anticipation taward "a dagfight" between the tape manufacturers and the CD industry ("the tape manufacturers are not ganna take this lying dawn," he asserts), he also admits that "certainly campact discs have the jump."

He sees one other strong advantage ta the CD. Or, rother, he sees a strong disadvantage ta the DAT: its ability to be used as a reproducing agent.

"We're about to be pirated again," he laughs, shaking his head.

Country Consumer Renaissance

The growth of the CD, with its abviaus benefits, is juxtapased alangside what Blackburn sees as a broadening consumer bose. Cansumers who are buying into country "...nat for the reasons of just be-

ing country, [but] for the reasons of artists' saund. We're seeing that today. The O'Kanes, for example. That music is selling. When we poll people—do focus graups—and get same data bock, we'll say 'Do you like The O'Kanes?' and the response might be, 'Well, we don't know wha they are. But we liked "Oh, Darlin".'

"They like the music, they like the sound, they like the songs, and they will purchase it based an that. And thot's the first time we've seen that in awhile. It used to be that our fon base was pretty layal ta artists— whatever a superstar put out they would buy. [But] it's a new day, it's a renoissance."

Still A Boutique Business

Despite the new cansumer and quantum leaps in the technology, however, Blackburn daes nat see the cauntry music market burgeoning into "mass appeal" status.

"I think it's gonna be specialized," he divulges. "Not unlike the cookie business. When yau laak at Keebler and some of the major cookie manufacturers—they are not the mojor manufacturers anymore. It's a bautique business. David's Cookies—somewhere in a shopping center, specializes in nathing but cookies. This may not be a gaod example, but yau'll get an idea af where I'm gaing with it.

"I think country music is a bout business. I think it's highly specio and I think we will develop specia outlets and da a better job of taking music ta aur consumer. Labels Rounder, Sugar Hill ond some at 1 m specialized boutique labels are [olraright on it. I think they're poisec mark. As long as they [cantinue to what they're daing.

"I see tremendaus oppartunity that far cauntry music—instead of that sit dawn and [cancern ourselves questions like] how do we crass chaw da we campete with Duran Dand how do we take our place an and all af those kinds af things. I Nashville has been hung up an that of an [assignment]. In the long run, I it's [heading] the other way."

Even the yauth-ariented pop bus mis becoming more specialized

"Basically, that's a boutique business. It's specialized; it's targeted for a specialized; it's targeted for a young-adult, teen, sub-teen market. They've got it, and they do a gaar with it.

"Country music is not teen-ariq KK music. This is a music form obout I was cheating, hurting, drinking, heart at KE You hove to live it to enjoy it, you u stand. I don't see cauntry music, with the message, trying to get into that was environment."

On the other hand, he acknowle that the cauntry market daes equate "adult superstars like Lionel Richies Billy Jael, and sa farth, who cer the singer/sangwriter. We have a least chance of homogenizing with that the of a market. In fact, they're hamage ing with us! Lionel Richie doing a with Alabama—"DeepHiver Won with Alabama—"DeepHiver Won the was a fantastic record! Forgel all charts, I know it died there. But it agreat recard! The cansumer proliter thaught it was #1.

"I think we've got aur work cut a us. I think we need ta stay focused specialized and understond what market is and what aur apport, are, and not worry so much about 's going on in ather markets. That's we lase it, I think. Some of the ath bels see that differently and akay."

GEFFEN GETS A BARGAIN-The

expense of producing the average music video has long been a sore point for record companies, leading some industry honchos to question the relative worth of videos in the breaking of records or exposure for new acts. With production costs soaring upwards of \$50,000 for a single clip - rivalling the cost of recording a full album - what exec in his right mind would resist the chance to make high-quality videos for less than a quarter the going rate? Not Geffen a&r exec Michael Rosenblatt, who's economy-minded brain storm might spawn the latest trend in the music video business: In-house video production. Rosenblatt is responsible for obtaining the services of Miamibased video directors Angel Gracia and Cliff Guest, the guys who turned in the winning video for Madonna's MTV True Blue "Make My Video" contest. The two have been tagged to do low-cost in-house videos for the label's up-and-coming acts. Their Madonna video was of such surprisingly high quality - and low cost - that Rosenblatt got them to do two yet-to-be-released Tim Scott videos. These videos turned out so well, and for so little money, the boys were hired. "I was trying to figure out how to make videos for certain acts without spending a fortune,"Rosenblatt told Audio/Video, "and I saw these guys' Madonna video on MTV. and I thought the video was just fantastic. Then I saw them on MTV with Madonna and they said it cost them \$1,000, so I called them up. They made these fantastic videos for me for Tim Scott, and I just thought . . . let's hire 'em!" While the cost of making videos was a prime motivation for hiring an inhouse production team, Rosenblatt stresses that saving money wouldn't mean anything if the videos weren't up to par."The cost factor is definitely there, but if these guys made (poor) videos I wouldn't be using them. If they weren't competitive with what's on MTV it would be a waste of time. But these videos are very competitive. They're very, very good videos and it's just amazing that we can do it at this cost." Hiring Gracia and Guest doesn't mean the label will take all its videos inhouse, and the pair are the only videomakers Geffen plans to take on at the moment. And while at present their videos are limited only to the label's developing acts, as Rosenblatt says, that situation may change. "I have a feeling that when some of the bigger acts see the quality of these videos, they're going to want to use them."

OVERSIGHT—Last week I told you that the forthcoming First Annual Soul Train Music Awards was the first show "honoring black music alone," and blathered on and on about filling gaps and "a long time coming" and such, while completely overlooking Dick Clark Productions' Black Gold Awards, a show seen nationally in syndication for the past four years. Produced by Larry Kline and directed by Chris Donovan (tasks usually performed by Gene Weed, who served as supervising producer on this year's show due to other commitments) the show has been taped for the last two years at the Orpheum Theatre in Memphis. The first two were held at L.A.'s Cocoanut Grove. Lou Rawls, co-executive producer with Dick Clark, is the two-hour show's ongoing host, joined each year by a different co-host, along with a slew of celebrity presenters and performers. The most recent show was taped February 19 (to be seen through March and April) with Natalie Cole as co-host, and such performers as New Edition and Andre Crouch (among many others). The show is geared toward newer acts, with its four awards categories honoring Top New artists. Veteran acts are also recognized, through a series of "Legend" awards. Watch for it.



Columbia with eight and RCA with seven were the big Grammy winners among the labels.

After last week's awards show, the leader board of career Grammy winners was changed only slightly. Sir Georg Solti remained the Academy's leading winner as his Grammy for Best Classical Orchestral Recording gave him a total 25 career Grammies. The addition of two Grammies for Vladimir Horowitz placed him in a tie for second with Henry Mancini at 20.

From Simon's straight-forward acceptance speech for Album of the Year, in which he referred to Apartheid as "one of the most oppressive regimes on the planet today," to Crystal's opening hope that (tonight) "the world is at peace and music reigns" the show had humanitarian impact similar to that of last year's "We Are The World" issue of world hunger.

The most unexpected emotional peak for those who've heard the song as many times as most humans living on planet Earth these days - was the Dionne Warwick, Stevie Wonder, Gladys Knight and Burt Bacharach (at the piano) rendition of "That's What Friends Are For,"a song which has thus far raised 3/4 of a million dollars for AIDS research.

Produced for the 18th year by Pierre Cossette Productions, in association with the 6.000-member National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences, the show had the kind of energy and emotional tension that sets a mediocre awards show apart from a good one.

There will also be a chili cook-off, an exhibition of Western movie stuntwork, recitations by the Cowboy Poets and horsemanship demonstrations—and that's just the *country* aspect of the festival which focuses on the multicultural life of the people of L.A.





giving something back to the community and, obviously, once you get the child into the game room they should spend more dollars after they've gone through their free tokens. More importantly, however, is that by undertaking such a program you're instilling the belief that you care about the well-being of the youngsters and are willing to work hand-in-hand with the educational system to provide extra stimulus for exceptional performance.

Fund raising activities are another avenue well worth investigating. How many times have we seen children getting sponsors for the number of laps they can swim, or the number of miles they will run? Often, these events are tied in with charities or local civic groups who are trying to raise funds. The visibility in the local press and media is always enormous and a perfect opportunity to put your best face forward.

Open the doors of your game room and have youngsters play pinball machines and video games. Let them go out and get pledges from their parents and other adults based on the number of points they can score on a given machine. It can be as simplistic as a dollar for every million points scored on a pinball machine, or pennies for 100,000 point increments. In addition, you should back the children and pledge some dollars from your business. Maybe it's \$50 a week for a month period or some other monetary gesture that is substantial enough to warrant the attention and notice of the public.

A different method for generating favorable press and community goodwill is to get your name out. There are always baseball, soccer and bowling leagues where you could sponsor a team and provide the necessary uniforms, team shirts, whatever. After all, if it's good enough for the automobile dealership and other merchants, why shouldn't you get in the act as well?

NAMA Offers 'Operation Alert' In Response To Cigarette Ban

CHICAGO — Proposals to restrict the placement of cigarette vending machines or to ban them have surfaced in the legislatures of several states recently, according to Richard W. Funk, director of government affairs of the National Automatic Merchandising Association (NAMA).

"We are working with NAMA members, representatives of the Tobacco Institute and the tobacco companies in opposing these proposals, specifically by utilizing the Operation Alert materials which NAMA improved last year through a nationwide survey of where cigarette machines are located." Funk reported.

He said that proposals to outlaw the placement of cigarette machines have been introduced in Connecticut and Minnesota in recent weeks. In Dade County, Florida which includes the city of Miami, a citizens petition filed with the County Commission calls for a ban on the machines. In New Jersey hearings on the subject were conducted by the State Public Health Board.

NAMA eastern counsel Thomas E. McMahon and industry representatives testified in behalf of cigarette machine operators in both cases and submitted NAMA material which proves that the vast majority of machines is located where minors are not present, such as taverns, cocktails lounges and offices.

Funk said that proposals in Georgia and Maine are aimed at limiting machines to places where minors are not present. Similar restrictions are in force in Utah and Idaho

"We expect that in the present climate of efforts to restrict smoking in public areas, transportation facilities and even in the work place, additional states and other entities may try to ban or restrict our machines with the alleged intent of keeping cigarettes away from minors," said Funk.

"Our research and Operation Alert material shows convincingly that cigarette machines are not and cannot be a source for minors because few machines are located in places where minors are admitted or would go without accompanying adults," he stated.

"NAMA has been the leader in opposing illogical restrictions on cigarette machines since the 1960's and I urge any industry member who encounters negative proposals to contact one of our three offices immediately for assistance and to get the information materials which we have prepared," he added.

Bally Reports Twelve Months And Fourth Quarter Results For '86

CHICAGO—Robert E. Mullane, president and chairman of the board of Bally Manufacturing Corp. announced the results of operations for the year and fourth quarter ended December 31, 1986. For the year, revenues were \$1,639.0 million compared to \$1,344.8 million reported in 1985. Net income was \$23.7 million compared to \$25.6 million in 1985. Earnings per share were \$0.81 compared to earnings per share of \$0.95 reported in 1985.

For the fourth quarter ended December 31, 1986, revenues were \$360.5 million compared to \$258.7 million in 1985. For the same period the net loss was \$10.1 million compared to a net loss of \$4.6 million reported in 1985. The loss per share was \$0.33 compared to a net loss per share of \$0.17 reported in 1985.

Mullane, in commenting on 1986, said, "Bally's results fell short of the prior year by \$0.14 per share. The new tax law which retroactively removed the ITC (Investment Tax Credit) had the effect at Bally of reducing 1986 net income by \$0.15 per share. On

a comparable basis, if the ITC had remained in effect, Bally would have shown a slight increase in earnings per share in 1985."

He noted that Bally's Park Place in Atlantic City was again one of the most profitable casino hotels in the city. "Bally has further increased its casino hotel and gaming activities in 1987," said Mullane, adding that "Bally reached agreement with Golden Nugget, Inc. to purchase that company's highly regarded casino hotel on the Boardwalk in Atlantic City." According to Mulane "this transaction will be consummated in the near future pending regulatory approval and the resolution of certain legal impediments."

With regard to amusement equipment Mullane said, "our coin-op amusement game business had an outstanding year as revenues continued strong in 1986 on a comparable store basis and the company produced some of the most popular amusement games introduced into the market in 1986."

New Illinois Law Aids Vending Ops

CHICAGO — A new Illinois law signed by Governor James Thompson in early February, requires cities and towns whose population is under one million to notify vending machine license holders thirty days before increased license fees can be put into effect, according to William R. Brandstrader, counsel and NAMA director of state councils.

"Our Illinois Automatic Merchandising Council members have worked hard for two years to get the legislature to adopt this provision under their Operation Roll Back program," Brandstrader stated. "We already have similar legislation in effect in Minnesota. In my experience the best tool

for limiting or defeating license fee changes is timely knowledge so that we can work with the authorities before it is too late."

Brandstrader estimates that the Roll Back program has produced annual license fee savings of up top \$90,000. This will be enhanced by the new law. Any increases voted without the required pre-notification to licensees will be illegal.

The Illinois Council, with guidance from NAMA, has been working for several years to reduce excessive per-machine licenses in the huge Chicago suburban market and the early notification now required will be a key tool in that effort, Brandstrader said.

You might even want to open your doors to the league at the end of the year and provide a fun afternoon for all the children by offering some free play, tokens, or other premiums that you might quickly dismiss as having no value. All of the posters and other items from the trade shows are wonderful items that have real value to those on the outside—and all it would probably take is a phone call to your local distributor or the manufacturer directly.

An event such as this gives your game room an opportunity to take center stage and provide a dimension that is so sorely lacking from the image that is normally associated with coin-operated amusement machines. Plus you're getting people in the door and making them comfortable with the surroundings while also showcasing just what it is that you have to offer. You might even go so far as to take out some of your plush toys from the crane and give these away to the winning teams in a given league. The bottomline is to get, and stay, involved.

Although there are many, many more possibilities to consider, a last one we'll review here is to get on the raffle bandwagon. Religious organizations and other civic groups are always giving away cars and ap-

pliances for the purchase of a \$1 ticket. Why not add in equipment off your floor and reap some benefits. Admittedly, this is normally a device that distributors use, but do it in tandem or on your own.

You will be surprised by the doors that will open once you become more aggressive and creative in backing activities such as these. You may even make some contacts in terms of business that can provide some long term relationships were future promotions will follow. Once you take that first step, a world will open that can only benefit your stature in the community and deliver increased visibility and awareness of your business so that parents aren't protective of their children spending time and money playing games.

What you must do is accept these type of activities as an investment in your future. You're not going to be able to balance off the money it might cost versus the money coming in, but you probably won't be able to get as much favorable press for the equal dollar amounts if you were to spend money on advertising directly. So keep an open mind and see what options are available to you. Start slow and build up to a level you're comfortable with. It's that simple.
