Oldies Are Forever

hile reading last week's issue of Cash Box we were rather surprised by Lee Jeske's East Coastings column where we discovered a small item about Chuck Berry. It seems that Chuck's autobiography - the Taylor Hackford documentary Hail! Hail! Rock & Roll - is about to be released, and is scheduled to screen at the New York Film Festival. Mind you, the founding Prince of Rock & Roll has just turned 62.

Well, that struck a little bell and we began to check the same issue of Cash Box for legends, giants and historical marvels. We were surprised at how much we discovered.

First, while we all know about Michael Jackson's Bad - but is it shocking to remember that his first number one record as a member of the Jackson Five hit the charts all the way back in November of 1969 - "I Want You Back" had a 17 week run for the Jacksons.

Smokey Robinson, who is on the charts with "One Heartbeat" (Number 12 with a bullet) first hit the charts with the Miracles and the song "Bad Girl" in October of 1959. And who knows how long the Grateful Dead have really been around, but their first chart single, "Uncle John's Band," showed up in August of 1970.

The Whispers are also on the charts in this, their 22nd year of performing and recording. Then there's Mick Jagger, who started life as a Rolling Stone. Mick has a new single and album on Columbia -- yet his debut on the Cash Box charts was with "Not Fade Away" in May of 1964.

Bill Medley, half of the Righteous Brothers, debuted in May of 1963 with "Little Latin Lupe." This week he's charted another duet, this time with Jennifer Warnes, on "I've Had The Time Of My Life." This single, from the platinum hit soundtrack, Dirty Dancing, moves to Number 50 with a bullet.

There are dozens of comparisons to consider as we salute those stars who have stood the test of time. Today, Herb Alpert's Keep Your Eye On Me is still charted - and let's remember that he debuted in Cash Box in October of 1962. The Bee Gees - who debuted on our charts in May 1967, are looking forward to even more success with their new LP, E • S • P.

Starship has been around since February of 1967, incorporating a variety of names, and it's interesting to note that both the King and Queen of disco, Donna Summer and Barry White have returned with strong albums, and have graced the cover of Cash Box in the last two

It all goes to prove two things; great talent is great talent and we were right the first time around on these timeless artists.

Martin confirmed that several soundtracks were selling briskly. "It's just amazing because they all hit at once. The Disorderlies' soundtrack is also doing well here. Soundtracks bring people into the stores just looking for that record. That goes for malls, as well as freestanders -soundtracks help there, too. After paying to go to a movie, it's nice to know you can re-live the experience over and over, for the price of a record, CD or whatever."

Jazz Bassist Jaco Pastorius Dead At 35

NEW YORK - Jaco Pastorius, the widely-influential electric bassist and former member of Weather Report, died of a stroke in Florida on September 21 at the age of 35. The details of Pastorious' death were unclear at press time - he had apparently been involved in a barroom altercation several days before his death - but he had spent years fighting drug and alcohol problems in the years before his

Pastorius was born in Norristown, Pennsylvania on December 1, 1951 and grew up in Florida. He first came to national recognition when he replaced Alphonso Johnson in Weather Report in 1976. Pastorius was a flashy, often outrageous, bassist gifted with a phenomenal technique – one part jazz, one part rock, one part Jaco Pastorius.

During his several years with Weather Report, his bass features -



flashy improvisations that would invariably culminate in "Purple Haze" were consistent crowd-pleasers. A frequent winner of Down Beat's Critics and Readers Polls for Best Electric Bassist during those years, Pastorius went on to record a couple of albums as a leader - "Jaco Pastorius" (Epic), "Word of Mouth" (Warner Bros.) - before personal problems caused him to become an inconsistent performer.

Westwood One & Coors To Sponsor Unique Caravan Tour

LOS ANGELES - Radio syndicator Westwood One is teaming up with Coors Beer to present the "Four Play Tour," a 25-city club tour featuring four promising young bands. The tour begins October 16 in Stoors, Connecticut.

The bands, Will and the Kill (MCA), The Royal Court of China (A&M), Hurrah! (Arista), and The Northern Pikes (Virgin) are all currently supporting their first U.S. album releases. The caravan tour will be unique in a number of ways: no admission will be charged to the public at any stop on the tour, free Tshirts will be given out to the first 250 concert-goers at each stop, and the four record labels have agreed to share cooperatively in the marketing and promotion of the tour.

The idea to pool resources and present young bands as a package deal began at the Creative Artist

Agency. "We're very excited to be part of this project," said Mitch Rose of the CAA. 'There's so much firstclass talent out there, performers who just haven't been given the opportunity to make a name for themselves. We think that the concept of the 'Four Play' tour will help to change that."

The gratis tickets for each show will be distributed at concert venues, record stores, sponsoring radio stations, and other selected locations. No band is designated as tour "headliner," rather they will switch order every night, and all sets are limited to 35 minutes. Road crews and travel expenses will be kept to a minimum, and all the bands will travel on the same bus.

The "Four Play Tour" will be Coors' first venture into rock sponsorship, and the beer company will (continued on page 32)





LOS ANGELES - On Friday, September 11, A&M Records celebrated the end of the first summer of its Y.E.S. (Youth Entertainment Summer) to Jobs program with a luncheon at the A&M Records Soundstage in Hollywood.

The program provided 12 weeks of work for 50 minority high school students in four U.S. cities, and the label is planning to expand the program next year. Schlesinger said: "While the Academy's Lifetime Achievement Awards began in 1962, there has never been a TV special devoted to the honorees, who have heretofore been acknowledged on the annual Grammy Awards presentation. We are especially pleased to now have this opportunity to honor those who have contributed, during a lifetime, to the world of music.


LINCOLN, NEBRASKA— More than 70,000 music fans gathered here on Saturday, September 19 as singer/songwriter Willie Nelson conducted Farm Aid III at Memorial Stadium. The benefit was produced by Dick Clark Productions, and was broadcast by both the Nashville Network and Gaylord Syndicom.

A source at Farm Aid said the event posted a \$3.3 million gross. This figure includes all income from the 1-800-FARM AID phone line, ticket sales, and merchandising activity related to the ten-hour, outdoor festival.

"We still have to check some post office boxes," the source said, "and it's hard to tell about exact expenses because there are still some outstanding bills." Unoffical estimates indicate that possibly \$1.5 million could go to relieve the farm crisis.

The Nebraska weather proved pleasant for such artists as Willie Nelson, Rattlesnake Annie, the Cruzados, John Kay and Steppenwolf, Emmy Lou Harris, John Mellancamp, Joe Walsh and Neil Young, all of whom donated their efforts in support of the farmers of America.





Donna Summer

LOS ANGELES - Donna Summer, the quintessential diva of the disco era, has returned to the world of vinyl with the scintillating grooves of *All Systems Go* (Geffen Records). But it's not what you think...

Far from the cooing, moaning,

grinding blitz of Love To Love You, Baby" (number 3 in early 1976) or the dramatic histrionics of ''MacArthur Park" (number 1 in late 1978), this effort is more mature, more emotionally secure than her earlier works.

The initial single, "Dinner With Gershwin," penned and coproduced by

Brenda Russell, is a picturesque, enthralling tale of longing that is not precisely sexual, evoking sophisticated images and emotions that mirror Summer's new-look reflection:

I want to have dinner with Gershwin/
I want to watch Rembrandt sketch/
I want to talk theory with Curie/
Impossible I guess/
I want to get next to you.

There are many other highlights on All Systems Go, especially the poignant intimacy of "Thinkin' Bout My Baby," Summer's favorite track, and the desolate inspiration of "Voices Cryin' Out." On the latter track, Summer commented, " 'Voices Cryin' Out' is my socially critical song on the album. I started out writing it about people who are hungry, and then it ended up also being about kids my daughter's age. She's 14 now, and so she's almost as old as I am in her mind, and all these things that are yet to come in her life are screaming at

her 'come on and try me, come on' so she's feeling all this stuff going on inside her and she yet can't do it. So there are these voices crying out to her, and those lyrics I think are the best on the album. Musically, it's not a commercial song, but the message

on the song is what it's about." These deeper, more reflective cuts seem to echo the well-publicized changes in her personal life.

"I've always regretted to some extent having started off the way I started off," Summer admitted. "I don't regret it because it was the inroads to my career, but I regret it because I've always had to try to erase

it. I would have preferred to start off with a song like 'MacArthur Park' and have a hit record." Her rather public conversion to Christianity threw many of her fans, but her gospel roots have paid off well, with Grammy nominations for "I Believe In Jesus" (from 1980's The Wanderer) and "Forgive Me" (from 1984's Cats Without Claws, her last LP) coming in the Best Inspirational Song category.

"When you base yourself on your looks and on your sexuality, eventually it wears thin. Thankfully, I changed my course after about the second or third album. If I shake my tailfeather, and five months later, someone else comes along with a bigger, prettier tailfeather, you're going to be looking at them, and I just wanted people to know that there was more to me than that." With the release of *All Systems Go*, Donna Summer has proved that all over again.

LOS ANGELES - Heard any good gossip lately? Chances are pretty good, especially if you've taken a listen to the latest album from Australia's Paul Kelly and the Messengers, entitled Gossip (A&M). It's an eclectic 15 song collection, void of

the usual formatted, formulaic concessions.

Kelly, a 32-year old native of Adelaide, writes pop songs with a stylistic range that usually bespeaks unpreparedness or a lack of confidence in the chosen material. In this case, however, breadth of composition is indicative of a restless, talented mind at work - one that will not be satis-

fied with merely mimicking the latest trends or sounds. "I've always trusted to the fact that if you just play the things you like, your own sound will develop anyway," the diminutive, affable Kelly insisted recently. "What keeps us unified and interested is doing all the different types of songs. I think if we were just playing one type of song, we would get pretty bored with it.

The lowest denominator of Gossip is a melodic, appealing guitar-based approach, showcased prominently in cuts like "Leaps And Bounds" and "Darling It Hurts." From there, the music can, and does, go anywhere, from the lilting country strains of "Somebody's Forgetting Somebody" to the reggae touches of "Last Train To Heaven."

Lyrically, Kelly's emphasis is on the personal side. His words recall incidents, emotions, problems, feelings, and affairs of the mind and heart. Life's daily doses are his pen's fodder. 'It's not really conscious, but I guess a lot of things that keep popping up are death, families, friendship, sex, trains, travel... what else?" he mused. "Like William Butler Yates said, there's only two things any intelligent man should be concerned with - sex and death, and 1 would agree with that."

Kelly and the Messengers' wide range of musical exploration stems from their varied backgrounds, encompassing everything from "the Beach Boys to Howlin' Wolf to Kraftwerk Prince to the Clash to Madonna to Suzanne Vega." Certainly a manyhued list, which makes it easier to understand and appreciate the polychromatic "Gossip."

The band is currently in the midst of their first U.S. tour, and they are approaching the task with the same sense of down to earth objectivity that marks their music. Pedro Bull, the Messengers' keyboardist, sees the American market as conquerable, if slowly. "I love to play in front of people, I love to play with this band, and I love to play keyboards. So that is its own reward, fundamentally. 1 don't think you can have these great expectations that we're going to come to America and make a million dollars because it's the land of money. I think it's just great to be able to just come and play here."

Although initial response in this country has been strong, stardom is not currently in the band's vocabulary, as Bull noted "I would hate to be in the position of not being able to walk around, to have to come out in a disguise or something like that. But, I'd go all the way if I had the opportunity," he added wistfully. "Anybody would..."

fronted with the audiences enthusiasm, is refreshing. He appears totally unaffected by the thrust into the limelight. The acceptance from the mainstream hasn't affected Cray's sound in the least, this man is writing and performing tunes with an intensely personal heartfelt ener-

Among all the tunes performed during the show, "Foul Play," "Bad Influence" and the incredible "Change Of Heart, Change Of Mind" generated astounding audience response. Such recent hits as "Smoking Gun" and "Right Next Door (Because Of Me)," possibly because of their instant familiarity to the crowd,

received the strongest reactions.

Cray's continued success and further achievements in the resurgence of blues-oriented rock are sure to continue. Truly a legend in the making...

Opener John Hiatt, fresh from huge critical success generated from his recent A&M LP "Bring The Family," truly provided a brilliant (but much to short) opening set. Hiatt's talents have yet to garner the mainstream attention he so richly deserves, but if the crowds reaction was any indication - big things are in the horizon. Much like Cray, Hiatt is definitely no newcomer to the music scene. Although a long-time critical

ORE ?????-During our continuing conversations with various programmers around the country, the consensus of opinions, seems to be, the CHR stations are sounding blacker, more soulful or should we say, urban? Regardless of the moniker you may assign the sound of a radio station, the fact remains that the CHR's are definitely playing more black oriented sounding music regardless of the artist's ethnic background. If it has the sound that has traditionally been associated with what was once called black, (now Urban?????) they are playing (top 20 or better on black charts, however some CHR stations' are apparently going on gut instinct) the song. In certain situations, it is impossible to determine whether a station is CHR, or Urban if you only look at their respective playlist and listen to the broadcast.

In my conversation Tuesday September 22 with a very prominent program director we were discussing the aformentioned topic, and I mention the difference I had noticed in the music being played on KIIS-FM here in Los Angeles. He quickly noted, "...Steve Rivers, program director of

said station knows the value of black music relative to garnering listeners." I have heard some Raggae and some "heavily Blues" influenced songs on KIIS. As we have mentioned before in The Beat, there is a definite market of listeners who are starving for someone to take the lead and program Blues Music. While on the subject of Los Angeles radio, it is interesting to note that Jeff Wyatt program director of KPWR was. recently named PD of the year in the category of Urban Radio for a major market. The interesting point is, the station has not allowed itself to be called CHR or Urban. You listen and pick a name.

ON JAZZ

S THERE ANYTHING FINER? – PolyGram Jazz, having given the complete, boxed-set treatment to the Mercury holdings of Sarah Vaughan – a massive project indeed – has now turned its attentions to vocal great with an even-heftier catalogue. "The Complete Dinah Washington On Mercury" will, by the time its finished, compile "every single note that she sang for Mercury" between the years of 1946-1961. In other words, just about every side that the "Queen of the Blues," ever recorded. A big project? A big project.

Now all of this is in the hands of the great Kiyoshi Koyama, the Japanese truffle pig of jazz archivists. Koyama does not sleep easy if he doesn't feel he's got it all – every alternate take, every unreleased side, everything. In terms of getting it all, Koyama is your man.

Unlike the Sarah Vaughan sets (and a four-LP Helen Merrill set), the Washington sets will be available on compact disc only. The first two volumes are out now: "Volume 1: 1946-49" and "Volume 2: 1951-52," each filled-to-the-gills three-CD sets, each stuffed with greatness. "Volume 1" contains 66 selections, including 16 newly-discovered performances and 20 sides previously released only as 78s (imagine, from 78 to CD, completely bypassing the LP). "Volume 2" has 53 tracks, including seven new sides and 13 selections never on LP.

Most of the music on the discs is caught in that hazy area between rhythm and blues and jazz-it is the precursor, goodness knows, of rock 'n' roll. Dinah's singing is, of all things, charming – her style is so natural, so pleasant, bluesy in an intimate way. She doesn't really belt them out here - she sings the songs, and the songs, for the most part, hold up. Some are dated, some are amazingly racy, some are junky. Most are delicious. Most of the transfers are crisp, clean and vibrant, but some are not - they were obviously dealing with several worn-out masters, or copies, and the static is quite notice-

As we've come to expect from PolyGram (especially from the projects that originate in Japan), the sets are complete with soup-to-nuts discographical information, scholarly liner notes (Leonard Feather in "Volume 1," Dan Morgenstern in "Volume 2"), and complete lyrics (there are three booklets in each set).

Dinah Washington's reputation has faded a bit in the years since her death (she died in 1963 at the age of 39), but this project should help rectify that. Her singing had rhythm and it had blues, it had irony and sass and a marvelous knowing

quality. With the current attention being paid to the roots of rock 'n' roll, these two sets (there's even two performances on the second volume with the Ravens) should find their rightful place in the jazzto-rock hierarchy. There have been numerous Dinah Washington imitators (Esther Phillips was one), but, as is going to become more and more clear as PolyGram's reissues progress, there was only one Dinah Washington. Maybe not the Queen of the Blues, but American vocal royalty indeed.

FUND TIME – The National Academy of Jazz has established a Woody Herman Foundation Fund, "with Woody's support and blessing," to be used to assist other jazz musicians in need of financial assistance. The administrative details of the fund are currently being worked out, but tax-deductible donations are being accepted. L.A. FACTS – Metro Notes, the Warner Bros. jazz mailing, commissioned a survey of retailers in the L.A./Orange County are during July, to find out how sales of jazz and new age product compared to last year. The result? 55% said jazz sales were up, 61% said new age sales were up. 100% said they had jazz sections, 84% said they had new age sections. 35% said that merchandising materials from the record companies had increased in the jazz area, while 84% said they increased in the new age area. Retailers estimated that jazz sales made up about 18% (!) of their total sales, with new age accounting for 8%. Jazzwise, the split between LPs, cassettes and CDs was pretty even. All very interesting

COOKIN' AT THE PLUGGED NICKEL - Miles Davis - Columbia CJ 40645 - Producer: Teo Macero

DIANE SCHUUR & THE COUNT BASIE ORCHESTRA – GRP CD 9550 – Producers: Morgan Ames, Jeffrey Weber

Last year's Grammy-winning Best Female Vocalist in a fine album with the (still) Swingingest Band in the Land. Schuur steps comfortably into a slot that has, over the years, been occupied by the very best singers around.

THE HEAT OF HEAT - Kevin Eubanks GRP CD 9552 -Producers: George Benson, Onaje Allan Gumbs

The exceptional young guitarist in an excellent, well-rounded

album: from light-funk to tasty fusion to Wes Montgomeryish jazz picking to pretty acoustic picking. The guitarist burns throughout.

WOODY'S GOLD STAR - Woody Herman and his Big Band - Concord Jazz CJ-330 - Producer: Carl E. Jefferson

Woody Herman's troubles have been too-well publicized, but what is getting left out is that for the 50 years up until his recent illness, Herman has led one of the roughest, toughest, hardest-swinging big bands going. This album – recorded live in March of '87 – makes the point very, very nicely. ZOE'S SONG – Peter Moffitt – Novus 3020 – Producer: Peter Moffitt

A Bob James discovery, keyboardist Moffitt has a nimble touch on piano, a way with melody, and a finger on the pulse of contemporary fusion—this debut has a savvy, poppish, chart—and airplay-aimed sound.

0,000 Maniacs

VARIETY ARTS CENTER, L.A. -The pride of Jamestown, N.Y., returned to L.A. for a well-received show at the venerable Variety Arts

Center September 19.

10,000 Maniacs are a five piece band, to be sure, and musically they are constantly maturing, tightening, and redefining their neo-folk wanderings into a more cohesive and widely palatable whole. While some sparks were missing at certain points (undoubtedly the result of exhaustion and jet lag, as they just flew in from a three week European excursion late the night before), their continuing growth was evident throughout the 80-minute show.

The band's true ace in the hole, however, is lead singer and focal point Natalie Merchant. On vinyl, she is a marvelous mystery - capturing and sustaining moods of enchantment with her diaphanous, crystalline voice and remote, swirling lyrics. Live, she is that and more... A captivating, demanding, spellbinding performer capable of providing the polite but faceless band with the glitter and spark necessary to carry the evening.

At their best, the Maniacs surround Merchant's lyrical insights with thoughtful folk/rock with a touch of beat, while her unique sense of wordplay is the main vehicle for promoting the message. Starting with "Hey Jack Kerouac" from their latest LP In My Tribe (Elektra), Merchant quickly seized the crowd's attention with her interpretive dance/motion and vivid, probing lyrics: Hey Jack, now for the tricky part/when you were the brightest star, who were the shadows?

"Among The Americans" and "Like The Weather" were early highlights, bringing Merchant's twodimensional sagas into full bloom of life, but it was a three song cycle toward the end of the evening that fully spotlighted the potential of this band.

It started with "Can't Ignore The Train," a romping, haunting story of small-town frustration and anomie from The Wishing Chair. This song, more musically ambient than the Maniacs' usual fare, segued beautifully into "Gun Shy," Merchant's true account of her younger brother's decision to betray her teachings and join the Army. This is perhaps her best song to date, with lyrics so poignant and heartfelt one can not help but be moved: There is a world outside of this room/And when you meet it promise me/You won't meet it with your gun./...They're so good at making solliers/But they're not as good at making

The final side of the triangle fell into place with the first cut from In

Here?" Decrying both the horrors of child abuse and the anonymity of city life, this was the band's finest moment, jumping out from the rest of the set like lightning in the dead of a summer night. A Song with a capital

Yes, the Maniacs can rock, led by drummer Jerry Augustyniak's frantic skin-pounding on the hyperkinetic set-closer "Scorpio Rising," but one doesn't dare take eyes off of Merchant for a second. She is the show, a batik-laden dervish of whirlwind magic.

Encores consisted of the gorgeous but unsettling "Lily Dale," the hook-filled "Cherry Tree," and a rave-up cover of Cat Stevens' "Peace Train," which Merchant introduced with "please forgive us, but we want to do Peace Train.'

The eye-opening evening ended quietly with Merchant alone at the piano for the introspective "Verdi Cries," a fitting tribute to her burgeoning, hypnotic talents. 10,000 Maniacs will be touring with R.E.M. on the first half of their national tour. Get there early for once - they won't disappoint.

HOLLY-PALACE, WOOD, CA. - "The Phantom Navigator is someone who takes us where we're going whether we want to or not," says Wayne Shorter. Within moments of the start of his set at The Palace, I had the feeling of being escorted out to sea in the dead of night, without a notion of the eventual destination. This was even

My Tribe, entitled "What's The Matter before Wayne graced us with his presence on stage. He appeared a minute or two after his four bandmates had launched into the opening groove, which served to maximize our anticipation and "describe" the spirit of the show.

From the instant Shorter took the stage he created an aura of mystique and suspense with his slow authoratative movements, intense concentration, and incredibly spare opening phrases. Playing only a thoughtful few notes at first, the power of each was strongly felt through his penetrating soprano tone. He gradually began building and developing his lines into intricate, breathing flurries of sound, all stemming from simple seeds of musical thought. This rare talent gave him the ability to seduce any attentive listener into the deep waters of his colorful imagination.

The opening "experience" was actually a rendition of "Beauty and the Beast" from his Native Dancer LP. This was followed by a wild contemporized version of "Footprints" (a virtual jazz standard). Ŝhorter's ability to" dance" with the melody, creating countless subtle variations, gave the tune a fresh spontaneous flavor that was truly remarkable. Keyboardist Jim Beard played his first of several very impressive solos during the set. Following in his leader's ilk, he started extremely sparse, got way outside, and built to exciting crescendos.

The rest of the show included very complete and satisfying versions of "Maria's" and "Endangered Species" from the Atlantis album, and ''Yamanja,'' "Flagships" and "Remote Control" from his newest LP, Phantom Navigator on Columbia Records.

Remote Control" was perhaps the highlight of the performance. Shorter teased the listener for the greater part of the song, only fully revealing the tune's "can't get it out of your mind" melody near the very end. For this reviewer, this was an incredible effect, keeping me on the edge of my seat the whole time.

Percussionist Marilyn Masur, a native of Copenhagen, played a spectacular solo as the introduction to "Remote Control". She fully utilized her plethora of percussive "toys", both acoustic and electric. The interplay between Marilyn with rhythm masters Teri Lynne Carrington on drums, and bassist Carl James, was a constant source of excitement the whole night

Bringing us safely back to port, the voyage ended with a medley of "Flagships" into a tag of "Beauty and the Beast"(creating a feeling of completion having opened the show with

the same tune).

Very few performers have the command and intensity Wayne Shorter brings to the stage. He has continued to be an integral part of the comtemporary jazz scene for nearly thirty years. THE ROXY, HOLLYWOOD - Austin-based blues stomper Joe Ely stormed into town September 17 for a rootin', tootin', whoopin' and hollerin' two hour set of blues/rock that defied all preconception and numbed more than a few eardrums along the way. But the true story of the night was the crowd, and what a crowd it was...

Ely has been around for quite a while doing this sort of thing, and has built up an impressive following of rabid fans, 450 of whom packed the Roxy to the rafters on this Thursday evening. Before the show began, I saw Hank Ballard outside bumming a smoke from Albert Collins, so I knew I was in for a treat.

The night's fireworks first flamed to life on the eight minute opus, "Letter From L.A.," with Ely's sax man and former Rolling Stone session player Bobby Keys blowing some guts into the heart of the slow, building number. Then, the hottest young guitar wizard seen round these parts in some time, Jimmy Grissom, got busy on some painful blues work, bending strings and snaking chords off of his baby blue axe. Right about then, I turned and spilled Keith Richard's drink all over his leather jacket. Embarassed, I mumbled something inaudible and moved away.

On "The Lord Of The Highway," the title cut from Ely's latest Hightone Records LP, Grissom broke out early, stomping hard on the wawa pedal as if to drain the life out of the sucker. Up in the posthumous booth, the mood was positively Elysian, if you'll pardon the pun. I saw Robert Johnson lean over to whisper to Big Joe Turner, who cackled loudly and elbowed the older man in the ribs, causing him to fall into Eddie Cochran's lap. There is something about Ely's music that is so sublime, so undeniably right, it tends to have that effect on people.

On "Musta Notta Gotta Lotta," Ely turned up the heat. He unreeled the mike stand over the crowd like the maestro, allowing the faithful to pledge allegiance once again. Then, after pulling the stand back, he found it had somehow come unplugged. Without missing a beat, he bent the stand in two over his leg, strapped his guitar back on, and sizzled onwards and upwards with no regrets.

On the single "My Baby Thinks She's French," Keys' sax blew big fat balloons of sound, which were pierced by stabs of Grissom's stilleto. Chuck Berry walked by, air guitar-

favorite, he has not been able to achieve more than a wide cult status here in the States.

Things got rolling with the opening number "Memphis In The Meantime," introducing the unsure audience to his musical styling. He continued with triumphant renditions of such songs as "Alone In The Dark," "Thank You Girl," "Learning How To Love You," and the achingly beautiful "Have A Little Faith In Me." The last song before encores was the dramatic, cathartic, countryflavored "Roll Of Dominos." Ely sang like a demon possessed, like a man sitting alone in the dead of night at a Greyhound station leaving his baby forever. I saw Johnny Cash and Marty Robbins sitting at a reserved table with eyes closed, swaying back and forth, caught up in the moment.

When Ely broke into "Not Fade Away" as the first encore, Buddy Holly stuck his head up over the edge of the posthumous booth and smiled approvingly. (I heard Marshall Crenshaw tried to get inside, but the bouncers laughed him out.)

Three more scorching numbers later and the show was history, and suddenly all those legends I had been watching so closely seemed to fade slowly away, like the picture tube on an old black and white Zenith. Maybe they had never been there at

he Long Ryders

THE ROXY THEATER, LOS AN-GELES - The crowd was revved up and ready for the Los Angeles return of native sons the Long Ryders, returning to the west coast while still riding high on the wave of critical acclaim received for their latest Island LP "Two Fisted Tales." Although the band has received only moderate recognition on American shores thus far, they have gone on to achieve notoriety overseas with their inimitable blend of country, blues and rock and roll. If the response generated from the crowd was any indication, The Long Ryders seem well on their way to establishing themselves here in the states, a long overdue accomplishment...

Guitarist Sid Griffin acted as the band's spokesman throughout the evening, trading off lead vocal duties with partner Steven McCarthy. Greg Sowders demonstrated driving drum work - also of note was the addition of bassist Larry Chatman, replacing the recently departed Tom Stevens. The depature of Stevens notwithstanding, the Ryders played a tremendous set - showcasing a tighter sound for the band. The genuine heartfelt emotion and power included within each song was refreshing, definitely not just tired readings of recorded work. The Long Ryders are a band in the true sense of the word, with each player complimenting each other brilliantly and no single member hoarding the spotlight. Most notably the addition of Chatman, who's comfortable stage presence led one to believe he's played with the band for years.

The program featured tunes spanning the career of the band, showcasing material from all their releases. Included were selections gathered from their earliest recorded work two projects for the indie Frontier label, "10-5-60" and "Native Sons." Most of the tunes were culled from the band's two Island releases, last year's underrated "State Of Our Union" and the recent "Two Fisted Tales."

The band set the pace for the evening with the opening numbers "Prairie Fire" and "Man Of Misery," two selections off the current LP. Honest songwriting and heartfelt delivery have always been a Long Ryders trademark, these traits were showcased best during renditions of such modern classics as "Capturing The Flag," "I Had A Dream," the stirring "Ivory Tower" and a burning delivery of "State Of My Union," (see "should have been a hit" dept.). Other highlights of the show included readings of "Final Wild Son" "Lights Of Downtown" and a fiery rendition of "Looking For Lewis & fellow teen idol Dick Clark.

Clark." The amazing loyal audience response was most evident during the anthem-like "Harriet Tubman's Gonna Carry Me Home," the recent AOR hit "Gunslinger Man" and the closing number "10-5-60." One has to see the Long Ryders perform live to fully appreciate the music, as it is almost impossible to capture a band's presence in a written review. I'm not saying that the Long Ryders are the greatest band in the world, but they might just be the most genuine.

Added bonuses were the two wellchosen opening acts for the Ryders; first up was Lucinda Williams, an exceptional country vocalist who showcased enough natural talent in her all too short acoustic set to have any A&R man doing backflips, big things are sure to come for this gifted vocalist. Williams was followed by House Of Freaks, an adventurous rockin' duo who have recently signed to the Rhino label. Both acts delivered unique individual styles which complimented the Ryders sound brilliantly.

To say that the Long Ryders are the last in a dying breed of authentic rock and rollers wouldn't be that far from the truth... but to add optimism, I see them as forefathers of a coming revolution.

nVue Sound, Inc. - With the inception of a company called InVue Sound, Inc. onto the scene, the music video industry has been buzzing with the aspect of being able to improve greatly the quality of sound on product. InVue, a company formed by George Reisz and Francis Milano, provides top quality postproduction sound work for music videos. The problem of adequate sound on a video tape has been a problem in the industry for years now, with the technology used by InVue, this dilemma may soon become a problem of the past. Recently George Reisz spoke to Cash Box discussing InVue's technology and the aspects that led them to become a growing force aiding to the improvement of the all-important music video.

Reisz and Milano first brought their talents to a video pool service called RockAmerica. Reisz explained, "They (RockAmerica) were sending out to their subscribers monthly compilation tapes, and were at the mercy of the audio quality of what the record companies were submitting to them and they were starting to lose clients because the quality was so bad and it wasn't really their fault..." Rock-America then decided to develop an in-house "audio correction" system to improve the quality of the tapes, resulting in a better product provided to the clients. Reisz and Milano found that simply correcting the product was a great task, as there was no set standard of which the tapes were recoded, each label's product varied greatly. Reisz remembered "...it was a natural outgrowth to say 'why don't we go to the source and deal with the music videos as they're being made,' because there was no reason why it had to be this way." He continued "We went to all the major record companies that were based in New York and presented them with our services." Through a mutual friend, Reisz and Milano were introduced to Elektra VP Robin Sloan, who instantly recognized the value of the services InVue had to offer. "The first time that Elektra was able (to take advantage of our services), they did. I think they were blown away by the fact that music videos could sound so good."

Often, full responsibilities of the clips are given over to the director of the project. Reisz explained the problem with this common occurrence, "The video people are there to do the video because that is what they do well. The soundtrack is another business and should not be left to them because it is not there area of expertise and it's an unfair burden to place on them."

"Essentially what we're doing is post-producing the soundtrack for music videos. As the video is being made, somebody has to take charge of the soundtrack." That is where InVue steps in, "We get involved at the time the video is being decided on, we prepare what becomes video master tape and we basically have a system set up where they (the video directors) can go off and do what they have to do. When it's done, we get back the final tape and then go back into the studio and do another session, where we restore to the video first-generation digital audio."

InVue's first projects with Elektra proved so successful that the label now used the company exclusively for all it's clips. Reisz explained "...eventually what happened was as they started to see what came back, and how we were able to over come all the problems that existed, and really take a burden off their back - it came to the point where we do everything (for Elektra) now."

Reisz and Milano's talents were

recently used by Elektra for two commercially released full-length video tapes, Motley Crue's Uncensored and Dokken's Unchain The Night. InVue provided both tapes with digitally remastered sound, resulting in high quality consumer product that proved hugely successful. So successful in fact, that both projects garnered the first Platinum (Motley Crue) and Gold (Dokken) video awards presented by the recording industry.

Thus far, InVue has proved themselves an extremely valuable tool in the recording industry. The company is constantly moving forward with continued work for Elektra and growing interest from other labels. Reisz concluded, "What we touch comes out very well and everybody is very happy with... We follow everything we do from beginning to end, once we start a project we make sure it is a quality product all the way through. We take a pride in our projects..."



Travis Leads The Way In '87 CMA Nominations



CMA's 1986 Horizon Award winner, Randy Travis, swept the 1987 CMA nominations, receiving the nod in five categories, while two Travisrecorded songs garnered nominations in the Song of the Year category. CMA's reigning Entertainer and Female Vocalist of the Year, Reba Mc-Entire, and CMA's current Male Vocalist of the Year, George Strait, copped four nominations each, as did newcomer sensations, The O'Kanes. Hank Williams, Jr., who announced the nominees at a press conference at Nashville's Union Station Hotel, walked away with three nominations, as did veteran entertainer George Jones and newcomer Holly Dunn.

Travis, who has sold more than two million records in just over a year, was nominated for Entertainer of the Year, Male Vocalist of the Year, Single of the Year ("Forever And Ever, Amen"), Album of the Year (ALWAYS AND FOREVER) and Music Video of the Year ("Forever And Ever, Amen"). CMA's 1986 winners of Song of the Year, Paul Overstreet and Don Schlitz, received nominations for Song of the Year for two Travis-recorded tunes, "On The Other Hand," CMA's 1986 Song of

the Year, and "Forever And Ever, Amen".

McEntire received nominations for Entertainer of the Year, Female Vocalist of the Year (an award she has won the past three years), Album of the Year (WHAT AM I GONNA DO ABOUT YOU), and Music Video of the Year ("What Am I Gonna Do About You"). Strait, who has won CMA's Male Vocalist title the past two years, was again nominated for that honor as well as Entertainer of the Year, Single of the Year ("All My Ex's Live In Texas"), and Album of the Year (OCEAN FRONT PROPERTY). Strait's recording of "All My Ex's Live In Texas" was nominated for Song of the Year for writers Sanger and Lyndia Shafer.

Newcomers Jamie O'Hara and Kieran Kane, who comprise The O'Kanes, were nominated for Single of the Year ("Can't Stop My Heart From Loving You"), Music Video of the Year ("Oh Darlin"), and for the highly-coveted Horizon Award. They were also nominated as songwriters in the Song of the Year category ("Can't Stop My Heart From Loving You").

Hank Williams, Jr., who was recently crowned the ACM's Entertainer of the Year, was nominated for CMA's Entertainer of the Year, Male Vocalist of the Year, and Music Video of the Year ("My Name Is Bocephus"). George Jones garnered nominations for Male Vocalist of the Year, Single of the Year ("The Right Left Hand") and Album of the Year (WINE COLORED ROSES). Holly Dunn received nominations for Horizon Award and Vocal Duo of the Year (with Michael Martin Murphey) as well as for Song of the Year, as writer of her MTM hit, "Daddy's Hands"

The 21st Annual CMA Awards Show, hosted by Kenny Rogers, will be telecast live from the Grand Ole Opry House on CBS-TV on Monday, October 12. The awards are voted on solely by CMA's 7,500 individual members, each of whom is a music industry professional.

HANK WILLIAMS, JR. (Warner Bros. 7-28227-A) Heaven Can't Be Found (3:11) (Bocephus-BMI) (H. Williams, Jr.) (Producers: B. Beckett, H. Williams, Jr., J. E. Norman)

This is a different, yet equally good, Hank Williams, Jr.! Here's proof that Hank masters a country ballad. It's a solid country arrangement and production. The song is Hank's, too. Bocephus sings this one with a vocal demanding attention. He certainly got ours! His performance shines with perfect emphasis and inflections. Gather 'round, you balladeers, and listen to this one!



FEATURE PICKS

GIRLS NEXT DOOR (MTM, B-72095) Easy To Find (3:08) (Uncle Artie-ASCAP) (R. Ferris) (Producer: T. West)

The Girls should be "easy to find" on the charts, shortly, with this release. This is one of those feel-good songs, which makes you want to dance. It's difficult to sit still and listen. It's clear, easy to understand, and it makes you sorry when it's over. Well, play it again!

OAK RIDGE BOYS (MCA, MCA-53175) Time In (3:37) (Tom Collins-BMI; Collins Court-ASCAP) (R. Murrah, R. Alves, J. D. Hicks) (Producer: J. Bowen)

Lay back, relax and take it easy. Here comes some mellowness from the Oaks! Of course, the harmonies are super, but harmony is "used" a little differently in this arrangement. The theme of the song should prove identifyable to a lot of listeners. Versatility is becoming to the Oaks!

GARY MORRIS (Warner Bros. 7-28218) Finishing Touches (5:26) (Gary Morris, Cross Keys-ASCAP) (G. Morris, K. Welch) (Producer: G. Morris)

Dramatic beginning for dramatic material. Superb lyrics which paint graphic pictures in the listener's mind. Gary "the voice" Morris surely put the "finishing touches" on this one! Don't worry about the play time on this release. In fact, you'll want more. What a voice! What a song! What a record!

NASHVILLE NOTE-ABLES

Jeff Stevens And The Bullets...

Down around Alum Creek, West Virginia, you'll find coal mining country and good people. Until a year ago, Jeff Stevens, Warren Stevens, and Terry Dotson were numbered among the 500, or so, residents there. Now, they live in Nashville and are numbered among the finest new country music performers here. They are known, to country fans, as Jeff Stevens and The Bullets.

Jeff Stevens and The Bullets had a hit single on the charts a couple of months ago. "Geronimo's Cadillac," on the Atlantic America label, did very well for them. Some "critics" have said the group has a little too much Rock influence to be considered a real country act. To those people, I offer the following quotes from my conversation with Jeff and Terry.

Jeff: "When we (Jeff and Warren, who are brothers.) were very young, we won a talent show by singing "Folsom Prison." That really started us performing a lot. We were busy nearly every weekend with talent shows, and gettogethers. It was a matter of everybody getting together to enjoy country music. Mom even made us some 'sparkley' suits. That's what she thought country music should be. It came from seeing some of the country acts in Nashville at that time.

When Warren and I got a few years older, we weren't a 'novelty' anymore. Too, there weren't those good ol' talent shows to go to anymore. We were teenagers, and we started listening to Skynard, Clearwater, and the like. I felt like they were talking straight to me. If we picked up a Rock feel, I suppose that's when it happened.



About that time, Terry (their cousin) started drumming for us, and we started playing a little of the Rock stuff. The country fans in our area liked our music, too. In 1979, we decided to go for a career in music. We hired an agent, quit our jobs, and went on the road. We've been there ever since...playin' 4 or 5 nights every week!

I know a lot of people have said that we're Rockers trying to make it in Country. But, we grew up on country music, and I feel I'm still basic country."

Terry: "Some groups, like The Eagles, were country/rock. I feel we are basic country, then, we insert what we believe is our 'sound' into the song. The 'sound' actually developed from our limitations. It's the only way we can play. What you hear is what we do. We feel very uncomfortable in New York and L. A. around the Rockers. We fit in Nashville. We think we are rockin' country."

Jeff: "Our next album will show a different light on our music and what it's all about. It will contain a lot more of our own material. We have written so many songs you wouldn't believe it."

Personally, I feel that Jeff Stevens and The Bullets have found what every artist searches for. They have discovered their own sound. Oh, by the way..Hank Williams, Jr. has had them opening several shows on his tour, and they are getting great audience response. Jeff Stevens, Warren Stevens, and Terry Dotson have country hearts. That's good enough for me! You all know what happens to Rockers, with country hearts, when they mature. Well, Jeff and The Bullets are still young, too.

CMJ New Music Awards To Be Broadcast Nationally In 1988

LOS ANGELES - The CMJ New Music Awards show will be making its national broadcast television debut in May, 1988, it was announced recently by the show's producers, Robert K. Haber and Joanne Abbot Green.

The show was originally scheduled to run on October 31 of this year, but was rescheduled to coincide with the latest national TV developments. It will still be held at New York's Apollo Theatre.

The show's producers are excited about the impending national broadcast of the awards, stating "This event has been carefully nurtured since its inception in 1983, and on its fifth anniversary it will finally receive its due accord as a national broadcast television property. The originally scheduled date of October 31 will remain the highlight of the annual CMJ Music Marathon Convention, with the return of the Scary Monsters Costume Ball and Showcase.

5 YEARS AGO IN CASH BOX

September 25, 1982 - A&M Records recently held an international conference in Los Angeles for its affiliates in celebration of the label's 20th anniversary. The three-day gathering featured a new music preview presentation, highlighted by a special listening party of the new Supertramp album, "Famous Last Words." Other events included a Go-Gos concert at the Hollywood Bowl, a special showcase performance at the Roxy by Bryan Adams and Willie Phoenix and a four-hour cruise... New Faces to Watch: Tane Cain. Long, blonde and green-eyed, 24-yeard-old Tane Cain looks more like she belongs in the offices of the Ford Agency than in a recording studio. But for the Hawaiian-bred singer, whose self-titled RCA album and first single, "Holdin' On," are climbing their way up the Cash Box charts, it is clear she's no model-turned-singer. Realizing that this year's holiday buying session may be more seriously affected by economic conditions than ever before, dealers contacted by Cash Box are full of suggestions for helping make the fourth quarter as strong as many feel it can be. The most popular and obvious suggestion offered was cutting list prices. "The only thing that can get our business rolling is list price reduction," said George Balicky, vice president of merchandising at National Record Mart's Pittsburgh headquarters...Top five singles: 1. At one point, event producer Dick Clark apologized to Joe Walsh for a technical problem with the rotary stage. This otherwise useful device engaged while Walsh was performing, causing the singer to be virtually whisked from the view of his audience in mid-song. Later, Walsh was returned to the stage following the grand finale, and his closing numbers brought large portions of the dispersing crowd back into the

Farm Aid I was the most successful farm benefit. The funds from that effort, together with Farm Aid II, generated approximately \$6.5 million in direct relief to desperate farm families.

There have been rumors that this may have been the last Farm Aid. Even Willie Nelson has hinted at the tremendous burden of coordinating the effort. Last year at Farm Aid II, reknowned for its hot weather and accessible, party atmosphere, Nelson encouraged younger artists to become more involved in the struggle to save family farming in this country. The odds against farmers are so great that they are hard to believe - Farm Aid executives claim that 200 family farms go under every day.

WEA/UK has decided to split itself right down the middle. Chairman Rob Dickins has decided to make US and UK product separate entities. Dickins is currently on a PR crusade to heighten the profile of UK product. He is making a tour of the world - Rome, Paris, Rio, Kyoto and Brisbane - to present the current roster of UK product.

Paul Conroy is to head the newly-created US division, while Max Hole is managing director of the UK division, with Moira Bellas as his deputy.

"We are doing this from a position of strength," said Dickins. "I believe this is the only way to get the company bigger. It will enable people to focus more clearly on individual artists without fear of being swamped. Turnover has trebled since 1984 while the staffing level has remained fairly consistent." However, Dickins admits WEA's head count will only rise marginally...

Radio 1 has felt under constant pressure from the ILR Network Chart. At the moment, the Gallup/Radio 1 chart takes three days to compile for the BBC, while the Network chart it done overnight. Now the BBC is to close the gap, and their chart will be just as up-to-date from November.

The charts are used by the rival TV chart shows, Top of the Pops and the Roxy. The BBC has been stung by criticism that their charts were way behind the commercial com-

The UK Record industry is optimistic that the new deal with CBS to screen the BBC's Top of the Pops across the States will provide a valuable showcase for British acts when it launches this month.

The 30-minute show goes out weekly in the UK with video clips. The 60-minute American shows, with segments recorded in Hollywood, will go out every two weeks. It will not include British video clips because of clearance problems. But the BBC will be increasing its use of studio bands to compensate.

EMI Records UK managing director Rupert Perry said: "Any additional exposure is always a good thing, and will be really healthy for British talent." However, there are fears the shows may precipitate a demand for records that will not be available in the U.S.

Japan Audio Sales Dip Video Sales Up 5 %

TOKYO - Audio software sales for July 1987 totaled 26,455,000,000 yen (\$176 million), which is a three per cent drop from the same month last year, according to the Japan Phonograph Record Association (JPRA). During the same period, video software sales totaled 7,481,000,000 yen (\$49.9 million) a figure which is up five per cent over the same month in 1986.

In the first category, audio software, sales broke down into several percentage groups. The biggest group was audio disks which accounted for 18,032,000,000 yen (\$120 million) of all sales. Audio disks sales includes CD's, which were attributed with 67 per cent of the dollar volume in audio disks sales, and analog disks which account for 33 per cent of audio disk sales.

Meanwhile, video software generated sales of 7,481,000,000 yen (\$50 million), which is up five per cent. Both video tape and video disk are responsible for a 50 per cent share of this increase.

Total sales for audio disks in Japan for the first seven months of 1987 was 114,945,000,000 yen (\$766 million), a figure which is approximately seven per cent higher than the same period last year. In this instance, CD's accounted for 63 per cent of the sales (a 58 per cent increase), while analog disks generated 37 per cent of the sales (a 31 per cent decline).

For the first seven months of 1987, audio tapes posted a four per cent rise to 52,779,000,000 yen (\$352 million), with a July sales total of 8,423,000,000 yen (\$56 million).

Video software, including tape and disk, reported sales totalling 51,824,000,000 yen (\$345 million) which is a strong, nine per cent increase over the same period last year. Video disk sales accounted for 56 per cent of this activity, while video tape earned the other 44 per cent.
