A True Hero Of Rock And Roll

arry Chapin died in an auto accident in 1981 at the age of 38. Harry was a one of a kind artist, and a one of a kind human being. On Monday, December 7, 1987, the forty-fifth anniversary of his birth, Chapin will be honored as a recipient of the Congressional Gold Medal, civilian equivalent of the Congressional Medal of Honor.

The presentation, to commemorate Chapin's work on behalf of World Hunger Year (a cornerstone of his humanitarian concerns), will be held at Carnegie Hall, with a program of Chapin songs performed by Bruce Springsteen, Carly Simon, Pat Benatar, Kenny Rogers, the Smothers Brothers, Dolores Hall, The Long Island Philharmonic Orchestra and others.

In addition, to honor Chapin, Dunhill Compact Classics has released *Harry Chapin/Remember When The Music,*" and is planning a special two track three-inch CD, believed to be the first of its kind, featuring two previously unreleased Chapin songs, "Hokey Pokey" and "Oh Man." A portion of the proceeds of the sale of these two records will be donated to the World Hunger Program. A statement from Dunhill CD president Marshall Blonstein said, "We always held the greatest respect for Harry Chapin as a songwriter and performer and, equally, as a human being with strong concern for his fellow man. It is a privelege having the opportunity to help make Harry's music accessible on compact disc at this special time."

Harry Chapin was a remarkable man, full of life and concern for his fellow man. We miss both Harry and his music. They can never be replaced, but his memory lives on. This tribute on behalf of his very special committment to the less fortunate will serve as a perpetual reminder that the measure of a man is not the number of records he sells, but the record he leaves behind.

Ex-KMET DJ's Suits Dismissed

ing wrongful hiring practises brought by two ex-disc jockeys against defunct Los Angeles radio station KMET-FM (now operating as KTWV-FM) have been dropped by a Federal District Court Judge.

Disc jockeys David Perry and Jack Snyder brought suits totalling \$1 million each against KMET, station general manager Howard Bloom, and program director Frank Cody. Judge David Kenyon dismissed the cases, stating that the grievances should be handled under AFTRA's arbitration process rather than in federal court. A third case involving dj Jim Ladd, totalling \$2.45 million, is scheduled to be heard on November 30, but plaintiff's attorney Michael Goch is planning to ask for a continuance. Ladd is currently touring as part of Roger Waters' "Radio KAOS" tour.

KMET, a flagship Album Rock station in Los Angeles, abruptly

LOS ANGELES - Lawsuits alleg- changed formats earlier this year, becoming KTWV (The Wave), which has since blossomed into a nationwide syndication network. Perry, Snyder, and Ladd claimed that they were induced to sign employment contracts by station officials who knew that the dj's would be fired upon immediate format change.

"Both employers and their unionized employees are bound by the collective bargaining agreement," stated Martha Hammer, attorney for the defendants. "The Federal Court has once again made it clear that it will not allow circumvention of the grievance and arbitration process by employees whose claims are covered by union contracts."

Goch anticipates different findings in the Ladd case, because at the time of his negotiations with KMET, he was an employee of KLOS-FM, and therefore is not subject to the terms of the collective bargaining agreement between KMET and AFTRA.

NEW YORK - The negotiations between CBS Inc. and Sony, regarding the sale of the CBS Records Group to the Japanese entertainment giant for an estimated \$2 billion, are still continuing, the two groups having failed to reach an agreement prior to last Wednesday's (11th) meeting of the CBS Board of Directors. CBS Inc.'s

terse statement, released Wednes day, read in full: "No decision ha been made regarding the CBS Records Group. Discussions with Sony are still continuing. No agree ment has been reached yet to present to the CBS Board of Direc tors." The CBS Board of Director meets every other Wednesday.

Paul Simon Donates Mobile Medical Unit to Homeless Children

NEW YORK – There are some 12,000 homeless children in the city of New York. These children make up the New York's largest segement of the homeless population. Many are without access to proper health care, a problem Paul Simon hopes to address with the formation of The New York Children's Health Project.

On November 5, Paul Simon and the New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center held a news conference to announce the establishment of the Children's Health Project. Using money raised from public and private sources, a mobile medical unit has been purchased. This van will provide free health care to approximately 3,000 children housed in 10 welfare hotels in Manhattan and two in Queens. Dr. Irwin Redlener, Chief of Ambulatory Pediatrics at New York Hospital, said, "Paul Simon is responsible for the raising of \$250,000 for this program. This is the making of a dream into reality."

For Simon that dream began sometime last year after visiting several welfare hotels and being struck by the plight of the children living in them. He had become interested in helping New York's homeless during the recording of the "Graceland" album, he said at the press conference. "Each day I'd get off at the

corner of 54th St. and Broadway a I'd walk towards 8th Avenue to go the studio. There was a woman homeless woman, who was sitti next to the bank on a grate so that heat from the building would wa her." Simon explained he and woman, Maria, gradually becar friends, and one day in the Spri when he found she wasn't there began to wonder what he could do help the homeless.

Simon's interest led him to a USA For Africa, ten percent of who profits were earmarked to fig domestic hunger, for donations Project Reachout on the Upper W Side. He secured \$50,000 for Proj Reachout, and met Dr. Redlener w was then advising USA For Africa the distribution of funds. It was o tour of Welfare Hotels shortly the after that the idea for the mob medical unit was hatched. Sim was able to donate money rais from the last leg of the Gracela Tour to the project, and money w secured from New York City Human Resources Administration the Office of Manhattan Borou President David Dinkins, and t New York Board of Realtors, amo others. Plans for an additional fu raising concert by Simon have not been confirmed.



AITS – The big noise around town last weekend was Tom Waits' three night gig at the Wiltern Theatre (11/7,8,9). Caught the Sunday night show - he amazed, amused, awed, stunned, captivated, brought chills to the spine and tears to the eyes. In short, yer typical Tom Waits evening.

"I'm so glad to be back in the Wil-

shire District," he drawled early in the proceedings. "I find everything that I need here." What he found was an adoring crowd more than willing to play along with Waits' idiosyncrasies, gutbucket rhythms,

and dangerous allegory.

The wit was razor sharp and amiably caustic, and he moved with trademark accidental, spastic grace. Singing with bullhorn and auto repair light, he blew away the worthless pretensions of most "theatre" shows (see Simply Red), replacing them with an immediate, warming intimacy that kept the capacity crowd delighted capacity throughout.

An unexpected "Christmas Card From A Hooker In Minneapolis" brought chills; the sinister "Clap Hands" (sane, sane, they're all insane/the fireman's blind, the conductor's lame|a Cincinatti jacket and a sad luck dame/hanging out the window with a bottle full of rain/clap hands) worked darkly; "Walking Spanish" slowed to a canter; and stuff from Franks Wild Years came across deeper, funnier, and more meaningful than on vinyl.

A tremendous evening from a master showman, albeit not for everyone. An old roommate once termed Waits "nightmare music," which I suppose could be true - a nightmare of musical and theatrical exploration into the dark side of life; a nightmare only for those with minds so tightly closed that no glimmer of originality and uniqueness can hope to shine through. Got a friend too uptight for their own good? Take them to a Tom Waits show - either it will cure them, or it will shove them completely over the edge...

DOING TIME - Yes, it's time once again to catch up on who's where doing what in the volatile, fertile, fecund, and loamy world of L.A. recording studios. At Skip Saylor, The Bangles were in with producer Steve Beltran and engineer Keith Cohen doing a re-mix of "A Hazy Shade Of Winter", Capitol's Bert Robinson was in for

a dance re-mix of his latest, and Richard Perry was in tracking The Pointer Sisters. At Larrabee Sound on Santa Monica Blvd., Reggie and Vincent Calloway returned to mix "Love Overboard" for Gladys Knight and the Pips, Barry White was in to produce his own tune "Sho You Right," Chris Powell mixed Teen Dream's "Toy," and Los Lobos came in to mix their "One Time One Night" with Steve Berlin behind the board. At The Rock House, CBS' Krystol is tracking material for their upcoming LP, and Sound City recently enjoyed the company of rocker Steve Stone, who recorded his debut release with help from Joe Walsh, Skunk Baxter, Ronnie Dio, Carmine Appice and more.

The tour consisted of a whole floor of offices and operations which comprise the company. Step One is set up with a network of distributors for their products. The products being distributed are singles, albums, cassettes and compact discs of the company's recording artists. And, with such masters of country music signed to the label, it isn't surprising that the staff handling the orders, and shipping, has grown from three, in the beginning, to fourteen at

With an ingenious marketing plan for the sales and distribution of such artists as Ray Price, The Kendalls, Hank Thompson, Southern Reign, Dave Holladay, Ray Pennington, Buddy Emmons and the new and exciting Reno Brothers, it is evident that ten to the listeners!

the company offices are extremely busy places. The smaller orders are filled from the local offices, and the larger orders are shipped directly from the factory. Ray pointed out the fact that four or five thousand pieces of each product are kept on hand, locally, at Step One.

Step One has an effective television marketing plan and a beautifully designed catalog mail-out campaign. The operation is a "family" effort. Ray's wife and daughters work along side of him, as do other husband/wife teams who are friends and associates. The company atmosphere radiates happiness and satisfaction that, through the combined efforts of all, they are reaching their goals.

Ray Pennington says, "We want to continue to grow in album distribution. We are working toward a complete catalog of album products. Our goal is to have such a variety of product that it will include some

thing for everyone."

Oh, yes, Step One is far beyond the first step! With the total dedication and determination I witnessed, it is certain Ray Pennington will be ever expanding the Step One operations And, I believe Ray knows, in his heart, he already has a record company which is prominent among the fans of country music! "Busted," "Baby It's Cold Outside,"
"Let's Go Get Stoned," "Unchain My
Heart," "I Can't Stop Loving You," "Smack Dab in the Middle,"

on. Ray Charles owns the masters,

Michael Tomlinson

Still Believe is the title of Michael Tomlinson's new LP on the Poly-Gram-distributed Cypress label. It is his first for the adventurous infant label. Prior to this, the Seattle-based performer had released Run This Way Forever, issued on Tomlinson's own label. The LP sold an unprecedented 50,000 copies - an extraordinary feat, to say the least, for an independent release. Tomlinson recently spoke to Cash Box, discussing his career and his hopes for the new album.

"That first album is an eight-track recording, that's unheard of in this day and age." Tomlinson confessed. He added, "It's getting to where nearly everything's digital and if it's not it's surely 24 or 48 [track]. I recorded an eight-track record and put it out there - and it competed in a world of [album's recorded using] state-of-the-art machines."

Tomlinson's music conveys an obvious spirituality, not necessarily in the religious sense - but rather in belief, in positives. His songwriting explores human emotions and quickly reaches the listener - going straight for the heart.

Tomlinson explained his reasoning for signing with the adventurous Cypress label, "I got called from about four major labels and they were all very curious more than anything, and to tell you the truth, I wasn't interested. I received word from another party about Cypress, and that they were interested in me. I was intrigued because I had found out that their first release was Jen-

nifer Warnes singing Leonard Cohen [Famous Blue Raincoat]. This was before they had the success with it and I thought 'how in the world does a new independent have the guts to do that?,' as well as the class?"

Cypress told Tomlinson that the label was interested in the whole record - not a single, but an album that is classic and timeless. "That impressed me so much, it's not the kind of talk you hear in this business, and if you do it's usually just talk. I had the sense that this was real, somehow they knew that I wasn't going to be interested in contracting songs. I was going to be interested in putting a part of my life on a record." He continued "Now we're finding out that, yeah, there's hits, there are probably five or six hits on this record. That's the feedback we're getting and that's what I believe. I'm real pleased that I chose a small label family, and they're growing fast..."

When asked to describe his sound and style, Tomlinson explained, "In the last year I've been played on country stations, jazz stations, AOR, A/C, CHR and public radio. I've been played on all types of formats." He concluded, "I'm hoping that I'm one of these artists that crosses enough boundaries that people quit trying to figure out where I go. I want to be known as someone who will not put a filler on a record, who will not do something just to make money, and that I will be putting out music that counts."

all of them."

The saying, of course, is that Ray Charles can sing anything – give him a pig's ear and set yourself up a silk purse business. Can Ray Charles

sing anything?

"If Ray Charles likes it," says Ray Charles. "See, there are two things I'm very blessed with. I can sing anything that I like, just like I can eat anything I like. I genuinely believe that if I like something, I can sing it. And, of course, I'm just as forward to tell you that if I don't like something, I won't try to sing it. What's the point? I choose songs that I like for myself and, of course, if I can't let myself into the songs, then I won't sing it."

For 40 years, Ray Charles has been plugging away – sweeping musical styles in his path, overcoming obstacles like blindness and drug addiction, sticking close to the road and close to his music. The pay-off, of course, is there. He's never been out of fashion, never been without a record deal, and never had to do things any way but his way. Recently, awards have been piling up: a Kennedy Center Honor, charter

membership in the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award.

"This is what you've been working for," he says of the recognition. "Isn't it great to have it where you can hear the results of how people accept your work? I think that it's a beautiful thing to have people let you know what they feel. So I'm very humble when it comes to awards because I never, in my wildest - and I do mean this sincerely - in my wildest imagination or dreams or any other way you want to put it, thought that I would be in the position that I'm in today. I never dreamed of no such thing like this. So it's not the kind of thing where I let it take me where it shouldn't, but I have great respect and admiration for it."

But certainly there must be some nights when Brother Ray gets up on stage – a stage filled with his gleaming and always-polished big band, a stage with five microphones strategically placed for the entrance of those Raelettes – feeling like he'd rather be somewhere else.

PRINCE

rince kicked off the year by releasing the best record, so far, of 1987. Now he's about to cap things off with one of the best flicks to come down the Hollywood merchandising pike in quite a while. His 'concert' film of Sign o' the Times is a steamy, funk filled, visually exciting tour through the Purple One's stated obsessions: dance, music, sex, and romance. Filmed both live in front of a Holland audience and in the studio back in Minneapolis, Sign captures all the heart busting, ass shaking spontaneous dynamism of performance and then gooses it up into hotter aesthetic stratospheres with Prince's directorial control and sleak visual stylization.

The set is a concert stage filled with 50s neon signs that give the feel of full color film noir. Among this semi-surrealistic heap of images Prince and a ten piece band, including Shelia E. on drums and Eric Leeds on sax, tear through thirteen songs, all drawn from the Sign o' the Times record with the exception of a piano rendition of "Little Red Corvette." The music has the perfect feel of studio jams, and benefits from a group dynamic that you can see if not hear. Pray for a soundtrack. There's a semi-arty 'plot' that involves, I dunno, the dialectic between sex and romance, but all that's washed away by, and better expressed in, the actual performance footage.

The whole movie is an erotically charged voyeuristic delight, easily ten times as sexy as anything that's intented to appeal solely to the prurient interest. There's something maybe disconcerting about the way the camera drops to chest level every time it shows a female band member, but the easy, confident activity of the women keeps them from being

defined as objects. There are

several overhead shots of Sheli E. joyously pounding away o drums that establish her as th literal heart and pulse of th band, as well as about the mos beautiful woman on the plane earth. Or maybe that titl should be saved for back-u singer, dancer, and Prince-fo Cat. During "Hot Thing" sh dances her way through a line of gawk-eyed guys, scatterin them like bowling pins. Whe Prince dives through her leg and grabs her skirt with h teeth you get an idea of what th man means when he talks abou "boy vs. girl in the World Serie of love." Throughout the mov there's a give and take betwee men and woman that keep things on the sexy side of sexis

As for Prince himself, he to ses elements of gospel, SI Stone, samba, JB choreograph and groove, Be Bop, Wayn Shorter (courtesy of Eric Leeds and pure pop into his soul steam comes on like the genit post-modern James Brown wit cosmic conciousness he is. A movies, Purple Rain proved he couldn't act, and Under The Cherry Moon proved he has some screwy ideas about racidentity, but Sign 'O' The Times the first Prince film venture to sucessfully exploit the goof engaging screen presence his howed in the "Kiss" video.

It's that stage presence, plu his ace dancing, singing, an guitar playing, that help make the movie so winning. But, for me at least, what really puts over the top is the sense of con munity the sight of the entire working togethe generates. Prince has alway been surrounded by an almo unbearable aura of ego and sel interest. There was often n sense of concern for the worl outside of self, and while the made him maybe the perfect 80 pop star, it didn't make his much more than that. But in th new movie he steps away from "Someday Baby I'm Going T Be A Star" and gets closer "Everybody Is A Star." This what the Wendy and Lis characters were pushing for i the *Purple Rain* film, and it's welcome change. As a prett firm believer in the social an political dimensions of son forms it gives me a good shot a trusting in the community in plied in the call and response of "Housequake." Prince's star ascending all over again, an this time it looks like we can a hitch a ride. Cool.

THE BEST-Concert promoter John Ray, president of Turning Point Productions, Inc., and his recently formed Magic City Records is a first class human being and businessman. Ray, for the past 12 years had promoted concerts basically in the southeast region of the country.

Turning Point (Ray) broke onto the national scene last year as the national promoter for Anita Baker's highly successful debut tour. John attributes the tour's success to the incredible talents of Anita as well as a loyal committment from she and her manager Sherwin Bash of BNB Associates. Anita broke through in 1986 with her multiplatinum selling album Rapture. Of course, John had a tremendous amount of belief in Ms. Baker's talents prior to the success of her album. Needless to say, many of his peers thought he was crazy to make an investment committment in an unknown and unproven artist. Looking at the overwhelming success this combination has enjoyed, this reporter would say, "The man has a marvelous sense for talent."

During his days as a regional promoter, John would constantly encounter situations in various cities where he was looked upon with great disdain, because some other promoters had made trips through those cities without paying their bills. That stigma will "never" be associated with John Ray of Turning Point Productions, "he pays his bills." In fact, John has built such a great reputation around the country, he can secure facilities or artists with a mere phone call and the venue operators and artists know they will be paid regardless of the show's success.

It seems that 1986 was a turn-around year for Ray with most of his promotions. He promoted Stevie Wonder in Lafayette, La., New Orleans, Albany, Ga, Mobile and Birmingham, AL. John says, "I probably had the most successful run of dates on Stevie in 1986. I also copromoted Luther Vandross with Stage Right Productions in New Orleans, Montgomery and Birmingham, AL. He sold out in advance the 15 year old Birmingham Jefferson Civic Center Coliseum and became only one of five artists to ever do that. He attracted 18,629 people.'

Ray also played Lionel Richie in Biloxi, Birmingham, Atlanta and Baton Rouge. "1986 was my banner year," he proclaims. "It was my biggest year. I also picked up the Off-Broadway Musical, Mama, I Want To Sing, which has been very, very successful." John is the national promoter, Vi Higgersen and Klen Wydro are the producers. The permanent company is at The Hecksher Theatre in New York, and John has promoted the road company since November with one or two week runs starting in Memphis. Then New Orleans, Dallas, Washington, D.C., Cincinnati, Houston, Cleveland, Miami, Boston, Indianapolis and Los Angeles. Doris Troy, who used to record for the Beatles', Apple Records and earlier had a big hit with Just One Look in 1963, is the star of the show as well as Higgersen's sister.

John has built such a credible reputation around the country as a first class concert promoter (who happens to be black) until he is now being offered exclusive rights to serve as national promoter for many of the top acts in the business. According to Sidney A.

Seidenberg, manager of B.B. King and Gladys Knight & The Pips, "John Ray is a reliable promoter, who we have worked with in the past 10 years. I can recommend him to any artist with confidence." Bill Washington, president, Dimensions Unlimited, says "there should be more concert promoters like John Ray. He's honest, straight and very professional. He lends credibility to concert promotions in this country.

John, who recently turned 42 has formed his own record label, Magic City Records and his own management company, John Ray Associates. The initial signing to both label and management company is the Atlanta based Brick with all original members. Brick, the cornerstone of R&B and Funk with such hits as Dazz, Dusic, Ain't Gonna Hurt Nobody and We Don't Wanna Sit Down, We Wanna Get Down, (certified platinum) are back on the music scene.

The group composed of drummer Eddie Irons, guitarist Reggie Hargis, bassist/vocalist Ray Ransom and brass/reeds/vocalist Jimmy Brown is funkier than ever after a five year hiatus. Although Brick disppeared from the music scene, their platinum hit Dazz has been getting a lot of air play all over the country, and of late, New York's rapster Dana Dane used the bass and drum lines from Dazz to hurl him into national prominence. All of the recent energy around Dazz has prompted the group to re-release this devasting hit with more of a 1987 flavor, hitting home to the teen and dance crowd. During the recent debut of the record at Uptown Atlanta, the crowd response was nothing short of sensational.

Brick is back and they will be bigger than ever! Other artists signed to the label are David Sea who not only has that "strong" black male image, but an absolutely sensational vocal style that will sky rocket him to the top. Other signees are Ikie, Eric Von Isaac and Stan Granger. Ray said, "One of the reasons I wanted to start my own record company, was to seek out and find good talent in the vast reservior of unsigned

To further enhance the success, (destined for Magic City Records) John has named J.C. Futrell as vice president. Futrell is a graduate of Shaw University with a degree in Radio-TV-Film. Prior to joining Turning Point Productions Inc.,/Magic City Records, Futrell was president of Rockwell Futrell Productions, Inc. of Atlanta, Georgia. (Amultifacet entertainment, marketing, promotions firm)

J.C. has worked with numerous recording artist, most notable, The Fat Boys. In adition he has taught at colleges and managed several public radio stations. He also found time to serve as audio engineer for such acts as Whodini, Joeski Love, UTFO, LA Dream Team, Fat Boys and The Latin Rascals.

This vibrant young man's administrative, managerial, technical, sales and marketing skills are indeed part of the charisma behind Turning Point Productions and Magic City Records. This reporter will go on record and say, you can expect some marvelous things from Magic City Records under the direction of a first class human being and businessman John Ray, who gives all credit to God!

SI LOVE YOU - PolyGram Special Imports, division that has been bringing in such important and innovative European labels as Black Saint/Soul Note, Owl, Sound Aspects, Minor Music and Red Records is more or less on its way to kaputville, due to manager Paul Del Campo's promotion to another part of the company. However, Poly-Gram Jazz, under the guidance of Richard Seidel, is going to pick up some of this product - specifically, they're going to be releasing items from the PSI labels on a selected basis, in addition to picking up some of PSI's other international activity. PSI, under Del Campo, has done a fantastic job of, as their saying goes, "Bringing America's Music Back Home.

PASSING ON — Two talented jazz musicians died within a few days of each other recently and attention should be paid. Willis "Gatortail" Jackson, a rough-and-tumble, blues-based tenor saxophonist, died in New York after heart surgery at the age of 59. Jorge Dalto, a rollicking Argentinian pianist with a fiery latin-jazz style, died of cancer in New York at the age of 39. They were both lively presences on the New York scene, and they will both be sorely missed.

A RARE BATCH OF SATCH -Queens College has recently established a Louis Armstrong Archive, as part of the school's Aaron Copland School of Music. Donated by the estate of Louis and Lucille Armstrong, the collection includes five trumpets, hundreds of personal tapes and discs, dozens of photograph albums, scrapbooks, correspondence, musical score, etc., etc. - in other words, a treasure trove material about the greatest jazz musician of them all. In addition to all of this, the College has made an agreement with the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs to run the longtime Armstrong home in Corona, Queens as a museum. This is, as you don't need to be told, wonderful news.

WORLD PACIFIC REDUX -Beginning in January, Blue Note (ur, Manhattan), will turn its attentions to yet another historical jazz label with a hefty catalogue - World Pacific. Under the banner, "EMI-Manhattan Jazz Classics," the CDonly midline series will debut in January with reissues of material by, amongst others, Gil Evans, Gerry Mulligan, Lambert, Hendricks & Ross and Clifford Brown, and will continue in April with items from Evans, Mulligan, Jim Hall, Hoagy Carmichael and others. Yeah!

BENEFICIALLY YOURS – Two big jazz benefits are coming up in New York in the next couple of weeks: "A Party for Zoot" – is a

memorial bash (the second) to raise money for the Zoot Sims Scholarship Fund of the Jazz and Contemporary Music Program at the New School. Urbie Green, Tommy Flanagan, Jim Hall and Scott Hamilton are among the performers, November 22nd is the date, the New School (66 W. 12th St.) is the place, and (212) 741-8950 is the number to call for details. Then comes a concert at the Beacon Theatre, December 7th, to raise money for WBGO-FM's Capital Campaign. The concert, the kickoff of a Philip Morris Superband tour (annual events that go to the Far East and South Pacific), will feature Ahmad Jamal, Kenny Burrell and The Superband All-Stars (James Moody, Clark Terry, Dee Dee Bridgewater, Jimmy McGriff, Grady Tate and George Mraz).

Chris Hillman and Herb Pedersen of The Desert Rose Band were kind enough to come by the Nashville Cash Box offices, recently. We had a fun and informative talk about the success the group has earned, and is enjoying currently.

Chris said, "We love it! We are very happy about our acceptance by the country music fans. We are also thankful that we seem to be in the right place at the right time. We're doing what we called 'country rock' in the 60's. However, we aren't taking anything for granted. It's very tough to get a deal in the 80's. You see, sometimes, having success in the past is a negative stigma.

The main thing for us, right now, is that we're having fun playing in the band! Whatever happens is great. If we fall apart tomorrow, it happens. At least, we'll know we tried!

Herb Pedersen added some additional thoughts. "Chris and I came up the same way in California. What's happening for us now is very satisfying for me. The band is good. The tunes are fine, and it all feels right. Singin' in this group feels great. The duets are really locked-in!

Chris and I go back as far as Exile in '63. We were both in California bluegrass bands, and we played the same circuit, but with different groups. The Desert Rose Band is producing the best music I have ever played. You have to figure out the sound you do best and stick with it."

When asked about the Desert Rose

sound, and how different it is for today's market, they both agreed and shared these comments. "We know 2. it's different, but it's not what we planned. It's a 'mixmaster' of what we have learned through the years. We don't try to tell the pickers what to play. We come to the guys with the basics, and they put the chord changes in,.. and we go!"

"One Step Forward" is climbing the charts for the band right now. It's their new single and follows the highly acclaimed "Love Reunited". 1 Chris says, "I think we are trying to stay with a style. I am very critical of my own writing, and we are open to cutting outside material. However, I really don't think we have tapped our style, yet.

The honeymoon's on, and we have to find out when to give and when to take. We're 'married', and we have to work together. It's an audio business, and we want people to know us when they hear us... know our sound. But, we're still out there struggling."

Chris and Herb were the two members of Desert Rose who came in to talk. The other band members are John Jorgensen (lead guitar), Jay Dee Maness (steel), Bill Bryson (bass), and Steve Duncan (drums). Put them all together, and you have 5 one of the most refreshing sounds in country music. We are happy to see a long-awaited, beautiful sight...The Desert Rose in full bloom!





WING: THE BEST OF THE BIG BANDS – November 12 marks the release date of MCA Home Video's Swing: The Best Of The Big Bands. The four-volume video cassette collection (available individually for \$24.95 each or \$79.95 for the complete set) contains incredible historical footage of some of the most influential and prominent legends in the big band sound.

The tape consists of footage shot throughout the 1940's and 50's, most of which was kept from public viewing over the years because of technical problems and clearance obstacles. Legendary artists such as Count Basie, Louis Prima, Duke Ellington, The Ink Spots, Nat King Cole, Tommy & Jimmy Dorsey, Buddy Rich, Stan Kenton, Les Brown and the immortal Billie Holiday are all featured prominently throughout the series. Together, a team consisting of producer George Paige, associate producer Karen Deal and creative consultant Jim Washburn together with MCA Home Video have put together a remarkable video journey chronicling the history of big band music.

Recently, Jim Washburn spoke to Cash Box, discussing the evolution of the video series. Washburn is an Emmy award winning producer and director who began his involvement in the entertainment media during the 'golden age' of television. He has worked extensively with big bands over the years, and his love for the music led to his involvement in the creation of Swing: The Best Of The Big Bands.

Washburn professed an obvious great love for the music of the big bands as he emphasized, "I've grown up with it all my life... I have great feelings for the music, I think it's happy music. It harps back to nicer times, there's nothing ugly about it..."

One viewing of the tapes instantly reveals the painstaking care and precision that went into the creation of the series. The performances included are breathtaking; whether it's Billie Holiday belting out her classic "God Bless The Child," Nat King Cole captivating us with "Route 66," or Louis Prima crooming "Old Black Magic." This music is timeless...

Most of the footage was culled from short subjects shown in movie houses in the 40's and 50's. Wash burn explained, "These originally were 15 to 17 minute short subject complete unto themselves. They're like miniature variety shows - there were some dance acts and some singing groups. We pulled out the best of the big band stuff primarily None of [what was used] is one of those completed short subjects, we just took 'the best of'."

As far as his expectations for the tape, Washburn explained, "I'd like to see it get a lot of distribution and see people get a lot of enjoyment ou of it. That would be a kick for me."

Each tape runs approximately 50 minutes in length, available in VHS Dolby HiFi Mono and Beta HiF Mono.

Pere Ubu/fHIREHO SE/Miracle Legion

THE RITZ, N.Y.C. - Pere Ubu finished their "Avant Garage" tour with a show at the Ritz, and when it was all over a friend of mine could only say, "It's scary. That a band could be that good. It just scares me." The whole thing is a little weird. In 1975, when there was no formal concept of underground - no punk, nowave, or new wave - a band from out of nowhere (Cleveland) pushed the limits of semi-pop to encompass the avant-garde. They recorded a handful of singles, a couple of records for major labels that went nowhere, and ended up letting the avant-garde suck the semi-pop dry, finishing their career with one disc of conceptual rambling stuff and one of, well, normal stuff. The band members dispersed to art-rock bands, and the frontman went on to a solo career that has something to do with him peing a Jehovah's Witness. Five years after their last record they get back ogether, announce that they never really broke up (just had an argument), do a two-week, twelve city our, and land a record contract with

Phonogram UK. Weird. Miracle Legion, a jangle-drone pop oand from New Haven, opened the show. These guys are trying make their way out of the small time, and hough they sound big and sound good, they don't look like they mean t. fIREHOSE followed with some polyphonic explorations of the truly rad that hit nice brain bending levels of pure sound. But they too were missing something, namely D. Boon. Then Pere Ubu stormed the stage like t was 1978 and the battle had to be waged all over again: prove music can be sonically inventive and fun, fun, fun. On records like The Modern Dance (78) and Dub Housing (79) Pere Ubu bridged the gap between sonic pleasure and sonic adventurism in a way no new-wave popster ever came close to. In this edition of Pere Ubu, original members David Thomas (vocals), Allen Ravenstine (synthesizer), Scott Krauss (drums), and Tony Maimone (bass) were joined by longtime associates Jim Jones (guitar) and Chris Cutler (drums). Together they tore through a joyous, funky set that was as likely to provoke a stunned, "Hey, isn't that the 'Pretty Woman' bassline?" as, "Geez, isn't this where the whole of the American underground came from?"

It did seem like the present alternative-rock scene came straight from Pere Ubu. Tony Maimone played bass as melody and rhythm just like Mike Watt (Minutemen, fIREHOSE), the double drummers recalled the Butthole Surfers and the whole Grateful Dead revisionist theory, and the overall orchestral wall of aural assault was like Sonic Youth. Jim Jones

avid Torn

AT MY PLACE, SANTA MONICA, CA. - An unusually large and anxious crowd squeezed into 'At My Place' to get a glimpse of guitar prodigy David Torn. Torn had established himself in the jazz world through his work with Don Cherry, John Abercrombie, Jan Garbarek and the Everyman Band with whom he has recorded two albums, Everyman Band, and Without Warning for ECM. His most recent disc, Clouds About Mercury, is filled primarily with his own inventive compositions.

Torn opened the show with a kotolike intro to "Snapping the Hollow Reed." Bill Bruford came in playing a sequential sounding groove on his wild electric/acoustic drum set. A healthy portion of the crowd undoubtedly included Bruford loyalists who have been fans since his Yes, U.K., and King Crimson days. Canadian Michael White entered playing a simple, smooth ensemble part, and bassist Mick Karn was spare but thorough in completing the backdrop for Torn's first improvisational journey.

From the minute this guy started to play, it was apparent he was into some new stuff. Where did he develop this outlandish approach? This was not your ordinary guitar phrasing. Oboe phrasing for that matter. His command of the instrument was obvious, moving vertically all over the neck of his Steinberger GL2T guitar with ease and familiarity. Not relying on hooks, standard licks, or comfortable melodies of any kind, Torn was pushing the boundaries. And this was his first solo of the night.

As the set progressed, Bruford's grooves became progressively more intricate and interesting and Torn's solos got increasingly wilder. How

far would this go? The tunes themselves were loosely structured using hand signals at seemingly arbitrary moments to take it back to the top. It required a skilled and tightly knit crew to carry off these seemingly effortless transitions.

The audience was devouring the whole display and had to remain fairly charged-up to greet the intensity being fired at them without being bowled over. Another monstrous intro-solo by Bruford, Michael White playing beautiful lines on a seashell, and Mark Isham sitting in for a tune were some of the highlights during the rest of the show. "Previous Man," "Three Minutes of Pure Entertainment," and the encore of "Burial Ground" were the other compositions featured from the Cloud About Mercury album. Also included were the unrecorded "Big Thing," "Interlude/The Others" and a Mick Tarn piece, "Dalis Car."

Perhaps the strenth and weakness of Torn's material was the mysterious 'cloudy' atmosphere he created throughout the set. A familiar 'branch' of sound or a couple of melodies you could whistle on the bus might instantly double his appeal. His daring and highly developed skill is extremely rare,

Every couple of years a prominent new artist of Torn's calibre rises from the world of avant-garde obscurity to become a virtual hero for a new generation of musicians. During the past decade, Steve Morse, Eric Johnson, and Allan Holdsworth are a few of the notable guitarists to travel such a path. Whenever a 'new' master of the frets begins to explore unchartered territory, it doesn't take long for the word to get out. Judging from the buzz generated during Monday's concert, David Torn will be influencing many players with his orchestral sound, ecclectic compositions, sinewey improvisations, and inventive band concept.

AT MY PLACE, SANTA MONICA - Keiko Matsui's rare Los Angles appearance had caused great anticipation among those in the know. Drawing nothing short of raves from her

previous visit to At My Place, the short, beautiful keyboard whiz was well worth all the attention and praise. Right out of the gate she awakened a seemingly listless crowd (judging from the apathetic response to talented comedian Pat Hazel opening the show) with her vibrant, advanced 'dancing' on the keyboards.

Endorsing Yamaha with her Dx7/Kx28 keyboard stack, her playing was instantly crisp, confident, and wildly energetic without ever being selfish, allowing her bandmates to stretch as well. Sax/flute man Mike Acosta stepped out with fervor and taste on the first three numbers, and axe-master Teddy Castelluzzi did some well-crafted shredding the second half of the show.

Spreading the spotlight further, Matsui invited two of her most intimate companions to join her or stage. Vocalist Carl Anderson, first known for his Jesus Christ Superstandays and featured with many prominent artists over the years joined the band for rousing variations of "Stormy Monday" and "Fairy." During"~Stormy Monday," Matsui broke out her Kx5, strapped it around her neck and used a mouthpiece to simulate a horn effect Taking the posture of a guitar player she displayed her ability to smoke or the blues.

Following Anderson was Keiko's husband, Kazu Matsui. Playing a Shakuhachi,a long Japanese wood flute, the spirit of the next two tunes became both haunting and mesmerizing. During "Ancient Wind' and "Light Above The Trees" Keiko had switched to acoustic piano, playing with a Japanese classical flavor that would conjure up potent imagery in the mind of an attentive listener. Kazu played stirring melodies himself, which appeared to rise from deep within, his body trembling "When I play I get really involved" he cited.

Displaying further versatility, the band broke into some high energy funk on "Midnight Shuffle," peaking with a rapid fire trading of phrases between Castelluzzi and Matsui. Her ability to mimick his lines, which were frenzied and intricate, was amazing.

The set ended with "A Drop Of Water," the title track from her recent album, which again included Carl Anderson. Following was an encore of "Mediterranean Sand," featuring strong solos by Tom Walsh on drums and Bob Wakerman on bass.

In a few days, Matsui is off to Japan, a back- and -forth trek that has become very common. On the heels of *A Drop Of Water*, another album is being planned for Passport Records, and hopefully more extensive touring next year. Keiko Matsui is one of the brightest young talents on the contemporary Jazz scene, and is sure to surprise and delight any fans fortunate enough to hear her play.

Ronstadt has easily achieved the title of pop music's greatest chameleon. She has sung material by everyone from Elvis Costello to Gilbert & Sullivan, she has successfully performed nearly all genres of music; rock, pop, country, opera, pop standards, and most recently Mexican rancheras (her Canciones De Mi Padre is due in stores on November 16, available on Asylum Records). Production seemed like the next logical step in her artistic progression, Ronstadt revealed, though, "I never wanted to produce. I've had offers, but I just never wanted to. In a sense l always co-produce my own records, I think most artists are involved with [their own] production."

Ronstadt stated that after seeing Lindley perform she wanted his record... literally. "I wanted to buy the record [laughs]." After discovering that no album was in the works, she decided to take on the project herself. "I could dream in [Lindley's] sound, it makes a picture for me. It was selfish, really, I wanted the record [laughs]. It didn't have anything to do with wanting to have this career as a producer, because I don't think that's in the cards for me. I have to many records of my own to make." The combination of Ronstadt and Lindley seemed equally appropriate, as they have worked together extensively in the past, (most recently, Lindley played on the smash Ronstadt, Dolly Parton, Emmylou Harris album, Trio).

Ronstadt explained the responsibilities she undertook as a first-time producer: "Ed [Cherney] knows a lot more about electronics than I do, 1 don't know anything about electrical what his music sounds like."

stuff. I know about sound, and I know about relationships of sound which is what a producers job is." She continued, "You hear patterns and you hear the way something relates to something, if something sounds vague or if it doesn't sound good then you do something else. It announces itself immediately if it's good. Over the years you develop an ability to hear sound in microscopic detail. You can hear the tiniest little nuances, the tiniest little breath or gasp or intonation. You can hear texture in a vocal, for instance. We've developed our ears to hear these very subtle relationships of one instrument to another, one instrument to the track, one instrument related to an effect you want to put on it.'

Cherney emphatically stated the joy of working with the duo for the first time: "It's been the most unselfish project that I've ever worked on. [Linda's] so unselfish that what we're doing is making a David Lindley record, not a Linda Ronstadt record. In a lot of other situations it doesn't turn out that way - there's someone else imposing their will on the artist." He continued, "For me it was as if we'd been working together for a long time. I literally cut my musical teeth listening to records by Linda and Mr. Dave. It's really been quite easy for me because Linda's vision and Dave's vision are so clear that we rarely have to talk about what specifically we have to be doing or what we're looking for, it's so obvious."

Lindley summarized prosperous working relationship by stating, "It's unbelievably easy. It's very, very easy because we have a lot of the same ideas about the way things should sound." Ronstadt agreed: "It's nice to have that common vocabulary. I know him. I know

Virgin Launches Soundtrack Label

LOS ANGELES - Virgin Records America has announced that they have formed a new label dedicated solely to soundtrack releases. The new label, called Virgin Movie Music, debuted in October with the soundtrack to the film Hiding Out. Upcoming releases in November will include Walker, with music by Joe Strummer; The Last Emperor, by David Byrne, Ryuichi Sakamoto (also the film's star), and Chinese musician Cong Su; and The Sicilian, composed by David Mansfield.

When Virgin opened its American doors last December, the first LP released was Ennio Morricone's soundtrack to The Mission, which has continued to rack up consistent sales since. Sales of this and other soundtrack albums sparked the idea for the new label.

Jeff Ayeroff, Virgin's co-managing director, commented "Jordan (Harris, co-managing director) and 1 thought 'let's do a soundtrack label for all these great projects we're doing' and so we did. It's going to be a great label - the proof is in the

"Personally, for myself, I can't honestly say to you that once I got on the stage that I ever wanted to be anyplace else. Once I get to the stage, that's my total existence, man, I don't want to be no other place. See, because what it is, it's the music, it's what's happening in the music, it's what's happening musically. You walk out there on the stage, and those people love what you do and they recognize you, and you can feel the electricity from them to you. Some nights maybe you might say, 'Well, Ray, we all don't always feel as well as we would like to feel. Some nights you might feel a little down or ill or whatever.' Well I'd say that 99% of the time, in cases like that, even when you don't feel well, something happens. I can't explain it, man, I don't know the answer to it - I've tried to study and figure it out - but once you get to the stage, once the music starts going, somehow or other something takes place and - until your body completely breaks down - you somehow get through it."

Right now, Ray Charles is thinking about doing a jazz project - maybe getting Dizzy Gillespie, Milt Jackson, Ray Brown, and some other people like that together and just doing a little blowing date.

"Well, that's where I'm going to be headed, because, you know, there are only a few people that's left that are around, man, who are among the creators of good jazz, and I'm working on trying to put these people

When asked what he is proudest of, Ray Charles responds that he is proudest of the fact that his life proves that the American dream can

'There is such a thing as starting from zero," he says, "it can happen. You literally can start from nothing and become something, truly, in this country."
