# Worldwide Amnesty Tour Planned

LOS ANGELES - Sting, Peter Gabriel, Youssou N'Dour, Jackson Browne and a host of other superstars will participate in an international concert tour titled "Human Rights Now" which will feature visits to several third world countries. The primary purpose of the tour will be to raise consciousness about human rights abuses and to circulate the Universal Declaration Of Human Rights, the internationally agreed to human rights document. The announcement was made by Amnesty International Director John G. Healy at a star-studded press conerence at the A&M Records' lot in Hollywood on April 12th. An exact itinerary is not yet available because ongoing sensitive negotiations with various countries, but Healy said the tour will cover "five continents from the East to the West" including the U.S. The dates are through late October. The tour will be produced by Bill Graham and directed by Michael Ahern. Reebok International will underwrite the entire cost of the tour, including an initial 2 million dollar donation.

Several of the participating musicians, organizers and former political prisoners were present, and each came to the stage to sign a large political prisoners were present, and each came to the stage to sign a large political for amnesty and make short statements. Among the musicians there was Sting, Suzanne Vega, Jackson Browne, Robert Cray, Richard Page, Bonnie Rait, Robert Lamb, Gloria Estefan, and Michael McDonald. It was also announced that Eric Clapton and Def Leppard would appear at the shows, with additional regional acts from the countries will also appear.

Possible visits to Russia, China and Central America were mentioned.

Healy did not rule out a concert in South Africa, stating, "It would depend upon the negotiation, they're in the U.N. and we'd discuss that as we go. What they could not do is forbid any activity that we normally do, which is our work."

"What we hope," said Healy, "is this will be the largest appeal for signatures of all time. We want to deliver on Human Rights Day to the U.N. millions or perhaps billions of signatures. We've already translated the declaration into fifty or more languages. There will be handouts, booths, television and radio coverage, much like the Conspiracy Of Hope Tour."

Bill Graham cautioned that because of primitive conditions and volatile political situations in some of countries being considered, it was highly likely that there could be some sudden changes in concert schedules or cancellations. "We'll be working with two to three units leap-frogging around, we'll be going, say, from Europe to South America to Central America. But we have to feel we have a good chance of pulling off a concert before we go in. It wouldn't be fair to endanger any of the performers or participants."

# Primerica Signs Definitive Agreement To Sell Musicland Group

NEW YORK-Primerica Corp. and the Musicland Group have signed a definititve agreement to sell the Musicland Group, Inc. to a group of private investors led by Donaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette for \$36 for each outstanding share, or approximately \$410 million. Upon completion of the sale, Primerica will receive approximately \$330 million for its 81% interest in the Group, with the remainder being distributed to the other public shareholders.

Primerica expects to record an after-tax gain on the transaction of approximately \$130 million, or \$2.50 per share, and intends to use the net

to reduce debut. The sale would be accomplished through a leveraged buyout by a group of investors led by the investment banking firm of Donaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette together with the senior management of Musicland. Primerica expects to participate in the leveraged buyout by purchasing up to 20% of the common stock for \$10 million, as well as \$8 million of preferred stock. The transaction, which is expected to be completed during the second quarter of this year, is subject to approval by the Musicland Group shareholders, and well as other closing conditions.

# George Michael

NEW YORK - No need, dear reader, for me to tell you who George Michael is and what he does. No need, because you know. You and about 14 million others worldwide who have bought his album Faith (Columbia), and the three #1 singles from it, "I Want Your Sex," "Faith," and "Father Figure." You know George and have heard his call and answered. With the Faith tour sweeping through the world (landing in America for two busy months from Aug. 6 to Oct. 9) more of you will answer the call than ever before.

And if, dear reader, you are not a record consumer but a member of the recording industry, you too have heard the call and answered: in Australia you heard the call and it was good and you bestowed on George a Crystal Globe Award (signifying sales of over 5 million outside the U.K.); in Japan you heard and gave George a Japan Gold Disc Award (the Japanese equivalent of a Grammy) for Best International Pop Solo Album of 1987; in England you heard and gave George a British Phonographic Industry (BPI) Award (the British equivalent of a Grammy) for Best British Male Artist; and here in America you heard and answered with a Grammy for Best R&B Performance By A Duo or Group for Michael's duet with Aretha Franklin on "I Knew You Were Waiting (For Me)."

Of all these honors, Michael may be proudest of winning the Grammy with Aretha. "Perhaps more than other category, winning the R&B award with Aretha validates the tremendous influence [R&B] music's had on my singing, songwriting and creative process," he's said. "Which is why it's so rewarding to have...broken into the top 10 on the black charts with my album and single." Faith and the singles from it

have done very well on the black charts (the LP was #3 with a bullet the Cash Box Black Albums chart laweek) and since he outdid Prince lasummer with "I Want Your Sex Michael has repeatedly expressed by pleasure, relief even, at bein "accepted" on black radio, in the clubs, and by black record buyers.

And perhaps this is his greatest a complishment. Faith is as compellis a record, from begining to end, as as released in the last year. It's stylis diversity is as impressive as its swa gering, self-assured funk groov But most impressive is how may people, and different sorts of peop it communicates with. How man people, and different sorts of peop hear the call and respond by dancing buying, singing along, whatever. T reason why massive sales are into esting at all, let alone important, because they reflect the wants al needs of individuals as a collecti force. George Michael's massi sales indicate that he's communicate ing with diverse groups. He has t approbation of the pop audience, t funk audience, the quiet stor audience - in short, he speaks to greater range of listeners than almo any other performer today. By to ping the pop and black charts simi taneously, he's created a communi that exists on the radio if not in t cities.

While Springsteen may be laud by the rock critical establishment the greatest rock and roller in the world (a rock critical establishment that has always payed closer attention to rock than dance must anyway), George Michael is being crowned king by an wider cross settion of listeners than Springsteen has been able to reach. Which is not be for a guy critics used to dismiss as it terested in nothing more than sty and disposable pop. Not bad at all

# **Treat Her Right**

NASHVILLE – When the Boston-based band Treat Her Right was approached by RCA Records o record their first album 'as is,' the band knew they were doing semething right. Judging by the almost unanimous positive garnering from both their LP and live performances, one is safe to assume that RCA made a gamble that should prove to pay off big. Recorded at Fort Apache studios (located in one of the rougher spots in Boston), the album was first released on an independent U.K. label, Demon Records. The studio, founded by è band's harmonica/baritone x player, Jim Fitting, provided he background for the band to

By the time the band was approached by RCA and finally signed in December of 1987, they were given virtually free reign over the product. In fact they produced all but three songs on the LP themselves, by "arguing and democracy," said Fitting. Treat Her Right is comprised of fitting, guitarists Mark Sandman and David Champagne, and drummer Billy Conway.

Citing influences such as Muddy Waters, Bo Diddley and George Jones, Treat Her Right has managed to capture the essence of all these musical forces, while creating something fresh as well.

Champagne and Sandman share a majority of the writing responsibilities on the album. Sandman's "I Think She Likes Me" has been released as the first single from the self-titled LP. Says Sandman of the song, "It was a good first song to release because it has all the elements of our sound in it."

There are several searing cuts on the album: "Jesus Everyday," a satirical look at religious politics; "Square," written by Fitting; and "Everglades," written by local legendary songwriter Harlan Howard. A majority of the songs have stories to tell, and the listener can get as involved or as uninvolved as he cares.

It's the simplicity, the downright plainness, of the music that makes it so attractive. And the fact that the band is able to pull it off just as well live is even more consoling. Maybe Treat Her Right can reinstate what music is really about.

The band is currently opening for the BoDeans, with plans to tour in support of The Smithereens on the West Coast in the near future.

AWARDS - Big winners at the 3rd Annual New York Music Awards on Saturday, April 9, were Suzanne Vega, and Lisa Lisa & Cult Jam who each won in five catagories. A poll of over 350 music industry members, including critics, biz execs, and agents, determined the results. Vega won Artist of the Year, Single of the Year ("Luka"), Song of the Year ("Luka"), Song of the Year ("Luka"), Best Pop Album (Solitude Standing), and Best Folk Artist. Lisa Lisa & Cult Jam got awards for Group of the Year, Best Rock Album By A Group, Best R&B Fly), Best R&B Group, Best R&B Album, and Bost Dance Music Album, and Best Dance Music Vocalist. Buster Poindexter did pretty well (four awards, including Best Rock Album By A Solo Artist), as did Salt-N-Pepa, Debbie Gibson, and The Brandos (two awards each). Other winners in the more than 50 catagories included The Silos (Best Pop Album, Independent Label, Cuba), LL Cool J (Best Rap Artist), Vernon Reid (Best Rock Instrumentalist), and The Smithereens (Best Rock Band). The real news here, though, is that Buster Poindexter spoke to Debbie Gibson backstage about writing a song for his next album.

STAR SEARCH-CMJ Entertainment (the folks who bring you the College Music Journal, and the CMJ Music Marathon convention in NYC) will be co-ordinating a nationwide talent search to uncover the best unsigned bands in the country. The winners will appear on a compilation album on RCA. In the past two years Unsigned and Unsigned Vol. II (previously on Epic) have featured such bands as The Radiators (New Orleans R&B bohunks who landed on Epic), Green (Chicago trio, currently the subject of deserved major label interest) and The Reducers (New London, Conn., power-pop quartet that isn't the subject of major label interest and should be, A&R folks; they just released a 12-inch on Rave On Records). The way it works: over 200 college and progressive radio stations submit cassettes of their local faves (decided by on-air competition); CMJ and RCA choose the ten best; once the album is out, listeners choose their favorite of the ten, fill out a ballot included with the record, and vote for Undiscovered Artist Of The Year, to be

named at the CMJ convention next October.

SHEAR POP THRILL — As reported last week, I.R.S. has signed Jules Shear and the Reckless Sleepers. Pop genius that he is, Shear probably won't fill the gap that platinum Godz R.E.M. left when they jumped from I.R.S. to Warners two weeks ago (for so much money you don't even want to think about it), but with Scott Litt (who worked on R.E.M.'s Document) producing you never know. The album is due in late June.

MORE I.R.S. NEWS – Just what the doctor ordered: an all metal series from I.R.S., called, quite simply, I.R.S. Metal. The label will picture the I.R.S. man (profile of a guy in hat and shades) with no skin. Can't wait. First releases (around June) will be from New Jersey's Nuclear Assault, inner city Detroit's Seduced, and London's Chrome Molly. Meanwhile, there so little truth to the rumour that I.R.S. might change distributors that it's not even a bona-fide rumour. Their contract with MCA will be renewed this year.

RECORD BREAKER – The folks

100 singles chart.

TASTY BITS – There is no stop-

ping Joe Satriani. His album Surf-With The Alien (Relativity) was #38 with a bullet on the Cash Box Top 100 albums chart last week. This is nothing short of Dern Amazing for an all instrumental record of heavy-metal-wangdoodle on an in-dependent label. It must be the generous fleet-fingered humor of Satriani's metal-boogie that makes Surfing such a smash. Just back from Japan where he backed up Mick Jagger, Satriani will play the Bottom Line on May 17 and 18...Dissidenten, world-beat dance mavens from Berlin, take it to the stage in New York, April 26 & 27, at S.O.B.'s. The six members Dissidenten (means "dissidents") are from North Africa and Germany, and their sound is a Euro-Arabic fusion. Bound to happen, I suppose, but fresh as can be. Those who haven't heard Sahara Electric (Shanachie) should...MCA is releasing Patsy Cline's catalogue on CD...Look for Westworld's Rockulator coming soon from RCA. Trash culture glam rock for TV addicts that asks the question, "How many times can we cross Bo Diddley with T. Rex before people get tired of it?"...There's a new Ladysmith Black Mambazo LP on Shanachie, Umthombo Wamanzi. lt was recorded before they did Shaka Zulu for Warners...Everly Brothers to do a summer tour...George Michael at Madison Square Garden Aug. 14 & 15.

#### VOICES OF THE HEART - Eric Marienthal - GRP 9563 - Producer: Chick Corea


Chick's entire Elektric Band is now recording their own fusion albums. This is his alto saxophonist.

The fact that all the governments of the world actually approved it is amazing. I'm coxvinced that through this tour we have a chance to build a strong international lobby made of the people of the world to help establish the basic human rights layed out in this docu-

Said La Bonte, "We're establishing a human rights award for two young people from around the world. They will share a \$100,000 dollar gift. # RAPPIN' With the Retailers

This week retailers around the country were asked if picture sleeves rather than dye cut covers have an impact on sales of 12" product, followed by their views on the 3" CD and their best moving independent product. The varied results are as follows:

GARY'S RECORDS / Richmond, VA

Reporting: Martin Gary
"I don't think a picture sleeve means that much in increased sales. As far as 3" CDs go, I don't think there is enough demand to support the product. It's definitely a Yuppie market. Independent product constitutes a whole lot of our sales; one of the best movers right now is Turn Off The Lights (In The Fast Lane by World Class Wrecking Kru, on Kru-Cut Records. Criminal Minded is still selling well, too. Profile's compilation Heart Of Steel is picking up well, and we've got a hot new item that's apparently local. The label is I Hear Ya and the name of the product is Go Go Live. We've sold out a couple of times. It's distributed by Landmark.

(editor's note: A check with Landmark revealed that the product in question is a compilation 12" EP and a 90 minute cassette which were gleaned from a video-recording of a number of bands in live performance in Washington, D.C. Landmark's team has networked the product through independent distributors so that it will now be available nationwide. Additionally, the label has responded to the distributors' request for 12" product,

and will also be doing an LP in the near future.)

ROSE RECORDS / Chicago

Reporting: Tom Jacobsen

"Picture sleeves on 12" product have a definite effect on the impulse buyer. The customer who comes in with a record in mind will buy that record no matter how it's packaged, but the shopper, the person who comes in to look around . . . that person is definitely more likely to pick up a picture package. The 3" CDs will be promoted here. We're not going to make a quick negative judgment, we are going to move cautiously and give them a chance. If the labels make full use of the time available in that format, which is about nine minutes, then I think they might prove to be good sellers. Hot sellers right now include Surfing With The Alien which is stronger than ever. I'm seeing nothing but increased sales for over four weeks now; Salt-N-Pepa is still selling well, too. There's an increase in Eric B. & Rakim since they are featured in **Colors** (the new movie with Sean Penn and Robert Duvall, ed.). The Seven Minutes Of Madness 12" looks like it's going to really pick up and do very well."

BEBOP RECORDS / Ridgeland, MS

Reporting: Steven Ritchey
"The 12" picture sleeve covers really help build interst, there's a big difference in the sales you pick up from the casual buyer. There doesn't seem to be much interest yet in acquiring 3" CDs. We do best with 12" and maxicassettes. Top product from the indies for us right now would include They Might Be Giants, Classical Gas, Steppin' Up. Surfing With The Alien is a good, steady seller, and it's too early to tell what will happen with The Rippingtons new album. Malaco has a winner with their new Rose Bros. single, In The Mix," and Ichiban's Hooked On Love and If You Can Beat Me Rocking albums are both doing well. The Tonight Show Orchestra with Doc Severinsen, Volumes I & II do fine, too."

RECORD MASTER / Baltimore, MD

"I don't see too much variation in sales with picture jackets. People are curious about the 3" CD, but they don't buy it. Our single cassettes and maxi cassettes are doing OK, we're going to stick with it. Our big independent product is still Salt-N-Pepa. We're doing well with the new jazz product from Landmark and Milestone, too. *Harlem Blues* by Donald Byrd is doing well. The Rippingtons' is getting hot, too. **Surfing With The Alien** might have peeked, but it's still selling.

JERRY'S ONE-STOP / Miami, FL

Reporting: **Jerry Bassin**"The European accounts prefer picture sleeve 12"s, while the domestic ccounts don't seem to care as much. Of course, this all depends on who




Frank Gambale A PRESENT FOR THE FUTURE Legato Records (1002)

#### Reviews

#### CLASSICAL

From time to time this column will do capsule reviews of new and older recordings in an effort to highlight albums that may have been overlooked in the past. This week's column focuses on music of the Renaissance and the

Over the last few years Capriccio Records (distributed by Delta Music in the U.S.) has issued a number of recordings of German choral music of the Reformation. An ongoing project includes Schutz's Symphoniae Sacrea, Book I (Cap 10044/45) featuring tenor Peter Schreier, the Dresdner Kreuzchor, and Hans Gruss conducting the Capella Fidicinia (Book II is due out shortly). The same group also recorded a set of Reformation Leider by various composers, most notabley Johann Walther (Cap 10089). Also available from Capriccio is Schutz's Schwanengesang SWV 482-494 performed by the Berliner Solisten, and the Capella Sagittariana, Dietrich conducting 10049/50). The Symphoniae demonstrate Schutz's mastery of the Italian few-voiced concertato style with a Latin text while the Schwanengesang shows his proficiancy in the German

psalm-motet style. All the sets possess a richness and warmth and the inherent qualities of Schutz's music are brought to the fore by these excellent German ensembles. Particularly effective is Schreier's solo singing on the Leider disc.

From Nimbus Records comes a new release of the Palestrina Mass for Pentecost coupled with five motets performed by the Christ Church Cathedral Choir, Stephen Darlington, director (NI 5100). This ensemble combines balance, expansiveness, and precision which makes these ancient works come to life. The sound of the boys choir gives this disc a transparent and clear sound; the measured pace results in a reverential aura.

Finally, two recordings of works of Lassus: on Hyperion (distributed by Harmonia Mundi U.S.A) the Requiem a 4 voci performed by the Pro Cantione Antiqua (CDA 66066), and on Hungaroton (distributed by Qualiton) the Lagrime di San Pietro performed by the Liszt Ferenc Academy of Music Chamber Choir (HCD 12081). Both are dark, brooding works impeccably executed the respective ensembles. One should note the effective inclusion of plainchant sequences in the Requiem and Lassus' use of word-painting in Lagrime.

# A Starry Night, A Friendly Ocean, Food For The Spirit and **Music For The Soul**

LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA -The above describes the Spring Blues Cruise which left Long Beach Harbor at 10 PM last Saturday (April 9) and sailed for three hours in the ocean channel between Catalina Island and mainland California. In addition to a reasonable beer/wine bar and a \$5-a-plate offering of barbequed ribs, smothered chicken, brown rice and corn bread, the promoters offered blues music performed by Albert Collins, who will also be performing at this years' Jazz and Blues Festival in New Orleans. Collins, who has long been a respected blues artist in the American south, is finally being recognized in other parts of the country. It must have been gratifying for him to realize that, as the solo star of the event, he was personally responsible for the enormous turn out.

Preceding Collins' appearance band, back-up Icebreakers, did a great job of doing just that, thawing out the standing-room-only audience on both decks of the cruise ship with their immaculate display of blues showmanship. They offered an instrumental conglomerate of three saxophones, keyboards,

drums, two guitars, and a bass that must still be walking to New

Yes, Nashville is happy for Eddie Rabbitt. In addition to his highly successful musical encore, he has just been named the first National Honorary Chairman for the American Council on Transplantation (ACT), a non-profit, national federation of individuals and organizations concerned with improving the donation and delivery of organ and tissue transplants.

When I asked Eddie about the most satisfying aspect of his career, he smiled and said, "I'm getting paid for what I love to do!". I'll take that answer, but I have a feeling that Eddie Rabbitt could fill a book with the most satisfying aspects of his career after what he's been through. God bless you, Eddie Rabbitt!

# It's Time To "Right" The Bullet!

ertaining to the Cash Box country music charts, it is my firm belief that there is wide-spread misunderstanding about the significance of the revered "bullet", which is designated to songs listed on our charts. In fact, so wide-spread is the misconception that I feel a full explanation of its significance is due the industry.

First, let's dispel a myth which has grown grossly out of proportion: the loss of a bullet does not mean the record is over or has peaked at that given chart position! There is no way that can happen if the radio stations and sales outlets continue to furnish us with numbers of continuing success. It may happen that way. It has, does and will happen that way, but it is not meant to be a "kill" sign!

Here is the proper definition of the Cash Box Bullet: bul-let (bool.it) n. a small square enclosing the chart position number of a record showing a great deal of activity in the form of radio playlists and sales reports. It is awarded to certain numbers by a comparison process relating the individual to the whole.

The chart concept of the bullet is a real paradox. Bullets are commonly thought of as a projectile used for killing. On the charts, however, it is thought of as a projectile used for survival. That is, sometimes, true. But, no doubt, too many industry personnel still believe that the loss of your bullet means you're dead!

To illustrate our point, let's reflect on a record by John Conlee a few months ago. ~"Mama's Rockin' Chair" lost its bullet somewhere in the 50's on the chart one week. It happened simply because the record had a comparatively "slow" week on our recorded reports sheet. As all of you well know, that sometimes happens. Well, the phones lit up with questions of "how did that happen?, Why?, etc.. I really don't think our explanations of the Cash Box bullet system were taken as actual fact. However, some promotion teams apparently went to work on the record to make us prove our system. Sure enough, the record picked up activity again the following week, regained a bullet, and continued its climb toward the top of the charts. That's one example from many.

It's time to "right" the bullet! A Cash Box bullet is a notation of a superior amount of radio and sales reports activity. It's that simple. Remember Barney Fife, Andy Griffith's deputy, who was given only one bullet for survival? He received rave reviews from the viewing public and managed to earn his way to the top. He was proud of his bullet, as you should be. But, if you lose it, remember that there is another to be had. Don't give up and play dead!!

# Home Games Continue Their Incredible Surge

Leisure time entertainment appears to have a worthy addition to its ranks based on past and forecasted performance for the new generation video game systems and the growing number of third-part software companies. Interestingly, much of the success for Nintendo, Sega and Atari is due to the recognition and success of the coin-operated amusement machines from which the greatest percentage of game cartridges are derived. And for 1988 the phenomenon will prove that the entire category of home video product isn't just a fourth quarter seasonal

windfall, but rather a steady retail seller in much the same sense as two distant cousins – personal computers and support software, and VCR's with its many pre-recorded programming options.

According to Consumer Electronics, one of the leading publications for the entire electronic entertainment/business field, in a report by Theodore Iacobuzio, the home market is gathering incredible steam as it reaches sales figures that are attracting considerable attention:

# AMOA Urges Support Of 'National Jukebox Week' Resolution

# U.S. And Foreign Teams Prep For Upcoming AMOA Dart Tourney



In the meantime, the quality of product shows a much more sophisticated level of standards than what previously existed. As Consumer Electronics additionally states in its report:

"...software is the major story of 1988. While percentage differences as to which side of the business accounts for how much dollar value will remain roughly the same in 1988 as they were in 1987, most manufacturers say they see 1988 as the turning of the tide. As the installed base solidifies, software will become more and more important in the profit mix, accounting for more and more dollar value. Manufacturers are not worried by this trend, as the thirdparty software pacts inked last year mean a continued flow of product.



# Taito's Top 'Shooter'

The latest entry from Taito America Corp. is "Top Shooter" and it's a commanding piece of equipment which combines the popularity of the shooting game concept with various innovations to further embellish its appeal. The company's current hit streak will continue, uninterruptedly, with this new piece.

The game portrays a junkyard theme and the targets represent what one would normallly find in a junkyard; such as bugs or rodents or empty cans. The player aims at a different target card which randomly moves to five different postions to challenge the players' skill and dexterity. The mounted gun shoots pellets and after all of the shots are completed the target card is returned to the player, and it can either be displayed at the location, kept as a souvenir or used for any number of other purposes. The ticket dispenser,

by the way, is a standard feature on all Top Shooter games.

The game has the capacity to hold three hundred targets and five thousand pellets. Taito is offering four different target cards that can be customized for specific location requirements. Top Shooter will be shipped in one packing carton for easy set-up and installation.

The new game was introduced, and very well received, at the recently held ACME convention in Reno. The model pictured here has been fashioned for the American market, and is being built at the Grand Products facilities in Elk Grove Village, Illinois.

hardware sales will come to around 8 million units, 76.9 percent better than last year's 4.52 million units (dollar value: \$493 million). The industry's hardware sales at retail should account for \$907 million, which is 83.9 percent better than 1987's tally.

In 1988, the software side of the business will move about 40 million units, 100 percent better than 1987's tally of 20 million software units. Those 20 million units had a retail value of \$475 million. This year's dollar value from software sales is pegged at \$875 million, a percentage gain of 84.2 percent."

Obviously, someone is doing something right to help keep the momentum going in regards to home video where these figures translate to about 10 percent penetration of all American home – a threshold that took approximately four years for VCR's to attain.

And rather than worrying that the fad will pass, as it did before, more and more consumers and retailers To put the number into perspective, the video game industry in 1981 tallied \$900 million in sales, actually a lower dollar figure than 1987's healthy \$968. But, by contrast, 1982 yielded \$3 billion in revenue, which is very different from \$1.78 billion projected for 1988. If it's not quite as crazy as the early part of the decade, it is steady growth."

And most important to the allied coin-op amusement game field, what the numbers represent is an industry segment that is growing at a faster pace with some very real expectations that might garner 50 percent of the gross currently being netted by the playing of arcade games, where the estimates claim about \$5 billion a year.

Together, the home and the game room can both benefit by the further acceptance of the artform and the discovery that the games can cross over age barriers for a solid core audience and appeal that can be timeless.

In summing up, even Consumer Electronics seems to feel the same way:

"To appreciate just how far the video game industry has come in the past few years, it's illuminating to look at 1986's tally. About 1.9 million pieces of hardware were sold, compared with the following year's 4.52 million. About 7 million software pieces were sold, compared with the following year's 20 million units. All in all, the business has come a long way, and looks as if it will continue to grow."

To concur, events have happened quickly with the ultimate repercussions and influences still not decided, but home video is a reality that will only help spread the market for game players who will be attracted and fascinated by the creations that are bursting forth. And in the final analysis, it should prove to be a very lucrative, synergistic relationship that can help propel the coin-op industry into a more majectic spotlight.

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
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
