KATHY MATTEA

The year's only nine months old and, already, Mercury's Kathy Mattea has made 1988 her year to shine in country music. She recently celebrated her second number one single from her Top 10 album, Untasted Honey, with "18 Wheels And A Dozen Roses" soaring to the top of the charts and staying there for two weeks running. Her first single from the album, "Goin' Gone", was also a number one hit, and the album has had rave reviews across the board.

Kathy has long been a favorite of industry people, a singer's singer whose voice was heard on hundreds of demos before she signed her recording contract with Mercury/PolyGram. In 1988, the qualities which established her as a top session singer have established her as one of the foremost female vocalists in the country music industry.

Kathy has been nominated in three categories for this year's CMA Awards: Female Vocalist of the Year; Album of the Year (Untasted Honey); and Single of the Year ("18 Wheels And A Dozen Roses").

"I was surprised!" Kathy exclaimed. "I didn't expect it! Album of the Year was one category that I hadn't let myself hope for. I didn't ever think about that one!

"A couple of things have really helped me in the business. First, working with Allen Reynolds (her producer). He keeps my mind and my concentration directed toward my music. This is very important to me, because I don't get 'shook' by the business side of my career.

"Secondly, this has been a relatively slow rising process for me. I was making records for a couple of years before I ever had a Top 10. That gave me a chance to experiment and find out what really worked for me...and what didn't.

"We've tried not to get pigeonholed into one style, or label, of music. We like to go with what seems to be some of several different syles lumped together."

Kathy Mattea is the darling of Cross Lanes, West Virginia. She has now stolen the hearts of country music fans around the world as well. When asked how she feels about her phenomenal success, Kathy smiled that beautiful smile and said..."I'm having a great time!" Thanks to Kathy Mattea, so are we!

LOS ANGELES - It was another big month for rock and roll, as the RIAA certified Def Leppard and Guns n' Roses well in excess of the minimum multi-platinum level (two million sales). It was also a big month for Sade and Steve Winwood, each scoring Gold and Platinum certifications in August.

Multi-Platinum awards went to the tireless Soundtrack - Dirty Dancing (9 million), rock monsters Def Leppard's Hysteria (6 million), country boy Randy Travis' Always And Forever (3 million), hard-partying Guns n' Roses' Appetite For Destruction (3 million), singersongwriter Richard Marx's Richard Marx (2 million), and the effervescent Gloria Estefan And The Miami Sound Machine's Let It Loose (2 million).

Platinum awards went to svelte Sade for Stronger Than Pride, Al B. Sure! for In Effect Mode, and the legendary Steve Winwood for Roll With It.

Gold Album certification went to Sade's Stronger Than Pride, ageless Rod Stewart for Out Of Order, Alabama's Alabama Live, durable Steve Winwood for Roll With It, classy New Edition for Heart Break, a reborn Elton John for Reg Strikes Back, Anthrax's I'm The Man, Samantha Fox's Samantha Fox, legendary Teddy Pendergrass' Joy, the corpulent Fat Boys' Coming Back Hard Again, the perennial Chicago for Chicago 19, ex-Zep Jimmy Page's Outrider, blue-blooded Hank Williams Jr.'s Wild Streak, Robert Palmer's Heavy Nova, and Bobby Mc Ferrin's Simple

Multi-Platinum Award for video (non-theatrical) went to Prince And The Revolution - Live.

Gold Awards for video went to Stevie Nicks Live At Red Rocks, Whitesnake's Fourplay, INXS' Kick The Video Flick, and Genesis' Visible

Grammy Final Entry Forms Mailed

LOS ANGELES - Nearly 7000 the one year form previously sent to members of the Recording Academy (N.A.R.A.S.) have just been mailed their final entry forms for the 31st annual Grammy Awards.

The members' forms, covering recordings and music videos released during September – the last month of the current Awards eligibility year - are due in the Recording Academy's national office by Oct. 7. Entry forms for the preceding 11 months, mailed in late July, are

due on Sept. 12.

'This marks the second year that the Recording Academy has used a two-stage entering process instead of

our membership," announced Recording Academy Chairman Al Schlesinger. "The process has been very successful in giving the Grammy Awards office additional time in which to verify eligibility of thousands of entries."

Final entry forms sent to 800 recording and music video companies covering their releases during the last three months of this year's eligibility period, are due by Oct. 5. Previous entry forms for the first nese months were mailed to companies early this summer.

Shocking LP Creates Controversy

LOS ANGELES - The longawaited major label debut album from Jane's Addiction, Nothing's Shocking, will not be stocked by six major retail distributors. Musicland, Target, Camelot, Hastings, Lieberman and Handleman have refused to carry the record based on its cover artwork. All representatives contacted declined to comment on the

The album, which was recently released on Warner Bros. Records, depicts a sculpture, created by Jane's Addiction lead singer Perry Farrell, of nude, female albino siamese twins, each with her hair on fire.

"Why is it in a museum," commented Farrell, "paintings of nudes created by artists through the ages, are considered fine art, while my sculpture of nude siamese twins, my expression of art, is censored because it's on an album cover?"

Although controversial, Nothing's Shocking will be stocked by other major retailers such as Sound Warehouse, Tower Records, Music Plus, The Rainbow, Record Bar, Strawberries, and Turtles.

Primerica Completes Sale of Musicland

LOS ANGELES - Primerica Corporation of Connecticut, a financial services and specialty retailing company, has completed the sale of its 81% interest in The Musicland Group. Purchasing Musicland is a group of investors led by Musicland management and Donaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette. The price tag: \$330 million in cash for its common share holdings of the Musicland Group.

Primerica will log post-tax gain of \$127 million, or \$2.42 per common share during the 1988 third quarter. Net proceeds will be used to reduce debt. Musicland is the largest specialty retailer of music and video products in the U.S., operating 633 stores in 47 states under the names "Musicland," "Sam Goody," "Discount Records," and "Suncoast Pic-

Written by Phillips. Produced by T Bone Burnett.
- Joan Armatrading's "Living For You" (A&M) Armatrading continues, after thirteen albums, to explore new territory and, it seems, could comfortably find a home at a number of varied outlets. This time out, Armatrading opts for a softer groove perfect for A/C and "Quiet Storm" formats. Written and produced by Armatrading.
- Transvision Vamp's "Tell That Girl To Shut Up" (UNI/MCA) Transvision Vamp easily have the best shot at instant Top 40 acceptance with their spirited reworking of the old Holly & The Italians ditty. Reminiscent of early Blondie and the like. Written by Holly Vincint. Produced by Duncan Bridgeman.
- Rosanne Cash's "Runaway Train" (Columbia) Although the recipient of massive media attention, Cash has yet to generate radio airplay at anything other than country radio (save for a handful of adventurous Alternative outlets). This, the latest single from King's Record Shop, is perfect for many formats, especially A/C. Written by John Stewart. Produced by Rodney Crowell.
- Sam Brown's "Stop" (A&M) This torchy-pop masterpiece should run the gamut from Top 40 to A/C radio attention. The 23-year old Brown demonstrates a stunning vocal ability and amazing prowess as a songwriter. Production is top-notch. Written by Brown, Greg Sutton and Bruce Brodey. Produced by Sam Brown and Pete Brown.

Honorable mention: Michelle Shocked, David Lindley, Living Colour, Ruben Blades and Take 6.

Isn't it time for programmers to recognize that recent unexpected successes from the likes of Tracy Chapman, Suzanne Vega or even Bobby McFerrin were no flukes. Could it be that (gasp!) the general public will often react favorably when exposed to material that they would normally not hear. Okay, we'll get off our pedestal now...

Tom De Savia Los Angeles PHIS – Here's an unabashed rave: One of the finest releases I've heard yet this year is Toots In Memphis (Mango), a record of soul standards sung inna reggae style by Toots Hibbert of Toots and the Maytals. A conscious echo of Dusty Springfield's Dusty In Memphis, it brings an outsider into Memphis and seeks to capture the magic and madness of the Memphis sound. On its own deep and soulful terms it succeeds as nothing has since Stax/Volt and Hi Records shut down in the 70's.

Toots's gruff, pleading vocals have often been compared to Otis Redding, and with all the covers - Eddie Floyd's "Knock On Wood," O.V. Wright's "Precious, Precious," Ann Peebles's "l Can't Stand The Rain" (here done as "Love The Rain"), Al Green's "Love And Happiness" - this record recalls the Redding albums full of Sam Cooke, Smokey Robinson and Chuck Willis songs. Toots In Memphis is a superb document of several decades of cross cultural black creative genius, from Memphis soul to the music it helped spawn in funky Kingston and back again.

The album was cut this past April in Memphis with reggae studio greats like Sly & Robbie alongside Memphis studio greats like Teenie Hodges, Eddie Hinton, and Andrew Love and produced by Jim Dickinson (Alex Chilton cohort and the producer of the last Replacements record). Its sound is remarkably organic, together. Every element – the Memphis Horns styled horns, the Steve Cropper styled guitar licks, the one-drop drumming – sounds authentic, fluid, and *right*. This is the kind of record they weren't supposed to be able to make anymore.

BACK IN WAX - The flood of reissues continues. Out in the last few weeks are another batch of Chess records from MCA (among them More Real Folk Blues from Muddy Waters, and Holwing Wolf, a foinky greatest hits package from r&b songtress Sugarpie DeSanto, and the year's first Christmas record featuring Chuck Berry's "Run Run Rudolf") and Volume 2 of James Brown's Funky People (featuring Bobby Byrd's oft sampled "I Know You Got Soul") from PolyGram (still to come from Poly-Gram is The Motherload, an album of previously unreleased James Brown workouts of the highest quality), and (best of all) Checkin' In With Don Covay, which covers the soul singer's 70's output on Mercury.

Perhaps best known today through other artist's covers of his songs (Aretha Franklin did his "See-Saw" and "Chain Of Fools," the Rolling Stones did "Mercy Mercy"), Covay is a great, often overlooked r&b songwriter and performer. Overlooked, perhaps, because his classic sides, recorded with the Goodtimers for Atlantic between 1964-1970, have been out of print for ages, available as an import on English Edsel. If they were in print more folks might have noticed the uncanny similarity between Covay's vocals on such stuff as "Come See About Me" and "Take The Hurt Off Me" and the vocals of Mick Jagger on the early Stones LPs. No doubt about it, Jagger copped more vocal stylings (accent, phrasing, tone...everything) from Covay than he did dance moves from Tina Turner.

Checkin' In With Don Covay covers material from a pair of slick but gritty r&b albums Covay made for Mercury in 1973 and '74, including a previously unreleased version of Solomon Burke's "There's Something On Your Mind" (a laid back stone groove with serious testifying) and an astoundingly sweet and funky single from 1974, "Dungeon #3." A very strong, welcome package.

OS ANGELES - "The pacing will be a lot tighter and the show will be shorter without losing the loose nature of MTV's style," promises Dick Clark, this year's executive producer of the fifth annual "1988 MTV Video Music Awards." The program will be broadcast live from the Universal Amphitheater, Los Angeles, California, on Wednesday evening, September 7. (Check local listings.) This year's host will be comedian Arsenio Hall, who co-starred with Eddie Murphy in Coming To America. It is the first time in two years that the show has had a main master of ceremonies.

Pere Ubu and the Art of Returning

Rumbling out of Cleveland in the late '70s, Pere Ubu took the conventions of rock 'n' roll and coaxed them through a Cuisinart. Their brand of "evant-garage-rock" was a multi-instrumental hoedown of fractured beats, well-honed dissonance and skewed lyricism that was as playful as it was confounding. Singer David Thomas was one of the most compelling figures of the American new wave, a gigantic bundle of nervous energy and sttershot intelligence. Then, in 1982, after seven challenging albums, Pere Ubu went silent. The band members delved into various solo and group frijects on the fringes of art-rock and performance-art before getting together for a jam session with Thomas' band, the Wooden Birds, at a concert in Cleveland in 1987. Between sets, Pere Ubu was reborn. Six months later the revamped combo has unleashed The Tenement Years, their debut effort for Enigma and the first Pere Ubu studio resording in six years. Recently Cash Box spoke with David Thomas.

Where have you been since 1982?

• This so-called hiatus has been a busy time for me. Since 1982 I've worked on various projects and with various bands, mostly in Europe. I've done solo projects, telling stories and playing accordian, I've toured with a band that was just a drummer and an electric bassoon player, and I've played with more exercised with a similar to Pere Ubu.

You would call Pere Ubu conventional?

• Pere Ubu has a great deal of respect for the standard rock song – verse-chorus-verse, in 4/4 time. We might occasionally drop a beat or add a half bar to the bridge, but we're espentially a rock band.

Do you see Pere Ubu as entertainers?

• I like music for its performance elements. When I sing I'm sort of known for my arms flailing around – like some kind of new-wave Joe Cocker – but it's just a way for me to concentrate on the performance. There's a strong visual element to our music – not in the sense that there's a lot to look at when we perform, but in the sense that we want to create images in the listeners' mind. We attempt to engage the imagination of the listener, in the same manner as drama on the radio. The listener fil's in the details.

Does the same go for the lyrics? Are you creating an impressionistic landscape where the listener can fill in the details?

• It's become popular to say that whatever the listener gets out of the song is all right, but I don't believe that. A Pere Ubu album is based on a scene that I have in my mind. I have a way that I want each album to sound, and an idea that I want each song to communicate. There's definitely an idea that we're trying to get at. But when you're working with a band, it's like a sculptor knocking

out a general outline from a block of stone. Then, through rehearsals, we refine it. After that I write words that amplify the idea communicated by the music. If a picture is worth a thousand words, than a sound is worth a thousand pictures.

Is there an improvisational element to what you do?

• To some extent. We improvise around a particular structure, and if something good comes out of it, we keep it and harden it through practice. In live performance, we improvise more. We like to create at least one new song on stage every time we play, to keep it fresh.

How often does that work?

• Pretty often. I start from a certain given point, some idea or a song from the past, and a song forms around it. We've worked together for ten years, so we know how we each operate. It's not like the bass jam in *Spinal Tap*. Often times, people don't even know when we make something up; they ask us what album it's from.

Didn't the band start as strictly a recording project?

• Yes, we had some ideas that we wanted to work out in a studio. The Cleveland scene was really happening from 1972 to 1975, and we emerged from various bands that were involved in that. We were like the Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young of Cleveland. When we first started out as Pere Ubu, we had no hope of doing anything in the larger world, so we had no pressure on us. Everybody hated us, nobody would let us play anywhere, so we were free to do what we wanted. It's not like it was really a scene. It was more like a hundred people, thirty of whom were musicians, getting together with their friends.

In the late '70s, when people began to notice what was happening in Cleveland, and there was money and record contracts involved, did you change?

• Sure we changed. Pere Ubu is about change. But we never deviated from our basic structure. Even when we had business managers telling us to do the same thing over and over again, we would just say okay and then continue doing what we wanted to do.

Is Pere Ubu an intellectual or an emotional experience?

• Oh, definitely an emotional one. We consider ourselves folk musicians, living on an urban frontier. We're trying to say something about the human experience. The human experience is more than just "Baby, baby, I want you." We have songs that might be about something as simple as glancing out a window and trying to make sense of what you see

Does the music ever get in the way of the lyrics?

• Of course! That's part of the tension. People have a hard enough time figuring out my pronunciation as it is. In a live setting, the words get completely lost, but I think the feeling is still communicated in other ways. At least on a record the listener has time to savor the words.

Do you deliberately sing in an offbeat manner?

• No, that's just the way I am. It's like the story about Elvis. He sang the way he did because he had to take the place of so many instruments that weren't in the band. I could never sing like Frank Sinatra on "In the Wee Small Hours," or Captain Beefheart. I just have to be myself, even if it means dividing the syllables in strange ways. Besides, there's already enough straightforward singers in the world.

Are you a big fan of Captain Beefheart?

• People are always comparing Pere Ubu to Captain Beefheart, but I don't see it. Maybe there's a similarity in the beats, but Beefheart works within a modified blues structure, and he sings about girls a lot. Me, my influences are completely whitebread. "Sloop John B" was the most influential song I ever heard. The production just amazed me.

But do you see how the comparison with Beefheart makes some sense to a listener without musical training? There's a similar kind of tension between major and minor keys, between the dominate and the eccentric elements.

• Yeah, that's true. But, like I said, we started playing music in 1972, and there were a lot of things going on around the world that influenced us – Pink Floyd, Can, David Ayers, Soft Machine, the Troggs, the MC5, the Kinks ...

Are you a music collector?


• Actually I don't particularly like music. I think there's too much of it. They should stop making guitars, or at least not sell them to people under 25. And some of the older musicians should start retiring. I'm just waiting for someone else to go first, then I'll be happy to join in.

BMG Distribution: Having The Year Of Their Lives

NEW YORK – The mood was exultant as BMG Distribution held the first Conference of its sales and distribution force in several years, a five day event (August 23-27) in Montreal that was marked by the rosy glow of a \$500 million fiscal year and a sense of gratitude and relief for Bertelsmann's purchase of RCA, turning the Distribution force from, in the words of president Pete Jones, "a bastard child" to a "favored child." The Conference was the first since General Electric's sale of RCA to Bertelsmann.

The soundtrack album to *Dirty Dancing* was on everybody's mind, the multi-platinum (19-million estimated worlwide sales according to BMG) smash hit that remains firmly rooted in the Top 10 after almost a year on the charts. "It's nice to get together," said one member of the sales team, "but what's really nice is having something to pay for it."

The Conference was marked by product presentations from RCA, Arista, A&M, Private Music and BMG Classics, along with live performances from Arista, RCA, A&M, RCA Red Seal, and Windham Hill

The week's most dramatic moment came in Friday's forthright address by Michael Dornemann, co-chairman, president, and ceo of Bertelsmann. "I think first what I have to do is congratulate your last year," said Dornemann, "it was a great year." He added that the first half of 1988 was already responsible for a 63% rise in sales over the same period last year.

While laying out Bertelsmann's management strategy--setting up their various arms as "independent, entrepreneur-oriented profit centers"--Dornemann zeroed in on what he termed the recording industry's "next crisis," which he sees looming as a result of the pricecutting of compact discs.

"One of the things that worries me very much," he said, "is that the record industry is somewhat short-sighted." Referring to the late development and introduction of CDs, he said, "I think the record industry does not understand how to

time a new product."

Citing market research that indicates that most compact disc buyers are happy to pay higher prices for hitproven product (a point that was made during an earlier presentation by the Street Pulse Group's Mike Shallet that showed that 61% of active buyers said they did not wait for a sale before purchasing hit product), Dornemann said, "You don't sell one unit CD more if you bring the price down at this point in time...This is something you should learn, I fight for that."

Turning to the still-to-be-widely-introduced DAT, Dornemann stated that while "you can not stop technology," some protection is needed to make sure that "intellectual product belongs to the people that developed (it)...The music industry, short-sighted as it is, doesn't see it...At the end, the hardware and software industries will see they're in the same boat."

"You have to give the world the music," he said, "don't let them steal the music."

He's nervous about CD-pricing and no-holds-barred DAT introduction, he told his U.S. sales and distribution team, but said if the past 18 months hadn't been as strong as they were "I'd be much more nervous."

The company was operating with \$35 million in losses when Bertelsmann purchased it, he noted, while the company is now \$75 million in the black.

Another point he made was his feeling that RCA Records has focused too much on the U.S. market over the past five to ten years, vowing that "we will become more and more an international company."

"I feel very proud of our performance," he said, "but not yet relaxed."

Pete Jones summed up the general feeling about BMG when, in his keynote address, he stated that the company "put a lot of money where their mouth was, a lot of money where their mind was, and a lot of money where their heart was."

Much of the Conference time was turned over to the creative people that Bertelsmann puts so much stock in: The various label presidents, who trotted out the new product, and some of the new artists, that the sales and distribution personnel will be dealing with over the next few months.

Arista's Clive Davis set the tone with a straight-backed, four-hour presentaion during the Conference's first full day, a presentation that ranged from two demo versions of "Please Don't Be Scared," the first single off of Barry Manilow's return to Arista (an album that Davis says will "define where the ballad is going in the '80s"), to "Military Beat" from rap act K-9 Posse (whose debut album was co-produced and co-written by two of Eddie Murphy's brothers), to new pop acts Blue Zone U.K. and Legal Reins, to old pop acts Eric Carmen and The Four Tops (including a Levi Stubbs/Aretha Franklin duet), to blind Canadian blues guitarist Jeff Healey.

One thing that was revealed during the four hours was the possible departure of Aretha Franklin from Arista. Franklin, said Davis, asked Arista for \$2 million per album, an amount the label is unwilling to spend. "If a company is going to come up to the plate and pay that kind of money," he said, "Aretha, eventually, will be on another label."

Arista showcased Jeff Healey at Montreal Club Soda that evening.

RCA's Bob Buziak, in a considerably shorter, snappier presentation, discussed RCA's use of a farm system to develop acts, as opposed to signing major acts away from other labels. "We didn't want to try and go out and buy market share," he said, before previewing new music from, among others, The Fixx, Fairground Attraction, and the soundtrack to Heartbreak Hotel, an upcoming Elvis Presley fantasy movie. The Nashville division previewed a bevvy of music, including K.T. Oslin's "Hold Me," which RCA's Rick Dobbis announced was going to be worked pop as well as country. There was a videotaped presentation from Novus/Bluebird, and presentations from Jive and Beggars Banquet.

At their showcase that evening, at the Spectrum, RCA presented Lita Ford, Jo-El Sonnier, Keith Whitley and Lorrie Morgan.

Other live performers during the Conference included Tuck & Patti (Windham Hill), Peter Allen (show-casing songs from the Red Seal original cast album to the upcoming Broadway musical *Legs Diamond*), and comedians Diane Ford and Will Durst (A&M).

One of the most widely talkedabout presentations was that by the Street Pulse Group's Mike Shallet, whose entertaining quiz-show-styled hour revealed that, according to Street Pulse's market research, 48% of U.S. households contain active music consumers, 28% of those consumers decide to buy records primarily from hearing them on the radio, more than 50% listen to the radio over two hours a day, 30% of what they're buying is hit product, and that CD sales are starting to sag.

"We have stopped spreading the message about CD," said Shallet.

All in all, however, the mood was upbeat. Most upbeat, perhaps, were the winners of the BMG Distribution Awards: Sales Reps Of the Year Dos Cleary (EASTERN, Boston), Roger Moore (SOUTHERN, Dalls), Stella Blatt (NORTH CENTRAL, Detroit), and Jodell Coy (WESTERN, L.A. Field Merchandisers of the Year Rhonda Foreman (EASTERN, N.Y.), Jennifer Colwell (SOUTHERN, Atlanta), Ann Annunziata (NORTH CENTRAL, Chicago), and Al Lutz (WESTERN, L.A.), and Branch of the Year, San Francisco (Charlie Ricebranch manager, Charlie Clendenin, James Swing, Gene Wilcox and Phillip Karakawa, sales reps, and Terry. Ward, merchandiser).

Everybody left Montreal in an even more buoyant mood than when they arrived, the main point being, as somebody pointed out, that when the BMG sales and distribution team posed the musical question, "Do You Love Me," to their relatively new parent company, the answer was "yes."

K.T. Oslin Top Contender For 1988 CMA Awards

Nashville-Female newcomer K.T. Oslin leads the way with five nominations for the 1988 Country Music Association Awards. CMA's 1987 Male Vocalist of the Year Randy Travis garnered four nominations, followed by Rosanne Cash, Kathy Mattea, George Strait, Ricky Van Shelton and Hank Williams, Jr., who received three nods apiece.

First-time CMA nominee Oslin took two nominations in the Song of the Year category as composer of "80's Ladies" and "Do Ya'" while also being named a finalist for Single of the Year ("Do Ya"), Female Vocalist of the Year and the Horizon

Travis received nominations for Entertainer of the Year and Single and Song of the Year for his self-penned, "I Told You So".

Cash claimed nominations for Female Vocalist of the Year, Single of the Year ("Tennessee Flat Top Box") and Vocal Event of the Year with husband/CBS labelmate/producer Rodney Crowell.

West Virginian Kathy Mattea was nominated for Female Vocalist of the Year, Album of the Year (Untasted Honey), and Single of the Year for "18 Wheels And A Dozen Roses", which also garnered a nomination for its writers Paul Nelson and Gene Nel-

Three-time CMA Award winner George Strait was nominated for Entertainer of the Year, Male Vocalist of the Year and Album of the Year (If You Ain't Lovin', You Ain't Livin').

A 1988 contender for the Horizon Award, Ricky Van Shelton also garnered nominations for Male Vocalist of the Year and Single of the Year ("Somebody Lied"). Celebrated tunesmith Harlan Howard took a Song of the Year nomination for Shelton's hit "Life Turned Her That Way".

LEE DILLARD:

A few weeks ago, a young man named Lee Dillard captured the Cash Box Indie Spotlight feature with his performance of "I Won't Fall In Love (If I Can't Win)" on GBS Records. It was so impressive that I called Ernie Bivens at GBS and asked him to send this artist by our office for an interview.

Lee Dillard is from Geneva, Ohio and he got interested in country music when he was just a boy. As Lee puts it, "Folks used to force me to perform at talent shows, when I was just a kid. I was hesitant, but I loved performing, once I was up there.

Lee began his professional career, at age 13, playing with a local band. He did some TV shows in the Cleveland, Ohio area (the "Gene Carroll Show", for example) early in his professional days. Through his personal appearances and the TV exposure, Lee developed a loyal following of regional fans.

Explaining how he got to Nashville and GBS Records, Lee smiled..."My drummer used to play for Melba Montgomery. In 1974, we came to Nashville and met Melba and Jack Solomon (his current producer). They tried to talk me into getting serious and recording



something. Fifteen years later, we did it! I guess I had to sow a few wild oats in between!"

Eventually, Jack Solomon introduced Lee to Ernie Bivens and the recording began. They have recently completed an album, and the release date is scheduled "very soon". Lee Dillard has a lot of good people behind him, but he has the talent and determination to succeed without needing much of a shove.



Jimmy Stewart came to Nashville in December of '84 from his hometown of Paris, Tennessee. He is another of the crop of extremely talented new writers on the Nashville scene. Currently signed as a staff writer with the Peer-Talbot Music Group, Jimmy has been with them since 1986.

"Thomas Cain (BMI) heard some of my songs when I first came to town, and he helped me by promoting them to different publishers," said Jimmy. "I took a lot of bass-playing gigs until I signed with Peer-Talbot. You don't know how helpful Joe and Janna (Talbot) have been! They are great to work for because they work so hard for us, as writers.

"I got interested in country music through my father's association with it. He was a songwriter and entertainer. He was also my inspiration. He never came to Nashville, but he entertained at the country music clubs around Chicago, when he lived there. Then, he continued around western Tennessee, when we moved to Paris.

"I started writing at about age 15. They weren't commercial songs, but our local band played them for our original material. I see that, now, as an extension of performing and for self-satisfaction."

Jimmy Stewart has a wide-eyed attitude about writing in Nashville. "It's a good time to be here! There are a lot of great writers and songs. I'm still a 'groupie', who enjoys the co-writing chances I get. It's a super learning process when you're writing with the likes of Tim Nichols, Scott Miller, John Drummond and Andy Byrd."

Jimmy may be 'new', but he has learned. He says it's a heart breaking business...(his first cut was an Earl Thomas Conley/Keith Whitley duet, which was "canned"!). However, he has had recent cuts by Moe Bandy ("Hittin' Close To Home") and Nisha Jackson ("Independence Day"). So, Jimmy Stewart is on his way with a great attitude.

CRYSTAL GAYLE - Nobody's Angel -Warner Bros. (25706-1) - Producers: E. Frestidge-J.E. Norman

With one of the most endearing female voices in country music today, Crystal Gayle has rightfully accumulated a wealth of chart toppers over the years. This is her fourteenth LP, and one that holds a few surprises as well as tastes of her always-evocative voice. She has already placed the title cut, "Nobody's Angel", on the singles chart a week ago. Other hot cuts include: "Love Found Me", (a duet with Dennis Locorriere), "Tennessse Nights" and After The Best".



DESERT ROSE BAND - Running - MCA/Curb (42169) - Producers: P. Worley-E. Seay

The six-member Desert Rose Band is becoming the most innovative group of its kind. With diverse guitar work (from mandolin to six string bass) the band churns out traditional country songs with decidedly contemporary lyrics. Already on the charts with "Summer Wind", there is plenty of possible single material to choose from on the rest of the LP. "Our Songs" advises the 'restless generation' of the 1960's to watch how they raise their kids in the materialistic 1980's. "Homeless" chronicles the lives



of a family on the street. "I Still Belive In You", "Hello Trouble" and "She Don't Love Nobody" are all strong cuts as well.

RICKY VAN SHELTON – I'll Leave This World Loving You (3:05) – Columbia (38-08022) – Tree/BMI – W. Kemp – Producer: S. Buckingham

CMA Horizon Award nominee Ricky Van Shelton expresses his undying devotion for the one he loves in this mid-tempo release for Columbia. Even though his girlenight walk out on him, Ricky asserts his feelings without hesitation, saying that even death could not cause the end of this love affair: an almost-gloomy theme handled with a great deal of optimism. Enhanced by true-to-form country in-



strumentation, this ballad should give Shelton another hit to add to his growing list of musical achievements.

INDIE SPOTLIGHT

SOUTHERN REIGN – There's A Telephone Ringing (In An Empty House) (3:39) – Step One (SOR-391) – Cross Keys/ASCAP;Fat Man/BMI – K. Brooks-A. Layne-K. Young – Producers: R. Pennington-J. Schofner

Southern Reign, vocally led by Jeff Crocker, releases a dramatic heartbreaker of a single for country radio. The tune is about a guy who leaves his girl high and dry, only to decide later that he's made a mistake. But it turns out to be too late,



because she's flown the coop as well. Big production and solid vocals make this song another winner for the folks at Step One.

GEORGE STRAIT – If You Ain't Lovin', You Ain't Livin' (2:17) – MCA (53400) – Beachwood/BMI – T. Collins – Producer: J. Bowen-G. Strait

Jimmy Bowen collaborates with yet another of MCA's brightest stars to produce the title track from Strait's newest LP. It's an upbeat ditty extolling the virtues of true love and downplaying the materialistic side of life.

DEAN DILLON – I Go To Pieces (3:43) – Capitol (B-44239) – Mole Hole-Bug-Rightsong/BMI – D. Shannon – Producer: R.L. Scruggs

Dillon revives a Del Shannon hit to its fullest potential here, making the crossover from 50's ballad to 80's country quite smoothly. An A+ too, for his sterling vocal performance.

WAYLON JENNINGS - How Much Is It Worth To Live In L.A. (2:53) - MCA (53314) - Waylon Jennings-Tom Collins-Murrah/BMI - W. Jennings-R. Murrah - Producer: J. Bowen-W. Jennings

Waylon and Roger Murrah team up to give the low-down on "the land of silk and money where the pretty people play," – good ole L.A. Doused with a rousing fiddle side, this one should garner plenty of attention from more rural audiences.

k.d. lang – Lock, Stock And Teardrops (2:37) – Sire (7-27813) – Tree/BMI – R. Miller - Producer: O. Bradley

k.d. belts out a Roger Miller tune, originally meant for her mentor, Patsy Cline before her death. Her sophomore LP *Shadowland* is in the Top 10, proving this Canadian songstress has mass appeal after all.

ORE MASTER-PIECES When Columbia started its LJazz Masterpieces series 1 - jazz skeptic that 1 am figured, "This'll start out big and, in two or three releases, fizzle to an inaudible hum." I was wrong. The releases just keep barrelling out; there's no stopping them. I am not complaining, I am delighted. Columbia, which claims to be selling these like hotcakes, is also delighted. In any case, the latest batch goes something like this: Thelonious Monk: The Composer (with liner notes written by yours truly - not bragging, just getting those conflict-of-interest questions out of the way), featuring an unreleased "Blue Monk" and 10 tracks pulled from Monk's Columbia records, spotlighting, in different settings, 11 of the man's greatest compositions; The Essential Count Basie Volume 3, swinging, pre-War brilliance; Miles Davis In Person At The Blackhawk Volume 1, the '61 album that features Wynton Kelly on tenor; Jam Sessions From the Vault, alternate takes (and one previouslyunreleased track) from the '53 and '56 Buck Clayton-led jam sessions (jammers include Coleman Hawkins, Freddie Green, Buddy Tate, Joe Newman, Milt Hinton, Jo Jones, Ruby Braff, Billy Butterfield and Clayton) that came out originally as All the Cats Join In; Slipped Disc, 17 '45 and '46 sides from, mainly, the Benny Goodman Sextet of the period (including Red Norvo and Teddy Wilson); Louis Armstrong: The Hot Fives & Hot Sevens, absolutely, positively, without any question, indispensible; The Quintessential Billie Holiday Volume 4, the march of the complete Billie Holiday continues unabated and these 1937 tracks are absolutely, positively, without any question, indispensible; and a sampler.

SONY, THANK YOU FOR THE SUNSHINE YOU BRING - It seems to me that since Sony took over CBS Records, we've been getting a lot of Japanese fusion acts released domestically. Seem that way to you? Well, in case it doesn't, the Bottom Line will be the site, from September 20-25, of "East Meets West," a six-night extravanganza of - you guessed it - CBS's jazz acts from both sides of the Pacific. Sony is going to shoot the whole thing in high definition video and Japan's NHK TV network will broadcast it. The line-up goes like this: Full Circle/Donald Harrison & Terence Blanchard (9/20), Kimiko Itoh/Kirk Whalum (9/21), Eddie Gomez/The Gadd Gang (9/22), Brian Slawson/Steve Smith and Vital Information (9/23), Osamu/Harry Connick Jr./Branford Marsalis (9/25), Nancy Wilson/Masahiko Satoh (9/25).

ENJOY THE GELT - The Meet The Composer/Reader's Digest Commissioning Program, a new music program funded by \$750,000 from the Reader's Digest and \$200,000 from the National Endowment of the Arts, has named its first recipients. Jazzwise they are Max Roach (winner of a recent \$372,000 MacArthur Fellowship), \$22,500 for a project with the Berkeley and San Diego Repertory Theatres; Ornette Coleman, Henry Threadgill and Alvin Curran, \$17,000 for pieces for the Rova Saxophone Quartet; and The String Trio of New York, \$12,000 for themselves.

S.F. Blues Festival: Sweet Sixteen and Ready to Drive

n Sept. 10 and 11, the San Francisco
Blues Festival celebrates its 16th
year of operation with a weekend
bash in the Great Meadow at Fort
Mason (Marina Blvd. at Laguna). The longest
ongoing blues festival in the U.S., it is a
celebration of both the enduring popularity of
indigenous American music and the spirit of
the independent music industry. All of the
headliners at this year's festival are affiliated
with such independent record labels as
Rounder, Alligator, Hightone and Arhoolie.

Unlike such other well-known festivals as the Chicago blues fest, the San Francisco festival is not subsidized by the city or any government agency. It is, rather, fueled by the enthusiasm of promoter Tom Mazzzolini, and aided for the third year in a row by the corporate sponsorship of Harrah's resort and casino in Reno, Nev. For the last two years the festival has drawn upwards of 20,000 people to the bayfront site, and this year's gettogether looks to be the biggest ever.

The festival will be previewed with a free lunchtime concert on Friday, Sept. 9, in the heart of the downtown financial district. Featured will be funksters Big Daddy Kinsey and the Kinsey Report, but it's a safe bet that special guets will be performing as well. The last time a major musical event was held downtown, it was U2 who literally stopped the traffic.

On Saturday, Sept. 10, the San Francisco Blues Festival offically opens with a full day of world-class blues entertainment. Co-headlining that day will be Texas blues-guitar champ (and Rounder recording artist) Johnny Copeland, and legendary vocalist Koko Taylor, whose work appears on the Alligator label. Taylor, dubbed by the *New York Times* "the most impassioned and exciting of women blues singers," survived a near-fatal auto crash earlier this year, and made a triumphal return to the stage when she performed at this summer's Chicago Blues Festival.

Another highlight of the Saturday slate will be an appearance by John Lee Hooker, the Missippi blues-guitar legend. Hooker's solo work has inspired several generations of rock and blues guitarists, and his upcoming album on Pausa records features guest appearances by Robert Cray, Carlos Santana, George Thorogood, Bonnie Raitt and Los Lobos.

Rounding out the Saturday bill are Joe Louis Walker, Lil Ed & The Blues Imperials, the Super Harps and the Chris Cain Band.

The line-up for Sunday, Sept. 11, is equally impressive, led by modern blues guitar master Albert Collins. At last year's show, the Alligator recording artist was joined onstage by Robert Cray for one of the most memorable jams in the festival's history. Also headlining on Sunday is balladeer Bobby "Blue" Bland. Bobby brings his big band along for his San Francsico Blues Festival debut.

Also on stage that day are guitarist Elvin Bishop (joining Albert Collins for a super jam) soul queen Carla Thomas, Emmit Powell & the Gospel Elites, Ron Thompson & The Resistors, and 72 year-old blues-guitar discovery Chester D., who is making his first major concert appearance.

A special treat on Sunday will be the appearance by C. J. Chenier & The Red Hot

Louisiana Band. Chenier, a one-time saxophonist, has adopted the accordian and assumed the mantle of zydeco king from his late father, Clifton Chenier.

Festival attendees can also count on appearances by "special guests" throughout the weekend, in addition to a superb array of New Orleans and Louisiana cuisine.

The San Francisco Blues Festival is a labor of love for promoter/organizer Tom Mazzolini. When not working on the festival or hosting his local blues radio show, Mazzolini organizes a travelling version of the S.F. Blues Fest that tours the world, presenting blues, San Francisco-style, to audiences from Europe to Japan.

True to his loyalties, Mazzolini tries to maintain a balance between national and West Coast talent at the festival, with bay-area stass like Hooker and Bishop prominently featured.

new pinball/video game manufacturer has surfaced in the Chicago area, Allme, Inc. with headquarters in Elk Grove Village, Ilknois housing a "high tech" plant facility. Cash Box spoke with Bill **Schimmel**, who is one of the key executives of the company and an eighteen year veteran in the busihess. The firm's roots emanated from Kalamazoo, Michigan (where The holding company is based) and, as Schimmel pointed out, "we haven't built anything in the states for the past seven years," since their principal involvement was in importing and they previously did a great deal of business in hotel/restaurant/motel equipment. With the establishment of Allme, Inc., the company will be channeling its efforts into the production and marketing of pinball machines and wideo games with "non-violent" themes. "We are a small company with very big plans," said Schimmel. "We have been talking with operators and, most importantly, we've been listening to them and will be incorporating what we have learned into our product line." Allme currently employs a staff of 55 at the Elk Grove facilities, and a "strong marketing team," as he pointed out to us. They are already boking into an additional plant site for occupancy in February of next year. Allme will be doing business strictly through distributors. Schimmel told us that 60% of the machines produced in Elk Grove Village will be targeted for the overseas market. The company will be introducing their three current pinball machines, namely, "Stock Market," "Pizza Gobler" and "Hero" at the upcoming AMOA convention. They

have two video games, "Allme 500" and "Pizza Delivery" earmarked for debut at the 1989 ACME show. Schimmel also noted that "Allme is an American company with American parts and we intend to make a big impact, so keep your eye on us!" Cash Box hopes to have some photos and further information for you in next week's edition.

Zenith orders 500 Seeburgs! The recently announced Seeburg lease/purchase agreement (Cash Box, 7/30/88) has certainly caught on with Jim Contis of Zenith Vending (Chicago) who purchased 500 Seeburg CD jukeboxes! Through its Apex Music subsidiary, installation of the Seeburg CD LaserMusic machines, including speakers, discs and other accessories, has already begun. This 500 unit lease is the largest completed under Seeburg's new \$30 million operator lease program which was announced in July. The 500 jukeboxes will be placed in locations over the next 24 months, at the rate of about 5 each week! Contis praised the Seeburg product as a "proven money maker and location opener," stressing that, under the lease arrangement, the music route becomes more profitable and the operator is able to discard his old systems before used equipment pricing goes down. An added incentive is that Zenith does not use its own bank lines of credit, which can be utilized for other equipment purchases and acquisitions. Poara Enterprises, Fugi Electronix and S.L. Video Enterprises, located in Ontario, Canada, pled guilty before wistrict Court Judge Patricia German in Toronto. Judge German fined Poara Enterprises \$10,000, Fugi Electronix \$7,500 and S.L. Video Enterprises \$5,000.

Last month a fourth defendant, Romar Conversion Systems, also pled guilty to one count of violating the Canadian fraud statute on July 7, 1988 in Toronto, Ontario. Romar Conversion Systems was fined

\$2,500. Poara pled guilty to 20 counts, Fugi Electronix to 5 counts and S.L. Video Enterprises to 17 counts of violating Canadian fraud

Rick Libman, Crown Attorney in the Province of Ontario, who handled the prosecution of this case stated it was the first time individuals have been found guilty criminally in Canada for distributing counterfeit video games.

Robert C. Fay, executive vice president of the American Amusement Machine Association, praised the effort of Mr. Libman and the Royal Canadians Mounted Police and stated that AAMA will continue to work with Canadian authorities regarding other individuals who are in violation of the new Canadian copyright law.
