CORE, Macola: **Development & Marketing**

INDIE COMPANIES WISHING TO IMPROVE their fortunes do not always look to the "Big Six" distribution machines. Case in point is CORE Entertainment, which could improve the label's artist development fortunes through its relationship with Macola Records Group, which built its reputation on marketing and distributing cutting edge music. The exclusive manufacturing and distribution agreement between the companies, announced in recent weeks, is an example of how two independent companies pool strengths to advance mutual and individual goals-all while firmly navigating the independent pipeline.

Nashville-based CORE's president Keith Dressel, whose company has developed a wide range of artists and product-from the Vigilantes of Love (now on indie label Capricorn Records) to perennial Adult Contempocrooner Engelbert гагу Humperdinck-hopes to take advantage of the relationship that Macola has with Navarre Corp., which is a major independent distributor of music, and other software which is causing the scope of artist development to evolve.

'One of the reasons this deal happened was because of our access to Navarre," says Don Macmillan, Macola president. "Not only do mass merchandisers and chain stores receive product through their system, but the core retail market also gets serviced. Surc, the Best Buys, Blockbusters and Camelots get the product, but so do the mom and pop stores. It's all about sales."

Macmillan notes that Navarre does a "tremendous job" on product because "they keep their roster of labels down so they can do a decent job" of promotion and marketing. He also noted that the company gets his vote because they help develop music companies with an eye to taking advantage of Navarre's firm foothold on the distribution of all software, including home video, and the ever-burgeoning CD-ROM, which is quickly becoming a major tool in artist development.

Macola has expressed excitement over handling product by Humperdinck, but moreso over the prospect of marketing other established and new artists. Legendary folk singer Dirk Hamilton, singer/songwriter Moon Martin and the indefatigable Stephan Allen Davis who has created 15 #1 hits, including "Take Time To Know Her," made popular by Percy Sledge. Turi, The Hardliners, Podunk and Mr. Happy are fresh acts that could continue Macola's legacy of breaking acts like N.W.A. and Timex Social Club.

While CORE's Dressel plans to create marketing and promotion strategies at the company's Nashville headquarters, Macmillan and his staff will work to create merchandising and promotional materials to be utilized by Navarre's 30-branch field staff and also be used by the regional reps employed by Macola.

"We have a staff that develops one-sheets, posters and other promotional items that work their way into the (Navarre) system," Macmillan explains. "We really believe that we can help some of CORE's artists thrive.'

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EXECS ON THE MOVE

Jonathan Platt, former music coordinator for Media Rights, Inc., has been named vp of business affairs for Sonic Images Records. The Los Angeles based label has also appointed Brad Pressman to the position of director of A&R and national promotions. Pressman previously worked as an A&R representative in

charge of artist relations. I Jeff Cook has been upped to sr. vp of promotion and marketing at Capricorn Records. Cook began his promotion career in the mid-'70s for Arista Records, moved to Atlanta in '78 to head the label's AOR promotion and then became sr. director of album promotion in '82. He also has held posts at Elektra. He joined the re-launched Capricorn in 1991. Cambridge, MA-based Rounder Records has upped a few of its employees starting with the promotion of Brad Paul from national promotion director to his new title of vp of national promotion and publicity. Susan Piver, the label's former director of marketing and sales, has been appointed vp of sales and marketing. **K-Tel International** has announced a series of executive changes. Arrival Music, the Christian music division of K-Tel, recently named Christian music industry veteran Tom Ramsey to vp of the label. Coldfront Records, an urban-oriented label recently started by K-Tel has announced the hiring of urban music veteran Allen Johnston as K-Tel's national urban sales manager. **Ron**dor Music International has appointed Carol **Spencer** to the position of A&R coordinator. Prior to Spencer's promotion she worked for years as an assistant for Rondor's sr. vp of creative Brenda Andrews. Al Bunetta Management has appointed Janie West the director of his associated publishing companies. Bunetta's companies includes song catalogues of John Prine and Steve Goodman. West will be responsible for overseeing the day-to-day activites of the publishing division, including song-plugging and A&R. In addition,











West will also be active in talent acquisitions for the Oh Boy Records label. Prior to joining the Bunetta team, West spent five years at Liberty Records in A&R and three years at MCA Records

Nashville. **Priority Records**, announced the appointment of Tim Reid II to manager of artist development. Reid will share duties of the ten year-old company's roster with current Priority employee, Dan Devita. Prior to Reid's work at Priority, he worked as a marketing/sales representative for black music at Hollywood

Records. Rhino Records has recently appointed Jill Ruzich to the newly-created position of national sales development manager. Ruzich was previously an artist development representative for the San Francisco branch of CEMA Distribution. Her new Rhino responsibilities include sales research and analysis, and the creation of a monthly newsletter that will keep the independents apprised of Rhino releases and events. Capricorn Records has announced that Paula Donner will be a publicist and her responsibilities will include communication with print and broadcast media nationwide. Prior to his work at Capricorn, Donner was employed at Sector 2 Records, as well as working as a sound engineer at Fitzgerald's in Houston, TX. She also served as an audio engineer at South Coast Film & Video. Also Roger Groce has been named as the publicity assistant for the label. Groce's duties will include the coordination of media service for the label's diverse roster. Roadrunner Records has appointed Rick Meuser to the newly-created position of director of business affairs. Meuser formerly held posts at PolyGram and RCA.

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INDIE ALBUM REVIEWS

WARRIOR SOUL: The Space Age Playboys (Mayhem/Futurist



Warrior Soul has released four records through DGC/Geffen Records, but The Space Age Playboys is its first for indie companies Mayhem/Futurist. While the musical quality remains consistent with the previous releases, frontman Kory Clarke can't help but reveal his political views about any and everything for the world to consume. However, this time his lyrics are a bit less blunt and the music is a tad more melodic, making the record more radio friendly than its predecessors. Clarke considers this disc "their best album to date." Stand out tracks are: "Television," "Rocket Engines" and, the closing tune, "Fighten' The War."

WELT: Better Days (Doctor Dream Records - no cat.



No need to worry, Welt is not another corporate punk band that sings about minor dilemmas while selling millions of records. This quartet from Sacramento, CA is sincere about the teen angst of which they sing. Their debut album, consisting of 13 tunes, is energetic and amusing. They aren't trying to save the world, just attempting to figure out what people want, especially those of the female gender. While the eldest band member is barely old enough to consume alcohol-legally, that is-they seem to have the right idea about their music, keeping it uplifting and fun. With song titles such as "Lame," "Really?" and "Anything," it's easy to see why Welt provides a welcome breath of fresh air. (KS)

PAUL RUSSO: I Can Show You Love (A&E 303) Producers:Paul Russo and Louis Mosley

This is a solid blend of cool, mellow soul and classic jazz tracks delivered with an easily accessible style that should capture this-up-and comimg artist a sizable following. Throughout this disc, the saxophonist displays a wide showcase of his gifts with personality and great style. He also cleverly incorporates his contemporary covers with an old school feel that should add to his credibility. Expect urban contemporary and jazz formats to embrace this disc which stands as a powerful beginning for this jazzman's career.

Standout tracks: "Butterfly New," "Mulatto," "Still In Love" and "For-ever Love." (GR)

BIRDBRAIN: Bliss (TVT 5710)

Birdbrain, a foursome from Boston, MA, speak of aggression toward what they describe as "this cheated generation." With a vocalist/songwriter by the name of Ammo, what else would you expect! His lyrics are rebellious, and his vocal style seems to bear that out. He presents some of his words audibly and clear, then other lyrics roll out of his mouth as if he's intoxicated and can merely mumble. This 12-track release includes partially acoustic numbers, almost tender melodies, as well as powerful upbeat tracks. With continuous diversity throughout, the listener may forget that one band is performing all these songs. If you are up in arms on what records to take along on that cross-country trip, this could be one considering, it covers a buffet of sonic tastes. (KS)

COWBOY MOUTH: It Means Escape (Monkey Hill Records MON 6128)



In case you haven't been formally introduced to Cowboy Mouth, it is certainly one introduction that is long overdue. This New Orleans-based four-piece band has been touring the country with longtime friends and current chart toppers Hootie and the Blowfish. While the group's music isn't identical to Blowfish's, something about the comfortable songs makes one think the band could perform in front of the kind of audiences attracted by Hootie and the Blowfish. To give you an idea of the Mouth's humor, take

Distributor Profile

Andy Allen & The Alternative Distribution Alliance

ANDY ALLEN, PRESIDENT OF THE Alternative Distribution Alliance (ADA) would like to clarify something. Despite widespread popular opinion, the ADA is not strictly part of the WEA Group. The amount of specialized work they do for the conglomerate, including working records like Better Than Ezra's highly successful Deluxe on Elektra, has led people to that conclusion, but ADA is an organization that is dedicated to remaining independent in its manner of doing business. The distribution company, which formed in May/June of 1993, currently handles such well-known independents as Epitaph, Futurist, Restless, Rhino, Teenbeat and Touch And Go, to name but a few

Allen joined the company in June of 1994 after a 10-year stint with Island Records. Allen said, "The last three of which I was general manager of Island in the States." Prior to that he served 10 years with RCA. Though ADA might not seem at first an ideal situation for him, given his background with major labels, Allen has abundant reasons as to why this was, in fact, the perfect place for him to go. Hc said, "A lot of the labels that were Island-owned, were distributed independently. Labels like 4th and Broadway, Mango, Grape Jones, were labels that were distributed independently, and obviously we were very involved in working those records."

Allen continued, "So, independent distribution wasn't something that was new to me. It was something that we had been involved with for some time. The ADA operation was very interesting to me as it had started up and I had kind of watched it grow just in that it was a competitor of the ILS system, which

was our independent system at Island. What attracted me to it were the labels that were distributing through ADA. The fact that it had the Warner Music Group involved meant a commitment towards making it work. And I have always loved the kind of entreprenurial and independent spirit that comes in working with or for an independent label. I just think it's a real exciting part of the business."

Allen's enthusiasm for the independent spirit is apparent, but the Warner Music Group is clearly a cornerstone of ADA's present and future plans. For Allen the reasoning behind Warner's involvement with ADA can be explained as follows, "With ADA, they have the opportunity to use a different distribution system...In the research that we've done, about 35 or 38 percent of the stores that we sell to are also sold (to) directly by WEA. So you can tell there's a significant difference in the stores that we reach directly.'


Unprecedented success is not without its drawbacks, though. Specifically, the point of ADA was to provide specialized attention to the labels it works with. However, continued expansion could make that goal less realistic. As president of ADA, what does Allen see as way to counter that problem? "Well, I think that there's a process in place to make sure that we don't grow beyond what our target is, which is to be able to provide distribution with an eye toward artist development."

In addition, ADA is constantly expanding in other directions. An example is their recent installation of CD sampling stations into selected independent retail outlets, designed to help those stores keep up with the major chains. After an initial outlay of stations to 38 stores, more are being added on a continual basis. While the cost might be a bit high, there's an old adage that says, you have to spend money to make money. And given their success, and potential for future growth, it's hard to argue with ADA's way of doing

Imagine a record filled with a beautiful voice and an eclectic mix of sounds. This indeed is one that contains just that. Fronted by the Scottish voice of Shirley Manson, known for her work with Angelfish, her singing is tender but ficrce, clean yet edgy, and



all the while entirely entertaining. Garbage's premiere single, "Vow," is a treat, but other tracks that stand out on the record include "Queer," "Stroke Of Luck," and "Milk." In short, this record is made up of blunt realities and while it's not always pretty, it certainly is a unique artistic creation for the world to interpret and consume. Because not all Garbage should be discarded, this one's a keeper. (KS)

AGF ENTERTAINMENT LTD., a New York-based music company, recently announced the launch of its new record label, Plump Records. Upcoming releases on the label will include discs from David Massengill, Harvey Fierstein, Eric Andersen, vitapup, Howard Jones, and a collection of rare recordings from current Columbia Records recording artist Shawn Colvin. Plump Records will be distributed exclusively through AEC Distribution...

If you're familiar with Aaron Neville's Grammy Award-winning music, you may want to look for new releases from some of his relatives. Ivan Neville and Cyril Neville currently have records separately available through an East Coast-based label called Iguana Records.

If you haven't heard the name Corey Stevens, you are about to. Stevens, the Eureka Recordings artist, will be featured in on-air promotions of Fox Television's critically acclaimed *Party Of Five*. His tune "The Brothers," which was originally written by Stevens as a tribute to Duane and Gregg Allman, seems to fit perfectly with the theme of the family friendly show...

Code Blue, a new blues-based label, just put out releases from Sherman Robertson, a Texas style blues vocalist/guitarist; Jay Owens, a soulful blues singer/songwriter; and The Hoax, a band made up of five young musicians from a small town in southwest England. The label also inked a deal with Chicago great John Primer and plans to put out a record from him in early 1996.

CONSIDERING in recent years the music genre generally known as heavy metal has had a tough time remaining mainsteam and also get major label support, such acts have relocated to more boutique companies and returned to their underground roots where they still enjoy appreciative and dedicated fans. A few labels that specialize in metal music are Earache, Nuclear Blast/Relapse Records and Noise Records. Despite the fact the band is in the middle of a national tour, the former frontman and ex-bandmates have split due to mutual differences. Temporarily replacing Macke will be former Old Nick vocalist, Jonny Ver-Planck. A permanent replacement should be announced before the summer comes to an end. More news to come regarding Macke's new musicial endeavors...

Legendary guitarist/singer/songwriter Eddie Hinton passed away on Friday, July 28, 1995. Hinton, an Alabama resident, worked as a session player, performing with such greats as Wilson Pickett, Aretha Franklin, Solomon Burke, Elvis Presley and Otis Redding. Hinton's own writing was influenced most by

Redding and his songs have been recorded by the likes of Cher, Gregg Allman, Percy Sledge, and Dusty Springfield. Later in his career, Hinton still produced soulful quality records...

NEW YORK-BASED Futurist Label Group is set to have several releases in the stores before Fall. Look for records from Warrior Soul, My Dying Bride, Sometime Sweet Susan, Mind Over Four, Beat Farmers and Hooch. The Futurist Label Group is distributed through INDI/Alliance Entertainment Corporation.

Evil Troll Records, a West Coast-based label just put out a disc from The Obvious Wish. The record is entitled *Stickman W/Red Balloon* and features just that as the album art work

K-tel International is going back a couple of decades to revive some music of the past. The label is set to re-issue several releases from a heart throb of the 70's, Bobby Sherman. The first four titles in the series are: Bobby Sherman, Here Comes Bobby, A Portrait Of Bobby, and With Love, Bobby. All of the aforementioned will be released on CD for the first time. More of Sherman's previous records are planned for release soon...

Damian Music, founded by musician Aldy Damian, just inked a distribution deal with Navarre Corp. The label's first release, With A Skeleton Crew from Larry Tagg (the co-founder of Bourgeois Tagg), is planned to be in stores this fall...

CMC International recording act Motorhead celebrated its 20th anniversary following a sold-out show at New York's Roseland. On tour in support of its current release Sacrifice, the band had to deal with a couple unexpected dilemmas, including the tour bus breaking down and frontman' Lemmy missing a scheduled live televison show appearance. But never fear, Lemmy did get a chance to toast "Father" Paddy and "Sister" Barbara at a party following that evening's performance.

Seattle, Washington-based CM Records has announced that former Swedish porn star, Marty Yterberg has ironically been named the new vocalist/guitarist for hard rock band Sweat. Yterberg replaces the departed Dennis Randall and the current line-up of the band plans to record its first release together in the next few months. Other bands to look for releasing records on CM are Picklehead, Mossdog, Snaut, Havana Blast and a compilation that's sure to turn some heads, Hemp For Victory - Volume One.

Empty Records, another label based in Seattle has an impressive catalog of product released on vinyl and CD. This year the company has put out several 7-inchers from such acts as The Statics, The Solid and The Fumes. Also available are full-length albums from Satan's Pilgrims, Sicko and SteelWool, just to name a few.

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
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




Thyret Named WB Chairman/CEO

IN A MOVE TO RESTORE STABILITY to its upper management, Russ Thyret has been named chairman/CEO of Warner Bros. Records Inc., replacing Danny Goldberg, who is reportedly leaving to pursue other interests. Thyret had been serving as co-vice chairman of Warner Bros. Records Inc. David Alschul is now the sole vice chair of the company.

WMG chairman/CEO Michael Fuchs announced the appointment, effective immediately, and remarked, "Warner Bros. Records is a unique organization and Russ Thyret has been an integral part of the fabric at Warner Bros. for nearly three decades. Russ has been the power forward on this team, but has played every position on the Warner Bros. team as well. That in itself is so rare in the record business...We are looking forward to a new era of stability and growth for the company under Russ.'

Remarked Thyret, "In light of the historic accomplishments of Warner Bros. Records, and the incredible legacy of its guiding lights Mo Ostin and Lenny Waronker, I am humbled at the prospect of assuming this position. Any record company is only as good as its artists and staff, and here at Warner Bros, we have the best of both worlds. It is now time to dedicate ourselves to getting on with the business at which we can excel, and maintaining the leadership role we've held since virtually the inception of this remarkable institution.'

Since the departure of Ostin and Waronker and the surprise ouster of U.S. Warner Music Group chief Doug Morris, there has been rumblings that Fuchs might seek to replace Goldberg because of the latters allegiance to

Interscope Claims **Tucker Wants Takeover**

INTERSCOPE RECORDS took aim at political activist and gangsta rap critie C. Dolores Tucker via a suit filed in Los Angeles' U.S. District Court, charging her with secretly conspiring to begin her own rap record company and to take over distribution of Interscope's Death Row label.

The suit further alleges that Tucker, chairwoman of the National Political Congress of Black Women, has laid claim to have obtained an agreement for backing of a new rap label from Time Warner chairman Gerald Levin and Warner Music Group chairman Michael Fuchs and that the label would operate under auspices of a black community-oriented monicker of which Tucker would maintain lyrical content control.

Eighty million dollars and two state-of-the-art recording studios are said to be the inducements offered Death Row chairman Marion "Suge" Knight, to be paid by Fuchs if Knight would change from the Interscope label.

Some of the language in the suit sounds as if it could be set to music for a new rap treatise since the filing goes on to say if Knight chose to remain behind Interscope doors Tucker and Time Warner would "use their power and influence to get the government to launch investigations" of Knight and David Kenner, his attorney, causing Knight to "spend the rest of his life behind bars." It goes on to contend TW and Tucker would use their influence with the press to "destroy Knight and Death Row Records" if the latter didn't ioin the new label.

A Time Warner spokesman denied that Tucker acted with the authority of Time Warner or Warner Music Group, and said that "any efforts Ms. Tucker made were on her own voluntary basis..."

Tueker has been attacking TW, blaming its music divisions for "promoting music that celebrates the rape, torture and murder of women." Some feel that Tueker would halt her vocal eriticisms if the corporation aided her in beginning her own rap label.

She started her career at the Elektra label in 1990 as an assist. manager of artist and media relations. A&M Records has named Ronald Edison vp of urban promotion. His new job calls for him to develop and execute promotion strategies for the label's urban artists. Edison most recently was with Scotti Bros. promotion in Los Angeles, and prior to that was vp of urban promotion at RCA in New York. He is from Dallas, TX where he was a regional manager for Virgin Records and a radio personality. Denise Gatto has been named vp of release planning for the Columbia Records Group, where she will now function as a liason between A&R, marketing, promotion and other departments to oversee scheduling of every project on the Columbia and WORK Group labels. A LEADING POINT: Not many performers can shed a name for their group every record and still be able to keep a large following, but Michael Franti has been able to jump from the hardcorish industrial funk of the Beatnigs to the more hip-hoppish Disposable Heros of Hiphoprisy to his latest incarnation as Spearhead, all the while keeping the light shining on himself. A packed and very diverse house at S.O.B.'s was all the proof needed that through his incarnations he has maintained his high profile. Playing a two-night stand with the Brooklyn Funk Essentials, Franti kept the crowd in the groove. Spearhead used some tried and true formulas to get people pumped up as they warmed up the audience before the lead singer come on stage. Once they got going there was less formula and more musicianship. With three singers transversing the stage and a four-piece band hitting the notes, the room swayed as they went from hard-edged beats to ballads, all within a mix of funk and rap that sometimes sounded like neither. In between, Franti talked about various subjects including the controversy over the prisoner Mumia Abu-Jamal. currently on death row. Politics aside, the evening was on the upbeat as Spearhead played numerous tracks off their album *Home*, out on Capitol, also including their latest single "Hole In The Bucket." Watch out for their tour, you may well get stuck.

PREMIUM FRESH SQUEEZED: Not more than five years ago, having a woman in a band was certainly going to be overly noticed, let alone if was all female. Now, no one blinks an eye. Juicy, though, has gathered an inordinate amount of attention because they play music that has a very sweet and unashamedly girlish quality. The trio, originally from Boston and now residing in New York, have been slowly maturing onstage. They have the same DIY attitude that kept their punk predecessors sticking with it, but with very different results. This could be seen Monday at Brownie's as they played their first gig in quite a while. Adding a keyboardist/sampler for the show, Juicy showed what they have been doing with their time off as the sound was richer than before, even though they had some technical difficulties. Juicy's CD for ladies only is in its second pressing on Slow River Records. They will have a track on the AIDS benefit compilation Red Hot And Bothered due out sometime in the fall.

IN THE CONTINUING OUEST FOR

either the perfect concert venue or a spot in the Guiness Book Of World Records as the city with the highest number of venues, Saturday, August 12 saw the "grand" opening of yet another Los Angeles home

for bands. The latest spot is The Hollywood Grand, which has long been a home for club activity, but had previously restrained from thrusting itself into the crowded mix for live bands.

However, after coming out of the box with a triple bill of Mercury's Catherine Wheel, Interscope's Wax and Gwen Mars, of Hollywood Records, it looks like the ample-sized club means business. Furthering that point, promoters succeeded in turning the show into an event reflective of a Hollywood "opening," complete with give-aways. Every person who came through the double glass doors was greeted with a Catherine Wheel/KROQ t-shirt.

But, the most amazing thing was the amount of people already in the room by the time Gwen Mars took the stage close to 8 p.m. Anyone familiar with L.A. concert etiquette knows that rule number two, right behind "show no emotion," is to "arrive fashionably late." Gwen Mars' hometown stature might have had some effect in luring the concertgoers in early, as most in attendance went to the front of the stage for the trio's set. The band didn't disappoint, playing material from its Magnosheen album, before closing with a killer cover of the Beatles' "Ticket To Ride."

After Wax came Catherine Wheel, the band that ostensibly everyone was there to see. It's hard to say if the industry lookie-loos were there for the show, or because they needed to say they were, but Catherine Wheel proved that its new-found appeal is for real

HOUSE OF BLUES RECENTLY hosted a return party of sorts, as longtime L.A. resident and Giant recording artist Warren Zevon came to the House in support of his most recent album, Mutineer. The venerable singer/songwriter, still best known for his mid-'70s hit "Werewolves Of London," and his backing band, Something Happens, put on a fantastic 90-minute show that proved there is still no substitute for good songs.

Diamond Rio: No Longer in the Rough

"STEP BY STEP...SIDE BY SIDE...we'll finish what we started." Those are the lyrics to Diamond Rio's latest single (currently at #45 on the Cash Box country singles chart). But they could also double for the group's motto. In just four years this six-member group has established itself as one of country music's leading contenders, a "band of the '90s" in the truest sense of the phrase. Having conquered the radio and video markets with top-selling albums and hit music videos, it is continuing to cement their place in country music history. In their quest for superstardom, Diamond Rio is leaving no stone (or media outlet) unturned.

Television is the group's latest venture. Diamond Rio recently taped its first one-hour TV special, "Diamond Rio Celebrates Red Wing," to be broadcast September 13 on TNN: The Nashville Network. "We went to Red Wing, Minnesota where they make Red Wing Boots," explains Marty Roe, Diamond Rio's lead singer and designated spokesperson. "They asked us to come up there and play their company picnic and their 90th Anniversary Celebration." The program will give viewers an opportunity to see the group in action on stage and behind the scenes

"A lot of the special will be our show...It gives us a chance to kind of show some different sides of our music," Roe says. And if any band has multiple sides to display, it is surely Diamond Rio. Each member boasts years of performing experience. Individually, the guys claim backgrounds in blucgrass, rock, jazz, and of course, country. By the end of the '80s, the Tennessee River Boys (the band's first name) had made a name for themselves as a main attraction at Nashville's Opryland USA Themepark. They were opening a concert for George Jones in Alabama when Arista Nashville's president, Tim DuBois, heard the soaring harmonies of country's next supergroup. One year later, the renamed Diamond Rio was in the studio working on its debut album.

At the time of Diamond Rio's inception, Arista Records was also experiencing new beginnings in Nashville. With Arista's country division being Music Row's new kid on a crowded block, the label was astutely discriminating when signing new acts. "We're just very, very selective on who we sign and make sure that we have a passion for them as artists and for the music they're doing," DuBois explains. "We have had an exceptionally high success ratio, but I think it's because we haven't signed a lot of people.

DuBois' gamble on the novice group turned into a sure bet in record time. "Diamond Rio was the first band, actually, that had big success for us. They were part of what I call the "Class of '91," which was Pam Tillis, Diamond Rio and Brooks & Dunn, which is a pretty strong class. They were the first band to just come out of the box with a number one record. We had two number one singles in a row and a Platinum album the first time out. So they really helped establish Arista as a player in this already crowded country market.

"I think what we always do is put the music first. We have quality over quantity," says Rhonda Forlaw, Arista Nashville's manager of media and publicity. "It's a real family atmosphere here and we all really pull together to try to make something happen." Forlaw reasons that Arista flourishes in a concentrated industry because the label tries to "bring everybody to the party," in contrast with other record labels in town. "They'll have a media event and that's the media's event. And then they'll have a marketing event, and that's the marketing event. We try to have more events with everybody involved," Forlaw

When asked about Diamond Rio's meteoric rise to the top, Forlaw declares what the band's press kit says: "They're the band that plays. They're all true musicians. I think the difference in Diamond Rio is their vocal blend and their individual instruments. You can hear them on the album, whereas other albums, they're more blended together.

DuBois concurs with the notion that the band offers originality. "We're often accused, rightly, of there being a lot of sameness in country radio. And I think that Diamond Rio is very different as an act. The guys play and sing all the stuff on its albums. I think what they do is unique to this marketplace. And I think that's always allowed their albums to find a place out there.

Presently, the band is hard at work on its fourth album for Arista Nashville (scheduled for an early 1996 release). "We're over halfway finished," Roe says. "I think we have a better picture of what this album's gonna be all about a little earlier on. We feel like we're singing and playing as good as we ever have. Those are the kind of things that need to happen when you're trying to put together a

If Roc sounds relieved that recording is going so smoothly, he has reason to be. After a platinum-selling debut album and numerous awards from the Academy of Country Music and the Country Music Association, the group's sophomore effort, Close To The Edge, almost ended their winning streak. Commercially, the



album was not a flop; it was recently certified Gold. According to Roe, the band's disappointment was in the *quality* of *Close To The Edge*. "The listening experience from top to bottom, for the person who went out and bought it, wasn't what we wanted it to be," Roe says. "We didn't spend enough time putting the album together, at least listening and living with the material once we did cut it.

Love A Little Stronger, the band's third album, was a redemption of sorts. Learning from its previous mistakes, the band was less rushed and more critical of what songs appeared on the final product. "Some things go away, some things kind of stay and grow on you. We really felt like Love A Little Stronger came back and was a lot more like an album we would like to be represented by. So we've applied...that same game plan to this fourth album," Roe says.)

This time the group even shares producing credits with DuBois and Mike Clute. "It's kind of neat to have a little more hands-on in that department," Roe says. It means a little more time in the studio...but once we got involved in that part of the process, it was exciting.'

Although Roe speaks for the band, Diamond Rio is comprised of five other musicians: Gene Johnson (mandolin, vocals), Jimmy Olander (lead guitar), Brian Prout (drums), Dan Truman (keyboards) and Dana Williams (bass guitar, vocals). As any road-weary musician will testify, six different personalities traveling together for most of the year can create frayed nerves and testy egos. "We don't allow that little three-letter word (ego) in the group," Roe affirms. "We are pretty good about not getting too eat up with ourselves. And when somebody does kind of get off on a tangent, there's five other guys that knock him down!

Roe says that the group's mix of dispositions served to keep the group together through early failures and recent successes. "I think by the time the success came, we had worked through our differences and had a pretty good understanding of one another's personalities and what made us tick. We come to majority decisions and that's the end of it. It's just the only way you can make a decision. And usually, if you use that philosophy and you're fairly democratic about it, six heads can be better than one.

To the naked eye, Diamond Rio's onstage chemistry and wholesome image appears to be as natural as their ability to make hit records. And though it is not contrived, it is certainly discussed and agreed upon before hitting the stage. "I'm sure there are things about the "band personality," that if you went to each individual, you might not find in that one particular person," Roe says. "But we sit down and we're fairly conscious of our goals, you know, and the values we want to stand for. And that's kind of what dictates, at least on a grand scale, anyway, the decisions we make with material and TV specials that we do-whatever we participate in. There's just a few overall values and goals musically and image-wise that we want to uphold...and I think they are pretty well held to on and off stage.

Based on the groups accomplishments so far, it doesn't take a fortune teller to predict that this sextet will one day have a track record that is just as impressive as another country band that, incidentally, took their name from the state in which Diamond Rio was "discovered." But first things first. Before Diamond Rio makes history, one of the group's goals is to make it to Europe and prove themselves as headliners. "We're a very goal-oriented bunch of guys that are not done yet," Roe says. "When you have a success on the first album, you have to really say, 'OK, let's prove that's not a fluke." And sometimes it takes a couple albums to convince people. But I think that those are the things we have focused on and are banking on to have a long career.'

PAULA ABDUL: "Crazy Cool" (Virain 11007)

And top 40 may follow suit.




REDBELLY: "Fire In The Hole" (EastWest 9213)

That musicianship carries over to this track and allows the Bay Area band to create easily the best R&B song by a rock act this year. So once again Faith No More are screwed by having the nerve to not sound like everyone else.

VICTORIA WIL-LIAMS: "Nature's Way" (Mammoth/Atlantic 6233-2)

Victoria Williams' Loose was one of the best albums of last year. Despite strong songs and its overwhelming warmth and coziness, the record hasn't caught on with fans the way it deserves to. But much to the credit of the folks at Mammoth they have not given up and continue to minc the CD for singles. With a little help from her friends, Williams may get over the hump yet. Wil-

liams' quiet cover of the Spirit song features vocal assistance from Soul Asylum's Dave Pirner, meaning radio might be more open to the record. And with a spot on the Soul Asylum/Jayhawks/Matthew Sweet fall tour, and an upcoming video to be directed by actress Winona Ryder, it will be hard for the mainstream to ignore yet another wonderful single from the singer/songwriter.

BLIND MELON: Soup (Capitol 34615-2)

Blind Melon's sophomore album has been delayed so many times, one had to wonder if it was the summer's musical equivalent of Waterworld. Depending on why you ask, the group's followup to its multi-platinum debut may indeed still be. Radio has been quick to jump on the CD's first single, the rocking "Galaxie," but advance reviews have not been kind to the 14-song collection. Taking the Swiss approach, both parties are right. The band developed enough of a fan base that Soup has to be considered a major summer release until the fans say differently, but artistically the group seems unsure of what direction it wants to take. Blind Melon fluctuates between the

traditional rock on songs like "2x4" and the psychedelic spaciness of "Vernie." While in theory that would sound like a dream, combining the fans of both Pearl Jam and Phish, the results of this experiment will likely prove disappointing in terms of sales

YOU AM I: Sound As Ever (Warner Bros. 45936-2)

You Am I is an Australian trio whose most creative moment by far comes while describing the type of song the group is writing. That's not to say this is a bad record. On the contrary, it's actually pretty strong, but the imagination lead vocalist/guitarist Tim Rogers uses in describing the band's music is just so cool. Unfortunately, if I were to reprint the quote it would take up too much space, so you'll just have to imagine. You can console yourself with such glorious pop gems as "Jaimme's Got A Gal" and "Adam's Ribs."

PAW: Death To Traitors (A&M 0370-2)

LUNA: Penthouse (Elektra 61807)

Luna is a New York quartet that, on previous efforts, has been overwhelmed by comparisons to the gentler side of the Velvet Underground. The group fueled the fire by having Velvet's guitarist Sterling Morrison appear on its Bewitched album. On this 11-song CD, another legendary N.Y. figure, Tom Verlaine, appears. But on the opening track, "Chinatown," it becomes clear the band will not escape the comparisons. Look, if you're gonna sound like someone there are a lot worse bands to sound like than the Velvet Underground, so get over it and enjoy what is a very friendly album. Other standouts include "Moon Palace," the groovy "23 Minutes In Brussels" and "Freakin' And Peakin'."



BRIAN WILSON: I Just Wasn't Made For These Times (MCA 11270)

This soundtrack to the upcoming documentary was produced by the extraordinary Don Was, the man brought in whenever it's time to take a veteran rock star and provide eachet for today's scene. With a press kit featuring quotes by Tom Petty (among others) singing Wilson's praises, it's pretty clear everyone involved feels now is the time to introduce Wilson to young record buyers. The extremely open-minded may groove on this collection of 11 previously released Wilson songs that were re-recorded for this CD. The one exception might be "Still I Dream Of It." Die-hard Beach Boys fans will be in seventh heaven with the more serene versions of Beach Boys' classics such as "Caroline, No," "Let The Wind Blow" and "Do It Again." Some of the more interesting cuts include "Love And Mercy" and "Melt Away" from Wilson's critically lauded 1988 solo album. Wilson will never appeal to everyone's taste the way he did in the '60s, but there's no denying his importance to the history of rock music.

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PICK OF THE WEEK



JOY DIVISION: Permanent: Joy Division 1995 (Qwest/Warner Bros. 45979-2)

According to the Jon Savage penned liner-notes, "...Joy Division were directly inspired by the Sex Pistols, and out of all the British groups who followed, they went the furthest into the demons of the time, the collective subconscious if you will..." (Be sure to read the rest of the essay). Though Joy Division didn't attack its listeners the way punk bands did, the group was no less brutal, and in some ways moreso, because Ian Curtis and mates hid their darkness beneath the friendly overtones of early techno, re: "Transmission" or "Days Of The Lords." No song better captures the contrast in Joy Division than the obvious "Love Will Tear Us Apart," which serves as a bookend for the 16-song CD. Because of Ian Curtis' tragic suicide and U2's incorporation of the song into a medley with "With Or Without You'' during the '87 tour, the song is as close to a classic as the techno genre has offered. That will be the hook in luring fans in. But once there, they will discover a wealth of buried treasures.

MICHAEL ROSE: Michael Rose (Heartbeat 144) Producer: Niney The Observer

Reggae's brother number one, Michael Rose, is back with a new collection of tracks that promises to increase his visibility as one of the leaders of this genre. This disc is filled with highly accessible tracks that should garner radio support from both alternative and urban formats. Throughout, Rose is in complete control with a vocal delivery that resonates with a passionate, high energy as

well as a tranquil, easy flow. Reggae has always been the type of music that rewards its listeners by putting them in touch with their inner selves, and with this project Rose proves that he's the master of that gift. Standout tracks: "Too Hard A Hearing," "Short Temper," "Don't Play With Fire" and "Casabank Queen."

SOULTRY: Soultry (Motown 314530553-2) Producers: Various

Motown's new four man group debut project is a strong collection of tracks that should provide perfect entree for this group's entry into the forefront of urban contemporary male groups. Throughout this disc the production is sharp and the vocals crisp with powerful harmonies and winning lead vocals. Soultry aggressively targets the material selected for this effort with verve and confidence, and in the process provides a shining example of what R&B music is sup-



posed to be. Urban radio will love this group across the board and there are a number of strong crossover possibilities included as well. A sparkling debut. "I'll Get Mine," "Where Do Broken Hearts Belong," "Cash Money" and "Relax Your Mind."



■ JAZZMATAZZ VOL II: The New Reality, Hosted by Guru (Chrysalis 34290-2) Producers: Various

This eclectic array of songs definitely maps out a new reality of song styling that is worth giving attention to. The disc features a strong cadre of guest vocalists who give the material here a personality and authoritiy that is combustible. The music here is a refreshing departure from the humdrum sounds associated with the bulk of today's urban-oriented recordings. Although initially the music here will probably not be immediately accessible for Top Forty

radio, it should succeed in the growing alternative urban market and with college and pop alternative formats. Standout tracks: "Living In This World," "Looking Through Darkness," "For You" and "Jazzalude."

PICK OF THE WEEK

PATRA: Scent Of Attraction(B) (Epic) Producers: Various

Patra's follow up to her highly provocative 1993 debut is a successful mix of urban and Caribbean flavors that should firmly establish a niche for her in the contemporary marketplace. Throughout this disc, girlfriend is in great shape, clevcrly playing off her image of provocative sex goddess, without getting too caught up in it. The song selection, musicianship, and duet tracks back her well and give the record a funky edge that adds



to its credibility. Vocally she's a strong singer whose voice is capable of displaying a wide range of personality. This project should enjoy long life on urban radio and may even cross over pop as well. A good second effort. Standout tracks: "Pull Up To The Bumper," "Banana," "Mek Me Hot" and "Time Fi Wine."

DANA DANE: "Chester" (Maverick 7661)

This is perhaps one of the most important songs to come from the rap/hip-hop genre in some time. This track's message about child sexual molestation is unfortunately both timely and essential in the perverse age that we live in. As for the record itself, the song has a nice nursery rhyme flow to it that's attractive while the vocals are confident and crisp.

MISTA GRIMM: "Steady Dippen" (New Deal/550 7067)

This eool-breeze rapper is in great form on this debut single from his upcoming eponymously titled disc. Throughout this single Grimm's style is strong and correct and his delivery a mixture of old school flavor with a contemporary edge. The slow groove, funky-fresh music backs him well which, together, all makes for a winning package.

CROOKLYN DODGERS '95: "Return of the Crooklyn Dodgers" (MCA 3492)

The first single from Spike Lee's upcoming film Clockers is a def track filled with a hard-edged flavor that's hard to resist. The groove is on and the rappers here are leading the way with a fresh and naughty delivery that's bound to get this track substantial support from urban radio.

Barry Gets Busy At The Greek

THE GREEK THEATRE, LOS ANGELES, CA—Only Barry White eould put musicians on stage wearing what could have been satin pajamas. The "Love Moaner" himself wore a green outfit that looked like something he'd wear while wooing women in an intimate setting, except this was a sold-out, open air venue and the audienee was there to imbibe his alternately sexy and funky music, which is designed to create a mood for intimate moments.

White continues to have, along with Isaac Hayes—to whom he was often compared when he broke onto the scene in the early '80s—one of the most distinct male voices in R&B/pop. And on this stop of his ''Icon World Tour'' in support of his A&M Records album ''The Icon Is Love,'' backed by the more than 30-piece, smoothly executing, Love Unlimited Orchestra, White demonstrated why his records are a must for romantic interludes. However, the live vocal delivery was uneven and sometimes overshadowed by superfluous staging.

White might as well have been performing in a studio, because it was a rare occasion when he seemed to bring any animation to his stage performance. But there was The Voice. If not for the rivulets of sweat gushing over his face you might not have known that he was working hard at all. He had daneers to do all the physical labor—four attractive women who increasingly wore more revealing outfits as the music moved through each of White's musical eras.

He opened with a rather languid version of "The Time Is Right" from his current album, before moving to his classie "Can't Get Enough Of Your Love" and the equally ubiquitous '70s hit "Never Going To Give You Up." The audience responded favorably to the presentation of these selections.

During his performance of "Ecstasy," the dancers were wheeled on stage in large champagne glasses, and during a later segment they did a sexy dance-play on chaise lounges. At that point, a woman in the audience audibly said, "You need to lose the hoes, Barry," something to which several of the

women present concurred.

But the dancers moved forward undaunted, taking center stage in a lengthy opening interlude during which the orchestra performed an engaging version of the hit "Secret Garden," which White performed with other singers on Quincy Jones' Back On The Block album.

White was most animated and seemed to effectively engage the audience when he took the conducter's baton and directed the orchestra through his signature composition, "Love's Theme." He brought the song to a rousing crescendo, often pausing to let the audience's anticipation build as the ending swirled to a sonic climax.

Sultry Silas/MCA recording artist Chante Moore more than warmed up the audience with a 40-minute set that covered selections from her first two albums. Her multi-octave vocal range, frequently compared to that of the late Minnie Riperton, was effective in the open air, even remarkable considering she had been battling laryngitis.

Summer Jam '95: KKBT Misses The Beat

IRVINE MEADOWS, CA—Bathrooms were filthy, food was ridiculously overpriced and most of the featured acts were unimpressive, but SummerJam '95 went off without much of a hitch at Irvine Meadows recently.

Hosted by 92.3 the Beat, the event was touted to be one that had no intention of honoring color lines yet, oddly enough, all of the acts that performed on this over-inflated balloon were all black. Note to the Beat: if you're going to pump an event that ignores color, have the insight to sprinkle your line-up sheet with more than one color.

The Summer Jam was advertised as a charitable event, with no one making any money and all proceeds going to charity—which might explain the almost criminal act of price gouging at the food lines (an 8 oz. glass of lemonade cost \$3 bucks), and helps to clarify the reason why so many of the more popular groups put on such lackluster performances.

But some acts did act like true professionals by respecting the \$30 per ticket price tag and rose to the occasion. Like Ms. damn-near-butt-naked Adina Howard, who earned the audience's affection by appearing in g-string underwear covered by sweltering hot pants.

And bald-headed Doug E. Fresh showed why he's earned the title as the "rap world's greatest entertainer." Doug's easy stage entranee lulled the audience into his performance from the beginning. He didn't come out in the "here I am world, love me for what I am" attitude as many before eame with. Instead he strolled out in front of the audience in a white musele T-shirt and faded blue jeans and teased the audience with songs from other groups before bringing the house down with "The Show" and "Li-Di-Da-Di."

Naughty By Nature raised their popularity in the west up a noteh with their powerful showtime antics. Hip-hop's truest residents gave the trio an approving nod from the beginning when Vinnie opened up the show with a skit from the movie *Beat Street*. Koyo Gee, Vinnie, and the pumped-up Treach gave the audience their money's worth by performing songs like "Hip-Hop Hooray," "O.P.P.," and "Feel My Flow," but their improved onstage presence is what set them apart from artists who shared the same stage. In spite of performances like these, Summer Jam '95 didn't live up to all the pre-concert hype set off by the Beat. It didn't earn the distinction of being the "greatest concert of all time," and was a painfully expensive disappointment to those who expected it to be more. In the future, organizers over at KKBT will need to do three things if they want their concert events to have the continued support of the people.

#1: Make sure public toilets are in the same condition as the portables used by your staff backstage.

#2: Give concertgoers the choice of bringing their own food and beverages instead of forcing them to buy from miserly vendors. Some people can't pay \$75 for a pair of concert tickets and then turn around and drop \$3 for a slice of cake.

#3: Diversify the acts that play at Summer Jam concerts. Your slogan is "No Color Lines," but how can we take you seriously if you don't allow more than one color to be represented?

CORE, Macola: **Development & Marketing**

INDIE COMPANIES WISHING TO IMPROVE their fortunes do not always look to the "Big Six" distribution machines. Case in point is CORE Entertainment, which could improve the label's artist development fortunes through its relationship with Macola Records Group, which built its reputation on marketing and distributing cutting edge music. The exclusive manufacturing and distribution agreement between the companies, announced in recent weeks, is an example of how two independent companies pool strengths to advance mutual and individual goals-all while firmly navigating the independent pipeline.

Nashville-based CORE's president Keith Dressel, whose company has developed a wide range of artists and product-from the Vigilantes of Love (now on indie label Capricorn Records) to perennial Adult Contempocrooner Engelbert Humperdinck-hopes to take advantage of the relationship that Macola has with Navarre Corp., which is a major independent distributor of music, and other software which is causing the scope of artist development to evolve.

"One of the reasons this deal happened was because of our access to Navarre," says Don Macmillan, Macola president. "Not only do mass merchandisers and chain stores receive product through their system, but the core retail market also gets serviced. Sure, the Best Buys, Blockbusters and Camelots get the product, but so do the mom and pop stores. It's all about sales."

Macmillan notes that Navarre does a "tremendous job" on product because "they keep their roster of labels down so they can do a decent job" of promotion and marketing. He also noted that the company gets his vote because they help develop music companies with an eye to taking advantage of Navarre's firm foothold on the distribution of all software, including home video, and the ever-burgeoning CD-ROM, which is quickly becoming a major tool in artist development.

Macola has expressed excitement over handling product by Humperdinck, but moreso over the prospect of marketing other established and new artists. Legendary folk singer Dirk Hamilton, singer/songwriter Moon Martin and the indefatigable Stephan Allen Davis who has created 15 #1 hits, including "Take Time To Know Her," made popular by Percy Sledge. Turi, The Hardliners, Podunk and Mr. Happy are fresh acts that could continue Macola's legacy of breaking acts like N.W.A. and Timex Social Club.

While CORE's Dressel plans to create marketing and promotion strategies at the company's Nashville headquarters, Macmillan and his staff will work to create merchandising and promotional materials to be utilized by Navarre's 30-branch field staff and also be used by the regional reps employed by Macola.

"We have a staff that develops one-sheets, posters and other promotional items that work their way into the (Navarre) system," Macmillan explains. "We really believe that we can help some of CORE's artists thrive."

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EXECS ON THE MOVE

Jonathan Platt, former music coordinator for Media Rights, Inc., has been named vp of business affairs for Sonic Images Records. The Los Angeles based label has also appointed Brad Pressman to the position of director of A&R and national promotions. Pressman previously worked as an A&R representative in

charge of artist relations. **III** Jeff Cook has been upped to sr. vp of promotion and marketing at Capricorn Records. Cook began his promotion career in the mid- '70s for Arista Records, moved to Atlanta in '78 to head the label's AOR promotion and then became sr. director of album promotion in '82. He also has held posts at Elektra. He joined the re-launched Capricorn in 1991. Cambridge, MA-based Rounder Records has upped a few of its employees starting with the promotion of Brad **Paul** from national promotion director to his new title of vp of national promotion and publicity. Susan Piver, the label's former director of marketing and sales, has been appointed vp of sales and marketing. **K-Tel International** has announced a series of executive changes. Arrival Music, the Christian music division of K-Tel, recently named Christian music industry veteran Tom Ramsey to vp of the label. Coldfront Records, an urban-oriented label recently started by K-Tel has announced the hiring of urban music veteran Allen Johnston as K-Tel's national urban sales manager. **Ron**dor Music International has appointed Carol **Spencer** to the position of A&R coordinator. Prior to Spencer's promotion she worked for years as an assistant for Rondor's sr. vp of creative Brenda Andrews. Ruzich was previously an artist development representative for the San Francisco branch of CEMA Distribution. Her new Rhino responsibilities include sales research and analysis, and the creation of a monthly newsletter that will keep the independents apprised of Rhino releases and events. Capricorn Records has announced that Paula Donner will be a publicist and her responsibilities will include communication with print and broadcast media nationwide. Prior to his work at Capricorn, Donner was employed at Sector 2 Records, as well as working as a sound engineer at Fitzgerald's in Houston, TX. She also served as an audio engineer at South Coast Film & Video. Also Roger Groce has been named as the publicity assistant for the label. Groce's duties will include the coordination of media service for the label's diverse roster. WARRIOR SOUL: The Space Age Playboys (Mayhem/Futurist 11072)



Warrior Soul has released four records through DGC/Geffen Records, but The Space Age Playboys is its first for indie companies Mayhem/Futurist. While the musical quality remains consistent with the previous releases, frontman Kory Clarke can't help but reveal his political views about any and everything for the world to consume. However, this time his lyrics are a bit less blunt and the music is a tad more melodic, making the record more radio friendly than its predecessors. Clarke considers this disc "their best album to date." Stand out tracks are: "Television," "Rocket Engines" and, the closing tune, "Fighten' The War." (KS)

■ WELT: Better Days (Doctor Dream Records - no cat. #)



No need to worry, Welt is not another corporate punk band that sings about minor dilemmas while selling millions of records. This quartet from Sacramento, CA is sincere about the teen angst of which they sing. Their debut album, consisting of 13 tunes, is energetic and amusing. They aren't trying to save the world, just attempting to figure out what people want, especially those of the female gender. While the eldest band member is barely old enough to consume alcohol-legally, that is—they seem to have the right idea about their music, keeping it uplifting and fun. With song titles such as "Lame," "Really?" and "Anything," it's easy to see why Welt provides a welcome breath of fresh air. (KS)

PAUL RUSSO: I Can Show You Love (A&E 303) Producers:Paul Russo and Louis Mosley

This is a solid blend of cool, mellow soul and classic jazz tracks delivered with an easily accessible style that should capture this-up-and coming artist a sizable following. Throughout this disc, the saxophonist displays a wide showcase of his gifts with personality and great style. He also cleverly incorporates his contemporary covers with an old school feel that should add to his credibility. Expect urban contemporary and jazz formats to embrace this disc which stands as a powerful beginning for this jazzman's career.

Standout tracks: "Butterfly New," "Mulatto," "Still In Love" and "For-ever Love." (GR)

BIRDBRAIN: Bliss (TVT 5710)

Birdbrain, a foursome from Boston, MA, speak of aggression toward what they describe as "this cheated generation." With a vocalist/songwriter by the name of Ammo, what else would you expect! His lyrics are rebellious, and his vocal style seems to bear that out. He presents some of his words audibly and clear, then other lyrics roll out of his mouth as if he's intoxicated and ean merely mumble. This 12-track release includes partially acoustic numbers, almost tender melodies, as well as powerful upbeat tracks. With continuous diversity throughout, the listener may forget that one band is performing all these songs. If you are up in arms on what records to take along on that cross-country trip, this could be one considering, it covers a buffet of sonic tastes. (KS)

COWBOY MOUTH: It Means Escape (Monkey Hill Records MON 6128)



In case you haven't been formally introduced to Cowboy Mouth, it is certainly one introduction that is long overdue. This New Orleans-based four-piece band has been touring the country with longtime friends and current chart toppers Hootie and the Blowfish. While the group's music isn't identical to Blowfish's, something about the comfortable songs makes one think the band could perform in front of the kind of audiences attracted by Hootie and the Blowfish. Distributor Profile

Andy Allen & The Alternative Distribution Alliance

ANDY ALLEN, PRESIDENT OF THE Alternative Distribution Alliance (ADA) would like to clarify something. Despite widespread popular opinion, the ADA is not strictly part of the WEA Group. The amount of specialized work they do for the conglomerate, including working records like Better Than Ezra's highly successful *Deluve* on Elektra, has led people to that conclusion, but ADA is an organization that is dedicated to remaining independent in its manner of doing business. The distribution company, which formed in May/June of 1993, currently handles such well-known independents as Epitaph, Futurist, Restless, Rhino, Teenbeat and Touch And Go, to name but a few.

Allen joined the company in June of 1994 after a 10-year stint with Island Records. Allen said, "The last three of which I was general manager of Island in the States." Prior to that he served 10 years with RCA. Though ADA might not seem at first an ideal situation for him, given his background with major labels, Allen has abundant reasons as to why this was, in fact, the perfect place for him to go. He said, "A lot of the labels that were Island-owned, were distributed independently. Labels like 4th and Broadway, Mango, Grape Jones, were labels that were distributed independently, and obviously we were very involved in working those records."

Allen continued, "So, independent distribution wasn't something that was new to me. It was something that we had been involved with for some time. The ADA operation was very interesting to me as it had started up and I had kind of watched it grow just in that it was a competitor of the ILS system, which

was our independent system at Island. What attracted me to it were the labels that were distributing through ADA. The fact that it had the Warner Music Group involved meant a commitment towards making it work. And I have always loved the kind of entreprenurial and independent spirit that comes in working with or for an independent label. I just think it's a real exciting part of the business."

Allen's enthusiasm for the independent spirit is apparent, but the Warner Music Group is clearly a cornerstone of ADA's present and future plans. For Allen the reasoning behind Warner's involvement with ADA can be explained as follows, "With ADA, they have the opportunity to use a different distribution system...In the research that we've done, about 35 or 38 percent of the stores that we sell to are also sold (to) directly by WEA. So you can tell there's a significant difference in the stores that we reach directly."

Unprecedented success is not without its draw-backs, though. Specifically, the point of ADA was to provide specialized attention to the labels it works with. However, continued expansion could make that goal less realistic. As president of ADA, what does Allen see as way to counter that problem? "Well, I think that there's a process in place to make sure that we don't grow beyond what our target is, which is to be able to provide distribution with an eye toward artist development."

In addition, ADA is constantly expanding in other directions. An example is their recent installation of CD sampling stations into selected independent retail outlets, designed to help those stores keep up with the major chains. After an initial outlay of stations to 38 stores, more are being added on a continual basis. While the cost might be a bit high, there's an old adage that says, you have to spend money to make money. And given their success, and potential for future growth, it's hard to argue with ADA's way of doing business.

Legendary guitarist/singer/songwriter Eddie Hinton passed away on Friday, July 28, 1995. Hinton, an Alabama resident, worked as a session player, performing with such greats as Wilson Pickett, Aretha Franklin, Solomon Burke, Elvis Presley and Otis Redding. Hinton's own writing was influenced most by

Redding and his songs have been recorded by the likes of Cher, Gregg Allman, Percy Sledge, and Dusty Springfield. Later in his career, Hinton still produced soulful quality records...

NEW YORK-BASED Futurist Label Group is set to have several releases in the stores before Fall. Look for records from Warrior Soul, My Dying Bride, Sometime Sweet Susan, Mind Over Four, Beat Farmers and Hooch. The Futurist Label Group is distributed through INDI/Alliance Entertainment Corporation.

Evil Troll Records, a West Coast-based label just put out a disc from The Obvious Wish. The record is entitled *Stickman W/Red Balloon* and features just that as the album art work.

K-tel International is going back a couple of decades to revive some music of the past. The label is set to re-issue several releases from a heart throb of the 70's, Bobby Sherman. The first four titles in the series are: Bobby Sherman, Here Comes Bobby, A Portrait Of Bobby, and With Love, Bobby. All of the aforementioned will be released on CD for the first time. More of Sherman's previous records are planned for release soon...

CMC International recording act Motorhead celebrated its 20th anniversary following a sold-out show at New York's Roseland. On tour in support of its current release Sacrifice, the band had to deal with a couple unexpected dilemmas, including the tour bus breaking down and frontman Lemmy missing a scheduled live televison show appearance. But never fear, Lemmy did get a chance to toast "Father" Paddy and "Sister" Barbara at a party following that evening's performance.

Seattle, Washington-based CM Records has announced that former Swedish porn star, Marty Yterberg has ironically been named the new vocalist/guitarist for hard rock band Sweat. Yterberg replaces the departed Dennis Randall and the current line-up of the band plans to record its first release together in the next few months. 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

Gramercy's Usual Suspects Not Usual: It's Good!

DEFINITION OF A HOLLYWOOD THRILLER: Something lean, mean and deliciously good which slips through the cracks where the usual flabby, tired and mediocre can't go-The Usual Suspects.

If any filmmakers out there are searching for a guide-on for the Contemporary Noir genre, The Usual Suspects is it and will be it for some time to come. This is the kind of motion picture that makes filmmakers with a sense of responsibility toward the art and love of craft stand tall with pride. It could inspire them to continue making stabs at it, in spite of the obvious opposition. Frame for frame, this is the best, certainly most finely crafted, work on the market. It's definitely one I'll go back to see, and if it's not the sleeper hit of the year there's no justice at the boxoffice and audiences are as stupid as bloated budget mega-makers give them credit for being.

It's noir. It's a thriller, and a whodunit, an action piece and a mystery. It's excellent on all levels of screenwriting, directing, acting, photography, editing and scoring, all the way down the line, and it didn't cost an arm and a leg. It snatches one up from the first frame, twists, turns and teases all the way to the final edit. And it's an evenly balanced, totally collaborative effort where every element knows exactly what the other is doing and everyone is working toward the very best that can be gotten. Every creative area of filmmaking is evenly interwoven. It's what filmmaking should be.

The foundation, writer Christopher McQuarrie's script, is solidly amazing. He juggles all the elements mentioned above so expertly he makes the complex appear simple. His characters are real and realistically interlaced; dialogue believable; plotting tight and marvelously nuanced, solid and totally imaginative. It's the freshest, genre-bending, original script to come out in the crime noir idiom since the pioneering thirties and forties.

Director Singer knows where each piece of the puzzle fits and allows the audience to follow by keeping them in the shadows observing while never leaving them in the dark. Great subtlety in the handling of a handgun as a hint to identity. There's absolutely no wasted motion and his work with the actors looks like a performer's dream situation. He brings his leads into a wonderfully tight ensemble that brings out the best in them all. Singer's first film, Public Access, brought him attention and he had with him some of the same key people he has here: McQuarrie, co-producer Kenneth Kokin, and editor-composer John Ottman. They work like a well drilled team.

Ottman's editing and music make a thrilling combination; teasing, enhancing, guiding, revealing. Newton Thomas Sigel's camera work puts the audience at the location.

The central actors: Stephen Baldwin, Gabriel Byrne, Chazz Palminteri, Kevin Pollak, Kevin Spacey and Benicio Del Toro work together like a well oiled machine. Call them "Singer's Sewing Machine" if you like, because director Singer puts them in some lingering skin pore-revealing close ups that call for concentration and control above and beyond the call of "acting," pushing them into the microscopic realm of "being." There are moments when they're—especially Spacey, Palminteri and Byrne—called upon to literally allow the audience to read their thoughts. Concentration and control. Marvelous. Acting coaches will be telling students to watch Kevin Spacey in his expertly layered performance for years to come. Pete Postlethwaite is solid as is Giancarlo Esposito and Dan Hedaya.

Disney Channel's Brian Wilson: I Just Wasn't Made For These Times

THIS DOCUMENTARY IS NOTABLE on a couple levels, actually. It's not a Beach Boys rehash and it marks the directorial debut of Grammy winning music producer Don Was.

Sure, the Beach Boys are there—after all, the subject is Brian Wilson, creator of the group and its sound-but the only ones taking part are Brian and brother Carl. And Carl is as much cursory as he is compulsory. He joins Brian and mom Audree on a family rendition of "In My Room" and talks of his association with brother Brian both humorously and guardedly.

Director Was—who also produced with Larry Shapiro, David Passick and Ken Kushnick—has employed Wyatt Troll as his director of photography. His black and white camera work is rich in texture, foreboding and offers up shadows of grey like some of the areas of Wilson's life, and it fits perfectly.

Wilson doesn't flinch at discussing controversial aspects of his life: the drugs, emotional problems, personal relationships or the work and his feelings about it—it took him six months to decide whether to take on this project after Was approached him and it appears that when he did arrive at the decision he approached it head-on.

It's highly interesting hour, not only for anyone who remembers the hey-day of the Beach Boys and the out-there aspect of Brian and his relationship to the other members of the group (pointedly missing from the project is Beach Boy Mike Love, though Brian credits him several times), but for anyone interested in the evolution of rock and roll, and anyone interested in the creative process and the toll it takes on its practitioners. Brian Wilson and his creativity was brought down largely because of business and its rule over creativity. It's a sad fact that that has always been the case, and is even moreso today. No one actually comes out and states it in those words, but it's alluded to during discussions of the Smile project that never came out, which was shot down by the performing members of the group because of their business-leaning acumen, all at the height of Brian Wilson's creativity and at a moment he was attempting to reach beyond, at a time he was attempting to expand, to grow. He never truly recovered from that.

Throughout there are testimonials to what Brian Wilson and his work meant to other musicians: David Crosby and Graham Nash, Tom Petty, Linda Ronstadt, Randy Newman and others. A touching portion comes as Wilson is joined by his formerly estranged daughters, Wendy and Carnie, and they speak about their father, evaluating their early lives as well as former wife Marilyn.

Ultimately it's a picture of a man, gifted but tortured, who has gone into a tunnel of terror and is emerging as whole as he can be for the times, but it's also a picture of a man who wasn't made for these times, and who speaks for a significant group of his generation who weren't blessed with the gifts

HBO's Tuskegee Airmen Is Affirmative

PERIOD PIECES CAN FALL VICTIM to the dictates of history unless there is an effort to see the people who lived and formed the history of the period. Despite the obvious manipulative polemics of this HBO Pictures presentation, at least a composite of people, history, and drama surrounding these American pioneers known as the Tuskegee Airmen is achieved. Sometimes the movie makes you proud of the human spirit. Sometimes human limitations want to make you puke. Sometimes dramatic license taken moves the story forward. Sometimes the dramatic forum lops off insights that would have made this a better story

But with this east, ably led by Osear-nominee Laurence Fishburne (What's Love Got To Do With It) and TV/movie veterans like Andre Braugher, Cuba Gooding, Jr., Courtney Vance, Allen Payne, Malcolm-Jamal Warner and the delightfully devilish John Lithgow, you have at least a series of vignettes that speak to history, the period, its drama, and the subjects' personal relationships, which salvage the aformentioned dilemma for the filmmakers.

There's not enough history that really tells the story of these African-American fighter pilots that represented a visceral touchstone for the irony of WW11. At home they were called niggas, eoons, jigaboos and other colorful epithets. But they all signed on to fight Nazi master raceman Adolf Hitler's minions for a country that disdained them. The initial 332nd and later incarnations, 99th, 100th, 301st and 302nd squadrons, were officially called the Tuskegee Airmen, and were the creme de la creme of intelligence and ambitiousness for a generation of African-Americans. They were political scientists, art history majors, economic majors, engineering students, pre-law majors, math students and, hell, some of them even already knew how to fly planes. But still they were referred to in polite circles as "Mrs. Roosevelt's Niggas."

They fought the inertia of racism and domestic political agenda, something that Lithgow's depiction as southern Sen. Conyers, and a training officer played with smooth relish by Christopher McDonald (Quiz Show), make

The trials of these initial cadets serve as the filament for how friendships are formed in life and lost during war. No need to recant history here.

Andre Braugher has one of the toughest jobs as he plays the 332nd's leader, Lt. Col. Benjamin O. Davis, a real historical figure; Fishburne tastefully avoids recreating his previous screen roles; Gooding is always a screen delight; as an actor Jamal Warner is still proving himself (like his character in this film); and Payne brings new dimension to his skill at playing arrogance to the max. Courtney Vance needs to headline a film, as he effectively makes his character the fulcrum of success and failure personified.

Two scenes that sum up the pride are when two cadets are forced to land near a prison gang working in the fields near Tuskegee. The gang boss is excited to see the U.S. flyboys—until he realizes they are black. The mostly black field gang's members swell with pride. At the end, a southern racist is convinced that the only way he'll live through a major bombing will be if the Tuskegee Airmen fly interference. He tells his commander as much, and no one objects. For the record: The "jigaboo" fighter pilots never lost a bomber when flying such missions. That's because they got a chance to prove

News From The Commonwealth, Ireland & Europe

THE ROCK WAR OF THE '90S is what newspapers in the UK and Ireland are calling the release on Monday, 14 August, of singles by UK megagroups Oasis and Blur. Released on separate dates, each single was almost guaranteed to hit the top of the charts. But this is war, and it's the first time there's been a clash of such magnitude since The Beatles and The Rolling Stones some 30 years ago. For weeks before the release date, the media have been beating the war drums for Oasis' "Roll With It" and Blur's "Country House," and the hype paid off with advance sales of more than 100,000 each. While Oasis has hit number one single and album in the past, Blur is hoping that their single will be the ticket to the top. The rivalry between the groups is also fed by the image of Oasis as being working class from the North and the Stones of today, whereas Blur is middle class from the South of England and the Beatles in the fight. However, Monday night's late figures from top outlets in the UK seem to put Oasis in top place with Blur biting the dust in the rear. However, next week's charts should tell the final story. The winner hoping to take over from Take That, which is currently the hottest group in the UK.

However, all is not lost for Blur as they will share writing the official songs for The Football Association's Euro '96. Blur releases through Food Records, which is distributed by EMI's Parlophone. Oasis is on Creation Records, a division of Sony Music.

SPEAKING OF TAKE THAT, a German girl and her mother claim they were attacked by a bodyguard when they tried to take pictures of Take That's lead singer, Gary Darlow's house. The bodyguard denied the charges and the women have hired a lawyer to press charges. Meanwhile, Take That has been voted "Best Pop Group on the Planet" and Mark Owen as "The Most Snoggable (Kissable) Star in the Cosmos' by readers of tcenage mag Big.

THE '80S SPEAR OF DESTINY SINGER, Kirk Brandon, has filed legal action against Boy George, Virgin Records, EMI Music and book publishers Sidgwick and Jackson. Brandon, who has a new group, 10.51, claims that allegations about his sexual life are untrue and holding up U.S. deals for his group.

THE BRITISH PHONOGRAPHIC INDUSTRY ASSOCIATION reported that pirate CDs and cassette tapes are costing the industry more than \$60 million (£38 million) a year.

WORD HAS IT THAT GEORGE MICHAEL, when trying to go through a tunnel toll gate realized he didn't have any cash with him, tried telling the guard who he was and promised to pay on his return trip. The guard, forcing Michael to turn back, told him he's already had two George Michaels who tried to get through as well as numerous other lookalikes.

NUMBER ONE ON THE UK TOP SINGLES LIST is still U2's "Never Forget." New to the charts in second place is Original's "I Luv U Baby," while holding third place is Boyzone's "So Good." Fourth is TLC's "Waterfalls"; fifth Seal's "Kiss From A Rose"; sixth, JX's "Son Of A Gun. Coming onto the charts in seventh place is Corona's "Try Me Out," with Diana King's "Shy Guy" in eighth followed by Suggs' "I'm Only Sleeping' in 9th, and Ontthere Brothers' "Boom Boom" is in tenth.

IN IRELAND, BOYZONE'S "So Good" is holding onto first place with "Never Forget" by Take That still in second and Outthere Brothers' "Boom (3)" retaining third position. Seal's "Kiss From..." is up to fourth and U2's "Hold Me, Thrill Me" is down to fifth. Brendan Keeley's "Take The Chains Away'' is sixth, Corona's "Try Me Out" is 7th, Diana King's "Shy Guy" is 8th with Who's Eddie's "Right Now" in 9th and Supergrass' "Alright" in tenth spot.

Sheri Price: Paying Tribute To A Country Legend



SHERI PRICE GREW UP IN EAST TEXAS on a 400-acre ranch just outside the town of Tyler and has loved music since she was a child. When she was five years old, Price received two Christmas gifts that would change her life—a record player and a collection of Hank Williams albums. Throughout her childhood, the Texan participated in every talent show available in order to perfect her craft.

Price had two lifelong dreamsone was singing, the other motherhood. It was her second dream that actually led her to pursue her first ambition. "I was always singing to my two kids," Price says, "and my

husband heard about a contest, The Country Showdown. He encouraged me to enter.

NAMA Releases '95 **Operating Ratio Report**

CHICAGO—The 1995 Operating Ratio Report, just published by the National Automatic Merchandising Association, addresses such pertinent topics as vending route averages, product costs, employee productivity and the competitive edge, among others.

Easy-to-read charts with detailed financial information allow vending operators to compare their operations to national industry averages for companies of similar size. Some of the comparisons include: sales per vending route; sales per employee in all the vending classifications; sales per machine by product; gross profit by product; operating expenses in 15 key categories; payroll expenses for five job categories; return on vending assets and inventory turnovers.

Management Foresight, a unit of Arthur Andersen & Company, compiled the statistics on this annual survey that NAMA has been conducting for 48 years. It is reportedly the only survey of its kind.

Other new information listed in the report includes "Vending Sales Per Route Serviced," and additional breakdowns of operating expenses in the less than \$1 million sales volume category.

The 1995 Operating Ratio Report was sent free to survey participants immediately upon publication. NAMA members who did not participate may order a copy at a cost of \$100 each. The cost for non-members is \$250. Non-members who join NAMA within 60 days of purchase may apply \$150 of that cost toward their first year's dues.
