Hard Choices

RED ZEPHYRUS, "THE END AS START," CAPITOL

WE COULDN'T DRIVE LAST TIME IN a cassette sampler two weeks ago and the feedback has been excellent. There was a ton of play on the debut--this time there will be even more...WOLFE Tall Edwards says, "I'd just comply with RIT on this one. It is an unqualified co-ty. We've just again burned out the advance we got in the sheet."...Mike, "Instant classic." And Jim may have to be "The Best Of Zephyrus" and "Through The Curtain".

WHITETOP, "DREAMS, SAVING, COOLNECK"

Another quality cassette THIS week, and an unqualified endorsement from me--the best non-superstar hard rocker in weeks. Derek and Brad do what they're supposed to do, and the singing and guitar playing are great. The song, "Twins" does better than It, Paradise. Even with all the heavies, songs like "Baroque" and "Every Morning" will keep this up there with the automation. So listen to the cassette.

SHOOTING STAR, "EP"

As much as the Sebastian stations have been banging left branch from the vinyl debut, you can bet we'll give it a shot. I'm looking for plant nerve moves whaka here. "Hold On To Your Life Tonight" is the one.

Chain Reaction

REACTION REQUISITE:

- 1) JOURNEY, "JOURNATA" In as a quacker, Journey hits 27 Top 20 (5 of 'em 4) Most Added, and based on the intense enthusiasm of the following committee, we could be in for a battle for the #1 strangle that lasts weeks...Buck McKilligan, with "Journey could release a package on 140 and it would still sell." The new energy of "Dead at the Wheel"...Jim Smith, with "Journey's album is pure pleasure. Although Cain's influence is another plus for the band"...Frank Anderson, with "Anyone accusing Journey of cross commerciality in the past had better go down in front of some odd stocks and let this to take a few fishes off the top of his head"...Raymond Nays, with "I can't escape the funk. These platinum playings band out nice like McDonald's makes hamburgers."
- 2) ZZ TOP, "WARNER BROTHERS" With no advance single out there to set up the pre-release comments, the raves for ZZ totally dominate the Radio Guide this week, and I think we're all agreed this record has the goods. It's at least played as my 8000, for sure. Their sense of humor and soaring texture and variety really make this one special...Jim says, "One of the most infectious new albums I've heard in a long time. They may look old, but their music is prime"...Real Points, NGRD, "ZZ blows your top on this one. 'Rockin' authentic, American rock and roll in the fine Texas tradition. My god, it's got everything--the hooks, super production, subtle vocals, a ballad, and even a barbers organ"...Jim Lee, WFF, "An album I find truly enjoyable. I saw a reference to them becoming the American Police, and that's not too far off. They certainly have developed from simple-minded boogie men to highly textured boogie men"...William Stewart, WNY, "ZZ rock me right between the eyes. 'ZZ Rock' is fantastic"...Bob from Love Season, "Anyone who thinks this is just a Texas boogie band is missing the boat completely. 'ZZ Rock' is two stars of white rock and roll"... "Tube Snake" and "Yearl Respite" rock with "Kinky in the Radio" and "Lotta" sneaking up.
- 3) HEAVY METAL, "SOUNDTRACK, COLTRANE/STYLON" What a tight Most Added this week, Journey 36, ZZ 94, and "Heavy Metal" 93. I have never seen the Top 10 so competitive. The album is really wide open with play on Black Sabbath, Deep Purple, Don Telson, Grand Funk, Journey, Stevie Nicks, and Donnie Fagan leading. Even a few positives on Rite...Shirley, WFF, "Heavy Metal" is like a good department store. "Heavy Metal" has the best of everything--you can just take your pick"...Jim Lee, "The best sounding soundtracks since 'KM', and should definitely be the biggest seller since "Urban Cowboy"...Mike, WFF, "A knockout collection of steaming album rock tracks"...Ron Nenni, WFF, "A terrific compilation of supergroups, and a few surprises. The Grand Funk cut is great, Levon's is amazing, and we're also using Black Sabbath. Seems like with the wide variety on the album, it's gonna be a monster"...Mike, WFF, "It's going to be a big phenomenon. Haven't seen the movie, but I bet it follows the progression of "Urban Cowboy" (minus the cow chases and John Winger's antics). The soundtrack might make more money than the movie!"

CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

IAN HUNTER, "CENTRAL PARK AND WEST", CHRYSALIS

Week's end, last minute Front-Page shot. Michael Abramson brought the single down and we love it. Wall of sound at its best. Out on 12" this week.

RICKIE LEE JONES, "PIRATES", WARNER BROTHERS

It's nice to know that the format still makes room for an offbeat but artistically deserving artist/record. Considering Rickie's latest sounds less commercial and 'up' than the debut, I'd call 39 out-of-the-box an exceptionally strong radio endorsement...WLVY-FM's Dave Logan says, "It's the one that really slays me. As Joni Mitchell strolls her way toward a more distant vision, here comes Rickie Lee moving right in and covers her abdication with the album audience, even more so than Stevie Nicks because of her totally unique style of writing and arranging"...Greg Gillispie, KAZY, "Obviously not as commercial as her first, but the textures on the album are fantastic"...Michael Knight, KZOK, "Mysterious music in a world of its own, and so satisfying"...Kid Leo, "Rickie Lee will surface last, but will stay with us the longest. She has become the female Bruce Springsteen, not a copy, but she's a supreme story-teller about the characters that make up this technicolor world"...Belle, KTIM, "It's total magic. I have found no other word to describe what Rickie Lee does. And no, friends, you don't have to be a junkie to enjoy her. It's more subtle than the first, and softer than the debut and exquisitely produced"...Bob Gelms, WXRT, "One helluva good record. Her songwriting has matured beyond my wildest expectations"..."Woody And Dutch" is the clear leader with "Pirates" close behind.

DEF LEPPARD, "HIGH AND DRY", POLYGRAM

16 reports rolled in, but watch out next week--it should blow in huge. Check these raves...Dave Kane, WCMF, "The Mutt Lange magic touch continues. First AC/DC, then Foreigner, then Def Leppard's heavy metal kids. The growth they have shown since the first is proof that they will be a recognized force in the metal market"...Sky Daniels, WLUP, "(Record of the Week) 'Let It Go' should be considered as an automatic. There's no way you can deny the grass roots level acceptance of AC/DC's 'Back In Black', and the same ingredients can be found on the new album. The tour with Ozzy should break them wide open"...Leo, "Waiting for producer Mutt Lange was a wise move, and definitely worth the wait. At this point, I do believe they are the finest heavy metal band from England (with the retirement of Led Zeppelin, of course)."

BUILDING:

- 1) FOGHAT, WARNER BROTHERS Foghat moves 16-11 on the Back Page, and advances 20-14 on the Metro chart for a double underline...This week's play increases: KOME, WMMS, KWFM, WDIZ, and WRIF. Solid on the Checklist-5 dropping, 29 maintaining, and 35 building...Now with good phones reported at WDIZ, WFYV, KLBJ, WMMR, KZEL, WBRU, KSJO, WRXL, KLBJ, WLWQ, WQFM, WSYR, KISS, and others.
- 2) MICHAEL STANLEY BAND, EMI The strongest debut on both charts--#19 Index and #28 in the Top 30 markets. Early max play on WQDR, WMMS, and WIOT...And heavy on WDVE, WBLM, KYYS, KSJO, and KSHE...10 new adds this week for a total of 77 in the past two...Comments: Tim Bedore, KZAP, "Love the MSB. Like everyone else, I couldn't be more pleased with his acceptance. If any of you are holding out, you're foolish"...Dave Lange, WDVE, "Good phones for Michael and good orders from the stores"...Joe McCabe, KYYS, "Sounds better and better with each listen"...Charlie West, KMOD, "I'm extremely impressed. With a style all his own, and many years of experience, he's definitely on his way to the top"...Buck McWilliams, WIOT, "Second and third listens reinforce my belief that this is far and away Michael's best ever"...Rob Barnett, WAAF, "I was glad to see a very positive station reaction last week--hard work is repaid with success. Isn't it great to be an American!!"...Leading songs: "In The Heartland" at #26 and "Somewhere In The Night" at #88.
- 3) POINT BLANK, MCA In our pick back on March 27th, I gave "Nicole" my personal preference nod, and now 17 weeks later, the Top 40 and album play on that track is moving it right on up the list 32-26 on the Index with a pretty amazing 29-20 Metro jump. "Nicole" is up 39-30. A job well done.
- 4) THE A's, ARISTA The A's moved up 34-28 on the Index with play increases on WSYR, KWFM, and KNAC...In our checklist this week, we found 27 stations maintaining, 12 dropping, and 17 building...Hottest request activity on WDIZ (upper demo requests), WIOT (strong female appeal), WMMS (in Power), WQXM (great record). Great calls on KROQ, WMAD, WHCN, and WMMR, and KZAP, where Tim Bedore sez, "A great stroke/message song. Can't miss with your females on that one."
- 5) BALANCE, EPIC One of only three debuts last week, Balance grabs another underline this week, 39-30. Considering the name-band traffic, that's an impressive progress record for just 5 weeks out. Five nice play increases: WMMS, WYFE, WQXM, KSHE, and WLIR...New on: WSHE, KZEW, WKLS, WHCN, WRNW, and WRKI, for a total of 53 reports in the last month...On the Song Index, "American Dream" jumps 49-36.
- 6) RICK SPRINGFIELD, RCA This record refuses to go away. 23 weeks on the Airplay Index, and still banging out those prime moves: 43-34 Index, 34-25 Metro. Another couple of weeks of this and I'll have to stroke myself with a Hard Choice reprint. A promotional plum for RCA.
- 7) DIESEL, REGENCY The comments are on the money. Lenny and Ron Barber have done one hell of a job on this record as it logs in prime move number one, 44-37. WSYR, KZEL, WXRT, WRXL, and KLBJ increased play. And on the Checklist, Diesel did very well. 17 said it was maintaining, 5 dropping, and 18 building. We're hearing about good phones on WRXL, KLBJ, WGRQ, WKLS, WCCG, WAQX, KZEL, KZAP, Seattle (top 30 sales), WTPA, WSYR (#1 most requested), WJCT, WDHA, and KTXQ.
- 8) THE ROCKETS, ELEKTRA "Can't Get Satisfied" leads at #74 as the Rockets place at #39--one of only two debuts this week. A super solid add week, including KZEW, WAVA, WCOZ, WMJQ, KMOD, WPYX, WXUS, WZIR, and WRAS. We're up to a three week total of 54 stations...WCOZ's new MD, Ted Edwards, comments, "It's a marvelous record. Not terribly deep, but the strong cuts are outstanding, specifically 'Back Talk' and the cut we've started with, 'Can't Get Satisfied'. It's easy to relate to--a lot of energy and the perfect summertime song"...And from Bob Majersky, WZUS, "'Back Talk' demonstrates the capacity the group has always possessed. The good driving beat and clear production should give them the attention they have worked to obtain."
- 9) THE RODS, ARISTA We had a near miss on the Index, but Bingo, a major market debut, in at #50 on the Metro chart...New on KTXQ, KQRS, KSMB, WHCN, KZON, WRKI, and WGLL... "Power Lover" dominates.
- 10) RED SPEEDWAGON LIVE, EPIC Very smart of Epic to get that live disc out--it's bringing the record right back up the charts--42-36 on the Index this week.
- 11) ICEHOUSE, CHRYSALIS One point short of a prime move on the Index, Icehouse comes up 22-18, #23 Metro. Some nifty increases: KOME, WKLS, KZEW, WHFS, WXRT, KWFM, and WBCN...KLAQ's Rob Roman reports, "Good upward movement last week. They're in the Top 10 with both requests and sales"...Temple Lindsey, KISS, "Icehouse is getting more requests for a new record than I've seen in a long time."

RAMONES, "PLEASANT DREAMS", SIRE

My three year old son Seth is a Sha Na Na junkie. I tape it every Tuesday night and he has to see each show at least 5-6 times (just ask Frank Andrick about the kid's air-guitar)...It did not escape my attention that the Ramones' appearance is one of his all time favorite recurrences, and with a demographic spread of 3-24, I guess it's time to get serious...As KLOL's Michele Robinson says, "The Ramones got added at KLOL. Imagine that!! I personally think it's easily their finest album and must credit Graham Gouldman for the fine job of projection. He did for the Ramones what I had hoped Phil Spector would do"...Jack Schwartzman, WBRU, "Help is consistent throughout. A return to that 'Road To Ruin' sound"...And from Lin Brehmer, "We like the new one better than 'End Of The Century', and we're leaving the album open. Few bands can sell out a 700 person night club these days as confidently as the Ramones do."

THE GO GO'S, "BEAUTY AND THE BEAT", IRS

Another solid week with Philadelphia leading the way. New on WMMR, WIOQ, WYSP, and 7 more..."Our Lips" is the airplay favorite, "This Town, and "Lust To Love" are next up...Joe Bonadonna says, "We added the single, and it's bound to be a hit record. It's wonderful. 'We Got The Beat' also sounds good on the radio, and we're already getting reaction"...Art Phillips adds, "We'll give it a shot. 'Our Lips' is an infectious track, and the entire album has been getting play on the office turntable."

GARY O', CAPITOL

Initial interest centered on the fine remake of "Pay You Back With Interest". The Sebastian stations have been doing quite well with "All The Young Heroes". It certainly makes sense to re-listen. New on WAVA, WLUP, WQXM, WMJQ, and WBLM.

SAD CAFE, "LA DI DA", SWAN SONG

The single had a great Top 40 week--including WQXI-FM, KJ100, WKXX, WALG, Q101, WDMS, WKNX, KQID, WPFM, WGAD, KTAM, and KENI. Album radio is paying attention--we log in new air on WYSP, KZOK, WIOQ, WILS-FM, WAVA, WQDR, WBAB, WXRT, and 10 more.

ALLMAN BROTHERS BAND, "STRAIGHT FROM THE HEART", ARISTA

Smack dab in the middle of KAL's FRONT-RED PAGE, as 8 majors and 41 secondaries roll in. And album programmers are equally enthusiastic...WYFE's Magic says, "They've been trying to have a hit record for years now, and they might just have come close with this one. 'Straight From The Heart' went straight on the playlist. Already getting phones"...Ilyse Gottlieb, WRXL, "With just a few days on the air, the single is really getting great phones, and stores tell me they are getting requests"...Ray White, WLIR, "The single has the phones buzzin'", and from Dana at KOME, "I think the new single could cross Top 40 and be another 'Ramblin' Man'."

JON AND VANGELIS, "THE FRIENDS OF MR. CAIRO", POLYGRAM

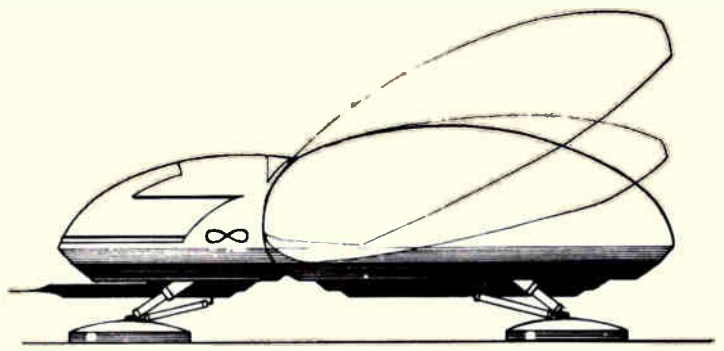
#7 Most Added with 16 more, including KSHE and KGB-FM. We're up to 31 for the past two weeks...Need phone reaction to be convinced? From Alan Sneed, WKLS, "'Mr. Cairo' is the hottest phone record I've seen in recent memory. We get 15 to 20 positive calls every time the song is played. It's unbelievable"...KGB-FM's Judy McNutt nails it, "The slant on 'Mr. Cairo' is the visuals it creates. With all of our peer group being brought up on television, this is a natural"... Ira Gordon, KFML, "Even more accessible than their first collaboration."

CHECKLIST RECORDS:

- 1) BOC Of all the records we asked about, BOC was the absolute monster--61 building, 14 maintaining, and only 2 dropping. Hot everywhere.
- 2) BLACKFOOT This one also had an exceptional week--30 maintaining, 6 dropping, and 40 building. Up 11-9 on the Top 30 market, 9-8 nationally..."Fly Away" is #12-9...A Front-Red Page single for Kal this week..."Searching" goes 55-44.
- 3) MICK FLEETWOOD 37 maintaining, 7 dropping, and 16 building. Calls at WPYX, KSJO, WQBK, WRXL, KLBJ, WMMS ("G man loves it"), WYSP ("Good sales"), KZOK, KZEW, WGIR, WRKI, WRKK, and KTIM.
- 4) SILVER CONDOR 5 building, 17 maintaining, 27 dropping...For some reason, it's murder to get album programmers to shift to a softer single about 4 or 5 weeks play on an album--but in this case, that's the move. The single is blowing out at KRBE with a 22-12 move and top 5 phones...Also jumpin' in the Dallas/Ft. Worth market, with a 22-17 on KGEL, and a number of stores showing top 10-20 sales. Phoenix is also raving.
- 5) THE A's Building 17, maintaining 27, dropping 12...Also quite active on both charts. See builders.
- 6) POCO Considering how healthy Poco looked in the Checklist, the comments are surprisingly light. We only came up with 1 station with a dipping report, 29 said maintaining, and 18 reported a building situation. More good stations, WIOQ, WLWQ, KSHE, WTUE, WRNW, and WQFM...Hottest sales market... Building on WRXL "they recognize the group"; KLBJ "Major familiarity"; WKLS "Cult is buying"; WCCC and KAZY "Sales"; WRNO; WQFM "Sales"; KZAP; WOUR "Fans interested"; and WDEK "Female and crossovers"; along with mentions from KATT, KILO, WRKK, and WIMZ.
- 7) DANNY JOE BROWN 4 Building, 29 maintaining, 29 dropping. Now it hangs on the single.

Here are this week's Checklist records. Please remember we're looking for your input on whether albums are Building, Maintaining, or Dropping at your station. We're primarily concerned with requests and sales momentum. So if it's building in your market, please note the reasons. Also remember that dropping implies a loss of momentum in sales, calls or confidence--not that you've dropped the record.

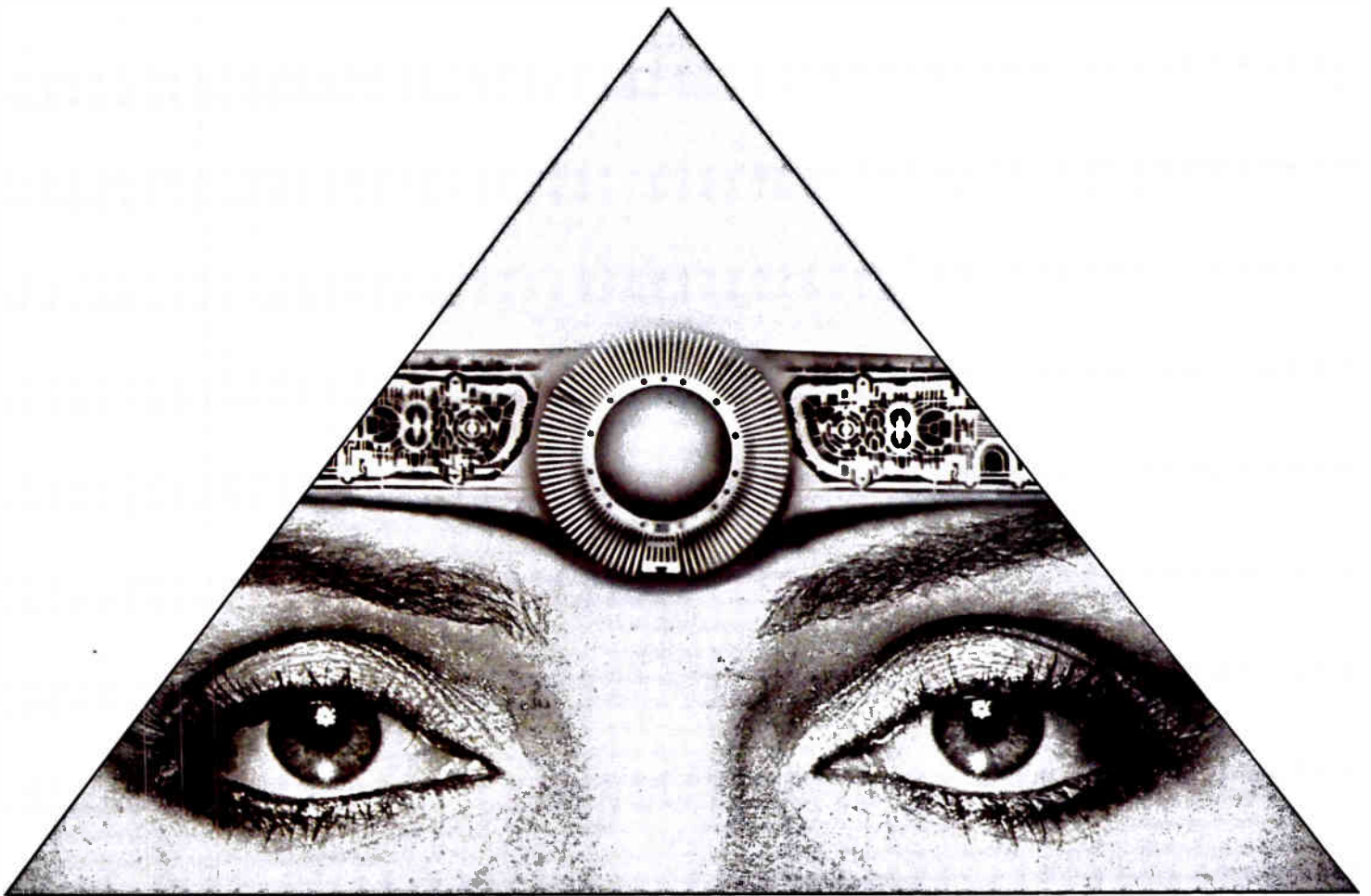

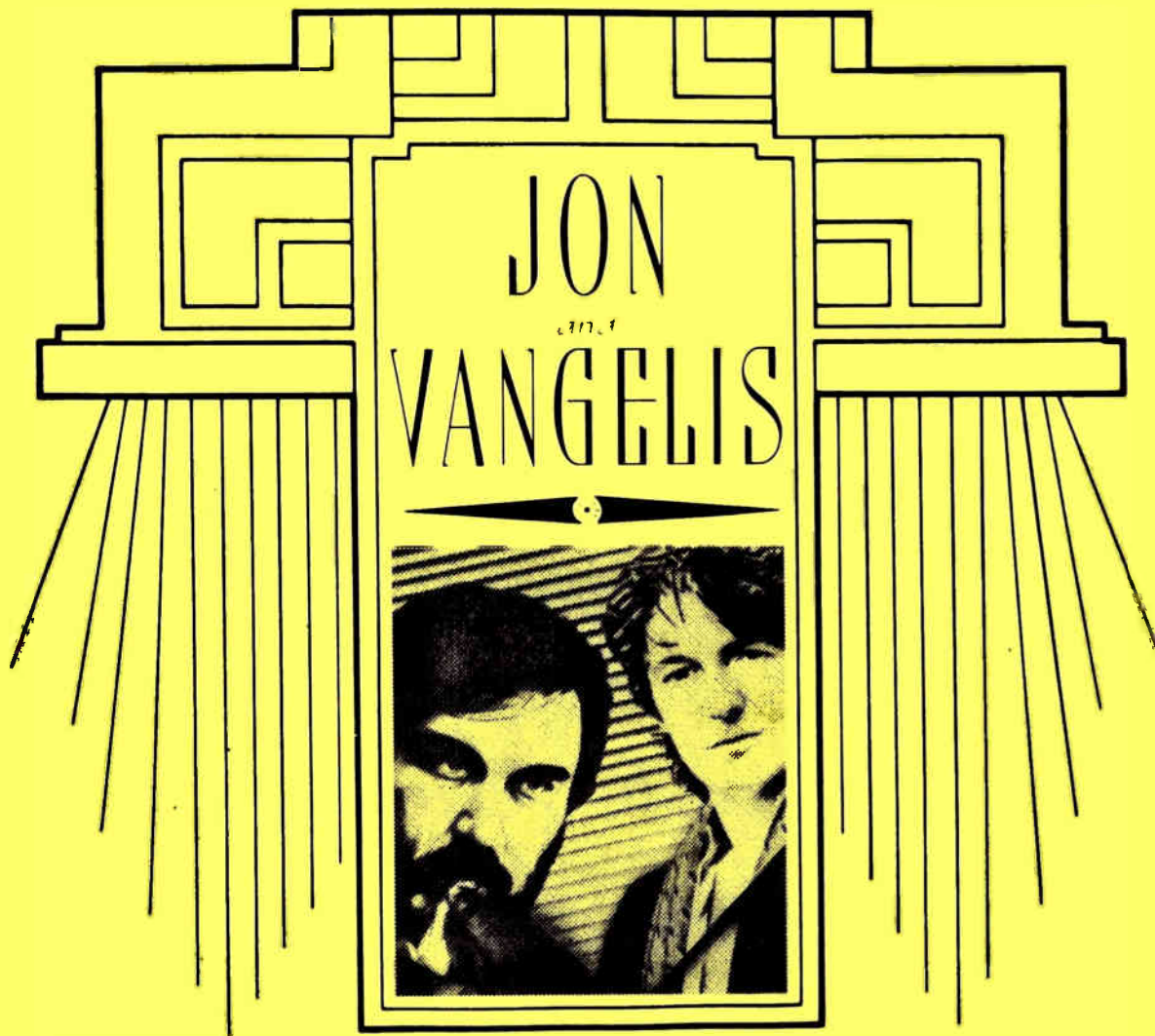

With all of our peer group being brought up on television this is a natural. BUFFALO, WGRQ, Paul Helne: *"Played the Jon and Vangelis for a bunch of friends and they all had a group orgasm."*

SYRACUSE, WSYR, Tom Nast: *"There are still a great number of people into Yes and everyone remember's Jon Anderson's distinctive vocal style. That's why Jon and Vangelis should do very well on this album."*

Question Of The Week

Since record company support is such a hot topic, we asked our reporters what sort of company support they look for on superstar releases, on left-fielders, and where they feel the companies usually drop the ball.

JERRY OSTERTAG, KGON: "We usually get one or two copies of a superstar release, and it takes forever to get backups. Yet, though those are the albums we rely on most heavily, especially early in their lifespan. When an unknown artist has released an album, frequently we are inundated with copies, and 3 or 4 months later, when the album finally hits, you can't find one...I think instore play is critical and frequently overlooked. Merchandising is an area that many companies fall down on. Packaging to interest consumers and samplers are useful ways to get a potential buyer's attention and are often overlooked. This doesn't often hurt the superstar, it almost always hurts the marginal act."

BOBBIN BEAM, WLPX: "Well, sometimes if there is an established artist out there, there seems to be a tendency that the artist will be a hit on its own laurels...In the case of a left-fielders, if it's legitimate, and they promote it, they're intensifying their credibility with radio stations. However, if it's promoted without the backing, i.e., support, local airplay, etc., they're just wasting their money. If they get a feel on a record, they should pursue it continuously so they could put the record to bed. Too many times a record is not pursued properly. On the other hand, it may be the wrong record being pursued...Like Walt Disney said: 'Find out what people want, then give it to them'."

DANA JANG, KOME: "Typically on left-fielders, unless the trades are excited, there is very little done. Acts don't usually tour until many, many months after airplay in individual markets. There is no stock at most retail outlets, and if there is stock, usually it's 2 to 10 copies, giving very little visibility in the store. Also, on the promotion end, there is usually a lot of cooperation from record companies doing promotions on these left fielders, including albums to the disc jockey, contests, and on-air promotions and unlimited tickets to the airstaff if the band is playing in town, as well as easy access for on-air interviews...Typically on superstars, copies for the airstaff are difficult to obtain, and tickets to see superstar acts for the airstaff are minimal. In other words, there is little appreciation by either the superstars or the labels they are on to the very people who helped establish them as superstars--that is the disc jockeys of individual radio stations."

MARC MILLER, WBCN: "Basically, when we add any kind of record, we expect just about the same thing--enough copies for all the jocks, and as much information about any band as they can come with...Companies seem uniformly negligent about getting us up-to-date biographical information on new and old acts."

JUDY MCNUTT, KGB-FM: "With a major release, I should think that there would be time buys immediately to supplement the initial buzz on the record, because the initial excitement usually only goes as far as the station itself. The community awareness takes as much as 6 weeks to build--this is on a major artist (at least in San Diego). If they want to give albums away on the air to stimulate community on-air presence, that's good, but the method of getting that to happen is cumbersome for a lot of companies. Quite a few ask for a letter--we're a lot busier than they can imagine, and I don't have enough time to sit down and write a specific letter. A phone call should be enough. If they need something for their records, they should send a form out that we just sign and send back. On a secondary release, I expect a company to phone me ahead of the release time because when you see something in print in the trades, it tends to reinforce. If they really want to work left-fielders, they should mention it before it comes in the mail rather than after. Generally, the pre-release hype is not strong enough...In the areas of getting, the companies should buy time in markets where the play is strongest, and radio is most committed, and forget the rest. It's easy to find out who they are--just ask or read it in Bill Hard's Sheet."

DAVE LANGE, WDVE: "On the big superstar artists, obviously, I expect them to stock the stores, and I think that they could make better use of time buys on some of those--not necessarily just for my station, but around the country...When it's a new act, I think stocking the stores and keeping me posted on local sales, regional pictures, and if it exists, a national story, helps me to stay on top of the record. In the rush to get next week's priorities on, companies tend to ignore last week's work records, a lot."

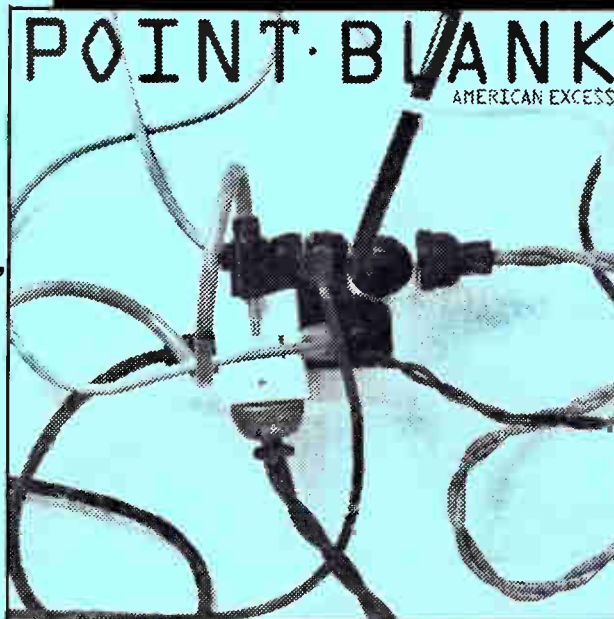

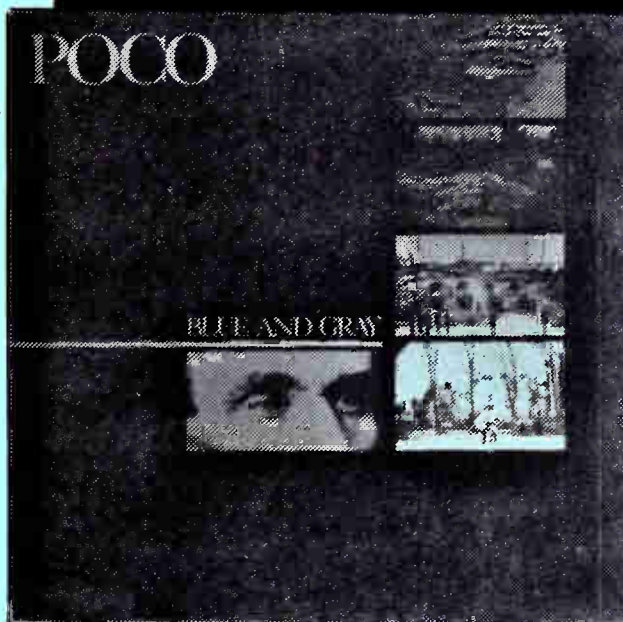

PAUL PAYTON, WCCC: "For a major release, we want it at the same time as our competition, and in enough quantity to be able to do mini-concerts from the album, and for the staff to be able to take it home, listen and get familiar with it in a hurry. For a left-fielder, we want the companies to share our belief, where possible, and support us with sufficient stock and sometimes advertising. The most typical piss-off is when they don't."

DAVE LOGAN, WLAV-FM: "Superstar: The major support is going to be there anyway. I think that's more important on a retail level than on a programming level. On a left-fielder, support is very important, particularly when the artist is working well in establishing a base in the market, both on a programming and retail level. I would like to see more support for breaking acts on a market by market consideration in markets where those acts are happening. That's where the priority should be for follow-up on a station level. What I would really like to see is more involvement with video, cable, or whatever. Also, availability of video for local TV shows, and I'd like to see more unique merchandising, promotions, and live Ep samplers from concerts on developing acts."

DOUG SORENSON, WTPA: "Generally, if the act is coming nearby, or in Harrisburg, it's the usual time buys and giveaways. For anything more than that, it generally depends on the act. With a superstar act, it comes under the heading of 'is it necessary to promote them'. Generally on a left-field artist, they will support it with time buys which will generate some type of unit movement. Personally, I'd like to know exactly who's calling the shots for the band. Sometimes I've heard from various people where 1) they're really behind this band and/or record; 2) it's not a big push this week, so don't worry about it. When you hear conflicting information from different sources, it makes things all the more confusing. I'd like to have a definitive answer on how much support they're willing to put behind certain bands as opposed to the usual. Case in point: Loverboy--they did everything possible to support it. But what happened to Silver Condor?"

FRANK ANDRICK, KSJO: "Supporting a superstar is usually no problem for a record company. The machinery and their minds lends to supporting the superstars. No local promo can afford to be visibly not supporting his superstar acts. Besides, it's the easiest end of the job. Usually bad to middlin' retail support, stockage problems caused in part by the record return situation, lack of display materials (sometimes from budget exclusions), and a general tendency for promotion people to not want to follow through on the dirty work of promoting stations rotation lists on unknown product. Assuring heavy airplay on a retail level in the stores, and sometimes lack of tour or live engagement support, and a general lack of imagination and desire of wanting to break new acts. Although this sounds heavy on the negatives, a lot of promo people in the Bay Area do an excellent job of promoting the music, and have valid enough reputations to be able to stand on what they do. One bad egg can hurt the whole ball game."

JOHN LOGAN, KLBJ: "As far as airplay support goes, and it is very important to have clean vinyl. We have found here that copies of major records are difficult to get, and copies of left-field records are plentiful, which is annoying. I think that's a major shortcoming. The way I'd like to see it changed is that I'd like them sent equally."

DAN BRENNAN, WRKK: "With the superstar release, very often there will be commercial buys made for a station which gives some more exposure to the product. The new artist, if they are appearing anywhere in the area, the record company will make certain we're aware of it, and will invite us to see the new artist. I don't have too many ideas on changes, I think they are doing a fairly good job. One of the problems faced by record companies breaking new acts is the limited number of dollars consumers have to spend and the tendency to concentrate those dollars only on product by established well-known performers. Also, the concert business has not been as good during the past year, so this has limited the personal exposure of new talent."

ROBERTA HABER, WAAL: "Usually, with just a lot of product backing. Very rarely do time buys filter down this far on a superstar release. We usually get a promotion only if the band is coming to town. A lot of this depends on the record company. Some of them will offer giveaways for the asking. Some of them won't even give you backup copies. That's the most frustrating part--the companies themselves. I think that as much support a station gives a record should be equal to what the company gives the station. When a station is really pushing a left-field album, it would be nice if they supported the left field groups. In turn, it's nice to give a promotion to a superstar act they normally wouldn't do."

TOM NAST, WSYR: "When it relates to super groups, concert tickets are hard to get a hold of. The labels don't want to bother with interviews, and forget about giveaway albums. Usually the support is better on a left-field record. They will always seem to have a time buy if you go out of the box on a new artist, or go out of their way to get you something promotion-wise. I think they should make a better effort at getting M.D.'s, P.D.'s and DJ's to see their concerts when in town. That causes a lot of jock talk and excitement. And that is what sells the records. I think they should take their newer artists on the road more for promotional rap tours, just to acquaint the artists with the radio people."

MICHELE ROBINSON, KL0L: "On a superstar release, it's usually immediate time buys and occasionally a follow-up promotion. I'm much more likely to get a big promotion on a major artist. On a left-field add, a time buy comes late in the airplay (usually) if it comes at all. Unless there is a tour, more often than not, there won't be any sort of promotion. I know that you can't do a promotion for every new artist you add. If there is a new band on tour, it's real important to get behind the tour in terms of instore visibility, and co-op support with the concert. If the record company is truly behind the artist, a time buy on the record is added visibility for them. It doesn't make any difference whether a record company buys time or not, and it'll never influence my judgement one way or another. It's merely additional support. It should come really no later than 3 to 4 weeks into the record. If it's a left-field record that has a slow build, and is doing well, 4 to 6 weeks into the record, it's time to consider a promotional package."

CHARLIE WEST, KMOD: "Usually on a superstar release, I don't feel that they have to support a whole lot because, if it's a superstar release, it takes care of itself. Generally with a left-field release, it solely depends on whether the record company want it to happen, and has considered it a priority. Something that generally works in this market is time buys other than those made with the concert. If we were going to get very picky, I would say that's about the only shortcoming I can think of."

MAGIC, WYFE: "The record companies typically support me on a superstar release by getting me the album on time, and on occasion, with giveaways. A left-field is more albums than I can carry. I think they should give equal treatment across the board for all acts."

TEMPIE LINDSEY, KISS: "It depends on the company. I think that the most cooperative company on all levels is Capitol where there is backup catalogue support, giveaway support, advertising support, or promotion support--that company covers all bases. And we appreciate it. My question is: Why do so many record companies find it necessary to cut back on supplying radio stations with catalogues they use on the air of major artists when continued airplay of those records continue to support those artists in future new releases? Thank you."

ED LEVINE, WAQX: "On superstar albums, I expect nothing, and quite often, that is just what I get. On an album that I hang my rep out on, a la Union, I think that if I come up with an interesting, creative promotion that makes sense and is cost efficient, I should get some help from the company. Unfortunately, I have just concluded two promotions with two different albums, and I got absolutely zero from the company. So I went out and bought the prizes myself and had a very successful promotion around the album. If it makes sense for my station, I'll find a way to do it. My biggest problem is when the glamour markets, a la Boston, New York, and Philly swallow up the bucks that could be used a lot more efficiently in a market this size. Sure, we won't sell the units they do, but on the other hand, we can give you a good or better idea if there is something worth chasing in the big markets."

QUESTION CONTINUED

TOM STARR, WOUR: "On a superstar release, it is traditionally harder for us to generate label support. If the record's going to walk out of the stores all by itself, we find that general lack of interest in providing extra help. One notable exception, I feel, should be when a band that has been helped in its struggling days by a particular station comes through on a superstar level...Left-fielders that we get behind are more apt to find active support, because labels are generally aware that when we commit to a new band, we will move product in Utica and Syracuse. I don't think they do fall short."

MICHAEL KNIGHT, KZOK: "On a superstar release, local promotion men usually see it as the deadman record. That is, any dead man could get the record played. The best support they can give that artist is to get the records in the store. You might get a poster or a pair of tickets, but that's about it for a follow-up...For the left-field release, my advice is the same thing. Make absolutely certain the records are in the store. I think it's more important than even a time buy. If you're getting even a small amount of airplay, milk it for all it's worth. That's when the company should offer custom made IDs, interviews, cheap concerts, pull out the stops to get that first album off the block. If the company is smart enough to keep that group for five albums, they might have another superstar."

NICK VAN CLEVE, WYNF: "Generally speaking, left-field releases always receive more support from the labels. Obviously because they are trying to build and promote that new artist...Superstar acts usually don't get a lot of support unless it is in relation to a tour or an Lp giveaway...Nothing major beyond that."

JAY WALKER, KSMB: "Support on a left-field record will frequently come through time buys and album giveaways. Occasionally a promotion of some sort will also be tied into a record...All three of those are done on a lesser scale with a superstar release...Actually, I think the record companies take pretty good care of us."

RON REGER, WNOR-FM: "I usually feel that most companies fall short. I usually have the impression that the people in sales are unaware of what we're playing, and have no communication with retailers to let them know which albums are getting airplay, and which are not. This is especially true of the left-field things that need some help, and week after week I'll call the stores, and they don't have it, and the only place they've heard of it is on the radio...Some labels are especially out of touch with our market. They're in Washington, and we're four hours away. That's not to imply they aren't doing their job. The situation is not set up for good communication."

JIM KINNEY, WTUE: "Sometimes they'll support a superstar act by sending some albums for giveaways, and possibly buying some time...On a left-field act, more often, we are offered support by album giveaways, and about once a month we will be offered some kind of promotion...The thing I would like to see the most is not so much record support, but radio station support with superstar acts, such as album giveaways. Because, obviously it sounds better to give away a big name album. Also, I'd like to hear more superstar interviews."

TIM SMITH, WLVQ: "When we add a superstar, I would hope they support us in the way of giving us advances on the next superstar. Also, I would hope the time buys were there, but that's not really for me to discuss--talk to the sales department...Naturally, promotions, albums, etc. are appreciated...On left-fielders, just to make sure that the record is in the stores and up front, and getting played in the stores...I would think a left-fielder would need spots more than an established act. Also, it's a burn when the time buy on a superstar goes to the Top 40 in town, particularly when we have better numbers."

ROB BARNETT, WAAF: "Superstar records generally support themselves. That's why they are superstars...Left-fielders, on the other hand, are too often touted heavily in their early life, and then wimped on when not enough stations join the party."

JOE MCCABE, KYYS: "On a superstar release, heavy airplay is a given. Sometimes things look so easy for the big acts that the merchandising and general follow-thru is neglected. That's something to guard against on newer acts, obviously, the merchandising. Make sure retail is aware of what's going on, well placed time buys (they do help), and if a promotion works, sure--anything to heighten public awareness. Follow-thru, in general, is a problem. They feel that once the record is on the air, it's time to get the next record on the air."

RAD MESSICK, WFVY: "For a superstar release, I expect superstar support--albums, time buys, and follow-thru, besides lip service. It seems to be the companies consider delivering such product more of a favor to radio than a service to the public, and ultimate merchandising aids--which is what it's all about anyway...On the left-fielders, if they're not happening, save your money. But, if they are, jump in both feet, and help something that could develop into a long-term success story, i.e., Billy Squier...Massive promotion on the first album that made the radio community aware, and on the follow-up, a half speed master cassette mailed early in the Sheet to go with a half speed master test pressing--the works. As a result, the record is happening in most every market."

GREG GILLISPIE, KAZY: "I would expect more from a record company support-wise on a left-field group, or a new up and coming group that we believe in like Cold Chisel, or Blackfoot back in the early days. As far as superstar support goes, I don't necessarily expect it, but I think it's necessary on their part because it helps back up the airplay...On an up and coming group, we believe 4 or 5 weeks down the road they would be ready to spring for a promotion, and back it up with a time buy...In Denver, they may start to support an up and coming band, but they don't always follow-through. Keep the momentum going."

KID LEO, WMMS: "With a superstar, we expect immediate support, and usually it comes about in this market. The companies realize that, with dollars so tight, they have to make as much noise as they can, and they do follow through well on that--displays in the stores, immediate promotions, etc...On the left-fielders, support is expected to come when we actually prove that there is a market for the album. There has to be some sort of retail buzz, and adequate airplay. We're looking for a minor league version of what they do for the superstars. Sometimes we push for it, sometimes they pick it up on their own. The biggest problem we find is when we go on the non-automatic, and it does start getting an adequate amount of play. We find that sometimes there is a lack of stock, or no stock in the stores, and that makes it hard to gauge the effectiveness of the airplay."

BRUCE GOLDSSEN, WRKI: "If the artist is a true superstar, it varies from company to company. Most companies, depending on the strength, use it as leverage for their left-field records, or to continue to spur interest into their other product. The better companies use the latter...I'd like to see superstar product to help get radio stations interested in the company and the other product they have, not to use it as a weapon."

JOSE DIAZ, WBLM: "Typically, it's done by developing a promotion. I would say you'll know a company is behind a record when they come forward with a promo offer...Right now it's a sign of the times, but I wish there was more support for developing acts on the road. That's the missing gap right now. There's no substitute for a band performing in an area where they're getting airplay."

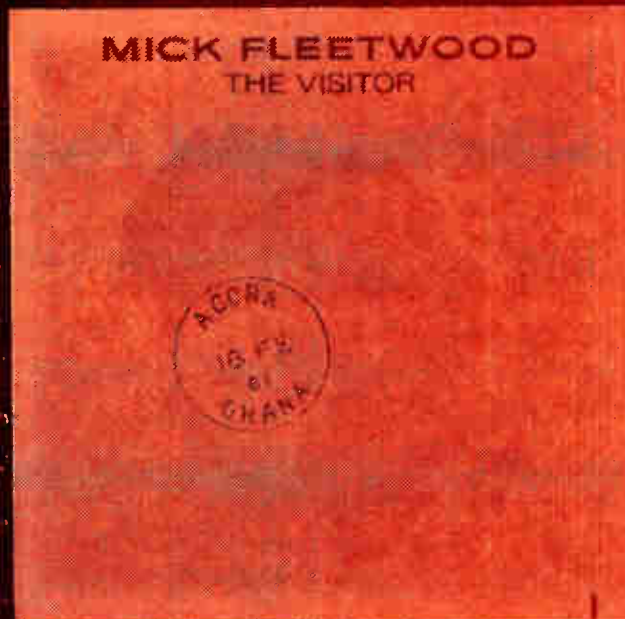

GLENN STEWART, WYMX: "Usually the superstar acts speak for themselves, and for left-field acts, time buys is the usual way of doing it. Time buys we could use more of, and any record company support for promo ideas is appreciated."

BOB LINDER, WDHA: "Superstar releases tend to generate a lot of pre-release excitement. Support is usually sufficient in getting enough stock in the stores, and to the radio station. Occasionally a foul up will happen to get a copy to a radio station on time, but for the most part, this is the exception. We would like to do an album giveaway on the initial release date to further the excitement for the public...On the left-field releases, there needs to be more attention payed to the secondary markets. We're willing to take a risk Advertising support should go to these stations."

MIKE HARRIS, WPDH: "The way they promote a major artist is satisfactory with me. Sometimes the hype on a lesser artist is a little hard to swallow. I would rather see more realistic approaches, like payola."

BUCK MCWILLIAMS, WIOT: "For a superstar band, they take it for granted, and leave you to assume that it's a natural #1 record. With a left-field, they compare its potential to that of a superstar band."

JACK SCHWARTZMAN, WBRU: "They typically support a superstar release by coming in and telling you 'it really rocks' or 'it sounds like their old stuff'. A new release, they'll tell you who produced it and identify a super group that the record bears the slightest resemblance to. Follow that up with every other station in the world that added it. I'd like to see the icons of music less revered than they are. If one of these superstars puts out a stiff, the company should lay off it since they have enough money anyway."

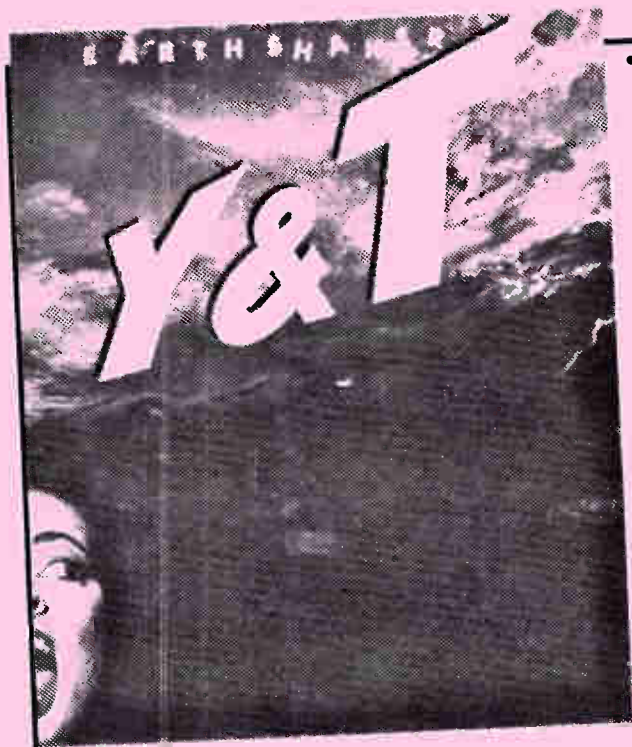
WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "Yawn--what a boring week! No albums of merit to talk about! We might as well end the conversation here! But seriously folks, I pity any new or marginal acts for the next couple of weeks. It's the greatest amount of heavyweights gathered together in one area since the Ezzard Charles/Jersey Joe Walcott days. Where do I begin? One that I find truly enjoyable is the ZZ Top. I saw a reference to them becoming the American Police and that's not too far off! They certainly have developed from simple minded boogie-men to highly textured boogie-men...The Rickie Lee is the one I think that will surface last but stay with us the longest. She, to me, has become the female Bruce Springsteen--not a copy, but she's a supreme story teller about the characters that make this technicolor world, even though their stories are best seen in black and white. I do believe this one has staying power and lots of it...'Heavy Metal' soundtrack is, to me, the best sounding of soundtracks since FM and definitely should be the biggest seller since 'Urban Cowboy'...I heard the reason the Def Leppard album took so long is the group had to wait for producer Mutt Lange. That was a wise move and definitely worth the wait. At this point I do believe that they are the finest heavy metal band from England (with the retirement of Zeppelin, of course)...Journey is the right step at the right time--what more can I say?"

WOXM, TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG, FL M.D.-MOBY: "I'm heavily into the new Gary O' album. I've loved it for weeks but the hot product of the last several weeks has made it tough to make room--but, in it goes this week leading with 'All The Young Heroes'...On the new Mick Fleetwood, I like what I've heard, I love it! I think he probably won't enjoy the commercial success that Stevie will unless he gets breast implants...ZZ Top has a great new album. They've always impressed the hell out of me and I haven't been disappointed yet...Journey, or course, is a natural s-m-a-s-h. Fits in real well, and the phones are as hot as they've ever been for the band...We're waiting for the Alice Cooper album with baited breath as Alice plays our 4th birthday party at the Sundome this Saturday--the first rock and roll concert there...Balance is beginning to move. 'American Dream'--what a song!...Considering: 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack, Carolyne Mas, Def Leppard, John And Vangelis, ELO, Rockets, Dave Davies (perhaps)!"

WLVO, COLUMBUS, OH M.D.-TIM SMITH: "This rock and roll station proves that there is life after 14--and it comes in the form of 15.9. We're #1 12+...The Journey album is pure pleasure. Jonathan Cain's influence is another plus for the band. Very surprised at the Journey letting a new member write so much material...ZZ Top's album has the humorous approach that makes rock and roll run...The 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack is a bonus to radio, no fat on these discs--on Black Sabbath, Stevie Nicks and Don Felder...Also drawing strong phones on the Felder single...Too early to tell on Sabbath but I'm sure the calls will be there...There was much initial excitement over Blackfoot that seems to have levelled off, but we have added 'Searchin' to try for the extra kick...Michael Stanley is pulling #1 phones...Iron Maiden pulling phones, but not seeing any sales increases...Joe Perry is selling the most of all of our light rotation records...Squeeze moving up in the trades, but I don't hear it yet...Considering: Def Leppard...The past couple of times I've played the Allman's single, I get people calling wondering if it's Bruce Springsteen!"

KAZY, DENVER, CO M.D.-GREG GILLISPIE: "I think all bands should try to model their careers after Journey. In the 7 or 8 years they've been together, they've made an amazing progression from record to record. 'Escape' is their best thus far, with every track being solid and they don't appear to have lost their stride when Greg Rolie left the band...I'm real disappointed with the new ZZ Top record. It seems as though they always wait about two years between albums, and this one is h-o-t on the heels of 'De Quello' and is pale in comparison. I think the redeeming highlights of this album are 'Leila' and 'It's So Hard' which would be good 45's...The Rickie Lee Jones is obviously not as commercial as her first, but the texture of the album is fantastic. I think the best songs are 'Woody And Dutch' and the title track...The 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack is another one of those soundtracks that will be good from a programming standpoint but probably won't sell well...I think the Devo version of 'Working In A Coal Mine' is great. Good to see Grand Funk back together, and I even kind of like the Cheap Trick song, not to mention Don Felder which sounds real good...And finally, has Stevie Nicks moved to Cleveland or is there just a Stevie Nicks lookalike roaming the streets that's got the G Man's eye?"

WYSP, PHILA., PA ASST. P.D.-LISA RICHARDS: "Wishbone Ash put on an absolutely incredible show at the Century Theater in New Jersey last Friday night. They played to a sold out crowd and got four standing ovations...Alex Van Halen and Mike Anthony stopped by for an interview yesterday. What a couple of characters. Can't wait 'til they come back...The Police are making their only U.S. concert appearance right here in Philadelphia at The Liberty Bell Race Track with special guests The Specials, Oingo Boingo, and the Go Go's...On to ZZ Top: This has to be their very best album ever. They've got the songs. They've got the energy. They are so damned tight with that boogie spirit maintained throughout each and every cut. I hear at least five tunes with 'Pearl Necklace' and 'Tube Snake Boogie' leading. ZZ Top is the only reason I made it through the heated battle between the Cherry Hill Stiffs and the Marietta A's...Thoroughly enjoyed the Front-Page comments on 'Heavy Metal'...We're going with the Stevie Nicks tune...Judging by the basic feel of the ELO single, it looks like the band will make a major comeback and break through their sugary image. An unmistakable, subtle Beatles feel...Personal faves on the currently on the air: Stevie Nicks single, Kihn single, Foreigner 'Jukebox Hero'...Finally, a belated congrats to my Corporate bother, Alan Sneed, on his great book...Considering: Def Leppard."

WCOZ, BOSTON, MA M.D.-TED EDWARDS: "The Rockets latest is a marvelous record. It's not terribly deep, but the strong cuts are outstanding; specifically, 'Back Talk' and the cut we've started with, 'I Can't Get Satisfied'. It's easy to relate to, lots of energy and the perfect Summertime track...Love the Don Felder single from 'Heavy Metal'. I really haven't had time to explore the rest of the record, but it is one of my priorities. One of the concerns I have about the rest of the package, from a sales standpoint, is the cost. A very attractive set if the price is right. If not, I can see it sitting on the shelves forever...I must concur with Bill on the Red Rider. It's an unqualified MO-FO. We got the advance cassette in the Sheet and have just about burned this one out...I've never really been a fan of Journey. I realize that their music is of high quality and definitely has something for the masses. On their new Lp their sense of melody has expanded, and it's a much deeper record for older listeners. I was really surprised that I liked it so much...Squeeze remains very strong here--the #5 selling album in the city. Although much like the Rick Springfield, there doesn't seem to be a second cut for radio...Tubes look good, slowly building. Haven't gotten the kind of response we need to expand play to other cuts...Don't know why the Def Leppard was a Hard Choice, sounds easy to me."

WMMR, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-JOE BONADONNA: "On the Go-Go's album, we added the single 'Our Lips Are Sealed'--that's bound to be a hit record--it's a wonderful song! 'We've Got The Beat' also sounds good on the radio and we're already getting reaction...ZZ Top 'Tube Snake Boogie' !!! --a h-o-t song from the album, and think it's a great record overall...The highest airplay debut is Foreigner. 'Urgent' and 'Jukebox Hero' leading, and 'Night Life' following a close third. Excellent retail on the Foreigner--already Top 7 in the city, and good telephone reaction...Personally, I love 'Just Like Me' on the Benatar record--the song is a killer...The ELO single is getting good reaction already. Don't think it'll be a Top 40 hit but definitely an album rock track...Stevie Nicks is burning up the airwaves, incredible reaction to the song...Squeeze 'Tempted' sounding great, picking up sales...Blackfoot sounding decent on the air...Foghat 'Live Now, Pay Later' doing well...Ditto Blue Oyster Cult's 'Burnin' For You'...Ozzy Osbourne's 'Crazy Train' is hot...Walls' is doing well from Icehouse...#1 retail is the Moody Blues followed by REO Speedwagon and Pat Benatar and Foreigner both got into the Top 5 retail this week...I want to thank Jon Landau and Bruce Springsteen for allowing me to MC Bruce's opening night in Philadelphia--something I'll never forget--Thank you!"

WMET, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-DAVE BENSON: "WMET adds for the week: Journey, ZZ Top, and Point Blank...The title tune from Journey's latest 'Escape' plus the two songs from the EP are just a start for airplay on the MET. Journey's popularity here is unqualified. They seem like hometown favorites...What can I say about the ZZ Top. Anyone who thinks this is just a Texas boogie band is missing the boat completely. 'El Loco' is two sides of solid rock and roll. 'Tube Snake' and 'It's So Hard' won the battle for airplay... Point Blank's 'Nicole' has done a slow and steady job on our ears. Now's the time for 'American Excess'... Still a definite possibility department: Michael Stanley Band, Def Leppard and Stevie Nicks...A warm word of welcome to all WEA people, headed this direction for the convention. WMET's welcome mat is out for one and all. I'm very excited about a chance to finally meet so many of the industry's best... Counterpoint: Bill, you running yellow dog lackey of the 'full page ad' corporate power structure. My comments stand. A Hard Choice should not have to tread in the tepid waters of wavering consideration... Congratulations to QFM in Milwaukee, good job, good book, welcome to Level 1."

KZAP, SACRAMENTO, CA ASST. M.D.-TIM BEDORE: "The Kinks sound tremendous. I think this next record should be a monster based only on hearing 'Better Things'. It's got some new wave touches, yet it certainly sounds like vintage Kinks...I'm real pleased with Journey. Seems a little deeper before, and that's nice because the rockers and kids love it. It the same time it's textured and refined enough for upper demos...The Vertical Smile Wet Dip Two Step Boogie' is the official KZAP dance, and you can move very well to the 'Tube Snake Boogie'. Seems like the song was meant for the dance, and we're just eating it up, so to speak. Really sounds great - love the record, love the titles, and think it's their best record in a long time...The A's sounds like David Bowie to me. I'm curious to see if anyone else agrees. It's a great stroke/message song. Can't miss with your females on that one...Some of the guys thought the Diesel might be a bit light for us, but I think it's a good Summer song, with strong local appeal for us...Love the Michael Stanley Band, like everybody else. I couldn't be more pleased with his acceptance. If anybody is holding out, you're foolish. Great basic Midwest rock elements that have it all...A good record from Foghat. It will serve its purpose--but don't know that it's going to be a monster...Squeeze continues to do real well. Just don't think anyone could miss with this record at all. No negatives for the rock and rollers...Gary Wright also continues to do well... Considering: Heavy Metal, Joe Perry, Balance, Icehouse."

WBCN, BOSTON, MA M.D.-MARC MILLER: "First off, I'd like to compliment Capitol Records on the half speed mastered version of the Billy Squier Lp. The album has not needed to be replaced since we added it three months ago. We here think that other companies should definitely follow suit...In other news, the 'Heavy Metal' Lp has lots of good stuff on it, esp. the Devo and Cheap Trick cuts. Hard's comments were funny as hell...Carla Raswyck really likes the ZZ Top Lp, esp. the cut 'Pearl Necklace'...Check out 'Keep on Runnin' and 'Lay It Down' on the Journey Lp. They sound fantastic on the air...Also the Ramones album is a solid killer...The Michael Stanley Lp is a real cooker Thanks to John and Mavis for the floating margaritas...The Stevie Nicks single was the most played song here last week. Hopefully there is more of the same on the Lp. Please do not miss the Go Go's Lp. It is wonderful...Also, you know how you can tell when there is a new Kinks Lp coming? Well, another record company releases a Dave Davies solo Lp. Real bad timing guys."

KOME, SAN JOSE, CA M.D.-DANA JANG: "I like the ZZ Top--'Pearl Necklace' is a standout track, also 'Tube Snake Boogie' is strong. The ZZ Top fans are immediately calling to hear more of it!...Journey is a smash, naturally. 'Who's Crying Now' is still the lead track, but getting calls on 'Stone In Love', and look for others to emerge soon. Debut Top 15 sales with 4 days stocking in the stores...Finally went with the A's. A couple of our disc jockeys from the East Coast are really into the sound of the band...Another good sales week Top 30 for Y&T. Getting phones from the cult. 'Rescue Me' is starting to emerge...Most of the jocks are into the Rockets. Too early to tell on trax or sales...Starting to see a dip in Mick Fleetwood sales...Also, love the Red Rider single...I think the new Allman Bros. could cross to Top 40 and be another 'Ramblin Man'...Already getting inquiry calls on the upcoming Kinks album due to play on the import single...Icehouse is getting a few phones but no sales...Pretty steady sales and a few phones for the Pablo Cruise single...Foghat up in play a bit, but no significant phones yet...Another strong sales week for Benatar. Still a few phones but no track emerging yet... Joe Perry phones dropping off...Johnny Van Zant picking up in sales after his recent appearance in the Bay Area...A few phones on Danny Joe--no sales...Squeeze sales slacking but a few phones...Tubes starting to get calls and sales have remained steady...Stevie Nicks still getting a tremendous amount of phones...Frampton sales still pretty steady, but phones tapering off a bit...Considering: Michael Stanley Band, 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack and Def Leppard."

KLOL, HOUSTON, TX ASST. P.D.-MICHELE ROBINSON: "Well, what a week! First, Chris Hensley called and chewed me out for not mentioning his name or how hard he works! Then the Texas Jam with some superb shows by Blue Oyster Cult and Foghat before an audience of 60,000 in the Astrodome. It was great fun broadcasting from there all day! I got to finally meet Janel Dolan and saw Drake Hall and both Tom Owens...Then, the Ramones got added on KLOL! Imagine that! I personally think it's easily their finest album and must credit Graham Gouldman for the fine job of production. He did for the Ramones what I had hoped Phil Spector would do...Some real nice live cuts from 38 Special. Marko, I'd love to have a copy of the show that they came from...Def Leppard--another killer! They're really going to give AC/DC a run for their money, as their vocals are far superior...Congratulations to all those stations who came up with good books this time. A few surprises out there--but that's what makes it f-u-n!"

KDKB, PHOENIX, AZ M.D.-J. DAVID HOLMES: "I think the Rickie Lee Jones is much stronger than the first album. Considering it's in a much more experimental vein. It's gonna be one that's tough to program but is already burning up my home turntable...Also waiting with bated breath for the new ELO album and also the Stevie Nicks. Heard 'Leather And Lace' on the phone, and the duet with Henley is gorgeous... Icehouse will start generating phone action within the next week. It has the mystery appeal that Phil Collins 'In The Air Tonight' has...Love the Allman Bros. single. A real happy Summer record...Some light phones on Balance 'American Dream'...Considering: The Rockets and ZZ Top."

KGB-FM, SAN DIEGO, CA M.D.-JUDY McNUTT: "A grocery list of thoughts. First of all, my suggestion for Question of the Week is to have everyone fill in the blanks of Mr. Hard's Heavy Metal comments last week. 2) Raspberry of the Year award goes to the Savoy Brown Poster Child. 3) Here's another suggestion for Mr. Bill: You could possibly combine the answers to the Question of the Week with the comments 4) The Allman Bros. single 'Straight From The Heart' sounds just like 'Straight To The Heart' by Navarro, title song from their second record. 5) The Stevie Nicks album is very good. 6) Finally, Hey Robin, nice car!! ...I think the Jon and Vangelis is very pretty and very catchy. To illustrate the point, I put the album on first time for Larry Bruce, and as 'State Of Independence' started out, we looked at each other and said, 'Eh, big deal, another Jon Anderson record.' Then I said, 'At least there is no mistaking Jon Anderson for Frankie Miller', and we continued to listen. I was filing records (what a little scenario), Larry was writing memos (as usual), and suddenly I sat down and put my feet up. Larry stopped writing, looked at me and said 'ALRIGHT!!' So--it's catching! As the song ended we were already deciding to play it again for ourselves--and now we're convinced everyone will like this. The slant on 'Mr. Cairo' is the visuals it creates. With all of our peer group being brought up on television, this is a natural. I listen to 'Mr. Cairo' and I get the image of myself sitting in a dark room in front of a blue television screen late at night (in my PJ's)...Def Leppard will be a BIG album. I really think they are the new Led Zeppelin...Talk about bands being 'the New'. I think Squeeze are the new Beatles. I'm not sure that people have kept their perspective. It takes a long time to build a record. How long does it take for a familiar artist, Foreigner for instance, with a brilliant new single which personally I turn up every time it comes on the radio (esp. the saxophone part) But even Foreigner as good as they are will take 6 weeks for the awareness of the community to build--at least 6 weeks to be everyone's favorite song with saturation airplay - absolutely. So you can imagine how long it take to develop a new artist--a couple of cases in point: Greg Kihn, Billy Squier, David Lindley."

KGON, PORTLAND, OR M.D.-GLORIA JOHNSON: "This week's requests, a three way tie for #1: Journey, Diesel and ZZ Top. They're followed closely by: Icehouse and Ozzy Osbourne...Sales: #1 Pat Benatar; #2 Moody Blues; #3 Foreigner; #4 REO; #5 Loverboy...Billy Squier's Lp enjoying its 3rd week in the Top 10. Billy was at KGON and provided one of the more intelligent interviews we've had recently. He even read some news. Thanks to Stan Foreman for bringing him by. Billy did a short but exciting opening for Pat Benatar. The audience knew most of the words and sang along. Could have turned the volume down as we noticed a lot of people were holding their ears. Unfortunately, Benatar is no longer accessible for interviews. Although the audience adored her and got their money's worth, I couldn't help remembering last years performances which seemed much more inspired...In talking to retailers this week, one thing came up I'd like to pass on: when trying to break an unknown band one of the most cost effective things you can do is make sure the stores have a promo copy. They won't open one of their stock copies and in a lot of cases they won't even take a chance and order it if they can't hear it first. The person behind the counter is an important link to the street. If you ignore that person there is a big hole in your game plan...New music: The 'Heavy Metal' Soundtrack is chock full of great songs by: Sammy Hagar and Cheap Trick, Nazareth, and Black Sabbath. KGON is involved in a movie premiere...Def Leppard was definitely worth the wait. The genius of Mutt Lange is obvious right away, but the band deserves credit for coming up with exceptional material and for playing their asses off. These boys will be around for a long time. Outstanding tracks are: 'Let It Go', 'High And Dry', and 'Lady Strange'. The whole album is great...Loverboy is in town tonight with ZZ Top. Our pre-platinum party is already underway this afternoon."

WLUP, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-SKY DANIELS: "Record of the week: Def Leppard 'Let It Go'. This record should be considered an automatic. There's no way you can deny the grass roots level of acceptance of AC/DC's 'Back In Black'. The same ingredients can be found on the new Def Leppard. The tour with Ozzy Osbourne should break them wide open, and if you don't play them now you'll be left high and dry...I wonder how Bill Ham finds time to successfully manage the careers of ZZ Top and Point Blank and turn around and prove himself to be one of our most adept rock and roll producers as well. This band eludes all labels that formerly were cast upon them because of their last two albums...I must concur with Kid Leo regarding Classix Nouveaux 'Guilty'. I'm not one to endorse any movement because I usually end up right where bowel movements do. It is particularly ridiculous in the case of the new romantic movement. The cover is atrocious and EMI's art department ought to be hung, but 'Guilty' is a hit nonetheless...The new Stevie Nicks is _____. I figure all of you will have something to say so I'll let all of you do the talking."

WKLS, ATLANTA, GA P.D.-ALAN SNEED: "I think first of all the Journey is probably their deepest, most mass-appeal effort to date. 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack is going to be an obvious airplay monster for album rock into the fall. The only potential problem I see with the two record set is the lack of mass appeal tracks for softer Top 40 airplay...Def Leppard is much improved from the first record. 'Let It Go' leads will lead here...ZZ Top will sell thru to the usual fans without question on the strength of 'Boogie' and 'Patio'. They have a real decent Top 40 shot with 'Leila' for the first time in a while...We're a couple of weeks late on Balance but my guess is that it will be similar to Silver Condor in terms of its being a great turntable hit...The Friends Of Mr. Cairo' is the hottest phone record I have seen in recent memory--We get 15 to 20 calls everytime the song is played--it's unbelievable!...Michael Stanley band sounds great on the radio, verifying my initial impression!"

RTXQ, DALLAS, TX M.D.-DRAKE HALL: "Fill in these blanks: 1) Overhyped; 2) bummers; 3) the refrigeration and the TV set; 4) you and the boys in Burbank; 5) all of the artists; 6) staying power; 7) unfortunately slept through it; 8) not vomit on my back any more; 9) more. Honestly, I think the album has its moments but overall is not as strong as 'Urban Cowboy'. The past record of animated flicks is not too impressive either. Maybe this one will break the current negatory trend...Added the Rods because I feel sorry for the ugly boys...Love the ZZ Top! Oh, God, this record makes you want to drink whiskey out of the bottle and make out. A great record!! Let's testify here--I love the son of a bitch. It's at least four or five cuts deep. We all know what a 'pearl necklace' is (if you don't, call me at the station) but when will they write a song about a California snowball, a Hungarian rope-job, or a brown bear?...Michael Stanley is no longer Cleveland's best kept secret. This guy has got to have a hit or get a job...Love the Rockets. We're already seeing retail after one week, which is ridiculous...Joe Perry picking up some retail action also...Foreigner is selling through beautifully...Van Halen is kind of showing surprisingly slow retail thus far, as is Tom Petty...Great phones on Diesel, but we're finding a stock problem (which appears to be clearing up)...Silver Condor just played in town and the guys are great. The band is hot stuff. Look for a couple of live tracks recorded here coming to you in a couple of weeks."

WLTX, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-BOBBIN BEAM: "ZZ Top, the three bearded wonders, just get down and have a good time, especially 'Party On The Patio'. Maybe everybody will turn up the radio and listen to them...Journey--Brilliantly executed album! Diverse, few minor artistic changes culminate in a successful sound for them this time around!...With the Squeeze record, we've just seen too much happen nationally, so we're going to try it out here...Some sales highlights: ZZ Top debuts #7; Rickie Lee Jones debuts #13; Michael Stanley Band debuts #16; 'Heavy Metal' Soundtrack debuts #25...Still considering: Mick Fleetwood, Rockets...Point Blank is coming on very strong--'Nicole' is the track. It looks like it's going to go all the way...One parting thought: Imitation is the most sincere form of flattery!"

WXRT, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-BOB GELMS: "Two technical notes here. Anyone wishing to find out what records we've added or the rotations of all the new records in our studio can call a special phone line that will give all that information: 312-545-4900. The other technical note is a brief reminder to folks outside of Chicago wishing to speak with me about music and other things. I will always be here Wednesday between 1:00PM and 3:30PM to take your calls. So if you've had trouble in the past, I believe this will eliminate it...As far as music goes, it's kind of an exciting week. Rickie Lee Jones had one helluva good record. Her songwriting talent has matured beyond my wildest expectations...Check out the Devo cuts on 'Heavy Metal'. That old Lee Dorsey tune 'Working In Coalmine' is a smash!...The new Sad Cafe record on Swan Song is a real good record. In particular, I like the single 'La Di Da' and a song called 'Love Today'... Special mentions go to Joe Jackson and Miles Davis."

KNAC, LONG BEACH, CA M.D.-JIMMY CHRISTOPHER: "The Go Go's came out of the shoot into heavy with both sales and airplay...Joe Jackson is great! Real good sales for that and I'm looking forward to the 'Jumpin' Jive' show this week at the Roxy...Psychedelic Furs are picking up and are in town next week at the Roxy...Oingo Boingo is steady...X is doing fine...We had a resurgence in sales for the Stray Cats... I like the Visage. I will interview Steve Strange next Monday...Also interviewed Eric Burden...Thanks to Kate Ingram for turning me onto the Swimming Pool Q's. I think we might go with that next week."

WAAF, WORCESTER, MA M.D.-ROB BARNETT: "Back in full swing. Thanks to all involved for a good time in New York...I just got the Stevie Nicks album in this morning. It's a beautifully balanced album, which I think will make the kind of album rock mark that Ronstadt was able to achieve four or five years ago, with a very hip factor also in its favor...I was glad to see a very positive reaction last week from stations on the Michael Stanley record. Hard work is repaid with success. Isn't it great to be an American?...We added the Kinks import single 'Better Things' last week. I understand that the new album won't be released domestically for a while but 'Better Things' merits airplay...In the 'You might not have listened department': Dave Davies has a strong rocker on 'Glamour'. We're getting very good listener response to the cut 'Is This The Only Way'. It's harder than you'd expect and feeds the hungry Kinks fans as well...From 'Heavy Metal' we're playing both the Felder and Hagar 'Heavy Metal' cuts. Also the 'Mob Rules' from Sabbath. This is certain to be one of the Summer's...Another new thing garnering mention is 'El Loco' from the Top. 'Tube Snake Boogie' is a bluesy, get-down killer. The trio has come up with some of their best production ever...We're getting real good phones for 'Jukebox Hero'...Also Blue Oyster Cult is solidifying real well...Moved Joe Perry up to heavy this week... The Moody Blues take #1 position in sales...To Jack Schwartzman: It's me. Remember Watitoh. I'll call you."

WYNF, TAMPA, FL M.D.-NICK VAN CLEVE: "Although there was no All Star Game this Summer, we did get an All Star Album. The major league sluggers came out for 'Heavy Metal'. The Grand Funk reunion is surprising, one of the stronger tracks on the album. Donald Fagan is nice, as well as the Stevie Nicks, Journey, and Felder tracks...It could be a case of the who-dunnit mystery. The Allman Brothers truly have given new meaning to the words 'departure of sound'...Three bad-ass hombres from Texas can put a couple more notches on their gunbelts. 'El Loco' is a welcome Summer album as well as a novelty. Phones for 'Tube Snake Boogie' and 'Pearl Necklace' (Could this be in regard to the Penthouse form letters?)...Buzzards' came up with the term 'Pride of Cleveland' for the Michael Stanley Band and it's just that. 'In The Heartland' and 'Somewhere In The Night' should build on the base of the last album...ELO's first stroke of success was with 'Roll Over Beethoven'. They have returned to the formula with 'Hold On Tight'. Congratulations to Epic on the montage approach. There seems to be a lot of strong tracks...Sales leaders: Moody Blues, Foreigner, Benetar, Billy Squier, Santana, and Blackfoot...Journey, this time out, offers the most complete and direct evidence that they are a band who truly can expand their sound and want to build a broader base from album to album. Could be the biggest to date."

KTCL, FORT COLLINS, CO M.D.-JOHN HAYES: "Adds: ZZ Top, Guy Clark, Miles Davis, Joe Jackson, Rickie Lee Jones, Tim Goodman, Jon and Vangelis, and the 'Heavy Metal' Soundtrack...We're considering Michael Quatro, Mary McCasin, Roy Ayres, and Journey...It's sad to see the noose-tightening around Denver radio. I'm afraid Denver's high tolerance for hits will cause withdrawal for any listener who might move out of town. Thank God for KFML, KBCO, KILQ and KTCL. Between us we can offer something other than force-fed pabulum...ZZ Top's 'El Loco' is my favorite this week. The Top has experimented yet refined their sound to a very enjoyable musical experience...Rickie Lee was worth the wait. With she and Benetar in hot rotation, we'll be sitting pretty for a while...Joe Jackson's album is a cut above indulgence. It is artistic fresh air...Jon and Vangelis fall in the same category...Don't overlook Tim Goodman's 'New Romeo'... 'Heavy Metal' will be happening big. We like Devo, Fagan, and Felder... We're happy to have Greg Fitzgerald joining us, formerly of KAZY, Denver. He'll be working nights, 7:30-Midnight, and I'll be moving to mornings, 6:00-11:00AM. You can reach me, beginning August 3rd, from 12 Noon to 2:00 PM, Monday through Friday."

WSYR, SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM NAST: "By far my favorite new album of the week is Journey. People will be talking about this in their current playlists a year from now. Every cut is totally accessible to radio and the band has never sounded better. Our listeners are madly in love with it...We debuted the new ZZ Top last week with great reaction. The 'Tube Snake Boogie' and 'Party On The Patio' are the cuts so far. Hope the band gets around for a tour, 'cause that would bring the album home... 'Heavy Metal' Soundtrack has come out at a great time. When you have Black Sabbath, Journey, Stevie Nicks, Don Felder, and the rest of the gang, there's no way you can go wrong on this one...There are still a great number of people into Yes and everyone remembers Jon Anderson's distinctive vocal style. That's why Jon and Vangelis should do very well on this album...The Red Rider Ep is a great sample of what's to come on the album. 'White Hot' did great off the last album. This one should make them white hotter...The Rods are flying out of the stores here and 'Nothing Going On In The City' and 'Power Lover' are pulling phones. Don't be afraid of this album. You should be playing it now...Ozzy Osbourne continues to sell and deservedly so as the 'Blizzard Of Oz' Lp is, no doubt, one of the greatest heavy metal records of all time...Congratulations to Dave Kane, the new M.D. at WCMF. Dave should do a great job there... 'Rockline' continues to astound me with the great guests and the way they put their show together. Global Satellite Network is fantastic...Is it true Ed Levine uses beer shampoo? Only the dirt-bombs know for sure."

KZOK, SEATTLE, WA M.D.-MICHAEL KNIGHT: "We had quite a crowd at the station to deal with Monday night (and then again Tuesday morning). George Gerrity blew into town to check up on the new and improved Sue Brett. They brought Jim Messina and his Manager, Larry Fitzgerald. Messina played DJ and the discussion ranged from how and where to record certain instruments in Jim's old Ojai, California home, to the edits he made in his new single. This went on for some time until wine tasting became the dominant theme. Our thanks and warmest regards to all involved. Thanks also to WB's Michal Lennihan for services rendered during Sue Brett's hysterical pregnancy...Both Mike Bone and our staff rejoice at the A's now being beamed to greater Washington state. KZEL, EUGENE, OR M.D.-PEYTON MAYS: "Praise the Lord and pass the royalty check!! My head is reeling from the sheer volume of heavyweight material on the turntables and in the mail. It sure will make things tuff for new artists to get a decent shot at the airwaves for a while, but it's great to see the bins full of high quality stuff with no end in sight...ZZ Top's 'El Loco' will stick to album radio's turntables like glue. The Tres Hombres have a real barn burner this time around with enough tracks to keep it healthy for the rest of the year. 'El Loco' boils over with the most brilliant performances of their career. We're covering a 6-track spread. 'Tube Snake', 'Drive', 'Tease', 'So Hard', 'Necklace' and 'Hippy Pad'...Old Ms. Jones how we've missed you. 'Pirates' is immediate heavy airplay item here. Music to fall in love: 'Pirates', 'Woody And Dutch', 'Living It Up', 'We Belong'. Her voice is silk satin and sweet wine on a sultry summer night, and her lyrics are pure beat poetry. She is one of the few artists who actually sends chills down my spine. Despite slower tempos and a more avante garde approach, I think 'Pirates' will become a radio classic after all. To coin a phrase, 'nobody does it like Rickie Lee'... Speaking of brand names, I can't escape the hooks on the new Journey Lp. These platinum playboys bang out hits like McDonalds make hamburgers. 'Stone In Love' has already left an indelible mark on our playlists, and I expect the same from 'Don't Stop', 'Escape' and 'Running'...Joe 'Jiveman' Jackson deserves the brass balls award for his courageous experiment. While I doubt it will be a commercial success, it merits serious consideration. Hard to say how the audience will react, but I'm eager to find out. We're testing 'Water', 'Sympathy Sid', 'Is You Is' and 'Jack You're Dead'. Cab Calloway he ain't, but as a big band leader he's got the goods. Hep cats unite!!...I don't know about the movie, but I do know that 'Platinum' is a heavy metal. From the truckload of top tracks we're keying in on the contributions from Sammy Hagar, Cheap Trick, Felder and Nicks with a special mention to Devo's deluxe treatment of 'Coal Mine'. The Spudboys are still on a roll...The new single from the Bros. Allman is so different from anything they've ever done I had to listen three times to make sure it wasn't mislabeled. More popularly commercial than they've ever sounded. The record should hit the mainstream with cannonball splash...Two records you should not miss in the current glut - Swimming Pool Q's (thank you Country Paul) for 'Little Misfits' and 'Tractor' - sounds like THIS band's been bathing at Baxters. Dr. Feelgood's new one on Stiff is 'Yakamo'. 'Drive' - Nick Lowe's patented pop production style makes it sound like music from the great Compression with compassion...In light of the aforementioned gargantuan glut of gold releases, we'll be dropping some records from the chart that we're still playing just to make room."

KYYS, KANSAS CITY M.D.-JOE McCABE: "The big guns are blazing! We haven't had this much new superstar product in a long time. Question? What don't you play on the new Journey album? The hit machine keeps cranking them out. It wouldn't surprise me to see 5 cuts make the Song Index...ZZ Top has one of the most infectious new albums I've heard in a long time. This little ole boogie band from Texas might look 'El Loco', but their music is primo...For those critics who say radio can't break new acts watch what we do with the Def Leppard. Their last laid the groundwork. Now Def Leppard with producer Mutt Lange will get requests, will sell out, and will continue to climb up the rock and roll ladder...Michael Stanley sounds better and better each time we hear it...Ditto for the A's. Only light sales after a couple of weeks...Gary Wright goes into heavy. I know that some people are dropping it, but we are having the best of luck with it...Foghat sounds good, is selling well, but is not burning up the phones with requests. Where are the commando kids? the earthdogs? the rivetheads?...Blue Oyster Cult working real well...Foghat maintaining...Considering: Shooting Star album."

WRKK, BIRMINGHAM, AL P.D.-DAN BRENNAN: "Moody Blues, Billy Squier, Foreigner, Pat Benatar and still Rush, are among the local best sellers...Just about the entire 'Heavy Metal' Soundtrack Lp is programmable as fine album rock material! We're going five cuts deep as a starter...Good request activity on the new Stevie Nicks single...It seems to be a very strong new album by Journey."

WIMZ, KNOXVILLE, TN P.D./M.D.-KERRY LAMBERT: "New records bringing up the sales chart in Knoxville: Foreigner, Blackfoot, Danny Joe Brown, Squeeze and Poco...Favorites this week include: 'Heavy Metal' Soundtrack, Journey and ZZ Top...Considering for next week: Def Leppard, Red Rider, and of course, the Stevie Nicks Lp...There are so-o-o many albums out right now by the superstar acts that the newer acts are being left behind unnoticed...Thanks to Chris Hensley of EMI for making me notice Bill Wray. Bill is from Louisiana and has quite a following down in the Bayou. We had him play a club date last week-end and we even had a group from Louisiana show up. I guess the greatest compliment came from the Club manager in the dressing room right after the show, trying to get another date. Bill is a super talent and a great guy! If you get the chance to work with him, you'll see what I mean. Once again, thanks to Chris and Bill. Hope we did some good...Finally, congrats to Dick Metter, Alan Sneed, and the crew at 96ROCK in Atlanta for a tremendous ARB."

KTIM, SAN RAFAEL, CA M.D.-BELLE: "I have a friend who is marketing milk steamers. Originally called 'The Magic Milk Steamer', she was discouraged from using the word 'Magic'--the claim being that unless it really has magical properties, it is misleading to the general public to use it and inadvisable. Having learned the literal translation of 'magic', I do not use it loosely. But this is total magic--listeners alike agree--and I have heard no other word to describe what Rickie Lee Jones does. And, no friends, you don't have to be a junkie to enjoy her. It's more subtle and softer than the debut album and exquisitely produced. Rickie Lee stirs up memories of the first sampling of Laura Nyro. Thank God it will be heard out of the North Bay. I'm sure this magical album will find itself in the Top 10 soon, regardless of a lack of a national rock radio airplay. It's a gem!...Roger Lifeset sent me an album in a package filled with goodies so I wouldn't look at this particular album cover. These diversion tactics worked and, as a result, I ended up requesting more of those incredible Aircheck (compilations) for our collecting crew...Kudos to Diedre O'Donoghue for tastefully resurrecting some FM giants. And, Roger, I'm sorry about the album in question but our current bin is bulging with new releases and I don't feel there will be room for it right now...Micky Hart of The Dead came by last week to talk about his new band High Noon. It features Norton Buffalo among other Bay Area notables. Lots of progression and rhythms and you don't even have to be Gary Cooper to enjoy it...After four sold-out shows at the Waldorf, the Dregs are proving to the world that they have staying power. They tell an interesting story of how the album got its name. Uncle Bill Graham was the one credited with coming up with 'Unsung Heros'. As usual, always a pleasure to talk with the Dregs. Also a real treat recently with Pat Metheny's visit. An intense man with a very easy manner and eyes that cut through the bull shit. Wow, those eyes! The show was hypnotic too...I'm enamored with the Any Trouble single. Now, can we play it, Roy?...Finally, KTIM is proud to announce its affiliation with the old Waldorf in San Francisco in presenting Kittyhawk August 1st; and the Stone in San Francisco in presenting the Neville Bros. August 5th."

KMOD, TULSA, OK M.D.-CHARLIE WEST: "As with everyone else, ZZ Top is doing some changing with the times. Being a little more innovative; however, I think after a few listens, everyone will agree it's a k-i-l-l-e-r album...I personally like the Rickie Lee Jones. This is just one of those records that your announcers will have to have the talent to place in rotation correctly...Journey is definitely going to be a record to take them that one step further, especially with the single which is extremely mass appeal. All in all, this one should give them the superstardom they deserve...I'm extremely impressed with the Michael Stanley Band album. He just gets better and better with each release. With a style all his own and many years of experience, he's definitely on his way to the top...Like a good department store, 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack has the best of everything--just take your pick...From what I can tell, most of the songs on the new Stevie Nicks album were written in the Mid 70's and in the last couple of years. With the things that were going on with Fleetwood Mac at those times, you can't help but have good songs...Musically, they're bound to be superb!"

WQDR, RALEIGH, NC M.D.-BOB WALTON: "Don't bother calling me this week, I'm not here. I'm in Hilton Head, South Carolina, at the Record Bar Convention. I seriously doubt that there will be many, if any, adds, but this week is a good one to call and harrass Daniel...I love the Rickie Lee Jones--superb from beginning to end. The only thing that bothers me is that we only got one copy and it's warped. I wonder how many Kid Leo got?...I'm both happy and somewhat concerned about the flood of 'Superstar' product. A lot of good records are going to get left by the wayside. Carolyn Mas comes to mind immediately...And, whose ever idea it was to send cassettes should be nominated for Sainthood. It's just a whole lot easier for me to listen to music outside of my office or outside of my living room."

WFYV, JACKSONVILLE, FL P.D.-RAD MESSICK: "ZZ Top has got to be one of the hottest bands going these days. They've done so well maintaining all the basics that made them so big in the first place, yet they have advanced so far. Check out the guitar on 'Pearl Necklace' and you'll see what I mean. 'Tube Snake' (formerly Tubesteak) 'Pearl Necklace' and 'Party On The Patio' are just as hot as can be...The Journey album is another good example of a band progressing but retaining all their basic roots, and yet just going wild into the future...Neal Schon has never played better guitar, and the leads on 'Escape' are just incredible. I'm really surprised they let Jonathan Cain contribute as much as he did. Great album destined to be one of the hottest five of the year...Stevie Nicks has gotten such incredible phones over the last week that it has moved to instant heavy. She also did a great job fielding questions on 'Rockline'. More companies should put their artists on the firing line and let the listeners find out what they want to know.. After all, they're the ones that need to be convinced to buy the product... Speaking of convincing, Michael Stanley has done another good job. Calls on 'In The Heartland' in just one week are better than any Michael Stanley album I've ever seen...On the 'Heavy Metal' Soundtrack fill in the blanks with these words: decent, highest priced, lack of promotion, the company, Led Zeppelin, on the album, snoozed thru, stay award. What was the question?...Hot sales for the week: Foreigner 17-2. Pat Benatar 12-5. Danny Joe Brown 10-8. Interesting move: Van Halen 1-7...Last, but not least, congratulations to Chris Miller, Joe Krause, Dave Lange, Alan Sneed, Sonny Fox, and Neal Mirsky, all for their great Arbitrons. Where's mine, goddammit!!"

WBLM, LEWISTON/PORTLAND, ME M.D.-JOSE DIAZ: "Journey has never really been as big as they are in the Midwest in this area. We have played their Lps in the past with only moderate reaction. 'Escape' should change all this. The title track and 'Stone In Love' are truly killer kuts. I guess all the work this band has put in over the years is just about to pay off for them...If you're lacking for boogie, there is a new ZZ Top Lp. These guys are relentless, and this new album should live up many a party. Is it true that 'Pearl Necklace' is about what everybody says it's about?...The 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack could turn into a big seller regardless of the success of the movie. Besides, the Don Felder cut, the Donald Fagen and Stevie Nicks are very tasty...After hesitating for a few weeks, I have given in to the hook on Gary O's 'All The Young Heroes'. This is one memorable tune...As can be expected, we find the Foreigner and Benatar both charting top 20 sales in this area...The Billy Squier album is so big around here that it's not funny. Billy is here to stay...I'm very encouraged by Point Blank's development on their latest Lp. It looks like 'Nicole' is on the way to being a major hit for this heartbreaking band...The Michael Stanley album passes the ultimate test. I probably listened to it 10 times since it came out, which I think is a good test of a strong Lp."

WIOT, TOLEDO, OH M.D.-BUCK McWILLIAMS: "Journey could release the lid of a garbage can and it would still sell! The new Lp is as deep as the river. We're on the single: 'Stone', 'Escape', 'Lay It', 'Keep On' and 'Don't Stop'--for starters...The new ZZ Top reminds me of stuff they've done before but it's as catchy as hell and I l-o-v-e it...Is anyone finding success with another track on the 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack? I see a lot of superstar groups but don't hear much superstar product...We're very happy to increase the rotation on both Michael Stanley Band and the Rockets after only one week. Second and third listens reinforce my belief that this is far and away Michael Stanley's best ever, and I go back to the 'Rosewood Bitters' stage...Phones have been h-o-t for new Blackfoot, Billy Squier, Rockets and Foreigner. Even people who grew tired of Foreigner seem to like the new one and it maintains its #2 standing in sales...To Chrysalis promotion dept.: I could go out on the street and beg and get more than the two Benatar catalogs and 15 copies of 'Precious Time' you so generously offered for our promotion; and then you have the nerve to inquire about our rotation on the Icehouse record which we added out of the box when half of our stores report stock problems on that record for the fourth week in a row! Keep your records and we'll do our promotions with a company that will back their artists. You'll soon realize that with all the superstar product out right now, Pat Benatar's the newest of the bunch and needs promoting like all the rest."

WBRU, PROVIDENCE, RI M.D.-JACK SCHWARTZMAN: "Rickie Lee Jones has returned with a s-m-a-s-h! Her long awaited second Lp demonstrates sophistication and maturity without sacrificing useful freshness and spirit. 'Woody And Dutch' is dynamite!...The Ramones Lp is consistent throughout. A happy return to the 'Road To Ruin' sound...Play Rick James! The 'Mr. Policeman' features Stevie Wonder blowing a fine harp...We're all looking forward to the Gary U.S. Bonds Show at Center Stage this Friday night. Some lucky individual will be walking away from that show with a diamond!"

KSJO, SAN JOSE, CA R.D.-FRANK ANDRICK: "I believe it's only fitting to end my last full day in NY talking about my local hometown bands. Journey's new Lp could just as easily be entitled 'Evolution'. This Lp is a definite step further. Anyone accusing Journey of crass commerciality in the past had better go stand in front of some Amp stacks and let this Lp take a few inches off the top of their heads!! With Journey and the Starship so strong these days, I'm proud to say we have two bands who can SCREAM 'Screw you, we can do what we want!' Judging from sales, requests, talk and concerts, it's what a lot of people want...Def Leppard--an Easy Choice in my book, even with blind eardrums. I agree with Mr. Bill, Def Leppard is the class heavy metal act #1!! I see jaded professionals play face-contorting air guitars complete with Townshend arm swoops upon first listen to advance cassettes (and in NYC yet)-while telling me 'THE KIDS will love it, You know you have the real thing'. Upon release of the first Lp, I foamed at the mouth with the Led Zeppelin of the 80's rap. Def Leppard II is the continuation of that impact and tradition...ZZ Top--For what it's worth, the Police comparisons are really applicable. Sure, ZZ Top was one of the best refried boogie bands around and sure they had a real handle on white electric blues music. But this new direction and complete amalgamation of music's past, present and future is the best yet. I dimly recall an article about ZZ about a year or so ago where the band stated their interest in New Wave music and credited the Police, Ramones, Talking Heads and Blondie with creating an exciting real new form of expressionism in the music industry. Well, they meant what they said and did what they meant! ZZ Top refuses to become a dyno-sore of the airwaves. You can't ask for much more than that. Top 20 airplay even before this week's official add...Heavy air action with: Foreigner, Journey, Benatar, Tom Petty, Frampton, Greg Kihn, Billy Squier, Blue Oyster Cult, Starship, Squeeze, Tubes and Blackfoot...All this and two singles that, on the virtue of their one song, have placed themselves within Top 15 airplay. An indication of just how huge of an airplay landslide they cause! Of course, I'm speaking about the new Stevie Nicks and the ELO. I really believe this is the era of the artistically credible good piece of music comeback. Regardless of whatever mega sales a lot of the superstar acts still draw a lot of the actual musical output that was destined for the dumper in my opinion. I'm really glad to see and hear so many rich, boring and self-indulgent artists returning to the 'I gotta live with myself' epic. Diogenese does live again!"

RADIO ACTION CONTINUED

WQBK, ALBANY, NY M.D.-LIN BREHMER: "There has been some apprehension here as to how Joe Jackson fans will respond to his radical shift. Staff reaction has been very positive as 'Jumpin Jive' was our #1 album this week. Phone response has been good from both old Joe Jackson fans and people who claimed they used to hate him...The Go Go's are all over the air as it is hard to ignore a song as endearing as 'Our Lips Are Sealed'...Another great record from ZZ Top is forging its way to the top of our playlist. We're starting with 10 cuts. 'Don't Tease Me' is my fave...Rick Lee Jones will have no trouble maintaining heavy airplay here. There has been a great deal of audience anticipation surrounding her second release. So phones for Rickie Lee have been pretty hot...Tom Petty, David Johansen, Squeeze, and Mick Fleetwood continue to be solid Top 5 airplay items...Other records with staying power include: Buddy Guy, the Neville Brothers, BOC, Psychedelic Furs, Greg Kihn, and AlDi Meola...We're occasionally rabid in our appreciation of the Ramones so any comments from this corner concerning the power and glory of their new record are tempered by our lack of objectivity. We will say we like the new one better than 'End Of The Century' and that we're leaving the album open. Few bands can sell out a 300 person night club these days as confidently as the Ramones do...David Johansen can and we would like to thank him for stopping by to do an interview. His live show was, as usual, amazing... 'Fat Time' from Miles Davis is a killer track for those stations that would touch such a release...Favorite sons Blotto continue to pick up new adds all over the Northeast. Remember, we have warned you that Blotto consciousness is the wave of the future."

WRXL, RICHMOND, VA P.D.-ILYSE GOTTLIEB: "For two weeks in a row Statutory rock from XL102 is #1 retail in Richmond. We're proud as can be and listener response has been fantastic. Also starting to do well in the stores is: Diesel, BOC, and Michael Stanley...Just got the new Stevie Nicks, and it surpasses even my wildest hopes for perfection. 'Leather And Lace' and 'Edge Of 17' are definite projections for next week... Also considering the new ELO single and the Rods. I had the pleasure of listening to an album by Tommy Bolin's younger brother's band called DVC including their rendition of 'Teaser'. The album is really good, and if you're a Tommy Bolin fan or even if you aren't, don't miss DVC. The physical resemblance between Tommy and John Bolin is really very eerie. It's obvious that the band has a diverse personality of its own...The new Journey album is a station and personal favorite. So are Michael Stanley and the Producers...With just a few days on the air the Allman Bros. single is already getting great phones, and the stores tell me they are getting requests. The Allmans are due for another smash ala 'Ramblin' Man', and this could be the one...Personals. It was wonderful seeing Sal 'the Italian Stallion' Ingeme again after years. Hasn't changed one bit!...And in case you missed it, Art Garfunkel was on at 2:05...To Steve Leeds: Okay, so I owe you three phone calls...To Mary Pillinger: Congrats to you and Craig. Day three, and they said it wouldn't last...And to Porkchop: NO NO NO!"

KLBJ, AUSTIN, TX M.D.-JOHN LOGAN: "Whew! Talk about new stuff. I can't remember so much major stuff at once, let alone so much that far surpasses the formula that we've been used to. Seems like just when we got used to it, they changed the formula. 1981 should be remembered as the year of the comeback for sure, but also the year Jr. Walker played sax with Foreigner; the Tubes had a top 40 hit; and Pat Benatar did even better. Even Savoy Brown tries real hard. I'm in shock...ZZ Top has a peach. Smooth like glass, tight like a speedboat, the boogie rumbles, the woogie rolls, and the depth of the album should deep six fans and non-fans alike. The production should be commended and Gibbons and company should be commended for the inventiveness in a restricting and difficult trio situation. It is of course, a natural monster in Texas, but I refuse to believe a limit on this one...The Allman Brothers have a smooth one, too. Melodic and hooky. Frankly I hoped for some all-out depth - Allman boogie, but they need a single like this badly...The 'Heavy Metal' boggler is a tasty treat for radio. Top notch from the bottom up, and Donald Fagan's solo tells Steely Dan's recent story. Walter Becker's solo work will be interesting in light of this. Cheap Trick has some new twists, and the Felder touch is golden on his stuff...Escape they did, I had grown tired of the patented Steve Perry and the predictability of Journey. But this one blows the cork off and Journey's off on a new adventure...I hope that Rickie Lee Jones doesn't have the problem getting her music played that Joni Mitchell experienced. This is a 'artsy' record, but it haunts and sticks in your head like a dream you only partly remember. With the voice familiarity and the long wait her audience has experienced, I think it deserves a healthy shot. Hopefully the quality will speak for itself. ELO has an inside track for sure...When they said 'Get The Hook' I think ELO took it seriously because they are all over the place. The montage is a great idea. I hope it will become a common practice like a TV preview...I must echo the positive comments on Mr. Bill's recent innovative changes. Extremely useful and much appreciated."

WAQX, SYRACUSE, NY P.D. & M.D.-ED LEVINE: "The Journey album joins Foreigner and Pat Benatar in the albums that will be around for the next two to three months. The record is very deep, both ballad-wise and as far as rockers go. Initially, I like 'Don't Stop Believing', 'Escape', and 'Stone In Love'... The 'Heavy Metal' Soundtrack contains a few surprises, most notably the reunion of Grand Funk. Their tune is my favorite on the album and it is getting a large number of curiosity calls. People calling cannot believe that Grand Funk is still around. An album by them right now could be The Moody Blues and Ozzy Osbourne all over again...I know that from time-to-time people have mentioned Point Blank and the tune 'Nicole'. I want to point out to you that since we have re-added the record three weeks ago it has started to sell to the point now where it is #11 in Syracuse, and is a huge female record... Another album which has done well in the area with light airplay on several stations (or is that several light stations?) is the Diesel. The record came in my research this week at #16. How many albums are you playing that are doing that well? And we're talking quantity here! Lenny and Ron Farber deserve all the credit in the world for this one...Def Leppard just came in a half-hour ago, and it's already in the studio. We'll have more on that next week...The Kink's 45 is a smash, and not necessarily Top 40. A great tune...The Allman Brothers 12" is an interesting tune. I'm not quite sure how the old Allman fans will perceive it...Another tune I'm not sure of is the Jon and Vangelis. It's an interesting tune for sure, and I'm going to test it to see what kind of response we get...Retail info: Pat Benatar booms in this week as the #1 seller in town; Foreigner, appropriately, is #4; the Tubes make their big move up to #17, all based on 'Talk To Ya Later'. I've also moved Squeeze up. It's selling very well considering the airplay."

WCMF, ROCHESTER, NY M.D.-DAVE KANE: "Greetings! I walked in yesterday and was cheerfully handed the advance of the ARB's which showed us up from a 6.6 to a 7.2. And Yes!!! We are 4th overall in the city...By the time you read this, we will already have had our second outdoor concert of the summer with 20/20 and a local group Pearl. The first one with Robin Lane drew over 5,000 rockers. Sales leads this week: Foreigner, Benatar, Rush, Tom Petty and Styx...Also Squier moving steadily as is Blackfoot and Moodies... The Adds this week: Journey (obvious) a real strong record. I think the addition of Jonathan Cain was quite a boost...ZZ Top, well sheeit, my favorite little ole band from Texas, is back albeit with a change in sounds. 'Tube Snake Boogie' immediately got calls, so that's the track we'll start with. Anxiously waiting in the wings is 'Pearl Necklace', 'Party On The Patio' and 'Ten Foot Pole'...Def Leppard - even if it wasn't the Hard Choice last week, it would still be an automatic up here. Great record! Do these guys want to be AC/DC or what? Mutt Lange's magic touch continues...First AC/DC, then Foreigner, and now Def Leppard's Heavy Metal kids. The growth they have shown since the first record is proof that they will be a recognized force in the metal market. 'Let It Go' immediately went on, and 'Another Hit And Run' will follow shortly on Heavy Metal! We added: Black Sabbath 'The Mob Rules' and of course the Felder tune has been in for two weeks already...Oh yea, Petty is here with Split Enz on the 28th, Styx the 29th, and the Tubes on August 6th, so there is much buzzin' about. That's all. Seeyabye."

RADIO ACTION CONTINUED

WYFE, ROCKFORD, IL M.D.-MAGIC: "Very proud to announce the fact that Y95 has obtained the largest rating it has ever had in the history of the station in the Spring ARB. We went from a 7.8 to an 11.5. Thanks to all those who might have had some part to do with it...Look for bigger and better things in the next book...I'd like to thank Marvin and Marty for the 'Heavy Metal' party last week. An excellent preview to an excellent album. We're four cuts deep and I can see going even deeper...Journey's new album is just what the band needed. The addition of Jonathan Cain has definitely had a positive effect on the sound of the band. 'Don't Stop Believing' and 'Who's Crying Now' are the two cuts I like the most. 'Stone In Love' is sure to grab anyone who has always liked Journey...ZZ Top's new album is refreshing. I really like 'It's So Hard'. 'Tube Snake Boogie' is also good...The Allman Brothers have been trying to have a hit record for years now and they just might come close with this one. 'Straight From The Heart' went straight on the play list. Already getting phones...Icehouse slowly building...Balance moved to heavy this week. I gotta feeling this one will do very well."

KISS, SAN ANTONIO, TX M.D.-TEMPIE LINDSEY: "Phil Collins. We've been on this record for nearly two months now (maybe three) and every time 'Something In The Air Tonight' is played we get a least six phone calls from people who are blown away by the tune and wanting to know who it is. An interesting statement on how long it takes for a new record to sink into the average listener...Foreigner's 'Jukebox Hero' gets immediate phones. Probably the 'heaviest' electric sound that Foreigner has pulled off so far...Stevie Nicks and Tom Petty is a real dynamite duo...Joe Perry is a real disappointment. Can't dance to it...Mick Fleetwood is starting to get some phone response. People who seem to be in their late 20's. I wonder why?...Foghat could be a comeback...Icehouse is getting more response to a new record than I've seen in a long time...Can't figure out the new ZZ Top album. Don't know where they're coming from or going to...Sales on Foreigner and Benatar are building nicely. Benatar's last album didn't drop off the 'C' 'til last week...Journey is going to be very, very hot here."

WOUR, UTICA/SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM STARR: "With radio and retail still reeling from the almost simultaneous releases of Benatar and Foreigner, the Summer cavalcade of stars continues. Journey, ZZ Top, Stevie Nicks, and 'Heavy Metal' are the icing on the cake. Groove for groove and pound for pound, ZZ Top is the baddest of the bunch. We've always loved to spin the Top and 'El Loco' will be wide open here within three weeks. If next week weren't going to be so heavy for Song Index debuts, I would have expected as many as five debuts from ZZ Top on the Song Index. It may happen anyway...So we've got Foreigner in the driver's seat with ZZ Top riding shotgun; Benatar and Journey in back, and Rickie Lee Jones' stunning new one in the rumble seat...Michael Stanley will prove himself great by surviving this on-slaughter, while others are forced to fold...'Bella Donna' uses all the right people in all the right places. It's like a great movie. Each time through you notice amazing new things, particularly rewarding is Roy Bittan's piano on 'Leather And Lace', 'After The Glitter Fades' and '17'...As long as we've been waiting for Stevie's album, it's still more amazing to consider that some of this material dates back to 1975...If you haven't got the Tonio K. Ep, call Jon Scott. We worked with him back when he had major label affiliation, and this new material is a good indication that it's time for somebody to sit up and take notice."

WDVE, PITTSBURGH, PA P.D.-DAVE LANGE: "A couple of items here regarding last week's Hard Choice of the ZZ Top album. You guys must have been concentrating on the game, since you missed a great song -- 'Party On The Patio'. I know it gets tough in the bottom of the ninth, tied at 8 apiece, but how could you have missed 'Party On The Patio'. I mean, you talk about your classic Summer song!! And these guys were around before the Police. If anything, the Police should be called 'The English ZZ Top'. Everybody on the staff thinks ZZ Top has better guitars, anyway...Other album of merit this week: the Journey. Tons of good stuff here. I just wonder if everyone is going to be able to figure out who the band is? I'd put a sticker on it...With the 'Heavy Metal' album, the ears here give positives to Grand Funk, Black Sabbath, and the Donald Fagan cut...To Dave Benson: I guess we're playing Jon and Vangelis for the same reason that other people in the Windy City are playing Frank Zappa--and it's working. Maybe even better...Good phones for Michael Stanley, and good orders from the stores...ELO is in kind of a precarious position. I think they may have lost what identity they had. The single is on the right track back, but they'll need some good cuts on the album too (from the montage, it may come through)...Allman Bros. is awfully pop, but I don't think it will damage them with album rock...A's are doing fine. Calls maintaining...Tubes appearance in town Saturday should boost sales, which are already at #20...My considering list is non-existent, due to heavy releases guaranteed to eat up space."

WCCC, HARTFORD, CT P.D.-PAUL PAYTON: "We missed talking last week in print due to the New Music Seminar, but did plenty of talking in person to some of the industry's best people. Rather than drop names, let me thank everyone for their openness, honesty, and enjoyable times, etc. While the forums were of varying quality, the people who attended were uniformly excellent...Congrats to Rick Aliberti on his upcoming marriage...RIP Harry Chapin. I had the pleasure to meet him prior to 'Taxi' and several times through his illustrious career. While he was a bit soft for CCC's mainstream, he was very popular in all formats in the market and one of the businesses' true gentlemen. He will be missed...Comments are excessively limited since this call is being made while waiting for the mover. Again, the new address is: 243 South Whitney Street, Hartford, 06105. New phone is: 203-233-4426. I'm on vacation 'til August 6th. Peter Cole will be subbing. Reach him between 3 and 5, Monday and Tuesday, and Noon to 2, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday...And now the Country Paul Fan Club takes a well deserved break down the ah,hall."

WMYK, ELIZABETH CITY/NORFOLK, VA M.D.-BILL SIMMONS: "Another killer album from Journey. Overwhelming phones on 'Lay It Down' and 'Stone In Love'...Very impressed with the new ZZ Top. 'Tube Snake Boogie' elicits instant response...And, of course, the main album of the week is the 'Heavy Metal' Soundtrack. To me the top 2 tracks seem to be 'Heavy Metal' by Don Felder and 'Heavy Metal' by Sammy Hagar. It's going to be confusing to the listeners for sure. I was also impressed by cuts from Riggs, although I don't know who they are...Gary Wright doing well in requests, but sales are light...Beginning to get a bit worried about Danny Joe. Phones are dropping and sales are very light...Mick Fleetwood's initial phones were good, but haven't seen anything since...Iron Maiden a steady seller."

WHCN, HARTFORD, CT M.D.-BOB BITTENS: (Editor's Note: Another big book rolls in for HCN--5.1 to 6.2. Their best book yet. Five years without a down-trend). "El Loco' is right. A strange new album from ZZ Top. Although there are a couple of standard ZZ Top rockers that are a lot of fun, some of the best cuts on the album don't sound at all like the band. '10 Foot Pole' has been the immediate phone call generator, and 'Tube Snake Boogie' lives up to its name. 'Leila' could be a top 10 smash. 'It's So Hard' is such a smooth R&B tune it could just as easily have been done with Gary U.S. Bonds on vocals...ZZ Top is a solid album, but Album Of The Week status has to be awarded to Journey. The single is the most beautiful song currently on rock radio. Add to that songs like, 'Still In Love', 'Don't Stop Believing', and wrap it up in a spacey package, and it can't possibly miss...Just heard the new Carolyne Mas, which sounds great on first listen. First two cuts on side 1 are real strong...Note to Judy McNutt: My point of two weeks ago concerned the seeming inconsistency of some programmers who give the same amount of praise to a new Foghat as, say, a new Foreigner album, when the two are not really of comparable quality. Perhaps it was unfortunate that I used specific examples to make the point, since there seems to be an abundance of fans out there in radio land for the two albums I mentioned. As far as sounding like a jerk is concerned, I'd rather express a little healthy cynicism once in a while rather than sound like a broken record. Even if I'm wrong, better an occasional foot-in-mouth than recycling the same old comments for every new album that comes along. I'm sure you will agree that occasional negative comments have just as much right to space in this Sheet as do the positives."

WQFM, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-MIKE WOLF: "Everybody's on cloud nine here at QFM this week, savoring the results of the new ARB report WQFM jumped from a 4.3 to a 6.0 in total persons 12+. Even more satisfying though was the complete dominance of WQFM in our targeted demo of adults 18-34. We obliterated our competition amassing a 16.9 share in sales 18-34 and a 9.3 share in females...The deluge of good new music continues unabated this past week...The 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack is a knockout collection of steaming album rock tracks with the Black Sabbath, Stevie Nicks, and Don Felder songs...ZZ Top's Texas Boogie fits in real good with the hot, humid weather. The 'Tube Snake Boogie' is a monster song and 'Party On the Patio' is already eliciting positive phone reaction...Poco's 'Widowmaker' is a great daytime record with enough guitar work to please even the staunchest rock and rollers. Good sales and unsolicited phone response made it easy to add that one...There's no doubt in my mind that Milwaukee will fall head over heels in love with the new Def Leppard release. 'Let It Go' is the track...What can I say about Journey's new album that hasn't been said already? 'Don't Stop Believing' has that very up positive feel to it, very reminiscent of 'Feeling That Way Anytime'. Let's waive the five year waiting period and induct these guys into the rock and roll hall of fame now!"

KZEW, DALLAS, TX M.D.-JANEL DOLAN: "Friday I saw BOC, Pat Travers, and Johnny Van Zant. At the end of the concert, Todd Rundren came out with Pat Travers and jammed with BOC--the crowd went wild. It was good to see Jimmy Del Balzo of Polygram (again) and of course, I was very happy to see my friend Pat again...Then the Texas Jam the next day to see REO, Heart, Foghat, BOC, and the Rockets. It was a big success...I flew home to do my show and go to see Todd Rundren at the Agora. Todd soldout two shows over the weekend, and Sunday night was one of the finest concerts I've seen in a while. Afterwards the vibes were so good as people were smiling, opening doors for each other--a very positive concert...As far as albums go, I love the new Journey. Steve's vocals continue to amaze me...Foreigner's incredibly perfect format for a rock album. Quality throughout...ZZ Top is so very fine. They're the national band of Texas. I think their latest is their most entertaining album--and entertaining is the word. It shows real progressive attitude and talent...Programmers should pay special attention to Icehouse. It deserves any and all attention it might be getting. I think it's good image maintenance for album rock stations."

WTUE, DAYTON, OH M.D.-JIM KINNEY: "Adds this week are Journey, ZZ Top, 'Heavy Metal', Poco, Joe Perry, and The Allman Brothers 45...Last week Squeeze, Michael Stanley Band, and Stevie Nicks 45 were the adds...Journey album and Stevie 45 are by far the best of the lot. Stevie Nicks is definitely a #1 single... 'Escape' could be Journey's biggest album yet. 'Open Arms' sounds like a hit single but we're gonna play 'Dead Or Alive' and 'Don't Stop Believing' in addition to the two on the Ep. There's only one tune I think is not great... 'Pearl Necklace' is the best on ZZ Top. We're on that, 'Tube Snake Boogie' and 'Patio'. Do you know what a pearl necklace is? They don't really go into detail in the tune-but ask your nearest corner pervert. Once the listeners find out, word is gonna spread like wild fire... 'Heavy Metal' has three great songs; Felder's two and the one by Stevie Nicks. Sammy Hagar's and maybe a couple others are okay and the rest can be filed. It'll take a helluva movie to make it a big album...Denise George busted her famous butt to get us on Poco. 'Widowmaker' gets the nod... 'BuzzBuzz' is the only thing we hear on Joe Perry, but it'll create some talk...The Allman tune is a hit and even though the diehards will bum-out, I'd rather see that tune a hit than an underrated 'Enlightened Rogues' fail."

WGRO, BUFFALO, NY M.D.-PAUL HEINE: "ZZ Top - blow your top on this mother. Smoking authentic America rock & roll in the fine Texas tradition. My God, it's got everything. Hot licks, super production, gutsy vocals, a ballad, even a Farfisa organ...Played the Jon And Vangelis for a bunch of friends, and they all had a group orgasm. It is one of the more unusual records out now. I've looked at it, and we're considering it for next week...Love the varied textures on the Journey. Nice harmonies, strong hook, hot guitar playing...A handfull of hits. You'll find them all on the new Journey album. A nice balance of material between the traditional Journey ballads and some hot Summer rockers...If you haven't heard yet, the Buffalo advance ARB shows 97-ROCK E-X-P-L-O-D-I-N-G from a 6.0 to a 7.6. We're #4 in the market and the celebrating has just started...The Tubes concert was here last week, and it was a total blow out. Theatrical visual, outrageously absurd, and very musical. This is one band that gives their fans their money's worth. Thanks to Fee Waybill for the interview and Terry Van Dyke for his hospitality...Sales: Foreigner and Benatar debut at #1 and #2 in retail, kicking the Moodies down to #3, Petty hanging in the Top 10, Van Halen dipping slightly, Greg Kihn selling thru, Iron Maiden in the Top 20 on the strength of their concert here last week...Top 20 sales: BOC, Top 25 on the Tubes."

WLAV-FM, GRAND RAPIDS, P.D.-DAVE LOGAN: "It's been a hell of a long time since I reported 9 different adds, so I'll do my best to keep my comments concise. Naturally I'm in agreement with everyone on Journey as a wonderfully strong album...Ditto on the 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack, where we're more or less 'centering' on six cuts. We're particularly impressed with the Sammy Hagar cut written with Jim Peterik, a Chicagoan who eventually will let fame catch up with him. Roy Thomas Baker sounds like the final touch Sammy needs to put him right up there with the majors. Baker's work on the Cheap Trick tune is particularly impressive. Other cuts we're banging include: Don Felder, Nazareth, Black Sabbath, Devo, and even Grand Funk Railroad...Just a couple of weeks ago we were all bemoaning the relative absence of female artists in the spectrum. This week Pat Benatar is #2 in sales and two absolute monsters, Stevie Nicks and Rickie Lee Jones are waiting in the wings. What could really be said about Stevie that hasn't already been hyped into the ground? The two lead cuts for us beyond the single are 'Think About It' and 'How Still My Love'. The duet is nice, but I liked it better with Waylon and Jessie. Still can't remember when I've enjoyed Don Henley's voice more...The one that really slays me is Rickie Lee. As Joni Mitchell strolls her way toward a more distant vision, here comes Rickie Lee moving right in & covers her abdication with the album audience even more so than Stevie Nicks. I say that because of her totally unique style of writing and arranging; We're focussing on 'Woody And Dutch', but I can't get the single out of my head. This album is going to become a significant landmark for the 1980's...Despite all these heavies in flight, I can't let the Tim Curry album pass by without a salute. Tony and I just finished digesting the whole thing, and this sucker is going right in without a blink. His last album 'Fearless' remains a BIG hit here. And this album will take its case even further, or is that Frank further?...Final thanks go out to two people I never get tired of hearing from: Robin Wren and Sean Coakley. Sean, thanks for the ahead of time considerations above and beyond the calls of hipness. If someone doesn't make Robin Wren a Lifestyle Consultant for the 80's, we're missing a great opportunity to further ourselves and our ever wavering images. I mean, this guy is a beacon for reality...P.S. Congrats to my buddy Mr. Lange on the great book...And John McGhan get well soon. You leave me in stitches...Personal to Bill: Your analogy of ZZ Top to the Police is precious. Billy Gibbons stands revealed as a legitimate Mo-Fo. My favorite surprise of the year and in immediate 5 cut heavy rotation."

WDIZ, ORLANDO, FL M.D.-MIKE LYONS: "ZZ Top is definitely the perfect record for the Summer. Kickass, good-time-party rock and roll...I think the 'Heavy Metal' is going to be a big phenomenon. Haven't seen the movie, but I bet it follows the path of Urban Cowboy (minus the cowchips and Debra Winger's smirks), and that the Soundtrack makes more money than the movie...The Stevie Nicks sounds excellent...The Journey track could be a great single if Elektra can place it between whatever Columbia releases as the follow-up to 'Who's Crying Now'... Cheap Trick with Roy Thomas Baker sounds real good too; just like 'Surrender', and everybody sang that during the Summer of '78...Congratulations to Sneed and Mirsky and we're waiting for ours on August 3rd."

WLIR, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-RAY WHITE: 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack is h-o-t stuff! Urban Cowboy was not our cup of tea, but 'Heavy Metal' is right up our alley. My immediate faves include: Devo, Blue Oyster Cult, Black Sabbath, and of course, Mr. Fagan...If you're looking for the next AC/DC, go no further than the new Def Leppard record--these young guys are scary! I don't think anyone expected the follow up to be this good...Thanks to Mark Cooper for the pre-release on the Grinder Switch. This could be an important one for them...The Allman's single has got the phones buzzin...The Rickie Lee Jones record is going to be work...Thanks to David Johansen for a fine radio concert...Pat Metheny stopped by and chatted about his music and amazing career. Pat is the best...We're still cleaning the rubbish from the Van Halen invasion. Alex and Michael of the group stopped by for a couple of hours last week-end and flipped out on-air jock Larry Dunn with loads of dirty jokes and craziness. Thanks Stu...The Go-Go's and Balance both on their way to heavy."

WDHA, NORTH JERSEY G.M.-BOB LINDER: "I admire Bill for taking a gamble on last week's Hard Choice! Not many people put their credibility on the line like that! 'The Friends Of Mr. Cairo' just might be a totally different and very big summertime hit for Jon & Vangelis. It's gonna take time and everyone's help! I've played the record for several friends not in the radio or music business, without saying anything about them. On the third day, everyone suddenly asked who it was. Most guessed Jon Anderson, so it has got a good familiarity base to start from and a good stereo production. It's interesting enough that very few listeners will be put off if it's properly presented...Good stereo production is more important than ever today with the millions of new personal stereo (Sony Walkman) listeners everywhere. With this in mind, let me urge Record Companies to follow Capitol's lead in making special high quality cassettes available to programmers preceding major album releases. If we show our interest in the higher quality, maybe someday record execs will find the technology and value to expand that higher quality to the poor consumer's tapes...On the subject of major album releases. May we humbly suggest a solution for Record Companies, upset about unplanned advance airplay--Contact the G.M. and P.D's first--let them know the planned release date and time. Tell each one they will get an advance copy if they promise to wait. If they break the promise, what can they say when they get the next major release after the others who kept their promises! Most pre-released airplay happens from stations who get a copy from the performer or management company. If every major station already had a copy and was waiting, the problem would disappear. This policy would develop a much better radio/record relationship, based on trust...Last week's NY party premiering the new 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack with film clips, was great, but it took some home stereo listening (here again, the advance cassette was extremely valuable) to fully realize the tremendous quantity and quality of the music. It's now in heavy rotation at WDHA. We especially recommend the Grand Funk get together on 'Queen Bee', Don Felder and Sammy Hagar's version of the title cut; Devo's real catchy 'Working In The Coalmine'; Stevie Nick's 'Blue Lamp'; and Donald Fagan's 'True Companion' are good, although I'm not sure how they fit into 'Heavy Metal'. But, after all this, great songs from: Cheap Trick, Nazareth, Black Sabbath, Journey, and Blue Oyster Cult and you've got a hell of a two-record set for any album rocker to enjoy...Adds: 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack, Journey, Ramones, Jon & Vangelis, Go-Go's, Rickie Lee Jones, Carlyne Mas, and Beach Boys melody...Sales: Moodies, Pat Benatar, Blackfoot, Styx, REO...Recurrent: Tom Johnston, Silverado, Steve Winwood, Jefferson Starship and Syl Sylvain."

WPDH, POUGHKEEPSIE, NY M.D.-STEW SCHANTZ: "Stop--stop--stop--Too much music! What's a M.D. to do? Where do I begin? Well, out of all the releases to come out this week, one stands out as the best-- That is the third album from Carlyne Mas. It is slickly produced and I think will be the one to break her. Better than Benatar...Speaking of women, the long-awaited second album from Rickie Lee Jones was well worth waiting for...ZZ Top boogies again, even if it is a 'Tube Snake Boogie'...Lots of phones on the Ramones. The track is 'My Baby's Been Taken Away By The KKK'...For the upper demos, it's Robbie Patton--nice mellow stuff...The new Journey album will do well. I think it's the best album to date. They have indeed escaped from the musical trap they were in! Sure to do well here and just about everywhere...Hooray for the 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack. Lots of stuff. I don't know what to pick but the Grand Funk and Cheap Trick tracks stands out at this point. And a special thanks to Black Sabbath for an under 3 minute song...Love the ELO single...Alice Cooper gets weirder and weirder but then again, he is the kind of weirdness...The Allman Brothers go pop. What will happen there, I don't know...Pat Benatar went straight to the Top this week with BOC right behind and Foreigner is making inroads...Till next time, be good!"

WGIR-FM, MANCHESTER, NH M.D.-KAREN ANDERSEN: "The new Allman's single goes further in the mass appeal direction than previous tunes like 'Angeline' and 'Mystery Woman' hinted at. 'Straight From The Heart' should be a big Top 40 record. I never thought there would be Doobie-esque harmony on an Allman record...How can an album like 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack miss with bands like Black Sabbath, Blue Oyster Cult, Journey, and tunes by Don Felder and Stevie Nicks? It's bound to be around for a while (Bill, I still have a few more blanks to fill)...The ZZ Top album has a different sound. The vocals seem to be buried a little more than usual, but the music fits in. The beat is the message and this Lp has it...We'll go with 'Tube Snake Boogie' and 'I Wanna Drive You Home'...Thanks to Debbie D. for rising early in the morning to hand deliver ZZ Top and Rickie Lee Jones. Debbie, I owe you a box of donuts!...Congrats go to Epic for the ELO montage. Besides the single, we'll use 'Escape' and 'Don't Stop Believing'...This past weekend we did the second annual ROCK 191 Easter Seals Car Show co-sponsored with Northeast Machines and Customs. This year's show was more successful than the last and we netted over \$2,000 for Easter Seals...Adds: 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack, Journey (into medium), ZZ Top, Savoy Brown, the Allman Brothers 12", the Balance 45...Conversions: Michael Stanley into medium; Foghat, Gary Wright, Blackfoot into hot...Sales: Pat Benatar, Billy Squier, Moody Blues, Ozzy Osbourne and Santana."

KFML, DENVER, CO. P.D.-IRA GORDON: "Adds: Rickie Lee Jones, ZZ Top, Journey, Jon and Vangelis, (even more accessible than their first collaboration); Roomfull Of Blues, Ena Kahle, Brian Auger, 'Heavy Metal' and the 45 from the Allman Brothers, ELO, Any Trouble, and both singles from Department S, on Stiff Records... I pin all my hopes for the future on Department S. Hopefully an album will follow...CBS please, please, please, don't let the Sinceros die a horrible death. Work it and it will succeed...Neville Brothers, Bad Manners, and Joe Jackson finding unexpected success here."

KKRQ, IOWA CITY, IA P.D.-MARK VOS: "This week's Silver Sow award goes to that little ole' band from Texas and the 'Elo Loco' album. 'Lelia' should be a hit but we like the raw energy of 'Tube Snake Boogie' the best...Wiz, Laurie, and Dave will be happy to see the Thunder add this week. I was just starting to hear 'Can't Hold On' when an account executive applied the necessary peer pressure for the add. It now looks like it could work for us with some light sales the second week...It may be too late now but for those of you who are out on a limb with the Union album, let me suggest you refocus on the 'Next Stop, London' cut and lay back on the spastic 'Mainstreet' track. 'London' has a great guitar hook and is generating requests for us...As reported three weeks ago, we tried our best to allow Alice Cooper the privilege of becoming the first famous pig-tosser, but we couldn't come to terms. I went to the concert anyway and feel it my professional duty to warn those of you who have Alice coming to your town, that he now does a concert--not a show. He could have used those pigs to replace the guillotine. But what the hell?...Being an all time Allman Brothers fan--the new Ep was a little hard to swallow at first. After a half dozen listens it starts to fall right into place. Excellent vocal harmony...Rick Springfield is coming to a theater in town this Friday. Should be a great show. His record is #6 in sales. Better late than never...The following night Eric Burden will appear in Fresno. He's back after two sold-out shows at a local night club. He did an excellent job. His voice, believe it or not, sounds just as good as it did in his prime...Fresno's looking forward to the new release from the Scorpions. We are the Scorpion capitol of the U.S. They probably sell more per capita here than anywhere."

WKWF, KEY WEST, FL P.D.-RIK MAYBEE: "Adds: Rickie Lee Jones, ZZ Top, Robbie Patton, Jon and Vangelis, Go-Go's, the 'Heavy Metal' soundtrack, Dave Davies, Sad Cafe, and the Darts...Singles from: Red Rider, and the Allman Brothers...The 'Heavy Metal' collection is a gem. Loaded with goodies...Anybody who didn't get to Dave Davies should try 'Try Again'. The reaction was awesome...Onto music. 'Heavy Metal'--word is that the movie is uncanny. Luckily the music isn't. Don Felder's tune is the cut we're playing. Joe Jackson's 'Jumpin' Jive' is easy to work with, and novel enough for all demos to enjoy...Top retail: Benatar, Moodies, Foreigner, and Billy Squier...Busboy Victor Johnson stopped by for an on-air chat and Aynsley Dunbar discussed his illustrious career and the Jefferson Starship on the airwaves...Guaranteed Summertime thirst quencher: Icehouse. Mucho requests, and in at #16 retail this week."

For those of you who don't, all I can say is he's got the strength of two men, is tall enough to play pro basketball, has the drive of a dozen Harley Davidson's, and a heart of gold...As far as records go, I really don't know where to begin...Dylan fans, get ready. Just returned from London with Bob's first interview in light years, done with Dave Herman from WNEW-FM and it's major. Also, know that his new Lp, scheduled for August, is quite special, and has everything from rock and roll Dylan to some ballads that will tear your heart out. Enough for now--we'll tell you more later...Joe Perry is growing by leaps and bounds. This record has great trax through and through. Right now 'Buzz Buzz', 'East Coast West Coast' and 'Listen To The Rock' are happening very big...BOC is #1. The single comes this week, and is already burning at Top 40...The P-Furs destroyed Chicago. The band did two sell-out shows, leaving kids standing around the block. Note: The club is 21 and over, and this demo is not even the band's main audience. All this interest, and their real fans couldn't even get in. They also did an instore which was so jammed they had to stay all afternoon. For those who know, be happy. For those yet to be conFURmed, better find out now so you can say you were there in the beginning...Silver Condor is on the road and blowing people down. Call any market they played in and ask anyone who's seen them (right, Drake?). This band will be a major force in music. 'You Can Take My Heart Away Tonight' brings top 5 phones. I repeat, this is not the case of a new band whose on the road getting it together. This band is THERE...We have a lot of good records coming: Rachel Sweet, Tim Goodman, Larry Jon McNally--these three already having singles success, and the Whiteford/St. Holmes Band which you are not ready for. If 'Sharpshooter', 'Whiskey Woman', and 'Shy Away' are not three of the best trax you've heard all year, I'll quit promotion and start the Friday Morning Rap Report...Hello to Jack Snyder, I miss the mighty MET, and yes, I agree, the Journey album could be THE record of the year."

RECORD ACTION CONTINUED

ROBIN WREN, EPIC (213-556-4909): "I figured this week I would slow down, get out of my car, and do comments. Thanks for all the calls. When you come to town, we shall cruise the Strip together...Ozzy is happening in a big way. Top 5 in Chicago, Seattle and Los Angeles and doing great in all the other markets across the country. In fact, as I sit here, it just went gold...Balance is the most refreshing sound to come along in a while. 'American Dream' is the lead track for album rock. It's just a great album...REO just went gold in the L.A. branch and this must tell you that this is the hottest album of the entire year. Plus, Epic has released a great live 12" of 'Don't Let Him Go' and 'Keep On Lovin' You'...Danny Joe Brown is starting to sell. Keep in mind that three or four weeks of airplay does not mean that an album is a stiff, or just because it's not selling, it's not a saleable record. With the flood of superstar albums out now, a new act is hard to get early sales on. Even with a Danny Joe Brown who has the following of the Molly Hatchet Band, it's still tough. I hope radio does not penalize a new act just because it doesn't sell right away...The Lp of 1981 that gets the 'I Won't Go Away Award' is Jim Steinman. The single is breaking big, and has bullets all over the charts. Even more of a bonus, he's a great guy. You must support his Lp even more because you have played it for weeks and it won't go away. Sales are starting to come through in a big way...To all of the radio stations west of the Mississippi, check out David Johansen because this is not an East Coast record. He is on the Pat Benatar tour for 55 dates...There's a great Dan Fogelberg coming, plus an outstanding rock 'n' roll Billy Thorpe album. With Ray Anderson behind it, and the entire Epic staff, we will break Billy Thorpe like he should have been broken a long time ago...Don't forget the live Ozzy track 'Mr. Crowley' and the previously unreleased 'You Said 't All'. These tracks are gonna start burnin' up the radio...ELO comes to you July 30. It's an incredible album and album radio will definitely love the ELO album...To Judy McNutt: If you do not now know what's up at Epic, then what's up?"

JOHN BRODEY, B.A.P. (617-944-0423): "The New Music conference awards are finally in. The results: Best haircut: R.White; Fewest embarrassing moments while serving on a panel: C.Kendall. Highest blood pressure: Bruce 'Mother Fucker' Harris. Lowest blood pressure: M.Babineau. Nicest person: S.Costello. Best shape: Bill Hard. Worst shape: L.Bronstein. Most hamburgers bought: L.Bronstein (thank you). Tallest: Sky Daniels. Most time spent in the bar--a tie: (She knows who she is) and B.McGathy. Worst luck: Again, L.Corey. Please throw another log on the air conditioner: E.Heckman. So, if you couldn't attend, don't feel like you really missed out...Moving on, some very healthy jumps for the Mick Fleetwood record. It's officially big time and has a nice second cut, 'You Weren't In Love', going for it...Radio is all over the Michael Stanley Band like a cheap suit, and deservedly so. The record really grows on anything standing erect...Joe Perry is still on the way up.'Listen To The Rock' got pre-release airplay in Boston. You might try it out...A hot new track is here from Red Rider. 'Lunatic Fringe' is definitely for the maniacal mainstream...Song of the week at A1's at the Lake: The Go Go's 'Our Lips Are Sealed'...Meanwhile at Brodey-by-the-sea, it's the Go Go's 'Urgent' and 'Planet Earth' by Duran Duran."

KATE INGRAM, DB RECORDS (212-243-2212): "I'm crossing my fingers while giving this report since the post office told me today that tonight there might be a strike. Let's hope not. It'd be a drag if something else besides sleet, hail, etc. stopped the U.S. Mail and you from reading the Hard Sheet... Just got back from Boston. It was good to see everyone, starting off with the Pylon show at the Paradise last Thursday, and ending up with a big WBCN reunion Sunday at the Charles Laquidara Plantation. If only Norm Winer could have been there -and Charlie Kendall...The press is rollin' in on our records. The current Rolling Stone gives the Pylon album a four-star review, while the Boston Globe called the Swimming Pool Q's album the debut Lp of the year. Most ironic of all is the flack I'm getting from college stations who claim the Q's album is too commercial, while only the trend-setting album rock stations have started playing it. Hopefully, the rest will be following through soon. The Pool Q's are on their way to New York, and will be playing here, in Boston, Providence, and Long Island. Any one who has doubts about their record would allay them after seeing this band live...Thanks for all the response and requests for copies. If you need any of our records, feel free to call me."

MIKE COOPER ON IMPORTS (404-627-2834/355-8686): "From the British music scene come quite a few new singles. Most notably: 'Wordy Rappinghood' from The Tom Tom Club, the group made up of Tina Weymouth of Talking Heads and friends. It's a catchy, danceable track that offers something new and interesting on every listen. Apparently this project, which started out to be just for a single, has now turned into an album for release later this year...'Tonight' from the all-girl group The Modettes is quite bouncy and energetic...A very Beatle-ish sounding single comes from the group Tease, called 'I Don't Want To Cry'...Among other singles which are doing well in the British charts: 'New Life' by Depeche Mode, mentioned previously in this column, 'Chant No. 1' from Spandau Ballet, the most unredeemingly disco imaginable from this group, 'Lay All Your Love On Me', a new 12" single from Abba that's really quite good, and, 'Sat In Your Lap' from Kate Bush, a much more complex and ambitious track than the singing shrub has presented before, (and one I haven't been able to decide whether to like or not.) Also notable is a single that is sort of a cross between rockability and pop from Kristy McColl, called 'There's A Guy Who Works Down The Chip Shop Swears He's Elvis'...Recent independent singles of note include The Fashions 'Skin Deep', Department S 'Going Left Right', and a newly recorded single from Bill Nelson called 'Youth Of Nation On Fire'...On the album front, most notable recent release is from UB40 called 'Present Arms', a reggae-dominated album, but with a commercial sound to it...From Australia, a couple of notable albums: 'Scirroco' from Australian Crawl, a solid rock band that's been around for a few years now with a 6th member, and 'Quasimodo's Dream' from The Reels, a more soft-rock approach. And also from Australia, an exciting new single from Mi-Sex, called 'Falling In And Out', (the catchiest thing from this group since 'Computer Games') a single that debuted at #28 first week out...Sorry to see Madness currently without a U.S. label...Glad to see Rough Trade's 'Avoid Freud' album will soon be out in the U.S. A very fine album that has gone platinum in the group's native Canada."

JERRY JAFFE, POLYGRAM (212-399-7044): "Ad-libs ad-nauseum...If all you radio folk are true to your pledges of objectivity in evaluating female rock and rollers as you said you were in a previous Question Of The Week, then let Carolyne Mas' new album, led by the splendid cut 'It's Important' enter the golden pantheon of spirited airplay with Benatar, Nicks, and Hynde...On the case of the so-called 'Mr. Cairo' by Jon and Vangelis, the 12" is no more than part one of the song which has a natural separation on the regular Lp. Hence, it is not an edit at all, but merely the first five minutes of a magnum opus...Personal favorites of my esteemed competitors: The Sinceros (terrific pop), David Lindley, BOC (best since 'Agents Of Fortune'), Duran Duran, Rick Springfield, and that scrumptious dance Ep on Ze Records through Island...I will take any ten dollar bet that Def Leppard's 'High and Dry' will be gold--however, I won't bet with radio people, since that could be self-defeating...In the meantime, get your head and feet into the Visage Ep. See where Pink Floyd has met David Bowie head on. Steve Strange and Company are gathering steam. Yes, Virginia, there is life beyond Led Zeppelin, and sales, too."

Among other things, Pete Townshend (twice!) and a rare Blackfoot Snakehead (a trophy from the 'Strokes' epoch). Hey, McCabe, this must be where yours snuck off to! Don't worry, pal, this time you'll get a hawk's head...Congratulations to those programmers who haven't just gone A.W.O.L. with all the new superstar releases and ignored the other quality music. If you haven't listened to Riff Raff, Sad Cafe, Thunder, or Apache, you're cheating yourself...Riff Raff sounds like Tommy James meets Led Zeppelin--heavy pop...Sad Cafe's 'Love Today' should please their past fans and win over a lot of new ones. And after all, KAL's had 'La Di Da' on his FRONT-RED PAGE for weeks...Thunder continues to gain respectable call letters every week...By this time you should all have Stevie's 'Bella Donna', and we're anxiously awaiting your consensus...Finally, thanks to the many network of Southern album rockers who broadcast a Blackfoot show from the Fox in Atlanta. Special thanks to Alan Sneed for being an excellent host, and to Paul Zullo of DIR for his invaluable expertise. This tape will make for a very nutritious and delicious Biscuit...Hot at home and in the air: Rickie Lee, ZZ Top, Eric Andersen (you're right Bruce, this does pick up where 'Blue River' left off), Stevie, Entwistle, and John Wellsley Ryles (Is there an album MCA?)"

MIKE BONE, ARISTA (212-489-7400): "Cowabunga! More impressive upward movement on the A's. This song 'Woman's Got The Power' sounds so-o-o-o good on the air. The top 40 action is coming in very strong) and more and more album rockers get the power of the A's. That was a good trick getting a woman nominated for a seat on the Supreme Court, eh? Anything for airplay on the A's...The mega-strong Allman Brothers Band 12" single 'Straight From The Heart' went straight on WPLJ. Bo-o-o-m!!! Put that in your pipe and smoke it. The Allman album 'Brothers Of The Road' ships next week...The Alan Parsons Project 'No Gamble' sampler is in your grubby hands now. So you have no excuse for not playing the 'Time' track. P.S. It's top ten now...A friend in London sent all the Arista field staff a limited number of Kinks singles. Call for yours now. 'Better Things' for better album rock radio... The Rod's rockers romp on radio as the rampage round the country continues. (What do you think, Fred?) The three bad boys from Roberta Haber's nightmare are breaking wide open in Texas. Big sales and phone action in San Antonio, Houston, and El Paso. This is because Texas radio plays the Rods unlike some of the Rods home market stations. (Dare I name call letters?) Giving an entirely new meaning to the phrase low-budget, the Rods are garnering amazing response. If you add the Rods, you will not receive a Rods pre-release cassette, a Rods coffee cup, t-shirt, scarf or baseball hat. You might receive a Rods polaroid shot of one of their female fans known as the Rods' Drill Team. (Ask Bill Hard or Chris Miller)...Personals: I did a heavy metal guest set on WLIR Sunday night. I think I saved John DeBella's gig and thanks to Ben Manilla for all the help. I really enjoyed myself...Chris Von Rohr, base player of Krokus, called today from the Atlanta airport to say goodbye (they're going home). Chris also said thanks to everyone in album rock for their support--and personal thanks to Arin Michaels for that wonderful night in El Paso. (What could he mean by that?)"

JUDY LIBOW, ATLANTIC (212-484-6063): "Well, Foreigner is quickly approaching #1 across-the-board; Stevie Nicks is an out-of-the-box hit; Blackfoot is solid top 10 airplay; Phil Collins and AC/DC won't quit; and, Glen Campbell loves his truck!!! What more can you ask for????! How about the Stones, John Entwistle, Genesis, and new AC/DC??? It's going to get EVEN hotter before this Summer's over... In the meantime, a few new Lps have been shipped that you should be aware of: Sad Cafe featuring the single 'La Di Da'; Thunder, try the first 3 on side one; and Riff Raff with Doug Lubahn (who penned Benatar's 'Treat Me Right'). A solid rock and roll effort from this New York based band...Shipping now: Apache, Buddy Miles, and New Passport...Heard some of the forthcoming Debbie Harry Lp (produced by Niles Bernard of Chic) and all I can say is--watch out!!! There's 'Backfired', 'Military Rap' (with shades of 'Whip It') and more! JEB BRIEN, CHAMPION, (212-765-8553): "Odds and Enz: Split Enz opened the Tom Petty tour in Montreal last night to 3 encores and 10,000 people. They'll be doing two weeks with the Heartbreak kid, then another two weeks headlining. 'Waiata' is close to platinum in Canada, and the single 'One Step' is a monster! 'Iris' ships this week here in America. This may be the cut to breathe more life back into 'Waiata'. This group deserves more than mid-chart. A&M is a never say die company, so look for MAJOR support on 'Iris'!.THE KID COMES TO BROADWAY. With 3 major stories and reviews in the NY Times, and two covers of NME, all in five weeks, Kid Creole (aka August Darnell) has become the international media face that we knew he would. So much so, in fact, that last night NY theater entrepreneur Joseph Papp presented Kid Creole's 'Fresh Fruit In Foreign Places' at the NY Public Theater. Billed as the first Papp musical, Mr. Darnell's vision has been realized. Mr. Papp is taking the show to Broadway this fall. Some artists need a different forum for their music. For Kid Creole, it will be theater. We are very proud to have the backing of the man who is NY Theater, behind us...FLASH!!!GET READY!!! Next week, new Hall and Oates!!! A 12" to album rock radio of the title cut, and the first smash single 'Private Eyes' is on the way. This will be the biggest record of their career...Stay tuned."

DON WASLEY, MCA (213-508-4018): "Just returned from the East Coast and had a chance to hear a lot of great radio and work with Tom Petty, Jimmy Buffett, and Wishbone Ash. Thanks to WBCN for making me feel at home...Thanks to John and Mavis for staying awake---Charlie Kendall for a memorable evening, and a wonderful tour of the Amazon in the rain Lastly, Bill, don't let your meat loaf."

JOEL WEBBER, INDEPENDENT, (212-255-7408): "I would like to thank everyone for their kind comments on the New Music Seminar. The whole concept of getting people together with such widely differing viewpoints, and business interests, was a potentially volatile one, and the Seminar certainly provided more fireworks than your usual Fourth of July. The real purpose of any convention, however, is to get people together and talking, and that was what happened at the New Music Seminar. It's truly a shame that more of the non-radio people in attendance at the radio panel didn't take better advantage of an opportunity to really learn something. The commercial radio panel consisted of the best people radio and records has to offer. I thank them sincerely for their time and interest...Watch out for John Montgomery's new label, MSI. I said #1 sales. Check it out if you would like. The retailers' comments are unbelievable. The key songs are: 'We Got The Beat', the single 'Our Lips Are Sealed', and 'This Town'...I agree with Bill Hard. Change tracks on the Condor to 'You Can Take My Heart Away'. Another big top 40 week. Make sure you see this band when Earl comes to your town...Who is Tim Goodman and why is 'New Romeo' making me go crazy? 'New Romeo' is a smash!...Other new stuff. Consider me 100% behind the new Bob Dylan album. I'll go on record and say this Lp is a great one. Unfortunately Bob suffers from image problems but this record should change all of that. Listen with open ears and you'll understand why it reminds me of 'Nashville Skyline'...And finally to Robin Wren: Who cares!?"

JIM SOTET, POLYGRAM (212-399-7813): "The New Music Seminar in New York City last week proves one thing still holds true. 'What does not change is the will to change'. I'm looking forward to next year's dialogue already, and it was great to meet Oedipus, Paul Payton, Eddie Wazoo, Michael Tearson, and all the usual crew...You have Def Leppard by now, and there is nothing I can add to the music other than 'turn it up'! This is rock 'n' roll...Never knew 'Mr. Cairo' had so many friends, did you? Last year Peter Gabriel, this year Jon and Vangelis...Frank Andrick: Hope to see you in New York real soon...Faves at home: Miles Davis, Was Not Was, Def Leppard, Rick James, and Dennis Bovelle...Congrats to Marvin Gleicher and thank you Kid Leo, John Gorman, and Rhonda for a great two days in Cleveland."

JOHN COSTA, JEM (201-753-6100): "It was great to meet all the faces at the Seminar that I've been talking to for so long. Nobody looks like they sound. I think Paul Payton should become an evangelist or something--what a speaker! As long as I'm on the subject of the Seminar, I have to say, I came away from it with more negative feelings than positives. The fate of new music (or just music in general) does not look good today. Until the time comes when the music itself is as much a priority as the business of radio, nothing is going to change. Call me an idealist, but I'm going to stay that way...Also, not to knock anybody down, but Don Felder doing the theme from 'Heavy Metal' is like Boxcar Willie doing Styx songs...To music. Yes, you too can join in and play Camel's 'Nude', in particular the first two cuts on side one. Initial adds are good, and they're gonna keep comin'... To be released at the end of the week: Siouxsie & The Banshees, 'Ju Ju'. They've had hit after hit in England, and now is the time for them to hit here as well."

MARTY SCHWARTZ, ELEKTRA (213-655-8280): "Our 'Heavy Metal' tour couldn't have met with greater success or response. New York's New Music Seminar brought out all the notables and the panels were sometimes as productive as the parties. It was truly a pleasure seeing everyone, and I especially thank Joel Webber and Steve Leeds for allowing us to jump on their bandwagon. Could this be a birth of a tradition?.. There's something on 'Heavy Metal' for everyone from Devo's 'Coalmine' to Hagar's 'Metal', from Fagen's 'Companion' to Nicks' 'Lamp'. I wish we had the single rights to Journey's 'Open Arms'. This is one of the great songs of the year. The Summer of '81 will be remembered as the summer of 'Heavy Metal'...The Rockets blast off with 'Can't Get Satisfied' and 'Shanghaied' leading the way. The record's looking real strong O.T.B. (out of the box). We're going for the stars with the boys from the Motor City...Greg Kihn is holding fast in the top 12 after 17 weeks. We're putting on a live broadcast via Starfleet from New York's Ritz Club. The ball keeps rolling for 'Rockinroll'...If you've not pounded Joe Vitale's 'Lady On The Rock', you're missing a great passive song. Where this track is played, it works. Check the Sebastian stations for proof...Currently on tour, and doing very well, are New England and Cold Chisel. Seeing them will also make you the believers that we are...Speaking of live, we have a live David Lindley from the Bottom Line which features a surprise guest appearance. We hope to be able to offer that very soon. David is continuing to kill them on the road, building up the same sort of following Jackson and Zevon did on their debuts...Chicago, Milwaukee, and Rockford breed serious full-timers. They enjoyed our 'Heavy Metal' tour, and I enjoyed seeing them...Up and coming: Yes, Bone, we are Rioting. On August 7th, Riot's debut on E/A; followed by a solo debut by Mickey Thomas, and in late August the boys from Toronto produced by Bob 'King' Ezrin ('The Kings' #2). Watch for them on Merv with Ezrin on keyboards...There's more on the way from E/A."

JOHN SCHOENBERGER, RADIO RECORDS (305-462-7407): "'Hot town, summer in the city, back of my neck gettin' burnt and pretty...' Who can't relate to those lyrics this Summer? If you haven't heard Max Werner's version yet, please listen. It's unique, it's different, and it's catchy. I'm also getting some reaction to 'Cosmic Winter' and the 'Spell Of Spring'. Max is still the drummer and lead singer of Kayak. This is his first solo project...Please, also be aware of a new Badfinger single shipping to you now, entitled 'Because I Love You'. They will be going into the studio in about six to eight weeks to start their next project for Radio Records...Personal favorites of late include: Mick Fleetwood, Miles Davis, and Pat Metheny."

KEN BENSON, EMI (800-421-4155): "From the looks of the adds this past week, it would appear that the 'North Coast' is definitely the place to be for this Summer. Thanks to everyone who helped the new Michael Stanley Band album become Most Added...Christine McVie has been taking some time off from the Fleetwood Mac routine, and has produced an absolutely stunning debut album by English singer/songwriter Robbie Patton. Listen particularly to 'Heartache' and 'One On One'...Gary Bonds' album 'Dedication' passed the 300,000 mark in sales, and the new single 'Jole Blon', features a duet with you-know-who...Watch your mail for a hot new 12" album rock sampler on Marty Balin...In answer to last week's Question, if I were to go back to either 18 or 35, I would continue to steal records, because there's no way in hell I could get by with only buying three records. I stole them then, I stole them when I was 35, and I will continue to steal them...Love and kisses, Ken."

ROY ROSENBERG, STIFF (212-765-3977): "I've already gotten a lot of really good comments on the Any Trouble import 45 'Trouble With Love' that I sent out last week. Most seem to agree that the somewhat more produced sound, and addition of keyboards have added to the group's overall sound. The album 'Wheels In Motion' should be in your hands this week. It contains some upbeat tracks and some ballads just like their debut album. By the way, in case you've forgotten, Any Trouble's debut album was #1, 2 or 3 Most Added in every trade the week of release last November, and within the first month, 90 trade reporting album rock stations had added tracks from it. This was accomplished without a top 40 hit single or an American tour. This time Clive Gregson and the boys will tour beginning early September. As far as a top 40 hit goes, we feel we have the goods this time. So to be corny once again, I'd say the 'Wheels In Motion' definitely...The early reaction to the Dr. Feelgood album from some radio folks is that it sounds very much like a Nick Lowe/Rockpile album. What better excuse to add a track or two. There is no current Lowe or Edmunds product out, and Rockpile doesn't exist anymore. Therefore, a void exists, and the familiarity factor is built in. The two tracks to check out are 'Who's Winning' and 'Best In The World' (both written and produced by Nick Lowe)...The debut album by Tenpole Tudor should also be on your desk now. As I said before, you should listen to the recent U.K. top five 45 'Swords Of A Thousand Men'. It's interesting, upbeat rock...Of personal note: This heavy birthday week includes Roberta Haber, Ron Reager, WSH's Mike Ross, WLIR's John DeBella, and Atco's Paul Yeskel. A stiff one to all!...To Steve Leeds: Sorry for being so insensitive. You're right...To Bob Bittens: Long live all mutts!...To Susan Costello: Not only is the Penguin Kaleidoscope still #1, but Susan, you'll always be #1 in my book (with a twist of my arm)."

An absolutely fantastic sound! It could be another 'Reaper'...Wedding of the week: Eric Anderson married his lady Zona last week at Woodstock. Eric's import album 'Midnight Son' is doing great on stations that are playing it. If you're looking for some great ballads to daypart and give a balance on some older demographics to your station, Eric's album is just what you're looking for. The Webber - Leeds affair was considered by many to be the highlight of the festivities. Special thanks to Marty Schwartz and Burt Stein...I never realized Marko Babineau goes to bed so early...Radio has headed to the North coast, and everyone seems to be enjoying the 'Heartland'... It puzzles me as to why more folks haven't checked out the States album (the record is selling #1 in Norfolk)...Don't forget to Balance your playlists...Summertime spins: Max Werner's 'Summer In The City' and Joan Jett's 'Summertime Blues'...Ask Ed Levine about beer shampoos...Moser, thanks for the road map...Congrats to new PD Ron Reger, Asst. MICHAEL ABRAMSON, CHRYSALIS, (212-935-8750): "First of all, I'd like to thank everyone for their immediate support on the Pat Benatar album, 'Precious Time'. There should be no doubt in anyone's mind that Pat IS the reigning queen of rock and roll. She has just begun a gruelling 4 month tour, and her new show is absolutely fantastic. Don't miss her, when she comes into your city...Now--let's talk about ICEHOUSE. Here is a group that created national impact upon release, and is growing steadily every week in both airplay and sales. But, there are programmers that seem to feel that airplay on a new group should convert to retail sales in the same amount of time it takes for an established act. THIS IS NOT SO! It usually takes a name act 2 to 3 weeks to begin reflecting solid retail activity, and at least twice as much time for an unknown group. If radio is going to commit to breaking a new group, they MUST put the Lp into a solid rotation--and keep it there until they have created the audience awareness needed to motivate retail sales. Airplay MUST be compared to advertising, and the basic premise of advertising is based on the fact that the more times a spot is run, the greater the chance of making an impression on the listener and thereby motivating them to make the purchase. Airplay is no different. The listener must hear the album enough times to become familiar with the product and once familiar, decide whether they like it enough to go out and buy it. ICEHOUSE is the group to break in 1981. Not because I said so, but because you, the programmers across the country, felt strongly enough about this group to make them the highest debuting act in the history of this Sheet. With this kind of initial reaction, I'm asking you to stick with the album and BREAK THE ICE!"

FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

1. **PLAYS PER DAY** - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
2. **PLAYS PER WEEK** - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
3. **AIRPLAY EMPHASIS** - Be careful not to confuse this with **PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK**. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 10. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 10 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 5 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

Before the lead cut listings, you will notice three columns of numbers. We feel that it is highly relevant to include the number of weeks a station has been on a given album--so we're listing that information in a third column at the far left...We list debuts with a small "d". That indicates that the Lp is in the second week of play. So--this week, we took last week's debuts, and gave them a 3 in the "weeks on" column. Next week those 3's will change to 4's--and so on. It's pretty simple.
