### Hard Choice

#### QUEEN, "THE SPACE", ELEVEN

The built-in resistance that the single has generated keeps "The Space" from top 40. This record is no walk-off. Be kept an open mind and give careful consideration—see, WABC, 62.1, "Put Out The Fire" and "Callin' All Girls".

### Chain Reaction

#### FRANKIE MILLER, "STANDING ON THE EDGE", DEPTON

The Jeger comparisons are finally overwhelmed by the feeling that Frankie's time has come. Programmer support has been building the past, now radio has the album to run with. The #1 Most Added with 49 stations first week should be a serious motivator for those considering... Comments: Rosetta Haber, WJZZ, "It would be a massive understatement to say the man has left his feet. He's always had the gas to equalment-without, however, it's a real, earthy-sounding voice, but he was missing the hooks. Now he's got 'em—a whole album of great rockers, ballads, and blues"...Sky Daniels, WJZZ, "As Bob Seger was the favorite rock singer for a long time, I think most rockers will think of him as their favorite singer... Then make the logical deduction"...Tom Drake, WJZZ, "Of all the artists that deserve to get some on the national airwaves front, it's difficult to think of one more deserving than Frankie"...Jeff Kaufman, WTR, "Nine years later, Frankie has come up with the top album radio must respond to. It's as if he spent his career saving songs for 'Standing On The Edge'"...Let's talk depth: Marilyn Randall, WMMR, "What a marvelous album. It's been a while since I had a real touch from the top of the charts"...Bob Linder, WMMR, "We're fighting over which cuts to play, and it's not easy to choose"...Bob Linder, WMMR, "Lots of playable material here. It stands out because it's got intensity"...Frank Summers, "Don't Stop", "Angels", "Edge", "Ganger, Langer", and "Flying Line" and the need to be released soon, "To Break The Ground".

#### ANASTAS, "WIND ISLAND", WARNER BROTHERS

Kid Leo nails it. "White America's" force is the Billboard Top 40 hit, the band has enough voice and taste to include at least 10 rockers and my two faves from this one are "For Queens" and "Still Not Satisfied"—one of their best songs ever"...Wito like same at WJZZ, "they're around we've danced on a number of times, but still not satisfied" shows a tremendous amount of promise"... From WJZZ's Susan Christie, "They've exceeded their own fan expectations. This wasn't the type of texture I expected, judging from their previous work, and it was a pleasant surprise"...Mark Miller, WJZZ, "The Anastas album is simply amazing. It's great to find a record with so much depth these days. I can safely say there are at least 4 radio tracks. 'Wind Island' is the kind of record you always knew the band was capable of making but were never quite sure when they'd get around to making it"...Larry Reitman, WJZZ, "Much more album-oriented than their last couple of records... The Rick Floyd connections are obvious, but that doesn't work in their favor"...Ray cuts "Still Not Satisfied", "For Queens", and "How Can You Love Me". #4 Most Added with 28 stations, including influential KATZ, Y100, WJZZ, WNEP-FM, and WMMR.

#### STEVIE WONDER, "NUJOLIARIUM", MOTOWN

First week reaction on "Front Line" part of our Top—with the #3 Most Added to (including WJZZ, KXAU, WMMR, WNEP-FM, and WJZZ) steals is making his way back into album playlists... Again in charlie at WMMR, "A super record from Stevie, great to have him back on the radio with current product. It's a straight ahead rocker and the message is in need of attention"...Joe White, WJZZ, "A green light and tip of the hat to Stevie for a fine compilation"...Bob Billera, WJZZ, "It's time to put Stevie back on album rock radio, and as much as I hate to agree with Sebastian, I think 'Front Line' is the band to do it. From the very beginning, Stevie has been one of the classic acts around. The music is great and it deserves the exposure"...Jim Foren, WJZZ, "We put it right on and it proceeded to get instant response here in metairie..."Bob Martens, WJZZ, "Stevie is a superstar. 'Front Line' is a strong record all around and certainly our image with the rock and rollers".

#### MARSHALL CRENshaw, WARNER BROTHERS

My wife has threatened divorce if I don't stop playing this record. It took a couple of listens, but now I literally can't get it off the turntable. More fun: Judy McNair, K98-FM, "Like the fact that Marshall sounds terribly familiar as I've listened. They manage to keep the energy high without blowing your eardrums out"...Ralph Harford, WJZZ, "Marshall's album is one I truly enjoyed listening to and hopefully the audience will agree. The music is bright, punchy, and perfect for the summertime"...David Elsavich, WJZZ, "Good solid pop rock. After a couple of listens, these hooks are embedded ten feet deep"...Bob Walton, WJZZ, "Forgot the pre-release hype, this is good, easy rock and roll"...Bob Sorenson, WJZZ, "Marshall is the star of the litter this week, despite his but punchy, despite the hook line sound is some, but sure"...And from love connections, WJZZ, "As much fun as a day on the beach. The sales on the record took me back to the burn days, Tommy Row, Rick Spring, and others... I think that one or two songs will definitely pop and be hit singles"... Tracks: "There She Goes Again", and "Some Lay Some Way" lead, with lots of talk on "Lycial (DJ)" and "Mary Anne". Marshall is #4 Most Added with 27 FMQB reporters including WNEP-FM, WJZZ, WJZZ, WJZZ, and WJZZ.

TIP:

## 707, "MEGAFORCE", BOARDWALK

As close as the first album came to breaking out of the midwest--forget it. This new single is as tight and refined as you could want. A perfect radio record from the regal intro to the classic rock tenor. Can't wait for the album.

## THE MONROES, ALFA

One of the neat things about this business is that a small label can find an obscure band, put out an Ep with a stinko cover, and with the right song capture the imagination of programmers coast to coast. (In spite of the common thinking that you have to be Warner Brothers or Columbia to break an act)...This week's raves: Janel Dolan, KZEW, "It's a true joy to add the Monroes this week. 'What Do All The People Know' is a perfect radio song, catchy beat, choice vocals and clear production. This one is gonna be a smash"...David Filipov, WBRU, "This song is chock full of hooks. Really reaches out and grabs you"...Bob Walton, WQDR, "This has hit written all over it. It sounds like a cross between The Records 'Starry Eyes' and Split Enz 'I Got You'. If this isn't a smash, I'm going to find a job flipping hamburgers"...Art Phillips, KIL0, "Sounding better with each spin. The production on 'The People' is superb"...And first week supporter Steve Feinstein reports, "They've taken a lead from light to medium. I will be vindicated on this record or my name isn't Rufus T. Firefly. When stations like KROQ, KGB-FM, KTXQ, KZEW, WMJQ, and WBCN express interest in a record from an independent label, you've got to take notice"...Front Red with Kal this week. Say goodnight. #5 Most Added this week with 19 stations.

## PAUL MCCARTNEY, COLUMBIA

16 new adds for Paul for a total of 111 in the past two weeks...The week's highest debut at #21 Index, #27 Metro, and a debut at #13 Superstars...Song Index debuts: "Ballroom Dancing" #39, "Take It Away" #55, "The Pound" #56...Max play reporters include: WIOT, WQXM, KTXQ, KCON, WLPX, and WBCN...Heavies: WFYV, DC101, WFBQ, KBPI, KSHE, WBAB, WLUP, WLIR, and KDKB...Comments: Rob Roman, KLAQ, "Let's not get high and mighty and forget where the roots of our rock tradition came from. The record is a very personal statement from Paul and there have been no negs on the phones"...Greg Gillispie, KEZO, "Last week we played the album in its entirety and got 92% positives with the average age being 25, and the favorite cuts, 'The Pound Is Sinking' and 'Ballroom Dancing'"...Scott Segraves, KSMB, "Listeners don't suffer all the label hangups we do. McCartney gets instant phones"...Ed Levine, WAQX, "McCartney is back with vengeance. The positive critical acclaim for the album turns into a massive #6 retail debut"...Dick Bascom, WQXM, "I was somewhat afraid of the image, and was somewhat reluctant to add it, but after hearing it on the radio, my fears have disappeared"...Mary Pillinger, WYMX, "The album sets a new record in our Augusta Guinness Book, selling the most copies of an album in one week"...Note the #4 Retail Index debut.

### SHERBS, ATCO

Consistency is the byword here--#6 Most Added with 16 this week, #3 last week with 27, and #5 first week with 31. New on the Back Page at #44, 49-43 Metro Underline, 20-18 Sebastian/Casey. "We Ride Tonight" debuts #73, "I'm Alive" at #79...Airplay: 11 steady, none down, and 3 ups: KIL0, WOUR, and KSMB...A closer look at developing phones and retail on this week's Checklist.

### JOHN COUGAR, RIV./MERCURY

The week's strongest chart move, 24-7, John gives The Rock Department three albums in the top 10. (Scorps 3, Rainbow 5) and with Cougar's 14 adds, he should also go top 5 next week. Whew!! Up 30-13 Metro, 11-8 Superstars, 20-14 Pollack, and 19-14 Sebastian...Song Index action: "Hurts So Good" 23-12-5, with "Jack And Diane" new at #89 and coming on like a ton of bricks...Airplay: 12 steady, none down, and 18 ups, including WHJY, WWCK, KDKB, DC101, WKLS, WMMR, WYSP, WAQX, WDIZ, and WBAB...The Checklist is in sync with these following glowing stats: 10 not playing, 6 considering, none dropping, 23 maintaining, and 62 building. Hottest phones and sales: KZEW, WZXR, KSRR, WOUR, WROQ, WRXL, WZZO, KYYS, WLPX, KBPI, KLBJ, KEZO, WFYV, WQXM, KTXQ, WILS-FM, KMOD, WIMZ, KWXL, KLAQ, WIYY, KSMB, WKLS, and WMAD.

### CHAS SANDFORD, ELEKTRA

Chas continues to build week by week, in spite of the relentless flow of automatics...#7 Most Added with 14, including KZEW, KDKB, WLPX, WMAD, KBPI, WFBQ, WKQQ, and WQMF for the best add week to date...Already on 25 reporters. Leaders: "Surrender", "Temptation", "Limelight", "Still Crazy"...Comments: Ilyse Gottlieb, WRXL, "Chas has strong upper demo appeal, along the same lines as Garland Jeffreys"...Belden Beam, WLPX, "He's a good songwriter and singer. 'Surrender' is the cut that hits me most"...Dave Krusenklous, WKQQ, "Although this record may not break the sales barriers wide open, I think that given Mr. Sandford's talent, he'll be money in the bank for E/A."

### BLUE OYSTER CULT, COLUMBIA

Double underline city--33-25 Metro, 25-20 Index, as "Roadhouse Blues" moves 28-26, and "The Reaper" 93-86...Airplay: 33 steady, 1 down, and 10 ups: WCCC, KEZY, WPDH, WQBK, WWCK, KCON, WGRQ, WHCN, WILS-FM, and WLVO...Checklist: 16 not playing, 5 considering, 3 dropping, 32 maintaining, and 44 building...Sales and phones: WWCK, WMMR, WLVO, KSHE, WMJQ, WYFE, WYSP, KEZO, WRAS, WSYR, KLAQ, KSMB, WKLS, WLPX, WMQK, and WROQ. Note the major market strength...Phones: WTUE, DC101, WILS-FM, WMAD, WPYX, WQBK, KYYS, and WIOT...Hottest sales: WAPI, WBCN, KSRR, KWFM, WNEW-FM, WGRQ, WHCN, KEZY, WQXM, WQVE, WLAV-FM, WDIZ, WZZO, and WRXL...Now on a total of 102 FMQB stations.

### MOTELS, CAPITOL



Starting to develop a good retail pattern."

### DAVE EDMUNDS, COLUMBIA

Two solid adds, KBPI and WBCN, but a blockbuster Index week, 45-36. Also a Metro mauler, 46-40...Overall we have 18 steady, 2 down and 5 ups: WOUR, KSMB, WDHA, WBRU, and WRNO...From Small Things advances 56-42 with "Me And The Boys" also active...Key calls to date: KBPI, WBCN, WBNB, WYSP, KRQR, KMET, KTXQ, KZEW, WCMF, WPLJ, and WLUP.

### SAMPLER NOTE:

Frankly, I used up all my best lines in putting the ad together with Harvey and Rich, so here's a quick mention for my favorites on the tape. The Johansen/Animals number is as hot a medley as I've ever heard...Charlie Kendall and Skyboy were testifying about the Clash tunes, and we're expecting serious major market interest to develop around them. Either song could have followed "Train In Vain" with no problem...Also pay close attention to Clocks. These Kansans have done their homework and play a smart brand of radio rock. We especially like "Here They Come".

### ELTON JOHN, GEFLEN

New on WPLJ, KLOL, KWLX, WDEK, and WXEZ for a total of 64 in the past 3 weeks...Key calls: WDVE, WCOZ, WPYX, KMET, WNEW-FM, WYMX, WQXM, KSHE, KBPI, WLIR, and WPLR...Increased play: WRAS, WPDH, WQBK, WBLM, LOVE94, WBRU, KWFM, and WBAB...Heavy on WOUR, WWCK, KBPI, KGB-FM, WNEW-FM and WFBQ... "Ball And Chain" debuts #95...Up 50-45 Index underline, Debut 46 Metro.

### SPLIT ENZ, A&M

The Lp hits the Back Page at #50 (#48 Metro) as "Leaky Boat" is quickly gaining on early favorite "Sandy Allen"...New on KSHE, KSAS, and KMOD for a total of 47 reports in the last 4 weeks...Key calls: KBPI, WCMF, KRQR, KKRQ, WAQX, KISS, WMMS, KBLE, WQXM, KPKE, WAVA, KWK, WLLZ, WNEW-FM, WLIR, and KROQ.

### A FLOCK OF SEAGULLS, JIVE/ARISTA

6 new believers roll in, heavy on the quality: WMMR, WNEW-FM, KMOD, KISS, KYYS, and WLPX. That takes us to 45 in three weeks, including WNEW-FM, WMMR, KMOD, WDVE, WMMS, KMET, WPYX, WROQ, WLAV-FM, WZXR, KZEW, and KTXQ...WQBK and WHFS increased play, most held steady, none down...Flock came in just shy of the Airplay Index, and we should see a debut next week. "Space Age Love Song" is gaining; we still favor "I Ran".

### RPM, EMI

KSRR, WYSP, WFBQ, KLOL, WQMF, and 5 more open it up for RPM. "A Legend Never Dies" is out front. Solid week.

### BOW-WOW-WOW, RCA

Considering how relatively left field this spunky item is, the Nipper continues to pull in credible stations--new action includes: WCMF, WMMS, WPLR, WNEW-FM, and WBAB.

### SIGNIFICANT SONGS:

#### "BLACK COFFEE IN BED", SQUEEZE, A&M

Just out on 12" and already attracting attention. New on 20 reporters, including WMMR, WHJY, WBAB, WNEW-FM, and KROQ. Never particularly strong starters and always very hard to hear, we suggest that you remember you may have to spend some extra time with this one...WHJY's Rob Lipshutz sez, "I believe 'Black Coffee' will be their most successful song yet. It's got a hell of a melody and the interplay between the lead and supporting vocals on the chorus will help hook you. Bet you won't stop singing it"...Sky Daniels, WLUP, "Another group that respects the craft of songwriting is Squeeze. Tilbrook and Difford painstakingly create songs like 'Black Coffee' and 'I've Returned', which upon one listen have the ring of classics"...Charlie Kendall, WMMR, "Just got the Squeeze, and we're using 'I've Returned'. It's pop and it's nice and squeezeable--play it!!"...#3 Most Added single with KROQ, WNEW-FM, WLIR, WMMR, WHJY, and 15 more.

#### "PLAY THE GAME TONIGHT", KANSAS, KIRSHNER/EPIC

The #16 Song Index debut ain't too shabby, and when debuts from this week's 56 reports roll in, we should be taking top 5 easy...Comments: Bob Linder, WDHA, "We love new lead singer John Elefante. Can't wait for the rest of the album"...Gloria Johnson, KGON, "Pleasantly surprised by Kansas. The new lead singer is real talented and sounds enough like Steve Walsh so as not to alter the band's identification factor"...Jose Diaz, WBLM, "I can't detect a difference in lead vocalists. 'Play The Game Tonight' is a strong song and should do well for the band"...Already max play on WIOT, WKOQ, KTXQ, KLOS, KSHE, and KMET...Heavy play on WRKK, KILO, WQXM, WLLZ, KSRR, KZEW, WHJY, and WWCK...#1 Most Added including WCOZ, WQMF, WLUP, KSJO, WMJQ, KLAQ, WMYK, KLOL, KISS, KATT, KRQR, WPLR, WNEW-FM, WRIF, WAVA, WSYR, WMMR, and KZOK.

#### "THIS MAN IS MINE", HEART, PORTRAIT/EPIC

Can I really be writing Heart and "upper demographic appeal" in the same sentence? Next thing you know, Ozzy will be doing the Cheryl Ladd special--hmmm--a solid start #2 Most Added single with 35, including WMMS, KLOL, KISS, WPLR, WZXR, KDKB, KMET, WBAB, WPYX, WAQX...Comments: Michele Robinson Sayre, KLOL, "I can't get enough of the new single. It grows on me and I was a bit concerned about how it would wear"...Mark Miller, WWCK, "The single reminds me of Martha and the Vandellas meeting Rickie Lee Jones. The song is infectious as hell and it deserves to go on"... Larry Reisman, KEZY, "It took a few listens, but I finally decided I liked the record. Sure, it's not 'Barracuda', but Heart's image is certainly strong enough to hold up to a pop single"... And from Mr. Levine at WAQX, "The 12" is a surprising favorite this week. I like the Rickie Lee overtones and I have to give 'em credit for trying something different."

### HIGHLIGHTS FROM KAL's FRONT-RED PAGE

KIM WILDE, EMI...It's been a relatively slow-starter on the album side, but T-40 is primed to kick in big. With KROQ, KMET, and KLOS all on the case, we'll keep a close eye on L.A.

SOFT CELL, SIRE/WB...Kal is raving about the new 45 edit with the "Where Did Our Love Go" seg. It worked like crazy in 12" configuration on WMMR, so watch closely if you never played the record. Still explosive in Syracuse as Ed Levine reports, "A legitimate monster here with 24-16 retail and #1 requested by a 50% margin over Asia."

SPARKS, ATLANTIC...A strong album week with KMET, WNEW-FM, WBAB, WQMF, and WRNO leading the way. The top 40 build is also intensifying; now power rotation and blowing out phones at WIFI, Philly (and down to the Jersey shore); up to #1 phones and play at lead test market Bakersfield, CA; and new on KIQQ, Los Angeles. Heating up in Louisville and Augusta. Also note the #50 Metro Chart debut, evidence of growing support in key markets. "I Predict" debuts on the Song Index at #97.

JON & VANGELIS, POLYGRAM...Kal says "Absolute home run. Will do what 'Friends Of Mr. Cairo' didn't do in the U.S. the last time around." Morning/midday play should be under consideration in less competitive markets.

JUST OUT: STEVE MILLER, "ABRACADABRA", CAPITOL...We hear it puts him back in the groove. Hooks, energy, the works.

### A QUICK REMINDER...

By now you have the new Columbia Lp by Men At Work. "Who Can It Be" is pretty neat, but please take time to crank up our office fave "Down Under". We're convinced.

### CAN'T FORGET...

The Outlaws radio remix seems to have had a positive effect with new air on KBPI, WHJY, WILS-FM, WCMF, WYFE, WDIZ, KWLX, and WRNW. A much better sounding disc, so if you're on the Lp, switch to the Ep immediately.







I'm not sure this is gonna see the light of day as far as airplay goes, but it's a catchy little number...While I'm on the topic of records on independent labels like the Monroes, let me also point out a killer rock and roll dance record. It's called 'Positive Negative', and it's by Positive Noise on Statik Records. If you want to get a copy of it, contact Steve Pross at Dutch East India Records, 516-432-3500...Good Sales On: Graham Parker; Iron Maiden; John Cougar; Dave Edmunds; Talking Heads Live album at #14 on our survey; 'Cat People' still selling well; and, Ozzy is still king of the mountain--outselling everything. It's in the #1 slot over Asia, Human League, and Joan Jett...A couple of good clone rock records this week: RPM's 'A Legend Never Dies', which we've added; and, 'Make It Right' by Alliance, which we're looking at closely...We've also added the Trooper record, which seems to be getting overlooked a bit...None of these records are going to advance the state of rock and roll, but they're all records that sound good on the radio... Had a great 'Drink To You' party with Duke Jupiter at the Bijou...Real fun working with Sandy Fagen... Had a good time breaking bread this past week with the inimitable Steve Leeds and Scott Anderson from Shaky City Records, who's doing a great job on the Plimsouls, and MCA's lovely Linda Feder, who has exquisite taste in both restaurants and partners...We heard that A Flock Of Seagulls really stole Human League's thunder in concert the other night at the Tower Theater...Ron Nenni at WPYX did a good analogy between the Monroes and The Records 'Starry Eyed'. Really on target about that."



KTXQ, DALLAS, TX M.D.-DRAKE HALL: "I can recall back in '76 at KPRI in San Diego, when we played the new Stevie Wonder, how exciting it was and how good it sounded. But then we got so white and uptight and actually changed our audience's taste by not letting them hear Black music. So this week, we added Stevie on an obvious test basis, and I hope to God it works. I would like to have this kind of energy back in album radio. It's down to 'take a chance on Stevie or go all Canadian'. I don't know about you, but I'll take a little funk over having a hoser attack every 10 minutes. Sing it, Steven, you bad dude!..We've put Paul McCartney in heavy rotation (thanks for the in-store)--and would you believe selling 110 copies in one afternoon? Jeezus!! Glad I could be of service with the Binaca. I don't know about phone and sales longevity, but it's selling unbelievably initially--#2 behind Asia. Hope the strong reaction continues...Dave Edmunds to a healthy real rotation. It kicks ass on the radio. It sounds nips-skyward in the words of McNuttski...Glad to hear MCA is rush releasing 'Don't Look Down' as the new Point Blank single, as Bill and I have been saying since Day One of release. What are we, used rubbers? Pay attention next time, guys. Go for it, Bubba and Rusty. Dare to be hits. Get rich and buy me a meal, I'm hungry...Also happy to add Frankie Miller. Have you noticed how much he sounds like Binky Ross? Give that man a cigar. 'Don't Stop' sounds just like 'Harden My Heart'. Blows me away...Punch Line Of The Week: 'It gives me something to pick in the off season.' Laughter fades...What a great fucking song from the Monroes! Not to sound like a record puke, but the Monroes is a mother!!! Ask Sean Coakley--and he ain't even working it...And Sean, by the way babes, Garrett sez licking her lips all the while, 'Where did that big tall New York guy go?'...Don't ignore 'Jack And Diane' from John Cougar's record. Boy, it's good...P.S. We now have a New Music Hour, once a week, where we expose and play, strange and wonderful new things. If I can be of assistance in playing or testing something for you, call me and let's discuss it."

WLPX, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-BOBBIN BEAM: "Chas Sandford. He's a good songwriter and singer. 'Surrender' is the cut that hits me most...Monroes. A catchy tune to be found in 'What Do All The People Know'... Jim Carroll. This guy is a true artist. We'll see if this album expands his cult following...The McCartney album is #1 in sales this week; then Asia and Van Halen...Rick Springfield is #4...John Cougar is #8 (Hooray for the Midwest!). 'Hurts So Good' sounds like it was made for radio--sounds so good on the air...Blue Oyster Cult is #9. We still get a lot of calls for the new 'Doors' song... Iron Maiden continues to sell at #12. Other stations should look at 'Run To The Hills'...We just had a promotion that I want to talk about. It was for the Premiere of the new Steve Martin flick 'Dead Men Don't Wear Plaid'. We had people send in the most outrageous use of plaid. Two young ladies won by driving up in a plaid Volkswagon. They won an all-expense paid trip to the World Premiere in LA. We got dozens and dozens of entries--from plaid condoms to a plaid deer head. A rather interesting audience profile to be found there...Considering: Artimus Pyle Band, 'Town To Town'; Phil Seymour, 'Talk To Me'; and, Ambrosia, 'Kid No More'."

WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "A lot of us have been in Frankie Miller's corner since the opening bell, yet have seen very little audience response. This time around, I know we're gonna give the same amount of support and the audience may finally pick up on him. He's always been looked upon as a Bob Seger sound-alike. However, with today's audience picking up more on formula rock, they seem to like familiar sounds--and Seger is familiar and Frankie is certainly talented...While Ambrosia's forte is the slick Top 40 hit, the band has enough sense and taste to include at least three rockers. My two faves on this one are: 'For Openers' and 'Still Not Satisfied'--one of their best ever...We went with Bow-Wow-Wow's first album and 'Chihuahua', and we're back again with 'I Want Candy'. I'm telling you this ain't Alpo, this is filet mignon...Seems that Heart has found some soul. The gals certainly must have been listening to their Motels records when they dreamed up this single. Heard a sneak preview of the album, and they definitely do rock on more than a few cuts."

KAZY, DENVER, CO M.D.-DOUG CLIFTON: "Adds: None...Retail: #1 Asia, #2 Toto, debuting at #3 Paul McCartney, #4 Van Halen, and #5 Rick Springfield...Retail Builders: Scorpions and Human League... Hot Phones: Toto, Aldo Nova, Human League, Go Go's, and Van Halen...Next Week: Frankie Miller and Split Enz...Considering: Alliance, Sherbs, Monroes, Wendy Waldman, and Magnum...Enjoyed lunch with Alan Wolmark last week. I was impressed with previews of: The Rolling Stones; Genesis; Crosby, Stills & Nash; and, Poco. Looking forward to all those releases...KAZY just wrapped up Leg 1 of our World Tour promotion. May 8th, the station sent two listeners to the Annual San Diego Sky Show. Runner-up prize was a weekend trip to Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Contestants registered through local Sound Warehouse record stores. KAZ will be giving away more trips around the country and outside the U.S. throughout the Spring."

KSRR, HOUSTON, TX P.D.-ALAN SNEED: "One Add This Week: RPM. We got 3 to 1 on our nightly test feature, and KLOL added the record a few days ago...To Jeff Cook and Mike Bone: How embarrassing for you to not have the Outlaws record on KLOL, the station that's fronting the Black Sabbath/Outlaws concert. Better luck next time...Also, to EMI, Elektra, Arista, and Polygram: Don't expect new releases to be priorities with this radio station when this market is not enough of a priority to have a local promotion man...Excellent phone response to: Human League. That's a \$10.00 bet I lost to Jon Scott...The Go Go's continue to blow out of the stores; as does: Asia, Joan Jett, J.Gell's Band, and Loverboy...Great Sales On: Aldo Nova, Huey Lewis & The News, and Van Halen...We're dubious about the Paul McCartney, but feel it's much stronger for album radio than 'McCartney 2', especially 'Pound Is Sinking'...Our personal favorites are: 'Rosanna'; and, 'Jack And Diane' from John Cougar, which we predict will be a giant Summertime single if released."

WDVE, PITTSBURGH, PA P.D.-DAVE LANGE: "No adds this week. We were all out of room...Looking at: Of course, Cheap Trick; and, we'll be listening very carefully to Heart to see what's there... Wendy Waldman is under careful consideration...Also, Ambrosia is a band that we've passed on a number of times here, but 'Still Not Satisfied' shows a tremendous amount of promise...Van Halen selling very actively right away...And of course, Asia is maintaining #1...After that, there is a big gap with, interestingly, Aldo Nova making big moves...Sammy Hagar holding strong after his appearance here. Thanks to: Alan Rosenberg and the WEA staff again for having Sammy over. Wait till you catch his Guest DJ show...Starting to get some phones on: A Flock Of Seagulls. I can't tell you what Mike Bone had to do to his body to get the Seagulls on."

KZEW, DALLAS, TX M.D.-JANEL DOLAN: "Enjoyed seeing the Human League perform in Dallas on the 4th. They did a good job, and I can't wait to see how much they improve next time they tour in the U.S.... It is a true joy to add the Monroes to our playlist this week. 'What Do All The People Know' is a perfect radio song. Catchy beat, choice vocals, and clear production--this one is gonna be a smash... Giving Chas Sandford a good chance. We added 'Surrender' this week. An unusual album, but well worth trying out...The new Frankie Miller is kick-ass. Look for it to be a big success, especially with Texas rockers...Looking forward to adding: Bow-Wow-Wow, which is excellent; RPM; Split Enz; and, yes, Stevie Wonder...Kim Wilde's causing immediate phone response, as is: The Jam and A Flock Of Seagulls. Maybe progressive isn't bad after all."



**WLUP, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-SKY DANIELS:** "Record Of The Week: 'There She Goes Again', Marshall Crenshaw. Here I go again. There was so much great music out this week (as evidenced by the Front Page of the Sheet), I felt like it was '79 and I had just come to the Loop, my head swimming with excitement. Then I hear this record, with its direct 'no concessions to trends' approach, and I find another one of those artists that I love to support, even if it's something as small as Record Of The Week. I guess it's because I feel we're both hearing the same radio. It may not be the radio we hear in reality, but it sure in heaven is the radio we hear in our hearts...Now onto the rest. Every one is a ROTW in its own right: Cheap Trick, 'If You Want My Love'. Roy Thomas Baker and the band, with more personality than any since the Fab 4, give us another song that gives power pop a good name... Songwriters have had a field week. Another group that respects the craft of songwriting is Squeeze. Tilbrook and Difford painstakingly create songs like 'Black Coffee In Bed' and 'I've Returned', which upon immediate listening have the ring of classics...The Clash come back and make it possible for American radio to give them a chance. Check out: 'Should I Stay'...After the devastating impact of the single, one could expect a letdown from the album, but no--38 Special's 'Special Forces' is rippling with the same excitement, ESPECIALLY 'You Keep Running Away'...Men At Work. Irresistible hooks in this song. Bill tells me to keep my ear open for 'Down Under', which after listening to the 12" should be no problem...Finally, Frankie Miller, 'To Dream The Dream'. Ask Bob Seger who his favorite rock singer is, then ask a million Midwest rockers who their favorite singer is, then make the logical deduction...This is the kind of week that makes being a rock fan a way of life!!!"

**WMMR, PHILADELPHIA, PA P.D.-CHARLIE KENDALL:** "Our 4th anniversary party was absolutely phenomenal. Many thanks to: Bill Ham and Point Blank, Novo Combo, and Robert Hazzard And The Heroes (local Philadelphia legends). We broadcast it live in the presence of such notables as: Craig Lambert, Marko Babineau, Fred DeSipio, Jerry Jaffe, Jim Sotet, Randy Hock--the list goes on and on. Thanks for your support, and we plan to be around for another 14 at least (would you believe I'll be here too?)...What a marvelous record the Frankie Miller is. It's been awhile since I had a real tough time deciding on tracks. We went with: 'It's All Coming Down Tonight'. The song's got a great slow rumble--it builds and then takes it home...A super record from Stevie Wonder. Great to have him back on the radio with current product. It's a straight ahead rocker, and the message is in need of attention...As Kid Leo said last week--McCartney is gonna be a hit anyway, why not play it first? It's good...Also new: A Flock Of Seagulls. When they played in Philly last Sunday night, opening for Human League, they blew 'em off the stage. We're using: 'Space Age Love Song'...Also just got the Squeeze. Using: 'I've Returned'. It's pop, and it's nice 'n Squeezeable--play it... Kansas--I guess they'll be with us forever...My favorite new thing: The Clash."

**WMET, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-DAVE BENSON:** "WMET Adds: Nada! We're on hold for: The new Cheap Trick, 38 Special, Queen, Don Henley, Kansas, and Heart Lp's...Sales: Asia, Paul McCartney, Van Halen, Loverboy, and J.Geils Band Top 5...Guess what--I got nothing to say."

**KGB-FM, SAN DIEGO, CA M.D.-JUDY McNUTT:** "Let's talk about the Frankie Miller record. When Capitol's Scott Martin played me a cut and asked me to guess who it was, I said, 'Oh, a new Bob Seger, great!!' How embarrassing!! Actually, with repeated listens, it does sound like Frankie--so I guess Seger is the copycat. Actually, since they share songs, they're both legit. My favorite songs are: 'Firing Line' and 'Angels With Dirty Faces'. I also like: 'Don't Stop' (because that's my favorite phrase)... In San Diego, Elton is back!! Very respectable retail--not huge yet, but I think it will be... Speaking of huge, sales on the Van Halen record have surpassed even our diehard Van Halen lover's expectations...Love the new Heart album. They've finally come of age, even though they still don't have a sense of humor. Their sense of timing, maturity, and cadence are wonderful...Like the fact that the Marshall Crenshaw sounds terribly familiar on first listen. They manage to keep their energy high without blowing your eardrums out...I think Stevie Wonder's 'Front Line' is excellent. I really like it...Special thanks to: Larry for the 'Men At Work' T-shirt...Found some good music on our Inside Trax show, including: John Hiatt, 'This Secret Life'; Boomtown Rats, 'House On Fire'; Split Enz, 'Make Sense Of It'; Monroes, 'Hungry Stranger'; and, Bow-Wow-Wow, 'Cowboy' (I know it's twisted and sick, but I think it's fun)...We're getting excellent response on: The Girlschool album. The nice thing is that no one is confusing them with Pat Benatar, Heart, Go Go's, or any of the other female groups. And I'm not complaining about the other female groups--I'm not. I think it's about time we had 'too many' female artists to play. I notice we never have 'too many' male groups to play. Tits up on this one."

**WLWQ, COLUMBUS, OH M.D.-TIM SMITH:** "Best news of the week came on the Back Page of the Sheet dated April 30th and the debut of Girlschool at #49. The metal eaters in Columbus have been following this record here for 10 weeks, with steady, consistent increases in sales and requests. This stiff is worth a fuck, and we're firm believers that 'Hit And Run' is a hit album...Frankie Miller takes a couple of listens before it sinks in. 'It's All Coming Down Tonight' is the one track I keep going back to, and the strength will come from its similarity to Bob Seger's music and Robert Palmer's voice. With that music, we're talking solid familiarity...The Motels have that contemporary rock feel of Quarterflash, and time is passing by quickly for us to lock in on 'Only The Lonely' before the Top 40's grab it...You'll find more punch in the live Quarterflash 'Find Another Fool' 12". Definitely more energy, and the band's live performance is an added advantage programming wise. Perhaps somebody can explain what Quarterflash is doing at Charlie Daniels' 'Volunteer Jam'...McCartney is overcoming initial doubts. Pulling #8 phones, and tied with Van Halen for #3 retail. We've upped rotation and expanded cuts...Home listening is leaning towards: Wendy Waldman, A Flock Of Seagulls, Stevie Wonder, and Ambrosia."

**WAQX, SYRACUSE, NY P.D./M.D.-ED LEVINE:** "I had a chance this past week to see Rick Springfield in concert, and I'm left with several observations. First off, the guy, unquestionably, has major star quality. However, just as unquestionably, he has quite deliberately positioned himself out of being an album rock artist. While it's true that his audience was made up almost entirely of 13 year-old girls, the posing and posturing didn't have to be, and there is still a large degree of stage work necessary if he is to be considered a serious rock and roller. I'm no longer comfortable playing his records...Soft Cell has legitimately exploded in Syracuse. It moved retailwise from #24 to #16. It's #1 in requests by a 50% margin over the second tune, which is 'Heat Of The Moment'. Not too bad, considering we're the only station playing the record...The Heart 12" is a surprising favorite this week. I like the Rickie Lee Jones overtones, and have to give 'em credit for trying something different...Ditto for Kansas. If you didn't tell me, I wouldn't even know they changed lead singers...McCartney is back with a vengeance. The positive critical acclaim for the album turns into a massive #6 retail debut...Other movers of note: Asia remaining #1; Van Halen up to #3; Human League to #9; Huey Lewis & The News to #15; Jethro Tull #17; Charlie Daniels finally cracking the Top 20 at #19; and, Rainbow checking in at #21...By the time you read this, our long-awaited and greatly anticipated and much rumored and feared tower move will have taken place. For two years, we've been fighting a competitor that has an enormous signal advantage over us. Now our signal will be approximately 10 times the strength of what it is currently. In other words, instead of giving away 60% of the metro just on signal, that total will be down to about 20%. If you think we've made noise up until now, just watch. We've also got a great campaign featuring an animated TV spot, bus cards, and billboards to tell everybody that we're doing it, with our competitor currently in limbo and their future in question. 1982 is our year. More in Rock Wars next week...Personal to Tommy: Why are you getting so nasty? Don't blame me, just because you didn't get any of the jobs you went for. I even put a good word in for you."



It's got a helluva melody, and the interplay between the lead and supporting vocals on the chorus will hook you in. **WWCK, FLINT, MI M.D.-MARK MILLER:** "The Ambrosia album is simply amazing. It's great to find a record with so much depth these days. I can safely say there are at least four radio tracks. 'Still Not Satisfied' is our leader. 'Road Island' is the kind of record you always knew the band was capable of making but were never quite sure when they'd get around to doing it. Ambrosia is as smooth as black velvet and just as seductive...Frankie Miller also makes a very impressive showing with his latest. The cut 'Danger Danger' simply burns on the airwaves. It's impossible to sit still while listening. Bob Seger comparisons aside, Frankie does know how to rock on his own...And a couple of old stand-bys checked in: McCartney and Heart. It sort of amazes me. Only this morning I swore I would never play 'Tug Of War', but after a couple of hours of listening, the sheer magnitude of this project set in. Paul McCartney simply transcends any alleged problems, image or style. The man deserves airplay...The Heart single is obviously going to be a problem for some folks due to its pop-sounding influences. It sort of reminds me of Martha And The Vandellas meeting Rickie Lee Jones. The song is as infectious as hell and deserves to go on...If you haven't given Aldo Nova's 'See The Light' a serious listen yet, you really are missing what might eventually turn out to be the real standout track. We've been banging it since the beginning with great success. In fact, most of our phones come in for 'See The Light' as opposed to 'Fantasy'. I really don't mean to sound repetitive about this, but honestly, the song literally jumps out of the radio and smacks you right in the face. Just a note to the folks at Epic: A 12" on this one might be in order. Sometimes that's the only way people will listen. It takes a bit too much effort to flip a record over and go to the last track...Sincere apologies to: Linda Baker at Warner Bros. for being left out of last week's comments. 

WMJQ, ROCHESTER, NY M.D.-ROBERTA HABER: "I've got a lot to rant and rave about today, so please bear with me. First up: Marshall Crenshaw. This album is so fresh and cheerful, I want to reach out and pinch this boy's cheek. No fancy studio effects here, they aren't necessary. Marshall reminds us what a guitar, bass, drums, and a love of pure rock and roll can accomplish. You can make all the Buddy Holly comparisons you want, but I say this guy's an original. He's got a vision all his own...Next: Frankie Miller. It would be a massive understatement to say the man has paid his dues. He's always had the basic equipment--that marvelous gin-soaked, emotion-packed voice--but he was missing the songs. Now he's got 'em--a whole album of great rockers, ballads, and blues. Just drop the needle any place on this record, and you'll know that 1982 will finally be Frankie Miller's year...Squeeze's 'Tempted' was last year's surprise hit. Can they do it again? Yes, I say. The advance 12" contains three absolutely delightful songs, particularly 'Black Cup Of Coffee'. In a perfect world, these fellows would be stars...Good to hear Ambrosia sounding nastier these days, but they do seem a bit uncomfortable with the mean, lean rock machine approach. Mid-tempo rockers like 'How Can You Love Me' are tough enough (An aside to companies like Warner Bros. and Capitol, who are experimenting with high quality vinyl--Bravo!)...Could 'I Ran' from A Flock Of Seagulls be the next Soft Cell or Human League? Stay tuned for the answer to this and other questions...Looks like another hit record for Phil Seymour, and this time there's less cuteness and more rock and roll. Wouldn't it be ironic if Phil had a hit with a Dwight Twilley song?...MJQ Social Notes: On behalf of Tom Hunter, myself, and the staff of WMJQ, I'd like to thank Sandy Einstein of Nightmare, M.J. Caliendo of Columbia, and most of all, Journey, for the terrific 5-times platinum plaque. Saturday night, we were lucky enough to see 18,000+ people in Buffalo screaming their heads off for Journey. Greg Kihn opened the show with great style. Thanks to: M.J. and Barry Lyons (E/A) for the hospitality... Speaking of screaming people, Friday night it was Rick Springfield in Syracuse. Truly a wild scene which is beyond any description. Thanks to: Louise Patrick (RCA) for an experience I'll never forget...And, finally, thanks to: George Gerrity for visiting, even though I insulted his Van Halen album."

WHCN, HARTFORD, CT M.D.-BOB BITTENS: "It's time to put Stevie Wonder back on album rock radio. And as much as I hate to agree with Sebastian, I think 'Front Line' is the song to do it. From the very beginning, Stevie has been one of the classiest acts around. His music is great, and it deserves the exposure. And no matter how racist you think your audience is, an artist's skin color should never be a factor in determining airplay...It took a while to grow on me, but now I'm convinced that 'I'm Alive' by the Sherbs is one of the hottest songs around. It just jumps out of the radio. If you like their sound but haven't been able to decide on a cut, I suggest you listen to that one a high volume a couple of times...The Heart single is a bit disappointing. But thanks to local Epic promo man, Mike Caplan, I got to hear the rest of the album and it's hot. Some of the rockers sound like Led Zeppelin with Ann Wilson on vocals. Those of you who'd rather hear Annie scream than croon, have no fear--you will not be disappointed by the album...The new Ambrosia ain't half bad either. I always knew that a band that did such great songs as 'Nice Nice Very Nice' and 'Holding Onto Yesterday' could put together a classy album-rock oriented album...The Kansas single is an official add this week, even though it's been on the air here for three weeks already. This is another album that has all the elements of a major smash. They've tightened up the sound (no more 8-minute violin solos), and the new vocalist is even better than Steve Walsh...The only other add this week is: Frankie Miller. His album will fill the void nicely, while we wait for the next one from Bob Seger."

WPYX, ALBANY, NY P.D.-TED UTZ: "First off, I'd like to congratulate: Mr. and Mrs. Ron Nenni, who are now honeymooning in Hawaii--or did he just say mooning? Their wedding was a beautiful day. If you have a chance, see them, as it should be the finest show for them in the country...The Human League remains very strong, as does Soft Cell... The Scorpions are still climbing."



Oh sure, it's Bob Seger, Part 2, but Bob's gonna have a mighty big lead to follow with his next one after Frankie is done. 'Danger Danger' will start. And we're looking at: 'Don't Stop', 'Jealousy', 'Dream', and 'Angels' as well...Out-of-the-box on 38 Special, with three cuts deep in their finest Lp to date. **KBLE-FM, DES MOINES, IA P.D./M.D.-RON SORENSON:** "Marshall Crenshaw is the pick of the litter this week. Poppy, but punchy. Despite the look, the sound is spunk, not punk. We're playing 10 of the 12 tracks, led by: 'Someday', 'The Usual Thing', 'Cynical Girl', and 'Mary Ann'. It's destined to be one of KBLE's top 10 debuts of 1982...The Pinch Hits are rapidly becoming my favorite records. The Men At Work single arrived just at deadline and it went right on. Can't wait for the rest of it...Frankie Miller definitely rates an 'Easy Choice' for us. The next step over the edge is that crazy escalator ride to the top and, me thinks, with this album, Frankie has a spot reserved...As I listened to the Artimus Pyle album, I thought, 'Hey, this sounds as much like Marshall Tucker as it does Skynyrd.' When I checked out the producers, I understood why. The Artimus Pyle Band is thoroughly professional Southern rock and roll and is very definitely playable...Adds: Frankie Miller, Marshall Crenshaw, Men At Work, Melanie, Artimus Pyle Band, Ambrosia, Squeeze 12", Heart 12", Pat Metheny Group, and Skip Haines 12"."

**KTIM, SAN RAFAEL, CA M.D.-TRISH ROBBINS:** "My comments this week will be on records--music. Just the stuff that's really getting us off here at KTIM...Most favorite this week: The Monroes. Now we're talking Summer songs...Also out of nowhere, the Abba single 'Visitors'. Couldn't quite pass on it, ever. And when it hit the airwaves--wow!...Also, Karla Bonoff's 'Personally'...Michael Smotherman's 'Crazy In Love'...Wendy Waldman's whole album...Pat Metheny's new one is heavenly...Greg Kihn coming through strong...Haircut One Hundred is shakin' right along with the rest of them...Of course, Lou Ann Barton's 'Brand New Lover' is still one of the best songs I've heard all year...Along with Chubby's 'Harder Than Diamond', 'Rosanna' from Toto, 'Only The Lonely' from the Motels, and Graham Parker has a number of excellent songs on his 'Another Grey Area' Lp...Ray Parker still sounds funky...As does Thin Lizzy's 'Renegade' and Renee Geyer's 'Good Lovin'...We are, 'Rocking the Bay'."

**KNAC, LONG BEACH, CA P.D./M.D.-JIMMY CHRISTOPHER:** "Happy Cinco de Mayo, Senors and Senoritas...Getting down to the music. Jim Carroll we did last week. I like the title, 'Still Life', and 'Jody'...New Math, a San Francisco band on 415 Records, have an Ep called 'They Walk Among You'...Another Bay area band, Chrome Dinette, has a real nice sounding 12" 45 that's called 'Robot Love' and 'Can't Live Without You'. Both of these grow on you...The Other Woman' by Ray Parker, Jr. and the Clash Imp 45 are hot on our turntable. The Clash album is due May 24th...Stiff Little Fingers has a wonderful Imp 45 with 'Talk Back' being my favorite...The Squeeze Ep with Elvis Costello on vocals on 'Coffee In Bed' sounds okay...A local band, T.S.O.L. (True Sounds Of Liberty), has released an Ep on Faulty Products with 'Work Is' a nice choppy ska sounding single. The vocals kind of sound like early Chambers Bros...Hurricane Jones' new single on MSI is pretty neat, and there's also a French version...We finally discovered the art rock of Laurie Anderson...Moving onto other things, we've interviewed John Hiatt and we did a show with him at the Rumble Seat Garage in Long Beach on April 29...Last Saturday, May 1, we simulcast an hour of MTV in conjunction with TM Cablevision of Long Beach...In celebration of the Split Enz concert at the Hollywood Palladium we gave away Split Enz tickets, limosine ride to the show, and 10 haircuts to winners courtesy of Fame Haircuts...Finally, the Dodger/Angel Report returns to KNAC 3 times a day; and, we're checking the surf out on the Surf Report mornings, Monday thru Saturday...To Roy Rosenberg: If you're out there, give me a call. Let's talk about the Dodgers and their troubles."

**WQBK, ALBANY, NY P.D.-JOHN COOPER:** "Merv Amols, who has been promoting Capitol Records in this market since before I was born, continues his excellent job. Merv certainly has some fine records to work. The Motels are receiving more and more airplay, with requests for the single and the infectious 'Mission Of Mercy'...Frankie Miller's new album is a solid 'Hard Choice', with Frankie's usual fine vocals and words to match, and the Muscle Shoals people providing the punch this time. 'Danger, Danger' is a hot one...Speaking of hot, over the weekend the temperature was in the mid-70's (hot for around here), and I was in the car with the windows down and the radio up to the tune of Marshall Crenshaw's Lp. What a record! Pure pleasure for Summer weather. 'There She Goes Again', 'Some Day', and especially 'Mary Ann' are the Q104 cuts...Personals: Congratulations to Ron Nenni and best of luck. It's the most fun you'll ever have. However, Ron, remember where records like Human League, Soft Cell, and A Flock Of Seagulls started in this market...Hi to: Wolmark, Steve Huntington, Ron Rizzi, Ray White, and Tom Starr...Thanks to everyone in Journey and to Jay Miggins of CBS for the platinum Journey. It's great to see a band of their stature care enough to remember how important Q104 and all of radio is. Thanks, guys!"

**WOUR, UTICA/SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM STARR:** "Of all the artists that deserve to bust loose on the national airplay front, it's difficult to think of one more deserving than Frankie Miller. This one comes out-of-the-chute sounding stronger than any of his past efforts. Since we've been with him all along, it goes without saying that this one is an immediate add, too...I'm playing catch-up with the Motels. It took me a while to come around, but this really is a super record and is destined to be a major airplay item well into the Summer...Great phones continue for: Van Halen, John Cougar, McCartney, Elton, Rainbow, Joan Jett, Toto, and Asia...But the real phone-mauler is 'Family Man' by Mike Oldfield. When I saw that this space cadet was back on the scene, I certainly didn't expect a song that ranks in the Top 5 phone-generators among new product in the last few years. The response is absolutely amazing, and all positive. Even though it sounds like techno-rock, it's got just enough gritty rock and roll elements to make it translate perfectly to the core audience."

**WHFS, BETHESDA, MD P.D./M.D.-DAVID EINSTEIN:** "Marshall Crenshaw is good, solid pop. After a couple of listenings these hooks are embedded ten feet deep...Speaking of deep, the Kim Wilde Lp won't let go either. This is not an album from a single, but rather one that contains British chart-toppers. How come it's so 'progressive' over here?...Also enjoying the Squeeze Ep, and looking forward to the Lp...Pat Metheny's new Lp is as fresh and pleasant as ever. Favorite tracks include: 'Eighteen', 'Barcarole'. Did Stevie Wonder walk through the studio when they were recording 'Are You Going With Me?'...Import and domestic Clash singles in with the Lp soon."

**WBAB, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-RALPH TORTORA:** "I have to admit I'm very happy at album rock's acceptance, once again, of Stevie Wonder. 'Front Line' is a great song, and it deserves airplay...It's good to have Frankie Miller back. Capitol could pull another Bob Seger. 'To Dream The Dream' would make a great single, and 'Don't Stop' is my personal favorite...Marshall Crenshaw's album is one I truly enjoyed listening to; and, hopefully, the audience will agree. The music is bright, punchy, and perfect for the Summertime...Thanks to: Pete Way from UFO, Kim Wilde, John Cougar, and Human League for stopping by this week...P.S. To those who care: There's a little Tortora coming in the near future (January, '83)!"

**WGIR-FM, MANCHESTER, NH M.D.-KAREN ANDERSEN:** "First of all, thanks to Debby and the folks at WEA, Boston, for a night with Asia. They carry so much equipment, and have such a large set-up for the stage, they've bumped several opening acts already. Geoff Downes' synthesizers are enough to do that job alone! The show was excellent! I'm always up for a healthy dose of British rock and I never tire of Steve Howe's acoustic pieces. I was disappointed; however, that the houselights came on before they got a chance to do 'Man With A Golden Arm' as a second encore. It was also a pleasure to meet the band after the show...To Mike Bushey: I wasn't kidding! You might see two GIR people come tromping into WBLM soon...In the hit-single-on-the-horizon dept.: Kim Wilde's 'Kids In America'. Besides being a good tune, Summer's coming and kids of all ages are gonna need a fresh-sounding anthem--and here it is...I've got one add in the add dept., and that's John Cougar."

The computerized synthesizer displays, lighting, and stage set truly enhanced the superb musicianship of each group member. I was having rushes singing along, dancing in the aisles. I might add the audience enthusiasm was so intense that it could only be compared to the Stones show. They certainly lived up to all expectations and with the excellent new material they performed, there's obviously no problem for a sequel to their current classic album...All went well at the NJBA. The Kal and Bill tag-team was quite a treat and a special highlight was Charlie Daniels' visit. Kent Burkhart had some excellent answers although I strongly disagree that there is no classic new music being released these days. Steve Leeds and Lisa Tonnaci are true professionals, but the big h-i-t of the day was the Chrysalis/Huey Lewis News van. Thanks to all who came from out of state, including Larry Berger, Jim Monaghan, and Bruce Bond...Is it true Mike Bone has a purple Mohican? Mike, you're strange but we love you anyway...Thanks to Howard Bernstein for bringing Kim Wilde out for an interview and pictures. She's even better in person, and we wish her the very best. Her album is doing well here in North Jersey... John Cougar did a great interview also last week. We appreciate it very much...Love the Rock Wars series. Well done, Bill...We love John Elefante, the new lead singer with Kansas. Can't wait for the rest of the album...New Heart single is growing on me. Hearing it on the air next to some early Motown material is great...Dave, we finally gave in and went with Iron Maiden --so, Eddie won't come get us... Frankie Miller is an absolutely outstanding album. We're fighting over which cuts to play as it's not easy to choose...Love the Marshall Crenshaw album, and especially looking forward to meeting him at our big Open House party this weekend...Hot album adds just making it before print deadline: Cheap Trick, 38 Special and Squeeze. 'Black Coffee' is a classic cut! More on these next week...Requests: Asia, Joan Jett and Iron Maiden...Sales: Asia, Go Go's, Joan Jett, Van Halen and Human League."

**KEZO, OMAHA, NB M.D.-GREG GILLISPIE:** "Adds this week: Toto 'Afraid Of Love'--#11 sales off Top 40 play can't be all bad so we'll use 'Afraid Of Love' by Toto for daytime only...Last week we played the McCartney album in its entirety and got 92% positive response with the average age being 25 and favorite cuts 'The Pound Is Sinking' and 'Ballroom Dancing'...Aldo Nova continues to hold down the top spot on the phones. If you're looking for a good second track, 'Hot Love' gets the call...Also h-o-t on the phones this week: Van Halen, Asia, Scorpions, and Human League. So far we've only gotten one negative on Human League...And the Scorpions continue to build both on the phones and in sales...Top sales this week: Van Halen, Asia, Chariots, McCartney, Go Go's, J.Geils, Aldo Nova, Joan Jett, Rick Springfield, and Loverboy...Upon the first couple listenings to the new Artimus Pyle Band, I'm not real impressed. Sounds like they need more song writing input...I hope the new Heart album is better than the single, otherwise they'll have a real image problem...Finally, the audience seems to like Kansas after a week of play. I think it sounds just okay, but evidently people have been waiting for something good from this band for a while!"

**WMAD, MADISON, WI M.D.-DALE WOLTER:** "God, this is a tough time of year to be adding music! There's just so much good stuff out there! With the onslaught of Arbitron and the amount of major acts releasing material, it makes the going real difficult in terms of giving some of these new artists the attention they deserve...We did, however, manage to sneak a debut in this week and it's Chas Sandford. The album is still growing on me but it's sounding better with each listen...We all got a chance to check out the new Cheap Trick and I tell ya, Robin Zanders' voice sounds just great! The album is quick, to the point, and full of fine rock and roll. 'She's Tight' and 'If You Want My Love' grab the greatest share of attention...In sales, Paul McCartney takes top honors this week with Van Halen, Rick Springfield, Asia, and the Human League not far behind...Special thanks to everyone at Epic for their help in making our Cheap Trick, Heart and Kansas Listening Party such a smash! Here's to future endeavors and hopefully the idea will catch on with all other labels."

**WKQQ, LEXINGTON, KY M.D.-DAVE KRUSENKLAUS:** "Added two records this week that I talked about very positively last week. I think the up-tempo sound of 'How Can You Love Me' from Ambrosia will get it played on album radio, despite the image of the band...Also went with Chas Sandford this week. Although this record may not break the sales barriers wide open, I think that given Mr. Sandford's talent, he'll be money-in-the-bank soon for Elektra/Asylum. And, I hate to swim against the tide, but I like 'Temptation' best on this record...Marshall Crenshaw is as much fun as a day on the beach! The songs on this record took me back to Buddy Holly, Tommy Roe, Ricky Nelson, and others. I think that one or two songs will definitely pop and be hit singles. I like pretty much the songs that were picked in the Choice; however, I think there was one left out: Check out 'Marianne' on side 2...I also found the Stevie Wonder song, 'Front Line' to be quite enjoyable. Records like Stevie Wonder, Ray Parker, Jr. and Chubby Checker, not only open up some interesting food for thought on current records, but for reccurents as well. Being in a conservative market at a station that's trying to increase females and 25-32 year old listeners, I have found that old Jimi Hendrix and Cream in the rotation (though valuable for my rockers) are not enough to attain certain desired demographic increases. I have found that the boundaries have to be stretched a bit. As Bob Hattrik said in Radio And Records this week, he has found a need for more variety and a bit more depth in the oldies. Whether that means we'll begin playing 'Sir Duke' from Stevie Wonder in the oldies, I've not quite made that decision yet. But, if an album station wants to expand beyond 18-24, certain sound changes might have to be started...If you'd like to take an upclose and personal look at the girl on the Charlie album covers, check out the latest issue of Playboy. You'll see more than you saw on the album cover!"

**KILO, COLORADO SPRINGS, CO M.D.-ART PHILLIPS:** "The Son of Seger Award goes to Frankie Miller. There truly isn't a bad track on the record and although our fearless editor is drooling over 'Dirty Faces', I promise you 'Don't Stop' is the key cut here...Monroes are sounding better with each spin. The production on 'People' is superb...We're giving the Plimsouls a shot on 'A Million Miles Away'. I think there was a reluctance on the part of programmers to try this one when the Plimsouls lost their major label status. But, listen to this song and the hook will knock you over...Applause to MCA for the excellent edit on 'Cat People' and good job on the Outlaw remixes. This is the kind of response radio is looking for from record companies."

**KSMB, LAFAYETTE, LA P.D.-SCOTT SEGRAVES:** "Listeners don't all suffer from the labelitis, we do... McCartney Instant phones...No negs on Motels or A Flock of Seagulls...Phones still building on Human League... Now we factor in the tastiness of Nowherefast and The Monroes...Where is all this heading? Even with an occasional chainsaw Charlie hollering his lack of awareness when we roll a Bowie or Queen, it looks like 'Top 40 of the 80's' may actually be becoming just that. Sorry for you folks in markets with so many rockers that you have to keep it metal modal. It's getting nice to be able to play some variety!... Home turntable power rotation: Chas Sandford, Stevie Wonder, Alliance, Phil Seymour and Jon and Vangelis...P.S.: To make it fair to all, our playlist changes will be available from Marsha at 3:30PM each Tuesday."

**WBLM, LEWISTON/PORTLAND, ME M.D.-JOSE DIAZ:** "Frankly, I can't even detect a difference in lead vocalists on the new Kansas single. 'Play The Game Tonight' is a strong song and should do well for the band...The Paul McCartney album is incredibly good considering the stuff he's been giving us the last few years. We expect to be using a number of cuts off the album as time goes on...We are already getting good phone reaction to 'Hurts So Good' by John Cougar, especially among the women... 'I'm Alive' by the Sherbs is one of the better things on the air right now. It's a very dynamic record that shouldn't turn anybody off...The Motels continue to astound everybody, especially since it is starting to develop a good retail pattern. We have believed in this band over the years and it's good to see them come out with such a wonderful album...Many thanks to WB, specifically Geffen Records, for a good interview with Carl Palmer. It sounds like this band is no flash-in-the-pan."

**WKWF, KEY WEST, FL P.D./M.D.-BRUCE YOUNGBLOOD:** "The Conch Republic still lives--we won't give up till the U.S. Border Patrol does! I have a song called 'Borderline' by the Mangrove Liberation Front, if any adventurous radio stations would like a copy--let me know...Our adds: Frankie Miller, John Cougar, Ambrosia, Mike Oldfield, Artimus Pyle, Magnum, Richard and Linda Thompson, RPM, Iron Maiden, Stranger... Singles: Heart and Kansas...New Wave Feature: Laurie Anderson...All That Jazz: Phil Manzanera."

**WQDR, RALEIGH, NC M.D.-BOB WALTON:** "This had to be the most difficult music meeting in quite some time. We were looking at about 14 records and only had about 4 spaces to put them in, but we got it hammered out...The Stevie Wonder is nearly an automatic for us, a tip of the cap to Bill for the tip! Bill's right, it's a h-o-t song and rock and roll is color blind...Kansas is also in the realm of automatic. It's their strongest in many years, instant response on the phones. I can't help but wonder how Steve Walsh feels about so many people saying that he won't be missed...Our picks of the week: 1) the Marshall Crenshaw. I haven't heard it too many times cause Ron won't take it off his turntable. Forget the pre-release hype. This is good, peppy rock and roll...And 2)(my favorite), The Monroes. This has h-i-t written all over it! It sounds like a cross between the Records 'Starry Eyes' and Split Enz 'I Got You'. If this isn't a smash, I'm going to find a job flipping hamburgers...The other records we are still looking at that I feel are real strong are Frankie Miller, A Flock of Seagulls, and Split Enz. I'd like to be first in line for a T-shirt or poster of the Ambrosia cover and I can't wait for the new album from AXE. That is some of the hottest rock and roll without abrasiveness that I have heard in a long time. Classy stuff...To Sean Coakley: This is the first time that I've had a cassette that skips...The Elton John is looking real strong for us. It debuted Top 15 sales and Pete Townshend on guitar is a great tie-in...We've increased rotation of Jethro Tull. We're also playing 'Fallen On Hard Times' just because it's so apropos. We're seeing very good phones and Top 10 sales...Two observations: Do the British get American mixes of Genesis albums? And Bob Bailey wins this month's firm grasp of reality award--Fuck art, let's make a buck. Our careers will last longer!"

**WWV, CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA P.D.-JAY LOPEZ:** "Adds: Frankie Miller: 'Angels With Dirty Faces' and 'To Dream The Dream'...The Jim Carroll Band 'Work Not Play'...Chas Sandford 'Surrender' and 'Temptation'...Kansas 45... Marshall Crenshaw 'Some Day Some Way' and 'Cynical Girl'...Considering and Testing: Sparks and Bow-Wow-Wow...Top local record sales: Rick Springfield, Joan Jett, Asia, Go Go's, Human League, and Charlie Daniels...Increased record sales on: Toto and Paul McCartney...Newcomers selling well: David Bowie, Franke And The Knockouts, Elton John and Robert Palmer...I'd like to thank Motown Records once again for their excellent service. Now we can hear what the songs sound like! This allowed us to up the rotation...The Heart and Kansas singles are not obvious signature songs for them, but it's nice to see the evolution of these bands...Ambrosia apparently has abandoned their mush for rock. This wasn't the type of texture I expected, judging from their previous works, and it was a pleasant surprise...The R.O.S.E. Radiothon is off and running. Top Sales: Asia, Loverboy, Iron Maiden, Van Halen, and Paul McCartney."

**KKRQ, IOWA CITY, IA M.D.-TED BURTON JACOBSEN:** "Adds: Heart 12", Kansas 12", Ambrosia, Alliance, Bow-Wow-Wow, Squeeze, Jim Carroll, Frankie Miller, Artimus Pyle, Stevie Nicks re-add, & Bonnie Raitt (re-add)...Ladies of Heart roll on, not afraid to try a new direction while still holding on to their root...The Ambrosia record blends a good drive time sound with enough rock to get the job done. We'll start with the 'How' track...The smooth sound of Alliance is gonna sound good. A shake of the hand to the people at Handshake... 'I Want Candy' can't be denied! All I can say is arf, arf and bow, wow, wow!...The new Squeeze record sticks to the memory like a stain on your notebook!"

**WDEK, DEKALB, IL M.D.-BRIAN LEONARD:** "Adds: Monroes, Nowherefast, Pat Metheny, Stevie Wonder, BeBe And The Guns, Squeeze 12", and Heart 12"...Stevie Wonder can do no wrong in my ears and he lives up to my expectation. I wish there were more new songs but I embrace these four warmly...Squeeze has returned with a real nice follow-up...Pat Metheny, while not an album for everyone, goes straight into h-o-t rotation...And gee, the Tammy Faye/Jim Baker album on PTL Records would be added but, due to the equal time provisions, I'd have to add Ozzy Osbourne. So, I'll have to pass on both...Hots for this week include: Haircut One Hundred, Greg Kihn, Asia, Motels, Graham Parker, Elton John, Jethro Tull, Dave Edmunds, Big Twist, Toto, Huey Lewis, Pat Metheny, John Cougar, Rick Springfield, Fay Ray and Aldo Nova."

**WYMX, AUGUSTA, GA M.D.-MARY PILLINGER:** "Adds: Eye To Eye, Sparks, Sherbs, John Hiatt...The Paul McCartney album sets a new record in our Augusta Guinness Book, selling the most copies of an album in its one week debut. Of course, the name itself is worth the money spent, but the album must have some socially redeeming factor to accomplish this Augusta first, and the album does! 'Ebony And Ivory', 'Take It Away', 'Ballroom Dancing', 'The Pound' and even the funky Wonder/McCartney tune which will be big other formats are great. McCartney debuts at #2 this week, second only to Van Halen...Asia and John Cougar continue to build #5 and #7 respectively...Toto was a near miss in the Top 10. 'Rosanna' is incredibly strong with upper demos...Other prime movers: Soft Cell 22-16; David Bowie 24-18; Greg Kihn 25-19; and Karla Bonoff 33-23...We're now seeing Eye To Eye what all the raves have been about. 'Nice Girls' is a tasteful and slick number with crisp, clean vocals...We also decided to 'Ride Tonight' with the Sherbs. Production on this piece is excellent! The hooks reach out and grab ya and you just can't let go...The same is true of the Sparks. 'I Predict' (or Queen meets Billy Squier). Get into the beat, then the lyrics, and before you know it, you've been snagged again...And finally, it's 'All Of A Sudden' (a few sudden moons later) for John Hiatt, 'Look For Love'. This one caught our attention from the start and now; hopefully, it'll catch somebody else's attention and give Hiatt a shot at the major leagues."

**WRNW, BRIARCLIFF MANOR, NY M.D.-PAT PRINCIPATE:** "What a weekend! Graham Parker (thanks Jeff), Sammy Hagar and Asia (thanks Valerie), a great line-up of talent this past weekend and I'm grateful to everyone who gave me the chance to catch it all. And, thank you, Cynthia Kitay for that extra Parker show...Asia, though, was the biggest thrill for me and while I sat through the show all smiles, I wondered was I smiling because of the music I was hearing or because of the tremendous artists on stage? Two of whom I hadn't seen in years (Carl Palmer and Steve Howe), and two I've never seen (John Wetton and Geoff Downes) but who convinced me quickly of their talent. Carl Palmer is still a machine! ## Question Of The Week

This week we asked our reporters a potentially dangerous question: "If you could ask Lee Abrams, John Sebastian, and Jeff Pollack each one question, what would that question be?" Some of the respondents would ask the gentlemen each the same question. Next week, ROCK WARS goes to Syracuse, NY.

STEVE FEINSTEIN, WYSP: "I'd ask each one of them the same question. What distinguishes what you have to offer radio stations from your competitors? In other words, what can you offer a client that your competitors can't?"

DAVE BENSON, WMET: "Abrams: Do you really consult my station?... Sebastian: How much do you plan on making this year?... Pollack: Do you really remember meeting me at the NAB?"

SKY DANIELS, WLUP: "Abrams: I was gonna be funny and ask the same question for all three, which is, am I not the greatest music director you know? But in seriousness, to Lee Abrams: Do you feel your outside involvement and the sheer number of clients you have has created a diluted impact on your service?... Sebastian: Are you concerned that there may be too strict a reliance on call-out research?... Pollack: What is the basis for a lot of the early adds you make. Is it gut instinct or effective promotion?"

CHARLIE KENDALL, WMMR: "Abrams: Are you gonna help me make history in Philadelphia, or what?... Pollack: Why don't you give up?... Sebastian: Who does your hair?"

DAVE LANGE, WDVE: "Abrams: Is it true that you played all Steve Howe's guitar parts on the Asia album while he and his wife were at Lamaze classes?... Pollack: Who are your mystery consulted stations?... Sebastian: What's this I hear about a 'Sebastian 2' format?"

DICK BASCOM, WQXM: "Abrams: How much money do you make a year?... Sebastian: Do you really think call-out works?"

ROBERTA HABER, WMJQ: "One question for all: Does radio have a responsibility to lead as well as to follow?"

ED LEVINE, WAQX: "Abrams: What's it like to be a millionaire?... Sebastian: Where do you buy your suits?... Pollack: Still hard feelings about WZIR?"

ALAN SNEED, KSRR: "Abrams: After so many years of consulting, do you feel that you have lost touch with the street?... Sebastian: Do you feel, after a certain period of time, the stations need to move out of so much dependence on call-out records and move into an area more concerned with active listeners?... Pollack: Do you feel that you have reversed yourself in terms of your approach to call-out from the days when you were a front line programmer?"

JUDY MCNUTT, KGB-FM: "Sebastian: Can unfamiliar music successfully be tested? And if so, is David Gariano really as charming in person as he is in person?... Pollack: Do you recognize this song?... Abrams: What's under your hat?"

JERRY MEINERS, WLRS: "For all three: What's on TV tonight?"

BOB FEINEIGLE, E/P/A: "Did any of you read Joe Maita's comments last week in the Lieberman Call? What did you think?"

JOEL WEBBER, INDEPENDENT: "Where do you get your balls?"

MIKE BONE, ARISTA: "Abrams: What words of advice would you give to Bob Hattrik?...Pollack: Who are your secret clients?...Sebastian: Do you plan on seriously integrating new music (i.e. Human League, A Flock Of Seagulls) into your format and why/why not?"

ROBIN WREN, EPIC: "To all three: Why don't you return phone calls? Why don't you care to talk to music people any more? Basically, we are all trying to attain the same goals, aren't we?"

JOSE DIAZ, WBLM: "For all three: If you were stranded on a desert island, what records would you want to have with you?"

GLORIA JOHNSON, KGON: "For all three: Tell the truth now, aren't you really in it for the money? How many new records do you listen to in a week?"

DOUG PODELL, KQRS: "Sebastian: Why pre-programming?...Pollack: Why call-out research?...Abrams: What happened?"

MIKE LYONS, WDIZ: "Abrams: Can you wait another 6 months before I pay you back the money I owe you?...Sebastian: Name: Mike. Station: \_\_\_?...Pollack: Jeff, are you like Lee or John?"

BOB MAJERSKY, WXUS: "How do they research brand new music that nobody has ever heard before?"

KAREN ANDERSEN, WGIR-FM: "Sebastian: Are Survivor and Shooting Star really testing that well?...Kent Burkhardt: Who does your hair?...Pollack: Is it true that in order to trim down the amount of consultants in the field, you and Bobby Hattrik are gonna form a dual consultancy?"

DAVID FILIPOV, WBRU: "How do you sleep?"

DAVE KRUSENKLAUS, WKQQ: "I would ask where they see the album rock of the future, whether it would remain 12-24 years old or go beyond that. I would also ask for a frank answer as to whether or not there are morale problems with their announcers because of the controls that are put on their day to day airshift, i.e., picking their music and the creativity and personality that's not allowed."

JEFF JENSEN, KLOL: "Pollack: Do people mispronounce your last name and call you polock?...Sebastian: Why don't you drop in more often? We'd love to see you...Abrams: Can we use your subway in Houston for a while?"

DAVE KANE, WCMF: "Why are you all so worried about what the other guy is doing?...With alternative types of music selling better than typical radio fare, why are you still reluctant to get behind any of the 'new' music?"

RICK ALLISON, WPLR: "How much tighter can it get?"

JIMMY CHRISTOPHER, KNAC: "How come you all play the same thing? How come you don't play any new music?"

TOM NAST, WSYR: "Who's your accountant?"

TRISH ROBBINS, KTIM: "I would ask each of them the very same questions: Why do the station charts have to be so small? And why the crushing of new talents by lack of exposure. What are you afraid of? Do you enjoy listening to what you have programmed?"

TED UTZ, WPYX: "Sebastian: What happened to WCOZ?...Pollack: Will you please send me those Led Zeppelin bootlegs?...Jon Sinton: I wouldn't put it into print...Abrams: Have you seen Wrongway Hudson lately?"

STEW SCHANTZ, WPDH: "I have one question for all of them: Why?"

BUCK MCWILLIAMS, WIOT: "The question I would ask of all three is: Who cuts your hair?"

BRUCE GOLDSSEN, WRKI: "I would probably ask Sebastian, why didn't he really come up with a long term plan once the novelty of what he's doing in a particular market wears off?"

BRUCE BOND, WZZO: "The same question for all three would be: Has your lifestyle changed significantly since becoming a millionaire?"

BILL SIMMONS, WMYK: "I don't have a question for Pollack...Abrams: Where can I find a major market gig that pays at least 70 grand a year?...Sebastian: Where can I find a major market gig that pays at least 75 grand a year?"

JACK DANIELS, WROQ: "Abrams: Do you see a danger in too much research?...Sebastian: Please define album-oriented radio in the 80's...Pollack: Would you also please define album-oriented radio in the 80's?"

TOM STARR, WOUR: "Abrams: What is reality?...Sebastian: What's your shoe size?...Pollack: Why is the sky blue?"

BOB LINDER, WDHA: "I'll ask them all one question: Since your track records seem to be based only on Arbitron results, what rationalization or explanations have you planned in case things don't go as hoped for? Behind this question is my thinking that it's time the radio industry stopped putting so much importance on one company's numbers. Although we're quite proud and satisfied with our independent programming efforts, we appreciate the greater efforts at professionalism that you've made for the radio industry. We only would urge that you consider more new music."

ILYSE GOTTLIEB, WRXL: "Bachelor #1: How much and what specifics do you recommend program directors know about sales?...Bachelor #2: If a station in a size of a market like Richmond has \$50,000 allocated for outside promotion, would you recommend TV or Billboard?...And Bachelor #3: What are you doing musically and promotionally to target 25-34's?"

**RECORD ACTION CONTINUED**

**STEVE BRACK, BOARDWALK RECORDS (213-656-2840):** "On your desk today is the 12" version of 707's 'Megaforce'. Produced by Keith Olsen, I think you will agree 707 has come a long way. The album will be released in 2 weeks and features 4 killer album rock cuts. They will be opening for REO Speedwagon this Summer across the country and look to finally reach the top as they added a new member to their group, and have come through with the right material."

**JOEL NEWMAN, HANDSHAKE RECORDS (213-655-8635):** "Join the Alliance. This Detroit-based band has broken open in the Southwest, initially. With excellent production by Ron and Howard Albert, superstrong lead vocals by Mark Bucchare, this band can cover hard album rock stations as well as soft album rock stations. Cuts that were added initially are as follows: 'Love On The Line', 'How Does It Feel', 'Make It Right'. Check it out, it's hot."

**ROGER LIFESET, PEER PRESSURE PROMOTIONS (213-506-0771):** "The purpose of this prose is to get you off your posterior and join in for a walk down the 'great, straight, white, Front Line'. It's a combination of some of the finest material currently available. First, Stevie Wonder. The most prolific superstar of our time has put his ass on the 'front line' for you. Will you put your ears on the 'front line' for him? You say 'Ebony And Ivory' is too saccharin for your rock and roll troupes? Does the word 'funk' still compute? I say yes! Funkier than zoo dirt and a bonafide smash, many will go out on a limb for this work. Thank you Bill, for putting your butt up here with the rest of us Motown mercenaries. At worst, you have a tremendous greatest hits package that should remind your conscience of the last time you gave Stevie his due. More next week. P.S. The word 'no' does not compute...Secondly, Magnum. It's been 3 weeks since release and our list of supporters number 45 with virtually half being key 'superstar' outlets. Eighty per cent of our adds have converted into chart positions after only a week. 'Walkin' The Straight Line' is one of those homogenized tracks that sounds like several different successful bands, and that's the key. Familiarity! The listener hears it once and swears they've heard it before, an important factor to many who are modal... Lastly, The Pointers! Have you hooked into the 'Great White'? I feel in my bones this is a rock classic along the lines of 'Green Grass' or 'Freebird'. It will take a minimum of 5 weeks of serious airplay to establish it as a phone-burner, but it will happen. Phase two of Point Blank means the A team of musical mercenaries have been kicked in. Our thrust will be to replace 'Let Her Go' in many cases with 'Great White Line', or 'Don't Look Down'. Get with it on the 'great, straight, white, front line'. You'll have a lot of company."

**SEAN COAKLEY, ATCO (212-484-6400):** "I realize that a great many programmers have a low opinion of their audiences' ability to comprehend rock with even a hint of intelligence. The stuff we hear on today's album radio is so often predictable and familiar (i.e., safe). Yet, every so often a record comes out that is hugely different (The Police, Gary Numan, Go Go's), and radio's wall of resistance slowly crumbles with the discovery of audience acceptance. Jim Carroll fits easily into this category. 'People Who Died' burned up the request lines a year-and-a-half ago. This new album is musically superior. Every song here will get response. This isn't an artist who'll spoon-feed 'em dumb rock (remember that one, Bill?). His music is direct, uncompromising, and it works. Play it!...The Sherbs are on over 100 stations with just about everyone reporting that it gets stronger with every listen...Watch out for Axe. To borrow an appropriate metaphor: A five hundred foot home run. You'll have it Thursday... Personals: Drake: Why does Garrett keep calling me?...Michele: Loved that guitar wiz. Let's get him signed...Janel: I've entered you into the Indianapolis 500, okay?"

**JIMMY MACK, STIFF RECORDS (212-431-1600):** "Ladies and gentlemen--Will you welcome please, for the first time on the Bill Hard Airplay Index, it's Girlschool! Yes, Girlschool! Those four British post-pubescent purveyors of feminine heavy metal hygiene have at last bullied their way into that elite ranking of corporate priorities and metal megastars. Chills run through my diseased body at the very thought. Stiff has its first airplay entity since God or Roy Rosenberg knows when. Thus, another batch of excuses not to play 'Race With The Devil' or 'Hit And Run' are rendered impotent. It's perfectly legitimate to wait until an album has top 50 airplay to add it. So, now you can. To question whether a company the size of Stiff Records has the muscle to follow through on airplay commitments is certainly justified. Well, now we have. Also completely valid to wonder if airplay will garner listener reaction. Well, we've managed to chart with only three dozen or so Hard stations reporting the record. In other words, the reaction at those stations is so strong that the lack of volume is insignificant. So there you have it. No more reasons to hold off playing the freshest, toughest, real rock and roll album around. The girls have finished their 'lock up your sons' tour and are plotting a Summer return to our shores. Los Angeles was leveled by 3 sold-out shows at The Whiskey and The Country Club. The girls show up for Love KROQ interview, the Go Go's show up at the gigs (Girlschool even dedicated ZZ Top's 'Tush' to them), Kenny Ryback shows up everywhere, and Mike Bone shows up looking like Wendy O. Williams on acid. In my hometown, Dana Jang, Jon Russell, Trish Robbins, Lori Cobb, Kate Ingram, Sheila Renay, and Ted Burton-Jacobsen show up for a disgusting record company gathering at San Francisco's infamous Stud, a personal fave. The Waldorf is sold-out. The girls took over KROQ and KUSF. And I passed out. Thankfully, my face has cleared up...And Judy, you are a wonderful woman for taking my comments this late."

**ALAN WOLMARK, ATLANTIC (212-484-6017):** "Great to see everyone on my recent jaunt to check out the opening of the Sparks tour. Tommy and Ruth; Al Peterson (I've never seen anyone look so L.A. in just two months); Rick Carroll (trooper of the month--how did we ever get you out of that hot tub?); Mr. Groves (Lookin' great and KROQ sounds incredible--spread the news from sea to shinin' sea); Good Luck to Joe Folger; great to finally put a face to Doug Clifton's voice (check all mail from McDonald's!); Strider, you're a gem, and thanks to John Duncan for always having a smile and being the world's greatest girl watcher (next to me, of course)...Now for the meat: Sparks is an incredibly exciting live act, and their opening date at The Whiskey was recorded by the BBC 'Rock Hour' for early June. As of this moment, if you're not on 'I Predict', you're late. This record is breaking like wildfire and that's album rock and Top 40...John Martyn (blessed by the magical hands of Phil Collins) looks about ready to go all the way. Check out some of our colleagues' comments about 'Couldn't Love You More'...Helen Schneider's gutsy 12" of 'Rock And Roll Gypsy' is hot, as well as Foreigner's new single 12" 'Break It Up' b/w live 'Head Games'...I'm giving my comments late this week because I just heard the new Crosby, Stills, and Nash album. (Boy, can these guys rock for the 80's!) It'll be out in the same release this June as the Stones, Nugent, Genesis, Townshend, and Poco...Congratulations to Ron Nenni on a wedding that I heard was second to none, but black singers at a nice Italian wedding?...I'd like to welcome Danny Buch to Atlantic's National Album staff. And you'll be seeing him in these pages shortly...Heavy rotation at home: McCartney, Sparks (their whole catalogue)."

**BETH ROSENGARD, B.R.A.S.H. PROMOTIONS (213-462-4204):** "It's my pleasure to be working the new record by Stevie Wonder, a man whose accomplishments, musical and otherwise, I've admired for so long. The song you must hear and play is 'Front Line'. The message is undeniable and the sound is superb. As you're listening to this great song, remember that, to the extent that you reflect your audience's taste, you also form it! You are, to many of your listeners, a voice of authority and, if you tell them it's not only okay but actually hip to like Stevie Wonder, they're going to embrace his music and make him their own. 'Front Line' is a cause on several fronts. Make it your cause!"

**BRUCE MOSER, COULD BE WILD (716-885-5200):** "Could be married. Congratulations and best wishes to Ken and Carol Nenni...Best wishes to Kevin Sutter who leaves Epic to do East Coast sales for IRS... And best wishes to Charlie Logan who crosses the street to go to WYNF...It was a pleasure to meet Howie Klein in New York the other day. Congratulations on your deal with 415 Records with CBS. 415 Records did a great job on Romeo Void which sold over 100,000 copies. They have a new band called Translator. Wait until you hear this one. It has everyone at CBS buzzing with excitement. Speaking of excitement, call Howie and ask him about The Edge (this band could be huge)...Question of the Week: Will Cleveland survive the 8th Annual Taurus Party. (Could be the party of the year)...Thanks to everyone on their support on the new BOC album. John Gorman's quote, 'rock and roll radio needs this album', says it all. Your audience wants this album. It shipped over 200,000 copies and is a heavy request item, especially 'Roadhouse Blues' and 'Veterans Of Psychic Wars'...Bryan Adams is a hit act. His live sampler proves this. If you need a copy, contact me...People are finally beginning to discover the Fist album. WLVQ, WSYR, and WTPA are the early believers. This is heavy metal that sounds new and fresh. Just listen to the title track...The Blasters continue to sell (Top 40 in Billboard). How long can radio continue to ignore their success?...Aldo Nova finished up the Sammy Hagar tour this week and begins a West Coast tour with UFO. The album will be gold before they hit the West Coast and the new single 'Foolin' Yourself' will change the gold to platinum...Best new record this week: Stevie Wonder. The song 'Front Line' is a great track that deserves to be on the radio. I'm sick of hearing 'we don't play black music'. Stevie Wonder is a proven act that sells across the board. Your audience buys Stevie Wonder. Why can't they hear them on your stations?"

**MICHAEL PLEN, I.R.S. (212-980-6874):** "It's really interesting how all the negative remarks (there have only been a few) I've gotten on the Go Go's are all coming from programmers who fought all the way to the end that it wasn't viable. Can't we just accept and bury the argument. They've succeeded and we should all feel that there's one more band out there that's made it that we all like, without any political or redneck attachments...Up for release June 15th---the new Go Go's single from the next album. And on July 20th, the release of the Go Go's second Lp entitled 'Vacation'. I can just see it now---everyone's excuse will be that this record doesn't have an 'Our Lips Are Sealed' or 'We Got The Beat'. I'm going to count how many people use that one...Also out soon: Chelsea, the 'Eraserhead' soundtrack, Tom Robinson, Wall Of Voodoo, English Beat, Suburban Lawns, and Lords Of The New Church. All of this in the next two months. A deluge of product. Help me dig out of it... Great record I heard is the Rupert Hine, out on A&M International. **JIM SOTET, POLYGRAM (212-399-7813):** "It's very gratifying to see the Scorpions and Rainbow listed #1 and #2 in the FMQB Song Index. Thank you radio for the support, and get ready for the tour later this Summer. It will be intense rock and roll...Without sounding like an expense form, thanks to everyone in radio and retail who made John Cougar welcome on his rap tour--a #12 debut on the Song Index is not too shabby. Thanks from the 'American Fool' to all of you!...Music you should be aware of: Motorhead (they make music for the audience, not for you, unless you're a gear head, like me, Marc Miller and Tony Berardini), The Jam, and coming your way, a new Rory Gallagher...Other folks' music you should be aware of: Bow-Wow-Wow, Ministry, Haircut One Hundred (!), Ray Parker Jr., and my current new fave, Jim Carroll. 
STEVE WINWOOD is in England recording his new Lp "Talking Back To The Night" in his own studio. This self-produced Lp will be out in late summer.

**FOR YOUR INFORMATION:**

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

1. **PLAYS PER DAY** - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
2. **PLAYS PER WEEK** - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
3. **AIRPLAY EMPHASIS** - Be careful not to confuse this with PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 5. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 5 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 3 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

The Airplay Index is our ranking system for the amount of play on albums as a whole. We determine rankings by converting all daily and weekly play reports to a 1-5 emphasis system and totalling the points on a given Lp. We use a simple percentage breakdown to indicate the amount of play on each track.
