Little Earthquakes served to win Tori legions of fans worldwide (She's even got her own folder on America OnLine's Alternative Music bulletin board!), and Under The Pink will surely win over many more. Mod Rockers already praying: WOXY, KBCO, KPNT, WEQX and WPGU!

POSSUM DIXON POSSUM DIXON (Interscope/AG)



Possum Dixon began catching the attention of Commercial Modern Rockers towards the end of '93, with many programmers

finding it hard to hold back on the add, resulting in over 20 stations (including KBAC, X96, Q101, WLAV-A, KBBT, WEQX, KNDD, WHFS, KNNC, KRZQ, WEQX, WWDX, WZRH and more) reporting play on "Watch The Girl Destroy Me" a week before the official add date! The infectious dissonant pop that PD puts forth on their eponymous debut will make it hard for you to get their hooks out of your head. As phenomenal as the single is, it's far from the only material on this album you'll want to play, as "Nerves," "She Drives," "Regina,"

"John Struck Lucy," "We're All Happy", and "Elevators" will all send you silly. Imagine Camper Van Beethoven, the Violent Femmes, and The Archies all squished together in one big hallucinogenic ball of energy and you'll end up with something that resembles something like Possum Dixon.

FURY IN THE SLAUGHTERHOUSE, "EVERY GENERATION GOT ITS OWN DISEASE" (RCA)



Fury In The Slaughter-house is one of Germany's biggest acts, having opened for the likes of Metallica and Roger Waters'

concert at The Wall - even going as far as to have their logo on European Coca-Cola cans! "Every Generation Got Its Own Disease" is a powerful combination of music and message, with FITS delivering a socially damning missive through this dark and moody track. This should set Fury In The Slaughterhouse on the track for a long career on our CHR shores.

CRASH TEST DUMMIES "MMM MMM MMM"

(Arista)



There is something undeniable about Brad Roberts' voice. His strong and deep vocal guides the direction of

the Crash Test Dummies, one of Canada's most impressive musical exports. "Mmm Mmm Mmm" is taken from their God Shuffled His Feet album (produced by Jerry Harrison & the Dummies). and has not remained narrowcast as a P.A.R. band, finding its way onto a good deal of Modern Rockers, including KEDG, CFNY, WBRU, KNDD, KROQ, WIIZ, KKNB, KDGE, Q101 and others. "Mmm Mmm Mmm" is as tasty as its title suggests.



NEXT DURAN DURAN RELEASE WILL BE COVERS, NOT UNPLUGGED: Duran Duran has pulled a fast one. Instead of releasing an Unplugged album in the spring, in March they'll release the album of cover versins of their favorite songs that they've been working on for the past few months. The album will be titled Thank You, for their supporters during their dramatic comeback this year. It will include such songs as: David Bowie's "Diamond Dogs;" "Crystal Ship" by The Doors; Elvis Costello's "Watching The Detectives;" Led Zeppelin's "Thank You;" nad "Iggy Pop's success. Some that may surprise fans are public enemy's "911 Is A Joke," and "White Lines," by Grandmaster Flash and Melle Mel. A version of Velvet Underground's "Femme Fatale," which is also on *The Wedding Album*, could be the first single from Thank You. "We hope to do these tunes justice--or injustice," quips Simon

ORZABAL READY TO START NEXT TEARS FOR FEARS ALBUM: Roland Orzabel says he's ready to make another Tears For Fears record right away, possibly starting early in the New Year. "I'd like to follow it up," he says. "I've got ideas already, a concept, and a few tracks." Orzabel predicts it would return Tears For Fears to the arenas they once played. He says: "The whole point about the last album being called Elemental, is gettign back to basics a little more and regaining some of that lost ground. You inevitabley lose that when you stop playing small venues because you forget about audiences. But," he added, "The way I see the next album, it would

work well large." Orzabal would like Tears For Fears to return to their previous heights, but he'd also like it to be a slow build. "Unfortunately, it seldom happens that you can go at your own pace," Orzabal said.

RAMONES PRODUCER TOWNSHEND EASY TO WORK WITH: Scott Hackwith was pretty amazed when he found himself producing the Ramones' "Substitute,"-with a guest appearance by Pete Townshend. "This guy's been making music since before I was even thought of, and I had to tell him to do something over again," says Hackwith, (who is also the lead singer and songwriter of the band dig). Hackwith thought that it was going to be tough workign with the who guitartist when they met in the studio. He recalls: "I held my hand out and said, "Hi, it's a pleasure meeting you." He looked at me, didn't say anting and shook my hand. I thought he was going to be weird, but then he just completely opened up and started talking my Hackwith said, that when Townshend had finished his part, he hung around the studio-and visited for an hour. Hackwith said the Ramones' record company chose him to produce the album, Acid Eaters, a collection of '60s cover songs just out-because they wanted someone fresh. "They thought their work was getting a little too produced," Hackwith explained, "So I gave them the non-produced approach. wanted ti to sound like earlier Ramones, like "Leaving Home." Basically you stick the microphone in front of the amp-and say, okay go." Hackwith said he also picked up some valuable producing pointers from Dave jerden, who did dig's album.

Bjork and Sinead O'Connor are set to make guest appearances on the forthcoming album by Jah Wobble's "Invaders Of The Heart", their first since signing to Island last year. The album is expected in March. O'Connor appeared on the former PiL member's Top 40 single "Vision Of You" in early 1992. The "other two" members of The Jam, bassist Bruce Foxton and drummer Rick Buckler, have their version of the pioneering new wave group's experiences published later this month. "The Jam: Our Story" is published by Penguin/Castle at £8.99 and reveals that group leader Paul Weller has not spoken to Foxton and Buckler since disbanding The Jam in 1982.

The 12-inch has the "Heavy Breather Subversion" mix of the lead track and the extended mix of "Windpower"; the first CD has "The Search For Truth Part I" mix of "Dissidents" and the second CD, out on January 17, has Part II of that mix plus the "US Mix" of "She Blinded Me With Science" and "One Of Our Submarines Is Missing".

One of Sting's co-stars from the Broadway production of "The Threepenny Opera" releases her debut single on January 17. Kim Criswell's "Moment Of Weakness" is written by Judd Friedman, who wrote much of the soundtrack to the box office smash "The Bodyguard". Criswell has had great theatre and concert success in such productions as "Elegies For Angels, Punks And Raging Queens" in London's West End, "Nine" opposite Raul Julia on Broadway and in the London production of "Annie Get Your Gun" for which she received an Olivier Award nomination. Her debut album "The Human Cry" will be released in February.

Bono is moving into the movies with a role in a science fiction thriller called "Johnny Mnemonic" which starts filming soon. The U2 singer will star alongside gangsta rapper Ice-T. Lena Flagbe, who's signed to U2's Mother label, is hoping to have her debut album finished in time for a late January/early February release. It'll be titled either "Lyrically Yours" or "Beautiful" and will include her debut single "You Come From Earth" and the Top 20 follow-up "Gotta Get It Right".

Depeche Mode's new single, out next week, is a remixed version of "In Your Room", one of the tracks from their "Songs Of Faith And Devotion" album. The first CD single features the "Zephyr Mix" of the track and the "Extended Zephyr Mix", by Butch Vig, and "Never Let Me Down Again" and "Death's Door." Two further CDs will be available on January 17, the first featuring the lead track plus "Policy Of Truth", "World In My Eyes" and "Fly On The Windscreen", the second with the "Jeep Rock" and "Apex" mixes of "In Your Room" plus the "Adrenaline Mix" of "Higher Love".

The first single from Level 42's forthcoming RCA album will be "Forever Now", due on February 14. Curiosity's "Back To Front" album is now scheduled for release in the spring when they're also planning to release a cover of Roberta Flack's "Killing Me Softly With His Song" as a single.

Soul Asylum follow their breakthrough reissue of "Runaway Train" next week with another single from their "Grave Dancers Union" album, "Black Gold". The CD single will feature "Square Root" plus "unplugged" versions of "Somebody To Shove" and "Closer To The Stars". The band have a UK tour lined up for March, including a night at Brixton Academy on the 23rd and dates in Glasgow and in Dublin on St. Patrick's Day, March 17.

One Dove's new single "Why Don't You Take Me", out this week, will be featured in the new British film "Shopping". The Glasgow band made their Top 40 debut recently with the single "Breakdown" and this new single will appear on the soundtrack album along with the next Utah Saints single "Too Much To Swallow" and a previously unreleased Shakespeares Sister track. The soundtrack LP is due out on February 28.






PYRAMID'S JAMMIN' IN BOSTON! WJMN JOINS KISS 108 IN NEW DUOPOLY

Zimmer Broadcasting has decided to shake up its St. Louis duopoly by moving Country-formatted WKKX/Kix 104 to the 106.5 frequency now occupied by CHR WKBQ/Q106.5. WKBQ will slide down to the 104.1 frequency, and become known as Q104. Why the flip? The 106.5 frequency is a 100,000 Class C that will provide better signal coverage in the rural areas for the Country station, while the Class B 104.1 frequency will serve the CHR format well, as most of WKBQ's listeners are in the city and nearby suburbs.

WKBQ P.D. Cruze tells Grapevine, "104.1 has trouble getting down into the boonies where the majority of the diary

returns are Country. In fact, their Country competitor eats them alive down there. WKBQ returns some diaries from that area, but not a significant amount. So the idea from management was to use these two signals for what makes the biggest sense for the company."

Concurrent with the frequency flip, the former WKBQ morning team of Steve & D.C. will return to the station at its new dial position. They were fired last year after making racial remarks on the air that brought on a firestorm of criticism. Cruze says, "They have completed a racial sensitivity training class at Webster University. They have also been in contact with the NAACP, and worked out their differences with them. I will go back to afternooon drive, and we'll be doing a pretty high profile, personalitydriven afternoon show, a lot like what Rocky Allen is doing at WPLJ. We are going to focus the music very tightly, be very fresh, very CHR, very exciting, and we will continue to be WKBQ... Q104."







STACY'S MAINSTREAM STRATEGY

Interview By Neal Newman



KKFR/Phoenix P.D. Rick Stacy has faced a number of exciting challenges in his 19 year broadcasting career. Rick broke into the radio biz back in 1975, when then P.D. (now Z100/N.Y. morning host) John Lander hired him at WLOF/Orlando. In 1983, Stacy landed his first programming gig in that very same market, at Y106. He went on to take the reins at the legendary Y100/Miami, and then headed north to Atlanta, where he hung his nameplate on the P.D. door at Power 99 (now 99X). Now in Barkleyville, Stacy faces an interesting challenge - take a Churban-leaner and turn it into a bottom line winner. His first move? Stacy decided to take the station in a mainstream direction. We decided to talk to Rick about his programming philosophy, the roots of 99X, Rap music, research, the mainstream move, and more, in this exclusive and enlightening Up Close interview.

What do you believe KKFR G.M. Fred Weber was looking for when he brought you aboard?

It can be summed up with the typical cliche: 'They wanted someone who could bring the station to the next level.' In my half-programming, half-business eyes, I had to look at KKFR thoroughly, at the financial situation surrounding it, and the programming. Once I did that, I understood what he meant. He wanted the station to make money. And, although the station did make some money in the past, over the past few years its been a tough sell. Primarily because of how tough it

is to sell a station that is mainly Rap oriented to a clientele for, whatever reason, didn't want to advertise on a station which had that type of music on it. In addition, due to the format defections of KZZP and KOY, he wanted to broaden the station out, without losing the core of the radio station. That was one of the things that helped get my foot in the door, since I've done that in the past. He also wanted someone with a broad knowledge of the business end of radio, as well as the programming end. I've owned stations of my own, as well as being on-the-air for nineteen years, eleven of those years in morning drive. So, there's no morning

man that's going to bullshit me about anything. I know exactly what's going on. As far as the other DJs go, I've done afternoons - the tighter shifts - and I know how to manage those as well. He wanted someone with a broader vision of the radio station as a whole, instead of just one aspect of it. I fit the bill. Fred also needed someone he could communicate and be open with. Fred and I hit it off right away. I've never seen anyone as determined to win! He wants to own this market, and he finally did it with his AM station KFYI, which triumphed over KTAR, the leading News/Talk station in town, and now he wants to do it with the FM. He wants some respectable demos.

What were some of your initial goals coming in, and how have you met them?

The initial goal was to assess the validity of the format as it was. I remember seeing a quote from Randy Kabrich in a Fred magazine article about ten years ago. Randy said, 'Whenever you go into a new market, it's best not to do anything for thirty days. Absorb the station. Absorb the market. See why things were done the way they were, and what effect they had. See if the previous P.D.'s goals were met, or why they weren't met.' I did that. My thirty day research led me to believe that the market is much more Anglo than anybody could have ever imagined. It consists of 85% Anglo, 12% Hispanic, and 2.5% Black listenership. After I went through everything, I realized that a lot of the TSL of this radio station was coming from Hispanics who were heavy listeners. That's a scary foundation to be

standing on because, while it needed to be done at the time that there were three CHRs in the market (to differentiate itself from Y95 and KZZP), as a stand alone, anyone who comes in here and does dance to attract Hispanics, there goes half your station. When the entire station is a five share, and you lose half, that's pretty miserable. Some ethnic groups rival teenagers regarding their volatility and lack of loyalty to a radio station. Unless you're a community-entrenched radio station, which I haven't heard any since Q105/Tampa, and my own Power 99/ Atlanta, you're going to get your legs cut off if another station signs on, and decides to play the same music you're playing. Music is music to them. If there's a new kid on the block who's shiny and new, they'd rather talk about them than you. You become the old news.

So, there seems to have been a lot of danger staying where you were.

Yes. Remember that this was all gut at the time, moving the station into a more mainstream direction. However, at that time, I expected to keep the base sound of the radio station the way it is ... as a Churban. I was just going to bring the Rap down, and add some titles that would appeal to more of the disenfranchised CHR listeners. That would have made the station more listenable after all. About sixty days after that, we concluded a Frank Cody's with Broadcast Architecture. Every assumption that I had was confirmed. As a matter of fact, this market is more Anglo and Pop/Rock in its musical taste than anyone on the outside looking in could imagine. They want uptempo music. They want variety. They want to hear a Dance record into a Rock record into a ballad. That's what KZZP was. It actually resembled Power 99/Atlanta. It was a high energy radio station, not too many oldies, and not too new. It was current and recurrent with a lot of tempo. That also told me why KZZP lost, and why Y95

What did you find?

From the outside, it seemed as though KKFR had beaten these radio stations - had out-hit and out-programmed them. In some cases, that may be true. They did out-promote them on the streets, and they were more consistent than those two radio stations. However, those two radio stations blew up from the inside. KZZP had a monster share, but they lost the focus of what KZZP did best. I wasn't here, but they started chasing either Power 92 or Y95. They started taking their station off balance. Once you start to do that with a legendary station, it's very difficult - once you piss off those adult listeners - to get them back. Once they're gone, they're gone. Y95 at that time was poised. It took over the ratings and the morning show. They did very well. But, down the road, they also started chasing Power 92 around. Again, this is from what I understand from the history of the market that I've looked at. They lost their focus, and pissed off their core. Basically they blew themselves up. One thing that Steve Smith did very well was keeping the station consistent, with a 'keep your head down and move forward' attitude. He kept it from taking any losses, and had gains over a long period of time.

Coming straight from a programming gig in one of America's hottest markets, what do you see as the main differences between Atlanta and Phoenix?

The weather! Seriously though, I find that people all just get along a little better than the people in Atlanta. The acceptance levels of everyone's style of music is higher here than in Atlanta. I don't think it's as prevalent with the younger demos in Atlanta as it is with the older demos. At least, here in Phoenix, there is a crossover in tastes. That's exciting. While KKFR has been playing a lot of Rap, people don't say, 'I hate the radio station', they just say 'I don't listen that long, because there's too much Rap for me.' Their responses aren't as emotionally charged as they were when I was in Atlanta. When you asked a Power 99 listener why they were listening less, they would respond, 'Oh, you play that Rap shit!' It was a very emotionally charged negative statement. The funny thing was that, in Atlanta, I wasn't really playing any Rap. I was playing the hits, and some of them were Rap. Here, they were playing Hip-Hop. On the weekend, every third record was a Hip-Hop record. Even with that intensity of Hip-Hop on the air, some being truly hard core, you can still go out into the streets, and still not get that emotionally charged negative that you would have gotten had this been done in Atlanta. That's just an observation I made. Sure, you could go into Atlanta with a Churban and do very well, but you're only going to do well with the young end. There's still that high level of unacceptability in that 25+ demo in Atlanta to Hip-Hop in general. That's why V103, the leading Black station in Atlanta, barely plays any Hip-Hop records during the day, and only plays the absolute hits at night. So, even in that format in Atlanta, they've got to be careful.

What factors led to the decision to flip 99X from a mainstream CHR to its current Modern Rock stance?

At first, it was just a gut thing that told me that something was changing. For a year and a half, the **Pearl Jam** album *Ten* was the number one album in Atlanta. That was with no airplay. If the college station added a record, we were lucky if we heard it once a day. There was no exposure. Another album that came along and outsold everything was from **Red Hot Chili Peppers**. Then, the **Spin Doctors** came along and outsold everything. I believe that, over a year's time, something like sixty to seventy percent of the music from the Top 10 albums was derived from Alternative.

What ultimately convinced you that your gut instincts were true?

I went to Turtles and Tower Records in Atlanta, looked in the Alternative bin, and didn't recognize any of the groups. There were a lot of imports, and very niche- oriented music. Then I turned to the Pop bins. I saw the Michael Jacksons and the $\hat{C} + C$ Music Factorys, but I also saw: the Pearl Jam; The Red Hot Chili Peppers; and, the Spin Doctors. All of this music would have been in the Alternative bin two years earlier - but was now in the Pop bin. I went out that weekend with my M.D., Sean Demery, to every single record store in town. We talked to people about their inventory load on that product. These records had become mass-appeal songs. We asked store managers who was buying what. We got comments ranging from, 'A 42 year old man walked in here, bought the new Eric Clapton Unplugged, and bought Pearl Jam, A 19 year old kid came in here, and bought Pearl Jam and The Butthole Surfers. A 22 year old girl came in here and bought C + C Music Factory, Snap!, and Pearl Jam. So, I started seeing that the consumption of this product was similar to the consumption of any other mass-appeal product. We started following SoundScan,, compared it to the trends in the music we were playing, and it began to be two different stories.



Cite some examples.

A lot of the records that Power 99 was playing in the days of the ten share would work - the **Kevin Page**, **Robbie Neville**, the Dance records. But after a while, they were not working! They weren't selling! Nobody was buying them! **Paula Abdul** came to town. Three thousand people bought tickets to a twenty thousand seat arena. Coke had to buy the rest. She would sell out 20,000 seats in a week back in 1988-1989. In 1992-1993, she sold 3,000 seats! All these mass appeal artists were falling flat on their face. Power 99 had a big backlash on Rap and rhythmic music. It was my fault! I'll take the blame for that! It



got out of hand! Also, the real middle-of-the road Pop music was disappearing. The glue between the other two ends of the spectrum was missing. It weakened the radio station! We compensated with too much Dance product, and it lent itself to a bad image. We wanted to change the image. The company had the courage to allow me to experiment. I thought that it would be great to mix Alternative music with Top 40, based on some of the stations I had heard in Los Angles, particularly KROQ. In our case, at Power 99, the station's negative image was so strong that, to do anything that would remind them of the old Power 99 was troublesome to the audience. So, whether it was wrong or right (I still don't know), we decided to go full-blown Modern CHR.

How did your relationship with consultant Tom Barnes come about?

I was speaking to Tom, a guy you interviewed a couple of weeks ago, about Alternative music lists. While I knew the music, I didn't know exactly what was current, what was two years old, what was five years old, etc. At lunch with Tom, I told Tom that I wanted to do this Modern CHR format. I made a deal with Tom which was: Let me use your music list, and I'll let him work with the station and allow him to use the name - if the station is successful, which it somewhat is. It was 9th 18-34. Now it's in the top three! That started our relationship. We were brainstorming before I read the book Generation X. This was before I was even aware that it existed. But, we did talk about the 18-29 year olds sharing a prevailing attitude of their chances of success, the economy, and their frustrations with society as a whole. A good majority of them are having a harder time than we did in bettering their lives - as they go along in trying to better their career paths. Just like any other social group, that frustration is displayed in art. The art I'm concerned with is music. You can hear that the music that matched their mindset was Pearl Jam, and all the other music that we ended up playing. Likewise, I think that Rap is a real reflection of what's going on in some neighborhoods. Alternative is a real reflection of teenagers and young adults who are trying to struggle through their first job. We agreed that there weren't any radio stations addressing these people. A nineteen year old trying to pay his way through college with all the hassles that go with it, doesn't relate to Paula Abdul! They do relate to Pearl Jam, Nirvana, and the Red Hot Chili Peppers. The music not only reflects what they're going through, but it also gives them an identity something to latch on to. That's something that has been missing for a while. We didn't want to stereotype these people. But, we did feel that a radio station could identify with these people, as a group, and identify the things they didn't like. For instance, they're an over-hyped group of people. So, we had to be more creative in selling the radio station. We needed to do what MTV does. We defused ourselves -disarmed ourselves by poking fun at ourselves on the air. We made it more real and friendly. However, real does not mean 'boring.' Real means that, if you do something creative, you poke fun at what you just did. You never take yourself too seriously.

What was the initial formatic philosophy at 99X?

We took 350 of the best Alternative records, and blended them with CHR music that fit, such as Under The Bridge by Red Hot Chili Peppers and Always Something There To Remind Me by Naked Eyes, and put them together into a Top 40 presentation without the over-hype. My Production Director, Keith Eubanks, came up with the sound that you now hear on Z100, and about twenty other stations. The whole MTV-ish, laid - back, creative, non-slogan imaging. However, it contained Top 40 basics. There were sweepers and IDs. We did the same promotions. They just sounded different! The rotations were probably knocked down about an hour. Instead of rotating the powers every two hours, it became every three hours. It's now third in the market! There's something to be said for that. The reason I'm not there is not connected to the format change. It's really because Bill Phippen had passed away, a new General Manager came in, and we really just didn't get along. And that was it!

I've always chased one thing at all of the stations I've programmed. After you get the music as right as you can, and you hire the most creative, qualityminded people that you can, then I try to 'create the essence'."

You've programmed just about every slice of the CHR pie: Mainstream, Alternative-leaning; and now, a Rhythm-leaner. What programming constants have you maintained throughout?

I've always chased one thing at all of the stations I've programmed. After you get the music as right as you can, and you hire the most creative, quality-minded people that you can, then I try to 'create the essence.' Everybody has a different name for it. Tom Barnes calls it 'bonding with the audience.' I've heard somebody say 'braiding your audience.' I call it 'finding the harmonic.'
There's a place in the majority of your listeners' minds that you can hit, and keep. Many stations, such as Q105, Y100, WABC, and Z100 (when Scott Shannon was there) hit it. You find that niche - that thing that makes the radio station become more than just a radio station. It transcends that relationship! It becomes a more personal relationship. The

product-identity goes through the roof, because top-of-mind awareness is generated through emotion. It's not easy to find, and I don't think it's something that you can force. When you put the right music, people, and promotions together, and you allow your people to be creative, and give your people the freedom to feel as though they are a part of the bigger picture, it just happens. But, you have to know what you're doing! You have to get everything right! The relationship with the audience comes. It happened to me at Power 99, I can't tell you how I got that ten share. I know that it just happened! I could mechanically get it to an eight share. But, two shares came from finding that spot. At Power 99, we called it 'the happy spot.' At Y106/Orlando, I got the station mechanically to a ten share. But, over the next two years, without changing anything that we were doing, we went to a 12.6. It just happened. The same thing happened at Q105/Tampa. They hit a stride that lasted longer than any other station I have ever seen. I can promise you that Mason Dixon, Cleveland Wheeler, Randy Kabrich, Scott Shannon, and anyone else who was there at the time talk about this, but they don't know exactly how it happened. It's the essence of the radio station. It's the difference between people saying 'That's a good radio station' and 'That's a great radio station!'

I understand that you've recently completed some new and exciting research. Can you expound on this?

I've always used focus groups to determine what questions to ask in a perceptual study. I've found focus groups to be very unnerving. I've found that there were too many variables in the room which we could not control. Opinion leaders in the room - you can either throw them out, leave them in there, and have them taint the entire focus group, or try to shut them down, causing a lot of stress in the room. I've found that, if the host of the focus group is not good at what he/she does, you're throwing your money away. I've found that there are people in a focus group who don't say a damn thing - they just sit there and agree with whoever else is talking. There is a lot of peer pressure - people saying things just because it seemed like the 'thing to do.' I would get some questions for later use in a perceptual. But, even in a perceptual study. people had to verbalize. I believe that, most of the time, people don't say what they mean, or mean what they say. They had to verbalize on the phone, to someone that they don't know, their deepest feelings about their relationship with a radio station or a personality. I was uncomfortable with that. But, that was the only way to do a perceptual at the time. I got to talking with Frank Cody about a technique that he uses which, according to their literature, had been used for presidential candidates. It's a system by which people respond to stimuli emotionally, not verbally, and with a dial in their hands, such as they would with a radio. Turn it up if you like it, turn it down if you don't like it. Every respondent in the room had one of these dials. You see it on TV as it happens. You see the 18-24 cell on one line, the 25-34 on another line. You can break it down male and female, white, Hispanic, it

doesn't matter. You can read people's reactions as songs, personalities, jingles, sweepers, and promotional messages go by. You can see their emotional response. You learn a lot about people. You get something that, right now, is far-and- away the most reliable research I've ever seen. It makes focus groups and auditorium tests obsolete. This methodology is the closest thing that you can get to the listening environment. The next thing that comes along that will be closer is the people meter.

You inherited quite a supporting management staff. Asst. P.D. Supersnake and M.D. Jerry Moran are both well-respected in the biz. Describe each one's role?

Supersnake is my contact to the streets (and the Suns)! Before I came here, there was one air talent that I had the highest respect for, and I still do. I think **Domino** (who is now at KIIS/L.A) is one of the greatest air talents in America. I believe that Supersnake is another one. I just met him, and I hope that we have a long-lasting relationship. Jerry Moran is more musically well-rounded. He understands all the different versions of Top 40 radio. I haven't known either of them very long. But again, I hope that we have long-lasting relationships.

How would you define the ultimate relationship between a P.D. and his/her staff?

The ultimate relationship is that everyone on the staff is their own mini-Program Director. At every station that I mentioned before, the ones which had the 'essence', the P.D. had a staff that was so self-reliant, you didn't have to be on their case all the time. They knew what to do. For instance, when I was in Atlanta with Domino, I would walk into the radio station at 2:00 in the afternoon, worrying about whether a promo was done. It was my job to worry about that. Domino would come up to me and say, 'Hey, man, I got your promos done!' I never had to ask him. If he didn't do it, someone else would. It makes for an incredible amount of energy. A station that has that kind of relationship with its staff is unbeatable.

What criteria do you follow when considering new music for KKFR?

It's got to have enormous hit potential! I'm going to take less chances on records now than I probably have since the inception of Power 99/Atlanta. It's also got to be material that could cross from Anglo to Hispanic, rather than Hispanic to Anglo.

How fierce is the battle for the streets in Phoenix?

The battle here is not as tough as if there were a head-on competitor, because then the listener could compare Top 40 to Top 40. But, it is tough in that there are two enormous Country stations here. Both of them are

extremely good! They both are extremely involved in the community. They are into everything. So, I'm up against everybody. So, I've got to battle for it. Now, it should be a little easier battling for it, because I'll have a station that'll be a bit more mainstream. However, it'll still be tough - due to the perception of the station from the past. The station has always been involved with 'Stop The Violence', and campaigns of that nature. Now, I want to get into some of the other stuff - the more mainstream, mass-appeal charities. I want to become what KZZP used to be. I want to own the market, and be everywhere!

What do you see as the major issues our industry will face as we enter 1994?

There will come a point where DAB is going to be available in cars. If, all of a sudden, for two or three dollars a month, you can have 80 channels of music available in your car, we're in big trouble. For the last ten to fifteen years, we have destroyed personality radio. We've linered people to death. We haven't taught people how to express themselves on the radio. which is an art form. There are some people, like Dan O'Day, who still profess and teach personality radio. I know that I do. But, for the most part, I really can't find any talent that can really do a show and entertain people. The last two people I know of who can do it right were Domino and Supersnake. There are a few morning guys here and there. But, when was the last time you heard a great morning show. When 80 channels of sattelite delivered, uninterrupted music straight to the car becomes a reality, the only thing that's going to draw people to your radio station is going to be personality. That's the only thing. We're not there now. If this should happen in the next five years, I can't imagine that radio will live through it.

I also wish that the racial lines in the clientradio relationship would disappear. That's something that I don't have control over, and there's not a lot that I can do. I know that a lot of the music that KKFR played, and is being bought out there - when it's put on the radio, clients cancel! I know that's motivated by a very ugly part of people's thought process. It's a very bad feeling! To see a station like KKFR, which has those shares, but a client won't buy it because of a certain style of music, there still exists a lot of racial discrimination and fear between racial boundaries. It's depressing! To this day, nobody really talks about it. When you go on a sales call, and the client refuses to buy, and leans over in your ear and says, 'Because you play too much of that kind of music,' you want to get up and walk out, or lecture him you don't know what to do. I don't know if there is an answer. When managers and General Managers side with that, it's really scary! It infuriates me! This will eventually come to a head.

What about the recent media backlash to Rap?

There really isn't that much Gangsta Rap; or whatever the term is. Stations like ours didn't really play that much of it. If we played any, it was one or two, late at night. The backlash has gone from Gangsta Rap to Rap in general, and that's just not fair. Rap music is an art form. Some of it is even more valid than some of the Pop crap. It reflects an environment. It's real. It talks about real things. It's lyrically rich. You can't say that 99% of it is shit, just because 1% of it really is. This is something that we're going to have to overcome. I don't know how. Rap music, just like Alternative, is a driving force in music. It's not going away. We'll have to find a way to deal with it.

You've programmed in a number of different markets. What is your fondest memory?

Working with Bill Phippen at Power 99. He not only became an extremely close friend, but was also one of the most compassionate men I've ever met in my life. This guy loved what he did. He loved us! He cared about people more than anyone I've ever met. He would do anything for you. And, if you did something wrong, it wasn't the reprimand. He would talk to you like he was your dad. He cared about you! Unfortunately he's gone. That was the highlight of my career, and probably always will be. Also, working with the people at Power 99, people like Domino, Leslie Fram, Sean Demerey. We had a group there that rivaled any of the great radio stations, anywhere. It was one of those situations where synergy was a major factor of the success of that station. That came from Bill Phippen on down. If it weren't for Bill allowing us to wear our shorts and T-shirts in the building, and to try stupid things, and to fall flat on our faces two out of every ten times on creative ideas, it wouldn't have happened. Guest Perspective

THE NEW WAY TO ADD NEW RECORDS



No matter how you may feel about your record collection, scratchy vinyl, and turntable dust are history. Music listening has evolved to state-of-the-art digital sound. Unfortunately the way radio adds new music to the playlist is still in the "record player" past.

Look at almost any format that plays newly-released music. When a new album comes out, stations add one track and play it ad nauseam, until finally a second cut will make its debut as the "new" release from the album. The process repeats itself over and over. Often a year or more has passed until all the good tracks from an album are exposed. meantime, record buying listeners who hear a song they like from the CD have plopped down their \$16.99 and added it to their collection. about how many listeners must scratch their heads when they hear radio introducing a new release from an album they bought some time ago. Radio should give new music listeners some credit. It should also give them what they say they want ... play more than one cut at a time from an album.

What drives the old single cut theory? The record industry for one. It wants a focused effort to help drive sales of a CD. They know repetition breeds familiarity which breeds preference. Beat 'em over the head enough with a song and listeners will eventually like and buy it. Conventional record promotion wisdom says multi-cut exposure will dilute this effort. And the repetitive approach is also accepted by most radio programmers as the best way to build song preference. So the system endures.

Unfortunately the theory doesn't work as well as it once did. Take a typical Top 40 station from twenty years ago. The station's success was based on a huge cume and a high turnover ratio that added up to lots of quarter hours. A song on this station that got eight to ten plays a day would take six weeks or longer to achieve the reach and frequency levels necessary for positive preference. Today, with more choices and more diverse formats, most radio stations depend on big TSL, not cume to build ratings. Modern new releases can achieve equal exposure frequency in six weeks with only a few plays a day. they won't get the same reach due to smaller cume and turnover. In reality it takes a year or more for a large portion of the audience to reach positive preference levels on a new song. High repetition only serves to grate on the TSL tolerance of the core audience.

Put aside the mathematics. Consider playing multiple cuts from new albums solely on meeting the needs of the audience. Research on new music listeners consistently indicates their displeasure with the one-cut system.

And there are other benefits, too. Playing several cuts at a time will create a portfolio effect where stronger songs overshadow weaker songs, thus reducing the impact of actually playing a stiff. Under the current scheme, a stiff is often played several weeks before it's dropped. In the meantime, other good songs on the CD don't get played.

The decision to play several cuts from a CD at once can enhance a station's individual music strategy. How often does a song from a playable artist get released that does not fit a station's sound? Stations can sidestep the problem by selecting other cuts that do fit their musical direction.

Perhaps the best reason to look deeper is image. Stations that do will develop music image based on popular artists rather than popular cuts. These stations will eventually be known for playing all the good music from artists listeners like most.

The decision to play all the good songs from a CD at once will certainly meet some initial resistance from the record industry. But change is inevitable. Stations that abandon the single release theory will better meet the needs of their listeners, while applying programming methods that reflect the listening habits of the '90s.







"It Ain't Brain Surgery" --by Jay Trachman

Perhaps something like this has happened to you...

While I was visiting my mom over the holidays, she handed me a clipping, torn out of the large-type edition of *Reader's Digest*. It was a joke I had written, and at the end it credited "Jay Trachman in **One To One**". Aunt Sarah's daughter had sent it to her--with a story.

Aunt Sarah--She wasn't even really my aunt, but she and Uncle Ben had been our next-door neighbors through all the time I was growing up. She had become Mom's best friend despite an age difference, and she was like a second mom to me for many years.

She knew every funny or "precious" story of my kid-hood--and retold them relentlessly. To this day, she refers to me by the pet name they made up for me when I was three or four--"lover-puvver"...I cringe when I hear it...

Aunt Sarah's in her eighties now; she and Mom keep in touch, even though my folks have moved to Florida while she and Uncle Ben, now 92, remain in New Jersey most of the year. She had just come through quite a siege, and at that age, I'm sure her children worried that this might be the end for her.

She was suffering from severe depression. Mom says it may have come from this feisty, dynamic woman's realization that little by little, her capabilities and independence were leaving her. Or from the knowledge that some day soon, the man she's been married to for sixty-plus years would die. For all I know, it could have been no more than a clinical, chemical imbalance. In any event, it was so severe that Aunt Sarah had to be hospitalized. And there she sat, weeping much of the time, for weeks, unresponsive

to medication. That is, until her daughter brought her the latest copy of *Reader's Digest*.

According to Mom, they found her in her room, chuckling over the joke she had seen, and the byline attributing it to her "lover-puvver." The doctor said, "Severely depressed people do not chuckle," and had her released.

In some small, almost random way, I had made a difference in Aunt Sarah's life when she needed it. It wasn't the first time

I've done remote shows frequently, but this one really seemed to connect. While MCing an event last night, three people asked, "How do you do a show from your home?" Listeners don't even bat an eye when we're "on the road" anymore-they're used to it.

But when it's done from my kitchen--to theirs--it's new and exciting. It was also a great change to talk about things like...stay-at-home dads, the growing athome business industry, and the changing times, how business is accommodating more and more parents.

One listener even suggested, "It says something about the management of your station when they let you stay home to take care of Catie."

The first morning Catie slept until 9, but the second morning she got up at 7:50 and was able to make a bit of a peep on-air about, "When's Mommy coming home?" Gush!!

As I said, I've done remote shows from car dealerships, hot-air balloons, even different cities, but this one really seemed to catch people's attention. A very rewarding experience.

I have a few suggestions for when you log commercials, which may help with the sound of your show. Every morning I come in early and redo the log for the morning show. It's kind of a personal thing and you may want to double-check with the programmer, but here are a few ideas which may or may not be new to you...

I always:

- --Play best-sounding commercials first (nationals, usually).
- --Play longer commercials first (sixties, usually.)

-One To One

--Shuffle so the same voice isn't twice in a row, or the set opens with my voice.

What do you think?

(Kevin, regarding your commercial scheme, I agree, except that I prefer to play the best-sounding spots LAST in the set when possible, on the theory that when the listener's attention is flagging, that may re-grab his/her mind.--JT)

ARTIST PROFILES

CRANBERRIES

"Everybody Else Is Doing It, So Why Can't We?", the debut Lp from The Cranberries, is propelled by the voice of 21-year=old lead singer Dolores O'Riordan. Hers is an instrument of unspoiled beauty--all swoops, quavers, and quiet insistence. Influenced less by popular music (she admits little knowledge of it beyond casual radio listening) than by the hymns she sang as part of the choir at the local Catholic church, Dolores was able to develop her unconventional abilities in comparative isolation.

"When I was little, I did do a lot of traditional music," she says. "But it wasn't traditional Irish diddle--ee-di music--I sang in liturgical choirs, very soft, not as boisterous as the Folk music. But I also sang in pubs when I was really small. I'd go in and sing Country and Western songs."

The band, originally named the Cranberry Saw Us (say it out loud), formed three years ago in Limerick, Ireland. Original members Noel and Mike Hogan and Feargal Lawler, then abetted by a male schoolmate on vocals, decided the pacific sound they made together needed a woman's vocal touch. Enter Dolores, a teenager from Ireland's Southwest countryside--even Limerick seemed like the Big Time.

"The three boys had a band, and even though they weren't very serious at first, I'd been telling people I was going to sing in a band since I was five years old, so I went down to audition," she recalls. "I thought what they were playing was very nice, and after they got over the fact that here was this little girl from the countryside coming in all fresh and sweet, we got on famously."

Before long, their first single, a cassette-only release of "Nothing Left At All," was drawing attention to them. "These days people can go into a shop and buy anything they want, physically. It leaves nothing to the imagination," Dolores says. "The way I was brought up was very antiphysical. It was use your spirit and your mind more. I didn't think I was different-when people would say 'those nice little Cranberries from Ireland," I never understood. But now it makes sense."

"Promotion Pitfalls"

Failure to consider every detail when putting together a promotion can result in real headaches. Barry Hoffman of the Promotion Marketing Association identifies these common mistakes:

- 1. Ambiguity or contradiction between the selling copy and the official rules. If your promo copy says "Win a trip anywhere in America", and the official rules restrict travel to the continental U.S., you're in trouble when the winner selects Hawaii as his destination.
- 2. The photograph or illustration of the prize doesn't represent the prize exactly. In print, show the prize you intend to give away. Changing even the color of a car can cause problems when the winner comes to claim the prize.
- 3. Prize value is overestimated or not qualified for variables. If you send someone from LA to New York, and call it a \$3000 trip, they can go to their travel agent and get a quote of \$2000. They can demand the full value or complain that \$3000 will be reported to the IRS when they're only getting \$2000. Use a phrase like "full retail value based on the farthest distance."
- 4. Descriptive words are used without regard to established meanings. In the travel business, "deluxe hotel" does not mean the Ramada Inn.
- 5. The prize described as "all expense paid" or the issue of expense is not

addressed. If you say "all expense paid", the winner may expect you to pay for new clothes or boarding pets. Name a specific dollar amount.

- 6. Copying rules from someone else's contest or using last year's rules. Rewrite the rules every time; there is always some minor change in the law that needs to be considered.
- 7. Letting retailers handle entries without specific instructions. Give detailed instructions, lest you have problems with drawings,

problems with drawings, etc.

- 8. Launching the promotion before the prizes are obtained. Get the prizes first--then you don't have to worry about a product that is behind in production or a retailer who fails to deliver.
- 9. Assuming the consumer will

understand. You've planned it; you've written the rules. After you say, "How could anybody not understand?" review the promotion again. If there's a way not to understand, a contestant will find it.

"Know When To Call"

Getting publicity for your station from other media requires planning. Using deadlines correctly is one of the keys; here are some timing tips:

- -3 p.m. to 7 p.m. is the crunch time at dailies and for TV. Call between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.
- --Find out what day the weekly papers go to press. Call the day after with your station's story to get coverage the next week.
- --For calendars and activity lists in weekly and monthly publications, send factual information at least three weeks ahead.

Now time for the surprise of the week, Ace Of Base The Sign picked up 20 Adds before-the-The premature list was led by box! KISS107.3 (KISF); Q106; majors like: KIIS: KKFR/Phoenix; WKSS/Hartford. It's already Top 10 for KUBE/Seattle, and KDWQ/Minneapolis! Expect a big big week for Ace Of Base coming up! Hey D.J.'s, there will be Mixes coming up on this soon!... 
What is the hottest sound from the streets right now?

HEART: Heart had to cancel their appearance on "The Tonight Show" December 17 for personal reasons, but it has been rescheduled for January 20. The second leg of their theater tour is scheduled to begin in mid-February, and will run through March in North America.

PANTERA: Pantera's third album, "Far Beyond Driven" will be out March 22. The band's Vinnie Paul, who co-produced the disc, claims that it's much heavier than their last, "Vulgar Display Of Power," just as that record was so much heavier than "Cowboys From Hell." BOSTON: Tom Scholz is putting the finishing touches on Boston's fourth album, possibly for a March release.

BILLY RAY CYRUS: Newlywed Billy Ray Cyrus taped his second TV special before he married Leticia Finley at his home outside Nashville. Portions of the special were filmed during a benefit concert in Huntington, West Virginia. Proceeds will go to a foundation that Cyrus has just set up. The TV special will air sometime this year on ABC. Cyrus' album, "Some Gave All," was Billboard Magazine's

"Country Album Of The Year" for the second consecutive year in '93. Cyrus and Sly Dog are about to begin recording their next album.

ELVIS COSTELLO: **Elvis** Costello's reunion album with the attractions will be accompanied by a North American lengthy tour beginning this spring. On Brutal Youth, Costello, keyboardist Steve Nieve, bassist Bruce Thomas, and Pete Thomas recorded drummer together for the first time since 1986's The new Blood And Chocolate. album contains 15 songs, and it was produced by Costello and Mitchell Froom.



Mariah Carey

MARIAH CAREY: Mariah Carey is donating the proceeds of the sales of "Hero" to the families of the victims of the December 7 Long Island railroad shooting tragedy. She also dedicated the song in concert at Madison Square Garden to the three men who subdued the gunman.

Carey, a Long Island native, has often taken that same rush hour train out of Penn Station.

PRINCE: Prince has picked up a gold record award for his three-CD, *The Hits/The B Sides. The Hits I*, the first of a two-volume hit compilation, also went gold.

JOAN JETT: Joan Jett And The Blackhearts--drummer Thommy Price, guitarist Tony Bruno, and bassist Kenny Aaronson are in the studio recording their Warner Brothers records debut-tentatively set for release early in the spring.

P.M. DAWN: Prince be of P.M. Dawn has been in the studio with Philip Bailey of Earth, Wind, And Fire. They recorded two songs for the solo album Bailey is releasing in February. Chuckii Booker and Brian McKnight have also been producing songs for Bailey.

BOB SEGER: Bob Seger's been on jury duty. After eight days of testimony, Seger was elected foreman of the jury that convicted a California businessman in a bank swindle. The man, 44 year old Louis Rossman, now faces up to five years and a \$250,000 fine for falsifying documents to get a loan for a project he claimed he was building in West Bloomfield, Michigan.

TYLER COLLINS: Tyler Collins is working on her first album for Prince's Paisley Park Records. She's currently in the studio with forceful enterprises, perhaps better known as full force. The album is expected out next summer.


ELVIS PRESLEY: Elvis: From Nashville To Memphis, The Essential 60s Masters, Volume 1," has become

HARD ROCK CAFE RELEASING T O BENEFIT DISCS **ENVIRONMENT:** Hosting free New Year's Eve concerts at all the Hard Rock Cafes was just the beginning of a campaign to draw the worlds of music and burgers closer together. In March, the chain will launch its own record company with four compilation albums of Metal, Reggae, Alternative, and Classic Rock. The proceeds will go to an environmental group, The National Resource Defense Council. The Hard Rock is also planning to get into the concert promotion business with a large outdoor show being planned for spring at the Newport Beach Restaurant. Other shows are being planned for early summer at the cafe's three southern California locations. The Hard Rock will also break ground this year on a new casino and hotel in Las Vegas and a cafe at Universal City.

\$250-A-PLATE BREAKFAST HONORS RUSSELL SIMMONS: More than 250 artists and record executives paid tribute to urban music and clothing line impresario Russell Simmons at a \$250-a-plate breakfast at Barney's New York. Funds raised to the music industry organization that fights Aids, Lifebeat. A co-founder of Lifebeat, President and CEO of EMI Records, Daniel Glass, called the epidemic "Holocaust," and praised Simmons' efforts on behalf of Aids-Afflicted people through his standup Harlem Foundation. Raffle prizes included VIP tickets to a Mariah Carey concert and front row Knicks seats.

FANS OVERRULE NEIL YOUNG; **CLASSICS** ON CD **NEXT** MONTH: Five Neil Young albums are being released on CD for the first time early next year. They are the 1972 retrospective, "Journey Through The Past;" 1973's "Time Fades Away;" "On The Beach" from '74, "American Stars 'N Bars,"-released in 1977; and , 1981's high tech, "Re-ac-Young has been very vocal about not being a fan of CD sound, but, Reprise records claims that it is making the albums available on CD due to fan requests.

WORLD PARTY'S WALLINGER SCORES FIRST FILM: New mixes of "My Sharona" and "Tempted" are included on the soundtrack to Winona Ryder's new movie, Reality Bites, a comedy about growing up in the 90s. The film also marks the first scoring job for World Party's Karl Wallinger. U2, Lenny Kravitz, Crowded House, The Juliana Hatfield 3, The Posies, and Dinosaur, Jr. have also contributed songs to Reality Bites. The music was compiled by the same A&R man responsible for the seven million selling Pretty Woman soundtrack. RCA will release the disc February 1,-

with the movie scheduled to open nationwide on February 18. Ethan Hawke co-stars with Ryder. Ben Stiller makes his major directional debut with the film.

COST OF 500 TV CHANNELS BEING DEBATED: How much will you be willing to pay to receive 500 channels? Interactive executives say that there are two areas of price consideration: the coast of the box, which the consumer will need for the services; and, the cost of getting the services into their homes. Some predict that consumers will be willing to pay more for the convenience of such services as banking and choosing programming. The trick is to get consumers to remember how much they like having such convenienceseven when the bill arrives. Critics claim that the pricing issue is being swept under the rug, over-hyped, and over-evaluated. They also point out that there is no proof that the cost of the technology is going to come down.

EARLY START FOR WOODSTOCK'S 25 T H ANNIVERSARY: The celebration of the 25th anniversary of Woodstock will get off to an early start in 1994 when the Seva Foundation brings together many of the performers from the festival for a benefit concert in San Francisco on February 13. David Crosby and Graham Nash, Bob Weir and Phil Lesh of The Dead, the Jefferson Airplane members, Arlo Guthrie, Richie Havens, and Country McDonald are among Woodstock vets who have already committed. The proceeds will be used foundations's programs: the fighting blindness in India and Nepal: for agricultural development in Central America; and, Native American Health Care.

EX-EMPLOYEE ACCUSES
TOWER RECORDS OF BEING
ANTI-GAY: The Tower Record
Store chain is being sued by a former

security guard who claims that he was forced to quit last February when he refused to spy on suspected gay Eddie Haroun's suit employees. claims he was ordered to bug a store manager's office to see if he was "arranging personal homosexual liaisons on company time and telephones." Haroun was also told to spy on gay managers after hours-so that the company could "terminate or demote gay store managers, because homosexuals do not fit the image of Records." The guard supervised security at 11 stores for over three years.

STEWART TOCONTINUE **MINING UNPLUGGED** VEIN: After two and a half million albums and one of the biggest tours of the year, you can bet the Unplugged bug has bitten Rod Stewart big time. But he insists that his next record won't be Unplugged Volume II. opened up a whole new area for me," he admits. "I don't think I'm going to be able to write songs like I did in my early 20s-like 'Every Picture Tells A Story,' again. But, I would imagine that the next album will definitely be in an acoustic vein. It's not going to be Unplugged Volume II; but there are going to be more acoustic numbers." Stewart loves the combination of drums, acoustic guitar, and a hammond organ. "That's the ingredients for 'Maggie May'-and I still love it," he explained. WHY PHIL COLLINS DELAYED RELEASE OF "EVERYDAY": Phil Collins has no regrets about releaseing "Both Sides Of The Story" as the first single from his sixth solo ablum, even though "Everyday" might have given ghe disc a stronger start. He insisted that the songs re released in that order over the objections of his record company and his managers, who argued that "Both Sides Of The Story" "Might Send The Wrong Message." "I didn't want people to think, 'Okay, it's four years on and this ballad does not surprise me," he explained. "I wanted to try to tell people that this album is different! I thought that the track that did that in a straight ahead fashion was 'both sides of the story." Collins was afraid that if people, especially his heard "Everyday," reaction would be, "yeah, it's a ballad. I know what the rest of the album's like then." "I was trying to doubleguess the critics," he admits. realize that I might have already missed the intellectual critic boat. But, I'll survive somehow." Collins will start rehearsals for his 1994 world tour in February. New members include: Michael Jackson's drummer, Ricky Lawson and a new horn section fronted by one of the members of the Phoenix Horns. The tour will start in Europe, and will arrive in America this summer.

STONES, PINK FLOYD WILL BE '94'S MEGA-TOURS: Promoters are upbeat about '94 when the bands with the two top grossing tours of all-time return to the road-the Rolling Stones and NKOTB. Pink Floyd will also be playing stadiums, and there could be reunion tours by Traffic and The Such perennials as: Sting, Eagles. Aerosmith, Billy Joel, Pearl Jam, Janet Jackson, Luther Vandross, Meat Loaf, Rod Stewart, Jimmy Buffett, Neil Diamond, Garth Brooks, ZZ Top, Rush, Scorpions, and Deep Purple will also be on the road as well.

RECORD GOLD IN '93: before holiday shopping sales were totaled, more albums were certified gold in 1993 than ever before, according to the Recording Industry Association Of America. The RIAA says that at least 521 albums went gold, up from 509 in 1992. Of those, 147 went on to sell a million for platinum certification, and 142 went multiplatinum with sales of two million or more. "The Bodyguard" was the year's biggest seller with 10 million albums and four million copies of the single, "I Will Always Love You." Kenny G. and Janet Jackson had the next biggest records - with five million sales each. Mariah Carey sold four million copies of "Music Box," and another four million sales of Eric Clapton's "Unplugged" raised its sales to seven million, but, spread over 1992 and 1993. At three million were: Billy Joel; Garth Brooks; Dr. Dre; and, "Aladdin."

Their first album, "Dreamboat Annie," was released on Mushroom Records in 1975. That album sold a million copies...

 Canadian radio stations were the first to play their first single, "Crazy On You..."

On February 3, 1991 Ann Wilson's adopted baby was born. Her name is Marie Lamoureaux...

Ann and Nancy wrote or co-wrote all but two of the tunes that appear on "Desire Walks In..."

REPORT

It sounds too good to be true, but according to reports by Goldmine magazine, the remaining members of The Beatles -- Paul McCartney, George Harrison and Ringo Starr --

have been in the studio recording new While details surrounding the historic reunion have been kept hush hush, it seems that Paul, George and Ringo, under the guidance of Beatles producer, George Martin, cut two new tracks in August at an undisclosed location. This pairing marks the first time the three ex-Beatles officially teamed up since the recording of the song "Let It Be" in January 1970. Informally, Paul, George and Ringo have played together on two occasions after the demise of "The Fab Four:" Eric Clapton's 1979 wedding reception and at Starr's 1981 marriage to Barbara Bach. An inside source described the new material as being "quite good." One of the songs reportedly is a tribute to **John** Lennon. McCartney, Harrison and Starr plan to commence recording more material in February. This new material is earmarked for inclusion in the group's monumental tenhour documentary -- a project that should be available in 1995. It's not known what moniker the musicians will choose but it's highly unlikely it will be "The Beatles." More news as it develops.

An influence on everyone from Jimi Hendrix to Lenny Kravitz, Curtis Mavfield is one of the most beloved musicians in music. Due in March via Warner Brothers is a star-studded tribute album to this seminal artist. Participating acts include Eric Clapton with "You Must Believe In Me," "Gypsy Woman" by Bruce Springsteen,
"Amen" by Elton John, "I've Been Trying"
by Phil Collins, "It's All Right" by Stevie
Winwood, "People Get Ready" by Rod Stewart, Lenny Kravitz with Billy Jack, and "Freddie's Dead" by John Mellencamp. Other artists involved in this worthy project include Stevie Wonder, B.B. King, Aretha Franklin and Public Enemy. The project is being organized by superstar manager Ron Weisner (Steve Winwood/John Mellencamp) who has done a tremendous job securing a dream team of musicians.

Reflecting the thoughts of a rootless generation, Reality Bites is the name of Ben Stiller's feature film directorial debut. The Universal Films release stars Winona Ryder, Ethan Hawke and Stiller. The RCA Records soundtrack is a feast of more than a dozen cuts from today's cutting edge talent. Six tracks were recorded specifically for the soundtrack. They are: "When You Come Back To Me," from World Party, "Going, Going, Gone," from The Posies, "I'm Nuthin," from Ethan Hawke, "Revival," from Me Phi Me, "Baby I Love Your Way," from Big Mountain and "Stay," from Lisa Loeb. Additionally, you'll find the music of U2, Lenny Kravitz, Crowded House, The

Juliana Hatfield 3 and The Indians. "Turnip Farm," is a Dinosaur Jr track previously unreleased in the states; The Knack's "My Sharona" gets a remixing from Red Hot Chili Pepper/Jane's Addiction producer Dave Jerden; and the original Squeeze band members gather back in the studio with Tom Lord-Alge handling the mix on a re-recording of "Tempted!" World Party's Karl Wallinger created the score for the film which is set to open across the country on February 18. The soundtrack is set for a February 1 release.



Tori Amos

The Rock Report scored an advance of the new Tori Amos album Under The Pink and we're happy to report the chanteuse is firing on all cylinders. Produced by Eric Rosse and Tori, the record is cut from the same cloth as her amazing debut Little Earthquakes. And while offering no major surprises, Tori's songwriting is solid and imaginative, her piano playing is stunning, and the singing is spectacular, all adding up to another triumph for Tori. Let's hope the lazy journalistic comparisons to Kate Bush cease and Tori is treated as the remarkable one of a kind talent she truly is. Britain has a new #1 single for the new year. "Twist And Shout" by Chaka
Demus and Pliers ascended to the top spot on Sunday, replacing "Mr. Blobby" which had held at the peak over the holiday. Other chart action included a new entry at 10 for D.Ream's remixed "Things Can Only Get Better," easily outdoing the #24 peak achieved by the original last February and becoming the group's first Top 10 hit. With many pre-Christmas singles still selling strongly, the highest climber in the Top 40, curiously, was Janet Jackson's "Again," which moved back from 17 to 12. "Blow Your Whistle" by DJ Duke was a new entry at 22. Wet Wet Wet's "Cold Cold Heart" at 23 and The Mission's remixed "Tower Of British rock outfit Strength" at 33. Terrorvision made their Top 40 debut with "My House" at 34, Alison Limerick returned with "Time Of Our Lives" at 38 and the million-selling American smash "Whoomp! (There It Is)" by Tag Team arrived at 39.

The previous week's chart, published on December 26, showed little activity, with Whitney Houston's reissued "I Will Always Love You" the highest climber, up from 40 to 25 before dropping back to 31 this week. Pearl Jam's "Daughter" was the only new entry on last week's chart at 18; it fell back to 19 yesterday. Meanwhile on this week's album chart, Eternal's "Always And Forever" was a new entry at 25, Gabrielle's "Find Your Way" came in at 24 and Take That's "Everything Changes" resumed the #1 position.

Bjork and Sinead O'Connor are set to make guest appearances on the forthcoming album by Jah Wobble's Invaders Of The Heart, their first since signing to Island last year. The album is expected in March. O'Connor appeared on the former PiL member's Top 40 single "Visions Of You" in early 1992.

One of Sting's co-stars from the Broadway production of The Threepenny Opera releases her debut single on January 17. Kim Criswell's "Moment Of Weakness" is written by Judd Friedman, who wrote much of the soundtrack to the box office smash The Bodyguard. Criswell has had great theatre and concert success in such productions as Elegies For Angels, Punks And Raging Queens in London's West End, Nine opposite Raul Julia on Broadway and in the London production of Annie Get Your Gun for which she received an Olivier Award nomination. Her debut album The Human Cry will be released in February.

Bono is moving into the movies with a role in a science fiction thriller called Johnny Mnemonic which starts filming soon. The U2 singer will star alongside gangsta rapper Ice-T. Lena Flagbe, who's signed to U2's Mother label, is hoping to have her debut album finished in time for a late January/early February release. It'll be titled either Lyrically Yours or Beautiful and will include her debut single "You Come From Earth" and the Top 20 follow-up "Gotta Get It Right."

Depeche Mode's new single, out next week, is a remixed version of "In Your Room", one of the tracks from their Songs Of Faith And Devotion album. The first CD single features the "Zephyr Mix" of the track and the "Extended Zephyr Mix," by Butch Vig, and "Never Let Me Down Again" and "Death's Door." Two further CDs will be available on January 17, the first featuring the lead track plus "Policy Of Truth," "World In My Eyes" and "Fly On The Windscreen," the second with the "Jeep Rock" and "Apex" mixes of "In Your Room" plus the "Adrenaline Mix" of "Higher Love."

Former Free and Bad Company vocalist Paul Rodgers will release the title track of his Muddy Waters Blues album as a single in mid-January and the additional tracks on the CD will be his versions of Jimi Hendrix songs. Meanwhile former Chimes singer Pauline Henry, who made her solo breakthrough with a cover of one of Rodgers' most famous songs, "Feel Like Makin' Love," follows it on January 17 with "Can't Take Your Love."

The first single from Level 42's forthcoming RCA album will be "Forever Now," due on February 14. Curiosity's Back To Front album is now scheduled for release in the spring when they're also planning to release a cover of Roberta Flack's "Killing Me Softly With His Song" as a single.

Soul Asylum follow their breakthrough reissue of "Runaway Train" next week with another single from their *Grave Dancers Union* album, "Black Gold." The CD single will feature "Square Root" plus "unplugged" versions of "Somebody To Shove" and "Closer To The Stars." The band have a UK tour lined up for March, including a night at Brixton Academy on the 23rd and dates in Glasgow and in Dublin on St. Patrick's Day, March 17.

Blue Aeroplanes, who left Ensign Records after completing the recording of a new album, have that LP, *Life Model*, set for release on their new label Beggars Banquet at the end of February. It's preceded on January 17 by the *Broken & Mended* LP, from which the lead track will feature on the album. The band have announced a major UK tour starting on January 26 and including a date at the Grand in London on February 11. They'll be supported by Irish band A-House.

Boston band the Gigolo Aunts have been picking up considerable UK airplay lately with their single "Where I Find My Heaven," released here on the Fire label. The quartet hail originally from Potsdam in upstate New York and have the same management as Nirvana. They appeared in the US on tour with Suede earlier in the year and take their name from former Pink Floyd members Syd Barrett's 1970 album track "Gigolo Aunt."

One Dove's new single "Why Don't You Take Me," out this week, will be featured in the new British film Shopping. The Glasgow band made their Top 40 debut recently with the single "Breakdown" and this new single will appear on the soundtrack album along with the next Utah Saints single "Too Much To Swallow" and a previously unreleased Shakespeare's Sister track. The soundtrack LP is due out on February 28.

US band **The Meat Puppets** will release their ninth album *Too High To Die* on February 28 and the first single from it will be "Backwater." They're booked to support **Nirvana** on tour in Europe and are also supporting **Soul Asylum** on a set of UK and European dates.

Marillion's new LP *Brave* which, as we reported previously, is a concept album, will be released on February 7. It tells the story of a girl, who has lost her memory, found wandering on the Severn Bridge between England and Wales. European territories are releasing "The Great Escape" as the first single from the album on January 10.






