


INSIDE TOP 40 WITH DAVE SHOLIN


Our updated and expanded Report includes several noteworthy revisions in Top 40's "Up And Coming" section. Rather than a requirement of 10% of stations reporting to make the page, the new entry level is simply 20 or more reports. In addition, a record that receives no new airplay for two consecutive weeks will drop off the page. Of course the main objective is to give you the information you need in a concise, easy to read format with key stats readily available. As predicted last week, PHIL COLLINS skates into number one, settling in for more than a short stay. Fast climbing PAUL YOUNG pulls ahead into the top ten with a Hit Factor that nearly doubles from 35% up to 65%. TIL TUESDAY has reached a Hit Factor of 75%, still adding to their airplay base. Biggest jumps reported by B97-New Orleans 14-8, WDEK-DeKalb 17-2, 14K/92K-Tulsa 17-11, KZZB-

Beaumont 16-9, KZZP-Phoenix 21-13, KRPL-Moscow 13-4, KCPX-Salt Lake City 15-7, KZZU-Spokane 26-13. KITS-San Francisco 24-18, KIIS/FM-L.A. 12-6, etc. MADONNA's "Groove" hits top 15 after only three weeks with hefty airplay growth of 180 to 246 reports. Sitting at number one in Los Angeles, La Crosse, Joliet, Madison, Houston, El Paso, Dallas, Phoenix, Salt Lake City, Sacramento, Las Vegas, Stockton, etc. Appears it will end up topping "Angel" when the final chart story is told. KIM CARNES rates a 35% Hit Factor with moves into the top 20 at PRO/FM, WZON, WFBG, KZHR, KXLE, KRIB, WWYO, WVJR, WJDQ, WPFM, WKDD, KDWB, KQHU, KSDN, etc.

West Coast led the way on DEPECHE MODE, a chartbounder set for a strong debut next week. Goes number one at KMEL-San Francisco, moves 13-10 at KDON-Salinas, 11-8 KXFM- Santa Maria, 16-8 KSTN-Stockton, 12-7 KKXX-Bakersfield, 15-11 KS103-San Diego, 20-16 KIIS/FM-Los Angeles.

Early action confirms that TEARS FOR FEARS' "Shout" will be one of the biggest hits (maybe the biggest) of the summer. Big request action at Q-96, KAFM, KDON, KMEL, etc. GO WEST's second effort picking up strong new airplay with adds at QlO4, 106X, WZYM, KFMZ, KVIC, KUAD, KIIS/FM, KLUC, KO93, KZZK, etc. Record To Watch shines a spotlight on Texas, where COCK ROBIN charts number 26 at 93FM-Houston plus on at KEYP-Tyler, KFMN-Abilene, KIPR-Lufkin. New at KFIV, 106X, WMPZ, KNOE. Best chart move is reported by KKYS-Bryan, taking it 24-14. Skip Bishop also reports great response to the WHAM! "Rap" (Enjoy What You Do) off the "Perfect' soundtrack.

PAUL WELLER: THE STYLE COUNCIL SPEAKS OUT

He's controversial and outspoken. Paul Weller made a living out of speaking his mind with The Jam-Britain's torrid postmod trio. In 1982, Weller abruptly disbanded The Jam for a simple reason he gave in this interview. Teaming with keyboardist, Mick Talbot, Weller threw the dice and totally changed his musical direction and formed The Style Council. Weller speaks very directly about politics and the crumbling British Kingdom around him. He's angry, opinionated, but claims that The Style Council speaks from fact not imagination. The new album on Geffen, Internationalists, stays close to the issues on Weller's mind-but does it in a nonjudgmental non-pretentious manner. Close investigation of the lyrics will find references to last year's crippling miners' strike in Britain, unemployment, the loss of community identity, and the heroin

Weller spoke to us from the British PolyGram offices and frankly we were slightly intimidated. Weller has a testy reputation towards dealing with Americans. His London-afflicted accent cut through the phone lines in typical Weller fashion—straight from the heart and shot from the hip. Love him or hate him, millions of worldwide music fans stand behind what he says. Now he tells you—exclusively.

KZ: The opening track, "Homebreakers" starts the album on a serious note. What were your intentions?

PW: The song is about a family torn apart by unemployment. The two sons have to move away from home to find work and the father has been made redundant. All in all, the unemployment has broken the family in two. (The song) is not all quite sad. The last line ends up with one of the sons seeking revenge on the people who brought about that kind of state. There's quite a lot of pessimistic subject matter on the LP. But at the same time, I think there's other bits of hope. There's a kind of defiance as well. Though things do sound pessimistic, they're the truth. They're all factual. Any of the subjects on the LP are all born out of reality. There are people fighting back against this (British) government. That's the sort of thing that's going to grow and grow. The music reflects the defiance of the people in this country.

KZ: Why do you think the current British government should be blamed for the whole mess?

PW: Most of the situations we find

ourselves in have been brought about through their total monetaristic policies and their lack of consideration for people. That could be said of most governments. In your own country, you're experiencing quite a lot of unemployment. In this LP, hopefully people in America will also understand some of the things as well because it's also happening in your own country—maybe not in the same degree.

KZ: It's not as bad here, but it can hit home here too.

PW: Even in New York. I've been through Harlem. That's the sort of America that never gets shown at all.

KZ: There's a strange irony in your music and your lyrics. Especially in "All Gone Away." The music is light, but the lyrics are serious.

PW: I think it's an interesting contrast. If you wrote all the music to suit the lyrics, you'd end up with an album that sounded like Leonard Cohen's Greatest Hits. Sometimes it's good to balance it out. The main reason is it makes people listen to the song. Initially perhaps they don't get what the song is about. But at some point in time they're going to hear the lyrics. Then it's going to make them think. Using the music that way can put a song across even stronger.

KZ: How did the miners' strike in Britain affect The Style Council's music? PW: I don't know about the music. But it affected us in the way we think and perceive things. I suppose those effects came out in the lyrics as well. Two things on the miners' strike: One was to show that kind of ruthlessness I was on about this (Thatcher) government. They were out to crush the miners right from the start. That became quite obvious. The other thing was that the miners' strike, as far as I'm concerned, was a class struggle. Putting down the miners is also as good as putting down the whole of the working class as well. The government wagging their finger saying "Don't get out of line because this is what will happen."

KZ: What about the charge that the miners are part of the problem of Britain refusing

to modernize their industries outlook?
PW: What's the alternative? What is modernization? Nuclear energy? If that's modernization then you can keep it. I don't see that as any way forward.
KZ: One of the most outrageous songs on

the album is "Come To Milton Keynes."
Could you explain to us Americans what
Milton Keynes is?
PW: The closest example I can think of as
an American parallel is a lot of those towns
where you've got a shopping mall and the

an American parallel is a lot of those towns where you've got a shopping mall and the houses dotted around it and that's it. There's no real community. It's like a prefabricated community. A community is born out of people's experiences and the people's spirit. There's quite a lot of these new towns springing up in England. I think they've got a real kind of soulessness about them. I don't think it's the way we should be headed. We should be headed in quite the reverse to that. In England, we get these TV ads trying to promote Milton Keynes which is an actual new town. We get these TV ads which try to paint this



idyllic picture of a prosperous town—where everyone is happy and nothing bad will happen. Which is all bullshit, quite obviously. The whole breakdown in community spirit really worries me. KZ: Was there one specific instance which made you re-evaluate your music and split up The Jam and form The Style Council? PW: I wasn't enjoying it anymore. That's a good enough reason, really. You've got to

enjoy what you're doing.

PW: Internationalist Socialism. (laughs) It's a funny way of describing a song. I suppose that's what we believe. You only have to look at the whole world. There's only one set of people getting pushed around and that's the people on the bottom of the pile. The people on the top of the pile, never. They're always living in the land of milk and honey. It's a question of making people on the bottom realize that, or even better still, to get mobilized to do something about it. But I'm not up to saying that a pop song is gonna do that. It won't do that. It's just us expressing our opinion.

KZ: Compared to other bands, The Style Council is going out on a political limb, why?

PW: We've been fairly active politically in

the last year. The more we see, the more we learn, and the more people we meet who are involved in these political campaigns, the more I've got to say about different matters. When you learn the facts behind things, you've got a solid base to write from. People can't turn around and accuse me of using my imagination. These are facts. That's the very important aspect of the LP. I would hope our music inspires people to get involved politically or to organize politically. If our music could do that in any way whatsoever, then that would be one of the greatest achievements ever.

KZ: You've been involved in UK Disarmament and support the miners' strike. Do you ever look at others in music and ask, "Why aren't you involved?" PW: Well, I find it a bit sickening. There's always that difference of opinion where some people say that pop music is entertainment and nothing else. There's the other people who say, "Well, no, you can actually use pop music as a medium to put ideas and messages over," Obviously I'm part of the latter. Of course it should be entertaining. I wouldn't ignore that either. I don't think it's good to ram politics down people's throats all the time. I find it really frustrating that a lot of our so called

contemporaries never lift a finger for anything or get involved—purely just because of their own public image. Most people in pop groups live in their own world. They're in a cocoon. It doesn't matter to them because they're okay and they're secure. And I don't like that attitude. KZ: Do you write songs like "Boy Who Cried Wolf" from personal experiences? PW: Yes and no. They're always born out a personal experience or something I feel. With those kind of what do you call them? Love songs? I dunno, I exaggerate them. I magnify my feelings. Take them out of all proportion, I often think of them being quite filmic.

KZ: "A Man Of Great Promise" has a very moving tone to it.

PW: That's based on someone I knew who killed himself with a drug overdose. It's about those kind of people who are just self-destructive, who find living too painful to cope with. It's a very sad song. One good thing about it is that it doesn't judge the person at all.

KZ: Listening to "Down the Seine," what is it about The Style Council's fascination with the French/Cafe Bleu sound? PW: Our two main influences: One is Black music—especially Black American music. The other one is Europe. Some European songwriters, especially the French ones, were really, really goodpeople like Jacques Brel (from Belgium, but adopted by the French). The words are so imaginative and so powerful, I also like Brecht, a German writer. Lyrically, they were really good. You have to look at their respective eras for the kind of lyrics they were writing then. They were far, far advanced from anything Britain was turning out around that time. I like the mood of those songs. I like French jazz. People like

Michel LeGrand as well. KZ: Why do you throw so many different

music styles at the listener?

PW: That's the way it comes out. We don't sit down and say we're going to make an LP of 57 varieties (laughs). We just let it happen, really. Whatever people think, it's natural. People get conditioned into thinking a band has to have one sound, one identity. I don't agree. It makes it nice and marketable but it doesn't make it as interesting.

KZ: What is your attitude toward your old Jam songs?

PW: Some I like. Some I don't like. No more, no less than that.

KZ: How can you be successful in the music scene and not be considered part of the elite?

PW: We don't align ourselves with any of that. It's against our principles and values. I have no emotional desire to go out and drink champagne at dawn with Rod Stewart and his wife. I find it a cliche, all that crap. There are more healthier and positive things to do.

KZ: Are songs like "Luck" written originally as duets?

PW: We have a very loose approach to writing. With "Luck," Mick Talbot wrote the

n the April 12 issue of the Gavin Report, I wrote about a subject that Bill Gavin felt strongly about too--the value of mentioning title and artist of songs being played. It's somewhat out of vogue these days, but far from being a positive, I feel that failure to tell the listener what the song is shows a disinterest in the music that can frustrate even the astute listener.

I received a note from Don Christopherson, afternoon personality on WNAX in Yankton, South Dakota:

"To announce or not to announce the artist title?

"When was the last time you were irritated at hearing that information? Can't remember? Okay, how often have you gotten upset with an announcer when you heard a new tune, or any tune you liked, and weren't familiar with, and the jock wouldn't tell you what you wanted to know and waited to hear?"

End of note, Needless to say, I agree! By the way, WNAX is an upper midwest legend, because of its vast coverage area, and so I had assumed Yankton was a larger city than it turns out to be. 12,000 people. There's an interesting profile on Yankton, intended to examine the problems of communities of that size all over the country, on page 132 of the May 20 issue of *Forbes*. Beautiful overhead photo of the town, too. Worth reading.

Apropos of the March 29th column, in which I quoted PD Mark Larson of KFMB in San Diego on the subject of time management, I received a letter from Virginia Birrell, Executive Assistant at 3KZ radio in Melbourne, Australia. She inquired about the "Franklin Institute" in Salt Lake City, from which Mark obtained the "Franklin Planner" he spoke so highly of.

She called the American Consulate in Australia but could not get any information on the institute. I was not familiar with it myself, but have obtained a telephone number and address for it which I passed on to her.

This subject, long completely ignored (all listeners and even most broadcasters, it seems, felt that improving the quality of AM radio sound was a contradiction in terms), has now become increasingly the subject of discussion and investigation.

A subcommittee of the Engineering Advisory Committee of the NAB has been studying the subject in depth, and a few months ago issued a lengthy report called "AM Technical Improvement: A Plan For The Future". A copy was sent me by Michael C. Rau, Staff Engineer at the NAB, and I found it fascinating reading. The NAB has made it available free to anyone requesting it. 

Perfect Soundtrack (Arista)

Although I'd never want to meet 'up with this movie in a dark room, there are trax you gotta check out on the soundtrack. Lay Your Hands On Me is a stray UK hit single heretofore unreleased until now. LOU REED's Hot Hips (Suzanne sideways) sounds straight out of the New Sensations sessions. Also, don't miss the two JERMAINES, POINTERS, and NONA HENDRYX. At least the musicians held up their end. Actually it looks like JAMIE LEE CURTIS is doing just that, JOHN TRAVOLTA, fifty push ups and take a lap, you bimbo.



Expose' — Taxxi (MCA)

In efforts to transform themselves to exotic video shoot locations, TAXXI takes a TransEuropean ride through lyric land. Writing in various and sundry combinations (and positions, so I'm told) MISTERS CUMMING, NEAD, and PAYNE provide a panorama of ballads and rock songs, multi-format in design. TAXXI defies the one-cut rule that Album Radio stingently applies to worthy bands. Beyond the single,

Still In Love, there's Lipstick/ Who Knows Me/Russian Roulette. You'll be reading more on TAXXI inside an upcoming GAVIN.

"Freeway Of Love" — Aretha Franklin (Arista)

ARETHA gives the traffic report of her career! Producer NARADA MICHAEL WALDEN's idea to add xylophones makes for a mighty good hook. The Album Radio special mix is toughened up by guitarist DEZ DICKERSON and sax symbol CLAR-ENCE CLEMMONS. I dig both mixes. Why not daypart both and get down.

"St. Elmo's Fire (Man In Motion)" — John Parr (Atlantic)

More GAVIN at The Movies music with the first single from St.Elmo's Fire starring ALLY SHEEDY and JUDD NELSON from The Breakfast Club. JOHN PARR sings the theme that's dramatically arranged.

"Cry" — Godley & Creme (Polydor)

The voices of 10CC are now award winning vid-directors. They mark their return to the audio realm with this expeditional three mix dream EP. Production credit is shared between C&G and TREVOR HORN. The video will cause a lot of talk, so be prepared.

"Barriers" — Simon Townshend (21/Polydor)

This track features a strong megamix from one of our favorite dial twiddlers, JOHN LUONGO that'll give SIMON a shove into the spotlight. The band is called MOVING TARGETS with SIMON fronting.

all these adds translating into rotations. Don't touch that dial. The showdown is coming right up.

Strange Minaret/Puppet Tears-SHEILA CHANDRA (Indipop-U.K.) After an apparent legal dispute, MONSOON re-emerged a few years ago-essentially the same group as SHEILA CHANDRA. Released about a month ago in England, "The Struggle" has a very distinctive East Indian flavor to it, containing a number of exotic songs that hold a steady groove. While much of the album is vaguely entrenched in tradition, the cuts mentioned represent a refreshing new discovery. Steve Coe, who has been an integral ingredient since the MONSOON days played keyboards and produced the LP. music. I'll just go away and listen to it. I just got what I felt was the feeling coming out of the music. Then I wrote it around that. I suppose we also have to make some kind of concessions of optimism on the LP. (laughs) No, I'm being facetious. KZ: Tell us about "With Everything To Lose."

PW: Steve White, our drummer, wrote the music. In England, they have a thing called the Youth Training Scheme. I think a lot of times it comes down to cheap labor. They give school leavers these Youth Training Schemes that they work on for six months, sometimes nine months—in the hope of ending up with a proper job at the end of their training. For doing a full week's work, they get 26 pounds a week (\$34.00), which is nothing. In the last two months, the government has cut supplementary benefits for 16-17 year school leavers-which kind of forces them into going into one of these schemes. I find it a bit like work conscription. Something like that leaves so much open for bosses to exploit people. KZ: Some of your lyrics have anti-drug

PW: I'm anti-drugs. It obviously depends on what degree. England at the moment is experiencing a really bad wave of drugtaking where heroin has become very, very cheap on the streets. You're getting really young kids like eight to twelve, thirteen year olds taking this cheap smack that's around. That's what I'm against.

KZ: What aspects of the album do you think Americans will have trouble relating to? PW: I'm hoping none. Possibly some of the colloquialisms. Some of the subject matter might sound foreign at first, but if you could apply it to your own country you'll see those things around. It's more magnified in England because it's a much smaller country and obviously a much smaller population. The things I'm writing about are worldwide. I really hope the LP will cut through that and relate to American people so they can understand it.

KZ: "Walls Come Tumbling Down" is an upbeat way to end the album. PW: It's basically about unity and the power that people have in unity. Last year with the miners' strike we saw working class unity really broken down-probably at its lowest ebb with the lack of support that the miners got from the rest of the trade unions. But that's no reason to say unity doesn't exist anymore. The question is not to get down about it, but to try and raise that level back up again. Things can change when people join together. People are powerful. There's more of us than there are of them at the top.

THE MEN FROM BAND AID

It has been quite a year for the lead singer of The Boomtown Rats. BOB GELDOF (along with Midge Ure) received the coveted NARM-Harry chapin Award for their formation of Band Aid. He also received the humanitarian Tom Donahue Award. In a recent session, the United Nations gave special accomodation to Band Aid Relief. Meanwhile, The Boomtown Rats have been a successful band since 1977 and their latest LP, Laying In The Long Grass, marks their return after a three year break from the record release treadmill.

KZ: So you've been seeing the fruits of your labor with Band-Aid? Have you been shipping food and supplies yet? BG: We've been sending in planes. I launched the first Band-Aid boat-Band-Aid One. It sailed for Port Sudan. Last month we spent more in Ethiopia than the British Government did. There's a concert I want to plan for the summer. What I would like to do would be to link Shea Stadium (in New York) with Wembley Stadium (in London). Each band would do four or five songs then you'd swap from one side to the other. Then we'd go out live to the entire world. It would have to be the biggest concert ever.

KZ: This is the first album since 1983. Have The Boomtown Rats been taking a break? BG: Not really. The name of the LP (Laying In The Long Grass) comes from that sort of question. It's an Irish expression. People say, "What have you been doing?" You say, "I've been laying in the long grass"meaning you've been around but you just may not have been visible.

KZ: How has it been going for the band? BG: It got too predictable for the band. Another tour, another album-we do really well in Europe and everywhere else in the world. It came time to do another record and I said, "Fuck it." It was getting to the

> point where the thing I liked best was playing live. So I went off and did The Wall (movie). Then we went and toured in places like India, Malaysia, Singapore, and Israel at the beginning of the Lebanese war. Very weird situations. Very challenging. All the expectations were off of us. It put it very much in perspective for me as to what exactly I enjoyed about music and how important it was to me.

KZ: What did you do when you got back? BG: I made another movie that just opened in Britain. It's called Number One in Britain. They'll probably change the name here. KZ: How is the new album different? BG: We went out and toured and I had these songs, so we played them on the tour. It was different because we usually play them, rehearse them, then record them first. There is more of that loose feeling. It's more in the groove from the word go. It wasn't a problem playing them in the studio. It's more like a rock album as opposed to a pop album.

KZ: I really like this song "Rain." What's it about?

BG: On the English album, it's called "Dave." Dave was a friend of mine whose girl friend died and he called me up when she died. He was drunk and he was crying. It's a cliche, but all you can say to people at that point is "look, you must keep going. The worst thing is to succumb to your sorrow. In a year or two years this will seem like a dream." So it was really a song to him. I always thought he had that selfdestructive thing about him, which is nonsensical. The key line in the song is "Dave, I've always felt that you were touched by fate.'

KZ: So you recut the song and changed "Dave" to "Rain"?

BG: The original lyric in Britain is "Dave called me up yesterday. Everything he loved had moved away." I added the rain thing to "Rain came pouring down yesterday everything he loved got washed away." I actually think it's better. It's more evocative. I also think it's a better vocal than the original. So I'm quite glad I did it. KZ: What's the formula for The Boomtown Rats staying together so long? BG: The formula is that we've known each

other for years and years. It wasn't the sort of band that you advertised for guys. I've known all of them since I was ten. Most of us played guitar. Johnny (Fingers) played piano and Simon (Crowe) played drums.

One of us said, "I'll do bass."

KZ: What do you think of American pop music today?

BG: You have style which is a major contribution. It's always been an English thing, mainly because we have national television in Britain. We could like the look of the band and the style of them and what they were giving off. That wasn't as possible before MTV, for example. On MTV, you've got the style of the band. It became important for Americans to look like something other than just a checked shirt with long hair and jeans. Even with bands that have been going on for ages like ZZ Top, you suddenly find them developing a style. Bands like Prince are very stylized. Their clothes and attitudes are almost like a direct English thing. Madonna and Cyndi Lauper are two other examples. Style became a predominant issue in American music.

KZ: How important is attitude as well as

style?

BG: The idea of a band is usually translated through its songs, but also through its attitudes. You buy the attitude as much as you buy the record. For example, The Stones sold an attitude. They sold it very well. The attitude said, "Fuck you." 'A Wop Bop A Lu Lop A Wop Bam Boom' means absolutely nothing. But when you have this black guy dressed up like a peacock screaming it, then it means everything.

Besides helping put Band Aid together, MIDGE URE is also part of the British music elite as a member of Ultravox. The band's last four albums with Chrysalis Records almost singlehandedly kicked off the British synthesizer revolution and have sold millions worldwide. Originally, Ultravox was a punk band and when Ure joined up, the band members scrambled at other musical jobs to get Ultravox rolling again. Ure played heavy metal guitar with Thin Lizzy, Billy Currie toured with Gary Numan on keyboards. Putting it on the line, Ultravox recorded the highy

acclaimed masterpiece, Vienna, and got in on the ground floor of video production by being among the handful of bands putting out the earliest videos in 1980. Ultravox's latest product, The Collection, a greatest hits package has surpassed one million units worldwide. A Midge Ure solo album is also in the works.

KZ: When you first joined ULTRAVOX, their lead singer and another guy left when you came in. How much of the current concept did you bring with you?

MU: There was no concept, really. When we met up, it was a financially horrific arrangement for all concerned. We'd been dropped by record companies. We had no management. On paper we owed more than a quarter of a million pounds to previous record companies who expected to get it back at the time, so it was no question of "Boy! Get together with these guys and we're goin' to be a-laughin' for the rest of our lives." The buzz that we got on the first rehearsal was amazing. We didn't know what we were doing at the time. I never wrote songs with other people before and we started writing songs for the first time. Within a week to ten days we'd written half of the Vienna album.

KZ: You guys basically put your behinds on the line by sinking money into keyboards. MU: We'd no money to do it. Billy (Currie) went off with Gary Numan on his first tour to get money to put into Ultravox. I went off with Thin Lizzy to get money to put into Ultravox. We borrowed money from the bank. Don't ask me how we managed it. We borrowed five thousand pounds to finance a tour (of the U.S.). We sold our souls. If we'd met the devil that day ...

KZ: Is it true you were asked to join the Sex Pistols?

MU: Yeah, but my teeth were too good. I was stopped coming out of a music shop in Glasgow and asked to go and have a talk with this guy in a car. I turned up at the car and there was Malcolm McLaren sitting there, a very odd looking character he was at the time. We had a chat and he said, "I used to manage the New York Dolls ... I'm back in London and I'm forming this group. I got a couple of people in the band and we're going to do this and we're going to do that. Oh, by the way, aren't you a musician? Do you play? Do you sing?" He actually asked me to join the band because of (my) short hair and tight trousers. I didn't look like the rest of the guys at the time with feathered hair and stocky boots. That was in '75.

KZ: Are you currently working on a solo project?

MU: I've been working on a solo album for the last few months on and off. More off than on because the Band Aid thing took up a lot of time. It's something that I talked about doing a few years ago when I released a couple of solo singles ("No Regrets" and "After A Fashion"). I'm too busy with Ultravox or producing other bands, taping videos. I'll be back in the

studio. I've given myself two months to finish it.

KZ: How did you get George Martin to work with Ultravox?

MU: Umm, we asked him basically. Why be afraid about it? We thought, he's just gonna blow us out. But he was great. He had heard Vienna and he loved that. His daughter was a big fan and that helped no end. It was just a matter of logistics and he said he'd do it. We just had to shuffle a few things about our recording time and his recording time because he was working with McCartney at the time.

KZ: I think some people think that videos started with MTV. You were involved in rock videos on the ground level with Ultravox then as a director. Could you explain the history of rock videos? MU: Well, there isn't really a history. The first video I remember seeing was "Bohemian Rhapsody" by Queen. Then The Boomtown Rats "I Don't Like Mondays" and the Vienna (video) was the next big one. It's funny that Britain should come up with a concept like that and put a visual to it because we don't have a vehicle to show it on. We only have three pop programs. We don't have a cable channel. We don't have a vast amount of rock shows on the television to show off. In the first year of MTV, 90% of the videos must have been from Britain.

KZ: Did you recently travel to the Sudan to oversee the Band Aid Project? MU: I didn't go to Sudan. Bob (Geldof) went to the Sudan. I went to Addis. It was an eye opener to say the least. I went there with the first Band Aid shipment. I went up country to a camp, a transit camp where they bring people from the north of the country where it's really bad and feed them up, get them medication, and get them reasonably healthy again. The people I saw were basically going to live. The families had been kept together. Then they take them out of there and take them to the south where it's not much better, but they have water so they can grow things. I saw where the money is going. And that was a good thing.

KZ: Now that Ultravox is a very big selling band in Europe, how do you respond when some people say that Ultravox is a little set in their ways musically?

MU: I suppose you interpret that as we have a type of music we enjoy playing and don't want to change it radically. We're not staying with that because it sells records. If we get tired of it tomorrow and wanted to go acoustic, we'll go. But that is the type of music we play. We have a particular individual style that is widely copied. A lot of bands bandwagon jump. They play a particular type of music because that is the "in thing" for six months. And then when that is not the "in thing," they jump on the next one. "I'm a funk band this week! Slappy bass. Doesn't work. Hey U-2 okay!" Honestly it's like that. I think we're lucky that we have a sound that when people hear us, they think, "Hey! That's Ultravox!" ■

HUEY LEWIS & THE NEWS - The Power of Love (Chrysalis)

Here is a shining example of why this band has emerged as a Top 40 staple from coast to coast. You won't get too many records better than this all year. The group that never rests is just back from a European tour in time to hear this track hit the air everywhere. Featured in Steven Spielberg's upcoming film "Back to the Future", it's one of those special songs that can be categorized as AUTOMATIC!

BRYAN ADAMS - Summer of '69 (A&M)

Hard to believe those in high school during the Summer of Woodstock are now in their early thirties. Adams does a brilliant job of recalling that era, shooting straight at the heart of 60's Brats and Rug Rats. Perfect blend of sentimentality and rock.

CARLY SIMON - Tired of Being Blonde (Epic) Al Green was "Tired of Being Alone", Rocky Burnette was "Tired of Towin' the Line" and Carly was tired of hangin' outside the Top 40. Showing her true colors as a vocalist/song stylist par excellence, "Tired of Being Blonde" features one highlight after another. This time around all her hard work was not in vain.

JOHN PARR - St. Elmo's Fire (Man in Motion) (Atlantic)

Can't help getting the feeling that the studio was smoldering after this session. Parr and David Foster prove to be a helluva match for this Hollywood inspired project. Chorus is the definite standout on this heavily produced entry that should get movie goers calling radio stations asking for Mo, Mo.

A-HA - Take On Me (Warner Brothers)

Video has already generated heavy requests and sales in advance of the record's release. England seems to have an unlimited supply of bands with unlimited creativity. Making their stateside debut with a video and a song that contains an awesome hook should give these guys the last ha-ha.

FREDDIE JACKSON - Rock Me Tonight (For Old Times Sake) (Capitol)

His early experience as a gospel singer gives Jackson the ability to add a double dose of emotion on R&B's former number one tune. 40 airplay is picking up fast on this sultry summer sizzler.

PEABO BRYSON - Take No Prisoners (In the Game of Love) (Elektra)

Time to shed the image of balladeer and pick up the tempo. Soft and pretty or pop and punchy Peabo's proving his appeal is mainstream, more now than ever before.

Sting "The Dream of the Blue Turtles" (A&M) The Album begins with the hit single, IF YOU LOVE SOMEBODY SET THEM FREE, a powerful primal screamspeech. Then it's on to third world rhythm with LOVE IS THE SEVENTH WAVE. At the very end of the track he pokes a little fun at his own greatest hit. What follows is a ballad version of TWO TRIBES called RUSSIANS, complete with Prokofiev melody. Next up, is CHILDREN'S CRUSADE which is the first hint that there's some jazz to be played. And that's what we get until the album's trailer, FORTRESS AROUND YOUR HEART, which is a return to pop reality. We've known "artists" with less credibility than he, who wouldn't give us the real airplay potential when stepping out. Thanks for considering us, Sting!

Peabo Bryson "Take No Prisoners" (Elektra) Whew! No prisoners taken on side one. Somebody lit a fire under his sofa. He's up on the good foot, perspiring from pulse-quickening rhythm tracks. As a confirmed balladeer, his heart beats for the slow dance...until now. The opening and title track is calculated to play thru the pop spectrum from rock through A/C to R&B. THERE'S NOTHING OUT THERE (with Chaka Khan) could have easily been a Chaka track. It's slick and souled out. LET'S APOLOGIZE is a firm and Pointer punctual sing along. Then...finally...we flip the disc and find side two and our Romeo crooning from bended knee toward the balcony of his imaginary Juliet and all is right with the world. Credit producer Arif Mardin for the up-side and Tommy Li Puma for the mellow.


