

# **INSIDE TOP 40** WITH DAVE SHOLIN

Something's gotta give, but what? Check out all those underlines in the top ten! DIRE STRAITS' "Hit Factor" increase demonstrates awesome growth pattern...48% to 76% and destined for a long stay in the top ten. MOTLEY CRUE continues to be a hit where it gets a shot picking up a 62% "Hit Factor" up 19% from last week.

Below the top twenty, lots of fast movers, including MELLENCAMP, debuting top thirty at Z98-Tampa, WJLK-Asbury Park, WZUU-Milwaukee, WQLK-Richmond, KYYA-Billings, KDON-Monterey/Salinas, KSXO-Redding, WRCK-Utica, etc. GODLEY & CREME got "Certified" a few weeks ago and those big jumps are now coming in...WHYT 35-27, KEYP 25-16, KZZK 30-24, KYES 24-16, KHSN 16-6, KIST 20-9, KOZE 15-10, WZON 34-20, etc. KATRINA & THE WAVES moving

inside the top twenty for 3WD, WFXZ, WTYX, WCGQ, WBNQ, KIZZ plus a good number of strong debuts gives them a shot for repeating their earlier success.

UB40, our "Record To Watch" at the beginning of the month, debuts, as new believers CFTR, WQLT, WKSP, KITS, KMJK, etc., take them close to 150 reporting stations. Interestingly, this song is making a comeback in England by...Sonny & Cher.

Excellent first week on ABC with WFBG, 106X, WDCG, KITT, KFIV, WDBR, WKYX, KLUC, KUBE, KS103, WKHI, WAVA just some of the 83 who jumped on board instantly. Philly's HOOTERS pulling closer to 100 total reports, as hometown Z106 charts it #9 and WPST-Trenton listing 16-11.

Noteworthy Up and Comers are DAVID FOSTER, busting out of the Lone Star state with KKYS charting


it 31-17, 93FM debuting it at 29, KEYP at 30, plus numbers at KIYS, KOZE, WEED, WBBQ, Y100, Z-98, etc. A/C winner MICHAEL FRANKS has a 12% "Hit Factor" with 25 Top 40 believers so far. Could be a crossover waiting to happen.

OINGO BOINGO's "Weird Science" happening fast as expected...doubling in airplay with adds at Z104, KMGX, KIIS, KFIM, WDEK, WTCQ, KSTN, KHIT etc. L.A. and S.F. confirming this week's "Record To Watch", OMD... KMEL 26-20, KKHR debut #23, KIIS debut #36.

KZZP's Guy Zapoleon feels the last KENNY LOGGINS "Forever" was a "hit that got away...top 10 callouts, big requests, and top thirty sales. Don't write it off yet".

# MUSIC IN REVIEW

ately we've been reading more and more serious and intellectual reviews of pop records. Leafing through old trade publications, we observe that record reviews in the fifties and into the sixties were little more than one or two line puffs that read like liner notes on old Rosie Clooney albums. They went something like, "Como's 'Catch A Falling Star' is yet another tuneful offering by the consistant hitmaker. Should keep toes tapping and cash registers jingling throughout the

And that was it. Then along came Rolling Stone, The Village Voice and a number of other publications who decided that our product was worthy of more heady analysis. The era of the star rock writer was born and the material we turn out was treated with a respect formerly granted only to performances of Mahler. and poetry readings. Frankly, we think it's gotten entirely out of hand. Here, in Los Angeles, for instance, we have Mikal Gilmore writing for one of our daily newspapers. Although Gilmore's stuff is supposedly in English, I've actually had to hire an interpreter to translate his Sunday pieces. The guy will do three pages of probing contemplation on the long term impact of Lone Justice on society, or a sixty paragraph dissection of Talking Heads.

## CHUCK BERRY: ROLL OVER BEETHOVEN AND OTHER HITS

Robert Hilburn, in the L.A. Times, does Springsteen pieces which are longer than War and Peace. If I was The Boss, and had just read one of these columns, I'd say ... "Wait a minute ... is THAT what I really meant when I kept yelling 'Born In The U.S.A.?' "

Our own Ron Fell is a master of the form. You can find his literate and well-crafted



musings in the back of every Gavin Report. On June 28th he told us that Carly Simon's lyrics "pierce the veil of intrapersonal privacy" and on August 9th he directs us to the "quirky abstractions" on the Propaganda LP. I listened to both of the above and never had MY intrapersonal privacy pierced by Carly. But that's probably because my copy was pressed off center. Or maybe it's just that I'M pressed off center. And that would be a quirky abstraction.

At any rate, the articles are getting heavier and heavier and we think it's a shame that few of the great oldie acts were treated to such think-reviews. Well, actually, some of them were, and we've uncovered some previously unpublished material which we'd like to share with you. Understand please that space limitations dictate edited versions of what originally were lengthy dissertations:

## BEST OF THE CHIPMUNKS, FEATURING ALVIN:

In this brilliantly conceived set, one hears tight rousing quartet harmonies paired

with raw lead vocals by the dazzling Alvin, all interspersed with fluid bop-inflected piano fills and stinging blues-influenced guitar leads. The result is a peerless collection of barely masked socioeconomic commentary that is both historical-minded and daringly modern at the same time.

This newcomer could have invented rock and roll. Well, he at least defines the grandest rhythmic and melodic possibilities of the burgeoning genre and does so with a deft and complex approach to the guitar. One hears a physical and aggressive mixing of numerous early ethnic forms, linked by surprisingly spare, but forceful arpeggios and romps. Crisp percussive lines propel every track to its good humored climax and Berry's vocals are never less than oddly graceful. He mates exuberance, intuition and optimistic hopefulness in this essential library addition.

## SONNY & CHER: I GOT YOU BABE.

Gospel, blues and pop are all fused here in this soaring and expressive declaration of amour. Intricate vocal interplay between the protagonists send our senses soaring as the emerging innovators reach their ecstatic denouement. This is a lively and rollicking sampling of an important new twosome, both as exemplary craftsmen and resourceful performers. Bravo!

Future in-depth reviews to appear in these pages will include detailed studies of The Standells, Brooklyn Bridge and early Count Five!

Give us your tired, your poor, your great quitarists, so Lady Liberty should be saying these days. The last few times Jeff Beck has visited our country, it was as both a hot rod racecar driver and hot rod guitarist. After a five year pitstop, Beck is back on the track as a player with his latest album bearing a more than suitable nom de plume, Flash, Beck, seldom one to mince words, sees today's industry through the eyes of a twenty year veteran. However, he's far from mellowed ("Me? I'm getting worse.") Though he still resides in the sleepy English countryside, Jeff Beck has "an affinity" for us Yanks. When it comes time to do some serious guitar, the USA is his main turf ("For a guy like me, the opportunity is here.") At the very least, he's an outspoken Miami Vice fan, for which his frequent collaborator, Jan Hammer, wrote the theme music. Our guess is that Beck's return to the mainstream is a serious one. In fact, he's already at work on a follow-up record that will probably blow the feathers off this current LP.

KZ: I pulled out all my Jeff Beck albums the other day and I noticed that you seem to disappear a lot for years at a time. JB: I know. I don't know why I do that. KZ: The last album was 1980. What have you been doing for the last five years? JB: I've been trying to decide what the hell has been going on with my life. Trying to enjoy what's good about it and trying to get rid of the horrible bits.

KZ: What's good about it?

JB: Well ... I don't know (laughs). I've

been around so long in terms of show business. I mean, five years is a long time. I've realized I haven't had much fun. So, I started having fun. Is that bad? The thing is that the music has been changing so much in the last five years that to grab any kind of bandwagon deal wouldn't have been good. And I wasted a lot of time trying to get the ideal band together. I haven't been just doing nothing. We wasted about four months back in '81 trying to put a great band together and that didn't happen. That upset me quite a

KZ: What were some of the players you were working with?

JB: I had Simon Phillips, my old drummer in the band. He was the main instigator of not wanting to do any more jazz rock. I felt, "Fantastic, let's not do any more jazz rock." But unfortunately, he played it. He still had that kind of whipped up manic jazz rock style there. And he was trying not to play it. It was that kind of indecisive attitude on his side that gave me trouble in deciding what I needed to be doing. The keyboard player was a kind of prima donna. I won't mention any names but it was gonna be a Jeff Beck with glamorous young guys around him kind of band. It didn't feel right to me.

KZ: Was (bassist) Fernando Saunders part

JB: Fernando wasn't I only played with him on the ARMS tour. Unfortunately, that band project folded. I kept running into retirement for about a few years. That makes up about three years anyway. Then for the last eighteen months I've been

doing a few sessions with The Honeydrippers.

KZ: It's been hard keeping a band together in the last couple years. JB: I'd rather have just gotten back-room boys and started from the ground up. But they tell me you can't do that. You've got to get out and go straight into the big arenas. The next logical step would be from the previous tour. My music doesn't

KZ: Would you like to go out and play smaller places?

always allow that.

JB: The logistics are ridiculous. In order to get a decent show together, you have to put a trained effort and money into one. On one hand, you're spending a million dollars for a band to go out and play The Steve Paul Scene (nightclub). You could play the same band in a huge arena and you just go for the bigger stuff automatically. I wouldn't mind doing just a few secret gigs here and there and let

loose on people unexpectedly and see how the surprise element works. KZ: Your new LP Flash is mostly vocal and some instrumental stuff. Did you feel the instrumental thing had run its course after There and Back?

JB: Well, I did, I realized there was no way I was going to reach anybody by carrying on playing straight guitar. I reached an acceptable audience in the mid-Seventies until about 1981. Toward the end of a six week tour across America in late 1980 we were ripping places up with what we were doing. It was a great healer for the wound that was opened up by the bad producing off the There and

Back album. We started doing powerhouse renditions of all the songs and they were convincing people we were doing the right thing. But there was a vocal shortage. We definitely need a front dragster in that band to perpetuate the idea of carrying on the bigger, better arenas.

KZ: You used (former Wet Willie singer) Jimmy Hall as a vocalist for the latest album. Even in the past you've used a lot of American musicians. Any particular reason?

JB: I feel an affinity towards the American people because I've been playing to them. With the Yardbirds I always felt a little bit weird in some ways because we were bringing American music back to the American people. In the Sixties we were playing to California surfers who were twelve and fourteen years old. They didn't want to see Muddy Waters, they wanted to see the Yardbirds, the Rolling Stones. But I really took America to my heart. It's all been the main source for me coming back.

KZ: Do you feel you made a bigger impact in America?

JB: Absolutely. No question about that. I

a voice box now, it's done with a vocoder. It still sounds the same.

KZ: When you were working with Nile Rodgers on the new record, were there any glaring confrontations with technology? Were you getting turned on to new things?

JB: I knew all about the things because England is the hotbed of activity for that. Whiz kids with synthesizers is what England is all about now. They really know how to use those things and Nile wasn't that hip with the Synclavier and the Fairlight (computer synthesizers). He was getting into it when I went over there. We were supposed to be working on that, but the Synclavier turned out to be a nightmare. Nobody knew how to work it. KZ: It's supposed to make things easier, right?

JB: Yeah, but Nile bought a Synclavier so we would only use that, like it or not. I fell out with him a bit over that because I didn't want to be spending fortunes in studio time while he was reading the manual on how to operate it. I don't mean that just to be snotty. (But) sitting there working out how to get something in stereo for three and a half hours! I'd rather

guitar that interferes with computers taking it over?

JB: That's right. That's what I'm saying. KZ: Do you have any memories about the ARMS tour?

JB: The thing that stays in my mind is the cooperative aspect of it. It was long before the USA For Africa thing where it was saying "Please leave your ego outside." We didn't have to have that sign on our door. Everybody did that already. KZ: A lot of people said you stole the show.

JB: I'll give it back.

KZ: You looked real healthy and you looked great. For a while nobody had seen you.

JB: Yeah, well that's good. It wasn't intentional, it's just what happened. I can't fake the way I look. Everybody was worried about Jimmy (Page) coming out there because the first rehearsals were pretty amazing in some ways. He didn't show any signs of any hope of even getting onstage. He came through and he's got a band and he's working. He's back working because of the ARMS tour, so that's notable too.

KZ: I talked to him just three or four

get out there and play with a drummer and get some guitar riffs down because people are buying the album for that—not for how many trick sounds you can get out of the Synclavier.

KZ: Did you assimilate any of your playing with some of those computers? JB: No. All the guitar that is on the record is pretty much straight guitar. They're trying so desperately hard, in volume especially, to try to make a guitar which could plug in and interface with a synthesizer. But it doesn't work. No matter how fancy the circuitry, the weakest link in the chain is how they pitch the voltage. When you're playing, a wire on a guitar goes through a magnetic pickup and then into a voltage thing and then there's a milli-second delay. When you're playing a very fast run on a guitar, that information has to be received and duplicated and sent out through the speakers. Until they get instantaneous reproduction through the synthesizer sorted out, it's not worth it. All kinds of extraneous things happen, funny noises, pings, notes missing from where they should be. Why waste time learning to drive this car when I can drive the other one all right?

KZ: Is there an imprecision to playing a

KZ: I saw him play live with The Firm and I think I caught a magic night. It was incredible. It was as if all that Led Zeppelin stuff had been lifted off his shoulders and he was back being a guitar player in a band.

JB: Oh, that's good. That's what I want to hear.

KZ: It's funny to hear you talk about the whole music scene in England, all the

can go into a club in, say, the north of England and there will be a few people who have heard of me. The whole thing is different over in England. It's like a never ending conveyer belt with new stuff coming out. It's millions of hours of recordings being made and they tend to forget the old ones except for the biggies like Zeppelin and the Stones and all that. It's all new stuff-Paul Young and Eurythmics. All dominated by fashion and video. But over here, people still want to go to a rock 'n' roll concert, which I think is great. To see Springsteen doing that and spelling it out loud and clear is great.

KZ: You once called yourself a gimmick artist. You said something to the effect that you're more into gimmicks than being a total musician. I wonder if you've changed your mind about that?

JB: What makes a total musician, I don't know. I find certain new sounds irresistable. I have to use them, like the voice beam, that voice box. I suppose I started that trend. You've only got to do something like that once in a big concert hall and you get labeled with it. Then it was taken up by Pete Frampton and he plays fifteen tours with it. It's not done with

trendy bands and all. But, what's ironic is that (the British television music show) The Tube has your song as the theme song.

JB: Well ... there's still a few things that contradict what I've been saying, but the fact that they asked me to write a signature for a really hip young show, I mean that in itself was smashing, to me. They could have said, "Let's get U2 or XTC," you know what I mean? But someone heard "Star Cycle." The last series which ran for about a year had that, I wrote and composed it. I suddenly had this amazing inspiration when they said I'd better go do a fifty second jingle. That's great. You can cram so much into fifty seconds, it becomes a lot of fun. They wanted all electro and hip explosives and that's how it starts. It starts with an explosion and then sequences there much the same way as "Star Cycle," but I wrote a different melody on that one. KZ: So how did Tina Turner get you to play on those two songs? JB: Well, she was being kind of molded

production. She just sat back and let me do my bit. I mean, what a professional! She'd come and within two minutes she was gone and done and let the producer do the job. That album just happens to be one of the biggest, most important albums of her career.

KZ: Definitely. How was it different working with her as opposed to Mick Jagger?

JB: Oh, way different! The two were totally different. Tina was on a kind of resurgence of her career, a natural kind of exuberance was there. All the people helping her, she had more or less no problem at all. But with Mick, he seemed to be having a little bit of trouble deciding what he should be doing if he did a solo album. And some of the songs were a bit strange. I don't know how to put it to you, but when I heard them, I wasn't knocked out. And I thought, well, maybe that's why he called me, maybe he wants my opinion on those things. And the guy, from the memory I have when they asked me to join his band about eight or ten years ago, he was the same then, a bit undecided about what he wanted to do. He would spend like ten hours with his guitar,

It?"

JB: Yeah! "Beat It!"

KZ: Even sounds like a Jeff Beck song. Stevie Wonder's "Superstition," that riff, was that yours?

JB: To tell you the truth, the musical line was not, but the drum riff was. Way back then, '70-'71, I was a frustrated drummer. I loved to sit behind a drum kit that was all wired up with mikes and everything. And I told the guy, when everybody was out at lunch, I told him just to tape a bit of drum. And I started just playing a funk rhythm "ta-ta-ka ta-ta-ka," and fuck, wouldn't you know it. Stevie comes waddling back into the studio just as I'm going at it, and he was grooving to it. And I look around and I stopped playing and he goes, "No! Play, man!" And I thought, oh, my God, he's going to find out I can't play. And he sat down at what was his favortite instrument then, the clavinet, And he started doggy paddling on it and I can barely keep up because my leg was aching. And he goes, "Don't worry," and jumps over and sits at the drums, puts the drum track down and here we had it. KZ: Any of your drums on the track? JB: No, no no no no no no.

KZ: Wasn't it Terry Britten and Graham Lyle?

JB: There you go. That's it. Maybe somebody thought of me, I don't know. Whoever it was, thank you. Then it came to putting the "Private Dancer" solo on and also "Steel Claw."

KZ: Had you heard "Steel Claw" by Paul Brady before you played on Tina's version?

JB: No. They only sent me a demo of "Private Dancer," which was all out of key and everything. Too low for her (Tina Turner), and I thought, "God, this really is strange." And I almost said, "Do you REALLY want to do this?" But, knowing Tina, she's got such a lot of integrity, you know, she had that key sorted out in no time and it was all right. I enjoyed playing it

KZ: How was she? Was she much in charge, as far as her being at the session?

JB: She was just perfect because she had her own stuff. She had her job sewn up. The vocals were well under control. She did her bit and she didn't interfere with the strumming the same song, wondering what was wrong with it. That's the way he is, there's nothing that can be done about it. It's a bit strange when you've got five or six tip top players who want to get on with it. I guess that the Rolling Stones took three weeks to make a twelve bar blues and that how you have to deal with it.

KZ: So why didn't you join?

JB: The Stones? Because I don't like spending three weeks playing twelve bar blues.

KZ: Do you have any favorite musicians?

JB: Umm...I don't know. I listen to records as Joe Public would. The days are not here anymore where you sit and scrutinize a Jimi Hendrix solo. You've got the three note solo and all that, which I love. I think, God, this is amazing, something which could probably have to do with me is on a Michael Jackson record. You know, that kind of fiery, manic style of guitar playing is actually on there and I might have inspired the guy, maybe when he was 12 years old, to do it. KZ: You mean, like on the intro to "Beat"

KZ: We used to have a drum set in the dining room. You sure get tired playing it. JB: Especially when you've got to keep going. You just can't stop and take a few seconds and start again. When Stevie was crankin' it out, I was just a bit upset about that. I don't know if I want to ... I've gone over the story a few times and never actually seen it in print, so I don't know whether it's a good idea ... the basic idea was something I had. But, big deal, he wrote the bloody song anyways. KZ: Did you play guitar on it? JB: No. Well, okay. I made a recording of it because he wrote it for me. He wrote the lyrics for me and he embellished a chord. He wrote the bridge, "If you believe ... " He wrote the bridge. Ninety nine and nine tenths of the song was his, inspired by my drum riff. After completing "Superstition" by Jeff Beck and his band, and this is how I heard the story, he took the demo and played it to Motown. They said this ain't no Jeff Beck song, this is a Stevie Wonder world smash, and they injuncted my version of it. KZ: Legally?

JB: Yes. It was a legal thing. We could not properly release our version until his was out. So I just banged it on the album and everybody thought we just copied Stevie Wonder. But he wrote the song for me in return for my playing a few things on Talking Book. That was the deal. KZ: So tell me about the Honeydrippers. Was there a cloak of secrecy?

JB: Yeah, it was all hush hush. I think for Robert (Plant), it was a move to give his career a bit of a boost. By not saying who was on the record, he wanted to do a

Robert (Plant), it was all most most to give his career a bit of a boost. By not saying who was on the record, he wanted to do a fifties rock 'n' roll album that didn't depend on his name. He told me he was listening to some strange radio station in New York, where they were playing Kaye Starr records and the like, stuff that rock 'n' roll came from, the pre-'55 stuff.

KZ: Sort of Lucky Strikes Hit Parade music. Kind of satiny stuff.

JB: There you go. That's what it was, like doo-wop, just pre doo-wop kind of stuff. Anyway, he said, "Let's go back further than Elvis on this record and do 'Rockin' At Midnite' by the original guys." So he played us all these original records and we were all freaking out, loving every minute of it. So what could be the harm getting some good players together for an afternoon of just having fun? And that's what it was, really. We just play along and had a jam, really.

KZ: So you were in from the start. A while back we spoke to Jimmy Page, and he regretted not being there from the start, rather than just overdubbing his part on "Sea Of Love."

JB: He wasn't in town then. It was New York. Whoever's around gets the cake. That's how it was. If he'd been there and I hadn't, then I wouldn't have been on it. But I didn't really know what to tell the players, because they were all so young. The drummer was 20 or 22. The bass player was 19.

KZ: Who was the drummer? JB; Dave Weckyl.

KZ: And who was the bass player?

JB: I can't remember. It was a frantic view.

We were all in the studio and having to read charts (laughs).

KZ: Are you a good chart reader?

JB: No. I can't read charts. I don't even watch them. I just look down and see what key it's in and then, fuck it but there was this thing on "Sea Of Love" where you had to read certain parts because you couldn't remember how many times it happened, you know? But we did about seven tracks that afternoon with Robert singing in a little glass container, like a sort of phone booth. And he was smiling and rocking around in this tiny little booth. We had a great laugh, it was good fun.

KZ: Were you the band leader of sorts?

JB: Yes.

KZ: You know, my favorite track on your latest album is "Escape."

JB: Oh! That's a new twist. Everybody likes everything but that one.

KZ: When you do instrumental work, do

you ever think of imaginary movies?

JB: Absolutely! I often think about doing film music.

KZ: But that piece in particular— JB: Yes. That could have probably been pre-Miami Vice. I think if you listen to it, you can hear a lot of Miami Vice type music. Jan (Hammer) doesn't always divulge what is going on. Maybe he's already seen that picture or whatever—a kind of graphic thing going on in his mind when he wrote that. I would really like to do something along the lines of dynamics to film music.

KZ: So over what period of time was Flash recorded? Was it put together over a long period of time?

JB: It ground to a halt after three and a half weeks. Eveybody has the idea like the Beatles. Hey man, it took three and a half light years for an album to be made. It wasn't like that at all. I wasn't in any studio for more than six weeks. It went on a bit because Madonna kept interfering with my career (laughs). She was going to be huge and it was quite obvious that the whole world was going to know Madonna. I couldn't expect Nile to drop what he was doing with her to get on with my thing. And then Duran Duran came

along and that was it. I lost Nile completely. I don't know where he disappeared to. He left me with a half finished album. He said, "Everything's cool, man," and it wasn't cool. So we got Arthur Baker to finish it.

KZ: How was that?

JB: Arthur? Oh, it was great. He's a hooligan.

KZ: A hooligan?

JB: Yeah, a musical hooligan. In other words, he wants as much power as you can deliver. In the old days, they used to say, "God, can you turn that shit down a bit?"

KZ: You must have been in heaven with Baker, then

JB: Yes I was. I was. I wasn't ready for it. He had to keep saying, listen, you're Jeff Beck. You can play. Give me some shit. And I just sort of let loose.

KZ: When was "People Get Ready" cut?
JB: Oh, that was a good two years ago.
KZ: Was that right around the Rod
Stewart Camouflage record?

JB: Before. I think Rod ... I don't know ... I took an instrumental version of that to Rod and he loved it. He said, "Hey, if you want to do this song, I'll sing it." Okay. Start the tape, Rod, and you pay for the studic time. Actually, they gave us the studio time because they wanted to see

how it would turn out Just me and Rod back together in the studio and I felt really ... I mean everybody was falling all over the place when he started singing, it was really good. And I think he played it for everybody and they loved it, but Rod didn't want to have to admit it was me that was sort of instrumental. So I kind of left it.

Then they were looking for some kind of fiery rock star playing on "Infatuation" so he rings me up and asks me if I'd do it. So then we had this kind of rebirth of the Stewart/Beck thing. Then that led to the tour and what happened on that tour was that we both misunderstood how long I would be playing. I thought I would be on stage for the whole concert and he had me on stage for about 15 or 20 minutes. I just didn't want to see my audience just come in and want to see me play and having me go off stage looking like I had lost my temper and stormed off. I didn't want that.

KZ: At the risk of sounding catty, I think Rod Stewart could have used another focal point.

JB: Well, that's what I thought, but his manager didn't see it that way. His manager thought Rod was the guy and didn't want to share any stage with me other than that short coming out, coming on appearance.

KZ: You must have felt a little disappointed, since it was you that first started working with him so long ago. JB: Oh, I just got burned up about it. I thought the best way to end it was to just go out and carry on with my dream, which I hadn't really concentrated on—in great lengths, anyways. I do one tour and finish and go away for three or four years. KZ: Do A&R guys call you up and try to get you into one of those bloated superstar bands?

JB: No, I never get that I keep out of the way. I live a very, very private life. I mean, New York is the exact opposite of the way I am at home. It's all action, all phone calls, people ringing up all the time. In England, nobody rings up because they don't have the number (laughs). And the opportunity is not there, not for a guy like me. The opportunity is here, in America.

KZ: So are you a little mellower after passing the big 4-0?

JB: Me? No! I'm getting worse. I'm definitely heading for disaster. KZ: When is the next record?

JB: I'm headed for the studio in a couple of days.

KZ: What kind of record can we expect?

JB: Well, I want to discover a bit more about myself and about how I haven't practiced in the last few years (laughs). I want to try and write some Jeff Beck music instead of listening to other people's rubbish and waffling on about things. I'll try to get some of my real stuff on tape. That way, with people like that, I'll be on the road toward doing my own stuff, instead of criticizing and revamping other stuff that's already been written.

## PREFAB SPROUT

#### Two Wheels Good-Prefab Sprout (Epic)

Wonderful, thoughtful music that owes just about as much to the American tradition as it does to breezy British pop culture. Listen and you'll see what MR. COSTELLO saw in their music early early on. There's character and humanity in between the verses and choruses. THOMAS DOLBY was next to run the ball further by producing this LP with a subtle, but updating technique. The gwirks and tricks he's injected into PREFAB's songs are done only in the best of taste. I could dribble on and on about this record, using up all my space usually reserved for cute graphics and obligatory praise, but I won't. #### The Rose Of England—Nick Lowe (Columbia)

"I Knew The Bride" is your basic ringer thrown in to spice up another one of NICK LOWE's goodtime club rock LPs. "Rose Of England" is a touching title track. "Long Walk Back" is a hackneyed tribute to DUANE EDDY. Side two has a bittersweet melancholy tinge. Sure, the recording is slaphazard, but that's part of the appeal. After all, a COWBOY OUTFIT would do a slipshod job painting your house or cementing your patio. They'd leave your lawn littered with beer bottles, but that's rock 'n' roll, isn't it?

#### "Better Make a Move/Test Of Time" The Romantics (Nemperor)

I hear Fenders, and I don't mean the type they pound dents out of in Detroit. It's been a long time between releases. However, my single has a b-side called "Better Make A Move". That's got all the twangin'. The A-side has SUPREMES/"Under My Thumb" type marimba/xylophone work, and is the more melodic of the two. Album Radio could easily mix up both.



This is producer STEVE LEVINE's second stateside assignment--from CULTURE CLUB to BEACH BOYS to QUARTERFLASH. He brings with him his usual tendency towards extreme high tech with organic results. The end product is a respectable regrouping of the band's attributes. The interesting twist is that the main hooks are layers and layers of vocals. Solid intro, too.

Free Yourself/Freak In The Streets/ Soul Together/Piece Of Your Love -THE UNTOUCHABLES (Stiff/MCA) This entertaining album is a welcome change with so many artistically gloomy Alternative records out these days. The more pop-oriented "Free Yourself" is the lead track. It received extensive airplay on many Alternative stations, over a year ago, as an independent release. The electric guitar rhythms and horn parts in "Freak In The Streets", "Soul Together", and "Piece Of Your Love" recall old Stax/Volt arrangements and represent some of the most exciting material on the record. "Wild Child" is a fun and lively album, despite the fact that one of the band members is sporting an L.A. Lakers cap on the back cover.

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

Although Dan Fogelberg's career has taken many detours through the years from country to rock to adult contemporary, his current bluegrass LP, High Country Snows is an exceptional demonstration of his flexibility and talent. Backed by the Chris Hillman band, Fogelberg is introducing the new material on his current U.S. tour.

EG: Although your career's been very versatile so far, your new LP might be quite a surprise to the portion of your audience unfamiliar with your earlier recordings and Nashville ties. Why did it all come about now ... would you say you're going home?

you're going home?
DF: Not permanently. I just stopped in again. I came off the road and stopped in there. I change musical styles a lot, and if anything, I hope it's not too off the wall. Thepeople that heard the early works of mine, especially Souvenirs, know that I did some bluegrass and some countryish material back then. I was kind of hoping to reach those people again with this. There are people that say, 'Why don't you

do some more bluegrass, and that sort of thing?' I think it's somewhat difficult for the newer audience to get into. You know, the ones I picked up in the 80's with *The Innocent Age* and *Windows and Walls*, 'cause I've gotten more known as a pop and rock artist. But I don't want to get pigeon-holed. I have fun changing styles and whatever interests me as an artist, I go with!

EG: Both the writers and musicians on the High Country Snows LP read like a Who's Who of country/bluegrass, from Flatt & Scruggs—Carter Stanley, to Ricky Skaggs and Herb Pederson ... among others. Coming from The Innocent Age and Windows And Walls to High Country Snows must have raised a few record executive eyebrows.

DF: Yes. (Laugh) Yes it did. I got a lot of resistance.

EG: How did you feel about that?
DF: I didn't like it ... but you know, record companies in a lot of ways do have your best interest at heart. If you're signed there, they're there to make money and do their job. When you start changing the formula that's worked, they get a little uptight about it. Why tamper with success? But to me, success has to be personal as well as financial. Once they heard the record and realized that it was

EG: Here you come blasting out of successful contemporary career into basically a bluegrass LP. You're going against the tide here. A lot of today's country artists wouldn't mind getting where you're coming from bridge to go

DF: Yeah, I know. They're trying to cross that way.

EG: Having lived in Nashville, and with a country background, how do you feel about the state of country music today? DF: Maybe that's one of the reasons I made this. I don't think that country music is country music anymore. I think mostly what's coming out of Nashville sounds like Hollywood. I love the old country music. Ricky Skaggs is kind of at the spearhead of the whole thing. He's been instrumental in bringing the old sounds of country back using mandolins and fiddles, doing some bluegrass. He's doing more traditional songs. Emmylou has been doing that. It's a whole new little underground in Nashville and believe me, Nashville is aware of it. They don't know exactly what to think of it yet ... but it's exciting in Nashville right now. When I went back to play the Opry with the band to premiere the album, it was a big evening for Nashville and for us. Kind of like everybody saying, 'Hey, what's all this?' 'Cause Ricky came out and sang

with us, and there were all these pickers in the audience. I think that was kind of an important night because it woke up Nashville to say, 'Hey, these young guys are comin' up here and they've got something neat goin' on. They're tryin' to take us back to what country music is all about.'

EG: There are traces of blues, country, classical, touches of gospel, rock and pop throughout your musical career. Yet, you don't fall into a musical nitch ...

DF: There have been critics that have said that I'm the most monotonous person that ever walked on the earth. I don't see how they can say that looking at the body of my work.

EG: How would you describe your music?
DF: Eclectic. I like good music. There's good music in every genre. There's good classical, there's bad classical. There's good country, there's bad country. I don't like the barriers that are set up between the musical styles. The fact that Nashville is supposed to be exclusively country...
LA is supposed to be rock... I don't like that.

EG: Well, that's changing now in Nashville.

DF: I think it is. I think it's changing in a lot of places and I like the idea that the record buying public is willing to accept some different things from artists. I think that a really groundbreaking record in this whole thing is Linda Rondstadt with Nelson Riddle. That was such an off-the-wall thing and people went to it! I'm sure the record company said, 'What is this?' EG: Were you musically trained in anything specific?

DF: Well, my folks were both musicians. I was never trained formally, no. I did take some piano lessons when I was a kid. I've been singing all my life. I love to sing. My mother tells me that the first public performance of mine was at the first movie I ever went to, which was *Prince Valiant* in about 1953. I guess I was adding to the soundtrack most of the night (laughs).

EG: In a very commercially-oriented age, you've maintained intelligent lyrics, depth, and substance throughout the different stages of your career ...

DF: I try, sometimes more than others succeed. You know, a lot of critics and interviewers ask, 'Do you feel like you're a dinosaur? Like you're an anachronism and your time is passing?' I say no because I go to my shows and there's lots of college and high school people that come to the shows. The demographics of my audience is growing all the time. I think that clearly says there's people out there that really do want music to mean something to them, even though they're young. You know, not every high school teenager wants to listen to Prince. There are people who wanna listen to other music. I think the record companies should be a little more responsive to that, instead of just going with trends.

EG: Did you ever feel pressured to sell out?

DF: Oh, it's there constantly. But so far I've been pretty successful at walking that line. You know, I'm no fool. I make my living doing this. I like the successful side of it

EG: When did you feel you might have sold out?

DF: I don't really think I have. If anything, the single "Language of Love" might have been closest to just pure commercial pop music. But again, I really like what that song says.

EG: Your work spans human emotions to

strong political statements with songs like "Face The Fire" and "Gone Too Far." As a singer/songwriter do you feel that a writer has any responsibilities to the public? DF: No, I really don't. The only responsibility you have as a songwriter is to yourself and if you happen to make some statements, that's something that affects you. I don't think I really owe the public anything more than what I give them in the music. That's why I'm a very private person. I don't live in Hollywood. You're not gonna see me on the cover of People magazine. My private life is very important to me for a lot of reasons. To maintain my own sanity is the main reason. Also, in order for me to write, I have to keep a very low profile and be able to move freely and observe and experience. I treasure that. I'm not the type of artist who walks downtown New York and gets accosted by people. I can pretty well blend in anywhere unless I'm in town for a show and people are thinking of me. Then I might get recognized. But usually, I can pretty well move freely throughout the world and I really like that. EG: Do you ever wonder how an

audience will react to one of your songs?
Basically, you're baring your soul. That's pretty high stakes. Were you ever disappointed with the reception?
DF: Oh sure. Some go over better than others when you're trying out new stuff. That's part of what it's about. You kind of throw it off the wall and see what sticks. I judge my own material pretty well. I think I have an objective viewpoint of what's

good and what isn't.

EG: What's your favorite album?

DF: The Innocent Age.

EG: Why?

DF: I think it's my best work as a songwriter, as a producer, and as a musician. I think it's the best work that I've done and I think it will be difficult for me to surpass that.

EG: Any special songs?

DF: Well that's hard to say ... no, not "hard to say" (laughs). It's like saying, well, which is your favorite child? You know, you really love them all one way or another or they wouldn't be recorded. "Old Lang Syne" is important to me, "Leader Of The Band" obviously is very important to me. I like "Tucson Arizona" in recent years 'cause I just really like the

craft of that song. I like "Phoenix" to listen to probably the most. It's very easy to listen to, it doesn't really demand a whole lot of your attention (laughs).

EG: Members of The Eagles are intertwined throughout your LP's. Would you say you've had the same musical

influences? DF: Oh, we're old friends. We grew up, came out of the same changes, and played a lot together. We're still good friends and I like working with those guys, especially with Don. I love singing with Don Henley. I still see them all occasionally. None of us gets to see each other like we used to when we were running crazy, touring all the time. People change, they get married and buy houses and move different places. But it's still always good to see those guys and it's always good to work with them. EG: There are some original drawings in your songbook and albums. Do you still

pursue that as a hobby?
DF: I don't much anymore. I just don't have the time. I may get back to that later in life. It's the type of thing that you have to do everyday to keep good at it. I just don't have the time to do it right now. I do photography a lot now. I love that, and that I can do when I travel which is nice. I can go back home and get in the darkroom. I haven't painted in a long time. EG: What can we expect from you in the

tuture?
DF: (Laughs) Well, a few more records I imagine. I'm only thirty-three so I'd imagine I've still got a few years in me. I don't know. I think the next album is gonna be more of what people are used to from me. More pop music, and then I've got some other projects up my sleeve which are pretty radical departures for me ... musically, and production wise. I don't

think you're gonna hear drum machines (laughs)!

DF: How much do you tour? DF: More than I care to ... but not that much compared to other bands. If I'm doing a rock and roll year I tour more than if I'm doing solo. This year I really haven't done that much. I've done these three weeks and I've done like a two-anda-half week thing with the full bluegrass ensemble. It's been fun this summer taking the bluegrass tour out. I was dreading going out and doing yet another solo tour, or putting the rock and roll band together. This has really been fun for me. It's given me some good breathing space to think about what I wanna do next. It's been a real special little island in my life, a musical island, that I can just run with this year and you know, it wouldn't happen again.

EG: I think it's something special for your audience too.

DF: I hope so. People have been responding to the tour real well 'cause it's something different ... there's no other acoustic pop tours I know of going on ... and somebody's got to do it, you know?

### THE QUALITATIVE INTERVIEW

short time ago, in an overview of the various radio rating services, I devoted quite a bit of space to the innovation from the Seattle-based Willhight Radio Research company-incredibly detailed qualitative research, cross referenced to the ratings the company does for the same market. A radio survey thus becomes two books-the basic rating book and the qualitative rating book.

Although I was very impressed by the approach and the execution, I expressed amazement that the telephone interviewees would stand still for the detailed questioning this approach would seem to require. Jim Willhight, founder and President of the company, wrote to explain some of his methodology.

Jim has boiled down the presentation to a basic ten questions, with additional custom-designed questions available at a surcharge to pre-survey subscribing stations. The ten basic ones cross reference the ratings to: Income; employment status; type of employment marital status; number of children; education; home ownership; primary auto's make, type and year; number of autos; and newspaper readership. As examples of additional categories stations can custom-design, Jim cites monthly dining out frequency; air travel (personal and business); soft drink purchases; concert attendance; planned expenditures of jewelry, furniture, computers; planned purchase of house; persons listening specifically for traffic or stock reports, the respondent's perception of signal strength and/or quality of each station cumed; even the annual frequency of drapery cleaning by station cume!

Concerning the complexity of the

interview that results in this sort of rating information, Jim writes, "There are several factors that contribute to the success of gathering the information. The biggest factor is the short time the interview actually takes. Generally the qualitative interviews in the two Bellevue (Washington) sweeps were about 51/2 minutes in length. Our interview technique can best be described by comparing the interviewers' speed and content to a 'tight' high-energy CHR station delivery. The delivery is quick-paced with no wasted words or redundant sentence structure.

'This 'tightly formatted' interview technique is possible since we do not subcontract the interview work out, and our interviewers conduct several thousand interviews of the same type. This redundancy helps build the speed and the flow of the interview, something that would be lost if our interviewers conducted this type of survey only once or twice a year

'The interviews are designed so that the questions flow from subject to subject as smoothly as possible. Each question is designed to be easy to answer, and because the subject matter relates to radio, there seems to be less resistance in gathering the information ... Some questions have lower response rates and are placed near the conclusion of the interview ... If the length of the interview is more than 25 or 30 questions, the rapid-fire technique may be counterproductive, with the hang-up ratio increasing dramatically as the survey length increases. We may, with increased subject matter, need to modify the interview methodology to include callbacks to gather additional information Our price structure for extra questions is such that after 20 questions, the cost per question rises to offset the increased



"We find that our worst-case in-tab return on the qualitative questions is about 65% of the total in-tab sample (income and automobile ownership generally have the highest dropout ratio). Generally, the response rate is 75 to 90 percent for the less offensive qualitative questions, such

as shopping frequency and marital status."

Jim adds, "It is also possible, by computer, to add another field of information, and create a three dimensional array. This third facet of the array could be, for example, income classifcation. With this information, not only could we tell how many of a station's listeners own cars, but how many own a car made previous to 1980, and make over \$25,000 per year!"

Up till the fifties, ratings were simply a nose count. In the sixties, demographics developed—the ability to break out ratings by age group. For the last decade, abortive attempts have been made to produce ratings that can be broken out by psychographic, or life style. Jim Willhight seems to have done it, and I thought you would be interested in his comments on the methodology. This small company seems to have scooped the ratings industry with the next logical step. If you'd like to write Jim-he's a former Program Director, by the way-the address is P.O. 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












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
