

Profile of PHIL COLLINS and DIRE STRAITS shows them very, very close statistically, with STRAITS making a strong move to replace JOHN PARR at number one next week. MELLENCAMP barreling along with what is proving to be his most successful effort since "Hurt So Good": Hit Factor sitting at 56% after just five weeks.

WHITNEY HOUSTON on her way to a follow-up top ten hit. Top ten at Z100-New York, Y100-Miami, Q104-Gadsden, 94Z -Raleigh and big moves for B104 17-11, WKTI 30-18, WCIL 19-12, KRQ 28-21, KUBE 25-19, KWSS 23-16, etc. JOHN CAFFERTY show-

ing another week of good growth, gaining in Hit Factor from 19% to 34%...top 20 for KMJK, KRZQ, KHTX, KYYA, WFBG, PRO/FM,WFXZ, Y94, etc. BOWIE & JAGGER backs up all that out-of-the-box airplay with staggering chart jumps at WCCC 31-13, WBEN 13-4, WKZQ 31-20, WBNQ 28-19, KFMN 25-16, KIIS/FM 23-7, KKHR 30-11, KNBQ 30-24, KMEL 28-21, etc.



Other than that folks, it was STEVIE WONDER's week again. He pulls off his second week as Most Added and the only debut, thus the only "Certified".

All three "Chartbounds" should live up to their projection of chartbound as many as four of five slots become available next week. A-HA's "Hit Factor" is already 45% from the 70 stations who've committed airplay.

This week's "Record To Watch", GINO VANNELLI'S HURTS TO BE IN LOVE is as safe a call as I've made in that risky category all year. But then again, this was a conservative week. Adds already from WBT, WSB/FM, K106, KFI and KWAV, and 29 others make it the second "Most Added" behind Mr. Wonder.

Consider this a public service, as we fill you in on our Day and Night of The Living Dead:



Our admission price of \$16.50 entitled us to all rides available. We, of course, knew that all stomach-churning dizzy attractions had to be eliminated, as our idea of a good time is not being whipped around at 100 miles per hour in a little car shaped like Dumbo. Those rides look great from the outside only, but what masochist would want to be **IN** one?

That left a few little rides we could sort of stand. We lined up for The Pirates of the Carribean. We lined up for forty-five minutes for what turned out to be a four minute tram ride through an exhibition of mechanical figures dressed as sailors. After purchasing a five dollar Mickey T-shirt for eighteen dollars, we headed for the gate and the thirty mile drive back to L.A. The problem was that Anaheim Stadium was releasing its California Angel fans at the same time and the beered-up crowd was hitting the road just as we were. And I do mean hitting, as we enjoyed fifteen or so near misses on the highway as the wackos whipped in and out of lanes, and we must have arrived home by the grace of THE BIG GUY.

All in all, it was quite a day and it taught us a valuable lesson: There's hope for The Singing Nun follow-up yet, because when the hype machine is working, you can sell anybody anything!

That's the story, visitors to Southern California. If you DO decide on a trip to Disneyland ... don't say you haven't been warned.

And, oh by the way ... how was YOUR week? ■

It's a long way from Houston, Texas to the Broadway stage, but Jennifer Holliday

made the trip as a teenager and was a certified star before she was twenty-one with rave reviews for her performance in "Your Arms Too Short To Box With God"

and later as Effie White in the Tony Award winning musical "Dreamgirls."

Now, with the release of her second album, "Say You Love Me," she has decided the next phase of her career to making hit records and knockin' 'em dead in concert.

We talked with Ms. Holliday during a recent visit to The Gavin Report's offices in San Francisco. At the time Jennifer was finishing her stint in the title role in "Sing, Mahalia, Sing," a musical which is not likely to make it to Broadway.



RF: Most of us first got wind of Jennifer Holliday when you had your first opportunity to perform in a Broadway play. Where did you come from . . . where are your roots?

JH: I was born and raised in Houston, Texas. I left there when I was 17 and a half, I was discovered! I did an audition for the role of "Your Arms Too Short To Box With God," and I got the part that day. RF: That's probably the only time you've auditioned for a job in your life.

JH: That's true.

RF: Was the audition stiff competition, or was it something that was almost predestined?

JH: I have no idea. All I know was that a young man who was touring with "Chorus Line" heard me on TV and sent me a plane ticket for New York and set up my audition. They knew I was coming. They heard me sing and took me to the director, Vanette Carroll, and she said, "Oh, you're wonderful dahhling!" and she hired me that day and that was it.

RF: (Laughs)And you were with that play for quite a long time.

JH: Two years.

RF: And then you spent an even longer period of time working with "Dreamgirls" ... How did that come about?

JH: I was on Broadway with the "Box With God" in the summer of 1980, and Michael Bennett, the director, had sent out the writers of the music, Henry Krieger and Tom Eyen, to look for some people. The two people they were interested in from the cast were myself and a guy named Clevon Derix, who plays the James Brown character. They asked if I would like to work on the workshop, a project called Project #9.

RF: Was there some significance or reason for calling it Project #9?

JH: (Laughs) I have no idea. They didn't have a title so they just called it that.

RF: They thought that was mysterious.

How about "Cloud 9"? (laughs).

JH: Right! (laughs) So we went down and read and sang for Michael Bennett. We

agreed to do the workshop. It was for \$75 a week, and a lot of work, hard work. RF: He had seen you, though, in "Your Arms Too Short To Box With God," so you weren't an unknown to him.

JH: No, it wasn't like I was an unknown, I was the new kid on the block. People were saying "have you heard this girl in

... Box With God,' Holliday something or other."

RF: Have people tried to draw a comparison between you and another Holliday?

JH: No, but everybody asks if Billie Holliday is my cousin or my kin. RF: Which we know is not true.

JH: That's right.

RF: The "Dreamgirls" experience we know is based loosely on the career of the Supremes. You apparently were, sometime during the play or the formation of the play, dissatisfied with your role in the play. Did this dissatisfaction take place during the preparation of the play or during the play itself?

JH: Before we actually went to Broadway. I did the workshop for a year, from June, 1980 to the following year. By that time, the show was very much like the Supremes' story. The only reason they needed me was to sing "And I'm Telling You ... " which they had written for me. RF: So you had some leverage then. JH: (Laughs) Yes. And what they had done was put the song in the middle of the first act and after that I didn't come back any more. He said they would just talk about me after that, but Effie would not be in any more acts. They would just say something like, "How's that Effie?" "Oh, she's sick," or "she's dying" (laughs). But I said "No, I'm sorry, I can't hang for this. This is not easy work. Not fun. I don't like this city. It's not enough money. Something's gotta give." So that gave me my reputation for being difficult! RF: Is it safe to say that you were a holdout, not unlike a professional baseball player that wants his contract renegotiated? (laughs) Could you draw a comparison with a Tony Dorsett or a Dave

JH: I don't think so because their situation is different. Their position is that they had already gone into prominence. They knew who they were, who to talk to, etc. I was 19 years old, talking to this man named Michael Bennett who I don't even know. I just didn't care.

RF: And you weren't doing this through some agent. It was just you and Michael Bennett.

JH: It was more of a case of naivete. RF: Would you have done it, if you had known more?

JH: Probably so, I'm still the same way. I haven't changed.

RF: Now, you did eight shows a week for almost three years. What was the breaking point? What precipitated your final departure?

JH: After the first year, to me, with all the hype and all that, and then winning the Tony and winning the Grammy, I was trying to find other places to go within the show. What other kind of mileage did I want to get out of it. I didn't want to stay just because the money was good, or I'm Jennifer Holliday and this is the Jennifer Holliday show. And then they said "Let's go to L.A.". So we went there for nine months, and after that I said, "Now what?" You don't go anywhere else, unless you're going to take the play to London, where it's done more for art. They only let you stay for four months and they don't pay a lot of money. So I told them if they wanted to do that or tape a special, or do a movie, call me. But it was really a decision to keep moving, and not have to be stereotyped. People have allowed me to grow, and whether it's "And I'm Telling You I'm Not Going" they try to open up, they never say that it's not as good as "And I'm Telling You...

RF: Did you have any reaction from members of the Supremes to the play? Did they ever communicate to you their feelings about your performance?

JH: Mary Wilson did. She said "How did you all know what happened?" I said, "Nobody knows what happened. This isn't your story." She said, "No it is, and it really happened like that ... " and on and on. Then Diana Ross said she was never going to bring her kids to see the show because that's not the story and she didn't want them to think that's what happened. RF: While you were in Los Angeles with the road show you had a chance to put together your first album. What kind of pressures did you find yourself under? JH: First of all I had to overcome the fear of singing into a microphone and to a producer. When you're used to singing before thousands of people, to me that's much easier because when you get out there, you don't have time to be nervous. you don't have time to look for mistakes. Your job is to give those people a good time and they respond accordingly. In the studio, you sing to the microphone. You hear "OK baby! Sing out!" I say, "OK, I AM singing!" And they say, "No, no, no, wait. Hold it! We want to take this again!" "Take

RF: (Laughs) This is Maurice White you're imitating?

JH: Yes, he says: "We want to take this again. Sing to me baby, SING!"

RF: This is to a pre-recorded track, right? It's just you in the studio, Maurice on the other side of the glass!

JH: Yes, you know, so I said, "Look, I've already sung this about four times already." And he says, "No, what we need is like, bring some of these lights down, alright."

RF: Now, here's an interesting point. You're tired of singing this song four times in one night, but you're going to sing "And I'm Telling You ..." for three years. Did you expect to dispense with an individual song over a period of a day?

JH: No, it was the idea of the repetition as far as what the producer was looking for. What I look for ... what the producer looks for, and what the fans look for are different things.

RF: Do you think there would be any point in your career when you could go on a stage in concert and not perform "And I'm Telling You..." You're going to pretty much have to perform that like Tony Bennett has to perform "I Left My Heart In San Francisco"?

JH: Sure! And ten years from now, they'll sing it without me singing it (laughs). I mean, I'll just hit the notes and they'll go! They do it now, they sing it with me now. RF: There was quite a bit of fuss made when you finally did leave "Dreamgirls," you said "I'm out of prison." For what period of time did you feel that way? JH: It was definitely during the L.A. phase, because it was more of a "let's go see that Jennifer Holliday" not the show itself. And I said, "Just come and see the show." It's a great show. These people were great. The understudies were great. This is not my responsibility. So it became more of a pressure situation because

people were saying "If you didn't see it with Jennifer, then you didn't see it." RF: I've heard more than one person say that! Getting back to that first album, the one that you did with Maurice White. What did you learn from that experience? JH: I knew absolutely nothing about how to go about anything with the first album. Not about singing. What took preference over other things, what should be important, what songs ...

RF: Did you take a more active role in the song selections in this new album?

JH: Yes, I had more to choose from. I purposely listened to about a million songs, whether people thought they were right for me or not.

RF: I gather from your early fascination with D.J. Rogers that you chose that song yourself.

JH: Yes, he is one of my favorites. RF: And the song that was credited to Duke Ellington, was that not like a Billie Holliday or a Bessie Smith type song? JH: A Mahalia Jackson tune. Can you believe that? And it's so funny because I picked the song before they picked me for the show.

RF: And the show we're referring to is the "Sing, Mahalia, Sing" show, which, by the time this interview runs, you will no longer be involved with. I've heard that this is your last week with the play.

JH: It is. I picked the song. It's a beautiful song, and I did it a lot different than Mahalia would have done it, she was a little scared to branch out because of her convictions and she would have wanted to keep it sacred. My idea was that it needed to have a little more push. It turned out to be incredible. "Say You Love Me" came from D.J. Rogers. Albums sort of document your life and as I get older,

there's so much about life that you learn that you can incorporate into your songs, your lyric content, your emotions. I wanted a prayer on the album. I'm a pretty spiritual person, so Tommy said we could try it.

RF: Mahalia said that you've got to try to live the life you sing about in your songs. Do you find that you have to be in love to sing a love song? Do you have to be spiritual to get the meaning of the spiritual song? Do you have to have the blues to sing the blues? Do you get into a trance to get wrapped up in certain songs? JH: I pay very close attention to lyrics and in fact, I have sent many songs back and said "You know I don't like this line here and let me tell you why ..."

and let me tell you why ...

RF: You didn't send back the song that

Michael Jackson did for you? (laughs)

JH: No, he did very well. I was waiting for
the lyric sheet. He sent the melody line
and then I kept waiting for the lyric sheet.

RF: I understand the album was held up
for quite a while waiting for the
completion of Michael's song.

JH: Our schedules were such that we
didn't even get a chance to meet. Our
conversations were on the phone or on
tapes. I was very proud of him because
these were some very mature lyrics. If
they had not been I don't know what I

would have done. I'm glad they worked

out that well.

RF: (Laughs) You would have been the first person to turn down a Michael Jackson song in the last few years. JH: I pay attention to lyrics in case it's something I can't relate to. When Maurice was writing "I Am Love" he wanted to take out the line "The White Knight came and took the little girl" because that's corny. And I said no, that it was alright because at that time I was only 22. And, I said this is my first album and these are my first growing pains. I want to think about what I'm saying.

RF: You're no longer in "Sing, Mahalia, Sing" and your album is now finished. What's next?

JH: In October, I'm hoping to go out with Bill Withers on tour and do twenty or so dates, 6 or 8 weeks, break, and then carry this album over into the next year, and then maybe tour again.

RF: I'm wondering if there's going to be a change in your professional direction. I sense that maybe you want to do more acting

JH: I would love to do more straight acting. I'm interested in getting into television. I'm fascinated by TV. I love the sensitivity that can come across in a Monday Night (made-for-TV) Movie. I would like to be able to do something like that. I'm pretty good at comedy, and I would like to do more dramatic roles. What I would like to focus on is getting my recording and concert career to the same level my Broadway career has achieved. And the time that I have devoted so diligently to that aspect of my career should be equal. I would say that

people that have seen me in the last six months have said that I'm a better actress today than I was when I won my Tony Award in 1981 because I have grown in that aspect of my life. Now I have to do the same thing with my concerts. I've only done two albums.

RF: You were originally on tour with Peabo Bryson.

JH: Yes, I opened for him. This time I want to be headliner. That was a new experience and those are the steps you have to take. I have to take a lot more of those steps with this concert, I have to get out there and fall on my face and get back up. I have to go back in the studio and I think that this album is great and I feel my next two albums will be even better.

RF: Very few people that have made it on Broadway have managed to succeed, by industry standards, in the pop music field. The last person I can remember that did it was Barbra Streisand and you're being compared to her. Is it going to be required of you to spend a lot more time in the pop arena with the concerts and recording, putting Broadway on the back burner?

JH: Yes, and when I'm working six nights a week, one night off, I need the time to concentrate on what I'm doing, the play, my fans, taking care of myself so that I can sound good each night. It's so time prohibiting and it takes everything I have in me. My problem is I don't want to give it up totally because there's still one more play that I want to do.

RF: Want to give us a clue or is this something too far into the future?

JH: No, it's not that far into the future. I'm trying to work on a tribute to Bessie Smith. Linda Hopkins did one several years ago but it was more of a review.

RF: It's interesting that Bessie Smith played a more important role in influencing you than did Mahalia, yet you performed Mahalia first.

JH: Yes, and Mahalia was influenced by Bessie Smith, and Aretha by Mahalia, and me by Aretha.

RF: Á vicious cycle.

JH: (Laughs) I know. I know. So I would like to go back, number one, because it was a fabulous era, and I love the clothes, but I also like singing and looking good when I'm singing. It was a fabulous era, the music, the strength, the time. And I would like to do it with more acting. RF: Are we going to run out of black musicians to have their lives caricatured in musicals?

JH: You mean females?

RF: Particularly females, but we've gone through the "Cotton Clubs" and we're going through the heritage stuff, but my concern is that maybe we're getting to the point where great performers like yourself are going back to reprise someone else's life, some other performer who went to the school of hard knocks. Even "Soldier's Story" was a 40's issue. We haven't had a lot of contemporary issues featuring black performers or performers that can play a

role to whom the race is irrelevant. And we haven't seen it much in film. What's it gonna take?

JH: At this particular point, it's not necessary. Even though Broadway has stories, history is more important. To go back and recollect, it becomes an education as well as an entertainment, a heritage. It becomes a different kind of magic. It sells tickets. As far as the contemporary nature of it, you would have to do something like a "Dreamgirls" where you would have to create a fictitious character. Those things are good, but they're risky. It requires a stronger script, a lot of talent, and a lot of money. So there are a lot of elements that concern black music.

RF: Should we be concerned about the high cost of tickets? And what is done to make it possible for people who can't afford the price?

JH: Yes, we should be concerned. Nothing is being done. "Dreamgirls" is closed and "Tap Dance Kid" is closed. It's not very fair. They've had to go out on the road, you have to have a name to go out on the road, and they don't do well on the road.

RF: Where is the need for \$30 tickets? JH: Well, 30 people on stage, 30 people behind stage, 20 other people running it. Advertising. Theater costs. We go down the line. Overhead becomes overhead. RF: You did \$320,000 in Washington, D.C. the first week and you probably didn't break even.

JH: No. We didn't.

RF: Would you invest in a Broadway musical at this point, knowing the rate of success over the last few years, if you had the chance?

JH: It depends. If I did Bessie, I would probably be co-producer, and that's why I would probably do it three years from now. Number one, it would have to have a strong book, number two, the music is there but it would have to have a new original score.

RF: Are you putting a little money under the mattress for that day?

JH: Yes, I am. I don't know if you can tell, but I'm more into the business end of it, with the albums and everything. I'm executive producer of the album and people ask me what that means, and I tell them I control the money. (laughs) RF: (Laughs) You're chairman of the bottom line.

JH: It allows me to be more free and understand what's really going on. Is this a choice about a song that you're fussing me about, or is this a choice about money? Because I can weigh this out for you really quick. I like to be spoken to in that manner and I thrive on organization. In five years I would like to be one of the top business women in my field, and to have a production company that I will be able to start some kind of that black theater where those tickets can be a little cheaper. Broadway's gonna be sad for a little while, it really is, and I feel sorry for it.

P.D. NOTEBOOK by Eric Norberg

BASIC PRODUCTION, PART II

ud Zumwalt has not only been a top air personality for two decades in Sacramento, and at KSFO in San Francisco, but his production is constantly being honored regionally and nationally with awards and the plaudits of his peers. I asked Bud the same three questions I put to Bobby Ocean, which I presented last week.

First: What is the *minimum* equipment needed to turn out usable production? Bud agreed with Bobby that only one turntable is an absolute necessity, since music or sound effects from a second record canbe transferred to tape and used that way. In fact, Bud advises that rather than getting two average turntables for the production room, it would be preferable to sink the bucks in just one turntable, and make it a topnotch direct-drive turntable. Bud adds that music and sound effects are used only for a reason--to set a mood, and to help sell--and should be omitted if they don't contribute to the spot. In fact, Bud says before any production is done, "you gotta have good words on paper to start with." He notes that many radio spots are not well written, and he urges any station, large or small, to budget the money to hire

somebody who can write. After all, well-written spots sell better, and a station succeeds or fails on how good the results are that it gets for its advertisers.

Bud also reminds that any production equipment should be well maintained--not just by an engineer, but by the people who use it, in order to turn out the best quality audio. And when possible, standardize on a particular kind of tape, and then bias the tape machines for it, for best fidelity and lowest noise.

In the "minimum" production room, along with at least one high-quality turntable, Bud would put a two-track stereo reel-to-reel tape machine, a second tape machine that is either two-track stereo or mono, and two cart decks. ("You can approximate four-track with this configuration, although it would be a mono mix.") Add a mike, and for a board, Bud says "buy a good slider-pot board, like the Audiotronics, to which you can add as you can afford it with their plug-in modules....plan your production room with expansion in mind."

The second question I asked was what he would add to the basic production room to make it better? He recommended more reel-to-reel tape decks, at least two, preferably stereo, and a good four-track



deck ("more expensive, but it cuts production time in half, and you can make the inevitable corrections and changes in spec spots after the sonsor is sold simply by putting the tape back up on the machine and changing the single voice track").

And the third question was, what is on your wish list for your production room? His reply was unhesitating--a bigger room!! Production rooms tend always to be cramped; there should be room to accomodate extra voices, and to help isolate equipment noise from the mikes. The room should also be well lighted.

"Anchorage is myth city," says KWHL Music Director Kevin Vargas, referring to Alaska's largest metropolis.

"I've seen one igloo. It's a cement one in front of a tourist stop," adds Carter B. Bradley, who was recently promoted by Pioneer Broadcasting to where he now oversees all programming aspects of K-WHALE plus their sister stations.

K-WHALE was born early one morning, September 18, 1982. General Manager Roy Robinson originally envisioned KWHL as an automated beautiful music beacon. He even went as far as buying all the

necessary equipment to do so. However, after a little further market analysis, Robinson turned his concept around and decided to go a hundred and eighty degrees the other way into Album Radio. A skeleton of his automation equipment still sits in the back room, most of its parts stripped and used by the station's engineers. KWHL ended up debuting as the highest rated Album Radio station in history with a 19.1 twelve plus share and has maintained a major foothold on the Anchorage market ever since.

Programmer Carter B. (as he is known here at Gavin) is a modestly humorous, occasionally deadpan sort who started out in the Great Midwest. Born in Iowa, Carter B. first worked at a classical station, KDVR in Sioux City.

After subsequent stints at college radio, KKXL-Grand Forks, KKDQ/KKRQ-lowa City, Carter B. finally migrated west to California, as an on-air Music Director at KBOS-Tulare playing "chainsaw rock 'n'

"After two or three days of driving from Iowa, I hit Sacramento, found KBOS on the dial. In the two and a half hours I listened until I got to the station, I only recognized two songs. They weren't playing 'Stairway To Heaven' because it was too mellow."

A couple years later, after hearing about the formation of a brand new Anchorage Album Radio station, Carter half-heartedly sent up his tape. Ten months passed.

"I was depressed. I mean, I couldn't even get a job in Alaska."

Eventually the call did come.

"At first I envisioned Alaska as being a barren, God-forsaken place. People living in igloos, all the stereotypes. That night I called the Anchorage Chamber of Commerce and asked all sorts of questions. The woman was completely NEGATIVE until I let her know I had a solid job offer. Then her attitude changed."

Kevin Vargas accidently became enthralled with Seward's Follie. "I was looking for a vacation spot. So I called radio stations. I called Carter and he was real cordial and he made this tremendous sales pitch on how great the area was.

After knocking around the Midwest, in college radio, KIIK/WOC-Davenport, and WWCT-Peoria, Vargas joined K-WHALE as on-air MD. Together they have built an impressive Album Radio expanse.

'I hate to say formula, but we offer consistency," Carter B. said. "Our audience is pretty close to a fifty/fifty split-55% men, 45% women. We never go over nine units an hour. There's a commitment from GM Roy Robinson saying we're going to be the best. Promos that I run count as units. We're sold out for months.

"Personally it hurts me that we have an image as a heavy metal station. We don't skew much Top Forty. I love the fact that we're not number one in teens."

The station line-up consists of morning team Cary Karrigan and Mark Raney 6AM to 10AM, Jessica West 10-3PM, Carter 3PM-7PM, Kevin Vargas 7-Midnight, Music Co-Ordinator Cyndee Maxwell 12-6AM, and Mike Ardaiz does weekends and nights.

"The market certainly wasn't as small as I'd been led to believe," stated Vargas. "Almost half of the state's 600,000 people reside right here in the Anchorage/Mat-Su valley area.

Carter B. agrees.

"It's a young, growing market. I'm in a market of over 250,000 people, yet there's very little of the pressure you would feel in other markets of that size. In Anchorage, the average age is 27. The audience's tastes in music are similar to those of the Midwest. It's meat and potatoes rock 'n' roll. I mean, dinosaur rock has a home at

"It's a clean market," laughs Carter. "The air is clean and the radio is clean."

Just A Million Dreams—Alan Vega (Elektra)

ALAN VEGA accidently donned the spotlight when the only record BRUCE SPRINGSTEEN praised in a rare Rolling Stone interview a few months back was ALAN VEGA and MARTIN REV's "Frankie Teardrop". "On The Run" kicks off ALAN VEGA's new LP, which is a guitared collaboration between VEGA and his producer and an engineer, who double nicely as his "backing band". And, whoa ho, engineer KENNAN KEATING just happens to play some nice lead licks. Check out the opening trax on each side, then on to the whole LP. RIC OCASEK contributes on two trax. Better yet, "blindfold test" someone on "On The Run" and tally the guesses. I guessed BEN ORR.



The Head On The Door—The Cure (Elektra)

Those who recall THE TOP (THE CURE's last LP, not counting the live LP) will notice the absence of maniacal arrangements (whew).In its place is a more artistic calm-well almost. There are still oriental

and arabic flavorings, but the melody does tone down the fervor a bit. In its place lurks more texture and simple elegance. There are grand moments of rock. The opening single, "In Between Days" as well as "Push" are up tempo and are somewhat reminiscent of earlier days. This is THE CURE minus any excessive intensity. For awhile, THE CURE was sporadically recording singles. Since departing SIOUXSIE & her BANSHEES, the dual ROBERT SMITH is now full time CURE, on the beam releasing full sized LPs. We see this LP eventually topping our Alternative chart, no sweat. In Between Days/Push/A Night Like This.

"Gone Ridin" "— Chris Isaak (Warner Bros.)

Aww c'mon. Are we gonna let the goddamn movies break all our artists this year? AMERICAN FLYERS is slated to be one of this year's big hit movies. The theme is lifted (and slightly altered?) from the monster LP That Refuses To Die At The GAVIN--CHRIS ISAAK'S SILVERTONE.

'Say It Again''—Danse Society (Arista)

Just the right amount of sneer for rockers and dancaholics. DANSE SOCIETY (kind of a misleading misnomer) has evolved from a band of anonymous tape-accompanied artistes to a real quintet--front man and all. Ironically, "Say It Again" could make a great segue into the new THOMPSON TWINS single.

Mac Davis has established himself as an all around entertainer - songwriter, singer, actor...performer. After writing hit songs early in his career for such notables as Elvis Presley, Kenny Rogers, O.C. Smith, and Bobby Goldsboro, Mac decided to make a go of recording his own songs. He proceeded to record a string of hits. His natural rapport with his audience lead to television specials and starring roles in such movies as North Dallas Forty and The Sting II. While his songs have popped up on the Top 40 and A/C charts from time to time, Mac remains loyal to his country roots.

LS: One of my spys here at The Gavin Report tells me that you used to do promotion for Liberty Records.

MD: I hate to date myself, but I started out with VeeJay Records back in '62. I did local promotion for them in Atlanta and worked my way up to Regional Sales Manager. Then I went to work for Liberty after VeeJay got in trouble.

LS: Did you stay in the South?

MD: I originally did the same job for Liberty that I did for VeeJay. We started setting up branches all over the South, and I realized at the end of a year that I had branched myself out of a job. They didn't need a regional sales manager anymore. So they asked me if I'd like to work in the publishing division, because at that time I was writing a lot of songs and sending them to the company. They never used them, but they figured that's where my talents were. So they brought me out to Los Angeles in 1966.

LS: So songwriting came before performing?


MD: They both kind of happened at the same time. I had a rock 'n' roll band when I first left Texas and went to Atlanta. I was writing songs then, but nothing of any consequence. This was back in 1958.

LS: When you first started gaining momentum, you weren't exactly country. How did you categorize yourself?

MD: I've always considered myself country. I'm a country boy, I grew up in Texas. So I consider myself a country artist who has had some pop hits. I've written everything from straight country, to pop, to protest songs. I think it's really hard to put a label on it. I'm just a songwriter.

LS: Our publisher, Ron Fell, tells me that his favorite Mac Davis song is a cut from the Songpainter LP called "Home". Could you tell us about that song?

MD: I wrote that years ago with a friend of mine named Larry Collins. It was basically a mild protest song against the Vietnam War. It holds up anytime you've got



servicemen overseas, because they're always thinking of coming home. Some of them make it and some of them don't. That's what the song is about.

LS: When did you start writing for Elvis?

MD: I wrote several things specifically for Elvis back in 1969. He did his first TV special then, and I knew Billy Strange, who was doing the score for the show. Elvis was going to do a medley of his old rock 'n' roll stuff, and Billy asked me to write a bookend song for it. So I wrote a song called Memories. It eventually became a huge hit for Elvis.

LS: Do you remember what inspired you to write "In The Ghetto"?

MD: I grew up in a town where they had dirt street ghettos, but they were still ghettos. My uncle owned a warehouse in that part of town, and I spent a lot of time down there working with my Dad and my uncle. I could never understand why the kids there had to lead a different kind of life than I did. We were poor, but these people were really poor. It always bugged me, and I kept trying to write a song about it with the title "Vicious Circle". Then, when the riots started in the '60's and they dug up the old term ghetto, I changed the song title to "In The Ghetto". It is a vicious circle a child is born, grows up, gets in trouble, dies or gets killed, and another child is born to take its place.

LS: How did Elvis get the song?

MD: I heard that Elvis was going to Memphis to record what was then being thought of as a country album. I thought that everything I wrote sounded country, so I sent him about fifteen songs on a tape. "In The Ghetto" was on that tape, and so was "Don't Cry Daddy". Elvis was touched by "Don't Cry Daddy" and recorded it for his father.

LS: How old was your son Scott when you wrote "Watchin' Scotty Grow"?

MD: He was about 4½ years old. The day I wrote it, he was spending the day with me at the office. He was getting in my hair and bugging me and I was trying to write. I ended up giving him one of those big yellow legal size pads and a pen, and telling him to draw me a picture. He drew a picture of a rocket ship, and on the side of it he'd written PRLFQ. I asked him what that spelled and he said Mom and Dad. I wrote the song in 45 minutes. Scott is 21 now.

LS: Was there a turning point in your career from songwriter to performer?

MD: When I used to sell my songs to producers, I'd either have a tape of me singing the song or I'd sing it to 'em live. I sold Kenny Rogers a song called "Something's Burnin" at a party one night over at Jimmy Bowen's house by just singing him the song. Eventually it became a hit for Kenny and the First Edition. Anyway, I wrote a song called "Friend, Lover, Woman, Wife" (that O.C. Smith eventually recorded). I took it to Jerry Fuller and he said "You ought to be doing this yourself. You sing good". I told him that I'd love to, but I didn't have a recording contract. So he talked to Clive Davis over at Columbia. Soon after that, I went over to the Beverly Hills Hotel and sat down in the room with Clive Davis and sang him

about half a dozen songs. The next thing I knew, I had a recording contract. This was about 1970.

LS: As it so happens, exactly thirteen years ago, "Baby Don't Get Hooked On Me" was the number one song in the Gavin Report.

MD: Is that right? Lord, has it been thirteen years already?

LS: I read somewhere that you actually wrote that song as a joke. Is that true?

MD: It was kind of a put-on. I was working with Rick Hall down in Muscle Shoals, Alabama. I had known Rick since I was a promotion man, and he was not in the early '70's. He produced Aretha Franklin, Mick Jagger, The Osmond Brothers. He contacted me and said he'd like to do a record with me, and I went down there to record. The joke started because Rick was so single-oriented. He was the origional 'you've got to have a hook' guy. He kept saying "Mac, you've brought all these mushy love songs down here, and you've given away all your hook songs. You gave away "I Believe In Music" and "Watchin" Scotty Grow" to other people. We need a song with a hook in it". And he kept saying that over and over. When I went to lunch that day, I wrote "Baby Don't Get Hooked On Me" as a joke. I only had the chorus to it, and I wasn't planning on finishing it. It was just supposed to be a joke for the musicians. I went back in the studio and said "Hey guys, I've got a hook song". I played it for them and was laughing about it when Rick said "I'm sorry, but that's a smash. Let's cut it". I hadn't even finished it, but we recorded it that afternoon with no melody, just the chorus. I went back to my room that night and finished writing the song. It turned out to be a big hit, and I was more surprised than anybody. I always thought it was an egocentric kind of record. It was kind of embarrassing, but I'm certainly not complaining.

LS: It was probably the most profitable joke you ever told.

MD: You've got it.

LS: You do a lot of TV and movies now. Does this cut into your songwriting and recording?

MD: I don't think so. If I really get inspired and want to write, then I sit down and write. To be honest with you, sometimes I get lazy, or sometimes I get writer's block. But if I push myself I can write. I wrote half a dozen songs for this current album. I wrote the "Texas In My Rear View Mirror" album while I was filming North Dallas Forty. You have a lot of time to write while sitting around the trailer between takes.

LS: You've always been accepted by country audiences.

MD: I think that's because I am country,

and in that respect I've never changed. I think that my fans realize I've never changed. A lot of critics like to say I'm slick and polished because I play Vegas, but what I'm doing is putting on a show for people. I've always considered myself a better entertainer than a singer. Combining the ability to make people laugh and the ability to write the songs that I sing has helped me more than anything as far as entertaining people goes. I don't have the voice of a Kenny Rogers or an Elvis Presley. I just do what I do - write songs, tell jokes and entertain.

LS: Your first song with MCA is doing well - to what do you attribute that?

The saddest words that a songwriter can say are "I wish I'd written that".

MD: I think it's just a good song. I liked it the first time I heard it. I didn't write it - Bob McDill did - but it sounds like something I would have written. The saddest words that a songwriter can say are "I wish I'd written that". This is one of those songs. I think it says something that women want to hear. My wife cried the first time she heard it.

LS: You changed labels recently. How does it feel to work with MCA?

MD: It's great. I was with CBS for ten years, and then changed to Casablanca. The first album I did with Casablanca was a big hit with "It's Hard To Be Humble". Neil Bogart was my mainstay there, and when he passed away, the PolyGram people took a bigger hand in things. They tried to get me to go straight pop, and it wasn't working. So I moved over to MCA with Jimmy Bowen, who has been a friend of mine since 1967, back when he used to produce Frank Sinatra and Dean Martin. I had never worked with him as a producer, so I was real excited to be going over to MCA.

LS: Do you listen to Top 40 radio? Any impressions of the music out now?

MD: I'm a song man, and if I hear good songs, I go for'em. I don't have any favorite artists per se, I just listen to the song and the production. Some Top 40 music is real creative right now. I think some of the new stuff is borderline genius. I just love some of the different chord progressions they're using and some of the technology. I don't like some of the lyrics I hear. I think there are subtler ways of putting sex in a song - I know because I've done it. I've always put a lot of double entendras in my songs. I know it's always been a problem with radio playing such a limited playlist. At the same time, I don't complain when I'm one

of those getting played. But I look at it from a promotion man's standpoint. I feel so sorry for the poor guy who walks into a radio station with fifteen singles, and he knows he's got to fight to even get *one* of those played. Then he's got to answer to the artist and the producer. He's caught in the middle.

LS: We've got a couple of rabid North Dallas Forty fans here. How did you get the part in the movie?

MD: I read for it. They were looking for somebody to play the part that had a legitimate Southern accent and who would come off like a Texan. I had read many scripts before that, but most of them were of me being a singer or me being a night club singer who was kidnapped. I didn't want to do that. If I was going to do something, I really wanted to act. I had fallen in love with the book North Dallas Forty - I thought it was one of the best books ever written about sports. So I immediatley jumped at the opportunity to read for the movie. I only weighed 160 pounds and they worried about the size factor. I told them I'd gain 25 pounds for it. The director liked the way I read, that's what it boils down to. They gave me the freedom to rewrite my dialogue a little bit. After I got the part, I went and worked out with the Los Angeles Rams for five weeks, and I gained the 25 pounds.

LS: The character was a sad person.


MD: He was even worse in the book. They actually cleaned this guy up. As a matter of fact, I asked them to change the ending of the movie. I told them I just didn't want to leave the movie being that terrible - I was bad enough as it was. The original ending of the movie had the guy rolling up his window in Nolte's face and just shutting him out completely, as if he cared nothing about him, and Nolte was spitting on the window and slapping the car. It just made the character come off like a real low life coward. So we rewrote the end of the movie to show a little compassion between the two. But that was one of the reasons I liked the part, because I wasn't the nice guy. If you're going to act, you might as well do a part that's really interesting.

LS: You say you don't have any favorite artists, but did you have people who inspired you when you were young?

MD: I grew up in Texas and I was an Elvis Presley freak. I've written about it in songs. I was inspired by Elvis. I was also very much inspired by Buddy Holly. I was one of the kids who used to go down and dance to his music at the skating rink in Lubbock, Texas. I wasn't exactly crazy about him as a singer or a musician at that time, but I certainly was impressed when he came back from New York with a Pontiac Catalina convertible and three blondes in the car. Right then I decided making music might be a little more lucrative than stealing hub caps.

"Pop Crossover" awards have a lot of class this week with FREDDIE JACKSON's "Lady" and JENNIFER HOLLIDAY's "Hard Time For Lovers". Both are the type that show strong staying power while accumulating added airplay. Both the Top 40 and A/C fermats are picking up adds on the FREDDIE JACKSON, which makes sense be-

cause it's of such a sweet nature. The JENNIFER HOLLIDAY is picking up attention from WXKS/FM-Boston, Y100-Miami, WHYT-Detroit, KQAA-Aberdeen, WHKW-Fayette, KSTR-Grand Junction, KBRV-Soda Springs, FM102-Sacramento, KJOY & KSTN in Stockton. KLKT-Lake Tahoe/Reno, KMGX-Fresno, KAGO-Klamath Falls, KHSN-Coos Bay, KITI-Chehalis, KYES-Roseburg, etc. DOUG E. FRESH has been building and already has a 45% Hit Factor, which proves that the ones who went on it early are already having to put it in heavy rotation. ARETHA's "Who's Zoomin' Who" picks up 10 new adds and gets the highest debut on "Up & Coming", and merits one of the two "Most Added" headlines. The other one is a repeater - MORRIS DAY. Seems that Mr. Day will follow in Mr. Wonder's footsteps by getting that billing for two consecutive weeks, too. Betty

Alan Vega - "Just a Million Dreams" (Elektra)

All the songs seem to take their pace from the instruments. The constancy that can be gleaned from synthesizers and rhythm machines give the LP its foundation. Ric Ocasek, from The Cars, lends a hand in writing, keyboards and producing (along with Chris Lord-Alge). Four tracks in particular intrigue me: ON THE RUN, SHOOTING FOR YOU, WILD HEART and a track which recalls the ambience of Robert Plant's BIG LOG called CREATION.
