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

By now WHITNEY HOUSTON's name is synonomous with number one as she quickly makes a return to the top. As mentioned last week MADONNA has her waiting number and it looks like a short wait. Only one new entry in the top ten so expect some changes next week. LABELLE AND MCDONALD blow past a bunch of folks with hit factor movement the story here...43% to 66%. LEVEL 42 still picking up airplay with an 82% hit factor and growing..28 -11 CKOC, 25-17 Y107, 28-20 Q105, 29-21 B-96, 27-20 KZPS, 30 -24 93Q, 2-1 KCPX, 13-9 KIMN, etc. HOWARD JONES more than doubles his hit factor which doesn't happen often. Biggest moves reported by Cindy Wright G105-Durham/Raleigh 25-19, Tom Taylor WPST-Trenton 32-17, Rich Stevens Z103-Tallahassee 37-22, Danny Wayne WRTB/FM-Vincennes 28-15, Scott Daniels KQ95-Aberdeen 35-25, Jay McCall KOZE-Lewiston 16-7, Mr.Ed KWOD-Sacramento 17-10, Kevin James KZHR

BILLY OCEAN has a 28% hit factor .. twice as much as last week with top twenty activity reported at WNSL, WPFM, WXIK, WBCY WQLK, WCIL, KJLS, KRGV, KLKT, FM102, KWNZ, KITI, KUBE, KHWK etc. GEORGE MICHAEL is also converting numbers quickly ... 7% to 23% in hit factor, debuting #24 Z100 New York, and already top ten top ten at WEBE, B-94, I-95, KATD, KWES, etc. SIMPLY RED has been a record we've been touting as a hit during the past month and 43 more believers come on board this week...top ten in San Francisco at KMEL and KITS confirmed by San Jose: KWSS and KATD Jumps 30-19 at KZZP, 29-18 KHOP, 24-14 KAFX, 6-3 KFYR, 30-21 Q104, 23-12 WXIK, etc. FABULOUS THUNDERBIRDS became our Record To Watch back on March 28th and they've skated by Chartbound for a Top 40 slot...looking real good in the Southwest at KIXY-San Angelo 20-10 and KAKS-Amarillo 13-9, and the

Northwest at KGOT-Anchorage 28-14, KNBQ-Tacoma/Seattle 24-17. Progress on April 18th's Record To Watch, PATTI AUSTIN, is also worth noting, with adds at KIIS/AM, OK95, KNVR, KLYK, KAGO, KRKE, KDVV, B-94, WCCK, PRO/FM and a move of 33-27 at KMEL. ATLANTIC STARR qualifies as the Urban and A/C crossover Record To Watch this week. Check out 10-8 KSTN-Stockton, 14-11 KGGI-San Bernardino, #5 KMAI-Honolulu, #13 WROQ -Charlotte, #19 WFBG-Altoona, and adds at 93Q, KZGO, KHOP, KSYZ, WBLU, WBEN, and WJLK. A handful of Top 40 stations are playing a tune titled "Don Quichotte" by MAGAZINE 60 on the Baja record label. It debuts #16 at 93Q-Houston, #23 FM102-Sacramento, #26 KRGV...added at WXKS-Boston, KWOD-Sacramento, KMGX-Fresno, KZZB-Beaumont, KIXY-San Angelo, KFIV -Modesto. May not be for everybody, but it looks like a hit for the right markets and stations geared for this sound.

THE MANAGER PERCEPTION BIAS

oday I'm going to talk to you about one very basic principle. I believe that a true understanding of this principle will help you become a more effective manager. The technical term for it is the "Observer Attribution Bias", and it's something that, as managers, we would like to avoid as much as possible. It works something like this:

Assume that you observe someone doing or saying something that is out of the ordinary. For example, you are at a restaurant and you observe a fellow at the next table snapping loudly at the waitress. You, the observer, will probably make an inference, or conclusion, as to why that fellow is behaving the way he is. This inference is called an attribution. Social psychologists have found that the direction of your attribution is fairly predictable. Observers, especially when noting novel or unexpected behavior on the part of others, have a strong tendency to infer that the cause of the other person's behavior is due to his/her personality or make-up. Thus, in that restaurant, you are likely to conclude that the fellow at the next table is rude, or crude, or uptight, or an obnoxious jerk.

It is quite possible, however, that you are completely wrong, and in fact that fellow was simply reacting to the particular situation facing him just the way you or I would. Perhaps the waitress had been ignoring him for a long time. Perhaps he had been receiving poor service in spite of his polite inquiries. Perhaps the waitress had been rude to him. Perhaps the waitress had been serving customers who had arrived after him, despite his polite protests. If you, the observer, consider these factors in your explanations of that fellow's behavior, then you would not be so quick to make sweeping conclusions about that person's personality.

The social psychological research shows that we observers, as human beings, like to make quick conclusions about why people behave the way they do. And because we often lack complete information about the situation facing other people, we usually leap towards concluding that people behave the way they do because of their personal make-up. For this reason, it is safe to predict that you would have been far more likely to think the fellow in the restaurant was rude, rather than that the service was poor.

And just in case you're wondering, the research suggests that the observer (that's you) is more likely to be wrong than right. That is, people's behavior is not simply due to their "personality" or "the way they are", but is often due more to the kind of situation that they face.

Now what does all of this have to do with management? A lot.

When an empolyee of yours is not doing what you consider top-notch work, or when your employee is not demonstrating the kind of attitude or motivation that you like, what do you usually conclude? If you're like the majority of managers, you'll probably conclude that the employee is not competent, lazy, uncooperative, or not a team-player, or "just doesn't have what it takes", or is a "problem type of person". How likely are you to conclude that the reason for that employee's behavior is something in the situation, like perhaps your management style? Not very likely. Most managers, like most human beings (and despite what many employees think, managers are human beings!), tend towards the Observer Attribution Bias and believe that problems with an employee are due to problems within that employee.

MANAGEMENT

A few research studies have confirmed this trend with managers. Managers were asked to explain why certain employees were not performing well on the job. The managers used explanations that revolved around the employees' make-up: insufficient ability, or lack of motivation on the part of the employee. The employees, however, had different explanations. They talked about the situation they faced regularly. They talked about the fact that they were given ambiguous goals and guidelines, insufficient support (resources, information), contradictory objectives, silly rules or policies that inhibited their performance, constantly changing priorities (this month it's this, next month it's that), insufficient training, little feedback on performance, or very little recognition for good work.

In many ways it's easier for us as managers to blame an employee's personality for problems we're having with that employee. Since there's not much we can do about an employee's personality, it takes us off the hook. But the fact is that the situation the employee faces (which includes the way we manage) is a much more potent factor than his/her personal make-up. Sure, there are times when an employee really and truly is stupid, or lazy, or has an impossible personality. But that's the exception rather that the rule. As managers, we're paid to take on the burdens of lifting our peoples' performance. If they're not up to par, we're copping out if we say that it's "their" problem or "their" fault.

Let's call the Observer Attribution Bias what it really is: It's a Manager Perception Bias. It takes courage to face the fact that we, as fallible human beings, might be subject to it. It takes even more courage to start working on our own management style rather than to automatically blame the people that work for us. But the payoff is worth it.

Tour Europe in your Hillman compact car.. (Opel and Humber autos were also heavily advertised)

Ethel Merman is on Broadway in Gypsy, Huntley and Brinkly are the NBC anchor team. Zenith Space Command Black & White TV's are released, and RCA is pushing the new Limeliters LP.

We were doing promotion in L.A. in '61 and here's a bit of what it was like:

Martoni's Restaurant opened and KFWB's music director, Don Anti, brought all the promo people in singlehandedly making the place a record business hangout throughout the sixties.

The LaBrea Inn, across the street from Imperial Records, served complete filet mignon dinners for \$2.50.

Jerry Moss, Sonny Bono, Joe Smith and Gil Friesen were all doing local promotion.

KFWB and KRLA were the TOP 40 outlets of note and among the major jocks on those stations wereWink Martindale, Gary Owens, Bob Eubanks, Gene Weed, Sam Riddle, Jimmy O'Neil and B. Mitchell Reed. Chuck Blore programmed KFWB Color Radio and Betty Breneman was music director at pre -Drake KHJ. Robert Q. Lewis and Lucky Pierre were among the jocks for whom she programmed.

Bill and Janet Gavin, from a tiny office on Sansome St. in San Francisco, published this paper with virtually no help, taking all reports, listening, managing the office, mailing, and keeping in touch with the record community. They'd never heard of computers.

NO-ONE had heard of sushi, quiche, goat-cheese terrine or warm duck salad on a bed of raddichio. Everyone ate steaks and baked potatoes, (and no-one seemed to have heart attacks).

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Steve Resnik turned 15 and Gavin Publisher Ron Fell became 16 in '61, and if you'll excuse a personal note being conveyed in this space:

To Rosemary, who's hung in there all the way from B. Bumble and The Stingers to Falco...thanks for being what REALLY made this past quarter century a hell of a journey! Can we do it again, starting now?? ■

A/C ANALYSIS

It's between MADONNA and the LaBELLE/McDONALD for #1 next week. MADONNA picked up 60 HEAVY rotations this week. And BILLY OCEAN picked up 61 HEAVIES. If you wanna know what A/C thinks are most appropriate, just look how they stack up in HIT FACTOR below.

GEORGE MICHAEL'S A DIFFERENT CORNER, the slowest record on the chart, is also the fastest. In one month it's already 79% HIT FACTORED, with nearly 200 A/C's playing. A 28-22-12 chart history indicates a serious numero uno contender.

Happy to see the **TEMPTATIONS** CERTIFIED this week. The track looks to be, from all early indications, their biggest A/C record in more than a decade.

NEIL DIAMOND is ripping the A/C chart to shreds with 137 adds in two weeks. Headin' for the top! JAMES TAYLOR has an almost

identical profile. What a pair.

A strange situation developing with my main men, the **PET SHOP BOYS.** Their single, *WEST END GIRLS*, is only getting airplay from 23% of our A/C universe but it's showing a 57% HIT FACTOR where played. HIGH ROTATION from: WKYE, WTAE, WWMJ, WALG, WAZX, WFFX, WHHQ, WKMQ, WKSW, WMGN, WMGV, KLYQ, KSKI, KDES, KALE AND B100.

This week's RECORD TO WATCH, EL DeBARGE's *WHO'S JOHNNY*, is showing a 41% HIT FACTOR among its 68 stations. Looking particularly good in the Midwest and Southern regions.

Our apologies for the big screw up in the A/C Correspondents pages this past week. Our research and charts were accurate, but GRIP and MAC, our usually reliable computer systems, provided us with the previous week's adds. Never again, guys.

ALONE AND TOGETHER By RON FELL and DIANE RUFER

A confession: Jermaine Jackson and I have been good friends for many years. I'm not trying to "namedrop", but our friendship could potentially taint my objectivity.

His willingness to speak so openly about his past, his family and his career has something to do with our friendship, and a lot to do with his relatively outgoing personality.

This interview was taped on a Sony Walkman Pro while Jermaine and I sat see-saw style on the diving board of his swimming pool. (Yours truly sitting over the water, JJ firmly over land.)

After the interview, at his invitation, I attended the fourth day of rehearsal for his upcoming "live" tour. His band of "unknown" musicians was already outdoing the hired guns who'd performed on Jeramine's latest LP, "Precious Moments".

RF: You came from a musical family of nine children, six brothers and three sisters. JJ: I'm the fourth oldest. Rebbie was first, Jackie was second, Tito is third and I'm fourth. RF: When was the first time Jermaine Jackson actually made any money from the performance of music?

JJ:Professionally it was a club called Mr. Lucky's and we got eight dollars. **RF: That was where?**

JJ: In Gary, Indiana. We had to split \$8 five ways. I picked up the change.

RF: Can we dispell the myth that Diana Ross discovered the Jackson Five? How were you actually discovered for Motown?

JJ: Gladys Knight really brought us to Motown, along with Bobby Taylor. Diana Ross played an important part from a press angle. So they all played very important parts. RF: You and your brothers had actually played the Apollo Theatre before you signed with Motown. You were that successful. Wasn't your first record as Ripples and Lovers for Steeltown Records?

JJ: It was called "I'm A Big Boy Now". RF: Have you seen a copy in the last twenty years?

JJ: I have a cassette of that somewhere. That was the beginning of it all.

RF: Did you have any clue when you were signing with Motown that things would happen so fast?

JJ: No. Berry Gordy sat us down and told us he wanted to get three #1 records from us in a row and his staff of people were able to execute that. They brought the material, the songs, the producers and that's exactly what happened. **RF: What was your participation in the early**

records like "ABC" and "I Want You Back"?

JJ: Some of the tracks were laid down and we played the instrumental parts, the voice parts and backgrounds. We would work with the producers on ideas. They were open enough to have, not so much creative control, but just an open mind to the session.

RF: That was The Corporation we see on some of those early albums.

JJ: Exactly.

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RF: Who were The Corporation?

JJ: Berry Gordy, Deke Richards, Fonce Mizel and Freddie Perren.

RF: You were a bass player probably more then anything else, but James Jamerson was considered the ultimate Motown bass man. Did you pick up some of your licks from being around him?

JJ: I've patterned my style after James Jamerson.

RF: I know you still take the instrument seriously, but you don't contribute bass on any of your projects.

JJ: I'm busy producing. If you're able to come to one of my rehearsals "young man" you will see that I'm very active in the bass area.

RF: Did you miss having a normal childhood? JJ: Yes. During that time we were always off to Europe or on a road tour, so it was important for us to enroll in a school that would allow us to travel and to have a tutor. Under California law, that was very important. The tutor had the power to pull us off stage if she saw us yawning, or if we were tired. There were a lot of things that we didn't get a chance to do because we were traveling so much. Now I find myself doing those things; going to parks, the circus, playing basketball with my buddies. We are still growing up.

RF: How do you want that to be different for your kids? You have kids approaching their teen years soon. Are you going to keep that in mind? JJ: Well, music is in our blood and it is in my kid's blood too. I took my kids to Belgium to a car race I had there. It was a 24 hour car race and I was to perform three songs and I brought Jermaine Jr. out and he stole the show. He was just incredible. He had write-ups in the papers. This was almost two years ago. He came out dancing. He's just like my brother Michael. He can see something and do it.

RF: What are you going to do to prevent happening to him what happened to Michael? JJ: He's able to have a childhood. He wants to start in music now, but it's important for him to be a little boy.

RF: Your parents have been referred to as the ultimate stage door parents because they were so intimately involved with your career. I imagine your dad was the manager of the Jackson Five since the beginning.

JJ: My father was the driving force who got everything together so we could present ourselves in a way Motown would say "Hey, that's raw talent. We want to cultivate it and do something with it". My father spent all that time getting us to that point where we were able to record on Motown.

RF: You were probably the last graduating class of the Motown school weren't you? JJ: Yes most definitely! RF: What do you think are things that stay with you most from the Motown school?

JJ: What didn't they do? From the aspect of being a better person, philosophies on life, musical content, lyrics, to structuring at how to present yourself, how to answer questions, how to carry yourself in public. We would do drills and play host, have questions thrown at us just to see how we would respond and be rapid with our answers. They showed us how to look like polished entertainers.

RF: You have shown a fondness for your mother. What does your mother mean to you that may be different from what mothers may mean in other families?

JJ: My mother means to me what mothers mean to everyone else. It's just that I'm in a position to sing and write about her and have the world see and feel my relationship with my mother. It is very important. My mother gave us life. She's always the same whether we're up or down.

RF: Did she play a particular role in your career development other than the fact that she was musically inspired and was prodding you guys to express yourself through music?

JJ: We get all our voices from our mother. My father gave us musicianship and he's the one

who cracks the whip. My mother showed the love and my father was very strict. RF: Despite a tremendous success on Motown, four of your brothers decided to leave Motown in 1974 or 75 and go in another direction and you stayed. Can we get the definitive reasons you stayed at Motown?

JJ: I'm going to set the records straight. First of all, I stayed at Motown for many reasons, but the media and the public thought that I stayed because I was married to the boss' daughter which didn't have anything to do with that. My reasons for staying at Motown were very simple. During that time, Motown was having problems and my brothers felt that they could go somewhere else and do much better, not really realizing that we had seven years of success that built everything that's going on right now. Those early years were the building of a strong foundation. So I just felt if Motown is having problems I want to stay and help.

RF: Could it have started off as a contract ploy to get a better deal out of Motown, or had the brothers made up their minds to leave without giving Motown a shot?

JJ: I heard about it on the news. That was when I

first got the story. They said all of us were leaving. I never said that I wanted to be solo because we all started at Motown. Everybody asked "why did you leave your brothers?" I would go to parks and play basketball and kids would walk up and ask my brothers for their autographs and they wouldn't ask for mine because they said, "Well you left". The question is "Who really left who"? I just didn't agree with what they wanted to do during that time, so I stayed. And it helped me tremendously as a person. I owe it all to Berry Gordy as far as being able to be in a position to record for other people like Clive Davis at Arista and it was great to know that other record companies had shown a very important interest in me too.

RF: Did you have second thoughts when your brothers started to have hit albums with Epic and you hadn't clicked with the big one yet? Was there a competitive thing in your mind, or were you hurt.

JJ: Now I can speak about it and smile. But I was so hurt because I remember we all slept in the same bunk bed as kids. I had to deal with pressure at a very young age and I was under emotional stress and I didn't let the public know, but I had a special doctor that would talk to me and let me know that everything was going to be all right. I was only doing something that I believed in. As far as competitiveness, Berry Gordy was very very good at saying "We're going to concentrate on what we're going to do. They are going to get hit records and it's going to be like starting over". So I knew I had to start from the beginning. He said, "You have to prove yourself, constantly prove yourself". And so I accepted it.

RF: What was happening to you in terms of management at that time? For a portion of your career you managed yourself.

JJ: Being in the business that long and having decisions made on your career from someone like Berry Gordy you always had his blessing, so if something was to come up he would step in and say "No. You should do this or that". There wasn't one person who played the role as my manager.

RF: So you stayed close to Mr. Gordy, through this whole thing?

JJ: I learned so much through my father-in-law. It's much more valuable than selling a hundred million albums, because I'm sure of myself. I know what I can do and what I can't do. I know where I'm going, how I'm going to get there and what it's going to take. Before, I was just an artist, taking directions and singing songs, not knowing what was really going to happen with my life. Now I'm able to give other people direction and that's important.

RF: Your solo career really seemed to... JJ: ...take a dive.

RF: Our readers know that you did have a solo career while still a member of the Jackson Five with "Daddy's Home". Didn't you think it a little strange, at the age of 17 or 18, singing a song about Daddy being home?

JJ: You know something, I didn't even understand it. All I knew was during that time I was a teen sex symbol and there would be these cover stories with my shirt off. I didn't have muscles at that time.

RF: Still don't. (laughs)

JJ: When we did some of our concerts back East, I would sing these ballads and girls would start fainting and acting crazy. But I couldn't relate to it.

RF: The biggest moment in your solo career, after you had spilt with your brothers, was hooking up with Stevie Wonder on "Let's Get Serious". How did the match-making take place? JJ: I met Stevie Wonder when I first got to Motown and we did some songs together. The song "You're Supposed To Keep Your Love For Me", he recorded with me in 1972. Then he came up with the song "Let's Get Serious". I needed help during that time. It gets a little frustrating having seven years of success with your brothers, now you're by yourself. You know that you're still a Jackson and you got pride but you're not selling any albums. People are upset at you for all the wrong reasons and all you did was something that you believed in. All I had to do was prove myself. Then I started to see things happen and started working with other people getting success from them.

RF: You talk about loyality and everything Berry Gordy meant to you. Your contract ran out a few years ago at Motown and you end up changing labels. How did that all come about?

JJ: It got to a point where I sat down with my father-in-law and had a discussion. He was very good. No harsh words or anything. I said "We're so close and you want me to do so well that I almost can be in the way. I think it's better for me to get out there and see how other record companies are and what life is about". Motown was so protective and I was so much under their wings that I really didn't have the independence or responsibility for my own thing. I had a solid contract with Motown and he let me go.

RF: I guess he remembered what you did for him in the mid 70's.

JJ: Yes, and he is a man of his word. If it wasn't for him I wouldn't be at Arista. 'Cause he could have said "no". He let me move on and develop myself.

RF: You signed with Arista and right around that time there were rumors of a tour with your brothers. Then talk that maybe you'd actually perform on record with your brothers. How did this come about? Was this a "kiss-and-make-up" session, or was it something you guys were talking about but didn't want to do while you were on Motown?

JJ: During the time it was the feeling that Jermaine had made the decision and he's going to stick to it. They didn't want to be under pressure to try to say I should get out to tour, but I missed them tremendously. I wrote songs about it.

RF: What songs?

JJ: 'We Can Put It Back Together" and "I'm My Brothers Keeper". I sneaked into Philadlephia when they were on a show and Randy was doing "Daddy's Home". I just walked on stage and I stopped the band and I said "What are you doing singing my song?" The crowd went crazy. That was my first time seeing them perform without me in a long time.

RF: Was this about 1972 or 73?

JJ: This was the tour before the Victory tour. We all hugged and embraced and I sang "Daddy's Home". The people loved it. I guess we always kept each other in our hearts. We did the Motown 25th Anniversary show that really triggered a whole lot of excitement and the rumor started that we were going to get back together and do a tour. Then it was time to talk about the tour. We knew we wanted to do it, but we didn't know it was going to take two years to get out there.

RF: Explain why it took two years?

JJ: Because you have the Jackson Five and The Jacksons, Michael Jackson and Jermaine Jackson. All these names are under the same family tree, but it's different attorneys, different accountants, different record companies and they all have to come together and say "okay". On the tour, Motown had rights to certain things... whether we were to use or sell old pictures of the Jackson Five. When you're doing something that big you want to make sure you're doing everything right.

RF: Did you know when you started to conceptualize this tour two years in advance of the first show that it was going to be as big as it was?

JJ: No. All we knew was that what made the tour so big was that Michael's album was so big. But still, as a family unit it was great to see everybody out there. It was a dream come true for me, but

we had no idea we would be doing the type of business we were doing.

RF: Let's clear up the high ticket price. I was one of those people saying that the \$30.00 ticket was ridiculously high.

JJ: I'm going to answer your comment. The public expected so much that we said "we'll give them a show that was better then Ringling Brothers circus. We are going to have a whole world of people out there".

RF: How many people were out on the road with you?

JJ: We had 300 people out there. When we would go to a city we would hire another hundred to cover all the things we needed. It was not that we were robbing the people because we were not doing it for the money, we were doing it because we hadn't been together for a along time. Also, to clear up a point which is important,for some of these shows we didn't know whether we were going to be paid or not. When we played Dodger Stadium we hadn't gotten paid for Canada. We were just performing. The people didn't know there was some controversy going on between us and the promoter. All they would have said was that the Jacksons didn't show up.

RF: I got the feeling that it got out of control. It was so big, with so much security for you and your brothers that it wasn't fun.

JJ:The Victory tour was fun for me, but on the same hand, Michael had just come off the biggest selling album in history. So therefore it put him in the position to dictate. He said "I'm going to do this and I'm going to do that". My brother is quiet. I'm the type that, if you do me wrong, I'm going to get you. "Jermaine is suing the tour accountant?" That's right because I told him not to touch my money and he did. During that time I was traveling with Pia Zadora and we were going over to Europe promoting "When The Rain Begins To Fall". I went to Israeland I read about myself "Jermaine Jackson Sues Tour Accountant". I couldn't believe it. I mean this news traveled all the way over to israel. It was a hot issue. Why would one of the brothers sue one of the accountants? Everybody wanted to know. Sometimes when you are in position to take a stand you should. Michael was the leading force during the tour. I just felt he could have made things a little easier. Not that I'm blaming him.

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RF: Another impression I got was that Michael did the tour for the brothers, that you did it to be with the brothers and the other brothers did it because they might not have much more professional music in their career. I know you can't speak for your brothers, but that's the assumption I get.

JJ: I can speak for my brothers. Michael didn't do the tour for the brothers. He did the tour for the people.

RF: Michael could have gone solo. He didn't have to do a tour with his brothers.

JJ: True. But until he does a solo tour he's still one of the Jacksons and you cannot sell 30 million records and not give something back to the public. So it was very important for him to tour because these were the people who took him to #1. I did the tour 'cause I missed them so much. I would have done the tour for free. RF: The third part of my statement though, was the other brothers are not the musicians as much as you and Michael are. Do your brothers, other than Michael, have musical strengths that we are just not aware of?

JJ: All my brothers are very talented, but their talent is not brought out. Everyone is going to say "It's all Michael and Jermaine". My brothers are writers, producers and dancers too.

RF: Are your brothers making an album now? JJ: Yes they are.

RF: Does that album include Jeramine and Michael Jackson?

JJ: Yes it does and I'm very excited about that. RF: When do you think we can logically expect the next Jacksons album?

JJ: I guess you'll have to ask Walter Yetnikoff. **RF: You are famous for calling family meetings. Do you have meetings without your father?** JJ: Yes. I guess someone has to keep everything together. My position in everything is to be the overseer and that's the part I played on the Victory tour. I usually call the meetings because I'm always concerned about just where the family is at that point as far as their careers. We're at different record companies. We're all separated. There has to be some point where we all come together to sing the same song. We don't want to lose that togetherness. **RF: Was there any talk of having the sisters**

perform with the brothers during the Victory tour?

JJ: There was talk about it.

RF: It didn't happen.

JJ: Michael, Marlon, Jackie and Randy felt that it would kill the "tough" image. Tito and I were for it.

RF: How did the sisters feel about it?

JJ: They had mixed feelings. But I think they really didn't want it either.

RF: In 1985 you participated in a Pia Zadora project, the track "When The Rain Begins To Fall". I'll go on record as saying it's probably the best record that radio didn't play. How did you hook up with Pia Zadora?

JJ: I met Pia Zadora through Don King who played me a song one day and asked me if I liked the song and I said, "yeah!". I never knew it was Pia singing. He said, "I want you to meet somebody". We went to Chassens and he said it was Pia Zadora singing that song. I never knew anything about Pia, I heard things, but I didn't know her. When I met her, she was just the nicest person, so sweet. Don King asked, "Would you like to do this song for a movie?" I said, "Sure". I had sung with Syreeta, Rita Coolidge, DeBarge, so why can't I sing with her? They said if it might create a problem with my record company they just might not put it out. **RF: It did create a problem with your record company.**

JJ: It did, but that song helped my career so much. In Europe, during the time we were promoting that song, I was also able to do some of my stuff off my first Arista album on all their television shows.

RF: Supposedly the video for "When The Rain Begin To Fall" was one of the most expensive videos ever made.

JJ: Yeah, the video was shot in Southern Italy and it took ten days to do it. We were on the set every day.

RF: Who directed it?

JJ: Bob Giraldi. They flew everyone over, even the dancers. It was like doing a movie and I enjoyed it. That song was a very good song and also we were visible.

RF: Why didn't it happen in the States?

JJ: I really don't know. Pia and I did some press on it, but I think radio never gave it a chance. **RF: Because of a perceived prejudice towards Pia?**

JJ: Probably. Now they accept her because she's done great with all that determination and drive. Now she's turned her performance around, she's getting positive, great reviews. RF: Another thing happened in 1985 that didn't include you and that was USA For Africa. Why were you not singing along with your brothers and LaToya?

JJ: I was in Germany during that time. I was trying to get back on a flight but I wasn't able to. RF: How did you feel not being in on the project and how do you feel about not having contributed to that project?

JJ: It was great to see all the entertainers get together and do something positive. I know my family did it for the right reasons because we've been involved with world situations before. But how many of the artists did it for the project and how many because it was the hottest ticket in town? When it was time to go over to Africa how many went all the way? My brother Marlon and Harry Belafonte did.

RF: What was Marlon's impression after he got back from Africa?

JJ: He said everyone who sang on that song should have been there.

RF: Were they asked? Why was Marlon the only artist there? Did these other artists have greater faith that it was going to happen?

JJ: You can never assume. The difference is, if I was to call a radio station and say "Hi, I'm Jermaine Jackson, when I'm in town I listen to WDAS'. It means much more when I walk into the station and I say "Hi" to people and shake Butterball's hand. It would have meant much more to see Lionel Richie and Michael Jackson out there feeding these people. It would have made what they sang much more believable. RF: You were quoted as saying "The trouble with people is that they cripple a man and then criticize the way he walks."

JJ: That was part of my poem. I was talking about the situation in South Africa. My heart goes out to those people. You can not say to someone "Your not going to amount to anything" then expect them to amount to something.

RF: The new album is your finest album to date. What have you been learning in the process of the last couple of albums which has made this album so strong?

JJ: I've learned over the years that you can get too caught up in your own musical talents. I basically learned to look for great songs, guality songs, not so much the dance records. I know my album is not a dance-oriented album. On the other hand, I was concerened with having quality songs, variety and songs that would last. "Precious Moments" was a title that I personally just liked. Do you remember when you would talk to me about titles for albums? You would mention something about Harvest and then you mentioned some other titles. When I thought about this title I said well, "Ron's gotta like this one". Then I see you at the Gavin Report Cocktail Party and you tell me you don't like the title This album took me fifteen months to do. Right after the Victory tour I went into the studio, working around Michael Omartian's schedule and David Foster's and Tom Keene's and trying to find space for myself to do some producing because, at that time they were also working with other people. I put a lot of time into it, which was a very expensive. I was trying to get accepted as a great singer with great songs. If you notice, I'm singing more convincingly. I don't read lyrics from a paper now. I memorize the lyrics and shut

the room out dark and try to imagine what I'm singing because if the listener is going to listen its got to be believable.

RF: There are four songs I want to focus on. How did you come up with the Rodney Crowell/David Malloy song "Give A Little Love"?

JJ: Clive Davis is great at finding songs, not just for finding songs, but running the record company. He brought me "Dynamite" and "Do What You Do". He's a great motivator. A lot of people I work with are respected by Clive. So Clive calls them in and gets them going.

RF: The tribute you do to Marvin Gaye called 'Words Into Action''.... I know that you had a tremendous fondess for Marvin Gaye before he was killed. I think it's ironic that you do a song dedicated to Marvin, but you didn't write the song.

JJ: Peter Vale and Mick Leeson are two writers with Chappell Music in London. I felt it was a great song to express my feelings for Marvin Gaye. At the end I say "We love you Marvin". They wrote "Heartbeat" too and I've since signed them to our record company.

RF: Anybody who knows their music knows Michael Omartian. They should by now know who David Foster is. But who is Tom Keene and where did you find him?

JJ: Tom Keene is a young, upcoming producer, musician and a great songwriter. He worked with me on this album and has worked a lot with David Foster on his projects. I feel he's very talented. In fact he should be an artist. He has written songs for other people and it's just a matter of us getting into the studio producing. Young too. **RF: Is there a chance you'll be doing anything more with Whitney Houston?**

JJ: I suppose there's a possiblitiy we might do a video for "If You Say My Eyes Are Beautiful". Whitney Houston is very special to me because I'm one of the first artists to work with her. I feel close because I took the time to sing with her first and she accompanied me on my album and Clive introduced us.

RF: You're starting your own record company for developing artists. What's that label going to be called?

JJ: WORK - World Organization Record Kompany. I travel a lot and I see so many acts and many artists over in Europe that I would like to work with them. I've been getting tapes and we are just in the process getting them signed. I am going to be very active in London the next year or two, getting this thing going. And I love it. RF: Will there be an artistic focus or will you take all kinds of artists?

JJ: All types of artists. We are a working record company.

RF: Some of our readers may feel it's hard enough focusing in one format of music and you're going to take on a label that won't have any apparent boundaries.

JJ: My formated focus is hit records - whether they are R&B or pop. If the record is a hit then I can deal with it and so can everyone else. Through my years of learning from my father-in-law I feel he has given me a foundation to look at raw talent - look at a song and give insight or criticism.

RF: What do you invision Jermaine Jackson doing ten years from now? A record company president or chairman of the board? CONT. ON PAGE 46





"Mad About You" - Belinda Carlisle (IRS)

Minus the extraneous tensions of group politics, solo-dom brings on a whole new different set of pressures and challenges. **Belinda Carlisle** seems to be performing well outside the format of a band."Mad About You" is a clearly mixed, clearly defined rock and roll record. There's a nice guitar solo-ette almost at the midpoint. Album Radio could make a point of beating Top Forty to the punch. Out-of-the-box on this one.



Tones - Eric Johnson (Warner Bros.)

Last week's Alternative Spotlight was the avant-garde instrumentalist Scott Johnson. This week it's Eric Johnson and his debut, Tones. Every few years I'd hear a tape floating around of this undiscovered, almost legendary guitarist from Texas. Then it was a half hour slot on Austin City Limits with the great Joe Ely (performing separately). Now on this album, EJ plays with a gentle, but forceful, finesse. "Off My Mind" is actually a mellower sidestep, considering Van Halen and the like. Do take a stroll through the rest of the LP. It's a day at the beach for those who listen hard for a good lick.

Peter Case (Geffen)

With this LP sample and its diversity, **Peter Case** will take our Alternative Chart by storm. Unlike his work within the confines of the quartet, **The Plimsouls**, Case on his own has a more sophisticated, hypnotic, progressive bent. This first batch of five songs project a down home, drumless, almost ambient Americana. Very unusual and tasteful.



Walk The West (Capitol)

Three trax arrived from a new band called Walk The West. Now, did you flip the disc over to the first track on side two? Comparisons to REM are bound to surface,but shift your attention over to the guitar player. Rhythmically and as a lead player, the direction is very much akin to, and influenced by,Jimmy Page. The jagged elegance is a cool forgery of the master, but applied to a radically different music style. Walk The West make the grade. This is one of the first guitarists I've heard in a long while that seems to understand the subtle essence of rhythmic hard rock playing. If you don't flip the disc, you miss out. So do it.

"Fourth Rendez-vous" - Jean-Michel Jarre (Polydor)

J-MJ's last mass appeal radio shot with his debut,Oxygene."Fourth Rendez -vous", connected with our wavering (but still popular) space program, drew a million people who watched a live laser performance in Houston. Scheduled to sit in on sax was one of the late Challenger astronauts. As "Fourth Rendez-vous" continues to emotionally gain steam across the dial, could it be the next "Chariots Of Fire"? KENT

The Unforgiven (Elektra)

You really have to see these guys to believe it. Picture six guys (five of which have guitars slung low) dressed like saddle tramps. At first, is it punk? Then you realize the caliber of the lead guitarist shoves the band up a few notches. On record, the songs are sweetened up by producer John Boylan (Pure Prairie League, Quarterflash). There are a number of unlikely ingredients at work here--deviations of The Clash, The Allmans, Clint Eastwood, and Sam Shepard. The intro track, for now, is "I Hear The Call", which could segue nicely into "I Still Believe" or "Everywhere I Go"...by The Call. Sorry.

"Love Missle F1-11" - Sigue Sigue Sputnik (Manhattan)

The last commercial tidal wave of outrage and controversy was **Frankie Goes To Hollywood**. They rode the crest of decadence. Sigue Sigue Sputnik is loudness, artillery, platinum hair, leather, and film clips. Fashioning their record sleeves after Japanese & Russian imports, SSS is the kick-up-the-butt/big splash controversy that helps keep kids a mile apart, musically,from their parents. It's been a long while since the circus has rolled in. Bring on the outrage.

"Feel The Heat" - Jean Beauvoir (Columbia)

Fortunately "Feel The Heat" does stand on its own as a hit record, apart from the fact that there's an association with **Sylvester Stallone's** latest law and order binge, **Cobra. Beauvoir** sure kept his talents as a performer, producer, and writer well hidden during his tenure with **The Plasmatics** (which is understandable). A

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





here are many ingenious sales strategies that build sponsorship for a station besides the straight cash sale. There's the inevitable trade -out or barter, in which the station receives goods it would have had to pay retail for, and the retailer gets the advertising at the cost of the wholesale price of the items and services he trades--a bargain for both. There's the barter for a merchandise item around which a package can be built for cash advertisers. There's the P.I., or per-inquiry spot, in which the station receives a percentage of each sale sent to the station or phoned to a toll-free number (these are far more common on TV than radio these days).

But never before have I heard of a situation in which the advertiser trades with the station, and the listeners pay the station. Hats off to WSNG

MAKING THE LISTENERS PAY FOR IT

in Torrington, Connecticut for this truly original approach. They have a two-hour-a-day auction show, using goods and services traded to the station by area businesses for the mentions on the show. The stations put them up for bid by phone, and the winning bid reportedly is between 60 and 70% of the normal retail cost. Look who benefits: The merchant gets radio advertising and participation in a much-listened-to show for their wholesale cost of the merchandise ... The listener benefits by getting a bargain on desirable, new merchandise (the quality of the items is the most important criterion in making the concept go).. And the station benefits, not only by having an appealing program (in this age of consumerism and shopping for price) and one which builds a repeat audience and holds it, but it trades merchandise and gets cash for it! That's diabolically clever. And since advertisers can see concrete evidence, not only of an audience. but an audience interested in buying their products at a good price, it encourages them to ante up cash for additional paid advertising!

WSNG also has an unusual spot pricing policy--\$2 for each five seconds. This allows the advertiser to buy odd spot lengths, and

JJ: No. no. We all have wants and desires and we are all ambitious people. I have watched my career, and I've watched how I've been effective in other areas as far as working with people creating excitement for them. Now I know what I enjoy doing. It's such a great feeling for me to be involved with something and see how the world accepts it. I feel I have all the drive, determination and knowledge to run a record company. I spent time at Motown going to pressing plants, going to distributors, the Mom and Pop stores, walking into radio stations seeing how strong of a salesman are the promoters. I've been on conference calls and that has helped me. I'm concerned with moving forward. I've been an artist for seventeen years and if I was to put my career on the wall right now it's just not enough.

RF: You could hang up your career now. You think about it and say "I'm proud of what I've done. I've accomplished what I set out to do". JJ: Exactly. You're taking the words out of my mouth. Still, I have to make other statements so that they're not going to look at me as just one of the Jacksons. My name will always be Jermaine Jackson, my heart goes out to other fields. I mean, I've spent time in film school and I would love to get involved with film shortly. But I enjoy working with other talent. So if I want to work with other talent why do it for other record companies when I can do it for myself.

RF: I would imagine the next round of solo contract neogations will be pretty interesting. You'll be in neogations with yourself and Arista at least.

JJ: It depends. If Clive Davis will give me his job then I'll stay at Arista 'cause I want his job. RF: What's this about you and Stevie Wonder possibly being related? Supposedly you did some researching of your family tree. JJ: On my mother's side we have the same family

JJ: On my mother's side we have the same family in Alabama. I had heard something about it when Stevie came to the studio to do the lyrics for "I Think It's Love". He brought it up to me. We have always been very close, even before we found this out, so it's like he's my cousin. RF: What are the possiblities of your touring solo this year?

JJ: I'm going out. I'm very excited about the band. We have a very strong band. This will be my first solo tour ever and I'm not nervous, not one bit. I'm just shakin'. compensates the station for those spots that run :35 :40, :65, :70, etc. Larger stations may have trouble administering that, both at the client and bookkeeping level, but there's no denying it's innovative.

And let me return to an idea any station can pursue to make money in unsold time--those P.I.'s. There aren't very many offered to radio anymore, and fewer still that attract significant orders from listeners. But how about making up your own? If there's a trade school in your area that can't afford a strong ad schedule, but is willing to pay a commission if you turn up a student who registers for the course, you can do a P.I. for that--and run the spot in unsold and fringe times. (Make sure the commission is substantial--\$100 or more--per student, because you won't be turning very many, most likely.) And perhaps there is a local inventor who is trying to market a new product in the area--a P.I. would give him or her advertising that would otherwise not be affordable and get the station a commission on each item sold. You may prefer to invite inquiries for your P.I. to the station, to be forwarded to the client, so you'll know if there were responses, and that you are owed a commission.

RF: After the last Jackson Five shows in 73 or 74, when was the next time you stepped foot on stage to perform live?

JJ: I did something with Stevie Wonder in Japan at Budokan Hall. As far as me performing with my brothers, it wasn't until Motown's 25th, then the Victory tour.

RF: You've never performed solo? Never been a marquee in front of a theater saying: "Tonight Jermaine Jackson".

JJ: There was one when I did my recent video at the Roxy. No. I've never had a billboard saying, "Tonight you're going to see Jermaine".


RF: What do you do with all your spare time these days?

JJ: Spare time?

RF: Your album is finished. You're obviously not working on a new album. You're just rehearsing a band. Are you racing cars?

JJ: I'm racing cars up and down the freeway getting speeding tickets. I'm going to rehearsal this evening. Arista has been calling me about the video I'm getting ready to do for "Do You Remember Me" and I'm supposed to be leaving for Europe in two weeks. All this just goes on and on and on. After I'm finished touring it's time to go back into the studio.





"URBANIZING"

"BY THE DAWN'S EARLY LIGHT"

OR

"AS THE MORNINGS GO. SO GO THE RATINGS"

"Mayhem in the AM"

"Wake me, shake me," sang the Four Tops over a decade ago, and while it was not a huge crossover hit for Levi Stubbs & Company, it did have some rather interesting lyrics. One line in particular caught our ear. "Wake me shake me, when it's over". You might say, there's a "do not disturb" sign hung over the control room door of many radio stations that are so busy concentrating on getting the music right and playing 15 songs in-a-row that they forgot one of the basics of winning radio - and winning always revolves around key players. The center, or the quarterback, or the hurler for today's music radio "Laugh Inns" is the morning man or the morning team.

There has been many a winning station in our format that climbed to the top because they had strong mornings. In Dallas, Texas, perhaps the best black morning man in America, and a recent Gavin Award winner, Tom Joyner, led K104's ascension to the top and maybe led a litany of urban morning show successes nationwide.

"Counting Sheep"

There are some who no doubt, will be offended at the use of the word "sheep", in reference to people. But these are some of the same people who program and manage as if their audience were sheep. The pied piper that gets the sheep to follow him are often the morning guys whose comedic antics and cast of characters have everybody whistling his tune. .. even ARBitron. The morning man with the largest following gets to graze on the greenest pastures...some may even get to retire.

But what does it take to gather a sizeable flock? More music? Better seques? Less news? Bigger prizes? Playing the researched superhits in hot rotation? Probably all of the above ... plus a morning leader.


Let us imagine momentarily, that the basic premise may be in error. What if the word "sheep" applies more to a cud-chewing mammal "Moming Music Mixes" than a radio listemer? What if the things that have been going down in this country for the past decade have changed people's thinking? Things like war, poverty, prejudice, abortion, terrorism and recession?

Could people be confused and disillusioned and searching? Perhaps because this generation that we're talking to and playing the hits for are better educated, more affluent,

better informed, in better physical shape and yet, have no way to escape no matter where they move. Do we really have a responsibility beyond ratings or should we just continue to blithely guide our "sheep" down the path to slaughter? But then, radio is supposed to be entertaining, fun, and not deal with the issues that are too serious. So let's put the fun in, take the reality out, mix with big hits and a cash contest, stir well, and "cook" over a cool, blue-yellow flame. Why, it's all so logical, you don't need Pavlov or his dogs. Sheep could be our staircase to success.

We have to put people and puns and prizes in place now. Once the sheep have grazed, they're ready to kick back and be stimulated on their way to work or school, even the unemployment office. They're ready to be entertained. And the entertainment that seems to work best in the morning is a combination of information that is relevant to the music or to a basic denominator connected to local interests. In a study just completed on information versus humor, humor definitely comes out way ahead. Humor is a necessary ingredient in the morning menu, but it must be in conjunction with information. Information that is not humorous is also necessary. The audience somehow senses when you're serious. Like the jock I heard recently who gave the weather "Sunny day with a chance of rain tomorrow"....then he did so-called "neighborhood weather with a touch of 'Black English'...it be wet." "Check out the sky juice ... " The point is that while it might have been offensive to some, it was funny to everybody! Often successful morning shows do occasionally become controversial and great moming talents often have to take some chances. But it's important to get the audience used to getting up and smiling.

If comedy and information rule the morning, what about the music? Music is always important. The difference is that in the morning, music is not the priority it is in other dayparts. Even though people want to hear it, morning listeners wake up with a curious mind. They want to know what's happening. So a great morning show must have an information base. The radio



station that says, "We play the most music in the morning" may not be the one that wins. It's not necessary to play a maximum of music in the morning. If you play two or three songs less in the morning, it doesn't matter. The audience is not geared to tune out the radio station in the same way. They're too busy running around getting ready for the day. Morning listeners are not really conscious to the extent of critique that happens later in the day. About ten o'clock though, all that changes. Middays, I feel, require more of a passive technique. You're trying to maintain quarter hours now. The midday listeners' habit patterns show that they will not only tune out, but tune out for a long time. A more aggressive audience is available to listen in the afternoons and evenings. At this point, the number of commercials, the kind of commercials and their placement in the hour becomes very important. Afternoon and evening shows have to carry an image. With the morning audience. you can apply something that is not hip, just relevant, and it will be acceptable.

What about the music mix in the morning? It should be bright, familiar and with lots of image artists. Oldies and re-currents seem to work well in most markets, and the guy who guides the audience through the early bright should sound like he belongs. If the guy doing the morning show is under the impression that he's a night man while doing the morning show, the audience will soon sense it, even with a "bagful of the best boogie in town".

So if you continue to dance to the music, you will eventually pay the piper - and if the piper has folks filling out diaries and remembering his or her name, the difference can be devastating!

Morning pipers leading sleepy sheep down the freeways can be rewarding. As the amount of meek, timid, defensely submissive people decrease, a good morning team can either change with the times or follow the dwindling, fickle flock to the depths of obscurity. Regardless, when the clock-radio goes off, the best part of the day is over, or it's only just begun.

KASE in Austin, TX just completed one of the biggest promotions in Austin and Central Texas history, according to those Texans. The station offered a \$1001 reward to the Austin gas station owner who would sell unleaded gas at the absolute lowest price for a 12-hour period on Thursday of that week. The competition began and bids on how low they would go started rolling in. Within three hours, the bids went from a high of 80 cents to 34.9 cents and by Wednesday, down to 26.9 cents. The surprise of the whole promotion was that the final two offered to split the reward and give their unleaded gas with the full service treatment away FREE at both stations, thereby winning hands down! When this announcement was made, lines formed during pre-dawn hours at both locations. stretching as far as two miles down the road. KASE 101 crew members handed out coffee, donuts and Pepsi as people waited, adding their contribution to the "fill-her-up" promotion with old-fashioned service. By 4:30, both stations' tanks were pumped dry!

MURDER ON THE TEX MEX EXPRESS

Another first in Corpus Christi, Texas was "KRYS's Murder On The Tex Mex Express", a two-act play produced by a local theater company as the train pulled out of the depot and headed toward Laredo, Texas. Forty detectives, qualified by KRYS AM/FM during the on-air promotion, matched wits with the authors to sniff out who was murdered and which character turned out to be the jewel thief. The detective resourceful enough to uncover the murderer was the proud winner of round trip airfare to either London. Paris or Frankfurt and the successful sleuth to find the jewel thief was awarded a 14-karat gold matrix cameo. In addition, this promotion also created public awareness of the new rail service between Corpus Christi and Laredo.

EASTER EGG HUNT


KIDN in **Pueblo**, **CO** held a major Easter Egg hunt that gave away major money to their listeners. The air talents gave clues on the air and people were traveling all over town looking for these hidden eggs based on the clues given on the air. Four eggs were hidden with a total of \$2,500 in them,and **Randy Hill** reports that response was overwhelming - so much so that people were showing up at the station at midnight trying to get the next day's clues.

THE ROAD TO DALLAS AND BACK \bigtriangledown

The final four of the NCAA Basketball Championship was an exciting event for Louisville, and WHAS-Louisville carried it from Louisville all the way to Dallas. They got the ball of spirit rolling by offering the home fans the opportunity to wish the Louisville Cardinals good luck on a 7-foot Best Wishes Card. The card was taken to Dallas with over 5,000 signatures by the WHAS Caravan, which included 20 cars of fans. 

BOB SEGER & THE SILVER BULLET BAND - Like A Rock (Capitol) Alright...now this is the Seger I've been waiting for!! Easily rates as one of his best since "Against The Wind". In fact, this could be tagged Against The Wind Part II. Shades of classic Seger and what more could anyone ask for?

JOHN EDDIE - Jungle Boy (Columbia) What would summer be without a teen anthem? I've had the 12-inch in personal power rotation for several weeks and it wears well. Youth-oriented lyrical content is highlighted by the line "Turn Up The Radio". Now, when will someone cut a song that says "fill out a diary?"

VAN HALEN - Dreams (Warner Bros.) They've unlocked the key to that magical land of rock 'n' roll with a melody, so why stop now? Once again, very commercial without compromising their image.

STEVIE NICKS - Has Anyone Ever Written Anything For You (Modern/Atco) A beauty and a pleasant departure from recent efforts. Stevie can make most any song seem special and she stretches her writing and vocal talents to new heights.

KIM CARNES - *Divided Hearts (EMI America)* Val Garay is reunited with Kim and the combination always seems to work . This is a spellbinder that cleverly leads into a irresistable chorus. **Billy Ocean** - "Love Zone" (Jive/Arista) Since his signing with Arista,he's been on one of pop music's strongest hot streaks. His ability to get automatic play in three formats has been incredible. Every track then and now lends itself to serious rotation. His songs are neither angry nor silly. Sentimental ity and sincerity are his strong points and he'll surely make points with the ladies. Down the line,I think we can expect tracks like BITTER SWEET and LOVE ZONE to spin gold for Billy at 45 RPM.

GTR - "GTR" (Arista) The long-awaited union of the Steves, Hackett and Howe turns out to be so much more. Lesser known, Max Bacon, takes a strong lead on all vocals,while journeymen H&H play predictably powerful guitars. Album Radio's playing this one as though it were the Last Supper. Top 40 rockers are already gobbling up the first single, WHEN THE HEART RULES THE WORLD (130 add already) and THE HUNTER is sure to follow. Word is that they'll do some large theaters "live" and work up to the eventual arenas of 10,000 plus. I'd catch 'em before their reputation catches up with them. To hear Steve Howe in a 3,500 seater would be special.
