FIRST NASHVILLE, NOW THE WORLD BOWEN GOES UNIVERSAL



Who else but Jimmy Bowen could start up a new label that has already signed Lacy J. Dalton, Larry Gatlin and The Gatlin Brothers, The Nitty Critty Dirt Band, Carl Perkins, Eddy Raven and Eddie Rabbitt? (And that's not all!)

This week in Nashville, Bowen and MCA Entertainment Group President Irving Azoff announced the start-up of Universal Records. The company will be headed by Bowen, marketed by MCA/Nashville and distributed by the MCA Distributing Corp. Universal will maintain its own promotion staff and an A&R Department that will be headed by James Stroud. Stroud is well-known as a musician, engineer, publisher, independent producer

and CMA and Grammy Award winner.

In making the announcement Bowen said, "I wanted to start a label in Nashville, and to do so with Irving Azoff and MCA is the best of all worlds...we will have a major label in a short time."

Azoff is excited about MCA's newest venture. "It's only natural that we commit further to Country music by launching a second Nashville-based company," he said, "and who better to build it than Bowen?"

Bowen is often called a renegade. He is one of the most influential figures in Nashville music and his list of accomplishments would fill an entire Gavin Report issue. In 1987 alone he produced 23 Top 20 singles, including 11 number ones, and six Top 5 albums, 3 of them hitting the top spot. He has been at MCA since 1984 and will now produce exclusively for both Universal and MCA.

How can there possibly be more you ask? Hold on. In addition to signing new acts and establishing a publishing company, Bowen has announced that he'll sign The Judds to Universal as soon as their RCA contract expires.

The first product on the new label will be Lacy J. Dalton's album *Survivor*, due out January 18, 1989

BERGER LEAVES WWPR

After programming WWPR-NY for 14 years, PD Larry Berger has left the station.

Both current GM Dana Horner and Berger cite "different philosophies" as the reason for the change. "Larry's been here a long time," said Horner, "He's done a great job in both the Album and Top 40 formats."

Berger started at what was then Album formatted WPLJ in September of 1974. He took the station to a 4.5 rating, and after a brief decline during the heyday of Disco 102-WKTU, he guided the station back up to respectable threes and fours. In the spring of 1983 he and ABC decided to change the station's call letters to WWPR and to head in a Top 40 direction.

"The new GM wants to put his stamp on WWPR," said Berger, "and I respect that. Our parting was amicable. I feel sad because the people there are tremendous."

Berger will continue his outside consultantcy work, and after a few weeks of down time he'll decide whether or not to go back to a station. He can be reached at 212-838-8750.

As of this moment, the Program Director position at WWPR is open. GM Horner is accepting applications.

SCONNIX WILL KEEP WHDH

The rumors about Sconnix selling WHDH/Boston are flying a supersonic speed, but Sconnix principal Randy Odeneal says his company is not going to let go of the station. "There were no discussions about selling it to anybody under any circumstances," said Odeneal. "Since the story started circulating I've gotten three or four phone inquiries...at this point in time there's no discussion."

Sconnix bought WHDH and WBOS a little over a year ago. They recently unloaded WBOS, and despite sagging ratings seem to be holding on to WHDH.

SHEPPARD GOES LEGIT

Alternative CFNY-Toronto PD Don Berns has thrown caution to the wind and named "Cool, Kooky and Connected" Chris Sheppard to replace Ivar Hamilton as Music Director.

For the past two years Sheppard has hosted CFNY's Saturday Night feature "Club 102" and because of its huge success he just launched "Chris Sheppards's Friday Night Dance Party."

A Toronto native, Sheppard has been making his presence known in city clubs since the early 80's. He claims that he's shed his punk-style makeup and multi-colored hair since he's been at CFNY. "This is quite exciting for me," he said, "I mean, I even got what some people might call an office!"

PD Berns took a more business-like stance in making the announcement. "His (Sheppard's) insight and enthusiasm make him a natural for the position. We're excited to promote him to Music Director and besides, now we've got him full time!"
What next Chris? Thirtysomething reruns?

KDOG HAS "ALMOST GROWN"

Anyone who has seen the new CBS series "Almost Grown" knows that there's a radio station featured that sports the call letters KDOG.

During the formation of the program, the Universal Studios/ CBS Research Department felt that the call letters were so out there that there couldn't possibly be a station that used them. So without investigating, the show went into production, and one pilot and five episodes later enter lawyers who wisely convinced the researchers to contact the FCC--just in case.

"They just thought it was so far fetched that the letters couldn't possibly be in use," says Brian

Garvin, PD of the original KDOG which is located in Mankato, MN.

Lawyers being lawyers, they expected trouble from KDOG, but Garvin was happy with the exposure. "I just wanted to make sure they showed the station in a good light." Garvin is trying to work it out with Universal/CBS to have some of his air personalities appear on the series as themselves--and KDOG has been promoting "Almost Grown" on the air.

As we prepare to close the books on 1988, it's time for that annual ritual--listing the most popular songs of the year. Reviewing any Top 100 always brings home the glaring reality of the competition facing those who create the music we enjoy. Arguably, like fine wine, some years are better than others, but considering the number of releases, those that make the cut deserve a standing ovation! If you ask the active audience to rate the year musically, you'll undoubtedly get varying opinions. However, I'd have to give the songs of 1988 high marks overall. Even though we had an overabundance of remakes, there was a tremendous amount of diversity, originality and balance on the list. While new names like Rick Astley, Terence Trent D'Arby, Guns N' Roses and Pebbles gain entry, the established artists own the lion's share of the year end chart, and there are some famous returnees including the Beach Boys, Cheap Trick and Def Leppard.

Ît's refreshing to hear young supertalents like George Michael and Debbie Gibson acknowledge that the pop hits they grew up listening to influenced them. Hats off to those special few who skillfully reshape the chords and construct the lyrics that make a significant contribution to our

culture.

Since they've reignited that flame, CHEAP TRICK has stayed on fire. HIT FACTOR increases 27% to 40% moving into top twenty territory at FM104 Modesto/Stockton, KPLZ Seattle, KZZU Spokane, KXXR Kansas City, WBNQ Bloomington, KGLI Sioux City, KKXL Grand Forks and Y94 Fargo.

BON JOVI barrels ahead for what looks like one of the first big hit records of 1989. Debuts #22 at KEGL Dallas while it gains 28-20 crosstown at Y95. Pat Ryan confirms stores are sold out and places it top three in requests. Pat describes it as "I Want Your Sex' multiplied by 20." The story is the same at KBIU Lake Charles, LA where it's the number one phone item "and nothing else is even close." Michael Shishido at KXPW Honolulu says that requests started immediately and after one week it's already top five. MY 1988 LETTER TO SANTA

Dear Santa.

It's hard to believe that another year has passed. It seems like only yesterday I was sitting at the word processor writing to you on behalf of promotion directors at radio stations all around the country.

It's been an interesting year for us, Santa. A lot of stations have been sold and this has put a lot of pressure on our jobs. You see, when someone new buys a station they don't always look at the benefits of marketingwhat they focus on is what contribution the promotion/marketing/merchandising department makes to the bottom line. As one of your gifts, I wish you'd give a crystal ball to these new owners—one that reveals the destructive effects of not marketing their station, or releasing good promotion directors. On the other hand big fella, I'd like you to give one of these seer-spheres to the promotion directors to show them what happens when they fail to recognize their responsibilities to the bottom line.

Road maps might be a nice gift for those of us who labor in the marketing area—particularly one that points the way to general management. The current road is shrouded in a fog bank put up by present management techniques. It might also be an interesting experiment for an adventuresome broadcast company to put one of us in the "big chair," to see what happens when you focus on the station through its marketing effort.

I'd also like one of those palm buzzers to be given to every salesperson. That way the audible sound and accompanying discomfort will be experienced every time they shake hands with a client on a sales promotion that not only clutters up, but also interferes with the station's marketing objectives.

Speaking of salespersons, Santa, they need the Q-Tip treatment. How about a superswabbing of their auditory canals so they can hear what we're saying when we tell them we can't accommodate another remote or promotion on our already full calendar. A mine field to the GM's office might prevent them from going there and whining their way into getting more confusion crammed onto our calendar.

Can you get the PD to admit that we really know what we're doing? Can you convince them that we really are able to read a ratings book, explain what the goals of our station are, and that we are, in fact, on the same team committed to the same level of success?

While you're doing the truth schtick, Santa, let's get all of those outside suppliers to stop

with the snow jobs—psyche-shovels and snow blowers are in order to clear their mental driveways and get them to start out with their best locations and prices. There really is a difference between a Pakistani weave and a Hanes Hefty T-shirt—just ask Willie Shoemaker. He's wearing one of those Pakistani extra larges that's been washed only once!

Santa, can you also make sure that when we deal with a concert promoter or a record label they give us the seats we're promised? We can't tell you how many times we've been assured of fifth row seats and have ended up (this is a real case) BEHIND THE ARTIST.

Make sure, big guy, that all of our remotes go off without a hitch, the satellites work perfectly, and there's a crowd that's eager, participatory and excited by the effort the station is putting out. Also, your supreme rotundness, will you please make program directors aware of the fact that well-produced remotes from important locations are a real benefit to the station's image? On the other hand, Santa Baby, refrain from encouraging the sales staff to suggest broadcasting from a store opening. Unless it's a major event it's not really going to attract a great number of listeners, and the retailer will confuse his small audience turnout with listeners to his commercials. Make sure that that promotion/merchandising/marketing is never misinterpreted as a test. Let it dawn on everybody involved that the primary reason radio is bought is for its media valueeverything else follows.

Also, Santa, while you're giving knowledge, please explain how radio works to agencies who want us as clients. They sure are good at selling cars and coffee and calculators, but they don't always do a good job for us

There must be a special ingredient when you're marketing something that's free—I guess that when the primary decision-making tool is the index finger of the consumer, different standards apply. Show agencies the light so they can be of help to us—we can sure use them. Or—maybe you'd lend us an elf or two to pick up the slack at the average station.

Finally, let's get the recognition level for the promotion director up to snuff. We can't have management ambitions without the recognition we deserve. Santa, get some enlightened GM's to embrace a promotion director instead of a sales person. The word protege doesn't have to mean sales.

Thanks again, Santa, for reading this letter from your bearded buddy Harv. I hope you find a bit of what I asked for in your sleigh—and to all of you in radio a very Merry Christmas, have a great holiday season, and I'll be talking with you next year.



THAT SONG

BEFORE SONG?

Bob Young, Program Director of WXTU, Philadelphia is one of America's most successful PDs. He utilizes a sound code in his music selection system that's worthy of consideration by all formats that face this problem: remakes.

For many years I had a policy against playing remakes if they were of a Top 40 song that still had shelf life (why not play the hit?) or if, in my opinion, the remake was of leaser quality.

I recall espousing this theory in Nashville a couple of years ago. I had been invited to participate on a panel addressing the Nashville Songwriter's Association. I remarked that I felt The Judds' version of "Don't Be Cruel" was inferior compared to the original. I further stated that I didn't see why Nashville record producers have to resort to rerecording old hits when songwriters can produce quality material at a moment's notice. This comment received a round of applause from the audience—95% of whom were songwriters.

Within a few minutes Bob Oerrmann, noted Country music critic and moderator of the panel, had introduced Otis Blackwell to the crowd. Remember, this was a room full of songwriters and Blackwell, who wrote "Don't Be Cruel," happened to be in attendance that day partly because he was consid-

ering a move to Nashville. To the group, having Otis Blackwell in their midst was comparable to Todd Storz or Gordon McLendon attending a Top Forty Seminar!

Being a smart (and political) fellow, I immediately rescinded what I had just said about "Don't Be Cruel" and begged Black-

well's forgiveness.

Now, even though I may have had foot-inmouth disease that one time, it doesn't change the principle that remakes had better be damned good. Country music is a format ripe with remakes. Perhaps it's because of our continuing obsession for music to be familiar, or the artists' affinity for the tune being covered, but it seems Country has more than its fair share.

With that in mind, it seems ironic to me that most of the really well-testing oldieslet's say the best 100—have had very few

I examined the best testing Country songs

this year (auditorium tests and call-outs) and found the following to be covers of old Country or Top 40 hits that made the list. Keep in mind that there were some songs that had been recorded before, but as far as the tunes being essentially a cover, only 5 madeit: STANDBYME-Mickey Gilley (King of the remakes); WHEN WILL I BE LOVED-Linda Ronstadt (Queen of the remakes); LOST IN THE FIFTIES- Ronnie Milsap (sort of a remake): ANGEL OF THE MORNING-Juice Newton; ANY DAY NOW-Ronnie

There are many sub-power oldies in Country radio station libraries that are covers, either of previous Country hits ("Crazy" by Linda Ronstadt) or Top Forty hits ("The Rose" by Conway Twitty). If a Country PD/ MD isn't careful, it would be very easy to schedule three or four of these remakes in a row, effectively and subliminally calling attention to Country's lack of originality.

from her successful 1988 tour before entering the studio in January for her 1989 album...New wave rockers-including Michelle Shocked, Cabaret Voltaire, The Mekons, Pete Shelley, Marc Almond and Gave Bikers on Acid are hitting the European scene in a big way with an LP called Things Are Brighter. It's a collection of songs made famous by Johnny Cash. The initial release is on Red Rhino Records and it's being distributed through England's hip "New Musical Express" magazine. U.S. release is forthcoming...

All I want for Christmas is my new CD (sing to the tune of "All I Want for Christmas Is My Two Front Teeth")...Well, it is CD heaven out there for stocking stuffers, and PolyGram has brought back some oldies but goodies. There's Ginger Baker's Airforce recorded at The Royal Albert Hall in London, two classics from The Bee Gees including 1st and Horizontal, two Uriah Heaps: Demons and Wizards and The Magician's Birthday and two more, The Blues Project's Live At Cafe Au Go Go and Projec-

tions. Make someone's day! Bits and Pieces: Sam Kinison is attracting a crowd of rockers everywhere he goes. During a recent benefit at the Palace in Los Angeles surprise guests included Billy Idol and his band, Charlie Sexton (wait until you hear his new one) and Billy Duffy of The Cult. In Anaheim the next night Sylvester Stallone appeared and Slash of Guns N' Roses put on a guitar bashing performance. What does Kinison think about his new rocker profile? P.D. NOTEBOOK

WHAT SHALL WE DO ON THE WEEKEND?

Last week, we tipped our hat to Top 40 radio and the pioneers who developed the techniques that most stations of all formats

Those pioneers frequently turned to oldies for programming on the weekends (remember the "Million Dollar Weekend?). Current music was usually included, but oldies composed at least 50% on the weekends.. During the week only one or two oldies an hour might be played. The "Million Dollar Weekend" provided a means of circulating weekday listeners back into the weekends, when listening spans were different—and invited longer listening time, though less repetition, when people were free to listen longer.

Since today's conventional music research relies on familiarity (hardly a requirement for good research, and in fact in most industries the testing is done before product introduction—but so far not in radio music testing), radio has gotten so heavily into oldies that there is nothing particularly special about them anymore, unless it's a matter of building a theme weekend around an artist or an era.

However, countdown shows provide a means of accomplishing the same thing, and that's one reason why there are so many of them. Countdowns represent some shift from normal programming, of course, as do all special programming (or it wouldn't be special), inevitably raising the question of how far from normal programming is it a

good idea to go?

I have endorsed using Top 40 countdown shows on A/C (particularly the ones that use an adult approach, such as Dave Sholin's "Countdown USA," "American Top 40," etc.), feeling that although the music is from a different format, it's compatible with the lifestyle of the A/C adult, who generally grew up with Top 40, relates to countdowns and likes to keep up with modern directions of popular music. On the other hand, I would have a hard time considering a Country countdown on an A/C or Top 40 station! That is not to say it cannot be done, but it would have to be presented in a way that related to the station's regular listeners. I think that's the key. Any special programming can work, no matter how divergent it is from the station's normal format, if there's a logical lifestyle link that leads to it. Can you imagine a successful Album station doing a "New Age-oriented" late night program, and a classical music program each Sunday

morning? No? Well, KINK in Portland, Oregon has been doing both for a couple of decades now. I have heard other stations in the region copy these ideas and self-destruct. The "Lights Out" hour and the Sunday classical show evolved from a unique "point of view" which pervaded the Album approach of the station from its beginning, and they made and still make sense within the context of KINK. Of course, KINK is also unusual in that the ratings often show that over 90% of the its audience to be 25-49. Few Album stations could even dream of achieving that.

There are many ways of relating an offbeat feature to a station's audience—topicality, common experience, and so forth. I remem-

ber being impressed 25 years ago not only that KRLA, L.A.'s top rocker at the time, would present Handel's "Messiah" in its entirety at Easter, but also that they didn't just rely on the topicality of the piece at Easter, but documented it with the circumstances under which Handel wrote it, and made it a real event—a programming plus, rather than (excuse me for this) a cross to bear.

I'd be interested in hearing about interesting ways of programming weekends, and success stories, for use here in the column. Also, obviously, ideas that didn't work—and why. (I'll withhold names if asked to.) Drop me a line c/o The Gavin Report.

"It 's Another Joyful Elvis Presley Christmas" is a clever record about the overzealous devotion of some Elvis fans that's sure to light up your holiday phones.



RONNIE McDOWELL with JERRY LEE LEWIS - Never Too Old To Rock And Roll (Curb)

Instead of just singing about how his rock n'roll idols influenced him, McDowell got one of them to help out. It's great to hear "the killer" (who is about to have his life story played out on the big screen) belt 'em out. As the song says, "there ain't no stopping ol'Jerry Lee."

DON SCHLITZ - Letter In The Fire (RCA) Taken from the Signatures collection of songwriters doing their own songs, this single is a story of overcoming heartbreak by destroying the evidence and Don sings it beautifully.



REBA McENTIRE - New Fool At An Old Game (MCA)

We're always partial to those singles where Reba's exceptional voice shines through. This is one of those records, a pretty ballad that should move quickly along Reba's normal hit-making track.

JAZZ NEW RELEASES

ELIS - SADAO WATANABE (ELEKTRA) Watanabe journeys to Brazil to record a powerful record and what makes Elis so indispensible on Jazz/AA playlists is the strength of the first three tracks, "Quilombo," "Passo De Doria" and the title track. Sadao had to wait until December to give us this impressive one-two-three punch but as they say, better late than never! The soloing is astounding, steeped in heritage and modern consciousness. The Brazilian team kicks butt here and the analog warmth and push of the production is a nice change from the recent parade of digital productions we've heard. Make no mistake we love DDD, but it's nice to get a break every once in a while. Watanabe's title ode is surely one of the most beautiful melodies of the year. By the way, the final track "Paciencia" has some programmers

ORINOCO FLOW - ENYA (GEFFEN) This three song EP/CD is drawing giant raves from Adult Alternative programmers like Mike Fischer of WNUA-Chicago. Whether or not Enva did play with Clannad in the earlier days, we do remember Sinead O'Connor paying homage to Enya on her debut album on Chrysalis. Whatever the situation, the fact is that Enya's upcoming album promises to rival Clannad's Magical Ring in impact--and that's saying a lot! For an EP pre-release, there's no garbage here folks. The mood of 'Smaoitim..." is a bit more mystical than the single and the final track is a quaint usable piano piece called "Out Of The Blue." Listening to the the EP will definitely make you anxious for the full album release. If you're AA and you don't

<u>FOREIGN AFFAIRS - BIRELI LAGRENE</u> (BLUE NOTE)

Back in his child prodigy days Lagrene could quite literally hide behind his axe and when he played his delightfully wicked version of Django Reinhardt sounds. But that was then and Foreign Affairs is now. Besides, Jazz/AA has already responded loudly by making FA a airplay giant in its first three weeks of release. For his early fans, Lagrene peppers the record with an improvisational accoustic triad entitled "Rue De Pierre, Parts III, IV and V." The rest is serious fusion and tracks like "St. Jean," "Josef" and the title tune lock horns with an almost sinister tonality. "Timothee" and Herbie Hancock's "Jack Rabbit" rouse things up a bit more. Look for December's Most Added to become January's chart monster.

THE GIPSY KINGS (MUSICIAN/ELEKTRA)

While on the subject of Django
Reinhardt, consider the Gipsy Kings.
Regardless of whether you intend to play
this record or not, it's imperative that you
give the Kings your valuable audition
time. Frankly, the more we listen to it, the
more we are moved by it. The vocals are a
bit raucous, but tracks like "Moorea,"
"Inspiration" and "Faena" could fit the
format. But be forewarned: This music is
hot-blooded and hardhitting. If you let
this music really sink in, it could draw out
emotional highs and lows of memories
past. I know that sounds corny, but check
out "A Mi Manera (My Way)" and you'll
see.

WORLD DANCE - DO'AH
(GLOBAL PACIFIC/CBS)
After four records on Rounder, World
Dance is Do'ah's first for Global Pacific.

The core of the band is Randy Armstrong who plays guitars, percussion and assorted strange instruments, and Ken LaRoche on woodwinds and keyboards. They are masters at applying the intricacies of modern 'Age music based on their past training in Jazz and classical. The credo behind Do'ah's music is world peace and the CD's best track, "The Awakening" is dedicated to that concept. The song travels globally with tablas, kalimbas, Chinese instruments and your standard Western ware of flutes, saxophones and synthesizers. "Wayo" is pure AA and "World Dance" features some exotic West African moods.

FRONT BURNER - CHARLES EARLAND (MILESTONE)

As kids growing up in the fifties, probably the first subliminal exposure to Jazz was those organ albums. Father used to play them on his homemade, souped-up stereo console that always used to raise the ire of all the neighbors. True, Ken Griffin's skating rink albums and "So and So Plays The Swinging Lowrey Organ" were the farthest things from Jazz, but every so often my dad would stumble onto something really funky like Jimmy Smith. I remember one was called Big Beat Hammond Organ. The cover had a couple of raw beets stewn across the keyboards. For me, Front Burner is a throwback to those days. Recorded by the great Rudy Van Gelder, the album opens with "Moonlighting (Theme)" and things get going quick. By track two, "My Two Sons," Earland's quintet breaks through. Bobby Broom's guitar work along with Earland's screaming, electrifying Hammond draws us back to the wild collaborations of Smith and Kenny Burrell.



AN EXTREMIST'S GUIDE TO CHRISTMAS CLASSICS AND DIVERSIONS

Around many households, as the Thanksgiving dishes are being scrubbed, Christmas music becomes the inevitable soundtrack for the retail spiritual blitz. As the spirit begins to gel, as heated workoholic tempers give way to Christmas cheer, a wide variety of Christmas music hits our stereos and the airwaves. Packratting Christmas records isn't unusual. Many reknown collections and lists exist. What's particularly pleasant is the diversity that has sprouted, expanding the artform beyond the usual carols, beyond Bing Crosby, Nat Cole and RCA's platinum Singing Dog. Here are a few of my faves, starting with some of the classics and ending with a laundry list of acoustic and synthesized sleigh bells.



A CHRISTMAS GIFT FROM PHIL SPECTOR (Phil Spector International/Rhino)

To many, including me, this is the first and final word in Christmas music. Painstakingly recorded and assembled through the better part of 1963, Phil Spector's masterpiece was blunted by the assassination of John F. Kennedy. Still, this fine mono recording has been re-released on various labels including the Beatles' own Apple Records. Lately technology has taken hold and the folks at Rhino have masterly mastered the tapes onto the CD format. Hearing the Ronettes, the Crystals, Darlene Love and Bob B. Soxx in digital splendor is right up there with watching Jimmy Stewart and Donna Reed in "It's A Wonderful Life." WINTER WARNERLAND (Warner Bros.)

YULESVILLE (Warner Bros.)

Christmas in beautiful Burbank? Greg Lee at Warners is quickly forging a new Christmas tradition (no small feat) with his anticipated yearly collection of Christmas songs, artist IDs and PSAs. Last year's Yulesville was splendid, ranging from Edd "Kookie" Byrnes to the Ramones to Ice-T to Los Lobos. This year's Warner wonderland opens with a vicious version of 'God Rest The House' by Jeff Lorber. Also present this year are Jazzers Jim Horn and Mark O'Connor, REM, Cold Chillin Juice and Randy Travis. There are IDs by ZZ Top, Pee Wee Herman, Nelson Wilbury, Lou Reed and many more. Yo ho ho, just say no. A GRP CHRISTMAS (GRP)

Another recent goodie package is GRP's fifteen track collection featuring Tom Scott, Lee Ritenour, Gary Burton, Chick Corea, Kevin Eubanks--almost the entire GRP stable, GRP

Christmas rates highly because the contemporary renditions stick closely to the famous melody lines--at least during the heads and choruses. In other words, no matter how soaring the soloing gets, it's always back to earth with a familiar frame of holiday reference. An added bonus is that GRP is willing to supply generic taped IDs by the artists themselves on a separate tape.

A FRESH AIRE CHRISTMAS - MANNHEIM STEAMROLLER (American Gramaphone)
Chip Davis' Mannheim Steamroller empire is legendary with its rabid following. In fact, the Steamroller was "new age" before that vicious term was invented. Modern synthesized music has always had an affinity for the holiday season. Mannheim Steamroller were among the first to connect synths with the season. A Fresh Aire Christmas is an ambitious project using a wide range of instrumentation and voice. And while you can classify the approach as modern, there is a gothic, classical shine to Mannheim's elaborate audio staging.

A VERY SPECIAL CHRISTMAS (A&M)
Back this year and, hopefully, many more to come is Jimmy and Vicki lovine's loving project bringing stars like Bon Jovi, Bob Seger, Sting and Bruce Springsteen together for a well-produced Christmas blast. Profits benefit Special Olympics International.



SOUNDS OF THE SEASON (MCA Master Series)
Nashville's Tony Brown assembles one of the fondest instrumental releases of the season.
Enlisting artists off his prestigious MCA Master Series roster, highlights include Caldwell Plus' "Joy To The World," John Jarvis' self-penned "One Bright Star," a beautiful dobro solo of "Away In A Manger" by Jerry Douglas and a Billy Joe Walker, Jr. rendition of "Little Drummer Boy." All have digital clarity and are applicable to a few radio, especially Adult Alternative, Jazz, A/C and Country.

TWISTED CHRISTMAS - BOB RIVERS
COMEDY CORP. (Critique/Atlantic)
Deck the halls with comedy. Radio crazy Bob
Rivers' Twisted Christmas is well-produced and
frequently hilarious. His "A Message From The
King" is a clever post-mortem message from
Elvis. "A Visit From St. Nicholson" is a cuckoo's
nest of jokes from a Jack sound-alike.
SANTA'S GOT A BRAND NEW BAG -

JAMES BROWN (Rhino)

Standing toe-to-toe with Phil Spector's offering is this James Brown compilation culled from three albums and a few stray holiday singles. This is Mr. Brown during his super bad King days. Included is "Santa Claus Go Straight To The Ghetto" and Mel Torme's "The Christmas Song." With impassioned urgency, JB sings and raps at ya.

Whether it's soulful or bluesy (after all, Christmas can get pretty blue), this album hits you deep.

"DO THEY KNOW IT'S CHRISTMAS (FEED THE WORLD)" - BAND AID (Columbia)

I still find **Bob Geldot**'s humanitarian brainstorm to be fresh-sounding and inspirational. The message is far from obsolete. Whether you're in the inner city or outside the urban limits, Band Aid is still a worldwide reminder that hunger is still much worse than getting a lump of coal in your stocking. ROCKIN' STOCKING STUFFERS (Rhino)

YULE FUEL (Rhino)

Last year, Yule Fuel not only featured a healthy dose of Phil Spector's work, but there were trax by the **Drifters, Clarence Carter, Chuck Berry, Frankie Valli** and more. Prime faves include the perennial "Jingle Bell Rock" by **Bobby Helms** and "Grandma Got Run Over By A Reindeer" by **Elmo** and **Patsy**. This year's equivalent to Yule Fuel, RSS incorporates more music by **Solomon Burke, Buck Owens, Marty Robbins** and **Brenda Lee**'s classic "Rockin' Around The Christmas Tree." This is a solid stuffer.

MY GIFT TO YOU - ALEXANDER O'NEAL (Tabu/CBS)

This year we all ended up on **Alexander O'Neal**'s Christmas list. Teaming up with super producers **Jimmy Jam** and **Terry Lewis**, the yule sparks fly. O'Neal's hot entry features gift-wrapped versions of "Sleigh Ride" and "The Little Drummer Boy" with a wild instrumental track. Needless to say, O'Neal gives a whole new funky meaning to "pa-rump-a-pum-pump."

AN AUSTIN RHYTHM AND BLUES CHRISTMAS (Columbia)


Here's a Gavin favorite. We originally received our copy of Austin Rhythm And Blues Christmas in 1983 on the Austin Records label. Along with Omar & The Howlers this collection is now on Columbia, remaining vitally in print. Prime performances include songs by Lou Ann Barton, the Fabulous Thunderbirds and a pre-teen Charlie Sexton.



GHOSTS OF CHRISTMAS PAST (REMAKE) (Rough Trade)

An oldie but a goodie. This is an avant-garde Yuletime package featuring the work of Cabaret Voltaire, Durutti Column, Pale Fountains, Aztec Camera and the best version of "The Twelve Days Of Christmas" by Winston Tong that ends with a drug-induced jail stretch. The ultimate Yuletime alternative.

MISTLETOE AND MEMORIES (RCA) This year we get a fantastic RCA Country anthology featuring one of my favorite Country ladies, Miss K.T. Oslin. Also along for the ride are new artists like Baillie & The Boys alongside the superstars like Elvis, Milsap, the Judds, Dolly,

Alabama and more. **BOBBY VINTON SINGS SANTA MUST BE** POLISH (Tapestry)

CHRISTMAS MEMORIES -FRANK YANOVIC (Smash/Mercury)

Deck the halls with beer and polka, Christmas is also a Polish experience. Bobby Vinton is all over the road with his brand of Country, Big Band and Pop. Before Weird Al stole his name, Frank Yankovic was the pride of blue collar Cleveland polka. Now he's the Polka Christmas King. THE NARADA CHRISTMAS COLLECTION (NARADA)

Atmospherics aren't safe from the Christmas spirit. Here's an anthology that includes a wide and soothing group of instrumentalists including Lanz & Speer, Tingstad & Rumbel and more. NEW ENGLAND CHRISTMASTIDE VOLUME 1 & 2 (North Star/Mobile Fidelity)

North Star brings us the music via vinyl and cassette while Mobile Fidelity presents the CD version. You'll swear you're in Vermont enjoying maple syrup and beautiful early American acoustic MUSIC FOR CHRISTMAS - KEITH FOLEY (DMP) Sixty minutes of electronic digital Christmas carols. This is one of the most popular synthesized Christmas packages and is now in its fourth year of making the rounds via re-release.

FOR CHRISTMAS - PETER KATER (Silver Wave)

Guitar pleasantries from Boulder, Colorado. Peter Kater uses his instantly likeable electric style, tackling thirteen lucky carols with vigor. KZ

IDE ALTERNATIVE RADIO

NEW RELEASES

Compilation - YOUNG BLOOD (rooArt)

If you read the article about my trip to Australia and New Zealand ("On The Road Down Under" July 15, 1988) you'll recall I mentioned this compilation from a new record label, rooArt, which is an outgrowth of INXS' management, MMA. Young Blood is a collection of some of Australia's brightest new talent that has yet to be signed to any major label. There's plenty to choose from, with my favorite cuts including: the

Hipslingers, who apply lots of brass and a sharp rhythm section to high energy pop music; Crash Politics, who build a layer of piano over an atmospheric guitar backdrop for a full two minutes before climaxing with their potent vocals; The Trilobites, with their eerie vocal chorus carrying gothic overtures onto a solid rock premise; Martha's Vineyard and their gentle, yet stern approach to acoustic rock; the Sundogs, who sound the most "American" of the lot with their relatively orthodox approach to rock and the Hummingbirds who mold a melodic brand of almost angry power pop. Flour - FLOUR (Touch and Go) There's no shortage of raw and highspeed Alternative garage music these days. However, bands like Breaking Circus and Flour offer us the rawness and brashness without the often uncomprehendable velocity of others. Flour is a bit gloomy at times but it's pushing the perimeter of our format, which is vital to its future. As they state on the cover, "Recorded solely for fun. If you want perfect pitch and slick production, please buy by Peter Standish something else."



Their restructuring and new musical direction paid big dividends judging from the success of "I Don't Want Your Love", and this follow-up sounds like it'll do the same. NEIL DIAMOND-The Best Years Of Our Lives (Columbia)

For you youngsters out there, Neil Diamond once took himself and his lyric as seriously as does Bono of U2 today. In recent years Neil's music has become more sentimental and less imposing. Along the way Neil lost the edge (no pun

intended) and unfortunately some of his pop accessibility. Distracted by his dabbling in film and fighting the ever-widening chasm between himself and the young, active record buyer, Neil may have stumbled recently, but The Best Years Of Our Lives is a return to form. Producer David Foster has focused Neil's energy and considerable talent by bringing the best studio musicians to the party. The result is Neil at his aerobic and at times elegant best. His live shows have always been an emotional pendulum and this studio set captures that magic. It may be one of his most overwhelmingly emotive sets and you can bet your last bottle of red, red wine that this is the beginning of a third volume of Greatest Hits. 
