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



Surprises Speculators

BONE SHOCKS WAGS, LANDS AT ISLAND

Former Chrysalis President Mike Bone finally officially acknowledged that he planned to join Disney-owned Hollywood Records—after he did an aboutface and joined Island Records as President, replacing Lou Maglia who left the label last month

Bone told the Gavin Report that just before he signed with Hollywood, Island Chairman Chris Blackwell gave him a call, and within a day and a half they had pretty much worked out a deal. His reasons? "It's an existing, up and coming record company and very successful," he said frankly. "While I think Hollywood is going to be wildly successful, it'll probably take two to three years—it takes a long time to build a record company and it's a pretty thankless task. I'd much rather run a successful record company than build one from scratch.

When Bone left his post at Chrysalis in December, it was widely assumed the Hollywood deal was done. Before working at Chrysalis, he held positions in the promotion departments at Elektra, Arista, Mercury and GRC.

"This is a class situation here," Bone said in closing. "It has everything from African to Heavy Metal—and everything in between. When I heard about a six person Samoan Rap band I said, 'Hey! This is the place for me'"

Emmis Unloads X-100

Emmis Broadcasting has soldKXXX (X-100)-San Francisco to anewly-formed local company. Alliance Broadcasting, Inc., formed recently by former Fairmont Communications President John Hayes, picked up the outlet late last week.

X-100 has been on the block since Emmis purchased the **Seattle Mariners** late last year. Hayes declined to disclose the price tag until the ink on the contract dries, but it is known that Emmis was asking \$30 million for the station. "I can't divulge the figure until the contract is signed," he said. "That's not one of the points. We've agreed on all of the major points—we're talking about language now."

His purchase of X-100 is a homecoming of sorts for Hayes, who was Vice President/General

"I am delighted to be part of this new global music structure that Chrysalis is in the process of creating," said Sykes in taking the position. "Chrysalis offers the ideal situation for both new and established artists in today's marketplace."

BARBER CUTS IN AT KBEQ

Karen Barber has been named Program Director at The Noble Broadcast Group's highly rated KBEQ/FM-Kansas City. The company's VP/National Programming, Bob Laurence, who has been interim General Manager, will remain at the station in that post.

In late November, the company let go David Small and Kevin Kenney, GM and PD respectively, after major mishaps occurred during station promotions.

Barber has been Music Director

at crosstown A/C outlet KLSI, and before that spent six years as MD and Morning Zoo co-host at KBEQ.

"How can I say anything other than I'm ecstatic," said Barber. "It's been a dream to program for quite awhile, and the chance to doit at KBEQ is more than I could hope for."

Barberindicated that she plans no major formatic or personnel changes. Assistant Program Director John Anthony will remain in that position. "He's my main man," she said. "I wouldn't let him go anywhere else." Barber's appointment was announced officially Monday, January 8.

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


I.R.S-Nettwerk Link



INSIDE TOP 40 by Dave Sholin

Depending on which argument you believe, we're either in the first year of a new decade or the last year of the eighties. But just ask yourself-how many people do you know who will be celebrating the turn of the century in 2001? So, it's hello nineties, where an abundance of technological marvels await consumers already on the brink of product and information overload. Of course from time to time we all need reminders about the limits of modern technology. Over the holidays a friend of mine mysteriously lost all the appointments, birthdays and other data stored in his pocket daytimer. Without a back-up he had no way of retrieving the information. Several days later, the manufacturer informed him that he wasn't the only one with that problem. Turns out that somehow a bug that caused the memory to get totally wiped out at the end of a decade was built into the system. So at 11:59 on December 31 everything was there and at the stroke of Midnight it simply disappeared! He's now ready to go back to his trusty handwritten datebook/directory.

Top 40 radio will mark its 40th anniversary in this decade and while programming has certainly made some tremendous strides in that time, it's important that we hold onto the basics that have made the format work yearin and year-out. Simplicity and familiarity supported by sparkling production elements and bright, warm entertaining personalities are part of all winning stations regardless of format. Top 40's big advantage has always been, to steal a phrase, "Variety in the mix."

Audiences just can't get enough of PAULA ABDUL, as her latest takes the now accustomed fast track up the chart. Number one phones at WCIL Carbondale, IL where it zooms 21-9. HIT FACTOR is already 49% with top twenty numbers at B94 #15, WKNE #12, 102QQ#15, WJET#18, Y100#19, POWER 99 #17, WIFC #15, KROC #18, KDWB #16, KZOU #17, Y95 #12, KRQ #14, KBQ #14, WPXR #14, KS104 #14, Y97 #13, KUBE #17, KYNO #17, KROY #14, FM104 #11, etc.



WDFX Detroit adds **BAD ENGLISH** at #11, plus more new airplay at WTIC/FM Hartford, POWER 98 Myrtle Beach, WGGZ Baton

Rouge, Q105 Tampa, WKTI Milwaukee, WPXR Rock Island and KWSS San Jose. Randy West, MD at KJLS Hays/Great Bend, KS, reports top five sales and top three requests, "mostly 18 plus," and shows a 36-24 jump.



Early believers on JANET JACKSON's "Escapade" are moving it up fast. KKFR Phoenix is first to take it to the top 6-1, with other gains at KMEL 29-10 and X100 18-14. John Ford at KWYR Winner, SD says, "It's taken off big time 27-19 and is without a doubt the strongest single on the album." Adds include 93Q and POWER 104 Houston, KBEQ Kansas City, Z100 Portland, POWER 106 Los Angeles, KISN Salt Lake City, WPLJ and Z100 New York, G105 Durham/Raleigh, WPST Trenton, etc.

1989's final TOP TIP from MICHAEL PENN continues to rack up impressive airplay stats and a slot on the first chart for 1990. Climbs 24-20 at WMGV Oshkosh, WI where MD Bill Lindy predicts a top ten listing in a week or two and says it's very strong with adults. Jay McCall at KOZE Lewiston, ID debuts it at #35 and reports it selling well and appealing mostly to upper demos. Joe Crain, PD at WTBX Duluth, MN, charts it 30-25 and says he's getting curiosity calls. Same pattern reflected at WILI Willimantic, CT where it debuts at #33. PD/MD Jeff Spencer mentions that it generated requests the first week it went on. At KBAU Golden Meadow, LA it debuts at #34 with "good upper demo response (25 plus) and callers asking about it," according to PD Dave Martin.

Z95 Chicago was the first to play the new SARAYA and it's now top fifteen, getting very strong 18-24 request action. Number one on the phones at KZZT Moberly, MO where it charts 22-16. Top thirty at WMJQ Buffalo, WIIS Key West, KBQSt. Louis, WBIZ Eau Claire, Q95FM Detroit, KZZU Spokane, etc. New on KATM, WKOR, WLXR, KQCL, KAGO, KAFX, WZLS and KFMW.

Top ten requests at WHDQ Claremont, NH for ALANNAH MYLES where it debuts at #28 after



three weeks of play. Also top thirty after three weeks at WQID Biloxi, MS. Plus, it's gaining quickly at KDWZ Des Moines, IA 30-18. Good adult response in many areas. Added at PIRATE RADIO, WBBQ, PRO/FM, 95XXX, WLLI, WZWZ, KZ103, KHTT, KGOT, KIXR, WSPT, etc.

Young newcomer MICHEL'LE scores a 37% HIT FACTOR including a #1 ranking at Y108 Denver. Other top five activity at Q106 San Diego, KMEL San Francisco, KYNO Fresno, WIOQ Philadelphia, KKSS Albuquerque and KITY San Antonio. New on KISN, WMMY, WBPM, X102, WNVZ, WKMZ and YES97.

Strong growth for **DEPECHE MODE** which goes top ten 13-7 at KRRG Laredo, TX with top five request action. HIT FACTOR is 26% and adds include KISS 108 Boston, Z104 Madison, KDWB Minneapolis, KDWZ Des Moines and KITY San Antonio.

D-MOB earned the RECORD TO WATCH title on December 8th and has sure come a long way since then. Exploding at POWER 106 Los Angeles 22-12, it's also showing good growth at POWER 99 Atlanta 30-26, X100 28-21 and KMEL San Francisco 12-9. B95 Fresno moves it 25-13 and reports strong 12"/cassingle sales with excellent teen and 18-24 response. Adds include 93Q, WDEK, 93QID, WDJX, WJMX, WMME, CKOI, Y108, KS104, KTRS, Z100 Portland, Y95, etc.

Just as the year was ending, ELTON JOHN was building steadily and qualified as the final RECORD TO WATCH of the eighties. Flies into the top twenty at KPAT Sioux Falls, SD 34-16. Bruce Stevens, PD at WBBQ Augusta, GA, readded it over the holidays and says it's doing great taking it 38-33. New believers include WHHY, WIQQ, PRO/FM, G98, KZZP, KXXR, WIAL, KYYY, WRKY AND WLXR.

It didn't take long for the buzz to get started on A'ME LORAIN, who charts #18 at WIOQ Philadelphia and gains 29-26 at Q106 San Diego. The song was co-written and produced by Elliot Wolff, who is also responsible for "Straight Up" and "Cold Hearted." Added at 102QQ, KZEV, WJMX, POWER 104, KKFR, KOY, KZZP, B95 and KSTN.

ON RATINGS & RESEARCH

RESEARCH QUIZ WINNER/ANSWERS REVEALED

...And the winner is-

...And the correct answers are-

We'll start out the new decade by cleaning up some interesting business from '89, namely closing the loop on the First Annual Gavin Research Quiz. Before we get into specifics we'd sure like to thank you for your interest. Over 100 entries were received at my home/office on the Jersey shore. Contestants ranged from group honchos to station GMs/PDs, consultants as well as our friends on the records side of the business. Markets represented ranged from top ten to unrated smaller towns.

THE WINNER

Talk about gilding a lily! Buck Owens' KNIX AM/FM-Phoenix, is already one of America's most decorated and acclaimed stations. If you were to look in the radio dictionary under "excellence" you'd likely find a picture of KNIX. Mike Owens, Larry Daniels and the crew there are superb.

Turns out there's another star at KNIX. He's Jess Hanson, the station's Research Director, and Jess is the winner of the inaugural Gavin Research Quiz. Congratulations! Jess will soon be receiving a plaque to commemorate his accomplishment.

THE CORRECT ANSWERS

Now for the unveiling. What responses were we looking for, having been previously spelled out or discussed in earlier column material?

Here are the correct replies, and some additional insight regarding some of the topics we examined—

- 1. We asked about the two ways you can use the terms "ratings" in our biz. Most of you got this one. We were looking for a reference to the "generic" use of the word, such as "the ratings are due in today," as well as a mention of the key term "ratings point" which is often used in sales or media buying discussions (represents one percent of the population).
- 2. We were pleased to see that all of the entrants understood, or were able to explain, the difference between ratings and shares. Seems pretty basic, but you'd be surprised how many in our biz get confused regarding these terms.

- 3. An understanding of format Time Spent Listening implications came through in your replies. Everyone understood that Country, since it's not as "hit" oriented as Top 40 or a News station with fast turnover in stories, would have longer TSL and a less fickle audience.
- 4. Asking folks to define cume threw a lot of you out of the race. The reason? It isn't just listening for five minutes or more in a given daypart, or sometime during the week-it's five minutes or more within a given 15-minute segment of the hour. Keep in mind the way Arbitron's clock works-00-:15, :15-:30, :30-:45, :45-:00. If the five-minute entry isn't entirely contained within one of those 15minute segments of the hour, you'll get no credit. For example: Listening from 9:28-9:33, although five minutes, is split among two of the above clock segments with neither getting a five minute span. No listening would be credited. On the other hand, if the entry had been 9:31-9:36, bingo! A cume listener.
- 5. The message about zeroing in on key Arbitron days seems to have gotten through as almost all checked that Saturday was probably the least important of the survey day choices you were given. Diarykeepers are less diligent on the weekends, making it very tough to get them to record your calls/logo.
- 6. We confess to being just a little tricky here, and a number of you were tripped up at this point. We asked about Birch—True or False that they ask people about their radio habits during the last seven days? Since Birch produces weekly cume figures many of you apparently thought they must ask about an entire week's worth of radio, but no. Just the last two days (they then project a weekly cume figure from that data).
- 7. We had written about the impact of heavy listening diaries and most of you recalled that data to correctly answer #7. A typical figure is to see 3% of a station's cume with 150 or more station QHs, usually tallying about 15% of the station's total listening. If your station's proportion is very different you are either good or enjoyed a fluke book.
- 8. The Arbitron/Birch face-off tripped up some when it came to dealing with how many people each survey firm samples in a given

household. Birch interviews just one person per household (the person with the most recent birthday) while Arbitron takes everyone 12+

9. Keeping track of the dangerous one-day cume total for your station must have been on the minds of respondents as nearly all zeroed in on this one. To recap—if more than 20% of your target demo is writing you down just one day per diary week you have problems. Either your marketing is too wimpy to get folks to recall your station—or your programming is not appealing enough to keep people coming back

10. You all seem to have a handle on how to delve into your next book in detail—the best choice is the option that makes the most cost-effective sense for you.

As for the tiebreaker, most everyone nailed that also. You recalled the legacy of old-time radio shows, their duration and the average-quarter-hour data that has been with us ever since



In addition, Balin and his band performed with the world-renowned Moscow Circus. Raisa Gorbachev greeted handicapped and orphaned children from all parts of the Soviet Union who attended all the festivities. The Soviet Television and Film Industry will be taping the event for a 60 minute television special and a film documentary...Jon Bon Jovi is starting up his own label in 1990...Bryan Ferry's new album is finished and will be out this spring...The Lemonheads, formerly on Taang!, are signed to Atlantic Records and will have an album out late 1990..

It was nice to get a phone call from the sweet, southern accented Steven David De-Long, vocalist for Sweet F.A. These Indianapolis, Indiana rockers moved to Los Angeles and met a true believer in Bret Hartman, West Coast A&R Manager for MCA. Bret gave the band a tape of Howard Benson's work with Bango Tango and a match was made. The unnamed album is due in February but there should be a single, probably "Whiskey River, out in early January. FM's DIFFICULT HISTORY

oday, upwards of 80% of the listening done to radio in the United States is done on the FM band, or so some rating services tell us. But except for three pivotal events, FM could have died. Understanding what FM went through to get where it is today helps today's programmer appreciate the FM success he or she may take for granted—and may offer encouragement to those downhearted by the perceived prospects now for AM broadcasting.

FM was the creation of Major Edwin H. Armstrong, who had become rich as a result of selling RCA his patent for the "superheterodyne" receiving circuit at the dawn of radio broadcasting in 1922. This circuit is still fundamental in virtually all radio (and TV) receivers today! After that triumph, Armstrong was intent on finding a way to reject static in radio reception. Since static is the result of electrical discharge, causing an electromagnetic signal which increases and decreases in strength, static is an "amplitudemodulated" signal. That's AM! And an AM receiver was unable to distinguish between a transmitted radio signal and static, and reproduced both as received. (This still is a problem with most AM receivers, although a "blanking" circuit now can deal rather effectively with it, and is incorporated into the legendary NAB "Super Radio" which represents the state of the art in both AM and FM reception, and which the NAB hopes to interest manufacturers in making available to the public.)

As a result of his research, Major Armstrong unveiled in 1933 "frequency modulation"—FM—in which the sound being transmitted was encoded by varying the frequency of the station in step with the sound waves, rather than the power of the station (AM). This allowed a circuit in the receiver to strip away any "AM" away from the FM signal before reproducing it, thus doing away with static—but FM did require much more bandspace, since the signal would have to "move around" on the band without running into adjacent stations. RCA, which had first option on the invention, was hostile to it, and attempted to block it in favor of developing TV. However, in 1939 the FCC authorized FM broadcasting, with the support of CBS, and in also allocating bandspace for TV, set aside "TV Channel 1" for the FM band, at 42 to 50 MHz, and specified that all TV sound should be FM (the picture is transmitted in





Oklahoma Swing (MCA)

What a pairing! It was hard to imagine these two voices together, but the result is magic. A jumping, swing number.



GARTH BROOKS - Not Counting You

(Capitol)

Here's a terrific follow-up to his #1 "If Tomorrow Never Comes" that should keep Garth's winning streak going.

<u>VERN GOSDIN</u> - Right In The Wrong Direction (Columbia)

Once again Vern paints a true-to-life tale; this time he's laying it on the line one last time.

LORRIE MORGAN - Five Minutes (RCA)

This song has all the makings of another hit for Lorrie—great vocal, nice hook and lyrics that will really appeal to your female demos.



O'KANES - Why Should I? (Columbia)

The long awaited single from their new Imagine That album is a joy that sounds better with each listen.

SWEETHEARTS OF THE RODEO -

This Heart (Columbia)

Tim Mensy co-wrote this snappy number from the Sweethearts upcoming Buffalo Zone album.

JAZZ NEW RELEASES

SLOW FIRE - CLAUDIO RODITI (MILESTONE)

Claudio Roditi's fire burns slow and blue-hot on his fourth solo project. In 1960 at age 14, Roditi was branded with the heat of Miles and Chet, and ten years later he began a six year residence in Boston, sharpening his craft at Berklee. Roditi then moved on to New York and toured and recorded with Paquito D'Rivera. Another D'Rivera graduate, Michel Camilo, once mentioned that Paquito always went out of his way to encourage band members to play outward as opposed to just fitting in. Judging from his dominant playing style, Roditi learned his lesson well. His notes are rounded in their attack, more like stones than bullets. Yet Roditi is clearly not that easy to classify. On his debut Milestone effort, Gemini Man, Roditi's impact was most fluent when he played fluegelhorn. Although on the cover of Slow Fire he's pictured with his fluegelhorn, only three tracks—the tour de force "Feel Good," the suave samba "Feitio Fe Oracao" and the relaxed "Papagaio"—actually feature the instrument. In fact, the title track is an end around from the start, a homesick sounding ballad with muted Miles/Gil overtones. For more of that signature driving blustery feel (fueled by the inclusion of trombonist Jay Ashby), try the aforementioned "Feel Good," "Brazil, Infinity" and "Annette's For Sure," both co-featuring the tenor sax playing of Ralph Moore. The bolero-esque "Malombo" and the scat duet with trombonist Ashby on "Carolina" are two Roditi vocal standouts.

WE MEET AGAIN - RAMSEY LEWIS/ **BILLY TAYLOR (CBS)**

A little jazz history from the pianos of Ramsey Lewis and Billy Taylor. There's lots of wide open sonic space on this one, with Ramsey on the left and Billy on the right. In between is a lot of breathing room, giving this set a let-thetapes-just-roll spontaneity. The old and new are explored, as Billy and Ramsey fiddle with compositions by Duke Ellington, Chick Corea, Bill Evans, Denny Zeitlin, Horace Silver, Taylor himself and more. Oscar Peterson's "Nigerian Marketplace" and Chick Corea's custom contribution, "We Meet Again" best accomodate the double part configuration and it's through those tracks that there's less feeling of players bumping into each other. Silver's "Cookin' At The Continental" gets a double-edged boogie treatment, while Taylor's "Somewhere Soon" provides the lush moments. Dueting grand pianos is much trickier feat than it seems. Like two bass' players or drummers, single territory has to be dissected carefully

lately with the re-emergence of Charles Earland, the relentless and persistent hard driving funk of Jimmy McGriff, and newcomer Joey DeFrancesco. But Jimmy Smith is still the master. After all, it's Smith who's traveled

PRIME TIME - JIMMY SMITH (MILESTONE) Jazz organ has enjoyed a wild renaissance

around with that Hammond B3 in his U-Haul trailer since the fifties. For Hammond organ fans, his early two track Blue Note recordings are almost Biblical. Besides, Jimmy had that amazing knack for playing bass pedals. His inclusion of Stanley Turrentine and Kenny Burrell (when Jazz greats toured the R&B circuits and jazzed it up in New York) on recording dates is legendary. With Prime Time we're treated to a world of late night roadside hangouts. Philip Upchurch returns with lean guitar fills and saxman Curtis Peagler, especially with his own composition "Simple Soul Song," provides that unmistakeable lounge atmosphere. "Here Comes C.T." is stinging and bass cabinet boomy. It's hard to believe this package was recorded digitally when the preserved, almost reissue sounding "No Doubt About It," Upchurch's cameo piece, comes around. Prime Time is a Jazz testament to the spirit of low lights, bourbon shooters and a hard week's work. Prime Time makes Miller time that much easier to handle.

PENSYL SKETCHES #2 - KIM PENSYL (OPTIMISM)

Kim Pensyl delves deeper into MIDI technology with the second in the Pensyl Sketches series. Like a kid with a key to the sweets shop, Pensyl is rarely content to keep things solo and intimate. His inboard style is theatrically outgoing and he's managed to impress many Adult Alternative and commercial Jazz programmers with his one man studio approach, even though the tunes are infectiously peppered with sounds of computerized per-


cussion. As usual, Pensyl's main strength is melodics as captured on one of the set's two solo keyboard contributions "Love Letters," a perfect Adult Alternative track. "Monterey Magic" is upbeat and not overbearingly funky. For a one man band, "By Any Means" is assembled with mathematical skill, challenging the listener to decide whether this really is the product of one lonely mind in a studio full of multi-tracked gizmos. Adult Alternative melodics reappear on "The Other Side Of Love," while both Jazz and AA can share "Dad's Song." So salt away the Pensyl Xmas set until next year, and bring on the New Year with Sketches #2.

DISTANT SONGS - BARRY GORDON (TELARC)

Telarc is going into the new decade with a brand new set of sounds. Barry Gordon's solo CD, Distant Songs, ushers in an Alternative Adult mindset for the label. Gordon has been active in New York City, working within the lucrative jingle and movie/television soundtrack circles. He's performed on many famous commercials (Macys, Campbell's Soup) as well as on TV themes for the likes of The Equalizer and Dynasty. Yet, as is most always the case, writing jingles and working behindthe-scenes for other artists gave way to yearnings of self-expression and a desire to be viewed as a bona fide performer-personality. Barry Gordon puts away his jack-of-all-trades tendencies in order to get "up close and personal" with this collection of acoustic piano offerings.



"DIRTY DEEDS DONE DIRT CHEAP" -JOAN JETT (BLACKHEART/CBS)

Joan Jett gives her current faves a workout on her upcoming album, Hitlist. The first taste is an airy, fresh cover of AC/DC's meanest ditty. "Dirty Deeds Done Dirt Cheap." Out of respect for the late Bon-man. Joan both sticks to the original arrangement, yet gives the song her own signature Gary Glitter backbeat chant beat bop treatment. Nice touch, Joan. You never fail me.

HATS - BLUE NILE (LINN/A&M)

Don't you wonder about bands who take four to six years to record? As is the case with folks like Kate Bush and Paul Simon, there's the risk of entire eras and trends of music going by in the time it takes to crank out an elpee's worth of tunes. Blue Nile, was just as elusive about this follow-up, playing quite a game of cat-and-mouse with Virgin, their European label. However, Stateside there's so damn much happening, nobody in their right mind waits for any band to lace up their dancing shoes. Hence the patient Blue Nile fan will be well pleased. Hats benefits from the fact that sonically the Niles were so far ahead of the game that a six year wait barely shows. They don't exactly have linear attitudes when it comes to percussion, song structure, tempo, you name it. It's a funny thing, but I have all kinds of non-musical friends who have become Blue Nile fans. Maybe the best way to describe their sound is progressive yet agreeable, and environmental in an urban, citified way. I hate to be this way, but all seven trax speak as a solid core. However, if you're strapped for a starting point give "The Downtown Lights" or "Over The Hillside" a trial spin. Here's hoping Blue Nile never diversifies into the restaurant biz. Who could wait so long for the main course?

"HOLD ON BABY" - J. J. CALE (SILVERTONE/RCA)

Give J. J. Cale the necessary autonomy and

you've got yourself a winner. "Hold On Baby" is the first track from the excellent Travel-Log. his first album in over four years. Cale's emergence on the English-based Silvertone label connotes freedom and creativity. Everybody thinks of J. J. as a country boy, but not me. Many forget that he was a recording engineer before he made his mark as a solo musician. While "Hold On Baby" rocks, there's some marvelous experiences to be heard once you listen to this fine new album in total. Welcome back John J. and band. You've been away far too long, bubba.

A BLUES FOR BUDDHA - THE SILENCERS

Though we rarely refer to labels per se. I can't help but comment what a pleasure it is to receive The Silencers and Peter Murphy (not to mention J.J. Cale) in the same pouch. A Blues For Buddha is gorgeously recorded, as Scotsman/former-Fingerprintz-of-darkness Jimme O'Neill glides the band into ethnic electric directions. As the drums backbeat and the guitars glide and strum, you hear vague shadows of pipes, fiddles and other Scottish paraphernalia. A good example is the opening "Answer Me." Its effect is hypnotic and way cool. "Razor Blades Of Love" ain't a bad starting point at all. It's sharp and slicing. But by all means don't stop there, my friend, as long as there's "Skin Games" to be played and a "Sacred Child" (my favorite track) to be tended to. "Child" does run long at over seven minutes, but isn't the percussive mix between the picked quitars and blues harps a snappy combo as the song goes into "Mona" Bo Diddley-Daddy overdrive? A wonderful piece of work well suited to those who like their air sound deluxe.

DEEP - PETER MURPHY

(BEGGARS BANQUET/RCA)

If Peter Murphy's last work brought his Bauhaus sensibilities more into the mainstream, Deep is a step back into the



nighttime. While alimpses of Bowie still emerge, doesn't "Deep Ocean Vast Sea" remind you a little of how Leonard Cohen might sound with aggressive production, pumping bass and British rock n roll glory? In many ways, Deep is Murphy's masterwork in that it combines the darkness of Bauhaus with the accessibility of Love Hysteria's "In The Dark." With the able backing of his band, The Hundred Men, Deep sounds like the work of one hundred and one rock n roll lunatics. I agree with my colleague, Linda the Ryan. Deep is an excellent, rockin' voyage. Trax: "Cuts You Up," the brazen "Shy," and the two part "Roll Call." It's already week one and I think I've found one of my best of 1990 already.

"LONE WOLF" - HAVANA BLACK (CAPITOL) Don't know about you, but I found it hard to decipher the bio material on the single sleeve. Fortunately, whether these guys are from Louisiana, Redondo Beach or Finland, Havana Black is a gutsy outfit. The singer's phrasing is akin to Paul Rodgers during his rockin', moody days with Free, while the guitarist is hooked on the wah tone much like Brian Robertson of Thin Lizzy during that band's middle period. "THE DEVIL IN ME" - JOHN WESLEY HARDING (SIRE/REPRISE)

In a lot of ways, JWH reminded me of early Elvis Costello. Now after hearing "Devil In Me" with both the voice and the lyrical sarcastic wit, it's beyond the accidental stage. Still, this is no Costello clone. Harding drags many more influences kicking and screaming. The raw production spotlights the message of the song—that is, the devil doesn't exist at all for it is indeed "humanity." Funny—next week you'll hear Harlan Ellison say damn near the same thing in his Gavin interview.

WHO FINALLY SET OFF THE REVOLUTION IN ROMANIA? WHY, IT WAS THE LOCAL RADIO STATION, OF COURSE.

In a story published by reporter Jonathan Randal in the Washington Post, it was revealed that Romanian dictator Nicolae Ceausescu's wicked regime came tumbling down not as a result of a stash of rifles and weapons assembled NRA-style by the people, not as a result of a huge march by the downtrodden masses. No siree, Bob. It was kicked off by a song on the radio.

It was around Thursday, 8:30AM, December 21st, Decebal Petcu heard the song on Radio Bucharest. "Pui De Lei" or "Baby Lions" contained the refrain, "There were heroes, there are heroes, there will be heroes as long as the Romanian people exist." Certainly not your Top Ten pick to click to be sure, considering the song is a 19th Century patriotic singalong.

"That's the signal," he told his men working at a plant that manufactures measuring equipment. "Let's go."

A vital rebellion was staged just before the

world was about to celebrate Christmas. About seventy dissidents faced the Securitate (Romania's secret police) in Republic Square amid five hundred bystanders. They found themselves outnumbered and unarmed, and one dissident was killed and thrown into a jeep. The bystanders were outraged and swelled to two thousand. Before long, Ceausescu and his wife were having their last cigarettes after a speedy trial and before their public executions. In fact, one underground group started as a result of a leader being arrested for refusing to submit the obligatory Christmas gift to the greedy Ceausescus. So terrible was the Ceausescu's twenty-four year rule that tavern crowds cheered the grisly sight of the mutalated corpses when they were broadcast on Romanian television net-


So it was radio that provided the spark. Starting with ranks as small as thirty people, spending months and years dodging the Securitate by switching meeting places on a daily basis, it wasn't until Petcu, on his way to fixing a machine at the honey cooperative, bumped into a Radio Bucharest employee who agreed to broadcast "Baby Lions" as a signal for the small group to attract the secret police. Leading them into the popular town square, a confrontation would errupt. And once the song was aired at a predesignated time, shop employees who were regular radio listeners would lay down their tools and change history. Originally the signal song was to air March the first of 1990, once the proper strategy was lined up. But the date was immediately moved up five days after things began cooking early in Timisoara, demonstrating yet another example of radio's turn-on-a-dime capabilities.

So think about it as you cue up that next song. In another time, in another place, in another era, that one song can do as much as move an individual listener or signal an entire revolution. Somehow it's hard to picture television with the same impetus, sparking anything more serious than a channel switch, a trip to the bathroom and refrigerator. But radio—there's a much different potential at work. You can think and plot as you listen.

Happy New Year and let freedom ring.
