Washington's Ban on 'Erotic' Music Called 'Embarrassment' to State

Ann Wilson of Heart called it "an embarrassment to the state of Washington in front of the whole country." Sire Records GM Howie Klein found it "horrifying," and Rock critic and author Dave Marsh described it as "an invitation for every demagogic right-winger in this country to come out."

Wilson, Klein and other music industry people were responding to the new law in Washington (H.R. 2554) that outlaws the selling to minors of recordings deemed "erotic."

Governor Booth Gardner signed the measure on March 20, three weeks after it had been passed by the state Senate and House of Representatives. His action, taking place on the eve of the Northwest Area Music Association Music Business Conference (NAMA), surprised and shocked most industry professionals and drew accusations about his political motives. Gardner had received thousands of letters and phone calls urging him not to sign the bill. One protest drew Chris Novoselic of DGC's Nirvana, which is based in

Seattle, to the steps of the state Capitol in Olympia.

Regardless, Gardner signed the bill, which goes into effect June 11, and said he wanted to "send a warning shot" to the industry. "It's not punitive," he asserted. "It gives parents some assistance and control over what young people have access to."

But that's not how most industry people read the new law, which tacks three words, "or sound recordings," onto a 1969 state law forbidding the sale of "erotic" material to persons under age 18. Although other states-notably Florida-have prosecuted musical acts based on obscenity statutes, Washington's is the first in the country to ban certain music for minors.

Sire Records' Klein wondered, as others did, about the timing of Gardner's signing. "What happened?" he asked. "Two weeks ago, we were told that he would not sign this bill, and now, all of a sudden he signed it. What happened in the interim is that they found out the Senator is a rapist and he's being thrown out of office," said Klein, referring to Sen. Brock Adams' announcement of plans to leave office in the wake of sexual harrassment allegations, which he denied. "And (Gardner) decided to give a nod to

the yahoos in the eastern part of the state by signing this absurd, although symbolic piece of legislation.'

Jon Donovan, President of Sounds of Seattle Records, also questioned the timing. "It's probably the opening shot of his 1992 Senate campaign and he's going with the populist opinion."

Others found bitter irony in

Gardner's timing. Said Jim Kelton, Entertainment Editor of the Everett Herald and a DJ at KSCR/FM-Everett, WA: "I think for him to sign the bill and declare this 'Music Week in the Northwest' is extremely hypocritical. They should all be chucked out of office. The fact that he signed this bill as the NAMA Conference got under way is not coincidental. It's a cheap appeal to the voters, and, this being a very conservative state, it will get him votes, which means it could lead to this happening in other states."

Daniel House, President of C/Z Records in Seattle, also found irony that the law was signed in a state with a thriving music scene. "The governor himself made reference to the Nirvana record in a speech a couple of months ago. (Nirvana had reached the top of the nation's Album charts.) And that record itself is very possibly one of the ones that is going to be targeted; it has a naked penis on the cover."

Wilson of Heart, one of the Northwest's longest-running bands, told the Gavin Report: "Just continued on page 6

The Bertelsmann Music Group (BMG) has invested in Private Music for a 50% equity stake.

Peter Baumann, founder and owner of Private Music, which has been distributed by BMG since 1987, called the new joint venture "the best of both worlds ... we now possess the financial muscle of a major."

Private will retain autonomy, said President/CEO Ron Goldstein. Future releases include recordings by Jennifer Warnes, Yanni, and Ringo Starr.

Blue Horizon on Horizon Again

Sire Records has reactivited Blue Horizon Records, one of Britain's first independent specialty labels.

Formed in 1967 by Mike and Richard Vernon, Blue Horizon was home to the early Fleetwood Mac, Chicken Shack, and Christine Perfect (of Chicken Shack, later to become Christine McVie). In the U.S., it recorded Otis Spann, Johnny Shines, Magic Sam, Furry Lewis, and Otis Rush before the label folded in the early '70s.

Seymour Stein, President of Sire and an early partner with the Vernons, said the new Blue Horizon will echo the original label's interest in all forms of music, "without regard to arbitrary record business boundaries." First release will be Pictures and Paintings, a new album from country star Charlie Rich. Sweet Soul Music, a collection of Southern singles inspired by the Peter Guralnick book of the same name, is next. Also planned is a compilation of songs written by the late Doc Pomus.


Evergreen Fields Grow; 3 Promotions at KKBT



now, the Seattle scene is at a very amazing artistic pitch...A lot of the music is intra-influenced, and it's dark and ironic, and it's not pandering and kiss-ass. It's not particularly erotic for the sake of beingerotic, but it's wild to think that our very own state would tell us 'No,' where no other state in the whole country does."

Marsh, who compiled the book, 50 Ways to Fight Censorship, and edits the newsletter, Rock & Roll Confidential, didn't blame Gardner as much as the music industry itself.

"This is something the record industry wanted," he told the Gavin Report. "The RIAA contends that it opposed the bill, but it was neutral, which was like supporting it. This is the fault of people who should have stood up and didn't." While some observers feared that the Washington law might lead to similar restrictions elsewhere, Marsh said the floodgates for censors were opened six years ago "since the RIAA folded in the face of the PRMC (Parents' Music Resource Center, the Washington, D.C. group whose efforts resulted in the industry's adoption of warning labels on certain recordings). It's an election year, and you're gonna see a lot more of this because it's an issue with no downside. The fans aren't organized and the industry is cowardly."

The RIAA issued a statement expressing "disappointment" with the new law. President Jason Berman commented: "We are particularly concerned that the governor described his actions as a 'warning shot.' We already use a voluntary warning label! The governor needs to be better informed before he issues any more warnings."

In response to Marsh's charges, Timothy Sites of the RIAA claimed that the organization "actively opposed" both H.R.2554 and S.B.6262.

The new law is seen by some industry experts as more symbol than substance, given the history of the 1969 Washington law that now encompasses recordings. "By and large," said Marsh, "that bill has not been enforced. But we know that these things tend to inhibit." DJ Nasty-Nes, Director of National Promotion for Nastymix Records of tainly not going to stop anyone from getting the music they want to hear."

In fact, said Klein, Gardner's signing of the new law could have "the opposite effect to what he is trying to do...What he will do will bring attention to those records, and by forbidding young people to listen to them, he will create an atmosphere where these young people *have* to get these records. He is defeating his own purposes."

"It's a very weak bill," said Chris Knab, Station Manager of KCMU who was Workshop Coordinator of the NAMA conference. "If it goes to

Seattle, agreed. The new bill, said Nasty-Nes, who's also a DJ on KCMU-Seattle, "will force artists to think before they write, therefore hindering their creativity and supressing their creative abilities."

On the retail level, **Rob Bruce**, Northwest Regional Manager of **Tower Records & Video**, worried about his employees being open to prosecution. "I can't believe that retailers are going to be put in the position of trying to enforce a bill that's only going to hurt retailers," he told the *Seattle Times*. "It's cercourt, it will not stand up. I've already talked to several entertainment lawyers here at the NAMA, and this thing will not pass muster."

Still, said Tim Devine, VP of A&R at **Capitol Records**, the bill will have impact. "It is cutting back on part of the audience that was normally able to buy any music of their choice," he told the *Gavin Report*. "A lot of kids have only the local store or mall outlet to buy records. In those markets, 1 think it will be a lot more restrictive."

The legislation was sponsored by

Rep. Dick King, a Democrat who received a complaint from Karen Leslie, an Everett woman whose four year-old son had inadvertently heard part of a 2 Live Crew record, As Nasty as They Want to Be Part II, that two pre-teen nephews of hers had played. King then sponsored the amendment to the 1969 law. Under the amendment, prosecutors can ask judges to rule whether a recording is "erotic" by law. Retailers would face fines and jail time if they refused to abide by court-ordered labeling and sales prohibitions.

Erotic material is defined in Washington as that "which is patently offensive because it affronts contemporary community standards relating to...sexual matters or sadomasochistic abuse; and is utterly without redeeming social value."

"I'm so happy," said Leslie. "I don't understand all this uproar over censorship. I mean, how can you be censoring something for people who don't have any rights anyway?"

Marsh, himself the father of two daughters, said he is all for protecting children. But he practices openness with them on all matters, he said. "If you want an end to sexism, racism, and rape, you get everybody's point of view out in the open, and you argue about it."

"As a mother myself," said Wilson, "I can say that I defend the right to have 'erotic' lyrics in this home coming into (my daughter's) head. The world includes them, so let's not have another '20s Prohibition. It doesn't work, and it only creates a new race of criminals."



INSIDE TOP 40 by Dave Sholin

Reacting to the ever-changing, constantly evolving tastes of the public is part of Top 40 radio's heritage. Last week **KMEL-San Fran**cisco PD Keith Naftaly shared his thoughts on when and why certain Pop records find their way onto his station's playlist.

In San Diego, Q106 (KKLQ) PD Kevin Weatherly agrees that there is a growing openness to playing product atypical of the station's overall sound. Kevin points to Nirvana's "Smells Like Teen Spirit" opening the door back in February. "The song was so big and we felt, being the hit music station for San Diego, it was important for us to deal with it." He adds that since then, "We started taking notice that some other records such as Mr. Big's 'To Be With You' and Eric Clapton's 'Tears In Heaven' were also huge sellers, so we got on those and they're really performing for us, too! In fact, three of our top five requests are Nirvana, Queen and Mr. Big-response to those records is incredible."

Is there less reluctance to play this type of product now? Kevin says, "Yes," and maintains, "from our standpoint, we want to play the biggest selling records. We don't avoid records because of their sound, but just play the hits." He recalls a time when "these socalled 'white Pop' records didn't sell at all. Now, the people are buying these songs and if that's what they want, then that's what we're going to give 'em."

Q106 determines what their listeners want largely by sales. Citing Eric Clapton as an example, Weatherly says, "When we first put it on three weeks ago, it was number twentythree in sales, mostly selling off MTV and some minimal market airplay—and now, it's *number three* in sales. On the other extreme, we're seeing the same reaction to TLC, which is just an explosive record in sales." That purchase at the checkout counter is, in his opinion, the ultimate bottom line. "Unless it sells here in San Diego, we're going to stay away from it. Sales tell you the real story in your market."

In Phoenix, "listener demand" will influence Y95 (KOY/FM) PD Jamie Hyatt to play a record like Mr. Big. "We're a Dance Top 40, but we still play the biggest hits and we kept our eye on that record. We got so many requests off the video; on top of huge album and single sales. With no airplay in the market, we tested it and it projected halfway decent"—a surprise to Jamie because of the song's unfamiliarity.

Concerned about what Hyatt defines as the "hipness factor," he cautions, "You need to find the really hip records and they have to be timely, too." His most recent example is Celine Dion and Peabo Bryson's duet, "Beauty And

The Beast." He acknowledges, "It isn't our type of record, but the song is up for an Oscar, the movie was huge, it's selling and requesting like crazy and researching great."

Time is another element that can affect the viability of a song being played on Y95 though it may not jive with a label's game plan. One song not aired as a current, **Curtis Stigers'** "1 Wonder Why," got played as a recurrent. Jamie explains, "It seemed so A/C when it first came out, but in talking to people on the street, we found women who like Dance music also liked that song." He agrees that the perception of a song can change during its lifespan.

These days, it seems the word "*never*," as in, "We'll *never* play that," is being heard less than ever.

Barrelling into the top twenty in many areas, CHRIS WALKER is establishing a strong HIT FACTOR profile of 17%. Massive moves include KDON Monterey/Salinas 22-13, WBSS Atlantic City 28-15, WNCI Columbus 23-18, WMME/FM Augusta, ME 17-10, KKJO St. Joseph, MO 21-13, KYYA Billings, MT 23-18, KHTN Modesto/Merced, CA 23-16, HOT 102 Milwaukee 19-14 and Q102 Cincinnati 26-20.

EAGLE 106 Philadelphia was one of the first stations to prove the appeal of QUEEN, taking it Top Five with a 7-3 gain. Week's highest debut for WRCK Utica, NY at #33. "'Wayne's World' is the top-selling CD/cassette and 'Bohemian Rhapsody' is number two on the phones." Early Top Ten stats at Z100 New York (15-4) and KIIS Los Angeles (20-9). New on: KISS 108, WZOU, WZYQ, WMME/ FM, KC101, WDJX, WZPL, Z102, WFMF, WTBX, XL93, Y95, KPKY, KONG, KISM, KUBE, etc.

Only one debut for Gregg Cassidy and Chris Kerr at HOT 102 Milwaukee, and that was EN VOGUE at #23. Highest debut at B95





READY FOR THE SPRING SWEEP?

rbitron is measuring all radio markets from April 2-June 24. This not only includes those markets that get regular printed reports with delivery starting in July, but also all counties in the mainland U.S. as well as selected counties in Hawaii and Alaska. The counties are being measured for inclusion in Arbitron's annual County Coverage Report and the Nationwide network radio report. County Coverage is produced annually from all diaries collected during a calendar year, but the Spring period gets the most number of diaries for the most counties. Nationwide is the network report that measures radio listening in the top 100 ADI's. Network compensation is often negotiated using the Nationwide statistics. Now that you know that this is the most important rating period of the year, are you ready for the Spring Book?

The Station Information Package -First Step to Ratings Success

You should have received and returned the Station Information Package. These were mailed to the general manager of the station on February 13 and should have been returned to Arbitron by March 9. If your station did not receive a form, or has lost it under a pile of CD's, it is not too late to submit it. The form requests personality names, sports programming schedule, special programs, broadcast schedule, simulcast time, format identification, and most importantly, slogan be listed in twenty-five spaces or less.

Most of the information in the Station Information Package is pretty cut and dry, but slogan seems to give many difficulty. The slogan is the alternate "name" of the station. Think of it as nickname. Joseph is the real name, "Joe" is the slogan. Don't confuse a slogan and a station positioner. Survey respondents will write down the slogan. They almost never write down a positioner. "Q104" is a slogan. "Best Music in the Valley" is a positioner. List only the slogan.

Here's a special note about simulcasts. In order for the station to have a simulcast line reported in the printed report the stations must have simulcast the entire daypart for the entire survey period. The only exception is when separate I.D.'s are required and then each station may state its legal identification and the station's slogan as submitted to Arbitron. Nothing else.

It is highly recommended that the station keep a copy of its submission; you may re-

quest Arbitron to acknowledge receipt of the completed Station Information Package. Every station should submit, including noncommercial stations and stations that do not regularly appear in a printed report. By the way, in some markets non-commercial stations are getting some respectable numbers. These estimates are reported via the AID system. Only sixty percent of stations return the Station Information Package. It makes sense that it will be easier for the research company to properly assign credit when it has the most information about your station. It is one way to insure getting all the credit your station deserves.

Arbitron mailed to your station a slogan list for your market. Review it for conflicts with neighboring stations. There are Arbitron rules that require the slogan to be used as the station's primary identifier and at least once per hour during the survey period. The mailing includes the full set of rules about slogans. However, these slogans are not protected by Arbitron the same way call letters are protected by the FCC. Any station may use the same or similar slogan. Some stations have been able to protect their slogan under trademark or service mark laws within a state. Vigilance is the watchword!

Whether you make the decision to use the call letters and frequency alone, or you choose to identify the station with a slogan, make sure the on-air people say the station name clearly and frequently. As I travel around the country, I am amazed how often I cannot understand the announcer saying the station's name. Just because they are very familiar with it does not mean that the new cume you are trying to build is familiar with the call letters/slogan. Remember also that certain letters of the alphabet sound similar to other letters. For example, bee, cee, dee, eee are close in sound as are "eye" and "why." This is one of those details that can make more impact than the contest.

Keep in the Book -Be Aware of Special Station Activities Policy

The promotional plans for the Spring book have probably been laid out for some time. Now they are being implemented. Contests, advertising, personal appearances and all other forms of marketing communication are no doubt in high gear. However, make sure that the station is protected with Arbitron Special Station Activity guidelines. A reminder poster and letter from the Chairman of the Advisory Council has just been mailed to every radio station in America. Hang up the poster. Have a discussion with the air staff about the importance of the ratings and how very important is is for the station to avoid ratings distortion and bias. There are actions that Arbitron can take and has taken that can make it very uncomfortable for station management if the rules are violated. The least of the actions is notation in the printed report that there was a violation and the most devastating is removal from the printed report which may be coupled with a law suit if the violation occurred willfully. These guidelines are easy to follow and are published in a handbook Arbitron will provide to the station at no charge. The rule of reason here is to avoid any contest, promotion or advertising that will actuate the ratings bias or ratings distortion rules

Research Advice

Just as a reminder, Arbitron will "pre-approve" on-air positioners and contests, and even advertising. If you think it might violate the rules after reading and studying them, contact Arbitron.

Now that you are in the Spring survey period, it is critical that you maintain a log of station and market activity that might effect the survey. This log will be very helpful when you begin analyzing the data three to six months from now. In your "diary" you will note unusual weather, major news events, station advertising for you and your competition, start and end dates of promotions/contests. Write down any change of on-air talent in the market as well as call letter or format changes, be sure to indicate the date. Write down anything you believe could affect the survey. Check this diary everyday so that you don't forget anything significant.

Getting ready for the Spring sweep means being ready for Arbitron's measurement procedures as well as the audience. Follow this check list: (1) Double check on the Station Information Package and be sure to inform Arbitron of any changes in it. (2) Review Special Station Activity Policy and insure that each contest, promotion and advertising message is in compliance. (3) Keep a log of market and station activity. Good luck this Spring. Of course, if you've done your homework a little more than luck will be on your side. ■

HARD KNOCKS - School Of Hardknocks (Wild Pitch/ERG) Atlanta born Hard Knocks releases one of the most thought provoking albums of 92'. Arranging a raw to the bone awareness of society's ills and today's delinquent youths, Hard Knocks, aka Hard Head and D.J. Stone Face, take a narrative position as each song gives a cruel depiction of Urban ghetto experiences. H.K. uses a very shallow Jazz-like music bed, on "Ghetto Love" you'll hear an acoustic bass against a snare and high hat, while on "The Road To The Precinct" you get the criminal element to help formulate the lyrical picture. "We have John Chelew to thank for getting us together. He's the guy who had it in mind that this unit would work. He runs a club in Los Angeles called McCabe's, and he oversaw the proceedings that became the album, Bring The Family."

"It was no small task getting four knuckleheads like us to sit in the same place for even four days, which is how long it took to record Bring The Family."

"From the beginning of those sessions, we all knew something was up and cookin'. Something happens when the four of us play together. After, we kept it on the back burner."

"I keep most things on the back burner, including reality."

"Little Village wasn't something that could be pushed, bent or shaped into somebody's idea of a career move. So we had to wait patiently. It couldn't be hurried."

"We have (Warner Bros. President) Lenny Waronker to thank for persevering a nudge from Ry who told him that if he stuck his neck out and put some effort into making this happen, it could."

There weren't any contractual complications to speak of. A&M has been terrific. I'm still with them as a solo artist. It was more about getting four lone wolves to get into a pack for more than four days. We're all used to operating on our own, including Jim Keltner, everybody's favorite drummer."

"I wouldn't portray us as a smooth outfit. It's anything but that. It's pretty intense when we get together. There's respect and love, but sparks fly. It's not smooth sailing, rather it's intense musicmaking. A lot of it has to do with letting the music lead us."

> "We co-wrote everything as the Four Muskateers. I wasn't allowed to bring in a song and graft it onto this band like a piece of skin. It was much more organic than that. The songs were born out of the music that the band made."

"Bring The Family barely scratched the surface as far as what this band can do. In fact, Little Village suggests only the first chapter of the kind of racket this band can make."

"We can't afford to compose inside an expensive studio. We save the hundred-dollars-an-hour for the psychiatrists. Or, as my friend Guy Clark says of psychiatrists, 'I'm okay, you're okay if the check's okay.'"

"I'm here to report that FAX paper disintegrates. I lost a whole set of lyrics after the paper just disappeared."

"Like Ry said, when a bus would drive by, you had to wait a few seconds before recording your part."

"Technology's come so far, you can practically shout into your watch and make a record."

"Ultimate technology is getting to the point where it's finally starting to serve the organism rather than the other way around."

"There's co-writing down here in Nashville where you get together at ten o'clock in the morning, write two verses, and you go get something to eat. You finish the song, demo it and that's that. Little Village was quite a bit different. We would sit down and make music as a quartet. Dare I use the word improvise?"

"Ry played the scariest guitar on the break on 'Inside Job.' Yeah, we really went somewhere on that one."

"I'm a sucker for the ballads, or a song like "Don't Think About Her When You're Trying To Drive.' I love the side of Ry when he can play so mean, then be unabashedly sentimental in a beautiful way. Not maudlin at all."

"I remember when we were doing Bring The Family and Ry took that slide solo on 'Lipstick Sunset.' Afterwards he was





shouting, 'I'm just playing "Danny Boy" on the slide, that's all the hell I was doing.' So I said, 'Well, it's beautiful, so just play "Danny Boy," ferchristsakes.'"

"I don't think music has ever been in a better place. Anything goes. I love having that clean of a slate. There's so much shaking these days, things are so simplified and user-friendly, I think these are exciting times."

"Have you ever heard of Camille Paglia? She's said a lot of great stuff in some articles I've read. What stuck with me was the bit about artists for freedom of speech. She essentially said, 'Fuck off. You're not interested in freedom of speech. You want freedom to get rich. Quit griping.'"


"She sees the process of contemporary music as part of a bigger problem. No one encourages an artist to explore their talent potential—it's all get in, crank it out and come up with a hit. You never hear a record company say, 'Here's twenty-five thousand dollars. Go sit in the shed for a year with your guitar and find out who the hell you are musically."" "Oh man! I've been hunting and pecking ever since I started. It's a learn as you earn program."

"Nick and I were talking the other day. Not to minimize our solo things, but you can get into this rut where you make your record, put your band together to get sort of close to the record's sound. Do your tour, play the record live. With Little Village, we haven't a clue what it will sound like live, or whether we can even play these songs the same way. Some of this stuff was so seat-of-the-pants, I can't remember what or how I even played it. Rehearsing and touring will be like making another record and seeing what's gonna happen."

"Ry came up with the name Little Village. It's also the title of a song by Sonny Boy Williamson. On the original record, he's actually yelling at Leonard Chess, who's giving him grief. That studio argument incident says a whole mouthful about understanding music. What Leonard Chess is saying to Sonny Boy is 'Tell me what you're up to.' And what Sonny Boy is essentially saying back is, 'Let me do it first and you'll understand.'" "In my extra bedroom I've got a twenty-four track two inch lateseventies tape machine, a big old board, a bunch of amplifiers, a cheesy Hammond organ, even some modern stuff like a sampler with Mac software. I'm going crazy, losing my mind, it's wonderful."

"Little Village has supercharged me over the last year. We're all cautious, afraid it's gonna blow up at any turn. It's like riding in a car with four bad tires."

"I left my heart in San Francisco and a good deal of my hair as it turns out. And a few million brain cells!"







P.D. NOTEBOOK

avin Report publisher Ron Fell called it an experiment that has intrigued him for a long time—an "Adult Radio Summit" that would place on the same stage leading programmers frcm the various formats seeking the 25-49 year-old adult, and compare the differences and similarities in how they implement their programming. His vision was realized at the Gavin Seminar last month in San Francisco, and its success set the stage for an even more useful dialogue next year.

The participants were Steve Feinstein from KKSF-San Francisco (Adult Alternative); Don Langford from KRAK-Sacramento (Country); Lee Logan, KSAN-San Francisco (Country);Gene Knight, B-100 (KFMB/FM)-San Diego (A/C).

Although all panelists were shooting for the same general demographic target, each format defines a different lifestyle, so there was no rivalry.

Feinstein said that "Adult Alternative" is moving toward a song-oriented rather than an artist-oriented approach—"to combat boredom." This struck me as good advice for any adult format, since mainstream adult listeners usually grew up song-oriented. But I would not have expected this to apply in the case of an eclectic, atmospheric, alternative format such as KKSF's. It was enlightening to find that it does.

Don Langford and Lee Logan observed that Country music has widened its demographic and psychographic appeal recently, attracting people who have nothing in common; this has led to the format splitting into diverse formattic approaches in some cases, from a traditionalist approach to the "Outlaw Country," which doesn't always appeal to conventional Country listeners.

ADULT RADIO SUMMIT

Gene Knight said he felt the biggest problem Adult Contemporary stations face is the perception of being a "background" format. He feels A/C has been stigmatized by an oldies orientation, and too often doesn't reflect what is happening now. When asked what percentage of the music on B-100 is "current or recurrent," he responded, "Sixty percent." When the question was posed to the other panelists, remarkably the same figure kept recurring. The only dissenter was Steve Feinstein, whose station plays "about twenty-five percent" recurrents, but Steve added that most of his non-currents are not particularly familiar to the Adult Alternative listener anyway, which leads to a somewhat more conservative approach to the newest music.

Langford added, "There was a period in the mid-eighties when Country radio didn't play new music, and we almost killed the format." (The same, it seems to me, could be said for many A/C stations today.) Langford commented that little music before 1975 is played on KRAK/AM, nor before 1980 on KRAK/FM.

When the panelists were asked how large their total music library is, including active oldies, their responses ranged from a low of about 450 to a high of near 1,000.

The panelists seemed to agree that new music should be announced, and Feinstein went further, noting that KKSF announces *all* records to enhance the station's service orientation, and to provide longterm audience benefits for the station.

Friday afternoon, many Seminar attendees walked across Post Street from the Westin St. Francis Hotel—the Seminar host hotel—to attend the first "keynote *event*" I've ever heard of at a conference. Rick Reynolds is a humorist who incorporates elements of pathos and laughter into a 90-minute stage performance based on his life and his observations of human experience. He lives near San Francisco but started out as a disc jockey in Oregon, and is being groomed for a role on NBC/TV this fall. His monologue was greatly enjoyed by the packed house at the Theatre On The Square. One excerpt might serve to give you flavor:

"It's so easy to fall in love. A lot of people just fall in love and their lives are ruined. You can go to counselling, it's sometimes effective in these matters, but there's something so much more effective-divorce. 1 hate to be Mr. Divorce Advocate, because some people turn to it much too easily. In fact, I think that if you're going to get a divorce it should be a big deal in your lifeas big a deal as your marriage. There should be people in your divorce-a divorce ceremony. They would send out the invitations: 'Mr. and Mrs. Jack Reynolds are embarrassed to announce the divorce of their idiot son Rick from that bitch Lisa.' You'd have to go back to the exact same church you got married in, walk backwards down the aisle, pull off the ring and give it to the Worst Man. You'd have your Maids of Dishonor-sluts in black. All to make divorce more embarrassing-this is the breaking of a solemn pledge."

JAZZ NEW RELEASES

SOLO PARA TI - OTTMAR LIEBERT + LUNA NEGRA (EPIC)

As progressive adult radio grooms it's own staple artists, players like Ottmar Liebert find the ways and means to expand the envelop, fighting off radio's natural tendency to shrink the arena. Solo Para Ti is an important release in that while progressing, Ottmar retains the seed of what made Nouveau Flamenco one of the most important records of the decade. This time around, Solo Para Ti's trump cars are the arrangements. Whenever there is a horn section, a synth line, salsa piano, a sax solo or percussion ingredients, it's never an overpowering force. Rather, it blends strategically with what makes Ottmar's music such an alternative-basic melody. As a whole, Solo Para Ti could be Ottmar's finest work. Yet in bite-sized pieces, it offers radio quite a range of curiosity pieces as well. "Reaching Out 2 U" is the natural melodicstarting point. "Danza Viva" revives a Spanish heart with violin. "Merenge De Alegrias" is a wonderful strumming mover with a understated addition of horns toward the end. **Carlos Santana** appears on "Reaching Out" and on his own "Samba Pa Ti," a well known Santana band anthem. Then there's the opening "When I'm With U" and on and on. Solo Para Ti has that intangible something special that surpasses the last two Ottmar releases—that is, it's grounded with an unpretentious spirit of experimentation that will excite a mass audience. No mean feat, hombre.

INGENUE - k.d. lang (SIRE/ WARNER BROS.)

Seize the opportunity! One of the hottest singers in America has defected right into our front yard. In a bizarre move, **k.d. lang** runs the opposite direction from **Garth Brooks**, d'issing Country in favor of—well—whoever will have her. And we say, on behalf of all AA programmers and the army of adult record buyers across the country, come on down! Ingenue is already on our Best Of '92 list, a beautiful collection of songs that are curious, lilting, restless, moody and

CLOSER THAN THEY AP-PEAR - SARA K. (CHESKY)

The synthesis of folk, Jazz and AA has been a subject of fascination since starting up this section almost four years ago. Sara K. has added more fuel to the controversy. Is there common ground between folk and Jazz, arguably invented by Van Morrison when he recorded Astral Weeks during his salad days in Boston? Later it was Joni Mitchell who utilized Jazz musicians since many rock sidemen failed to understand her time odd signatures. Sara K. (paired with Chesky guitarist Bruce Dunlap who serves as her "musical director") takes ready advantage of not only of her label's penchant for painstaking fidelity, she samples an arsenal of Jazz tones. Bassist David Finck gives the music a Jazz bottom. Of course, Sara's music (like Ms. Mitchell's) lends an easy flexibility to a Jazz course. Songs like "Miles Away" and "Hidden From View" emulate the free structures of Jazz while a song like "Make Believe" is a more remotely traditional folk work. **Closer Than They Appear is a** monumental leap from her previous album, Gypsy Alley, which enjoyed ground-breaking success as well.

SHAKILL'S WARRIOR -DAVID MURRAY (DIW/ COLUMBIA) DAVID MURRAY BIG BAND (DIW/COLUMBIA) Nothing quite makes a day

sparkle like new DIW releases falling through the mail slot. Well, happy days are hear again as Columbia picks up the option to distribute the DIW line in America. They start with a complementing pair of David Murray discs. Shakill's Warrior is a funky Hammond organ-dominated blues sound. "Blues For Savannah" is a Jimmy Smith styled shoot-around. You can almost hear applause between each solo. Outside of Joe Henderson, few can play a straight note-for-note melody like Murray. It's disciplined and clean, though you feel like he could go ballistic at any moment. Don Pullen is glorious on Hammond. He helps to create an R&B, seventies throwback, especially with the Strat guitar noodling. The set's arresting ballad is the crawling, nocturnal "In The Spirit." Also check out the David Murray Big Band. It's a loose knit aggregation—an outfit positioned somewhere between the Liberation Music Orchestra and a frenzied Oliver Nelson, Like the New York Yankees, DMBB is a team of individuals. Everybody stands out in the arrangements, yet nobody particularly leads. "Lovejoy" is wonderfully chaotic.

UNTITLED - BILLY WALKER, JR. (GEFFEN)

More home cookin' from Billyuhh-Walker, Jr. And just in time. Untitled will surely give Adult Alternative the meaty boost its playlists need. While The Walk felt more secure and self-contained in the snugness of its arrangements, Untitled has more air pockets between the instruments. Take "Ballerina Dance." John Jarvis' waltzing, signature chiming piano lines frame a graceful melody. Yet Walker's guitar passages unravel an intriguingly subliminal blend of tension. The chord progressions beneath "4th Of July" suggest urgency and dynamics. Even at seven minutes plus, "China Girl" gives Billy a much needed song sabbatical to ease out and explore broken rhythms and grooves. The chase continues with a fortified, driving "Night Rider." More jazzy AA ears will find solace with the breezy "Marotta." Melody addicts should grab the gushing "Perfect Love." Untitled is a fine combination of great songs and spirited improvisation. A number one artist comes through again.

HUMAN TOUCH -BRUCE SPRINGSTEEN (COLUMBIA)

Of the two simultaneous releases, Human Touch is the expensive spread, all gussied up in a magnificent Sunday Best Clearmountain mix of moods and ideas. Fourteen songs strong, selecting trax isn't a matter of finding the best, but settling on degrees of best, depending on your appetite for rockers, softies or crooners. The beautiful opening title track mixes a lot of the subject matter to come, as Springsteen writes mostly about love and its collisions as well as the spiritual emptiness of wealth and fame. Or as the song "57 Channels (And Nothin' On)" intimates: it don't matter if vou're rich and famous, we all gotta watch the same shitty TV. The big surprise (and surely one of Springsteen's dream-cometrues) are the voices of Sam Moore and Righteous Brother Bobby Hatfield (who guest stars on "I Wish I Were Blind"). Sam (obviously minus the late **Dave**) rips and soars through "Soul Driver" and "Man's Job," the latter wrestling the question of masculinity, another Springsteen paradox that haunts his lyrics. "Real Man" is another thoughtful shot at that same subject with a tinge of insecurity ("I ain't no fighter that's easy to see / And as a lover I ain't goin' down in history"). Other personal favorites include "With Every Wish," which sort of features the ghost of Woody Guthrie lurking near that back-end verse and chorus. "Gloria's Eyes" is a guilty overview of the emotional chess game that can make a relationship challenging-yet another Springsteen dichotomy. All in all, it's still heartening that the world's most successful artist sings directly from the American experience. While the future looks more and more like a glo-

bal village, there's still lots to be said for the dusty boots and faded jeans of an American tune. It's pleasing to report that American songwriting is still in full blossom, and only a fool would deny that Bruce is the lord of the hen house.

LUCKY TOWN -BRUCE SPRINGSTEEN (COLUMBIA)

Amid the demands of releasing best-sellers, Bruce Springsteen has a history of careening off the fast track onto the dirt road, creating music as much for himself as for his raving legions of lunatics. He's done it in the past with Nebraska and Tunnel Of Love. I'd position Lucky Town in between those two efforts. Springsteen, along with drummer Gary Malabar concocts a low pressure collection, probably culled from first takers and acoustic experiments, perhaps the musical equivalent of what Presidential candidate Jerry Brown is out to do with his \$100-a-head political campaign. That is, speak clearly and just throw your dreams out there, critics be damned. The result is a dense but informal and likeable set of American landscapes like the pretty "My Beautiful Reward," the haggard "Lucky Town," a spiritual "If I Should Fall Behind" and the understated, introspective "Book Of Dreams." True, Springsteen could make the Oscar Meyer wiener song sound like a cold and lonely ballad, but here you get what lurks between the lines of the more commercial Human Touch. As Jerry used to say when he was the Guv'nor of California, "lower your expectations" and see if songs like "Local Hero" don't sound like "Bruce Springsteen's 111th Dream."

"VIVA LAS VEGAS" -ZZ TOP (WARNER BROS.)


IMMERM

ZZ Top translates the madness of Vegas into the gladness of their own brand of rock n rolled Texas mud. With a high quality video presentation, ZZ and a fake Elvis roll their Cadillacs straight through the heart of Lost Wages. And the music? Just what you might expect from the bearded wonders—guitars galore, sequenced synths and drums with lots of triggered high-tech high jinx.



"LET'S GET ROCKED" -DEF LEPPARD (MERCURY)

Hey, admit it. In the early days, rock n roll meant doing the hoochie coo. Over the years it's become a respectable term for contemporary music—you know, Grammy awards and that whole lip synch scene. Well, sod all that. **Def Leppard** puts rock back in the dirt where it belongs. Up! Youthful! Poppy!




"LIFT ME UP" -HOWARD JONES (ELEKTRA) It's been a long, long time since

we've heard from Howard Jones, the cognac-swilling vegetarian of keyboardom. "Lift Me Up" is the first single and vid from his new album In The Running, an uplifting piece of work with barrelhouse piano, synth horns and pop choruses. You'll hear a little Howard, a little Stevie (take your pick, Wonder or Winwood) resting on a thick bass-ic foundation.

"FLY LIKE AN EAGLE" -NEVILLE BROTHERS (A&M)

On paper it may sound funny, but the Neville Brothers turn this Steve Miller classic inside out. Oddly, the song (especially the lyrics) have a timeless quality. The Nevilles performed the song frequently long ago. Now, with solo projects and group albums flying high, the Brothers revisit their arrangement, not really too far from the original. In fact, Miller's own voice and guitar licks are sandwiched in on the last go-round.



"EVERY TIME I ROLL THE DICE" -DELBERT McCLINTON (CURB)

From note one, it sounds like everybody's having a hot time in the room next door. Don Was produces. Bonnie Raitt slides. Melissa Etheridge sings a snug background vocal. A hip band includes Waddy Wachtel, Benmont Tench, Kenny Aronoff and more. You can't get much better than that, except that Delbert McClinton is singing better than ever. Whadda side!

PETER MURPHY -"THE SWEETEST DROP" (BEGGARS BANQUET/ RCA)

Peter Murphy's latest single, "The Sweetest Drop," is a slow charmer that, once the groove is hit, grows into an aural epic and leaves you spent by the fourminute mark. The romantic/ goth imagery is enhanced by chanteuse Alison Limerick (This Mortal Coil) and creates the perfect soundtrack for Murphy's lyrics, which read like the script to 9 1/2 Weeks. (No wonder he's smoking a cigarette!) Re-



leased on the heels of Washington state's "erotic lyric" law (see News section), "The Sweetest Drop" might be seen as a defiant slap in the face (which sort of appeals to me) or just one of those great songs that shines brighter with every listen. LINDA RYAN

CHOO CHOO TRAIN -BRIAR HIGH SINGLES (SUBWAY RECORDS U.K.)


Although they now call Velvet Crush home, Paul Chastain and Ric Menck were the nucleus of this ultra-hip, pop group in the mid-eighties. They released a couple of EPs on England's Subway label, which have been combined on one fabulous CD—just for me (yeah, when monkees fly out of my butt). I was a sucker for the Choo Choo Train's sweet melodies back then and the sugar addiction is just as strong today. Particular favorites include "Big Blue Buzz," the Beatle-esque "Every Little Knight" (which features The Shoes' Jeff Murphy on guitar and backing vocals), "Flower Field," "Catch Another Breath" and "High." One listen to this and you know why Matthew Sweet took Paul and Ric out as part of his live band. Worth scouring the import section for over and over again! LR

NIRVANA -HORMOANING (DGC)

According to the cover, this is an Australian tour EP, although both Seana and Cyndi picked up the same CD as a Japanese import. Closer inspection reveals many of the tracks on this to be Peel Sessions although I don't think they've ever been available before. My heart stops beating every time I hear Nirvana sing (The Vaseline's) "Molly's Lips" and "Son Of A Gun." Also included are versions of Devo's "Turnaround" and (The Wipers) Greg Sage's "D-7" as well as a couple of originals-"Aneurysm" and "Even In His Youth." As their choice covers suggest, it's a spirited CD that captures the band-gulp-having fun. And really, this version of "Molly's Lips" rules! Find it if you can. LR

UNCLE GREEN -BOOK OF BAD THOUGHTS (ATLANTIC)

I'm sure there are quite a few out there who remember this band's early releases and dismissed them as another R.E.M. wannabe. Uncle Green's major

label debut shows just how far the band has come since their salad days. I mean, "Know All About You" is more in line with Matthew Sweet than R.E.M.! I'd say the common link here is a love for guitar-oriented, well crafted pop songs layered with lots of harmonies. Other tracks tocheck out include the Costelloish "I Don't Want To Know About It," "Wake Up Now," the quirky "Woke Up Naked" and "Look Into The Light." LR

3Ds -HELLZAPOPPIN (FLYING NUN/FIRST WARNING)

If Yo La Tengo and Sonic Youth were adapted as cartoon superheroes on a Saturday morning show for today's off-balance preadolescents, the 3Ds would do the soundtrack. 'Cause this New Zealand four-piece use whining dissonance (a la Sonic Youth) as an integral counterpoint to/component of their melody (like Yo La Tengo), then fill in those outlines with some downright unnatural colors. Hellzapoppin is the band's first domestic fulllength and follows on the heels of First Warning's consolidated release of their two earlier Flying Nun EPs. Believe it or not, the 3Ds find a lot of room in their niche of cranked, hooky, nonsensical distortion, and they successfully balance continuity and variety-so you gotta listen to the whole disc. If you need more guidance, start with "Outer Space" and the airy female vocals on the pensive "Sunken Head;" also try the lighter "Hairs," "Something In The Water" and "Homo Necans." SEANA BARUTH

different backgrounds. Jim was a Jazz musician, really. I guess you can say Ry comes from a folk background. John, of course, is a hard staff writer. He's not recognized enough for his fantastic playing abilities. My thing is cheesy pop. All those elements are important to make this thing work."

"Ry is an innovator. A lot of people think he's merely got a good record collection. I don't agree. He's tremendous."

"Ry has this shed at the end of his garden in Santa Monica. We'd play, talk a bit, someone would kick around a title then we'd all go home. We'd get back together in a few weeks time after using the FAX machine a lot. Lyrics would come back to you ten minutes later with amendments."

"Little Village is a bit like that old saying—'A camel is a horse designed by committee.' That's us. Little Village is a glorious compromise."

"Does the music sound American? That's a really good question. I live five thousand miles away, but I suppose this is American music. All the best shit is. The world is a village now. A little village!"

"I welcome the onset of advancing years whereas I'm sure there are those in the music business who are fearful of getting older. They feel their success is tied up in their youth. The stuff I like to do sounds better the older you get. You get better and more confident doing it. You can reach down inside yourself much easier. I'm in an enviable position in that I'm encouraged to make music as opposed to making records. I don't have any A&R people breathing down my neck, keeping me abreast of the market. I think if you make good music, nothing's hipper."

"I don't want to be Vanilla Ice. I don't envy those pop stars, nor am I interested in that side of the business. This is about my fourth go. I look forward to many more of them."

"I was always dismissive of any notion of talent I had when I was young. I stood a far better chance of meeting girls as a musician than if I was an estate agent. There was nothing hipper in the sixties than being in a band. It wasn't because I had any burning musical passion. It seemed great to buy a guitar, stick it around your neck, jump up and down and make noise. It still is, by the way. Nothing's changed, I suppose, except you get more and more interested in the kind of noise you make."

"I think it's good that Little Village has one Brit. In my younger years, my culture was to just buy records, whether it be Howling Wolf or the Hollies. It seemed that everyone that made music was the same color. Music was only either good or bad. A rather rosy little world."

"I'm forty-two now. When I was growing up, I thought America was paradise. Everything I saw was on film. Everyone was rich, riding around in fantastic-looking cars, wearing fabulous clothes, hanging around with great-looking chicks, listening to this incredible music all day. What could be better?"

"When I came over here, I realized America's incomprehensible size. You can't understand how enormous it is. It wasn't this huge town."

"I'm into people who make worthy music. Black and white people. I won't mention any names because it always looks so cheesy in print, but if you make music with any depth, then you've got to have some blues recognition. Even Neil Diamond knows about the blues. It's not apparent, but he does know. I'm also into that throw-away shit that the Brits do. If you add a little bit of that, you come up with music that doesn't really follow any trends."

"As for the difference between Rockpile and Little Village, Rockpile had an immediate lust for life. It had very little to do with music, and yet the music came through. It's fabulous when that happens to white people."

"Rockpile was a band that had a life span of three years. We were doing a lot of drinking and whathave-you during those days. We devoured life. I seem to remember us having a fantastic time doing it. Musically, we were only really any good for six months, during the beginning when we were really hot. Then it trailed off because we'd lost interest." "During that time, Rockpile loved being the opening act. We knew we were hot. Some of the bands we'd open for thought we were these English losers, so we'd strive to go out there and grease their arses."

"Little Village is much more grown up, more naughty than savage. Maybe that's not fair since some of the rehearsals have been quite good. When we get unhinged and loose, it does gets seriously savage."

"The fifth member of the group is Lenny Waronker. We couldn't have done this without him. It was on and off, then halfway off then back on. Occasionally the band would have a shout at each other. One time I even showed up in Los Angeles, and nobody knew anything about it. I came to start working. I went straight back to the airport and took the very next flight back to England. I was very pissed off. There have been lots of incidents like that."

"Even now when I go to rehearsal, I think someone's gonna say, 'No, fuck this.' Yet it's solid since we know it's something we can never escape from. It feels so great when you're scared of the other three. That keeps you on your toes."

"Considering the time and money, we'll keep at it. After all, we're responsible citizens and an extremely sober lot."

DEF LEPPARD - Let's Get Rocked (Mercury) Delivered to radio late last week and just as expected, it's one of the MOST ADDED a few days later. Though it's been five years since the release of Hysteria, an album that sold an astounding eleven million copies domestically, it seems like only three years have elapsed. That's because it hung around sprouting hit singles from '87 to '89. Word is their soon-to-be-released album, Adrenalize, will turn in just as strong a performance. There's no denying that if this first taste is any indication. Listeners should follow the group's recommendation on the pro-CD's sleeve and blast this puppy!

HOWARD JONES - Lift Me Up (Elektra) Another artist who's been out of the studio far too long returns with one of his all-time finest efforts. That says quite a lot, considering the catalog of this creative wizard. With his technical expertise and uncanny knack for writing the ultimate in Pop melodies, Howard has managed to bridge the generation gap, appealing to a broad cross section of music fans. None will be disappointed by his first offering of the Nineties.

SOPHIE B. HAWKINS - Damn I Wish I Was Your Lover (Columbia) When 1992 is done and gone,

WYNONNA JUDD - Wynonna (Curb/MCA) The lady does just fine, thank you, on her solo debut. Wynonna is understandably a tad more youthful in her approach now that she's in the spotlight all by herself. Her instrumentation is sensationalized a bit by some edgy guitar in places, as on WHAT IT TAKES, and she sings of many spiritual awakenings and "religious" experiences. With plenty of morality at play, Wynonna still gets her fingernails dirty on tracks like NO ONE ELSE ON EARTH. Wynonna's mom, Naomi, can be heard on at least one track, WHEN I REACH THE PLACE I'M GOIN', while stellar songwriting from the likes of Dave Loggins, Mike Reid, Andrew

we'll likely remember the debut of this singer/ songwriter from New York's Upper West Side as one of the year's musical highlights. It's not often when programmer consensus is this strong on a new song by an unknown artist, but in this case, it's totally justified. While it may never have been one of "The King's" greatest hits, it's included on a new ZZ Top Greatest Hits package and stands a good chance of becoming one of their biggest Top 40 winners. Elvis and Ann-Margaret starred in the movie of the same name in 1964, and if I was forced to guess which oldie the wild threesome would someday cover. this would hardly be near the top of the list. Maybe that's the point. Known for great videos, the band has outdone themselves this time, lending even more support to this outrageous track.

MR. BIG - Just Take My Heart (Atlantic) A year after they released the album Lean Into It, these rockers have bagged a big, big #1 song and there's no better way to get programmers' attention when it comes to a follow-up. Another easily accessible melody powered by lead vocalist and co-writer Eric Martin.

Gold, Kostas, Marty Stuart and Brendan Crocker make for an enjoyably eclectic blend of tunes. No great surprise, but the "relative" lack of harmonic vocals makes this project distinctly different from the usual Juddsquared formula. It's too bad this project comes on the heels of Mother Judd's retirement, rather than as a breakout, one-off project, where we would know for sure that mother and daughter would obviously reunite for the next big one. All that aside, we hear the beginning of a new era with all the potential of the old family act and more. My personal faves include MY STRONGEST WEAKNESS, SHE IS HIS ONLY NEED, A LITTLE BIT OF LOVE (GOES A LONG, LONG WAY) and ISAW THE LIGHT.

CONCRETE BLONDE - Ghost Of A Texas Ladies Man (I.R.S.) A far cry from their biggest Top 40 hit, "Joey," but then again, of the many things one might say to describe Concrete Blonde, "predictable," is not one of them. Top Ten on the Alternative chart since the beginning of the month, they take over #1 this week, and on the strength of this song and an exceptional album, they're due for an extended run.

MATTHEW SWEET - Girl riend (Zoo) A former Top Five Alternative winner that maintained high chart numbers for many weeks is now primed and ready for Pop audiences. Obvious Sixties' influences permeate the Sweet sound, but what really drives this tune home is a chorus that slowly sneaks up and never lets go.

CROSSOVER PICKS

KRIS KROSS - lumv (Ruffhouse/Columbia) Check out "Inside Top 40" for all the stats on this week's RECORD TO WATCH, which is taking off faster than a member of Congress leaving the House Bank (Oops-make that the former House Bank). These two twelve year-olds from Atlanta are about to bounce in only one direction-to the top of the chart.

BOYZ II MEN - Please Don't Go (Motown) One of the rare (and boy, were they ever rare) highlights at this year's Grammy presentation was this foursome's performance. Their awesome talent is evident once again on this fourth single from Cooleyhighharmony, which moves 35-27 on the Urban Contemporary chart and gets ADDed at: WHYT, HOT 102, Y95, KKFR, HÖT 97, KISS 108, KMEL, etc.
