# Wherehouse Sues Four Majors

When used CD sales moved from an indie-only phenomenon and into a major retail chain—Wherehouse—last spring, red flags went up at record distributors. In order to stem what they saw as what could be a loss of revenue, four companies took an unusual step: withholding co-op dollars from any retailer who sold them.

Now, the Torrance.

Calif.-based Wherehouse has lodged a suit against CEMA, Sony, WEA and UNI, charging that by yanking advertising from retailers who sell used CDs, the companies are engaging in unfair business practices. Though a monetary value hasn't been put on the action, a Wherehouse attorney said it could "get into seven figures."

"We're suing CEMA, Sony, WEA and UNI because they've enacted policies that unfairly discriminate against the Wherehouse and other retailers who sell used CDs," said Bruce Jesse, Wherehouse's vice president

of marketing communications.

Maxwell Blecher, attorney for Wherehouse, told GAVIN: "The record companies, for economic reasons, which have nothing to do with what consumers are being discriminatory.

"There's a federal law which prohibits manufacturers from offering advertising allowances on a discriminatory basis." The law he was quoting is known as the Robinson-Patman Act, which was enacted in 1914.

This move is the latest in escalating bitterness between the retailer and record labels that has been brewing since Wherehouse went into the used CD business. Labels, who already had begun to pressure independent retailers to stop selling used CDs, pulled Wherehouse's co-op dollars, saying, among other things, that both artists and labels lose rovalities

The 339-store chain is the only major player selling used discs. On Memorial Day weekend it took out full-page ads telling customers to bring in unwanted CDs, and in return receive \$3 off any new CD or cassette priced above \$9.99. This week, Wherehouse's

San Francisco stores are offering up to \$6 credit for unwanted discs. The defiance has angered CEMA president Russ Bach.

"Some view the used CD business as a small sideline, not worth the attention it has received," he wrote in a recent editorial. "But there is no such thing as a 'small sideline' when you are taking royalties from artists, producers, musicians and artist managers, and margin away from the record company."

"Oh, bunk," said Blecher.
"There's no copyright issue.
Copyright is gone on the
first sale. What happens after
that isn't subject to any
copyright law that we're
aware of."

Blecher said he and his clients gave each label a chance to explain why they were withholding advertising before filing suit. "Not one of the four suggested that it was a copyright problem."

It's been estimated that


used CDs brought in \$500 million last year. When Bach spoke to GAVIN in May he projected, "The used CD business could be up to 20 percent of the industry in five years."

Jesse is also miffed that other stores are getting advertising dollars he would be if his company bent to labels' wishes. "We're saying that, legally, you can't not give us advertising and promotion support while giving it to our competition," he said. "We don't believe that's fair or legal. We stand to lose millions and millions of dollars in advertising funds."

None of the labels involved would comment on the action.

"We haven't had the suit yet," said Margaret Wade, director of media relations for Warner Music Group, "but if we had we would not comment on any litigation."

"We can't comment," said CEMA spokesman Bob Bernstein.

# NYC Vs. Devil's Decibels

You could say that the decibels made them do it.

New York police officers, accompanied by inspectors from the Department of Environmental Protection, stopped and confiscated 22 cars early on the morning of July 17 in East Village and Greenwich Village, and they cited their drivers for blasting music too loudly from their stereos.

The officers, part of the two-year-old "Operation Crackdown" in New York City, set up traps to measure decibel levels of cars that passed their monitors between 10 p.m. and 2 a.m. Offending cars were impounded as evidence, and their drivers, who face fines of \$100 for the first offense, up to \$500 for the third, can reclaim them after their cases have been resolved.

The crackdown was the fifth in two years of "Operation Soundtrap," a city response to one of the most frequent complaints in the Big Apple.

The cars-known as

"Four-wheel boom boxes"—are considered illegal if they blast music at more than 80 decibels when a listener is 50 feet away. According to Ian Michaels of the environmental office, that level of sound is equivalent of a subway train pulling into a station—with the listener in the middle of the platform.

The boom box drivers, says Michaels, "are people who like their music loud and like other people on the street to listen to their music whether they like it or not."

# **Tasty Licks on Garth's CDs**

Garth Brooks' recent announcement that he wouldn't let retailers who sell used CDs carry his next release so upset some store owners that they've responded by having what might be called Garth-be-ques. Ragin Records, a store in Fresno, Calif., has one-upped the good ol' boy by taking all of his product off their shelves.

Over the past week, fans, especially in the West, have been "grilling Garth" for his decision. Terry Currier of Music Millennium, a record shop in Portland, Ore., was even pictured in the August 2 issue of *Forbes* as he took a huge bite out of a Garth CD slathered with mustard and dripping with all the fixin's.

"He (Garth) feels used CD sales hurt the amount of royalties he and his entourage make," said a Ragin spokesperson as he tossed another Garth on the barbie. "Garth Brooks has sold over 25 million records over the past three years. We feel he has made more than his fair share of money."

Does Garth, known for his generosity and loved for his humble personality, deserve such callous treatment? Maybe he can take heart in knowing his records are not only good—they're tasty.

KIIS slipped 4.3-4.0. Alternative scored big as KROQ moved 3.9-4.3. Howard Stern owns Tinseltown mornings, but his station, KLSX dropped 3.8-3.6...Chicago Urban station WGCI dropped 7.4-6.9, but it still leads the pack. Full service WGN is only .2 behind 'GCI at 6.7. When the last book came out, the two stations were over a point apart. Country WUSN goes 6.2-5.7 and WBBM/FM jumps 5.0 to 5.7, making it a tie for #3...Country still tops San Diego, even as KSON dips 7.9-7.7. Taking the prize is high-jumper KKLQ AM&FM which bounded 3.5-6.0. As in Los

Angeles. Alternative scored big, with XHRM going up to 4.6 from 4.0...Perennial San Francisco #1, News-talker KGO dropped to 7.6 as Sports station KNBR rode on the baseball Giants as well as Rush Limbaugh and nabbed a 6.1, up from 4.5. Top 40 mainstay KMEL dove to 4.4 from 5.3, while KSOL (Wild 107), they of the Bay Bridge tie-up stunt, accelerated from 3.6 to 3.9. Classic rocker KRQR adjusted its format and rose to 2.8 from 2.1...Philly's WMMR surprised with its 6.6, up from 4.1 and Country WXTU also took a big gain, 4.1-5.1...In Detroit Country WWWW soared 6.7-8.3, Urban WILB stayed flat at 6.3, Top 40 WHYT jumped 5.1-6.7 and Urban A/C WMXD went up 4.0-4.7...WXKS pushed farther into the lead in Boston with 8.3, up from 7.8. That puts

it 2.2 ahead of News/Talker WBZ. A/C station WMJX is at 5.7, up from 5.1...Top 40 is alive and healthy-more than healthy-in Washington, D.C. where WPGC hits 9.4, up from 8.6 and far ahead of #2, Country WMZQ, which also did extremely well, 6.6-7.2. Urban WKYZ jumped 4.1-4.7 which makes for a tie with A/C WGAY (4.3-4.7)...Baltimore Top 40 WERQ jumped 4.0-5-2...In Dallas, Country KSCC dropped to 8.0 from 8.8, while #2, News/Talk went up from 4.8-6.3. Urban KJMZ fell 5.1-4.3...In St. Louis, WKBQ, whose morning team was fired after using a racial slur, dropped 4.9 from 5.4... to Minneapolis Album station KWRS bounded 8.0-9.8...Top 40 WBZZ in Pittsburgh took a superhealthy move, 6.0-7.2...

Rundgren began the project over two years ago when he began to rethink his conventional approach to music. "I probably know more about computers than any other musician, so CD-I seemed to fit," he says.

Branson, who owns one of only three privately-held national frequencies in the U.K., wants to move his outlet, Virgin 1215, to an FM frequency. While Virgin 1215's album-oriented for-

mat has been wellreceived by both public and critics, it suffers from the reception problems inherent in the AM band.

Before the House of Commons com-Branson mittee explained that under his plan, now being studied by BBC engineers, the corporation would not have to give up any of its frequencies. In addition, if granted an FM frequency, Branson would return his AM slot to the BBC

According to the proposal, FM frequencies not fully utilized by the BBC could be used for a new network. Engineers also found that by supplying residents of a small town on the southern fringes of London with satellite dishes, the transmitter they are now using would provide FM service for 7-1/2 million people in the London area. It's estimated that since its inception Virgin 1215 has attracted three to four million listeners. If he succeeds in getting an FM band, Branson thinks he will have over 10 million listeners.

Branson Pushes for

Branson likens his new challenge to that faced by his airline, Virgin Atlantic, when it began.

"With Virgin Atlantic we

were initially confined to Gatwick (airport) and we had to battle to be allowed to fly from Heathrow," he says. "With Virgin radio, many millions of music listeners at last have a choice—but have to listen on an AM station- more suited to talk than music."

In 1990 the British government, for the first time, put up for sale one FM and two AM frequencies. It was stipulated, however, that the FM be used for a format "other than rock." When he spoke to Gavin in June, Virgin 1215 chief executive David Campbell said, "It would be wrong to say AM is an advantage, but I don't think it's as big a disadvantage as people think."

Characteristically, the

BBC and the National Heritage Select Committee is looking at Branson's proposal with caution. A Tory MP, John Gorst, called the tactics "foot-in-the-door broadcasting; you get your license, then seek to change it."

Heritage Committee itself was less than thrilled about the idea. "There is more money in pushing your records than in boring old farts talking about Masstricht on Radio 4," a Labour MP, Joe Ashton, told Branson.







WKSE-Buffalo PD Brian Burns said that today's young adult audience no longer sits still for the overblown hype of years past, whose worn-out slogans no longer hold any credibility. When it comes to putting callers on the air, Burns cautioned programmers to steer clear of unnecessary two-way talk that's little more than noise. He suggests asking off-the-wall questions, taping responses, doing some editing and coming out of music with a great call. The object is to create forward momentum, excitement and entertainment rather than have taking a call become an exercise in boredom.

Everyone agreed that relating as a real human and being in touch with the street should be a personality's goal. WNVZ-Norfolk, Va. PD Wayne Coy conducted a demonstration designed to improve a personality's ability to make meaningful remarks in short bursts over song intros; and it was warmly received. First, Wayne asked the disc jockeys present to take everything out of their pockets. Next, he instructed them to intro SWV's "Weak" and improvise a thought prompted by one of the pocket items. By doing this, Wayne made the point that ideas come from many things and can be conveyed with a few words. And it's a safe exercise to try at home.

Veteran personality and programmer Jim Elliott, now vice president, pop promotion at Arista, received applause when he commented that rigid format restrictions often prevent a jock from saying something on the spur of the moment. Jim talked about the frustration he experienced when he had a great thought but didn't have the freedom to open the mic and do more than a liner. He also talked of AM's heyday, when great jocks could be heard at great distances and influenced other talent. He said old tapes should be required listening for today's deejays. Jim also pleaded for the return of on-air emotion when introducing new music, and recalled hearing The Cars' song "Drive" during a music meeting. He jumped up and exclaimed how great the song was, only to be told, "There's no room for emotion here, this is a music meeting!" Jim said it's strange that PDs and other people in the biz often turn up the jock's voice or promos and then turn down the music. The listening public does exactly the opposite.

Moderator **Gerry Cagle**, VP/GM of *The Network Forty*, told the crowd that the greatest staffs are "people you need to bail out of jail about once a month." Playing it safe doesn't reap the same rewards as

Paige Nienaber of New World Communications echoed Ellion and Cagle's views and said he goes into stations and asks PDs to tell him about the concerns of their community. Sadly, he reported, most don't know. As an example, Nienaber cited that **WPGC** found that in **Washington**, **D.C.**, crime and violence were uppermost in the minds of listeners. But many programmers feel those topics are downers, and like to pretend they don't exist. But, according to Paige, the audience really makes an emotional connection when you hit their hot button with issues that directly affect them. He urged everyone to





# PENNY FORD I'll Be There (Columbia)

Ever since I saw Penny perform this track at a listening party I've been sold and patiently waiting for its release. Penny Ford will impress your listeners with uplifting vocals that soar on this "people come together" anthem. "I'll Be There" could be bigger than last summer's similarly styled, "One Song" by Tevin Campbell.

# JOHNNY GILL I Got You (Motown)

Johnny will definitely "get you" with this track. This first production venture by labelmates Boyz II Men is perfect for listeners who love Gill and at the same time are waiting for the next BIIM album. Johnny strong vocals mixed with the Boyz' harmonies are an unexpected treat. Sixteen mixes on the CD-Pro make choosing difficult.

With nearly 200 HEAVY reports, **Sting's** "Fields Of Gold" dominates the chart with only Tina Turner's "I Don't Wanna Fight" a near-term contender

With a 92% HIT FACTOR, **Steve Miller's** "Wide River" is approaching flood-level as it enters the top ten with more than half of all players in HEAVY.

Of the four singles from current films in the top ten the newest is **Celine Dion** and **Clive Griffin's** which debuts in the top ten this week with 183 players. This 5-week old version of a 33-year old classic, "When I Fall In Love," has an exceptional 81% HIT FACTOR.

HOTTEST track in the format is **Michael Jackson's** "Will You Be There" (which, lest we forget, is also from a movie.) Nearly 80% of the stations on it more than a week are already HIT FACTORing and the newest players include KBIG, K103, KIDX/FM, WBDX/FM, WOBM/FM, WIVY/FM, WGMG and WPXZ.

Biggest increase in HIT FACTOR belongs to "Rain" by **Madonna**, with its 32% leap from 5% to 37%. It's also the highest chart debut at #32 and third MOST ADDED behind **Billy Joel** and **Michael McDonald**. Among Madonna's newest are Y92, WKYE, WTSX, WAHR, WMT/FM and WOBM/FM.

# LISA KEITH "Better Than You" (A&M)







# MORE ABOUT MONUMENT VALLEY

he "new" Gavin debuted on April 30 with a beautiful cover featuring Monument Valley, Arizona-presented to make the point that the valley is one of only three places in the United States where a GAVIN station can't be heard. There are a few other places in the country where you can't get any radio station, such as sections of the south coast of Oregon, for example, and it's a spooky feeling to sweep the dial and hear nothing.

And yet you can hear radio stations in Monument Valley, and probably in all the other dial deadspots too, at night. There are still music stations on the AM dial, and some of them have powerful signals that bounce of the ionosphere at night and can be heard hundreds, sometimes thousands, of miles away.

One of the romantic aspects of being on an AM station at night was the people could be listening to you who were vast distances away-in

isolated areas where you might be the only companionship available! Satellites and cable systems provide a similar opportunity for some FM stations today, but not on the same

Not only cloes Gavin have more FM reporters than any other trade, but this magazine may be unique in having quite a few AM reporters, too, in mainstream formats such as A/C and Country. The skywave effect, which makes AM stations audible at night in places like Monument Valley, also creates major problems for AM stations. A good number of all AM stations in the U.S. have to change their mode of operations—power and/or direction of transmission—at sunset to reduce interference to distant stations, and some must still sign off at sunset. There is a lot more interference on the AM band at night due to the effect, both "under" stations and adjacent to them. The 10,000 Hz beat note, which can be heard on many stations at night on widerband receivers, is caused by the receiver picking up the carrier wave of a station 10kHz up and/or down the dial from the station being listened to. The AMAX AM receiving standard uses a sharp rolloff, often combined with a 10 kHz "notch filter," to eliminate this annoying tone on high fidelity AM receivers

Recently, the AM band was officially extended to end at 1700 kHz, instead of the previous 1600 kHz. Some broadcasters don't seem to be aware of the fact that the FCC has set these extra 10 frequencies aside specifically for interference reduction. The band is set aside just for existing stations "causing the most interference" on frequencies below 1610 kHz.


Stations moving to the new channels would be allowed to simulcast on their previous frequency for a period of time to allow radios with the new frequencies to penetrate the marketplace—after which the old facilities will be closed down.

There are many marginal and

daytime-only AM stations that will find it to their advantage to make this move-and the FCC has just begun the process of selecting the stations most eligible to do it, from among those expressing an interest. Check the detailed rules for applying for this opportunity.

The stations being assigned a frequency between 1610 and 1700 kHz will be able to operate nondirectionally with 10 kw daytime and 1 kw nighttime, and the stations will be widely spaced enough geographically to prevent sever nighttime interference. A preference will be given to those stations planning on transmitting in AM stereo on the new band.

The only stations not eligible for the new frequencies are the former Class IV's (now designated "Class C") on 1230, 1240, 1340, 1400, 1450 and 1490 kHz. If your station fits the criteria, and could benefit by such a move, check now with your communications attorney or your consulting engineer!

# Jazz/Adult Alternative **New Releases**

# PAT METHENY GROUP The Road To You (Geffen)

Pat Metheny turns back the clock with this live-in-Europe package by his full band. While Pat's solo opus, Secret Story, enjoyed success on the air and onstage, The Road To You was already banked for subsequent release. It's a refresher course and should hold us until Metheny's next move—rumored to be a live tour, starting sometime in October, with Joshua Redman and also featuring Brian Blades, the amazing drummer some of you saw at Joshua's Gavin Seminar gig and with Daniel Lanois. The Road To You contains some stunning remakes of Metheny's best tracks. One of the highlights is Metheny's crack solo on "Beat 70." Metheny is an expert at balancing synthesized effects with his guitar, and knowing when to move in and out of a pure guitar tone. Argentinean musician Pedro Aznar is his usual versatile self on voice and second guitar. While recent shows have suggested a more subdued Lyle Mays, by way of composing and featured cameo bits, TRTY signals a stylistic comeback for him. Check out his deceptively effortless acoustic piano fills on "Better Days Ahead" and on the confessional recital, "Letter From Home." Mays' keyboard work seems to have wormed its way back to the frontline of Metheny's sound. Meanwhile, Metheny continues his dominance of the Jazz/A2 format. He's forced other musicians to burrow down and come up with compositions that are more heartfelt, as opposed to being vehicles for technical ability, sappy ballads or hot-dog changes.

# RICHIE COLE **Profile (Heads Up)**

It's been too long since we've heard a new Richie Cole studio album with the pizzazz of Profile. Our memories of Cole is as a musician who likes to have fun with audiences in between songs. There's also a mischievious side to his playing. Cole will often inject zany, one-line phrases from other tunes in between his own speedy solos. Although Cole has his own set of heavy jazz influences-Phil Woods, for starters—there's nothing leaden about his presentation. Like Woods, he's a reliable technician, and both share that same brassy intonation. Whether it's a flailing bop workout like "One For Monterey" or some samba-charged tunes like "Festival De Samba" and "Paulo," Cole's saucy approach should enlighten jazz playlists nationwide. "Sarah" has that Hollywood noire vibrato down to a science. Special guest guitarist Henry Johnson locks on for the ride through the faster pieces and never lets up.

# I MOTHER EARTH Dig (Capitol)



Zealous hard-rock entrepreneurs I Mother Earth cut loose with their new album on Capitol records. If you're a fan of current rock throw on this CD and be prepared for an onslaught of '90s hardrock soaked in a cloud of '60s psychedelia. If it were possible to cross-breed Soundgarden with Santana and a dash of Pink Floyd you'd end up with I Mother Earth. Although their style can be compared to that of the great bands of the past and present, I Mother Earth has an unprecedented sound that's all their own, whether it be wailing

guitar jams or melancholy melodies. The first track, "The Mothers," offers a glimpse of the psychedelic tendencies that are apparent on the rest of the cuts. Edwin's throaty vocals mesh well with Jagori Tanna's tripped-out guitar antics and Bruce Gordon's wild bass. Further evidence of the bands acid-grinding effects can be found on "So Gently We Go," "Not Quite Sonic" (great guitar hooks on this one), "Lost My America" and, of course, the eight minutes and 19 seconds of "The Universe In You," which offers a welcome overdose of swirling guitar melodies. # MERCIFUL FATE In The Shadows (Metal Blades)



Heavy metal addicts won't be straying too far from their CD players after they put on the latest album from classic metal musicians Merciful Fate. Crank the volume to eleven and surrender to the evil guitar tantrums and eerie high, pitched-vocals of King Diamond. Loaded with slabs of guitar licks courtesy of Hank Sherman and Michael Denner, Merciful Fate's latest release, In The Shadows, is terrifyingly delightful. Hardly a glamband, and decades away from ever charting Top 40 (thank God). Merciful Fate deliver a metal sound that was forged in '80s but it's encased in a '90s style that showcases their infectious qualities. ## JOHN MELLENCAMP "What If I Came Knocking" (Mercury)

If both musically and promotionally, you sense an informality at work on the new John Mellencamp, methinks it's intentional. "What If I Came Knocking" is the first official taste of Human Wheels, the new album not due for another month. Gang-produced by Mellencamp and band (including producer Malcolm Burn), "What If I Came Knocking" sneaked in the back door, and eventually worked its way onto playlists everywhere. No stranger to live studio recording, this is Mellencamp at his most bare-boned. I like that dulcimer on the right channel.

## **DEEP PURPLE**"The Battle Rages On" (Giant)

And the battle, quite literally, does rage on. Deep Purple enters their "Giant" era with my favorite line up, the same personae that recorded *Machine Head* and *Made In Japan*. That includes Ian Gillan lead vocals, Richie Blackmore on guitars, Jon Lord on keys, Ian Paice on skins and Roger Glover on bass and control room. Quite appropriately, the mix is less cavernous and more seventies-style. Clocks in at over five minutes with no edit. Yippee!

#### SMASHING PUMPKINS Siamese Dream (Virgin)

You may recognize Smashing Pumpkins from the *Singles* sound-track. After forging underground success with *Gish* (on the Caroline label), Smashing Pumpkins make their major label debut with grunge-meister Butch Vig behind the glass. Before you point an accusing finger and cry, "Seattle! Seattle!" be forewarned that the band hails from Chicago and before Vig scored big success with Nirvana, he worked exclusively out of places like Madison, Wisconsin. Great stuff!

#### CONEHEADS SOUNDTRACK (Warner Bros.)

Nothing from France here. From the looks of this soundtrack, the Coneheads' taste in music is as diverse as their taste in food. Guns N' Roses' Slash makes his "solo" debut with former Hanoi Rocks vocalist Michael Monroe on a twisted cover of Steppenwolf's "Magic Carpet Ride." Supplementing unreleased tracks by R.E.M. and Red Hot Chili Peppers is a neutered cover of Donna Summer's "No More Tears (Enough Is Enough)" with k.d. lang singing Donna's part and Erasure's Andy Bell singing Barbra Streisand's. This set's as interplanetary as Beldar and Clar.

## The Alternative format is going through the pains that come with growth.

As Jonathan Rosen, the program director of KUKQ, puts it, "The format is at a crossroads." He remembers back a few years, "When there were 15 or 20 us. Now we're pushing 43 or 44."

It's a bit of push and a bit of shove, as rapid growth has generated debates and tough questions for all those on the cutting edge. Is it growth-or a plundering-that the format is experiencing? Are commercial Alternative stations still taking the kind of risks for which the original stations in the format were known? And with a record number of Alternative artists finding new homes at Top 40, has the cutting edge dulled?

Historically, Alternative radio has been looked at by the record industry as a viable means to break their developing artists. In the past, it was natural for an Alternative stations to go many cuts deep on a new artists' album, but an increasing number of Alternative stations are playing it safe, going for "mass appeal" numbers by playing established artists with proven, auditorium-tested track records. If Alternative radio is going to continue to develop and break the next R.E.M. or U2, it would seem beneficial to be more adventurous; playing a second single and going even further left of center.

Geffen's Mark Kates can clearly see

pluses and minuses of the situation. "I feel like I'm part of another generation




now," he says. "There's a generation of people getting into radio and working at record companies that were pretty young when this stuff was starting and don't have the emotional

ties to it that we do. It's hard for us sometimes, but let's face it, this (popularity) is what we always wanted, so we can't complain.

"We like the fact that they (the singlesdriven stations) rotate the records. If you have a song that works on these stations, it usually results in sales. But the lack of interest in artists' careers... well, let's just say it's a mixed blessing. As a label, we're extremely artist-and career-oriented, and that doesn't put us in sync with Top 40."

He continues, "These guys are in business to generate ratings and revenue. Maybe artists don't necessarily do that, I personally believe they do or AOR/classic rock stations wouldn't be in business?

With a long history in Alternative radio behind him, WFNX's PD Max Tolkoff adds. "There are some stations that are Top 40-leaning but

"We did it at 91X in 1983," he continues. "We signed on with almost a duplicate of KROQ's format. That lasted almost a year and then our numbers started to slip. We had to customize the format to the San Diego market. We had to be true to the rock and roll roots of the city—a different kind of rock station, but a rock station nonethe-

"Radio is a numbersdriven game and always will be," Tolkoff says. "Those 'play-it-safe' bands are the glue that holds this format together. It's what allows us to play Paw or Sebadoh. Rock Of The '80s songs have a half-life of 1,000 years," he laughs. "They're not even close to burning out!

"And let's face it," he continues, echoing Kates' sentiment, "It's what the industry has been screaming for for years. I was probably the one who was most skeptical about any more of these stations showing up but, now

that they have, I think it's great! It probably helps the format as a wholethe more of us there are, the less we can be pushed around.

KUKQ's Jonathan Rosen is in a fairly

unique situation in that the Phoenix

area now plays host to two Alternative

stations, long-time staple KUKQ and

upstart Edge station, KEDJ. Naturally, Rosen is bit more subdued than Tolkoff. "At the Gavin Seminar back in

February," he recalls, "I said that I didn't want to sound like an alarmist but that the format was growing. And not only would there be more stations,

but there'll be a number of markets with two stations. It's all coming to pass.

"I've felt it for a while," Rosen continues, "but obviously no one, including myself, thought it'd happen this fast. Personally, I think they should make their own format, call it Modern 40 and let them treat it like they did Rock 40,

Another long-time Alternative programmer, WXRT's Norm Winer, is also dealing with a direct Alternative competitor in the Chicago market—something he hasn't had to deal with in the station's 14-year history. He tries to see the positives of the situation.

"The positive good that's been reflected in Chicago is that WKQK (Q-101) made us focus more and concentrate on what we're doing," Winer says. "They made us more self-conscious and scrutinize what we do more closely.

It also caused us to be more aggressive in terms of the way we approach new releases, promotions and the marketing of WXRT. And with the intent of not

just sustaining our success, but with the additional goal of eliminating the threat of competition.

"These new stations tend to rely on a lot of the

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y stap rely f the

same devices (like BDS) they were accustomed to using when the people running them were in other formats," Winer says. "It might be easier for


record companies to relate to this methodology, but it doesn't necessarily reflect the impact of the station. So I play an artist 15 times a week and they play the same artist 30. Our listeners are very active and there's a quality vs. quantity factor to consider.

"Sometimes we will reserve judgement about the merits of a project until we've heard more than just the lead track," he continues. "We want to know there's substance behind an artist, and sometimes lead tracks can be very deceptive. We want to be involved with a solid record that's going to provoke interest. We want to be involved when the artist comes to town and follow them as their stature increases. We question the loyalty of labels who are obviously looking at their own short-term interests.


"The second thing that bothers me about these Current formatted stations is the danger that history's repeating itself in the vein of the Abrams Superstar stations of the '70s, where you'd go to Indianapolis, Hawaii or Chicago and the station's music would be identical," Winer says. "Nowadays, air personalities may be identical as well. You're hearing very little localization from a musical standpoint and to me, that defeats the purpose of an FCC

license. Every radio station in the country shouldn't be playing the same music. We should be entitled to pick out our icons."

"I think it's partially that attitude that's forcing record companies to develop other ways of breaking bands. We like to rely on something else besides radio airplay. Mercury's commitment to new bands and Alternative radio is at an all-time high. The company is pointed in a fresh direction and we're fighting to establish our bands."



RCA's Bruce Flohr takes this philosophy one step further. "There are some aspects of the Commercial Alternative panel that do tend to program for a mass audience,

and they're not as artist loyal. As labels, we have to make sure that artists put out better albums with stronger songs—make shying away from playing a second track a less attractive option.

"It also puts more pressure on the labels to do things other than work radio—marketing, publicity, etc. We're concentrating on having our record so set up that the Alternative station in the market we're concentrating on will be forced to deal with it, rather than *hoping* they're going to *want* to deal with it.

"We have to start looking at the big picture," Flohr continues. "These guys (at radio) don't often program on emotion. They're looking to pull in numbers so they can take this format to a higher profit level. We're looking to make money too, and since we're both trying to do it through music, there has to be a common ground somewhere."

Finding that common ground—one that is listener-friendly and artist-intensive—could be the biggest challenge facing the Alternative community. In order for this format to continue to prosper, a new generation of music heroes has to emerge. Radio must help them emerge. And record companies can aid this process by making sure their artists are producing the kind of albums heroes are made from. •

With many record companies taking an, ahem, alternative approach to radio in order to establish their artists, how do record companies seek out and make the most of these avenues?

The Question Man asks:

# How Do You Stay In The Streets? Inuch With The Streets? EX LINDA RYAN

## **BRUCE FLOHR**Director Of Alternative Promotion and Artist Development, RCA Records

Because I do both radio promotion and marketing, I have to look at the big picture. At RCA, we try to surround radio using other elements from a specific marketplace. Sometimes you can create something through the local retailers, local press or the local video channel. Then you can invite radio to the party. The marketplace doesn't demand great singles, it demands great bands. So in a sense, the idea of being connected to the streets is a myth, because the streets are completely different anywhere you go. It may only mean that you know what's happening in San Francisco, Grand Rapids or San Diego.

#### MARK KATES Director/A&R Geffen Records

There are other people that might buy your record that don't listen to any of the stations on the GAVIN panel. How do we reach them? Press, local video shows or getting a cool line up with a popular local band involved are a few ways. Local bands are important in a lot of cities and they often don't have anything to do with Edge-type stations.

As a company, we're in the process of addressing that in a more serious manner than before. The only way you can stay in touch with the street is to spend a certain amount of time there yourself. We try to have a field staff that's in touch with the streets. It's often hypocritical to ask people to be in touch with the streets and in

touch with radio at the same time, but we have people who are capable of doing that.

#### TIM HYDE

#### Director Of Alternative Promotion, Mercury Records

I think that as a company, we're looking more toward signing bands that already have an organic story happening. They have a nice fan base and a good sales base as well. I think when we look at bands these days we ask, "Hey, can this band survive without radio?" I look at that H.O.R.D.E tour that's happening and I think it's so cool. Bands like that—it's almost a homegrown thing. Those bands (Widespread Panic, etc.) have toured their asses off. It's not trendy. It gets back to real rock and roll.

#### **SHERI TRAHAN**

#### National Director Of Alternative Promotion, MCA Records

I think we try to keep the whole grass roots approach happening—tours, direct mailings, special promotions, etc. If you stay true to it, the bands don't really lose

to other formats.

We try to focus directly on the consumer. There are a lot of consumer magazines that do compilation CDs

even when they cross over

their 'alternative' image

now. That's one way of reaching the hip kids who are excited about music in the first place. We've used the subscription lists of a couple of hip magazines and turned them into mailing lists to tell those peo-

ple about our bands. We also collect names at shows and add them to our mailing lists. It's an approach that gets directly to the people. You can't get that over the air now, so you have to appraoch it differently.

We have the added problem of not being able to advertise at independent stores that sell used product. We haven't found a way around this problem yet.

#### **JEFF SUHY**

#### National Director Of Alternative Promotion, A&M Records

I go out into the clubs and so do the people I work with—there are people in our Alternative department that are very street-oriented. We've come to the conclusion that touring and guerilla marketing on the street level has become the

most important factor in developing a band's career.



Radio is, without doubt, the best tool; if you have great radio exposure, everything else falls into place. But you can't always count on radio to be there.

Sometimes everything else

can fall into place, making radio join in. To start something, we'll do everything from passing out cassettes of our bands at cool shows to putting cassingles on people's cars at the beach to doing "low-dough" shows so people can see a cool, happening band without spending a fortune. Aiming to break a band market by market using this street-oriented approach is a great thing, and has worked for us with The Gin Blossoms.

We're currently seeing great response to Paw's Eve Of Palooza "low-dough" shows, as well.

#### MICHAEL McDERMOTT Gethsemane (SBK)

We like this guy a lot. He loves to drink and write poetry. He's not afraid to venture into nine-minute territory when it comes to telling a story and he's been known to rock it up a bit. Oddly, McDermott never left America until last week when he ventured to Paris to soak up a week of cafe life before *Gethsemane's* release. Sorta Irish, definitely a Chicagoan, Michael McDermott is of rugged American stock—stock that went through the wringer of change

to bring us this latest batch of music. In making this record, McDermott visited his own Mount Gethsemane, fighting off the fear of the future. Would the business side iron out? Would he continue in music? "Need Some Surrender" deals with that uncertainty, surrendering to the uncontrollable forces and standing tough. With a rockin' new band, McDermott's one of the best of his genre-streamers of consciousness straddling Boomertown and Generation X with verse and big drums. You may find this necessary A3 edge.

Tracks like "Chains" and "Fade To Black" are Fly's most compact devices.

## STEPHEN BRUTON What it is (Dos)

If you've ever honky-tonked to the live sounds of Kris Kristofferson or Delbert McClinton, chances are you've seen Turner Stephen-or just Stephen to us-Bruton on guitar. Grounded in the same type of down-home reality as his friend Bonnie Raitt. Bruton's Austin debut stays close to the bone and—thanks to former Beach Boy Ricky Fataardeep in the pocket. Fueled by experience-driven, blues-crazed sidemen, Bruton never seems to let up. The first three tracks, "This Train Is Gone," "It Is What It Is" and the Rockpile-ish "The Face Of Love" represent straight-up testimony. The sad "Who's Fooling Who," however, is our favorite.

#### BETTIE SERVEERT Palomine (Matador/Atlantic)

File this one under "new to me." First off, there is no Bettie Serveert. It happens to be the name of this Dutch four-piece fronted by former roadie turned vocalist, Carol van Dijk. Way alternative, the band performs with clean tones and sings in perfect English. *Palomine* has lived on WXRT's playlist for months. I like the Velvet Underground/ Cowboy Junkie simplicity especially on the title track.

## OVER THE RHINE Patience (IRS)



The next 10,000 Maniacs? By virtue of their influences, listed on the cover (Dylan Thomas, Stan Getz, Leonard Cohen and Tom Waits). Over The Rhine are what you might call creatively ambitious. It's hard to distinguish any of the aforementioned influences inside the music, but that makes Patience all the more interesting. The band actually hails from Cincinnati, and they seem to have a keen interest in old-fashioned photography, woodcuts and Rilke poetry. The big challenge Over The Rhine ultimately meets is creating music as interesting as their graphic presentation, sepia-toned bits of postcard Americana. Over The Rhine are already enjoying success with "Jacksie."

#### PIERCE PETTIS Chase The Buffalo (High Street)

Chase The Buffalo is very much a band record. With an instrumental core that includes drummer Jim Keltner, Lobo David Hidalgo, Desert Rose John Jorgenson and Booker T. Jones, Pierce Pettis has spun outside of the folkie realm, his songs getting a wider, sonic treatment. His relaxing style blends especially well with Booker T.'s sheer curtains of Hammond B-3. Pettis has a voice not unlike Bruce Cockburn in that it keeps its even-keel no matter the passion of the subject he's tackling. Tracks include "Nod Over Coffee," a tribute to the felled songwriter Mark Heard.

#### HIS BOY ELROY (Immortal/Epic)

The first one-man band record I remember buying was Todd Rundgren's *Runt* album on the Ampex label. Every so often a new artist attempts to recapture that same daffiness. His Boy Elroy is Fly, who works his magic with a charming and warm demo feel. Like early Todd, Fly borrows melodically from various music forms, including sweet Philly-ish soul and ingenious retro white pop, never sounding too techno or overly sampled.



## **SMASHING PUMPKINS**Siamese Dream (Virgin)

Some two years after the stunning Gish album, Smashing Pumpkins deliver Siamese Dream. And despite all the rumors of the internal tension supposedly threatening to split the band, about the only things that have changed for the Pumpkins are the length of their hair and the quality of their production. Siamese Dream takes up where Gish left off-hypnotic guitar grooves intertwine with Billy Corgan's flexi-vocal to suck you into a druggy and addictive ecstatic dreamstate. Do you remember the episode of Lost In Space with the planet inhabited by teenagers who were kept mesmerized and dancing by groovy music and lights? If they remade that episode, they'd use Smashing Pumpkins. Anyway, Siamese Dream's production is a bit dirtier this time around, which works very well on the ominous, billowing, cloud-like tracks ("Quiet," for example), but the band and Butch Vig know to pull back the amped-up fuzz on the acoustic or string-accessorized ones. Don't be lazy, check out the entirety of this anticipated release. - SEANA BARUTH

#### DOUGHBOYS "Shine" (A&M)

After five years in indie purgatory, Canada's Doughboys deliver a heavenly offering on A&M, the so-cool-it-hurts single, "Shine." Written by the band and Mega City Four's Wiz, "Shine" is a power-pop lover's wet dream. Loaded with catchy guitar riffs and even catchier harmonies, it's impossible not to sing along—or keep your finger off the repeat button! Look for the entire album the first week of August. ## **PEACE TOGETHER**Various Artists (Island/PLG)

Here's another compilation worthy of your attention. By now, you've heard the single, "Be Still," and probably know that proceeds from this album will be put toward developing activities for the young people of Northern Ireland-both Catholic and Protestant-in an effort to step up the peace process. Prejudices are learned feelings, and can be "unlearned" through positive experiences, which the program would provide. There are quite a few favorites, including Therapy?'s version of "Invisible Sun," Blur's take on "Oliver's Army," a chilling version of "When We Were Two Little Boys," done by Hothouse Flowers' Liam O'Maonlai and comedian Rolf Harris (anyone remember his 1963 hit, "Tie Me Kangaroo Down, Sport"?), and Pop Will Eat Itself's "Games Without Frontiers." Again, a great line up and an even better cause - LINDA RYAN

## **TRIBE** Sleeper (Slash/Warner Bros.)

It's been a couple of years since we've heard from this Boston fivesome that links engaging female vocals with an aggressive guitar bend and a dash of keyboards. 1991's Abort was more truculent, whereas Sleeper opts for a subtle, more refined sound. "Miracle Of Sound" uses glossy vocals and sleigh bell tambourines to tell the story of a new band that plays "without their hands." First single, "Red Rover" begins slow but builds into a radio friendly chorus with a melodic guitar and elusive, piping keyboards. Perfectly cadent lines like "He must be there, I have these letters tied in twine," attest to the band's lyrical ability. The dull-edged chug of "Crawl's" guitars and its reckless vocals recall former days, while "Romeo Poe" reads as homage to fellow Bostonian Edgar Allen Poe. References to Poe's haunting "Annabel Lee" abound and Tribe again waxes poetic with lines like "Upon the velvet sinking I implore." "Mr. Lieber" is the winning hand that combines Tribe's strong suits of smooth vocals, biting guitar and accentuating keyboards.

## **SMOG**Julius Caesar (Drag City, P.O. Box 476867, Chicago, II 60647)

The low-fi world of Bill Callahan, ā.k.a. Smog, is filled with junkshop trinkets, genuine finds, and lotsa dust. For such simple entities, his songs-stripped-to-the-bone, unproduced offerings—cover a lot of ground. Some, like "Strawberry Rash," are engaging, meandering thoughts to ponder (trinkets), some like "37 Push Ups," are brilliant Lou Barlow-esque gems (finds), and some—"Stalled On The Tracks," for example—are uncharted noise paths featuring backwards slips and slups and overdone feedback (dust-get it?). Low-fi recording, to some, (like Gavin's Kent Zimmerman, who snorts almost every time he passes my stereo), eviscerates a songwriter and robs him/her of his/her power. I'd counter that only a songwriter whose material has true substance can shine in a lower-fi medium. Callahan, though spotty, makes his points with the undiluted impact of lyrics like these: "47 push-ups in a winter-rate seaside motel/And I feel like Travis Bickle/I'm listening to 'Highway To Hell'/It's a shitty tape I taped off the radio." That's "37 Push Ups," which, along with "When The Power Goes Out," "Chosen One," "Your Wedding" and "I Am Star Wars" are Julius Caesar's finds. Callahan, I'm told, has recently relocated to Northern California, so guesting on cello here is ex-SF Seal and ex-Flophouse member Kim Osterwalder. —SEANA BARUTH

## **LOVE BATTERY**Far Gone (Sub Pop, 1932 First Ave., Seattle, WA 98101)

Dig it, man, these guys are swell. No rumbling, grumbling, pissed-off Seattle grunge here—LB is merely a bit miffed. No incredible riffs, tricks or histrionics either, just quality songs drenched in plenty of fuzz and wah. *Far Gone* combines a definite retro feel with a smidgen

of folk and a whole lot of corrosive (pun intended) attitude. 4/4 beats, active bass and simple-yet-infectious guitar stylings establish the '60s/'70s-style psychedelic groove that propels the album's 12 tracks. With Far Gone, Love Battery prove they've matured a lot more gracefully than Seattle siblings (and former personal faves) Mudhoney, whose major-label signing caused many to write off the Seattle scene completely. Will Love Battery's pending major deal signal Seattle's rejuvenation or be a final nail in the coffin of its cooling corpse? Aw, forget the heavy questions-play this disc and a foot tappin', head bobbin' good time is sure to be had by all. PETE BURNESS



## SAVAGE REPUBLIC Recording From Live Performances 1981-83 (Independent Project Records, Post Box 1033, Sedona, AZ 86336)

This four-sided, 15-track 10" documents Savage Republic's early live performances, encompassing even their first show as Africa Corps. These are versions of live songs complete with imperfections and even an amusing betweensong, car with lights on/license plate announcement. Those unfamiliar with SR's experimental excursions into percussion are in for a treat. Long before Robert Bly began holding drumming sessions for men, there were men who got together to celebrate the tribal spirit on skins. "Ivory Coast" is introduced as a surf song, and this version sheds the more typical, driving surf beat to focus on more intricate, counter-beat drumming. "Real Men" is an angst-spackled mass of throbbing drums and raw-nub bass, and "Tragic Figure" skates from a reggae-flavored guitar riff to an Arabian section. Other notables are a raucous "Surfin' With The Shah" and the surging "When All Else Fails." The sound quality is fair to partly cloudy, but when the band hooks into one of their groove trances, the listener is transported.

#### TERENCE TRENT D'ARBY Delicate (Columbia)

In an era when some criticize Top 40 for playing disposable music, Terence's early hits remain cutting edge and continue to sparkle every time they're played. Unquestionably his finest effort since his dazzling debut in 1987. The video is featured on next week's GAVIN Video Magazine and it's one you'll want to watch again and again.

#### BABYFACE For The Cool In You (Epic)

"Cool" is definitely the operative word here. Babyface's awesome list of achievements in all facets of music place him among the most creative talents on today's scene. Add it now or add it later, but it's a must-spin.

#### **ROD STEWART Reason To Believe** (Warner Bros.)

It's a trip down memory lane with this touching Tim Hardin song, first sung by Rod on his album Gasoline Alley. The Unplugged and uptempo approach makes it fresh again for the '90s.

#### TONI BRAXTON **Another Sad Love Song** (LaFace/Arista)

Last week's RECORD TO WATCH is well on the way in sales and airplay, but expect the real blowout to come over the next few weeks. Another L.A., Babyface and Daryl

Simmons masterpiece by an artist with a great future.

#### **ROBIN ZANDER** I've Always Got You (Interscope)

Responsible for helping Cheap Trick sell millions of records during their long and successful career, former lead vocalist Robin Zander embarks on his solo career. Written by Mike Campbell of The Heartbreakers and I.D. Souther, it's the perfect vehicle to get it underway.

#### **BELL BIV DeVOE Something In Your Eyes** (MCA)

Can't remember a time when one artist was involved on three picks in the same week. But sure enough BBD's slow jam off the Hootie Mack album is written by Babyface and produced by him and partners L.A. Reid and Daryl Simmons. Put all six of these guys together and it's a powerful combination.

#### D:REAM **UR The Best Thing** (Sire/Giant)

Pronounced "DeeReem," the sound is forged by Irish songwriter Peter Cunnah and Scottish deejay Al Mackenzie. The pair blends a house sound with a just a taste of alternative. The track was voted "#1 Single Of The Year" by BBC Radio in London where it was a huge hit back in April. Todd Cavanah, APD/MD at B96-Chicago, says just about every club in town has it in power rotation. After three weeks on the air, it's number four in requests, with B96 playing Dave Morales' remix.

## Albums .....

#### SWEET RELIEF A Benefit For Victoria **Williams (Thirsty** Ear/Chaos)

By now you should be well

aware that Sweet Relief is a compilation of Victoria Williams' songs interpreted by some of this format's most exciting players, and that proceeds from its sale will be used to A) help with medical bills Williams has incurred since being diagnosed with multiple sclerosis and B) go to a fund established for other uninsured musicians. What I like most about Sweet Relief are the curveballs. So far, radio has played the heck out of established acts like Soul Asylum and Pearl Jam, and that's fine; they're great songs and great bands. But I like the songs that sort of hit from you out of nowhere—the ones that make you stop what you're doing and really listen. For me, the highlights on Sweet Relief are the tracks contributed by Buffalo Tom, Evan Dando, Shudder To Think. The Javhawks and The Waterboys. The stellar talent and worthy cause make Sweet Relief one of the most important releases this year.

#### **TAYLOR DAYNE Soul Dancing (Arista)**

Not many divas can get Cole + Clivilles, Narada Michael Walden, Ric Wake, Humberto Gatica and Shep Pettibone to wear producer's smocks all on the same album, but Ms. Dayne's "track" record as a hitmaker got the attention of the best, rhythmically-driven maestros. Dayne's dynamic vocal attack is the binding factor that ties this package up and keep it together. It's hard to ignore the set's first single, her smoldering cover of Barry White's "Can't Get Enough Of Your Love"

as it becomes a neatly tailored (no pun intended), instantly familiar entity. But the disc's opener, "I'll Wait," is a high-heeled, pumpedup dance floor dervish with swells of riptide melody as undercurrent to its ballistic meter. Well into the project come a couple of excellent new Diane Warren songs: "I Could Be Good For You" and "The Door To Your Heart." the latter a duet with Keith Washington, (both were produced by her longtime producer Ric Wake). Here's an album with the legs to still be giving up hit singles well into -RON FELL **'94**.

#### **TERENCE TRENT D'ARBY Symphony Or Damn** (Columbia)

From the moment you enter Terence Trent D'Arby's "monasteryo" you're treated, at face value, to an album of great music. On a deeper level, Symphony Or Damn is all about love, and the joys and pains it can bring to those involved. This is D'Arby's first album since



already had Alternative, Alternative crossover and MTV success with "She Kissed Me," and now "Delicate" (with guest vocalist Des'ree) is primed to be a multi-format winner. Other ear-catching tracks are the pleading "Penelope Please," the Prince-like "Wet Your Lips," "'T.I.T.S.'/'F&J' " (translation: Tension Inside The Sweetness/ Frankie And Johnny), the country-ish "I Still Love You" and the pensive close, "Let Her Down Easy." Don't miss D'Arby next month when he begins a tour with Duran Duran.

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
