Two Veeps Reportedly Set For Leaps at Warner Bros.

As the corporate atmosphere at Warner Bros. calms after a month of chaos, new company chairman Danny Goldberg has reportedly begun solidifying the label's corporate staff.

According to a memo circulated Thursday (November 17), Russ Thyret, currently senior vice president of marketing and promotion, and David Altshule, currently senior vice president of business affairs and general counsel, will be named vice chairmen.

Thyret has been with Warner Bros. for 25 years, Altshule for 20. Thyret is popular with company staffers, artists and managers, and will be a bridge between the old and new regimes at Warner Bros. Altshule is known as a good

deal maker.

"Both of these men are well-known to you, and I am thrilled that they are committed to work for us for the next several years," Goldberg reportedly said in the memo.

In the communique, Goldberg also apologized to Warner Bros. staffers with whom he has not been in contact. "There is no symbolism to the fact that I've spoken with some people and not others," he said.

Goldberg, formerly the president of Atlantic Records, took the chairmanship of Warner Bros. after Mo Ostin opted not to renew his contract and label

president Lenny Waronker declined to take the position. Goldberg addressed Ostin and Waronker's departure in his memo. "I don't delude myself that I could ever fill the shoes of Mo or Lenny, but I share their belief in the Warner Bros. staff, the Warner Bros. culture and, of course, the Warner Bros artists. I look forward to getting to know all of you better, and I am convinced Russ and David will help all of us go forward to have a spectacular 1995 and beyond."

Colorado Talk Host **Ouits Amid Accusations**

Amid threats and accusations from people who say his comments about President Clinton inspired a Colorado man to spray gunfire at the White House, Chuck Baker has quit his talk show on KVOR/AM-Colorado Springs.

Baker, 50, ended his November 15 show with a blast at his critics. "I'm leaving," he said. "I'm sure that will make you left-wing liberals out there very happy."

His show, which had been on the air for six years, was reportedly cited by Francisco Marin Duran, the man who fired 27 shots

White House last monthas an influence on him.

"So what if the jerk, the wacko, the creep...said that," Baker raged. "If this man thinks I or Rush Limbaugh are the reason he went out there, he needs psychiatric counseling in the first degree."

Two months before the shooting incident, Baker urged listeners to take action against Clinton's crime bill, which included a ban on some assault rifles.

That day, Duran called Ben Nighthorse Campbell's office, according

from an assault rifle at the to a spokesperson for the senator, identified himself, "and said, 'This is very bad. I will go to Washington and take someone out." KVOR GM Donn Seidholz

said Baker was overwhelmed by a flood of hate mail and calls after the White House incident and by rumors that investigators wanted to indict him for coconspiracy. that...exploded on him. He's trying to get his head together. He will come back to work eventually, I hope." Since Baker's departure, the station has received calls and letters urging his return.

After a successful year as general manager of Sony 550 Music, Polly Anthony has been upped to president of the label and senior vice president, Epic Records



KDIA Sold, But Its History is Secure

KDIA/AM-Oakland, Calif., at age 35 one of the pioneer urban/R&B stations in the nation, has been sold, pending FCC approval.

The buyer is San Francisco broadcaster, James Gabbert.

The station, first operated by the Sonderling Group, which also owned WDIA-Memphis, where the DJs included Rufus Thomas, is moving from black ownership (Oakland mayor Elihu Harris, wife Kathy Neal, and California Assembly Speaker Willie Brown) to white, and community groups have expressed concern over the possible loss of KDIA as an African-American voice. But Gabbert, who owns a UHF TV station and a Spanishlanguage AM, both called KOFY, said he would not tamper with KDIA's format, aimed at an adult urban audience with a mix of old and new urban music.

"I plan to bring back KDIA to what t used to be, when it was the Boss of the Bay," said Gabbert. (Actually, KYA was the Boss of the Bay, while KDIA was simply "Lucky 13.")

"We'll keep the rhythm and blues format," said



Gabbert, who is paying a reported \$3 million for KDIA, for which Harris and partners paid \$1.6 million in November, 1992. Gabbert said he would upgrade KDIA from 5,000 to 50,000 watts, provide additional marketing, and "plunge the station into the community."

If he does, KDIA could regain the luster it had in the '60s, when it broadcast the games of the Oakland

Raiders and the A's and had such DJs as a hip musician who moonlighted as a jock. On the air, he was Sylvester Stewart. On stage, he was Sly Stone. KDIA also served as a springboard for several now-prominent African-American broadcast reporters on television.

Said Dr. Michael Lenoir, who hosts a medical show on KDIA: "KDIA is an institution, (but) institutions have to be self-sustaining. African Americans come together to avert demise. They will need to rally to promote a living institution."

Eddie Vedder Offers Pearls of Wisdom

Eddie Vedder, leader of Pearl Jam, shed some light on his band's stand on ticket prices and merchandising in an interview with the Los Angeles Times.

In recent months, the Seattle band, whose third



album, *Vitalogy*, is just out, has been locked in a legal battle with Ticketmaster over ticket prices and service charges (GAVIN, November 11, 1994).

Talking with the *Times'* Bob Hilburn, Vedder noted: "Someone wrote a letter (in a magazine) the other day about 'Eddie (It's So Hard to Be a Rock Star) Vedder.' Well...it's not hard to be a rock star. If you want to go around (expletive) women and cleaning a bunch of

teenagers of all their dough because they like your band and charge them up the ying for T-shirts and concert tickets, that's easy. That's playing the game. What's hard is trying to stop playing the game...to try to treat people fairly and with respect..."

"Not for You," Vitalogy, includes the line, "All that's sacred comes from youth." The song, Vedder said, is about "how youth is being sold and exploited. I think I felt like I had become part of that, too...In the last ten or 15 years, there have been a lot of changes in music, and somehow the percentages being charged (by the concert industry) got out of hand. We also don't want to be part of all the marketing tools or whatever, but believe me, we have been...I feel awful about it and I'm not going to do it

KLOS Cranks Up the Turnstiles

In an effort "to continue to evolve into a more contemporary rock station," as program director Carey Curelop put it, KLOS-Los Angeles has overhauled its DJ lineup.

Beginning with the dispatching of long-time album rock jock Gino Michelini in

late October, KLOS, which had experienced ratings declines over the past year, cranked up the ch-ch-changes in mid-November by firing two other veterans, Bob Coburn and Jim Benson.

The station has gone to crosstown KNAC/FM for

replacements, hiring Long Paul and Remy Maxwell, and promoted fill-in Randy Maranz to a full-time shift, taking the mid-day, 10 a.m.-2 p.m. shift. Michelini's 2-6 p.m. shift goes to Long Paul, while Maxwell covers the 6-10 p.m. slot formerly anchored by Benson.

BMI Sets Up Rate Court

BMI—and its licensees—can now take any disputes to court.

The organization, which collects and distributes performing rights license fees for more than 150,000 composers, writers and publishers, said that the U.S. District Court in New York has granted its motion to establish a rate-setting procedure through the court.

Clients will be able to apply to the court if they cannot reach agreement with BMI on fees.

"BMI," said president/CEO Frances W. Preston, "has always been...committed to negotiation rather than litigation. However, if negotiations do not produce a mutually agreeable outcome, having an established rate court

will help resolve the matter..."

Anyone seeking permission to play music licensed by BMI will be automatically licensed. If, after 60 days, the parties don't agree on fees, the user can apply to the court for a determination of a "reasonable" fee. BMI said its rate court is similar to, but separate from, ASCAP's rate court.

Seminar '95 Will Be Radio-Friendly

The GAVIN Seminar will be a catalog of call letters if early response to the New Orleans venue is anything to go by.

"We are looking forward to our biggest radio attendance ever for our tenth anniversary Seminar," says GAVIN CEO David Dalton.

"The event has always enjoyed a national attendance



from across the country but, having been in San Francisco for nine years, we didn't realize quite how many more stations we could

reach simply by relocating," says Dalton. "In fact there are numerous major or secondary markets within driving distance of New Orleans."

To cater better than ever to radio, several new services and sessions are being added to the mix. For instance, Seminar attendees will be able to "Sign Up For Service," whereby GAVIN will process requests for record service from radio stations and make sure they get into the hands of the appropriate record company executives.

"Instead of having to track people down during the Seminar, or raising the issue of record service during precious session time, people can fill out a simple form at the Seminar Information Desk and we will take care of the rest," Says Dalton.

The deadline for early bird registrations is fast approaching. To receive the \$290 rate, registration cards must be returned to GAVIN postmarked December 16. If you have not yet received registration details, phone the Hotline number immediately.

'I'm Virtually With the Band'

A couple of new CD-ROMbased video games are aimed at wannabe rock stars. Ahead, Inc. has introduced the Virtual Guitar and Quest for Fame game featuring the new Aerosmith song "Walk On Water."

The Virtual Guitar is every closet rock and roller's dream. Weighing in at



under five pounds, it feels and sounds like a real guitar. By plugging into a computer's serial port and connecting to the accompanying CD-ROM, the guitar supplies the proper notes, while the players provide rhythm. Aspiring players without real guitar experience strum songs like the Gin Blossoms' "Hev Jealousy" (or any of seven other tunes) while a video of the rest of the band appears on the screen.

The computer animation is where the game truly

becomes an interactive experience. Characters in the virtually real town of West Feedback critique your playing, and have no qualms about sending you to the polyester lounge if it isn't up to speed.

Dino Valenti Dies at 51

Dino Valenti, whose song, "Get Together," became an anthem of the '60s generation and who was a lead singer in Quicksilver Messenger Service, is dead at age 51.

The singer-songwriter, who died November 16 at his home in Santa Rosa, Calif., underwent brain surgery several years ago, but no specific cause of death was announced.

Born Chester Powers in Danbury, Conn., Valenti, whose songs were also

credited to Chet Powers and Dino Valente, worked New York's folk clubs before moving to San Francisco in the early '60s.

His "Get Together" became a hit in the hands of the Youngbloods and gained further exposure via Jefferson Airplane, the We Five, and other groups. It also came to symbolize the vulnerability of artists, as Valenti reportedly gave up the publishing rights to the song for some \$500 cash that he needed to battle a one-toten year sentence on a dope bust. He was imprisoned for nine months and expressed no regrets for the lost royalties from the song. "For ten years of my life," he said, "I can write another song."

Valenti also wrote "Hey Joe," which was recorded by Jimi Hendrix and the Byrds, made one solo album several with Quicksilver, scoring with "What About Me" and "Fresh Air."

Valenti is survived by a sister and two sons.





Inside Top 40

Cruise Austin, Texas on any Wednesday and odds are you'll hear lots of radio listeners exclaiming. "Oh wow!" The reason? After more than a two-year run people temain hooked on KHFI's weekly retro feature Wayhack Wednesday, during which the Top 40 outlet breaks format from 5:30 in the morning to 6:50 at night.

Such a radical departure from "normal" programming is common if it happens at a lunchtime or over the weekend, but devoting more than 12 prime hours once a week to late '70s and early '80s Top 40 hits would be considered suicidal by most programmers.

KHFI PD John Roberts, who inherited the idea from former PD Roger Allen agrees, saying it's unlikely he would have signed off on it for all the obvious reasons, such as throwing off cume, not meeting listener expectations, etc. But he didn't blow it out when he arrived in town because he quickly realized that it was working. "It's the hottest feature on the station, generating cume that isn't with us the rest of week without losing KHFI's core audience," he says. We get tremendous at-work listening, but the biggest part of the story is that we generate exclusive country cume who only tune to us on Wednesday and listen to country the other six days of the week!"

Rather than try to canonize this music, Roberts' jocks present it with a "tongue in cheek attitude." But they don't ever make fun of it. Instead, they have fun WITH it. Another key element to the feature is the cinematic production that surrounds the music. "It's the air talent and production that makes it all cool and acceptable to both young and older listeners." Roberts claims.

As for the music mix, a recent noontime hour included: Cvndi Lauper's "Girls Just Want To Have Fun," the Ohio Players' "Fire," Men At Work's "Overkill," Donna Summer's "Last Dance," After The Fire's "Der Kommissar," the Hues Corporation's "Rock The Boat," K.C. & The Sunshine Band's "Get Down Tonight," Duran Duran's "Hungry Like The Wolf." Claudja Barry's "Boogie Woogie Dancin' Shoes," the Four Seasons' "December, 1963 (Oh What A Night)." Tavares' "More Than A Woman" and Michael Jackson's "Billie lean.

Now that country also-ran KHHT has flipped to '70s oldies, some are wondering whether Roberts will drop Wayback Wednesday, but he denies that's even a consideration. It's a go TFN but up for review every 90 days, he reports. Though Hits 93 plays '70s, Roberts points out that their music mix of 40 percent classic rock, 30 percent A/C hits and 30 percent of what KHFI plays makes it vastly differnt in style and texture, and as of yet it hasn't made any impact. Roberts also acknowledges that since KHFI is Austin's only Top 40 station, Wayback Wednesday is less risky because listeners have no other option. But he also argues it makes a case for breaking the rules and taking chances, a novel concept for many managers. Meanwhile advertisers are lining up to get on the air, and sister station WRVQ-Richmond is now airing a similar all-day feature, Flashback Friday. Roberts, however, prefers Wednesday when, hopefully, those diary keepers are getting ready to as he says, "fill 'em out and get 'em in the mail." So far, it's a plan that's working.

mall Market Success" takes you to Waukegan, Ill., which is located in one of the state's largest counties, Lake County. It was also comedian Jack Benny's hometown and is home now to Great America, one of the nation's biggest theme/amusement parks. Playing the Top 40 hits for Waukegan is WXLC, better known as Hot 102.3. Music director Dave Michaels provides us with some insight about the station and its listeners.

Your station is located about 40 miles north of Chicago and 40 miles south of Milwaukee. What does that do to your positioning?

It puts us in a great situation. We're the only mainstream station in either city or in between. But we're too far outside either city to even try to cater to them. We concentrate on what's right here. Lake County is very loyal to us.

What does Lake County have to offer?

Business and home starts are way up. In fact, 49.4 percent of the people living in Lake County have moved here in the past five years.

This must do great things for you promotionally.

Great America is practically in our back yard, so we're very involved there. Hot 102.3 is also connected with the Big Brother/Big Sister program here and Lambs Farm, a home for mentally challenged adults.

Do the stations in Chicago and Milwaukee have a great affect on your station's goals?

They have an effect musically, but they're niche-oriented formats. The closest competitor we have musically is Q101 (WKQX)-Chicago because of their Top 40 approach to new rock. Our main goal right now is musical consistency. In the past few years this station has leaned adult Top 40, rock

Top 40 and new rock. Our corporate office is very supportive and we're now ready to give our audience a mainstream Top 40. We also need to be able to give our salespeople an entertaining and effective product to sell

Is your general manager very hands on?

He stays involved in all areas, but concentrates on the sales. He lets the department heads run their departments

Tell me about your communication with the local record retailers.

We talk with them weekly. It's great because I know we're selling music in this market. Des'ree's "You Gotta Be" is the number five selling single in the area and we've been the only station playing this song. We're also playing the Rolling Stones' "Out Of Tears" 48 times a week and it's the number six selling single. We watch what's selling and they watch what we're playing.

Do your record reps notice?

Some labels pay absolutely no attention to us and with others, we have a great relationship. I'm treated the same as everyone else by labels like MCA, Warner Bros., Geffen and Mercury, but others could care less. I recently had to go buy a record just to get it on the radio, and that was because my calls and faxes went unanswered. It's been over 50 calls easily. I realize budgets don't call for giveaways similar to major markets, but can't you at least return my call and service me with a CD-single?

Any last comments?

I'm really glad to see that the Top 40 format is actually making a comeback. I believe that there'll always be a place for Top 40 on the radio.



What do you hope to accomplish at Scotti Bros/Streetlife?

I want us to establish a winning Urban music devision. I'm fortunate to be working at a company that wants to be involved with urban music at a time when many companies are eliminating their urban departments and rosters.

What was your first music industry job?

I interned at RCA and at SBK where I was given encouragement and the opportunity to learn. My career really took off from there. I got a job with A&M records while I was

attending Georgia State and I left them to become Peabo Bryson's road manager. From that point on I was on the fast track. I went over to Light records which, with artists like Edwin Hawkins and the Winans had a strong gospel music roster. How are things different from when you fgirst started in the business?

. If you want to be more that competitive you have to remain in touch with the community. You have to remain in touch to what's happening now and what going to come. What is your impression of radio? I think that radio lacks vision. Radio is looking for the same type of sound, or style. We have to go beyond that because all listeners are not the same.

Do you think that radio is the best way to break a record?

The best way is to get it to the public—to reach the buyers period.

That's where your street team comes in. Labels that are successful have a strong street team.

What do you think of formats such as A/C and Top 40 adding black artists out of the box? Do you think of that as a benefit to a company like



yours?

Absolutly. Artists shouldn't be pigeonholed into doing one thing. It's good for them reach to out and gain a new audience.

KEITH MURRAY "The Most Beautifullest Thing In The World" (JIVE)

The latest disciple to emerge from the "Green-eyed Bandit" (Eric Sermon) camp, Keith Murray comes with a smoove-but-rugged flavor on his debut. Rolling along to the boomin' beat of the Isley Bros. classic jam, "Between The Sheets," this track is ripe for the Urban airwayes. Not to mention that Keith flexes his vocal chords on the chorus, singing "the most beautifullest thing in the world" in all his mellowed raspy glory. The remix juices up the track with a little help from Bootsy Collin's smokin' track "Bootsy Gets Live." Rugged around the edges, yet smooth as glass, this track delivers a whole heap of soulful funk.



In the last few years, as formats split from each other and radio became more fragmented, the ranks of independent promoters has swelled.

For many, making the plunge isn't easy. Independent promoters still, to some extent, suffer from the payola-wielding image portrayed in books like *Hit Men*, and the insensitive "cement shoes" jokes just don't seem to die.

But despite the innuendo, indies are thriving. Joining the established companies such as Jeff McClusky and Associates, who have been around for 14 years, are promoters who have spent years with labels, only to be let go when the faces in executive suites change. Instead of going back to another major, some have found it easier to hang out their own shingle and cash in on the contacts they made over the years.

However, despite experience and hard work it's still hard to shake the image. "There is still, unjustifiably, this image that independents are thugs," says Harry Levy, who started his company, radio Active, four years ago. "Even people outside the industry look at us with suspicion."

Tom Barsanti, a senior vice president with Jeff McClusky, acknowledges that indies have a less-than-savory image, but says it's never been attached to his company. "We've always had a different image. We're businesslike and have never been viewed as anything other than straight ahead."

What do indies offer that supplement the majors? "Focus," says Levy. "Record company people sometimes get caught up with corporate issues. "We're able to put all of our energy into a job, and because of that we're able to get results."

"Our level of service is higher because the number of stations we work with is much smaller, so we have a solid personal relationship with them," says Barsanti.

Starting up an indie and keeping it going isn't as easy as printing up business cards, calling old friends and staying on the phone. Independent promotion is becoming more and more competitive, and it takes real work to stay in the mix. "You always have to keep changing," says Levy. "If you get complacent, you're screwed."

What you may not know is that it's not only labels that rely on indies. They're hired by, among others, managers. And publishers can make up as much as ten percent of an independent promoter's business.

Despite the growing legion of indies Levy says the competition that exists between the majors isn't a factor in independent promotion. "People think that indies compete with each other, but that's not always the case," he says, and mentions McClusky as a company with whom he has a close relationship. "We have a let in common."

What indies don't have in common, anymore, is a bad image. Those days are over.

"It's like being a detective," one said. "You have to get a bloodhound and try to track

down payment on something you delivered on weeks and weeks and weeks before."

have 100 stations at the three plays per day level and Williams' newest is flat-out the HOTTEST growing track in the entire format with its Spincrease of 804 this week. Four weeks out and 182 stations are on board. It should clear the magic 200 level next week.

Richard Marx is wasting little time getting back on the chart's higher rungs. "Nothing Left Behind Us" is averaging better than 40 ADDs a week and spins are over the 3,100 mark in just four weeks. New this issue for WKWK, KTDY, KUDL, WALK, WRQX and KMZQ.

If you remember our old HIT FACTOR stat where we showed how well tracks do when played (what percentage of a record players reported good rotations), then you'll appreciate the current spins per station stat on **Melissa Etheridge**'s "I'm The Only One." Only Madonna's "Secret," at 28.51 gets more spins per playing station than Melissa's 26.9

Steve Perry's "Missing You" is ripping up the charts where it's now at #17 with 164 players. It has been

"found" at KLSY, KUDL, WTPI, WMXV, WBMX, KDMX, K103, KQXT, KESZ, KXYQ, K101, WDEF, WMGN and K99.

Top chart debut this week is **Jon Secada**'s "Mental Picture," which beats out our Top Tip, **Dan Hartman,** by two ranks. Secada's also the #1 MOST ADDED with 48 new, while Hartman is #3 MOST ADDED with a 570 spincrease.

Last week's RECORD TO WATCH, **Des'ree's** "You Gotta Be," takes a 201 Spincrease this week. There are only 28 stations playing it, but it's getting 23.36 spins per week on average at its playing stations. Top spins include WMXV, KXYQ, WBXX, KVIC KGRC and K99 at 30 or better already.

one begs for airplay and probably the majority of the "yet-to-plays" are coming from stations still bangin' the old one, "I'll Make Love To You. "Nevertheless, it's #2 MOST ADDED with 38 new like KBLQ, KVYN, WKHI, KYMG, WASL, WJLK, WCKQ, K101 and WALK.

The aforementioned Tom Petty single, "You Don't Know How It Feels," debuts this week at #40 with a spincrease of 244, while Carly Simon's "Like A River" now tops CHARTBOUND with a third of the format playing it and spins nearing 1,000 thanks to a spincrease of 229 this week.

The vocals are more clearly understood and the arrangement is, shall we say, more American? And it is the "third" single from the album.

KENNY G "Have Yourself A Merry Little Christmas" (Arista)

This is the sexiest sounding Christmas song of the decade. At least that's how this standard is laid-out by the master of the sax. It's reason enough to buy G's new album, *Miracles—The Holiday Album*.



RESPONSE FROM BOISE

In my September 16, 1994 column, country programmer Al Hamilton of KKAJ-Ardmore, Okla., wondered why many of today's country hits, such as "Queen of My Double Wide" convey a "hokey country bumpkin image." He added, however, that he proudly played them because they're good songs. "I have never let my personal opinions interfere with my music judgment," he said.

Drew Harold, music director of KBOI/AM in Boise, which has an FM country sister KQFC, writes, "Some (not all) of Al's listeners do live in that big double wide. In this day a double wide is just like a new home, and those kinds of songs are certainly entertaining to most."

Turning to another topic Drew comments, "As to your continuing statements about AM stereo, you couldn't be more right. KBOI has

been AM stereo since 1985, and a full service station since Martha wasn't even a Vandella. We still have great ratings and great revenue. The right mix of personalities, news, sports, airplane traffic reports and the right A/C music will keep us alive for years to come. We have found that people come to us for music and news...people ask us how we do it; there are three items that lead us to success: localize, localize, localize."

It's contrary to the myths of the business everybody seems to believe, but if you program a music AM station the way your listeners expect you to, the statistics from many different markets of all sizes show that you can succeed handsomely. The key is meeting listener expectations. If you have an AM with a big cume and a small share,


you are not meeting your own listeners' expectations. Identify the expectations and fulfill them, and the share will rise. But responding by changing format simply dissipates the cume and leaves you nothing to work with.

And then there's that matter of AM stereo, KFOD/AM-Anchorage evening personality Dave Taylor has been using the inexpensive Sony SRF-42 AM stereo/FM stereo Walkman radio to promote the A/C station's AM stereo presentation. I met Taylor recently, and learned that his promotional efforts on behalf of the AM stereo, mostly voluntary, include taking a demonstration display to every personal appearance he makes, setting up a permanent demonstration in the station's lobby, and giving the little Walkman-type radio away on the air.

Taylor has gotten enough consumer demand for this radio at Anchorage retail stores that this Walkman is now being sold in Radio Shacks there. Remember that Radio Shack seldom, if ever, sells merchandise not in its own catalog. If Dave can accomplish all of this in his spare time, other programmers can do it in their respective markets.

There are now some 25 million cars and trucks with AM stereo installed as factory equipment driving the streets and highways of the United States, and most of them flip to stereo automatically when a stereo station is tuned in. The market is there and the sound quality is exceptional.

Jazz/Adult Alternative New Releases

GERI ALLEN TRIO TWENTY ONE (BLUE NOTE)

It was when she was a trio pianist with Paul Motian and Charlie Haden that we first felt Geri Allen's spark. Now she re-energizes her trio chops with Ron Carter and Tony Williams on Twenty One. Like Allen, Carter is very technically oriented. On the ballad, "Old Folks," he displays some snippets of flashy fingering and on "A Place Of Power," Carter's walking pattern is a curious backdrop to Allen's avant garde clusters. Williams, on the other hand, is graceful and inventive with his rhythmic crescendos. Allen, while not your traditional swing merchant, adapts an edgy, free jazz-inspired technique into something tangible and perceptible.

AVENUE BLUE featuring JEFF GOLUB (BLUEMOON)

Avenue Blue is a musical concept featuring session guitarist Jeff Golub. As he learned from his own successful A2 project, producer Rick Braun gives the soundscape a cool noir. "Stockholm" thrives on mystery and subdued arrangements, but Golub and producer Braun are especially adept at recreating nifty, elemental rhythm tracks on top of famous oldie soul classics and using them as tasty solo guitar vehicles. "Pick Up The Pieces" is an economic silhouette of the original AWB party song. Golub massages the well-known melody line over a bed of congas, organ fills and a funky drum loop. On EWF's "That's The Way Of The World," Golub dabbles with a smooth Wes-styled octave swing. The Spinners' "I'll Be Around" gets the smooth urban treatment with a tight combination of vibes, a James Brown-like snare loop, R&B female vocals. The self-penned "West Side Serenade" is sensual and cinematic as Golub cuts a bluesy pose reminiscent of '60s Atlantic Records soul.

LEON PARKER ABOVE & BELOW (EPICURE/EPIC)

Leon Parker is much more than your garden variety, "tish-tish-boomboom" drummer. He's a multi-dimensional percussionist who expands past conventional high-hat, snare and bass drum back beats. Wood blocks, a single cymbal, impeccable stick work and hand drums figure into a fuller net. These antics on "BBBB" into the hypnotic "Evy" work especially well under Joel Dorn's spatial production. For more spare cadences try "All My

VANESSA WILLIAMS "THE SWEETEST DAYS" (MERCURY)

The reality of major market A2 radio is that there is now a place on the playlist for pop singers like Mariah Carey and Gloria Estefan provided the song has the right feel. While most of us in A2 discourage the track-by-track mentality, it would be hard to ignore Vanessa Williams' current single. "The Sweetest Days" is a sensitive and crafted ballad just right for a format that's adding more vocal numbers. This pretty tune will throw your audience a nice curve and elicit requests.

NORMAN HEDMAN FLIGHT OF THE SPIRIT (MONAD)

One gets the feeling that we've heard a lot from Norman Hedman without realizing it. He's a percussionist who, over two decades, has played with a diverse collection of talent that includes Darryl Hall, Sister Sledge, the Spinners and New Kids On The Block. Like many session players, Hedman chose jazz/A2 for his instrumental debut project. While a track like "Only You" qualifies for the urban smooth set, he follows up with "Sweet Thing" and features a more aggressive blend of jazz piano. "Island Spice" has a rich, exotic rhythm base of conga and drums. But wait. Our favorite cut is the title tune, the set's prime jazz crossover number with its fine soaring improvisation between Jay Lock on vibes, Alex Foster on soprano sax and Charles Blenzig on piano. Dig out Hedman's latest and give it a shot.

JAN HAMMER DRIVE (MIRAMAR)

Jan Hammer has managed to diversify himself at crucial times throughout his career. When the original Mahavishnu Orchestra split up, Hammer's solo career spiced up by touring with Jeff Beck. When his solo career wound down, he made an impact doing the music for the Miami Vice television series. Several movie scores later, his music for the computer graphic video Beyond The Mind's Eye hit platinum pay dirt. Now *Drive* is his return to recording non-soundtrack music. He brings in Jeff Beck and Michael Brecker as special guests and while sounding decidedly pop/A2, there's jazz chord progressions hidden inside songs like "Curiosity Kills" and "Peaceful Sundown.





Perhaps Nick was too juiced to crash the sessions, but lots of international travelers did. Here's a gorgeous selection of music that will tickle your world music itch. Most of you will be drawn to Van Morrison and the Holmes Brothers 'opening track. Our fave is Jam Nation's skulking funk version of the traditional "She Moved Through The Fair." Other cool ones are Lucky Dube's "War And Crime," the beautifully breezy Ashkhabad's "Bayaty" and Karl Wallinger's improvisational "Politics."

DIONNE FARRIS Wild Seed-Wild Flower (Columbia)

If you had the unfortunate fate of being a fly on the Zimmermen wall over the past two week, you would have heard a lot of this one. Dionne Farris (formerly of Arrested Development) has recorded a fantastic rock R&B album that's readily A3 adaptable. Using layers of soul vocals, guitar licks and simple rhythms, Wild Seed-Wild Flower is a '70s throwback and a '90s throw forward. With the recent conquests of Seal and Boxing Ghandis, R&B soul seems to be surfacing as a worthy ingredient for A3 radio. Do yourself a huge favor and live with this one awhile and see if this one don't thrill ya. We love "Passion," "Reality," "Don't Ever Touch Me (Again)" and "Now Or Later."

THE BOTTLE ROCKETS The Brooklyn Side (East Side Digital)

Wethinks we've discovered a real hip new label. East Side Digital (who brought us the stunning Blood Oranges) has two new releases coming your way-The Spanic Family and The Bottle Rockets. Hailing from sunny Festus, Missouri, The Bottle Rockets recall a time when bands like Brinsley Schwartz and a young Dave Edmunds ruled the earth. The Rockets are valiant rocketeers. The Brooklyn Side unapologetically mixes "analog tape hiss, a single coil guitar hum, tube crackle and truck noise" with their superior blend of quartet rock. While these guys might look like trouble at a truck stop, their brand of rock n roll is brimming with love and happiness. Keep it comin'! "Gravity Falls" and "Welfare Music."

PHIL ALVIN County Fair 2000 (Hightone)

We found Phil Alvin's *County Fair* 2000 a fascinating slice of Americana. This is somewhat of a concept piece,



sorta Tommy meets Elvis's Kid Creole. Enlisting lots of blues friends, rockers, gospellaires and jazzbos, *County Fair 2000* is yet another Great American adventure. Phil's a smart cookie—a mathematician best known for duking it out with his brother Dave during the Blasters' heyday. In addition to having recorded with the late legend Sun Ra, Alvin seems to have a knack for mixing roots with progressive spirit, which he does here with confidence and skill. There's a lot to discover here, starting with "Keep In Touch."

Every major-city-dweller I've spoken with in the past few days has spouted the same refrain: "There were so many great shows here this weekend!" San Francisco was no exception—The Wedding Present, Spell, American Music Club, The Wandering Stars and Zumpano all played club shows that exceeded my (often extremely high) hopes. The Wedding Present and American Music Club-and their respective front-men, David Gedge and Mark **Eitzel**—are nothing short of legends in this format, and that kind of demigod status can be a heavy burden to carry onstage. Neither man, however, appeared to be hampered by his audience's expectations, and Eitzel, who seemed almost comfortable in front of a home-town crowd, even abandoned his self-effacing shtick.

The parade of Legends-In-My-Own-Mind continued into this week with **Howe Gelb's** visit to the Gavin offices. Giant Sand's Howe was accompanied by daughter Indiosa Patsy and sometimes-Sandster Paula Brown, and he and Paula played a smattering of scattered twangy tunes while Patsy (and Alternative intern Eric Shea) played with the shelves of toys in Linda's office. I thought that at my advanced age and with my vast experience, I was no longer suseptible to extreme nervousness, but my respect for Gelb-combined with his unsettlingly odd demeanor—prompted him to inquire, "Has somebody had too much coffee?" I'm so embarrassed.

Kathy McCarty also came by to play some tunes from her new disc, Dead Dog's Eyeball: Songs Of Daniel Johnston. Kathy (perhaps you remember her from Austin's longlived ensemble, Glass Eye), was on a solo promo tour to meet all the people who have worked on her behalf. She came to Gavin, yes, but I think her main intention was to meet the distribution folks and sales people that run the machinery behind the scenes—a genuinely noble endeavor that she funded herself. That's why it sucked so hard that her rental car got towed while she was playing for us. Bummer. Be nice to Kathy if you see her—she's great!

From the mailbag: Although the approaching holidays have slowed the influx of CDs and singles, the mailman recently brought me a treat—in the form of a playlist—from WVKR. Why is this playlist special, you ask? Because instead of closing with lame shout-outs and thank-yous and station news, this list includes a "Special WVKR Listener Profile: Kevin from Cornwall," that's accurate and snide enough to make you howl. An excerpt of the profile, written by WVKR MD Ben Goldberg: "Those of you who've done college radio know you get two kinds of

regular callers: those who are working the graveyard shift at the local bakery and want to hear some Zappa, and those who will not be allowed to listen to the radio if they get another F on their report cards. Kevin is the epitome of the latter. At his age I was calling WSOU to request "Fade To Black" (a Heavy Metal "Stairway" for those of you who've never metal-headed). He, on the other hand, chooses his band of the week and requests them until he's heard the entire album. This has happened in the past with Gastr Del Sol, God Is My Co-Pilot and This Kind Of Punishment. Currently, it's Thinking Fellers. I remember long conversations with him where he voiced his digust with...everybody in his school who listens to local commercial alternative station WDST ("How can they listen to that shit?!?"). In effect, WVKR has helped himaesthetically and socially—to wholly remove himself from the company of his lackluster peers... We at WVKR applaud young Kevin and those like him within our listening range and around the United States who have become reclusive hermits way before their years. These precocious tykes know what many of us have taken too long to realize: Thank God for the Underground, for thee provideth a niche from which I can direct my bitterness." Damn, Ben is brilliant.

And speaking of Ben, WRFL MD Sami Ibrahim offers the following Thanksgiving thoughts, courtesy Ice-T's "Original Gangsta": "Sit on a table like a fool and eat turkey/That's the day your forefathers jerked me."

songs on *Dog Man Star*; which kicks off with the trance-inducing, Eastern-saturated, "Introducing The Band." "We Are The Pigs" is a swirling and uplifting piece that best represents the band's new direction, but perhaps the most epic tune on the album is "The Wild Ones," a catchy-as-hell love song that steers clear of becoming a sappy ballad, packing enough power to send listeners swooning. The London Suede have proven their best songs come from the heart, and not giving in to expectations. —Eric Shea

S*M*A*S*H Self Abused (Vernon Yard)

S*M*A*S*H is a power trio who sound like the bastard sons of the Stooges and The Clash. Their new album, Self Abused, has the bitter methamphetamine flavor of postadolescent fueled pop-chaotic, guitar-crunching, power pop. "Reflections Of You" starts off in classic boot-stomping, three-chord stuttery punk, and shifts and climbs until "Self Abused" hits full-throttle through your sound system, molesting your speakers. "Real Surreal" is a raunchy, bouncy, "radio-friendly unit shifter" that slaps around The Boomtown Rats, and gives The Stooges a swift kick. S*M*A*S*H's rawness creates a power that's not to be underestimated. If Blur are responsible for getting the British bulldog to bark again, then S*M*A*S*H are the lads who gave it rabies. - ERIC SHEA



LETTERS TO CLEO Aurora Gory Alice (Giant)

Kay Hanley says she doesn't view the songwriting process as a precious thing, but that she hears stuff and it just comes out as melodies. The simplicity of these ten tracks reflects that. "Big Star" is the tale of a blossoming romance with instrumental false starts, and Hanley conveys apprehension with her chiming vocal style. "I See" swells with a cool bass line, crystal clear vocals and a must-have chorus. Radio will kick itself if it passes up on this song's hooks. Distorted guitars swarm on the rocker "Here & Now," and "Mellie's Comin' Over" is an accessible casserole of scintillating guitar, sideshow organ and charismatic singing. The down home style of "Step Back" combines knee-slapping percussion with an acoustic guitar, and adds yet another dimension to LTC's sound. —DAVID BERAN

College Albums

BAZOOKA BLOWHOLE (SST RECORDS, P.O. BOX 1, LAWNDALE CA 90260)

This Southern California power jazz trio (Tony Atherton on sax/Vince Meghrouni on skins/Bill Crawford handling lcw-end) blast out driving jazz rhythms with punk-filled angst. It's an aggressive vibe which has been justly dubbed "jazzcore." Traditional jazz foundations give way to rollicking rhythms and meaty riffs that fill every nook and cranny of their third full-length offering. Dollops of agro-be-bop, manic vibes and grit filled grooves are the signature on tracks like "The Procedure," which begins with lilting strands of sax only to culminate in a cascade of drum beatings and walloping bass throbs. "Screwcifer" is a molten bass-dominated romp with forceful sax blaring over the solid groove of thrashstyled back-beats and crashing cymbals. The trio occasionally come up for air on brief, down tempo tracks like "My Favorite Pearl" and 'Five Years In Space." But just as the listeners catch their breath, the boys quickly launch back into their full frontal assault of terror jazztics. Though essentially rooted in trappings of trad jazz, many tracks veer off into ruff funk territory with Bazooka getting swept up in the frenzy of the jam. "Terror Bears Have Torn Our Lawyers Apart" is ripe with juicy bass and drum interplay while "Turkey Tenders" rages on well past the ten minute mark. FOOM! BOOM! BAM! Bazooka's cool noize will hit you upside the cranial wall

with tasty, twisted licks, thick funkstools and massive jazzafied riffage. 100% pure hardcore bopology not recommended for the faint of heart. - SPENCEDOOKEY

THE ASS PONYS ELECTRIC ROCK MUSIC (A&M)

With Electric Rock Music finally out, Ass Ponys fans everywhere will have their fix for the year. Thirteen offerings take their turn showing off Ass Ponys trademarks. Seating you firmly in the saddle, the first dark strains of "Grim" (also the title of their second full-length effort) explode into dissonance and wailing. The band plays low and tense both here and in the threatening "Banlon Shirt." "Little Bastard" (which appeared with "Banlon Shirt" on the Little Bastard EP) and "Peanut '93" are marked by songwriter Chuck Cleaver's penchant for twisted glimpses. Bluesy guitar sounds ramble their way through "Lake Brenda" (which features a great falsetto), the reaffirming "Live Until I Die" and the youthful twilight of "Ape Hanger." Personal favorites include the sweet innocence of "Blushing Bride," which offers a lovely, slow melody; the there-you-go-writing-about-mylife lyrics of "Earth To Grandma" (my grandmother made X-mas ornaments that bear a scary resemblance to the disc's cover art); "Place Out There" for its slide guitar; the rockin' full sound of "Wall Eyed Girl," and the rangey, ringing guitar and emotional pull of "Otter Slide." Take your pick with this album-there ain't a bummer in the batch. -BLANE M.MALL

MARIAH CAREY All I Want For Christmas Is You (Columbia)

Every year there seems to be at least one new pop entry for the holidays. In the tradition of those great Phil Spector Christmas hits of the early '60s, Mariah and producer Walter Afanasieff collaborate to create the one that'll help us recall Christmas, 1994.

Mystic (known as Mohammed from MTV's The Real World) and Will Power have conceptualized a rhythmic, passionate journey through the minds of the young, gifted and Black. The elements of jazz, blues, soul, poetry and hip-hop (DJs Pause and Mad Mike do work on the turntables) converge seamlessly throughout. My picks are "Fluid" and "Runaway."

K. McCARTY **Dead Dog's Eyeball: Songs Of Daniel Johnston** (Bar None Records, P.O. Box 1704, Hoboken, NJ 07030)

Songs as intensely personal as Daniel Johnston's are often dismissed as self-indulgent, megalomaniacal, or worse, some kind of joke. There's probably a fingerful of people who appreciate the purity of an artist creating entirely on his own, but isn't that how it's always been? Kathy McCarty (formerly of

Glass Eye) checks all these tired attitudes at the door and dons a healthy respect for Johnston on these 19 covers of his songs. "Walking The Cow" captures Johnston's tentative, fragile style, and on "Rocket Ship" McCarty uses heliumstretched vocals that match the subject. "Sorry Entertainer" is a frolicking rocker with distorted surf percussion, and "Desperate Man Blues" is a stark reading with brooding strings, ragtime piano and McCarty's countrified, Lucinda Williams-like vocals. McCarty shows respect for the original cadence of "Desperate" by keeping the pronouns intact. The ticking of a kitchen clock punctuates "I Am A Baby (In My Universe)" and her doubletracked vocals induce an unsettling air of experience into the song's innocence. Kurt Cobain, Sonic Youth and firehose hailed Johnston. This is a priceless introduction for the unanointed, and a brilliant reading if you're familiar with the terrain.




