Gavin's Country-Only Seminar is a Winner

BY CYNDI HOELZLE

From the moment Marilyn Monroe and James Dean ushered guests into the Kick-off Cocktail party at the GAVIN Country Seminar, folks knew they were in for something different.

The first country-only GAVIN Seminar, which took place May 7-9 in Burbank, provided an intimate atmosphere for learning and sharing ideas, and gave attendees the chance to interact with industry pros.

Our tie-in with the Academy of Country Music was a natural; GAVIN registrants were able to attend a special preview of the program, and were out in force at the awards show.

Keynote speaker Larry Rosin wasted no time telling the audience that listeners just do not believe a lot of their claims. As president of Edison Media Research, Rosin conducts research for many media outlets, and has found that statements like "More Music! Better Variety!" mean almost nothing to listeners, he said, "in this difficult, cynical environment." The typical response in focus groups is: "Do they think I'm stupid?"

Rosin then talked about the "unsell," noting how all the commercials on MTV are selling imagery as much as product. When someone in the audience asked how to accomplish this without a big TV budget, Rosin responded, "Don't ignore your own airwaves. We have 24 hours a day to create these images."

Cledus T. Judd (no relation to Naomi and Wynonna) kept things moving at the acoustic lunch after premiering his hilarious new video. "Gone Funky."

Cledus brought up Jeff Carson, Kenny Chesney, Helen Darling, Clinton Gregory, Terry Radigan, Ron away a bucket of pig shit to an Iowa farmer—and they'll love it!" he laughed. GAVIN award winner Linda Stone,

However, GAVIN Large Market PD of the Year Doug Baker admitted that WSIX has decided to not fixate on the issue, pointing out that whether or not your banner is up at a show has little to

News/Talk, Country Still Top Formats

Adult Contemporary radio is losing popularity, according to findings by the Interep Radio Store, which recently analyzed format shares according to the recent Arbitron Ratings. Down to a 9.9 share from its fall standing of 10.2, A/C was at 12.5 last winter.

However, GAVIN A/C editor Ron Fell notes, the stat

doesn't include "Hot A/C" (see chart on right).

Top 40 stayed flat at 5.5, but is down from 6.0 in the same period last year. Country remains the most-listened to music format, with an 11.0 share of the radio audience. Not surprisingly, News/Talk is on top, although it fell to 14.7 from 15.0 in the fall.

At the SFO2, It's in the Bag

For those at SFO2 who, for some reason, can't make it to all 30 nightclubs to catch all 225 bands, GAVIN will help out—to a certain extent.

All attendees at the May 18-21 gathering in San Francisco will receive an *Unsigned Band Sampler*, a CD featuring 18 bands in various formats, including alternative, jazz/hip-hop, Americana, and even "dumpster rock."

The CD, made possible by Tower Records and Disc Makers, includes contact numbers for each band.

White House Says 'Keep the Lid On'

Keep it where it is.

That's the White House's opinion of what to do with the cap on radio and TV ownership, and it's told Congress just that. The Clinton administration this week said their opinion is based on the fear that too much of the industry would be in too few hands.

"If you allow that concentration of power, you could have one person owning the newspaper, the cable company and the equivalent of three broadcast channels," said Larry Irving, Assistant Commerce Secretary.

Texas Republican Jack Fields is pushing a complete re-write of the 60 year-old Telecommunications Act, which allows a company to own 20 AMs and 20 FMs.

Rep. Ed Markey (D-Mass.) said raising ownership limits will benefit telephone companies, who he said would be the highest bidders. McGraw Hill Broadcasting president Ed Reilly expressed fears that lifting limits would stifle localism "in favor of...a handful of powerful networks."

CBS Broadcast Group president Peter Lund disagreed. "I believed that facts show that the three networks...plus...Fox, are now and will continue to be held in check by other major players in our business."

Reba, Tim, Alan Nab Top ACM Honors

Reba McEntire unseated Garth Brooks as Entertainer of the Year in the 30th Annual Academy of Country Music Awards, presented May 10 in ceremonies at the Universal Amphitheater hosted by Clint Black, Tanya Tucker and Jeff Foxworthy, and broadcast live on NBC.

McEntire and fellow Oklahoman Brooks (who won Video of the Year and received the Jim Reeves Memorial Award) both dedicated their wins to the people of Oklahoma City.

Alan Jackson, who won Top Male Vocalist after several nominations, drew a standing ovation.

Mavericks' The two awards, as Top Group and Top New Group, were a pleasant surprise, even to bassist Robert Reynolds, who accepted the awards. The first time up to the podium Reynolds forgot to mention his wife, Trisha Yearwood. However, he made up for it on his second trip. "I love Trisha even more than I love Raul," he laughed, referring to lead singer Raul Malo.

Tim McGraw, who won



Top Album (Not a Moment Too Soon) and Top New Male, also expressed surprise. "This is totally unexpected," he said. A charming Chely Wright won for Top New Female Singer.

Brooks & Dunn appeared shocked to win their fourth consecutive Top Vocal Duet honor. As Ronnie Dunn put it: "You never know when the train is going to stop."

Last year's Top New Male, John Michael Montgomery, won two trophies-Single and Song of the Year-for "I

Swear," written by Frank J. Myers and Gary Baker.

The Pioneer Award went to a surprised and moved Loretta Lynn, who was brought on stage by Leeza Gibbons, Faith Hill, Patty Loveless, Reba McEntire, Pam Tillis, and Mary Chapin Carpenter (via satellite from London). They lauded Lynn and reminded the audience of Lynn's impact on country songwriting-her direct style on songs like "The Pill" and Come Home A'Drinkin'" forever changed the way women wrote country songs. An emotional Lynn dedicated the award to her ailing husband Mooney.

Garth Brooks received the Jim Reeves Memorial Award, named after the singer who pioneered international markets for country artists. The award hasn't been given out since 1982, but the ACM's board of directors decided to bestow the award on Brooks, who last year played to more than half a million fans in 11

The next morning, the first session, "Follow The Chart or Follow Your Heart," was a waker-upper: heated and emotional. Moderator Larry Daniels, from KNIX-Phoenix, was the voice of reason, as Warner/Reprise's Bruce Adelman, MCA/Nashville's Scott Borchetta, Columbia's Debi Fleisher, KKBQ's Dene Hallam and KYCY's Larry Pareigis stirred up the crowd. In the audience, WHKR's Bubba Thomas

objected to the accusation that consultants rule radio by saying, "I do not let my consultant do my music-he doesn't live in my market, he doesn't speak to my listeners, he doesn't go out on remotes."

With a panel that included WRKZ's Dandalion, KFAT's Debbie Baker, KICE's Dallas Dobro and WUSZ's Mary Befera explaining the benefits of broadening their scope by programming Americana, the message to the industry came across loud and clear: Your stations can benefit in many ways by programming this music.

Without getting hung up on what specifically is or isn't Americana, the discussion stayed on track in its attempt to reach out to the country world with simply the offer of more quality music. Americana's radio

presence was further emphasized as audience members Paul Hurt from KNOT, Don Ashford from KVLR, Rene Engel from KPCC and Laura Hopper from



described their experiences. WUSZ's Befera said her station is implementing one Americana cut per hour and is gaining listeners from the rock area. "It works with that rock generation and works very well," she said.

"Our musical mix is attracting listeners from Portland, Oregon tuning in to a station two hours away," said KFAT's Baker. Dandalion then turned on the juice. "A lot of artists deserve more respect and airplay than they're getting, and a lot of it is politics," she said. "We've stopped letting radio be fun. I'm playing music that some of your stations haven't played in five years. You owe your listensome heritage—it works "

Radio on Television: It's a Funny Business

Television shows have consistently used radio as fodder for comedy and drama, from the Jack Benny Program and Hello Larry to WKRP in Cincinnati and Midnight Caller. These days, NBC's News Radio and Frasier and CBS' George Wendt are gambling that America's funny bone is connected to the radio waves.

Howard Stern and Rush Limbaugh have raised interest in talk radio, and television is capitalizing on the format. NBC's sitcom NewsRadio depicts the dayto-day scenes at Manhattan's

all-news WNYX. The program relies heavily on the fictional station's snappy pace to keep the comedy flowing, and the premiere episode incorporated familiar radio NewsRadio cast jargon and situa-

tions. Characters bantered about news director and station manager titles, and at one point Phil Hartman (Bill) tells the new news director Dave that he has "Good stuff, good pipes."

Executive producer Paul Simms describes NewsRadio



as "a look at the lives of people who spend 12 hours a day in a small office together." Although the focus often strays from daily radio, the station is the perfect volatile setting to draw out confrontations and clashes between characters.

Frasier, NBC-TV's successfully established, criticallypraised comedy, uses radio more peripherally. Frasier acts as a psychologist on his talk show on radio station KACL, but scenes in the station are minimal.

The program is characterdriven and the action takes

McKnight, traffic director at WNUA-Chicago. "I don't have to question where a tape is (and) I don't have to find out if anyone messed it up, or deleted it."

DG Systems, which started up in 1991, can transmit to more than 2,000 stations across the country in a matter of several hours, utilizing both ISDN and conventional telephone lines.

Associated information, such as traffic notes, affidavits of broadcast or press releases are transmitted by fax in a comparable amount of time. "By mid-summer we are supposed to be completely digital, so I would say they have kept up with the technology we have," says Steve Hart, who works in promotions for WQCD-New York. When they do need a new spot, he adds, they can get it "...within half an hour...and of course it's all digital."

DG Systems has field offices in New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, Dallas, and Atlanta.

Radio Spots Getting Shipped by Phone

Radio stations have a new way to get advertising, PSA's, late- breaking news, or that hot new single on a digital format: by telephone.

Digital Generation Systems, Inc. (DG Systems), a San Francisco company, has cornered the market on a telephone delivery system that utilizes on-site computer stations that connect directly to a radio station's production workroom. The computer stations can be connected to the master control board via remote to ease production.

Paul Turner, traffic director at WYSP-Philadelphia, uses DG Systems to receive spots for his station and transmit voiceovers he does for a network of stations. He says DG Systems is "...handy if you're going to do stereo sound," and appreciates the speed of the service.

"I'm usually cramped for space in my unit where I keep my tapes, so it takes up less space," says Kim



Inside Top 40

It's much much too early to tell whether or not some Top 40 stations are playing too much alternative music, but it appears that it might be time for the yellow light to begin flashing.

It wasn't that long ago that dance music was being described as dis-

posable. Now guess what? The current issue (May 19) of Entertainment Weekly features an article by David Browne



who questions the lifespan of the alternative acts. He recalls consultant **Jeff Pollack's** recent complaint that much of the new music is disposable. He compared the era to "the one-hit parade of the **Knack**, **Soft Cell**, and other skinny-tie proponents of the early '80s."

Work Group senior VP Burt Baumgartner (above) recalls the glut of dance product in the early '90s. "As things spiraled out of control," he says, "the focus became less artist-oriented and more producer-oriented." He points out that the danger then as now is not playing music of a particular genre, but playing too many bad records because of their classification.

Geffen/DGC's Bob Catania (right) uses a careful game plan when setting up so-called alternative crossovers and says the mad rush to classify any record that isn't by a mainstream, mass appeal artist as alternative is ludicrous. Bob lays some of the blame for the difficulty in proper Top 40 set up at the feet of people who are defining formats by music rather than by formatics. "It's dangerous to have fewer 'bridge' stations—those between pure alternative and Top 40," he says. "Too many have simply been reclassified as 'alternative.' It's critical that a proper foundation be built. When that doesn't occur the programmer gets a negative perception. They say, 'We played that record, it wasn't successful and it was an alternative record, therefore all alternative records must not be good for my radio station."

Though the internal criteria at every label is somewhat different, Baumgartner says, "During every era the art of timing has spelled success or failure in crossing and exposing a song to the widest possible audience." His rule of thumb: "You can usually get hurt going too early, but not going on too late." That's something that will no doubt sound familiar to many PDs. Baumgartner and Catania agree on



the cyclical nature of music. The cycle at the moment is alternative, and in Baumgartner's opinion, the burnout phase

will begin when pure alternative outlets seek out more and more hardcore, left-of-center songs and acts that will push the limits further and further.

In the meantime, Top 40 would do well to color within the lines and, as always, hand-pick the very best from a range of choices that will likely grow larger in the months ahead.

BROUN FELLINIS Aphrokubist Improvisations #9 (MOONSHINE MUSIC)

Live and direct from the ninth floor of The Phat Temple come The Broun Fellinis, harbingers of the next wave of sonic transference: Other Jazz. The Fellinis are a San Francisco-by-way-of-Boohabia-based power trio specializing in the mystical art of chocolate surrealism. By reaching deep into the recesses of the right cerebral hemisphere, these cats unleash a wave of pure abstract metabopalisciousness (a form of sonic expression that is equal parts music, literature, art and politics). Close your eyes and "Dreamstate" will launch you into the swirling world of broun sound. The track breaks down key Boohabian concepts through witty wordplay and tightly knit grooves. Likewise, "Soulogik Syntax" relies upon the sacred spoken word to deliver a lesson on the metaphysical aspects of "phlow.


But the Fellinis' true power resides in the groove. "The Other" begins with a slow, droning bass riff before motoring off into the sax stratosphere, propelled by the kinetic skirr of drum-spawned rhythms. The crew's zenithal mark is manifested as the mouthful "Herodotus On The Nile," a sonic rendition of the fabled

Greek scholars' travels to Egypt back in 500 B.C. With *Aphrokubist Improvisations #9* The Broun Fellinis have harnessed the powers of maximum phlow, altering the spectrum of groove. Behold: what was once called jazz is no longer.

ROSA MOTA Wishful Sinking (MUTE/13TH HOUR)

If Rosa Mota were a breakfast, they'd probably be called Bangers a la Swervedriver and Mash Yo La Tengo. This disc is a collection of ethereal repose juxtaposed with some hard-edged noise. Clocking in at just under one hour and ten minutes, tracks one through 13 are a wide variation of rhythms and ideas, complemented by swirly guitars and a variety of vocal styles. "Hopey" offers an almost Faith Healer-esque drone that rises and falls through a seven-minute tour de force that is just too much spread for one slice of toast "Big Fat Arms," another gem, is more varied, with a meek intro that metamorphoses into true snap-crackle-and-pop-type noise. And if you're the odd type who eats ketchup on your scrambled eggs, you'll probably appreciate tracks fourteen through thirty-eight, an all-you-can-consume trance extravaganza. Wishful Sinking, as Andy Griffith would say to Aunt Bee, is "Good eating."—WALT REED



ELLIOTT CAHN:FROM WOODSTOCK TO WOODSTOCK

"I'm not worthy..."

That's how Elliott Cahn feels about being the keynote speaker for SFO2, but don't believe him. Modest as he is, Cahn is a perfect choice to kick off this weekend of seminars and showcases designed with the artist in mind. Cahn is a successful manager who began as a

successful musician and suffered plenty of failure and frustration—to the point of almost giving up on the music biz—before hitting paydirt with Green Day.

Perfect.

In fact, after his four-year run with Sha Na Na, the 12-man oldies revue, ended in 1973, Cahn wanted nothing to do with the industry. He went to law school instead.

Now, with partner Jeffery Saltzman, he is co-head of Cahn-Man, and the two—both attorneys—manage Green Day, Jawbreaker, and the Muffs. Their legal clients include Rancid, the Offspring, Mudhoney, the Charlie Hunter Trio, Pennywise, the Melvins, and Van Gogh's Daughter. They've also worked with Primus, Shonen Knife and tons of metal bands, among them Testament, Exodus, Vicious Rumors, Violence and Forbidden. They've ventured into film as music supervisors for soundtracks. And they've created 510 Records (their office is in Oakland, in the 510 area code), with the first release, by China Drum, set for next month.

In short, he's plenty worthy.

Playing host in a domed room upstairs from his small, but nicely-appointed offices, he sits mostly still, and speaks in a soft, shy voice. No Colonel Tom Parker/Bill Graham histrionics here. But once his self-esteem has been pumped up a couple of notches, he's more than capable of dispensing words of wisdom to those who—unlike the younger Elliott Cahn—are interested in making it in music.

Sha Na Na, he says, had some "high experiences," but it's their time on the road that led Cahn to the way he handles his own charges.

"I've been through a lot of the experiences my clients are going through, and as a result, I do have a decent amount of empathy for what they're going through—the pressures and the temptations they're facing. But as far as they're concerned, it's probably a bit of a mixed bag. Although I am more understanding, I'm also more tough with them. I have fairly strong feelings about how rock and roll musicians get treated. Basically, they spend most of their time having their asses kissed, and I don't think that's all that healthy. So that's one thing I don't do."

What Cahn does is rely on his training as a lawyer and negotiate deals. He delegates other work that some managers take on—merchandising; dealing with tours and concert promoters—to experts in those fields.

"A good manager," he once told columnist Julie ("The Flash") Gordon, "must have the ability to deal with enormous amounts of information. It helps to be able to juggle a lot of things at one time, and to have good people skills."

A few years ago, however, it seemed like being a good manager wasn't good enough. Cahn and Saltzman had built up a healthy roster of hard rock bands. They had major label deals. Testament sold some 800,000 units of one album worldwide. "Then, Nirvana hit and changed the musical world, and Testament ran into a wall and stopped growing. They got frustrated, and our relation-

ship soured."

The other bands, he says, had similar problems, and Cahn-Man's income sank. Cahn considered moving to Los Angeles; then, after deciding against it, promised his wife that "if things didn't get dramatically better by April I, 1994, I'd find another job. And it probably wouldn't be in the music business."

Those, he says, "were very depressing days."

A year or so before, he and Saltzman had become the attorneys for a young Berkeley band called Green Day. At the band's suggestion, they became their managers.

The band had just finished their second album for a small label, Lookout. "They wanted to get with a record company who could get their records out more than Lookout could," Cahn recalls, "although they wanted to be sure that Lookout was protected in terms of their masters."

Cahn began working with them in early '93."We played a song of theirs over the phone to Columbia, and boom, the interest was immediate, and we started sending out demos. They were signed by spring."

But when Cahn, in his funk, set his deadline, early in '94, Green Day had just released their first album for Warner Bros., and, as Cahn puts it, "They didn't explode immediately."

In fact, the first week the album was out, Cahn got a report from Reprise's alternative promo man, Steve Tipp. There'd been two adds. Tipp mustered up all the optimism he could and promised to work hard, but, Cahn remembers, "My heart sank."

Just about ready to start scanning the classifieds for some other line of work, Cahn began to detect some movement. By April Fool's Day—his deadline—"it was clear it'd be a successful record. It was at a few hundred thousand."

Now, the album, *Dookie*, has sold more than four million units; Green Day was a muddy smash at Woodstock '94 (Cahn, with Sha Na Na, played the original), and Cahn has decided to keep his job.

And, he says, he's still learning. "My growth curve is focused in certain areas," he says. "I'm learning about radio now. I'm finding out why they play certain records and not others. This is a fascinating time for radio, in the modern rock era. The number of alternative stations is exploding, and stations are changing formats every day."

In the world of rock and roll management, there's something new every very green day.

DAVID LEFKOWITZ: HE WOULD DIE FOR YOU

Right after graduating from Duke University in 1986, David Lefkowitz came to the San Francisco Bay Area to work with manager/producer David Rubinson, whose eclectic roster ranged from funk and jazz to world beat artists.

After learning the ropes, Lefkowitz opened up his own

booking agency and then began managing Primus. It was the classic indie story: Lefkowitz was able to book the

hot-getting-hotter Primus with bands such as Red Hot Chili Peppers and Fishbone. The band's fame spread, and they began to sell out San Francisco Bay Area venues even before they landed their contract with Interscope. Primus' first album for the label sold 800,000 copies in the U.S. alone.

Along with Primus, Lefkowitz's clients include the Melvins, the Charlie Hunter Band and local favorites the Mo'fessionals. His latest project is a group called Slider, whose first album will come out on A&M Records in November. Lefkowitz also runs an indie label, Prawn Song Records.

On the eve of SFO2, Lefkowitz talked with GAVIN about his still-young career.

How did you get a job with David Rubinson? It was a personal connection. A manager in New York, David Krebs (Aerosmith), is a friend of my family. I'd been interviewing with him during my senior year in college and I told him David Rubinson was managing all the bands I was excited about. He (Krebs) called Rubinson up and said I was willing to work for free, so I did that

Although I wasn't paid, I started making connections all over town.

What came next?

I started my own booking agency and handled a variety of mainly alternative acts around Northern California. Alternative was "the scene" back then (1986). I was also doing some world beat stuff.

That couldn't have been easy, because booking is really combetitive.

Fortunately, at the time, there wasn't anybody that wanted to handle unsigned, alternative, Bay Area bands. How did you become associated with Primus, and how did you get them started?

They were friends of mine. I started managing them and Limbomaniacs (1987). I learned a lot from people rejecting Primus demos for two years. We slowly built this local following, and they finally were able to fill the Warfield—before they even had a record. We put out their first record ourselves—I was working at my house. I just mailed hundreds of copies out to college radio, press and A&R people.

Promotion takes money. How did you get the word out about Primus on a limited budget?

As a local booking agent, I was the person that a lot of the venues would call and say "I've got this band called the Red Hot Chili Peppers playing, do you have anybody that might be able to bring in a crowd as the opening act?" And I'd be like, "Oh, of course." That was certainly the best kind of exposure a local, unsigned band could get. Then Primus started getting good local reviews and the draw just kept getting bigger and bigger. We started selling tapes at shows and printing up T-shirts—we were just selling a bunch of merchandise. That plus we were able to draw people not just in San Francisco, but in Sonoma, Marin, Chico, Sacramento and the South Bay.

But the key was performing...

...Yes. We would open for bands like Fishbone and the Red Hot Chili Peppers , and as they rose, we rose. You were working with other bands at the same time... This whole scene was developing in San Francisco—funk thrash we called it. I was working with another band called Smoking Section and Pschefunkepuss and Fungo Mungo—and a lot of these bands got major deals.

How does a manager hold on to a successful artist? There are two ways. A contract, but that often doesn't work, and in the early stages it costs a lot of money. Really, the whole thing is about the relationship. Obviously the manager has to be able to grow at the same rate the client's success is growing. Elliott Cahn has been Primus' manager since the first day they ever

needed one—and mine as well—and he's a person I can turn to and say "Explain this."

What's your big thing right now?

Primus has a record, Tales From the Punchbowl, coming out June 6. It'll definitely debut in the top ten. Their last album sold 800,000 in the United States. We're really gearing up for that—we're spending twice as much on the video as we've ever spent. Another thing I'm excited about is a commercial alternative band called Slider. They've just finished their album for A&M Records and it's coming out in the fall. It's incredible songwriting. The main person in the band is Matt Winegar; he's been a friend and associate of mine and Primus' for several years. He co-produced Primus' first album when he was 18 years old, and he was in a band on Geffen called Spent Poets. Matt is finally doing his own project, and he's got a trio of incredible musicians and songwriters. They're working with David Bianco who just did the Teenage Fanclub record. Everyone at A&M is excited about it.

You're pretty low key.

That's me; I couldn't be the other way if I tried. The whole thing about this job is that I'm doing what I'm excited about. If I'm hyping a band it's because I believe what I'm saying. If I'm dealing with the hassles of day-to-day personal management, it's because I believe in an artist and know that whatever the particular, tedious pursuit is, it's necessary for the furthering of someone's career.

What's the most important element in being a good manager? You literally have to be able to die by your clients. You have to believe in them so strongly that you're willing to go to whatever extreme you have to convince people of the artist's creative vision, but at the same time it's very important not to take failures personally. Whether the artists themselves aren't successful or if a particular marketing tactic isn't successful, or whatever—there are failures every day. You have to just be able to roll with it.

HERBIE HERBERT: Mr. Backstage Man

When you think of hotshot managers, Herbie Herbert's name isn't the first that comes to mind.

Which is fine by Herbert. "I want my artists to have the name recognition," he says.

Although best known as a guiding force behind Journey, over the past 20-plus years, Herbert has worked

with Mr. Big, Roxette and Enuff Z'Nuff, and now he's overseeing Abraxas, comprised of members of Carlos Santana's early band.

Herbert has not only remained behind the scenes, he's built a separate business out of being, literally, behind the scenes. Through his company, Nocturne,

Herbert is responsible for backstage production that gives today's concerts much of their pizzazz.

However, for all his determination to stay in the shadows, when he steps out Herbert has a good time. He enjoyed his participation in SFO1 so much last spring, he volunteered an encore at SFO2. This time, rather than being part of a panel, he'll be featured in a one-onone interview with music business consultant Nadine Condon.

On the eve of SFO2, we posed a few questions of our

What was your first involvement in the music industry? "I played in a band but I wasn't into it," Herbert says. He became friends with a band called Frumious Bandersnatch—named for a character in Lewis Carroll's Jabberwocky—members of which evolved into the Steve Miller Band. He became a roadie. "I was one of the first," he says.

You've said that you didn't really plan to become a manager. "I was working for Journey, and they wanted to fire Bill Graham, who was their manager at the time. He was onstage talking to them; they came over to me and said, 'Would you deal with this guy!' That steamed Bill because we were friends."

Graham may have been steamed, but when Herbert had to choose between working for Peter, Paul and Mary or Journey, the volatile rock impresario told Herbert to go for Journey. "I took Journey even though it was for half the money."

Many times a band's first manager isn't the one they have when they hit the big time.

"I have disdain for bands who ditch managers who have gotten them to the brink of success. It's tough, but you have to work together to learn how to cope with mega-success."

What's your secret for staying successful? Music has radically changed since you began.

"Times change, and that's why I built other things, such as the backstage production we do with Nocturne. It's impossible today to achieve the kind of success we had with Journey. We live in a disposable time; bands are flavor-of-the-month. MTV is also at fault. They'll find a band, nurse them through three or four hits and drop them." Have you ever worked with bands that are totally unmanageable?

"I managed a band from Chicago, Enuff's Z'Nuff, who needed a wheelbarrow to carry their talent, but they just kept shooting themselves in the foot. I also managed Roxette in the United States. It's harder to market to the American audience than it is to the international audience. Roxette did really well, but once they started marketing themselves here the same way they did outside the U.S., they slid. The United States' audience is fickle."

What's your current focus?

"Abraxas. It's like working with family; I see big things for them. We invited Carlos (Santana) to work with us, but he wants to continue down the path he's on. We're trying for a Journey reunion, but Steve Perry is making it difficult—his demands are onerous. We'll keep working on it; can you believe it's been exactly ten years? Their Greatest Hits album is still selling —it's up there with The Eagles' Greatest Hits."

Jazz/A²New Releases



KENNY GARRETT TRIOLOGY (WARNER BROS.)

Kenny Garrett really gets down to the basics on his latest recording, Triology. Back in 1957, Sonny Rollins (one of two tenor legends to whom Garrett dedicates this set) got fed up with piano players and made a breakthrough trio record sans piano called Way Out West. Garrett blowing the veneer off the standard "Night and Day" reminds us of that spare sound. While you can drive mini-vans through Garrett's minimal soundscape, the notes are at times angular, but swinging. Brian Blade and Kiyoshi Kitagawa (Charnett Moffett plays bass on three tunes) is a kicking twosome. Garrett maintains the standards-to-originals blend at roughly 50-50 (including three of his own pieces), keeping the project well anchored. Jazz listeners will get the concept quick with Garrett's versions of Coltrane's "Giant Steps" or Brubeck's "In Your Own Sweet Way." Then venture beyond with spiky haymakers like Wynton's "Delfeayo's Dilemma," "Pressing The Issue" and, ultimately, "Wayne's Thang," the tune that really hits the Z-spot.

THE GREG HATZA **ORGANIZATION** (PALMETTO)

Since all of you have read the cover article on Verve Records a couple issues back, you know about Verve's upcoming record by Jimmy Smith, the bossman of the Hammond B-3 organ. Jazz organ sounds are making another cool resurgence. Eddy Louiss' duo live record with Michel Petrucciani and Bobby Militello's latest make good use of the genre, yet there's one more to recommend: The Greg Hatza Organization on Palmetto. I stumbled across this disc while snooping around the NAIRD booths last week. Evidently, Hatza was a teenage whiz at the organ and has had a couple of decades to hone his craft. Hatza uses live drums, a couple of sax players and an electric guitarist to polish off the sessions. There are slow blues numbers like "Midnight Freight," toe-tappers like "Juicy," boppin' chestnuts like Coltrane's "Moment's Notice" and

even a frenzied fusion experiment called "The Wizard." Give Greg's ORGANization a shot.

CARL ALLEN **TESTIMONIAL (ATLANTIC)**

Timing is everything, but nowhere as crazy as with jazz records. Cyrus Chestnut is just finishing his run up and down the Gavin jazz chart; Vincent Herring's most prolific effort is currently making a speedy ascent; and now drummer Carl Allen's second solo disc has claimed the highest debut on this week's chart. All three artists have played interchangeably on each other's records, so the Chestnut/Allen/Herring axis has been more than duly represented these days. Allen's Testimonial begins with "Come Sunday," an Ellingtonian gospel piece with Chestnut on organ. Nicholas Payton joins Herring on the horn frontline with some pure New Orleans-style trumpet. Allen is agile and tasty behind the traps without overstepping his role as drummer/bandleader. Check out the bright minuteand-a-half organ/drum jam on "Foot Pattin' " into the soulful boppin' title track. Mark Whitfield experiments with some offbeat keys and chords on Allen's Latin/Wes vehicle, "The Presence Of Dr. B.," our favorite tune because it frees up from the reverence of other compositions with devout titles like "Holy Land," "The Message" and "Tuesday Night Prayer Meeting.'

THE GERALD WILSON **ORCHESTRA** STATE STREET SUITE (MAMA FOUNDATION)

As KXJZ's Gary Vercelli's liner notes attest, arranger/composer Gerald Wilson is one of the deepest of the big band conductors, having blazed his trail through six decades of working with everyone from Count Basie to Bobby Darin. Through the auspices of the MAMA Foundation, Wilson has recorded his most sparkling big band recording in several years down at Capitol Recording Studios in L.A. If you're looking for beefy, brassy big band charts that will test the sonic limits of your control-room sound system, cue up the sprawling "State Street Suite" or the surging crescendo blasts of "The Feather." Wilson's son Anthony on guitar plays a lot of the solo cameos, and B Sharp Jazz Quartet's Randall Willis pops a few solos on alto sax. If you're looking for heady ensemble fare devoid of novelty or eight-bar clichés, stop right here. Stellar remakes from the Wilson songbook include the moody and mercurial "Caprichos," clearly the Z'men fave of the lot. Don't blink. State Street Suite is steamin' up the chart this very minute.

LARA & REYES GUITARRAS HERMANAS (HIGHER OCTAVE)

Sergio Lara and Joe Reves, a guitar duo from San Antonio, plays acoustic music of Moorish, Spanish, Mediterranean and Mexican descent in a contemporary fashion without sacrificing regionality and spice. While A2 radio's smooth, urbanstyled tendencies have helped strengthened the ratings front, we can't help but miss the days when Strunz and Farah, Ottmar Liebert and other Flamenco crossover talents would send an electrifying and adventurous spike through A2's daily music flow. Lara and Reves trade fiery licks as well as crafted melodic phrases. Stretch things out a bit and experiment with "Cielo Sin Nubes," a rhumba with jazzy chord changes.

HERBIE HANCOCK DIS IS DA DRUM (MERCURY)


Our favorite response to Dis Is Da Drum came from a Jazz programmer who devilishly accessed the record this way, "Sounds like Herbie's been a bad boy lately." In fact, Herbie Hancock has had DIDD up on blocks for a couple of years, tinkering, funking, fine-tuning and finally bringing in technicians like Mars Lasar (credited with Sound Design & Sweetening and four co-writes). Personally, we've already placed this near the top of our best-of-1995-sofar list, as the material careens between funk and in-the-pocket A2 melodies (i.e. "Butterfly" and "Come And See Me"). It's that flirtation with melody that constantly keeps most of DIDD in potential airplay mode. Of course, Hancock has an outstanding track record in that every time he diverts his attention to a new electric thing, the results are golden. However, unlike Headhunters and Rockit, whose effects were commercially immediate, we see Dis Is Da Drum making a more subtle, long term, time-released groundbreaking impact as Hancock's genius locks horns with the realities of format radio

BROUN FELLINIS APHROKUBIST IMPROVISATIONS VOL. 9 (MOONSHINE)

Digging the Broun Fellinis is a little like reading A Clockwork Orange. Here's a band with their own glossary of terms. They reinvent a little here, and pay a little homage there, using jazz as a launch pad to the outer realms. The one irony is how similar this "aphrokubist" music is to the white Canterbury psychedelic movement of the sixties (i.e. early Caravan, Soft Machine). People often ask about San Fran's jazz/hip hop/acid scene. Here's a 55-minute answer to all your queries from one of the most prominent bands in the heart of it all.

P. D. RESPONSIBILITIES

Tith another four weeks to go in the Spring Arbitron, program directors, who double as research specialists, are focused on getting better ratings.

Research and Ratings

- Commit yourself daily to explore new ways to serve the present audience and build anew one.
- * Constantly promote and advertise to gain trial and replenish cume. Remember Pareto's curve: about 80 percent of the AQH comes from 20 percent of the cume.
- Make station more visible; develop new and creative promotions that put the station and its talents in the public eye.
- Know how Arbitron (and other rating services available in market) work, such as placement of diaries, the particular wording in the diary, important ZIP codes, sampling, etc.
- * Be able to analyze a book, calculate TSL, turnover, and reach-and-frequency (for promo scheduling) without a computer program, and provide lucid interpretation.
- Implement and interpret local research including perceptual, focus, listener advisory committees, music call-out, auditorium, etc., resulting in quality control in music.
- * The PD is constantly learning more about the market and the station's target demo. He/she knows the core audience and lifegroup, and conveys this perspective to his staff.
- * Tap every available means of research like B.D.S., the local Chamber of Commerce, national

population data from the Survey of Buying Power, your program and management consultants, Internet and AOL sources, broadcast industry publications, etc.

- * Research what specific prizes your listeners (and your competition's listeners) would most like to win.
- * You are totally in touch with the core listeners. Aided by research and an up-to-date database of frequent listeners, the P.D. knows exactly what the target wants from the station, and delivers on the promise.
- * Utilizing all available research, develop the format and particular program elements that fills a listener void and satisfy need.
- * Create and oversee the radio station's call-out research for music, perceptions, and audience trends. Know what's hot before it makes the papers. Thus, drive trends, don't be late and react to them.
- * Adhere to the four basic ingredients of research: Examine, understand, accept, and have the

FEAR FACTORY

The advance tape of this incredible album rarely leaves my cassette player. A handful of Rocks reporters who were fortunate enough to receive the advance said the same thing. Angry and aggressive easily describes the pulsating waves of hard rockin' metal that comes screaming off the CD, smacking you

square in the face. Fear Factory (Burton C. Bell, vocals; Dino Cazares, guitar; Raymond Herrera, drums: Christian Olde Wolber. drums) feed off the daily pressures and stress of living in Los Angeles, and generate cauldrons of rage, distrust and fuming hostility. These feelings are transformed into raging metallic guitar hooks, howling vocals, frothing bass lines and pummeling drums. From the fast-paced metallic guitars of the title track to the gothic synthesizers of "A Therapy For Pain," Fear Factory rages and pouts. One of the stronger elements of the album are the sampling and other forms of tech hardware which gives the music a light industrial and mysterious feel. All the eleven tracks merit airplay but my faves are "Zero Signal," "Replica," "Flashpoint," "New Breed" and the cover of Head Of David's "Dog Day Sunrise." Listening to Demanufacture is like eating peanuts; I can't stop.

UGLY KID JOE "Tomorrow's World" (Mercury)

The first single from Ugly Kid Joe's upcoming album, Menace To Sobriety, should be in your hands and ready to spin. "Tomorrow's World" is a hard-hitting track featuring electrifying guitar hooks, hefty vocals, aggressive drumming and booming bass lines. For those of you who wished that Ugly Kid Joe was a little harder on their last album, your wish has been granted. This track has an undeniable hook and is just a taste of what's to come. The full-length is going for adds on June 12, so be on the lookout.


CRAWL Earth (Pavement)


Crawling out from the seedy depths of sludgeville (Green Bay, Wis.) are Pavement Records' Crawl, Armed with gyrating low-end guitar licks, domineering bass lines, off-beat drumming, throaty growls and lots of indistinguishable techno tidbits, Crawl presents their gloomy brand

of death metal via Earth, their fist full-length. Crawl has been around since 1992, when they went by the name Bleed. They released their first EP the following year, and it received enough favorable reviews to encourage them to continue creating unearthly death metal music. Some death metal listeners may be put off by the band's lack of speed, but that's replaced by multiple time changes and, unlike a lot of death metal, song structure. Crawl does exert quick grooves, but mainly focuses on deep slabs of guttural grooves that are layered with sluggish programming. "Womb," "Gray" and "Servant" grabbed me, but the focus track is "Skinned," which rates pretty high on the cool meter. Get on all fours with Crawl.

KING DIAMOND The Spider's Lullabye (Metal Blade)

The King has returned. King Diamond that is, with his fifth album, The Spider's Lullabye, which features the long-time knighted guitarist Andy LaRocque along with newcomers Herb Simonsen on guitar, Chris Estes on bass and Darrin Anthony on drums. Diamond's latest effort showcases his patented horrific metal sound which is composed of bold gothic rhythms and slicing melodic guitar schemes. Diamond's elastic vocal range are stretched to the limit from the piercing screams of "From The Other Side" to the low-to-mid octave yells of "Room 17. Musically, King Diamond's new lineup mixes in '80s metal style with more current-sounding hard rock schemes. It safe to say that the ten tracks rock and are mixed with enough old and new to appeal to long-time fans as well as new ones. Besides the title track, "Six Feet Under," "From The Other Side" (great song) and "Dreams" are worth checking out. The Spider's Lullabye is the next chapter in King Diamond's rock legacy.

Singles

MICHAEL JACKSON (duet with JANET JACKSON) Scream (Epic)

There are lots of major releases each year, but the first single from Michael's forthcoming album, due in stores one month from now, is an event. As such, it's safe to bank on media coverage piqueing the public's interest. I can't imagine they'll be disappointed with the funky dance rhythm of this Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis production.

THE REAL MCCOY Come and Get Your Love (Arista)

Based on immediate programmer reaction, it seemed destined that this cover of Redbone's 1974 hit would be the obvious follow-up to the trio's hits, "Another Night" and "Runaway." Polishing it up '90s- style gives the group a clear shot at plenty of radio and club play for the summer ahead.

DURAN DURANPerfect Day (Capitol)

Other than "Walk On the Wild Side," Lou Reed's music was largely ignored by Top 40 radio. Luckily, Duran Duran chose to put their spin on one of his finest creations. Comparisions to "Ordinary World" seem right on the mark.

BON JOVI This Ain't A Love Song (Mercury)

Trace the musical history of this band and it's easy to hear how they've evolved over the past decade. Clearly, they've matured without sacrificing any of the raw, gutsy approach their fans have come to expect. The first track from their new album *These Days*, set to hit stores late next month.

STRICTLY 4 U Open Arms (Quality)

Denver is home to the quintet known as Strictly 4 U. This single is a lesson in how to cover one of the biggest songs from one of the most successful acts during the '80s—Journey. I wouldn't be surprised to see listeners (some who may not even be familiar with the song) turn this into the group's first major hit.

EVERYTHING BUT THE GIRL Missing (Atlantic)

What a difference a few months and a remix can make. Miami is where "Missing" has busted big, and where requests tell the story of how broad the appeal of the song really is. Track two, the remix edit, is the one to check out.

BLOODHOUND GANG Mama Say (Underdog/ Cheese Factory/Ruff House/Columbia)

Crossover play has got this track off to a strong start. The video will also get the public's attention. We can't deny that the chorus has familiarity woven into it.

PORTRAIT How Deep Is Your Love (Capitol)

It's remakes galore this week. The best thing is they each enhance the original. That's what these four talented vocalists have done to the Bee Gees' classic late '70s hit. Multi-format appeal.

CHARLIE ROBISON BANDERA (VIREO)

Another true talent from the Texas Hill Country, Charlie Robison, a Bandera, Texas native and Austin resident, has made one hell of a hip-kickin' debut album. Opening with brother Bruce Robison's destined-to-be-a-hit "Red Letter Day," Bandera rides like a high-steppin' pickup speeding down some dusty Texas trail. In other words, this is one romp of a Texas country time. A most cohesive effort held together by Robison's strong writing ability and compelling vocals, sometimes reminiscent of John Prine. Bandera was co-produced by Robison and Lloyd Maines and features a bevy of Austin's finest musicians helping along on "She Leaves Her Heart At Home," "Barlight," and the heartbreaking fun of "I Don't Feel That Way." With *Scars From Falling Down*, this San Francisco trio can finally add a majorlabel release to its impressive, extensive discography. While Steel Pole is fond of odd samples, overpowering surges of guitar noise, fuzzed-out bass rumblings, whine-and-howl vocals and abrupt turns of tempo and

tension, the band maintains respect for the hooks-the unkempt and not-entirelymelodic hooks-that loosely anchor these eleven songs. On Scars. Steel Pole combine a raawk aesthetic with vicious creativity, random artiness and compelling power while managing to avoid the overweening self-importance/ hauteur that too often afflicts the bands of this school. An auspicious major-label debut from the world's sweatiest live band.
