



MCA Makes Two Big Moves

Doug Morris, Ron Meyer Join

In less time than it takes most unemployed people to produce a resume, Doug Morris, former chairman and CEO of Warner Music-U.S., has a new job.

After two weeks of being courted by Sony, PolyGram and Viacom, Morris has gone with the first company that called him, MCA Records, where he will create a new record label, Rising Tide Entertainment. The label, a 50-50 joint venture between Morris and MCA, will have its own A&R, marketing and promotion departments. Other functions will be handled by MCA Records.

Morris wasn't the only high-level news at MCA this week. Ron Meyer, president of the Creative Artists Agency, was named by Seagram (MCA's new parent) CEO Edgar Bronfman, Jr., to head MCA, Inc. as president and chief operating officer. Described unanimously as well-liked an well-regarded, the 50-year-old Meyer's clients include Tom Cruise, Demi Moore, Barbra Steisand and Whoopi Goldberg.

Morris heard from MCA immediately after his dismissal. "We moved aggressively to court Doug and quickly bring him into the family," said Al Teller, chairman and CEO, MCA Music Entertainment Group.

Insiders say that Bronfman hired Morris partly because he's angry that Time Warner didn't give Seagram seats on the company's board. Seagram's owns 15 percent of Time Warner. "I did not go in

and poach on him" said Bronfman. "What they they think he was going to do take a walk on the beach?"

The move caps a whirl-wind year for Morris—one that saw him go from head of Atlantic Records to head of Warner Music-U.S. to being ousted. All that after making Atlantic one of the most profitable labels in the business. And there is still more drama to be played out by Morris and Warner Bros., which he has sued for breach of contract.

For now, though, Morris is concentrating on starting over. "I'm thrilled to have the opportunity to start over at a corporation where creativity will dominate the culture," he said.

At MCA, Morris joins former WEA colleague Bob

Krasnow, who also has a label deal with the company. It's also heavily rumored that former Warner Bros. chairman Mo Ostin and president Lenny Waronker are being courted by DreamWorks SKG.

Justice Dept. Punches Pearl Jam's Ticket

The Justice Department has added to Pearl Jam's Summertime blues, announcing July 5 that it had ended its year-long probe of Ticketmaster without bringing an antitrust case against the agency.

The band had alleged that Ticketmaster was a monopoly engaging in illegal anticompetitive practices and levying excessive service charges on tickets.

But the government, in a two-sentence announcement, said it told Ticketmaster that "it is closing its antitrust investigation into the firm's contracting practices."

For Pearl Jam, the announcement was the latest blow in a bummer of a summer. Mounting its first tour after having stayed off the road last year, following its initial complaints about

Ticketmaster, the band has had shows cancelled because of security problems and bad weather, seen lead singer Eddie Vedder cut short a performance because of a stomach flu, and announced a partial cancellation of the remainder of the tour.

Said the band: "Unfortunately, those who will be most hurt by the Justice Department's cave-in are the consumers...They are the ones who ultimately pay for the lack of choice in the marketplace."

Ticketmaster spokesman Larry Solters naturally sang a different tune: "Ticketmaster is pleased," he said, "that after an intense, year-long investigation that the Justice Department has concurred we are conducting business within the bounds of the antitrust laws."

Warner Cites 'Cause' for Morris Firing: Stolen CDs

Hit with a hefty lawsuit by dismissed CEO Doug Morris, the Warner Music Group has responded to his charge of being fired without cause.

Morris was dismissed by Michael Fuchs, new chairman of Warner Music, on June 21. Fuchs said Morris led a campaign to destablize the Warner Music Group and that the change "was about chemistry inside the company."

Last week, in clocuments filed in New York State Supreme Court, the company said Morris was chairman of Atlantic



Records when thousands of CDs were stolen by executives who sold the disks to distributors.

Morris, said the Warner Music Group, failed to disclose the scandal when he negotiated a new contract last December.

The company's general counsel, Peter Haje, said the company would likely countersue for \$10 million, the amount already paid

Morris as part of his new contract. Morris is suing for the balance of the contract, which totalled some \$50 million.

An attorney for Morris, Stanley Schlensinger, said Time Warner had dug up the CD scandal to justify Morris' dismissal, adding that Fuchs had promised Morris a promotion in a note dated May 15, months after the company had learned the details of the Atlantic CD theft.

An investigation resulted in the dismissal of several Atlantic executives, but Morris was not implicated.

Entries range from mere names and dates to full biographies loaded with radio trivia, including the reasons various DJs got fired, how at least one "Boss Jock" died, and which personality now runs a bed and breakfast in Pittsburgh.

Barrett also uncovers DJs' real names (Dr. Demento is Barrett Hansen, Charlie Tuna is Art Ferguson, Jed the Fish is Edwin Gould, Shana is Margaret LiVigni, and Shadoe Stevens is Terry

Buddah is Back

"Does your chewing gum lose its flavor on the bedpost overnight?" Lonnie Donegan asked, in song, in 1961. Buddah Records hopes not.

Buddah, home in the '60s and '70s for a small but wide-ranging stable of acts, from bubblegum poppers to Captain Beefheart and including Melanie, the Lovin' Spoonful and Gladys Knight and the Pips, is gearing up for a comeback.

RCA/BMG, which bought the label from Essex Entertainment earlier this year, has named Rich Roberts, from its Special Products division, as vice president of marketing.

"We're gonna walk before we run,"


Roberts. "We're going to do some fun things with our catalog, sort of ride the '70s nos-



talgia wave. Then, I'm sure, we'll be signing (new artists)."

WNEW Drops

WNEW/FM-New York, long a bastion of progressive rock and, in recent years, a classic rock station with some of the best-known DJs in the country, switched format last week to what's being described as "rock alternative."

After debuting with R.E.M.'s hit "It's The End of the World as We Know It (and I Feel Fine), the station began playing new core artists that include U2 and the Talking Heads. Current artists include Blues Traveler and Sarah McLachlan, but program director Ted Edwards has said that doesn't mean his station is A3. He also said, "It's not youth-based modern rock'

No Rival Network For MTV—for Now

Long on the back burner, a plan by five of the six major record companies for a music video network has slid off the stove.

The plan for a rival to MTV involved Warner Music Group, Sony Corp., BMG, Thorn EMI, and Polygram in partnership with Ticketmaster.

"It never really got off the ground," said a source involved with the pro-

The shelving of the proposed network is reportedly the result of the dismissal by Time Warner of Robert Morgado, chairman of the Warner Music Group who was seen as the primary force behind the plan.

Even before Morgado's firing in

May, MTV had made a deal with Sony for the rights to air Sony Music's artists. More recently, MTV worked out a similar, worldwide music video licensing agreement with EMI Music. The two companies also announced plans to develop compilation albums for the European market, with music primarily in the Top 40, metal and dance areas.

Other deals between MTV (and its sister network, VH-1) and record companies are considered likely. MTV networks, now reaching 275 million households in 70 countries, include MTV Europe, MTV Brazil MTV Latino, MTV Mandarin, MTV Japan, and MTV Asia.

Radio Revenues Up 10% in May

For radio, the news keeps getting better.

May's radio ad figures followed this year's growth trend, showing a 10 percent increase in combined local and national spot ad revenue as compared to the same time frame in 1994.

Local sales grew 12 percent from last year, a 3 percent jump over April, 1995's 9 percent increase.


The estimates are given by the Radio Advertising Bureau (RAB) whose president and CEO Gary Fries sees the trend continuing. "As we move into the second half of the year, we are well on the course to see a \$1 billion increase for 1995," he says. "The challenge for the remainder of the year, as we move against strong third and fourth quarters of last year, is going to be in managing our pricing and inventory control."

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

Music Downloader: 'Record Biz is Obsolete'

"That large sucking sound you hear is the future. It's sucking up anything that can be digitized—text, software, shareware and images. Music is next. Someday soon, a Sting or a Madonna is going to decide they don't need their record company. They're going to record an album, put it on the Net, and sell it there."

That large, scarey prediction you read is from Rob Lord, co-founder of the Internet Underground Music Archive (IUMA), talking with the *San Francisco Bay Guardian*. In the year and a half since Lord created IUMA with band promoter Jeff Patterson in Santa Cruz, IUMA has grown from a funky underground site on the Internet's World Wide Web to a business—small,

but a business, nonetheless.

IUMA, which began with the concept of uploading songs by local, unsigned bands to the Internet and making them available for downloading and listening by anyone who wanted to, is now an award-winning Web site offering free downloading of music by more than 600 bands, graphics, and music and artists info from numerous record labels, almost all of them indies.

IUMA is also home of *Addicted to Noise*, the pioneer rock magazine and, most recently, the on-line version of GAVIN.

IUMA figures it receives about 250,000 requests —or "hits"—to the system each day (although some users make as many as 100 or more hits in a single visit). Lord estimates that between 2,000 and 3,000 people call

on IUMA daily, and that there are about 40,000 people who've registered with IUMA as users.

Those statistics have yet to draw the kind of advertisers that would make IUMA big business, but the company is young and bustling—IUMA staffers design sites for corporate clients—and optimistic. It hears reports of its impact from such labels as Heyday Records. According to Heyday's Christine Ostrander, one

customer heard a Steve Yerkey song on the radio in Waupaca, Wisc. and couldn't find it in any local shops. He then turned to IUMA, found Yerkey and Heyday there, and sent in a check.

"The music business as it exists today is obsolete," says the 24 year-old Lord. "The technology exists right now to put music out on the Web, so why not do it and cut out the middleman? That's all the big music labels are."

Such a dramatic change in the way music goes from artist to listener may be a matter of time. Depending on formats and equipment, downloading can take longer than a Dead set. And, as the *Bay Guardian's* writer, J.H. Tompkins, notes, "Sting could sign on with IUMA tomorrow, but if music fans have to wait hours for his latest to download, chances are a lot of them will head over to the Wherehouse instead."

Finally: How to Open Those CD Packages

When Paul Reiser, hosting the Grammy Awards, joked about how difficult it was opening the cellophane packaging on compact discs, not to mention that little foil thingie, Brian McCracken laughed louder than most.

For McCracken, the Reiser rant was a plug for something he'd just invented: the EZ-CD opener.

McCracken, who lives in Woodland Hills, Calif., also markets CD storage, organizing, and cleaning products, but it was the difficulty of opening CDs he heard most about.

"Howard Stern," he recalls, "did about a half-hour on it."

McCracken's device is a variation on the cutting gadget designed for clipping articles from periodicals. The CD opener zips down the spine of a jewel box. An



interior razor cuts the outer wrapping and factory seal.

Retailing at \$2.99 and sold at some stores minus frills (fancy box and velcro attachments) for 99 cents, the EZ opener is selling well, said McCracken. "We just shipped 10,000 pieces to Tower Records, and it's in 1,000 Musicland stores." The opener also works, of course, on other products in jewel boxes—CD-ROMs, computer

games, and karaoke CD+Gs, to name a few.

Does McCracken worry over reports that CD packaging may move away from jewel boxes?

Not at all, he says. "The mega-companies who own jewel-box manufacturing companies won't let them go away. It needs work, so the hinges don't break and the box doesn't crack, but the design is excellent."




Creativity

Make a contract with yourself to follow the basic steps listed below and empower your mind with truth, wisdom and inspiration.

- ☐ Learn as much as possible about whatever subjects interest you, whether it's photography or computers. Listen to self-improvement tapes or take a personal growth class.
- ☐ Think illogically. Abandon the old rules, throw conventional wisdom out the door and don't reject ideas because they don't make sense.

Qmc: Doesn't it come down to relatables, talking about things people are interested in?



Patience is what Adult Contemporary radio is all about, and for the format's promotion executives it's an absolute necessity. Martin Page's case proves that good things come to those who can wait.

On July 22 it will have been a year since the release of Page's "In the House of Stone and Light." It's a classic study of tenacity, endurance and commitment.

We're pleased to note that GAVIN and its reporting stations played a significant role in Page's ultimate success. Here's a brief history of the single's path to the top of the charts.

BY RON FELL

THE ARTIST

Martin Page is a native of the Southern England seaport of Southampton. His first professional music experience was playing bass in local reggae bands. He then migrated to the States with his band Q-Feel.

Soon Page was writing and/or performing with Earth Wind & Fire, Paul Young, Go West ("King of Wishful Thinking"), Starship ("We Built This City"), Bernie Taupin, and most recently with Robbie Robertson ("Fallen Angel" and "Sign of the Rainbow").

All this was the prelude to his first solo project; for the first time Page was writing for himself, not to complement the feelings of other performers.

THE WRITING

MARTIN PAGE COMMENTS:

"In The House of Stone and Light' was written a year and a half ago. I had just returned from the Grand Canyon, and while there I had learned that the Indians (Native Americans) call the Grand Canyon 'The House of Stone and Light.' The title really moved me and I brought the phrase back with me to my home studio (in Los Angeles)."

"It's a personal song about rebirth and discovery...about finding stillness, shelter and peace within one's own soul. I knew I was writing an inspirational song that was honest and had passion. My job was to communicate emotion. It was a bonus if the song EXPLODING AT RETAIL!







WUSZ's Mary Beferareports that it is the top selling album-of all formats-in Northern Minnesota. In other words, Shania is outselling Michael Jackson.






Americana Picks

LAURIE LEWIS & TOM ROZUM The Oak And The Laurel (Rounder)



NEWS AS A WEAPON

News can be a programming tool to build ratings and listener loyaltv-an idea that has always seemed strange to many PDs.

It shouldn't. After all, by definition, "news" is information that is interesting. We live in an "information-dependent" age. Spend a few days in the wilderness without a radio and you experience withdrawal symptoms.

Since news deals with human affairs, and radio's audience is made up of humans, news is important to all radio audiences. The key, as it is in every programming function, is building and then meeting listener expectations.

The first step is ridding yourself and your staff of any idea that "news is a tuneout." If it is, you're community and competing with other news media for speed and accuracy. Avoid the ones who like staying in the station all day, and value going off duty on time; the most compelling news never happens on schedule or in assigned hours, and that's the stuff you must cover to build and keep the station's reputation.

News isn't usually a profit center for a radio station, but done right it's a ratings builder. In addition, as we approach the age of digital radio and satellite radio, it's news-local news-that will keep your station relevant and competitive. Radio has a bright future and media are transformed by technology-but only by being personal and by being local.

One more important point. It's

But, as the saying goes, you don't win by playing defense.

not doing it right. For every listener who doesn't want to hear the news, there are two who will tune in to get it. That defines one of the greatest values of high-quality radio news-it builds cume outside the station's normal audience, and can broaden demographics.

First, figure out for yourself what expectations you want your listeners to have about your news-expectations that are higher, or more clearly defined, than your competition. What do you consistently offer that the other stations don't? If there's nothing, better redefine your news effort

Is there a local or regional orientation to the news? Are you committed to an audio-intensive approach—"taking" the listener there? Do you concentrate on being ahead of the other media on breaking stories? Do you find human interest news others miss? There are all kinds of ways to define a news

Then, construct the newscast to highlight whatever it is you see as your edge. News intro wording, story sequencing, stylized news writing, can all help do this.

Make sure that your news director understands the station's news goals and is committed to them. Look for newspeople who are motivated by the fun of staving on top of the

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the custom for most music stations these days to have news only in drive times. This is essentially a defensive approach; the idea is to keep listeners from tuning out of information-oriented stations to find out what's going on (there's that information dependency again).

But, as the saying goes, you don't win by playing defense. The key to whether news is working as a tunein is whether your listeners would turn to your station in an emergency, or when they hear that something major has happened. Do they have any reason to think you'd cover it, whenever it happens? If the news is normally presented only in drive time, they don't Listeners don't understand why the station has news sometimes and not others.

To build that listener confidence that when important news happens your station will have it, you must present the news consistently around the clock. These days, for most stations, that's a radical idea. But, we are in an informationdependent age, and if your news is sold, your music station can do this and win. The content and structure of the news must be consistent; the length can vary by the time of day. It's the consistent appearance of news in all time periods that builds listener expectations, and makes yours the station to turn to.

exception when out of the clear blue sky comes solos by no less than Jerry Garcia, Chaka Khan, Bela Fleck and especially Pat Metheny. The opening "Spider Fingers" is a fantastic display of melody and flash. Fans of

the last Rob Wasserman album will revel in a revived "White Wheeled Limousine." Other fantastic moments include the even-tempered "Walk In The Sun" and our fave, the walkin', boppin' "The Changes" as well as the single "Cruise Control." All in all, *Hot House* is the meeting grounds for a lot of hot licks.

EDWYN COLLINSGorgeous George (Bar None)

Vinyl junkies will recognize Edwyn Collins' name from the back of a half-dozen Orange Juice albums released during the early '80s. While OJ launched a million Scottish garage bands, they themselves wallowed in relative obscurity, dissolving in 1985. After another ten years of low-profile solo work, Collins is back with an international hit, "A Girl Like You." Backed by Sex Pistols drummer Paul Cook (one of the true nice guys of rock n roll), Collins' music is compact and unpretentious. He's not without his obvious influences (David Bowie, Nick Cave, Scott Walker, Andy Williams), and shows many stylistic sides, including a beautiful acoustic-based "Low Expectations." Spend time with this one and enjoy its many retro delights.

SAY A PRAYER FOR SLIM

The next time vou wander into a bar or restaurant and see a man or woman at the piano competing with the roar of conversation. think of Slim Man.

It can be uplifting when radio rescues a struggling independent artist. Tim Camp, alias Slim Man, is a prime case. His

story, until now, has been fraught with disappointment and false starts. It started in the early '70s when he broke into the music business writing pop tunes.

"It's been near misses since my teenage years," sighs Slim Man. "In the early '70s, when I was 19, I got signed as a songwriter for Motown and got a song, Summer Days, placed on Angela Bofill's very first album. After that Motown asked me if I wanted to do an album. I worked my fingers to the bone for a year and a half. I did everything. String charts—real strings. Horn charts-real horns.

Slim developed a style he now calls "laid back jazzy pop," which is similiar to Sade's breezy sophistication. But he did it a full 6 years before her 1985 release of Diamond Life.

Then came the bad news. "While waiting for a release date, I was at a Motown party at the Bronx Botanical Gardens for Stevie Wonder's album, The Secret Life Of Plants," says Camp. "Somebody in the bathroom said to me, 'I'm sorry to hear about your album, I heard you got dropped.' I was crushed."

To this day, Slim Man doesn't even have an audio cassette of the finished masters. The tapes still sit in Motown's vaults. Camp left the

smooth pop genre and took the "rock of the '80s" route.

"I started a rock band called Boot Camp," he says.

"Atco, RCA, Lifesong and Atlantic offered us development deals, but nothing ever panned out.'

Camp again shifted gears-into Country


"In 1987, after Boot Camp broke up, I organized talent contests sponsored by Philip Morris and Marlboro cigarettes." he says. "Someone screened the tapes, and my job was to be emcee and organize 30 bands, on and off stage. We visited cities like New Orleans. Chicago, Lexington, Portland. It was crazy-ten bands a night for three days, each playing 15 minutes.

It was on the road with Marlboro that Camp became Slim Man, a pseudonym he used onstage, in case fans of losing bands tried to track him down back at the hotel.

Slim Man's third bout with bad luck struck in 1991 when he worked with a Bryan Adams/Michael Bolton-style vocal-

"Brian Jack was signed by Epic after we had done a locally-released CD that drew huge response," says Slim Man. "They came down to see him play in 1991; I had written and produced all 12 songs and got him



his deal. Then, as the lawyers started negotiating, it became the master of disaster. They brought in the Spin Doctors' producer and Diane Warren to write songs. Four songs and \$40,000 later, Brian was dropped."

Down, but not yet out, Camp returned to his "laid back jazzy pop" roots and recorded nine songs in a friend's spare bedroom.

"We recorded next to the University of Maryland." he says. "On warm days we had to open the windows. If you solo any of the vocal tracks, you'll hear dogs barking, phones ringing and the university marching band practicing in the distance."

The result is a quality collection of stark, but catchy adult pop songs. One haunting tune, "Faith In Us," is one of the finest male vocal songs to surface on A2 radio all year. Not surprisingly, many compare his vocal sensuality to Sade.

All the major labels passed. Then came the strangest twist in Slim Man's career.

A direct telephone response firm believed in Slim Man's music so much, they formed their own small label, GES. *End Of The Rainbow* was pressed and mailed out to radio.

"The parent company at GES Records is the American Association of Professional Psychics." Slim says. "These are the people that started the Psychic Friends Network and splintered off. The president had heard the music and thought it should be released."

"Our most difficult musical need to fill is vocals, particularly male vocals," says Dore Steinberg, music director at KKSF in San Francisco. "Slim Man's arrival is great timing."

"My plans are to kiss butt until my lips fall off." says Slim, no doubt pondering the success Bobby Caldwell has as an independent. "I am my own manager and I'm loyal to GES."

Walk into a piano bar in Baltimore and you just may bump into Slim Man. He still takes the odd piano gig to help make ends meet until he can get his national tour together. Two nights a week he plays bass for a local blues band. The other nights are spent in the studio recording his next record.

Half embarrassed, Camp laughs at the irony.

"Especially now, I make fun of playing piano in a bar. Hey! I'm number 22 on the GAVIN chart! The customers don't know or care. They want to hear 'Brown-eyed Girl!' or 'Margaritaville.' " ●



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



soloists like Craig Chaquico, Peter White and Boney James have taught Aura that new age is now just a state of mind. "Forever Yours," "Here Comes The Night," "Listen To Your Heart" and "Force Of Nature" will stand up to any smooth jazz scrutiny from metro A2 PDs and MDs.

ROY HARGROVE FAMILY (VERVE)

This could be Roy Hargrove's deepest record yet. Family has a giant, live roomy feel, and plenty of guest stars give it real marquee value. Stephen Scott commandeers the piano bench for the main quintet, but stars like David "Fathead" Newman, Wynton Marsalis, John Hicks and Jesse Davis take serious cameos. "Nostalgia" is a superb duet between Hargrove and Marsalis, as the band sports a floating backup arrangement. Hargrove switches over to fluegelhorn on one of the many ballads, "The Nearness of You." Newman's tenor tones sidles up against Hargrove's beautiful notes. Instead of feverish bop, Family is more intimate, relaxed and introspective.

SHAHIN & SEPEHR E (HIGHER OCTAVE)

It's world music gone backwards. Two musicians from Tehran, Shahin and Sepehr, give us Middle Eastern influences with a western bent instead of the other way around. Those moody synth sounds you hear on *e* are Shahin bending and sustaining electric guitar riffs by Shahin

using a volume pedal. Plunge straight into our fave track, "October Moon." We call it flamenco guitar meets spaghetti western. There's a yin and yang feel to Shahin & Sepehr compositions. According to the duo, Shahin contributes a moody feel to the music, while Sepehr on keyboard and computers obsesses over the arrangements and technicalities.

JOE TAYLOR SPELLBOUND (RCA VICTOR)

If you're interested in spiking your music blend with some fine musicianship, check out Joe Taylor's Spellbound. Not only are Joe Taylor's guitar solos certifiably smooth, but his duet with Dave Koz on the opening title cut, an original composition, is a virtuoso performance. He masterfully mixes electric and acoustic guitar on a song like "Queen Of Pain." Spellbound also sounds fresh—the benefit of a live rhythm section. On the Quiet Storm front, check out the vocal remake of Gino Vannelli's "I Just Wanna Stop," featuring Al B. Sure! whose vocal sweetness could make "...Stop" a big summer record for adult alternative radio.

JON HENDRICKS AND THE ALL-STARS BOPPIN' AT THE BLUE NOTE (TELARC)

Not only does jazz vocalist Jon Hendricks make this record a family affair by singing along with his wife and daughters, Judith, Michele and Aria, but special guest soloists leave their shades of blue. That's Al Grey on trombone, as well as Benny Golson on tenor and Wynton Marsalis on trumpet. Jacky Terrasson's bassist, Ugonna Okegwo, played on this live date as well. Hendrick's ringmaster-type enthusiasm is contagious. He's the master of jumpin' jazz jive, and his scat and vocal rasps rival any sax player on the scene. Segue some Hendricks next to vocal newcomer Kurt Elling for some teacher/student compar-

TORCUATO MARIANO LAST LOOK (WINDHAM HILL)

Brazilian guitarist Torcuato Mariano's Last Look is much more distinctive than his previous album, Paradise Station. The chord changes are unmistakably Brazilian, but the overall atmosphere is uptown American smooth jazz. Check out the electronic shuffle rhythms and acoustic piano fills on "A Very Special Place." Mariano's interlocking chord patterns and Wes-style leads with unison flute parts against an orchestral backdrop make these arrangements downright sweet. Mariano will kill you softly with his songs, especially "Africa," with its satisfying samba vocal scat. Jazz radio could dig on "Dindi," TM's homage to Antonio Carlos Jobim.

"There are at least three or four people living inside me," says Rosie Gaines. "When I sing, I try and bring them all out." Bring them out she does - Aretha, Chaka, Bessie and Billie all come to mind when you listen to this extraordinary vocalist, writer, producer, arranger and instrumentalist. This CD is exciting listening. You want to tell everybody about Gaines' raw power and this astonishing array of songs that range from sultry to serious. All I can say is R&B music is safe; Rosie is here.

MOKENSTEF AZZ IZZ (OUTBURST)

MoKenStef are three street sharp women (Mo, Kenya and Stefanie) whose songs focus on love and relationships, but at the same time these sexy L.A. natives steer clear of hollow, cliched pillow talk. Their debut CD, Azz Izz is full of songs that tell it like it is. Your



choice of sexy ballads or uptempo rap. This is advantageous for radio because you can pick the stuff that fits your needs.



AARON HALL "CURIOSITY" (MCA)

This is one of the first hit singles from the soundtrack to the movie *Dangerous Minds*. Other hit artists on the CD include Coolio, Immature and Rappin 4 -Tay, just to drop a few names. If Aaron Hall's funky mid-tempo groove is any indication of what's to come, look out. We may have a block-buster on our hands.

TAKE THAT Back For Good (Arista)

Take That has sold millions of records worldwide, but has yet to be heard of in the States. Other than a release that was out for about a minute several years back, their band's success story has all been written overseas. Prepare for the next chapter, and when they add up sales figures they're likely to take up a lot of space. Those looking for the ultimate pop sound of 1995 stop right here. Take That to the bank.

HOOTIE & THE BLOWFISH I Only Wanna Be With You (Atlantic)

Duh!

AFTER 7 'Til You Do Me Right (Virgin)

It's always nice when Babyface is part of the family and is available to help write your next hit. Melvin and Kevon Edmunds do fine on their own, but teamed with 'Face they cover all bases. A solid base has been built at Urban where this record gets hotter each week, and the pop appeal of this super-smooth production is undeniable.

BLESSID UNION OF SOULS Let Me Be The One (EMI)

On the heels of one of the year's strongest debuts comes the obvious choice for a follow-up by Cincinnati's favorite sons. This track will expand interest in the group and put them in contention for best new artist of the year hon-

YO!CO ROSS Miss Me (Columbia)

All right, so I was a bit premature writing up this track in mid-January. But I wasn't alone. As mentioned in that review, B96 (WBBM/FM)-Chicago was spinning this track back then. I still love and dancehall flavor of this uptempo effort, which just might complement the current season even more.

IAN MOORE Modern Day Folklore (Capricorn)

With a lot of hard work and an excellent sense of blues-rock balance, guitarist Ian Moore spread a long tradition of Texas guitaring by traveling hither and yon. One of the best guitarists to break out of Austin since Stevie Ray, Moore shows his stuff on the opening "Muddy Jesus." However, it's a slow builder like "Today" that

reveals the depth he's truly capable of. A young man playing way beyond his years, Ian Moore will be gunslinging Fender guitars for a long time to come.

If there's any good to come out of the this whole Nine Months/Hugh Grant spectacle, it's the return of Little Steven on the self-penned, internationally-flavored lead track "The Time Of Your Life." It was recorded in Milan, Berlin and Madrid, and mastered at Abbey Road. The intertwining mandolin and accordion and backing by the boys from the Bon Jovi band make this track the sure standout of the Hans Zimmer-composed soundtrack.

MICHAEL SPEAKS No Equal (East West/EEG)

Nineteen-vear-old Michael Speaks was discovered while serenading commuters on a New York City subway platform, and since then he's gone from underground to above ground in a big way. Speaks has proclaimed himself the "undisputed vocal champion" (he has a sevenoctave range), and demonstrates his singing prowess and amazing vocal range throughout his debut CD. I like his confidence. Anyone who covers Luther's "If Only For One Night" without breaking a sweat is a talent that can hang with the best for 15 rounds.
