



Launch.com's

Bob Roback is the president and co-founder (with Dave Goldberg) of Launch.com, which they started in 1994 to publish a monthly, teen-oriented music magazine on CD-ROM. Earlier this year, Launch bought SW Networks from Sony and began recasting and blending that company's 24-hour formats with Launch's own online and CD-ROM content.

We bought SW Networks for two reasons: content programming and marketing. The first was an opportunity to build up our editorial content, and to add some depth across genres and formats, and to get greater strength, frankly, in the area of news.



The second reason is that we feel radio is a very important, traditional medium, one in which we should be getting our message out and driving people to Launch.com. We're all about Launch.com and the things that happen in the digital arena. So, to the extent that we're working in radio—or TV for that matter—it's all about the marketing opportunity and how that can build up our interactive media company.

SW programming team and have a much deeper content base to build from.

One thing we're now able to provide radio stations, when you think of on-air and online, is much deeper content. We have a very large volume of musicians, generally, and to a lesser-extent, celebrities, on our CD-ROM. Often, we generate news items just from those musician and celebrity interviews. That means we can bring to the table different types of interview clips, audio clips, anything that's beneficial and that can differentiate a station.

Until now, Launch hasn't been providing anything to radio stations. But now that we have that radio outlet, if Mike Myers is our featured artist for our new CD-ROM and there's a lot of buzz about the new Austin Powers movie, we can take a couple of funny things that he says and put them together for the stations. We think this will also work well for the record labels and their artists.

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Radio Revenues Should Hit 9% in '99

BY TONY SANDERS

Radio ad revenue is on a real tear in 1999 and should close out the year up about 9 percent, according to advertising guru Bob Coen, whose official title is Sr. VP McCann-Erickson.

In fact, first-quarter spot-radio business did so well—up 14 percent over 1Q 1998—it turned out to be a real surprise, Coen said. "We knew it would be strong, but not this strong," he said. Some of that early momentum may start to fade as the year presses on, but overall, radio revenue should post some of the best growth rates in the media business this year, behind only cable.

UMG Outlines Reorganization

In an effort to create greater efficiencies across multiple labels, Universal Music Group has announced a new organizational structure in North America of its Common Label Operations department.

Six distinct areas will report to Vinnie Freda, Senior Vice President of Common Label Operations of Universal Music Group: Copyright Administration, Recording Administration, Marketing Administration, Advertising and Media Services, Repertoire Management, and Image Management.

Freda remarked, "Universal's merger with PolyGram has given us the unique opportunity to completely review the operating procedures of our labels and adopt the best practices employed by each. Our department will manage the key administrative processes that are common to all labels while allowing each label to pursue its distinct corporate culture."

\$3.76 billion this year, a 9 percent gain over last year, while local radio should top out at \$12.6 billion, also a 9 percent gain over '98 figures. "That's considerably higher than we expected," Coen said, telling GAVIN that part of the reason for the gains is that radio groups are putting

more salespeople on the street, "and you guys are able to get away with charging higher rates." Coen also noted that "it has taken awhile for marketers to catch on" to the fact that the economy has been "so much stronger than anybody expected."

Arbitron Sets 4Q Debut For Streaming Audio Ratings

Several hundred broadcasters and Internet audiocasters may get a Christmas present this year: the first set of Arbitron's much-anticipated Webcasting ratings. "We're not putting a specific date on it, but the first data release should come out sometime during the fourth quarter," says Arbitron New Media VP/GM Greg Verdino. He told GAVIN the first numbers will cover "several hundred stations" and provide such data as cume and "time-spent-tuning" for stations that are streaming live, 24-hour audio (as opposed to on-demand audio). Verdino said the major radio groups he has talked to about the streaming-audio ratings have been "pretty positive" and "definitely interested" in the new numbers, but that they're content right now to adopt a wait-and-see attitude. "These are definitely not a radio ratings add-on," he said, "but a new set of numbers that look at streaming on the Internet."






Van Dull-ism

When speaking at conferences, I always like to pose the rhetorical question: "Why do radio stations have vans?" This inevitably draws vacant stares until some bold soul ventures. "To haul stuff around?" Half right.

The reason radio stations have vans is because radio stations have always had vans. Period. We're stuck in a rut. When stations first started purchasing promotional



vehicles, the voung, hip audience that dictates trends and styles was into vans. In a large way. But I don't imagine there are many 18vear olds in your market today pestering their dads to buy them a boogie van. Yet, what do vou have parked in your station lot?

"A station vehicle is your first line of defense in promoting and marketing your radio station," says Mark Gullett, the Director of Marketing for Wild 98.7-Tampa. "They are not just utilitarian, they're an imaging device for your station. Often it's the first impression a listener will have of your station, so it has to fit your vibe."

I've sat in on conference calls that ran hours while management obssessed about the colors and clothes that would be worn in a station TV campaign...while an incredibly un-hip and out-of-format van sat just outside their office window.

In Tampa. Gullett's station, which targets young adults, has a tank (yes, a tank), three jeeps, and a van. "It's the anti-van. We tagged it with spray paint with slogans like 'We're the station that doesn't suck.' When there's a huge event in Tampa that everyone's at, it's kind of fun to roll up in it and watch everyone stop what they're doing. You'll have 20 vans, a couple of Mastercruisers, and us. Guess who wins?" says Mark. Additionally, the station's street crew wears camouflage blue shirts that match the tank's paint job; they've removed

> the gun and replaced it with an aircannon that shoots tank tops.

The point of promotions is to stand out, get noticed, and make a lasting impression. Kind of difficult to achieve when one of the key weapons in your arsenal is identical to the competition's, with the exception perhaps of the paint job. And that begs the question, "What is the appropriate

vehicle for your station?" New Planet Radio's Oldies 107.9 in Honolulu went straight to their listeners and asked them, and the answer was a Woody (like you'd see in an old '60s beach flick). They got one, logoed it, and it is a hip and viable representation of what an Oldies station in Hawaii is.

With so much emphasis placed on out-innovating the station down the dial, it's kind of bizarre that in the case of one of our standard fundamentals, many of us are caught in a time warp. Fortunately this is a solvable problem...and there's no better time than summer-our bread and butter promotional season-to make the leap into the '90s...before they're gone.



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

"S FAVORITE SAMPLE

His HAIR score reflected all of these

Galt MacDermot composed HAIR.

OK. I've said it. It seems that every article focusing on this man must start with some reference to the musical which revolutionized Broadway in the late '60s. But for us, HAIR only serves as a starting point. Our focus on MacDermot comes from a hip-hop point of view; we want to know what makes this 71-year old man so damned relevant to contemporary music. MacDermot is of the utmost importance to us-and not because everybody and his uncle has covered "Let the Sunshine In" in the 30 years. since he composed the sona.

MacDermot studied music in Capetown in the early '60s, where he observed the complex polyrhythms of native South African musicians. He moved to New York from his native Canada in 1964 and delved into the world of studio musicians, befriending many of his colleagues, including drum master Bernard Purdie. He then formed his own company, Kilmarnock Records, on which he released his own experiments in rhythm; 1966's Shapes of Rhythm heralded the oncoming funk movement. By the time he composed the score to HAIR in 1967. MacDermot was already a seasoned player and composer.

influences and more. By the time the play reached Broadway in 1968, MacDermot had assembled an aweinspiring group of musicians—bassist Jimmy Lewis, guitarist Charlie Brown, and drummer Idris Muhammad, among others-capable of playing the funk that he envisioned. His funk, MacDermot remembers Muhammad telling him, was "unorthodox"; it did not follow the patterns that James Brown and other innovators had established. But it had the power to move nonetheless. As MacDermot reflects on the days playing in the Broadway pit, "We played flat out-loud and hard. No one pulled back."

Lucky for MacDermot, HAIR was a worldwide smash, enabling him to kickstart his fledgling label. In between major label projects, such as the instrumental HAIR album First Natural Hair Band (1969) and the film score to Cotton Comes to Harlem (1970). MacDermot now managed to sneak in projects like the soundtrack to the obscure documentary on designer Yves St. Laurent, Woman Is Sweeter (1969). He served as A&R person, producer, composer, and arranger on almost all Kilmarnock releases because, as he states. "Nobody else wanted to release my music, and I wanted an outlet as I wrote and recorded."

At its height, Kilmarnock released 7 records per year, ranging from the poems of inner city children set to sona

(Ghetto Suite) to albums by established artists playing MacDermot compositions (Billy Butler Plays Via Galatica). All of Kilmarnock's records shared an offkilter, unconventional approach that eschewed the formulaic commercial sound. And while MacDermot did have some friends helping sell the records in New York and Montreal, most Kilmarnock releases went from the pressing plant directly to the composer's Staten Island basement, ostensibly never to be heard again.

This is where the hip-hop generation enters the picture. By around 1990, the music of James Brown and his disciples had been thoroughly plundered, sampled to within an inch of its life. Inventive producers began to dig deeper and deeper into the crates, eventually pulling out, well, Galt MacDermot, This is not surprising; any crate digger worth his salt knows that a HAIR soundtrack (and there are dozens) will invariably contain some material worth sampling-and that the RCA-released HAIR, specifically, contained many never-before-used gems.

The first to utilize MacDermot in a rap song was the chocolate boy wonder. Pete Rock, Grabbing the melody from HAIR's "Where Do I Go?," Rock crafted an other-worldy beat for Run D.M.C.'s comeback Down With the King. In effect shouting to the rap world, "Galt MacDermot has some ioints!" Other producers quickly followed suit. Buckwild used the instrumental version of "Ripped Open by Metal Explosions" for the Artifact's "C'mon With the Get Down," Masta Ace Inc. flowed over Cotton Comes to

For his part, MacDermot-although aware that producers were sampling his tunes-remained a bit removed from the rap movement. Although Vic of the Groove Merchants regulary traveled to the composer's house with the Beatnuts to buy MacCermot's old Kilmarnock releases, the musican never sat down with his visitors to listen to the rap songs that had used his compostions. This all changed in 1995, when MacDermot recleved a tape in the mail from Busta Rhymes, at the time just emerging from his stint with Leaders of the New School. The tape contained "Woo Haa! Got You All in Check" along with a letter explaining

MacDermot had not thought about "Space"—or the soundtrack—in years and was amazed that not only had Smith found a copy of the recording, but that he had used it so inventively. MacDermot took an immediate liking to Busta's delivery and OK'd the use of the sample.



Some months later, the composer received a call from his lawyer, telling him that "Woo-Haa!" was the number one rap song in the nation. MacDermot began following the progress of the song, tuning in to rap station Hot 97 and watching for Busta's video on MTV. But above and beyond the novelty of hearing his music used in the '90s, MacDermot found that

hip-hop had saved the funk feel that he thought disco and the '80s musical slump had killed...and he appreciated rap's innovations. As he says now, "I

spent my whole life listening to rhythm music. And when you listen to rap, you catch it—the freedom, especially of the voice. That's good, that's real freedom. When the voice is good, it's like a jazz solo."


Now, the sample requests pour in.

And MacDermot fields them personal-

ly, accepting virtually all ("I only turned down one; the song had a horrible message," he says). In response to the bootlegging of his rarest works, Kilmarnock has begun actively reissuing his old records; Woman Is Sweeter and Shapes of Rhythm are currently available (check www.galtmacdermot.com or call 800-497-1691 for more information), and more issues, including a compilation of previously unreleased funk tracks, are in the works.

These days, MacDermot plays with his New Pulse Band, comprised of old chums Purdie, Brown, bassist "Bad" Bascomb, and a sparkling horn section. And he listens to rap on the regular (his car radio has Hot 97 as a preset!). So how he would feel about collaborating with rap producers in the future? "I'm open to any musical endeavor," he says matter-of-factly, then cautions, "but I only do what I like."

A good ethic, if I do say so myself. It is for that reason that Galt MacDermot's music, whether it was recorded 30 years ago or yesterday, retains an exciting edge.

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
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
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Behind the Wu



In the early '90s, a powerful force erupted from the badlands of New York. With origins in and around Staten Island and plans to take over the world using the power of the Rap industry, this force, collectively, is known as the Wu-Tang Clan. Eight members and one overall, steel-fisted ruler—known simply as the RZA—and unquestionably the driving force behind one of the greatest Rap groups of all time. But one cannot be an effective ruler without a trusted right-hand man. RZA's cousin, John "Mook" Gibbons, is that individual.

President of Wu-Tang Management and the newly-appointed President of Wu-Tang Records, Mook first got his start in the record industry through his cousin. "RZA asked me to help him with his dream," he says, "so here I am."

Mook says that his main focus in '99 is Wu-Tang Records. "Our primary goal is to sell records. However, the overall strategy is to introduce each artist's original style and flavor—I want to flood the industry with Wu artists from now until the end of the year.

"It's time for us to make a change. Wu-Tang Clan was one of the first acts to bring independent hip-hop to the masses. That is where we want to bring it again."

Wu-Tang Records has almost a dozen acts (new and old) that will hit stores before the end of the year. "Wu-Syndicates is our first group to hit," Mook says, "They represent the V.A. Chamber, and their album is in stores now. They remind me of early Raekwon and Ghostface Killa."

GIBBONS MAY BE THE BUSIEST MAN IN SHOW BIZ

Then there's Poppa Wu, exploding out of Brooklyn with his obscure philosophical rhymes, whose first release is scheduled to hit the streets later this year. In keeping with the family-style of business that Wu-Tang Clan personifies, Mook adds, "[Poppa] brought us this kid, Bang Bang, an R&B singer who is going to appeal to all those thugs out there."

The return of Shyheim is also in store: "He's matured in style and attitude, and he has brought his vision to a higher level." *Manchild* will drop around August and, Mook predicts, "he is going to be a major force to reckon with in the industry."

Also in the pipeline is Money Making Operation (M.M.O.), which Mook calls "our Ace in the hole. They're coming out of the Coney Islands Chamber. We're going to catch this industry sleeping when we drop them."

The West Coast Killa Bees (Black Knights), Mook continues, "have extraoridinary potential." And the Royal Fam is "taking it to that next level. They have philisophical rhymes, rough beats, and a militant perspective. These kids are hot! Their time is now!"

Finally, two of the original Wu members will be gracing us with releases this year. Masta Killa and U-God are the last Wu-Tang members to drop solo albums. Mook says that once Masta Killa attacks, you'll feel it. "You won't be disappointed. Masta Killa is a mystery to all of us; he's on some ol' 'Now you see me, now you don't'-type s**t.

"U-God is my pride and joy. He'll be the one paying the bills for the next two years," jokes Mook. "U-God is our powerhouse hitter for the year. He has a hard, rough edge to him. Yet, he's very smooth. Kind of hip-hopish with a rock style." Check for *Redemption* sometime in September.

• • • • •

Along with Wu-Tang Management and
Records, Mook has his hands in a num-

ber of other business ventures. One, called "The Feast of 12 Jewels," is particularly on his mind when we speak.
Following the 12 jewels of Islam—knowledge, wisdom, understanding, freedom, justice, equality, food, water, clothing, love, peace, and happiness—the Feast brings together gang leaders to discuss ways to make stronger communities in their cities. "We went into the community and hit up the best soul food and chicken joints to

feed these guys," Mook says. At a recent 12
Jewels event in
Chicago, there was no fighting or arguing—just peaceful talking about how to solve problems.
"I'd like to go into some cities in Virginia and out to Compton," says
Mook, "you know, cities like that."

Also involved with a sports management company, Mook has a vision of a place called "The Clubhouse," where kids can go after school and develop their athletic skills. "We're not trying to compete with Master P

or any other sports agency," he says. "We only want to work with kids in Junior High and High School.


"I want it to have a swimming pool and basketball courts. I want to help boys and girls develop themselves both mentally and physically."

There is also mention of a film company. "Wu-Films—or something like that—will be shooting a movie about Shyheim's life," Mook says. Shyheim's story is deep, Mook tells me. "Shyheim went from being a child rap star, to being incarcerated, to being back out on the street." While Manchild will probably be a straight-to-video movie, there are definite plans for more fea-

tures in the near future.

Mook is also working on an "interactive studio": "It's called the 'K.I.D.D.'
The Kesler Interactive Digital Design,"
he says.


"It's a portable studio, the size of a suitcase, that you can carry on a plane and fit under your seat. You have 24-tracks to play with. You can be on the plane, make yourself a beat, add a yocal, and then master it all onto a



CD," he explains. "It's incredible. We're going with full-scale publicity ads in all the hip-hop publications."

Finally, there is Mook's personal dream: Wu-World, "Wu-World will become the super entertainment complex of America," he says proudly of his vision for a family-oriented complex with something for everyone. Mook is hoping to break ground for Wu-World-in Broward County, Florida—sometime in 2004. There will be a cyber-cafe, a movie theater, a bowling alley, a recording studio, a roller skating rink, a disco club with a stage for live performances, a nursery school, and Wu-Bingo for the elderly. "That's for my Mom," Mook says laughing. "Mom is a bingo fanatic. She goes on bingo trips on buses. They got bingo on the bus even!"



Creative Ways to Boost Your Numbers



What are the key elements involved in programming successful radio stations? Based on my experience, there essentially are two: good leadership/people management skills and, assuming you're all on the same page. creativity. Talent can come and go; marketing budgets can wax and wane; ownership can change. But if you and your station can keep the creative flame lit on a consistent basis, you'll be successful.

Allow me to offer a few suggestions/ thought starters to help creativity flourish within you and your station.

WHAT NUMBERS?

There's nothing more tragic than creativity that doesn't count. If you or your team goes off on an idea, make sure it's going to help your numbers.

Creativity without impact on your numbers is like a tree falling and no one hearing it. Did it really happen...or matter? Practice "focused creativity," a term I coined to help radio clients focus on the ideas that will move numbers. Likewise, discard ideas that sound great but won't move the needle.

What numbers should you focus on? In our business there are two scorecards that count:

- Sales numbers. If you're the PD, have you and the sales manager and GM sat down to discuss (and agree on) audience and revenue targets? Given today's financial pressures, woe to the PD who doesn't work closely with sales. Brainstorming with your sales manager may actually help both of you, leading to creative ways to program and promote. Bottom line: make sure your on-air product (and the audience it hopes to deliver) are on target with sales' needs.
- **Arbitron numbers.** Here's where focused creativity gets its report card. If you've channeled creativity toward pleasing the audience—and shrewdly playing the Arbitron game—it

should show here

Suggestion: whenever someone on your staff has an idea, test it against two criteria. First, does it help you meet your programming goals? Next, is there a sales/revenue impact, consistent with your programming/marketing plan? If the concept doesn't satisfy at least one of these, then honor the idea and thank the person who offered it, but just have the courage of your convictions. Say something like, "Great idea Mary, but it just doesn't fit what we're shooting for now. Thanks anyway—and keep the suggestions coming." The unemploy-

on that idea? Brainstorming can be a healthy way to foster creativity.

ARBITRON CREATIVITY

Every PD would probably sell a small part of his or her soul in order to assure success in Arbitron. Indeed, Arbitron recently reissued a ratings book found to have been corrupted by someone with a "media affiliation." However, with a few creative ploys you may achieve Arbitron impact in a less felonious mode.

As you turn your station's creative juices towards the Arbitron challenge,

ment line is filled with PDs whose creativity wasn't focused enough to move the numbers. Don't be one of them!

STAFF CREATIVITY

Ideas are what separate winners from also-rans. But how do you spark creativity within a station? Maybe this checklist will help:

- Are you open to ideas? How do you communicate that interest to your staff?
- Do you and all key programming folks—especially jocks—get out of the station daily to interact with the public? Go to a mall, a club, a community event, and mingle. Do your sponge impression—soak up a lot of ideas and input. To get the cleanest ideas, don't wear station logo clothing; people may skew their perceptions and suggestions if they know who you work for. There's plenty of time for that "station look" at remotes and public events.
- Is there a consensus internally regarding how best to convey ideas to management? Do you have set meetings weekly? Can folks call or see you anytime they have a suggestion? If so, then how does the rest of the staff become exposed to or get to comment

focus on one key—the diary as a recall methodology. Everything you do on-air, or in outside advertising/promotion, should have one goal: to become so "Top of Mind" that listeners almost can't help but write your station in the diary.

Some tactical tips:

- Invite your listeners to stay tuned for a specific time frame. For example, "Give us the next hour and we'll give you (music, artists, prizes, whatever)." Keep promoting the "give us an hour" theme. Eventually, folks who listen but forget brief intervals will, when filling in their diary, subliminally conclude, "Well, I don't recall exactly how long I listened, but it must have been for at least an hour," and record it as such in their valuable booklet. While that can help your TSL, what is your challenge in building cume? Often, some stations don't have the marketing funds that others may have—so how do you make a meaningful impact?
- Be the most "high touch" station in your community. Radio is invisible, free, and there are lots of choices; it's a tough marketing challenge. Involvement in the community, in a meaningful way, may be the breakthrough you need. As

noted above, ask around your community. See what your listeners' priorities are, and brainstorm to see how your station might reach out to make a difference. It's vital that your listeners be given something from the station that they can touch or keep—a photo, a tshirt, school bag, or a cap—whatever will be a special way to touch your audience (oh, and by the way, help you be Top of Mind with them). Stations that creatively touch their audience in a manner relevant to that public win in Arbitron.

CREATIVE LISTENER INPUT

With budgets tightening, many stations can't spend the sort of money on research and consulting that a major market powerhouse might be able to. So what do you do? Street contact is useful, but you may want something more quantifiable and organized, yet within your budget. Here's a creative way to tackle this dilemma:

• Research Tip: Set up monthly, informal, listener focus groups—either in-person at a neutral, central setting, or over the phone via a local conferencing setup. Over the air or via your Web site, invite listeners to a "chat room" or whatever you want to call it.

Screen potential participants to make sure you weed out ringers or those outside the specs of your audience target. Have a professional moderator (cost: about \$500/session) conduct the hourlong "chat" about issues that are important to you. Solicit listener feedback and input—their verbatims and comments will likely fuel more creativity within the station, as well as help you focus on what activities/music/DJs are really important to your cume. Finally, try to mask the sponsorship of the research, so as not to skew folks' comments about your station—or the competition.

Creativity runs rampant in our business—from musical artists to radio execs. I've just tried to spotlight a few areas that can help you focus your creativity...and see it pay off.

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THE MUSIC MEETING

Doug Davis, MD, WJMZ-V103, Greenville, S.C.



Doug Davis started his radio career in college, at WCUF at Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio, before landing his first professional gig at News/Talk WHIO/AM-Dayton Ohio.

He joined WROU/FM when the Urban station hit the air in 1992. "That's where I learned the basics, from sales to production to promotions and programming," says Davis. "I did every job I could at that station." The hard work paid off when PD Marv Miller brought Davis with him to WJMZ as production director. "It was a chance for me to grow," says Davis. "Later, I started doing middays and was promoted to music director.

What personal quality assists you most in your work?

Organization. I like to stay on top of national trends and I like to have a good grip on retail, requests, and rotations. I'm very detail-oriented.

What are your responsibilities as Music Director?

You have to be—and stay—on the same page as the PD.
You have to understand what type of sound he has
designed for the station. It's my job to find music that fits his

style and the station's sound. I have to compliment his vision.

What is the sound of your station?

We're basically a 25-44 station, rather conservative and focused on the adult demos. We're a family station. We ask the labels for super tight edits on songs because we don't want to offend our female listeners.

What signature artists fit the sound of your station?

R. Kelly is an excellent representation of our sound. He's a king of R&B music and receives tons of requests here. Artists like him that have a lot of pop appeal.

How important is research in the selection of new music?

When it comes to new music I still depend heavily on my gut. I've heard it's suicide in the '90s, but when I hear a record I know if it's going to win or lose. I may miss a few—I'm not perfect—but I have to feel it and believe in its potential. That's more important than anything.


ARTIST PROFILE

SHORT-LIVED CAREER PLAN: "I thought I wanted to be a veterinarian, until my teacher told me I would have to treat snakes and rats!"




FUTURE GOALS: "I want to go to law school (later), but for now, doing cartoon voice overs is cool."

You Need Passion



This year's winner of the GAVIN Urban Small Market PD of the Year award, Phillip March is a 16-year veteran who has spent the last nine years programming WFXE in Columbus, Georgia. Following his graduation from Emerson College

in Boston, he auditioned for a job at WLOU in Louisville, didn't get the gig. instead landing at competitor WJYL for five years. "I started out as a part-timer and in four months I had a full-time shift doing 7-midnight. I was the Commander of the Night Patrol. I moved to middays and became the music director."

In 1989, March went to KATZ in St. Louis, "I

because I



knew I would turn this major market experience into a programming job," says March. In six months, he had landed his first PD job at WFXE. March has been programming WIZF since March of this year.

What personal quality assists you most in your work?

I still have passion for radio. I try to pass that on to my team. If they don't have passion for what they're doing, they can't win. Listeners can feel the difference.

Do you believe that a radio station is a reflection of the PD's personality?

Not like it used to be. It's more of a shared experience today, because of the influence of consultants and other department

heads. Personally, I'm still in the process of learning.

What is your definition of teamwork?

When each of my personalities is willing to do whatever it takes to win—especially giving a helping hand to other team players.

What is the one thing you demand from all

your air personalities?

Passion for what they do and a shared goal of winning.

If there was one thing you could change about radio what would it be?

Get rid of charts. Back off on the research and get more involved with your community. Know what your audience wants; not by questions over the phone, but by getting to know them and touch them on an individual level.

URBAN WORKSHOP

Cross-Promotion

What is good cross-promotion? It's reading a liner card without making a mistake, promoting ahead to an upcoming event (contest/music) or another show. Great cross-promotion is a personality using creative, interesting, colorful, or humorous language to entice a listener to stay with the station a little longer.

It's important that all jocks promote ahead to elements in the next 20 minutes, next hour, next day. By Wednesday, everyone should be pre-selling special weekend programming and promotions. Jocks should never go into or come out of a break without giving listeners a rea-

son to listen longer.

Phillip March: Program

Director, WIZF/FM-

Cincinnati

Everyone should promote the moming show and its features. The moming show should always be selling what's happening next, its institutional features, plus any interesting things they have planned for the next day. The moming show mantra should be "tomorrow, tomorrow, tomorrow, tomorrow."

A fresh morning show promo, heralding the next day's events, should be cut on a daily basis and scheduled throughout the day. Ideally, this promo should be on within an hour of the show going off the air.

Schedule at least two

"blank" liners a show, forcing the jock to be creative in promoting the next air personality, new music, or some other special event.

Any station that can execute great cross-promotion will have a consistent spread of listeners from daypart to daypart, weekend to weekday and weekday to weekend. Cross-promotion also gives your listeners the feeling that your station is a real family unit, made up of people who care for one another. When was the last time you read that in your research? A good vibe goes a long way with diary keepers.

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Q FILE CHRIS ROCK

Eddie Murphy was the African American stand-up comedian of the '80s. He flaunted an irrepressible, macho comic Image that reflected the brashness of the hip-hop culture. Murphy's humor was blasphemous and full of straight-up parodies. Others who made their mark in the '80s and early '90s were Arsenio Hall, Robert Townsend, Whoopi Goldberg, Marsha Warfield, Keenan and Damon Wayans, Sinbad, Martin Lawrence, and Chris Rock. But it's Chris Rock—once considered the least likely on that list to succeed—who is now the new stand-up king of black comedy.

Rock's style is reminiscent of Richard Pryor's trailblazing African American humor, mlxing abrasive characters, a rambunctious stage manner, and social and political satire into raucous, slice-of-life hilarity. Rock's latest CD, Roll With the New, and the earlier Roll With the New Tour 1997 have people around the country hollering. Not since Pryor's Is It Something I Said? or Murphy's Raw has there been a comedy album that black radio could so fully embrace.

Rock is everywhere these days. The Saturday Night Live alum has an Emmynominated HBO television show, and he's



been a spokesman for Nike ("Little Penny"). Rock has worked as a correspondent for the television show *Politically Incorrect*, and his movie career includes roles in *New Jack City, Panther, Boomerang,CB4*, and *Lethal Weapon 4*. With all this exposure and an album that has become a classic, Chris Rock is on his way to stardom.

Chris Rock will host the 16th annual "MTV Video Music Awards" in New York City, on Thursday September 9th.



The Bottom Line to Advertising on the Web

So, just how much is this new way to market your station gonna set you back? According to the fastblast.com's Director of Sales and Marketing Bob Bellin, a former GM at WMMS-Cleveland, "The cost depends on each station's actual needs. It won't be a 'one size fits all' kind of deal," Yeah, sure. How much exactly?

*Depending on market size, your goals and specifics, there is a lot of flexibility, but the cost will range from \$30,000 to \$200,000." Given the prohibitive costs and the difficulties finding the Alternative audience through direct mail and telemarketing, that doesn't seem too bad—if, in fact, it really works to help your station's ratings.

According to Y-100's McGuinn, "Look, you never really know what makes your station's ratings go up or down, although you have a pretty good idea. I consider this to be a pretty interesting marketing idea. Has it had an impact? Well, we used Fastblast during this Spring Book, and so far the ratings are shaping up to be very good."

Marketing Alternative For the New Millenium



One day we'll look back fondly at radio and the way it is marketed now, much like we look back on the days of the horse and buggy. Oh, how sweetly we'll think of those crazy, fun-filled "pre-Internet days."

That day may come sooner than we think. Today a new company, Fastblast.com, is gearing up to help radio market itself in the wired age. I first heard about Fastblast last October in a hush-hush meeting with principle investor Larry Rosin at the NAB convention in Seattle.

Less than a year later, the new company

What is Fastblast? "Simply put, it is a way to increase your ratings by using the Internet," says Rosin, who is best known as the President of Edison Media Research.

"After two years of exhaustive research and trial campaigns with WPLY-Philadelphia, the Lazer, WLZR-Milwaukee, and KNDD-Seattle, we are finally ready to go," he says. Explaining, "the Internet has crossed the threshold, and is now definitely a legitimate place to advertise your station."

Essentially, Fastblast does the research for you to find out what types of sites are the most efficient for your station; the company then continues to monitor the effectiveness of each banner ad and Web site, actually adjusting campaigns as they unfold. "And this is not just valid for Alternative," states Rosin. "It works for all formats-we look at each Web site and determine if it is an efficient use depending on your specific demo targets. I am really excited about this, because it's a great opportunity for radio."

"Fastblast actually drives cume and TSL," says Fastblast's VP/GM Bob Bedi, a former programmer and consultant, "We've found that with the banner ads, you get an inflow of new listeners, and with the

contesting, you increase TSL."

"The four campaigns we have conducted so far have been very exciting-and absolutely mirror our expectations," he continues. And according to company literature, Fastblast knows the Internet: "We know how many banner ads you are going to need to buy, where they need to go, the creative concepts that work, and how to tie the whole campaign together," boasts one release.

Fastblast is more than just building a database and using banner ads on the Internet. How have the End and Y-100 used Fastblast? "We did something we called 'The Unfair Internet Advantage," says Y-100 PD Jim McGuinn. "This was a

I ASLDIASL.com day's song and the time we would play it announced on the air every weekday morning at 7:20. But if you signed up on the Web, you got a daily e-mail with the song title and time info, so you didn't have to listen in at 7:20." How could you tell Fastblast was working, I wondered?

> "It was amazing to see how many people actually signed up and got into the contest. One day, our server had a problem—then about one hundred calls flooded the switchboard, asking 'where's my email.' That's when we knew we were on to something," laughs McGuinn.

Sales = Stripes. Meanwhile, **Limp Bizkit** lead singer **Fred Durst** is now a Senior VP at Interscope. I guess that makes him Brian's boss. According to *Hollywood Reporter*, Durst will get to do A&R, sign acts, and have his own label imprint.

More Bizkit. "Limp Bizkit is absolutely huge," says KXRK-Salt Lake City PD Mike Summers. "The phones are out of control!" Summers adds that, "Korn is starting to test well, and another record that is working is Len."



Final Comment About the Nookie. "It's all about the 'Nookie' here at WPBZ," says MD Dan O'Brien from his seaside digs in West Palm Beach. "We're doing it all for the Nookie. All the kids are out of school now and so all they do is call up and ask for Limp Bizkit, and if I say I just played it, they say, 'Well, then can you play Korn?'" There are other songs working in Florida

though. Says O'Brien, "**Lo Fidelity Allstars** is finally taking off. As the familiarity builds, people are really starting to dig it. **Silverchair** also gets lots of requests."

Extremely Hot. "Our 5th Annual Edgefest was huge—our biggest show to date," says KTEG-Albuquerque PD Skip Isley. We had over 18,000 people to see 17 bands including Limp Bizkit, Kid Rock, Smash Mouth, Fuel, Kottonmouth Kings, Zebrahead, Staind, and Shootyz Groove." Just one little problem. The desert heat (about 105 degrees at showtime!). Isley reports, "Unfortunately The Living End could not play. The lead singer was suffering from heat exhaustion and dehydration. He spent all day Monday in the hospital in Albuquerque getting re-hydrated." More "good" news: The band was scheduled to fly on to Phoenix to play the Warped Tour show where it was even hotter! As Isley notes, "Unfortunately the band was still in no condition to play and they had to cancel our show as well as Phoenix." And we thought it got hot in Australia.

"We're celebrating 'Test Fest' all during the month of July," reports **KKND**-New Orleans PD **Dave Stewart**. **The End**'s answer to **Lillith Fair**, The Testicle Festival includes such events as, "A golf tournament that has a lingerie show, and a bowling tourney where every team gets their own 'cheerleader' from the local talent of Vision's Gentlemen's Club," says Stewart.

Speaking of shows, KNRK-Portland has announced the line-up for their **Big** Stink 4 on August 8th: Hole, Blink 182, Eve 6, Orgy, Moby, Len and many more—18 bands in all on two stages, with a dance club to boot. Jokes PD Mark Hamilton, "There'd better not be any disasters, because I am off to Maui at 6 a.m. the next day!"

The True Test

BY L.J. SMITH AND MIKE ANTHONY

Nothing affects P1 listener share more than your music choices. When it comes to testing your gold music library, the only valid methodology (proven through trial over an extended period of time and one that produces reliable results in a completely controlled testing environment) is Auditorium-style music testing. That said, music testing has become a vendor item—and too many times is shopped for price, ignoring the fundamentals of what a quality music test should entail.

Auditorium music testing should

always be done in a controlled environment that makes all things equal for everyone taking the test; it should allow each song to be evaluated under the same conditions. It gives you the opportunity to re-screen participants on site, you can

take breaks whenever you are concerned about participants' fatigue, and you can have a research professional on-site to make sure everything is supervised, explained, understood, and documented. Be wary of so-called new technology or short cuts to save money when it comes to music testing.

Keep these thoughts in mind when evaluating music testing companies:

- If they farm out the recruiting to local supervisors and are not doing independent verification of the participants, then you have lost control of the sample. The chances of getting a pure sample of respondents free of professional test takers, referrals, or friends are low.
- If the library testing is conducted over the phone, you have lost control of the testing environment—and the ability to supervise the test, which should be void of distractions. The mood should be equal for all test takers, This can only be done when all songs are voted on at the same time under the same conditions.
- If your respondents are taking the test at different local facilities, you have lost control of the sam-

ple. Once again, by not being able to control the test environment, you have no control over the use of local databases that could contain professional test takers. The number of different local facilities you use compounds this problem.

Generally, you want to recruit to the natural order of the format target—a sample of 80 to 100 respondents with a narrow target demo of 10-12 years. Male and female percentages also are determined by who your P1s are. This way they can listen to

any station but you know what their favorite type of music is. You may want to include a certain percentage of the client stations' P1s.

Finally, all participants should be screened for their music preferences. You would

be surprised how many companies recruit by station cume. Cume screening is cheaper and easier for research company to recruit...but it's deadly for the client. When you do this, you haven't screened based on the reason they cume a particular station or what their music preferences are. A respondent might cume your station for the morning show or a contest or as relief from their favorite station. Do you really want someone who has no passion for the type of music you play voting on the songs that you are going to play? No. You don't test music with P2s to try and turn them into P1s. You'd be surprised how many people think this way. Music testing is about super-serving the tastes of the core listener of the format. There are no short cuts to a quality recruit—all music testing is only as good as the sample that is recruited!

Gram Parsons 101

Had Gram Parsons lived, he'd be 53. And while many hail him a country rock legend, some of you may be unfamiliar with his work. Here are some basic "Gram facts" to help you enjoy the Return of the Grievous Angel.

Real Name: Born Cecil Ingram Connors, November 5, 1946 in Winterhaven, Florida

Family: Mother Avis Snively Connors came from a wealthy citrus family. Father Cecil "Coon Dog" Connors died Christmas Day, 1959. Avis later married Robert Ellis Parsons, who adopted Gram at age 15.

Education: Briefly attended Harvard in 1965, dropped out in 1966.

International Submarine Band: Formed in 1966, cut Safe at Home in 1968 with Lee Hazelwood. Appeared in The Trip, starring Peter Fonda, 1967.

Byrds: Joined in 1968. Appeared on Sweetheart of the Rodeo.

Burrito Deluxe.
Posthumous Sleepless
Nights released in 1976,
all on A&M. Played
Altamont 1969 with

Solo Stuff: GP and

Grievous Angel, featuring Emmylou Harris, were released on Warner Bros. and Reprise, respectively. Recorded 1972-73, players were the seeds for Emmylou Harris' legendary Hot Band. Gram Parsons & the Fallen Angels was recorded live at WLIR in 1973, released in 1981.

Died: September 19, 1973 in a motel in Joshua Tree of "natural causes" helped along by a mix of morphine and tequila. Body burned by a close friend in Joshua Tree National Monument.

Musical Descendants: Emmylou Harris, the Eagles, Tom Petty, U2, Rolling Stones, Son Volt, Black Crowes, Jayhawks, and many more.

Return of the Grievous Angel Gram Parsons Interpreted

There have been numerous recorded tributes to Gram Parsons over the years, but none stand as tall as the new 13-song collection, *Return of the Grievous Angel*, recorded for Almo Sounds and quarterbacked by Emmylou Harris (who was discovered by Parsons) and Almo GM

Paul Kremen. As a member of the Byrds, the leader of the Flying Burrito Brothers (signed by Jerry Moss and Herb Alpert), and as a solo act, Parsons must certainly be considered the father of country rock.

"I thought it would be cool to get the copyrights and redo [Gram's songs], featuring three generations of artists inspired by him," says Kremen. "And I knew it would never happen without Emmylou."

Harris and Kremen put together a wish list, and "revised it a million times." The only MIA was Parson's pal, Keith Richards, who wanted to contribute, but was on the road with the Rolling Stones. Former Byrd Roger McGuinn didn't respond, but everyone else on the list agreed with enthusiasm—some with specific songs they wanted to perform. Here is Kremen's blow-by-blow account of the selections included on this, the first officially-

sanctioned Gram Parsons tribute.

"She" - Pretenders

"This was the first track that was completed. The Pretenders went in with Emmy in 1997. Elvis Costello and Chrissie Hynde were the first two artists to hear about the project and both immediately agreed to cut a song."

"Onh Las Vegas" - Cowboy Junkies

"The Cowboy Junkies finished their song about a year after the Pretenders. They knew exactly what they wanted to do. Emmy is a big fan of Margo [Timmons]. We both thought they were unique interpreters."

"Sin City" - Beck/ Emmylou Harris

H went to junior high school with

the guitar player in Beck's band, so I gave him all of Gram's CD recordings to play on the tour bus. Six months later, Beck agreed to do the track—if he could do it with Emmy. We didn't even know which song he would cut until

it was done live with Billy Payne of Little Feat and Jay Dee Maness, who played with Gram on Sweetbeart of the Rodeo."

"\$1,000 Wedding" - Evan Dando/Juliana Hatfield

"Evan and Juliana have been doing this song live for ages. Glynn Johns produced the track, he's a friend who knew Gram."

"Hot Burrito #1" - The Mavericks

*After we had 11 tracks recorded, I gave them to Jerry Moss, who originally signed the Burritos. He listened over the weekend, and felt something was missing, 'Hot Burrito #1.'

"High Fashion Queen" - Chris Hillman/Steve Earle

"This was the third track done. Chris was an obvious choice—a former Burrito—so we wanted him on the record. He suggested working with Steve.

"Juanita" - Sheryl Crow/Emmylou Harris

"Sheryl was one of the first people on our list, but she was touring and didn't have time. Then a time window opened up while Emmy was in New York. They cut it the next day, during her recording of *The Globe Sessions*, nailing it on the second take."

"Sleepless Nights" - Elvis Costello

"The very first song turned in, produced by Glynn Johns."

"Return of the Grievous Angel" -Lucinda Williams/David Crosby

"Emmy really wanted Lucinda aboard, and Lucinda wanted to do this song. Chris Etheridge, bassist from the Burritos, is on it, as is

Spooner Oldham, a writer for Stax. Burrito Bernie Leadon played on it as well. We added David Crosby because he was Byrd, which was Glynn's idea."

"100 Years" - Wilco

"Before going to work at Almo, I saw Emmy and the Hot Band's reunion at the Fillmore in San

> Francisco. In between sets they were playing a brand new Wilco record. That's when the idea popped into my head about how many people Gram Parsons influenced, including the whole No Depression movement."

"Song for You" - Whiskeytown

"I wanted Whiskey-town to cut this song, and they were in the studio recording it before we even set everything up. They didn't want to wait for the paper work, so they just handed it in. It's my favorite Gram song. Ironically, Glynn's son Ethan produced it."

"Hickory Wind" - Gillian Welch/David Rawlings

"Emmy is a huge fan of Gillian's; she specifically wanted her to do this song. They cut it in the studio of their house, coming up with a unique rendering.

"In My Hour of Darkness" - The Rolling Creekdippers

"Obviously [guitarist/producer] Buddy Miller is tight with Emmy; he plays in her band. He also fronts this alternative country supergroup with Jim Lauderdale, Victoria Williams, Mark Olson from the Jayhawks, and his wife Julie."

"This Time" (Hollywood)

Kiko's still dancing by the light of the moon as Lobos continue their alchemical mix of high tech and low tech with outstanding results. The instrumental portion of the single bears out the song's intricate construction.

Blue Indians

(Dangerous Discs/Inside Recordings)

Over the years, John Trudell has won over a lot of allies, many of whom we know by just one name: Bob, Bonnie, and Kris. But nobody has stuck by him closer than Jackson (Browne), who offers Trudell asylum on his label (Inside Recordings) as well as production for these sessions.

Blue Indians is the ultimate millennium blues album, a black cat moan, meditations on current and future issues. "Dizzy

Duck," for example, serves as a scary reminder of recent headlines, mixing firearms with manly identity

crisis, while pieces like

'Devil and Me" and "Toy."

"All Nite Cafe" and "You Were" are deeply personal odes. If *BI* seems more ambient, that's because hard drums are replaced with Triple A-friendly slide guitars, Hammonds, and vocals. Nobody's shouting or shaking fists, just quiet, persuasive rant and roll. As Trudell says, "I'm mixing the oldest with the newest." Also try:

PAUL THORN

Ain't Love Strange (Perpetual Obscurity)

While signed to A&M, Paul Thorn had a Northwestern hit at KMTT. Now following the demise of the label, Thorn has continued on a writing spree, and you're not likely to hear a better anthem to daytime



Long Way Home From Anywhere (Lucky Dog)


Bruce Robison's follow up to Wrapped is a flat-out winner. The production is soft and accessible,

allowing the songs to shine. This is easy country music, with tasty hooks and

And Bruce again provides great vocal presence enhanced, of course, by "The Voice"—wife Kelly Willis on backup vocals. "Travelin' Soldier" and "Trouble" are infectious; "The Good Life" swings sweet, as does "Anymore Good Lovin." Welcome Home.

Chris Botti: Homeless and Happy



Boss Smooth Jazz trumpet player Chris Botti dropped by GAVIN Central in San Francisco two weeks ago, excited about his third and latest solo recording. Slowing Down the World, on the GRP label. With this release, Botti decided to make a pronounced shift from a guitar-oriented sound (influenced by progressive rock bands like Roxy

Music and Blue Nile) to a more serene, string-oriented groove.

"I was really influenced by that Frank Sinatra/Antonio Carlos Jobim record they did together in 1967," says Botti, stabbing at his garlic noodles and grilled shrimp dinner. "You know, the one where Claus Oggerman did all the string arrangements."

The listener can get hypnotized by what's not there as well as what is there. When you listen to Sinatra and Jobim, there's not a lot of instrumentation there. The whole theme of that record was about playing music to a whisper. In terms of my new CD, my heart leans more towards the intimate stuff, like the bossa nova 'The Look' and 'Irresistible Bliss."

Having said that, though, it's uptempo tunes like "Why Not" or "Drive Time" that will become the heir-apparent to Botti's 1997 airplay gem, "Regroovable." "Drive Time," inspired by Botti's recent migration to the West Coast, is clearly the catchiest song on *SDTW*.

"I had just moved from New York to Los Angeles, and literally my life became 'drive time.' I hadn't owned a car in 12 years. 'Drive Time' is the most pop thing I've done to date.

Slowing Down the World is not without its big name guest stars. Sting sings a chilling

version of "In the Wee Small Hours of the Morning" (another Sinatra chestnut) and the orchestrations were penned by Art of Noise's Anne Dudley. Other guests include keyboardists Jeff Lorber and Bob James.

Botti's association with Sting began with a couple of appearances at Sting's Rain Forest charity concerts. Botti approached Sting about singing "Wee Small Hours" after the pair performed a duet of "Roxanne" at


Carnegie Hall. At Sting's urging, Botti traveled to Tuscany, where Sting was recording his own record. In exchange for Sting's appearance on *Slowing Down the World*, Botti added trumpet to a couple of upcoming Sting tunes.

"Who do you think got the better end of that deal?" Botti asks, laughing.

Chris is currently touring as part of Paul Simon's band for an amphitheater double bill with Bob Dylan, a gig that continues for another several weeks. He'll follow that with some gigs of his own and tour as an opener with Al Jarreau and Dave

Koz. Then he'll join up as a featured soloist with another multi-platinum artist. According to Botti's calculations, that should keep him out of trouble for another year and a half.

"I'm on the road these days," says Botti. "I've already sublet my place in Westwood and put my stuff in storage. I'm homeless for the foreseeable future. Afterwards, maybe I'll move to the Venice/Santa Monica area. I hear the yoga there is incredible."

These days I'm more into Jazz sounds that



don't necessarily eminate from the Jazz mainstream. Katharine Whalen sings with the Squirrel Nut Zippers and her husband/bandmate James Mathus plays guitar on Jazz Squad. If you agree with Bert Gambini and I, and feel it's good to integrate these kind of nontraditional records, then crank up "Same Old Feeling," "Deed I Do," and "Just You, Just Me." Jazz radio can rub shoulders with the mass appeal and satisfy their core with something curious, modern, and reduxe at the same time.

ARTIST PROFILE KONNY Garrett

BEING A GOOD LISTENER

When I think of who I am, I see someone who really loves to play in a lot of different genres. Rather than simply say, "I play Jazz," I say, "I play music." I'm a musiclan and I listen to everything. Being a good listener is the key to being a good player and composer.

Obviously *Songbook* was a watershed moment in my career, and I wanted to continue in that vein, focusing on the tunes, whether they be pop-flavored, traditional Jazz or World Beat-based. The idea of the album title [*Simply Said* on Warner Bros.] is that sometimes I would rather express a musical idea more directly and subtly instead of always approaching it with a high-powered flurry of notes or specific improvlsatlons In mind.

Nearly every song is a story about some place I have traveled in the world. "Delta Bali Blues" combines my love for Japanese and Indonesian cultures with a Balinese pentatonic scale and a Mississippi blues flavor, combining many experiences into one cohensive whole. The piano on "Charlie Brown" reminded me of Vince Guaraldi's *Peanuts* themes, and I traveled to South Africa with Sting some years ago. "Back Where You Started" is my ode to the hiphop generation, featuring a spoken vocal chorus talking about the nature of passing time. The idea is that as we follow the rhythms of life, we

always find ourselves making fresh starts day to day. "Conversation With Hutcherson" was written with Bobby Hutcherson in mind, someone who has influenced me musically. I use unique chord clusters that I know he puts into the music he plays and which makes him unique.



"Organized Colors" began as an open canvas which I first painted with a classical piano intro before figuring out which colors conjured different spirits.

It's always exciting to grab pleces of those melodies as they float through the air and put them together to create a song people will hum at first and then hopefully come to treasure as time passes.
