# COMMUNICATOR NETWORK ADDS NONE

## ATLANTA

WSAI PD, Bill Sherard has been moved to Atlanta to program WQXI. He replaces Gary Cory, who will be jocking at WWDJ in New York. WSAI music director takes over Sherard's position in Cincinnati.

## PHILADELPHIA

One of the country's heaviest ratings battles is going on in this city . . . latest Pulse showing a resurgence of WFIL from the last ARB. WIP was beaten by FIL across the board . . . even in the morning with a 17 to 15 verdict. WCAU, with Phillies baseball, was the closest in any time segment to WFIL with an 11 at night to FIL's 14. Ratings appear elsewhere in the book.

## CHICAGO

AUGUST 23, 1971

Should an outsider, an individual not affiliated with the National Association of Television and Radio Announcers roam into last week's annual convention of the sixteen year old predominately black organization, he would have walked into a disorganized, undisciplined gathering of individuals, for the most part more concerned with broads and booze than furthering the goals of the organization.

Even members primarily concerned with the advancement of the profession and organization, were totally disenchanted with the apparent unconcern demonstrated by so many of the general membership.

The Chicago-based NATRA annual conference, for many reasons, became a major fiasco and a minor success. General meetings became disasterous, gatherings of bleary-eyed, hung-over individuals, more interested in the next party than solving organizational problems. Most meetings got underway anywhere from one to two hours late and rapidly disintregrated from organized, well conducted, disciplined business meetings to wobbly undisciplined bitter groups primarily interested in furthering personal interest rather than the interest of NATRA. One of the prime reasons behind the lack of attendance, organization and discipline during the general business meetings was traced directly to the members and their guests, partying and sipping the bubbly until four and five in the morning, leaving them too done-in, too mentally fatigued to concentrate on their original purpose for being at the convention, to attend meetings, workshops, and seminars designed to further the professionalism of the members and to give the organization, as a whole, an image of maturity, respectability and responsibility.

Another demonstrated factor reducing NATRA's sixteenth annual convention to bedlam could be traced to the organized planning of dinner meetings and shows which, too, were so protracted they extended into the wee small hours.

Throughout the four day confab at the Regency Hyatt House, politicing and deals among individuals and groups seeking office or lobbying for special interests was rampant, turning many general and special meetings into political battlefields fraught with bitterness and personal animosity.

## NEW YORK

23 year old Joseph Ferraro and 18 year old Allen H. . Weiner were arraigned in Federal District Court here last week . . . charged with criminal violation of the 1934 Communications Act in operating radio stations without having a license. The two have been broadcasting from their own radio station from Yonkers, New York for the past year and a half. They were instructed to go off the air last January, but were "laughed at" when they attempted to obtain a license . . . they've pleaded not guilty to the charges. They were quoted as saying that they did not operate the station for politics or money . . . but to show the FCC that their domination of the airwaves just wasn't logical. The station facilities cost about \$3,000 . . . no advertising was accepted, costs were covered by donations. Anyone who had something to say could walk in and speak on the station.

## TUSCALOOSA

WJRD is the scene of the nation's latest radio walkout. The general manager of the station informed PD Jim Hansen that the station would be going automated within the next thirty days. PD Hansen informed his staff... three of the four jocks immediately resigning and walking out.

## MIAMI

Announced changes at WINZ, now being programmed by Dick Starr, came about this week. Former Miami radio man, Rick Shaw returns to the city and will do nights for the station. Scott Kenyon has left Miami for a show at WKNR in Detroit. He'll be replaced by Johnny Gilbert from KRIZ. Starr said the only changes in the station that he could announce was a "general strengthening of the format and improvement of the signal. It's been a 50,000 watt station that sounded like 250". Former PD, Al Brady, has returned to New York and will be on the air at WWDJ.

#### SACREMENTO

Long time KROY PD, Bob Sherwood has resigned from the station with no plans. In resigning, Sherwood paraphrased a Bobby Ocean statement of a few weeks ago. . . "I want to use my own water colors." Sherwood is looking for a PD or MD job.

## MIAMI

Pickets ended in front of WQAM Thursday. Following the President's request that all strikes end, four WQAM jocks returned for work . . . only to be again told they had been permanently replaced. AFTRA national representative, Walter Grinspan told the Report office that the union has filed an amended charge with the NLRB... showing that the station representatives were now locked out. At the same time, AFTRA has filed a petition with the FCC challenging Storz's right to maintain it's license. One of 26 complaints filed with the FCC was the station's attempt to control the presentation of news in order not to antagonize their sponsors. Unfair labor practice charges, wage and hour violations and EEOC complaints have previously been filed and are being investigated by the various governmental agencies. In the meantime, AFTRA negotiators stated that "the union will intensify its sponsor leafleting campaign and request every working man and woman in Miami and Broward County to tune out WQAM's "scabs".

## HAMILTON, ONTARIO

CHAM is sponsoring appearances in Hamilton of Miss August, Playboy Magazine Playmate of the Month at several sponsors stores.

## SAN ANTONIO

KTSA is featuring the Cheech and Chong album with a contest. They are giving away a 1954 Chevy complete with all the heavy duty things that were on "cool" cats cars in that year . . . along with that, the station will be holding a giant sock hop . . . and are giving away one hundred Cheech and Chong albums every day.

## LOS ANGELES

The Radio Report lifted it's freeze on new Reporters this week and added several stations to the In-Depth report list. WRNO/FM was named to cover New Orleans, both WCAO and WLPL/FM in Baltimore were added from that city. KTSA and KONO in San Antonio, KOMA in Oklahoma City, KUDL in Kansas City, WMYQ FM in Miami, and WPGC in Washington. Each one of these stations has made gains in ratings and exhibited music knowledge that makes them significant in their own markets and, as a result, significant to the rest of the radio-record community. As staff of the Radio Report increases further, Reporters will be added to give as much a total picture of the music week as possible. At the same time, the Communicators Network made further plans for more expansion in that area.

## PITTSBURGH

KQV in giving away a Dodge Charger in an oldies contest there. Three of the biggest oldies of the past fourteen years have been placed in the glove compartment of the car. Once an hour, contestants on the phone get an opportunity to guess the oldies. When one of the oldies is named, the jock will tell the contestant they've named one of them, but won't tell them which one of the three is correct.

## DENVER

Following the naming of Ross Reagan as PD at KTLK, further changes have come down the pike. Jock, Mike Lee has resigned . . . his replacement not clear at the moment. At the same time, Reagan announced that the play list, which has been cut to 30 records, would be reexpanded to 50.

MANCHESTER, NEW HAMPSHIRE-215th market. Population, 215,800....black population, 300.

ECONOMY---Largest is industry. .shoes, textiles and mill work. Tom McCann has two different factories here . . . other shoe manufacturers also are located here. Sweater manufacturing is a large industry . . . other clothing work. Tourism must be considered their second most important economic factor . . . Lake Winnepausakee ... a huge, beautiful lake in the middle of some fantastic woods is only 45 minutes north . . . there are 33 different state parks in the area. When summer is on, the world comes here to camp. In the winter, this is about the heaviest skiing area in the US . . . There are tons of people who move here from Canada in order to get work. The abundance of workers brings industry in and keeps the pay scale down. While Concord (12 miles away) is the state capital, Manchester is the largest city . . . one hour from the shore . . . one hour from Boston. The state lottery is also an effect on the city's economy. About six small colleges are located here. . . the largest being St. Anselms (6,000 people). Tallest building at present is 12 stories.

**PEOPLE**——Over 40% of the population is French Canadian . . . about 15% is Greek. City is very heavy Roman Catholic . . . also fairly heavy Greek Orthodox. City is heavily conservative. Don't take changes very well. City is friendly, low crime rate, very popular sports town.

COST OF LIVING—Only state in the union with no state income tax and no state sales tax. Apartment will run about \$140... food costs about average. Gasoline costs high. Jocks make from \$90 a week to \$10,000 a year ... average jock makes about \$160.

WEATHER——Four seasons . . . spring and fall are unbelievably fantastic . . . summers are hot with high humidity. Winters are murder . . . o to 5 degrees is the average temp. Tons of snow . . . on the ground all the time . . . that's great if you're a ski-er.

WICHITA——Market rank 71st. Population 426,000. 6% black.

ECONOMY——Based on three categories . . . aircraft, agriculture and oil. Some 50,000 people are involved in the aircraft industry . . . this is the home of Boeing, Cessna, Beechcraft and Leer. From manufacturing to making instruments to ferrying planes this is the city's most important industry. Heavy livestock market here. . second only to KC. Plenty of grain is stored here in one of many elevators . . . western Kansas . . . very important grain area. Many independent oil drillers are located here. . . including Derby and Vickers . . . plenty of area oil production. Wichita State (13,000) . . . Friends University (2,000) and Sacred Heart College (1,500) are located here . . . likewise, McConnell A.F.B. (15,000) Wichita is the largest city in Kansas . . . retailing also important here.

**PEOPLE**——Still plenty of conservatism here but its beginning to change as evidenced by last election. Old city Commission (they kept Hair from playing) was heavily defeated by liberals. City is well educated with so many engineers, etc. A mixture of locales also. Police are super conservative.

**COST OF LIVING**—Fairly low. Nice one bedroom... \$125. Plenty of housing available. Food is lower..gasoline low...Jocks make \$425 to \$800. (One exception makes \$20,000). Average Top 40 jock makes \$650.

WEATHER——Summers are hot but not too humid. Winters aren't too bad . . . does get cold and snows but certainly not as bad as farther north. Spring and fall are fantastic. Rolling hill country.

Richard Underwood and Gordon Smith have formed Tot Productions . . . coming up with a package called "A Rock And Roll Revue" . . . a ten hour special featuring hit music from 1955 to 1970 . . . highlighted by news notes, current events of the times . . . along with musical and personal information on the groups and solos featured. Further particulars can be obtained from Tot Productions in New York.

## PHOENIX

KRUX is the latest station to run the "Keep On Truckin" contest. The contest was originally conceived by KCBQ . . . an off shoot of the old prize truck contest. The station bought a small Datsun truck and would drive to an area of town . . . the driver phoning in his location on the air . . . announcing that the first person there would receive from one hundred to six hundred dollars. Immediately, this caused a panic of a couple of hundred people. (The truck, by the way, would be followed by a station mobile unit) . . . after the money was given away, all the people there would then win an album . . . the whole thing being taped or going over the mobile unit live. The station also played "Truckin" by the Grateful Dead, which made top ten only in San Diego (even the album became top ten). Phones were answered "KCBQ keeps on truckin"... the theme line was used on the air constantly. KCBQ Keeps On Truckin' shirts also were given out. . . plus all the people gathered in the parking lot banned together to shout the theme line which was taped and used on the air. "Keep On Truckin"...already on posters, bumper stickers, pins, etc. became built in promotions for KCBQ.

Part two of a rap with Peter Fonda......

BOB: How do you accept the responsibility of trying to affect the world with your motion pictures? PETER: Ahhh ... reasonably and with grave doubt as to my rights to speak. Not my civil rights to speak, but my rights to speak as being part and party to this devastation that has happened to the temple. Also with the idea that maybe I'm setting myself up . . . as Mitch Reed said yesterday . . . "Aren't you setting yourself up?" I could very well be setting myself up . . . I'll explain it very quickly. From one person to another, I think communication is incredibly important and whatever you say to one person is very important. Whether you're in an act of loving somebody and speaking with them . . . whatever kind of communication you have, your responsibility of the words that come out of your mouth . . . is incredible. When you say something then to several thousand . . . several million people . . . your responsiblity is that much heavier. That doesn't mean you have to be that much more theatrical or entertaining or interesting . . . its just you, really . . . you have to have your act together, and your act cannot be a script that's written. Your head has to be open and cannot be a rhetorical routine that you're up to. It's not simply quoting people . . . its not adopting someone else's cause . . . that, that will make anything effective that you communicate is that which is from within you that you speak that will be effective to people. So, knowing that I've sold ... I think ... eight and a half million posters now around the world with me doing the various things like smoking a joint on the motorcycle, I realize that people have put some sort of importance on me. I also know that people have no idea who I am and what I'm doing and make up things about me that they want me to be, etc. I would be wasting my time to try to set them straight about my life. At one time, I was going to make an album as a matter of fact called Gotta Get You Into My Life, going into all sorts of aspects of my life . . . the questions that people asked me, situations that I arrive in . . . being harrassed by the government whenever I came into the country . . . being searched in a little room . . . being stopped by the cops. . .

BOB: That happens to you? PETER: All the time ...

BOB: Stopped by the cops?

PETER: Yeah ...

BOB: Searched?

PETER: Well, I don't get searched too much in this country ... they usually just stop to see what's happening. Sometimes, they're very amusing . . . they stop and they say, "We know who's got your motorcycle" . .or some routine like that. But when I come into the country, they always stop me and search my bags . . . and then go for my body, but I won't let them touch me, so there's always that possible confrontation with the U.S. government which I've so far been able to avert by minor theatrical methods such as taking pictures of them as they're starting to do it and other minor things. Nevertheless, I found it was a waste of my time to try to describe to people what my life was or what I was thinking of, or how they were wrong in conceiving me as some kind of a spokesman for them because I'm only speaking for myself. I cannot see through your eyes. I have no desire to see through your eyes. We can see the same tree and we're looking at different trees . . . and I understand that totally. I don't want to be leader . . . not for the responsibility part of it, because its responsible enough to be human . . . to live in a human way in a relationship to other humans in this environment without destroying it and without destroying the relationship. Relationship is a very heavy word . . . and nobody understands it . . . its like love . . . we are conditioned to respond to it in different ways and we look to the dictionary for its meaning. We have no idea how responsible it really is . . . relationship and communication. Its incredible, but we know nothing of it and apparently we have no desire to know anything about it, so I find its more important to me to utilize the field that's given me and to utilize it well . . . and to do it the best way possible, whether I'm right or wrong. I'm not espousing anybody else's cause ... my sister says power to the people ... I say power to the camera ... because the people have fucked it ... so you know . . . give the camera a shot to show the people that they fucked it.

BOB: That means a tremendous amount of responsibility.

PETER: Well, if I thought of it that way, I would take myself too seriously and never get off the ground. I'd be in a state of turmoil about now... what do I say ... because I see this incredible mess, and obviously people need to have something said to them. I simply am stimulated by ideas and I put my ideas out on the screen and I put them out on television or in interviews ... magazines ... whenever I have a chance without conceiving that ... well, this is my master plan for my contribution to the revolution. I don't separate myself from the things . . . its just the thing that I'm doing. I do realize that there is a responsibility for me to not only be accurate if I give out information about the planet, but accurate for myself . . . truthful to what I'm saying . . . because truth varies from moment to moment. Accurate is the word I'm using . . . accurate . . . the truth of oneself takes a quiet mind if you get to there ... to be real still and then you can see the truth of yourself ... and the truth of yourself is the truth of the world. In yourself, you see all the problems . . . all the falacies and weaknesses . . . and all the strengths. If you look outside, you'll see only projections . . . and you'll only be able to deal with them on a projective level. So, my thing is I'll be as accurate as I can . . . utilize the field that's given me . . . and I will play on it. But, I will not play a game on it. When I said to you I like to fuck around with people's heads, I do it without playing a game. I'm deadly serious when I say that I have no desire to kill a man because I have no desire to eat a man. At the moment, I have no more feelings about it. I think its stupid to kill a man because we do not need to eat him . . . its that simple. But we go about killing men and women and children and the whole thing . . .

It was the consensus of many of the more matured members and those ending up in leadership positions that numerous changes must be inaugurated before the next annual conference if the organization is to endure and become a unit working for the betterment of its members and the industry.

Among the changes recommended, the curtailment or abolishing of late night partying in position of heavy fines or withdrawal of membership recognition of those failing to attend general membership business meetings, special workshops and seminars, setting rigid curfews for all dinners and entertainment.

One of the major changes recommended by this same small group concerned with the future, called for the rewriting of the constitution of NATRA, a tightening of financial procedures, and a concentrated effort to establish a closer working relationship between the membership, owners and management in an all around improvement in the general conditions.

Listed above were some of the causes of the chaotic conditions prevelent at the 1971 annual convention of NATRA in Chicago last week.

It should not be assumed that the convention was a total loss or complete failure. It was not. One of the successes of the confab was the election of a strong president and strong, matured board of directors determined to improve the organization during their term of office.

Elected to head the more than 500 member organization for the next two years as president was the dynamic, positive minded, youthful program director for Cleveland's WABQ, Curt Shaw. Shaw's background and experience both as an air personality and executive will stand him in good stead as president.

Sharing the board of directors for the same period is one of the most respected men in the industry. Noted for his business acumen, his integrity and fairness was Georgie Woods, veteran air personality from WDAS in Philadelphia.

Both men, Shaw and Woods, in an after-the-convention session, pledged to work together as a closely knit unit to eliminate the problems besetting the organization and to utilize every modern method to improve conditions to the point where NATRA will be recognized as a force for good within the industry and one which will demand and obtain the respect of all with whom it

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
