HOUSTON

KILT continued to dominate this market in latest figures released from Pulse. A complete look is included on the inside of the sheet.

SAN BERNARDINO

Fred Lindholm, for over a year general manager of KMEN, has been replaced by former KOIL sales manager, Pat Shaughnessy, With the change also came announced jock changes by PD, Scott Seagraves...Bill McKinny moves from part time to 9 to midnight... Gene Lanes comes in from KROY to do all nights and Steve Carey is out.

PHOENIX

KUPD PD, Gary Whitman, was let go last Thursday and former PD, Joe Bailey replaced him in the afternoon drive slot. The station has announced no other changes.

NEW YORK

Gil Bateman, for three years national promotion director for Elektra Records, has . . . "been relieved of his duties . . . so I guess I was fired." Bateman, who plans to go into record production, apparently disagreed with company policy on number of releases and methodology. When asked for a comment, Bateman replied . . . "Yeah, be sure to say hi to everybody."

VANCOUVER, BRITISH COLUMBIA

This city has been named as the next to host a Radio Report Clinic . . . the exact date not yet decided, but tentatively set for the latter part of October. This particular clinic has been in the planning stages since the San Clemente clinic and promises to be the most incredible meeting between radio-record people in both the US and Canada ever held.

LOS ANGELES

The first three months of the Communicator Network has gone by with a fairly impressive record . . . for a beginning. The Network voted on some 50 records, picking its fourth add this week. If the trend of the voting would have continued, some 7 other records would have been added on the network, but zero voting because of lack of product caused the average to drop below the needed 7. Of the three records tested, only one has proved to be a success, but that record in itself is proof positive that the Network can break records. The Joan Baez-Night They Drove Old Dixie Down . . . getting almost no play, went on all the stations. Inside of two weeks was a definite smash . . . national top five . . . now for sure. Most stations average about 5.5 per record with KSEE and KLWW leading the pack with an eight average and WDAK being the most critical grabbing 3.8 per record.

HOUSTON

24 year old Jimmy Bale Hutto was pronounced guilty in Federal Court here last week, on charges of conspiracy to bomb a California Pacifica radio station . . . and now will face similar charges on that bombing last year of the Pacifica station located in Houston. The charges carry up to 12 years in prison . . . and fines in the \$20,000 range. Hutto, whose home is Houston, is a self-avowed member of the Ku Klux Klan.

LOS ANGELES

B. Mitchell Reed, Jimmy Rabbitt, Gene Weed, Deano Day, Charlie O'Donnell . . . yes, son . . . even the pros. The headline for LA this week could have easily been FALL all over again. KLAC went through some far out changes, dropping it's modern approach to country music. With the drop went PD, Bob Kingsly, who steered the ship for a year . . . He's being replaced by former KBBQ general manager, Bill Ward. His approach to country did not include Charlie O'Connell, Gene Weed, or Jimmy Rabbitt. Rabbitt had just recently moved over from sister FM'er, KMET/FM... only to be surprised by a shot from upstairs. KMET/FMalso has gone through some changes . . . B. Mitchell Reed is out there, Richard Kimble has come in from KSAN, Mike Turner joins from WPLJ and Bob Rudnick moves in from WABX. The line-up is listed in Changes. Kingsly was not the only PD to get it this week. Ed Shane, who's hardly unpacked from an Atlanta to LA trip, was let go at KKDJ and replaced by Bill Comb. The explanation to Shane was that "he didn't fit the format plans". The format plans apparently are a change from the adult, no teeny bop, plenty of oldies and album cuts radio to a full fledged top forty. While it is an FM station \dots one must recognize the fact that FM'ers are beginning to resemble AM'ers in many rating books at the moment.

INDIANAPOLIS

I'VE GOT MINE . . . YOU'LL GET YOURS! That's what WIFE listeners are hearing on the air all this week. Those who would like to get theirs are asked to send a post card to the station . . . with the promise that on October 11th . . . everybody would get theirs. That's the day that (some 10,000 so far) a good part of the city will be opening a package that includes their very own balloon . . . with the words . . . "YOU'VE GOT YOURS-WIFE".

SAN DIEGO

Another modern day version of the Mystery Man... KCBQ is asking listeners to find Rodney Ripoff...Rodney is holdin'...thousand dollar bills, that is...find Rodney and bust him. That's the promo...you've got the rest of it.

PHILADELPHIA

A good back to school item. Dr. Don Rose of WFIL is using a clock on the air . . . ticking at various times throughout his program. First caller after the alarm goes off . . . wins a clock radio to help him get up and get to school.

BALTIMORE

Good heavens, this really must be a record. Frankie Jordon of WCAO . . . now music director there . . . celebrated her 41st year with the station last week. I wonder if she answered an ad that said . . . "No drifters".

SAN FRANCISCO

A weekend on the Sacramento River gave plenty of time for radio listening. Most impressive was SF station, KSFO . . . in particular, one Sunday night lession in human beings communicating on the radio given by legend, Bobby Dale . . . up, and totally into his show . . . no pretentiousness . . . and an incredible knowledge of the music. Not top forty, but certainly music that could be dug by the hip and the un-hip. The highlight, however, was the midday man at KSFO . . . Bernard . . . or, as he insisted . . . "Mr. St. Bernard, Sir." Bernard, in between records picked up phone calls from San Francisco listeners who already believe that Bernard knows everything about everything. KDAY for weeks asked their listeners to send in a list of their all time favorite album cuts . . . some 11,000 cards hit the station . . . from that an all time 200 cuts were picked and played (only) on Labor Day weekend. The play started 6 am Saturday and went to 9 am Sunday. . . . then started all over again and went through Labor Day. The station also gave away five complete packages of the cuts on tape . . . along with a casette player to play them on . . . drawing from the voter's cards themselves.

SAN ANTONIO

Heavy Mexican populated cities should be aware of the fact that today begins Simana De La Raza . . . or Week of the Cause . . . in Mexico . . . finally ending with Mexican Independence Day. KTSA kicks off the week with sponsorship of Superstar. . . and a free concert with Cheech & Chong.

This past week, my special guest on the morning radio show was a talking mynah bird named "Raffles" . . . resulting in . . .

You know why he won't talk . . . he's a member of the "silent mynah-ority".

When I brought the morning paper in, "Raffles" immediately went for the sports section . . . I guess he wanted to see how the mynah leagues are doing.

Do you think I could get busted for contributing to the delinquency of a mynah?

He just sits here picking at his feathers. I guess he's molting. Thank heavens, he molts in his mouth and not in my hand.

"Raffles" has no script . . . he just wings it.

I don't understand why he won't talk for me . . . I even took my bird control pill.

The bird wants to hear either "Asia Mynah" or Lou Christie's, "I'm Gonna Make You Mynah".

"Go Away Little Girl" . . . you're still a mynah.

You know why he's having so much trouble whistling . . . did you ever see a mynah bird that could pucker? He only drinks water . . . after all, you could get in a lot of trouble serving beer to a mynah.

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SAN QUENTIN PRISON, CALIF.—Population—2,522. inmates. 36 per cent black . . . 13 per cent Spanish-American. . . 1% other. Located in Main County . . . 18 miles from San Francisco.

ECONOMY—Costs about \$2,400 per prisoner per year for up keep. The prisoners either go into the educational program or get a job, depending on what the various conselors decide. Prisoners can get an education from night or day school or by correspondence. If no education is necessary, an inmate will get a job. They are divided into two areas: industrial or maintenance. Maintenance includes laundry, cleaning, etc. . . anything that is necessary for the up keep of the prison. There are also four factories in the place . . . a furniture factory . . . a mattress factory . . . a clothing factory and a detergent plant. The products of all but the detergent plant are sold outside the prison. Back in the 50's, the prison was up to 6,000 prisoners but is now, fortunately down to it's comfortable position.

Each person who wants to at this point is housed in a cell all by himself . . . some of the trustees actually have keys to their cells . . . they lock the door when they leave and lock themselves back in when they come home. There are approximately 15 or 20 maximum security prisoners . . . on the average. However, at this point, there are many more than that because of the George Jackson incident a couple of week ago.

PEOPLE -- The average prisoner (over 90%) is trying to get out . . . the legal way. The Adult Authority (Parole Board) is most important to the prisoner. He realizes that he has to show that board his progress and his ability to make it on the outside. There are more educated people than you would realize in the prison . . . about average for a city of 2,500. However, there are many who may have a high school diploma but can still barely read or write. The prisoners have a large gym, are involved in intramural sports of all kinds . . . plus there is a varsity team for each of the major sports that play outside teams. Every week there is a motion picture change . . . the average prisoner gets to go to a movie once a week. There are 2 or 3 television sets in each block (individual housing unit) . . . plus TV in the big yard. And Saturdays and Sundays, most of the prisoners get to spend their leisure time in the yard. There are no TVs in the segregation cells. Prisoners get magazines and newspapers, but they, along with TV programs, are screened . . . so as not to incite a riot.

COST OF LIVING—Those people who work in factories make any where from six dollars to 24 dollars per month depending on their job skills. That money can be held for the prisoner . . . or he can send it out . . . or spend it at the canteen. Those who make no money, get the necessities from the canteen. . shaving soap, tobacco, etc. Each prisoner's necessities are supplied . . . food, clothing, etc. There is no pay for the people who work at the prison radio station.

RADIO—There are two channels all over the prison... piped into the factories and into most people's cells. The inmate body gets a list of the radio stations... and what programs they can be permitted to listen to at what time. They then vote on the schedule. All San Francisco area stations are listened to at one time or another. News is pre-screened by experience of the attitude of the station, so as not to incite riots. The prisoner can turn the radio to either channel ... on or off ... up or down ... in his cell. Radio goes on at 6am and goes off at 11pm ... which is lights out. There is a local station manned by the prisoners themselves. They give the local news... some music... are on just part of the time. Several people have become profficient while in prison, although the training is very lax.

WEATHER—Nice west coast San Francisco weather. **RATINGS**: Which station is listened to most was not available for the Report.

OKLAHOMA CITY—Market rank—50th. Population—665,500 . . . black—44,800.

ECONOMY—Based on oil, agriculture and aerospace. There is still a great deal of drilling going on in the city area. Many drilling companies headquarter here. Oil processing machinery and oil field equipment are manufactured here. There are also flour mills, meat packing plants, iron foundries, steel mills, and printing and publishing plants. The city is the state's largest town and is located right in the middle of the state. The western half of the state is a huge wheat producer . . . of course, meaning a great deal to the city's economy . . . grain elevators and shipping by rail going on here. Cattle is also a major factor . . . the Oklahoma City stockyards are huge, shipping to Kansas City and Chicago. As a retail center, it's heavier than the average city . . . being surrounded by small towns. The city is also the state capitol. . . that must be considered in the economy. The University of Oklahoma is in Norman, 32 miles away (15,000 students) Oklahoma City University has 1,500 students and Oklahoma State University is 60 miles away with 14,000 students. Tinker Airforce Base is also here.

PEOPLE—Extremely conservative. A good portion of the people in the town are farm background people... heavily influenced by the church. Very few long hair cats, although the city pretty well ignores them...very little hassels. No racial trouble at all... plenty of apathy. Plenty of well deserved paranoia on the part of dopers... heavy penalty. There are plenty of people there from all over the U.S.

COST OF LIVING—One bedroom with furniture and pool — \$125. Food is average . . . gasoline low. Jocks make from \$125 to \$350 per week. Average top 40 jock makes \$175.

WEATHER—Summers are hot . . . not too humid. Winters are mild . . . little snow.

WKY-PD is Danny Williams . . . Music-Dale Wheba and Alan Clark KOMA-J. Robert Dark is PD.

OTHER STATIONS: KBYE-Soul & Religion...KBYE/FM-R&B...KEBC/FM-C&W...KFNB/FM-Progressive MOR...KJAK/FM-C&W...KGOU/FM-Progressive...KLPR-C&W...KJEM/FM-C&W...KOCY-MOR...KOCY/FM-Progressive rock...KOFM/FM-Progressive MOR...KWHP/FM-Progressive rock...KXLS/FM-MOR...KTOK-Progressive MOR.

RATINGS: Depending on the ratings, it's either WKY or KTOK leading the pack. WKY dominated for years before KTOK swung into a progressive MOR. KOMA grabs third . . . (they can be heard in half the U.S.) . . . are getting better ratings than the past.

Paul Anka, song writer and Las Vegas entertainer, on the business

BOB: Do you see any wavering of the popularity of night clubs?

PAUL: I think they're dead, basically. Vegas is really the last night club town. There's too much money involved in seeing an act today . . . there is a constant flow of nothing lasting . . . lifestyles, occupations, groups. The consumer is constantly looking for that new thing. There's no loyalty whatsoever. Where there is so much talent and product that sounds the same, that's all going to be in a constant change.

BOB: Can anything new be done with music?

PAUL: If the new quiet revolution is getting down to simple things, maybe that's what's going to happen with music. Music is a vehicle that plays on the emotions, a communicator that conveys a kind of fantasy.

BOB: Isn't writing a hit song a reflection of society?

PAUL: Since Dylan, a guy who said what he wanted to say and changed lives, it has been. He started it. Music is in a position it never held before.

BOB: Isn't it true that singers are on the way out, and the Leon Russell's and Kris Kristofferson's are communicating a thing called "feel", where people know whether they're being told the truth?

PAUL: I think if they accept you, they believe you. We're back to cults again, if you can call it that. I think there is more of the "people-star" today . . . the writer who identifies with young people who believe what he is saying. Singers are panicing.

BOB: Would you define the word entertain?

PAUL: An entertainer must be an actor, constantly creating a premise that looks and is honest . . . to surprise and constantly keep ahead of the audience. I don't want them to understand what I'm doing . . . let 'em feel it and like it, but not understand it.

BOB: What kind of changes have come down in your philosophy?

PAUL: The past three years have been the biggest change in my life. We've really all become specialists . . . if you are aggressive and ambitious, and you're really into something that's successful for you, you find that you lose touch with a lot of things in the world. For many years, I was so into what I was doing that I was not really aware of what was going on underneath me . . . I was feeding on security. Them: I took another look, started feeling and working differently. My values changed . . . the importance of bread. I started giving away anything over that which I deserved. I rebelled against the Hollywood and glamour scene and the teenage star thing. If you're great, you're gonna be great anyway, no matter where you are. I've put my life into a woman and some kids and I know that's very right for me. I was never like that before.

BOB: What caused the change?

PAUL: I'd like to believe that change is due to my being tuned into the future. Writers and artists have always been ahead of it all. The farse will not exist only when the values of the people change . . . when there's no more importance on television, promotion, publicity. . .

BOB: As a businessman, would you be involved in someone like that?

PAUL: No. As a businessman, I would not be involved in something that didn't have quality . . . I buy and sell constantly. Nothing has a seal on it that's going to be forever. If I've got the bread, anyway, and it's my name, I'd rather come home with something solid, because that's what my career has been based on. I had everything against me. I was just a song writer ahead of my time, so I've always been a fighter of quality and of spending money for something good. I don't think those kind of stars are going to be around, anyway.

BOB: Is there a story to your moving around between labels?

PAUL: I made the mistakes. I made the first move because it was shown to me that I was making a lot of money for a company and I wasn't seeing any of it. I was told by people that I trusted that I should move where I could make more bread, with a company that wanted me. When I got to RCA, I was put through all the changes that you go through with a large corporation. I was stuck with it, but I lived with it. It really got to me one day and I left. I didn't believe in the bread and the large company, so I went with Barnaby, but I got involved in a partnership fight so I was loose with no contract. I had a lot of offers but I liked the excitement of Neil Bogart. People are going to be jammed into that club whether you're on Columbia or Buddah. When you have a team that believes in you, and they're willing to spend the same amount of bread, then you gotta go with them. I'd rather be with a guy that doesn't have 60 other acts to worry about.

BOB: In an age when things are being thrown off because they're old, isn't this a drawback to your record career? PAUL: It may seem that way, but it will work for me. People are intelligent enought today, even the new generation, and will pick up on anybody that really is saying something, is really intelligent or is really putting something down. They know what my past is, but now I'm laying down a whole new thing to them. They're not going to wipe me out if I really say it in my writing and performing. The unfortunate thing is that because of age, writers and producers who are older are not being utilized. It's got to work for me as long as I take care of business. They say, "Wow, here's a guy at 15 who said what he had to say, then came all the way up here and now he's doing this." It's not like I stopped at one level of creation. As long as there are people with ears and a brain, they have to know that what I'm doing is as good as anybody else and they gotta respect that — and that I'm never going to lose. I want to make my past work for me.

MY OWN THING

BOB HAMILTON RADIO REPORT

Dear Mr. General Manager:

It has finally saturated me. The lie, the big lie under which I have been working for the last 15 years . . . it's time you heard the truth.

Let me explain it to you by using a parable. You are a home owner. Some way or another, you amassed together a down payment and you bought a house. Oh, I realize you know a lot about houses. After all, you grew up in one . . . maybe several . . . and you visited hundreds. You even read the homeowners manual . . . and you talked with a few carpenters. Of course, most of your time was spent in making money . . . to buy your own home . . . by selling . . . selling insurance. And you sold enough insurance . . . to make enough money . . . to buy your house. Mr. Homeowner!

Now let me tell you about me. While you were out selling insurance, I spent my days learning . . . learning about termites. Yes, termites. I have learned how they fly . . . how they eat . . . how they destroy. I also learned about how to get rid of termites. I studied termites day and night . . . I studied poisons day and night . . . and I studied your house day and night. I learned from books and I learned as a protege of master termite inspectors. I learned how much spray to use, what kind in what situation.

I know how to get rid of termites. I spent my life learning.

Let me tell you of a course they taught me in termite school. It's called homeowner pacification . . . my instructor told me it was 50 per cent of the job.

Last week, you found you had termites. So, you called me. You explained to me that termites were eating your front door facing. Ah, the common problem. I picked up just the right amount and right kind of poison.

"How much will it cost?"

"Oh, take me about five minutes . . . about 50 bucks." "Okay."

WASHINGTON

BROADCAST COMPLAINTS DECREASE IN JULY.

A total of 922 complaints from the public were received by the FCC during the month of July, a decrease of 107 from the month of June. Other comments and inquiries totaled 1,635, a decrease of 393 over the previous month. The Commission sent 1,197 letters in response to comments, inquiries and complaints.

The Federal Communications Commission has petitioned the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit for rehearing before the entire court of decision reversing FCC Fairness Doctrine rulings on the purchase of advertising time by Business Executives Move for Peace in Vietnam and the Democratic National Committee.

OAK RIDGE, TENN., AM APPLICATION GRANTED; DROP-OUT AGREEMENT APPROVED.

In response to a request by Leonard Broadcasting Co., and Radioak, Inc., the Commission has approved a joint agreement providing for the dismissal of the Leonard application in return for payment of expenses not to exceed \$2,500, and granted the application of Radioak, Inc. for a daytime AM station to operate on 1550 kHz, with 1 kw, directionalized antenna, at Oak Ridge.

BLOWING ROCK, N.C., NEW AM STATION PRO-POSED IN INITIAL DECISION; WKSK, WEST JEF-FERSON, N.C., FACILITIES CHANGED DENIED

Grant of the application of Mountina Broadcasting Corp., for a new standard broadcast station on 580 kHz, with 500 watts power, daytime only, in Blowing Rock, N.C., has been proposed by Hearing Examiner, Chester F. Naumowicz, Jr. Examiner Naumowicz, also proposed denial of the application of Childress Broadcasting Corporation of West Jefferson, for change in the facilities of WKSK, West Jefferson, from 1600 kHz, 1 kw, daytime, to 580 kHz, 500 watts, daytime.

Grant of the application of WHJB, Inc., licensee of Station WHJB, Greenburg, Pa., for a facilities change to increase daytime power from 1 kw to 5 kw has been proposed in an Initial Decision by Hearing Examiner Ernest Nash. The grant will be subject to the condition that the licensee submit certain technical data to the Commission before program tests are authorized.

Examiner Nash concluded that WHJB was financially qualified and that the station's purpose for seeking a power increase was to improve the service to its suburban community. Noting that Greenburg could not be considered either as a residential or a "bedroom" type community or a suburb of Pittsburgh, he pointed out that no other station rendering primary service to Greenburg was showing any special concern for the needs of the community.

RULING ON SEX DISCRIMINATION COMPLAINT AGAINST WTC (AM-FM-TV), WASHINGTON, D.C., HELD IN ABEYANCE BY COMMISSION UNTIL EEOC RULING

Action on a complaint by the WRC Women's Rights Committee and the Washington Chapter of the National Organization of Women, alleging that National Broadcasting Co., Inc., and station WRC (AM-FM-TV), Washington, D.C., have discriminated against employees on the basis of sex, has been held in abeyance by the Commission pending action by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC).

In a letter to Nancy Stanley and Gladys Kessler, the Commission said that it had been informed that the EEOC was conducting an investigation into the matters raised in the complaint, and noted the procedures the FCC intends to follow regarding a discrimination case of this nature. The Commission cited its order and notice of proposed rule making In the Matter of Petition for Rule Making to Require Broadcast Licensees to Show Nondiscrimination in Their Employment Practices, in which it said that "if a complaint raising a substantial issue of discrimination is received against a station with 25 or more employees, thus making the Civil Rights Act applicable, the Commission will refer the complaint to the EEOC, and will thereafter maintain appropriate liaison with that agency and the Department of Justice." The Commission said it felt it was appropriate to hold in abeyance any action, including ruling on the complainants' request for a hearing, until the EEOC had an opportunity to act on the complaint before it.
