It looked like the same show all over again with the same plot and the same players . . . only the guys in the white hats changed with the guys in the black hats. Is it possible that FCC Chairman Dean Burch would be taking the side of drugs . . . and Commissioner Nicholas Johnson being the narc for the day?

Ahhh . . . but the point is advertising. "Drug advertising is one substantial source of broadcast income (and therefore is an important contribution) to its continued ability to bring to the American people expensive entertainment, news, public affairs and similar programming. Burch told the investigating committee that the Federal Trade Commission should take the lead, but that he would co-operate. On the other hand, Commissioner Johnson, in his own statement, disagreed with Burch (that's verse 134 of the same song) and he stated that he would advocate such items as a ban on all over-the-counter commercials . . . a requrement that all drug ads be

VANCOUVER

I'M OK--YOU'RE OK . . . the title of a book written by a Sacremento psychiatrist, will be the theme of a gathering of both U.S. and Canadian radio-record people now set for October 23rd and 24th, some two hours drive outside of Vancouver, British Columbia. The Clinic will differ in many respects from its predecessors, but mainly the difference will be in purpose. Rather than the usual let's-all-get-together type gathering, the Clinic will be an in depth study of Communication. Not only communication from the radio-record standpoint, but communication as a whole. Speakers were chosen because of their knowledge, dedication and pioneering in that very subject. Few will actually be from the radio or record business. Whistler's Mountain will be the scene of the meeting. It's located by car, two hours east of Vancouver. The Ski Boot, a mountain lodge right on the road, has been entirely taken over by the Clinic. There are private rooms for those who bring their wives . . and small six man dormitories for those who wish them. From the Ski Boot the members of the Clinic will take a 20 minute ski lift ride up to the very top of Whistler's Mountain (that, by the way, is the only way to get up there) where lies The Roundhouse, a huge, round building, complete with fireplace. It is here that the meetings, themselves, will be held.

The \$65 registration fee will include all meals and lodging. The meeting will begin at one p.m. on Saturday afternoon and go through to six p.m. on Sunday. Busses will be running Friday night and Saturday morning from the airport to the Ski Boot. Wives will not have to pay registration, but there will be a \$5.00 per night charge for her lodging. As always, the Clinic will be limited to 200 people, and with the meeting only a month away, registration should be prompt. There is a form in the back part of this sheet. Oh . . . one more thing . . . there will be snow and skiing going on through the meeting and there is that ski lift ride so be sure and take your warm clothes. The speaking staff will be announced next week.

Hello! Just sitting around on a beautiful Sunday afternoon in the Santa Cruz Mountains reading the Radio Report, and what do we see? Nothing less than a "Bob Hamilton negative," that's what! (See page 4 of September 13th issue). "Don't forget to watch out for the boogiemen"—Then see The Power of Your Subconscious Mind, (Use your mind to remove fear—Examine your fears), and you'll learn that "There is no boogieman—it is a false belief."

We unemployed programming people have to ignore such threats of fear if we wish to continue our search for employment.

OK, enough for the non-serious side and on to the serious side of this communication. I've been out of work for two months now and although I've had several offers I've had to turn them down; of course, in most cases, there has been some insane internal hassle that wouldn't have permitted me to do what I have to do. I am getting a tremendous education about management's attitude towards Program Directors, though. But I do know that the "infinite intelligence of my subconscious mind" will eventually lead me to my goals; I do have faith, Bob! Keep those peaceful thoughts rollin',—Rick Carroll Editor's Note: Boogie-men . . . two root words . . . in other terms . . . men who boogie . . . the dance . . .

WORCESTER—Market rank—55th . . . population—620,500 . . . 1.6% ethnic.

ECONOMY-Situated in the geographic center of Massachusetts, 39 miles from Boston and 73 miles from Hartford. The industrial base of the city is electronics with insurance and aviation figuring strongly. Norton Industries employ 21,000, Herald Machines employs over 7,000 and Knowles Corp. employs nearly 10,000, to mention a few. Thom McCann shoes are manufactured here. The "heart of the Commonwealth" boasts the new Worcester Center, third largest indoor mall in the country, which the city just completed at a cost of \$27,000,000 . . . just part of the \$405,000,000 downtown revitalization. There are six universities here, including Clark, Holy Cross, Assumption, and Anna Maria College, totaling some 18,000 students. There are also four junior colleges. The University of Massachusetts medical school just opened here.

PEOPLE—Being an All-American yankee town, the people are conservative, the politics are Republican...the leanings are on tradition. Catholicism prodominates. The environment is economically stable. Women, incidentally, make up 37% of the labor force. Population is heavily adult...median age is 35.2.

COST OF LIVING—One bedroom furnished apartments run about \$200. Food and gasoline costs are just slightly higher than average. Jocks make anywhere from \$85 to \$325 with the average top forty jock making about \$165.

WEATHER—Typical New England, constantly changing. Bitterly cold and snowy winters. ... reasonably mild, not too humid summers. Chamber of Commerce terms "ideal for business and recreation."

WAAB-Ron Carson is PD . . . Judd Coursey is MD. WAAF (progressive top 40 - owned by WAAB) Music and programing handled by Judd Coursey. WORC-Norm Larramee is PD . . . Bob Frost is MD.

OTHER STATIONS: WTAG-MOR . . . WNEB-MOR . . . WSRS/FM-Beautiful music.

RATINGS: WTAG (NBC affiliate) ranks highest in shares, dominating with the adults . . . WAAB ranks overall second, heavy in teens and young adults. WBZ, Boston-MOR, also figures strong in ratings.

LUBBOCK-Market rank-151st. Population-199,400.

ECONOMY-Located in the south plains of Texas . . . south of Amarillo . . . about 700 miles west of Dallas. Agriculture dominates the economy . . . approximately one half of the population is employed in agri-business industries. Cotton and the related fabric manufacturers are the most important . . . primarily Litton Industries. As one would expect, the raising of beef cattle is the second most predominate industry with packing plants being plentiful. Reese Air Force Base is located here . . . plans are in the works for a nearby airport. Building is an important industry due to the number of tornadoes that go tripping through the area. Devro is also located here . . . a division of Johnson and Johnson. Lubbock is a dry country . . . but residents quench their thirst about ten miles out of town on the wet "strip." This city is big on football . . . the Coaches All-American Game is played here. Most of the cheering is directed at local Texas Tech. and its 22,800 students. The University brings in \$67,500,000 per year to the city. Lubbock Christian is also located here (700 students.)

PEOPLE—There are more churches per capita here than in any city in the country.... primarily Church of Christ. People are very conservative and only tolerate the university long-hairs. An unsuccessful Peace festival was just held here . . . termed the "Cotton Festival." There

is an unusually low unemployment rate of 2.3%. Thoughts are always on the price of commodities as town's livelihood fluctuates with the market.

COST OF LIVING—University housing has caused a rise in cost of apartments . . . one bedroom apts. can be found for about \$150. Gasoline and food costs are average, however, and jocks make from \$125 to \$250. The average top forty jock makes \$150.

WEATHER-Fairly moderate climate with hot summers and little snow in winter. Winds are common, causing spring dirt storms and a harsher chill factor in winters. Area is known as "Tornado Alley", for appropriate reasons.

FCC COMMISSIONER NICHOLAS JOHNSON CALLS ON GROCERY MANUFACTURERS FOR "HONESTY HYPE"

Citing the influence exerted by manufacturers of grocery products on television programs and commercials as a result of their heavy advertising, FCC Commissioner Nicholas Johnson called on the manufacturers to recognize the causes of public ferment today and to aid in resolving them--for their own benefit as well as that of the public.

Commissioner Johnson's remarks were made to a public policy seminar on marketing of the Grocery Manufacturers of America, Inc., today at the Hilton Hotel.

Excerpts from Commissioner Johnson's address:
"..., gentlemen, the fact is that you have far more
power to control the television programing seen by the
American people-including your children and minethan do all the Federal Communications Commissioners
put together, even on those rare occasions when the
seven of us act unanimously.

".... between national and regional spot TV and national and regional spot radio, your Board of Directors' companies spent as much or more money on advertising as each of six states of this Union spent the same year to fulfill their responsibilities. Alaska, Idaho, Nevada, New Hampshire, Vermont, and Wyoming move over.

"With that kind of power at your disposal, you can feed a lot of heads in this country as well as bodies.

"Millions of Americans of all races and social and economic strata never see their images on the TV screen.

Beverly Magid, head of the New York office, rapped with Florence Greenberg......President of Scepter Records.

BEV: What made you decide to start a record company?

FG: What makes you decide to work in the first place? Children grow up, they're in high school, they don't need you physically anymore... there is a vacumn, so you look around for something to do. My son was a piano student, and he and his teacher wrote a song... and that's how I'm in the record business.

BEV: What ever happened to that song?

FG: Absolutely nothing . . . it wasn't really that good, but I thought it was the best at the time. Once I tried to sell the song, I thought I knew the whole record business . . . and my daughter knew the Shirelles, four classmates of hers. They weren't the Shirelles then, of course, just classmates. They wrote a song called, "I Met Him On A Sunday". We went in to make a demonstration record, or whatever I called it at that time. We went in with four local musicians from Passaic; the four little girls, my daughter, my son and I . . . and it was the first time that any one of us had ever been in a studio . . . and we had a million seller on our hands.

BEV: Have you ever been sorry you started in records?

FG: Every once in a while, desperately . . . but most of the time, no.

BEV: Did you find it particularly hard, being probably a pioneer as far as Women's Lib is concerned in the music business?

FG: Never found that difficult, ever . . . I always find the men, even when I was younger and much prettier, very cooperative and even chivalrous.

BEV: Today, with more record companies going together in larger conglomerates, do you find running an independent label more exciting, more challenging or just more frustrating?

FG: Not that much different . . . business always changes. There are changes in concepts, distribution and those changes you ride with . . . I don't think conglomerates hurt an independent at all.

BEV: Is it more difficult today?

FG: Do you mean as an independent? I think that the whole industry is difficult. You know that you're always riding new trends . . . whether it be music trends, or business trends, or personality. Our business is very emotional as well as business, and on the independent side, you can handle the emotion which is basically the basis of our business . . . the whole music business. If you've got a good record, you're going to sell it whether you're an independent or a conglomerate.

BEV: You don't see more difficulty in distribution?

FG: Everybody's been crying that, but it has not hurt me at all . . . as long as I have product, they'll sell, and when product is weak, they won't sell. It does not matter if the distributor or rack is part of the conglomerate. He's still looking for the hit record, the hit lp.

BEV: Do you involve yourself in every area of the business?

FG: I used to, but not so much anymore now that the business is larger. There's an old Jewish expression which means "stirring spoon", and that's what I am now. The heads of the departments are all very capable men, and I rarely meddle except to keep the whole pot stirring.

BEV: Where do you see the trends in music going now?

FG: Rock in the broad sense is here and will stay, but there's acid rock, hard rock, rhythm & blues, and they change within themselves, with variations within themselves . . . and you have to meet the new feel. I hear a soft sound at the moment, more ballad . . . more soft.

BEV: What about the religious trend in music?

FG: We did it, too, and it was there. No question about it, it's part of the whole picture, but I don't think it's a lasting . . .

BEV: Have you run into any problems as far as the FCC ruling on drug lyrics?

FG: I've never permitted it, to my knowledge. I imagine records have slipped by in the company. I don't read every lyric . . . but it's never been a problem . . . I don't think that's brought to us.

BEV: Then your stand is very strongly opposed, not necessarily pro or con lyrics but any lyrics pertaining to drugs?
FG: I have very strong feelings about the drugs . . . I don't think that a drug-oriented record ever made an addict, and I think that music is the town crier, or the minstrel, and it tells the story of the time . . . and in drug-oriented times, drug-oriented lyrics are going to creep into it, and I think that it's putting your head into a gunny sack to think that it won't. I'm not going to put a record out saying that drugs are wonderful because I don't think that they're wonderful . . . but if drug is mentioned, or if someone is sick from drugs . . . I don't think that it should be banned. I think that it should be even more so played, so that people get disgusted with it. I think that anything that is satiated, people get disgusted with . . . banning makes an interest . . . I don't believe in banning anything. I've been thinking of something which would probably get me into a lot of trouble, but I seriously think drugs should be legally dispensed on medical prescription. I feel it would reduce the crime rate, take the pusher off the street, it would simplify the life of the extablished addict, there would be less addicts coming up since the pusher wouldn't be there. Criminal elements wouldn't be making a fortune, and I would love to see drugs sold in the drug store by prescription. And I would go on the corner and shout for it if I could get enough support to do it. I have never known one drug addict personally, or at least, if I do I'm not aware of it, but to say that if it doesn't touch me I'm not interested in the situation is simple.

BEV: I gather that you're not in favor of censorship?

FG: I am against all censorship and all laws against personal problems. If they passed laws against the bootlegging of records, which is not a personal emotional problem but a criminal problem, they'd be much more active and serving a better purpose. A personal crime against yourself . . . how can that be legilized?

Gentlemen: At the moment I am writing this, I am in a helicopter approximately one hour from Vancouver B.C. We are over 6,000 feet in the air . . . Keith James of CHED is on my right . . . our pilot, Walt, is on my left. Beneith me on my left through this glass bubble is a glacier . . . thousands of years old, quietly doing its work . . . carving its way through these mountains. Oh, if only I could relate to you the magnificence, the unbelieveable joy that this scene holds. There are no cars, no people, no houses, absolutely nothing but trees . . . pine trees that you can smell all the way up here . . . and lakes . . . gorgeous, pure, blue, incredible lakes. In my life I have never felt this quiet . . . this love . . . this close to God himself. From here I share with you . . . October 23 and 24 . . . we will come together . . . up here.

Now that I am safely down on the ground here in the L.A. office, I will explain a little more about the October meeting . . . perhaps from a more logical standpoint.

It has taken the evolvement of all the past meetings, from Shreveport to San Clemente . . . to finally come to an understanding of the hows and whys of radio—record people gatherings. I would say that not one . . . of all the gatherings . . . ever . . . in this business . . . have accomplished their purpose. Over and over at the end of one of those get-it-together trips I have heard such statements as "nothing was accomplished" . . . "I didn't learn anything" . . . etc.

Even as beautiful and fine as San Clemente was, it still lacked the final step . . . the element that made its purpose . . . a reality.

See, what these meetings are is a bunch of people in the industry getting together and discussing the industry's problems.

And that's the problem. We've been discussing the problem . . . and never the solution. We wasted our time looking at the engine . . . without taking the carburetor apart.

We talk about the short play list . . . the lack of service . . . the heavy commercial load limit . . . the need for more community service . . . and rap, rap, rap.

In Vancouver, we will not waste time discussing the industry's problems . . . but utilize our time touching briefly on THE PROBLEM . . . the root cause of the trouble in the carburetor . . . and the other 90% of the program on THE SOLUTION.

The problem in the first place is Non-Communication. Non-Communication with ourselves . . . with one person . . . and with our audience.

The people who will be speaking are people who know the answer . . . people who are not dedicated to radio or the record business . . . but people dedicated to communication.

We have spared no horses with acquiring their presence, and they have come willingly . . . understanding the solution as they do.

We are not inviting radio or record people but people interested in the solution. The number of people attending is not important . . . the reason is.

Can it be done? . . . Can we find the solution? Let me answer it this way. I know a 105 pound housewife who couldn't lift half her weight . . . until she saw her 9 year old son pinned underneith a car. In that moment, there were no mental blocks or negative attitudes . . . she lifted it.

Two friends of mine were rapping. One of them asked the other if he could remember a phone number that he hadn't used in six months. The other man tried... couldn't... then turned about a minute later and recited the number. "How did you do it?" the other asked... The man replied... "I just put it on a life or death basis."

Our son is pinned underneith a car . . . Vancouver . . . on a life or death basis.

It's round-up time at the ole New York corral . . . the entries have all run the concert races, and it depends on your point of view who won, the performers or the audiences. On the second night out, I saw the favorite Sly Stone go through his paces. No attempt is made to confront serious social problems which affect every citizen today. When the parents in Pontiac, Michigan go home after a day of demonstrations, do they see any mention of busing or the underlying racial problems when they turn on their television sets for the entertainment shows? When the people of Attica, New York sit around this week and reflect on the tragedy that hit their state prison, do they get an iota of artistic edification from TV's entertainment shows? Do these questions answer themselves? Of course they don't. And why not? Because TV considers these questions too controversial. They may scare off part of our audience,' TV tells it's critics.

The whole country is in ferment over the quality of life in general, and the quality of commerce in particular.

"People are fed up. People do want change--not just tokenism and public relations programs. You can either fight it or you can seek to adapt your own behavior as corporations to newly-felt and newly-expressed desires.

"If people want honest, quiet advertising, give them advertising which they can use to make up their minds on which brand to buy, and whether to buy any brand at all.

"Marketing men are wont to talk about new campaigns and new marketing strategies as hypes."

"Do you know the newest hype in town--for politicians and business alike?

"It's called honesty." It's new. It's untried. It's startling. Many of us are uncomfortable using it at first, until we develop a taste for it.

"But to borrow a venerable advertising phrase, 'If you'll try it I think you'll like it."

NO BASIS FOR ACTION IN JESSEL-NBC "TODAY". CONTROVERSY FCC STATES

In reply to a letter from Congressman William H. Harsha of Ohio raising questions regarding the termination of remarks by George Jessel in an interview conducted by Edwin Newman on the NBC "Today" program of July 30, and the applicability of the Fairness Doctrine to the incident, FCC Chairman Dean Burch has stated that the Commission shares Congressman Harsha's concern that "broadcasting remain an open medium of expression," but that "there would appear to be no basis for Commission intervention in this matter."

Chairman Burch pointed out that under Section 3 (h), the Congress defined a broadcast licensee as not a common carrier, and that a licensee's "affirmative responsibility under the Act" requires that he make "reasonable judgments as to the programing presented over his facilities."

Noting that NBC defended the action concerning Mr. Jessel on the ground that "his statements appeared to be verging into possible libelous areas," Chairman Burch pointed out that this is a judgment that the licensee may reasonably make as to programing that does not fall within the no-censorship ban of Section 315 (broadcasts by candidates for public office), and that the Commission is required only "to decide whether the licensee has acted within the wide discretion that is necessarily his as to such programing judgments."

The Fairness Doctrine goes to a quite different point, Chairman Burch said. While under the Communications Act, as interpreted by the courts, licensees have an affirmative duty to afford reasonable opportunity for the discussion of contrasting viewpoints on controversial issues of public importance, they could not rule off the airwaves some viewpoint with which they might not agree, such as one critical of the media, the Chairman said. Under the doctrine, licensees retain discretion as to the manner in which a controversial issue is to be covered, including such matters as appropriate spokesmen and program format, Chairman Burch added, and so the Commission cannot conclude that the cut-off of Mr. Jessel on the grounds stated by NBC standing alone, raises a fairness issue.
