VANCOUVER

OCTOBER 4, 1971

"The function . . . of the nervous system in the human body . . . COMMUNICATION. It is also the function of the nervous system which ties the world together, and it is the concentration on communication ... what facilitates it and what stops it ... which will produce something new under the sun. We believe we have found an opening. This opening will be explored not by a nameless, corporate society, but by individuals together in that society." The words of Dr. Thomas A. Harris (former Chief of the Psychiatric Branch for the Navy Department and founder and president of the Institute for Transactional Analysis) from the book, I'M OKAY-YOU'RE OKAY ... the inspiration for the October 23rd-24th meeting in this city. Dr. Harris had agreed to be one of the instructors at the meeting . . . his session beginning at one pm on Sunday. Along with Dr. Harris, the Report can announce the addition of CRTC (Canadian counterpart to the FCC) Vice Chairman, Harry Boyle, to the speaking staff. Commissioner Boyle has been extremely outspoken on radio's need to serve the public and was more than willing to participate in the Clinic. At the same time, one of the motion picture industry's most successful producers, Stanley Kramer, will not only be at the Saturday night session, but will bring with him his latest film, "Bless The Beasts and Children" for a showing prior to its release. A fourth staffer, Ritchie York, an outspoken writer on communications, particularly broadcasting in Canada, has agreed to be a part. Actor, producer, director, Peter Fonda informed the office that his plans to attend had been thwarted by a shooting schedule in Paris . . . attempts to try and fly from Paris to Vancouver and back proved fruitless. However. Fonda is preparing a tape presentation that will be part of the Clinic's opening. Fonda was an immediate backer of the Clinic idea, and had agreed to attend with no hesitation.

Writer York, Commissioner Boyle, Dr. Harris and Producer Kramer . . . only the beginning. More instructors will be announced next week.

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BOB HAMILTON RADIO REPORT

MARKETS OF THE WEEK

TOLEDO——Market rank—46th. Population—692,571. 8.2% black.

ECONOMY-Located in the Northwest corner of Ohio, 58 miles south of Detroit . . . 235 miles east of Chicago. Market is known as the Glass City . . . home of Owens Corning Fiberglass, Libby Owens Ford, and Owens Glass. The famous Toledo Scale is made here . . . other blue chip home offices include Champion Sparkplugs, and the American Motors jeep division which is the largest employer in the area-6,000 employees. Chevrolet and Chrysler both have plants here . . . Sun Oil, Standard Oil and Gulf all have refineries in this high dollar volume market. City has two totally enclosed malls with two more under plans for construction. Situated on Lake Erie, the "Port City" is one of the most active centers in the country for foreign and U.S. shipping. Boating is the most popular outdoor sport with Lake Erie and the Maumee River as convenient outdoor playgrounds. Toledo University's football team has the longest winning streak (26 games) in college football. Boling Green University and Toledo U. each have an enrollment of 15.00 students.

PEOPLE—There is a definite line between the more influential, conservative community and lesser liberal faction typical of the Mid West. . . with Democratic politics and 60% of the population over 21. Average income is over \$11,000. . . 70% of the residents own their own homes. The few long hairs are tolerated.

COST OF LIVING—Prices are slightly higher than the national average here . . . including food and gasoline. A furnished one-bedroom apartment will average about \$200. Jock salaries run between \$125 and \$250...an average Top Forty jock will make about \$170 a week.

WEATHER—Nothing unusual here . . . relatively mild with cold and snowy winters and pleasant summers. TOP FORTY STATIONS:

WOHO-Don Armstrong is PD . . . Norm Davis is MD. WTTO-Jack Hoppas is PD.

OTHER STATIONS: WCWA-MOR. . . WKLR/FM-Soul . . . WLQR/FM-Beautiful music . . . WSPD-MOR WTOD-Daytime country.

RATINGS: July Pulse shows old line WSPD with greatest totals . . . WOHO is a strong second . . . leading in the 18-49 quarter hours . . . CKLW from Detroit pulls third in the market followed by WTTO, KLR, KJR from Detroit, WTOD and WCWA.

RICHMOND-Market rank-66th. Population-526,700. 22% black.

ECONOMY-City is the capital of Virginia . . . situated in the east-central part of the state on the James River, 100 miles south of Washington, and 100 miles west of the Chesapeake Bay. Tobacco and farming are the major industries. Tours are available at the American Tobacco Co., Philip Morris, and Liggett & Myers. Manufacture of chemical products, food, and wood products are also important. Reynolds metals are manufactured here . . . anything from corn to tomatoes can be purchased in the open-air markets here, common to only a few other cities, like New Orleans. City is a large financial center similar to Atlanta... results in a high per capita income. Insurance companies also have their place here, including Northwestern Mutual and Providence. Being the seat of the state government, there are many central government offices. Important to the culture is the great historical background of the city . . . was the capital of the Confederate States during the Civil War . . . Washington slept here as well as Thomas Jefferson, Patrick Henry and Robert E. Lee . . . a veritable tourist mecca. The public parks and numerous lakes outside the city make swimming and boating the most

popular sports. Schools here include the University of Richmond and Virginia Commonwealth University, each with an enrollment of over 10,000. Others include Randolph Macon and nearby Virginia State. The University of Virginia is 60 miles away.

PEOPLE—The population is still primarily conservative, based on the thirteen-colony tradition. Historical influence is heavy with many Presidents having originated from the state. The conservative senator, Harry Byrd influence shows itself in the names of airports, hotels, and streets. Politics are becoming moderate, however, despite the polarization of the liberals and conservatives. There is a Republican governor in office, reflecting the trend away from the conservative Democrats . . . toward the younger and more moderate elements. The Church influence is not as great as one would imagine. There is a fairly even spread among the various faiths. No particular hassles for long-hairs due to the substantial college community. The current topic at cocktail parties is the bussing problem. The attempts at consolidating the school system, along with the major exodus of the whites to the suburbs (away from the over 40% black urban core) have caused major problems. The city has the 24th largest black community.

COST OF LIVING—Food and gas costs are average ... a one bedroom furnished pad will cost from \$175 to \$225 per month, including utilities. Retail taxes are low here, (4%) but property taxes are higher than average. The people here are very money-conscious and pay their city taxes independent of the county. The average annual jock salary for a Top 40 man is \$7,000 but jocks make as much as \$20,000 here.

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BOB: Can I ask you what you had in mind . . . and the purpose for doing that movie?

STANLEY: Well ... now ... that's a bad question. You can ask me...

BOB: Okay ... I'm asking you ...

STANLEY: You see, the idea of having something in mind is a bad deal. I don't think you have anything in mind. I think you have anything in mind... I think you have an emotional reaction to a subject when you read it. You say to yourself, with the idea of being the producer or director incarnate ... you say, "I can make a helluva movie out of that." So it isn't what you have in mind ... if you have something specifically in mind to administer to an audience, that's bad because it's patronizing and it never works. You have to have an emotional attachment to the material and then try to translate it to the film. Now what happens afterwards triggers many things. Some people say it's about Mai Lai or Kent State or it's about the generation gap ... or it's about the gun cult in America ... or just ecological in nature. It's hard to say. All of that is there, but that's not what I intended. I intended to tell the story you say but my subconscious, which I'm sure believes in all of those things, was being triggered all the while. All of it's there—it just isn't something that I said, "Now I'm going to do this in this way." Rather, I simplified it down to six boys who had to do something positive who were misfits.

BOB: The shooting of the buffalo . . . it's my understanding that that's the way they thin out the herds . . . **STANLEY:** You can bet your boots that's what goes on. It happens a couple of places in America, but most particularly in Arizona where I saw it . . . and there's one going on this October. Now you know that I didn't kill those buffalo, because I couldn't very well make this film and actually kill the buffalo. I bought film from private sources of the shoots from the Dakotas and from Arizona, and then I built my sets to conform to that film. But those shoots are actual and real . . . all of them.

BOB: I understand your statement about not having anything in mind before making the film, but after it was done . . . what did it show to you. . . what do you feel about it?

STANLEY: Well, it shows to me something which is modified by what all the other people say, but it is . . . to me . . . a story about love . . . a story about compassion for human beings. I mean, a compassion for life.

BOB: The word parent . . . not necessarily the blood line kind of parent, but people who impose their views or impose their tradition on other people. . . I think that was the biggest statement I received from the movie. **STANLEY:** Well, you've got your supporters on that account. I can support that in another way, too, because the parents came to visit the boys who star in the movie . . . the actual parents . . . and I would be invited to dinner as the camp councilor. I would listen to the parents refer to the boys in the third person . . . "He always does that", or, "He always did that." Well, the boy is sitting there never opening his mouth and actually they were all very precocious, but they never opened their mouth when the parents came. I would think to myself, listening for a half hour to them make every traditional boo-boo in the world in terms of communication with the kids . . . I would say to myself, "Do I do that?" I've got four kids of my own and I learned a lot.

BOB: Someone said they've never seen you quite so intent at communicating a movie you've done . . . would you say that is correct?

STANLEY: Well, that may be the result of two things. I think, generally speaking ... yes ... I can't tell you about the emotional pull. What can I say to you ... that I'm moved by it?... of course, I am. That I love the boys? ... yes I do. That I care that since nobody wanted the film originally, I want to see it successful? ... yes I do. Sam Goldwyn said that he didn't care if it made a penny, as long as everyone sees it. Times are very rough now and few pictures make it, and I think it would be awfully nice if a film that represented as much love among the people who made it and the selection of kids ... most of whom aren't actors ... I'd get a big kick out of that ... and that's why I'm trying so hard.

BOB: Is that really the word . . . "A kick out of it" . . . that seems almost treating it lightly. **STANLEY:** Well, . . I'm . . . trying . . . not to say . . . it matters. It matters deeply because what it's about I care about . . . and I've got many points of reference in my own life and career.

BOB: This is always a good question . . . what would you say is the best movie you ever made?

STANLEY: I wouldn't have any idea. You see, when anybody ever asks me what was the best one, I become almost overcome with the feeling of some guilt . . . because when I look back at those kind of movies, I realize there is something wrong with every one of them. It isn't that some of them weren't good . . . or some better than the others . . . it's just something wrong with every one of them. I see it now. I shouldn't have used that woman in that part . . . I say to myself . . . or that last scene was overplayed . . . or whatever. That's because that films that were a little bit challenging or a little bit controversial . . . it bothers me when they don't strike the right note all the way through . . . but none of them can. Now, instead of remembering it that way, I always remember pieces of films. I remember Marlon Brando in The Men . . . or I remember Sidney Poitier in The Defiant Ones . . . or I remember Spencer Tracy in almost every scene he made . . . in Nuremborg, I remember Spencer Tracy saying . . . "This is what we believe justice . . . truth and the value of single human beings."

From-AS A MAN THINKETH by James Allen

From-THE GREENING OF AMERICA by Charles Reigh

Whenever any attempt is made to begin confronting America's problems, we encounter a profound lack of understanding. This lack of understanding is not merely a phenomenon of the masses, for it extends to the powerful, the well educated, and the elite, it is not simply a lack of knowledge, for it includes many people who possess more than enough information. Its basis is a pervasive unreality. Our picture of our economy, of how we are governed, of how our culture is made, of how we may be threatened at home or abroad, is fantastically out of keeping with contemporary realities. Indeed, the central fact about America in 1970 is the discrepancy between the realities of our society and our beliefs about them. The gap is even greater in terms of our failure to understand the possibilities and potential of American life.

From-I'M OK-YOU'RE OK by Dr. Thomas A. Harris

The "best" in any concrete situation is identical with the "least evil!" There is a certain evil in all lying, because it tends to break down the basis of trustworthiness, and there is evil in returning a good man to unjust imprisonment. The good man must weigh these as best he can, and the lesser evil is his duty, because the only alternative is worse. Often in such a situation, we wish we could avoid the cruel choice, but we cannot, for we are faced with what William James called a forced option. The very failure to decide is itself a decision and perhaps a decision for the worse of the only alternatives. The man who refuses to decide is not thereby freed from responsibility but is obviously culpable. We are just as responsible for the evil we allow as for the evil --Elton Trueblood we commit.

WASHINGTON

BISBEE, ARIZ., KSUN DAYTIME OPERATION WITH 500 WATTS POWER AUTHORIZED BY FCC TO DEC-EMBER 31, 1972.

A request by Bisbee Broadcasters, Inc., licensee of KSUN, Bisbee, Ariz., for temporary authorization to operate KSUN with 500 watts daytime power has been granted by the FCC until December 31, 1972. KSUN requested the temporary authority until adjacent channel stations XECG at Nogales, Sonora, Mexico, and KWJB at Globe, Ariz., increase their daytime power to 1000 watts. In February 1971, KSUN--a Class IV station licensed for unlimited time operation on 1230 kHz with 250 watts power and located in the "border zone" with Mexico--was granted a permit to increase daytime power to 1000 watts. The grant was made on condition that construction or operation will not begin until notice has been received by the station of coordination with Mexico. This is in line with the U.S.-Mexico standard broadcast agreement.

WTBY, WATERBURY, CONN. ORDERED TO FOR-FEIT \$1,000 FOR RULE VIOLATION.

Trend Broadcasting, Inc., the former licensee of WTBY, Waterbury, Conn., and parent corporation of Radio Trend, Inc., the current licensee of WTBY, has been ordered by the Commission to forfeit \$1,000 for repeated violation of the rules by falsifying operating logs. The new licensee, Radio Trend, Inc., asked that the forfeiture be rescinded or reduced from \$2,000, attributing the violations to operator error and improper supervision of the chief engineer who has since been discharged by the station. Radio Trend claimed the station had been brought "up to the F.C.C. standards and better" under new management and a new chief engineer. The Commission reduced the forfeiture liability to \$1,000 in consideration of the station's financial condition.

NEW YORK

The purchase of the Starday-King Music Division of Lin Broadcasting Corporation was announced today by Hal Neely, Freddy Bienstock, Jerry Lieber and Mike Stoller who have formed a partnership called Tennessee Recording and Publishing Co., Inc.

Don Pels, President of Lin, disclosed the purchase price of one million dollars in cash and approximately four hundred thousand dollars in the assumption of liabilities. The sale confirmed long-standing rumors of Lin's interest in divesting itself of the Music Division in order to concentrate on its vast radio, TV and telephone communications interests. In addition to operating Telanserphone, Inc. and Aircall, N.Y., the Lin chain of broadcasting outlets includes WFIL/AM, KILT/AM-FM, KEEL/AM-FM, WIL/AM-FM, KAAY/FM, WBBF/FM and WBFB/FM Also WAVY-TV and WAND-TV.

In addition to the Starday-King labels, the sale price includes all the copyrights and publishing catalogs owned by LIN. Among these are the Lois-Starday catalogs and interests in the vast Jay & Cee catalog owned jointly with Henry Glover. Several additional smaller catalogs are involved and will be a part of the expanded publishing operations.
