#### **BOSTON**

One of American Broadcasting's most well known general manager-owners, Mac Richmond, died in a Boston hospital last Thursday night. He apparantly had had a heart attack. Mac Richmond was the owner of WPGC in Washington, KBMI in Henderson, Nev. and WMEX in Boston. He is credited with radio's first two way talk show back in 1957 in Boston. Originally from the Conneticut-Rhode Island area, Richmond previously owned an ad agency in Philadelphia. WPGC general manager Bob Howard has assumed the GM position in Boston, along with continuing to oversee WPGC.

#### LOS ANGELES

**NOVEMBER 1, 1971** 

A total of 27 members of the staff of KPPC/FM were fired here last Sunday night, October 24, by Manager, Doug Cox. Station jocks actually heard rumors of their coming dismissal from record men in town....then proceeded to beseech their listeners to provide letters and calls in support of keeping the present staff....over 1,000 telegrams were received as well as numerous phone calls. When the axe finally fell, over three days later, a number of protesters formed a picket line outside the station and had to be dispelled by police. There have since been threats on the new staff not to appear in public. Cox, who has been with the station for one and a half years, was quoted as saying both that the firings were entirely for "off the air reasons" (a KPPC statement) and that the jocks "were not complying with public service requirements" (as reported to KMET/FM news staff). None of the staff were under station contracts or union protection. Four of those fired were reportedly offered options to return....but flatly refused....including Ted Longmeyer who was on the air from 6:00 to 6:30 p.m. on M Vnday. Among those other on-the-air personnel who were fired, were Joe Rogers (MIssissippi Fats), Jeff Gonzer, Les Carter, Outrageous Nevada (Carter's wife), the Pierce Family (David, his wife, and kid), Steve Segal, and the Credibility Gap (satirical news skits), along with other innovative features. Dick Moreland heads the new crew as PD....was program director and MD for KRLA at one time....and was most recently with RCA Records. The new lineup includes William F. Williams (formerly at KRLA) in mornings, Peter Franklind (PD from KPRI in San Diego) in midday, Tom Clay (recently of "What The World" fame) in drive, Bob Taylor (from KDEO in San Diego) in evenings, and Bobby Applegate (of Pentagram Records) in 10 p.m. -2 a.m. The station will play solid music from 2 - 6 a.m. The National Science Network, owner of KPPC, KMPX/FM- WNCN - New York, and WHDF, reportedly has made such mass firings in the past and is rumored to be looking for a buyer for the whole chain. The management is said to have turned down over \$50,000 worth of national business last summer because of is sensitivity to it's particular audience.. KPPC was responsible for causing a high competitive factor among the other progressive stations here -KMET/FM and KLOS/FM. No word at this time on any plans for the 27 fired.

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**World Radio History** 

#### **NEW YORK**

If your friendly program director looks a little harried this week, it might be because the October, November ARB started last week. As in all cases this one is important with special interest on several markets. New York itself has some interest....WPIX-FM is the latest of stations to join the contemporary rank....that along with Pacific/Southern station WWDJ has added some interest here. While WABC still seems far out in the open, a night time tie by WOR-FM in one of the last ratings taken should prove of interest for this ARB. Some here-to-fore sleeping stations have changed and opened up their guns against the giants....such as WIBG in Philly....throwing whatever they can against WFIL. In Boston, WMEX has come alive....not beating WRKO but, suddenly proving competition for them. It's a four way battle in Miami....WMYQ-FM has shown up super strong on late Pulses and Hoopers plus the addition of former KYA'er Dick Starr at WINZ should be interesting. The main question is whether or not the strike trouble at WQAM will affect enough to see them in the deep water this time around. The Chicago ratings are always interesting....WLS still holding their own....some changes have come down at WCFL and that should be one to watch. KRIZ and KRUX in Phoenix will battle for a prize that KRUX holds at the moment....Gary Stevens at KRIZ now has had a little more time in the market.... perhaps a change of approach for this rating. In San Francisco Julian Breen is taking his first shot at Paul Drew in the KFRC-KYA fun fest. Los Angeles should be interesting with the drastic changes that have come down from KRLA....and the continuing improvement of KDAY. KHJ and newly formatted KKDJ can be called the only top forty stations in town. In San Diego latest Pulse's show the continued growth of KCBQ over KGB....but, certainly the battle continues there. Seattle will continue to be a more and more interesting market; KING's last ratings were surprisingly high...the possibility of their continued movement upward is the heaviest factor in this market.

#### WICHITA

KLEO program director Bob Roberts led an hour long discussion with the jocks about what kind of large plant that was peering into his window from just outside the station. The vice squad was called and after verifying the plant as marajuana set it on fire. With a south wind blowing jocks gathered north of the station and watched. Late word is that KLEO may be going all religion.

#### **WICHITA**

Perhaps KEYN is just north of KLEO. Seems this week some dude came up with the idea of showing America's first Drive-In Matinee Movie. Sixty cars showed up to watch blank screen in bright sunshine....while listening to soundtrack of Romeo and Juliet and Spike Jones tracks for cartoons. Anybody who sat through the whole show got free movie passes....pizza and of course free records. The theatre actually made more from concessions than regular Saturday midnight show....maybe the theatre is north of KLEO.

#### **CHICAGO**

Ed Shane formerly program director of KKDJ has taken over as PD at WGLD/FM in this city, replacing Morgan Tell. No word on why Tell is out or where he's going.

#### **VANCOUVER**

Some 200 registrants along with 28 staff members met at the Ski Boot Lodge October 23rd then proceeded up the ski lift to the Roundhouse for a two day discussion on improvement of communications. The meeting opened some 6500 feet above Vancouver (20 degrees, crystal clear, no wind, 32 inches of snow) with a film presentation produced by Bobby Ocean....narrated by Peter Fonda and Graham Nash. Keith James, CHED PD and George Brewer of Columbia Records followed with a discussion of differences between Canadian Broadcasting and American Broadcasting. Harry J. Boyle, Vice Chairman of the CRTC spoke for some 45 minutes regarding radio's need to be more of a service to the people they serve. Stanley Kramer, motion picture producer was the key note speaker at the evening meal....discussing mostly his movie, "Bless the Beasts and Children". The Sunday morning session began with Ritchie York, who laid heavily on....between the records....and the lack of regard of music people in relation to the music. He was followed by Mike Nesmith who stated that you are what you want to be. Dr. Thomas Harris followed with a discussion on Transactional Analysis and his book, "I'm Okay, You're Okay''.

#### JUNEAU, ALASKA

Members of the Greenpeace Commission have accused the US news media of a conspiracy of silence regarding the extent of world protest against the scheduled Amchitka nuclear test. The 5 megaton blast now scheduled to go off sometime this week has been protested by a group of Canadian news people who anchored just off Amchitka, to stop the blast. The group headed to Juneau and stated this week....."Throughout our voyage which has included stops in Akutan, Sand Point and Juneau, we have noted with increased alarm that Alaskans have simply not been informed by their media of the overwhelming reaction to the test.....not only in Canada but, elsewhere." Crewman James Bohlen said the ship would return to the Aleutians to register further opposition to the test. Few Americans have been aware of the planned test at all.....no story can be found on the Greenpeace mission.

### DETROIT

Ahhhh....Radio....Ahhhh....General Manager. WCAR, just a few weeks ago finally switching over to a long anticipated top forty format has proven to be very strange scene. The station, consulted by Draper-Blore, apparantly is going through some changes. Neil McIntire put into the PD position by the Draper-Blore organization has been fired and replaced by CJ Jones, who'll assume the title, Program and Sales Promotion Manager. New jingles have been cut....the list is down around 30 (unusual for a DB station)....and the station has been tightened toward the strict format kind of station. Is DB still programming? When contacted at his L.A. office, programming head John Rook stated, "No comment."

#### MARKETS OF THE WEEK

**EL PASO**--Market rank-86th...population 380,000... 45.4% Spanish

ECONOMY--Located in the far west corner of the state, just over the border of Central Southern New Mexico.... and just across the bridge from Juarez, Mexico....on the Rio Grande. Oil refining, copper, cotton, ranching, and farming make up the base of the economy. One third of the world's copper is mined nearby as well as one third of the silver in the world. Natural gas and crude oil are the city's most important natural resources. Tony Lama boots are manufactured here....the largest boot maker in the country and Farah slacks....the largest manufacturer of slacks in the world. Fort Bliss, an enormous Army base located outside the city....known as the most important air defense training center in the free world, now engaging in new activities because of the lessening of draft calls. The city is heavily Spanish influenced being separated only by a river from Juarez...is therefore a heavy tourist attraction with Spanish missions, etc. The largest pine forests in the country are found in nearby southern New Mexico where there are many popular ski resorts. Sports-wise the city boasts its native Lee Trevino who racked up most of the golf tournaments this year....the Sun Dodgers of El Paso are the farm team for the L.A. Dodgers. The University of Texas at El Paso has an enrollment of over 35,000 students and the newly opened El Paso Community College has some 1,500 students.

PEOPLE--The median age here is a very low 22.5. Unlike the rest of the state, the city is moderately liberal with many longhairs who are well accepted. The city has a non-hassle police department and a noticeable lack of paranoia. All this could be partly due to the city's water....the lithium levels in the water are higher here than in any other part of the country....the drug is still being used as a tranquilizing agent for manic and depressive personalities. Residents reportedly call their miracle drink.... "happy water." 50% of the population is Catholic. There is a great deal of underpaid Mexican labor.

COST OF LIVING--Prices are generally average here.... slightly higher in food if anything. Apartment costs run between \$135 and \$175 for furnished one-bedrooms. Jock salaries range between \$450 and \$600 per month... an average top forty jock will make about \$500. Management on the other hand, is much heavier on the other side of the wage scale.

WEATHER--Winters are moderate....days average in the 50's and 60's. Summers are hot and dry....there is only about 8 inches of rain here per year. The city is in a mountainous area with a peak elevation of 7,200 feet.... mountain climbing here is popular.

TOP FORTY STATIONS--KELP--Scotty Brink is new PD....Mike Skott is Music Director. KINT--Johnny Thompson is MD....Program Director yet to be named. OTHER STATIONS--XEJ-Spanish Top 40...KHEY-C&W XEWR-Top 40...KIZZ-talk...KROD-MOR...KSET-beautiful music...KJSM-MOR....XEF-Mexican Top 40..XEFV Mexican C&W....XEWG-modern Latin...KINT/FM-MOR Progressive...KIZZ/FM-MOR....KSET/FMBig band.....KTSM/FM-MOR

RATINGS--April-May ARB shows KELP overall No. 1& KHEY a strong second (stronger in older demographics KINT pulls third.

GRAND RAPIDS--Market rank--64th....population.... 539,225. 4% Black.

ECONOMY--City is situated 25 miles east of Lake Michigan....on the western side of the state...125 miles from Detroit...and 125 miles from Chicago. The economy here is diversified and therefore stable with the two main industries being the manufacture of auto parts and furniture. General Motors has plants here as well as many smaller companies supplying automotive components to Detroit. The city used to be known as the largest furniture manufacturer in the world...is still known as "furniture City." Lear-Siegler is located here (an aero-space electronics firm) as well as Kelvinator....famed manufacturer of refrigerators (a division of American Motors) Everything from dairy products to vegetables are grown in the surrounding country....making the area an important agricultural center. There is a major urban renewal project under way which will compliment the excellent freeway system....the best for its market size. Water sports are the most popular here with 12,000 inland lakes surrounding the city. Skiing is popular in winter There are no major colleges....the nearest is Michigan State at Lansing. There are 6 small colleges with 1,000 to 2,000 students each.

PEOPLE--The major influence here is Protestant Conservative. Republicans are in office...new city charter is about to be voted in....major issue is changing from a city manager form of government to a mayor and city commission. The median age here is average....the Governor has just signed a bill authorizing 18 year old drinking and voting....will be effective January 1st. There are plenty of longhairs here....they are generally more organized than elsewhere....pseudo-leaders speak for the cause.

COST OF LIVING.-Gas and food costs are, if anything, lower here. Furnished apartments are difficult to find. although there are many unfurnished ranging from \$125 to \$150. Jock salaries run between \$100 and \$400 per week. The average top 40 jock will make about \$150. WEATHER--There are four distinct seasons here. Springs and falls are beautiful....winters are cold and snowy (last year over 100 inches)....summers are warm and humid

TOP FORTY STATIONS--WGRD-PD is Ron White.... handles music....WLAV-John Leader is PD, Chuck Roberts is Music Director.

OTHER STATIONS--WZZM/FM-Top 40 (Bill Holen-PD & MD)...WOOD-MOR...WOOD/FM-beautiful music. WJEF-C&W...WMAX-MOR....WFUR-Religious...WFUR-FM-simulcast....WJFM/FM--C&W....WLAV/FMMOR...... WGRD/FM-simulcast.

RATINGS--April-May ARB shows WOOD (NBC, news, etc.) to be overall No. 1. WOOD/FM pulls strong enough to be rated second in the market. WGRD is third..... heavier in afternoon drive and nighttime. WJEF pulls fourth...stronger in mornings and midday (carrying Tigers baseball)....followed by WZZM/FM and WLAV.

# INTERVIEW WITH BOBBY COLUMBY - DRUMMER, BLOOD, SWEAT & TEARS

On one hand, everybody talks about how democratic the group is, on the other hand I've been told

you're the heart of the whole group.

I am an active member of the group...in any situation where you have a lot of people, there will always be some that are more passive, and others more on the side of....well more aggressive. And I quess I fall into the aggressive side. But as far as being a leader of the group, or the heart of the group, I don't think that I am at all.... because every decision has to be made by everyone. We all sit down and discuss it, because we're a 9 man operation in every sense of the word. I may have an idea about something, but I don't say "okay it's my idea, so we're going to do it.".....it involves 8 other people.

BEV: So everything is unanimous, eventually?

BC: Yes.

BEV: The latest album was a departure as far as more original material, are you planning more departures? BC: We are recording so far, I don't know what will happen in the end, ourselves with a symphonic

orchestra in New Orleans in November and we'll also record live at Philharmonic Hall in N.Y. And we haven't done any live recording yet. And we are the kind of band that should, in my opinion: the band can really play, and live should be as good as a record.

BEV: Then you're going into other fields of music?

BC: We're going to try other things. I think that the commercial end of the business anyway is really a good song....because you could conceivably take a studio band and find a decent singer and make a hit record if the song is good enough. So our band initially and still is not really a band that was formed with the idea of.... okay let's make a lot of bread, and a lot of hit records....because a 9 piece band is not as likely to make as much money. Anyway that's the way we started, that was out of the question, as far as money. It was just a fun venture and experimental, and as long as we keep trying to do something that is going to make the guys in the band happy, then I think that we're going in the right track, because you can't get a group on the stage and expect them to really perform with any kind of spirit, and the spirit of playing is very important....and you can't expect them to perform a song with any spirit if they don't like the song. So we're going to stick with the format of playing what we will enjoy playing, and also go in the direction of playing the best songs that we feel the band can do. If they are a commercial success....great, that will depend on the strength of the song. There was a hit record by James Taylor called "You've Got A Friend", and that is not a likely single...if I heard that I would think that most people would not choose that as a single....and yet because the song is so great and there's no question that that is a beautiful song, it became a tremendously accepted record.

BEV: Okay, you're not thinking first in terms of commercial success.

BC: No because I think that there is a way to be happy with your music and be very successful, and the key to that is to stick with great material, just do the best songs that you can do. And I think that's what our future will be.

BFV: Because you've had another gold album, but the single didn't go up very far in the charts, as you might have expected?

BC: Frankly that's the case where it was such an obvious single, and you've got a song like "You've Got A Friend" which was not such an obvious single, and one of them made it for a very good reason. I think that our last album was kind of an attempt from the band to do as much of their own material as possible....and this was kind of determined by the press, by a lot of people who said....since the band is very successful, it became a target for a lot of adverse criticism and since the band plays and performs well, that was kind of hard to put down....so what was the natural thing to hit on....well they're doing other people's material. That's kind of funny, because a lot of people seem to do that, along with their own....and I don't think that it's really so terrible. When our first album came out, we had about the same amount of other people's material as our third, yet our third was the one which got killed, by coincidence, after a great success. So after that, we kind of went the route of ... okay let's try and write our own material, and that was done. If we should do our own material again, great....I think that it really will be determined by the quality of the songs at this point. If it comes from the band, and if it's the best song of its kind, then we will definitely use that song.

BEV: Then each of you doing original things, doesn't mean that you might be thinking of going out on your own.

No, it was just understood at that time that that was the way we would go. A recommendation also by a man involved in producing by the name of Don Heckman...he was co-producer along with myself and Roy Hallee, and he urged us to try and do our own material. And he did a great job in that concern because a lot of songs came out of the group, where as you might not expect that many. Because the guys write well but not a lot....they're not able to sit down and say....okay I think I'll write five songs tonight, because I have to make an album. As far as guys going off and doing their own thing, our singer is doing his own album, and I am coproducing it with Joel Sill. For me it's a nice thing to do, because I respect David as a singer, I think that he's an excellent singer, and he's not limited because the band can do lots of things, but we don't have strings or girl singers or we don't have a Memphis type of a rhythm section and David on his own album will get a chance to do this. And Steve also, who's a writer-singer-guitar player, is going to do some things on his own, where he's going to have a lot of his own songs.

Usually when group members go off on their own, it gets harder to get back as a member of a group. BC: I don't think so, because in final analysis it's going to help the band. Because if Steve's album is a gigantic success and our album is successful that many more people will be interested in hearing a Blood, Sweat & Tears record. I don't think it was to help an ego to do it as much as a musical expression, in trying to go in other directions. If he wanted to leave the band he would have left the band, but he felt that because of the kind of business we're in, a person does not have to be totally divorced from one thing in order to do something else. If he gets tremendous success on the album and single, and then decides that.... I sure don't need these guys anymore, I'm going out on my own, I'm a star....I may be very wrong, but I doubt that he would do that, because again the band could play any of the songs.

# WKYX, PADUCAH, KY., ASSIGNMENT TO WKYX, INC., GRANTED BY FCC; HENDERSON, N.C., LICENSES ASSIGNED TO HENDERSON BROADCASTING COMPANY

An application for assignment of the license of station WKYX, Paducah, Ky., from Kicks of Kentucky, Inc., has been granted by the Commision (BAL-7277). Consideration was \$200,000 including a \$50,000 non-competitive agreement. The Commission also granted application for assignment of the licenses of stations WHNC-FM, Henderson, N.C., from Henderson Radio Corporation to Henderson Broadcasting Company (BAL-7315, BALH-1513). Selling price was \$349,295.30 including a \$66,000 noncompetitive agreement. WKYX, Inc., is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Bristol Broadcasting Company, Inc.

# WVLK, LEXINGTON, KY., ONE YEAR LICENSE RENEWAL PROPOSED IN INITIAL DECISION

Renewal of the license of Station WVLK, Lexington, Ky., for one year has been proposed in an Initial Decision by FCC Hearing Examiner Millard F. French. Bluegrass Broadcasting Co., Inc., is the station's licensee. The Examiner found that the licensee had not exercised the degree of responsibility over the operation of WVLK

that the Commission requires.

In an order released August 5, 1968, Bluegrass Broad-casting's application for license renewal for WVLK was designated for hearing on a number of issues including fraudulent billing of advertisers, commercial practices, misrepresentation or lack of candor, falsification of program logs, logging practices, and public service commitments. In subsequent actions, the FCC Review Board added an issue to permit consideration of the station's record of service to the community, and the Commission revised two issues to include determination of the licensee's responsibility for the management of the station, whether it is qualified to continue to be a licensee, and whether a grant of the license renewal would serve the public interest, convenience and necessity. The Commission denied Bluegrass Broadcasting's request for inclusion of a forfeiture issue.

# WBTH, WILLIAMSON, W. VA., NOTIFIED OF APP-ARANT LIABILITY FOR FORFEITURE OF \$2,000

Harvit Broadcasting Corporation, licensee of station WBTH, Williamson, W. Va., has been notified by the Commission that it has incurred an apparent liability for forfeiture in the amount of \$2,000 for willful or repeated violation of the rules and the terms of the station license by operating the station with power of one kilowatt prior to local sunrise and after local sunset.

# WTOP-FM, WASHINGTON, D.C., LICENSE ASSIGNMENT TO HOWARD UNIVERSITY APPROVED BY FCC; STATION DONATED

An application for assignment of the license of Station WTOP-FM, Washington, D.C., From Post-Newsweek Stations, Capital Area, Inc., to Howard University, has been granted by the FCC. The station was donated to Howard University.

Howard University plans to operate WTOP-FM as a commercial station. It will sell advertising, but proposes to broadcast no more than 15 minutes of commercial matter per hour.

# MY OWN THING

One of the most difficult tasks I face is trying to explain what happened at a Clinic...especially right after the meeting....I took the questions asked Monday through Wednesday and have printed them here along with my own answers....

Question....How was the Clinic?

Answer....For me it was personally the most incredible learning experience of my life. Not only the moments while the Clinic was going on...but, the weeks prior to the Clinic....at times they were full of joy....at other times literal hell. But, at the end I had learned more about myself....other people in this industry....and meetings as a whole. Mind you I am only speaking for myself....everybody experienced their own thing at this Clinic....and that's what I decided to do....leave everybody alone so they could grab their own trip. All I know is that I don't feel like the same person this week that I did last....maybe it's winter coming on.

Question...Did the Clinic live up to your expectations? Answer....That's another thing....I had no expecations. Each time I have had one of these things I made the mistake of trying to manipulate, so that I could see something come down. This time I just set up the program and let it ride. More than anything I want to see people in this industry feel the freedom of being able to tell themselves and their listeners the truth. How does one do this? I don't have the answer....that's why I didn't try to manipulate. I just asked people to come that I thought might be interesting to listen to. I do believe the problem of our world lies in the inability to communicate, I tried to gear it toward the problem.

Question....Did people learn how to communicate? Answer....Ask them....about them. As for me I learned and felt a new love and less of a fear of people than I have had. My lady and I sat Monday evening and had the most honest and the most freedom kind of conversation we've had in three years. But, how can I speak for people?

Question....A good many people didn't relate to Dr.

Harris....didn't this disappoint you?

Answer....Certainly the word is not disappoint. Since I operated with the attitude of no expectation of the people around me how could I be disappointed. A good many people left in the middle of Dr. Harris' discussion and I think this was for many reasons. First of all, some had to catch early airplanes to get back to Monday morning. Others listened and felt challenged.... maybe the word is frustrated because a cat who was a psychiatrist was in front of a group saying they looked a little sick and he had something for them. In this day of heavy drugs....heavy religion....heavy spirituality.... we have a tendency to put down the self helps we once believed in. Don't go see your pastor and forget about the psychiatrist who's probably as crazy as you are. But, the fact of the matter is, Dr. Harris' attitude is exactly one of doing his own thing. He believes in transactional analysis and everybody who knew what it was stayed and listened because they now believe in it. Those who didn't read the book....didn't understand.... that's why they felt their time was better spent at the coffee shop. But, that's okay....this is the first time a clinic ever ended with the room in tears with their arms wrapped around each other. Those who left didn't get to experience that....but, I can't put them down....they had their reasons. Nobody was poking anybody in the chest....if they felt that it was coming from their own prejudice....pre....judging.

Question .... You're into a lot of far out things like yoga, philosophy, psychology etc., don't you think you might be getting a little over peoples heads?

Answer....We talk about truth....telling the truth....the truth by whose standards. Am I so heavy that I can't share what I've learned with other people and they can't share it with me? What makes me think I'm so heavy that I would dare withhold part of myself when speaking to other people? The truth....the answer is not complicated....it's the most simple of all. That's why I particularly got into Transactional Analysis....to me it's the Let It Be...of human behavior. It's a simple way to understand yourself....and understanding yourself is the whole ball of wax when it comes down to communications.

Question....All in all how do you feel about the Clinic? Answer....Fantastic!

Because I've hesitated in categorizing or labeling my feelings about this past weekend, they somehow felt they were negative. No, No, No. Wayne Bryant of CHED summed it up the best, when he said that he would never be the same again. I don't know whether that means he's happy or satisfied, but if it means that everyone present at the top of that glorious mountain will be affected and changed....it's fantastic. It would have been naive to expect instant miracles, but the seeds of honest communication have all been planted, and they will shoot forth, and they will grow in the most unexpected places. Over 200 people have been touched, willingly or unwillingly and the most noise came from the tumbling down of protective shields. 
