KING SHOCKS SEATTLE; CHULKE AND BEAUTI-FUL MUSIC SKY ROCKET AS ARB'S COME OUT BELTSVILLE, MD.

JIM CHULKE IS ON HIS HONEYMOON THIS WEEK ..... SO WORD THAT HIS NAME IS BEING TOSSED AROUND THE IN-DUSTRY WILL BE NEWS TO HIM WHEN HE RETURNS. IN FACT AT THIS WRITING CHULKE HASN'T EVEN SEEN THE LA AND MIAMI BOOKS IN PARTICULAR ..... BUT, HE WILL .... AND IF HIS TREND CONTINUES A GROUP OF STATION OW-NERS MAY WELL TAKE UP A COLLECTION TO SEND HIM ON ANOTHER TRIP.....SAY MAYBE AROUND THE WORLD FOR A FEW YEARS. SCORES OF BOOKS HIT THE STREET THIS WEEK.....AND IN LOS ANGELES THERE WERE LITTLE SURPRISES EXCEPT FOR THE CONTINUED GROWTH OF KJOI.....AN FM'ER PROGRAMMED BY MR. CHULKE .....PUL-LING A SOLID THIRD IN THE MARKET....NO MATTER HOW YOU LOOK AT IT. IN MIAM! THE NUMBER ONE STATION IS ACTUALLY ALL SPANISH WFAB....BUT, MR CHULKE ...IN ENGLISH...HAS THE TOP RATED STATION...IN PHILLY IN LESS THAN A YEAR'S TIME HIS FM'ER WWSH PULLED SEVENTH PLACE AND IS ON A STEEP CLIMB THERE .... THERE IS LITTLE HOPE, HOWEVER, THAT CHULKE IS GO-ING TO REPLACE BILL DRAKE ..... ALL HIS STATIONS ARE BEAUTIFUL MUSIC.....PROGRAMMING AT LEAST 57 MIN. OF FAMILIAR SONGS.....STRING ORIENTED. MORE FROM CHULKE AFTER THE HONEYMOON IS OVER.

OUTSIDE OF BEAUTIFUL MUSIC THE BIG STORY HAS TO BE THE SEATTLE BOOK WHICH SHOWS KING IN A VIRTUAL OVERALL TIE WITH KJR. KING BEAT KJR AND KOL IN TOTAL MEN AND TOTAL WOMEN BUT, LOST TO BOTH OF THEM IN TEENS. SEVERAL BROADCASTERS OVER THE PAST MONTHS HAVE URGED US TO RECONSIDER PRINTING QUARTER HOUR SHARES.....STATING THAT AGENCIES WERE MORE CONCERNED WITH TOTAL PERSONS.....TOTAL SURVEY AREA. THIS IN ESSENCE IS THE AVERAGE NUMBER OF PERSONS LISTENING AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY IN A GIV-EN FIFTEEN MINUTE PERIOD. AFTER DISCUSSIONS WITH VARIOUS RATING SERVICES, TIME BUYERS AND OTHER PROGRAM DIRECTORS, IT IS APPARENT THAT THE MA-JORITY OF TIME BUYERS DO BUY FORM THE "TOTAL PERSONS" CATEGORY, SO THEREFORE WE WILL BEGIN THE POLICY OF PRINTING THOSE NUMBERS. THIS WILL MAKE A MARK ON BLACK RADIO STATIONS, WHO SEEM TO HAVE ALWAYS BEEN GIVEN THE BACK SEAT OF THE LICENSING BUS ..... BUT, WE'LL TRY TO TAKE INTO CON-SIDERATION IN REPORTING. THE FOLLOWING IS A LOOK AT VARIOUS MARKETS.....FIGURES ARE IN HUNDREDS...

LOS ANGELES.....All-news KABC leads the pack overall with KHJ coming in second place and KJOI third. KGBS improved ratings, pulling a 350 overall (share 3.1....Bill Ballance (with his Feminine Forum) grabbed a 665 or 4.8 share in midday.....that was good enough for fourth in the market. That 350 total is up from a 276 in the July/August book and a 233 in the April/May. KLOS likewise moved up.....from a 57 to 172. KRLA dropped from 486 to 343 in this book. KDAY went from 173 to 151.....or in shares from 1.6 to 1.4. KHJ pulled up almost exactly the same as last book and KKDJ likewise was almost identical as their last book.

BOSTON.....WBZ is the number one station in town, followed by WHDH and then WRKO.....followed by WEEI.....WJIB-FM.....WMEX and WBCN.....As in L.A. beautiful music WJIB-FM grabbed off super heavy ratings .....they are by far the top station in midday.....(840 to WBZ's 610).....WBZ wins in every time segment.....scoring especially heavy in the morning and pulling an 800 at night with sports. WRKO leads WMEX in all time segments....finally pulling them 550 total to WMEX's 340. MIAMI.....Five radio stations place in the ratings before any rocker hits the scene. WFAB all Spanish is the leading station....then WLYF (Chulke) 276....followed by WIOD (250)....WGBS (200) and then WQAM (161) .....WMYQ follows them with 136.....then WFUN with 90 and WINZ with a 69. WQAM dropped almost 50 per cent this time around (from 334 last book to 161 this book)....only WMYQ (of the rockers) went up. They had a 99 last book....now, pulling a 136. In the Metro survey.....both WFUN and WINZ look better. WQAM had a 5.8 to WFUN's 5.5....WMYQ's 4.0 and WINZ 2.2. But, that again was behind an all Spanish, a beautiful music and two MOR's.

CINCINNATI.....WLW pulled heaviest ratings here taking on a 442 overall.....followed by WSAI's 353 and WKRC's 289. WONE comes in after them.....then WCKY..... WHIO-FM. WKRC leads in mornings.....WLW in midday and at night and WSAI in afternoon drive.

BALTIMORE.....WBAL is the leader in this market with a 480.....followed by WCAO with a 396.....WCBM has a 312.....WITH has a 221.....WFBR 200.....WLIF 185.....WSID 135.....WWIN 129.....WPGC moves in from Washington with a 127.....WLPL has 104.....WBAL leads in each time segment except at night.....WCAO winning there with WCBM second.

CHICAGO.....WLS took top honors in the city.....one of the few places where a top forty station wins the number one spot. They have 1760 followed by WGN with 1515 and WAIT with 918....WBBM with 801.....then WCFL with 773.....Next comes WJJD.....WMAQ..WVON..WNUS WWEL and WFMF.....Only figures available were the total for total survey area.

SEATTLE.....One of the more interesting books...KOMO is the leading station in town with 342.....second is KVI with 286.....KJR with 193.....KING has 189.....KIRO 179 .....KOL 151.....KIXI-FM (sweet music) 119...KTAC 107......KIXI 101.....KAYO 98 and KYAC 23....KING beat KJR in total men (70-59) and total women (68-61 but lost in teens (73-51). Midday is where KING shows strongest.....they beat KJR 221 to 136.....KJR took all

other time segments but, they were close. 6-10am, KING 234.....KJR 257.....3-7pm, KING 239.....KJR 272....... Nights, KING 124.....KJR 148. Night time ratings show KOL Leading both KJR and KING with a 149.

HOUSTON.....There's not much to say about this book except KILT. They pulled a 316 overall, compared to second place KTRH with a 301.....followed by KULF 202.....a good increase for them.....KIKK had 177..... KXYZ 171.....KYOK 159.....KNUZ 152.....KAUM 112 .....KPRC 109.....KYND 108....KODA 100....KTRH actually leads in all time segments except afternoon drive.....all of the segments being close.

ATLANTA.....As usual it's WSB two to one over anybody else in the market. They grab an overall 456 as compared to 207 for WQXI....WPLO is third with 176.... then WRNG with a 138.....

DENVER.....While KTLK improved in quarter hour shares they actually dropped in total persons from an 84 in last book to a 52 in this one. KIMN on the other hand dropped a bit.....in quarter hour share from a 14.9 to a 12.2.....and went down a little in total persons with a 288 in last book to a 261 in this one. KIMN is still the number one station in Denver followed by KOA with 207....KHOW with 150....KLZ 136....KBTR 111 .....KOSI 109.....KLIR 94.....KLAK 85 then KTLK with 84.....KLZ-FM had a 49.....

WASHINGTON.....WMAL leads out with a strong 544.... then WGAY and WOL tie wtih a 237.....WPGC is next with 223....pulling strongest numbers on their FM.... WTOP follows 231.....WJMO was 190.....WASH 166..... WRC 144.....WOOK 142.....WWDC 130.....WEAM 124. In shares it was WPGC 5.4 and WEAM grabbed a 3.5..... that WPGC number is a combined AM and FM trip..... they're simulcast. WCAO also pulled a 101 in this market. **DETROIT.....CKLW** is the leading station in this city barely edging out WJR 1257 to 1249...WWJ follows with 398....WJLB with 393....WWJ-FM with 350....WQTE with 345.....234 for WDEE.....thenWCHB with 184. pulls a 131 to WCAR's 152. Quarter hour shares are not available....WKNR having a signal problem in some areas of the city must look better in the metro than the total. CLEVELAND.....This book is super far out.....WKYC is the number one station in town with a 315 total....they also won in the Metro with an 8.8. Second place went to WGAR, who pulled a 245....followed closely by CKLW with a 247 and then WIXY with a 234....In the Metro WGAR had a 7.1....CKLW a 4.0 and WIXY an 8.6. These stations were followed by WDOK.....WERE ...WJMO....WHK....WDBN....WMMS....WSLR and WNCR. SAN FRANCISCO.....KGO barely edged out KFRC for number one honors in the Bay area....KGO 534, KFRC 531....KCBS 517.....then KSFO with 470 and KABL 355 .....followed by KYA 324.....other interesting overalls included KDIA 171....KFOG 241....KLOL 285....KKHI 114....KNBR 229....KNEW 202....KSAN 101....KSFX 46....KBAY 236....KRAK 235....KSJO 83....

#### CONSENSUS:

Most interesting are the beautiful music formats numbers in almost every market. All news usually scores extreme—ly heavy and MOR's are in the running. Very few markets anymore show a top forty station with the number one ratings, although in most markets a rocker still figures in the top three.

#### WASHINGTON

WPGC is running a contest giving listeners an opportunity to call whoever they wish on Christmas day. The winner will have their call placed for them by World Famous Telephone Operator Lily Tomlin.

#### TORONTO

As time nears for the second step of the CRTC's plan to help Canadian music it's obvious that a good many Canadian broadcasters are getting nervous. Next month stations will have to have two of the four requirements prescribed by the CRTC rather than one as it has been all this year. The four requirements include.....Canadian wrote the music.....Canadian wrote the lyrics.....record was produced in Canada....or the artist is Canadian. The RIAA has stated that an average of 144 records are released in the United States .... statistics show that 7.7 new records are released in Canada each week....and of these only 5.5 would qualify as contrmporary product. In top 100 record lists put together by CKLW.....only 13 were qualifiers for Canada and a similar list at CHUM showed only 8 Canadian hits in the top 100. CHUM also has an oldie file of about 100 Canadian content music ...and officials there told the Report office that they had received listener complaints at the repitition of these and other Canadian artists. Fully five of fifteen records in a given hour must qualify Canadian.

#### ANN ARBOR, MICHIGAN

More than 13,000 young people jammed an Ann Arbor, Michigan auditorium Friday night to listen to rock stars perform and to radical leaders calling for the release of John Si nclair from prison. John Lennon and Yoko Ono entertained the overflow throng with four new songs..... including one entitled "Free John Sinclair." Others who addressed the eight-and-a-half hour rally included Bobby Seale, Jerry Rubin, Leslie Bacon, Rennie Davis and David Dellinger. David Fenton of the Rainbow People's Party, sponsor of the event, said: "I've never seen so much dope smoked in one place." He said that spectators literally were breaking open pounds of marijuana, were rolling joints, and were passing them around to anyone in the audience who showed the slightest interest in taking a toke. Sinclair, who is presently locked up in Jackson State Prison in Michigan, was able to listen to the benefit concert which was carried live over station WABX-FM in Detroit. Sinclair was permitted to make a 15 minute phone call to the rally, and he broke into tears as he confessed at one point that he did "not know what to say." Sinclair, the chairman of the Rainbow People's Party, is serving a 9½ year prison sentence after being busted for possessing two joints of marijuana. His conviction is presently being reviewed by the Michigan Supreme Court. Earth News

#### JOHN SINCLAIR....afternote

John Sinclair was freed from prison Monday afternoon after spending 28 months in a jail cell. Sinclair, the chairman of the Rainbow People's Party, was set free after the Michigan State Supreme Court set an appearance bond of \$2,500 in return for his release. The court announced that it was reversing an earlier decision which denied Sinclair bond because of a bill which has been passed by the Michigan state legislature; the new bill proposes that the maximum penalty for marijuana posession in Michigan be 90 days in jail.

Republican Presidential candidate Pete McCloskey has called on the United States government to recognize Bangla Desh as a new and independent nation. McCloskey insisted that the United States "should follow its anticolonial heritage and recognize Bangla Desh. "Earth News

In the letter Dean informed the Report that the FM penetration for the city is 89 per cent.....(according to the latest survey.....source of survey not given).....

#### LOS ANGELES

KDAY on the first day of the release of the Bangla-Desh album procurred the services of Phil Spector for a three hour show, explaining and commenting on the various cuts. PD Wilson hasn't said whether a tape dub is for sale as yet.....



JACKSONVILLE——Market rank - 64th. Population -536,200. 22% Black.

**ECONOMY** – Located in northeast Florida....near the Georgia border. The city is most important as a port (50th largest in the world). 11,000,000 tons of goods are shipped each year by some 130 steamship lines. The port is also the entry point for foreign automobiles. The Navy has several bases here.....including Camp Blanding, Cecil Field Naval Air Station, and Mayport which docks the largest carriers in the world. Beer brewing, paper manufacturing, and freight companies, are also major influences on the economy. Anhauser Busch, St. Regis Paper Company, and Seaboard Coastline Freight are the primary companies in these lines. Prudential Insurance is located here, along with Gulf Life, Independent Life, Peninsular Life, and Afro American Insurance, making Jacksonville "the insurance center of the South." Saltwater fishing is the most popular sport. There are many marinas and residences on the waterfront. Jacksonville State University is located here with 4,400 students. Jacksonville University (2,000), Florida Junior College (5,000), Jones Business College (has a broadcast school), Edward Waters College (1,000), are also located here. **PEOPLE** – Old conservatism predominates here. Voting is heavily Democratic....and Southern Babtists control this part of the "Bible Belt". Bussing is the major issue. An illegal mandate was just responsible for voting down the issue in a special referendum...which was immediately repealed. Student governments have been criticized for displaying rebel flags....and are meeting now in an attempt toquellthe local racial violence. Longhairs are concentrated mostly in the beach areas....and are hassled a good deal when outside the city limits.....(Easy Rider was filmed 60 miles from here).

COST OF LIVING - Low....a one-bedroom furnished apartment will cost about \$125. Food and gas are moderate. Jock salaries in the market range from \$125 to \$250 per week. Average salary for a top forty jock will be about \$190.

WEATHER - Florida....warm all year round.....temperatures below freezing are abnormal. Summers are warm and humid with rain every afternoon.

COLUMBUS, OHIO - Market rank - 36th. Population, 932,400. 18% Black.

**ECONOMY** - City is the Capital of Ohio....located in the center of the state....on the Scioto River....middway between Cleveland (northeast) and Cincinnati (southwest)....and is larger in square miles than either of these. Industry is diversified here with many important manufacturing activities.....most important being aricraft machinery, paper, food and chemicals, and telephone equipment. North American Aviation is located here along with Western Electric, Sears, and Borden Industries..... which has just bought out the BBF Hamburger chain (a five-state company). City is the home of Nationwide Insurance, RFI Insurance, and Midland Mutual....also a major factor in the economy. John Deere is the major grainery in the area and Columbus Coated Fabrics has its home here too. State government offices also employ a good number of the population. Ohio State University, 9th largest in the country, has 46,000 students and an extremely popular football team — the Ohio State Buckeyes. Other schools include Capital University (1,600) .....Ohio Dominican (800).....Ohio Wesleyan (2500)..... and Otterbeis (1350) - the first coed college.

**PEOPLE** — The city is a Republican stronghold and, therefore, very conservative. There are abundant longhairs in the North end of town.....the University area ....but these are counterbalanced by the factory workers who come primarily from Kentucky and West Virginia ....in the West and South part of town. The blacks in the city are not concentrated in one pocket or ghetto area.... and therefore have fewer riots than in comparable cities. There are many new office buildings downtown....but there is much less pollution here than in Cleveland or Cincinnati.

COST OF LIVING - Prices are moderate. A one-bedroom apartment, furnished, will cost about \$145. Gas and food prices are about standard. Ohio has been one of the less-heavily taxed states until now....but there is a new state income tax. Jock salaries are in the range of \$500 to \$850 per month. The average salary for a top forty jock is \$700 per month.

WEATHER - Winters are snowy, summers are mild and not too humid.....temperatures seldom go above the 80's. The general topography is very flat.

An afternoon at the home of Ravi Shankar.....

BOB: You read bits and pieces about Bangla-Desh..... Can you tell me about it?

RAVI: It's such a great problem....the technicalities you really read everywhere. That I don't have to say.....it's a very complicated affair.....but, it's a very simple affair. A set of people who want freedom.....who live in a country which is a thousand miles away. They feel that they've been treated like a colony....instead of the same .....equal. These people are Moslem by religion, which is the state religion. Pakistan is a religious state....it's not a democratic state like India for instance. So they speak the language Bengali.....the part that's in India is known as Eastern Bengal.....and the part that's in Pakistan is known as Eastern Pakistan....many people call it East Bengal. So, that's the area of maximum population ....East Pakistan. They want their independence.....this has been going on for a long time. Where we came into this picture...is that after they had problems there, people started coming to India as refugees.....and that's why we became involved....apart from the feeling that that's my original ancestery....many of my folks have come over from there....some have been killed....some have come to Calcutta. At the same time being an artist and not being a politician....going with banners..... I can't do that. The only thing we felt we could be helpful in doing is as much as we can for ten million refugees. They're in bad condition.....they're sick.... there're epidemics ...we have tried to raise as much as we could, but that's spent in about five hours.....I hope the record.....and the film also will help.....

BOB: In your movie Raga you got into Yoga a great deal....seems that it is becoming more and more important in this country.....although there are not that many places that you can find out about it.....I'd love to be in India....

RAVI: That's very true, to go to India....many of the young people today go to India....and they have taken the road which has been pre-conceived and fixed for them....through Hash....other drugs....it's only an exchange for Haight Ashbury.....or the Village....unfortunately they don't really find much....and they become disillusioned. I'm saying the average. I'm not saying everyone....there might be a few who are really out of that. Unfortunately the majority.....what they are seeking.....they never go to some wise people.....and there are plenty of people....but, they are not sitting on the street with beard and everything.....the people who exploit..... that's who they go to and that's very sad.

BOB: Where do you go?

RAVI: The minute you are out of this....you find it out .....moment you are in the circle of people who stay together....they have communes there also. People addicted to drug.....they are ridiculed.....I know a number of people who go to friends and they find the people they are searching for....they are not hard to find. You don't have to go to the Himalyan Mountains.....some married people....some family people....very much enlightened. There are some that are well known....there are a number of many many others which are not so well known.

BOB: The word Guru means teacher.....

RAVI: Technically yes....but, it is much more deeper than that....it's master.....the percepter.....the person who takes a lot of money form you and teaches you the techniques.....they are teachers.....they're not really Gurus. But, those who we call Gurus are much deeper than that

.....they don't only pass along the form of art.....but, it's almost on a religious level....a spiritual level.

BOB: When you said.....this is my music Guru....you meant music teacher.....but, more than music teacher..... RAVI: Yes, difinitely. You see to me....Baba.....belongs to a very sort of old school....very full of principals.....to which there is no compromise....to whom music is a religion....he's a Moslem, by the way,.....but it doesn't matter because he believes in the old scriptures that go along with music. When I went to learn from him I was surprised because he said all those things which is very typical to our faith....the Hindu faith.....that sound is "God" ....and it is not meant for prostituting yourself just to earn money but, it is something that is for the salvation of the souls.....it can bring so much peace.....and is connected with yoga. I was surprised because it's very rare that you find a man with Moslem religion along with these sort of principals. And then.... I really learned a lot from him....in the sense of the depth....the spiritual quality of our music, which you don't find from other people to that extent. It is there all the time, but I don't think that all musicians have that approach. BOB: How did he teach you....you actually lived in the house with him?

RAVI: I lived next to his house....and later on with him. In the begining I had to go through all the technicalities ....kind of like the Western classical music....learn the scales.....practice scales.....all the fingerings.....a lot of fixed excercise .....fixed music.....I had to memorize them....not write them down....that makes it even better because you don't depend on your eyes .... it gets into your system. In the beginning it was not very interesting. A lot of frustration. After a year and a half or two years I started to get into something else which was satisfying. In the beginning the training was very little .....he had little to give.....I had to give more.....,but more and more length of duration of his teaching became more when I could take everything. So after a period it really opened up....and then it was not worrying about what the taking was he was like an ocean....teaching.... mostly singing....and we follow. Vocal music is the basis of our music....it's the source....even when we teach our children....we sing.....

#### VILLARES, SWITZERLAND

Dr. Timothy Leary continues to live in complete freedom in the Swiss village of Villares.....and it now appears that he will not have to face extradition hearings which could have forced his return to prison in the U.S. Leary's attorney Michael Kennedy, who is presently staying with Leary in Switzerland, has reported that Leary will likely remain free in Switzerland "unless he causes the Swiss government any trouble". Kennedy said that the Swiss government seemed to oppose starting any extradition proceedings as long as Leary and his wife Rosemary remained law-abiding citizens. Leary was arrested and jailed in Switzerland earlier this year....and is currently out of jail on \$18,000 bond. Several extradition hearings against him were scheduled during September and October, but each of those hearings was postponed with the permission of the Swiss Government. If Leary is ever extradited to the United States, he would be re turned to the prison from which he escaped; he had been imprisoned on charges of possessing marijuana. Earth News

## NEW ORLEANS, LA., WJMR (AM & FM), ASSIGNMENT OF LICENSES GRANTED BY FCC.

An application for assignment of the license of station WJMR (AM & FM), New Orleans, La., from Summit Broadcasting Company, Inc., to Security Broadcasting, Inc., has been granted by the Commission.

#### BROADCAST COMPLAINTS DECREASED IN OCT.

A total of 1,50l complaints from the public were received by the FCC during the month of October, a decrease of 34 from the month of September. Other comments and inquiries totaled 1,572, an increase of 130 over the previous month. The Commission sent 1,230 letters in response to comments, inquiries and complaints.

#### WINF, MANCHESTER, CONN., APPARENTLY LI-ABLE FOR \$1,000 FORFEITURE

National Media Corporation, licensee of WINF, Manchester, Conn., has been notified by the Commission that it has incurred an apparent liability for forfeiture in the amount of \$1,000 for willful or repeated operation of the station by an unlicensed person in violation of the rules, also over power operation and failure to make logging entries. The licensee attributed most of the violations to actions of its former chief engineer and its former general manager. The licensee also noted that it had only owned the station for seven months prior to the inspection; that this was the first station it has ever owned; that corrective action has been taken for most of the violations; that procedrues have been established to prevent recurrence of the violations, and that the violations were procedural rather than intentional. licensee added that the chief engineer and the general manager, it alleged were responsible for most of the vio-lations, have been replaced. The Commission said that even though many of the violations could be attributed to the station manager and chief engineer, licensees are responsible for the acts of their employees and for assuring that stations are being operated in accordance with Commission rules.

### WRS-FM, BAYAMON, P.R., ORDERED TO FORFEIT \$1,000 FOR RULE VIOLATIONS

Radio San Juan, Inc., licensee of WRSJ-FM, Bayamon, P.R., has been ordered by the Commission to forfeit \$1,000 for repeated violations of the rules by failing to maintain the center frequency of the station within 2,000 cycles per second of the assigned center frequency. Radio San Juan had requested that the forfeiture either be rescinded or reduced, because of equipment and financial problems. The Commission said it had considered the financial condition of the station at the time the forfeiture was assessed. The licensee had 30 days to apply for remission or mitigation.

#### KNOW THE PROS

Edward Windsor Wright is as the years go still a young man and his youthful appearence is deceiving. During the course of a year Ed attends acores of banquets conferences and conventions attended by representatives of the broadcasting industry. To most his is just another face in the crowd. Only a few of the older pros in the industry are aware of and appreciate his knowledge of the business and the personal impact he has had on contrmporary radio.

Ed Wright now head of his own Los Angeles public relations firm, actually iniated what is presently known as Black Format Radio. We are not calling him the father of it all. That description would have to go to the leader, the late Jim Randolph who, in the early 1960's at WYNR Radio in Chicago, gained widespread recognition as originator of Black Format Radio. What is not generally known is that Ed Wright had been developing the format before Jim but in a smaller market in Cincinnati, Ohio at WCIN.

Jim Randolph was the super professional who moved into the windy city from a McClendon station in Dallas, Texas where he was a Top 40-Jock. Randolph helped set up WYNR with his new format and completely captured the market for a brief period of time until the station softened their sound. WVON came on like gang busters playing black oriented music and became the leading black station in the area simply, because in our opinion, WYNR softened it's format (in an attempt to capture more of the market) and consequently forgot from whence they came, WVON didn't.

When Jim left WUNR he moved over to WVON for a brief period, then left for the West Coast and station KGFJ in Los Angeles. Jim Randolph learned all of the trials and tribulations of the broadcasting industry form the master McClendon who at that time counter programming, counter contesting and literally buying the markets in his efforts to be known as number one. Jim Randolph learned his lessons well and applied them wherever he went in radio.

Ed Wright was at that time known as the young genius because at the time he was (we are not sure 19,20, or 21)in Cincinnati at WCIN under the leadership of Chuck Scruggs and Jack Gibson. Larry Dean had given Wright his initial start when Ed was 13-years old, and Ed immediately moved to the fore as a teenage air personality. Incidentally, Larry Dean, at another station gave me my first air job, although I had been an engineer at the station prior to going on the air.

Jack Gibson left WCIN for Cleveland and WABQ where one of his first acts was to call Ed Wright to join him as production director. It was at ABQ that Ed wrote the book on production for Black Format Radio.

Even back in 1962, as a very young man, Ed Wright was the type guy that communicated with everyone who had knowledge of the industry. He and Jim Randolph used to talk constantly on the phone, exchanging ideas, theories and philosophies. He used to sit with his staff rapping on the future of radio. In fact Brother Wright is the man who taught me Black Format Radio. Prior to his taking me under his wing, I had been strictly a Jazz Jock. In 1963 the Tiger Format he had refined from his days at WCIN was refined again and became a true monster under his direction.

Ed, always a man with an eye for business and progress, decided to branch out. In 1966 he was elected to NATRA, resigned the presidency of the Air Personality's Organization to migrat to California where he became general manager of the Minit Label for Liberty Records. In 1968 Ed left the Liberty Records Company to form his own public relations organization which he has, in typical fashion, developed into a tremendous success.

#### DOUG EASON

An estimated three hundred persons representing all facets of Radio, Television, and the Recording Industry flocked to St. Louis last weekend to pay a well deserved tribute to one of the real professionals in the broadcast industry.....Doug Eason, VP and general manager of station KATZ Radio.

Doug Eason is one of the first black vice presidents and general managers of a major market station who really has the power to back his decisions and who was not put up to his administrative position as a token move to placate black listeners.




