





GIVE US ALL YOUR TITLES, BOTH IN AND OUT OF POWER96.

That's not fair man. You're gonna make me look like I never sleep.

WELL, THAT'S PRETTY MUCH TRUE, ISN'T IT?

I've been a power mixer for six years at POWER96, but it's been about nine years since I've been mixing on the radio. I'm also an on-air jock at the station.

YOU'RE GETTING A CHANCE TO NOT ONLY MIX ON THE AIR, BUT YOU'RE TALKING TO THE LISTENERS, TO ENABLE YOU TO VIBE OFF OF WHAT'S HAPPENING MUSICALLY MORE THAN JUST DOING A MIX SHOW.

One of the things that enabled me to get the opportunity to have an onair shift was the fact that I would go ahead and talk about a record even though I wasn't supposed to be on a microphone and I did it in such a way that it was a natural thing. I was inspired by Red Alert in New York. Many, many years ago I heard him Yo, I'm going to be going to this sav. club," and I almost ran off the road. So with that in mind I came back home to Miami and I took it a step further. Before going on the air I'd talk about records I had coming up, after I finished my show I'd talk about where I was going and then somewhere in between if I had a record that I was playing that wasn't in rotation I'd walk into the control room and if the DJ wasn't in there, I kind of snuck up on the mic and said, "POWER96, brand new music from whoever," and that kind of instilled a little courage in some of the other mixers and the next thing you knew every mixer was getting on the mic and they created what was called a "Power Mixer Hour" because Funk E., my PD said yes, you guys always want to be on the mic, let's see what you've got. And they gave us an hour where we switched positions with the on-air DJ.

FUNK E. FRANK WALSH, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN.

Funk E. is progressive. He's like Ricky Leigh. You give him a seed and it turns into a whole forest. That's what happened with that and we did the Power Mixer hour and it ended up happening around the time that we were short an on-air jock. That showcased what I could do and Frank already knew that I had experience on the air because a few years before that I had an interesting adventure. I was a power mixer on POWER96, I was also Keith Isley, an on-air jock on WEDR which is the R&B station, but Keith Isley the real name belonged to the program director of HOT105, who was the direct competitor of 'EDR. These two were going viciously head to head and here I come along. The reason why I was able to do that is because I've never really let the politics of this business control who I am. Even though I worked at POWER96 I got along with everybody within the industry. The program director at the time; Tanner had a meeting with Jerry Rush the program director from 'EDR and they said yes, Mohamed could pull this off and I did it.

MOHAMED MORETTA, THE RECORD PRODUCER. WHAT DOES THAT ENTAIL? HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN DOING IT?...

I started in 1982. My first gig was the remix concept for Get Down On It by Kool And The Gang. I realized at that point that that's where my heart would really be at. The first record I ever produced that ended up getting me on the map was a group out of Miami when the whole Miami Sound thing was starting, called Sequel, She Don't Want You on Capitol. It ended up coming off a little label called Joey Boy Records and ironically that record outsold the entire album. They had a single that was all over the radio, but wasn't selling. Joey Boy offered me money to do a remix, but I turned it down and I asked to produce a single instead. they laughed at me since I had never produced a record before. I told them to call me back when they were serious; and ironically they did; and gave me my first opportunity to actually make a

POOL...TALK ABOUT THE BENEFIT.

It's like a producer who started as a DJ that stopped playing in the clubs. I didn't want to be a victim of that. It doesn't mean that to be the best producer you have to be a DJ. There's a certain unmistakable and undeniable vibe that comes from getting a reaction from the dance floor that only a DJ can understand. For years we've been trying to influence radio and with the mix show thing happening now, I think a lot of programmers are realizing what we're all about. A record pool, although it's the lowest form of promotion on the totem pole, many of us pool directors around the country try to stay in the game and show how important we are, everybody knows. The industry knows that this is definitely a vibe. It's like you can find out if a record is real by giving it to different aspects of the industry and the record pool is just a great barometer. For me, I come like only once or twice a week, I spend a few hours here. Within those two or three hours, I feel I can walk out of here knowing more about what's happening than some people that are sitting in some ivory tower somewhere that aren't in touch. So my answer to that is I want to stay in touch because I don't want to turn around and all of a sudden become a successful producer who's not in touch, who throws a record out there and people go, wow man, I remember when Mohamed was in the cutting edge. There's the word "sell out" that's



record. I had all these things in my head and it was a chance to get it out there. Eventually I realized I could only go so far just doing stuff for other people. As a re-mixer you're not going to make money off of publishing, you're usually not going to get points, you sure won't get management. There are so many aspects of the business that DJ's don't benefit in, but contribute to. I wanted to explore them. I think about music all the time, but not only from an artistic point of view. In my experience I've found that when people are used to you doing a certain thing, they are sometimes reluctant to let you move forward, especially if you're an asset to them. I've tried to keep my chips in place with club appearances, the radio mix show, and on the air as a DJ. Hey mon, I got many jobs.

LAST, BUT NOT LEAST, YOU OWN HITZ MUSIC RECORD used because a lot of times you've got to make a record that's going to be mostly for radio and of course, not everything is going to work acrossthe-board, but keeping in touch is the most important thing to me and that's why I do the different things that I do in order to stay in touch.

NAME THE GUYS THAT YOU DO THE MIX SHOW WITH AT POWER96 WHO ARE ALSO MEMBERS OF YOUR POOL AND HOW YOU GOT INVOLVED.

Starting with D.J. Laz, Felix Sama, Eddie Mixx, Dancin' Danny B., Diego D., George Perez, Raymond Hernandez, and Johnny Caride...Phil Jones is the only power mixer that is not in the pool. He was one of the first members of the Flamingo Record Pool for many years, but we definitely stay in touch with Phil as far as picking his brains, seeing what he's



on...A guy named Tony Perez asked me to buy a pool one time and I had no idea what it was. My goal was to become a Billboard reporter. They passed a rule back then that said if you were a pool director, you couldn't be a Billboard reporter, so I had to make a choice. Once I became a pool director and I bought Star Town's Record Pool I realized this was no longer just fun and games it was a competitive, cutthroat business where X amount of records come into a marketplace and people do what they've got to do to get the service and get it to their DJs. So I took a long look at the business. I was already on the radio and that's how I started my quest in the record pool business. I said to the record people I understand that I don't have any Billboard reporters, but every time you give me a record I'm exposing it to half a million people; and by the way, I've got three or four other guys that are doing the same thing. That caught on very quickly, and this is before the radio mix show promotion game even started and I did it because it was business. That was my niche in the marketplace. With that in mind over the years I moved forward and eventually I bought the Florida Record Pool, from which Hitz came about, combining Star Sounds and Florida Record Pool, Then I trimmed the total membership which was 220 members down to 100, which no one else has done as far as I know in the country.

SO THROUGH HITZ RECORD POOL YOU GUYS ARE A MAJOR INFLUENCE AT THE STREET LEVEL IN THE CLUBS AS WELL AS ON THE RADIO...

When a record is just sent to a radio station, usually the DJs who do the mix shows come on at night, therefore the music department is open from 9-5 so the records pile up and we pick them up whenever we can, but by having them in the record pool it does two things. It reinforces certain records that might be sent to the mixer directly to the radio station, but we have a platform where we can rub shoulders and we talk about records that come into the pool. We give them priorities that are working so it's a sense of promotion that we also do



through the pool to the mixers and our ulterior motives are different because we're family. We're a team, whereas an individual record company they're going to be pushing their particular product and saying this is the greatest record that's ever been released, but when it comes from us it gives it a different perspective.

WHAT DO YOU THINK CURRENTLY IS THE MIS-UNDERSTANDING WITHIN THE INDUSTRY ABOUT RECORD POOLS AND HOW CAN WE TURN THAT AROUND?

By making record company execs understand that just because we do not get paid to promote their records, we should not be viewed as dispensible. We <u>are</u> an asset to the big picture. An integral part of the risk one takes when they release an artist. As important as the independent promoters who <u>do</u> get paid. I speak on behalf of all effective pool directors in the country. You are <u>not</u> wasting records by properly servicing us. Cut back on the real areas of waste. It's a misconception that a service that is free, has no value. Bifooyaka!

TELL US WHAT'S GOING ON MUSICALLY IN MIAMI.

Well, I think Tag Team and records like Whoomp! There It Is and Dazzy Duks in the last year and a half have made the industry take notice, Luke for example was always being categorized as a guy who only sold in the Southeast. The southern hub many retailers know about. Atlanta, the Carolinas, Florida which, don't get me wrong, that's a major part of sales for those type of records but most of those records were shut out and they weren't given the opportunity just like Rap many years ago wasn't given the opportunity at radio and look what's happening with that. Look what's happening with R&B. The actual sound of Miami has been known as the bass sound or even dance music in the mid-'80s with Sequel and Expose, that's another part of the Miami sound. You've got Miami Sound Machine, but what I'm really saying is opportunity is all any city needs that has good music. Chicago with commercial house, with underground has all types of music coming out of there. Given the opportunity at radio and I keep going back to radio because let's face it, the masses listen to radio. A lot of people have never been into a club in their lives, but they turn on that radio and given the opportunity programmers having an open mind will let records like a Tag Team sell millions of records. Whoomp! There It Is tell me I'm wrong, but that's got to be like the most famous words that came out last year. If Johnny Carson was on the Tonight Show I'm sure he'd be going Whoomp! There It Is, so ... Am I right? When I do guest spots, I try and get out of the country whenever possible I'm like the token American DJ in Jamaica for example. They fly me out once a year, I did their Independence in Ocho Rios. Five thousand people came out to party with an open mind, even though they are a tough crowd to please. Many DJ's who have spun in other countries can attest to the fact that foreigners don't categorize as

much as Americans do, especially American radio. They are hungry for music. They sing along to all the words and can't even speak English. We need to be more childlike in our approach to music and not automatically categorize it. Next time you hear a bass record clocking at 140 BPM's, remember that it can also be played on a radio station that plays say Jeru The Damaja. There is room for all kinds of Rap music. It's either good music or it's not. Let the audience decide. Give them at least the opportunity. I think it needs to happen, that people need to listen to music and say is it good or is it not good.

DO'S AND DON'TS FOR RECORD PROMOTION WITH MOHAMED MORETTA.

You've got people that are doing record promotions that never went to a nightclub or don't go to clubs or don't go to the radio. They aren't in touch. And that's a certain category of promoter that you deal with in a certain way because you know they're going to throw records at you and they're going to give you a list of stations playing it. Then you've got the other type of promoter who is somehow involved in the business. whether they were a DJ before they got the gig or they were at retail, they have some type of background that they can relay their information as far as what the company requires of them but then they also put their heart into it or they'll say Mohamed, I know the type of records that you break out-ofthe-box. This might not be a record that you would gravitate to out-of-thebox, but give it a shot. I think it'll

mean that you've got to promote a record for two years, but give it a shot. Give it the opportunity before you say you're over this record, we're promoting this one now. There are people that make records from the artists, to the managers to the engineers. They've got to feed their families with this stuff and a lot of times they don't get my perspective. They can't relate because I'm there. I know what it's like when a record is no longer a priority within a company. It's a sad situation. We're talking, even if they spent \$200,000 on the album, it's like we're not working that record any more. Next. That's sad. Good records lose out because of politics and I think what has happened there's people like myself that are in the position to break a record, got to turn around and say look. I know it's not your priority man but people want this record. It's working and at least give it the opportunity.

TALK ABOUT WHERE YOU'RE AT AND WHAT YOU'RE GOING TO DO IN THIS BUSINESS.

I'm not trying to reinvent the wheel, but what I'm trying to do is be a part of the wheel. I just got a label deal on POLYGRAM Records called Boom and by not reinventing the wheel I'm learning from others and of course I'm putting my flavor into it as far as the way I handle my business. I've got to give props to Eddie O'Lochlin. Eddie O is the first guy to give me a production deal and that's how I ended up hooking up with Eric Kupper about seven years ago through a mutual friend of ours named Chuck Nunez, may he rest in peace. Even if I talk to Eddie once a

work for you and they might be able to tell you a few other people that are playing it and not to say, well so and so is playing it, how come you're not playing it? That's a no-no, because so and so is wherever they are and I'm over here, so with that in mind as long as the person is true to what they're saving, because let's face it every record you're promoting you can't believe in. You've got to sell it but you can't really believe in it. And if you don't believe in it how can I believe in it. Now if I get the record and you don't believe in it, sometimes I might turn around and tell vou. whoa you gave me three records you're promoting this but this is the one that's working for me. And my favorite promoters are the ones that will give me the freedom to tell them what's really happening for me and hopefully turn it around within their company if it's legitimate and make it happen. I don't like the ones that say we're over this record. If you tell me you're over a record then as far as I'm concerned when I make a record I don't want you promoting my record. Because certain records get played two years after they came out doesn't

month or two months, I know I can call him up and I can ask him something about the business that I'm faced with a decision I have to make because he's very connected. I'm not trying to reinvent the wheel, but be a part of it as I add my own flava. I am going to continue being an aset to Funk E. Frank my PD, and try to grow as an on-air jock while maintaining my responsibilities as a power mixer. I will keep overseeing Hitz to make sure that it continues to be an asset to the music industry as well as to myself as a DJ and a producer. I'm looking forward to releasing quite a few new artists this year. I'll continue doing some remix and production work with Eric Kupper including some songs for my fiance China Gray. She's got her own deal on ATLANTIC and is ready to make some noise! I'll also keep reporting to **HITMAKERS**!

THERE'S A CHANGING OF THE GUARD IN THIS INDUSTRY. AS MORE MIXERS TAKE POSI-TIONS OF INFLUENCE...

The intelligent players in this

business are the ones that can see talent and use it to their benefit. It's just a question of recognizing someone's potential, grooming them and giving them the opportunity to make things happen. It then becomes a question of loyalty at that point.

CLOSING COMMENTS AND SHOUTS?

Shout out to Eric Kupper for inspiring me to be the best that I can be in the studio. He's a true friend, plus he let's me steal some of his sounds. Eddie O'Loughlin from NEXT PLATEAU for giving me my first production deal and my first taste of making money from International Publishing. Henry Stone for letting me pick his brain and there is so much to pick! Bo Crane for selling me Florida Record Pool, his baby, also for his patience and insight. Tom Silverman for recognizing that I've been there from day one and for Charles Dixon and Planet Rock. Richard Clarvit for the best legal advice and a great friendship. Frank Walsh for telling me that to do less is more and for allowing me to find that out one step at a time. Amir Bayyan for being the first person to let me work in a recording studio. There is life after Kool & The Gang. To Chep Nunez for teaching me to strive for humility and to my grandma Cecilla Moretta for discovering the music in life. May you both rest in peace. Lastly to my family and to China Gray for being my better half. Everyone else you know who you are. I want people to know that I'm a Godfearing individual whose voice in this business is positivity. I'm only human and I may fall short every now and then, but I thank the Lord for giving me a vision and a mission.

YOU'RE ONE OF MY FAVORITES. I KNOW THAT I'M NOT ALONE IN SAYING THAT. 
