LET'S GO AROUND ONE BY ONE, SAY YOUR AIR TIME AND WHAT YOU DO AT THE STATION.

Tony B.: I mix 10 to 11, 11:30 to 1, and2 to 4 Saturday night..

Eric V.: I'm on mixing everyday... 5:30, 7:30 and 9:30. Monday through Friday. Nick V. is just basically the mouthpiece. I'm the Jawjacker of the group.

Nick V.: Jawjacker...that's what I do here. Eric V. mixes most of the time, but when the people really want to hear some mixing, Nick V. gets busy. (laughter)

Eric V.: Cold!

Nick V.: We're on every morning from 6 to 10 and then "Friday Night Flavas," straight up hip hop from 9 to 1...in the mix.

DJ Enrie: I'm on Saturday nights from 8 to 10 PM and then I'm on "Power Tools," if Richard and Tony let me be on (loughter)

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: I'm on Friday morning because they do an extra half-hour mix, Fat Friday with Tha Baka Boyz, Friday afternoon at 5 o'clock for the Weekend Kick-Off Mix, Saturday night from 11 to 11:30 and then from 2 AM to 4 PM for "Power Tools" which is deep house...straight up deep house and progressive trance.

WHAT IS IT THAT MAKES YOUR MIX SHOW NUMBER ONE IN L.A?

DJ Enrie: Most of the time is because it's live. At all the other stations it's taped, even the vocals.

WHY DO YOU THINK THAT MAKES SUCH A DIFFERENCE?

DJ Enrie: Because it gives it more feel, more of a vibe. Because everyone knows we're in there, we're taking the phone calls and putting them on the air, right on the spot.

DO YOU FIND THAT TO BE THE CASE FOR THE MORNING SHOW TOO?


Eric V.: Yeah, it's live, it's totally involved with the people, I can throw anything on at any time. If people tell me beforehand, I'll put it in the mix. It's not only that though, it's the way you present it. Presentation is more than half of everything. Any DJ can present a song, but if you come to us, we'll introduce it a different way.

Nick V.: It's like a gift. You know, at Christmas if you get a gift and it's in a sloppy-ass container, it's not going to be as good. It's going to be trashy. If it's nice and presented correctly to you, it's going to be extra special to you.

Eric V.: You're going to pay more attention to it.

Nick V.: Exactly.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: One reason why our mix show kicks ass is




because we have variety in our mix show. We play the hip hop cuts, we play the house cuts, we play the radio cuts, and I think that the way we do it, we keep it entertaining. Not only are we mix show DJ's, but we mix in the clubs which I think gives us a good base. A lot of mix show DJ's do not mix in the clubs and do not know that vibe.

Tony B.: We've all been involved in the music for a long time and more than just DJ's, we're involved in the industry and I think that gives us more of an edge than the other mix show guys in town.

HOW'D YOU START OUT?

Nick V.: We started as producers because we couldn't get on the radio. We said that if we couldn't get on the radio, that we were going to make



but for about a year we lied to him and said we were on the radio and we weren't. He asked for a tape every time we went to see him and we'd say, "Oh yeah, we'll get it for you," but we weren't on the radio, so that's why we didn't. (laughter)


Eric V.: We lied to him because you have to be on the radio or in a club or something to be in a pool, right? So...

DJ Enrie: You said you were in Vidal's.

Eric V.: Yeah, but it was closed down. (laughter) That was back in '84 when we first started so...

IT WAS AN UNDERGROUND CLUB?

Nick V.: Yeah, it was so underground, 'nobody could see it.

FIELD DOWN TO L.A.?

Eric V.: It was just the right place, right time. We came down one day, we were fukking around, doing some producing, we went to see Bruce Reiner cause we used to always fukk with him when he was working at Profile. And it just so happened that Dave Morales was there and he asked us, "What are you doing later tonight?" and we said, "Nothing, let's go to dinner." We started talking about radio and Nick hits the table and said, "This time next year I'll be working at POWER106." That's it. He asked for a tape...

Nick V.: And up at Gavin we gave it to him...Morales hooked us up with the whole thing.

the whole thing.

Eric V.: Rick Cummings called us in on Wednesday and then two days after that, we got hired for a Friday. Back in the days when I didn't have hardly any money, I was working my ass off in construction, I used to put shit up on my wall...like a picture of a drum machine that I wanted for so long, so bad, but I couldn't get no money. Two thousand dollars was a lot of money to me back in the days. It's like I worked forever for that drum machine doing construction with my father. I hated that shit. But I had to do it because I put it up on my wall, and that was my goal.

Nick V.: You got to set your goals. Eric V.: Me and Nick said, "Okay, we got this goal set, what are we going to do now?" We did that, boom, okay go to the next one. What are we going to do next, next, next. We never got comfortable, right?

DJ Enrie: The reason why he's so happy is because we get along. We've been friends for so long and we look out for each other. We communicate with each other. I think that the mixers at other stations do their show and hand it

music for the radio so that they'd have to play us. We were two young kids from Bakersfield. Two sixteen and eighteen year old Mexican kids. They weren't going to let those kind of kids run the radio station.

Eric V.: Not in Bakersfield.

Nick V.: It's a hick town. It's all cowboy shit. So we said, "Well, fukk it, we're gonna make music so they have to play us someway, somehow." God saw that we were really trying to get involved with the music and shit and they finally saw the light and let us on the radio. So we started as producers...that's where our base is. Before that, we were DJ's in swap meets, clubs, high schools.

DJ Enrie: The only link I had in the industry was that I started out as a record pool director. I knew Rich and Tony back then and I knew Tha Baka Boyz because they were in the pool at the

Nick V.: Little does Enrie know,

(laughter)

TALK ABOUT, GOING FROM BEING A MIX SHOW DJ TO BEING FULL-TIME AIR PERSONALITIES.

Eric V.: Number one: don't think of yourself as a DJ. Most think of themselves as just DJ's and those motherfukkers get comfortable. They have a mix show for so many hours in the little city they're in, and they think that's all they're going to do. Fukk that. Take your shit to the next level. The only person who can stop you from taking you to the next level is you. If something don't work, try something else.

Nick V.: And once you get to that power, you can go back and say, "Well motherfukkers, I'm here."

in and their out. If I like a house record or something I say, "Yo, Richard, pick up on that." Or like Tha Baka Boyz will tell me about a hip hop record. So, you know, it keeps us tight like that.

Eric V.: Other mixers at other stations are always in competition with each other instead of trying to help each other. They're ego-trippin'. ...whose mixes are badder...who gives a fukk? You're on the same payroll. you work for the same company. If one of them's going to go to war, you better go with them, motherfukker. I tell them and I tell any other person that works with me, don't ever feel that you can't come to me with something, come to us.

Tony B.: We work for some great eople. I worked at KIIS for a while. Working at KIIS and POWER is the only radio experience that I've had, but Rick Cummings is a great guy. He opens up to us, he lets us give him our advice on records and on anything. He asks us our opinions and that's a great situation to be in, too, because we have weekly music meetings with Rick (Buckshot Shorty) and Michelle.

Eric V .: To all you industry motherfukkers out there, Buckshot Shorty is Rick Cummings, okay? That's all there is to it. (laughter) You make sure when you ask for Rick Cummings, you call him Buckshot Shorty. That's the only way you'll get respect in these times now.

Tony B: He goes on the morning show with Tha Baka Boyz. He'll go hang out at clubs. That's where the Fresh Tunes #1 record on Strictly Rhythm came from. He came into the club and I said, "Rick, watch this," and I played the record and the crowd went crazy. The next Tuesday, they added the record. He trusts us. He takes care of us, and he cares about what we have to say.

WHO ELSE GOES TO THE MUSIC MEETINGS?

Tony B: Richard, myself and Enrie go on Tuesday...Tha Baka Boyz don't need to go because they're there everyday and they talk to Rick every day.

Nick V.: We don't sit down at a certain time and talk to Rick Cummings at all. It will be in the middle of our meeting for the morning show and he'll say, "Let me ask you about a couple records.' He'll ask us about them and we'll tell him, yes, no, maybe so, but check this He asks us about records at least once a week. He'll just go down the list, records that motherfukkers are pushing him on and we'll say whether it's shitty or dope.

HOW MUCH FREEDOM DO YOU HAVE IN YOUR MIX SHOWS?

Tony B.: The regular mix show has gotten a lot better recently with us getting to play a little more house at the station.

D.I Enrie: It's three out-of-rotation songs per hour, but since we've been having the music meetings what me, Richard and Tony do is go over the big house songs in the clubs and Rick and Michelle let us know if we can play them.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: It wouldn't have to be house, it could be big hip hop records that we're really into too.

Tony B.: For the regular mix show which is Saturday night, the Saturday Night Street Party, we play mainly what the station plays, either the uptempo, not so much uptempo, but grooveable hip hop, not the 80 bpm stuff, the more uptempo stuff and the house stuff and then we get to throw in two or three records for a half hour or hour that we like ourselves. I think the three of us, Richard, Enrie and myself know what is a good radio record or what has the potential to be a good radio record and I'm not going to play a record at 10:30 that is just like a house track, that has no potential to be a radio record. For that show, it's just not appropriate. We want to play new records in the mix show that have the potential to become records for the station.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: I think what's really cool is that we have to follow some guidelines, but we also have other shows like "Friday Night Flavas" and "Power Tools" in which we play exactly what we want to play. Straight up. If we want to play some hip hop, an underground track that no one knows that we think is the dopest shit, or if we want to play the deepest house track, we have that outlet.

TALK ABOUT THE DO'S AND DON'TS OF PROMOTION. RECORD

Nick V.: Make me aware of it first, we are the authority in Los Angeles. POWER106 is the authority. We sell records here at POWER106. We know the music and if the music is good, we will sell the record. In the morning, if there's a song that I really this industry upside down. We want to be the people that are making this motherfukker go.

Tony B: I'll tell you exactly how I know that we sell records. I go into a record store on Sunday afternoon and I see kids going in there with cassettes of our show "Power Tools." We have a certain format for the show, we talk at the beginning of a mix, we talk in the middle, we talk at the end and we try to schedule the music so, if there's a big record that we want to push we'll put it in the beginning so right before it we say, "This is the new so and so artist on blah blah records, go out and buy it." We give out the 12 inch stores where they're located, kids are in there buying that music. That is our main goal with "Power Tools' because we want to make artists careers, we want to sell records for the record labels

Eric V.: Don't become rude. Don't call me at home, motherfukker, or else I'll change my number again. You want it right now? It's (213) 876-FUKK YOU (laughter)

Nick V.: If the record is good you'll hear us talking about it. I understand that that's your job and that's cool, but, if we really like the record, we'll call you and say, "Yo, this shit is bumpin'! We got your back on this one." Do not call me every week, do not come to the station and put it in front of my face on "Friday Night Flavas," do not try to do none of that stuff because if it's dope, it'll be played, period. Back in the days, you didn't have BDS. You don't need that shit to sell records.

AND BDS DOESN'T WORK ANYWAY...WITH THE MIX SHOW.

want to get behind, that I feel good about it, I say what record label the song is on, I say who the artist is...And I tell everyone to pick it up at your nearest record store, it's phat! That's selling records right there. It's that extra, cause you know, people are listening to what I say. When I turn the mike on, they're saying, "What's he going to say next?" So when I say, "Go and pick it up at your nearest record store," that sets the scene for five people, for one person, for three people...it don't matter, a sale is a sale. Subliminally-type shit that we sell records and other DJ's at other radio stations don't know what the fukk their playing, or what label it's on, or who produced the song, or how much heart they put behind that, or who sampled it or what sample it is.

I DON'T THINK A LOT OF DJ'S THINK ABOUT SELLING RECORDS. IT'S NOT A CONCERN OF THEIRS.

Nick V: It's not a concern of theirs 'cause they just want their paycheck at the end of the week. We want to turn

Nick V.: With the mix show, it doesn't work. All the record labels: Don't get on your street promotion kids. When you speed up the turntable, BDS does not pick up. Plus, we only play it for one verse so it ain't going to work anyway.

WHEN YOU'RE GOING TO MIX OR JUST STRAIGHT UP PLAY, YOU DON'T GIVE A SHIT WHETHER IT'S TAPE, CD'S, CASSETTE...

Nick V.: We took a song off video because we didn't have the vinyl yet.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: Do not make the video before you make the vinyl! (laughter) That is very, very stupid. It starts from the streets. From the streets. DJ's from the streets and mix shows. Give vinyl, then do the fukking video. You shouldn't have to take shit off the video, that's ridiculous (applause) Do's and Don'ts: Call me on my call day, Tuesday from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m.

THEY LIKE TO TALK TO YOU

ABOUT A RECORD BEFORE YOU GET IT.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: I can't stand when they tell me how many sells, or that some guy's playing it in Charlotte. Oh my God! This is L.A... we know our market. We don't have to know about other markets, we'll listen to the record and make the decision. I can't stand when they say,"Give it another listen." I listen to it one time, I don't have enough time to go give every record another listen.

Nick V: Make sure that the 12 inch record stores get it as well, because if I walk into a record store...

YOU'RE TALKING ABOUT MOM AND POPS RIGHT.

Eric V.: Exactly, the ones that sell 12 inch records to the real DJ's. When I walk into a store and I hear a song and I like it, I might have it already, but I didn't listen to it that good, or it was a different situation. You hear it in a club or in a record store, and it's different

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: If I hear a slammin' record and I have to pay for it, I'm gonna send your ass the

DJ Enrie: Basically the thing that bugs me about promotors is when they keep calling every week asking about the same record. It's like, think within a week you could actually tell them how you really feel about a record. And it's not like your mind will change about it with each week goin' by. Another thing I don't like is that BDS stuff because I think if they got West Coast representatives out here then they can listen to the show for their research. They can catch a vibe as far as what's goin' on in the retail stores as well.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: If you're gonna call us, do your homework! I can't stand people callin' me and saying,"why aren't you playing the record?" And we are actually playing the record!

Tony B.: Mr. Greg Lee from Warner Brothers tapes the show weekly.

Nick V.: So he can understand what's really going on out there on the

Eric V.: We love getting white labels with nothing on it. That's the

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: It's good for us to know when it would be in the mom and pop store, so we can say, "Hey you know what, you're hearin' this first, but it's gonna be in the stores a week from now.

DJ Enrie: We wouldn't play the record if we didn't care about the record. Why would we spend the minutes to put it on our turntable if we didn't feel for it and like the record ourselves. Why would we then put it out to our listeners who listen to us every week and rely on us for the new shit.

Tony B.: I'd like to thank the Jammin' Salmon for puttin' us on the Hitmakers project. For everybody reading this Ricky Leigh's official new nickname is the "Jammin Salmon." These are my do's and don'ts real quick "I-Ight!" I learned that "I-Ight," from the Baka Boyz I'm proud to say! This is comin' at yah from the uh kind of grandfather of the mixers. This is important what I'm

about to say because it's gonna save the record labals hundreds of thousands of dollars per year. Send me one copy of the record. Don't send me 10. If I would like an extra copy, I will call you and tell you.

DJ Enrie: We put em on each others piles.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: The record promotors that I respect most too are the ones that...they'll ask you, "What records are working for you... what are your hot records."

Tony **B**.: And they don't care if it's on their label or not.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: Exactly, you're just talkin' about music, that's dope...that's very cool.

DJ Enrie: So that way they know what kind of music you're into.

ARTIST APPEARANCES....

Eric V.: For alot of the mixers out there, you need to get to know the artist personally. Then you can just call him and chill with him. Like you were saying about Warren G., Ricky, we got a relationship with Warren G...Then you know if we need them or they need us...they got a new group comin' out, they know they can bring it to our show first and no question we're gonna put 'em on because they're down with us you know. It's about relationships.

TALK ABOUT L.A. MUSICALLY.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: L.A. is an incredible city with an incredible hip hop scene as well as an incredible underground scene. At POWER106 we got the best of both worlds. With the hip hop, we got Tha Baka Boyz, on the house side, we've got Tony B. and myself and Enrie. Plus what's great about us is that Tha Baka Boyz will play house music, and we do play hip hop. We're not just only house or only hip hop, we're DJ's that play good music. And we all have our own niche, but we also relate with one another and what impresses me so much is Tha Baka Boyz know all the old Disco. Then you got the king of Freestyle...DJ Enrie comin' from New York just kickin' ass with the Freestvle! I think he's gonna bring Freestyle back to L.A. I think as a unit we're just all about the music and we want to play good music period. And when you play good music, you get respect on the streets cause they know you're not playing any

Nick V.: There's individuality musically in this city. It's different in every place. You got your house kids with their own vibe, the hip hop kids got their own little vibe.

DJ Enrie: The reason hip hop ain't workin' as far as outside our radio station is the clubs. The club owners don't want to do hip hop clubs. The little tiny undergrounds are playing the serious hip hop and no one's gonna dance to that. They're just gonna listen.

Tony B.: But when you look at the music, and what's happening in L.A. on the industry level, hip hop is blowin' up. All the big hip hop records are coming out of L.A., And L.A. is gettin' props and respect finally for the kind of hip hop that we're doin'. But then you look over on the house tip, L.A. is non-existant.

Eric V.: I have to give Dre all the credit for that shit. There was other people who had that vibe, like Too

Short, he'd sell shit right out of his trunk man. He'd sell two hundred thousand copies. The Click, E-40, they all got their own ghetto sound and people want to bop their head to that ghetto shit. And when Dre came out and blew up with that, that just opened up the gates for every thing else to come through. For your Domino, for your fukkin' Warren G. and all that shit.

DO YOU CARE ABOUT WHERE A RECORD COMES FROM?

Eric V.: No! It don't matter, if it's good, it's good period! I mean it doesn't matter if it comes from Indonesia, I don't give a fukk! As long as it's dope! The first thing we listen for is music, then we check the lyrics, then everything else. I'm sure they go the same way, Richard and Tony, they listen to music first. I mean within the first five to ten seconds of a record you can tell if you're gonna like it. I put the shit on and I don't want to fukk with it any more.

Nick V.: Another reason why, I think stuff like Dre and the west coast sound basically is just ghetto. And there's ghettos all around the country.

DEFINE THAT FOR THE PEOPLE THAT DON'T UNDERSTAND "GHETTO."

Nick V.: It's what they're speakin' about, it's the bass, the boomin' systems, you know they like the way it sounds on their system. The stories they tell, 'cuz they live that shit every day. The people can relate with that shit. Also alot of sales come not from

records are starting to get faster BPM's, keep playing the same stuff at the same BPM's things get boring, music changes and we ourselves make music that changes. There are three or four house labels that are coming out of L.A. which is really cool, and I think with Tha Baka Boyz producing stuff, and Enrie producing stuff, and Tony B. and myself producing stuff, as well as being on the radio, L.A.'s gonna become a major, major force in the music industry. Thank you and good night.

Nick V.: With the crowd that wants to dance, playing hip hop is real tricky because it gets boring so fast. You gotta be creative with it and sometimes you gotta play something that they don't hear very often, but at the same time, if they've never heard what you're playing, they might give the "I've never heard what you're playing before," and get off. When you're playing hip hop, you gotta keep on changing shit and be a fast DJ that can mix or cut up shit. And that's what I do a lot because I get bored with the shit. When it first comes on, boom, everybody puts their hands up in the air. But then you gotta switch it up real quick because, "If I'm bored with it shit they might be bored with it!"

A LOT OF INDUSTRY PEOPLE WOULD SAY TO YOU, "YOU DON'T KEEP IT ON LONG ENOUGH FOR PEOPLE TO GET WHAT THE SONG IS.

Nick V.: That's true! It's a catch twentytwo. And I hate when DJ's let shit play for a long time, I'll turn that shit off in a quick second! I'll dis that motherfukker cause he let the song play for two verses. I wouldn't appreciate a DJ like that because he's not do that for us and you're doing it for us. We love you for it baby and we appreciate it from the heart. There's a lot of good talent out here in L.A. and I think all the labels need to start looking out here cause we got a good sound and we can do a lot of good work.

Eric V.: All record labels please put out a capellas on everything that you release. I need those, I don't want to play the same old shit everybody plays. I want to give shout outs to the big man upstairs of course, God got it goin' on. What's up to Ricky Leigh. Big shout out to Buck Shot Shorty and everybody else who came and was involved with that in some way or another. Be lookin' out for Tha Baka Boyz in '94, tearin' the assholes out of everybody.

DJ Enrie: One quick thing for the record labels, if you're sending hip hops send two. I gotta give props to Richard and Tony cuz they hooked me up with Power. I guess it was the easiest way to get a mix show on, they just said come on down, make a tape you know. I gotta give props to Ricky Leigh too for hooking us up. And don't put my last name on my packages, it's just Enrie.

Nick V.: Basically, Tha Baka Boyz are larger than life, little does everybody know yet, you know what I'm sayin', they don't understand exactly what Tha Baka Boyz are all about, but everybody's gonna see in the near future. We started in Bakersfield and got blessed, people gave us an opportunity, Steve Wall thank you very much. Then we moved to Los Angeles, now we're blowing' shit up not only in L.A., but across the world. Thank you very much to my mom and my dad for all the support. And Ricky Leigh for breaking us off on this shit. And Buckshot Shorty for the opportunity baby thank you

baby thank you.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: Real quick, for people out there that don't think they can do what we're doing or don't think they can take it to the next level, I came to POWER106 answering phones for free, then I worked my way up into research. Then I did promotions, washing vans hanging up banners, taking jocks prizes and finally I got an opportunity to mix on the radio and it's just about working your ass off and being at the right place at the right time and I learned this from Lazano, "The harder you work the luckier you will get." And that's just the bottom line. And big props going out to HITMAKERS and Ricky Leigh for giving us an opportunity to voice our shit. Also big props to Michelle Mercer and Rick Cummings because before they came to the station things were looking pretty dim and they came and really turned the shit around. And I know at first they were really strict, they even took off "Power Tools," But all and all it was the best turnaround. They've learned from us and we've learned from them and that's why we're a better station for it and that's why we're the number one English speaking station in L.A.

Eric V.: One more shout for the Jammin' Salmon!

the ghetto, but they want to be like the ghetto. The kids in the suburbs that want to be down. So they'll go and buy the record...say a couple of kids are sittin' out by their school and there's a couple blue collar white kids from the suburbs, and they're sittin' with a couple ghetto kids, you know some brothers, and a couple Mexican kids that are boomin' a Kid Frost, or a Snoop Doggy Dogg. Kids walk by and they like the way their vibe is and they like the music they're bumpin'. They'll walk over and ask them, "What is that shit?" And they'll go right to the record store and pick it up.

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: When these people go to clubs...they want to hear something that they don't hear, every fukkin' day on the radio. What I like about L.A. is the fact that the music is always evolving. It keeps it interesting. Techno went in, and then the Techno got faster, and then the Techno slowed down, and now it became house, and now it's becoming more progressive house. And now we see the trend; and all the record stores are telling me this in L.A., that Techno is coming back for the summer...and then there's certain lower BPM records and it sounds like hip hop

showing me nothing special. To me he's gotta be exciting.

DO YOU THINK THAT THAT'S REFLECTIVE OF L.A. MUSICALLY?

Richard 'Humpty' Vission: I think the DJ's in L.A. are more aggressive. I've been to every city, and besides Chicago, DJ's in New York are very relaxed, they'll let the song play for ever, and L.A. DJ's rock that shit. They make things move, keep it energetic.

Tony B.: If you're doing a mix show or you're mixing in a club, the people that you're playing for, they don't want to hear exactly what they hear on the radio. You've gotta give 'em something different. Whether it's doin' what Eric V. does, like he cuts the hell out of things on "Friday Night Flavas." Even though it's the same old thing they've heard one thousand times, you're given 'em a different way to listen to it.

YOUR FINAL COMMENTS.

Tony B.: Huge props to Ricky Leigh cause you're putting us on the map. You're gettin' us the respect that I think we deserve. Nobody else was willing to



Late-Breaking Hews:

In a surprising move, GANNETT'S KHKS/Dallas PD SEAN PHILLIPS turned in his resignation on Tuesday. Rumors continue to swirl surrounding the circumstances leading up to Phillips's abrupt departure, including his reported suspension last Friday. APD/MD MR. ED LAMBERT is overseeing the radio station TFN. Stay tuned for the full story.

Meanwhile, former KIIS-FM/L.A. overnight personality 'BROTHER BILL' McKINNEY has filed a \$2 million racial discrimination lawsuit against GANNETT over his June 1993 dismissal from the station after 14 years. Sources within the company deny any discrimination.

B96/Chicago's morning team of EDDIE & JOBO has left the building. The duo has been embroiled in a legal situation due to an ongoing on-air debate over the identity of the father of a local female newscaster's baby. The woman filed an \$8 million lawsuit against CBS, and apparently, the guys announced the settlement of the suit in the newspaper, reportedly in violation of the suit's confidentiality agreement. Look for parent company CBS to pay \$1 million, plus on-air and newspaper apologies.

Keep your ears on San Diego, as B100 goes off the air forever. PD TOM GJERDRUM announces that beginning Monday, May 16, B100 embarks on 'San Diego's Great Radio Experiment.' Each day, the station will feature a different musical direction, then solicit listener response on the new sound. The station will run jockless during the experiment. Gjerdrum told THE EAR, "The goal of the experiment is to come up with a format that is compatible with San Diego." He added, "Sometimes you get so caught up in research you overlook your real objective: pleasing the listeners. Our ultimate goal, of course, is to secure a solid format for the FM station within the next month," said Gjerdrum.


