LET'S GO BACK 10 YEARS TO THE BEGINNING OF YOUR CAREER. YOU AND I MET AT KSAQ IN SAN ANTONIO.

That's right. I used to come on the air after you. I actually got started doing religious radio in San Antonio, which was the only place I could find to get my foot in the door, and it was pretty hard to put a decent aircheck together...I eventually landed a job in the actual competitive Mainstream radio world, and it wasn't too terribly long after that that I met you when we were both working at KSAQ in San Antonio. I finally got on full-time there and eventually wound up being the music director and getting involved in the programming side of things.

YOU ALSO TOOK A BIG CAREER TURN LATER WHEN YOU STARTED DOING MORNINGS.

Right. I went to Oklahoma City and did my first real morning gig at KJYO and had the highest morning drive shares that station ever saw. Had a 23 share in morning drive.

THAT'S A HELL OF A SHOT IN THE MARKET OF THAT SIZE.

It was just a situation where the right things came together. They were looking for somebody and didn't know what they wanted. I was available and they let me have a shot at it on a test run. I wound up being in the right place at the right time. When Joel Folger took over the station as PD and he just energized the station, and it exploded all over, including morning drive, and that, as far as I know, is the best ratings book that radio station ever had. From there I went to work doing mornings for Rick Upton at KITY in San Antonio. I stayed in a pattern of doing morning drive in Houston, New Orleans and then back in San Antonio again for the next several years and worked through several different formats: Urban, AOR, Top40 and Alternative.

DO YOU FEEL THAT WORKING MULTI-FORMAT HAS MADE YOU MORE WELL-ROUNDED?

Not everybody gets the chance to work multi-format. We have the tendency in this business to get labeled – 'He's a rhythm/crossover guy, or he's a dance guy or he's an Alternative guy,' or whatever – but I think any time you have a chance to work different formats I think it makes you more well-rounded, especially if you're going to be a programmer, because you have more of an understanding of what your competition is doing. Just like now in St. Louis, I don't have a direct Top40 competitor. I have a very strong Hot A/C competitor, a legendary AOR station, a strong Urban Contemporary station, and we have an upstart Alternative station. All of those are my primary competitors, and having background in all of those formats I think that helps me better understand what they're trying to do, and helps me carve out the right position for WKBQ.

BEFORE YOU CAME TO ST. LOUIS YOU HAD YOUR FIRST PROGRAMMING SHOT AT WPFM IN PANAMA CITY, FLORIDA.

That's right. I had been a music director and APD all over the country, and I finally decided to go into a small market and actually earn my PD stripes. I kept waiting for a PD to die or take a better job, but none of them did...When I started at WPFM, the station hadn't really been programmed at all for the previous year and a half. In fact, it had actually been dark and off the air for a while, and there wasn't anybody really involved at the time I came in that had put a cohesive programming plan together for the radio station. Our competitor, WILN, had huge numbers in the market, and I couldn't figure out why their numbers were so big. I finally determined it was because they just hadn't had any real competition. We finally got WPFM lined up and sounding good, and in the first book there managed to bring WILN tumbling down from a 13

quite some time that we were actually seeing each other.

SO YOU DID END UP GETTING HER OUT OF THE MARKET AFTER ALL...

Yes, but what's frustrating now for her is it's tough for her to be able to actively seek a job as a promotions director, because I certainly don't want her working for my competition, and it's tough sometimes for your fiancee or wife to work for the same company that you do.

TELL ME ABOUT THIS TRANSITION. YOU'RE PROGRAMMING IN A SMALL MARKET ON THE REDNECK RIVIERA IN FLORIDA. HOW DID YOU POSITION YOURSELF TO MOVE INTO A TOP 20 MARKET LIKE ST. LOUIS?

It's one of those 10-year, overnight success stories I guess. I had worked with some really great programmers as a music director or assistant PD throughout my career, and I had always felt like I had the background and experience from that angle to be able to handle it. After earning my PD stripes in Panama City, it was just a matter of being in the right place at the right time. Rick Upton had taken the job as PD of KHTK, which was HOT97 here in St. Louis. He was listening to his competition, which

share to down several shares below us. I was very proud of that. As I listened to the station and the market, I felt that our music balance was better, and I also thought we were stronger in the talent department. The only place where they were just kicking our butts was in promotions.

WHICH BRINGS US TO THE STORY ABOUT HOW YOU MET YOUR FUTURE WIFE, NADIA.

She was the promotions director at crosstown WILN, and I figured I had to get her out of the market. Actually, in a beach market like that, when you have two Top40 stations, you're both constantly at the same events and the same nightclub promotions, so you wind up getting to know most of the talent from your competition pretty well. That was how Nadia and I met, and it wasn't public knowledge for

was WKBQ, and after hearing Steve & D.C. in the morning, he realized that in order to make KHTK competitive, he was going to have to put a morning show together. We had such a good run working together back at KITY in San Antonio, but I kept turning him down because I was having fun being the program director in Florida, plus I lived two blocks from the Gulf of Mexico. He finally talked me into taking the job as morning personality and APD of KHTK, and a month and a half later the company announced they were buying WKBQ, and in the process of that they moved almost the entire staff over to WKBQ, so instead of being morning personality/APD of KHTK, I was doing afternoons and was music director and APD of WKBQ. About a month after that Upton got an offer he couldn't refuse to go back to San Antonio and program KTFM. An hour



later they asked me to program WKBQ, and I've been in that position ever since, through 1 might add, three different ownerships.

WHICH IS AN UNBELIEVABLE STORY, NOT TO MENTION A FREQUENCY SWAP WHICH HAPPENED A COUPLE OF MONTHS BACK.

Right. I don't want to sound like I'm griping and complaining, but it has been so intense. I've had a lot of very exciting things happen in my career: 23 share in morning drive in Oklahoma City, coming from a four share to a seven to be number one in the market in morning drive at KITY in San Antonio. But I don't think I've done anything career-wise that I'm prouder of than just holding WKBQ together through the tough year and a half that we've had since I became program director. We immediately took the station up. When I walked in the door the last trend on the station was a 3.9, and we immediately took the station up to the mid-fives, and then Steve & D.C. got in some trouble on the air, and it was like the opening of the floodgates of problems for the radio station. We had to practice damage control for months on that situation.

THEY ACTUALLY LEFT THE COMPANY AFTER THAT FIRST INCIDENT, SO YOU HAD TO SCRAMBLE TO FILL THAT SLOT YOURSELF.

Right. I really didn't want to replace them as morning personality because quite frankly I thought it was going to be a very difficult job for whoever went in there, and I wasn't sure that I had the time and energy to be able to devote to it and really do it right, plus continue to run damage control on the station. But before we even really got the situation under control, the company that I worked for, Legend Broadcasting, had problems getting all of their financing arranged to complete the purchase of the station, so overnight, they were out of the picture.



SO SO DEF

Evergreen, who was in the process of selling the station, stepped back in and took the station back. Evergreen hired me to stay on and suggested I try and fill the morning gig myself. I began a long, slow and painful attempt to try and repair all of the damage that had happened in morning drive, and actually had things going pretty well by the time we got down to the winter of last year.

THEN YOU WERE HIT WITH THE FREQUENCY SWAP.

Evergreen operated the station until September of last year, when they found a new buyer, Zimmer Broadcasting. Zimmer already owned a Country station in the market, KIX104. That station didn't have as good a signal as 106.5, and in fact, the area where the 104 signal was the weakest were places where the majority of Country diaries are returned from in this market. The Zimmers decided that once they had completed the purchase of WKBQ, the best way to position both stations in the market for maximum effectiveness was to actually do a frequency flip and put the Country format on 106.5, and move the Top40 format to the weaker 104.1 frequency.

TELL US ABOUT THE RE-HIRING OF STEVE & D.C.

One of the things that we decided to do at the time when the frequency swap happened was to look into rehiring Steve & D.C. because we figured that in going to a frequency that was not as powerful we were going to need a real newsworthy situation, something to draw people's attention to announce the move down the dial.

PLUS THE BOYS WERE AVAILABLE. THEY HAD GONE TO KAZY IN DENVER FOR ABOUT 20 MINUTES.

Right. They were on the air there for eight days. They had been off the air for nine months and during the time that they were unemployed, I think the real reality of what had happened the first time began to sink home to them, and they did a very respectable thing. They went into the community, and with no prospects for a job on the horizon, began to try and mend fences with the groups that they had offended. They had lengthy discussions with the NAACP, and they enrolled themselves in a racial sensitivities course at Webster University. These things had all taken place before we started talking with them about coming back. To make a long story short, the NAACP told us they would not stand in the way of Steve & D.C. coming back on the air. that they would be listening, but that they would not boycott the radio station, and basically gave us their blessing to give it a try. With that in mind we brought Steve & D.C. back on when we debuted O104. I also took the opportunity to re-focus what had been a fairly broad-based Top40 station and bring it into the '90s and

make it a lot tighter and more focused.

YOU ALSO MADE A CONSCIOUS EFFORT TO BRING UP THE TEMPO OF THE RADIO STATION.

What I began to realize as we talked to a lot of people and took a look at the research that was available to us, is that people were turning on the Q when they wanted a lift, when they wanted something different than what they were getting every place else on the dial, and when we delivered that, they liked the radio station a lot. When we didn't deliver that they were confused. They might really like Michael Bolton, but it wasn't why they punched to us in the first place. I focused the radio station on delivering more consistently what people expected of us in the first place, and that meant an increase in more active, more Alternative and Dance Crossover-type music and a decrease in the amount of titles on the air that we'd share with the Hot A/C.

OTHER THAN STEVE & D.C., TELL US ABOUT THE REST OF THE MORNING SHOW AND TELL US A BIT ABOUT EACH PERSON ON THE AIRSTAFF.

The rest of the morning show is filled out by Kim Furlow, who does news and information and is also a very valuable part of the morning show in that she helps provide the female perspective, which is very important. Sometimes Steve & D.C. have a tendency to lean towards a 10pm to 2am, and she has the perfect sound for middays. She's easy to listen to, and a big feature of her show is the 'Flashback Lunch,' which we started quite some time ago and virtually every radio station in town is now copying in one form or another.

Kenny Knight, my music director, is on from 1pm to 4pm. Kenny is fabulous. I think he's the most solidsounding jock on our station. He's from this area. He really understands what's happening in and around St. Louis, and he's very local and very easy to listen to. He's also in huge demand for club appearances. He's our resident wild man.

I'm on from 4pm to 7pm and it's kind of a big experiment. Although I'm certainly making an effort to try and keep the music rolling, I'm also stopping down and doing some real personality-driven, morning showtype bits and humor in the afternoon. I know WPLJ in New York is having a lot of success with Rocky Allen doing this type of thing, but in many markets it seems like just a more solid music afternoon show seems to work better. We'll see. I think it's too early to make a judgment yet on how it's working, but we're getting good response on the street from it and the latest trends show us moving up very nicely, so we're excited and anticipate even more good things.

At night from 7 to midnight is Rick Idol, who is the local teen heartthrob. The thing that is so great about Rick is that he's able to be huge with teens without sounding like a screaming night jock who would turn off a 25 year old female listener. That's one of

male point of view, which makes sense because they're guys. Kim provides a nice balance and makes sure that the female perspective is very well represented on the morning show. Courtney Landrum is the morning show producer, and is the hardest-working producer I've ever seen. She's fabulous. She really understands what makes that show tick and she consistently makes Steve & D.C. sound much better than they would if she weren't in the picture. Another key player on the morning show is a guy we refer to as 'The Mad Hoosier.' In this part of the country the word 'hoosier' is like saying 'redneck' in other parts of the country. The Mad Hoosier is a real personality, the guy who gets sent out on the street to do crazy things and he has a following of his own. He's actually the most fun when we get him to try and read poetry and stuff like that.

WHO'S DOING MIDDAYS?

Middays is Jai-C. I hired her originally from Jefferson City to do

the keys to Rick's success, is that his appeal is not just limited to teens. He's very well known in the market. In fact, he hosts a dance TV show here called 'Live At Stages' that one of the local nightclubs puts together.

Overnights is Fast Eddie, who has probably developed faster than any other personality on the radio station, has really come a long way and has a really musical and conversational style that makes him perfect for a late night slot. He's also the #1 fill-in for everybody's spot.

IS THERE ANYBODY ELSE, LIKE MANAGEMENT WE NEED TO STROKE HERE?

Obviously everybody on the staff is important, but I just wanted to say that my general manager, Bill Viands, has been so cool, because although he comes from a Talk and Country radio background, he has quickly grasped what the Q is all about. A lot of times he surprises me by jumping on what's hip and current faster than Kenny or myself, and he's been very supportive. I don't think we would have been able to hold this thing together as well as we have if he had not been willing to say 'Here is what we want to accomplish,' and then step out of the way and let me put the radio station together. Bill is a great people person and a great manager and I think every bit of this success that we're enjoying now can be attributed to him.

YOU'VE LIVED THROUGH THREE OWNERSHIP CHANGES, MORNING SHOW CONTROVERSIES, AND A FREQUENCY SWAP. DO YOU FINALLY FEEL THAT THINGS ARE SETTLING DOWN AND YOU'RE ON THE RIGHT COURSE FOR SUCCESS?

I almost hate to say that because I'm afraid if I do I'm just inviting something else crazy to happen. There's really no such thing as a normal day. We have so much going on and so many variables, it seems like just when I think things are settling down, some other bomb will go off somewhere and we're rushing over to try and deal with that. I will say this, I'm very excited at how well we've done since the frequency flip. Our first book shows our cume to be down about 10%, which is about what I expected from going to a signal that doesn't have as good a reach in the market, but by focusing the radio station, and by marketing Steve & D.C. as the morning show we've been able to bring the constant listening up enough to compensate for that. I'm very proud that in only one book we came within a 10th of a share of where we were in our last book on the 106.5 frequency. The latest trends show us blowing right past the Fall book, even with a lesser signal. I honestly believe that we have a realistic shot at taking WKBQ to the highest ratings in its recent history. The momentum we're feeling now is an indication of how well we've tapped into the core of our audience, how loyal our listeners are and how exciting and passionate this radio station is.

ANY CLOSING THOUGHTS?

I think a lot of the problems that we've had to make it through at this radio station could easily have torpedoed us, and it would not be surprising to me at all if WKBQ didn't really exist any more. Any one or a combination of several of the difficulties we've been through could have brought it to an end, but we have a staff of people that is really passionate about the station, and really passionate about the kind of radio that we do. Our philosophy is not just, 'Don't give them a reason to tune out,' rather. 'Let's give them a reason to tune in.' When I was a kid growing up. I felt like if I didn't turn the radio on every day or every night, I'd miss out on a whole lot of the cool stuff that was happening. I think that we're finally seeing a return to that kind of broadcasting, with a music mix and a presentation that listeners can be passionate about and really be involved in. That makes today one of the most exciting times ever to be in radio.
