





HERB ALPERT & JERRY MOSS CREATE NEW RECORD COMPANY

A&M founders Herb Alpert and Jerry Moss are making their much-rumored

A&M founders Herb Alpert and Jerry Moss are making their much-rumored return to the record business with the creation of their Almo Sounds label. They have signed a pressing and distribution deal for North America with Geffen Records and expect to release their first three albums by mid-1995. The Almo Sounds label is a division of Almo Sounds, Inc., under the aegis of Rondor Music International, Inc., which in turn encompasses music publishing companies Almo Music Corp. (ASCAP) and Irving Music, Inc. (BMI). Said Moss, Chairman and President of Almo Sounds: "We have a successful publishing company which is doing extremely well, but I like making records and I love working with musicians. The industry is in great shape and growing bigger and bigger. It's a great time to start a new record company, which is one of the few businesses in the corporate world where an individual human being can make a difference in the lives of so many people." The label's premiere album will be released in early 1995 and a total of three are anticipated in the first half of the year. Of the several new artists signed to the label, the first albums are expected to come from Angel Corpus Christi (an Alternative band from San Francisco, presently in the studio with producer Craig Leon); Rake's Progress (a Rock group from New York City being produced by Nick Sansano, who's worked with Sonic Youth); and Sherree Ford-Payne (an R&B singer from Los Angeles currently recording with producer/songwriter Howie Tee, who's collaborated with Color Me Badd). Moss emphasized that Almo Sounds will embrace all forms of music, from R&B and Rock to Country, and more.

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





Sort of a "mixed bag of thought, actually, but I truly believe in my heart of hearts that there were some important ingredients in the powerful and speedy teaching 1 received in coming up the stairs of success that I wish that I had paid more attention to. For a touch of a less "clinical" approach. Let's call it "Making War and Making Peace." This is not to sound mushy or wimpy...it's a matter of "balance." If there was anything to point out (using my own past as reference), Strategy, focus, confidence, passion and learning...not "self-sabotage". It is your personal destiny to create a compelling life of success. And never believe for a second...that the past equals the future! Next "BRIEF"...is a hot one. Until then, just be whatever you want to be, don't bother in "Majoring in Minor." Respect yourself and everyone around you every day.



DAVE FERGUSON, PD KSFM/Sagramonio Where's the engineer?

Look around your radio station. Where's the engineer? Chances are he or she is not in the shop, not out at the transmitter, or not in the kitchen area pouring a fresh cup of coffee. Wait! You forgot that there is no engineer!

You're at one of the many radio stations that chooses to use an outside engineering firm instead of an inhouse engineer. Sure, the GM justifies it because, "all your old engineer used to do was walk around with his thumb up his nose. Why pay for that?" Maybe much of the work your old in-house engineer did was general maintance. Whatever the case, the outside engineering firm must have successfully sold the GM on their services. Who knows, it might really be just as good or better than the way it was in the old days.

One such engineering firm is CMBE based in El Dorado Hills, California. Chip Morgan, the founder and president of this small business, employs more than fifteen techs, and services twenty or so client stations at any given time. Chip offers many technical tips to air staffs and production people working at radio stations that don't have in-house engineering: PRODUCTION QUALITY - Always clean the heads of your cart machine before any series of dubs. If using ITC 99B cart machines, the ELSA cycle must be run on each cart right before dubbing. Do not take out the cart between the ELSA cycle and recording on the cart. Doing so will ruin the "phase" of the cart.

Also, on cart tape and reel to reel tape look for scrape marks and bad areas on the tape itself. Throw away the tape if it looks worn in any way (tape that has streaks or lines in it, crinkled edges, greasy spots, or any other obvious problem). The older and more used the tape, the worse the sound quality and the worse the quality of your dub.

Most reel to reel players are aligned specifically for a certain grain of tape (AMPEX 456 for example). Do not use any other tape for recording (such as tape from agencies or from outside the station). Most such tape is of inferior quality and should not be used in your production room.

USE OF MICS - You should always find the "sweet spot" for your voice with a mic. It's the spot where your voice is loud and full, but not distorted or boomy. Usually it's as close as you can get to the mic with out distortion. You don't have to speak directly into the mic. Try it from the side. This helps reduce popping of "P's". Since most of your vocal energy comes from your chest and throat, the mic will sound best when it's kept a little lower than the center of your mouth.

This all may seem rather sophomoric, but these basics are easy to forget...especially when there's not an engineer to look after you. By paying attention to detail and keeping the basics in mind, you can often be your own engineering problem solver.

Of course we'll probably have to put up with some of those extreme Miami Bass acts like the 69 Boyz. Despite rap goin' out and dyin' on us they still managed to pull top 5 phones in almost every major market last month. Last month! That was the past, but this is today.

Today...when a group of guys get on a bus to LA, hook up with a producer named Eazy E and then proceed to put Cleveland, the rock capitol, on the rap map. Bone Thugs & Harmony are today's top 5 in most American cities.

How did it go Cube? Ten years 6 Million albums, 3 number one albums, 2 movies, 3 screenplays...so far," Cube says mournfully.



TENDERSTICKS <u>Marbles</u> (BAR NONE) - I've been playing five tracks off the CD, and I would call it a seductive cross between Nick Cave and Bryan Ferry. **PRISONSHAKE** <u>Two Sisters</u> (SCAT) - The album is called THE ROARING THIRD. It's dark-grinding, sexdripping Rock & Roll.

JOHN CALE <u>SEDUCING DOWN THE DOOR</u> (RHINO) - A collection of old stuff. A former member of the Velvet Underground. This CD is a collection of his solo work. A good overview of this classicallytrained artist's career.

GUMBALL <u>Revolution On Ice</u> (COLUMBIA) - I realize that this record is several months old, but it's a sadly overlooked gem by an underrated band. THE BENT BACK TULIPS <u>Tie Me Down</u> (EGGBERT) - On vinyl only. It's actually Dramarama. It's got an uptempo beat of the Go-Go's <u>We've Got</u> <u>The Beat</u>.

THE BENT BACK TULIPS <u>Last Of The Famous</u> <u>International Playboys</u> (EGGBERT) - It's better than Morrissey's version.

LIGHTNING SEEDS *Jollification* (TRAUMA) - It's Ian Browdie, who's been a producer for Echo & The Bunnyman, Allison Moyet, Three O'Clock & The Primitives. Ian <u>IS</u> **The Lightning Seeds**. He does it all. Perfect songs are: 1) *Lucky You*, 2) *Change* and 3) *Feeling Lazy*. Lots of over-dubs a-go-go!

KIM FOWLEY <u>Bad News From The Underground</u> (MARILYN) - This is quite unusual. Good for specialty radio shows. The best cuts are: 1) <u>Oo-oo</u>, 2) <u>Bad News From The Underground</u> and 3) <u>Invasion Of The Poloroid People</u>. Makes the phones light up like a Christmas tree. The way it's recorded invariably makes you lightheaded – listen with caution.

HAGFISH <u>Buick Men</u> (DRAGON STREET) - Hailing from Dallas, TX, they have a 19 song CD. They sound like a jolly punk on a Megacity Four and Buzzcocks level. The cuts that turn my listeners on are: 1) <u>Flat</u>, 2) <u>Disappointed</u>, 3) <u>Landshark</u> and 4) <u>Happiness</u>.

LANCE AVANSINO, Alt. Show Personality, KRZQ, Reno

THE EX-IDOLS <u>Go Away</u> (RELATIVITY) - They are a group of well established musicians. It turns me on! KILL CREEK <u>Fruit Pie</u> (MAMMOTH) - A maturesounding Green Day.

FOR SQUIRRELS <u>Kabaret</u> (Y&T) - Very different from most of today's Alternative. A great song!

GEORGE ROSTA, Alt. Show Producer, KSLY, San Luis Obispo

LIVE <u>I Alone</u> (RADIOACTIVE/MCA) - I realize that I alone am probably the last person to add this song, but <u>Selling The Drama</u> had such a good run that I didn't want to put it to rest before its time. Another strong tune from a band that gains more fans each week.

NIRVANA <u>About A Girl</u> (DGC) - A great track that I'd be playing – even if it wasn't from the most influential band of the '90s.

WEIRD AL YANKOVIC <u>Headline News</u> (SCOTTI BROS.) - Our hometown hero returns with his finest parody yet. Any song with an accordion in it has got to be cool.

DAVID X, Alt. Show Producer, KWOD, Sacramento

LUCAS <u>Lucas With The Lid Off</u> (BIG BEAT/TAG) - Can't get enough of this one!

LOVE AND ROCKETS <u>Body And Soul</u> (AMERICAN) - It's smooth, trippy, and surreal. I like it a lot.

JON HASSELL and blue screen <u>Personals</u>

(WARNER BROS.) - Kind of an Acid Jazzy sound with samples of people's personal ads thrown in. A great novelty song. Gets a lot of phone calls.

WHAT ACTUALLY PROPELLED YOU INTO RADIO AND NOT INTO A REAL JOB?

If I think back really far, when I was a little girl I lived in Los Angeles and I used to listen to KIIS-FM and KFI and all the other Top40 radio stations and I used to tape the Top40 countdowns. I would literally stay up 24 hours at a time and write down all of the songs to see if they really did play them over and over, hoping a pattern would emerge, but it didn't, but I was always suspect of that.

IT'S A GENETIC THING, ISN'T IT?

Yes. And then they used to do these battles of the songs where the Beach Boys would be up against the Osmonds, and I could always guess the winner. My sister thought I was spooky. I was always fascinated with taping things, and when I was in sixth grade we had this substitute teacher who belonged in a looney bin. We were telling everybody that this substitute teacher had lost her mind, and nobody would believe us. One day I brought my new tape deck in and I put it on her desk in a brown paper bag, hit play and record, hoping I could catch it before the 45-minute tape ran out. She was on one of her crazy binges, screaming at us and telling us we were all garbage. I took the tape down to the principal, gave it to her and said, "I know this is illegal, but I just wanted you to know what this lady is saying to us," and of course, she never worked at the school again.

I CAN'T BELIEVE YOU DID THAT. HOW OLD WERE YOU WHEN YOU?

I was 11. I was a hero for a couple of weeks in sixth grade. I'm still reliving the glory.

OBVIOUSLY YOU WERE DESTINED FOR A RADIO CAREER...OR ELSE THE CIA.

I wandered into college thinking that I had had a pretty colorful, if not successful thespian career in high school and I thought that would be something I wanted to do. I had stars in my eyes and I went to UVA and joined all the drama clubs, and on the very first night there, on my way down from the dorm, I saw this sign saying the campus radio station needed volunteers. At 8 a.m. the next day I was there at a meeting and that was it. So my second day of college I was bitten really hard by the bug, and I haven't looked back.

LIST SOME OF THE STATIONS THAT LED TO WRVQ.

I have the most boring past with stations. The day after I graduated college I was working as a dishwasher just because I knew I wanted to go into radio but I had to have a job to pay the bills. I think I made \$25 my first paycheck.

YOU WEREN'T REALLY A DISHWASHER, YOU WERE AN OUT-OF-WORK DISC JOCKEY.

I was working, but I was bored about being at a really small, familyowned radio station. Just the worst kind to work for. They ended up buying a couple other stations and I was like the corporate promotions director and afternoon girl and dishwasher...I ended up in the mountains somewhere working for one of these stations and I was really depressed. I looked around and decided, "I'm going to the beach." I packed up in February and moved to Nag's Head, North Carolina and got a job at SURF106. In June, the Operations Manager of WRVQ called and asked me for a tape. Two weeks later I was here, and that was six years ago.

YOU WORKED WITH STEVE DAVIS. DID YOU LEARN A LOT FROM HIM?

Yes, I did learn a lot from Steve. It was all so hazy when I first got to the radio station. I don't really understand how I ended up being music director, but somehow he saw some potential in me. I guess because I was probably getting on his nerves every day asking "Why do we do it this way when this other way sounds so much better?" I try to remember that when my jocks

LISA Mekay

PD, WRVQ/Richmond

It was different for everybody. I think one management technique won't work for everybody, because each person comes with a different set of expectations and a different set of preconceived notions on the way in. Some of the staff thought it was great, some of the staff said to my face they thought it was great, and of course really didn't think it was great, and some of the staff didn't take direction at all, and I realized there were a lot of ways to go about it. Of course a nice public hanging would have probably been the quickest answer, but I think the most effective method was to win people over by hard work and trust and making fair decisions. I also believe in taking chances when it's warranted and rewarding other people for taking chances, and relying on their gut and giving them the direction they need to do their job. That's what I tried to do for the last two years. I've just been weaseling my way in.

AND TWO YEARS LATER, HOW DOES THE STATION FEEL TO YOU?

Good. Probably every four months we do a complete renovation. I think Madonna has the right idea. I think as soon as we become predictable, people take us for granted. I know they listen to us, but they forget they

come in and do that to me. They could be potential music directors.

I learned a lot from Steve, and he gave me the opportunity to move up into the music director job. He gave me a lot of responsibility and put a lot of trust in me, and I've always appreciated that.

YOU WERE NAMED PROGRAM DIRECTOR TWO YEARS AGO WHEN HE LEFT. TELL US ABOUT THE TRANSITIONAL PERIOD.

I really, really care about this radio station, so my every thought was how can we make it better? How can we sound better? How can we make our listeners happy? How can we get them to listen longer and to tune in more often?

THAT'S THE OBVIOUS PD ANSWER, BUT YOU WERE ON THE SAME PEER LEVEL AS listen to us. I try to re-invent the radio station about every quarter, which is a lot of work. This is a very high maintenance radio station. I would love to work for an AC station some day where you can just sit there and play the music.

THIS FORMAT HAS TAKEN ITS SHARE OF LUMPS OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF YEARS. NOW IT SEEMS TO BE ON THE UPSWING. ARE WE DOING SOMETHING RIGHT, OR IS IT JUST THE CYCLICAL NATURE OF THE BEAST?

I think Top40 did get stuck in a rut for awhile. Programmers stayed in their comfort zone too long. What worked in Tampa or the other radio stations plastered over the front of **HITMAKERS** didn't work for every market, and it certainly stopped working way before people stopped doing it. I'm talking about the boss

jock sound and the attitude liners that were ugly.

IT WAS TOO MACHO.

Yes. You're exactly right. It stayed that way for a long time, and now I think MTV has changed. Pop culture has changed. The sensitivity factor has grown, and I think you see that reflected on radio stations now. A lot of the liners are more subtle. You have to think about them before you get them. They don't hit you over the head. They don't take the listeners' intelligence down a couple of pegs. You have to earn your listeners' respect.

HOW DO YOU KNOW IF YOU'RE ON THE RIGHT TRACK?

I think the record community always grows faster than radio because it's more tangible. There has to be a way of letting people know immediately whether or not their tactics are successful. Radio people have a waiting period before the book comes out, and then the ratings system is sometimes so whimsical, you think, "Maybe it was just a wobble." If we had a better barometer on how we were doing, radio would have moved along quicker.

IT'S TOUGH TO GET A REPORT CARD AND FIND OUT YOU'VE BEEN DOING IT WRONG FOR 12 WEEKS...

Exactly. Then you have to think back, "Where were we 12 weeks ago?" Keeping records is really important. I keep a journal every day of what I did to make the station different, so I can go back and I can see where we were 12 weeks ago.

WHAT GOES INTO THIS JOURNAL?

Conversations with each one of the people that I have during the day. Like I said, every quarter we change. I think we're moving forward. If I tweaked something, if I added more recurrents or if I made a new category, I log that. I update it every night before I go to bed. My laptop and I are very close.

WHAT'S YOUR TAKE ON THE '25-54-ITIS' THAT WAS PLAGUING THIS FORMAT?

I don't think 25-54 has loosened up in Richmond. I hate our rank there, Of the last trends we're #6, but usually we hang out between 8-10 and it's very frustrating. We do very well 18-34. We're either one or two across-the-board. It's interesting, our more seasoned sales people, the one with most of the agencies account, when we have a bad book it hurts them, but the new people really excel because generally if we're doing bad 25-54 we're doing well 12-25, so the new people have an opportunity to explore non-traditional sales avenues. I think our sales manager, Allen Eitzel is brilliant, and we have a healthy respect for each other.

THE SAME WAY YOU'RE SELLING THE FORMAT TO YOUR LISTENERS WITH THIS NON-HYPE APPROACH- HAS THE SALES STAFF BEEN ABLE TO TRANSLATE THAT TO THE STREET AND SELL THE FORMAT TO CLIENTS?

I'm not sure if this answers it directly – One of the greatest strengths of this station in particular is if we ask people to do something, they will. If we're out some place they will come, no matter what it is. I've rarely done an appearance, where we didn't draw a crowd that met with our client's satisfaction. Our sales people always go to the appearances because it's a great way to make contacts and to have a living testimonial that the station works. Our Promotions Director, Dotty Brooks, makes sure that happens.

THE PROMOTIONS DIRECTOR ...ALWAYS THE STATION'S SECRET WEAPON.

Yes. She's very dedicated and has been here longer than I have. She started as the receptionist and knows everything about winning. I like Dotty because she takes chances. She's always pushing me.

LET'S TALK ABOUT SOME OF THE STAFF MEMBERS AT THE RADIO STATION.

Corey, Jay and Betty are the Q Morning Zoo. It's a high profile morning show. They play about seven songs an hour. They are incredibly funny people. We have the funniest meetings. I'm really surprised we ever get anything done in our meetings because it's just like one joke after another. They're really tapped into women 18-34. I haven't had to make them do anything weird like wear women's clothes. Actually they did that one day on their own, but that's a different story...

I'D WORRY ABOUT THAT IF I WERE YOU.

I do. Corey openly admits that he will buy women's magazines and enjoy leafing through them. We have a subscription to just about everything, and they make it a point to immerse themselves in the lifestyle of our listeners. Each one of them has a family of some kind, and they relate with our listeners through their family life and bring it in to the studio. They reveal a lot of things about themselves on the air and they come across as humans. It's all about getting the listeners to buy into the radio station and they do a really good job and plus they're really smart and genuinely nice people. I don't know how I lucked out, to be honest.

WHO'S NEXT ON THE AIR?

Paul Anthony does middays. He's brand new, from KQCR in Cedar Rapids, and is taking the market by storm. My little corn boy. He actually brought me corn when we flew him in for his interview. He handed me this warm, squishy bag, and all I could think of was, "Oh my God, he gave me a turkey carcass." I don't eat meat of any kind, so I was really grossed out. When I opened the bag, I realized it was corn. It had been in the sun so long, it felt like a dead turkey...

Paul is really talented and funny. I've had positive feedback from everybody on the staff and he does all of our club nights. He's the most outgoing one of us and he has all these fun toys lined up in his office.

Mike Rivers is on after that. He's been in radio at least 20 years. He focuses every break. In fact, I find these notes that he writes to himself occasionally in the garbage can or in the studio, and I blow them up and put them up on the door, because he really gets it. He knows how to make the show flow.

I pull 4 to 7 p.m. That's my favorite part of the day. I have to admit, babbling to strangers, "Did you hear about Madonna?" I guess I need that outlet. People would hate me if I wasn't on the air. If I'm feeling obnoxious, during my show I'll write notes on the night guy's log and on the morning log about things that I thought were important. I just bought one of those erasable boards and I'm going to start putting stuff on that. So and so's on Letterman tonight, make sure you mention that.

BILLY SURF IS DOING NIGHTS. THE BEST HAIR IN SHOW BUSINESS...

If I could hire 10 new employees, I would hire 10 new Billy Surfs. He's the Madonna of the staff. He's the one who reinvents himself every single night. He's my best friend and the biggest pain in the neck I've ever worked with. He's very polite to his listeners on the telephone. He actually says I love you to them and it's genuine. He's a very genuine person and it comes across on the air.

He's actually one of the sales department's favorite people to take out because he really delivers when he's out in front of people. He's very listener-interactive on the air, very focused. His breaks are very tight. He does a lot of comedy where he ends up, of course, being the butt of the joke. He actually has an update every night called 'Billy's Night Bites where he has another reporter come in and give the scoop on what's going on with people you'd be interested in hearing about. He also gets good high school gossip, a lot of times from the cheerleaders. Every hour we have some kind of listener interaction on

between 3:55 and 4:00 I'm moving like a mad woman trying to finish my work, which I never quite succeed at but I try not to bring it in with me. I think you can set up a lot of rules but you have to be realistic and you have to be flexible, but when it interferes with my radio show I am the most angry person you have ever met.

If someone has a question about a promotion, I'll say, "Let's set some time tomorrow." That's my first line of defense. If they really need to know tonight, I say, "I'm off at 7 p.m." If they say, "I need an answer right now," then the answer is 'no.'

ARE YOU STILL GETTING THAT GRATIFICATION FROM BEING ON THE RADIO?

This is going to sound really horrible, I've done it for 13 years now, it's something that I'm used to and it's something that I spend a lot of time preparing for, like watching the news and reading the Life section and the trades and catching MTV and Entertainment News, and I need an outlet for it, otherwise I would be

the air...I demand it.

Overnights is Kirby Carmichael. I think Kirby has been on the air as long as we have. He does a great job. He's probably the most well known of the entire staff because he's been on so long. I'll walk into a store or gas station and people always ask, "How's Kirby Carmichael doing?"

TALK ABOUT YOUR MANAGEMENT TEAM.

Linda Forman is our General Manager. She's actually the VP/GM of XL102, which is our Rock sister station in the same building and Q94. It's interesting that you would mention that, because I just went to a Leadership Institute for Managers training session. It was four very intense days, and it was everything that Linda's been telling me for the last two years. She's very hands-on, she has great instincts, and she has great product knowledge. Her husband is also brilliant. He runs our whole research computer system, so she knows what's going on, sometimes before I do.

CAN YOU QUOTE SOME MANAGEMENT HIGH POINTS EITHER FROM HER OR FROM THIS SEMINAR YOU JUST COMPLETED?

Management by objective I thought was very interesting. It involves the entire team. The entire team will come up with an objective. In fact we just did this yesterday with the whole air staff, come up with an objective and then come up with standards to get there. The standards have to be quantifiable, so instead of just saying we'll do show prep, it lists the things that are important to do: I'll see two popular movies a month, I'll rent two popular videos, 1 will make myself aware of issues facing women by reading two women's magazines a month, or whatever.

SO THERE ARE CONCRETE STEPS TO ATTAIN EACH OBJECTIVE?

Exactly and then you go back every week. Did you do this, did you do that? And it gives you a place to start if there's a problem. These are the things we decided we wanted to do. This is what we decided we wanted to put on the air. Is this what's coming out on your aircheck tape? I guess I'm a little off focus, a little too self indulgent or whatever. I didn't pay enough attention to the things I was supposed to do, and it makes it easier to pinpoint the problems and makes it easier to give a complement. I believe in catching my staff doing something right every day. The whole idea with management by objective is instead of focusing on the objective, you focus on the gap between where you are and where you need to be, and then how you need to get there, so as long as you are improving there's that criteria. If you set the right standards, you should be improving and evolving, which is really good. We also talked about the necessity for change. Nothing stays the same, but if it does, then you're behind. We focused on getting a higher level of commitment versus compliance. Finding out what motivates your staff members and how to get them to achieve a higher level of motivation. Getting to know the level of each one of your staff members individually, and managing them based on that instead of based on one theory. W also took lots of self-tests, which were really helpful. I now know all of my weak points. They're glaringly obvious, but my strong points are there too, so I know in a given situation what my tendencies will be, and what they should be.

It was a really good seminar. I want to thank Chris Lytle, Ken Greenwood, and Norm Goldsmith.

ANY FINAL PHILOSOPHY?

As Nathaniel Emmons once said, "Habit is either the best of servants or the worst of masters."

Top40 radio needs to examine its habits often or pay the consequences.



PROMOTIONS ON A BUDGET: MORE BANG FOR LESS BUCKS By Paige Nienaber

Anybody who was in radio during the early to mid 1980's can remember fondly the days of big budget and mega money giveaways. If the ratings went down, the first step that most stations took was to dump a huge amount of cash on the air. Unfortunately, money blowouts don't build loyalty, won't elicit "passion" in your audience and do nothing to connect on an emotional level with the listeners. They may be a quick fix, but they also stifle the creative process and don't force you to find better and more effective ways to promote and market your radio station.

If there has been any benefit from the budget-slashing and belt-tightening that hit radio in the late 80's and continues today, it has forced us to use our minds and not our checkbooks. And in the long run, that makes it better for radio.

I've been a proponent of the promotional mythology that stresses HEAVY community involvement. When a radio station comes from "back in the pack" to overtake the market leader, usually the first place they'll start to win is on the streets. A street-level attack is often more cost effective and much more of an impact than any TV campaign. There's no excuse for a radio station van to be sitting in the parking lot when it could be out making impressions in the community. You wouldn't cover you billboards for 5 to 6 hours a day.

A heavy presence in the community and on the streets can be accomplished for a low price and should be a key factor in any radio stations marketing plan. You should be tapped into what's happening in the market and never miss the opportunity to be at a festival, fair, parade, or similar event. If there's nothing happening, then go make something happen, even if you have to park your van in front of a movie theater on a Sunday aftemoon and impact a thousand people. Or cruise the parks and beaches. Find out where your listeners are and <u>be there</u>.

Whenever there is a major concert or festival, you have the opportunity to impact tens, if not hundreds of thousands of people in a creative way that doesn't cost you much money. Kay Feeney-Caito, formerly of WZPL and now with WFMS/WGRL Indianapolis, found and cost effective way to "crash" the Indy 500. Instead of buying an expensive, and totally out-of-thebudget billboard inside the track, she created her own signage. Many of the residents around the events. It cost her pennies and achieved its goal.

Concerts draw thousands of potential-core listeners and continue to be one of the great "missed opportunities" in the radio industry. For a relative low cost, you can "own" a show by tactically and strategically bannering a show, broadcasting from the venue, and doing creative giveaways that outshine what the competition has going on. For example, if a major artist comes in concert, make arrangements to secure their hotel bed once they've left town, and award it to a contest winner. The cost: some spots for trading out the bed.

More stations are relying on clients to pick up the cost of events and prizes for giveaway. Whenever you get a box of shirts from a movie or record company, don't miss the chance to logo it

motor speedway rent out their yards during the month of races, and use them as parking lots. Handmade "Park Here" signs dot the neighborhoods and streets for a mile in all directions. Kay printed up a thousand "Park Here" signs with her station logo and a space to write in the price. She distributed these for free to all of the home-owners/parking lot operators and succeeded in getting <u>massive</u> visibility in front of the 2 million plus fans who attended the races and its many for a fraction of the cost of buying your own T-shirts. There's always the risk of junking up a promotion with sponsors, but a perfect balance can be found to get clients to pay for an event or contest without turning it into something that sounds like an auction on the air.

Carlos Pedrazza, Promotion Director at 102 Jamz/Orlando, has totally client sponsored station concert that would have cost 102 Jamz thousands of

dollars if they had paid for out-ofpocket. Last Thanksgiving his station did "Free Willy" which was a highly successful promotion that cost the station hardly anything, generated an enormous amount of publicity and raised a large supply of canned food donations for a local food shelf. 102 Jamz got a live turkey, named "Willy", and held him hostage under the threat of execution until a specific amount of food was collected.

Rick Thomas, PD at Wild 107 in San Francisco, says, "I've worked at stations that had a ton of money and the promotions sucked." Budgetary contains have forced Promotion Directors to be more creative in an industry that suffers from mediocrity and thinking inside-the-box. Hopefully, this can only improve the quality of the product. Get ready for





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

It was also the first time in 18 straight books that a Country station has not been #1. Both KSCS and KYNG are tied for #2 with a 5.9. Urban KJMZ moves 3.4 to 4.1, while JOEL FOLGER'S KDGE moves 3.7 to 3.3.
