Programmer's Think Tank

BACK TO THE GOOD TIMES

When I wrote in these pages last year that Top40 was going to come back in vogue, I was told no. Naysayers cited fragmentation of the format and "Refined Music Targeting" as reasons why Top40 couldn't ever re-emerge as a winning format. Well, they were wrong. Few can argue that Top40 has now once again become a viable entity and we're seeing some gratifying success stories – new converts to the format and overall growth.

Part of the creeping comeback of hit radio is the music. Rock-based songs are starting to hit home while Hip-Hop is creating a niche format of its own. Good time music is returning. All of this has many programmers a little off guard. PD's who were groomed on the premise of music-intensive radio aren't practiced in the art of communicating the energy and fun that today's hit music conveys. Radio stations call themselves Magic or Moose or The Edge or The Arrow or The Frog and boast more nonstop music than anybody else. The trouble is, though, that we've overdosed on all that. Bill Drake started uncluttering Top40. Paul Drew, Jerry Clifton, Guy Zapoleon and successive consultants continued the task of removing perceived irritants from hit radio stations. More

music, simple giveaways, music-oriented liners and no-risks.

The pendulum has swung, however. Radio became too sanitized...too tight. Recorded positioners and repetitive liners are the rule, not the exception. I just got back from vacation and not one station I heard used the word "fun" in its moniker. I heard some oldies stations calling themselves "Goodtime Oldies," but can't contemporary stations reflect an upbeat state of mind too? Of course they can – and they should. Top40 stations used to describe themselves as "The Fun One" and other happy slogans. Contests and promotions used to reflect the spirit of fun and games and levity instead of giving away a prize to caller number 16.

Historically, in good economic times, music started to take an opposite turn and wa driven by somber ballads and rebellious songs. In wartime and difficult economic periods, hit music was again a paradox, providing levity, brightness and a beat to lift listeners out of the gloom. Radio listeners are screaming to be lifted out of the gloom. The music is brightening up but the stations have to echo that energy and upbeat mood between the songs. Become "Fun 101" instead of "The Edge." Laugh, play contests, and content.

Driving through the Northeast, I would push "scan" on my car radio on the AM dial. My radio would pick up between 6 and 9 stations at any one time carrying Rush Limbaugh. Is there a clearer message that people are unhappy with the status quo and want radio that reflects a desire to escape. AM talks about dumping the hillbilly moron in the White House, and FM hit music stations need to provide a metronome for happier times.

It's time to replace liners about the superhighway of sound and gigabytes of non-stop music and go to happier messages of fun, frivolity, free form and the good life.

Haiti, Bosnia, Cuba, abandoned nuclear warheads now controlled by starving countries give us all the serious contemplation we need. We must provide escape through our media, not such a serious menu as tabulating and playing the "Best Hit Music of the '80s, '90s and Beyond."

The Top40 days are back. Let's rejoice and play the fun songs in a setting of laughing, scratching fun. Let's sound like we enjoy what we're doing and get everybody into the game. Presentation is everything.

THE RULES OF THE GAME

Part of winning any game is knowing what the rules are. As of Wednesday (October 19), you have completed exactly one-third of the Fall Arbitron game. Let's take a look at the rules.

For example, let's use a market with nearly 1.3 million people like San Jose. During the past two books, Arbitron has achieved an average of 2,013 diaries returned, about 168 a week.

Think about it. Only about 168 diaries per week are representing the "true" listening habits of 1.3 million people. Now, break out the demos. An average of just 56 18-34 diaries are returned weekly. In the 25-54 demo, a 30-year spectrum, only 95 diaries are returned weekly. Think of all the stations chasing those 95 people.

Based on 56 18-34 diaries in the market weekly, a successful 18-34 station will have to be in 20 of those diaries. If just <u>ten</u> of those people decide you talk too much or you play songs THEY don't like and they punch the button...you just blew off 50% of your 18-34 ratings this week!

Remember, Arbitron is only a numbers game. You only have 168 chances out of 1.3 million to score. THAT'S IT!

Winning this game means knowing <u>exactly</u> who your audience is and what THEY want. Winning means playing only the best songs THEY want, not cluttering the station with too much talk, commercials or promotions THEY don't care about, being involved in lifestyle events THEY care about, maintaining high visibility in THEIR streets, and effective marketing tactics. There are only 168 diaries out there right now. What are you doing <u>right now</u> to make sure those 168 people REMEMBER your station?

To win the game, you need as many diaries as possible. That means, winning the ARB game in Top40 means being cume-driven, broadening your appeal to as much cume as possible without alienating your core audience (which logs up to 70% of your time spent listening). It's a tough balancing act.

Usually, in most winning situations I've worked in, every seventh diary is a high TSL diary. The bigger your cume, the bigger your stack of diaries, and the more times you win a high TSL diary. You actually increase time spent listening by building cume. Remember, it's only a numbers game.

Arbitron is calculated in 15-minute increments, the quarter hour. Play the odds. With only 168 chances out of 1.3 million to score during those 15 minutes, your audience better hear songs THEY love. Therefore, a Top40 playing a tight list of the hottest hits will generally have higher ratings.

To increase your chances of winning, you must work <u>continuously</u> to discover what your audience wants. You may find that what you want and what they want are not the same. Open up your mind and your ears.

Ultimately, know who your audience is. Give them what THEY want. You will increase your odds of hitting one of those 168 chances out of 1.3 million each week. Remember, it's only a numbers game.



DEAD CAN DANCE <u>American Dreaming</u> (4AD/ELEKTRA) - They've created a seductive and powerful genre all their own. This is a live album that sounds as good as any of their studio efforts.

Josh would like it if it wasn't so out-of-key, and gives it one star.

ARMIDA SANTA CRUZ, Alt. Show Producer, KIOT, Santa Fe

DOWN BY LAW Punkrockacadamyfightsong (EPITAPH) - Punk as F**k (in which they don't say f**k) and Goodnight Song (in which they do say f**k) are just two of the outstanding tunes on this release of Punk-ish Rock with snappily barked lyrics and keen guitars. (Note: The cover of 500 Miles is killer!)

PORTISHEAD <u>Sour Times-Airlines Reconstruction</u> (LONDON) - Captivating vocals and a rockin' music bed...I just keep listening to it and feel something different each time.

1,000 HOME D.J.'S NATIVITY IN BLACK (COLUMBIA) - A crazed, delirious cover of Black Sabbath's <u>Supernaut</u>...Just gut-jerking, just good!

SUSIE DUNN, Alt. Show Producer, KLPX, Tucson

TODD SNYDER My Generation/Alright Guy (MCA) - So great – A little treat we received from the music business. Lyrically, Todd's writing some of the best stuff I've heard this year.

IDHA <u>Oooh La La</u> (TRI STAR) - This song is from the EP. A woman in a man's world. She does a great cover of The Faces, <u>Oooh La La</u>. Original. Other songs to check out are: <u>A Song For You</u> and <u>Willing</u>. A faster, more uptempo song is <u>Going To Mexico</u>.

OASIS <u>Cigarettes And Alcohol</u> (CREATION/EPIC) - A new single in England. It's very T-Rex. Also check out their amazing Godhead live version of <u>I Am The Walrus</u>. A supersonic type of song is called <u>Listen Up</u> & <u>Fade Away</u>.

LANCE AVANSINO, Air Personality, KRZQ, Reno

ECHO BELLY <u>Insomniac</u> (TRANS GLOBAL) - Morrissey's favorite new group – and mine too!





HITMAKERS Guest COLUMNS

DAVE FERGUSON, PD KSFM/Sacramento

AUDISK, THE PROGRAM DIRECTORS DREAM

I'm not much into conversations. Too many people looking for jobs. Too many hoodlums in the hotel lobby. Too many week long hangovers after the conventions are done. The majority of radio conventions are just big parties, except for one - The NAB. Oh sure, there are the usual parties each evening out in the host city's restaurants and night clubs, but there are actually a few people who go to the NAB to learn something. Believe it or not, I am one of those people.

I found a variety of interesting exhibits in both the radio/audio exhibit section, and the multimedia area. In all, about 130,000 square feet of exhibit space was sold this year. 53,400 of it for radio alone. There's something at the NAB for everyone, especially producers and programmers.

It's amazing to imagine how much digital technology is changing the radio industry. A Program Director can now sit at home with a lap top computer and run his radio station. Music, drops, weather forecasts, everything at the touch of a key. One system that I know of first hand with just such technology is an automation system called AUDISK, (audio-disk). With this program every element on your radio station becomes a file on the disk and is given a 4 digit number. Commercials are dubbed straight onto file, eliminating carts and cart machines. Songs are "files" too. Even disk jockeys become voices on a file. With the right program you can even transfer music logs and commercial logs directly to the AUDISK. No more paper! Who'd read it anyway? There are no live jocks! Yes, automation has come along way since the days of old. You can record to file a variety of weather forecasts, then on Saturday morning from your home, tune in the weather channel, decide which of your prefiled forecasts fits the day's weather, punch in it's four digit file number and "Hallelujah! There's snow in the mountains!"

One thing that's critical with AUDISK is the "end of-marker". This one is a tone put at or near the end of every file to tell the next file to begin. These markers are put on manually, and placement is very important to making the automation flow smoothly. A misplaced marker will leave overlaps or dead air in commercial sets, segues, etc...

AUDISK eliminates lots of things and lots of

people, but not everything and everybody. You still need a talented Program Director who can temper the technology with the art of radio to make it sound great. If you think AUDISK or a similar program could be for you, Les Tracy, Program Director of KSMJ-AM in Sacramento will gladly relay some of his experiences to you. Feel free to call him with questions at 916-920-1025.

GREAT AIR TALENT, THE SEARCH IS ON!

As Program Director, one of the hardest parts of your job is to find new, quality people. You regularly have to be on the search for air people. In fact, that's probably the only way to go about it. Look and listen constantly. The great air talent you hear today could fill the opening you have next year. It's really a good idea to keep a list of talents you'd like to hire one day.

Each choice has many restrictions. Can you find someone who doesn't need to be moved? If you do pay for relocating, how much will it cost? Of course you've usually also got the pressure of finding someone to fill your open position at a lower cost than you were paying. Will your candidate for the position relate as well in your market as they do in their current market? What effect will this person have on the other members of your staff? Just another set of reasons why they call the PD job a "hot seat".

The obvious way to find available air talent is to put the word out in the trades. HITMAKERS lists Actual Damn Jobs almost every week, so do the other trades. Usually you'll get a large response from a trade ad or mention. If you're looking for someone who's already in your market, ask your jocks for help. Most jocks know a local talent who at least

qualify to be considered.

If you really want the best way to find talent, ask another Program Director. In fact, you really need to have an ongoing dialogue with several PD's who can relate to your format. As Paul Drew would say, "This is one of those things in life that works better than it should." If you can regularly talk with a few PD's who are facing the same situations, you'll get the best input ever on possible hires.

The other PD's can tell you about people who have applied that they have no place for. Many times they've already met a person, or even better, they've worked with the person you're checking on. In fact, I have to say that most of my hires have been based on information I've gotten from other Program Directors.

It's a different story when you're looking for an entry level air talent. The weekend talents on the other stations in town are always a possibility. That way you can hear them un-edited, over the course of several weeks or months. Another good talent source for a new air talent is you local college or high school station. Many of these kids are really dedicated to radio and music. In most cases, they are working for no pay.

Another place to check for an entry level jock is at local clubs, skating rinks and even record stores. In some areas there are mobile DJs to consider. I suppose you could get the guy who operates the Himalayan ride at the carnival, but that might be reaching. It all depends on the size of your market and your willingness to train a person.

One last suggestion. Look around at the non-air people already on your staff. It doesn't happen often, but sometimes the kid who drives the van is a good person to train. What about the mix DJ? I know a few mixers who became excellent jocks. The great thing about mix DJs is they know the audience is there for the music. They are hip and in touch with the street. Not bad for a start.

Hiring is the most important thing you do as a Program Director. Where will you find your next great talent?

INJECTING SOME FUN INTO YOUR WEEKEND GIVEAWAYS BY: PAIGE NIENABER

The title for this week's column hopefully sums it all up: "weekends are a state of mind". They're something that your audience works towards and are consumed with planning for, all week. If they head home on Friday afternoon and tune into your station to hear some stale Free Music Weekend, that will go a long way toward totally de-vibing them.

Fallacy #1: Weekend giveaways are a great place to dump unwanted prizes and items that some account executive committed you to. Wrong. Weekend giveaways are outstanding opportunities to tie-in something that is topical and timely: a concert stop by one of your core artists, a holiday celebration, a championship appearance by a local sports team, or even something wacky, unusual or out-of-theordinary such as the wedding of two celebrities like Michael Jackson and Lisa-Marie Presley.

Fallacy #2: Great prizes are a key ingredient to a successful weekend giveaway. Wrong again. Prizes are entirely secondary. For instance take the giveaway that WPGC did when Left-Eye from TLC was involved in the arson of her boyfriend's home. They gave out smoke detectors, fire extinguishers and TLC CD's. None of these were "strong" prizes. But it was topical and highly entertaining, which are the two criteria you should keep at the top of your list. When I was at KISS 102 in Charlotte, the day Jim Bakker was sentenced we gave

away "Jim Bakker Prison Survival Kits" which were nothing more than a cassette of "Jail House Rock", a Twinkie with a file in it, a bar of soap that said "Don't Drop" on it, and a lifetime membership to the North Carolina Department of Corrections. The audience went nuts trying to win these things, yet there was no cash, concert tickets or other bigbuck prizes involved.

There are some stations out there that consistently do great weekend giveaways. Q-102 in Philadelphia is one such station. For a normally throw-away holiday like Labor Day, they presented an "In Labor Day Weekend" that featured listeners "birthing" their prizes on the air, complete with the prerequisite screaming,

instead choose to do "Bays II Men In 30 Minutes or less". All weekend long, within a half hour of winning, Q-102 listeners had their Boys II Men CD delivered to their door by a station van, accompanied, of course, by a Dominos pizza.

Fallay #3: Weekend giveaways are simple contests that don't require much planning or prepromotion. In this case, that's partially wrong. Weekend's allow you to react quickly if something exciting newsworthy happens. You can turn it into a weekend theme and have it on the air in minutes. But these contests shouldn't be treated flippantly to be something that you start worrying about Friday afternoon. Whenever possible, plan your

Don't make weekends the throw-away dumping ground for prizes that don't fit into your regular, Monday to Friday contesting. Use this opportunity to get wild and have some fun. I mean, isn't that what weekends are all about anyway?

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
