NAPOLIELLO PROMOTED TO SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, PROMOTION, EMI RECORDS





Programmer's Think Tank

WHAT DO WE REALLY NEED TO KNOW?

The Federal Government recently spent nearly a half million dollars on a research project analyzing why eating pizza burns the roof of your mouth. I personally find that so ludicrous that it's funny. We all know that pizza, however cooled off we might think it is, still burns the roof of the mouth. So what?!!? Anyhow, after this exhaustive study was completed, it discovered that the melted cheese holds the heat, and that's what burns only the top part of your mouth. Whew, heavy discovery.

As I say, I laughed at the fact that anyone would waste time, money and resources from our taxes for such a pointless project. Then I realized that it was probably somebody with a radio background who commissioned that study. We're the only people who go to such an extent as to dignify the imponderables of life. Take a radio guy, put him in the pizza business, and give him the results of the hot mouth research, and I guarantee you he'd stop putting cheese on his pizza and start promoting "Painless Pizza." There'd never be any consideration that the pizza would taste like shit without cheese...we just made it pain avoidance. Wow! How "radio" that reaction would be.

Radio manages to focus on irritants rather

than conceptual positives. We're an industry built on removing the tune-outs instead of building a concept. There's a new book every broadcaster must read. "Built To Last: Successful Habits of Visionary Companies" by Collins and Porras is a fascinating look at the value of the big picture instead of the nitpicking things which preoccupy so many radio people who spend all day with their noses in the computer, painstakingly agonizing over which song to play when.

Companies and organizations that are "Built to Last" have a mission statement beyond just a product. Radio gives its mission statement on "The Best Hits of the '80s and '90s Without The Rap" or "Always 12 in a Row" or "The Hit Music Station." Those are pretty lame mission statements when you compare them to Disney's mission statement to "Use Our Imagination to Bring Happiness to Millions." When Sam Walton built Wal-Mart he wanted to create a great retailing outfit. He didn't know what kind of retailing. Merck's Mission Statement is "To Preserve and Improve Human Life – somehow a little more open to growth than "Iowa"s Best Mix of Music," don't you think?

Companies that succeed are visionary. While 3-M evolved in the 1920's to the giant it is today, competitor Norton vowed to stick to making grinding wheels. Furthermore, Collins

and Porras point out that visionary companies launch "BHAG" (which stands for Big Eairy Audacious Goals). Motorola did that when they built a worldwide cellular phone system. Boeing risked the company on the 747 jetliner. Meanwhile, your station's 'BHAG" is whether or not to add the new Boyz II Men song, and should we sweep the top of the hour, running the I.D. at: 55.

The fact is that true success isn't measured just in quarterly earnings. A true success isn't measured in one book or two or three. You must look at things over a longer per od. Resiliency, bouncing back and coming out stronger – that capability is so powerful in all successful companies.

Certainly it's foolhardy to disregard any piece of input which comes from a reliable source. It matters somewhat how the new Boyz II Men is performing elsewhere and how it tests. It matters that cheese causes pizza to burn the roof of your mouth. On the other hand, neither fact should singly prevent you from adding a record or putting melted cheese on your pizza. We cannot be truly successful if we look at the time and build our missions from the time. We need to build the clock – through the clock we control the time.







GRIFTERS <u>CRAMPIN'</u> <u>YOU</u> <u>NEGATIVE</u> (SHANGRALA) - This album makes about as much sense as the album title. Cruddy, electric brilliance that rumbles with the youthful anarchy of trying to create something in a world where everything has been done.

SMOKE *The Pond* (LONG PLAY) - The album is called <u>HEAVIN' ON A POPSICLE STICK</u>. Bizarre amalgamation of New Orleans funeral march, Middle Eastern Pharoh dance and Tom Waits.

R.E.M. <u>Star 69</u> (WARNER BROS.) - It's a great album.

URGE OVERKILL Girl. You'll Be A Woman Soon (MCA) - Try it, you will like it!

SOUL ASYLUM <u>Can't Even Tell</u> (CHAOS/COLUMBIA) - Well-rounded rockin', but not too rockin'

DINK <u>Green Mind</u> (CAPITOL) - You can't help but smile with these snotty-nosed dudes, and if you don't like it, go to hell!

JEFF PETTERSON, Alt. Show Producer, KLZR, Lawrence

SUPERCHUNK <u>Driveway To Driveway</u> (MERGE) - Second single from this great Chapel Hill, NC band. If you missed the boat on <u>The First Port</u>, it's time to check this one out.

JOHN SPENCER BLUES EXPLOSION <u>ORANGE</u> (MATADOR) - Rock-solid Bluesy, Stompabilly. This will add a little diversity to your sound.

FASTBACKS Waste Of Time (SUB POP) - Cool, fast tunes from this almost legendary Northwestern band.

LES AARON, Air Personality, KPNT, St. Louis

JESUS & MARY CHAIN <u>Come On</u> (IMMORTAL/ EPIC) - This is my recommendation for the second single.

OASIS Cigarettes & Alcohol (EPIC) - Getting more requests for this track than any other.

SWIRL <u>Strange Lands</u> (DIRT) - Just a really cool sound from Australia. Very different. Their live show is great!

RODNEY BINGENHEIMER, Air Personality, KROQ, Los Angeles

CHINA DRUM <u>Great Fire</u> (FLUFFY BUNNY IMPORTS) - Punk Rock at its finest. They are from the UK and they are also touring with Green Day in the UK. Other cuts to check out: 1) <u>Biscuit Barre</u>l, 2) <u>Meaning</u>, and 3) <u>Down By The River</u>. This one starts slow but it kicks in hard.

PATRICIA MORRISON <u>Reflection</u> (PMMC) - She was formerly with The Mission. This is her first solo project. The seven-song EP is called <u>REFLECT ON THIS</u>. Very gothic but with some instrumentals. The best cuts are: 1) <u>The Living End</u>, and 2) <u>Reflection</u>. She writes all the songs herself.

LET LOOSE <u>Crazy For You</u> (MERCURY IMPORT) - This three-piece band is very Pop Commercial. They are the next stars. It's like Duran Duran meets Scritti Politti. The best songs are: 1) <u>Crazy For You</u> and 2) <u>Cardboard City</u>.

SOUP DRAGONS May The Force Be With You (MERCURY) - The album is called HYDRO-PHONIC. This sound is beyond T Rex, because Micky Finn of T Rex is playing on the album. Put on your platforms and check out: 1) Don't Get Down (Get Down) 2) May The Force Be With You 3) Contact High and 4) Out of Here.

GEORGE ROSTA, Alt. Show Producer, KSLY, San Luis Obispo

JEFF BUCKLEY <u>Grace</u> (COLUMBIA) - Just because this artist's music cannot easily be pigeonholed into 'Grunge,' 'AAA,' or whatever silly category, does not mean it should be ignored. GINA RIGGI, Speciality Show Personality/Producer, KWNZ, Reno

LORDS OF ACID <u>Voodoo</u> <u>U</u> (AMERICAN) - Totally wild! The cover artwork alone will make you go 'hmmm.' **DAVE MATTHEWS BAND** <u>What Would You Say</u> (RCA) - Featuring the unmistakable flair of John Popper from Blues Traveler on harmonica. Too groovin'!

MICHAEL HAYES, Alt. Show Producer, KWOD,

MALCO <u>Koukou's Dance</u> (COYOTE/POLYGRAM) - One that takes me right in and wraps itself around...A very atmospheric, fabulous piece of work skewed from the repetition. The sequence changes throughout the track definitely take ya' for a ride. It's perfect for 'Ambience!'

ICE MC Think About The Way (WEA) - Words can't describe this one, but I'll try...High energy and climactic with strong female vocals and Reggae that'll have you humming, 'bom digi digi digi bom digi bom! I've already worn the groove on my copy.

LA BOUCHE <u>Sweet Dreams</u> (ARISTA) - You can't help but sing along to this track. It's simply...FUN! Give it a spin!

SWEDISH EAGLE, Air Personality, THE IMPORT SHOW, Los Angeles

FATIMA MANSIONS <u>Nite Flights</u> (RADIOACTIVE) - What more can I say about this band? Another amazing single! Get this album, <u>LOST IN THE FORMER WEST!</u> You won't be disappointed.

SUGAR <u>Believe What You're Saying</u> (RYKODISC) - Just released in the U.S. Bob Mould can do no wrong! Well, at least not with this one.



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SCOTT ROBBINS PD, WBNQ, Bloomington, IL

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN WITH THE STATION, SCOTT?

Well, it depends. I was here '84-'88. Then I did mornings at KKRD in Wichita for three years, then came back here to program in '91.

I UNDERSTAND THIS IS YOUR HOMETOWN.

This is very close to my hometown, Washburn, Illinois, a town of 1200 people about 40 miles northwest of here. It's cool for me because I've always had a very close, tight-knit family, and it was difficult to leave them when I did. Working here gives me the opportunity to do something I really like with a great radio station, a great company and I can still go home and have Sunday dinner with my Mom and Dad.

WHO OWNS THE STATION?

Bloomington Broadcasting, who also owns WKLQ in Grand Rapids, KZ106 in Chattanooga, the Tri-Cities, and we just bought 'LAV too in Grand Rapids not too long ago. We own B106 in Columbia, South Carolina and continuing to buy property. This is the home office for the company. We see the guy who owns our company, Timothy R. Ives, every day, which is cool. He's a broadcaster. He's not really hands-on in terms of coming in here and asking why we're doing this or doing that. He's hires good people and let's them do their job, and so far, so good.

WHAT'S THE MAJOR INDUSTRY IN BLOOMINGTON, ILLINOIS?

We're a big university town. Both Illinois State University and Illinois Wesleyan University are here. Illinois State has about 25,000 students and Wesleyan has between 3,000 and 5,000, so we're talking about a pretty good population base of students. The world headquarters of State Farm Insurance is also here. They own everything. What they don't own, Country Company's Insurance owns, which is also here. This is a big insurance town. There's also the Diamond Star Motors plant here where they make all the Mitsubishi Eclipses and Galants. Bloomington is the fastest growing city in Illinois. Outside of Chicago, this is the most expensive city to live in in the state. A kid will come out of college at Illinois State and into a job at State Farm as a computer programmer for \$25,000-\$30,000 a year, and if you're 24-25 years old and making that kind of money, you have a lot of disposable income, so housing here is expensive. Very low crime rate, very white collar.

YOU PROGRAM IN A COLLEGE TOWN. YOU HAVE TO PAY ATTENTION TO THE FACT THAT THE SCHOOL IS THERE, BUT YOU CAN'T PROGRAM ACTIVELY TO A TRANSIENT POPULATION THAT DOESN'T HOLD DIARIES.

Correct. I don't worry about them too much. We are probably a little quicker on the Alternative records, and that's simply because there's a large acceptance for those. Most of the students here are from Chicago and they hear these records on Q101, plus most of them are active in the club scene in and around the Chicago area, so when they get here a lot of these songs are familiar to them. If we daypart properly we can serve two masters, the townies and the students.

Unless you live in or around the university you don't even know it's there. There are occasional problems that arise from time to time, but for the most part everybody lives pretty much in harmony. The students have their things going on and the townies have theirs. Except during basketball


CAUSED THESE OTHER STATIONS TO GIVE UP THE FORMAT? IS IT THE SAME UPPER DEMO-ITIS THAT CONTINUES TO AFFECT TOP40 RADIO?

Absolutely. That and I think people too quick to try to fix something that wasn't broken. Rather than wait and ride it out, choosing to take either too much of an Alternative direction or too much of a Dance direction and ending up alienating a lot of people who used to love your radio station prior to that.

WHAT'S BEEN THE KEY TO WBNQ's SURVIVAL?

I think just being totally mass appeal. Also, when the music isn't quite right or you don't feel like the strength of the music will carry your radio station you had better have people on the air who are personalities. We have that. I do the morning show along with our music director, Scott Laughlin. We also brought in a female newscaster named Colleen Reynolds to help keep us away from the 'boys club' mentality. Our midday show is anchored by a female who also hosts a cable television show. Her name is Patti Crilly.

In the afternoon, we have a guy named J.D. Scott. We have a lot of Scott's here. J.D.'s been here since

Right. "When are you going to play some Rock & Roll?" Scott Laughlin once told me that radio is the only business where people will drive by your billboard screaming out the call letters of your competition, but if you worked at McDonald's, people wouldn't drive-thru screaming, 'Burger King!'

THE BLOOMINGTON MARKET MUST LEND ITSELF TO MANY FINE PROMOTIONAL OPPORTUNITIES? HOW DO YOU KEEP PEOPLE AWARE OF THE STATION?

God, we do everything. Everything that happens in town we're involved in. During Illinois State basketball games we do "The Halftime Shootout" every year and give away a car. We drive that through one of our car dealers here. We're always doing tailgate parties during football season. We're in every single parade that there is in town. We buy every available billboard we can buy. Our van is always out. We also do a ton of remotes, so we're very, very visible. We're the most visible radio station in town, bar none.

DO YOU FIND IT EASIER OR MORE DIFFICULT NOT HAVING ANY DIRECT FORMAT COMPETITION?

Much harder.

IT'S GREAT GETTING SOMEONE OUT OF THE FORMAT, BUT SOMETIMES THAT TENDS TO MAKE YOU FAT AND LAZY.

And the other problem is not being able to use someone else to familiarize your music. Now we're the only ones playing a particular type of music. As far as hit music, we're it, and that's difficult because now we're

and football seasons or in the event of a major concert you wouldn't even know the schools were here.

TELL ME ABOUT ANY DIFFERENCES IN THE STATION OR THE MARKET BETWEEN YOUR FIRST TOUR OF DUTY AND YOUR CURRENT TOUR.

The market has become much more competitive. We probably aren't as wide as we used to be, but we're still a pretty broad-based Top40. You can play Crystal Waters and Weezer on the same radio station. I enjoy that aspect of this radio station. Also, the town is much bigger than it was before, and now I'm the only Top40 radio station in the area – KZ93 in Peoria and WLRW in Champagne have all gone AC.

WHAT DO YOU SUPPOSE

Marconi invented the radio. I think he's been at the radio station 20 years. Everybody in town knows this guy, and everybody likes him. He's one of the nicest guys I've ever met in my life.

At night we have a young kid we just call Greg who is involved in the schools and every other thing that he can get his hands into, and overnights we have Aaron C. Aaron who has been here over 15 years. I remember listening to both Aaron and J.D when I was in high school.

I'M SURE THEY APPRECIATE YOU MENTIONING THAT.

I grew up with these guys at the radio station. Aaron also owns a Mobile DJ business, with video, the whole media extravaganza.

With Halloween under you belt, it's time to turn your sights on Thanksgiving; the official halfway point of the busy holiday promotional season. (Whoever scheduled Halloween. Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years to all fall within a 60-day period was either on drugs or had never been a radio Promotion Director!)

Thanksgiving is always a tremendous opportunity for radio stations to do something significant and meaningful for their market. Food drives, and blanket clothing campaigns and promotions to help the homeless are all good things to do, but they've become almost expected: every station in town is going to be doing one or more of these, so whatever you do had better be so unbelievably spectacular and unique, or it's going to get lost in the shuffle everyone else's promotions and events.

Make a decision; what are you going to collect and who is going to be the benefit of your campaign? Then try to figure out a way to put a spin on this so that it'll stand out from the

"Marathon Broadcasts" from on top of buildings or billboards are fairly standard, but they do generate some attention and will make your station stand out amongst the pack of stations who are doing "Coats For The Cold" collections and similar programs. Where can your you stick poor, unsuspecting jock so that it'll create a buzz, get a lot of press, and create passion in the audience? (Or at least enough passion so that they'll get off their butts and drive over to drop off a sack of groceries or clothing.) Think "high". How about on top of your local coliseum, or from a window washer's platform on top of the tallest building in town? That'd work.

The key to any charitable drive is often the one that most radio stations completely miss the boat on. What group or organization is going to get all the clothes, food or cash? If it's

not "tangible", nobody is going to want to donate. "The Greater Twin Cities Emergency Food Shelf Relief Fund". What the hell is that? But there are always going to be stations out there collecting items for some similarly obscure untangible charity.

How can you make your campaign sound "real", effective and tangible? Why not cut out the middle-man? Everything that you collect with your super incredible marathon broadcast from the top of the transmitter is "going to be delivered directly into the hands of listeners who have had a tough 1994 and could sure use a sack of groceries/turkey/warm clothing. "That would be one way to be much more impactful than the other radio stations in town. Your collected food and coats are not going to disappear into some "black hole" charity and never make it into the hands of your listeners who could really use then.

Thanksgiving also is (unfortunately) the only time of

market, plus it's a good way to initiate a clothing or blanket campaign.

Thanksgiving can also be fun and there are a ton of promotions you can do that are not "heavy" and focused on getting listeners to give you Turkeys are like stuff. pumpkins and Christmas trees. There's a world of possibilities once you get your hands on a hundred turkeys.

Relatives are always a good "hook". Do a "Retreat From The Relatives" party on Thanksgiving night and give your audience some place to escape to. Steve Conley, the Program Director at FM 100 in Memphis does an annual contest called "Ready For The Relatives" that gives one lucky listener extra furniture for all the excess bodies who will be invading their home, plus a fridge full of food for the holiday dinner.

One thing that Steve won't do is "Dinner On The Mayflower". No matter how much you dress it up and decorate it, there's



DR. ALBAN Away From Home (LOGIC) - Once again the Doctor's in the house, or should I say Reggae? Like a kid in a candy store chok-full of mixes!

MIRANDA Round And Round (SUNSHINE) - Yo! People! Wake up and smell the pollution! Don't you see a hit when you hear it? Look at your dance floor!

SWEDISH EAGLE/STEVE TSEPELIS, GROOVE RADIO INT., Los Angeles

JAMES CHRISTIAN & FRANKIE BONES <u>2 Clues</u> <u>EP</u> (EMPIRE) - A wicked duo to say the least. Features 2 tracks, 4 mixes. A-side features a track called <u>Chant</u> which is basically a tribal stomper. GREED <u>Pump Up The Volume</u> (WHITE LABEL) - 2 mixes and 2 main tracks mixed and sampled are the <u>Nightcrawlers</u> and of course <u>Pump Up The Volume</u>. Lots of other samples included in this powerful, straight ahead sound with some hip hop sections and progressive meanderings.

JAZZY JIM, HOT97.7, San Jose

ROCHELLE <u>Praying For An Angel</u> (S.O.S.) - A very energetic dance record that has caused a big comotion out here on the West Coast. If you're playing Spanish Fly, Little Suzy or Collage than this one's a must for your station.

BEASTIE BOYS <u>Sure Shot</u> (CAPITOL) - One of the few across-the-board 'hip hop/alternative' acts once again shows why music can cross into both extremes. Another automatic reaction record.

DR. ALBAN <u>Away From Home</u> (LOGIC) - Oh, what a smash! Play it now because radio will burn this one out! And on the underground club tip:

ACE OF BASE <u>Living In Danger</u> (ARISTA) - For the big clubs only, and let it play through. It is like two songs in one.

MOBY <u>Feeling So Real</u> (ELEKTRA) - This sound still works. 140 bpm Unashamed Piano mix hits hard. It makes you look up in the DJ booth or at the radio dial and say, 'yeah, Markus is rockin!'
