POLLY ANTHONY APPOINTED PRESIDENT OF SONY 550 MUSIC AND SR. VP, EPIC RECORDS GROUP

Polly Anthony has been named President, Sony 550 Music, and Senior Vice President, Epic Records Group, it was announced by David Glew, Chairman, Epic Records Group. In her new roles, Ms. Anthony will continue to report to both Mr. Glew and Epic Records President, Richard Griffiths.

"Polly's contribution to the growth of Epic Records Group and Sony Music has been consistent and substantial," commented Sony Music Entertainment President and Chief Operating Officer Thomas D. Mottola. "While each phase of her career has revealed new facets of Polly's talents, they all share the same constant: creative growth. She has proven time and again her ability to take artists, and now labels,

to the next level. I applaud this appointment."





The Genesis of the '90s reaches its halfway point in a month and there are so many driving forces that have been part of the development occurring the "first half" that is truly a classic representation of the paradigm that's sweeping its way through industry and technology that in no way is exclusive to radio or really any one business. It seems that just about everything is under 'round the clock reconstruction.

The emotion, zip and delight is the "pilot light" for me and lots of people, I'm grateful to know. The other side of the coin, there is an overwhelming wind that seems to be blowing harder than ever. This wind is the wind of change Hold on tight...'cause this "wind" is only a breeze compared to what's to come. I've mentioned before that it's a good idea to watch successful people. Finding role models and studying the clues they leave behind can often save you lots of time and frustration. (I use myself as an example of one who did a lot of that. I'd go out and make an utter fool of myself. Through that experience, however, it was enough to make me realize that there was much to learn and lots of growing to do.)

A romantic for this crazy radio business drives me with a passion that just won't shut off. Being a romantic brings along one of the reasons I enjoy plotting future relationships. Looking back at powerful life experiences can help get us set up for a supercharged goalsetting system to bring about a more compelling and successful future. Looking back doesn't mean focusing on the past. That's like staring at the sun – you lose your ability to see. Referencing, checking in with the flow chart, so to speak, of the progress you've made and possibly some areas that need to be freshened up in your core belief system.

The holidays are coming...and a little down time until the calendar says 1995. I hope that you set aside some time for yourself and rest up, take a deep breath and be prepared for another year of invention, inspiration, etc., as the race to 2000 is on...a very fast track.

There are lots of great books out there. Sometimes I think too many. (I like the idea of having a "chip" implanted in the brain so that we could just download the information for instant access). Just go to the bookstore, present your data card for hook-up, have chair, get wired up and a few minutes later walk out with all the extra information neatly planted in your brain for when you need it. The "organic

computer" we carry around between our ears and the "hardware" as we know it today...I'll bet ya it's just around the corner. One book really worth reading is Tom Peters-Seminar. It's a great new book by a guy who has a grip on what's happening. The sub-title of the book is Crazy Times For Crazy Organizations. I like a remark he makes that sums up where we are and what approach we should be taking in today's marketplace. "Welcome to a world where imagination is the source value in the economy. 'IT'S AN INSANE WORLD, AND IN AN INSANE WORLD, SANE ORGANIZA-TIONS MAKE NO SENSE." The rules are changing fast...every day, every minute and every second.

Let's look at approaches next. There seems to be a lot of confusion out there. You have the passion, now let's answer the wake-up call, focus amidst mayhem, and go for it with more personal and professional success as our reward.



PETE DROGE Fourth Of July (AMERICAN) - Don't let the picture of the nerdy used-car salesman on the cover fool you, the LP goes down smooth and easy...Why, it may even make you smack your lips. These musicians don't rock in an in-your-face sort of way, it's a subtle 'feel' kind of rock. Instant phones!

MASSIVE ATTACK <u>S/v</u> (VIRGIN) - A floating, sensuous groove. Glad they're back!

EGGSTONE <u>The Dog</u> (CRITIQUE) - Kinda cute, very snappy. Why, it's power-Pop! <u>Luck</u> also sounds good on the air.

DAVID SADOF, The Guy Who Does "Exposure" KLOL, Houston

PEARL JAM <u>Not For You</u> (EPIC) - I liked this song when I first heard it on <u>Saturday Night Live</u> and I'm glad to see it's on the album. An early favorite!

ELECTRAFIXION Zephyr (WEA IMPORT) - It's great to see former Echo And The Bunnymen members Jon McCullock and Will Sargeant back together again. Looking forward to the rest of the album.

JEFF PETTERSON, Alt. Show Producer, KLZR, Lawrence

GARY YOUNG <u>Birds In Traffic</u> (BIG CAT) - A bit goofy, but very original stuff with great drumming from Pavement's first drummer.

RED RED MEAT Make You Gone (DRAG CITY) - Great acoustic guitar over a quiet layer of distorted

beauty. This song is found on the cool <u>HEY DRAG</u> <u>CITY</u> compilation.

KEVIN SALEM <u>Lighthouse Keeper</u> (ROADRUNNER) - He's worked with Freedy Johnston and now he has a new solo release. Very cool mid-tempo guitar-based folk-rockers.

JACK LOGAN <u>Shrunken Head</u> (TWIN TONE) - Just listen to the quality and original songwriting.

POLO IDAHO, Air Personality, KQEX, Fortuna

VARIOUS <u>Dark Entries</u> (CLEOPATRA) - From the album <u>GOTHIC ROCK</u>. I like it...I liked it before and I like it now...Admittedly I'd rather be listening to Biohazard or Deconstruction, Pale Saints, P.J. Harvey and the like, but you're not interested in that...Curse you!...There's nothing grey and dreary about either of these collections...They hum and burble with life, as does goth itself I should say...A lot of these songs are now virtually impossible to find elsewhere and there's some exclusives...An attractive movement, and attractive ideas and two beautiful, simpering records. Also check out <u>Say It Isn't So</u>, from the <u>IN GOTH DAZE</u> album.

RODNEY BINGENHEIMER, Air Personality, KROQ, Los Angeles

CRASH TEST DUMMIES <u>Dumb And Dumber</u> (RCA) - This has been the year of the great movie soundtracks. This is one to wind up the year. What better way to start off than with Crash Test Dummies featuring Ellen Reid, plus Dead Eye Dick doing <u>New Age Girl.</u> I can't believe that two of my favorite bands are on it. Echo Belly <u>Insomniac</u>. The Primatives <u>Crash</u> with a different mix. More guitar sound and even ending with a car sound. Also Gigolo Aunts <u>Where I Find My Love</u> and Butt Hole Surfers doing <u>Hurdy Gurdy Man</u>.

EGGSTONE <u>Split</u> (CRITIQUE) - The best cuts are <u>Luck</u>, <u>Corflake Crow</u> and <u>Split</u>. They're from Sweden. **THE CATCHERS** <u>Cotton Dress</u> (SETATA IMPORT) - A four-piece band with a girl singing. A different sound. Also check <u>Jesus Space Man</u> and <u>Song For Autumn</u>. The album is called <u>MUTE</u>.

BLUR End Of A Century (FOOD) - Also check out for unusual listening <u>Red Nechs</u> and for something really weird, <u>Alex's Song</u>.

GEORGE ROSTA, Alt. Show Producer, KSLY, San Luis Obispo

BAD RELIGION 21st Century (Digital Boy) (ATLANTIC) - Another strong dose of reality from a band that gets better with each release. Consistently strong lyrics and great music.

LLOYD COLE *Morning Is Broken* (RYKODISC) - A tune which grows on you more with each listen. Cole still has a strong fan base and this song is perfect for stations whose playlists are a little too grungy.

GINA RIGGI, Specialty Show Personality/ Producer, KWNZ, Reno

SKY CRIES MARY <u>Shipwrecked</u> (WORLD DOMINATION) - I love this band! I've also played <u>Every Iceberg Is AFire</u> and <u>Deep Sunless Sea</u>. The phones just get crazy!

BOUNCING SOULS <u>Candy</u> (BYO) - This is a punk cover of a great '80s tune. Someone called me singing it while it was playing. I think he liked it and so do l.

TODD SNIDER <u>Talkin' Seattle Grunge Rock Blues</u> (MCA) - I love it! I love it! I love it! I love it!

SWEDISH EAGLE, Air Personality, THE IMPORT SHOW, Los Angeles

BLUR <u>End Of A Century</u> (FOOD) - Six years early, but I'm glad they didn't wait until the year 2000. They haven't missed yet this year (knock on wood).

STEREOLAB <u>Wow And Flutter</u> (ELEKTRA) - Their new album is now out on ELEKTRA here in the U.S. A must for those who like Portishead and St. Etienne. An incredible blend of ethereal landscapes and catchy Pop songs.

LOOP GURU Shrine Of The Mountain (NATION) - Here is this week's pick for those with a sense of adventure. A brilliant piece of music. Listen and absorb. You can also

find remixes of the song done by Drum Club and Zion Train. Something for everyone.

STEVE PICARD, Alt. Show Producer, WFNX, Boston

DRUGSTORE <u>Star Crossed</u> (GO DISC U.K.) - I like it! It sounds nice. It sounds like a rip off of another song. Go ahead listen to it anyway because you'll like it.

SMASH <u>Self Abused</u> (VERNON YARD) - It's ugly, but I like it. Not for the timid.

DAVE MARSH, Alt. Show Producer, WHFS, Washington, DC

EDSEL <u>Detroit Falling</u> (GRASS) - One of the most underestimated bands around, but one of the most talented. This is their third CD and it shows the band in a more mature songwriting state. Great Pop melodies deserving of heavy radio airplay.

GUIDED BY VOICES <u>I Am A Scientist</u> (SCAT) - Although I like the original much better, from a radio standpoint re-recording this song was a smart move. Instantly likeable.

THE BLACK WATCH Whirl (ZERO HOUR) - Really cool atmospheric guitar Pop!

BILL HANSON, Alt. Show Producer, WHTF-FM. York

GREEN DAY When I Come Around (REPRISE/A&M) - For Green Day this is a ballad.

ECHO BELLY *I Can't Imagine The World Without Me* (RHYTHM KING) - They do Morrissey better than Morrissey.

HOOTIE & THE BLOWFISH *Hannah Jane* (ATLANTIC) - Not very 'Alternative,' but the best song on the album.

SUGAR <u>Believe What You're Saying</u> (RYKODISC) - No song sounds better on the radio.

COMPULSION <u>Delivery</u> (INTERSCOPE) - So energetic. An unceasing power guitar onslaught.

ECHO BELLY I Can't Imagine The World Without Me (RHYTHM KING) - I can't imagine that Morrissey and I would both love the same band. Must be the end of the world is coming

SPELL <u>Superstar</u> (ISLAND) - The female vocal hook is still in my head, five days after first playing it. Who would have thought that an 'aye-yeaye-ye-aye' could be so darm catchy?

KEN ZIPETO, Planet M Producer, WMMR, Philadelphia

MAGNAPOP <u>Lay It Down</u> (PRIORITY) - This song really cooks! It reminds me of making bacon on the beach. We love that!

POP WILL EAT ITSELF <u>Ich Bin Ein Auslander</u> (INTERSCOPE) - Remember that Simpsons episode with Mayor Quimby? 'Ich Bin Ein Springfield-ian.' Ha! Ha!

BASH & POP *Making Me Sick* (COLUMBIA) - I just can't say enough about Tommy. It's a great song, and I hope you live in a place where the grass grows the greenest.

PEARL JAM Spin The Black Circle (EPIC) - Great! Now what do I do with my 8-tracks?

AIMEE MANN <u>That's Just What You Are</u> (IMAGO/GIANT) - Ok folks, I really like this song. You should see my shoes.

VERUCA SALT <u>Seether</u> (DGC/MINTY FRESH) - Yet another hit out of Chicago. This place is like the new hot bed for Alternative music. This is my #1-requested song. **Very** hot phones!

DAVE FERGUSON, PD KSFM/Sacramento

IDENTITY

Music and air talent are a major part of a radio station's identity, but not ALL of it's identity. Much of what you'll be conveying over the air will be in the form of produced liners, sweepers, promo's and the like. Who should voice those elements? Some one in-house? Or one of those national voiceover artists like Driscoll, Craig, or even myself for that matter?

As a Program Director who voices his own promos and liners, I've never quite had to deal with that question. It's always sort of been taken for granted that I would be responsible for the station (voice) identity. Does that mean I'm against a radio station using an outside voice? Of course not!!! That kind of thinking didn't get me where I am today in the voiceover industry. Infact, having served as station voice for lots of very differently-programmed stations, (and the different programmers behind them), I can offer some insight into why an outside voice is good, and why it is sometimes bad.

First, it depends on the talent within your own radio station. Most Program Directors either lack the talent, or simply lack the time to effectively image their own stations on their own. Obviously, the most ideal situation is one where you can afford to have you own n-house creative person whose sole job is to take the ideas you want to convey, voice and produce hem in as artistic fashion as possible. In most cases this should be someone other than your regular Froduction Director. The time constraints and deadlines of the commercial production room make it tough to stop down for creative sessions, especial y when you're in a very competitive situation and need things FAST!

Professional voiceover artists for radio are most effective as an alternative to having your own inhouse creative director. I would imagine that one of the main reasons is the almighty dollar. It costs much less to keep a voiceover person on retainer then it does to have his/her equivalent on full-time salary. I stress "alternative to" more than "equivalent". Using an outside service offers many of the benefits of an in-house person, but has to be handled somewhat differently. Longer turnaround time being one reason. It forces the Program Director to plan ahead by one, two, sometimes up to three days. Something most PD's never manage to do, bu-always should, regardless of wether the



station promo's are done in-house, or by an outside service.

Whatever you do, DON'T THINK YOU CAN DO BOTH!!! Some stations suffer from schizophrenia with two or three different "station" voices, diluting each one with another, and making it very hard for any listener to hear ONE VOICE and identify it with ONE STATION.

BROADCASTING TO THE ISLANDS

Every morning Music Director/Air Talent Rex DeShannon wakes up at his Ft. Lauderdale apartment, hops into his car for a short commute, and arrives at his radio station. Rex steps into the studio, cracks the mic and says hello to...the Bahamas. Nassau to be specific. It's the capitol of the Bahamas, on the northern coast of New Providence Island. Out there with Cuba and the Virgin Islands. About 175,000 people. A city settled in the mid-1600s, tourism is the major source of revenue.

"Nobody knows me here in Ft. Lauderdale", says Rex, "But in Nassau, the people hear me every day, I'm reaching 70 to 80 percent of the Bahamian listening audience!"

100JAMZis the station. Owned by The Tribune newspaper. Historic because it's the first privately owned radio station to go up in the Bahamas and because it is so successful. The identical studios are split, one is in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida and the other in Nassau. They're linked by satellite. Not just a studio audio link, but their computers are linked too, via satellite, so they can easily communicate.


Rex's PD and Operation Manager is former Miami DJ Erik D who also does morning drive, from the Nassau studio. Erik is joined by Ed Field, and charter Yvonne Battlelist. Mid-days originate in Ft. Lauderdale with talent Brendalee Francis followed by Rex on PM drive. The rest of the broadcast day originates in Nassau

with DJ Terrible T on 6PM-10PM, Captian Keith (a real ship's captain) does 10PM-2AM, and Randy C jams overnights. The 100Jamz GM is 24 year old Robert Carron.

It's interesting to see this station at work. Production orders arrive from Nassau on the fax. Rex and Brendalee do the voicing and production then send the complete spots, promos or music back to Nassau over one of their two daily satellite audio feeds. It's more than just spots going back and forth. The audio is left up between the two studios. Crack the production room mic in Ft. Laurdale and you're talking to the crew in Nassau.

DeShannon has appearances in Nassau, usually about two a month. Rex says "When I do go there, and do a remote or whatever. I do the best job I can on soaking up stuff. The local stuff, names of places, things like that. So I can use it on the air during my show. So I can really be a part of Nassau." The jocks back in Nassau also keep the Lauderdale jocks in touch ove- the satellite link by telling them about things that are happening, like concerts.

Music programming is also very interesting. 100JAMZ is consulted by famed Miami programmer Bill Tanner. Tanner, now based mostly in Los Angeles, works with MD Rex DeShannon via phone and satellite linked computer bulletin board. Music logs travel back and forth between Nassau, Ft. Lauderdale, and Tanner's Los Angeles office. The format is a broad mix of Churban tunes like, Boyz II Men, Aaliyah, Luther Vandross, Changing Faces, Ini Kamoze, and Mariah Carey, mixed with local Bahamian music and Reggae. Rex says this Nassau audience accepts a much



broader selection of music than the fragmented radio audiences in the states.

"That's why we're asking for help from the records companies." Says Rex, "We don't really fit the formatic breakdowns of the most American stations. But this audience of 175,000 to 255,000 people really loves American recording acts. The huge response to our station has proven that. Since the music programming originates in Ft. Lauderdale we need service from the US record companies." Rex is the Music Director. The station address is 100JAMZ, 3650 Hacienda Blvd., Bay-I, Ft Lauderdale, FL 333114

CARMY FERRER! PD, KGGI/Riverside

TELL US HOW YOU GOT STARTED IN RADIO.

Actually, I was in college studying computer science. Believe it or not, l wanted to be a systems analyst for NASA. The turning point of my career plans, true story: I was sitting on a grassy knoll on campus on a beautiful spring day. Lot's of pretty girls were wearing shorts, and the guys I was hanging out with were saying, "Hey, let's go debug this program..." I decided at that point that these probably were not the people I wanted to hang out with for the rest of my life. I had seen a broadcasting ad on TV and though I could do that. I'd always been a radio junkie, and I'd listened to all kinds of music as a kid. When all my friends were either listening to Rock or Top40. I was listening to Jazz, Urban, and even Talk Radio to an extent. I just couldn't get enough of the different types of music and entertainment on the radio.

WHAT DID YOU DO TO GET YOUR PLAN INTO MOTION?

I begged...Actually I got started at the KIIS Radio Workshop in L.A. in 1980. I spent about a year there and the big highlight of the program was when we finished we got to actually record some carted tracks that played between 3 and 4 am Sunday mornings on KIIS-AM 1150, which I think played Christian music back then

WOULDN'T LET YOU NEAR THE FM, HUH?

No way...After that I went to San Luis Obispo and worked there for about two and a half years. I actually did some sales and then I did middays, which at that station was noon-6pm. We had three fulltime people: 6am to noon; Noon - 6pm; 6 pm to midnight, and then we signed off from midnight to 6am. I worked with some pretty good talent there, far better than I was. In 1982, I got the overright gig at KPOP in Sacramento. buddy Mark Cruze got afternoons. Mark had been our night guy in San Luis Obispo. He later worked at KYNO-FM and with Kevin Carter at KMGX in Fresno. Cruze was a maniac.

KPOP was an Urban station when I first got there, and about eight months into my employment, they decided to change direction and brought in Rick Carroll as a consultant, We changed format to Carroll's 'Rock of the '80s,' and at that point, because I was the only person on staff who knew anything about that music, they made me the music director and moved me up to 7 to midnight. That lasted about eight months, and new owners came in from the East Coast, very conservative, had no idea what the format was about. They were a little baffled by the whole thing. Actually, the station was doing very well. It was a little before its time and probably a little too aggressive for the time period. Looking back now, we probably could have been a little more Top40-leaning. So we flipped Top40 and I became APD/MD and moved to middays. That format also eventually got blown out by the GM because we we were a new station and all we were getting were teens. Of course, he wanted adults like yesterday, so it all fell apart. I left the station, and six months later to the day they called me and offered me the PD job. I had originally pitched the PD job when the Top40 thing first fell apart, but at the time they told me they had to have a "name." They did find a guy whose name I won't mention, but in only six months managed to destroy a radio station. It was the worst thing I had ever seen. So they brought me back after six months, made me PD and I changed the station to 93ROCK in

SUDDENLY YOU'RE PROGRAM-MING AN AOR STATION.

Yeah. The reason I came back was not because of any AOR expertise, but because I knew the station and I knew the market. They apparently had also done some sort of market research, and my name recognition had scored very well in the market.

WHAT AIR NAME WERE YOU USING AT THE TIME?

sales manager. 95SX was the hot shit station in that market when we got there, and we managed to stir up some noise and do some crazy things, but before I was ever able to see any rewards from it the guy let me go. He said, "No hard feelings, I'm just making the bottom line look better." He sold the station, made a bunch of money and retired to Key West.

YOU THEN RETURNED TO THE WEST COAST?

It was 1987 and I decided to go back and take a little time off from radio, which didn't last long...My old company, Fuller-Jeffrey, made me a real good offer to move to KRLT-FM and KOWL-AM in Lake Tahoe. I went up there and said, "Hell yeah, I could live here and play radio." I was having fun playing radio in a small market and skiing like a mad dog.

WHAT WAS THE FORMAT IN TAHOE?

It was a Hot A/C. I went up there just to do afternoons. I later became MD, then PD, then Operations Manager, and ultimately Station Manager. When I got there the station had an eight share, and three years later when I left we had a 26 share with 22 signals coming in to that market. Most of the Reno stations and a couple of Sacramento stations penetrated the market, but we did it by being local. We were the local station, period.

"I know I get bored if I'm not being constantly challenged."

My own name, Carmy Ferreri.

SOMETHING EASY TO REMEMBER...

Yes. At first people say, "What the hell kind of name is that?" But once they know it, they say, "I'll never forget that weirdo."

WHEN DID YOU MAKE THE TRANSITION TO TOP40 RADIO?

I had always been a Top40 radio listener. I had done Top40 briefly at KPOP, and after my stint at 93ROCK I went to Charleston, South Carolina and did a Top40 start-up.

WHAT STATION WAS THAT?

The call letters were WCCG, but it was 1986-87, right in that mid-'80s money grab. This guy had gotten a CP, put this station on the air then turned around and sold it. But before he sold it he got rid of me and the

WHAT WAS YOUR NEXT MOVE?

I started my own business. I made a bunch of money in Tahoe and didn't know what to do with myself, so I opened up a teen night club. Hey man, I've got to tell you I almost got rich real fast. The place just took off.

WHAT CITY WAS THIS IN?

This was in Victorville, out here in the California desert. Unfortunately we had some gang problems, and that ultimately hurt business. An element of about 20 people ruined it for 600-700 kids at night, so I shut the doors on that and went to work at KXTZ in Las Vegas, (which is now a Clifton station) doing marketing and sales, figuring that that was my weak point. The GM position there was looking pretty appetizing after my little stint in Tahoe running two stations, so I figured if I get a little sales background, a little marketing

background...

I had been in Vegas about eight months cutting my teeth on marketing and sales, and personally grooming myself for an upper management position when this deal here at 99.1 came along. I met with Jerry Clifton and Bob West and thought the world of them from the minute I met them. Actually, I had known Bob because he had programmed KROY Sacramento when I was there. I had run into him several times over the years, but that was the first time I met Jerry, and he's just the shit. This sounded like something that I could definitely get into. Plus I'm from here originally, I went to Pomona High School, so this was an opportunity for me to do radio in my home town.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN AT KGGI?

This is my 13th month. I got here in October of last year.

AND YOU'VE TAKEN THE STATION TO THE HIGHEST RATINGS THEY'VE EVER HAD. DIDN'T YOU EVEN BEAT BOB WEST'S PREVIOUS RATINGS?

No, not in share. Bob had a bigger share than we've gotten into, but for the first time in about two and a half years, we beat the Country station, KFRG, 12+.

IN YOUR OPINION, WHAT HAVE YOU DONE DURING YOUR FIRST YEAR THAT HAS IMPROVED KGGI FROM WHEN YOU FIRST ARRIVED?

We got back to basics, with the help of my GM Dave Presher, who has a great programming mind and who doesn't interfere with what we do, through Bob West and his personal expertise with this station and this market especially, and through Jerry Clifton's 'guru-dom,' we decided to do good radio. We found that some of the basic things weren't being done that well. The music library was huge, so we shaved down the number of titles.

The music wasn't focused on our core audience. We tried to make the promotions more mass appeal and we focused the music on our core, which is 25-34 Hispanic females. We got back out in the streets and started shaking hands and kissing babies, just like a politician. Basically that's what we're doing - we're asking for votes through Arbitron.

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE UNIQUE CHARACTERISTICS OF PROGRAMMING IN A HISPANIC-DOMINATED MARKET LIKE RIVERSIDE/SAN BERNARDINO?

Hispanic markets, unlike a lot of other markets, and in Riverside especially, are sometimes slow to react to music, but once they do react, they hang on to records forever. Boyz II Men's *End Of The Road* was in power rotation for a year and never burned. Mariah Carey's *Hero*, nine months in power rotation, never burned.

I'M SURE THAT <u>TOGETHER</u> BY TIERRA IS STILL IN POWER ROTATION...

Oh, big time. We still play the hell out of those types of records. That's the most obvious trait in a Hispanic market. The other thing is their willingness to accept a much broader-based radio station than an Urban audience.

WHAT DO YOU MEAN BY THAT?

For example, we'll play Lisa Loeb, Snoop Dogg and Tierra all on the same radio station. Some people might think we're all over the road, but in this market that's what they want. I believe they actively seek a variety of sound.

HOW DO YOU DETERMINE WHAT GOES ON THE RADIO?

Obviously we watch the retail, and we watch what gets video exposure. We don't have THE BOX here so we don't have that advantage, but we do have MTV and VH1. We watch them because they have a big influence with our younger audience. Our mixer Lynnwood is also the Entertainment Director and the head DJ at the biggest club in the Inland Empire, so he's got a real good vibe for new stuff that's breaking out from the streets. We go out into the record stores, and we see what the 'Mom and Pop' shops in the hoods are selling. We also have our in-house research.

YOU'VE NOT ONLY HAVE LOCAL COMPETITION FROM V103, BUT ALL THE L.A. STATIONS (KIIS, POWER106, THE BEAT) POUND INTO YOUR MARKET.

V103 is about to go away, but we've got KIIS-FM, KPWR, KKBT, and KROQ to an extent. We actually share some audience with KROQ. Once again, with Hispanics in this market, their musical tastes vary dramatically. You can meet a 23 year-old Hispanic female in this market who listens to KROQ, KGGI, an Oldies station, and she'll also sample a Hispanic station, so you find a pretty broad musical taste in our core audience.

YOU HAVE MAJOR MARKET STATIONS WITH MAJOR MARKET BUDGETS POUNDING INTO YOUR TURF...HOW DO YOU COMBAT THAT?

Generally I curl up in the corner in the fetal position at night and panic. POWER106, KIIS-FM, and THE BEAT are all great radio stations, but it's virtually impossible for them to come out here and press the flesh in the Inland Empire. They have to service all of the L.A. metropolitan area, so we beat them in the streets. We're in people's faces; we're the local station. We are the radio station for the Inland Empire. When anything happens here, people automatically turn to 99.1 and we're on top of it, whether it's a school walkout for Prop. 187 or how to donate water, food or clothing for earthquake relief.

LET'S RUN THROUGH THE AIR STAFF

First, from 5;30 to 10am we have Hollywood Hamilton and the 99.1 Morning Posse, which consists of Hollywood, Samantha Santiago (who doubles as news and producer), and

YOU RECENTLY HIRED KRAZY KID STEVENZ FROM HOT102 FOR NIGHTS.

That's right. Tony Dee brought him to Milwaukee from B95 in Fresno. With the recent format change at HOT102 we were lucky enough to pick him up. He's one of the hottest night talents in the country.

Overnights is Jeff Garcia, who started as an intern and has an incredible natural ability for radio. He's a great guy in the streets, great in front of people. He does four overnights and does the two mix shows on Friday and Saturday nights from 10pm to Iam.

DO YOU THINK MIX SHOWS ARE AS IMPORTANT AS THEY USED TO BE?

Absolutely. Our mix shows work incredibly well. In fact, our numbers nearly double on Friday and Saturday nights when we go into the mix.

CAN A MIX SHOW HELP BREAK RECORDS?

I think it's a great place to expose new product. I don't think it gets enough exposure just two nights a week to actually break records, but you can certainly get a feel for how it sounds on your radio station. However, if it's going to be a hit, it'll react quickly. You'll see the sales and phone reaction relatively quickly.

Carmy on dealing with L.A. competition: "Generally I curl up in the corner in the fetal position at night and panic..."

Dr. George, who used to work with Rick Dees at KIIS. We've also got a guy named 'Bubba The Schizo' who does about 100 different characters and dialects. We also have 'The Bronx,' who is the morning show producer.

Anton Sousa does 10am-3pm and comes to us after five years in Palm Springs. Anton is a local guy. He was born here. He reflects the Inland Empire tremendously.

YOU USED TO BE ON 1-3 PM...

I'm now off-air, and my staff thanks me for that. Sometimes the best coaches were the worst players, and in my case, that is the truth.

WHO'S ON AFTERNOONS?

Jesse Duran, who is also my Production Director. Jesse worked at XL93 in Grand Forks, worked at POWER106 in promotions, did some parttime at Q105 in Oxnard and Y97 in Santa Barbara. Jesse is one of the hardest-working people we have on the staff.

WHERE DO YOU SEE YOUR CAREER GOING FROM HERE?

Ultimately I aspire to be a general manager. That to me is a huge challenge. Knowing my own nature, I know I can get bored if I'm not being constantly challenged. Not that programming isn't challenging, but I want to push my limits and see exactly how far I can go. I think a GM position is about as tough a position in broadcasting as there is. I don't think running an entire radio broadcasting corporation could be any more difficult than running an active radio station in a competitive market.

YOU RECENTLY PROMOTED SONIA JIMENEZ TO APD... WHO ELSE IS INVOLVED IN THE PROGRAMMING DEPT.?

Right now officially it's just Sonia and I, but we always include our interns, air staff, and the support personnel. If we're trying to get a vibe on a certain record, we'll bring in two or three staff members and ask their opinion. D.J. Lynnwood also helps

with the music, but as far as day-today programming and operations, it's Sonia and I. By the way, Sonia has become a tremendous asset. She is really shining and on her way to superstardom. Just between you and I, there's a girl to keep your eye on. She's going to go places.

YOUR AM JUST WENT OLDIES. ARE YOU INVOLVED IN THAT?

Yes. Harley Davidson took the opportunity to program KMEN and has done a tremendous job. I just oversee the operation and make sure we're all on the same page, because what we're doing with that station no one else in the country is doing - It's an Oldies station, targeted to 35-49 Hispanic females. You don't hear a lot of the British Invasion stuff you'll hear on other typical Oldies stations. It's more on the Hispanic tip: Peaches and Herb, Marvin Gaye, Brenton Wood, etc., what you might call the Urban product of the '60s, '70s and '80s.

YOU ALSO CROSS FORMAT BOUNDARIES BY SIMUL-CASTING ART LABOE AND HOLLYWOOD HAMILTON ON BOTH STATIONS?


That's right. We simulcast Art Laboe on Sunday nights and we simulcast the Hollywood Hamilton Show Monday-Friday.

SO HE PLAYS KGGI'S MUSIC ON KMEN EVERY MORNING?

Yes. The theory is, if you've got a great morning show, why not have them on both stations. We believe in thinking outside of the box. A great morning show is a great morning show, regardless of format.


BEFORE WE RUN, COULD YOU TAKE A MINUTE AND SHARE YOUR PROGRAMMING PHILOSOPHY WITH US?

I don't have any...Fly by the seat of your pants, baby. Radio is changing at the speed of light. There are some fundamentals in radio that are true and have always been true. Number one, and I hate to sound like a broken record, but you must reflect the market you serve. Number two: Not all records work in every market. Number three: You have to have fun. People turn on the radio to lose themselves, even for just a brief moment from what can sometimes be a dreary, drab world. I can't imagine clocking in at a factory at 8:00 every morning, clocking out at 4:30 p.m. and taking my lunch pail home. I tip my hat to those people who manage to do it day in and day out. We have the unique opportunity to add some fun to those people's lives, and that's what we try and do. Put a smile on their faces. That is what is important. Number four: Talk about what's important to your listeners. And most importantly, always strive to give something positive back to your community.



DIRTY TRICKS AND GUERRILLA WARFARE: A 90'S GUIDE TO RADIO ANARCHISM By Paige Nienaber

For the sake of space and brevity, I won't even deal with the "should we?" or "shouldn't we?" aspects of this issue. Basically, the people who are against dirty tricks and other radio hijinks won't be swayed by anything I could write, and the same goes for the supporters of guerrilla warfare and "radio in the trenches." It's a mind-set that if you're not into it, you're not into it. Simple enough.

I do believe that there's a time and place for messing severely with the competition, and anyone who's ever worked with me, or against me, can tell you that I've done more than my share of Gorden Liddy-style promotion. But only if the situation warrants it.

If you're beating the competition and are comfortably in the lead, there's absolutely no reason to take your eye off the ball to waste time screwing with the guys across the street. On the other hand, if your station is being beaten, is in last place, or is the new kid on the dial, what's the worst that could happen? You'd lose. Well guess what, you already are, so have some fun. Plus, these kind of tactics are especially effective when employed against the big station that has never been beaten. It completely unfocuses them and they don't concentrate on their strengths and the things that have made them successful. They're too busy worrying about you and reacting to you. And if you can get the station that's beating you to start reacting to you and concentrating on you, then you've


I've compiled some of the great dirty tricks from some of the great dirty tricksters, and have even included some of the totally juvenile things that I've pulled on the competition back when I was young and immature. (But that I'm still very proud of nonetheless.) Virtually everyone asked for anonymity either because of statutes-of-limitation or the fact that they're now working for the very stations that they terrorized.

•One of the most vulnerable places to take down a competitor is from within. If you can chip away at their morale, that's a big victory on the field of battle. Many stations do that by getting moles into the competitor to feed them info that they can use to \$#@&% with them. Show up at everything that the competition does before they get there and banner it and stick shirts on everyone. One source told me about discovering a new campaign that was to start at 3pm on Monday, during a Friday night dumpster dive. With that info he kicked off a duplicate promotion the next morning and pounced it all weekend. The competition ended up scrapping the campaign, which billboards, contesting and TV.

- •Fax machines are great. Using "borrowed" letterhead from the competitor's corporate office, I "fired" their morning show via fax. I also canceled the bar service at their company Christmas party, once again using this marvel of modern technology.
- One station sent an intern in a competition's t-shirt into a chain of convenience stores to remove all their stickers. He told the mangers that there was a printing error and that new stickers would be delivered the next week.
- •An intern at another station was a closet electronics geek who once bragged that he could disable the competitors Marti using a paper clip. When nobody believed his boasts, he proved his point by taking the other station off the air at a major festival.
- •When the competition started promoting that they were going to "take over" another station, one PD assumed correctly that it was the old Free Gas bit, determined what gas station it was by calling the other radio station's gas station clients, and showed up at the

competition's air staff is indeed a dangerous item to have. One PD scanned the back of an adult magazine, and signed up all of the other station's jocks for porno films and other services. Some of these announcers took years to finally remove their names from these mailing lists.

- •I once discovered that my t-shirt manufacturer also printed the shirts for the station down the dial. I found this out when 200 of their shirts ended up in one of my orders. I saved a few for future use and then distributed the rest to the homeless people living in the parks downtown. The GM at this station used to call my campaign of terror "Death By A Thousand
- ·Stink bombs can be bought at just about any novelty store and more than one station has used these to make their competition's remotes and events very unpleasant places
- In one famous incident, a station took a Radio Shack FM wireless mike, put it in a coffee can and hid it outside the studio window of the competitor. The signal was just strong enough to over-power the in-studio FM tuner that the jock's headphones got their feed from. Thus, when the wireless was turned on during his break, he

part-timer did, and took his station off the air.

·Immobilizing the competition's vans has become a hobby for many stations. More then one person told me that a tooth pick in the tire's air valve works great. A Promotion Director in the Northeast once froze the other station's vans in place, using a couple of buckets of water on a cold December night before one of their busy Christmas season promotional days. To insure that they weren't going anywhere, he injected some water into the locks.

I talked to PDs and Promotion Directors from stations in all formats including All Sports and News Talk to compile these stories, which, while not pretty, are very representative of what's been done in the past, when a station has used dirty tricks in their promotional arsenal.

Do they work? It's arguable, but once again, if you can take the competitions attention off their game plan, then you've been effective in one aspect. I've also seen guerrilla warfare bring a staff together and get them working as a team. It can be instrumental in building morale and injecting some excitement back into the staff. Just don't get caught up in it and find that you're spending all of your time plotting and scheming. Dirty tricks, if you use them, should be supplemental, not the whole focus of what your station does.

I do believe that there's a time and place for messing severely with the competition.

location two hours before the actual event to banner the hell out of it. Five minutes after the free gas giveaway began, a motorcade of station vehicles (seven in all) pulled in to fill up, courtesy of the competitor.

- •Those giant latex balloons that get tossed around inside concerts are always great visibility. One Promotion Director used them to own musical events...until the competition started bringing pins to pop them. He fixed that by partially filling the inflated balloons with spit, beer and questionable fluids, thus drenching anyone unfortunate enough to pop it.
- •An addressed list of the

- suddenly heard nothing, and assuming the station had gone off the air, let loose with a string of profanities...that went over the air.
- •An old colleague of mine freaked out the competitor's GM by dummying up a fake direct mail piece that promoted the fact that the station was going to send out 25,000 t-shirts to people who responded to the piece. The GM, the PD and all of their neighbors got these.
- •Another station hot lines a weekend part-timer posing as their engineer at the transmitter site, and asked him to flip off the transmitter while he was working or he might get hurt. Of course the



Four great mixes to choose from. All feature Erik waking up the natives on those tribal drums. Shoulld share the same success as his previous hit, <u>Jungle Lust</u>




