
BILLIG APPOINTED ATLANTIC SR. VP



DAVE FERGUSON &

Last week I called the DSE 7000 by Orban the "Mercedes" of digital workstations. That was some what of an over-statement. There are more expensive digital workstations out there. Though not many. And as far as user-friendly systems go, I'd say this is about as close as you can get (for under \$20,000). I suppose that one reason I compared it to the Mercedes is that everybody's either got one, or wants one. That must be because it's a pretty damr good unit! And user-friendly for disc jockeys and producers. Virtually anyone who can handle a standard 8-channel analog board can operate the DSE 7000. It was the first fully digital production system with all the familiar analog controls and functions. Making it one of, if the most used digital workstations in the industry.

You don't need to be a computer programmer to take advantage of the DSE 7000's powerful features. Think of it as an audio system that just happens to use lightening-fast RAM for editing, massive hard disk storage for archiving and creating your own sound library, and an easy-to-uncerstand display. This "display" is shown on a color monitor giving the user full wave images of all &-tracks, along with a list of commands underneath the wave images for editing. All assignments and mixdowns can be done from the board, which looks like the most simple 10-channel board you've ever seen! Some of its features include level controls, pan, echo send/return, track bounce, and solo functions.

You can also time slip, copy, or undo anything right from the board. It also has a scrub wheel for rocking back and forth over cue or edit areas.

The DSE 7000 tutes hundreds of satisfied costumers. From such stations as HOT97/New York, to KILT in Houston. I know for a fact that there are several stations here in Washington that use the unit, and I'm planning on visiting at least one of them soon to see the DSE 7000 in action. Aside from getting a trial run with such a system, (which unfortunately is not one of the options offered by Orban, seeing an industry peer use it is really the best way to decide if it's right for you. Kind of like the next best thing to a test drive is being in the passenger seat during a drive. This way at least you can ask questions about the unit's performance and it's unreported problems, without some slime-ball sales person looking over your shoulder telling all of the good things and none of the bad things. I would recommend this type of research on any type of digital equipment you plan on buying. What you don't want is a unit that looked great in the presentation, but is impracticle and troublesome in actual everyday use. In other words, the best way to not get stuck with a lemon is to know what you're buying, what it's going to be used for, and how it works. Don't buy a Mercedes if you're going to use it like a four-wheeler. No matter how simple the control panel and settings, not every system can take the high volume of use that a radio station production board has to withstand. Nor does every radio station have a full-time engineer on hand to fix a unit when it crashes.

In my opinion the DSE 7000 is a solid investment for



radio stations that produce a usual amount of multitrack commercials and promo's. It may even be more of a "workhorse" than most digital systems out there today. It's certainly laid out in a way that anyone can understand. But, with these strengths comes a strong price tag. The DSE 7000 isn't the most expensive, but it's up there. You can't get the base unit for less than \$17,000. It just depends on where you want to put your money. Not every station has the money to invest in a unit of this cost. Many of them end up getting units that cannot be used by very many of the a rstaff and production personnel. Then money is spent to educate, or simply lost to the competition. My money's on the DSE.



THE SIMPSON CASE: MOST STATIONS ARE WATCHING AND WAITING By Paige Nienaber

It was bound to happen, as it does anytime there is a massive onslaught of publicity on a topic or event. People are getting burned out on the whole OJ Simpson case and all of the various side-stories that go with it. But that poses another question: Can you ignore what is arguably the biggest news story of last year, and barring a nuclear war, the biggest story of this year. And depending on who gets nuked, probably is <u>still</u> the biggest story of '95. It's a dilemma

By the time this article arrives in your hot little hands (or cold, depending what part of the country you're in), the lawyers for both sides should have delivered their opening statements and the biggest trial that any of us will ever witness, will be under way. As I often say/write/fax, "So what are you going to do about it?"

Well, many stations are choosing to do nothing or are going to wait to deal with it if and when the story re-heats. And that's understandable. The whole "OJ Thing" got so saturated that there was a burnout factor that occurred way back during the prelims. Everybody covered the story and the listening/viewing public got tired and went in search of bigger, better and more riveting stories. If Andy Warhol was right and we each get 15 minutes of fame, then that should be about perfect for America where the average person has a 15 minute attention span. "The subject's definitely in a 'fatigue period' and has really been run into the ground," says Brian Douglas, PD at 102Jamz in Greensboro. "When it first started, if you even said 'OJ' on the air the phones lit up like crazy," he adds.

In Minneapolis at KDWB, Program Director Mark Bolke concurs with Douglas; "People are so tired of it right now, but there's still a curiosity with the Simpson story, so we'll deal with it on a day-to-day basis." He says that KDWB will deal with any major developments as they occur, but isn't planning on any major features or other reactions to the OJ case at this time.

In Albuquerque, 97Kiss Promotion Director Randy Savage says that while his station has dealt with serious and potentially "Negative" subjects in the past, except for some morning show humor, they probably won't deal with the case outside of normal news features and programs.


It will certainly be interesting to see how Radio reacts if/when the trial's start awakens America and re-ignites the public's passion and interest in the story. I mean, the biggest news story of the year; you're going to ignore it?

There are so many ways to approach a story like the OJ Simpson case and not be seen as just a radio version of "Hard Copy" or any of the other tabloid TV shows. The trial will undoubtedly provide many opportunities for morning shows to react to what's happening in the courtroom. Especially when it comes to having guests and experts on the air. Morning talent should be closely watching the trial and its twists and turns so that they can book guests that are topical to what's happening in Judge Ito's chambers. If Marcia Clark spends a day arguing about the admissability of Nicole

with which you can deal with the OJ Simpson murder trial.

If anything positive has come out of this story, it's that there has been a focus on the plight of battered women and domestic abuse in America. This is a tremendous opportunity for your station to not only hook into a story, but more importantly, to perhaps initiate a promotion or campaign that affects something positive in your community. Besides having guests on the topic of domestic violence, move beyond just "words" and help transform a building into a shelter for families that are escaping domestic abuse. Raise the consciousness of your audience about the subject and provide them with resources for getting help.

Another avenue is to give your audience an outlet for their emotions and feelings. Open the mics and let them talk. "When the story first hit, we became almost talk radio, and opened the phones up for listeners to get on the air to talk about OJ, the case, and how they felt about it. They couldn't get enough of it," says Russ Parr from 100.3JAMZ in

that none of your giveaways will contain the names of any key figures in the case. And don't forget about soap operas. There will be millions of angry people who are going to be livid that their daytime dramas have been pre-empted. See if you can get your hands on videos of the pre-empted soaps and use them for giveaways. Or host Soap Parties in the evenings.

In Atlanta, Tony Brown at V103 says that his station will handle it as they did when the story first broke, giving it priority in the newscasts, and doing hourly updates on trial days. "I definitely think there's an interest in the story. Everybody's just waiting for the attorneys to stop fighting and for it to get underway," he says. "People have some very strong feelings about the Simpson murder case, and with that kind of interest, it's something we have to address," concludes Brown.

However your station chooses to handle the OJ Simpson trial, it will be in response to a rare promotional opportunity: the biggest murder trial in recent U.S. history. Talk to the listeners, gauge their feelings, and react appropriately. burying your head in the sand won't make this story go away.

Simpson's psychiatrists notes, then your morning show might want to take three minutes to speak with a mental health professional about confidentiality and how they feel about what's happening in L.A.

It would be an excellent idea to have a lawyer (or two) available to visit on the morning show to discuss the status of the trial and give their perspectives on how it's going. What about autograph experts? How has the case affected the value of an OJ Simpson signature. See? This is not a one-dimensial case. There are dozens of different angles

Dallas. Now that the trial is on, he says that the station will use the same approach if there's as much of an outpouring of interest as there was last Summer and Fall. "Of course we'll be treating it as a news story, and will handle it that way, but we will be prepared in case something startling happens."

Even if your audience is "burned" on the OJ Simpson trial, you can still deal with it by providing them with activities and events to take their minds off all the hype. That way you're dealing with the case, but then, you're not. You could do a "No J Weekend" and promise



A LOT HAS HAPPENED TO YOU GUYS IN THE LAST WEEK. APPARENTLY, PRECISION MEDIA WENT CRAZY AND STARTED HANDING OUT VP STRIPES TO EVERYBODY.

Yes, I've recently learned how to spell 'potato.'

YOU'RE IN A GROUND FLOOR POSITION WITH A YOUNG, BROADCASTING COMPANY. GIVE ME SOME BACKGROUND ABOUT PRECISION MEDIA.

In a decade where most radio stations are run by banks and guys in suits, I am blessed to be working with a company that is basically run by rock and rollers. One of the parties in the company is legendary concert promoter Don Law. The other partner is Frank Barsalona, who we all know runs Premiere Talent in New York.

And of course, the third partner, who is also my General Manager and is Chief Operating Officer, Tim Montgomery.

THIS WILL BE TIM'S THIRD APPEARANCE IN OUR MAGAZINE, SO RIGHT NOW HE'S LEADING YOU THREE TO TWO....

Better this than the cover of Cosmo...

YOU'VE BEEN THERE ABOUT THREE YEARS NOW?

I'm actually going on my fourth year. I started here in October of '91.

AFTER ALMOST FOUR YEARS, CAN YOU ANALYZE SOME OF THE CHANGES IN THE MARKETPLACE AND THE CHANGES IN THE RADIO STATION. LOOK AT THE CHANGE IN RESPECT THAT KISS95.7 HAS GONE THROUGH IN THAT FOUR YEAR PERIOD.

We've been incredibly fortunate to have the right people come up with the right ideas, work together closely enough to spot the right opportunities and seize them at the right time. Many things changed over the past three years. The competitive nature of the market changed dramatically, and as we monitored those competitive changes in the marketplace, the company knew that we had to seize I think the biggest misperception of WKSS in Hartford was that we did not have the resources to win. No one ever believed that we could win, and that is the foremost testament of never under-estimating your competitor. We learned a big lesson along the way.

WHAT SPECIFICALLY DID YOU DO TO OVERCOME THOSE MISPERCEPTIONS?

We made a commitment on a marketing and programming level to crank up the heat and be much more aggressive.

OBVIOUSLY IT WAS IMPORTANT TO KEEP THE STAFF FOCUSED AND MOTIVATED. WHEN EVERYBODY AROUND YOU THINKS YOU CAN'T WIN IT'S DIFFICULT TO KEEP THAT FORWARD MOMENTUM. THIS IS WHERE YOU AND TIM STEP IN TO KEEP THE STAFF MOVING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION.

Absolutely. You have to win in the hallways before you can win on the air. What happens and what is said about you outside the building, in the industry, it doesn't matter when you know you're working as a team and doing the right thing.

TALK ABOUT THE RATINGS HISTORY OF THE STATION. WASN'T TOO LONG AGO YOU HAD ABOUT HALF THE RATINGS OF THE MARKET LEADER.


Times have changed and the music

music station. Our signal is statewide, covering the metro, and reaching all the way out to Long Island, where we have a 3.3 share. For obvious reasons we focus on the metro, considering that our competitors have comparable metro signals. Because of our signal strength statewide, we need to focus a bit heavier in the metro, but we always market on the street. There's always a club event going on in New Haven, there's always a sticker event going on in Southington, we always have a street-type event happening throughout the state, whether it's an ongoing vender promotion, a PSA event, we are everywhere.

YOU MENTIONED PERSONNEL INVESTMENTS. CAN YOU GO THROUGH SOME OF THE PEOPLE THAT ARE PART OF THE SUCCESS OF KISS95.7?

Let's first start with our leader, Tim Montgomery, who actually signed on the station back in 1984. One of Tim's strengths is spotting new, upcoming talent and giving them the chance to prove themselves, which was a risky position to take in 1994 radio. One of the greatest aspects of these past three years of my tenure here at KISS, is that Tim has given me every tool necessary to win.

has changed as other formats have niched away at Top40. KISS95.7 was hot during the dance craze of the late '80s and '90s. We found that mainstreaming a bit was the answer. We always had a strong cume, and we always had tremendous market awareness, even in the early days. We're always on the street, we're always marketing this radio station on some level, so the market knew we were there. We just tweaked a bit and promoted it, made some personality investments, and at that time we started to turn the corner.

YOU HAVE A VERY STRONG SIGNAL...DO YOU ALSO MARKET KISS OUTSIDE OF THE METRO, SPECIFICALLY, IN THE NEW HAVEN AREA?

We are Connecticut's contemporary

BACKGROUND AND HE OBVIOUSLY GETS IT.

Absolutely. Whatever I needed, whether it was emergency cash for a TV spot, an extra body to help out during the day, or whatever, I had to fight for it, but Tim was always there for me in the end. It gave me a tremendous amount of satisfaction knowing that I was able to come up with an idea, put it on paper, get it approved, put that idea into action and then see it work successfully.

HOW OFTEN DO YOU AND TIM INTERACT DURING THE DAY?

The easier question would be: when do we <u>not</u> interact. Every day, Tim and I are constantly on the phone, in each other's face, and in each other's office. We talk all the time, every



single day.

My relationship with Tim is such that he is my boss, but he's also a tremendous sounding board. When I'm unsure about an idea or a promotion, even a song that could be questionable, I can go to him and feel totally comfortable that he'll give me unbiased advice. In the past I've found that's a rare trait in a relationship with your superior.

LET'S TALK ABOUT THE OTHER KEY STATION PERSONNEL.

One of the key ingredients of the success of this radio station the past two years has been the addition of Gary Craig In The Morning. Gary is an 11-year market veteran whom we hired away from WTIC-FM back in February of '93. What an event that was. I wish I had another whole article just to tell you how exciting that was to build a morning show around a market veteran. We even did a 'Countdown to Craig,' an hourly countdown to his first day on the air with big, well-produced sweepers. It was tremendously exciting.

NO PRESSURE ON GARY AT ALL?

He was just pleased to get back on the air. He had been off the air for six months sitting out a non-compete. Gary is the cornerstone of morning radio in the market and has a wide variety of abilities and skills and also brings a lot of ideas to the table after 10 a.m. It's great to have a morning man who's been in the market for years who can also be a source for promotional events. He lets us know about ideas that have worked or not worked, or ideas that might have worked, but can be improved upon. It's always great to have someone like Gary around. He also has tremendous vocal ability and is one of my main promo voices for the radio station. Another added bonus.

WHO ELSE IS PART OF THE

MORNING TEAM?

That would be Robin King, another market legend. Robin has been with the station for years; she started out as our night personality, moved up to afternoons, then to middays and broke into mornings shortly after we hired Gary. Robin clearly is one of the most talented females in radio today. I look at Robin as the 'Murphy Brown' of the morning show – approachable, yet with a tremendous amount of spunk.

THAT'S A TOUGH TRANSITION TO MAKE, GOING FROM A SOLO SHOW TO PART OF AN ENSEMBLE.

Robin has made the transition tremendously well. She always comes up well in our research, and has proven to be one of the key personalities on the radio station. She's done a tremendous job, and continues to grow every day.

In middays I'm incredibly excited to announce the addition of our newest midday DJ and MD, Christine Simonet, the former Tina Marie Simonet from KZFM/Corpus Christi and KPRR in El Paso.

WE'VE BEEN BIG FANS OF TINA'S FOR YEARS.

With the midday/MD opening, after an exhaustive search for the right element to bring to KISS, we felt that Tina was the perfect choice. Tina brings many years of experience to the table in music, programming and air work. She sounds great on the air and I do believe that she is one of the great undiscovered talents in America.

Also handling the later midday show is one of the new additions to KISS95.7, Tony Moreno. Tony has just been handed the Assistant Music Director stripes and is a jack of all trades here at the radio station producing promos, assisting me in the programming and promotion and also assisting Tina in music. Watch out for him in the next couple of years.

NEXT YOU HAVE THE RECENTLY APPOINTED VICE PRESIDENT OF AFTERNOONS, MARKET LEGEND JEREMY SAVAGE.

That's right. Jeremy has been with the station since the very beginning.

I USED TO LISTEN TO JEREMY AT WAAF IN WORCESTER ABOUT 15 YEARS AGO.

We worked there together. Jeremy and I have known each other for almost 11 years. We did radio together in Worcester, Boston and now here in Hartford. Jeremy, who was also recently promoted to Vice President of Operations clearly deserves his new position. He is the heart and soul of the radio station. When you need something, if there's an emergency, whatever it is, Jeremy will be there for you, whether it's an idea, a troubleshooting answer to a painstaking problem, or just a

shoulder to cry on, he's the man, and I bet you that everyone on the staff will agree with me. He's a true friend.

IS HE REALLY FOLLOWING YOU FROM STATION TO STATION OR HAS HE ACTUALLY BEEN STALKING YOU ALL THIS TIME? POLICE ARE INVESTIGATING...

DOES HE RATE A COVERED PARKING SPACE NOW?

Yes, and he also gets Sundays off and a handsome plaque.

WHO'S DOING NIGHTS?

A while ago we talked about undiscovered talent. Well, we discovered one a few years ago and now he's here doing 7-midnight at KISS95.7. It's Michael Maze. We found Michael eating back bacon and hanging out at Ben & Jerry's in Burlington, Vermont back in December of '91. Michael has clearly become the nighttime choice in this town. He has outlasted every nighttime jock in the city and continues to dominate the shift. His street presence and on-air delivery are second to none in Connecticut.

Michael is now the standard at

even go in and change a song or two while I'm in my office and call up and ask his advice before I do it.

AS YOU KNOW FIRSTHAND FROM YOUR TIME IN PHILLY, A LOT OF NEW SONGS ARE BREAKING, THE PHONES ARE ACTIVE, IT'S UNLIKE ANY OTHER SHIFT.

That's right. I did nights for four years at EAGLE106 in Philadelphia. When you're not in the studio every day you've got to maintain dialogue with your talent. Nights can be the indicator for your next big reaction record on the radio station. You have to stay plugged into that.

TELL ME ABOUT YOUR PROMOTIONS DIRECTOR, AND I ALSO HEAR YOU RECENTLY HIRED A NEW PRODUCTION DIRECTOR.

Our Promotions Director is Larry Hyrb, another station vet. At any given time you will always find Larry manning one of the many ongoing KISS promotions on the street. Larry is also one of our resident computer experts, making him an invaluable employee...(at least, that's what he keeps telling me...)

Also new to KISS is our Production Director, Brian Apple, who we just hired from MIX93.7. Brian is a young, aggressive, up-and-coming production talent who is well-versed in 1990's Top40 production. He's a whiz with our digital

known for amazing mixes of both classic retro tunes and the latest dance hits. Chris is always taping drops off of TV, samples them into his music and is always putting together a showstopping mix.

PRECISION MEDIA ALSO OWNS FOUR OTHER STATIONS?

That's correct. Besides KISS in Hartford, we also own four stations up in New Hampshire.

WOULDN'T THAT BE KIND OF A 'QUADROPOLY?'

I would call it a quadropoly. There's WERZ, which is the flagship station, also WZNN, which is running Imus In The Morning. There's also WMYF-FM and WWEM-FM.

AL PERRY, THE GM, WAS ALSO NAMED A VP OF PRECISION MEDIA DURING THE VP BLITZ LAST WEEK.

Al is another New England mainstay, working both in radio and the record industry for many years in the New England market. I look forward to spending more time with Al, and getting to spend more time with the other stations in the chain.

Speaking of New England mainstays, WERZ recently re-hired Jack O'Brien, who programmed the station in the mid '80s,

ANY OTHER MAJOR OR MINOR FORMATIC SHIFTS IN THE MARKET RECENTLY?

Since the inception of our initial game plan the market has changed dramatically. My main competitor, WTIC-FM now has taken on a 'No-Rap, No-Sleepy Elevator Music' position, playing many titles from the '80s and has softened their approach dramatically, especially in nights. The American Radio Systems' MIX98.7 has now switched to an 'All '70s' format, calling themselves 'The '70s Station, 98.7,' and the other Hot A/C, STAR104 is now Modern Rock.

MODERN ROCK AND ALL-'70S SEEM LIKE THE TWO FLAVORS OF THE MONTH RIGHT NOW. WHAT'S YOUR OPINION ON THE PREVALENCE OF MODERN ROCK IN TODAY'S TOP40 RADIO?

Top40 has always gone through, as Guy Zapoleon puts it, its extreme periods which we're experiencing right now. For stations that are Mainstream I agree with Mr. Zapoleon's point of view that certain Modern Rock titles appeal to two separate sets of listeners and you have to be very, very, very careful when you go on something Alternative that is not a proven hit.

night, and one of the most exciting aspects about Michael's air work and presentation is he constantly reinvents his show. He always tries to keep new and fresh and staying plugged in, whether it's a phone bit or the production elements on the show, you can always tune in and hear something new.

Michael is currently developing a syndicated radio show, built around his unique talents. Details soon!

HOW MUCH LEEWAY DOES MICHAEL HAVE IN THE MUSICAL SELECTION FOR HIS SHIFT? ARE THE LOGS PREPRINTED AND WAITING, OR CAN HE RESPOND TO THE MOMENT AND 'CALL AN AUDIBLE' ON THE AIR?

Michael and I are always talking music. A week doesn't go by where we don't take a few minutes and discuss the requests, discuss his vibe on the street about certain songs. I'll workstation and bangs out great sweepers. He's always there with new production, sales and programming ideas.

DOESN'T HE HAVE A SIGN ON HIS DOOR THAT SAYS 'NO LASERS?'

That's right, a picture of a laser with a circle with a line through it...

YOU CAN'T TALK ABOUT KISS AND WITHOUT MENTIONING CHRIS WALSH.

Absolutely. Another KISS mainstay. Many of you know Chris from his national Super Mix dance show. One of the great assets in having a guy like Chris here is he's always listening. He's an added plus in the music department. Chris is always listening to new music, is plugged in to the streets, does a tremendous Oldies show called 'KISS Classics' on Sunday Nights, and is

DOSE OF MODERN ROCK.

I go back to the old notion, a hit is a hit is a hit. At some point, certain songs cross over to the Mainstream, no matter what they are. Once they cross over to mainstream, they are no longer hip to the Modern Rock core, which as we know, prevents cume broadening. The minute *Basket Case* goes into power rotation on a Mainstream station, it's no longer hip to the Modern Rock core.

BOTTOM LINE: DOES A KISS LISTENER EXPECT TO HEAR GREEN DAY?

The KISS listener expects to hear the

hottest hit records...I believe a key element to our success is the fact that the KISS audience does enjoy rhythmic music, but at the end of the day you have to play the hits and you can't be pigeon-holed. Does the KISS listener expect to hear Green Day? If a Green Day song meets the formula, it's in. If it doesn't, it's not.

WHAT ELSE DOES THE COMPANY HAVE ON THE BURNER RIGHT NOW AS FAR AS FUTURE EXPANSION?

I'm very excited to help in the process of acquiring new stations. I

plan to be a part of that process in the next year or two.

WHAT ARE YOUR SHORT TERM AND LONG TERM RADIO GOALS?

Short term – to set up KISS95.7 to have a great '95. Long term – to grow with the company, to spend more quality time with my wife. Susan, and my two wonderful children Jordan, who's five and Matthew, who's two.

DO YOU GUYS EVER GET OUT AND GET AWAY FROM THE RADIO STATION AND DO DUMB

STUFF?

We had a great Christmas, and the highlight was when my two year-old climbed up onto the vegetable crisper in the fridge and defrosted the freezer. Imagine what an exciting moment that was to wake up to.

DO YOU CONSCIOUSLY MAKE TIME, PACK UP THE FAMILY TRUCKSTER AND GET OUT OF TOWN FOR A COUPLE OF DAYS?

Have you been talking to my wife?

A CONVERSATION WITH TIM MONTGOMERY, CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER OF PRECISION MEDIA

HOW WAS THE COMPANY FORMED?

It started back in 1984. I was working for Cox Communications as the General Manager of WHIO AM & FM in Ohio. I was very happy and was looking forward to a long career at Cox Communications, which is a fine company, but I'm from Boston and I started in the business in Boston. Don Law, who is a very well known concert promoter in the Boston area and a longtime friend, contacted me and asked if I wanted to get together with him and get into radio ownership.

EVERYBODY LOVES THOSE PHONE CALLS.

Yeah. So Don, Frank Barsalona and I have been doing this together for 10 years. They're really not involved in the day-to-day business, but they're very interesting partners and they see radio as kind of ancillary to their own businesses, a business that they understand.

TELL US ABOUT FRANK BARSALONA.


Frank is the President and the founder of Premiere Talent in New York, which is one of the biggest talent agencies in the world, at least in the Rock & Roll business. They represent U2, Bruce Springsteen, Bon Jovi and Van Halen. They did The Who tour a couple of years ago. They have a pretty significant roster of acts. Frank is a legend in this business.

SO YOU ARE THE ACTUAL BROADCASTER OF THE THREE PARTNERS?

That's right. I'm the Chief Operating Officer of the company and I also act as General Manager of WKSS day-to-day, so I wear a couple of different hats.

YOU BROKE INTO THE BUSINESS AT THE LEGENDARY WBCN IN BOSTON.

That's right. I worked there for nine years. I'm one of the original 'BCNers. I worked there throughout the '70s. I left in 1980. I started out writing copy and doing production and a little air work, and I very quickly realized that the money in the business was to be made by sales people. I became the local sales manager, then the general sales manager, and when I left I was the acting station manager. I was pretty young, but I certainly worked there through the legendary period. It was a very, very exciting time. I left shortly after Infinity bought it and then I went to KISS108, so I've worked at two great radio

MAKE IT THREE. NOW THAT YOU'RE AT KISS IN HARTFORD.

And now my own station.

GIVE ME SOME BACKGROUND ON PRECISION MEDIA.

I would have expected that we would have grown a lot more by now than we have, but the recession hit us just like it hit everybody else, and I think that, coupled with the highly leveraged transactions that were being done in the '80s didn't allow us to grow as fast as we wanted to. We have four radio stations. A so-called duopoly up in Portsmouth, New Hampshire and we have KISS here in Hartford. We're very aggressively looking for new properties right now. We have a good lender and we have access to some funds, and we're looking. Prices are high right now, but I think the right opportunities will come along. I expect by the end of the year we'll make another acquisition. We're bullish. We think it's a great business. We've enjoyed it. We've always done well. We fought a tough battle here in Hartford, but I believe this is basically a sound market, a good competitive market. We have a great radio station and it provides a terrific springboard for other acquisitions.



What's happening with the "Candyman," John Candelaria, at KPRR/El Paso?




