Programmer's Think Tank

JUST SAY NO

It's television sweep-week, so the TV stations are trying to unearth society's shames and secrets to run as features on the late news. In New York City, some news-vulture uncovered the allegation that cheese - as much as a year and a half old - is being fed to kids as part of the school lunch program. Furthermore, the wheels cf cheese had mold, in some cases, growing on the outside. "Blaaah, spit, gag, retch..." The righteous public responds. "They're poisoning our kids," a do-gooder exclaims as she takes a bite of salad with Roquefort Cheese dressing. She never stops to consider that Roquefort and Bleu Cheese owe their distinct colorism texture and flavor to the mold that grows in the cheeses. Furthermore, virtually all cheese is aged. The older the better. When big wheels are agec in a cool, dry place like a basement, for anywhere from 60 days to several years, the bacteria and mold grow and flavor the cheese and the mold is carefully scrapped off to avoid upsetting the queasy consumer.

Besides telling you more than you ever wanted to know about cheese, I want to point out more than we seem to understand about hypocrisy. It's a fact that New York City school children may be eating aged cheddar cheese, and it does piss me off – because I pay \$45 00 a pound to have aged cheese shipped to me from Vermont. These kids just don't appreciate a good thing. "21 Club" has Welsh Rarebit on the menu made with 2-1/2 year aged cheese. At \$22.95, it would make a hell of a school lunch. The problem is, we keep getting lost along the way before we focus on the big picture. A local disc jockey is supposed to be there to "jockey the discs" – to pick the order the songs are played and make the "show" fit together as one cohesive unit. That's the overview. Now zero in to what's really being served. Morning shows in Top40 radio appear to follow one of a couple of paths. Mostly, it's a "locker room" team doing mornings with too much compression and reverb on the mike channel so there's a lot of sucking, pumping and breathing. This is worsened by the '90s mike technique in which if the nose and lip don't touch the mike, then you're "offmike." The alternative to the locker room is the "bit jockey" or the "endless promo" type show.

Finding an air talent for any time period who's warm, friendly and relatable – and who knows how to use a microphone – is difficult. That we take away any chance for these would-be's to develop and grow is a tragedy. It took me two weeks to fill out my "Billboard" Awards nomination ballot. I was really forced to dig deep to find small and medium market morning personalities that were exceptional in Top40.

Now, in total violation of everything local radio stands for, we're giving up morning drive to syndication. Satellite-delivered formats and daily music shows have not ever worked in radio's history. Greedy radio pigs have tried this trick since the 1960's when Mutual tried to take Dick Bondi national in evenings. A weekly feature is one thing – a daily complete airshift originating from out of the market is suicide. If you're told that all timely and regional references are excluded from the show or interfaced to the computer locally, then who needs the show?


Hey, I make my living from this business. I love radio and I believe in syndication and network programming as a way to obtain material that is a distinct asset to your station. Yet to try and produce it locally would not be realistic or feasible given your resources. It doesn't take that many resources to put on a Top40 morning show!!!

I admire the way talk radio has been resurrected by satellite delivered networks. Talk lends itself especially well to national distribution, but music needs to be interfaced with human beings and the market to build a daily following. Efforts to syndicate the #1 Country show in America. Gerry House failed. There are <u>no</u> music-driven daily shows out there that work, with the possible exception of Tom Joyner.

Radio is in the "economic sweeps" when ownership is vigilant for ways to cut overhead and improve efficiency. The moguls that own the airwaves would love to believe that a six or seven figure morning show could be replaced with syndication. A big proven name on a medium-size station! Wow! Investors love that as much as the TV ratings mongers love the story of old cheese in kids lunches. Just don't buy into the game...it's your own nemesis.

Crackers and cheese anyone? And whatever wine you're pouring for third grade lunch will be fine.


Welcome to HITMAKERS '95 in Chi-Town. From what I understand, this years Hitmakers Convention posted a record breaking attendance.

This week I'd like to take you back to a time in radio when it seemed- if only for a short time, that the color-lines were going to be broken. I'm not talking about Top 40, not in it's true sense at least. The format I'm talking to you about was called Crossover. The year was 1985, and what had begun as a mainly Hispanic-driven format in the Southwest and in Miami, soon began to spread all around the courtry. Of course the lean was different in each market, depending on the racial composition of the individual markets, but regardless of the varying fringe records, and the local twist, for a while, Contemporary Crossover was the hottest format around. Artists like Lionel Richie, Whitney Houston, Prince, George Michael, and Madonna, were the backbone of the playlist. These artists were the epitome of Crossover because they appealed to such a wide range of people. Young, Old, Black, White, and Latino. Ten years later, many of these artists are still making hit music, but the Crossover format is all but dead. Why? What happened?

It was a different time. In retrospect, it seems as if people were getting along alot better. There wasn't nearly the division between races that we see in America today. That division seems to have transcended the radio airwaves as well. The great Crossover stations of the past have swung to one side of the pendulum or the other. In the 90's, it seems as if we've taken a step back to a time when you are either Black or White, with no middle ground. The music of today reflects the mindset of the people. In the 80's, Rock music was boring and out-dated. So maybe the white kids were getting into Black music because there was nothing else out there that really demanded their attention. Now there's Alternative music that appeals almost exclusively to the white audience that ten years ago would have probably listened to a Crossover station. On the other side, the Black youth of today listen almost exclusively to Rap/Hip Hop. A few stations have tried to mix Alternative with Rap- but with little or no success.

So is Crossover dead? I don't think so. I think it has gone back to being what it was before the "booming mid-80's". That is, a mainly Hispanic-driven format. Stations like KGGI in Riverside, KSFM in Sacramento, POWER 102 in El Paso, and KTFM in San Antonio, are doing it like they were ten years ago, and still having success with it. Maybe on a national level the Crossover format was a flash in the pan, but in core-Hispanic markets, it is alive and well.

* A lot of times, your only opportunity is in areas where research is negative, because don't forget, everybody else is doing research. We said to Warner-Lambert that they should introduce a flu product and they said, "Gee, our research shows that nobody would buy it!" So, another company introduced the product, "Thera-Flu", which is probably the biggest, most successful over the counter drug in the last couple of years.

* I think that certainly the internet is the hot thing of today...I think it has a number of areas where its very, very strong.

* Its not so much pleasing the musical tastes of your audience -- they don't have any musical taste! They want to hear what other people want to hear. It's a question of what's in and what's out. It's not just reflecting the taste of the public, but creating the taste of the public.

TODD CAVANAH & ERIK BRADLEY PD & MD, B96, Chicago

TODD, LET'S BEGIN WITH AN OVERVIEW OF YOUR VERY INTERESTING CAREER. YOU STARTED IN RADIO, MADE THE TRANSITION TO RECORD PROMOTION, THEN SEGUED SUCCESSFULLY <u>BACK</u> INTO RADIO, AS THE PROGRAMMER OF ONE OF THE COUNTRY'S MOST ACCLAIMED STATIONS. HOW DID IT ALL HAPPEN?

Well, what happened is I was doing local in Denver for Elektra and they ended up wanting me to go to Chicago. I came here, did promotions for about a year and then they promoted me to National. And in that same time Buddy Scott, who was programming B96 asked me if I'd be interested in doing some weekends. So being the record rep for Elektra, I went to the other stations and said, "hey, do you have a problem with this?" And Rick Lippincott and Brian Kelly at Z95 said "no problem." The only people that really hated me was the people at The Loop. They didn't want me to come into the radio station because I was the Elektra rep and I was working weekends at B96. But I ended up filling in. I did all of the vacation fill-in, did mornings, did afternoons, did a couple of weekend shifts. And as I was doing that, Dave Shakes came in to program B96. And he came to one one day and said, "Hey I really would like to have you full time on the air. I think you sound good and with your knowledge of the market for music, I'd love to have you as music director and do middays.' And after working fill-in here for over a year and doing both jobs, I really decided in my heart that radio was still in my heart. I hadn't done everything that I could do in radio and I decided to go back full time. I made a decision and it was a wise decision, I think.

WHY DID YOU LEAVE RADIO IN THE FIRST PLACE?

I was bored with it. I'd been doing it since I was 15. I started real young and I was in Denver at Y108 and I saw the people travelling. I thought it would be fun to work on the other side of the business and I actually, it was the best thing I did. It was like going to college, learning the record side of things and the record companies' agenda and it really helped me become a better programmer knowing both sides of the business.

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE MOST IMPORTANT THINGS YOU LEARNED ON THE RECORD SIDE?


I learned a lot about working records from the street, the clubs, the marketing from the retail and the record pools and really learned how a record is broken. I learned as a programmer to look at some of those indicators early before SoundScan and before 15 other stations add a record, how to look for those golden records, those hits. And I learned how to accumulate frequent flyer miles and get free vacations and things like that. Actually just the street level – working records from the street. That's probably my biggest thing.

DO YOU THINK THAT AS A PROGRAMMER, THE WAY YOU TREAT RECORD REPS NOW, VERSUS BEFORE YOUR RECORD EXPERIENCE, HAS CHANGED?

I am really honest with people and I think it's hard to come back sometimes with stats and sales and things like that because I know I'm really honest. I'm not a PD that'll say one thing and then the next week go against my word and add a record that doesn't really make sense. I think that when you get a response from B96 on why we're not on a record or why we are on a record, whether it comes from Erik Bradley or myself, it's an honest answer. One thing that B96 is is we're very consistent.

WE MIGHT SAY THAT B96 HAS BECOME A HERITAGE RADIO STATION IN CHICAGO. RIGHT?

Yes. I think that it's a station that...it's really interesting because now I get letters in the mail all the time from young people from other



since it's been any kind of a contemporary radio station. Buddy Scott, Dave Shakes and then myself. So before that I really don't know what they were doing. We found some old letters in a supply closet and I think they were Rock or something way back in the '70s. I'm not sure what they were here.

HOW HAS THE RADIO STATION EVOLVED THROUGH BUDDY SCOTT TO DAVE SHAKES THEN TO YOU?

I think that with Buddy Scott, back in those days we seemed to play a little more music for the Urban audience. It seemed that way to me. Dave Shakes brought in a lot of Top40 things. He brought in fun



markets, and even other countries. who want tapes of this radio station. I think that we offer personality. We do fun contests. We play really outrageous music. And I think that if you're a young person listening to the radio in Chicago, that this is one of the stations that when you get older vou'll talk about. I think that we've done enough consistently over the last few years, whether it be the Killer Bee or Party Radio, that there's a lot of memories in this radio station and it's a fun radio station. It's like a soap opera. Jocks talk about other jocks. It's a family and I think that it's become a heritage radio station. I think it's very well respected.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN IN THE FORMAT?

There's only been three programmers for this radio station

contests, outrageous personalities and really made it like KFRC. Dave interned at KFRC, I grew up listening to KFRC. So when Dave and I worked together we used to always talk about KFRC. When we did a great promotion or we had a great break from a jock or great jingles, we'd always say"that's KFRC." It was a station that I always dreamed about working at and of course, it's now no longer what it was then. So I think that we really made B96 more of a Top40 station and really focused it on some certain demographics in the market. We're really focused and we've really targeted that segment right. And now it's evolving into a situation where we are definitely the dance position in Chicago. When you want to party, you turn on B96. We are getting more competition, and there's more formats being niched out around us. So we're changing and



adjusting the radio station to that. But I think that since 1990 it's pretty much remained the same in our overall feel for the station, with contesting and air personalities and things like that.

CAN YOU GIVE US AN IDEA OF WHAT THE COMPETITION IS LIKE? LET'S START WITH Q101.

Q101 is a harder-edged, it's harder than it was when they came on the dial, and they'll admit to it too. That's where that music is going. It's Alternative and Rock. I think that finally people that like AOR...AOR kept growing with the audience. AOR became Classic Record. And then all of the AOR stations in the market were playing Bruce Hornsby records. Now there's finally a young person's Rock station and that's how I look at Q101. The music is selling CDs. There's definitely a market for it. They're about where we are now in cume actually. They've almost tied us in cume with over a million people a week, so they have definitely been the station that we've lost more of our audience to. Believe it or not, it's not GCI or JAMZ or any of those stations, it's Q101. It's just like the same thing we went through when THE BLAZE came on the air. It's a new thing, a new restaurant, people are checking it out. Will it continue? Well, time will tell. This station has continued. One thing that I can say about B96 is we've been under attack from a lot of radio stations and we've always remained on top. We're going through a little bit of a down cycle right now. We're rebuilding because of the loss of our morning show. So all the losses that we're going to see in this next book are all related to the mornings, and we're working on that. It takes time to rebuild a morning show, especially a morning show that had been on the station for five years.

WHO DO YOU SHARE THE MOST CUME WITH?

WGCI probably. We share more of our ethnic audience with WGCI than anywhere else. They're a very strong, stable radio station. They're very

focused at the Urban audience. They've got highly visible air personalities. They are rhythmic to some degree, but I would say a little more adult. But we share. It's either us or them number one or number two in teens, so in the teen area we tend to be a lot closer with 'GCI than anybody else.

WHAT IS THIS ETHNIC BREAK-OUT OF YOUR AUDIENCE?

We're 55% white, 35% Hispanic and about 10% black. And that's what really surprises a lot of people, because we're in the rhythmic side of the chart, and a lot of people are probably surprised that we are more white than anything else. That's why some of the Urban Crossover music is so late here because we play only a select few cuts...the biggest ones. And the other ones, some of them come and go and we never touch them because we're playing the ones that cross over with our white core.

B96 HAS HAD A LOT OF CONSULTANTS IN THE PAST. WHO'S IN THERE NOW?

Ever since I've been here it's been Alan Burns. Before that, I think Jerry Clifton was in here for a little white with Buddy. That was before my time. I really can't answer before that.

HOW IS ALAN TO WORK WITH?

Alan is great. I use Alan mainly for strategy, for strategic issues. If I have a question about a contest that we're thinking about doing, he's a great guy to bounce it off of. He's got a couple of decades of programming experience. It's nice to go to somebody and say, "Hey I'm thinking about doing this. What do you think? What's the down side? Do you have a better idea?" Musically the station is so unique that nobody can figure us out. We play a lot of freaky records here that are club records because that's what this audience and this market enjoys. But Alan really is great at listening to the radio station, listening to my morning show, giving me some advice on that and he's good at talent and strategic issues. And research too.

HOW DO YOU DIFFERENTIATE BETWEEN MUSIC THAT'S HOT IN THE CLUBS AND MUSIC THAT COULD TRANSCEND THE CLUBS AND GO ON THE AIR AND DO WELL AT B96?

Erik: It's not really that hard. You can tell by a lot of ways really. The best way is to see what's going on at retail. If it's selling and getting a lot of reaction at retail and all the record stores that we look at, not just the generic stores, but the active danceleaning stores, that's a great way. If we get requests for some things before we start playing them, you can just tell. It's really hard to not know.

Todd: The thing he's says is if it's not SoundScan, we have a list of stores that aren't even hooked up to SoundScan that we call and they'll give us the real deal. They'll say,

"Yeah this thing sold 100 pieces this week." Another way that we really find which records are big, is out of our mix shows. How many dance songs are there a week? These guys are playing hundreds of dance mixes and songs and we play three or four of them out of the mixes that become actual big hits. There are a lot of songs out there that just are good mix songs or good club songs. But there's a very few that actually cross over. So a lot of people think since we play dance music that if they release a dance song we're going to automatically add it. They don't realize that you go from point A to point B to point C. Not point A to point C. It's not from release to on the radio. There's a whole other area of mix play and retail tracking that goes on before we actually add songs to regular rotation.

YOU HAVE FIVE FULL-TIME MIXERS. HOW MANY OF THEM HAVE THEIR OWN SHOWS?

Their own mix shows? They all do.

SO WHEN DO YOU PROGRAM THESE MIX SHOWS?

Erik: Predominantly on the weekends. We have a slot from 10 p.m. - 4 a.m. Friday and Saturday nights. We mostly do 10:00 remix during the week days and ? night.

ERIK, I KNOW YOU STARTED IN CHARLOTTE WITH MARK SHANDS. TELL US ABOUT YOUR BACKGROUND IN RADIO. hits at KISS102. I was showing him the research and all the positives we had on her.

Todd: So let that be a lesson to all the young Music Directors out there. When a record person comes in to work you on a record, you never know. They may be your future PD.

Erik: That's the way it happened for me!

AND THEN YOU WENT TO KANSAS CITY, RIGHT?

Right. For about six months. That was actually after being at WCKZ for about four years. The time was right for me to move on. Kansas City ended up being a good experience. It was the first time I was out on my own and the first time I was away from my family. KBEQ was pretty cool – a 20-year heritage Top40 station. Then out of the blue the format was changed to Country, so it ended sour.

BEAUTIFUL STUDIOS!

Great studios. Kip City ended up being a pretty fun experience for me. It was the first time out on my own and the first time away from my family and the station was cool. But when it changed to Country, it was kind of a disaster for me.

AND THEN FROM THERE YOU WENT TO CHICAGO?

Actually I went back to WCKZ. Jerry called me back to Charlotte and asked if I wanted to do the music. I figured it would be better to be home and work there than be away doing

Erik: I started at WCKZ in my hometown, Charlotte, NC. I began in the research department, working three hours a night for a couple nights a week. I wanted so bad to be involved in the station, so I'd go in to work at noon, just so I could be a part of the station. I assisted in the Music Department and Promotions Department, whatever it took to be in the station and learn more about radio because I loved it so much!

WHAT STATION WAS THAT?

Erik: WEKZ in Charlotte. I basically started there in the research department and was supposed to work 6 p.m. - 9 p.m. each night for three nights a week. I would just end up going in at noon or 10 a.m. or whatever time I could just to get in there and do whatever I could to be a part of the station because I loved it.

Todd: Now tell them how I came in and worked you on records.

Erik: My first month at the station Todd came in and was working Anita Baker, who happened to have a few Country and being miserable. So I went home and fortunately, six months later, Todd rescued me from the disaster at the station.

TODD, WHAT IS IT IN ERIK THAT YOU LIKED SO MUCH THAT YOU BROUGHT HIM TO CHICAGO?

I advertised the job like you're required to do. I had no idea who I was going to hire. I said to myself, "God, I've got to find another Todd Cavanah. Somebody that'll work until 3 a.m. Somebody that'll do the job until it's done, won't complain, be a team player." I was a hard worker when I was Music Director and I was looking for those kind of characteristics. I've got to tell you, I did talk to a few record people and I asked, "Who are the up-and-coming guys out there, who are the guys that are honest, that have a lot of respect?" Erik's name came up from several people that I respected, and he sent me the best package. This guy sent me logs, sent me several logs from a week, sent me music rotations, sent me great letters, had great followthrough. Everything was typed and looked great and I thought this guy is like a little manager here. He had the best package. He sent me everything and I kind of gauged everything else I received from that point on. He was one of the early guys that sent me a package. I gauged everything else from Erik's package because it just outdid everything else I received. I flew him in once for an interview. He likes sports, likes barbeques, so I said he's the guy.

WHO'S ACTUALLY ON THE AIR AT B96, FOR EVERYONE IN TOWN FOR THE CONVEN-TION? RUN DOWN YOUR ON-AIR LINE-UP.

Todd: Mornings we have a new morning show, TJ. & Wild Bill. They were a couple of guys that we teamed up for mornings. They've had two full books so they're really early in their career here in Chicago, but we're working on some things and we're getting them tweaked and I think they're going to be successful. In middays we have a two year veteran. Her name is Coco Cortez. She does 10-2 Afternoon drive is a gentleman named Terry Fox, who I hired out of Dallas. He was working at K104. He's been here almost two years now. At nights, 6-10 is George McFly, who had been here before during the Killer Bee days, went to POWER106 in L.A. and I hired him back to do nights. After that is Frankie Hollywood Rodriguez, who was a mixer on the station who we turned into an air personality. He does late nights from 10 p.m.-3 a.m. He just had his two year anniversary. So really all my jocks...when I came in I hired a new staff and everybody's kind of coming in to their own now. They've been here about two years and it takes about two years for people to get familiar in a market, so that's who you're hearing on the radio. And if you watch Channel 26 (WCIU), you can see our dance show that's on every day for an hour Monday-Friday. It's on from 4 p.m. -5 p.m. It's hosted by some of my mixers with videos and mixes. It's an hour-long show on a local station, WCIU. I think if you check it out you can decide for yourself.

HOW HAS THE AUDIENCE RESPONSE BEEN TO THAT TV SHOW?

Well, we wondered, "Is this safe to put a TV show on and have it up against our own radio station?" But the show is called "You Dance With B96." It's got a logo all over it. It's like an info-mercial for B96, so it's really interesting that when we first put the show on we were getting calls on the request line. People saying, "Hey we'd like to request this video or this video." So people think it's B96. So I don't think we're going to lose any cume. As a matter of fact, our afternoon numbers in the last trend went up. I think people, if they're getting an Arbitron diary, even if they're watching the show, are writing down B96.





THE MOTHER OF ALL DAYS

As a Promotion Director, | always loved doing Mothers Day contests and events, if purely from a mercenary point of view: I was able to grab a few of whatever we were giving away off the top and my own Mothers Day expenses were dramatically cut. Not that whitecollar crime in the Promotions closet is the only reason we should be doing stuff for Mom in May. Besides giving us the proverbial wacky fix that we've so desperately been needing since St. Patty's Day, it's one of those rare occasions when we can get a little mushy on the air without the Geek Meter registering off the scale.

There are many things that a radio station can do for Mothers Day that will allow you to tap into the whole sentimental vibe. Since this always falls on a weekend, why not use these two-and-a-half days to let listeners call in and salute their female parental units? On-air dedications are always excellent. It's even better if you do them the week before, tape them and let the people know when their dedication's are going to air, so that everyone in the family can be tuned to hear this very special and personal moment that's being shared with several hundred thousand people. Or, provide everyone who's dedications you aired, with a cassette of it actually being done on the air, including the jock's intro and whatever song was attached to it.

James Baker is the Program Director at KZIO in Duluth, a town that has a notoriously bad rap for being so %\$#& cold, but has always been known for having great radio. "We're bringing back one of our old Mothers Day standards, The Mothers Roll-Call, that we'll run that weekend", says Baker. This feature involves soliciting post cards from the audience, espousing the wonderful qualities of the writers' mothers. Many of these are recorded onto promos, with three or four salutations per promo, and then rotated throughout the weekend. Something similar that I've heard is having a jock go out to an elementary school or daycare facility and getting taped messages from kids to their moms. These are insufferably cute and are almost impossible to take if you're a diabetic. Having worked with a few jocks who actually enjoyed lurking around elementary schools and daycare facilities, I can kick myself for not ever having done this bit.

There seems to be a mind-set that you have to give away flowers, candy and jewelry for Mothers Day. While these are all fine prizes, many stations just blow these out through "Caller #10" contesting without any Mothers Day hook to it. Pardon me, but that's stupid. Please quit radio immediately if this is your idea of servicing Mothers Day. If you dig a little deeper, there are many other appropriate prizes for this holiday. How about sending someone over to cook her breakfast in bed, clean the house, do the laundry and shop for groceries? Even better, what if the person who did all this work was the morning jock from your station?

Sales is going to want to get involved with Mothers Day, which is good since they can be the source for all of your wonderful prizes. However it's important to remember to keep the contesting on-air. A perfect example of what can happen with a register-to-win promotion is the Wildest Mom contest I did when I was in the Bay Area. The Grand Prize winner got to go to LA with three of her friends for a weekend of fun and debauchery. They all got temporary tattoos, shopping sprees for wild clothing like leather mini skirts, hot new hair styles. and \$107 in one dollar bills for stuffing in the guy's g-strings we sent them to when Chippendales in Hollywood in a limo. A cool contest, right? It got turned into a register-to-win promotion and the winner who was randomly drawn from among all of the various locations was a 62 year old retired guard from a woman's prison and she'd never heard of Wild 107. Two of her quests had infirmities that precluded them from'



Reuniting moms and their kids is another avenue to pursue. You can either fly one or the other to another city so they can be together for Mothers Day. Or you can at least give them some free phone service. With the advent of station calling cards, expect no less then 10,000 radio stations to do this promotion in '95. If you've got conferencing capabilities in the studio, on Sunday the 14th, have jocks do the actual dialing and hooking up of moms with kids. Put the first 30 seconds of it on the air arid then segue into music so they can finish their conversation in private.

flying, etc., etc., etc. Learn from my mistake. This is too good of a holiday to allow some client to get all of the hype and excitement out of it.

Erik: People think they're watching B96 on TV. They don't think it's any different than the radio.

Todd: And it's a great way to market dance music to teens because they're not exposed to it on MTV. They're not exposed to it because they're too young to go into the clubs, so it's a good way for us to bring young adults into the dance culture.

YOU JUST BROUGHT UP MTV. HOW MUCH OF AN IMPACT DOES MTV PLAY IN THE MUSIC THAT'S SOLD IN AND AROUND CHICAGO?

Erik: It has a pretty big impact. The way that I really see it is when they get behind something and they pound it they can only make something of it. It seems like if they get behind something, like we happen to be playing too, you can see it really break that much quicker, like TLC, Boyz II Men and names like that. They can really drive it home. As far as the Alternative stuff goes, it goes without saying. That's going to sell anyway because it's getting played on all the Alternative stations.

Todd: One thing that they did is they helped build Q101 by playing all that Alternative music. It helped that whole Alternative scene happen faster in Chicago.

TODD, NOW THAT YOU'RE BACK IN RADIO AND IN SUCH A SUCCESSFUL POSITION, DO YOU SEE YOURSELF STAYING WITH IT, POSSIBLY BECOMING A GENERAL MANAGER IN THE FUTURE?

I think that that would probably be the next step. I think I've got probably 10 years left of doing this. You have your ups and your downs. You have your good books and your bad books. And once you learn, and you're a veteran and you go through a bad book and you go through your bad books, it becomes a lot easier to deal with on a day-to-day basis. You know that you're under Arbitron's rules and you know the rules of the game. And I still hate down books. I hate rebuilding. Rebuilding is exciting in some ways, but it's frustrating in others because it takes so long to rebuild a morning show and that's what we're going through right now. As I said before, this radio station is the same or outperforming the rest of the day from 10 a.m.-midnight. Outside of mornings, that's our only losses right now. So I'm real excited to get mornings going and to get the station back to where it was. We're in a rebuilding phase right now, but I would say that after going through this and learning more, going through building a morning show, I think that I'm probably ready. Down the line I would like to look at running a radio station.

AND I GUESS FOR ERIK THE QUESTION WOULD BE, WHAT'S IN THE IMMEDIATE FUTURE FOR YOU? I GUESS YOU'D LIKE TO BE CAPTAIN OF YOUR OWN SHIP SOMEDAY?

That's something I don't think \underline{too} much about because I want to stay

focused on the current task at hand, which is to make B96 kick ass in Chicago. I do know one thing. I'm VERY happy being the Music Director at B96. I mean, who wouldn't be? I'm extremely fortunate to be in this position. I get paid to work with music – something I love more than almost anything else. And I get to do it in an exceptional environment. I'm in the business for the music, so that's what my future will entail, God willing. As far as becoming a PD, I think I could do it but don't know if I wanted to right now.

DO YOU SEE THE FORMAT CONTINUING TO BE AS SUCCESSFUL AS IT HAS BEEN AROUND THE COUNTRY?

Erik: What format? Top40?

TOP40, DANCE, RHYTHMIC FORMAT, STREET-ORIENTED RADIO STATION.

Erik: It depends on the city. Our format is a legitimate format in Chicago. We've been able to do it for so long and be profitable at it. That's what it's all about.

MANY PEOPLE ARE LOOKING AT THE ALTERNATIVE MUSIC WAVE THAT'S COMING ALONG NOW AND PREDICTING THAT IT IS GOING TO BE THE NEXT BIG PHASE, NOT ONLY IN THE RECORD BUSINESS BUT IN RADIO. DO YOU HAVE ANY THOUGHTS ON THAT? AMERICA TO START ANY OF THAT AND YOU'RE STILL DOING THAT. HOW DID YOUR RESEARCH COME UP WITH THAT WHEN EVERYBODY ELSE TENDS TO SHY AWAY FROM THAT?

Todd: Well Techno really is pretty much over now. When I do research groups and we go out and do listener panels, some of the audience, especially the suburb people, they tend to call anything that's Euro-sounding as Techno. The name Techno is still strong in their vocabulary. But actually the music that has taken over for Techno in this market is the Euro-Dance. The Fun Factory's, the Real McCoy records, the Maxx <u>Get Away</u>. That's really big for Chicago right now and it's really big with the white audience more than anybody else, so it's good for us.

Erik: Some people think Techno is Euro. I've had meetings with several people from Italy and other countries that have passed through Chicago and they all say that the Superstars in their countries are Euro artists. They're like Boyz II Men or TLC is here.

Todd: It's like The Outhere Bros. They are like Madonna in Italy. These guys are huge. They live in Chicago and we're probably the first station and only station in America playing The Outhere Bros. We're about three cuts deep on their album and they're selling thousands of copies of their album overseas and they're platinum in Italy. You see the success of dance music in Europe and it tends to be in America that people always want to have

Todd: It's going to be a situation where we should see how these artists do on their second releases. Everybody jumped on the Rap bandwagon, now everybody is jumping on Alternative music as the answer to Top40s problems. The bottom line is, you've got to play the hits for your market and this radio station is the number one cuming music station. We're the number one most-listened to music station in Chicago. So I think what we're doing, there's definitely a market for, and there's definitely a market for Alternative. When you get into a big city like this, there's millions of people and you can niche out your own section. We're not avoiding an Elton John Lion King record. We're not going to avoid a Celine Dion Power Of Love record. We still play those records along with our dance mix, so we still are very mass appeal. I think in a lot of ways people don't realize that.

MUSICALLY, YOU ALL PLAY RECORDS THAT MORE OR LESS HAVE SOME SORT OF TECHNO FEEL TO THEM. YOU WERE SOME OF THE FIRST GUYS IN something that's cool somewhere else. So I think there's still a lot of room for dance music to grow in America. I think that it's recycling around and everything comes through in cycles. But again, we're already there so we're just going to play the biggest hits that cross over. We'll still play the big Boyz II Men records and B96 really doesn't change too much.

WHAT RECORDS, IN GENERAL, DO YOU SEE BREAKING OUT IN THE NEAR FUTURE?

Erik: The new song by All-4-One [Can Love You Like That is without a doubt a complete smash. I love that song. Tony Thompson is gonna be a star on his own, just as he was with Hi-Five. Speaking of stars, is there any doubt about Jon B? He IS all that. There's a new song coming out by Fun Factory called <u>I Wanna B With U</u>, which I feel is a #1 Pop record. Mainstream radio is gonna freak out for this song. Future B96 MEGA-SMASHES include Max-A-Million <u>Take Your Time</u>, The Outhere Brothers <u>Boom Boom Boom</u>, and MCM-13 <u>My</u> Ding Dong – a total phone monster.

LET'S TALK ABOUT WHAT PEOPLE SHOULD DO WHILE THEY'RE IN YOUR TOWN OF CHICAGO. WHAT'S THE HOT RESTAURANTS AND HOT CLUBS AND WHERE SHOULD EVERY-BODY HANG OUT?

Todd: You've got to go to Michael Jordan's, Ruth Chris' Steak House. My favorite Italian place is Mia Francesca. It's hard to get in there. You can call me to get a reservation, but it's probably the primo Italian place. One of my favorites.

Erik: As far as Italian goes, I like Maggianos Restaurant. You gotta go to the United Center and pay respects to the greatest athlete that ever played anything, Michael Jordan. His restaurant is worthy of attention too. Go see the Bulls play (if you can track down the tix!) 'cuz they're goin' all the way again!!!

Todd: Yes. Bulls all the way.

Erik: Go see the Sox, they're playing the KC Royals all weekend. As far as clubs go, there are so many I can't list all of 'em, but I'm gonna be hangin' at Crobar, Kaboom, Excalibur, Shelter, and Cairo, where Bad Boy Bill & Julian "Jumpin" Perez are gonna be spinnin' on Friday night.

WHAT ABOUT THE ROSEBUD?

Todd: The Rosebud is ok. That's where old, rich Republicans hang out. But if you want to be cool and hang out with the artsy, fartsy people then, the place you have to check out is Mia Francesca.

WHAT ABOUT ELI'S STEAK HOUSE?

Todd: Eli's is good if you're looking for Howard Bedno.

WE'VE GOT TO GO THERE AND HAVE THE POTATO LATKES. WE FIGURED THAT ANYBODY LEAVING CHICAGO ON SUNDAY HAS TO BE NOT ONLY WELL INFORMED, BUT WELL FED AND WELL ENTERTAINED. WHAT DO YOU THINK?

Todd: Chicago is a great city, great food, clean, there's great radio here. It's a great radio market. The audience is very educated on radio here because we have a columnist that writes a column every day in the *Sun Times*, just on radio. So you get a lot of good radio all up and down the dial. Everybody's doing their own thing and I think you'll have a wonderful convention.

GENTLEMEN, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. WE'D LIKE TO THANK YOU FOR BEING THERE FOR US AND BEING THE HOST STATION. THIS IS OUR FOURTH CONVENTION IN CHICAGO AND WE LOVE COMING BACK TO YOUR GREAT CITY.

Todd: Well thanks. We love having you and hope you enjoy B96 while you're here.


