

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

MCA RECORDS AND DOUG MORRIS ANNOUNCE A JOINT VENTURE TO LAUNCH NEW RECORD LABEL



Al Teller (right), Chairman and CEO, MCA Music Entertainment Group, announced a 50/50 joint venture to form a new record label affiliated with MCA Records that will be headed by **Doug Morris** (left), formerly chairman and CEO of Warner Music U.S. The label will be based in New York City.

Under a multi-year agreement, Mr. Morris will serve as Chairman and CEO of one of the largest joint ventures in the history of the music industry. He will create a full service label with its own A&R, marketing and promotion departments. Backroom functions such as royalty accounting, legal, business affairs and finance will be handled through MCA Records. UNI Distribution will distribute the label domestically, and MCA Music Entertainment International will be responsible for distribution internationally.

HIRIAM HICKS TO HEAD NEW BLACK MUSIC DIVISION AT ISLAND



John Barbis, President and CEO of Island Records, announced the formation of a new Black Music Division at the label to be headed by veteran recording industry entrepreneur Hiriam Hicks.

Hiriam Hicks is perhaps best known as the managerial force behind such chart-topping acts as TLC, Bell, Biv, Devoe and Keith Sweat. His career began in the '80s when he signed on as the tour manager for the R&B group, New Edition. From there, Hicks went on to manage other successful groups, writers and producers. He also founded the Philadelphia-based rap magazine. Serious Hip Hop, one of the first


magazine Serious Hip Hop, one of the first Black-owned magazines of its kind.

Mr. Hicks, whose official title will be Sr. VP/GM, Black Music Division, will be responsible for assembling personnel to staff the new division, drawing both from existing Island executives as well as from outside the label. 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

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DIZZY TIMES IN RADIO BIZ

WRITING THE "BRIEFS" is always a challenge, a venture to stir and arouse, motivate and contemplate the various situations, zero in on miscellaneous hot spots. Since June, travelling around the country, producing promos, networking with people in person or in the comfort of the net, on-line or the telephone, I have observed so much. It seems that there is a very confused "what to do?" attitude in radioland. It seems that there are more copy cat scenarios than should be. Why? It's a war zone on the airwaves...understandable, to a point. It shouldn't be that way in the hallways. So hold the phone! It can be avoided. How? Guts, draggin' the street, getting aggressive, thinking for yourself and for the team. With all the trading, buying and selling, deregulation and action at the banks right now, insecurity among programmers seems to be running at high rev's. The cycle of radio programming has always had its slumps, but somehow, given time, it overcomes, comes back strong. It appears that the cycles are getting shorter and shorter between the ups and downs. That is not a very good sign if the medium is to protect itself with ratings and revenue...and good talented people. There again, we'd better be careful before it's too late. There's some super people doin' a great job. But the well is running very low. We must get the vitality and balls back into the format(s). Study, work hard, take on some new renegade spirit, throw some rambo attitude back on the air, play the hits, chill the chicken rock crap and get those turbo rockets charged up. And beware of the copy cat business...everyone starts sounding the same and...poof...it's back to the drawing board, unemployment and the wait to get the listeners excited again.

AN IDEA

IT'S BEEN DONE BEFORE...maybe it's time to do it again. The programmers and Dee Jays today are becoming more and more "specialists" at various aspects of creating the sound of a radio station. Creative people, production, promotion, peer group leaders, daypart intensive (mornings, day, afternoon, night...the whole personality of a station. Music ears for one time of the day or another. Phone users, brief, on and gone type presenters. Really, stop and think about it. With the way the programming of a station needs to be handled these days. Can we really expect one single human being to do the whole thing? (If so - they should be making a whole lot more money)! Sure, there has to be the PD or the Operations Manager, the General Manager, Chief Engineer, Business Manager, Traffic Director. Mixed all together the specialists working with the basic management team, and a fully understood game plan...could it be possible that everyone involved gets more satisfaction, thus more positive contribution to the overall effort? I'm not suggesting chaos, but strong individual effort from each individual that really super sizzles in a certain area. I remember that era. Then the whole thing got so cookie cutter, that it may be why we are looking at such a *huge* talent void. Something to think about...and do something about it.

THE LOSS OF A GREAT ONE

It was a loss of a great person. A personality who had a great idea, blessed with so much talent and for sure a real renegade...one of the first of the Top40 days. A friend of mine, maybe yours and certainly to many listeners. Wolfman Jack. So much could be said about him. He'll be missed. And to his wife (I was at the wedding), and family, may God comfort your loss. For those of you who missed his shows years ago...it was a trip. Many of us owe him a lot. He paved a path for us to be strong enough to pave one of our own. One last clap for the Wolfman. Thanks bud.

WYATT EARP?

A programming cowboy story. The Wild West produced some fascinating tales. One is *The Wyatt Earp Story...*adapted for radio. It's a good one to inject into your imagination during this awkward time. THE BEAT GOES ON

The music styles of the '90s has become so narrowly sliced into micro-niches that it's probably very difficult to explain an exact music position for most Top40 stations. Especially when they happen to be shaded with small differences from one station to another. Hits are hits. Extreme differences in music styles certainly deserve special categorical identification, understood? Have we taken it too far? Is it possible that we need to "modernize" (by actually going back to a basic core music generalization)? The charts have sliced out and gashed format approaches to the point that popular music has become so difficult to easily describe, that the term mass appeal has bitten the dust. Rolling Stone magazine did a bit on VH1 and MTV recently. Plainly it seemed that presentation and some slight music differences made it tough to really draw

specific, hard line differences between the two. Over the past several years, certain radio trade magazines have "expanded" the charts for formats that it's no wonder that other studies have cut the pie into such fractionalized categories. It's not hard to figure out why it would appear that Top40, basic hit-based, current driven stations, seem to be dropping in scary numbers. One would think that out of all the radio stations that report and are tracked and monitored by the "airplay police": we have lost sight of basic popular music playlists. Country, Rock, Top40, Christian, Urban/Black, Modern and Progressive. Really, do we need to cut it up so much? It seems pretty simple to fit the correct songs into some basic and obvious categories. Alternative music styles are just that. They are an alternative to a core format that caters to specific listener tastes like Jazz, Hip Hop, Oldies, etc. There must be a more simple way to cluster the active formats in a generalization that would give programmers an overall idea of what's on the air and happening. To use that information and check against the local scene in anytown would be very helpful. But to cut it up into so many pieces seems to be overkill and confusing. I'll bet there is a system (I know there is...) That would simplify the reporting by trades to indicate, and help stations get, a better overall feel for what to be aware of by the networking and bulk feedback. It's an opinion I've had for a long time. The trades do a great job and spend a lot of time and effort collecting data, but has it gone too far?

RATINGS

It's just about time for the book to be handing out – the report card. I wish all of you the very best. This is (as they all are) but, this book is really going to have some very heavy impact as we roll into 1996. Many questions may be answered, hard directions and quite possibly a big time wake up call for some PD's, GM's, Owners and Dee Jay's...not to forget research companies and consultants. This book is gonna be as hot as the Summertime temperature. Are the trades trying to be program consultants?







RANDOM THOUGHTS

The Internet-

Someday, somehow, radio will find a way to effectively market itself on the Internet. This morning I woke up at around 7am, fixed a bowl of Fruit Loops for each of my kids, and while they ate, quickly headed downstairs to my work area. First thing did was boot up my computer. As it went through it's series of tests, I turned on the radio. While I listened to one of Washington's morning shows, and entered the Internet, I thought, "what if the first thing I saw when the Internet menu came up was an invitation to tune in to a specific radio station? Maybe because they were doing some kind of contest tied in the Internet, or maybe for a cluster of songs by one of my favorite artists"?

As it stands, you have to go into "Radio's Home On The Internet", at http://www.cmmnet.com. Of course the only people who are going to do this are in the pusiness, but there's got to be some way to effect the listening of the general audiencemany of whom are experiencing the Internet for the first time.

Research-

Lots of ruffled feathers over my recent article about research. Firstly, mine were ruffled, because Hitmakers misspelled the word "research", r-e-a-s-e-a-r-c-h, in the heading. I guess record guys have been ignoring research for so long that they don't know how to spell it! Hey, I don't care if it's Cluster Analyses, Variety Control, Nest Marketing, or Egg Hatching! Research is a tool, NOT an end-all. If you know your format and your audience, use your gutcombined with research, and you'll win. The stations that still do their research in-house, generally do so because of the cost factor, not because they think that their in-house research is better than that of a national company like Coleman, Critical Mass, or the hundreds of others out there. On the other hand, they don't call it "outhouse" for nothing.

Production-

If you're a Production Director, you need to read Radio and Production, (R.A.P.). The articles are written specifically for you. Many of them are written by Production Directors just like you. Check out the June 1995 issue. WKLQ-FM Grand Rapids Production Director, John Pellegrini, writes an interesting article about Spec Spots, and why they do or do not work. Plus there are "test drives" of some of today's hot new digital equipment, and an interview with WYNY- New York's Production Director, Bill Schultz. Call 214-254-1100 for info on how you can get your copy. Tell 'em Dr. Dave sent you. (No, I'm not getting paid for this plug).

THE MAGIC

It is amazing how hearing the simple truth will hit you on the head. All it takes is one simple statement. Even here n the 90's when we're all bombarded with a constant stream of messages and pitches. We've gotten pretty good at mentally turning all that input off.

I just got one of those jolts of truth. It happened as I was eating lunch, the television was playing nearby. Someone was talking about the baseball strike and the effect the strike has had on the fans of baseball. They were expressing their surprise at the obvious dip in fan enthusiasm now that the strike is over. It was as if the baseball fans had gotten a look "behind the curtain" of the baseball show and did not like what they saw. Greedy uncaring owners who only see the game as a commodity. Stuck-up self-absorbed talent who treat the game like a sideline, a front for their commercial interests.

It's as if the fans and the game itself are ranked far, far down on the baseball chart.

Sounds kinda familiar doesn't it? Radio has become somewhat of a commodity. Now we talk about which corporation did what. Which owner made the biggest offer, or the stupidest move. Seems rare that we talk about the great programming move that was made and the ratings it generated. The jock who has blown away an entire market in a couple of ARBs. The program director who's found the key that moves his station, and company, from worst to first.

In one word, it's the "Magic".

When you're in your station, does it feel like you're back stage at a show that has an audience that includes tens of thousands of people? Or does it feel like you're at a branch office of a savings and loan association? Does your station sound like the office people have taken control or does it sound like the creative people are programming? Are your jocks doing a "shift" or a "show"?

There's more to radio than the actual sounds that pour from the speaker. More important than the sound is the vibe. As the baseball fans have pointed out, the audience knows when something is up, and when it is not

It's the magic.

But now we don't have to worry about just your station. We have to worry about our entire industry. There ain't a lot of that magic goin' around. It's all deals, cutbacks, being lean and mean. It's so mean, creative people have to think twice about whether they want to live their one life that mean and lean.


And wasn't it NBC News that reported last week that all the downsizing has had a surprisingly negative effect on the companies that did the cutting? A negative effect on profits and current employee moral

CONGRATULATIONS ON BEING APPOINTED PROGRAM DIRECTOR THERE. YOU'RE ONE OF THE SELECT FEW. THERE ARE VERY FEW WOMEN PD'S AND IF I'M NOT MISTAKEN, IN THE TOP40 OR RHYTHM END THERE ARE ONLY FOUR OF YOU. YOU'RE ONE OF THEM. THERE'S MICHELLE STEVENS IN TRENTON, SUE O'NEIL IN BUFFALO, MICHELLE SANTOSUOSSO IN SAN FRANCISCO AND NOW CHARLIE MAXX IN CORPUS CHRISTI. LET ME ASK THE OBVIOUS QUESTION, WHAT'S YOUR BACKGROUND?

I've been working in Top40 for the past six years, but I started out in radio at an Adult Contemporary station, basically in the middle of nowhere, right outside of Portland, Maine and that was my first full time job in radio. I was two months out of college and everybody told me it would be impossible to find a job. I'd never get a job in radio and two months after I graduated I was working full time doing middays. From there I moved on to New Jersey at WAYV in Atlantic City and I was there for a little under two years. Then I worked at WJRZ in Toms River, New Jersey, which was a Mainstream Top40 station and I was there for about four and a half years. And then I came down here to Corpus Christi. All of the Top40s I've worked at I've worked my way up through the ranks to the APD/MD position. This is the first station that offered me the PD title and I'm kind of happy about that. I've been working toward that goal for a long time.

THAT'S GREAT. NOW DO YOU HAVE A DEGREE IN BROAD-CASTING FROM COLLEGE?

I have an Associates degree in Communications.

WHAT SCHOOL?

I went to Bauder College in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

AND YOU'RE FROM FLORIDA ORIGINALLY, RIGHT?

No, actually I'm from New York City. Born in Brooklyn, and grew up in Staten Island.

NOW THAT YOU'RE IN CHARGE, ARE THERE ANY CHANGES YOU THINK YOU NEED TO MAKE AT KZFM?

I'm lucky enough to have inherited a station that is pretty much on its toes. We're a pretty big force in the market. We don't have much competition in the way of direct competition. But there are a few things. As far as musically, we're pretty much on target. We play a lot of

the songs that the market wants. We do a lot of intensive research as far as record store callout. We do callout research, sampling hooks and of course, I try to get out on the street and talk to people as much as I can. Whenever I'm at an event, a remote, I ask them about the music, what's their favorite song. I ask them about the station. What do they like and dislike.

YOU LIKE TO DO A LOT OF TOP-OF-MIND RESEARCH.

I sure do. I figure that's where you're going to get your answers. The listeners are the ones that tell you what they like. What's going to work in other markets may not necessarily work down here, so I really need to get inside a listener's head and find out what it is they're looking for here in Corpus Christi.

YOU LEAN VERY RHYTHM, RIGHT?

Very. From a lot of Freestyle music. It seems to work very well down here. We play little to no rap. We play some songs, of course, the ones that explode on the charts. We can't ignore a hit, but we do tend to lean more dance and rhythmic than Hip-Hop.

ARE YOU THE DOMINANT STATION THERE?

We're dominant in the fact that we are the market leader, we are the I get off at 9 a.m.

YOUR GM IS LILLIAN KATZ. IS THE REST OF THE MANAGEMENT TEAM FEMALE?

Well, our Sales Manager was male. He just recently left, and our sales staff is primarily female. Our Promotions Director is female too.

THAT'S HOT.

We're kind of leading the pack down here.

WHO'S ON THE AIR AND WHAT TIMES ARE THEY ON?

Well, myself and Chuck Bennett are filling in mornings right now, and Suzi Camacho is on 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Our Production Director, Ed Ocanas does 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. Bart Allison does afternoons and Dino Fernandez does 7 p.m. to midnight.

AND THEN WHO'S ON OVERNIGHTS?

Gabe Cervantes.

ARE YOU GOING TO REPLACE YOURSELF AS MD?

Dino Fernandez is helping out right now. I am looking for anybody who's interested in an APD/MD position. It does come with an airshift attached to it. I am also interested in hearing



SUMMER IN THE WAY OF PROMOTIONS THERE?

Something that's pretty neat that we do every year, which kind of ties us real tight into the community is we supply the music and we simulcast it for the Fourth of July fireworks, which are displayed over the Bay Front.

WHAT ELSE IS COMING? WHAT DO YOU DO NORMALLY JUST YEAR-ROUND TO KEEP THE STATION OUT ON THE STREETS?

We do lots of remotes, lots of public appearances. We do street hits. We try to get our jocks out there as much as possible for people to get familiar with them. We want listeners to know us like friends. Not that we're superstars, but we're your buddy and then when you see us you recognize us and you say hello. Street hits are when we send a jock out for about an hour and they just unload the van of prizes, movie and concert tickets. Whatever we have. We just like to give away tons of stuff and we stop at a place, say we're on the corner of wherever. Come and see us and until all the prizes are gone we'll stay. We do a lot of that. We are tied with the community during a lot of events. We do stuff for the Special Olympics. We hold bike races with them. We get involved with any kind of promotion that they're involved with. We feel a strong tie to them as well and we're just out all over the place. During the summer, every weekend we're at different places. We're in the clubs almost every night.

ARE YOU ON THE AIR?

I do mornings.

WHO'S WITH YOU IN THE MORNINGS.

Right now I just have a parttimer filling in. Although I am currently looking for a new morning show.

THIS IS GOING TO BE A LOT OF WORK FOR YOU BECAUSE OBVIOUSLY YOU GET UP AT 4 A.M.

I get up at 3:30 a.m.

AND YOU'RE GOING TO GET THERE AND THEN DO THIS. WHAT TIME DO YOU GO OFF, 9 OR 10? some tapes on morning shows. Doesn't necessarily have to be a man. It could be a man/woman, whatever, but I am interested in hearing that. My options are pretty much open right now. Of course, my priority is filling and finding out what we're going to do with that morning shift.

WHAT RECENT PROMOTIONS HAVE YOU DONE?

We try to do as much stuff out on the street as possible. We recently organized a listener appreciation party. It took place on a big boat out on the bay. "The Hot Z95 FANTASTIC VOYAGE" was June 30. We had U.N.V., Max-A-Million and Michael Damien and Tony Pena from *The Young And The Restless* on board. It was very successful.

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE FOR

HOW LONG HAS THE STATION BEEN THERE?

Since the late '70s. It's started as a different format. I believe it's been Rhythmic Top40 for probably the last 10 years. It started more of a Rock Top40.

AND OBVIOUSLY YOU'VE HAD THE SAME SIMILAR LOGO.

THE CITY MUST HAVE Z95 BUMPER STICKERS EVERY-WHERE.

Oh yeah. We make sure of that. Every time we're out that's our main objective, especially when our jocks are out. We make sure we put bumper stickers on everybodys car. If we can we'll put them on right there. I've done it myself. I've been at remotes and I've seen cars pull up and say, "Hey, mind if I put this on?" And I'll put it on myself. I'll even wash off the spot if they want me to.

DO YOU HAVE BILLBOARDS AND DO YOU USE TV SPOTS?

We do. We did television for the Spring book. We're going to be doing a media blitz in the Fall with some billboards and some newspaper advertising. We haven't done that in probably about a year.

DO YOU TIE IN A LOT OF PROMOTIONS WITH MOVIES?

We sure do. In fact, we're premiering the Mighty Morphine Power Ranger movie this summer and we try to do at least one a month.

AND THEN OBVIOUSLY YOU JUST GIVE THOSE AWAY ON THE AIR.

Yes, we just blow out the tickets over a weekend promotion, or do street hits. We'll send a jock out with a whole bunch of tickets and just let them toss them out.

WHO DO YOU SHARE AUDIENCE WITH? THE HISPANIC STATIONS OR THE ROCK STATIONS?

I would venture to say that we probably share a majority of our audience with the Spanish stations. We do pull in some from the Rock. Of course some male numbers will probably come from there and then the Country stations. The Country fans are real fickle. They'll go everywhere. They'll listen to a little Spanish, a little Top40. But, our objective is to get the listener and keep them here. We do that by playing the best music that's out there, the music the listener wants to hear, all of our formatics are strong. All of our jocks are very talented and very entertaining on the air.

WHAT TYPE OF SYNDICATION AND SPECIALTY PROGRAMMING DO YOU AIR?

We do the Retro Mix, which is an Old School show. We do that on Sunday nights. We do Street Jams with Paco Lopez. We also broadcast one of the Top40 shows, Hit List, on Sunday mornings, and we air the Rick Dees Countdown Saturdays from 6 a.m.-10 a.m.

HOW DOES RICK DEES' SHOW, WHICH IS VERY MAIN-STREAM, FIT YOUR STATION? CAN IT HELP YOU EXPOSE A BROADER VARIETY OF MUSIC, OR DO YOU WORRY

ABOUT IT BEING A POTENTIAL TUNE OUT?

I think it's not so much a tune-out factor as it is that they'll hear music that they're not exposed to and then it reflects our phones. In fact, a perfect example would be Hootie & The Blowfish *Let Her Cry*. I never would have really concentrated on that song and looked into it. We started to get some requests on it. Of course, MTV always helps. And then we put it into some callout research and it tested really strong and we eventually ended up adding the record. There's a record that we probably primarily would not have looked at.

NOW THAT YOU'RE IN THE SEAT, NOW THAT YOU'RE IN THE CONTROL SEAT, THE CAT BIRD SEAT SO TO SPEAK, WHAT DO YOU ANTICIPATE ON DOING THERE TO HELP BRING YOU...HOW ARE YOU GOING TO DEFEAT THE MARKET LEADER?

The question with the golden answer. I definitely have to stay on target with music. We have to keep up on that. If it's looking like a song that the audience wants to hear, you know we've got to look into that. We've got to reflect what the audience is asking for. We're out on the streets all the time so we're out there. People are aware of us. Like I said, there's not one person who's in this town who does not know the name Z95, so as far as all that goes, we've got the ball in our court and our jocks are great. They're very talented, they do great shows. So we're just going to keep

HOW FAR IS KINGSVILLE?

Probably about a little less than an hour drive from Corpus Christi.


WHO ARE THE MAIN RECORD STORES THAT YOU LOOK AT DOWN THERE?

We deal with Blockbuster Music, Camelot, Disc Jockey Music. Those are some of the bigger chains. Then there's a record store here called Craig's Record Factory and we deal with them as well.

WHAT PART DOES RECORD SALES PLAY IN YOUR DECI-SION MAKING PROCESS FOR WHAT GETS PLAYED ON AIR?

It affects it somewhat, believe it or not. If there's a record that we've spun a couple of times and a little unsure on the callout and it starts to sell, then by all means we're really going to look at that record and case in point would be a record like a Dr. Dre where we weren't too sure how it would sound in the mix and it started to really sell strongly in the market. Number one and two single sales at some of the stores. Well then that's a record we seriously need to look at. We're not playing it but, they're hearing it somewhere, usually MTV. And if it's selling at number one and number two in the market, we need to really address that. So retail does influence our playlist.

making sure that we're giving the listener what they want and keeping up on the music and giving them promotions and lots of fun. I think radio's got to be fun, especially for the listener. They tune in to have a good time and to maybe escape every day's ups and downs, and we're here to give them a good time. And that's what I think a lot of people have to remember is that this is supposed to be fun for the listener.

IS YOUR COMPANY DUOPO-LIZED OR ARE YOU STAND ALONE?

We have an AM sister station. It's news-talk.

YOU DON'T HAVE ANOTHER FM THERE?

No. We have a Country station in Kingsville, which is a 3,000 watt Country station which we are looking to upgrade so that so that it is comes into Corpus Christi right now. The signal is a little weak into Corpus.

It's the truth. He is definitely consulting us now and I've been working with him closely the last couple of weeks and Bob has worked in this market before, so he's real familiar with it. I think he's definitely got a lot to offer. I know I'm going to learn an awful lot from him. And I'm happy to be working with him. It's good to have somebody who has different perspectives than yourself. Somebody to bounce things off of and Bob is real good that way. We get along well. I like working with him and I look forward to it. I think it's going to be good for us and get a finer edge on the station and he's got a lot of resources to give to us as well as far as research and imput and you can never have enough of that.

LET ME ASK YOU THIS. DID YOU EXPECT TO BECOME PD WHEN MICHAEL STEELE LEFT?

I was hoping when Michael left that I would get the nod.

HAD YOU BEEN TALKING TO LILLIAN ABOUT THAT?

I honestly did not know Michael was going to be leaving this soon, so I was kind of broadsided by it. But when it happened it was great because I had spoken to Lillan before about it. I went in and expressed my interest in the position and she was real conscious of the fact that this is what I wanted to do and I'm glad that she felt that I'm doing a good job and can handle it and I'm going to do my best to bring this station to the number one position.

NOW THAT YOU'VE SORT OF BROKEN THE GLASS CEILING, DO YOU VIEW THE FACT THAT YOU'RE A FEMALE AS SOME-THING THAT PERHAPS UP TO NOW HAS HURT YOUR POTEN-TIAL TO SUCCEED?

I don't know so much that it's hurt me. It may have at times made things a little bit more difficult. Case in point: my first job in radio ever I was doing middays and also I had to clean the restrooms and when I asked why I had to do it the General Manager's explanation to me was, "Well you're the woman, that's why!" I did not know that midday jocks clean the bathroom? What is this? Nobody told me this in school, but it just ended up that I was the woman and it was part of my responsibility to make sure that the bathroom was clean. I don't know necessarily that it's hurt my career. And we talked about this at the **HITMAKERS** Convention in Chicago. Sometimes you have to prove yourself twice before people realize things, or it may take you a little bit longer to get there, but I think if you're talented and you work hard and you're really dedicated to this profession, you'll get to where you're going and it may take you a day longer than a guy but so what. That's the end result. As long as you know you're doing a good job and you're getting the job done. It's your pride that matters.

DO YOU HAVE ANY CLOSING THOUGHT FOR ANY ASPIRING FEMALES YOU WANT TO BE A PD? BECAUSE YOU GOT THERE PRETTY FAST, I THINK.

I do to. I happen to think I'm extremely lucky and I hear a lot of women say, "You can't get anywhere in this business if you're female." I did and if you're looking to get into that position, the only thing I could tell you is hard work and dedication gets you everywhere. You may not think people notice it but they do, so just keep plugging along and do the best that you can. Like I said, it's going to be your pride in the end that gets you where you're going. If you take pride in what you do and you do it well, it reflects on you and if you're going to use the excuse of, "Well, I'm a woman and I'm never going to get anywhere," you never will get anywhere. You just have to go for what you want and pursue it and you'll get it.

MOTIVATING AND GETTING THE MOST OUT OF YOUR ASSISTANTS

I went to a party last weekend and one of my old radio buddies was pretty broken up about having just turned 40. I reminded him that 40 isn't old...if you're a tree. And the good news is that if he was a dog, he'd have been dead years ago.

Supposedly dogs age at 7 years for every "human" year. I've often felt the same way about Promotions Assistants. Seriously. It's kind of a sad statement about the position, but if you've got a great assistant. then they're probably doing 18 hour days, seven days a week and they'll eventually crash and burn after a couple of years. My goal with the staffs that I've had in the past has been to, A) get as much time and energy out of these people as I can before they hit the inevitable wall, and. B) make sure that their time at the station is a crash course in radio promotions and that they move on to head up their own department, bursting with knowledge and wisdom. For me, nothing is cooler than to see some old van driver of mine land a job as a Promotion Director at a big market radio

Being a Promotion or Programming Assistant is usually considered pretty low on the radio food-chain, but these are critical positions at any station, and I can't think of tougher or more thankless jobs. So what can you do to get the most out of your staff and keep them motivated and excited about their jobs? That in itself is just about as hard as being a Promotion Assistant. These are employees who can be invaluable to your success...if they can stay focused and hyped about the work.

From my own personal experience, I found that creating a fun and party-type atmosphere in the department was one method of keeping things fresh and new for the staff. Doing spontaneous daytrips to places like theme parks will help break the monotony. I once took them all inner-tubing on a nearby river and another time took over a bowling alley and set up an open tab at the bar. The point that I tried to get across to them was that I was genuinely interested in their present and future success, and most importantly, the job is about having fun and believe me, we could have all made a lot more money loading boxes at UPS. But it

wouldn't have been fun. I also made myself available to them when they had personal crises, and let them know that I valued them as more than just some assistant. If they had a problem, they could come to me. In radio there can often be a very thin line between your personal life and your job, and you need to remember that when dealing with these kids. I found this approach to be extremely motivating back when I was driving vans and I tried to work from that experience.

Something else that really kept me jazzed about being an assistant, and ultimately made me intensely loyal and thus, more productive, was when my boss would come out and get down and dirty in the trenches with us. She wasn't just a "suit"; she was one of us and lead by example. To a minimum wage, part-time employee who spent most of his waking hours hauling tanks of helium and hanging banners, I thought she was the greatest boss in the world. She didn't just delegate. She pitched in too.

Good managers will take a personal interest in their staff and think of them as being more than just

treats his assistants to dinners and movies and also holds staff meetings away from the station in upbeat and fun locations. Other things that Carlos will do to motivate his assistants include switching their days and duties around so that they won't get consistently stuck with the same jobs and will always have something new to look forward to. "Plus, new duties mean more experience, and the goal is to teach these people so they'll be more than just two or three year employees. I'd love to find long-term spots for them all here at the station," adds Pedrazza. He also goes out of his way get fees from clients for his assistants work at their remotes and events. "These are like little surprise bonuses for them," he says.

Recognition in front of the rest of the staff can be very motivating too. Marlear Alston is the Promotions/ Marketing Director at V-103 in Baltimore and she makes an effort to thank her assistants for jobs well done with personal letters and memos to the entire staff that recognize their accomplishments. Does this work? Well, twelve years later I still have an all-staff memo from the GM who thanked me for



another warm body at events. From calling around I've found that there are many ways that people have found to be effective in motivating their staffs, while still getting a maximum effort out of them.

102 Jamz in Orlando has one of the more efficient Promotion Departments in the business. Carlos Pedrazza is the Director and learned the ropes as an assistant in Miami radio at Hot 105 and later at Jamz. "You have to value them as more than just an assistant," says Pedrazza, who makes an effort to create activities for his staff that are "out of the ordinary" and designed to make them feel special. He often

putting together a summer event. Marlear agrees. "It seems like the memos are really successful at giving them their 'props' and this kind of encouragement pays off in a big way," says Marlear.

"Enthusiasm can be contagious. If you're excited about something, then your staff will be too," says Janet Magelby, the Marketing Director for New Century Media (KUBE, KJR/AM & FM) in Seattle. In her position she oversees the Promotions Directors for three large radio stations; a daunting task that could tend to make some people desk-bound. However, Janet is a big believer in creating camaraderie





with her staff by getting out in the field, pitching in and being at the station's promotions. "It sends a good message to everyone and the team effort can be very motivating for these people who are in very nontraditional jobs," says Magelby. New Century Media has a Kudos Board in the facility that posts all the most recent success letters and press that the station's have gotten. Janet says that that too can be inspiring for the staff.

Janet Magelby's opinions are mirrored by Renee Pestana, who has done Promotions both in radio and retail. "My goals were to always keep a positive attitude and make everyone feel ownership in the product, no matter what their contribution was. You can't say enough about creating a feeling of team work inside your station," says Pestana.

Sometimes we can lose sight of where we were ourselves just a few years ago. Take time to remember the hard work and frustrations of laboring as an assistant and it will make you a much better manager of your own staff. Carlos Pedrazza at 102 Jamz in Orlando sums it up best when he advises, "the assistants are such an intregal part of the department. You can never do enough to make them feel wanted needed and appreciated."





Clive Davis is heading up one of the most consistent charges in the music business right now, with players like Rob Stone and Davey Dee on his team, and music that's runnin' the streets and airwaves. On the Hip Hop and R&B tip all the Bad Boy/Rowdy/Arista product is wearin' out turntables and car speakers. Check out the lineup: Monica, Notorious B.I.G., Craig Mack, Faith, Real McCoy, Annie Lennox, D&D Project, TLC, and now Deborah Cox who's gonna blow up! What are these people calling the Dionne Warwick phychic line? Joey Carvello's assessment of Clive's commitment to Dance Music was definitely on point. You gotta give credit where credit is do. 




