Programmer's Think Tank

THE CLASH OF THE TITANS

We hear of mega mergers and the acquisition of more and more stations by groups. We ask, how bad could that be. After all, the FCC has always been a pain in the ass – to have that thorn out of our side is worth a lot. Furthermore, sn't getting bigger a good sign – a sign of progress?

Let me take it outside the radio business for a minute. A couple years ago Manufacturers Hanover Bank merged with Chemical Bank here in New York. The merged entity - Chemical closed half its branches and laid off thousands of employees. During the past two years since that merger, lines at the teller windows have more than doubled in length and over two dozen new, higher fees have been imposed on depositors. These fees include higher ATM charges, higher costs for overdrafts and returned checks and so forth. Branches of the bank cannot be reached by phone. Accounts information is only available through a complex automated voice mail system when it's functioning at all. Last week, Chemical Bank merged with another banking giant -Chase Manhattan. When this merger is completed, half of Chemical's remaining branches and half of Chase's branches will be closed and thousands more employees cut locse. Do you think service will increase? Already a bank in Chicago has started charging \$3.00 per transaction for anything involving a real teller. We can see where that's going. Bigger is

unquestionably better for these banks' bottom lines and they sure can talk a convincing story when they point to the growth and health of the banking industry. As far as customer service, though, it's plastic cards and Disney-esque lines of people following ropes.

This bigness we see in banking is having the same affect on radio. Just yesterday I spent eight minutes in a "voice mail from hell" at one radio station. Anyone calling a PD these days needs to either know an extension number or be able to maybe spell his/her name on eight digits of your touchtone pad. Yet with all that voice mail, have you noticed it takes five or more rings before anybody picks up a phone?

In no way am I suggesting that the groups that are buying up more and more radio stations creating bigger and bigger chains, are bad people. They're generally good, highly successful businessmen. But their goals aren't those that necessarily are best for radio as an art form or even a communications medium.

The Communications Act of 1934 established radio as a public trust. Although franchised through transferrable licenses, the radio spectrum was regulated in the public interest. A resource just as precious as our water, our parks and mineral rights, radio was protected against pillaging. As owners, franchise holders in radio used to be limited to 7 AM and 7 FM stations, none overlapping within the same spectrum. Further, to ensure that franchises not traffic in quick-turnaround deals, but rather, nourish and

grow the medium, owners were required to retain ϵ radio station three years before reselling it.


As owners, we were forced to air public service and other programming which was contrary to our format and image. The three-year requirement meant we couldn't dump the station if we got in trouble – therefore we had to nurture its growth. We hated the FOC and all its rules. We wanted our freedom. Well here it is. I just got back from the N.A.B. Convention in New Orleans where I was besieged by out-of-work PDs. The fat cats were beaming and the underdogs were whimpering. Everybody's trying to be optimistic, but we've got a lot of work ahead of us if we're going to save any of radio's creativity and warmth.

Our best ally is FCC Charman Reed Hundt who says we've gone far enough and some ownership caps and some controls should remain in effect. Business interests are all in favor of turning radio into a commodity. In doing that we can only lose our opportunity to practice our craft. Radio has the power to excite, enthral, entertain and paint magnificent mental images. To turn the "theatre of the mind" into a parking lot, in the interest of our business, will be a terrible loss to our society. Are we wiling to look the other way just to keep our jobs short-term?

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



CLARKE INGRAM

PD, 98PXY, Rochester

CLARKE, LET'S START WITH AN OVERVIEW OF YOUR CAREER. WHERE DID YOU GET STARTED?

I started out, fresh out of college, at 96KX in Pittsburgh in 1978, working for Kevin Metheny and then Bobby Christian. In the next few years I went from being the weekend guy to Assistant PD/MD and night jock.

WHERE'D YOU GO FROM THERE?

When 96KX changed formats in 1983, I walked across the street to B94, where I did nights for Steve Kingston and later was Assistant PD for Guy Zapoleon. In 1986, I followed Guy out to KZZP in Phoenix, where I ended up being Operations Manager. Then, in 1987, I moved to sister station KRQ/Tucson as PD. After a brief stint back at B94 as PD in 1989-'90, I went to Allentown to program WHXT (HOT99.9) and its AM station. While there, I hooked up with Malrite for on-air work at Z100 in New York City and EAGLE106 in Philadelphia. Allentown eventually went Oldies, and I decided to stay with Z100 for awhile. In late 1993, Buddy Scott and Tex Meyer asked me to come back to B94, and I did. Then, near the end of 1994, I got the call to come here to Rochester and 98PXY.

HOW DID YOU END UP AT 98PXY?

I had interviewed for the Charlotte PD job when Pyramid was in the process of acquiring 95.1 (now WEDJ) in 1993. A year later, when John Ivey resigned from 98PXY to go to (then) Nashville, someone in Pyramid remembered me, and I got a phone call. As I recall, I sent my package to then-OM Bill Schoening on a Wednesday, came up for the interview that weekend, accepted the job on Tuesday, and resigned from B94 the next day. It all happened very quickly.

HOW WAS THE SPRING BOOK?

Excellent in every sense of the word. We went 8.3 to 9.1 12+, #1 cume in the market, #1 18-34 women, #3 25-54 women, #5 25-54 persons. What's even more remarkable is that we made these increases in the face of a brand-new Modern Rock station. When a new competitor signs on with a five share in its first book, and you still advance in the 12+ ratings and make significant gains in all your

demographic targets, well, that's high cotton!

YOU'VE HAD A LOT OF GREAT SUCCESS STORIES. WHAT ONE OR TWO SUCCESSES STAND OUT AS REALLY SPECIAL FOR YOU, AND WHY?

I've programmed around half a dozen stations, but most people seem to remember my 23 share in Tucson, where we had the highest-rated Top40 station in the nation. That sort of pinnacle experience truly only happens once or twice in a career. Other than that, I'd include KZZP going to #1 in Phoenix, the 9.5 share we achieved at B94 in 1990, and my three years on the air at Z100, the #1 Top40 station in the #1 market in America, as some of the highlights of my career.

IT MUST BE A THRILL, AND A REAL HONOR, TO BE ASSOCIATED WITH SO MANY SUCCESSFUL STATIONS THAT IN THEIR HEYDAY WERE REGARDED IN HIGH ESTEEM, AND IN THE CASE OF KZZP, IS VIEWED TODAY AS A PIONEERING STATION. YOUR COMMENTS ON THAT.

GIVE US A LOOK AT 98PXY TODAY...AND TELL US ABOUT YOUR STAFF.

98PXY is, very simply, a Mainstream Top40 station, and I think we fly in the face of the conventional wisdom that Top40 is dead or dying. Just look at the ratings, and remember that we have TWO AC stations, a powerful heritage AOR, a strong Urban station, and the Modern Rocker all coming after us. The formula for 'PXY's success is simple...we play hit music, we have great personalities, we do our homework, we're very promotionally active, and we're very well positioned, marketed and researched.

In mornings, we have longtime 'PXY personalities Scott Spezzano and Joan Brandenburg, and in PM drive it's heritage air talent Pete Kennedy. Our midday voice, JoJo and nighttime idol Artie the One Man Party both came to us from Boston, where they worked on the air at a very early age. My Music Director, J.J. Rice, does late-nights. We also have two very important off-air people in Promotions Director, Tristano Koriou, and Production Director, Joe Kaus. They operate on a major-market level.

TELL US A LITTLE BIT ABOUT

Well, certainly it has been an honor to work with great programmers like Steve Kingston, Guy Zapoleon, Steve Rivers, and Buddy Scott, and I have sure learned more than my share of programming techniques from them. And there's no question that having so many legendary call letters on my resume has made Clarke Ingram more bankable.


Having said that, I hope that in some small way, the success of the radio stations I've been associated with reflects whatever talent or ability I've been able to bring to the table. At least in part, I've been a success due to the radio stations I've been a part of, and hopefully the reverse is also true. People say that in nearly two decades, I've never made the ratings go down, and so far, it's the truth!

J.J. RICE. WHAT MAKES HIM SUCH AN ASSET TO YOU?

J.J. is a young Guy Zapoleon in the making. He's got a terrific set of ears, he's extremely conscientious about his work, and he plays Selector like a Stradivarius. In the next three to five years, I'm sure he'll be a PD himself, and a damn good one. Mark my words, he's going to be a rising star.

HOW DO YOU BOTH DECIDE ON WHAT GETS PLAYED AT 'PXY?

Well, I should mention that JoJo, as Music Coordinator, is also in the loop on music decisions. We sit down with our research and our earpicks and our networking information, and we try to



use our gut and science to add those songs which are most likely to be big hits for 'PXY, the cream of the crop. It's not a perfect process, but for the most part, it works.

DESCRIBE, IF YOU CAN, THE PERFECT 98PXY RECORD. IF YOU COULD ONLY PLAY ONE SONG, WHAT WOULD IT SOUND LIKE?

Over the past few years, 98PXY has primarily been a Pop and Rhythmic radio station, and the first song that comes to mind is *Another Nigh*t by Real McCoy. We had it in a power rotation for eight or nine months and over 2500 spins, according to Selector. So, more than any other song, I'd have to point to that one as the kind of sound that defines 98PXY. Of course, there are also Pop/Rock artists like Melissa Etheridge or Hootie & The Blowfish that bring 98PXY back to the middle musically.

WHO'S YOUR GM, AND HOW DO YOU TWO INTERACT?

Our Vice President and Chief Operating Officer, Ken Spitzer, acts as the GM of our two FM properties here in Rochester. He's a terrific guy with a sales background who knows how to get things done. We touch base at least several times a day on different management-related issues. As far as programming is concerned, he offers suggestions and comments, but pretty much leaves the big decisions to me, which I respect a great deal.

ARE YOU CONSULTED?

Nope. Mike McVay does consult our sister FM station here, WVOR, and I occasionally call him with a question, or to ask his opinion on something, but other than that, it's all

mine to take the blame for!

DID I HEAR CORRECTLY THAT YOU ONCE SAID YOU PRE-FERRED PROGRAMMING IN MORE MEDIUM-SIZED MAR-KETS, AS OPPOSED TO THE REAL BIGGIES?

You heard correctly.

WHY?

A much better quality of life, less fragmentation, and a better chance for overachievement. You just don't get a 23 share in the majors. I have an incredible amount of respect for people like Steve Kingston who fight it out every day in a market like New York City, but I have no real desire to do that myself.

IT'S BEEN SAID THAT PROGRAMMING IS PROGRAMMING, AND THAT THE SAME TECHNIQUES WORK IN ALL MARKETS. IF YOU UNDERSTAND THE FUNDAMENTALS, AND CAN ADAPT YOUR MANAGEMENT STYLE TO FIT THE SITUATION, YOU CAN PROGRAM ANYWHERE. IN YOUR MIND, IS THAT TRUE?

Yes. There's no question that the style changes from market to market, but frequently, the substance is the same. You need to understand your market, realize who your audience is, know what they expect from your radio station, and give it to them, with enough panache that they listen and remember.

IT'S EASY TO "GET TO KNOW YOUR AUDIENCE" WHEN YOU'VE GOT RESEARCH ON A REGULAR BASIS. FOR THOSE PD'S WITHOUT REGULAR RESEARCH, WHAT CAN YOU TELL THEM ARE OTHER WAYS TO GET FAMILIAR WITH THE TARGET DEMO?

I've always said that life is like a big focus group. It's not scientific, but the audience will certainly tell you what's right or wrong with your radio station, if you listen to them carefully. They're not product-smart like we are, they can't tell you what a sweeper or liner card is, but they sure can tell you what they like or don't like about your station and WHY they do or don't like it. You have to listen with an open mind and open ears, and be careful to understand what they're really trying to tell you. So I'd get out there on the streets and hear what they have to say.

If you're in this business for any length of time, sooner or later you end up being an observer of people. You start out in an artificial setting (maybe a focus group) watching how they use or describe your radio station. Later

you translate that into real life, seeing how they react to different types of music or a public event of some sort, and pretty soon you're just watching them behave. So you sort of become an amateur behavioral psychologist at some point. I've found that to be helpful. You sure have to understand the audience's behavior in order to successfully program to them.

Personally, I've also found that casually dating a number of women in the target demo, all at the same time, is an interesting way of doing research (laughter). I'm only halfkidding about this! If you want to understand the female audience, spend some quality time with them. Of course, sooner or later, their objectivity is gone (and so is yours), and then the project is over. But I'm 38, and I find that dating 21 to 34 year old women is a real source of information and understanding. As well as being pleasant for other reasons! (laughter)

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE CHALLENGES UNIQUE TO PROGRAMMING TODAY?

Getting your message heard in an increasingly distracting world, fighting increased format fragmentation, and keeping your station from going too far in any one direction. This requires everincreasing skills in delivering broadbased music radio in an age of

THE EVER-EVOLVING RADIO BUSINESS. DID YOU EVER THINK YOU'D SEE A TIME WHEN, AS IS LIKELY TO HAPPEN, RADIO WOULD BE VIRTUALLY DEREGULATED?

After 17 years in this business, nothing much surprises me. I suppose if you'd suggested today's environment at the beginning of my career, I'd have been in disbelief. But given developments over the past few years, I think near-total deregulation is just a logical extension of recent events.

focus, and it's been a problem since long before deregulation. I think the most important thing is making sure what comes out of those sneakers every day sounds great, and it's what the audience wants and expects...MORE than they expect. Every minute you spend on something other than the air sound has to be watched very carefully. Unless you're making the product sound better, or networking with people who are working towards that goal, you're probably wasting your time, or at least not using it effectively.

ANY WORDS OF ADVICE OR ENCOURAGEMENT FOR CAREER FOLKS WHO WONDER HOW TO TAKE THE NEXT STEP FORWARD?

Keep improving your skills, always strive for overachievement, commit to excellence, network with the right people, listen to the opinions of others, and be nice to them on the way up...you'll certainly meet them on the way down. And when the chips are down, you'll find out who your friends are.

OKAY, WHAT ABOUT YOU? WHAT WOULD CLARKE INGRAM LIKE TO BE DOING OVER THE NEXT FEW YEARS?

Actually, I'm very happy doing what I'm doing right now. I wouldn't mind being a Group PD or VP/Programming at some point in the next five years or so, but I'm a handson programmer, and wouldn't want to be too much a part of the corporate structure. And I have no real desire to go into the consulting business, although I already advise two stations. I'd rather do it myself, as Program Director...one station at a time!

diversity, delivering your message in more creative ways, and remaining true to the mass-appeal nature of the Top40 format.

Honestly, I think it's too easy to play all Alternative music, or Hip-Hop, or Soft Rock. The tough task is to program a radio station that can play Van Halen, Toni Braxton, Better Than Ezra, and Real McCoy at the same time, and win. And there seem to be fewer and fewer people who can do that very well. Top40 is the most difficult and expensive of all the music formats to program successfully, especially in terms of reaching adult listeners. It's a lot easier to give up and switch to some sort of niche format, and that's just what many PDs, GMs, and owners have done.

CLARKE, YOU'VE BEEN AROUND FOR A WHILE, AND SEEN A LOT OF CHANGES IN

In many ways, for Top40, I think deregulation is good, if it means that the Top40 and Hot AC stations are co-owned and not beating each other's heads against the wall, then the Top40 is more likely to survive and will have more format stability and financial success, and I think that's very good indeed. And, in fact, that's precisely what has happened with our duopoly situation here in Rochester.

ANY THOUGHTS ON WHAT IMPACT DEREGULATION WILL HAVE ON PD AND MD JOBS?

We'll all be overseeing two, or three, or four radio stations, and working harder than ever. It's happening already.

DO YOU SEE ANY DANGER OF PROGRAMMERS PERHAPS LOSING FOCUS?

There's always the danger of losing





DAVE AWARDS

I love listening to radio in L.A. On my latest trip there it sounded especially good. KIIS sounded great, as did POWER, KROQ, KLOS, and others. Maybe one of the factors that makes L.A. radio sound so good to me is that they, (at least the stations I listened to), didn't sound "backgroundy." Maybe Ihat's because there are so many more forms or media in L.A. to compete with. Maybe it's because the cream rises to the top. Whatever the reason, it was refreshing.

Besides being treated to some good competitive radio, I got to hook up with some Homies I hadn't seen since my move from California to Maryland in December of last year. If I start dropping names we'll be here all day.

Upon returning to The Ironwood Studio here in Southern Maryland, I buckled down with WPGC Product on Director/APD, Bob Holmcrans to judge the entries in the first ever- DAVE AWARDS. After the initial listening, there were four stations that really stood out above the rest, and after careful deliberation, (and consumption of a couple sixpacks), by our esteemed panel of judges, we deemed the winner to be (drum roll please)...New

Rock 102/Milwaukee! Special mention goes out to G105/Durham, FLY/92, and KZIO/Duluth. Keith Eubanks and Brian James come to mind as two of the most used voice talents in all of the entries. Program Directors/Production Directors/Creative Services Directors, Chris Edge, James Baker, Marc Allen, and Rob Dawes all made fine showings of their skills. Great work guys!

The other day, Albie D., WPGC 95's Music Director/PM Drive jock handed me a copy of a handbook I had put together 6 years ago when I was Program Director of WPGC. We both laughed at the quality of the type: we had not yet entered the computer era at the time, so I'd used an electric typewriter-a poor one, at that! As a matter of fact, it's still there to this day-but that's another story. Anyway, tonight, as I searched for a topic to write about, I pulled it out just to give it a look over. I was surprised at how many of the quidelines I'd written for DJ's 6 years ago were applicable still today. They were probably applicable for years and years before I even wrote them, as I'm sure not even one of my teachings were new thoughts, just timeless advice, like

1. Make the music, the station, and it's events, the stars, and you'll be a star too. It goes without saying that each spokesman needs a great product to speak for. The programming department delivers that product, and the DJ's job is to sell it.

- 2. Every time you talk, sell the benefits of listening to us over the competition. You're here to brag about this station's product. Outside of talking about the music, this station, and it's events, your content should reflect the interests of the audience.
- 3. Don't waste the time of getting the listener's attention without offering a payoff. Once you let them down, it won't be so easy to get their attention the next time. Thus, the formula for most standard breaks:

BASICS- Call letters/Slogan

LURE- Attention grabber (may be in form of question).

CLOSE- Payoff (Don't give 'em an 87 second Tyson fight).

For fear that if I go on, Howard Stern may read my guidelines verbatim on his morning show, I'll stop here for now.

Congratulations again to the winners of the first ever-DAVE AWARDS: New Rock102 in Milwaukee! Keep on being creative!

PROGRAMMING'S

TECHNOLOGY CRUTCH

As a D. you're probably used to being on the look-out for what we call a "crutch." Those little habits that creep into your act and make you sound kinda automated. Often a crutch is something you use to fake it. Rather than thinking of something creative to say, you pull out ye olde crutch saying and just say it again, Sam. Sure it was funny or interesting the first twenty or thirty times you used it. Now it's kinda like hearing Glenn Frey's "The Heat Is On" in yet another auto commetcial on TV. It sucks, and (almost) everyone knows it!

Now the champions of crutch are radio programmers. Now that we have these really cutting edge computers we can find out everything we need to know without ever leaving our nice radio office. No need to deal directly with those pesky, Icwer class than I, listeners.

Day after day we sit in our broadcasting office pod and play radio. Spend the morning juggling the Selector. Middays we play "minimize the damage" with various sales people, discussing promotions that are really just another bonus spot. It's really easy to get hung up in the trivial.

Learning to run the music computer is so much easier than learning to program well. Besides the music software comes with a manual! It has a beginning and an end.

Hell, I can get all the record sales information I need directly from Sound Scan. No need to talk to retail clerks anymore. Who wants to know the information a week or two ahead of everybody else? Who cares what's on those B-sides. Who cares that a certain album track is getting all the mentions from the record buyers or the club attendees. It'll pop up on the computer printout in a few months, maybe. If it's ever chosen to be designated an official single.

Yeah, who needs to know how a record is selling to the different ethnic groups that make up your market? Of course record sales move geographically around some of the larger, more diverse markets, and once you figure out the process, you can see a hit coming long before your market's single or album sales summary comes out on the computer.

That BDS will tell you all the rotations, as long as the song you need to know about has been entered in the big computer. Sorry, but there will be no information on your competition's promotions, presentation, spots, features, talent changes, and on and on.

In fact, have you, as a programmer done one thing today that put you directly in touch with your audience?

Duff Lindsey is the Program Director at one of the most successful stations in the Clifton group, 102 Jamz in Orlando. Regularly Duff will drop the office work and will take over his request lines. All it takes is about 30 minutes with the audience for Duff to discover many things he would have never known otherwise. In that short time Duff hears about how his audience feels about promotions, music, jocks, his station image, make-up of his audience, and on and on.

And that's one of the big secrets of radio greatness. Looking at your audience in an open ended way. Don't always make up some questions and then send a company out to ask them. Expose yourself to your audience with no preconceptions. Let THEM ask the questions. Let THEM take your station where they want it to go.

Very few radio listeners visit program director offices.



SCARY TALES FROM THE SALES SIDE

When I was a Promotion Director, I truly went out of my way to try to educate the Sales department about the criteria for what constitutes an appropriate on-air giveaway. Basically, it should be topical, entertainment or sports related, tie-in to a bigger promotion that the station already has on the air or most importantly, relate to our music and key artists.

No matter how hard I tried, at least once a month I would find an AE in my office who wanted me to do something totally ridiculous. My generic response when confronted by these Mensa rejects was to feign excitement, grab the phone, call the PD and breathlessly inform him of incredible promotional opportunity that just walked in the door. "No seriously, cancel the Lear Jet-With Ten Friends To See Madonna In Tokyo Contest! Rich is here and he's got free cases of Canada Dry for the morning show to do with ginger ale trivia! We've got our Book promotion!!!" I'd then hang up the phone and the AE would hopefully have gotten the point.

Among the many client requests that I've turned down over the years was a car dealership who provided us with a list of songs to play during his remote (and the Sales guy was incredulous that we couldn't accommodate this), hundreds of Win It Before You Can Buy It and Family Four Pack giveaways that I did under other titles and made the competition look foolish (since they were always doing the exact same contest as specified by the client), and numerous promotions from clients who thought that people actually cared enough about their product that they'd want to call in and answer trivia questions or expound for 30 seconds about it. Anyone remember the "Letters To Dave" promotion from Wendys in the Fall of '91? A perfect example.

I've collected some great/horrific Sales requests from around the country for your personal enjoyment. Bon Appetit!

Lynn Jeanrenaud, Promotions Director, Y-100/Philadelphia. In her time, Lynn's seen requests for toothbrush giveaways, call-in contests that would have listeners talk about the weirdest place they ever slept to win a futon, and a light store that thought people would call in and tell their worst stories about where they were when the lights went out...to win light fixtures.

Scott Green, Promotion Director/ 95X/Syracuse. Already on the calendar and approved for give away when he joined the station were contests with weed wackers and Ocean Spray coupons as prizes.


Carios Pedrazza, Promotion Director/102Jamz/Orlando, "I had someone who wanted us to giveaway 20¢ discount coupons for cookies. And they'll always want to throw in one of their company's T-shirts to round out the package and make it sound BIG on the air."

Blaine Kelly, Promotion Director, 93 BLX/Mobile. Blaine recently was faxed 10 pages of questions to use when doing "Milk Trivia" for the American Dairy Association. "I mean how many possible answers can there be; Louis Pasteur, 1%, 2% and Skim. That's about it," says Kelly. He advises to scan the request for an "out clause" that states something like "or similar promotion." Then you're off the hook. For this promotion, WBLX ended up doing a great community

tickets and haircuts for the entire family. If that wasn't bad enough, the promo said 'Take the whole family to get their haircut and *head off* to the circus."

Randy Malloy, Promotion Director, CD101, Columbus. Randy reminds me of those contests where the client tells you about the huge Grand Prize up front but forgets to tell you that all of your qualifiers are in the running along with those from fifty or sixty other radio stations around the country. At CD101, they got roped into a contest that forced people to call a long distance company, spend money and have the chance, along with everyone else in Ohio, for a big screen TV. "The lottery has better odds. And it's easier to play," says Randy.

Alan agrees and says that he tries to block some of the stupidest of these ideas from his memory. Take for instance the "Stack 'Em High" contest that came from a hamburger chain that wanted listeners to call in with their "tallest

panties on a roped bull in the center ring at the rodeo. Easy enough? "All the jocks said 'No way!' so we got our station mascot, a beaver, to do it. You should never run a promo that has 'beaver' and 'panties' in the same line," advises Hunt.

Mike Wall, Marketing Director, KJ103/Oklahoma City. In the 70's, he approached the PD with a client's request to give away 10,000 bottles of vitamins on-air. He was not too happy but it got on anyway. "I was sitting in my office and heard the jock announce that the next 10,000 callers would get free bottles of vitamins. About two minutes into the song he broke in to announce that we had all of our winners!," remembers Wall.

Tom Martens, Program Director/ 97.5 KWTX/ Waco. Tom and I used to chug beer in the radio van. This was before he got responsible and headed off for his first PD job in Marshall, Minnesota. "Not only did the Sales Manager want to sell the time, as in 'The Skewes Jewelry time is 3:14,' he also wanted to sponsor the tornado and thunderstorm warnings," says Martens.

Scary enough for you? I'll reprise this topic around Halloween so be sure to let me know if you've got anything worth including.

Dave Redelberger, Promotion Director, Z93/Dayton. One of Dave's personal favorites are clients who want to turn everything into a Family Four-Pack. "The circus came to town and Sales tied in a chain of hair salons so that everyone would win a Family Four-Pack of circus

tales" to win a "Big" burger.

Frank Neill, Promotion Director, 102 Jamz/Greensboro. "The stuff you get from the national clients is usually bad, not because of the product, but because of the methodology," says Neill who points to Dust Buster Trivia as a perfect example. "They wanted to hook into American history so the Dust Buster question had a clue like 'Truman successfully ran for a full term in this year," he adds.

Lizann Hunt, Promotion Director/ Arrow108/Sacramento. Vinegar Trivia (yes, Vinegar Trivia) couldn't hold a candle to a "Panty Put-On" that a rodeo requested. Essentially, a jock would try to put a pair of




LET'S MOVE FORWARD, NOT BACKWARDS



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

FCC CHAIRMAN STUNS 'EM AT THE NAB:
With allusions to the affect that he favors using the powers of the Commission to put some limits on broadcast industry consolidation, FCC Chairman REED HUNDT electrified and shocked those gathered to hear his speech last week at the NAB Radio Show in New Orleans. In his address, which some industry analysts feel was a warning shot issued to those proponents of the recent (and almost unbridled) pace of mergers and acquisitions, HUNDT essentially made it clear that he does not favor total elimination of broadcast regulation, including ownership caps. In fact, he raised the possibility that long-dormant FCC requirements (the Fairness Doctrine, minimum programming requirements, etc.) could be revived if/when current ownership limits are nixed. Despite that however, the Chairman did say that he favors some kind of increase in the current 20/20 ceiling on station ownership.

While Chairman HUNDT was making news in the Big Easy, Vice President AL GORE was making headlines in Washington. In an address this past Tuesday (9/12) to executives of international telecommunications firms, Mr. GORE continued his very public criticism of the telecom dereg bills passed in both the House and Senate, calling them giveaways to America's largest corporations. Pointing, no doubt to some recent mega-mergers, the Vice President said, "The highest bidders, not the highest principles, have set the bar." He also attacked a plan to slash FCC funding, even though the Commission is tasked under both telecom dereg bills, with protecting consumers against media monopolies. Not perhaps coincidently, the Senate appropriations committee agreed that same day to fund the FCC at \$166 million for next year...some \$18 million higher than the committee had agreed

INFINITY COURTING GANNETT?

Amid speculation that Infinity Broadcasting is on the verge of a major merger deal, the company is scheduled to issue a \$285 million stock offering to fund an acquisition. Rampant rumor has it that the apple of Infinity's eye is Gannett Co. Inc.'s radio group. PHILLIPS & BALDWIN IN ALTARED STATE:



ARBITREND SCORE CARDS

The second phase Summer Arbitrends are in. Here's the latest from New York, L.A. and Chicago:

In the Big Apple, STEVE SMITH's got both his stations tied for #1, with HOT97 (WQHT) and KISS (WRKS) deadlocked at 6.6 (12+). Spanish WSKQ goes 5.1 to 5.0, while Gold-formatted WCBS-FM nudges up to a 4.8 from a 4.6 and remains in 4th place. AC WLTW bumps up slightly, 4.6 - 4.8, while Z100 (WHTZ) stays virtually even, going 4.5 to 4.4. WPLJ hangs very solidly at 3.7!

In Los Angeles, POWER106 (KPWR) grows 5.1 to 5.3 to retain the pole position. KROQ (basking in the glow of being named "Rock Station of the Year" at the NAB Marconi Awards) grows 4.3 to 4.6, with THE BEAT (KKBT) on its heels, moving from a 4.2 to a 4.5 and into a tie with Spanish KLVE, which notched down slightly from a 4.7. KIISA/F hangs very solidly at 4.4, with KOST dropping from a 3.9 to a 3.6!

On the Midway, Urban WGCI grows 6.4 to a 6.6, with WGN-AM (riding the Cub's recent play-off bid) grows 5.9 to 6.1! B96 (WBBM) moves up 4.5 to 4.7 and overtakes country WUSN, which slips 5.0 - 4.7! Rock WRCX moves up 3.6 to a 3.9!




