





Upcoming releases under the new deal include, aside from the self-titled new album from Ashanti, new discs from Charlie "Chuck" Baltimore and Caddillac Tah.

Commented Cohen: "We are thrilled to continue our very successful partnership with Irv Gotti and Murder Inc. Through his leadership and musical innovation, Irv has not only played a major role in developing the careers of some of our label's

most popular and respected artists, but has launched musical movements in the process. And, like me, he never buys retail... unless we get \$2 off."

Added Liles: "Irv Gotti and Murder Inc. have been an incredible inspiration to the culture of the Def Jam Music Group. His ability to discover, develop and break talent is unparalleled. And one day, he even promises to introduce me to Sammy the Bull. Whaddaya mean, he's not that Gotti?"

Murder Inc. was founded in 1997 by Gotti, whose production credits include Jay-Z, DMX, Ja Rule, Mary J. Blige, Macy Gray and Michael Jackson, among others. Gotti started Murder Inc. after serving in A&R at Def Jam, where he signed such multi-platinum acts as DMX and Ja Rule.

Said Gotti: "I re-signed with Island Def Jam because of my relationship with 'Lansky' aka Lyor Cohen, who I feel is like my father in the music business. I started with him, and I'm going to finish with him. There is no other company that complements Murder Inc. or is a better partner for us. But I draw the line at buying a tree in Israel."

Big Radio Bad, Says AFTRA

In a legal brief filed with the Federal Communications Commission, the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists accuses Clear Channel of expanding its dominance to such a degree that "there is concern both the radio and sound recordings industries have been forever transformed and destroyed."

In a 20-page, annotated document obtained by HITS, AFTRA claims "consolidation in the radio industry since 1996 has harmed the public interest by reducing diversity and competition in local radio markets." The brief goes on to state this consolidation has also "caused particular harm to recording artists and to the music industry" and that "the harms to the public interest...are illustrated by Clear Channel."

The complaint, which also singles out CBS/Infinity and ABC/Disney, claims the loosening of station ownership limitations since the Telecommunications Act of 1996 "has had a devastating impact on diversity and competition in radio broadcasting." AFTRA insists the act "directed the FCC to revise its rules in order to permit consideration and meaningful investigation of how the Commission's regulatory structure did or did not foster the public interest, [making it] entirely appropriate to consider other factors beyond mere numerical limits.'

The Federation also points out that radio-industry consolidation has harmed the public interest by "reducing diversity in news and public affairs programming," as well as the advertising competition in local radio markets. In one of several examples, the study concludes that in Tampa, the nation's #21 market, Clear Channel, Infinity and Cox collectively control 88% of total ad revenue.


According to AFTRA, certain music formats are being eliminated from the airwaves,

including classical, jazz and bluegrass, as is the role of disc jockeys and PDs to program music to "local tastes and preferences." Meanwhile, the amount of advertising has increased in proportion to programming.

The brief points to the exclusive agreement between radio group Cumulus and Jeff McClusky and Associates as another partnership not in the public's interest, stating, "Dominant radio group owners now control the music market through exclusive arrangements with independent promoters, who decide what music gets...played on the stations."

Clear Channel comes under particular scrutiny in part because of the conglom's expansion into the concert industry with its 1999 purchase of SFX Entertainment. The acquisition gave Clear Channel the power to "limit promotional support of bands and artists who are performing for other companies, at other venues or who are sponsored by other stations... Some of the remaining independent [concert] promoters have alleged Clear Channel is engaging in anti-competitive behavior by using its leverage to force smaller companies out of business."

In its conclusion, the AFTRA memo urges the FCC to "conduct public hearings on the effect of deregulation and...consolidation" and "investigate complaints of anticompetitive behavior" which have been leveled at the radio behemoths.







ast week's column pondered political efforts to mandate anti-copying technology on future consumer gizmos. Meanwhile, entertainment peeps continue to bicker over the value of a defensive posture in the face of transforming tools like P2P. On one hand, media companies are desperate to safeguard their revenue flow, since millions of regular folks—especially kids—reject the idea that file-trading is stealing and expect their online content for free. On the other, said safeguards could have the effect of "consumer-proofing" digital wares. Steve Griffin, head of StreamCast Networks—the folks who brought you Morpheus—hopes to strike a kind of compromise with MusicCity, a portal designed to allow rights-holders to "wrap" content files of any sort and specify what users could do with them. The "rules-based" content could then be introduced into the P2P swim, programmed to time out and compel a purchase, if the owners so desire. Griffin says P2P is now "part of the fabric of our society," and that rather than "waiting for the perfect chastity belt," contentholders need to find a way to embrace it as a delivery form and exert what control they can. Meanwhile, the folks behind ContentGuard look forward to presiding over a "rules-based" future with Microsoft/Xerox co-venture XrML (that's eXtensible rights Markup Language, sports fans), a programming language that tells devices how to put the rules specified above into effect. The Content-Guard people hope XrML will allow rights-holders to "future-proof" their wares by being versatile enough to be adapted to whatever devices come down the pike. How do they respond to the assertion that the policing of content is more an obstacle to profitability in the digital space than a bulwark against lost revenues? "People will bring bad business models to the marketplace, and they will fail, and others will succeed," relates XrML Evangelist Brad



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Terry, you're usally known as the quiet member of the duo.

Terry Lewis: Jimmy's usually the big commenter. But I don't mind speaking. Everybody says, "You're shy," or wonder if I'm articulate. I hate the word "articulate." It's a word they made up for black people who speak "proper" English. I hate that! When people talk about things that I really care about, I have a great deal to say. You talk about kids or helping people, things that mean something in life, and I've got a great conversation for you. What I do for a living is a blessing. It's what I love to do.

When you're by yourself, what do you do?

Lewis: I do some reading, though not as much as I used to I mostly try to stay undercover, spend some quality time with myself. I used to be able to stay up and do 20 hours a day, seven days a week. Now, I do 20 hours a day, TWO days a week!

better, and we instinctively know that. It's like our handshake deal back in the day; it's all still 50-50.

Does business sometimes take you away from the creative side?

Jam: No, thank goodness. I don't like the business end particularly, but I know you've got to deal with it, so I do. I really like the creative end. One of the nice things about being in business with L.A. Reid is that he is a producer who runs a label. He enjoys that, and he knows that we don't really like doing it. He really takes care of the day-to-day stuff along with our staff in Los Angeles and [Flytetyme GM] Gwen Irby, so we can do what we do, which is write and produce. I was talking to Quincy Jones about that. I asked him, "How do you like running a label?" And he said, "I hate it." But he added it's necessary to get new talent—talent that you discover or that people turn you on to—out to the public. Without our label, there's no Sounds of Blackness, no Mint Condition, no Solo.

You don't find many people with 30-year friendships.

Lewis: The key elements to any relationship are trust and respect. We have a lot of both. The one thing we've been able to do, as far as our business partnership, is keep our personal lives separate from the business. And in turn, keep our personal lives in order, which helps the business stay in order.

Do you ever get sick of one another?

Jimmy Jam: No. It's not that we're joined at the hip. Here's a perfect example: Terry is in Los Angeles mixing Nodesha, and I'm here in Minneapolis working with Boyz II Men. So we split the responsibility. It happens naturally. We never designate; it just all falls into place. That allows us to be more productive. And allows us creative freedom. We each get to work on projects that we feel really strongly about, 'cause usually one of us feels stronger about a project than the other. That's a natural thing, because there are certain people you vibe with

It gives those acts an opportunity to get out and make some noise the way they want to, with their musical integrity intact. We're not going to change what they do; we're just improving upon it.

What was your first recording session like?

Lewis: Our first "professional" session was a blissful situation because we always thought we had things to share, musically. More than producers, we saw ourselves as songwriters. Most people confuse the two, especially these days. We had to learn to become producers to get our own songs across. The first sessions that we did were for a song titled "I Can't Stand It," which is a club classic now. Those were what we called the "Golden Bird Sessions," because we weren't making any money, just enough to buy some Golden Bird chicken! A three-piece, French fries and a strawberry soda. Those were our first sessions, and then we moved on to Klymaxx.

"There is no Jam/Lewis sound because we never do the same thing twice." That quote greets visitors to Jimmy Jam & Terry Lewis's Flytetyme Studio's website (www.flytetyme.com) and it's an out-and-out lie: They return to the top of the national song charts on a regular basis. As the highest-charting production-team in music history, Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis have every right to wear their trademark hats 10-times the size. Their 16 pop (and 25 R&B) #1 hits, with various artists, place the dynamic duo behind legendary Beatles producer George Martin's 23, and tied with Elvis Presley producer Steve Sholes. Tack on seven nominations in the Grammy Producer of the Year category—with two wins—as well as taking home this year's "Best Dance Recording" for Janet's "All For You," and you can see their greatness is cemented. Jimmy and Terry are currently celebrating their 20 years together as a production team, not to mention 30 years of friendship. In reality, you'd be hard-pressed to find two more down-to-earth human beings. That is, if you discount owning courtside seats for the hometown Minnesota Timberwolves, where they are the Jack Nicholsons of the 10,000 lakes area. Jimmy Jam & Terry Lewis are entitled to the spoils of success, but success hasn't spoiled them. However, this interview with one-time HITS denizen Gary "One Eyed" Jackson stands a chance of falling through an ice hole quicker than you can fish out a wall-eyed pike. Or something like that.

How big is the Flytetyme Studios staff?

Jam: About seven people, total. It's very efficient. Steve Hodge, our mixer, has been with us since 1986. One of the things we did when we built the studio is, rather than hire a bunch of engineers, as we put the equipment in, we taught the producers on-staff how to work the various rooms. If they needed help, Steve was there. We have Xavier Smith, who started out as a food runner. When he was sitting around, he'd pick up a manual and learn how to do different things. When we got into hard-disk recording, Pro Tools, those types of things, he knew all about them. The furny thing is, he still runs for food for us, but he's really a great Pro Tools programmer, too. Alex Richburg, who was part of Trackmasters out of Atlanta, has his own room. He's very technically proficient, but also a good musician. Big Jim Wright, who has been with us since Sounds of Blackness, has co-written and produced many records. Susan Owens, our ad-

ship with EMI Music. So, it all kind of stays in the family—each business is run independently, but complements each other. The studio allows us to work whenever we want to and be creative. What I like to do is look at the businesses and say, if we were just writers, are we pulling our weight? Are we doing OK? And we go, "Yeah." If we were just publishing, are we doing OK? If we're just running a studio, are we doing OK? It all seems to work.

You called your first label Perspective Records rather than Flytetyme.

Jam: We wanted Perspective to have its own identity. We didn't want anybody confusing it with our production company. We already had Flytetyme Studios, Flytetyme Publishing, Flytemtyme Productions. At the time, we just thought, let's do something different. We thought Perspective was kind of a nice name that showed that we were trying to do things from a different perspective, as we like to say.

ministrator, was the very first person we hired; she's been with us for 16 years. Debbie Morrison, who is Terry's executive assistant, has been with us for 13 years. Then we have Jane Laub, our accountant. Brad Yost is our tech, who not only keeps everything running, but he actually wired the studio, initially. The other thing is, we haven't had turnover. We've pretty much kept the same employees. It's like family. Everybody knows that their job is not really defined by any parameters except whatever it takes to keep the ship running. That means, if I have to, I take the trash out!

How has Flytetyme combined all its various interests?

Jam: We do a lot of things that complement each other. Our songwriting gives us the product to produce. The production of the songs gives us the reason for having this studio. Our publishing company publishes the songs—in partner-

Who is currently signed to Flytetyme?

Jam: We have two artists. One is a 16-year-old named Nodesha and then there's a three-piece group out of New York called Morrison Slick. Terry calls them Mint Condition on steroids! They are very, very musical. They all play, they all write, they all produce, they all sing. I think they fit neatly into that neo-soul category, but it's different too. We're excited about that. The nice thing about Nodesha is, besides being a singer and a really great dancer, she's also a really good songwriter. That's great for us because we've always been collaborative people.

How do you prefer to collaborate with an artist? Do you sit down and write together?

Jam: Absolutely. That's part of the theory about having our own studio. Where that really bore out was doing the *Control* album with Janet. When she came to



town, she kept asking when were we going to start working, because we didn't just run to the studio right away. We just kinda sat around, talking. I told her, "We're already working." She said, "What do you mean?" We said, "We're just vibin', we're getting to know you." That kind of thing. The first song we did was "Control," and we played the idea of taking control of her life, that kind of thing. And she said, "Oh, so the things we just talked about is what the album's gonna be!" We said, "Yeah." And she said, "Great!" You see, nobody had ever said anything like that to her before. Everybody said, "Here are the songs. Go in and sing." That opened up a whole perspective for her. If you give people the opportunity to collaborate, some people will say, "Well, that's OK... You guys can just write it." But Janet was like, "Now, I want to talk about this!" Having our own studio affords us the luxury of taking the time to be creative without watching the clock, thinking about how much we're spending. That's a major part of the way we work, and it translates to all the artists we work with.

Lewis: That's the inspiration for everything. If you don't get inspiration for every project, you're doomed. There are only so many songs in you, so there has to be inspiration from other people to bring everything together.

Give me an example of how "The Vibe Room" works.

Jam: Studio B is "The Vibe Room," where we sit and start the process of formulating the songs. Usually, we don't have anything prepared. I'll usually sit at a keyboard. Big Jimmy Wright, one of our staff producers, will sit at a keyboard. Terry will sit either with his bass or a notepad, and then we'll just sit and talk. And as the artist talks to us about the kind of music that they want to do, we'll just start playing, based on that, and the ideas begin flowing. What the artists really like about that is the songs are truly tailor-made for them. They are songs that come based upon what they think, what they feel. They know their song isn't going to sound like everybody else's on the radio; it's not going to be part of a hot sound where five other songs sound just like it. It makes the artist feel comfortable, gets them involved with the project. They bring that extra energy to it, makes them work harder, sing better, and at the end of the day, I think we manage to do a good job in capturing the essence of the artist.

Lewis: Most artists want to get involved, but what we try to do is incorporate everybody's vibe into it. That's what makes every project special.

And that keeps you fresh.

Jam: It's funny, because we do have those moments. We just started working a Boyz II Men project. They walked in and said, "What have you got?" We said, "Ain't got nothing... But we're gonna have something." And at the end of the night, we had a great song. The energy comes to us when the artist is there. Remember, it's not our album. The artists have to know what they want at some point; You're not going to be a very good artist if somebody always dictates to you who you are.

Do you ever see yourselves working with Prince?

Jam: We'd love to. We have had on-going conversations with him about it. As a matter of fact, when we first built the studio, he came over and just kinda looked around. Said he liked it. He never said he's proud of us, but I know he is. I know he has to be, in the way that a father would be proud of his sons, Prince was the one who opened the way and showed us—more than anything—the work ethic it takes to do something. Not only is he one of the most talented artists ever, he's also the hardest-working. And that is so scary. Usually, someone who has natural talent could bluff their way through things and show up. He was the hardest-working quy we've ever been around.

Terry, Jimmy calls you a visionary.

Lewis: I can see into the future, but I can't see things right under my nose. I'm always looking out, trying to see what's going to keep us competitive—not necessarily with anyone else, but with ourselves.

What three songs have you written that have given you goosebumps?

Jam: Sounds of Blackness' "Optomistic" is always at the head of our list for many reasons. It's one of those songs that just happened. We wanted a song that really showed their talent. It was gospel music, but not limited to traditional gospel; it embraced a great many musical genres. The other two would be really tough to call. I would have to say the entire Janet Jackson catalog of songs, and that whole relationship—if you could roll it into one song. But "When I Think of You" was our first #1 pop hit. When I listen to Yolanda Adams' "Open My Heart," I definitely get chills.

You're tied for #2 for all-time top producers in chart-topping pop hits. Can you put that into perspective?

Lewis: We never set out to do that. I never paid any attention to it until someone pointed it out. And I really don't pay that much attention to it now. Every time I go into a studio, I'm just making music. But what makes it very gratifying to me is that we've done it with artists that everybody knows and loves; we were able to help their careers in some way.

Jam: Hit records are wonderful. But records can uplift and do other things... that, to me, is the divinity of music. It's a privilege to do what we do. I don't think it's a matter of repaying—if you can ever really do that. I don't think you can ever save a part of yourself for that. We still have more positive things within us. God's saying, "Stick around, y'all. Still got some good things to do, and you're gonna do 'em."

How long do you think it'll be before you catch up to George Martin?

Lewis: I don't even think about that; we just make music. One thing I know is, if you love the music, the music will love you back. It's not an ego-driven thing. We make music because we love to make music. We used to pay to make music. Now, we get paid to make music. What a blessing!

First to report is the Steve Sessa/Safta Jaffery-repped U.K. act Serafin, who sign with Sylvia Rhone and John Kirkpatrick at Elektra, largely on the strength of their SXSW perf. The signing carries the added distinction of being the first from this year's Austin confab-Elektra quickly took the band off the market just as other majors were starting to circle... A surprise turn for Wheels fave The Living Things, as Beth Halper and Lenny Waronker add the act to the DreamWorks roster. As of early last week, insiders were expecting this one to go down with either V2 or Capitol. Legal eagle Jeffrey Light, along with Jackie Holland, handled the weaselocity on this one... Arizona rockers FiveSpeed sign

with Virgin, as N.Y.-bound David Wolter and Matt Serletic seal the deal... And the Peter Lewit-repped Noelle, featuring a 16-year-old girl singer, signs with respected A&R vet Brian Malouf at RCA. Of course, these are but a few of the numerous deals signed in the last couple of weeks—and publishing's been busy, too. Heard the reports on the recent pub deals going down with label priorities such as the Eric Hunter-signed Trust Co. (formerly 41 Down) on Geffen and the Craig Aaronson-inked Used on WB? These acts have been commanding advances in the high six figures. With this in mind, keep an eye out for Jampol/Atencio-managed 143/ Reprise band Dropline, who hit the Dragonfly on Thursday (4/4). With the signing momentum in full swing, expect the trend to continue for some closely watched acts... Speaking of closely watched, Nebraska new-new wavers The Faint, who recently enlisted on the No Doubt tour, have been hotly pursued by labels since last year, and it looks like the band and its indie

label, Saddle Creek, are now entertaining offers in earnest. Sources close to the act say a major-label P&D arrangement similar to Enjoy (Jack Johnson) or Aware and Columbia is a strong possibility, with Universal, Capitol, DreamWorks and American the frontrunners. We'll keep you posted... Word abroad on the Hives-WB deal is that the Swedish act is quite unhappy (read: pissed!) with the state of things. The WB purchase is rumored to involve the U.S. rights to the current Veni Vidi Vicious album and the band's next release. Their current single, "Hate to Say I Told You So," not only continues to spin at KROQ, but is also slated for the upcoming Spider-Man ST... Lots of heat surrounding the Andy Kipnes/ Doug Davis-repped Carlos Bernardo, with L.A. showcases lined up for several label heavies. Busy indie producer Brian McTernan (Thrice, Cave-In) discovered Bernardo and recorded the demos... Strong responses to demos from Sactown rockers Shortie. Look for heavy attendance at their upcoming ASCAP Viper Room show with Pattern and Mellowdrone... And hip-hop A&R whiz/manager Evan Bogart (of Eminem fame) and partner Curtis Mann are rolling with a new act-Detroit-based Vishis, who's doing the label meet-and-greet thing thanks to smokin' demos... The Brian Schall/ Joe Berman-repped Sissy Prozac is getting some radio love on several Modern Rock stations. We tipped you off early on this one last week... 

Gary Cee at WLIR for incorporating the April Fool's concept into his on-air time with Moby. At 11:00 that morning Gary broke the news to his midday talent that WLIR had been sold. The new owner, Moby, announced he had bought the station for \$4,012,002 (4/01/2002). Moby then "fired" the staff and took over the station, playing his favorites like Bowie, Pixies, The Strokes, Joy Division, White Stripes, Beck and XTC until 12:30 pm, when he announced on-air that owning a radio station was too much trouble. Moby sold the station back for \$4,012,003, yielding a \$1 profit. Very cool.... Another great Abandoned Pools week for Eric Bakes, including KPNT, WRZX, WPBZ and WSUN.... Speaking of WSUN, congrats to Shark and Co. on their extraordinary trend: 3.3-4.1! He celebrated by adding cool records like "The Remedy," Moby, Remy Zero and Headstrong.... When I tracked down Steve Leeds today to tell him The Scorpion King soundtrack debuted on the PoMo chart at #7 this week, he let the news slip that he's been promoted to Sr. VP New Technology for Universal and Motown, which will continue to include all aspects of video promotion (Steve was in Nashville when we spoke, overseeing a CMT "Crossroads" taping with Elton John and Ryan Adams). Kudos to him and the rest of the Universal team as Godsmack's "I Stand Alone" continues to gain spins, helping drive the Scorpion King ST near the 100k mark for its debut at retail... Having a new Tool song in rotation is always a good thing, and WYSP, WAAF, KUPD, KXXR and KUFO are among the MANY that prove it with a "Parabola" add. We hail Warren and Michelle for having such a landslide in hitting #1 Most Added with so many killer songs launching simultaneously. This column has always been just as much yours as mine and KISS PD Kevin Vargas outlines why: "While many great songs cross over into the land of multi-shared property, Tool remains completely owned by just two formats. Making Tool 'yours' is essential to your credibility, and this is another good song to help the band move higher up your 'most played artists' report." Pat and Paul at KRXQ put "Parabola" in rotation six months ago and as a few programmers overthink the band that has had some of the biggest-testing songs in the format's history, Paul says: "Forget everything you think you know. Tool is a band that defies all conventional radio thinking and perhaps it's time for that." KUPD's Larry McFeelie gets it: "'Parabola' is just another chapter of the Lateralus masterpiece. It's melodic, hooky and it rocks! You'd have to be crazy to NOT add it!" Exactly, Lar... It wasn't long ago that so many were saying they couldn't play a band with the name Hoobastank. "Crawling In The Dark" has been Top 10 for weeks and it's showing signs of even more growth. KUPD's JJ Jeffries will tell ya: "It's crawling out of the dark and has become a real hit," as team IDJ launched "Running Away" with big

adds, including WLUM, WLZR and WBZX. Next week, they're launching American Head Charge with an early add from KXXR ... J is also one of many heavies raving about how well Earshot is doing. "Get Away" sounded so amazing at their L.A. show last week, as did all of the other hits on their LP, which I'm addicted to. Bunny labelmates Glassjaw have a massive future if their album comes out

Kim and Darren have Tommy Lee moving nicely up the chart with new adds at WAAF, WCCC, KATT, WTPT and others. Many are expressing the same sentiments as WYSP's Nancy Palumbo: "'Hold Me Down' is going to bring him back. It's a hit—a great rock song that sounds amazing on-air. Gaby and Raymond put KRXQ, WLUM, WNOR, WRXL, KRQC, WQXA, WXQR and a handful of others on the board... WAAF, KAZR, KRAB and WTKX gave Cheryl Valentine belated birthday (3/30) presents in the form of early Incubus "Warning" adds... Heard the Chad Kroger/Josey Scott smash from the upcoming Spider-Man ST? WHJY's John Laurenti called to scream, "It's gonna be a huge fuckin hit! Song of the summer for sure"... Out of space... Check out Deadsy and TRUSTCo....






Moth Provisions, Fictions and Gear (Virgin): Need proof PoMo is moving in a melodic, highly inventive direction? Look no further than this Cincinnati quartet's energetic major-label bow. Merging indie rock's adventurous songcraft with hard-rock heft, frontman Brad Stenz and company—with help from producer Sean Beavan—have forged an album to please all

the senses. A case in point is the thrilling "Hearing Things," in which slamming riffs give way to ear-candy melody and giddy, twinkling synthesizers. These tracks will also stick in your head: four-on-the-floor singalong "I See Sound," the surging "Burning Down My Sanity," the frantic cautionary tale "Cocaine Star" and the ass-kicking, staccato "Plastics Campaign." (S.G.)

The Apex Theory Topsy Turvy (DreamWorks): Sharing Armenian heritage and a Mediterranean influence with friends System of a Down (for whom singer Andy Khachaturian once played drums), TAT's huge creative energy continually takes their music in unexpected melodic and rhythmic directions. Riding a hyped-up groove that ranges from prog-funk ("That's



All") to heavy rock art-rap (single "Shhh...(Hope Diggy)"), the band seems to shape-shift continually, but that's half the fun—the other half being their many uncountably complex time signatures, driven by the ace skinbashing of drummer Sammy J. Watson. "Drown Ink" brings it all together, but besides that, anyone with a song called "Mucus Shifters" is an automatic winner. (J.O.)



Golden Boy with Miss Kittin Or (Emperor Norton): Swiss funk soul brother/award-winning visual artist Stefan Altenburger (aka Golden Boy) has met his match in the French Miss Kittin, who has lent her sing/speak chanteuse vocalizing to records from the Hacker and Felix da Housecat. Golden Boy's mellow electro-pop grooves provide a burbling, analog-synth

drenched outline, with Miss Kittin playfully giving color to the sketches, whether on the murder-with-a-twist musing of "Rippin Kittin" or vocoderized on "Autopilot." On the handful of strictly instrumental tracks, such as on the nearly seven-minute "It's Good for You to Meet People Like Us," Golden Boy busts Euro dance-party disco a la Daft Punk. (D.S.)

Gomez In Our Gun (Virgin): Merging country blues and psychedelic rock, Britain's Gomez has tread closely to the jam band line on its two studio records, but the band's latest serves notice that the band has evolved into a songwriting powerhouse. The quintet clears the decks with the short, sharp and punky opener, "Shot Shot," with a horn riff nicked from the Beastie



Boys' "Brass Monkey." In place of guitar noodling are electronic blips and beeps, drum machines and studio trickery, and the song structures are tightened. The band's ace in the hole is Ben Ottewell's singing; his voice falls somewhere between Tom Waits and Otis Redding—and he's not even the main singer. (D.S.)




MARIO: Friend indeed.

Consultant's Corner

It takes a lot to encourage us, but maybe Randy Lane of The Randy Lane Company can put a little fire under you radio nuts, Zzzz...

Is it crazy to experiment on a #1 rated morning show? Absolutely Not!

In the book "Built to Last" by James C. Collins & Jerry I. Porras, they outline how some successful companies' best moves resulted not from detailed strategic planning, but through experimentation, trial & error, opportunism &, quite likely, by accident. What in hindsight looks

like brilliant strategy often was a result of experimentation. For example, the invention of the post-it note at 3M accidentally came about when an employee was fiddling around with adhesive compounds on paper. To promote this, several companies have "The15% Rule," encouraging employees to spend that much of their time experimenting, doodling & fiddling around. Band-Aids for Johnson & Johnson was the result of an employee experimenting with bandages because his wife kept cutting her fingers cooking. The point is, neither one came out of strategic planning session, but out of experimentation.

The value of this concept for PDs & talent is that experimentation is a key component of the creative process that can directly impact ratings. By encouraging experimentation you may come up with the new "Battle of the Sexes" or the new "No Repeat Workday" idea. But how do you know if it's worth putting on the air?


In this environment of voice tracking & cyber jocking, many stations have lost the overnight live slot, which was a prime training ground for developing talent & trying new things. Talent must be allowed to experiment, even in morning drive. Set up an environment where they're allowed to fail & make mistakes occasionally. If you're particularly nervous about a new idea, put it down on tape first.

Benchmarks & experimentation give you the balance for a great show. Jimmy Kimmel turned experimentation into a benchmark. One day on KROQ they were brainstorming & came up with so many that they couldn't decide which to use, so they put them all on a wheel and spun it to choose. This ended up being a successful benchmark that he continues to use even on *The Man Show*.

Keep these points in mind:

- · Listen to anyone with an original idea.
- · Encourage, don't nit-pick.
- · Encourage experimental doodling.
- · Let people run with an idea.
- · Take small steps toward something give it a try.
- · Accept that mistakes will be made.
- · Hire good people and leave them alone.




