

DIALOGUE

As I walk into the downstairs office of Michael Ostin, Vice President of A&R for Warner Brothers Records, he is scrutinizing a 12" dance remix of Fleetwood Mac's "Big Love" at ear-splitting volume. The 30-year-old son of company chairman Mo Ostin pays careful attention, just as he meticulously responds to Hits' queries about his role in guiding the label's impressive mix of proven superstars and promising young talent.

It's no surprise to learn Ostin was exposed to the world of music at a very early age. "There's a lot I gained just through osmosis," he says. After graduating from the University of Colorado at Boulder, he decided to take Warner's then head of A&R, now President, Lenny Waronker up on his long-standing offer to join his department. Waronker served as young Michael's mentor, but Ostin proved an apt student, signing such diverse acts as Christopher Cross and Dream Academy to the label.

Although he has one of the high-visibility, prestige jobs in the industry, Ostin enjoys working behind the scenes. He understands that it is the artists who are the real stars, and his role is to make sure they achieve their creative potential. While he freely acknowledges he's had opportunities afforded him by dint of birth, Ostin insists he's privileged background has forced him to prove himself even more.

Ten years later, Michael Ostin doesn't have to apologize to anyone for where he is. Through hard work and dedication, he has risen to the top of his field as an astute administrator and creative problem-solver. Michael Ostin has emerged as a force in his own right, as VP of A&R for one of the most successful record companies in the world.

How much input do you generally have with your artists?

A It varies. There are so many different kinds of artists I work with. Each one requires a different kind of A&R. Our role is trying to enhance the artist's vision. Someone like Madonna knows exactly what she wants and how to get it. When you're working in a vacuum. sometimes it's great to get that outside input. Most of the time, it's just a pat on the back, the kind of "duck and get out of the way" school of A&R. In the case of songs, I've been real lucky because I came up with two for Madonna which really worked out, "Like A Virgin" and "Papa Don't Preach." When I played her the tunes, she knew instantly she wanted to do them.

What's the best part of the

A The creative challenge. There are two distinct roles in A&R: the maintenance of the artists on the roster and talent acquisition, both of which are very exciting. It's great to find something in its embryonic stage and have a vision as to what that should be and be able to realize the vision. Then, there's the problemsolving aspect, when artists on the roster come to you for guidance, help or suggestions, and being able to provide them with that.

Is the job as glamorous as it appears?

I feel fortunate to be surrounded by the kind of people that are here. I'm lucky to be at a company that believes in fostering a creative environment. The second day I worked here, I walked into an A&R meeting with Lenny Waronker, Ted Templeman, Michael Omartian, Russ Titleman, Gary Katz and Tommy LiPuma. I was blessed to be in a real learning situation; an atmosphere that enabled me to really learn my craft.

What are some of your earliest memories growing up?

I was always a real music and record junkie, a big fan. I remember my father bringing home the first Jimi Hendrix record and just having my mind blown. It was something I had a real feel for, something I wanted to do all along and again, was provided the opportunities to do so. Of course, the whole nepotism thing is a double-edged sword. Often, you have to prove yourself


doubly. Fortunately, Lenny Waronker comes from a similar background; his father was also president of a record company. When he brought me in, he told me to just do the best I could, and not worry about the rest. He made it really easy for me. When I was a kid, I used to hang out in the studio and go over his house. He used to put me to work listening to tapes for him.

Why did you go into A&R rather than some other position?

Probably because of my relationship with Lenny. I think this is where my skills are. He realized I had talents in this area.

Did you receive any en-

couragement form your father?

My dad took sort of a hands-off position. Not that he was discouraging, but he plays things by the book. I had to prove myself even more to him than an outsider would have. He probably made it more difficult for me, which was fine, because it gave me a certain amount of muscle. But it was the environment which gave me the chance, being exposed to that at an early age. The first artist I signed to the label. Christopher Cross. (producer) Michael Omartian actually let me come into the studio and work on the album. Being involved in the creative process really enabled me to better understand what an artist goes through, it taught me the language.

What are your own tastes in music?

A I'm fairly eclectic. I listen to all kinds of music. Because of the realm of my responsibility, I have to work with every kind of act. Obviously, you have to divorce yourself from personal taste much of the time. Mainly,

I operate in the pop-rock arena. Right now, I'm working very closely with Benny Medina, who we brought in as head of Black A&R about a year ago. We're a real team; we bounce off each other. Currently, we're executive producing an artist named Taja Sevelle from Prince's label. He discovered her in Minneapolis, but realized it wasn't something he should produce, so his manager called us up and suggested we should deal with it on a creative level. She's kinda like Prince meets Rickie Lee Jones, but at the same time totally unique, one of the most amazing singers you've ever heard.

How active are you in scouting new talent?

We all have our network of people out there whose

opinions we trust. Things get filtered through to us. To be honest with you, I'm not a street rat. That's not the style of A&R I do, especially with my office and roster responsibilities. I can't be out every night scouring the clubs. We have people who work for us to do that. And they do a good job of it, too.

Is a label roster put together as carefully as, say, a sports team?

I wish I could say it's master-minded, but it's not. My A&R philosophy has to do with one thing, and that's talent. People call all the time and ask what kind of acts I'm looking for, and I tell them I'm just looking for talent and inspiration. Plain and simple. That's how this roster was built. It has nothing to do with

being short on, for instance, heavy metal acts this week. It doesn't work like that.

How much input do you have with an artist like Prince?

There isn't a great deal of involvement. It basically comes to us complete. He's just so wonderfully gifted and prolific. They come to us after the record is done and ask what we think. And, if there are some suggestions to make, he'll listen. He respects Lenny's opinion a great deal. Sometimes, he'll take our advice and sometimes he won't. Often, he's right.

It must be more fun to work with developing artists, then, where you have more input.

Absolutely, where it's a hands-on situation. That's exciting. Or when you connect with a major artist looking for direction, where you can put them together with the right producer or song.

How does your A&R department interact with the other parts of the label in signing acts?

With respect to the signing process, very little. We go by our instincts. If promotion or marketing brought me something that was great, as they have in many cases, I wouldn't hesitate to consider it. Russ Thyret, for example, is the one who brought Prince to us. But I wouldn't let that be the determining factor in signing an act. When I'm interested in an artist, I won't take it to promotion or marketing and ask if we should sign it. Often, they'll look at things from a different perspective, so I wouldn't want that to influence our decision. Of course, during the recordmaking process, they play a very important role; we like to tease them and get them involved by playing little snippets of music here and there to create a groundswell of enthusiasm. Once the record's done, they become essential. Obviously, you couldn't do it without them.

As a pretty low-key executive, I take it you don't subscribe to the superstar theory of A&R?

The artists you work with are the superstars. I love being behind the scenes. Actually, it's the record producers who have become an integral part of the A&R process. Developing relationships with them is a very important part of this job. Again, I feel fortunate to have been exposed to the great producers on our staff at an early age. I realized even then what a vital role they play. In a lot of cases, my dialogue is with producers rather than the

artists themselves.

Would you like to be a record producer yourself?

A I feel I have the best of both worlds where I am now. I'm not a musician. And that limits me in a production sense. On a certain level, I can be involved in producing a record, but I couldn't really get in the trenches. I understand the process of making a record; I think I can supervise a project and do a pretty good job at it. But I get to do that in the position I'm in. And I don't have to do the dirty work. I get to sit behind a desk, so that when artists and producers come in and play me stuff, I'm able to make suggestions they can go back and try.

What are the qualities you look for in an effective A&R executive?

A Taste, conviction, the ability to pick a record apart, instinct, intelligence, the skill to communicate with an artist or producer and a knack for seeing something in its embryonic stages. Also, the ability to divorce your personal taste from your decisionmaking, to have an open mind and a broad overview. The bottom line is, this is a business. Often, you have to work on projects that don't coincide with your own personal tastes. To be able to pick up on something you might not listen to at home, but you realize could sell a lot of records is an important skill one would need to do this job.

Would you like to be the

head of Warner Brothers some day?

A There's a lot of talented people who work at this company. I'm really happy where I am now. This job is extremely gratifying. Some day it might be fun to run a label, though I realize there's a lot of aggravation which goes along with the job. It's not as if what I'm doing now is easy. There's a tremendous amount of pressure and a heavy work load, but I love what I do.

You've received offers from other record labels in the past. Would you ever consider leaving Warners?

I'm pretty content right here. I've had various opportunities afforded me, but I'm still learning. And this is the best place to learn. This kind of environment brings the best out of me. And that's what's most important to me right

What is your A&R strategy regarding signing superstar talent as opposed to developing newer acts?

Unfortunately, business enters into it. There's a place for both, especially on a label of this size. In the case of pursuing big names, it has to be an artist we believe in and we feel has longevity, as well as fits into the Warners artist roster.

Is there anybody out there you'd like to have on the label?

That's a tough question. If there was, I wouldn't give it away. I'm a huge Sting fan,

though. I love him and I loved the Police. If they were free, I might be interested. But A&M has done a tremendous job with them; I'm sure he's quite happy there. But as a fan, Sting's an artist I truly admire.

What's most impressive about Warner Brothers is the label's willingness to take chances on unique acts.

A Well, that's our philosophy. We're always willing to go out on a limb for something we believe in and feel should be heard. Over the years, we've always been on the cutting edge, or whatever you wanna call it. That's an overused term, but I think you know what I mean. We've always stuck with artists even if they weren't commercially successful. And I think you have to attribute that to Mo, Lenny, and the A&R department here. You have people with such diverse tastes, from a Karin Berg to a Michael Hill to a Roberta Petersen to a Felix Chamberlain to a Kevin Laffey to a Steven Baker to an Andrew Wickham. And that's what goes into making the roster so eclectic. If I hear something I like, but it's not in an area I feel really comfortable in or qualified to make an evaluation in, I can pick up the phone and call Karin or Ted (Templeman) or Seymour (Stein) and ask their opinion. It's absolutely a team over here. By no stretch of the imagination is this a one-man show. I'm just part of that team and that's what makes it work.







"London swings like a pendulum do."

Even before the '60s, when that song came out, the eyes and ears of America, as well as the rest of the world, watched very closely to see exactly how that pendulum moved. We might have invented rock and roll, but the Brits kept tinkering with it. But lately rock in the Merrie Olde is tending to be just that. Old. And American.

For a shot of pure deja vu, it only takes a quick glance at the recent British charts, or a listen to their radio. Though the nostalgia is occasionally broken up by U2 and Beastie Boys, most of what's being heard has been around the block a few times. Or is a cover. Recently the top three singles on the charts were Ben E. King's "Stand By Me," Percy Sledge's classic "When A Man Loves A Woman" and Boy George's limp Bread cover "Everything I Own." The list was rounded out by Ferry Aid (a Band Aid-like effort to assist victims of the ferry disaster) with a painful cover of "Let It Be," Freddie Mercury was back with "The Great Pretender," Mel and Kim had "Respectable," and Bruce Willis had butchered "Respect Yourself."

Something is definitely in the wind, and it ain't *hard rain*. (Though somebody will probably cover *that* next.)

The latest influx of Americana into the U.K. can be traced to one of our more worthy exports: Levi 501 jeans. Strange as it might seem, a fairly benign ad campaign for

Levi Strauss has helped transform the British pop charts into a world of the '60s and before.

It all started innocently enough. Last year, Levi began a major television campaign in the U.K. The ads employed Marvin Gaye's "Heard It Through The Grapevine" and Sam Cooke's "It's A Wonderful World" as background music. Within weeks, both songs appeared on the charts. High on the charts. "It's A Wonderful World" went to number Two (and launched the singing and pin-up career of Nick Kamen, who is shown in one ad stripping down to his undies). Making chart hits wasn't exactly what Levi Strauss had in mind when they began the advertisements. But they aren't objecting either.

According to Rachel Dyson, Levi's Account Executive at Bartle, Bogle and Hegarty, "We didn't anticipate that the record would become so popular. We were looking for an American image since Levi's is an American product. We did want tracks from the '50s or reminiscent of that era. Current-day America has less appeal to Europe. The mythology of the '50s has so affected teen culture. There were so many legends; there was a great number of images that we wanted to reflect. But those specific songs were picked for no particular reason."

Maybe not; they worked anyway. Levi's has had a great sales year in Europe during 1986. Naturally, this year brought Levi's

Ads: the Sequel. This time the songs, "Stand By Me" and "When A Man Loves A Woman," were picked carefully; in this series of commercials, the songs were the stars. Admits Dyson, "This year, the storylines were written around the songs."

The immediate impact of those ads has not gone unnoticed by either the advertising community or the record biz. What soundtracks meant here, two years ago, ads are for Britain now. The difference is that the material isn't new. Like music on soundtracks, a lot of the more recently unearthed tunes aren't wonderful. But it's cheap, available and nostalgic. And coming your way.

"By mid-May," ventures Danny Kelly, features editor and resident soothsayer of the British music weekly, *New Musical Express*, "you can predict that the Number One record in all of Britain will be Doris Day's 'Move Over Darling." He pauses for effect and continues, "There's an advert coming out for tights over here, and that's the soundtrack. They are so confident that the song has been re-pressed and a company is getting ready to make the video — with Bob Geldof's wife, Paula Yates, as Doris Day. We've had the great songs," he adds wryly, "now we're into Division Two."

He's right. Though not even the feistiest of rock critics can complain about hearing Ben E. King on the radio again, there is



something odd about a Top Ten list that is, local heroes U2 notwithstanding, comprised of re-issues and covers. Doris Day is a far cry from classic Motown. Yet, there is no single reason for the strange condition of the charts, rather it's a combination effect.

"Figure the average kid watching a 501 ad," offers Kelly. "Not only are the adverts very well made, and sexy, but those kids have never heard 'Stand By Me.' British radio plays only Top 40; we don't have a choice of radio stations like in America. So to the kids, who hear this in an ad, it's just a great song, so they go out and buy it."

There's also (surprise!) an economic reason for the proliferation of older songs. They are great money-makers. In Britain, like America, what sells is what is heard, and if old is what is heard on TV or radio, that's what people buy. If new bands get lost in the shuffle of insta-nostalgia smashes, that's life.

"The record companies," explains Kelly, "the big ones, are tuned to hit-making. They don't equate good music with hits. They equate hits with other hits, which is why, last year, five of the cast members of the top non-imported soap opera, 'Eastenders,' had a hit record. They're celebrities.

"Currently record companies are spending enormous amounts of time and money on reprocessing their back catalogs into CD. It is possible that it's a case of chicken and egg. That the lack of good new music means that there will be more nostalgia hits."

There is also a certain amount of laziness involved, particularly with the infusion of hit cover versions. It is certainly a lot easier for Kim Wilde, whose career has been languishing for years, to remake and break an already familiar hit song ("You Keep Me Hanging On") then to write her own. The formula has definitely worked, not only for Wilde, but for Freddie Mercury, Boy George, and many others.

A lot of people would argue, rightfully, that there is a a great deal of good new music; it simply never gets heard. Part of the problem seems to be the lack of a solid new musical movement to push things along. Punk is dead, rockabilly is forgotten and haircuts have been done to death.

"It's definitely an unhealthy situation for new young bands," says Tony Fletcher, a music critic and manager of the transplanted Boston band, Three Colors. "There is nothing sweeping the nation right now," he says. "We should be grateful that at least most of this older material is good music."

Some of it's not even very old. As part of a reaction against '80s dance music, several London disc jockeys have begun the "rare groove" scene. Basically, it's the resurgence of '70s funk records and artists. It's become so popular that the entire War catalog has been re-issued. With more to follow.

But out of the ashes, there is - if you squint - a phoenix. One covered in irony. Less than a month ago, for the first time ever in Britain, the Number One album (U2's "The Joshua Tree") outsold the Number One single. In Britain, it appears that the single is dying. That, according to Kelly, has changed the way hit records are made, and affects what gets into the charts.

Because of the drop in singles popularity, it no longer takes sales of a million to have a hit single. Good black music - hip-hop and rap - never gets played on the radio until it's a hit, a Catch-22 situation. But that's being broken down by the dip in the singles sales figures. Five years ago, the 7-10,000 people that go to dance clubs where American imports are played, would buy those records, but it would make no impression on the charts. Now, because of the drop in sales, when those 10,000 people buy a record, it becomes a hit and goes to Top 40.

Theoretically, that also means if all 10,000 Zodiac Mindwrap or Stump fans buy one copy each of their respective records, the bands could find themselves high on the charts and, in seven years or so become the next U2.

Unfortunately, they'd have a better chance if they did a cover. How about, "Those Were The Days"?
