




TOP FIFTY SINGLES

Whitney Returns In A Big Way

You can forget about that sophomore jinx garbage.

Whitney Houston's second project for Arista, "Whitney," is blowing through the roof at retail as her single, "I Wanna Dance With Somebody (Who Loves Me)" continues to rocket.

In fact, this week the young chanteuse captures the top spot on the *Hits* Top 50 Albums Chart in her debut appearance, while the single takes top honors on the *Hits* Top 50 Singles Chart.

She's come back in grand style.

"To see Whitney's album enter the charts at #1 is one of the top thrills of my career," Arista Founder and President Clive Davis told Hits. "Everyone at Arista is just thrilled and proud."

"The first week has been really rewarding," said Arista's Vice President of Sales and Distribution Jim Cawley. "The retailers are very happy — a 'Whitney-mania' has developed."

"Whitney-mania" is probably the best way to describe these numbers: #1 Sam Goody; #1 Musicland; #1 Lechmere; #1 RTI One-Stop; #1 Music Peoples; #1 Elroys; #1 Tower Sunset; #1 Strawberries; #1 Elroys; #1 Transworld and on and on and on.

"It was huge right out of the gate as we expected," said Sam Goody's Mike Maska. "It's #1 for the Goody chain with 3-1 sales over the #2 record."

"This will top the first one," exclaimed Elroy Enterprises' Director Of Purchasing Steve Lerner.

"It's in the same league as Springsteen and U2," remarked Strawberries' Jeff Cohen. "Houston hits the top!"

Arista's Cawley applauded the huge retail response to this second project and cited a great relationship between Whitney and the retail community. "When the first album came out, Whitney visited retail and met a lot of people. They watched her grow and took her to their hearts."

The marked difference between Arista's approach to this Whitney album and the first Whitney project is the label's quest for a younger demographic. With majority of the last year's hit singles being upper demographic appeal ballads, Arista set out in search of another prime Whitney audience: the kids. Thus label President Clive Davis' choice of "I Wanna Dance With Somebody" as the first single has paid off handsomely in younger demographic returns. Whitney's appeal spans all ages.

"Whitney was very visible in our campaign at retail," said Cawley. "Her picture was everywhere — we really wanted to get across the youthful image of this 23-year-old phenomenon."

It's working. Retailers are reporting young buyers comprise the majority of the audience, with many of them springing for the new cassette single. At Turtles, the cassette single is outselling its vinyl counterpart.

In an exclusive Hits interview Naftaly stated, "I would like to thank all of my 'friend' at Hits (my #1 source for accurate predictions) for all the encouragement and support."

Naftaly's former bosses were quick to comment on the appointment of their former protege. KS103's Nick Ferrara stated, "I always knew he had the potential, even though he doesn't return phone calls. The kid is hotter than *Hits* magazine."

Gerry Cagle of Y106 (who has the dubious distinction of first hiring Naftaly to handle the phones at KFRC) added, "My only joy in this business is to watch an amoeba become the blob. It was a great

choice, now all he has to do is change his hairstyle."

KIIS-FM's Steve Rivers was so underwhelmed by the promotion that he refused to leave a meeting to give us a quote. However, his secretary did call to tell us, "Leave your name and phone number and Steve promises to return your call with a quote about Keith."

The search is on for a new music director at the station.



Doesn't it seem a little hypocritical that MTV rejects the sexuality as exhibited in the new George Michael video, yet flaunts it in numerous other clips especially in the case of Mötley Crüe? The Crüe video is soft porn exploitation at its sexiest..... With the Madonna tour getting ready to cook, we highly recommend airplay for her sizzling album cut. "Where's The Party." It's already receiving strong play in many markets with positive results..... In response to the startling success of the Kenny G single and album, many are wondering whether it is a unique case or the beginning of a musical trend. Our guess is the former..... The instant success of the LL Cool J album comes as only a small surprise to those of us who chart the marketplace. His debut set was one of the discussed success stories of 1986 and set the stage for the current explosion. The people speak loudly at the cash register, and he is considered #1 in the rap field..... The next dance/rock remake explosion in the tradition of Run-DMC, Club Nouveau and Pseudo Echo is the unusual teaming of the Fat Boys with the Beach Boys on a rapping version of "Wipeout." Fat Boys albums are moving quickly and Top radio should notice..... Now that both radio and retail are cooking on the great new Suzanne Vega

project, attention is swinging to RCA's Jonathan Butler and Manhattan's Richard Marx. Butler's combination of R&B and Jazz (a la George Benson) is taking both the Black and Adult charts by storm and is already selling. His album has been developing for some time, while the Marx record (with backing from many former Eagles) has exploded at Album and Top 40 radio almost instantaneously..... highly recommended new songs include the forthcoming Dionne Warwick/Jeffrey Osborne duet from the consistent hitmaking factory of Burt Bachrach and Carol Sager, the Charlie Sexton cut from the "Beverly Hills Cop II" soundtrack, and the catchy pop ditty from Virgin's Danny Wilson (now better known as the cut endorsed by Elektra's Mike Bone).

THE LATEST ON UP AND COMING BANDS

It's been a particularly good week, what with seeing the striking video of Suzanne Vega's "Luka" filmed in a cool blue by D.A. ("Don't Look Back") Pennebaker, certainly a stand-out among the current fare in video clips......Then came an impressive show by the Saints who are touring behind their well-documented and wellreceived "All Fools Day" album on TVTbut the next night topped it all with a memorable show by World Party who brought alive their "Private Revolution" album on CHRYSALIS and came across in the very best way as the ultimate Big Chill band, espousing messages of love, peace and ecology, but with a friendly cynicism and contemporary sound interspersed by touches of Stones, Dylan and the Beatles whose "Day In The Life" was the band's encore - the live rendition being a first for everyone in the audience. Even the sustained chord at the end was re-enacted faithfully. This is a show that people will be saying many years from now "I was there" even if they weren't. Band, label reps and assorted liggers reconvened at a local Santa Monica nitery (owned by the band's management) for oysters and champagne......Seminal English post-punk band Wire are making their first U.S. tour in many years behind their ENIGMA album "The Ideal Copy." WARNERS is giving away fuzzboxes as part of a college radio promotion for the anglo-gal trio Fuzzbox who are making their first American tour this month behind their GEFFEN debut......New Echo & the Bunnymen album due in July on SIRE comes with rave advance word. Their late Summer tour with New Order and Gene Loves Jezebel is creating a lot of excitement at advance ticket brokers already......New English offering from CHRYSALIS called Living in a Box is eagerly anticipated. The band already has a Top Ten single in England......Two other bands that are 'big in England right now' are MERCURY acts Swing Out Sister and Curiosity Killed The Cat who have finally completed their respective albums, both in the U.K. Top Ten and both expected to be released here shortly......WARNER band Erasure is set to open the Duran Duran tour......Label mates Martini Ranch, making their first full-length LP for SIRE, had B-52's singer Cyndi Wilson come in to do a vamp of "Girl From Ipanema" in phonetic Portuguese at the end of one track. Also contribbuting sizzling sax work is Hits own computer genius Francis Lambert Ivan Ivan, Book of Love producer, handled a number of the Martini Ranch tracks. He was also behind the boards for Detroit band Figures On A Beach whose single "No Stars" is getting steady airplay......dB's Pete Holsapple concluded his cross-country trek in L.A. last weekend. He was met in the glamourous suburb of Whittier by forty Ramblers that escorted him on the last stretch of the way to the Jiffylube franchise in downtown Lakewood. Jiffylube of course sponsored this "Ugly American Tour" if you remember and Peter had his vintage Rambler completely renovated for the trip. Meanwhile new dB's LP due soon on IRS, a label that incidentally looks set to sign its first heavy metal band.......The new Depeche Mode single on SIRE "Strange Love" sold out at retail in the first 24 hours. The band is currently in the studio working on the album for a Fall release.

RCA is leading off with "Lies" as the first single, and a number of formats have responded in a big way. There's more than a few choice cuts on the album, and many are already making the almost unavoidable comparisons to George Benson. Jonathan Butler has arrived.

Suggested Cuts

"Lies" is an undeniable smash. Also check out "Take Good Care Of Me," "I Miss Your Love Tonight," and "Barenese."

Label Comments:

"It's a monster record," said RCA's Vice President of Product Development Ed-Mascolo. "It's a huge record at the Urban level, and a monster Adult Pop record — right now, it's developing into a Top 40 smash." Mascolo and company have other reasons to be optimistic, Butler's the special guest on the first leg of Whitney Houston's upcoming tour, and the demand is snow-balling.

Suggested Cuts

"Betcha' Don't Know" is a great cut for a variety of formats, but we suggest diving in the whole album — it's a winner.

Label Comments:



DIALOGUE

In a town where word of mouth can mean people are either envious, respectful or hate your guts, Dr. Jerry Buss is a highly visible celebrity who evokes all the above reactions and more. As owner of the Los Angeles Lakers, Kings, Lazers and their home base, The Fabulous Forum, the former USC grad- where he earned his Ph. D. in chemistry- seems to do business at one time or another with most of the top guns in sports and entertainment. Add in the fact that the 52-year-old bachelor is often seen in the company of teenage women five years younger than his own four children and you have an image that is highly controversial, even for hot-tubbin' Hollywood. An extremely intelligent, sometimes moody though quite polite and emotionally complex man, Buss is one of the more interesting owners in all of pro sports. As his Lakers are heavy favorites to beat their arch-rivals, the hated Boston Celtics, in the championship final, Buss is currently an El Lay basketball junkie's best friend. Got any tix for your pals at Hits, Jer?

In true Hollywood tradition, let's talk about whether or not the Lakers can win next year even though as we speak, the NBA finals have just gotten underway.

I think we can win next year. We won't have many changes. The team will return virtually intact. I don't think any team has strengthened themselves dramatically in our division, plus I don't see any major weaknesses in our club that need to be taken care of in the off-season.

You recently made an offer to Kareem Abdul-Jabbar for him to remain the Lakers' captain and center for the next two years. Why haven't you been able to find his replacement in the past three years that you've been looking?

That's a very good question, specifically because there's no easy answer to it. We've tried trading for one and perhaps seeking a free agent, but we haven't been able to come up with an adequate replacement for Kareem. The team after Kareem leaves will probably change its style of play until we get a top center. The Cel-

tics played a running game and won a championship with Dave Cowens, who wasn't a physically dominating center at that position.


Are other teams reluctant to trade with the Lakers?

I don't think so. If they can pick one of our plum players, they'll try to. But they know (Lakers General Manager) Jerry West is a shrewd judge of players' abilities, so I assume they think twice before dealing us a player he's interested in.

What are the chances of getting Navy center David Robinson, whose military obligations put him in a unique situation of being available during the next three NBA drafts?

It's too far down the road. San Antonio has a whole year to sign him. He seems to be a franchise player and he's definitely the top college player this year. The only way I could see us getting him or Ralph Sampson would be if we engineered a trade.

The average NBA player



receives a salary of \$425,000 a year. Is the NBA pricing itself out of existence?

It's a case of the players realizing they shouldn't try to kill the golden goose when the collective bargaining agreement comes up for renewal next year. In the next two years, the NBA will be adding four new teams. I think the main problems facing the NBA are drugs and trying to arrange a travel schedule so teams don't burn out from long road trips. I've heard criticism, that by adding an NBA franchise in Miami, players will be more likely to be involved with drugs. I disagree, although when you watch "Miami Vice," seems to be the only crime committed there. The NBA has an excellent drug program and has taken a strong stand against players who are users.

Is it possible to shave points or even throw an NBA game?

I don't see how you could do it. Anybody who watches the game knows any team can overcome a ten point lead in under a minute. Players make so much money already that they have no incentive to throw a game, and there's no way they could get their teammates to assist them.

Can Los Angeles ever be a hockey town?

Yes, but I think you have to be a winner to become a big draw. But, as the Kings get better on the ice, they'll draw better especially when you consider we have a six million population base to draw on. To be quite honest, if the Kings weren't so popular on our Prime Ticket sports network, I'm not sure at present if they

would be profitable.

What do you think the public should understand about professional sports?

They should learn the draft rules. Then they'll know the guidelines under which we have to operate. If they knew more about drafts, salary caps and rules regarding trades, I believe they'd have a greater appreciation of what it takes to run a team. It would be a welcome relief, especially in hockey.

As an owner, what are your strengths and weaknesses?

If I've made a contribution as an owner, it's probably been my absence at key matters involving the teams. (Laughs) It's true, I was- thankfully-talked out of trading James Worthy last summer for two Dallas players. I think my biggest weakness at times is putting my nose into the business. I try to remain calm and not give too much advice to West or (Kings General Manager) Rogie Vachon, which would probably turn out bad.

Why do you think you

Are you worried about the Forum losing concerts to other musical venues in Southern



The top acts always want to play the Forum and they generally do. Often they may play another venue, but that's usually because we're booked with a game or an ice show or something we contracted for a long time ago. We cut a good, favorable deal with music acts. We take a straight percentage of the gross with each concert. It costs a lot of money to open the Forum, so I expect that we wouldn't book a concert unless we thought we could make at least \$25,000. We're making major changes in the Forum for concerts. We're changing the sound system and looking into permanent replay screens for concert acts. The main problem the Forum has is parking. We tried to buy empty lots nearby, but couldn't strike a deal. We're looking into building a double or triple-decker parking lot on our property, though, to alleviate the parking crunch.







A Tale Of Two Cities Hits Interview With Z93's Bob Case

Z93 Program Director Bob Case was born and raised in Seattle, where he worked for KJR-AM and KUBE before moving on to his current post at the First Media station in Atlanta last August. The talented P. D. had

How was the transition from Seattle to Atlanta?

A It's really gone amazingly well. I never dreamed that I would end up any place other than Seattle, my home town. I really thought I'd die there, but Atlanta is a very nice place, the people are super warm and I work for the same company, so there's a lot of common purpose there. I was really transferred, and it's just a great station to work at. Z93 has a long tradition in Atlanta and the South, so that made it instantly great. It's a good place to live. There's a lot to do.

How do the two cities compare?

Atlanta is very fast, very aggressive. This is a spot where people from other cities up and down the East Coast end up. You get a lot of different people from all over the country. It's a huge melting pot and it ends up being very quick. We have the fastest growing county in the nation, so there's a lot of building going on. It's a great place to have a business. There's even more opportunity here than there is in Seattle, and that's a great place for opportunity.

But Seattle is just not as aggressive as far as things that are new, hot and hip. Atlanta is more on the cutting edge.

What about music that works for you in the Atlanta market as opposed to Seattle?

A I think it's pretty similar, the only real difference I see is that Z93 listeners are more quick to catch on to stuff. You only have to play it for them a couple of times and they get it— they either like it or they don't like it. The request lines either light up or they don't. I mean, you can tell in a matter of days whether a record is going to go here or not. It's really fast. In Seattle, it could take weeks to build something. People just didn't react as quickly there as they do here. I think a lot of that has to do with the kind of radio station this is. Z93 is a younger radio station that KUBE was.

Any advice for someone moving from one city to another?

You really have to keep your eyes, ears and mind open to everything around you. You've got to really be able to accept that this is a totally different place and it's brand new

worked in the Northwest for his entire career in radio before moving to the South, where he's been impressed by both the region's fabled hospitality and the competitive broadcast market.

To you. The way they do things

Over the years, we've really

here may not necessarily be the way you're used to, but that's the way they do things, so you've got to get a grasp on that real quick. I would just say read voraciously everything you can get your hands on that has anything to do with the city you're moving to. Watch local TV and read the editorial page of the local paper so you can get a vibe on people's attitudes. You've got to try to warm up to the city as quickly as you can. That's the only way to get a pulse on things.

Were your colleagues a help during the transition?

Oh yes, they were great. It's like everyone works for the Atlanta Welcoming Committee, everybody wants to show you everything. They all want to take you to the hottest club and best restaurant in town. People here get a kick out of showing newcomers around. Southern hospitality is no fallacy. It's the truth. And the people at the station are the best. They've made sure I was comfortable.

Tell us about your morning show.

Over the years, we've really learned how important it is to have a strong morning show. I would put ours up against anything on the air in any city in the U. S. Randy Miller and Mary Glen Lassiter are the two main characters in a large cast that works on our morning show. Every day is a brand-new surprise. When I wake up, I have no idea what we're about to get into. That makes it real exciting. I think they're fantastic.

What's the competitive situation among stations like in Atlanta at present?

Mever a dull moment. It's similar to most major markets today in that there's always action going on and people are quick to react to non-productivity. The minute it isn't working, they don't waste a whole lot of time sitting there being patient. That's the same case here. Everyone is out to catch whomever happens to have the highest ratings. It doesn't matter what the format is or who it is, everybody guns for them, so it's extremely competitive. Since Atlanta is an attractive place for people to end up and live, you've got nothing but great people working here.

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

SPOTLIGHT

DEPARTMENT OF COLLECTION

If It's On Vinyl These Guys Will Take It.

BY HANK BORDOWITZ

"We're like the dumpster of music," says Bob George. "It's more economical to donate records than it is to try and keep them in storage. We're going to have, like, little organ donor cards people can keep on them. Maybe have them shaped like a record. Freeze my liver and send my records."

George is actually kidding about the cards, but only halfway. He is dead serious about getting records. Along with David Wheeler, he runs The ARChive Of Contemporary Music, an organization dedicated, as he put it, "to collecting all popular music from all cultures and all races from 1950. To store it in one place, or many places around the country where people can have access to the information, and access to the actual records."

"There is a great gap," says Wheeler, "in any sort of systematic collecting and preservation of pop music, both domestically and internationally."

For this reason, a little over a year ago, George and Wheeler conceived of the herculean task of setting up an archive containing every pop record from all over the world, a central resource center for all recorded arts.

"We're the best people to do this," George insists. "That may be totally arrogant, but it's also true."

They are both very qualified for the gig. George, in addition to having produced Laurie Anderson's "O Superman" for his 110 Records label, also compiled the enormous volume *Volume*, an exhaustive tome of new wave discographies. Wheeler has a Masters degree in Library Sciences. Both are very determined to make this thing work. They are about a year and a half into a three-year set-up plan.

"It's sort of a Russian three-year plan," quips George. "It might take anywhere from six to twenty years."

The first year of the plan involved getting the word out about the Archives. The next step is to get funding for this undertaking.

"Basically," George says, "we're trying to get a dollar for each record, make sure we have enough money to move into a public space where anybody could come in, listen to records, look at videos—there'd be a film theater—go through photos, research music for soundtracks. We hope to make it totally open to the public, except that everything has to stay in house."

One thing they don't anticipate too much of a shortage on is the actual records. Already in their collection, stored in several container cars in Massechusetts, are well over 100,000 albums, the gift of one collector.


"We find that a lot of people do have an

enormous emotional attachment to their collections of records or magazines or memorabilia," Wheeler expounds. "They get to a point where space considerations prevent them from keeping it around, but they can't bring themselves to throw it in the trash, or to scurry it to a collector. This really is ideal for a lot of people. They say, 'Great. I can give you all this stuff, I know it has a good home, and if I ever do want to listen to any of it again, I know where to come.' And in addition, they get a tax deduction."

Beyond this, they are on the mailing lists of most of the record companies. George estimates they recieve twenty albums a day. But even this is not enough.

"Our idea," George says, "is to make sure a lot of the distributors think of us, too. Periodically companies go out of business, or they're not willing to pay for the freight to send back things that didn't sell very well. We want to get things from as many sources as possible. We need every record that comes out."

"For example," Wheeler adds, "We know someone who works at New Music Distribution, and he obviously gets sent a lot of things to consider for distribution that really aren't up his alley at all. He'll usually get this massive glut of things accumulating that's not germain to what he's dealing with.

We got 4-500 records from him. All very, very bizarre stuff. The most recognizable thing, I think, was 'Bowling Balls From Hell,' that compilation of Akron bands."

While the ARChive, per se, is not yet open for business, they already find themselves serving as a recource center, a clearing house for any information on popular music.

"We get lots of calls from magazines, from independent writers, from advertising agencies, general interest magazines," George says. "Basically for fact checking, finding out when a certain release came out, who played on what, did Paul Simon really tour with these people. Basic historical information we are able to dispatch pretty quickly."

Recently they went looking for a copy of a record called "Insider Trading" by the VPs, on a request by the BBC. They made over 150 phone calls, but were unable to locate it. "It's one of our few failures," George demures.

"That's a story in and of itself," adds Wheeler, "Trying to find a record that came out of New York City within the last nine months, and granted, it's an obscure item, but calling some of the most knowledgeable people we know, we were not able to find a copy or even the name of the label. That seems to me to be as great a justification for

the need for the ARChive as any. In addition to that, we get a lot of calls that are potentially as frustrating, which we are able to answer, but things you would assume there would be access to. For example, someone like Laverne Baker, who in her day was a relatively big artist. The stuff disappears so fast. There has to be a place where that material can be preserved and found easily."

"We've been getting a lot of calls from *Rolling Stone* magazine," George smiles devilishly. "What we think is funny about that is often we look up the information in a *Rolling Stone* publication."

"Jerry Lieber asked us to locate the sheet music to a '30s or '40s piece of vaudeville music called 'Who Put The Snatch On The Lindbergh Baby," Wheeler recalls another of the odd bits of musical detective work the ARChivists have been requested to do. "Very topical and more than a little bit morbid....."

"And another total failure," adds George. Part of the reason George and Wheeler are so forthcoming about their failures is that there have been so few of them. Yet in this leg of the ARChive's three-year plan, they face one of their toughest chores— not research— but getting up that buck a record they figure it will take to operate the AR-Chive

"We've had no interest whatsoever from the industry," George bemoans his fundraising efforts in corporationland. "Artists are another thing. Artists are very helpful. But not the industry itself. We're rather surprised, too. We're actually willing to do a job that they're unwilling to do. To save their records. Even if they have their own library, you have to have a couple of places. We're a little surprised. Our first year of operation, all of our expenses could be covered by the same amount of money it costs to produce just one LP. We really do need that support and help from the record industry. So far, it hasn't been forthcoming."

Still, there are the small victories. "I was happy to find on the street last night," Wheeler says, "for twenty five cents, 'Jimmy Swaggart's Greatest Hits.' There's a lot of interesting music out there. Interesting for one reason or another."

"There isn't a single most interesting thing," counters George. "It's all amazing."
