NABET Takes On Westwood

The embattled National Association of Employees and Technicians, currently in the midst of a bitter, 13-week strike against NBC, has urged the Federal Trade Commission to investigate Westwood One for the "anti-trust implications" in its recent purchase of NBC's three radio networks.

NABET attorney **Stephen Sturm**, who drafted the letter, told *Hits* (your #1 source for anti-trust strike-busting) that Westwood's acquisition of those networks "is not conducive to competition as it concentrates almost 30% of the network radio marketplace in a single entity, weakening our union's bargaining position." Westwood One, which already owns Westwood Radio Networks and the Mutual Broadcasting System, is second only to ABC in market share.

"I am hoping the FTC has access to further information which would block the sale," Sturm said. "It is our opinion this merger will eliminate most, if not all, non-ABC competition."

A Day In The Life Of

At the very heart of West Hollywood's gaudy Sunset Strip sits Tower Records, the fourth location in a worldwide chain of fifty. This is the store, though, which first put Tower on the map in the eyes of the music industry.

In the early days, it was the destination point for British rockers who first came to this country. Today, rockers frequent the store to see their records displayed. As company founder, President and self-described "benevolent owner" Russ Solomon says, "The record companies make damn sure their records are here." The labels take an active role in marketing their product there, with in-store promotions, autograph signings and publicity events. It is at Tower's Sunset store that new formats are tested for use nationwide.

Before 1970, Tower Records was the home of "Madman Muntz," a pioneer in the car stereo business, who installed a fourtrack predecessor of the eight-track and current cassette system. Muntz employed pretty

girls, who worked the floor with shorts and tank tops. Today, Tower employees wear a different costume, sporting rock 'n' roll tshirts. "We're still raucous, loud and brassy," says Solomon. "Not exactly the Bel Age, but people seem to love it anyway."

Hits takes a look at all the people that do love Tower: the customers who come from all over the world, the personnel whose hearts and souls lie with the music, the artists whose recordings are in the store, and the industry pros who visit to keep their fingers on the pulse of what's happenin'.

Saturday 9:00 A. M.: A dozen customers are already lined up, waiting. "Pee Wee's

Playhouse" is playing on the mounted video monitors throughout the store. Talon Von Tigrin is working in the cassette department. Talon, a committed rocker, is dressed in Cheap Trick t-shirt, Marine Corps jacket with silver metallic epaulets, baggy grey and black camouflage pants, black sash and hardware-laden boots. His long, straight blonde hair hangs down one side of his head and a black ribbon secures a ponytail in the back, topped by a policeman's hat complete with badge. Forty silver bracelets adorn his left arm, spider rings are on his fingers and his eyes are defined with black eyeliner. "We always watch Pee Wee on Saturday morning," he says. "It's the most happenin' thing to do, that is, besides drink coffee. Is this the episode with the fireball? Aw, bummer, it's a repeat."

9:10 A. M.: First customer of the day is 14-year-old Benjie Morpurgo, who approaches the counter. He's going home to Colorado and had to pick up that last-minute Pseudo Echo tape before meeting his dad bright 'n' early at the tennis club. Beverly Hills hairdresser Tom Sims, en route to the salon, is here to get Carly Simon's "Coming Around Again," which was recommended to him by his doctor. He wants to listen to it on his way to work, so he can discuss it with his MD over dinner later that day. A halfdozen shoppers trickle into the store.

10:00 A. M.: Enter Jack Lewis, Marlon Jackson's manager and George Carlin's producer, who has come to do his "homework." He was running late this morning, so he hasn't brought the usual coffee cake for the employees, a tradition of his weekly trips to Tower over the last fifteen years. He confides, "Billboard is a good three weeks behind Tower, so I come here to stay on top of things." Lewis' running repartee has become an institution. He jokes to Talon and his co-worker, cashier Josh Steinberg, "Do you have that soundtrack from a Mexican picture about a hooker called 'La Bimbo?'" Josh cracks up. "Oh yeah," Talon snaps back, "Isn't that Paul Simon backed by Whitney Houston and Anita Baker?" Talon looks toward the door. "David Lee Roth should be by any minute. He comes by all the time on Saturday mornings. He'll come in and say, 'Hey dudes, what's new? What's happenin'? What's bizarre?"

10:30 A. M.: Mom Margaret Hughes and her teenage children, Rhonda, 17, and Keith,

16, are visiting from Texas. "One of my business associates in Dallas knew my kids were really into music and he said Tower was the biggest record store he'd ever seen, so here we are." Rhonda chimes in, "If there was a Tower in Dallas, all my friends and I would be there all the time!" She stares at Talon and whispers, "I'd really love to take that guy's picture." Talon graciously holds still for the snapshot, easily the dozenth he's posed for this week before the whole family is out the door for a tour of nearby stars' homes.

11:00 A. M.: Four pens have disappeared from the counter. "I think the customers take them as souvenirs," observes Josh from behind the register.

11:15 A. M.: The information booth is at the center of the store, where Skip Clary, a seven-year Tower veteran, and Betsey Hester, shift manager, are celebrating the latter's fourth anniversary at the store. "I love music and working with people," she says. "We've got a great crew, with a core of people who've been here more than ten years. There are a lot of perks and celebrities come in all the time. Jon Voight was in the other day, Iggy came in last week and Bruce Springsteen comes in regularly when he's in town. Usually nobody recognizes him because he's in a baseball cap and grubby jeans. He'll hang out in the tape department for fifteen minutes, buy a bunch of oldies and leave. The employees know who he is, though, and he autographs albums for them at the front desk when he signs his American Express draft."

11:30 A. M.: Jack Lewis makes his way to

the information booth and gives Betsey a big hug. The phones are ringing off the wall, so he helps a caller with a question about Arthur Prysock. Lewis knows everything. "Jack did it again!," he says as he replaces the receiver and kisses her good-bye. Betsey comments, "People call up all the time, sing a song off-key and ask. 'Who is it? Do you have it?' We got a lot of people singing the little kid's part on XTC's 'Dear God.' It was really funny." Skip tells a story of a well-known soul singer, who shall remain nameless, who asked him, "What's that song they play at football games?" The man was then directed to Kate Smith's version of "The Star Spangled Banner."

12 Noon: London-born Peter Christian is a regular at Tower, stopping in three or four times a week. He is here to check out new releases. Christian designs sound systems and deejays for fashion shows. He spends over \$150 a week on records at Tower, maintaining a charge account at the store. "I don't like to read the trades or watch MTV," he says. "I like to have a fresh attitude about what's new, so I come here to get that."

1:00 P. M.: Talon's lunch break. Sitting in the stock room, he talks about his job, "I'm a guitarist and singer. I came out from Cleveland to break into the music business. When I applied to work here, my hair was a foot high, totally punked out, and I was dressed in my usual ripped-up jeans and tshirt. We can express ourselves in the way we dress and just be ourselves. Management respects us as individuals. But we all have good attitudes. There's a warm feeling and everyone gets along. It's a no-pressure, fun job and the best part is the co-workers and the customers. Working here gives me an inside look at the politics of the record industry. It's also a great opportunity to hook up with other musicians. Sometimes, we even get offers to do extra work in films or modelling jobs."

1:30 P. M.: Several calls come in to request free passes to that night's taping of a Kiss video which the store has been handing out in a co-promotion with radio station KNAC. Two young kids from Covina excitedly accept the tickets and go over to another counter to fill out an entry blank to win a free bicycle from WEA.

2:15 P. M.: Hector Elizarraras needs assistance. "My girlfriend sent me all the way

from Glendale to get this record, a soundtrack. I saw the movie last night, but I slept through most of it. I guess I was drunk." And he's not too steady today, either. "Was it 'La Bamba?'," asks Betsey. "Yeah, yeah that's it. I gotta get that record. I got a hangover, but I have to keep my girlfriend happy," he says. Betsey hands him the LP, the 389th copy the store has sold that week.

3:30 P. M.: The store is getting crowded with shoppers of every variety. Ron Bailey, 12" singles buyer, says, "Once in a while, we get a real nut. A short guy in his late thirties, dressed like a businessman, came in recently and threw a tantrum when he found out we were out of a certain album. He went over to the stereo console, knocked the tone arm off the record and started rocking the entire unit, screaming at the top of his lungs. Security had to toss him out."

3:45 P. M.: Talon warns a customer about the World Saxophone Quartet tape he's about to purchase. "Don't listen for a prolonged period of time. It'll cause brain damage!" Undeterred, the customer buys the tape. Another customer asks the name of the last Genesis album. Talon and Josh answer in unison, "'Invisible Touch!"" To them, "it's a matter of personal pride to keep on top of things."


4:00 P. M.: A Japanese tour bus has arrived, one of the two or three that will be

stopping here over the weekend. Skip says, "They usually unload about fifty Japanese tourists who ask for extra bags and shoot pictures of themselves in front of the displays." Makoto Takahashi from Kawasaki is visiting L. A. as an escort for a high school students' cultural exchange program. "We have a Tower Records in Yokohama, but when I read about this one in a Japanese magazine, I wanted it to be one of my first places to see here." Takahashi is clutching a large stack of gospel, folk and Christmas music he says he can't find in Japan. "The amount of records here is amazing," he marvels.

4:30 P. M.: The next shift arrives, including Jim Laspesa, a drummer whose bandmembers also happen to be his roommates. All three of them work at Tower. One by one, they moved to Hollywood from Buffalo, where they'd held jobs in indie record stores. "I enjoy this job so much," says Jim, "that I really don't mind making less money. Right now, we're saving up to buy a band car that we can use for moving equipment and getting to rehearsals."

"I don't think anybody really works here for the money," affirms Ned Brown. "There's a lot of camaraderie and the experience of meeting people you couldn't meet anywhere else." Ned hopes to study at Julliard one day. "I've met artists who are

my inspirations, and that helps my drive. I realize my idols are regular people, and it makes my own career goals seem more attainable."

5:30 P. M.: Ron Bailey comes to the back room to pull stock. "I'm working toward becoming a producer," he says. "I come from New Orleans, where the record stores are small. We never saw any industry people, needless to say. Here, I've met VP's of record companies, and I feel comfortable relating to them. When the time's right for me to make a career move, I'll have laid some important groundwork."

5:45 P. M.: Ron, Talon and Judyth Springer, assistant to the singles and 12" buyers. are swapping their favorite celebrity stories. Talon goes first. "Vanity came in with some big six-foot guy. I had a big crush on her and wanted her to autograph my single. She asked if she could touch my hair. I thought she'd just pat it or something, but she ran her fingers all the way up my neck and through my scalp. If looks could kill, that guy would've nailed me."

It's Judyth's tum now. "A great-looking guy came up to the register, and I thought to myself how gorgeous he was for an older gentleman. He bought some stuff, walked over to the tape department, then went to the front door just a few feet from me. I kept staring at him when my friend buzzed me and said, 'Hey, did you see Mel Gibson?' So I said, really loud, 'Mel Gibson? Where!!??' The cute guy looked me right in the eye and smiled and I realized it was him. I just wanted to crawl under the register. He just kept smiling, though. I guess he thought it was really funny."

Ron pipes up with his brush with greatness. "You know that porn star, Kitten Natividad? She was the best. She came right up and brushed against me. Just like a kitten," he sighs. "Oh, and there was the time Robert Plant came in after eating at Spago. He was immediately surrounded by fifteenyear-old boys. We kept saying we were sorry, but he said, 'Are you kidding? I live for this!!"

6:00 P. M.: Talon has disappeared at the other end of the stockroom. He calls out, "Hey, check this out!!" Everyone moves from the office over to the one-way security window where the retail area can be carefully scrutinized. A young couple has found what they think is an isolated corner of the store. "He keeps looking around to see if anyone can see them and then he fondles her," says Talon. Little do the pair suspect that every employee not out on the floor is watching them.

7:30 P. M.: "The Chief" arrives, weatherbeaten, in his forties, with a five-day stubble, greasy dirty blonde hair, beat-up jeans and jean jacket with peace signs and American flag patches, and a guitar strap with no guitar. He looks like a washed-up Don Johnson. Singing along to AC/DC, "The Chief" is jamming around the store, playing air guitar like a frenzied maniac, as other customers stare in disbelief. Import Greenland buyer Chuck laughs, "Sometimes he has drumsticks in his back pocket and beats on the blues records. Once he tried to imitate a Chuck Berry duck-walk. It's a miracle he didn't fall flat on his face! At least he's an improvement on 'The Sniffer.' That pervert kept going after women's skirts. He lasted two days before we threw him out for good. They had to lock the guy up."

7:45 P. M.: A well-groomed, conservative looking man in his forties, who has been eyeing a ponytailed woman close to his age dressed in a tennis outfit, approaches her in the jazz section. Together, they take their purchases to the register and exchange phone numbers in line.

8:30 P. M.: The parking lot in back of Tower is packed. Cars are waiting at both entrances for the next spot, some of them for up to ten minutes. Occasionally, according to security guards (William) "Mack" and Calvin Sherrod, there is an argument, but for the most part, the two gentlemen maintain a watchful eye, directing the

smooth flow of traffic in and out of the lot.

9:45 P. M.: The store is jammed with over a hundred people as the action heats up. For a good number of the customers, this trip to Tower is their Saturday night party. Hardcore rockers decked out in full leather regalia rub elbows with sophistos in expensive evening gowns and formal wear, surf punks, skateboarders, well-to-do tourists and not-so-well-to-do tourists. The browsing is heavy, but sales are brisk, too. The lines at the registers seldom slow down.

11:15 P. M.: A trio of heavily made-up, flashily dressed mini-skirted strippers (or hookers?), one of them in a nearly transparent dress, want to find some "good lovemaking music" they can dance (or strip?) to. Their needs are accomodated by conscientious recommendations from the Tower staff of Luther Vandross, Jody Watley and Kenny G.


Midnight: The Saturday night soiree at Tower is in full swing. The "night freaks," as they are dubbed by Tower personnel, are out in full force, some of them drunk (though not unruly) from their earlier excursions to nightclubs and bars along the Strip.

12:45 P. M.: Dennis Sharpe makes the inevitable announcement: "Tower Records is now closing. Please bring your purchases to the front of the store." People take their time, a few unwilling to heed the request to leave. "Aren't you open 24 hours?," someone inquires.

1:00 A. M.: The last browser still doesn't seem to realize Tower's business day has ended. "Can you tell me where I can find The Beastie Boys?," he asks. C. J. Buscaglia, shift manager, guitarist and one-third of Jim Saspesa's Buffalo band, patiently responds, "They're probably at home right now," hoping he'll get the hint. But the recalcitrant customer is oblivious. Salesperson Jeff Burdette makes the point a bit more strongly. "We're closed. We're really closed. Anyone who wants to stay can grab a broom." The message finally sinks in and the last straggler walks out as the doors shut for the last time on a Saturday that has seen some 2,000 people trek through Tower Records. The end of another day.

Q Is there any difference between the so-called "Hot" and "Power" formats?

A It's just two different names for a radio station. Both are based on similar principles, but they've been adjusted for their local markets.

I think it has more to do with the music make-up than anything else. And what the competitive situation allows each radio station to do. In L. A., for example, there is essentially one competitor for PWR106, and that's KIIS, which is a pretty progressive Top 40 radio station. In New York, there are four competitors that we have to deal with. There are two black radio stations that have that segment of the audience pretty well covered. And there are two Top 40's which are very strong, al-



though they are also the most conservative when it comes to playing new music.

In L. A., Power has been able to go a little faster on music and to go through music a little bit quicker than we do. It takes a long time to get a record going in New York to the point that a Z100 or WPLJ will look at it. We can be out in front of those guys without being too far in front.

Q How do you position your station against Z100 and WPLJ?

A Basically as an alternative to those two. In research we've done, Z100 and PWR95 are perceived as very stale. They play the same music over and over and they don't play anything new. So the marketing line we use is "HOT103, because New York won't stand still for the same old music," We've marketed ourselves as a fresher, more happening version of a Top 40 station.

Q What is the difference between your format and the old disco stations?

A A pretty large difference.



We do know that Van Morrison will make his annual crosscountry outing fairly soon. 



THE OTHER SIDE OF DAN HILL



Dan Hill knows how dangerously close he came to being an answer to a '70s trivia question as in "Who was that strange-looking Canadian dude who co-wrote that song always done at weddings and in real slow elevators called 'Sometimes When We Touch'?" He also sang that mega-hit, which got the affable low-key singer-songwriter a Grammy nomination and royalty checks of close to one million dollars. After a four-year hiatus, he's back with the cleverly-titled Columbia album "Dan Hill" that includes a smash duet with Vonda Sheppard "Can't We Try," a dramatic ballad that won't be sung at weddings unless divorce lawyers are present. Hill has lost over thirty pounds from his hippie days, regained his confidence as an artist and maintained his ability to create music yuppies can relate to without fear of embarrassment.

What's the story behind "Can't We Try"?

I was having a fight with my wife. I left the room and went into

my study and started writing the song. A short time later, my wife entered the room, looked at what I had written and told me she thought a woman's side should be represented. She came up with the lyrics that Vonda sings. The song came together easily from that point, but I wouldn't suggest any aspiring songwriters fight with their lovers in order to get material for a song. The toughest part of the song was finding a singer who could put that passion in the vocal. We were getting down to the wire and an engineer thought of Vonda, who was a backup singer who lived near the studio. I think the song is a success because the pain it portrays any lover can relate to.

"Sometimes When We Touch" was a chart-buster almost a decade ago. What was it like

literally becoming an overnight success back then?

I was 23 at the time and seemed to follow the song around the world on tour as it hit in different countries. I had long hair then and became easily recognizable, which made it harder to be invisible around people to study them for possible songs. I became the star and it was too much for me. It's ironic but in the early '80s when Dan Hill was out of vogue musically I became a very good songwriter I had come full circle. Suddenly I was unknown again yet I had the full knowledge of having been famous, which nearly destroyed my life and career.

During those glory days was there any aspect of fame you indulged too much?

(Shy grin) I had just had a woman I'd been living with for a long time leave me. I felt very inadequate and thought there was something wrong with me. "Sometimes When We Touch" was a sensitive song that became a fantasy symbol for a lot of women. The woman I wanted wouldn't have me and the women who desired me generally didn't want to know me. I could have been replaced by Air Supply or James Taylor or the next chart hitmaker at any time, but I went with the fulfilling of my sexual fantasies. This was ten years ago remember, pre-AIDS, so I had a fun time letting myself go. You burn out quickly not because of

any sense of higher morality. (Playfully shrugs) All studs slow down sometimes.

What response did you get within the industry after your hit was relegated to a musical memory?

I became lumped as a '70s songwriter that people thought was out of touch in the '80s. They wondered where Dan Hill could fit into a new musical scene dominated by The Police and Talking Heads. Other people like Jackson Browne, Carly Simon, James Taylor and Van Morrison also weren't selling records in the

'80s like they had in the previous decade. Nobody wanted to hear me sing my songs like "In Your Eyes." Both George Benson and Jeffrey Osborne recorded the song and it went into the Top Ten on the jazz and adult contemporary charts respectively.

Did you suddenly discover you had an image problem?

Most definitely. I had a persona that I didn't know how to change. It made me work harder. I was more angry than feeling rejected. See, I always thought my singing ability was better than my songwriting ability. What kept me going was the words of encouragement I got from a lot of songwriters in Los Angeles who thought I had a special talent. In the back of my mind I always saw myself returning on the music scene as a singer. I knew I needed to create and record my own hit in order to validate my own ticket on the concert track.

What's the most common mistake amateur songwriters generally make?

They try to sound like somebody else. If you listen to local talent contests that radio sponsors, the music will likely imitate the current hot artist. This year it would be U2. Songwriters need to find their own distinctive style. A strong melody can always overcome weak lyrics. Everyone can hum a tune, but not everyone can sing.

Hits interview

with Darryl Strawberry

During the summer doldrums before the all-star break, when the Mets were 6 1/2 games behind the first-place Cardinals, a brouhaha erupted that threatened to destroy the spirit of the once indomitable 1986 World Champion New York Mets. It began when Darryl Strawberry, their most controversial power-hitter, claimed he had a fever and asked to be removed from the line-up for the second and third games of the June 29 - July 1 three-game series with the Redbirds from St. Loo at Shea.

The Mets won that night without him, but the next day in a New York paper appeared a picture of Darryl in a Queens recording studio rapping his tune "Chocolate Strawberry" into a mike when he was

• Was it worth the trouble you got into making the record? Were you really sick?

A I most definitely was sick. I was committed to doing the recording session. When you make a commitment you have to do it. I felt terrible all day. I was so sick that I wasn't strong enough to help the ball club win, and I thought the best thing to do was sit out.

• Who are your musical influences? sibility of doing a rap record with Kangol Kid and UTFO. I said, sure — fine. They were based in New York, so I was prepared for it because I was playing right here, in New York. We then just put things together and made it happen.

Q Whom do you listen to? Do you like Run-D.M.C.? The Beastie Boys? LL Cool J?

A I kind of like LL Cool J and Run-D.M.C., but you'd never catch me at a Run-D.M.C. concert. I also like Dana Dane.

A I had a lot of influences. It's something I've always wanted to do. I was going to do it with Kurtis Blow, but things just didn't seem to work out. We couldn't get together to do it. I then got involved with some other people, namely this guy from California I went to school with, Ritchie Rich, who was in the rap business. He spoke to me about the pos• Do you have plans to follow up "Chocolate Strawberry" with a video?

A It would be nice. We had talked about it, and somewhere down the line we'll work it out. I'm quite sure it would be very exciting for me to do a video after the release of the record. I'm anxious to do that if it comes around. supposed to be sick. The result of this seemingly innocent photo was a backlash of criticism from his teammates, especially Lee Mazzilli and Wally Backman who both felt he let the club down by not playing.

Strawberry was hurt by his teammates' remarks and reacted boldly. "Where would this team be without me? So I miss a couple of games. These guys are asses. When I'm gone from here, they'll wonder why I left," he said.

Hits Magazine hit the field to elicit the "Strawberry Statement" from the Straw Man himself and to find out more about his moonlighting in the record biz.

O Do you have plans for music after baseball?

A No, not really [laughs]. I just enjoy music. I like all types. Making the rap record is something I looked forward to doing. Being in the profession that I'm in, you think of other things that you like to do, and cutting a rap record has always been my dream.

0 Do you really want to be traded? Wouldn't you rather stay in New York with all its media exposure?

A Right now, I'm very pleased and satisfied with the way things have calmed down. New York is a great place to play in, with the support behind you. I'm going to continue playing here. I don't really worry about the media; I'm so used to it. I've been in New York for five years now.

0 What do you find to be the difference between New York and California? Would you rather play in your hometown, Los Angeles?

A At this point, I'd prefer being in New York. A lot of things happen here. People in L.A. are more laid-back, whereas people in New York are more outgoing. They like to go and do things. There's a big difference. It's something you have to deal with. Most players on the team that are not from New York find it rough, but it takes time to get used to. Everything else comes around once you make those adjustments.

0 Do you think the Mets can win this thing?

A We have a great chance as good as anyone else's. Right now, we're not going to look ahead to the World Series. You have to be very patient until that happens. When that time comes, if it happens and you're in the World Series, it's exciting to be there, you enjoy it and make the best of it. After all, the goal is to make the World Series. I've been in the majors now for five years, and I've already played in my first World Series. Some guys spend 10 years without ever reaching the World Series - some spend an entire career. Hopefully, we'll get back there. It's just a matter of time.
