pany has offered \$14.25 a share for Wherehouse stock, but analysts expect that bid will go higher. Wherehouse, headed by Louis Kwiker, had no official comment at presstime. Shamrock has already purchased 6.7% of the company's total common shares in the open market.

#### **More on CBS**

The long awaited Oct. 14 meeting of the CBS Board Of Directors to decide if the CBS Records Group will be sold to Sony, has ended with a firm "no decision." According to a CBS spokesman, "CBS .... is continuing to explore alternative ways to maximize the short and the long term shareholder values in its record operations." Meanwhile a report in the Wall Street Journal stated CBS Chairman Laurence Tisch favors spinning off all or part of the company, rather than selling it to Sony.

### **George & George Make Their Mark**

It was a good week at radio for people named George.

Granted, the name alone did little for the pair of Georges who made an allout assault on radio this week—the music had a lot to do with it.

Our first George is Columbia's **George Michael**, whose "Faith" single racked up the most adds and impressive call letters during its first week at Top 40.

"It's looking great," said Columbia's Vice President of Promotion **Marc Benesch**. "It's strong across the board, in every market."

Benesch isn't exaggerating. This week "Faith" flies at (among numerous others) Z100, B94, KHTR, Q105, B104, WCZY, WLOL, WKSE, KDWB, KWK, KATD, PWR106, Y108, and

"'I Want Your Sex' broadened George Michael's audience," Benesch noted. "It wasn't just a teen record, it was a 25+ female record also. Now he's coming with this song that has a great groove—it sends a great message. Add to that a stunning album, a world tour, and the impact

of this single, and George Michael's solo career will reach new heights."

And then there's the other George. This week **George Harrison**'s first single in five years, "Got My Mind Set On You," makes its presence felt at such outlets as (among others): Z93, 94Q, KDWB, WMMS, KWK, WNCI, WKSS, WTIC, KSAQ, Y107, WROQ, 99DTX, PRO-FM, KPLZ & PWR 99.7.

"Stations in every region are hitting the record," said Warner Bros National Promotion Director Stu Cohen. "What happened was that people were pleasantly surprised by the record - it's uplifting, it's uptempo, it's a fun record. Obviously George is back having fun making music, and that's reflected in the adds."

Cohen attributes some of the excitement to the former Beatles' five year lay-off, but says the real reason is simple: "It all comes down to whether the song is good or not, and that's what people are responding to. I've had good phones out of Atlanta and a number of smaller markets where the song was played over the weekend. People are happy to have a Beatle back on the radio, and they're excited that it's good, fun music."

Next week, we expect the George phenomena to continue with hot product from George Bush, Nelson George, George "Sparky" Anderson, a tribute to Lake George and of course, George Jessel's Greatest Hits.

### Hank, Randy Rule

WB's Randy Travis and Hank Williams Jr. were the big winners at this year's Country Music Association Awards, nationally broadcast on CBS last Monday.

The show was quick, precise and entertaining, unlike many of the "mainstream" award shows which seem to run endlessly with tons of pomp and drivel (Editor's Note: Sorry, we got carried away).

Travis took the most honors (four) by copping statuettes for Best Single, Best Album, Best Male Vocalist and Best Song. MCA's Reba McEntire took Best Female Vocalist, while RCA's The Judds won for Best Vocal Group. Ricky Skaggs & Sharon White took Best Vocal Duo honors, and Holly Dunn won the prestigious Horizon Award for best newcomer.

The irrepressible Williams won his first Entertainer of The Year Award after 15 gold and three platinum records. Williams, who has changed his lowdown ways when it comes to showing respect for the Nashville music establishment and has finally been embraced by the very close-knit town, also won in the Best Music Video category.

#### Hoosiers, Platoon Yanked

A federal appeals court in S.F. has blocked videocassette distribution of both Hoosiers and Platoon by HBO. The ruling prevents the company from distributing the two films for home video and orders HBO to try to retrieve all unsold copies from retailers. The suit was filed by Vestron which claims it acquired home video rights to the two films directly from Hemdale before either movie was released theatrically. #### **Bruce Takes The Lead**

ONE BY A MILE: Initial sales on the new Bruce Springsteen package (Columbia) featuring the hot single "Brilliant Disguise" have placed it in the #1 position nationally. The album is not holding the #1 position at all accounts, but where it is strong—it is super strong. Many retailers feel that the initial surge will calm down in the next few weeks and bring the album back to the solid, tightly-packed field in the Top Five. But for now, the album is selling at a clip far exceeding the powerful likes of Michael Jackson **Dancing** (Epic), Dirty (RCA), Whitesnake (Geffen) and Pink Flovd (Columbia).

THANK HEAVEN FOR LITTLE GIRLS: Speaking of big records, none in a long time has been quite as big as Tiffany's "I Think We're Alone Now" (MCA). The single has consistently scored with giant requests (the highest ever reported to this magazine) and big single sales as it soars to the top of the national chart, but now the story is beginning on the album side as well. We look for the continuing strength of this and future hits from the album to propel it up to and way past gold status..... And don't forget Debbie Gibson! Her debut Atlantic release has now yielded its second straight major hit single as "Shake Your Love" is following in the Top Five footsteps of "Only In My Dreams."..... It has been a long time since teen stars have been happening in the business (Leif Garrett is the one that comes to mind). And the reason for the

instant acceptance of these two teenaged killers has a lot to do with the climate at Top 40 radio. While programmers voice a desire for the 25+ demos, their research remains attuned to the active singles buying and request line calling audience. And, it is this audience that is rocketing dance ditties up the charts enabling these youngsters to quickly establish themselves as forces in the business. Marketing campaigns by their labels (as well as the actual depth of the artists in question) will help determine how far these two will go, but the opportunity exists for breakthrough youngsters to add their claims for fame.

SHORT TAKES: The new Alabama "Greatest Hits" package should be a longterm quality seller for RCA and a hot Christmas item. Whodini on Arista is hot, as expected..... Fleetwood Mac (WB) is resurging behind the current hit single..... New Or-CD (Owest/WB), featuring 11 tracks not on the album, is a hot seller..... Belinda Carlisle's album (MCA), with a very hot single leading, is scoring well first its week availability.....

Mike Bone has the reputation of being a helluva nice guy. After we finished chatting, he invited me to a roof party he was throwing for his new team at Chrysalis, their family, friends from Elektra, WEA, old bosses, and a stray music journalist (trust me to find a party). What a blast!

As one of the youngest heads of a major record company, Bone is remarkably unaffected in a sport shirt, Levi's and boots. He lives simply, claiming that he has a real nice car, an apartment that is certainly high rent, but in Soho rather than Sutton Place. He concedes that it's a toss-up whether to use the car or the subway each morning.

Mike Bone is also known as a hard-rock fan. Certainly when he was with Elektra he was integral in breaking acts like Mötley Criie, Dokken and Metallica, selling millions of records in an area that many record bizzers regard with distaste. But this is where he comes from. His first job in the music business had the 16-year-old Bone managing a high school rock band in Macon, GA, called the Celtics whose lead vocalist was Atlanta Rhythm Section singer Ronnie Hammond. Bone worked for a southern concert promoter in the early '70s, then for a booking agent that sent him on the road with Hydra, then managed a club, doing the ads and taking care of the money. His first job in the record industry was with a small label run by a major pornographer that folded when the owner was thrown in jail. About that time, he got a call from Cliff Burnstein, then an album-radio promoter for Mercury, to work there before moving on to international artist development. "At the time," he says, "all of our European artists hated Mercury Records. So anytime 10CC would say, 'Fuck it, we're not going to give them another record,' they put me on an airplane."

He then formed Mikes' Management with Mike Lembo, but that area moved too slowly for him, so he took a promotion position at Arista, then segued to Elektra, where he was Sr. VP, Marketing and Promotion, before being named President of Chrysalis Records.

- Q You've said that you were nominally in charge of the day-to-day operations at Elektra. How does that compare to your situation at Chrysalis?
- A I'm definitely more in charge here. I have finance, A&R and business affairs, which I was never in charge of at Elektra and it has definitely been a learning process for me.

Fortunately, I have very good people here, in the form of Jeff Aldrich running the

- A&R department, Paul Huchinson running the financial side of it, and Adam Ritholtz running business affairs. It makes it a lot easier when you have good people already in position who know what they're doing.
- At Elektra you developed a reputation for promoting the hell out of the heavier bands, being able to break Metallica and Dokken while establishing Mötley Crüe as a platinum act.
- A I sincerely believe that this

new Dokken album should make two million easy. Chocolate cake, to paraphrase Dave Urso. We were very successful in our marketing of hard rock and heavy metal over there. We signed the right acts and they had the right booking agency. When you have all the elements working for you, your chances for success are dramatically improved, as opposed to when any one of the key elements is missing, then you are pretty much behind the eight-ball. We had all the elements working with our hard-rock bands over there.

I'm looking forward to doing basically the same thing over here, once we get into the position to sign a new metal group. We'll be looking for the total package and we'll go from there. We have two heavy metal acts here, Armored Saint and Vinnie Vincent, which I believe are going to be successful projects for us. Armored Saint is managed by Ron Rainie while George Seward, who is also involved with the touring side of Billy Idol, manages Vinnie Vincent.

Billy Idol is a very strange animal, because he is not offensive to the hard-rock market, yet he is also supported by the new wavers, the modern rockers — because of his Generation X ties. In addition, he is also palatable to Top 40 radio. He covers a lot of bases at the same time, which is good. I think that Billy's potential is vast.

Q How are you adjusting to your new job?

A It's taken me a while to learn all the staff, but I spend a lot of time out on the two floors here checking out who's doing what and just talking to people and spending as much time as I can in the office.

We are distributed by CBS, one of the two great distribution companies in America. I'm spending a great deal of time learning the CBS style, which is a different style than WEA, and the CBS personnel.... going out and meeting the branch staff, as well as the marketers in the field, and spending time in the home office. It's different and I don't know what button to push to get things done, but it's a learning process, and fortunately, I have a guy that does know the system, named Chris Tobey, Sr. Director of Marketing. He knows all of these people, knows how to get things done, and he's been a big help to me in learning who does what where. Distribution is a big part of the puzzle.

- Q How does it differ from the WEA system?
- A I just don't know the people. They have different systems, different ways of dealing records, different shipping points. It's just a different system. The CBS system seems to be more structured, though this is after only having been here six weeks. There's a



real machine-like way of doing things; everything is preplanned and things are scheduled two months in advance. Then, once everything is in hand, there's a process you go through in order to get a record solicited and shipped, which is just different.

At Elektra, we were about 18-20% of WEA's billing. Chrysalis is nowhere near that percent of CBS' billing. At Elektra, we were owned by the same company, while at Chrysalis, we're a distributed label.

Q Chrysalis seems to release less records than you did at Elektra.

have two singles in the Top 10, so it's a matter of how people perceive the label. There are things going on here. We are breaking new talent. I'm told that in the six weeks that I have been here it is the first time the label has had new artist singles in the Top 20 in three years, and it's certainly the first time in three and a half years that they've had a single by a new artist in the Top 10. So things are beginning to happen. They're on the singles chart, though, and I'm used to being on the album chart.

So it's a start. We're building here. We're in very much a building phase. All I can say to

A Well, I think that's a matter of perception. Huey Lewis has a top five single as we speak while Living In A Box, a single by a new artist, went Top 20. Jellybean, with Lisa Fiorillo, went Top 10. Go West was being played by over 150 stations at one point. In R&R that's called a breaker. I know this is Hits, and Dennis and Lenny don't like to use that terminology, but, hey, they're the number one source for whatever.....

We have two singles by new artists in the top 20, and we'll

the readers of Hits Magazine is watch what happens to Jethro Tull. Watch what happens with Paul Carrack and what happens to watch Icehouse. I think that those three, along with other projects we have up our sleeves, like Bonnie Hayes, are going to show some real honest-to-god artist development here. You're going to see some album-selling artists come out of the shoot and do some significant numbers.

Q Have you found anything

here that you're not happy about?

A There are a couple of things that we are changing and have changed. There has been a tendency in the past I call "In Search Of Excellence." People have a tendency to continue to go after that last 1%, and in doing so, be it in recording, remixing, marketing, promotion, whatever, they will spend an inordinate amount of dollars. When you have 99% of it, take that and go to the bank. Don't spend on the remaining 1% as much as you spent on the first 99%. So that was one thing, to bring a little financial reality into the situation here. The other side of it was that people had a tendency to worry about, "Well, it's not in the budget." Plainly put, if a record is breaking, and by breaking, I don't mean just airplay, I mean it's getting ariplay, it's getting phones, people are talking about it, and most important, it's selling, I don't give a shit what the budget says. I'm interested in breaking an artist, particularly a new artist, someone who has the potential to break big and do well for a number of years. One of the things I learned from Bob Krasnow, God bless him, was fuck the budget. If you're breaking the artist, break the artist.

Q How did Elektra react to losing you?

A Bob Krasnow was a total

mensch. I was under contract there for two more years, but he always said that if I got a good offer, and I really wanted to take it, he would never stand in my way. He was a stand-up guy and a man of his word. And I love him forever for letting me do it.

I think they're taking it very well. The Mötley Crüe album is over two million, the Cars album shipped 600,000 and was on some ungodly number of stations out of the box. They're doing really great, and I wish them all well. I love those people over there. I hired many of the people that work there, and a lot of my heart is still there. I work for Chrysalis Records. I come in at 9:30 and I leave here at 8 at night. This is where all my efforts are going, but you don't just walk away from five years of your life. Those people were a big influence on my life, maybe I was a big influence on their lives, too.

Q Chrysalis' roster includes a great many Top 40 acts, and yet your specialty has always been album radio artists.

A This label does fifty million a year with a lot of pop acts. To me that is not an insignificant amount of money. It's about ten million a year more than we were doing at Elektra when I got there four or five years ago. For instance, I've known Huey Lewis for 10 or 15 years. He was in a band I worked with on Phonogram

called Clover that I ran through North and South Carolina with in the back of a Chevrolet station wagon. Here's a great pop act. I don't have any problem with pop acts like that. Our promotion department at Chrysalis has the ability to put little records with big holes in them on Top 40 radio stations. They do it really well.

My reputation may be in the rock 'n' roll area, but I don't plan on taking this label down the hard-rock path. I'm looking for one great hard-rock band. When we sign them, and break them, then I'll sign another one. After that, I don't think a label this size can afford to sign five or ten or make a label deal and diffuse our efforts. This is a small staff here. We have to have one hardrock act that we all believe in, that we can go after and break. It may take me six months or a year to find the right band, but I'll find them. I'm out there working now. Anybody who has a great hard-rock group, with a great live act, great songs, great management, and a great booking agency, looking for a great label, give me a call.

About a week ago, around six o'clock, I got onto an airplane for upstate New York, to go and see a band, just totally unannounced, because I heard a tape that I liked. Week after next, on my way back from California, I'm stopping off in the midwest to see another band, I'm looking, But in the meantime, I have Icehouse, who are going to have a huge hit single called "Crazy." I have Paul Carrack, who has four singles on his album. I have Jethro Tull who have their first good album in 3-5 years, and who are going to go on tour for the first time in years. With Lynyrd Skynyrd and the Grateful Dead happenout to L'Amour (a heavy metal club in Oueens) by themselves. I'm probably the only one who could find his way out there blindfolded.

In the meantime, I have a fifty million dollar record company to run, and find a heavy metal band or not, next fiscal year I'd like to take this company to sixty million. I think we have some talent, already on the roster, with records already in the can, that we can break, and that's the

ing right now, I think if this record is as good as I think it is, we may be looking at a million units and there are 21 more albums in the catalog. God only knows how many of those we'll sell. My search for a hard-rock or heavy metal band is extra-curricular activity, but I do it because I like doing it. And I do it in conjunction with all my A&R people, with John Carter, Jeff Aldrich and Kate Hyman. We're all looking, we all go and see bands. I'd like to take a poll of record company presidents in New York and see who knows how to drive

whole thing. Everybody's saying The Waterboys could be the next U2. From their lips to God's ear. World Party's another one. I think World Party has a very bright future. If the next World Party album doesn't go Gold, I think Karl Wallinger should come in here and kick my fuckin' ass! And he probably will.

• How did you get this job?

A It all came about when I insulted Chris Wright at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Dinner this year. Daniel Glass had told everyone he was getting out of the record business because he didn't like the pressure, so I walked by the Chrysalis table and I said, "Daniel, congratulations on your freedom." Meaning freedom fron the pressures of the record business. Chris Wright, sitting at the table gave me this look like "how dare you?"

I saw Daniel a couple of days later and I said, "I think Chris Wright misunderstood me." And he goes, "Boy, did he ever." So I wrote Chris a note, and I said, "Look, here's what I meant."

He called me in February, he said, "Look I got your letter and thanks for writing. By the way, I'm coming to New York, would you like to have breakfast?" I said sure, went to breakfast, met Doug D'Arcy, one thing led to another, and here I am, President of Chrysalis Records.

It's been great. So far, I'm having a ball. I'm working a lot of hours, but the label has already set some new benchmarks of success. Rome wasn't built in a day, and we have nothing but time. We're going to make some mistakes, we're humans, but at the same time we're going to break some new acts here and we're going to make history here. Just like we made history at Elektra, we're going to make history at Chrysalis.

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# The Critical Condition by Roy Trakin

Build 'em up and knock 'em down. That pretty well describes the way today's entertainment writers work, when they aren't lifting press release quotes for mindless filler. These critical attacks take the form of, the bigger they are, the harder they fall, with a special emphasis on big-name superstars like Michael Jackson, Mick Jagger, Prince, Madonna and Bruce Springsteen, among others.

Of course, this tendency of the press to roast personalities instead of dealing with their work is nothing new, but it has reached a feverish pitch in this post-Watergate era of investigative reporting and soft *USA Today*-styled journalism. Take Michael Jackson-Rather than analyze his new album, "Bad," critics have taken to concentrating on everything from Michael's new face to his belt buckles to his "Elephant Man" fascination to his pet chimp. While his press reps try in vain to guide reporters in the direction of the LP's out-of-the-box success, the angle continues to be Jackson's idiosyncracies.

Obviously, the reason most people are speculating about what Michael is really like is because the superstar hasn't granted a one-on-one interview since "Thriller" came out almost five years ago. Whenever a performer isolates himself from the press, that individual invites all sorts of scurrilous rumor-mongering. And don't think Michael doesn't know the value of good PR; witness how his invitation to most of the nation's leading record retailers to preview "Bad" at his Encino mansion resulted in a pre-order of more than 2.5 million. Similarly, if Michael wants to shift the emphasis from his face to his album, he's gonna have to talk, sooner or later.

The same thing has happened to such superstars as Prince and Madonna, too. The more Top 40 embraces these artists and spreads their appeal to an avid teen following, the more the "serious" press chips away at their credibility. Of course, it didn't help that the duo starred in turkeys like "Under A Cherry Moon" and "Who's That Girl," respectively. Pundits were lying in wait for the opportunity to pounce at the first sign of vulnerability. Both Prince and Madonna have lately taken to the offensive with the press to show they are just "regular folk," hoping to build likability at the same time as they sacrifice mystique.

There are any number of ways to ensure a favorable reception for superstar product. One is to do something completely unexpected. Even the most passionate "Bad" supporter will admit there are a number of similarities between the new album and "Thriller." That's not necessarily a bad thing.... you don't stray too far from what it was that sold you 34 million plus albums, that's for sure. But, lacking anything new from the Jackson camp in the way of quotable quotes, we have only interviews with manager Frank DiLeo and a record that sounds much like the last one (which still isn't anything to carp about). Result? Critical backlash, but another mega-platinum success story. As big as "Thriller?" That seems to be the \$64,000 question, one prompted by the public's insatiable desire for more, bigger, better, grander. No wonder Michael's gone into hiding.

Perhaps Mick Jagger should try the same. Always a master press manipulator, the once and hopefully future Stone has over two decades of experience in disarming his critics. And this time was no different. By talking to a number of important writers on both coasts, Jagger managed to get begruding acceptance for his second solo effort, "Primitive Cool," as many writers compared it favorably to his first, "She's The Boss." Still, most rock crit types will be holding the LP up, not just to Mick's solo output, but to the records of his band, the Rolling Stones, clearly a no-win situation for Mick. One can probably judge the harshness of each review by how much the reviewer feels betrayed by the Stones going on hiatus while individual members pursue their solo muses. Just as Paul McCartney has never been able to overcome the expectations of being an ex-Beatle, these pieces end up serving as Rorschach tests which tell us more about their authors than what they're writing on. We'll have to wait and see how George Harrison's first album in more than five years

fares, but the Quiet Beatle has gotten off his dark horse to make sure the media knows he's still around.

The final case is critical darling Bruce Springsteen, who effectively circumvented expectations in the wake of the multiplatinum "Born in the U. S. A." by going personal and intimate on the new "Tunnel of Love." Confounding expectations is almost always a guarantee of press accolades, though that certainly hasn't always been the case. Artistic departures like Stravinsky's "Rites of Spring," the Stones' "Exile on Main Street," Sly and the Family Stone's "There's A Riot Going On" and even "Sergeant Pepper" were not universally wellreceived by critics upon their initial release, only to grow over time into classics. On the other hand, if you change your image/sound/aesthetic too often, you run the risk of David Bowie, who cried wolf just a few times too many to maintain his audience's devotion. Still, despite that recent report of his cheapness as an employer in a British weekly, the Boss' faithful looks like it will follow him wherever he leads, even as he reduces his accessibility to a press corps starved for superstar info.

Reporters like to view themselves as at least partially responsible for the success experienced by the stars they cover. It is more fun to build up a newcomer, and concurrently, knock down a superstar, than to write a predictable puff or pan. Fans as well as critics don't particularly like it when a cult artist they've championed breaks through to a mass audience. There is always the suspicion the artist has sold out what made them so special in the first place. That's where the so-called sophomore or second album jinx comes in.

The danger of this kind of sensationalized writing has become even more apparent in the political arena, where such foibles as Gary Hart's womanizing, Joe Biden's plagiarizing, Jesse Jackson's vocabulary and Pat Robertson's pre-marital sex take their place alongside Michael Jackson's spelling and Bruce Springsteen's employment practices as headlines which obscure the real issues. Still, if the likes of Michael Jackson and Bruce Springsteen continue to embargo the working press, then they leave us no recourse. We'll have to make it up.....



# Two-Fisted, Guitar-Totin, Southern Brothers

One of the most fascinating elements of the Elvis Presley legend was his alleged longing for his twin brother Jesse who died at birth while he lived. There is a special bond between Southern brothers — even when they are lost forever. It's part geography, part cultural — an emotional commitment that transcends family and touches on the mythic.

They stomp the hell out of each other growing up, but will team up ruthlessly on anyone else who tries. Those gritty Southern roadhouses double as music schools where these good ole boys get a no-nonsense introduction to their roots. Their music is uniquely Southern — a mix of rural rock and roll, black blues and blue-collar confusion.

They dare each other and double-dare the world— living, playing and sometimes dying with the same reckless abandon. Their primary means of communication is music. In the beginning, it is often what brings them together; but it can also tear them apart. Finally, though it is the music that bonds them and strengthens the blood tie.

It is impossible to imagine the intensity of the hormonal collision a pair of Presleys would have started in the wriggling young girls and duck-tailed boys of the '50s. Music has gone through many transformations during the last thirty-odd years, but the basic elements of recklessness and smoldering sexuality have remained. Many of Elvis' heirs are also Southern boys who rock hard, sing the blues like they know what it means, and live the legend to the max.

The very first supergroup was actually two brothers with choirboy harmonies, Kentucky roots and rock sensibilities. Don and Phil Everly rocketed to stardom in 1957 with "Bye Bye Love," and rode that success hard until Phil told stunned fans at Knott's Berry Farm on July 14, 1973, "It's over, I quit. I'm tired of being an Everly Brother." With that bitter statement, he walked away and left his brother alone on stage for the first time ever.


Ten long years passed before a simple long distance phone call from Phil to Don put the past behind them and paved the way for a family reunion. Their comeback appearance at Prince Albert Hall in London generated 60,000 requests for tickets to the 12,000 seat auditorium. Voices and roots intact, those trademark black acoustic guitars ringing, the Everly Brothers sung themselves back to where they belonged, on stage with each other, where they began nearly 40 years ago, little baby boys playing with their parents Ike and Margaret Everly on their radio show.

These days, the two choirboys have the look of survivors — a little worn, but not too much worse for wear. While there can be no return to the trailblazing they did in the '50s, they don't fall back on nostalgia, either. And, those family vocal chords never fail them.

If the young Everly Brothers started performing together as children, Duane and Gregg Allman weren't getting along quite so well. Gregg remembers, "Me and my brother used to go at it every day, until we started playing. A week before we started playing really good, I just brutally kicked his ass — I mean but good. All my life, he had whupped up on me. After the playing, we became friends. It wasn't like we were brothers anymore, because brothers aren't someone you have to get along with. You've got to get along with the people in the band."

Loving somebody doesn't have much to do with getting along, and Gregg Allman loved Duane — he calls him a "natural" on the guitar. "My brother learned to play the guitar in a week. I don't mean just a little playing, either. Every day I'd come home



from school and he'd be in his room — playing. You knew exactly where to find him every day for a year. If he wasn't asleep or in the bathroom, he was sitting on the bed with the guitar."

There grew to be an intense sibling rivalry between the two. "I had to change instruments because of that. In the beginning, I was the lead guitar player while Duane was the rhythm and he sang. He couldn't touch me playing guitar at first, but that changed real quick. He left town to play because I was still going to school and could only play on weekends and that wasn't enough for him. About that time is when I started singing."

The approval of his older brother was important to Gregg. "I wrote six or seven hundred songs and they were awful. I finally wrote a song called 'Melissa' and still, I couldn't tell. I threw all the other songs away, and I only kept this one because my brother said something about it. His opinions were real short, but real potent. He said he liked it. Actually, it was his favorite song of mine. When he died, we were cutting the 'Eat A Peach' album and I decided to put that song on it. That was the first song I ever kept and that was in 1967."

The 20 years since that song has been a full circle for Gregg. If, in the fifteen years since Duane's death, Gregg has not found a way to replace his brother, in 1987, he has found himself. He has survived several deaths and some messy personal history. His long blond locks intact, boyish figure very obvious in lean jeans and a tee-shirt, the years of too much of too many kinds of excesses seem to have deposited their scars only internally.

"I never set out looking for fame or fortune," he muses, "I only wanted to be a musician. I never thought I'd really make a living at it. But fame brought its set of major problems. Money never changed me — the money bought me some chemicals that changed me."

He resurrected himself recently. The new album, "I'm No Angel," is being termed a comeback, "I don't know exactly where I came back from, but I'm glad I did. This album is working, the next one is almost written and things are good on-stage."

Another pair of good ole southern boys are the Vaughan brothers. Stevie Ray is today's guitar hero, lizard boots on his feet, a feather in his Stetson, a full blown peacock tattooed on his chest and a growing legend to his credit. Jimmie Lee's lead guitar fires up the blues-rock quartet The Fabulous Thunderbirds. He is cool, black leather and spurs on his boots; his tattoos are slyly hidden from the casual observer, includig the hula girls on his legs.

There is no rivalry in these Texas siblings. It is obvious off-stage and on that these two softspoken guitar wizards love each other.

Stevie Ray latched onto his first guitar just because he wanted emulate Jimmie. "I remember it was a guitar he had gotten — it was about 1962, it was a Silvertone. I felt good as soon as I picked it up, but I only picked up in the first place because it was what my brother was doing."

As soon as he could get his hands around the neck, Stevie says, they were playing the blues. "When Jimmie started, he was bringing home Muddy Waters and B.B. King records." His brother adds, "Anything that had a guitar in it. People forget that Jimmy Reed was Top 40 then and you heard whatever was popular on the radio back then. I'd listen to the radio late at night to a station in Dallas called KNOK, and before that we heard it 'cause we grew up in the South. Our daddy was a pipe coverer and we traveled a lot. I went to the first grade in Jackson, MS, and we lived in Louisiana and Arkansas and a bunch of other places. Even before I had a guitar, we were listening to all that stuff. It was just in the street."

Stevie Ray credits his brother with encouraging him to pursue his muse, "Jimmie left home to go on the road when he was 15 and my parents were scared, they thought they were losing him and they tried to influence me heavily not to go, but I wanted to be just like my brother — they were pretty sure we were both goin' to hell."

It's almost odd that two brothers both playing lead guitar don't challenge each other — but they don't. Stevie Ray describes his brother's playing, "He's more to the point than I am, he listens better than I do and as a result, it comes out clearer and more defined. And, if Jimmie Lee Vaughan can't play the blues, they can't be played."

At a recent show on which the two shared billing, Stevie Ray was the universal mischievous younger brother. He came up to the side of the stage during the T-Birds set, had the equipment handler plug him in and let loose with some sweet little licks of his own. On the first note, the usually solemn Jimmie whipped his head around and a grin split his face. Later Jimmie sat on

an equipment box watching Stevie with total concentration until the baby brother came and said "Please come play." As terrific as the show had been before, together the brothers swung into an intensely personal finale that drew squeaks, moans and uncharted notes out of those vintage Stratocasters and wild cheering from the audience which refused to let them offstage. The two hadn't seen much of each other since their touring schedules keep them on opposite ends of the world. With this show, they had a chance to say hello, again.

The Austin club scene is where the Vaughan brothers first found glory and it has become a spawning ground for yet another pair of rockin' siblings. Charlie Sexton is the walking, breathing, guitar-playing proof positive that rock dreams can come true. He wears skin-tight Levis and blue suede shoes; strands of his jet black pompador fall over cheek bones rivaled only by baby brother Wil. Both brothers are boyishly beautiful. Charlie was a certified star on the rise before his 18th birthday with a smash debut album, MTV visibility and hoards of screaming fans his own age and older.

Sibling Wil has been playing around Austin since he was nine, learning by listening to, and here we come full circle, Stevie Ray and Jimmie Vaughan. When he played Los Angeles this year, his brother Charlie joined the 15-year-old on-stage for a good-time romp. The world will see what the teenage Wil has to offer with the release of his debut album in January.

Living out the ass-kicking, beer-drinking, hell-bent-for-leather life in front of the fans and for real was another group of good ole boys with family ties, Lynyrd Skynyrd. In one of rock's tragedies, near Gillsburg, MS, on October 20, 1977, the band's chartered plane went down with 26 members on board. Lead vocalist Ronnie Van Zant died and so did most of the rest of the band. This month, the reformed group hits the trail again. They had come back once before, two years after the crash to perform at the Volunteer Jam V. At that show, "Free Bird," the tribute composition to Duane Allman, became a eulogy for Ronnie as well. Now there is an album out to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the crash — the remaining original members have reunited, with Johnny Van Zant, the youngest Van Zant, taking his brother's place in front of the band for a tour and LP, "Legend." It is an appropriate example of the family feeling which informs these groups and their music.

The legend of Southern Rock lives on, not just with this album, but as long as there are hot-blooded young boys with guitars in their hands and rock dreams in their eyes. And, if they happen to be brothers, the equation is complete.


