George Smokes!

Ginsburg, the Gores, Babbitt and close to one out of every 10 Americans can claim that they have, at one time or another, qualified as smokers.

Well folks, there's a new smoker on the scene, but this one's got nothing to do with those down to seeds and stems again blues. His name is **George Michael** and this week he's got the hottest album in the country.

It's called "Faith," his debut album for CBS, and it's making a huge impact at retail on the heels of a single ("Faith") that's headed straight to #1.

This week the album debuts on the *Hits* (Your #1 Source For Debuts) Top 50 Albums Chart at a whopping #7, a dead-on lock for the Top Five.

Hot first week action includes #1 Musicland, #1 Record & Tape Outlet, #1 Navarre, #1 Tower Sherman Oaks, #1 Pacific Coast, #1 Waxie Maxie, #1 Baker & Taylor, #2 Strawberries, #2 Tower Sunset, #2 Sam Goody East Coast, #3 Pro One Stop,

#3 Apple Tree, #4 Camelot, #4 National Record Mart, #5 Flipside and on and on and on......

Meanwhile single sales for "Faith" continue to skyrocket with #1 reports from Tower Sunset, Sound Warehouse, and Gamco. Among the outlets reporting Top Ten sales on the single: Musicland, Rainbow, Tower National, and Universal.

"Without question George is going to emerge as one of the mega-stars of the 1990's," said an expectedly pleased CBS Records Group President Al Teller. "The initial response to his first solo effort is a big step in that direction.

"We've all been anticipating this kind of reaction," Teller continued. "George has given us a great album. The transition that's occured from the time that the last Wham! album came out to the time of his first solo effort has been handled brilliantly from an artistic point of view — in terms of the single he did with Aretha Franklin as well as 'I Want Your Sex.' He showed the audience how broad and deep his talent truly is.

"George is one of those uniquely talented people whose appeal cuts up and down and across every possible demographic," Teller concluded. "We all share enormous confidence in his future, and we're thrilled to be part of it. I would like to think he is in the great tradition of CBS superstars."

George Michael the solo artist has arrived, and the man is smokin'.

The Gore-y Details Surface

Despite his recent statements to entertainment industry rulers that he was a reluctant participant in the 1985 Senate hearings on rock lyrics, Daily Variety's Henry Schlpper has reported that Presidential hopeful and former dope smoker Senator Albert "Don't bogart that hooter" Gore actually took a very aggressive role in the proceedings.

According to the report, which cited official minutes of the meeting, Gore was one of the first members of the Senate committee to arrive and one of the last to leave.

Furthermore, records show that Gore questioned, "often vigorously and at length," every witness and group of witnesses to come before the panel.

While Gore told a gathering of music and entertainment biz heavies that "he did not ask for" and "was not in favor of" the hearings (he also said the whole proceeding "was not a good idea"), the Congressional Record shows that the Senator thanked and commended Senator John Danforth for calling the hearing.

The record also shows that

Gore took a very hard line against the music industry, chiding some labels as being "really irresponsible in promoting suicide and all the other things we have heard about here."

But the real kicker for the former inhaler of pot fumes came after a Tennessee psychiatrist implied before the committee that a New Jersey teenager who gouged a friend's eyes out before committing suicide, did so because he "followed Black Sabbath and Judas Priest."

"I'm delighted to hear your testimony," said Gore.

know: did she or didn't she? (Editor's Note: Marijuana, Marijuana — Thank You.)



Pop Stars Needed

Many programmers have recently been complaining "under their breath" about a lack of hit records. Exactly what they mean by the lack of hits isn't immediately apparent because, in the words of one key record executive, there are always ten songs in the Top Ten. What there are, are an unlimited number of female appeal hit dance ditties (Pretty Poison, Debbie Gibson, Swing Out Sister, Taylor Dayne, etc.) coupled with limited-play male hard rock winners (Aerosmith, Poison. Def Leppard, Stryper, etc.) and adult-leaning songs (Elton John, Dan Hill, Michael Bolton, etc.) but there are a lack of classic Top 40 mass-appeal middle of the rock hits. To be more specific, Top 40 radio desperately needs fresh new hit product from Hall & Oates. Genesis. Huev Lewis, Chicago, Billy Joel, Michael McDonald and former Eagles Don Henley and Glenn Frey to balance out their lists. It is this music that radio can play during any daypart, which appeals to males and females - young and old — that is lacking.

The album marketplace is heating up this week with lots of interesting new product hitting the street and catching the public's fancy. George Michael's solo album (Columbia) leads the way. It is pulling sensational numbers already at key dealers including a #1 report from powerhouse record mover Musicland — and appears headed straight to the top. The album includes "I Want

Your Sex," and current Top 40 and black smashes "Faith" and "Hard Day." Retailers everywhere are predicting huge sell-through and great longevity here. Also moving well out of the box are George Harrison (WB/Dark Horse), with his hit single leading; Robbie Robertson (Geffen), whose solo album is catching some of the Peter Gabriel (Geffen) and Paul Simon (WB) yuppie magic; Steve Winwood (Island/WB), with a hits package featuring current Top 40 favorite "Valerie"; and Earth, Wind & Fire (Columbia), with their comeback set. Also gaining quickly are INXS (Atlantic), with a hot second week and a big single — "Need You Tonight" - and Tiffany (MCA), which is gaining momentum every week behind her giant hit, "I Think We're Alone Now" and massive television exposure.

Been getting great feedback from last week's item on aggres-**Fourth** Quarter Strategies. It's clear that most labels are planning a fight to the bitter end, with some majors releasing superstar product in December. We hear the new Eurythmics album that RCA is releasing in early December monster.... Kudos Chrysalis' Promo heavy Daniel Glass who "guaranteed" the success of Billy Idol's "Mony Mony" to the label's UK players. As the 45 now plays at the top and the approaches platinum, Glass has followed with hot action for Paul Carrack and Icehouse making a major statement for the label's future!.... EMI U.K. Interna-

LeComber. whose label boasts Whitesnake, Pink Floyd and the Pet Shop Boys among others, was in New York for a meeting with Pet Shop Boys manager Tom Watkins before jetting to Detroit for a presentation of Multi-Platinum to the boys from Floyd and their manager, Steve O'Rourke Back to the topic of Crossovers which we touched on in last week's "On Records" column — once again tlmlng is the key. The label that keys crossover campaign around the giant sales of rock product, will more than likely find itself with a mass appeal monster..... on the subject of Black Crossovers, Reprise is scoring big at Top 40 with Roger. The label struck as the tune was achieving both sales and saturation airplay. Once again, timing is everything..... Is heavy Sam Kalser being wooed to return to the record fold?.... and the beat goes on.

It's hard to believe it has been over 22 years since Cher first burst onto the music scene, along with her then-husband Sonny Bono. After performing in small clubs as Caesar & Cleo, the couple changed their professional names to Sonny and Cher, and scored their first Top Ten hit with their debut single, "Baby Don't Go," back in 1965.

Their second single, the multi-platinum "I Got You Babe," quickly established the duo and their eclectic wardrobe of bell-bottoms, fur vests and love beads as a true sixties phenomenon.

But while the hits ("The Beat Goes On," "What Now My Love") and their joint careers flourished (TV's "The Sonny and Cher Show"), their marriage disintegrated, eventually ending in divorce in 1975. And despite a successful solo career ("Gypsies, Tramps and Thieves," "Half Breed") Cher gradually set her sights on new territories — the movies.

Now in 1987, she has done what few other recording artists have ever done — successfully crossed-over to become a bona-fide movie

star, thanks to her strong performances in such films as "Come Back to the Five and Dime, Jimmy Dean, Jimmy Dean," "Silkwood," "Mask," "The Witches of Eastwick" and her current movie, "Suspect."

Starring as an overworked public defender, Cher insists that the real-life Washington lawyers on which she based her role, "are good-looking women who dress great." Even so, it's hard to imagine any of them looking as stunning as Cher does today at 41. With her long black curly hair framing those famous Cherokee cheekbones and almond eyes, provocatively dressed in a heavily-studded leather jacket, miniskirt and spike heels, Cher is that rare sight — a movie star who looks even better in the flesh than she does on the silver screen.

With her first album in six years also ready for release, Cherily Sarkisian has certainly come a long way from her humble origins in El Centro, California.

Describe your childhood.

It was pretty bizarre. We were very poor, and moved around a lot. Basically it was very unusual. My mother, who is part French, part Cherokee Indian, was married six or seven times — she's a pretty interesting woman, 'cause three of those times were to my father. He's Armenian, and I never met him until I was eleven. There was almost never a man in the house, which is also a little bizarre.

Did it affect you in terms of ambition?

Oh yeah. Quite early on I decided I wanted to be famous, though I wasn't sure how. But I did perfect my autograph at an early age, so I guess I was already preparing (laughs).

What were your early dreams?

I always wanted to act from the time I can remember wanting to do anything. I loved the movies, and I also didn't think I'd be much good at anything else.

So how did you get into the music business?

I started singing by accident. You know, when I first met Sonny, I was already studying acting — I'd been doing it for a few months and that's what I wanted to do. Anyway, Sonny was working for Phil Spector at the time, and I just started as a background singer. Later, we got married and began working as a couple.

Who's idea was "Sonny and Cher"?

That was Sonny's. The whole thing was his idea. He had a real good instinct for things like that.

Do you look back fondly on those days?

Sure, especially the real

early ones, and also the first year of the "Sonny and Cher Show." We had a great time together, though we worked incredibly long hours. We just made better friends and professional partners than marriage partners.

What went wrong with the marriage?

(Laughs) Everything. Basically, we should never have gotten married at all. We should have just worked together and stayed friends, because we had a great working relationship — I think that's what held the marriage together as long as it did. On stage, it was fine. It was the rest that didn't work out.

So why did you get married?

Because in the beginning we were crazy about each other, but our relationship didn't grow along with our careers. It was also that when we met, I was just 16 and he was 28, and he always wanted me to act like I was 16. But as I got older, there was no way I was going to stay that naive and immature.

Was it you that gradually drew away from Sonny?

I would say so, yes.


Are you still friends?

I don't know if you'd call us "friends." I don't know what we are, though I know we're still connected in some strange way. (Pauses) No, I don't think "friends" covers it. I really don't know how I feel about him.

Do you keep in touch?

We talk every once in a while, but there's not much contact now. It depends. We go through stages when we're pretty friendly, and then we're not at all.

Did you know that he's running for mayor of Palm



Springs?

Yeah, and I honestly think he'd make a good mayor. He's very good at dealing with situations and looking at problems and figuring out solutions.


What happened after Sonny and Cher broke up?

The music thing was still very big. I mean, I had my own TV show, and I kept making records as a solo artist. But my goal was to be an actress and get back to my original plan. In fact, doing all the TV variety stuff, like all the sketches and dancing, turned out to be real useful later on. I just wasn't totally fulfilled and happy doing it, though. I got tired of it all, and I wanted to do something

serious — except "serious" gives the connotation that all the other work wasn't. It's more that I'm very serious about my work, but I don't like being called "a serious actress," because I don't think I am.

After your enormous pop success, did you find it hard to be taken seriously as an actress?

You kidding? It took me five years to get a job. No one wanted to give me a chance, no one. I was still working as a singer, and trying to act, and I realized I wasn't going to get anywhere unless I devoted all my time to it. So I said "Screw this," I quit singing, went to New York, and landed a job in about a week.



You made your Broadway debut in "Jimmy Dean." Was it nerve-wracking?

Not at all. I had absolutely nothing to lose because no one expected anything. I was the least nervous of anyone, partly 'cause I'd been onstage all my life and it felt so natural. The other thing was I was ignorant — Broadway then had no meaning for me. I didn't know that if you flopped, it was disastrous. For me, it was just a lot of fun.

Did friends encourage your move into acting?

Yes, but they didn't think I should give up the singing to gamble like that, and they didn't want to see me fall flat

on my face. Even my sister said, "I'm glad you're good, since I was so afraid you wouldn't be."

You've only done a handful of films, but they've all been choice parts. You're pretty particular about taking a role.

Yes, very. I turned down a film before anyone even wanted me. I was in the middle of a screen test with the director, and Terri Garr was helping, and I suddenly thought "I don't wanna do this," and I left. My manager and agent thought I was nuts, but I said, "I'm not gonna get many chances at this, and this director won't let me do what I can do, so it's pointless." So I waited, and then "Jimmy

Dean" came along, and I knew it was right for me.

Did you also wait for "Silkwood"?

No, they picked me. I didn't even read the script, I couldn't have cared less, but I figured if Meryl Streep and Mike Nichols are doing it, it was O.K. And it was. They helped me a lot, because I'm not a technical actor — I never know where I'm meant to be on the set, or where the key light is.

"Mask" was another great role for you.

Yeah, the writer wrote the part with me in mind after seeing me in "Jimmy Dean," but the studio wasn't that thrilled about me. They made me screen test three different scenes, and then jacked me The thought is, around. Universal didn't really want me to make the movie period. Then they thought they might, but with Jane Fonda. So I said, "Fuck you," and disappeared to San Francisco for a week with my boyfriend. Everyone got frantic, of course, but I wanted the part so badly I didn't want to be abused. In the end I got the part, but I hated the director, Peter Bogdonavich. I acted well in spite of him.

Do you often fight with your directors?

If they're assholes, yeah. On "Witches of Eastwick," I didn't get along with George Miller and he made my life miserable before the goddamn movie even started. He made me cry as much if not more than Bogdanovich, and shooting "Witches" was a real pain in the ass. You know, I didn't think it was a great role and I didn't like the film particularly. The only reason I took it was to work with Jack Nicholson. That made it all worthwhile.

What about your new films. Are you pleased with the

results?

Yeah. Working with Peter Yates on "Suspect" was great — he understands actors. We still fought tooth and nail over one particular scene I worked with but he's sensitive and a gentleman. And then there's "Moonstruck" which was directed by Norman Jewison and which comes out next year. I love myself so much in it that it must be a bad omen!

You seem to be pretty tough and demanding.

Hey, you can't afford to be too soft because this business eats its young. A man is admired for being tough, but if you're a woman, you're a bitch. And if you're sweet they walk all over you, so I'd rather be a bitch.

Do you miss the music business?

Not the "business," but for a while I've wanted to get back to my singing, and I've got my first album in six years coming out on Geffen in November. It's called "Cher" and the first single is "I Found Someone." I'm real happy with the album, which was co-produced by Jon Bon Jovi, Peter Asher and Desmond Child, while Jon wrote some of the songs. I've also got people like Bonnie Tyler and Darlene Love singing back-ups, and Steve Lukather from Toto helped out too. I'm also about to do a video, but I haven't danced since the last time I sang, so I'm busting my ass to get back in shape. I don't do drugs, I eat well, and I work out, but this is the worst shape I've been in for years.

What sort of musical direction are you heading in now?

Very rock 'n' roll! I think that's the reason I didn't get on with the Academy too well — I look too bizarre and rock 'n' roll to be serious. But like I said, I'm real serious about my work, but my life is my life, so they can go fuck themselves.





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Morning KAOS at KLOS

An exclusive Hits interview with the drive-time team of Mark & Brian by Mike Murphy

Illinois native Brian Phelps and his partner, Florence, AL-born and raised Mark Thompson joined L. A. album-rock station KLOS as its new morning team from WAP1-95 in Birmingham. Phelps toured with an improvisation comedy group for three years and interned at Q101 in Chicago, where he did voices for the morning show. Thompson knocked around in southeast radio for about 15 years before working with Mark St. John at Y102 in Montgomery, AL. It was St. John who put Phelps and Thompson together for the first time as the morning team at WAP1-95.

- ☑ Tell us about the adjustments you had to make in moving from Birmingham to L. A.
- A Brian Phelps: There has-been a major adjustment in designing the show, but it's the same kind of honest humor that we've always done, kind of a David Letterman style. It is not a produced-sounding show where, if it's Tuesday, it must be time for this character to come in. We don't want it to sound planned or organized. We want the audience to discover along with us bits and ideas for comedy, and then run with that. It's very much an audience participation kind of program.
- What about the differences in going from a Top 40 to an albumrock format?
- A BP: Corning from the Top 40 in Birmingham, we could just do mainstream comedy. We could make fun of the most popular television shows and the most popular Top 40 artists all day long. It's kind of simple. But, when we came here to an albumrock station, we had to readjust our thinking a bit. No longer could we make fun of the El DeBarge's and the Whitney Houston's. The show is not as produced here as it was in Birmingham. We're much looser here. They don't seem to like the more produced kind of stuff here. They prefer it to be real natural.

Mark Thompson: We are not rock 'n' roll disc jockeys and we never have been. And we don't necessarily want them to think we are. We don't care. We've got Bob Coburn and Joe Benson and those fellas know their stuff. Like.

we've learned that you don't speak over Led Zeppelin. Believe it, we learned the hard way.

BP: So we play the rock 'n' roll tunes and when the song is over, Mark and Brian plug themselves in. We do our two-minute thing and we get out and play commercials. In Birmingham, we were all over everything and here we have to honor the rock 'n' roll because people that listen to this station live, love and would kill for their music.

- What was the audience reception like?
- AMT: When we first hit the airwaves, we got nothing but hate mail, hate calls and packages that ticked.

BP: Over a two week period, the thing started to change around. They had to listen to us to understand that we are so tongue-incheek, we don't mean anybody any harm and we make more fun BP: When the negative phone calls started coming in, we put them on the air letting them know that we realize we're jerks and we don't care. We don't care whether you think we're jerks or not. We are jerks and we're here to enter-

tain you in the morning.

A BP: In Birmingham, our show was so audience-oriented people knew they could call us at any time for no good reason. They would even plan an idea for a bit and knew that we would jump on it and play with them. Here they were only used to calling for ticket giveaways. So, we had to open them up with thousand dollar giveaways for tidbits of talent to get them used to calling and participating. Now that that's winding down, we're happy to say that they are still calling with

parently tired of the old stale kind of radio. We were surprised and thankful that there wasn't a Mark & Brian type program out here. By that I mean, again, the honest-humor-Letterman-we'll-try-any-thing-once style of radio. There wasn't anything like that out here. We've brought a new dimension to morning radio in L. A.

MT: That's why we knew we could come here. If we came in doing the same kind of show Dees does, we probably wouldn't be successful because I'm not sure you can beat him at his own game. He's the best at doing that highly-produced smooth kind of show. And obviously we don't do that and don't even want to. We are definitely another alternative to morning entertainment in L. A. radio. We are in competition with Dees and Thomas and we came here to win.

How do you like living in L.

A MT: This city is one of a kind. The climate is the best in the world. I very much like it. The entertainment center is here. You have literally anything you want to do here. If the ground would just stop shaking, it would be perfect. That earthquake scared me to death. I've never been through anything that frightening.

BP: In Alabama, we dealt with tornadoes and hurricanes. The tornadoes are great. You go down to the basement, eat a few canned goods and wait until it's over. With tornadoes, at least you know they're coming. These earthquakes are out of control. We have one more and I'm a contract-breaker!

"Let's Make A Deal":



At the heart of the record industry's growth is the indie distribution deal. Over the past few years, labels like Enigma, Slash, Twin/Tone and Bigtime have served as farm clubs for the majors, providing young, raw talent for corporate distribution pipelines. The history of popular music is wrapped up with small companies from Sun to Stiff, from Stax to Solar, from Motown to Def Jam. The more you hear about these different pacts, the more they sound the same, with their talk of "unique situations" and "two or three tier deals." Hits decided to examine four of these symbiotic arranincluding Enigma/Capitol, Slash/Warner Brothers, Twin/Tone/A & M and Bigtime/RCA.

When you step into the El Segundo, CA offices of Enigma Records, you are taken back by the whirlwind of activity from the dervishes of this five-year-old label. But be careful — you might step in one of Enigma's marketing ideas left by Vanda La Vache the "Movie Star Cow" who backed up The Dead Milkmen during a recent So-Cal appearance.

"We tend to rely more on creative marketing ideas than most," says Rick Orienza, Enigma's former PR Wiz, now Director of Marketing and Promotion. "But most of all, we like to sell records and have good 'clean' fun doing it."

Wesley and William Hein began their moguling as importers, bringing in many artists and labels the majors wouldn't touch. But money wasn't the main concern at this time. The brothers' love of music was. While their friends listened to BTO and Elton John, Wesley and William were thriving on avant-garde punk like Henry Cow, Conrad Schnitzler and Henry Kaiser.

"I guess I liked it because all my friends hated it," Wesley says with a laugh. But when he worked at Music Plus in high school, he saw the actual need to bring in this kind of music first-hand. "During the

great punk explosion of 1978, all the importers suddenly decided it was safe to bring in the new music..... but only from England. That was fine, but there was *still* a market for Henry Kaiser or Conrad Schnitzler records. And seeing that market we went into the import business."

Hein remembers the following year when the punk movement began putting out its own records in the U.S. The majors still wouldn't touch them because they had their own bands to cultivate. "Oh, they were definitely not going to distribute that stuff..... who would? But there we were, with our own goofy little company and we're bringing in Granada Records from Spain and things like that, so of course we're going to distribute anything that's really weird," says Wesley.

said, 'That's nice..... no one will sign us.' We said, 'If we formed a record label, would you sign with us?' They said, 'Yes!,' so we signed them. And that band was..... Mötley Crüe!," Wes pauses for a breath. "Needless to say, four limos later.... I was responsible for Heather Locklear and Tommy Lee! Anyway, that led to Berlin, Ratt, Stryper, Smithereens, Poison, and this interview....."

A few years later, things started speeding up — more signings, more promotions, more fun, less sleep. "We had meetings," Wesley says with a sigh, "with a couple of different labels while many others wouldn't even meet with us when they found out who our artists were."

But a chat with Tom Whalley at Capitol proved different. He didn't ask them for their *Billboard* and *Hits* chart positions or


And soon, the weird came running to them as William and Wesley became distributors. Specializing in U. S. independent product, they carried such proven acts as Black Flag, Circle Jerks, and 45 Grave, among others.

Then they heard about a band with long hair that everybody hated. Naturally the Hein Brothers went down to see them. "We told them we'd like to distribute their record. And they thought that was great because nobody else would touch it. They said they needed promotion, an advance and lots more stuff. We told them, they didn't need a distributor, they needed a record label. They

their market shares. "That's what I liked about Tom," says Wesley. Whalley sums it up simply, "I knew about Enigma's problems with EMI and I also knew from observing Warners and Slash that this kind of distribution deal can work. I let the Hein Brothers function in A&R. They have a rare belief in history and a clear insight. Because of these qualities, they are truly intuitive, visionary A&R men. I think it's important they signed with us because we believe in them and they are wonderful to work with."

Enigma goes through Capitol, but their Restless label is distributed independently. "That gives us two tiers of distribution.

Restless is our more youthful label for developing acts that wouldn't be right for Capitol. But after one year with Capitol, we've seen this company grow, so there must be some correlation," Wes says confidently. "Way before we signed with Capitol, I knew Poison was going to be huge. I couldn't understand how everybody couldn't see that Poison was defining a culture. And you have to be stupid or deaf to hear the Smithereens and not realize the potential there. Through independent distribution, Stryper had sold several hundred thousand copies. It shouldn't take a genius to figure out that if they went through a major, we'd sell more. Then, as we were signing with Capitol, I started getting calls from people we'd had discussions with before — as soon as Stryper went gold that is - or from people I couldn't reach. They said, 'Why didn't you talk to me?' My favorite rebuttal was, 'Because you wouldn't take my calls!""

Things were different in town with Slash. Smaller in size but as amiable as Enigma, they are currently enjoying success with Los Lobos' "La Bamba." In 1981, when they were having their first go-round with the Blasters, Lenny Waronker and Tom Whalley, then at Warner Brothers, became very interested in the group and the label. It wasn't long before Bob Biggs walked into the future and signed a three-party agreement joining Warners, the Blasters and Slash. When the record industry finally began to pull out of its '70s lull, Biggs insists Warners saw Slash as a way of marketing product to a specialized audience and signed them to a deal. "I talked to a lot of people," he said. "But when the excitement died down. Warners was still there because of our work with the Blasters. I think the other labels were just paying us lip service.

"Our deal is pretty complicated," Biggs continues. "At present there are two kinds of deals. We'll sign a band for Slash, which

is then distributed by Warners through the WEA system. Warners has the right to pick up any Slash band and put them on Slash/Warners — which is a licensing deal that pays us a royalty while they do all the promotion. If a group is signed to just Slash, we pay for everything. We start a band's career by keeping them on the road creating a buzz and then, hopefully, Warners picks them up and uses the big muscle."

Biggs knows that Warners has a lot of respect for what he can do. He also knows that can pay off at the top, where he can't compete with WEA's clout, even if Warners acknowledges Biggs' ability to get things started.

Lenny Waronker knows about building from the street. When his father started

depends on the band and the nature of the music. "If there's something special going on somehow it seems to work. And if there's not, then it doesn't. It's that simple and basic."

The general consensus is that independent distribution is a lot better when you are trying to break bands because of its relationships with the mom and pop stores often ignored by the major labels, who are better selling 100,000 Madonna Records in one day to one account then they are in selling 3 or 5,000 to many different individual accounts.

But, while Biggs has never seen the record business so hot, he does confess to missing the "good old days." He still considers it fun to find a young band and work it step-by-step..... until he can get it into the

Liberty Records in the '50s, it left the younger Waronker with a personal interest in indie labels. "Big isn't what we're always looking to do," he says. "When we made the Slash deal, one of the things we were concerned about was making sure they maintained their own identity without getting caught up in a big record company."

What Biggs and many others in the same situation have found out, though, is, once you go through a corporate entity, you must sign bands that are a little more developed because the stakes are considerably higher than they were before.

Waronker agrees but thinks it also

Warner arena. "I think we are going to start another independent label called Punishment Records." Biggs slaps his forehead..... "Maybe I should have a V-8 instead."

Halfway around the record industry world, in Minneapolis, is Twin/Tone, with quite a different arrangement. They have formed a collective of five labels: Twin/Tone, Hoboken's Coyote Records, Wide Angle and Atomic Theory out of Minnesota, and Lost Records out of New York. Because of the particular needs of each label, they use five or six distributors exclusive to each label. Says prexy Paul Stark, "We don't want to put our eggs in one bas-







ket for payment. That's why we've stayed with multiple distributors."

In some cases, though, Twin/Tone acts like a minor league for the big guys. "When we sign these groups we do not intend them to go to the majors, unlike some of our compatriots," he adds, "It is natural that some of our groups become more mainstream as they get older and rather than holding these bands back, we have often helped them get to major labels." Such groups as the Replacements, the Suburbs and now Soul Asylum have gone that route.

What A&M is hoping to do is pick up a minimum of two Twin/Tone acts per year (including Coyote Records) and put them out on the A&M/Twin/Tone Label. Their first joint venture is Chris Stamey, formerly of the dB's. "It is vital," says Karen Glauber, A&M's enthusiastic Director of Special Projects, "that Twin/Tone maintains its own independent status and continues to be our midwest 'scout.' They have access to bands we normally wouldn't."

Glauber is ready for her first project. She will work Stamey through her alternative network which includes some 40 progressive album rock stations, 500 college outlets and 500 trend-retail stores. "I think I could multiply his base over ten times and he could be my superstar!" she says with a giggle. "Of course, no one else at A&M has ever heard of him, but to me he's a superstar."

Says Stark, "I can see signing one or two bands because of the A&M situation, but that's all. We want to stay as we are, even if being in the midwest gives us a definite disadvantage since marketing, publicity and promotion are on the two coasts. If we really wanted to compete with the majors..... we'd move!"

Back in Hollywood via Australia, Bigtime Records brings an international flavor to the indie market. With offices in London and Australia, Bigtime once distributed Enigma and Slash overseas until they became competitors in the U.S. market place. Says Fred Bestall, affable founder and head of the company, "We had the independent side working very well. As the label grew at a certain rate, it didn't take long to realize we had to make a move." The first step was placing the HooDoo Gurus with Elektra.

At that stage Bestall began looking around for a major that needed a label like Bigtime. When Bob Buziak took over at RCA, he made a bee-line for Bestall and Bigtime. "Last year at the New Music Seminar, I met with Bob and we structured a deal."

point, "All of a sudden you've got kids out there who are running retail operations. And they talk to each other. As do the college and alternative radio programmers. They are all looking for something to get excited about. They are just not interested in buying Journey records anymore.

Without massive airplay in this country, Bestall has been forced to concentrate instead on alternative marketing and retail, where his acts have experienced success.

RCA realized that they had to give Bigtime a lot more than just pressing and putting their records out. much airplay, so much money you can spend on an act. It's as though everything has got to be packaged one way, like you're selling soap. For labels like ours, that's not healthy."

These arrangements between majors and the indies fully illustrate Darwin's Survival of the Fittest in a volatile, capital-intensive business. They are like a marriage of convenience for both sides, one that lasts until the thrill is gone.....or, more likely, the money runs out.

The scene in Nancy Wilson's basement is probably not much different than many others around Seattle or the nation, a montage of instruments, cases, wires and other musical paraphernalia, evidence of a band honing their chops for the next gig. The difference is, this band is Heart and their next gig is a worldwide tour of the biggest arenas on the planet. Still, guitarist/singer/writer Wilson, surveying the impromptu work space, observes, "We're a good garage band."

Never mind that most garage bands haven't sold five million copies, reached number one on the charts and produced four hit singles, as Heart's 1985 Capitol label debut did. Never mind that most garage bands haven't released one album, let alone ten, the latest of which is the platinum "Bad Animals." In two years, there may be a break in Heart's non-stop activity. Nancy would like to have a baby, perhaps try some more acting. Her sister, lead singer/co-writer Ann Wilson, wants to make a solo album with an R&B flavor. For now, though, it's full speed ahead for the Wilsons, Howard Leese (guitars, keyboards and background vocals), Mark Andes (bass) and Denny Carmassi (drums).

Q What goals did you set for vever to go out on the road. I the new album?

A We didn't want it to be like "Heart II." We didn't want to imitate ourselves or be predictable. We made an intentional effort to really go in there and do more of our own material and make the album more cohesive from song to song by incorporating the group's live sound more into the production. Our producer, Ron Nevison, had never seen us live before making "Heart." This time, he said, "Now I get it. Now I see what you are." (Laughs).

Q Did you feel the pressure of following up such a massive

think the only good thing about touring is the playing, being on stage for those two hours or so. It just makes the experience worthwhile. It's not that much fun to be carted around like a paper bag. It can be really alienating. You lose track of your own personal life and family. We now have a situation where [the music] is doing so well we want to bring it to people as much as we can. Doing concerts is a chance to get all our frustrations out. There are no sick days. But the energy that goes between the people and players, that's like the best thing you will feel all day (laughs). No matter what

A There is a lot of pressure when you are real popular. There is a certain amount of expectation put on you. I don't see that as a problem. You have to do what you want to for yourself first and make sure you incorporate things that won't upset people.

Q Do those expectations extend to touring?

A You are expected to tour, especially if the album is big. If it's not a successful album, it doesn't pay to go on the road. It's more expensive than

A There were times in the past where we weren't doing that well, that's when I felt the business was leading us and that we didn't have control. When you are having success, that's when you can make choices. You are getting the rewards of your work.

A We'd arrive at a snooty hotel and get looks that could kill from businessmen and others in their leisure suits. We started to call ourselves the "riff-raff," as in, "what is this riff-raff doing in this hotel?" (laughs). "Riff-raff" evolved into "animals" then, "bad animals."

Q How would you like the public to perceive Heart?

A I hope they think of a band with two women in it, instead of two women with guys in the background. We think of it as a band and that's what we try to get across in our videos and records. We would never be happy otherwise.

Since we got Mark and Denny, the chemistry has just been right, really perfect. We look out for each other. We travel as a pack. We have a band sense of humor that really pulls us through. Per-

sonalities are a really big factor in keeping any band together. It has to be leadership within that team. You have to have the right cast of characters..... and no built-in resentments. I think Heart will be around for a long time.

Q Is it still necessary to prove yourself as a female in the largely male world of rock?

A I think there's always that built-in thing. Any female can go out and play rock 'n' roll and probably work in any business in the world, but you have to prove you are competent first. You have to be good. You do have to work a little harder if you are a woman. I think we can feel good about influencing a lot of other women in the industry. At the same time, there are so many women out there now. Each person has to do it for themselves.
