

Just Some Thoughts

CROSSOVERS LIVE. MAYBE!: For the last few months, we have been writing about the lack of records crossing over from the R&B charts. Now, all of a sudden, there appear to be four records — all major R&B hit records — that have the potential to score in the mass appeal marketplace. Unfortunately, since they have all reached the beginning of their cross to Top 40 at the same exact time, all will not be successful. However, if at least one, possibly two, hopefully three and doubtfully four make the cross, the door will be open again for more to follow. Hence these four records: "Shower Me With Your Love" by Surface "Keep (Columbia), On Movin'" by Soul II Soul (Virgin), "Turned Away" by Chuckii Booker (Atlantic) and "For The Love Of You" Tony! Toni! Tone! by (Wing/Polydor) are the new pioneers for the wave of R&B crossover potential to come in 1989. We will watch their progress carefully and report on developments.

SO WHO'S HOT?: MCA continues its streak led by Fine Cannibals Young and Bobby Brown who are still at #'s 1 & 2 nationally. Now these two, as well as Tom Petty, Jody Watley and Guy and joined by two hot new albums in the street this week - Ghostbusters II and the latest rap contender Heavy D — continue to strengthen the streak..... And at Atlantic, the strong **Beaches** soundtrack, Stevie Nicks, Debbie Gibson, Winger and Skid Row

giants are joined on the chart this week by the new release from White Lion..... Capitol's strong airplay showing in May has led to a June that is busting out all over. Paul McCartney, Great White. Queen and the Doobie Brothers are all entrenched in the national Top 20, while M. C. Hammer and Bonnie Raitt continue strong and **Billy Squier** readies to join them.....



An exclusive HITS interview with BRIAN BURNS, CHUCK BECK and JOEL FOLGER.





The newest "Hot" format that has people talking is rock leaning Top 40, or Rock 40 as it's becoming known. The success of Brian Burns at KXXR in Kansas City, Chuck Beck at WDFX in Detroit and Joel Folger at KEGL in Dallas, has lots of owners, GMs and PDs taking notice and even consider-

How do you image your station?

BB: For Kansas City, the word is *Attitude*. KYYS, the album rock station, had a very old, stodgy profile. By being very avant garde and having a make-up-our-own-rules-as-we-go-along-attitude, we made KYYS very un-hip.

CB: Very much the same. Top of the mind is attitude. That's exactly the way we signed this thing on. We had WHYT which is urban, WCZY, which had a really un-hip image, and we had the two album rockers, that were also un-hip playing the Doors over and over. JF: KEGL is further along in the evolution process. But in the beginning, it was also a very hip Rock of the 80's Album Rockbased station, that has evolved into the current Rock 40 type station, that's been able to maintain that hip image.

Who do you steal from for share points?

CB: I think I read in an interview with Brian that he said you have to steal from the Album Rock stations. We can't survive on what we steal from other Top 40s, or at least, I can't.

BB: That's true, although I would qualify it. There might be a couple of missing Album Rock shares for people that also have a rock preference, but have a more modern rock preference and just aren't being served. There has to be a need for what you're doing. You can't create a need.

JF: There has to be a hole in the market *and* you have to take numbers from the Album Rockers and Top 40s.

ing a move to this brand new hybrid format. Certainly, it's something fresh and exciting, which is why HITS' always excitable Mike Murphy sat down with these three opinion leaders and chaired a roundtable discussion about the quickly evolving Rock 40 sound.

Who do you share the most audience with?

BB: According to Arbitron, I share the most audience with KYYS, about 46%, then 36% with KBEQ, 32% with Classic Rock KCFX and 29% with KCPW.


CB: When we first signed on, we actually shared more with WHYT and WCZY. But as the station's evolved, WHYT has gone more ethnic and urban, so our sharing has gone down there. Currently, it would have to be WLLS and. believe it or not, I'm sharing guite a bit of audience with the Classic station WCSX. I also still share quite a bit with WCZY. JF: According to Arbitron, half with Y95, 1/3 with Q102, and I also share with just about any other station. Fragmentation, that's what I am going through.

Let's talk about music philosophy.

BB: It's our opinion that Rock 40 is not like mainstream Top 40. They tend to take the top hits from all formats, A/C, Urban and Rock and put them together. Rock 40 is more of a hybrid position, where we take the Rock records that are hitoriented and mass appeal and can be played by both Album Rock stations and Top 40 stations. Those are our strongest core records. Then, rather than going outside the format to find things of an A/C or Urban genre, we would rather develop new artists. So, we have a core of about 20 records. then we develop new artists --- so that bands like the Choirboys and Red Siren will be exposed to our audience. Whether they have a national hit isn't as important as the exposure to our audience, so that when the next album comes out. they will already have an image and be developed. That's what we feel will enable this format to be thriving two years from now.

Where do you stand on oldies?

CB: It varies from daypart to daypart. It can be from 20% to 30% oldies. It's also according to what product we can find out there



that are actually hits. But, there is something very important here that you should know: WMMS, Joel, myself and Pirate Radio are all in cahoots with Brian. He has a 40 record playlist, so he can test all that stuff to see what the hits are, and then we pick those hits and play them.

BB: I'm a guinea pig! That goes back to our attitude. Our whole approach on the air is that we're not gonna tell you what the hits are. We're gonna play them and let you decide.

CB: Exactly. We step out in left field from time to time, too. You have to take those chances. It's something that we learned with this type of format.

BB: They'll forgive you if you play

something they don't like, as long as it is a rock record, but it's my opinion — and Joel, I hope you don't take exception to this — but I feel if you play a Madonna record, you'll piss off the 18- to 24-year old men.

JF: It's the exception, though, rather than the rule. You just have to go with your gut sometimes. In the selection process what I do is: if the song fits in my mind what the image of KEGL is, then we'll play it. Madonna is a fringe artist for us. It's my opinion, though, that if you play a rock record that doesn't work for you, it's just as much of a mistake in the listener's mind as a fringe artist is.

BB: Since I brought this up, I'll play the devil's advocate on Joel's

behalf and say that KEGL's image in the mind of their listeners is a more mainstream radio station than we in the industry consider by comparison.

JF: What did the Moody Blues say, "A question of balance?" ---it's all how you present the Madonna song. Where it's put in the mix, that makes a big difference. You put the Madonna in between or close to Guns N' Roses and properly put in the mix, people will then have a tendency to equate the Madonna with all the rock product you play. CB: Having been in the Dallas market for a couple of years, I can see where KEGL could even play - from time to time - something like a Pretty Poison record, because they've set the standard down there for so many years. They can play a Madonna record a couple of times a day and they're perceived as being the mainstream Top 40 station. When Y95 started up, KEGL was perceived as the Top 40 station.

Is your station perceived as a rock station or as a Top 40 station by the listeners? BB: We believe they think of us as a rock and roll station. In the Midwest, a lot of people still consider Top 40 rock and roll, because

there isn't the heavy saturation of urban product that there is in the coastal cities.

CB: I don't think we are perceived as being a rock station. I don't think people walk around the streets of Detroit saying, "Those are the guys that *don't* play Bobby Brown or Paula Abdul." But, we are the only station that plays Skid Row. However, we are the rock station in town.

JF: You may have hit on something there — and that may be part of the reason you are seeing success with this format. We have dared to be in a spot where we don't put labels on it, like "We're a Top 40 station, so we have to play what's on the Top 40 list!" or "We're an Album Rock station, so we have to play what's on the Album

Rock list." We're just a station that plays the very best music in a certain type of sound that we can find.

Do you use the term Rock or Rock n' Roll in any of your sweepers or positioning statements?

JF: Not as far as music goes. CB: No.

BB: We definitely do that. It's a counter position from "Hit" because "Hit" says two things. It says "Repetition" number one, and number two, it says "Variety" of different types of music, urban and rock together. "Today's Rock and Roll," countered KYYS. If we're "Today's Rock and Roll" then they must be *yesterday*'s rock and roll.

Is there enough available music for your stations to play?

CB: There are always going to be problems, because finding hit records is not easy to do. When you are doing mainstream Top 40, you have to do some digging to find records that are hits. We all know that's the ball game. You play hits, you don't play the back page of another trade magazine! So, in our format we go out and find hit records that fit our radio station, and if I have to dip into an album to find a hit, so be it. Don't get me wrong! I think I have a pretty bad image that my MD John McFadden works on every day, trying to clean up for me. The record companies know that I'll play whatever I feel the need to. Skid Row is a good example. The record company is saying we want to do this and we want to do that and we want to wait on this. Guys, this is a hit record that I'm gonna play! If I can help out the record companies, I will. I'll help them out as much as I can, but I have to

play hit records. I'm here to win. I really hate to mess up a record company's priority sheet and I hate to mess up the game plan that a record company has laid out; but if the record company hands me five records, and if the five they send me, in my opinion, are not hits, but I have another one or two off the an album that are, then I'm gonna play the hits.

BB: I think Chuck just spoke for me, and it's funny that he brings up the Atlantic thing with Skid Row. I can't tell you how frustrated I was

With all the fragmentation going on with Top 40, will we come full circle and return to mainstream Top 40 radio?

BB: I think all of us try to reflect the attitude of the society at any given moment. In the 80s, during the Reagan era, it was oldies. The attitude was everything old is new again. The oldies burned out. Now with satellites and all the technology, this planet is tiny and we have to start dealing with different issues and try some new things. I

when they said they were going with "18 and Life."

Everyone agrees that "I Remember" by Skid Row is a hit. The people at MTV say "18 and Life" is a hit, and that it's pulling great phones. Are you saying "18 and Life" is *not* a hit?

CB: Let me tell you this. We ran into this situation with Bon Jovi: we had "Bad Medicine" on the radio, and we pounded it till it burned. We went to Mercury and asked what the next cut would be. They said, "We don't know, we're trying to make a decision." Meanwhile, I'm needing another Bon Jovi record, so we go to "Living In Sin." It becomes a big record for us, then they come back and say "No, no, no! we're going with something else." think this format is something new and fresh, and pretty much a reflection of people's willingness to experiment.

CB: I think Brian is correct. We have to reflect society, as it is today, to be successful. I think that some mainstream Top 40s can come in and do okay, but I think

the evolution we are going through now is this. We are becoming the new AOR stations.

In Detroit, I think we are becoming or we are taking the place of the AOR station. It's something I think Joel has done in Dallas to an extent. I think it's something that Brian and Scott Shannon and I are experimenting with, and I don't think this format is going to die out. If we maintain the format and evolve our format and let it grow, then we will become the AOR of the 90s.

JF: The interesting thing though, especially in bigger cities, is that there are formats that never go away. You were talking about things going full cycle, that type of thing. What happens in a city like this is that there's a Top 40 that will probably be around forever. You've got a couple of urban stations, a couple of AORs, there's a Rock Top 40, a Classic Rock station. Instead of seeing formats go away, you will see one station or format get hot and go up, then cool off and go down. Then another will get hot, and so on.

What if a full time Post Modern station signed on in your market?

BB: Can I plead the Fifth? I don't want somebody coming up with that idea. What we've done at KXXR is fortify that position, by doing a Post Modern hour every night from 11 till 12. Actually, it's Sunday through Thursday nights. We break records out of that. We've found that records like the Cure and the Cult will work. We've, also, found that just because they have alternative roots, it doesn't mean they will necessarily always work. New Order is just too much of a beat record for us, the same with Erasure and Information Society.

CB: In different markets, it will have different effects. Here, some of it works and some doesn't. The acceptance here in Detroit is less than in Houston, where those type of acts work extremely well. We currently have WDET that plays Post Modern, and they don't really effect us. So, I don't think there is enough core audience for Post Modern to do major damage.



The Apple show was reportedly a huge sucess, while the L.A. show at the Roxy was due to take place just after we went to press. Meanwhile, the EMI album by the band is arguably Bowie's best outing of the decade Jamaican dance/pop queen Grace Jones has a new album on the way for CAPITOL Primal pop energy from two new U.K. rock bands looks hotter than table-top fusion. (OK, a safe bet, I know.) EMI have picked up Diesel Park West, who mix an attractive jangly pop with a driving rock bottom on their "Shakespeare Alabama" debut. Expect Moore to outflank even his old Jesus & Mary Chain chums on the airplay front. There are songs on *Blind Man's Zoo* like "Hateful Hate," "Headstrong," and "Please Forgive Us" that all seem to deal with the delicate state of the human condition. What is it about your life, in particular, that causes you to write songs of this nature?

I find a lot of things that disturb me. And I feel that I have a role as a communicator...a professional communicator to make those things know. It's important to convéy my opinions and personal feelings in the songs without me being too blatant about it.

You've written about alcohol abuse, drug addiction and child abuse. Are there any other new social issues that have been raised in your consciousness? The song 'Dust Bowl' on Blind Man's Zoo deals with a woman who has to raise a family without a husband. She works

the latest album from 10,000 Maniacs, finds the group addressing the important social issues that are part of our everyday lives. Songs like "Poison In the Well" and "Dust Bowl" raise the level of consciousness, as they tackle single motherhood and corporate negligence.

Money is a poor substitute to return those things We're talking about life. There's no price you can put on any

life, whether it be a human life or an animal life.

Do you look at yourself as a bit of a crusader?

I guess I am. People don't really want crusaders. They don't want to be evangelized. I certainly don't. But that is the spirit behind it. As long as I disguise it in narratives and ballads, well, that's alright. Maybe people won't feel manipulated.

Are you happy with Elektra Records?

Yes. I'm always interested in

how the record company perceives us. I think they think we're stubborn. And they're right. When it comes to how we're represented, we are very tubborn. Specifically, the record company has a job to o, and it's to take the music and sell records. They sell records by promoting the music and the artist. We want the emphasis to be on the music and *not* the artist. So there's a lot of image questions.

Do they treat you as a product rather than as a person?

That's what we're fighting against, The fight is against a format that is acceptable for them and works for them. They'll say, "It's time to do publicity photographs;" but, the nature of doing publicity photographs is so fake and artifical and worthless. Then they'll say to me, "Now Natalie, we need these photographs!" So I say, "Well, can we do these publicity photographs in

a more natural setting?" The answer is usually "no." Those e things that frustrate me, but they have to have them; so, we



Doobie Doobie D

Interview by Jesse Nash

Back by popular demand, it's the "original" Doobie Brothers— Tom Johnston, Pat Simmons, John Hartman, Tiran Porter, Michael Hossack and the most recent member, Bobby LaKind. They've reunited for the release of the brand new album, Cycles, as well as for a world-wide tour. It's the first time the original line-up has recorded together since 1975, and Cycles brings the Doobies back to the high-spirited sounds of "China Grove," "Listen To The Music" and "Black Water," which marked the group's sound before Michael McDonald joined the band.

After selling more than 40-million lps worldwide over the past 20 years and receiving four Grammy Awards, 1989 finds the Doobies re-grouped and ready to rock 'n' roll. Three of the band's original members, Tom Johnston, John Hartman and Pat Simmons, teamed up for a rare chance to talk Hits' man about town, Jesse Nash, into submission.



To what do you attribute the longevity and longstanding popularity of the group? *Johnston:* Over the last 20-years, the writings been good.

Hartman: No matter what the differences in music may be, there are some bands that just hold up through all the changes. We're one. There are some that always remain popular. I can think of two immediately: there's Led Zepplin, whose music's played more than some of the new people on the charts. The other group that's held up real well is The Who.

Are you going to be calling this tour the "Reunion Tour?"

Simmons: No, we did that already — two years ago. This will probably end up being called the "Divorce Tour," because by the time we get home our wives will probably want to divorce us. (Laughter).

Johnston: (Imitating his wife's voice) "You never call me. You're never home." (Laughter).

Where's Mike McDonald? Why isn't he with the group this time around?

Johnston: Mike prefers his solo career. We had a long talk. When he did the "Reunion Tour" two years ago, he signed on the contract that he was just going to do *that* tour, and continue recording his solo albums.

Hartman: (Sarcastically) He actually said, "The money's not good enough guys. I'll be seeing ya."

Did Mike McDonald confuse the audience as far as the image of the Doobie Brothers was concerned? His was the only face the audience could remember — he was always up front.

Simmons: Well, we feel that people know what that was all about. That was then; this is now. We're talking about two eras. With the original guys getting back together again, the minute you hear the music, you slip right back into the original Doobie sound — without Mike. How about the business? Simmons: Oh, it's the same.

Hartman: It's like the old Air Force motto: everything changes, and nothing changes.

Yeah, but there must be something that bothers you.

Simmons: For me, it's that you're an artist, and yet you have to be handled as a product. I think that's always been the same for us. We would like to do artistic things, but then we end up having to do things that are more businesslike and diplomatic.

Do you still fight with your label (Capitol) now and then?

Simmons: We never fought with the record company. (All nod in agreement)

Johnston: It all comes down to communication between the record company and the band. We might feel it should be one way, and they think it ought it be another. It all comes down to compromise. But, we have a long range plan that (the

record company) may not know about. So, we have to look at it from our perspective. We know how our touring is going, and we have a real good idea of who our audience has been and probably will be, and we have an inside view that they don't: they're looking at it from business standpoint of a marketing only. We're looking at it much deeper than that. But, the end result is that we help each other. That's how we make our decisions.

Who chooses what songs go on the record?

Hartman: Well, everybody shows each other what they've got. We listen to the songs and do some pickin' and choosin'. The producer has some say in it, of course. It's important that everybody unveil the best material they have so we can make the best possible record. Of course, there are some songs that never make it to the record. There's no set pattern to what makes it and what doesn't make it.


