EMI Music Pumps Up The Volume

Bigger, beefier **EMI Music Worldwide** reports a 33% increase in total sales for the first half of its fiscal year, and a whopping 256% leap in total sales before tax and interest. (We'd tell you the amounts, but there's no "pounds" symbol on the

computer.) Richard Marx and Great White contributed to the strong showing of domestic wing Capitol-EMI Music Inc., which took over distribution of Chrysalis and purchased a 50% share of Enigma during the same period.

Since Thanksgiving is a time of celebration and joy with your loved ones, we here at HITS felt compelled to bring nightmare and misery into your meaningless lives. Thus, we take pleasure in presenting our obligatory "Batman" headline story. We hope you enjoy it. (Ed Note: To be honest, we don't really care. Thank you)

Early reports indicate that the "Batman" video has absolutely ruled at retail since hitting the stores last Thursday, Nov. 16., no matter what price retailers are selling it for. In its first four days of release, the Batvid's only serious competition is coming from New Kids On The Block, whose music vid had a two-day head start.

Gary Ross of Musicland, which keeps daily sales figures, says the Batvid is the chain's No. 1 video by 10-to-one, and that's at \$17.99 to \$19.99. "Other folks are blowing it out price-wise," says Ross. "We're not."

Gerald Bain of Q Records in Miami told us that the chain pre-sold 600 units as a loss leader at \$9.95, but moved 400 pieces at \$19.94 in its first two days of release. Says Bain, "Based on the response so far, it will either meet or beat 'E.T."





MILLI'S STILL NUMBER **ONE:** Who would figured it? In the midst of a superstar glut, in the heart of New Kids On The Block mania, Arista's Milli Vanilli - a studio alburn whose only face is false - would be the dominant #1 album in the land for the sixth consecutive week. And Milli's lead over the nearest competitors is growing, not shrinking! It's already four #1 hits deep and it has more to come. I guess that's why the game of the record business is played. The unusual becomes the norm, and the hits just keep on a comin'..... Everybody, and we mean everybody, is talking about the boom of new labels about to descend at the turn of the decade. Where will they find executive talent, and much more importantly, where will these new execs find the product necessary to compete? Will it come from Europe, as was the case with Virgin, from superstars whose contracts are up a la Geffen, or will the new companies steal a trick or two from Luke Skywalker, Delicious Vinyl, Next Plateau, Megaforce, Relativity, etc. and attempt the street record strategy? Stay tuned. The game is afoot And what about radio changes? Rock 40 has come along and created a starting point for companies to break rock records, just as the urban leaning stations created a launching pad for dance hits. But Rock 40's have already found a shortage of real hit product and sales staffs lacking in the ability to sell the

younger demos the format produces, which is already causing some to re-evaluate their music mix and move more toward the center. Just this week, WDFX in Detroit and WRQQ in Charlotte have widened their Rock 40 spectrum to include the Paula Abdul's, Milli Vanilli's and Janet Jackson's of the world. What will happen next? Stay tuned..... And about those upper demos, howzabout hit records from oldtimers like Rolling Stones, Linda Ronstadt, Billy Joel, Phil Collins, Alice Cooper, Cher and Rod all hitting Stewart airwaves simultaneously to state emphatically that the original baby boomers are still alive, well, and buying CD's as fast as they bought records in their college days. The music habit, once established at youth, is a hard one to break.

So, as we all sit down to break bread with those closest to us this week, let's all give thanks that our industry (however inscrutable it might be) is here to stay as a vibrant entertainment force to be reckoned with in the 90's as it has been since the dawn of rock n' roll.



Born in Freeport and educated in Athens — that's Illinois and Ohio, you jerk, not the Bahamas and Greece! — John O'Rourke's taking the PD gig at Toledo's WRQN pretty serious. So far, he's set his station attacking the two market leaders, not bad for a guy who graduated from Ohio University in 1983 and went to WWJM in New Lexington, Ohio for the swing thing. Along the way, he's also worked at WIBZ in Parkersburg, West Virginia, WNCI in Columbus where he did the swing thing again and produced the morning show, before heading to KZZP in Phoenix for overnights. Now, though, he calls the shots, as opposed to HITS' Danny Ostrow who spends most of his time dodging bullets.

What made you decide to leave Nationwide?

It really wasn't a conscious decision to leave Nationwide. It was a conscious decision to get into programming. I love Nationwide; Î think they're incredible fun and a very fair company. They've got some great talent there and working for them was probably the highlight of my career so far. I just wanted to get into programming and there wasn't anything with Nationwide that I could do in that area. John Sinton works pretty closely with some of the Nationwide AOR stations and I'd heard a lot of good things about him; Guy recommended him highly. So, Sinton bought WRQN and when I decided to go, the folks from Nationwide said, "Hey, we're not going to let you go too far." So, I'm hoping one day I'll be back with Nationwide in one of their markets!

Do the other major Ohio market

stations influence you?

I look at certain things: WMMS' playlist doesn't affect me a whole lot in terms of, "If WMMS adds it, I should." I do like to see what that market is doing, though, because I think we're close to Cleveland demographically, an industrial town, more of a blue collar town than I've been used to. It's more blue collar than, say, Columbus or Cincinnati is. I like to know what's going on in Cleveland, but I'm more interested when I can find out little tidbits of research here and there as to how records are doing in Cleveland, not just WMMS, but all the stations there. Detroit, too, to some extent — although Detroit tends to be much more of an urban market than Toledo.

When you got to WRQN, how did you decide how to position and image the station?

The imaging and positioning of WRQN was pretty much set when I

got here. The Operations Manager. Steve Mason, who was acting PD at the time, had pretty much set the tone for the station. And I don't want to say Pirate Radio, either, because it was before Pirate and we are not Pirate. But that reckless attitude, that "Hey, we're the little guys, the 2000 watt station twenty miles outside of town that just wants to do what you want to hear" type of attitude, that's what we're about. We were leaning a little bit more rock for lower demos at the time, because the stations we were going against were a classic dinosaur of Album Rock, WIOT, and a hot adult station, WMHE. Those

and get by with it. We came on really hard, really aggressive and attacked both stations, took their images and drove them home in the minds of the listeners. (We) made WIOT look like it was a station for drug crazed rock and rollers and WMHE look like it was a station for blue hair old ladies. We just pounded that into the listeners heads, while at the same time saying we were the cool, hip station. We referred to them as "The Wimps" and "The Dinosaur" on the air. In other words, we positioned them as a heavy metal station and a wimpy station because they were vulnerable. The one thing that's

two had been around since God was a kid and traditionally pulled 15 and 17 shares, back when this station was pulling 3s and 4s. We needed to go someplace where they hadn't been. WMHE was very A/C, especially during the day, and WIOT was practically a classic rock, so that left us a niche to sound Rock 40-ish and still play the Madonna's and what not.

How has WRQN changed the Toledo market?

I'd say the biggest way we've changed it is by breaking it up. Like I said, there were two giants in this town: WMHE and WIOT. They've been around forever and had never had any really serious competition. They didn't compete with each other too much; they each had a good chunk of the market and were happy with that. WRQN, this little dinky station 20 miles outside of town was always just sort of an also ran. So to pick up steam, we had to wake the town up. It sure woke those two stations up! No longer could they just sit there doing what they were doing for several years

really happened — and I've heard it from the record people that come through — is that radio in this town all over the dial has gotten a lot better. And I have to attribute that to this radio station. We forced everybody to get on their toes. Toledo is a very tough market right now, it's a neck and neck battle down to songs and breaks.

Why haven't you mentioned Guy Zapoleon or Bill Richards yet?

That's right, two incredible programmers! I've worked with both of them. Bill gave me my first shot at a real radio station and I appreciate that. And what can I say about Guy Zapoleon? I mean, he's Guy Zapoleon, someone I look up to and probably always will. The thing that I liked about Nationwide is that I got to network with such incredible talent, guys like Dave Robbins, Clark Ingram, Kevin Weatherly, Todd Fisher and Gene Baxter. Whenever I can pick their brains, I'll do it and they know it. I would like to see that whole team reunited one day — and when that happens, look out world!






That was the question the entire industry was asking in September, 1986, when classic-car buff Jeff Ayeroff and part-time race driver Jordan Harris jointly took the wheel of Virgin's new American operation. Ayeroff and Harris had worked closely at A&M before the former moved to Warner Bros. to head the label's creative efforts, while the latter took over A&M's A&R department. Each seemingly had everything — money, power, visibility, great gigs at respected labels, the works — but they wanted something more: to run a record company.

So when Richard Branson knocked, Jeff and Jordan answered, and the industry waited for them to crash and burn. But instead of stalling out, they took off, clicking with British pop from the parent company while they gradually built a formidable domestic roster that runs the gamut from A (Paula Abdul) to Z (Ziggy Marley & the Melody Makers). Now, just three years later, Virgin Records America is a major player, with big hits and big plans for the '90s — as HITS' Bud Scoppa discovered when he sat down with his former colleagues from the A&M product management department (circa 1977-78). Ayeroff and Harris own lots of cars, Scoppa's still saving up for an oil change.

BUD SCOPPA: This operation is a far cry from our little offices above the A&M soundstage. At the rate you're going, can feature films be far off?

JEFF AYEROFF: I used to think I wanted to be in the film business; now I think I wanna be a farmer.

JORDAN HARRIS: Jeff always knew that his attention span was too short to ever make feature films. Now he's decided his attention span's too short to make music videos!

JA: Yeah, I think I'm gonna get into subliminal messages and soundbites. JH: In fact, Jeff's now bored with this interview.

JA: So, what do you want to know... BS: What led you two to leave those great gigs you had and hang 10 with a new label?

JA: It was a perfect opportunity — Virgin needed us and we needed to make a move. We didn't have to move; we needed to do it for our own career goals and our own psyches. That's what life's about. We had both apprenticed in good schools and were ready to make a move, and there was no room where we were to take that step. So the next logical step was to take the risk and start a company with good people backing us. That's what we did and that's why we've succeeded — it's the synergy between the good people backing us and us. JH: That, and being able to handpick good people to work with. BS: You didn't hire stars for your key slots; you mostly took younger, less well-known people. And quite a few of them have come through in a big way.

JH: I don't think we took anybody at the peak of their careers or their abilities. We took people who were on the right side of the curve. JA: We come from a very unique

part of that background, you probably understand it better than anybody else who could write an article on us. We learned one basic tenet from A&M, and that was to be artist-oriented. It sounds like a cliche.

Art Director in the '70s] used to say, "Enjoy the artists in this business and you'll enjoy the business." We've always bought into that. We've always tapped ourselves into young artists, old artists, recycled artists, recirculating artists — the energy that comes from the art form we're involved in. Between the two of us, we probably have disdain for the business aspects. I'm not capable of doing it — I don't

to put it into practice.

JA: To a certain extent it is rhetoric. but the bottom-line situation for us is not necessarily that Paula Abdul and Soul II Soul are selling a lot of records. If I was to put a paragraph together about us, I would say that it's Paula Abdul's success, it's Neneh Cherry's reviews, it's Lenny Kravitz's potential, it's the overall excellence of Syd Straw, Sam Phillips, Bob Mould

have the psyche for it. Jordan can do it because it's a challenge to him, but I think he endures it more than he enjoys it. So I think the reason we're successful is that we override a lot of it. We short-wire it and we tap into the energy of creativity. And we looked for people who weren't joundiced by the nature of our business. We hit people at the right time, and created an environment that promotes creativity. It's the kind of environment we've seen before; it's not like we invented it. We reinvented what we'd seen at A&M and

JH: Those are the two places where we both worked.

JA: And they're the only two places where we probably could've worked. JH: Talking about "artist-oriented companies" and all that; it may be rhetoric, but we're two guys who bought it and believed it and tried

Y'know, you look at us and we are our roster. In this three-year period, the phenomenon of our company is not our sales, or the fact that we're making money, or that we look good on the charts — it's our roster. Because all that success flows out of the crafting of our roster. That's the craft we learned at A&M and Warner Bros. BS: From a purely aesthetic standpoint, there aren't a lot of generic acts on Virgin.

JA: I'm proud of that, And whether we're in the black or the red with our artists is insignificant relative to the synergy that's created in terms of being able to sign the next Lenny Kravitz, NRBQ or Syd Straw, It tells me we're doing the right thing. BS: There was a period before the label kicked in when skeptics around the industry pointed to Virgin and said, "They're spending way too much money, and they don't seem to be getting results from that expenditure."

JA: Do we spend any more money than other labels? I've worked at companies, I know what budgets are. We don't spend any more money than other labels do. BS: But that's the perception.

JH: If people have that perception, maybe we're getting value for the dollars we're spending.

JA: Let's put it this way: Yes, we spend more money than anybody has ever spent in the history of the record business on every aspect of what we do - including lunch. And we're gonna continue to do that. But somehow we make money doing that! So we're happy, and we eat

BS: To ask what may be a leading question, got any big plans for the '90s?

JA: The next phase for us is we're going to expand - but not to the point of growing to fail. We'll be cautious and do it in the same manner as we've done it before. It's also good for our staff. We're deep on the bench in promotion, for example; it allows for growth to come out of that area. Because creatively we have the ability to have too much. When you have that, you have a real problem, because the things you're losing are too good to lose. JH: Rather than allowing bureaucracy and corporate thinking to get into this company as it gets bigger and bigger, the growth pattern for us is to do what we've done in the U.K. — and that's to spin off into several creative centers JA: Two small companies rather than one big company.

JH: - so you can have a number of smaller creative areas where the artists and records will get a lot of individual attention. But, the whole adds up to more.

JA: So an artist becomes the number one or two artist on your label in a certain category rather than the sixth, because of the level of the act's sales and because of the workload. It's those kinds of situations that we're trying to remedy. JH: It's recognizing what works and what's special. Everything changes and evolves into something else. We

passions, and one of my statements is that all acts are not created equal. I may get more passionate about one artist than another. BS: So fuck objectivity - go with what you're excited about.

JA: Objectivity gets in the way, because it causes you to step on the brake pedal as opposed to the gas pedal. See, brake pedals are dangerous when you're in a race - you don't win a race if you've got your foot on the brakes. In a race, I'd rather be very proficient with the gas pedal and not the brakes. That's what it's about. At a certain point you've gotta say, "Put the brakes on

national figures at radio. There are very different spheres of the record business: the light that is cast on Jim Swindel in the sales and distribution community, the light that is cast on Phil Quartararo... we've had some good spotlights. People were dubious about our ability to be president of a record company, but I don't think anybody was ever dubious about us as a creative director and an A&R head. I still think Jordan and I are on a learning curve — we're in this process of being two guys running a record company. Every other day I learn something I screwed up on or I should've done or I did right. And I think we're gonna be learning for a long time. JA: And just like in any business, our bosses make us crazy. It's the nature of the beast. We strive for great-looking ads, we strive for great-looking videos, we strive for great promotion people, we strive for honesty... There's a lot of stuff, and it's been working.

JH: We decided early on that if we were gonna do this, we were only going to do it one way - by setting really high standards for the kind of people that we work with and the artists that we work with. We've held onto that, and it's too important for us to take shortcuts.







hrashing backbeat, buzzing sonics and themes that put the arsh realities in your face — as on the opening "Thief" that romises in the end "I will kill you." Frustration personified, finistry's made a disturbing LP to reflect our times.

translator for. Their far-flung zest for life drives "Zobi la ouche," which alternates almost chanted verses with wildly heered a capella choruses. Merging the sounds of Algeria, emphis, Seville and Paris, Les Negresses are onto something.

diriam Makeba, "Welela" (Urban Africa/Mercury): With the current focus in apartheid and human rights riolations, African music is more topical than ever. Who better than Miriam keba, herself exiled since the '60s, o serve as an entry way to this music? Welela," her Urban Africa debut, is

THE LATEST ON UP AND COMING BANDS by John Sutton-Smith

'Tis the season for boxes, and two of the best come from a couple of Anglo icons with nearly a half century of pop service between them. Few have had more influence on it all than the incredible David Bowie, and the essential "Sound + Vision" compilation package, lavishly styled and meticulously assembled, captures the breadth of Bowie's repertoire through his numerous incarnations. The Rykodisc effort chronicles the young performance artist into Ziggy through the Thin White Duke to the techno-pop pioneering of his days with Eno, selecting some tasty, not always obvious pieces. Highlights include the current radio favorite, a fierce version of Springsteen's "It's Hard To Be A Saint In The City" from the "Station To Station" sessions, and heretofore unreleased versions of "Space Oddity" and "Changes." Unlike most compilations, which merely serve as nostalgic retrospectives of an artist's career, this set actually functions as the precursor for a comprehensive release schedule from the label of every Bowie album from 1969's "Space Oddity" through 1980's "Scary Monsters," each of which will reportedly include various outtakes, additional tracks and/or alternative takes Rod Stewart, another mod from swinging '60s London, was a rocker and blues stylist, in contrast to the theatrically inclined Bowie, but likewise provided a tremendous understanding and cultivation of pop as a culture. And if the costumes and buffoonery seemed garish at times, there was never a doubt that the man could sing a blues or a ballad. Much like the Clapton and Allman Brothers packages, Rod's "Storyteller" collection is the sort of classy catalog redevelopment many labels have yet to fully undertake. Created and released by Warner Bros., thanks to the enlightened understanding of the Mercury and CBS folk, the set is a complete retrospective, including early solo gems like "Handbags and Gladrags" and "Gasoline Alley," as well as essential Jeff Beck and Faces-era material through an incredible streak of hit songs that spans two decades.... Last word on the subject of boxes: MCA's Chess packages on Willie Dixon, Chuck Berry and the just-released Muddy Waters are the class of the older catalog sets, researched and documented with all due love and respect by Andy McKaie.... Trendy pop stylists Everything But The Girl have left Warners after three alburns there to sign with Atlantic. Always considered a huge hit prospect in this corner, ETBG's new album, "The Language Of Life," is due out in February.... Church activities: Individual members of stylish Australian pop band the Church continue with their ever-impressive series of secular solo projects. Steve Kilbey has a new album "The Slow Track" just out on Rough Trade, while Marty Willson-Piper's latest on Rykodisc, "Rhyme," is full of attractive hooks bathed in new romantic notions, ranging from Bryan Ferry to David Sylvian Two worth a second listen: the Subdudes' self-titled debut on Atlantic is a refreshing mix of rural rhythmic pop, and the same can be said of Irish folk-rockers the Black Velvet Band, with their impressive first album on Elektra Album of the week: "Automatic," from Jesus & Mary Chain, who just get better and better, this time extending a kinder, gentler edge to the furious guitar-driven Velvets sheen on standout tracks like "Halfway To Crazy" and "Her Way Of Praying" (WB) And former Television mastermind Tom Verlaine is getting strong radio response to his U.K. single "Shimmer."

One-stop shopping. That's why A&R people have been frequenting showcase club the Coconut Teaszer on the corner of Sunset and Laurel Canyon. Club bookers Len Fagan and Carol Miller have come up with two novel concepts that have made the Teaszer a hit with talent scouts: "residencies," in which selected bands are given weekly slots, and "L.A.'s Best Kept Secrets," a twice-a-month series featuring a bunch of hand-picked bands performing mini-sets. Every Best Kept Secrets night is an A&R convention, and people are actually signing bands on the spot. RCA's Bennett Kaufman, for example, made his move on Kik Tracee right after the band's BKS appearance, while Tom Zu-

taut nailed I Love You within a month after spotting the band during its Teaszer residency. Among the BKS and resident bands that have been signed to record, publishing or management deals are the Rock City Angels, Flies on Fire, Burning Tree, Rebel Train, Rhino Bucket, Food for Feet, Red River and Rick Elias. More recently, I.R.S. grabbed Slaves of Babylon, and Capitol's Nigel Harrison walked away with Shrine, a funk-metal dance band featuring ex-Cruzados guitarist Steven Hofsteader.... But wait, there's more: Richard Perry

has told the Sheilas that he wants them to be the first act on his new WB-distributed label, and just the other night Tom Werman brought down a bunch of PolyGram people to check out Slave featuring E.G. Daily (whose A&M contract will probably not be picked up). At press time the big buzz surrounded Olivia Barash & 13th Step; "The other night the A&R men were all over their manager like a Batsuit," says Fagan. And among the bands Len predicts will go next are the Passion, Mail Order Brides, Nicole Jones (whose bandleader is the venerable Kenny Edwards) and London McDaniel (who has no band yet but is working with GNR associate West Arkeen). Len's personal fave is Epic power trio Burning Tree, who still play regularly at the Teaszer — and at a pre-deal price. "They're throwbacks to the old days," Len says. "If it came down to a choice between going to the Rainbow and getting laid or coming over and jamming, they'd jam every time. And these guys can tear it up."... Fagan has just made an agreement with ASCAP talent scout Tom De-Savia to host a monthly ASCAP-sponsored showcase series, which'll kick off in January. The first band Tom has nailed down is Beatlesque Vancouver-based quartet the Odds, who got positive responses from A&M's Aaron Jacoves, Columbia's Ron Oberman and Michael Leshay at Famous during their recent visit to L.A. ASCAP's Mona Cecil was the band's first industry supporter, and it was Mona and DeSavia who introduced the Odds to nightlife in Babylon. Tom admits the experience was a tad wearing on his loyal Canadians.... Credit where credit is due: It was Nick Clarke of Virgin's 10 Records who signed Soul II Soul. Jeff & Jordan appreciate that very, very much.

THE PLANE TAKES

OFF AGAIN

Hey, if the Who, the Rolling Stones, Poco and the Doobie Brothers, etc., can come back, why not Haight-Ashbury's favorite sons (and daughter), the Jefferson Airplane? Principal members Grace Slick, Paul Kantner, Jorma Kaukonen, Jack Casady and Marty Balin have buried the hatchet in the oft-acrimonious feud which has raged on and off since their last album, 1972's Long John Silver. With John Cougar Mellencamp drummer Kenny Aronoff and producer Ron Nevison filling in the gaps, the band has re-formed for a brand new, self-titled LP and a tour, which has been drawing critical kudos at most stops. The 50-year-old Slick is still one of the best interviews in all of rock 'n' roll, as feisty and frank as ever, while cohorts Jorma Kaukonen and Marty Balin provide a steady stream of color commentary for HITS' totally groovy Roy Trakin, who wears a flower in his hair.

"Each time I quit, I said, 'I'm gonna become a Mill Valley housewife and get real spiritual.'" What brought you all back together again?

Marty Balin: I came into it easy. I had a couple songs that fit the concept. When the concept fits, it's easy to be convinced to do it. I had a few songs I thought were Airplane tunes when I was doing them by myself. When I was asked to take part, I happened to have music that fit.

I heard you resisted at first, Marty. Grace Slick: Yeah, and then he got hate mail.

MB: I was told I wasn't wanted in the first place. Which made me totally relieved. Great! I'm thinking about a reunion for years, and then I'm told I'm not included. The burden was off, so I went about my business. Then, they came around and wanted songs, so here I am. Then Paul asked me why I didn't sing the songs, so I

said, "Great."

Is that true, Grace?

I wrote to Marty about it because he used to draw pandas for me and I happen to like pandas. We started communicating through the mail. And we began talking about this happening.

It must have been quite an undertaking to get everybody back together.

GS: It just sort of slopped together, little chunks here and there. Pretty soon, there you are...

Jorma Kaukonen: There were many realms from which this came together. Jack and I were doing a thing with Paul, and one night Grace came down to make Paul miserable. No, seriously, Grace sang a few songs with us and it sounded great.

MB: Paul was the instigator. He'd been wanting to do this for years. GS: He's more a band person. PK: He's the prime mover. I resisted at first, too, but then the roses started smelling, y know? And some days they smell better than others. The music is the easy part. We all have different lifestyles, different axes to grind. But once that stuff was out of the way, it's been pretty smooth. GS: Paul's into family and having a lot of people around him. He works better that way. The rest of us aren't like that. I like working by myself, and so does Marty. When I was a kid, when everybody else was playing jacks and jumping rope, I was off in museums alone. I prefer it

JK: Sometimes I don't even like working for Jack, and I've been with him for 25 years now.

GS: We would have made a terrible baseball team. We're isolated, introspective individuals who happen to be able to do the band at some points in life. It amazes me. JK: Nothing short of miraculous. MB: It's like doing another James Bond movie every so often. They keep offering you a lot of money to

How did you feel, Grace, as the last original Airplane member in Starship, which was essentially a different band?

do one more.

I'm just sorta sad RCA didn't let 'em re-name it, because Starship had nothing to do with the Airplane. That band was just more pop-rockoriented in a way I don't write in. I didn't want to force myself on them and they didn't want me to force myself on them. I just got hungry. And I'm not even talking about money, because Starship had three #1 singles and some good songs. But I like to write and I like the rest of my band to write, so I can tell what they're thinking. Starship wasn't like that.

How much of a role did money play in the decision to re-form the band?

GS: Not a whole lot for me, simply because I'm so negative. I always think things aren't going to make any money. I'm real cynical. I never assume anything. I think this is a format for these particular songwriters to communicate with people who like the music. Period. Of course, more people are attracted to the Airplane than they would be to a solo album from each individual in the group at this point. We're reaching more people for our music with the name Airplane and, as songwriters and musicians, that's our goal. MB: Of course, everybody around us is making a lot of money.

I've read stories, Grace, that you're very sensitive about the age issue.

GS: Because it's still placed on women to look good. Not so much for men or even black people, because they look better when they get older. But the pressure's on me to look, say, 35. Our manager'll come down to the photo shoot and say he likes me in a particualr hairstyle because it makes me look younger. JK: I had one photographer tell me to hold my arm up so the veins'd look smaller. That was the best. Society puts a lot of pressure on you to look young, but we're gonna change all that with this record.

GS: You just don't quit making music. I've walked away twice saying, "I hate this goddamned music business, to hell with this, blah. blah, blah..." But I can't stop writing. So, whether or not I leap around onstage, which I think is sort of unattractive for a woman anyway, I'll always write. Each time I quit, I said, "I'm gonna become a Mill Valley housewife and get real spiritual." But, it didn't work because I couldn't stay away from the piano. Neither my husband or child likes to eat anything green, anyway; they'd rather go to McDonald's. Or have pizza. I mean, you see these women on Hollywood Blvd. in their sixties wearing cinch belts, short skirts, spiked heels, loaded with make-up with bleached blonde hoir and

they're pathetic. And I don't wanna do that.

JK: Hey, they need 'em for heavy metal videos.

What's it like working with Paul again for you, Grace?

GS: Shit. (laughs) There's part of him I think is extraordinarily charming and interesting and part of him I want to strangle. And that will never change. He's gotten a little better, not a lot. If you push the wrong buttons on Paul, he goes to the moon. And you can see it in his face. You know the atom bomb is coming. It's just a matter of how long you want to argue. Our business meetings were hysterical. Jorma was always the one who'd stay with the argument the

JK: But, I don't do that anymore, I'd rather take a nap now.

After all the great album titles you've had, how come you decided to call this one Jefferson Airplane? JK: Trouble was, none of the best ones were printable.

GS: We filled pages and pages of legal paper with potential names. JK: I still like Sweaty Nut Love.

Did the '60s have a positive or negative influence?

GS: Everyone says they didn't work, but look at Arsenio Hall. He's black and he's a talk show host on a major TV network.

Didn't the '60s also produce the Charles Mansons and Mark David Chapmans, though?

GS: There have been axe murderers since time began.

JK: And how do you know Yoko didn't hire him?

MB: I always thought John Lennon hired him to kill Yoko and he missed.

What does your daughter China think about the Airplane coming back, Grace?

GS: It's not a huge deal or anything for her. She's used to her parents and various step-parents being in this business. It's just another shift. She likes it better, obviously, when Paul and I are getting along. It's hard for her when he and I are at each other's throats, as we were for the previous three years. I think a lot of young people will come to get a taste of what the '60s were like.

Are you having a good time?

JK: I'm still here.

GS: Truth be known, he likes his motorcycle more than either music or his wife.

JK: It's been fun for everybody. I mean, there are thorns on the roses, too. But basically, they still smell pretty good. *



LERNER-ED ONE

Record World's Steve Lerner began his career in the record business like most successful retail executives: at the bottom. In 1972 at age 17, Lerner was looking for a summer job. Through his father, a buyer. Steve was hired as a gopher in Record World's warehouse. After a few years of cleaning floors and putting away stock, he transferred to a store where he "substantially increased" the audio cassette sales, which in 1975 wasn't exactly the configuration of choice. He did such a fine job, in fact, that he was offered the new position of tape buyer for the chain. During the climb to his current position of Director of Purchasing, Lerner attended C.W. Post and Nassau College but "couldn't sit still long enough to finish." With legs still aching from the New York Marathon, Steve was more than happy to sit still for HITS' Joe Medwick.

You're in one of the most dense and competitive markets in the country. How do you keep an edge?

From my experience, we thrive on catalog. I think catalog is the backbone of this business. There are a lot of angles to the business, but I've always felt that if a customer came in and wanted something that no one else had, you're going to get that customer back. I also started in the company when there were only six stores in the



chain. Now there are 81, so that gives you an indication of how far we've come and how much my frustration has built up.

How do you balance your purchasing budget while at the same time breaking new acts?

With a lot of luck. We have guidelines. If a company is going to do X amount of dollars per year, you only need so many units to do that business. This year, as the business started to drag, we reduced our purchases.

How do you break new acts?

We go to the temple or church and get down on our hands and knees and pray for these damn things to sell. We do have a program that we follow where we try to give them a little more exposure than average records. If one out of 10 hit, we're lucky and it's probably not that high. We have a "Buy It and Try It" program where we feature about 12 new artists every month and sell them at a discount price. They get in-store play and radio advertising. We try to coordinate it with what radio stations are going

"We go to the temple or church and get down on our hands and knees and pray for these damn things to sell." to be playing, what we think is going to sell, and what the labels want extra attention given to...but like I said, if it's 10%, that's high.

In regard to cassette singles, is the industry pricing itself out of the youth market? Is there music kids can still afford?

Barely. I'm upset about the fact that they're doing that. I think they're making a mistake by raising the cassingle price.

Have you thought about how not to lose the kids market?

That's a tough question to answer. I just try to fill the stores with what we think is going to sell. About 70% of our stores are located in malls, so you have a built-in crowd of kids already and our strip stores, I guess, are being geared more towards adult-oriented buyers.

What's been your most successful cross-merchandising promotion this year?

We worked with radio station, WNEW, in the New York area, where they put together a CD, and we got together as sponsors. We both had our names on it. They advertised it, we sold it, there was no margin for profit or anything — and it went over far beyond anything we expected!

How does video and radio effect your buying?

I used to get a call from someone who gave me the Hip Clip of the Week and that was helping me tremendously. The problem with radio is that radio stations play so much of the new music, you're going to get calls on everything. It's a matter of timing. If you have it in the stores on time, fine. If you

miss it, then you're onto the next thing already and you've missed sales.

Have you made any major system-operations changes to keep up with the changing business?

We're changing the 45 browsers in the stores to accomodate cassingles and what's left of the 45 vinyl. We're also computerizing most of the stores to become directly on-line with the warehouse. That's a two to three year job before it's fully completed. We've had the computer hooked up at the home office for 10 years, but now to have it hooked up to the stores is going to be a huge change. The computer is to me our only hope to really grow....successfully. You can grow, but you can grow and fall apart a la Crazy Eddie

What one thing helps your buying procedures the most?

Instincts. I use my computer read-outs, plus I use my own personnel. I've got a dozen excellent managers giving me viable and accurate information. As an example, I've got a feeling about the group Third Bass on Columbig. No one's heard of them. I have inside information on them from two of my stores. From what I hear, they're going to be the next big rap thing. We're putting the puzzle together now and I think they're going to be huge for us.

How would you describe your buying style?

My style is from the old school, you roll your sleeves up and get your hands dirty.

How did the Knicks manage to lose to the Orlando Magic?

I think the Knicks are overrated. ▲






