

EMI Music has reported record results for the year ending March 31, 1990. According to figures released by the company, EMI Music's sales increased 34% from \$1.26 billion to \$1.69 billion, as profits doubled from \$73.5 million to \$150.2 million.

The company reported an increase in world market share by 1% to 12%, with the strongest gains in North America, Japan and Europe.

Said EMI Music World-wide President and CEO James Fifield: "EMI is now recognized as a force in the music industry. We currently have the top four albums as well as eight of the top 20 records on *Billboard's* pop album chart."

Louisiana Lunacy

Those looney folks in Louisiana have taken lyric labeling legislation HB154 and voted it out of the Senate Judiciary commitee for a full floor Senate vote. The bill, which has already passed the Louisiana House, calls for strict mandatory labeling of music that someone, somewhere in Louisiana, finds objectionable. The bill also calls

for the restriction of the unlawful sale, exhibition or distribution of lyrics deemed harmful to minors. The full floor vote could go down any minute with approval signifying the first state lyric legislation in America. The RIAA plans to file suit on constitutional grounds if the bill becomes law. Those who think Top 40 programmers have a hard time breathing and walking at the same time will surely revel in the chaos that will go down this week as a slew of hot new singles bombard the better broadcast byways of America.

Take a look at our Front Cover, folks — those Hot New Releases ain't whistlin' "Dixie." Among the new CD Singles arriving on PDs' desks this week: Madonna (Sire/WB), Heart (Capitol), Midnight Oil (Columbia), Aerosmith (Geffen) and Anita Baker (Elektra).

Think that's a plateful? Make some more room as there are also new ones from Sinead O'Connor (Chrysalis), Jeff Lynne (Reprise), Bruce Hornsby (RCA), Soul II Soul (Virgin), Adam Ant (MCA), Bad Company (Atco) and newcomer Alias (EMI), which features former members of Sheriff.

Now the stage is set to see who scores and who doesn't; who thrives and who just survives. Then there'll be the records that don't survive at all. Stay tuned, folks—there's action aplenty this coming Tuesday—and you know there's one music trade publication that can tell you all about it. 

Item in the give-a-guy-a-break department: it's morning in Miami, and David Bowie has been in town just a few hours. Jet lag is happening in a big way. "Absolutely, completely," he says with a hearty laugh. "It took 17 hours to get here. Isn't that ridiculous? That's what happens when you take the Concorde."

OK, maybe Bowie — who does have a bit of a jet-setting image should have taken a regular 747. Or a boat, for that matter. What's important is that rock & roll's favorite chameleon is happy today, enjoying himself on the kind of tour nobody ever expected to see from him. Titled "Sound + Vision," it's a retrospective, greatest hits tour designed to promote Rykodisc's re-release of his body of work, as well as new compilations like the multi-disc "Sound + Vision" and the brand-new "Changesbowie." Designed by Edouard Locke of the Montreal dance troupe La La La Human Steps and featuring super-guitarist Adrian Belew and his band, the two-set, two-hour show offers a striking recap of Bowie's 20-plus years as a recording artist. He's eschewed the costumes and personas of his previous shows, however, and the visual key is a see-through scrim on which his giant image is projected, sometimes singing along with the flesh-and-blood Bowie on the stage below. The hook is that Bowie says this is the last time he'll trot out his hits and fan favorites for concert consumption. He even set up 900 numbers for his fans to call to request songs they'd like to hear from him. Remembering that this is the man who's announced his retirement from the concert stage more often than any pop star, it still has the ring of sincerity. And for his part, Bowie is eager to talk about his future projects — both solo and with the group Tin Machine. Here's what our travel-crazed

How did the 900 lines work? Were you able to use the audience feedback for the first part of the tour? It really kicked in in Europe. We made a brief assessment on a local radio station in Canada and we found that we were pretty well within the parameters of what people wanted there. We readjusted by the time we got to Europe, and we'll be taking it into consideration as we get things started in the States.

Did the results surprise you? There was a big difference on the top end, in the first five in each country. In America it was fairly easy to predict things like "Fame" and "Let's Dance" and

expect to stage this kind of retrospective tour. How did it happen?

Frankly it's to support the albums coming out on Rykodisc in America and EMI in Europe. I didn't have any product to support this year. but they asked me if I'd be willing, because of the rereleases, to tour to increase attention for the albums. I thought if there was any way I could do it, with the two people I'd most like to do it with — Edouard and Adrian it might be a fun trip. Plus, it keeps me working

live. I've now decided that I want to do something live every year. I don't want to be in the position where I do something just every five years. I did a small thing with Tin Machine last year, this tour this year. Next year there will be a larger Tin Machine tour and per-1992... [laughs] who knows?

> I felt that this tour would be a great way to sort of tidy up the last 20 years so I can keep working with some verve and enthusiasm. What I didn't want to happen was to

lapse into doing this kind of tour, supplemented with songs from a new album, over the next three years. Then it's a safe bet. You know that they may not like your new stuff, but they'll hear "Heroes" and "Ziggy."

conceptualize it with me. He and his troupe were performing in Europe at that time and couldn't do it. It wasn't long after that we started working together on some arty projects in Europe — it was also the first time I

worked with [Tin Machine's] Reeves Gabrels. At that point we committed ourselves to working on some long-term project. This tour seemed like the perfect opportunity to do that.

What does Edouard bring to the party?

Artistically, for me, it's his understatement and elegance. It really added to what I wanted to do on stage for a long time. This time I really threw the ball. I had so much faith in his vision as a director that I gave him carte blanche to get on with that. I'm merely his performer.

And when he came to you

And when he came to you with his plans?

I thought, "Oh God, this is going to be expensive." And indeed it was.

I take it you're referring to the videos?

The filmed pieces were not a problem. But when you're talking about live video image, which works in conjunction with what's going on on stage, you're talking about totally new technology. There just wasn't anything that would throw a black and white image that long a distance at that height. It took

quite a few months and an extraordinary amount of money to create a piece of machinery to show it. Right up until the last minute we had syncing problems. Two days before opening night I was ready to ditch the entire damn thing. We could not make "Ashes to Ashes" sync with what I was singing onstage.

How hard is it to actually sing with your video image? There are three pieces where we're doing that, where the filmed image is singing with me. We work with a sync pulse; it's up to the drummer to keep us up to speed. The sync pulse itself starts the projector. If the projector doesn't read it, watch out. The scrim suddenly shoots up and we're doing it as straight-ahead rock. Sometimes that does happen. Other than the videos. though, it's a pretty barebones production, right down to the smaller band. Sure, absolutely. The reason for bringing this down, in my case, was that I'd never done anything at a real humanistic level. This is as near as I'll ever get to it. It was a real boost that came with working with Tin Machine last year. We did about 20 gigs last year, and that was such fun, a whole different kind of performance. The band tends towards an open-ended structure onstage, more improvisational than anything I worked with before. I liked that so much, I wanted to at least duplicate some of that feeling of smallness and tightness on this tour.

Also, Adrian and his band don't have the same familiarity with my music as Carlos [Alomar] and Carmine [Rojas] did. They're freely moving around with arrangements that otherwise might have stayed traditional. I think "Changes" changed a lot; it's become almost Beatlesque. That's fine by me; a lot of my favorite pieces are kind of Beatlesque. My all-time favorite song used to



be "I Am The Walrus"; that for me had everything — special qualities of experimentation, a wonderful tune and an arrangement that was more than interesting. It summed up what a good rock song could be. You also collaborated with Adrian on two songs on his new album.

"Gunman" we wrote in the studio, with Adrian's music and my lyrics. It's more of a stream-of-consciousness kind of thing. I think he does a great job with "Pretty Pink Rose," too, which I had sitting around. I love his last album, "Mr. Music Head"; the new one ["Young Lions"] is different. I won't say better, but different.

Are you happy with the way Rykodisc is handling your catalog?

I wouldn't have my material with anyone else. The care they take over every aspect of the music is primo, from the packaging to the digital remastering. The care and research in finding old pieces I've forgotten about is the best. I don't think you'd find that with a major company at all. I'm very happy.

What's on tap for Tin Machine?

I'm down here in Miami working with Reeves on some overdubs and sax playing. I'm beginning to find my chops again. It's weird after not playing for years and years, but Adrian coaxed me into playing it at the end of "TVC15". I was going to crucify him, but now I thank him. I'm putting sax all over the Tin Machine album [laughs]. Reeves will probably take most of it off, but I've been indulging myself. The album should come out at the end of this year, the beginning of next. It'll be a lot more introspective than the last one. The aggression is from a different place. It's not as actively aggressive guitar-wise as the last time. Reeves is using a different, one

could almost call it sensitive, playing [style].

Lyrically Tin Machine seems to bring out a particularly hard and violent edge in you.

I know. Isn't it interesting? I'm not even sure I want to know why. I guess there's a newfound freedom, in a way. We're all very aware that we're not on the commercial cutting edge. There's almost a sense of relief there, to be quite honest. There's an exploratory process going on that I haven't allowed myself for some time. That's probably something I needed, since the last time I got involved in that area was "Scary Monsters." To a certain extent the last couple of albums have been obviously not of that nature.

How does it affect your solo writing?

That's going to be interesting. What it has done is push me further to the edge. I've got some ideas l've been collecting for about 18 months for what I want to do as a solo artist next year after the Tin-Machine tour. It certainly doesn't point to any radiofriendly ideas. I think maybe I've slipped myself into a position where I'm artistically going to be very happy. I'm having a ball [laughs]. It's very adventurous, I'll just say that.

Did the success of "Let's Dance" sidetrack you into a more commercial direction that you wanted to go? I personally was very happy with the "Let's Dance" album creatively. "Tonight" and "Never Let Me Down," I think, were unfocused. I was in a dilemma of which way I was supposed to go with material. I listened to other people too much. That's now over. I think I lost some very good material; I thought there were some excellent

songs on the album which, had I dealt with them in a

way that was mine, would've

been creatively and artistically more successful.

It sounds like you're pretty excited about your new solo stuff; are you sure you want to go right into a band thing with Tin Machine?

There's only so much you can do at one time. With myself, if I start overloading my work schedule, I start spreading thin. I have all the time in the world, so I'll take them as they come and do them properly. My stuff can wait. It's not going away.

That's an awfully mature attitude.

How do the powers that be at CapCitles/ABC affect the way Q107 is programmed?

They pretty much leave the programming up to Lorrin [Palagi, OM/PD]. They primarily focus on sales and they do it well. The one thing the company does emphasize is that we are a family-oriented station, but that's Lorrin's philosophy too, so it works out well. For the most part, we have autonomy over the programming of the station. How do you perceive Cap-

They're probably more conservative than some other broadcast companies. We don't do really outrageous backstabbing-type things. We rely more on promoting ourselves than bashing the competition. One thing we do differently, for example, is buy everything we give away. We don't trade for mention or give away commercial air prizes. We are very self-sufficient.

What kind of music research
do you rely on the most?

Most stations are on records

before us, so I like to network with my friends and use that as a barometer for the hits early on. I look at requests, call-out, sales and all-around demand for an artist or record. VH-1 and MTV, unfortunately, aren't a huge force here because cable saturation isn't 100% in Washington. But I always use video information because I have found it to be a great indicator.

What factors would compel you to add a record early?

If I have Top Five sales on a very active nighttime record, I would be compelled to add that record early. As far as adult records go, we usually don't see early sales activity on the passive ones, so I have to go by word-of-mouth. So, if a colleague tells me good things about a record and I believe in my heart it's a hit, I could give . it a shot. I don't want to base everything on research; I rely on my gut, too. But it's always good to know a record is happening someplace else to back

cause the people don't seem to be passionate about any type of music in particular and it's really hard to predict what's going to be popular at any given time. Within the last year, I would definitely say the dance scene has become a factor. WPGC has emerged as a strong urban station with high ratings and, even more recently, WAVA has taken an almost all-dance direction as well. As I see it, you have the dance stations programming towards city dwellers and the straight-ahead Top 40 stations, like us, programming towards the suburbs.

How are the local promotion people in Washington?

They have a tough job because everyone's basically late in adding records. They get us excited, but they don't come in and start screaming at us. They try to understand what we're trying to do, point out records that they think will work for us. We have good relationships with everyone. We always want to be open to

new artists and have the opportunity to break them. Are women getting more prominent as major market players in radio?

I'd like to think they are. I'm always looking at which women become PDs. I think females should be taking on a bigger role in major markets. After all, who are many of the Top 40s now programming to? 25- to 34-year-old females. Therefore, those are the people who should be programming the stations. Nothing against all the studs who program in major markets, but let's get real, people. It's the women who know what's going on! \$\frac{\pi}{\pi}\$



SITIN' ON THE ROCK OF THE BAY

When you get right down to it, there aren't too many kinds of music that don't sell in the San Francisco Bay Area. Since the days of the beat generation, through the psychedelic '60s and the punk movement of the late '70s, San Francisco has been a magnet for alternative lifestylists who thrive on the Bay Area's diverse music scene and breathtaking beauty.

The music business in the Bay Area has been shook up, literally, by last year's devastating earthquake. Hardest hit, by far, was Rainbow Records, whose 37 outlets are all local. "The quake to Rainbow really shook us up as a company because our whole chain is here," explained Director of Advertising John Corley. "It's not like Tower, even though they have many stores here, they also have a huge operation elsewhere. It's really devastated our business; our Santa Cruz store is still down. It's affected our whole operation."

Tower was luckier. Its landmark store at Columbus & Bay has not been seriously affected, other than the fact

that the freeway has been closed near North Beach since the quake. Two of Tower's more rock & roll locations, Mountain View and Campbell, have more than picked up the slack; both are located in the South Bay.


By far the most dominant chain presence, by sheer number of locations, is Wherehouse. With 62 stores and counting, Wherehouse, along with national megachain Musicland/Sam Goody (35 locations), is becoming a force to be reckoned with. "What we've tried to do over the last couple of years is do more and more regional promotions with Wherehouse and Musicland to get them more involved rather than treat them as people coming from outside," states CEMA branch manager Terry Sautter.

While the chains are powerful, San Francisco consumers in the know head for the city's unmatched indiestore scene to catch up on the latest trends and releases. Topping the list is Village Music, located in Mill Valley north of the city in Marin County. Village Music has

been in existence for 22 years and has gained notoriety for its hip and famous clientele, which includes the likes of Tracy Chapman, Linda Ronstadt, Elvis Costello, Carlos Santana and Jerry Garcia. Village Music still sells records. "We're still a record store and most of our well known customers seem to like it that way," says owner John Goddard. "Eighty percent of our sales are vinyl, while CD sales are around four percent of my business."

While Village Music specializes in blues, jazz and rare R&B music, Rough Trade, located in the Haight at the well-known intersection of Haight & Asbury, is without question the dominant alternative store in the city. Rough Trade, which is also an independent label, serves a very "hip alternative crowd," according to retail manager Gayle Countryman. "We stock our own product, plus pretty much anything else we can get our hands on." While they've had much success with Rough Trade artists Galaxie 500 and Victoria Williams, the one-store operation has gained national



noteriety with alternative instores. (They recently hosted lan McCulloch, in his only live U.S. in-store.) During the last year they've had in-stores with a veritable who's who of PoMoland, including The Chills, Tall Tales & True, X-Tall and John Wesley Harding. "Usually the alternative bands do the KUSF interview/Rough Trade in-store tour before their local gigs," quipped Countryman.

The hot spot for Urban/ Dance breakouts, The Music People in Oakland, while also serving as a combo retail/one-stop, is being looked at by the majors as a key national player in breaking new rap acts. "We've broken a lot of the rap artists that are now mainstream, we have an annual barbecue every June to celebrate Black Music Month," says Nancy Lewis. "Last year we had Digital Underground and Tony! Toni! Tone! - both before they made it." Music People hosts industry breakfast/lunch artist appearances for its one-stop customers, which have been "hugely successful." Artists participating have included Paula Abdul, Sybil, Salt & Pepa, NWA, Eazy-E, and Bobby Brown, most of whom appeared before they broke nationally.

Other indies of note include Rasputin's in Berkeley, Down Home in El Cerrito, the Music Coop in



Petaluma, Cymbaline in Santa Cruz and Reckless in the city. Radio, especially college and alternative, is strong in the Bay Area, with KITS the clear PoMo pick, and KUSF in San Francisco. KALX in Berkeley and KFJC in Los Altos being the hot college stations. Top dogs in Top 40 are KMEL and, to a lesser degree, X100, with KKSF getting high marks for its unique blend of alternative, jazz and new age. Album Rock is pretty much limited to the South Bay, where traditional leaders KOME and KSJO air in one of the country's heaviest metal and rock & roll markets.

Independent distribution is strong, particularly in the hipper blues/R&B field. Bayside's Vern McNemar cites Alligator, Antones, Arhoolie, Black Top, Rounder, Kaleidoscope, Kate Wolf, Sugar Hill, Philo and Specialty as especially hot labels for the area's ultra-hip collectors. While CRD and City Hall concentrate mostly on urban/dance/rap product, Valley in Woodland and Lieberman in Reno also have a stake in the Bay Area.

To top off an almost too perfect music market, the area's club scene, while affected by the quake (Bill Graham's Fillmore burned down), remains legendary, and is pretty much concentrated in two general areas."Seventy percent of the action that goes on in SF is south of Market or on Market," reports PGD's Jerry Kopecky, "another 30 percent exists in the Haight." Boz Scaggs' Slims is the club du jour these days, basically based on "diverse booking," according to booker Dawn Holliday. "We opened primarily as a blues club, and since that point we've been able to extend our booking policies to

include everything from gospel to Camper Van Beethoven. We're also doing a lot more world beat." Slims' main claim to fame, however, is its ability to attract name acts like Simply Red, Was (Not Was) and, more recently, Rickie Lee Jones, Marianne Faithfull and Laurie Anderson, most of whom play clubs very often. "Slims is definitely the hottest club in the city," says Tower Columbus & Bay Manager Bob Olsen. "You also have to look at the Paradise Lounge, where downstairs they'll have someone like Throwing Muses and upstairs they'll have a poetry reading or a jazz show." The Paradise, also booked by Holliday, specializes in PoMo acts like Kevn Kinney & Pete Buck, Robyn Hitchcock, the Silos and the Gunbunnies, yet remains "primarily a local club, with music seven nights a week with three or four bands playing a night," notes Holliday.

On the same block as Slims and the Paradise are the equally hip DNA Lounge and the Oasis. Other key clubs include the Kennel Club on Divisadero, the I-Beam in the Haight, the Stone in North Beach, Kimbals East (for jazz) in Emeryville, Yoshi's (for jazz) in Oakland, the American Music Hall in SF, and Sweetwater and New George's in Marin. Among concert venues, most, including the Warfield, the Cow Palace, and the Oakland Coliseum, are controlled by Bill Graham Presents.

It's no longer mandatory to wear flowers in your hair when going to San Francisco. The Bay Area does remain, however, one of the key music markets in the U.S. for breaking and supporting new music of all shapes and styles. ★



Kimm Rogers, "Soundtrack Of My Life" (Island): Longtime a fixture on the LA folk/performance scene, Kimm Rogers has distinguished herself from the pack with this outstanding debut. Her band of crack musicians helps to punctuate her acoustic guitar and soaring vocals. The quality of Kimm's

songwriting is on par with singer/storytellers such as Suzanne Vega and Janis Joplin. From the infectious "Right By You," to the pleading tone of "Desperate," this album introduces the arrival of a very special new talent.

Katydids, "Katydids" (Reprise): This is one of those rare debuts where everything falls into place. Credit, in part, is due to Nick Lowe's sparkling, yet spare production, allowing the vocal interplay of Susie Hug and Adam Seymour to accentuate the special quality of the lyrics and music. The



songs, written by Hug and Seymour, stand up as individual vignettes, with clarity and passion rarely found on a debut release. "Lights Out," and "Growing Old" are immediate standouts, but "Katydids" is an absolute joy from start to finish.



Jesus Jones, "Liquidizer" (SBK): Hailed by the influential British music press as one of the "Brightest Hopes" of the year, Jesus Jones' debut is a full-frontal hybrid of sample-pop mayhem, which owes its musical antecedent to influences as diverse as Sonic Youth and Public Enemy. These metal

machine messiahs skate the razor's edge of well-written songs delivered with scathing attitude; the effect of which is not unlike having your head split with an axe. Experience the musical meltdown that is "Never Enough."

Ultra Vivid Scene, "Joy 1976-1990" (Columbia): Produced by Hugh Jones, Kurt Ralske and band have truly delivered pop music for the '90s. Be it the intricate guitar filigrees or the seductive vocals, this record is warm and enticing, yet deceptively so. The buried vocals (a la House of Love) command



strict attention, unlike much of the fluff that passes for PoMo. It's a journey well worth the trek. Start with "Staring At The Sun," and segue to "It Happens Every Time," and "Guilty Pleasure."



T ON UP AND COMING by John Sutton-Smith

Who's on First? New York new wave alums Debbie Harry, the Ramones and shrunken-Head trips Tom Tom Club and Jerry Harrison's Casual Gods are out together on a revolving show where, in a a rare display of musical glasnost, the order of the acts changes each night, according headlining status to each artist in turn. Harrison's latest, "Walk On Water," is just out through Warners, and among the progressive funky pop tracks lies a killer ballad in the Bryan Ferry style called "Sleep Angel."... The Mission U.K., out on tour with PolyGram labelmates the Wonderstuff, pulled a fast one on fans and press when a guitar roadie came out for the second encore, the Cure's "In Between Days," looking for all the world like Robert Smith himself, and taking the intensity level at the Palladium up a notch or two. It wasn't until the next day that word started to leak out about the mischievous impersonation, and even the trades and dailies were caught unawares in their reviews of the wild but well-received show.... SECOND COMING: Two years after their brilliant debut album, Liverpool's sons of soul the Christians are back with a follow-up of similar quality and power, and with the songs that will hopefully give it the mass acceptance the last album got everywhere in the world but the U.S. "Colours" is a wonderful mix of early Culture Club, Soul II Soul's cool rhythmic style and the plaintive, heartfelt pop of the Waterboys. It may be a little early for album of the year honors, but the Christians stand to be right up there at year's end with Sinead and World Party, whose Roxy appearance last week was the single hottest ticket in town, despite stiff competition from David Bowie and the Tracy Chapman/Johnny Clegg bill the same night.... Two other rare and wonderful live shows came through last week as longtime laidback country bluesman J.J. Cale did a great set of old classics like "Crazy Mama" and "After Midnight" and current material from the recent "Travel-Log" on RCA/Silvertone; and African phenom Salif Keita proved himself to be one of the best crossover prospects in the world beat market with a powerfully haunting vocal delivery and a rumored new album to follow up last year's "Ko-Yan" on Island Joe Cocker's version of the Leonard Cohen classic "Bird On The Wire," from the just-released-on-CD "Mad Dogs & Englishmen," far outstrips the new Neville Brothers attempt, from the movie soundtrack of the same name, which suffers from unsympathetic production work by the normally reliable Dave Stewart. With the exception of that song, Cocker growls and croons his way through all his hits in fine form on the new "Joe Cocker Live" from Capitol Other worthy new releases include Roddy Frame's latest Aztec Camera outing from Warners called "Stray," probably Roddy's best work since the debut album of nearly a decade ago. And two from Charisma put the label on the right road with Kirsty MacColl's "Kite" and a self-titled solo debut from Brent Bourgeois. Warners also has a new Ladysmith Black Mambazo release, "Two Worlds One Heart," which the awesome a cappella act is out touring behind.... Best of the unsigned: A Tuesday night at Molly Malone's featured talented singer/songwriter Mark Davis, much-compared to Mike Scott, which can't be bad, and Chrysalis' soon-to-be-ex-publicity gal Elaine Summers, who is following her muse to the spotlight.



Last Tuesday's Best Kept Secrets marathon at Hollywood's Coconut Teaszer featured a pair of extremely hot prospects — adult-alternative group Children's Day and neo-soul band Momma Stud. Not surprisingly, the joint was crawling with talent scouts and moguls, many opting to check out both bands. Momma Stud's set had 'em rockin', but none more so than RCA's John Axelrod, who announced, "I still don't know how to act!" as he jitterbugged past — or was that the Lindy? That kind of body language would seem to translate as "serious interest." Nonetheless, several A&R types concurred that Momma Stud's strongest tune was its cover of King Floyd's "Groove

She's a terrific singer, and she's bringing increasing drama to the songs of guitarist/bandleader Russell Scott. When Konte and Scott sing together, the

blend is eerily reminiscent of Berlin during its "Sex (I'm A)" period, although the band and the material are more along the lines of the Sundays or Innocence Mission.... At this point, Children's Day has a pair of publishing offers, Island while CBS have offered demo deals. The CBS invitation, a no-strings, direct-to-DAT situation initiated by Len Fagan (who got his boss Richard Griffiths to come down for the show), would seem to be hard to pass up - and Children's Day would finally have itself a demo tape. Actually, not having demos may have been a plus in this case, arousing curiosity and forcing people to see the band. It hasn't hurt, either, that Gary Gilbert is Children's Day's lawyer. The way the buzz is building, I suspect the ante will go up in the next few weeks.... The Gin Blossoms' deal with A&M is officially done, which means rents have been paid and phones have been turned back on. Attorney Gene Salomon's next project is the Bedshredders.... I.R.S. publicity guy Dave Millman would give a bundle for a copy of the advance cassette for Chris Isaak's 1985 "Silvertone," which contained what Dave claims is the great lost Isaak song, "Another Idea." The track was cut from the album at the last minute. But that doesn't mean it couldn't show up on the next one.... If you thought you saw Susan Collins recently, you were right. She's back from London and working with Kaz at Virgin Music.... Little-known fact: Nick Terzo was the one who got the ball rolling in the CBS/Sub Pop deal.... Media note: Fred Goodman out at Rolling Stone.... For sale: Eight vintage David Bowie masters, all originals, cut in '65 by his group David Jones & the Mannish Boys and produced by their present owner, Shel Talmy. Bidding is expected to start at \$500,000.... Coupled: Sinead O'Connor and Hugh Harris.



There may not be a more apt name for Memphis' Human Radio, a five-man band that defies categorization as it embraces a plethora of musical elements. Whether you're looking for African rhythms, Middle Eastern embellishments, clean Steely Dan feels, Zappa-esque weirdness or intelligent lyrics, it's all here—just like a truly great radio station. Of course, an intelligent pop band that doesn't fit easy pigeonholes is bound to be problematic, but that doesn't worry them. As principal songwriter Ross Rice says, "We figure there are bound to be people like us that want to hear something new. We just wonder about all those bands who are underestimating their audience." Funny, Rice and drummer Steve Ebe went way out on a limb, completely overestimating HITS' features wench Holly Gleason.

playing Memphis music." And we always say, "Yeah, but Memphis music is about bringing a lot of different elements together." What was Elvis but a hillbilly guy singstuff that's in the third verse.
SE: I like the whole idea of "Me and Elvis," especially the idea of "sweating in the Memphis sun, but Elvis kept us cool in the shade."



Your sound is so fresh, and while there are elements that are familiar, there's no easy handle for what you do. Was that intentional?

Ross Rice: We were all playing in all kinds of bands and we got to where we didn't feel like we were being honest with ourselves. It was always this kind of music with these kinds of people. We're friends who like to play together; that's the essence of why we put this band together.

Steve Ebe: We decided we wanted to make music that we liked, not music that sounded like something that was already out there.

The songs are intelligently written. Weren't you afraid of today's lowest-common-denominator aesthetics?

RR: I've always liked songs that struck me on one level, with other levels emerging on repeated listenings, like buried treasure. So I take great pains to make sure there's something beyond the surface meaning. I think people need that—it's the key to a

song's longevity.

The playing is surprising, too.
SE: That may have something to do with where we come from.
Steve [Arnold], our bass player, has studied with Jeff Berlin and Jaco Pastorius. Peter [Hyrka] is a classically trained violinist. And, of course, Ross, Steve Arnold and I have played with people like Steve Cropper and Duck Dunn.

Steve Cropper and Duck Dunn are real player's players. What did you learn from them?

SE: To keep things loose. They just come in, pop open a beer, tell the band a joke and count the song off. It's that simple.

RR: They're really just basic Memphis guys. I don't think they've got a real clear picture of how much of an effect they've had on other players. But what they do comes from the heart and the butt. They know how to make you shake it. There's no analysis to them, they just play it.

Your sound isn't exactly straightup "Memphis."

SE: People always say, "You're not

ing like a black man?

RR: There's a general perception, too, that people in the middle of the country don't have a concept of what's going on in the world. But it's easy for us to get African music. What put Memphis on the map was combining all different types of music, and that's what we're doing. We're just doing it with new styles.

OK, the big Memphis question — who has the best ribs?

SE: The general consensus is the Rendezvous, but those are dry ribs. It's really up to taste, but I prefer the Rendezvous for atmosphere. RR: I think Payne's, or else Three Little Pigs if you're looking for a pork shoulder sandwich.

Given the songs have such subtle humor to them, is it possible to have a favorite line or lines?

RR: My favorite line is from

"These Are The Days," "Nietzsche knocked on my door/ Saying God is dead and getting funky..." I can just imagine Nietzsche driving up to my door on a Harley, knocking on my door and telling me all the

There are so many ways you can take that — that he defined cool for us, that we were so busy rocking we never noticed how hot it was, that because of Elvis we had it made in the shade.

"I Don't Wanna Know" encapsulates society's laissez-faire attitude.

SE: The line, "You reach out and change the channel," really puts it in perspective. It's about people being apathetic, who say, "I don't watch the news, it's too depressing."

Is your diversity a problem? RR: Sometimes I worry people will hear one song and think that's what we're about. But I wouldn't want to do it any other way. We're not in it for rock stardom. We're musicians, and that's what's important. Of course, every now and then we want to just get out there and burn. We want to make every mother have to turn us down. SE: Adrenaline is the best drug there is.

GETING RICH

What was the biggest change going from distribution at CBS to the Columbia label?

The biggest transition was that rather than working all of the product at CBS, I'm just working Columbia product. To be perfectly frank, at times it's difficult because I'm a music person and I love all kinds of music.

Columbia has been viewed as somewhat of a monolithic machine, yet there are more wild while not necessarily crazy, people like yourself moving up there. Can you explain this duality?

You're right. Columbia was always the granddaddy, so to speak, of record labels, and from the field standpoint, it was a bit staid. Much of the change started to occur very recently with Tommy Mottola, Donny lenner and Dave Glew coming in. I have to attribute this new energy and excitement to them. Donnie's the main reason I chose to come to New York.

Columbia has one of the widestranging talent rosters around, not just their pop and rock but in jazz, classics and country as well. How does the field keep it all straight without things falling through the cracks?

Coming from the field, we never put labels on things, we just sell. The same thing goes with genres of music; you have to know your account structure, you wouldn't go into a metal shop and attempt to sell them Beethoven on Masterworks. We have some of the best sales reps around and most of them have been with us a long time — really it's just their feel for the marketplace and their account structure.

With the New Kids phenomenon approaching Beatlemania in scope, how does it affect other projects and business in general?

It's kind of a double-edged sword. The New Kids thing is really a lot of fun and terrifically exciting, but as we have so many different types of acts and product lines that above all else we really, as powerful as they are, have to put them to the side to deal with acts like Perfect Gentlemen and some of our alternative groups like Poi Dog Pondering. This thing rolls so easily that it

Columbia VP of Sales Rich Kudolla got into the record business In Chicago with Consumers Mart of America. Forsaking a more lucrative career in blueprinting, Kudolla became manager at Consumers after the then-manager "ran off with the day's receipts" during the holiday rush. The department was run by area independent distributor Garmisa Distributing. When Garmisa's owner formed a new company, Royal Disc Distribution, Rich was asked to join as the "inside man," doing everything from "sweeping floors to packing, shipping and billing." After 10 years, the company eventually went public, when the original Musicland people, Amos and Danny Heilicher, bought in. Rich was the only principal to remain, running distribution out of Chicago. As independent distribution faded somewhat in 1974, Rich joined CBS as a sales rep in Indianapolis, moving to L.A. as a Field Sales Manager, which was a training position for Branch Manager, Kudolla eventually became Cleveland Branch Manager, Regional VP and finally Branch Manager in L.A. — until last August, when he accepted the VP of Sales position at Columbia. Kudolla offered to conduct this interview on the golf course, but HITS' ever-alert Joe Medwick wisely declined, opting for the relative safety of long distance.

doesn't necessarily give us a lot of lessons on how to market some of these other things. We have to be cautious not to give it too much time — it's just a part of the mix, granted a very big part. Public Enemy has opened a few eyes. Do you see the incredible response to "Fear of a Black Planet" as a sign to those who might censor that kind of music or is that overstat-

Ing the situation?

I don't think that's off-base, people can pick and choose whatever they like — that's America. I think we are seeing more and more written about rap, about Public Enemy and the legitimacy of this particular form. Even the finest of artists, whether they're in music, painting or sculpture are not liked by everyone. It remains an individual taste thing. I've

found that this group has come a long way; it's their form, they believe in it and they want to maintain its integrity. That's their right to do, just as it's everyone else's to buy it or not.

A lot of rap is showing major crossover activity, especially Public Enemy.

Well, it's pretty good music and people like good music. Secondarily, the message is something that is getting across, and I don't care what color people are today, I can tell you that young adults are a lot more aware than they were when I was a youngster. They care about what's going on in the world, and they want to hear these type of ideas, they want to weigh them before they judge — and the only way you do that is by listening to the music. How do you approach breaking new acts at retail? Is it all in relationships

or are there other keys?

Of course the relationships are important, but above all else it has to be in the grooves. You start with something you believe in, and nowadays Columbia is a lot more selective then they've ever been; so when we sign an act we genuinely believe that it's meaningful music and has hit potential. It starts with the branches, we give them the tools they need with marketing, advertising, previews. Once we have an act in hand, there isn't much we won't do to make it happen. Poi Dog, Toad the Wet Sprocket and Shawn Colvin are all acts we believe in and we're going to stay with them as long as it takes to bring them to as many people as we possibly
